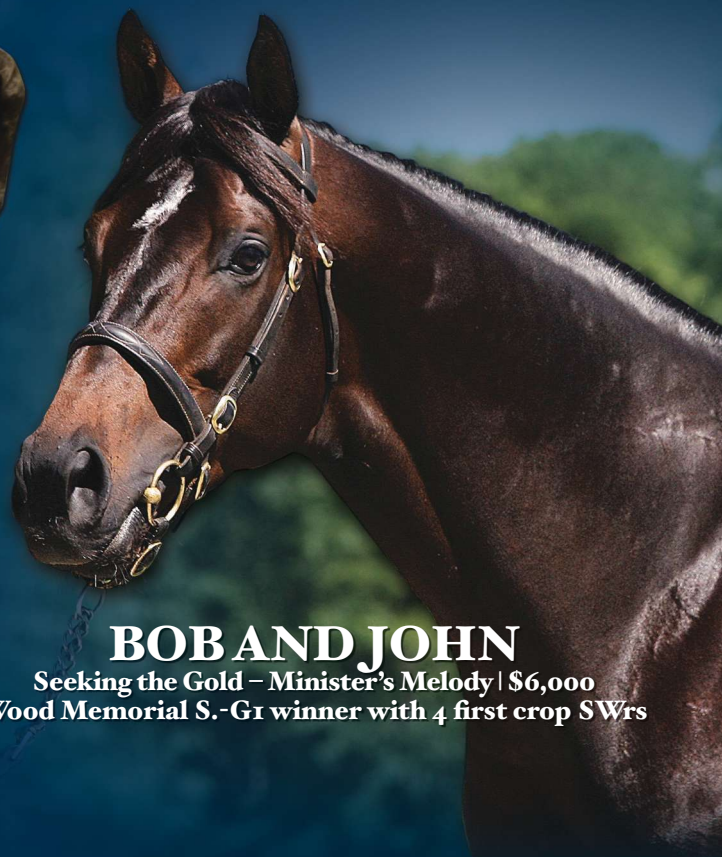

2012: A Numbers Game

Dear Breeders,
Sometime around New Year's Day most of us pause to take a look back at the year and cast a forward glance toward the year to come. This time around, my mental New Year's inventory included some thoughts about the racetrack achievements past and future of the wonderful New York-breds you breed.

In 2012 five different Empire State-breds—four of them 3-year olds—won grade I races at five different racetracks. This is unprecedented. You need to go back to 1982 to find five New York-bred grade I victories in one year, and in that case three horses accounted for the five wins: Cupecoy's Joy, Naskra's Breeze, and Slewpy. In the miracle year of 2003 we had four grade I wins with three horses: Funny Cide, who took the first two legs of the Triple Crown; Whitmore's Conn; and Buy the Sport. In 2010 four different horses (A Shin Forward, Franny Freud, Rightly So, and Haynesfield) defeated the best of the best at four different racetracks.

The 2012 grade I honor roll consists of: Willy Beamin, who took the Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes on Travers Day at Saratoga; The Lumber Guy, winner of the Vosburgh Invitational Stakes on Belmont's Super Saturday Card in September; Dayatthespa who won the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes at Keeneland; on the same weekend, 4-year-old Next Question took the Nearctic Stakes at Woodbine; and Unbridled Command, who capped the series by defeating 13 rivals in the Hollywood Derby at Betfair Hollywood Park in

November. Three of these grade I winners won multiple graded stakes this year.

Grade I victories are only part of the story. In this year's classic races, after a poor break and traffic troubles, New York-bred Went the Day Well charged home fourth in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands with the best closing move of the field and Zetterholm finished fourth in the Preakness Stakes. As to the first weekend in November—The Lumber Guy thrilled us all with a runner-up finish in the Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint. New York-breds won 15 graded races this year and an additional 29 open stakes and everybody is talking about them!

Now on to the future. We can't even begin to predict what will turn out to be the greatest racing moments for

your horses in 2013, but I have no doubt that the coming year will provide lots of excitement. There is one thing, however, we can all put on the calendar right now: a new spring New York Showcase Day June 1.

Five existing races for New York-breds (the Kingston, Mount Vernon, Affirmed Success, Mike Lee, and Bouwerie) have been moved to this special card, and will be joined by two new races, the \$100,000 Dancing Renee at seven furlongs for fillies and mares, and the \$150,000 Commentator at 1¹/₁₆ miles for 3-year-olds and up. This new day of racing dedicated to New York-bred excellence is one of the most significant additions to the New York Racing Association's racing calendar in 2013 and will form part of an extended celebration of the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) June 8.


As you know, Fall Showcase is a day of pride and celebration of our program. What a ratification of your success that one Showcase Day is not enough and that a second Showcase Day is being linked to Belmont's marquee race.

Congratulations to you all and Happy New Year!

DATES SET FOR '13 STALLION SEASON AUCTION

New York Thoroughbred Breeders will be conducting its annual Stallion Season Auction from Jan. 24 through Jan. 28, 2013. The auction will be held online using the Starquine bidding platform at www.starquine.com and feature a mix of seasons to Kentucky, New York, and other regional stallions.

The annual auction supports NYTB and its PAC in the work of promoting the welfare of New York's Thoroughbred industry and ensuring the state's breeders are heard in debates impacting the breeding and racing industry.

Frost Giant Ices First-Crop Progeny Record

Frost Giant, who stands at Keane Stud near Amenia, is putting the finishing touches on a record-setting season with his first crop of foals. From an initial crop of just 30 foals, Frost Giant has 10 winners from 14 runners who have earned a state record \$783,743 (through Dec. 18). The previous freshman sire record holder in New York was Precise End with \$709,293 in 2004.

The record came when his daughter, Kelli Got Frosty, won the East View Stakes Dec. 9 at Aqueduct. His other stakes winner is \$192,153-earner West Hills Giant, winner of the New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes. Frost Giant has two other stakes-placed winners: Zekes Surprise, third in Saratoga's Aristie Stakes; and New York Stallion Series Stakes third-place finisher Nonnie Connie.

"We're pleasantly surprised at how well Frost Giant's first offspring are doing as 2-year-olds because they are big horses who we expect will get better as they mature and go longer distances," said Andrew Cohen, who manages the stallion under the banner of his Sunset Stables.

A grade I winner by top sire Giant's Causeway, Frost Giant is out

of the Gone West mare Takesmybreathaway. She is from the family of the Phipps' family's grade I winner Dance Number, who produced champion Rhythm and graded stakes winner Get Lucky, who is responsible for 2010 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Super Saver, grade I winner and leading New York-based sire Bluegrass Cat, and grade I winner and New York stallion Girolamo.

Frost Giant's fee is slated to be \$7,500 for 2013.

RULE TO HOLD COURT AT VINERY NEW YORK

The multiple graded stakes-winning Rule has been retired from racing and will stand stud in 2013 at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag, N.Y.

The 5-year-old WinStar Farm homebred will stand for \$6,500 stands and nurses. He is part of the farm's popular "Dream Big" breeders' program.

By Roman Ruler, Rule is out of the Personal Flag mare Rockcide, a half sister to the New York-bred Funny Cide, the 2003 champion 3-year-old male and winner of that year's Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I).

"Rule is a natural for New York, and his pedigree should be a very familiar one to local breeders," said Elliott Walden, WinStar president and CEO. "Obviously, his dam is the sister of perhaps New York's best racehorse ever in Funny Cide, who was the first Kentucky Derby winner we bred, and the horse that really put WinStar on the map. Rule is an awesome looking individual and a precocious, high-quality racehorse in his own right, winning a grade II this year over Flat Out and placing in three grade I races during his career."

Rule captured three straight races to close out his juvenile campaign in 2009, culminating with a win in the Boyd Gaming's Delta Jackpot Stakes (gr. III). He ran his win streak to four with a victory in the Sam F. Davis Stakes (gr. III) at 3 before placing in the Florida Derby (gr. I).

As a 4-year-old, Rule won the Birdstone Stakes at Saratoga and placed in four graded stakes including the Donn Handicap (gr. I) and Woodward Stakes (gr. I). This year, Rule won the Monmouth Cup Stakes (gr. II) over Flat Out.

Trained by Todd Pletcher, Rule was retired with a record of 6-2-6 from 20 starts and earnings of \$1,162,350.

SPENDTHRIFT INTRODUCES "BREED SECURE" PROGRAM

Spendthrift Farm is expanding its popular "Breed Secure" program to New York breeders in 2013 through its New York-based stallion Dublin, who's set to stand his second season at Keane Stud.

The program was launched two years ago to relieve commercial breeders of the risk of paying stud fees on some of Spendthrift's young Kentucky-based stallions.

"Owning the stallions outright gives us the flexibility to offer breeder-friendly deals that puts Spendthrift and the breeder on a level playing field," said B. Wayne Hughes, owner of Spendthrift Farm. "It's really simple: we don't make money unless the breeder can make a profit that will justify paying the cost of the stud fee. If breeders are willing to support young and unproven Spendthrift stallions in good faith, I think it's only right to return the favor and relieve breeders of the risk taken on by their patronage. We want breeders to

believe in our product as much as we do. The program has been very well-received in Kentucky, and we hope the breeders of New York will be equally as enthusiastic."

The program offers breeders a guarantee of a profit to those who wish to sell the resulting in-foal mare, weanling, or yearling at public auction before any stud fee is owed.

Dublin, winner of Saratoga's Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) as a 2-year-old, covered 102 mares from his introductory book in 2012, and his first foals will arrive in 2013. He stands at Keane Stud near Amenia, N.Y., for a fee of \$7,500.

Strength in Numbers

Diversified approach helps Lewis Lakin stay in racing for long haul

When Thoroughbred breeder Lewis Lakin entered the racing game more than 30 years ago, he dreamed about months like November 2012.

Lakin's November-to-remember started at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale where a weanling Blame colt he bred and consigned fetched \$320,000. That breeding and sale success was followed by a breeding and racing success when New York-bred Unbridled Command secured his first career grade I victory in the Hollywood Derby (gr. I) Nov. 25.

Breeding such top horses still thrills Lakin.

"It's great; it's what it's all about," Lakin said. "It can make up for a lot of ones that don't do it."

While November proved a dream month for Lakin, he believes his diverse approach in the run-of-the-mill months puts him in position for such success. While Lakin sees himself primarily as a breeder—it's what he enjoys most—he is active in nearly every facet of the game: buying, pinhooking, selling, and owning. Lakin also likes to breed a solid number of horses each year as opposed to taking just a shot or two.

"John Nerud gave me a lecture on horse racing and breeding that stuck with me. He said that you have to buy a lot of horses because you never know which one will jump up and be a winner," Lakin said. "And he told me that once a decade you'll get a horse that will allow you to get even. That's the only advice that anyone's given me that has come true."

One of the latest "once-in-a-decade" horses to come along for Lakin is New York-bred Unbridled Command, a newly turned 4-year-old son of the late sire Master Command who seemingly improved with every start in 2012. Lakin, listed as A. Lakin and Sons, and long-time adviser and

sometimes business partner Becky Thomas, listed as Sequel Thoroughbreds, are the co-breeders of Unbridled Command.

While Lakin and Thomas sell most of the horses they breed, Lakin will campaign a homebred if he believes the horse is not getting the right auc-

tion price. That was the case with Unbridled Command. Offered at the 2011 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training, Lakin stepped in and purchased the colt for \$28,000.

"My partner, Becky Thomas—who is pretty good at this—told me that she thought he'd be a good racehorse. She saw some real potential. So I bought her out," said Lakin, who gives Thomas a lot of credit for his success over the years. "She's not into racing at this point. She's more into the pinhooking, the buying, and the breeding."

Thomas' evaluation has panned out. In his third and final start as a 2-year-old, Unbridled Command secured a maiden special weight victory against New York-breds on Nov. 4, 2011, when he drew off to a 5¼-length score on the Aqueduct turf.

Still, Unbridled Command had not completely matured. He dropped his first two starts of 2012, but things would change when Unbridled Command posted a 4¼-length victory against state-breds in an allowance race June 23. After another allowance win against state-breds at Saratoga, trainer Tom Bush entered Unbridled Command in open company for his stakes debut and the gray or roan colt out of the Unbridled's Song mare Unbridled Betty responded with a victory in the Saranac Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Saratoga.

Bush said Lakin showed patience in allowing Unbridled Command time to develop.

"He's super knowledgeable. He's been in the business a long time and he's had some ups and some downs. He's very familiar with the terrain," said Bush. "Those (experienced owners) are certainly the easiest people to train for because they have the fundamental understanding you need to participate in this game."

While patient, Lakin also likes to take advantage of all opportunities. He entered Unbridled Command in the Keeneland November sale but

pulled the colt out of the sale after the stakes victory.

"With that victory he was saying, 'I don't want to go. I want to run for you,'" Lakin said with a smile. "We said, 'As long as you're winning, we'll keep you.'"

The winning would continue. Bush took full advantage of racing opportunities afforded New York-breds by returning Unbridled Command to a restricted stakes. Unbridled Command not only rolled to a 6¾-length victory in the \$175,000 McMahon of Saratoga Mohawk Stakes Oct. 20 on the Belmont Park turf, he also positioned himself well for his first grade I race, the \$250,000 Hollywood Derby, which also would mark his first race outside New York.

Bush said Lakin enjoyed seeing Unbridled Command's progress, culminating this season with the Hollywood Derby win at Betfair Hollywood Park.

"I think that's been exciting for him. It's always something special to see a horse take those little baby steps and keep moving forward," Bush said. "This horse is a beautiful horse physically, and he's come along

the right way as well. It's good to see for sure."

Lakin said the improvement grabbed him.

"He didn't really mature until the spring of this year. And he just blossomed into a racehorse," Lakin said. "Obviously, you wait a long time and hope. And once in a while you get lucky and have a good one."

Of course, Lakin has had his share of good ones. His homebred Pure Clan won the 2008 American Oaks Invitational Stakes (gr. IT) at Hollywood Park, the 2009 Flower Bowl Invitational Stakes (gr. IT) at Belmont Park, and four other graded stakes. Lakin homebred Greater Good won the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II) as a juvenile and placed 13th in the Kentucky Derby (gr. I). He and Thomas were part of an ownership group that campaigned grade I winner City Zip, who would start his brilliant stallion career in New York.

Other top horses bred or campaigned by Lakin, individually or in partnership, include Capeside Lady, Fleet Indian, Healthy Addiction, Behaving Badly, Irish Smoke, and Dream Rush.

Lakin keeps about 25 broodmares at his Versailles, Ky., farm and ships about half of them to Thomas' Sequel Stallions each year to foal and be bred in New York. Lakin has been a long-time supporter of New York breeding—he used to co-own Lakland North with Thomas before selling his interest in 2006 to Dennis Narlinger in the operation that would become Sequel.

"I don't have any interests in New York as far as the farm. But I do a lot of work with Becky; she's my adviser. And I'm also partners with her on mares

and some pinhooking of yearlings to 2-year-olds. I board at her farm, and she does all my breedings for me," Lakin said. "I really rely on her a lot."

Lakin enjoyed seeing New York-breds succeed on the track this season as Unbridled Command joined The Lumber Guy, Willy Beamin, Next Question, and Dayatthespa for a record five individual New York-bred grade I winners in a season.

"It was great because I do a lot of breeding in New York. I believe in that program. And I think it's going to be successful in the future," Lakin said. "There's going to be more of that as long as that program is in place."

Lakin noted that some of the races restricted to New York-breds Unbridled Command won this year were very tough and prepared him well to face open competition. He expects the competition on the track and in the breeding sheds to only grow in New York.

"It's going to be tough competition, but it's worth it," Lakin said. "I hope it stays that way. You never know what politicians are going to do, but for now it sounds like it's going to get even better."

Patience Can Pay Off

Lakin, who is always willing to consider an offer, had an opportunity to sell the mare that produced the Kentucky-bred Blame weanling colt who sold for \$320,000 at Keeneland November, Lifeinthefastlane, by Unbridled's Song. But he had liked several of her foals and decided to keep her. He struck big this season after paying the \$35,000 stud fee to go to Blame.

"I could have sold her, but I liked her babies and I kept her," Lakin said. "So it was very satisfying. If you get enough of those, it helps you overcome a lot of low ones. That mare has thrown some beautiful babies, and this one came together. This was a very beautiful Blame colt."

Lakin said it is important to be patient.

"Once again, in this business—patience. If you're not patient, the horses are going to make you patient; so you might as well get used to it," Lakin said. "In dealing with mares, breeding, and running, it's the same way. You can try to rush it, but that will be it—it's not going to happen."

In his breeding program, Lakin starts with broodmares who have

some level of pedigree.

"I'm pretty well convinced that there's no sense breeding horses without much pedigree. It's hard to make the pedigree. I prefer when I do get a horse that has some pedigree and does some winning, I'll keep her and breed her," Lakin said. "When I go to sales and buy a mare, I look for young broodmares that have some pedigree in the family. And I can't breed too low on the stud fees. I don't like to go lower than \$30,000. And if the horse warrants it, I'll go to the top."

"I think that's where the money is. If you can get a decent baby with the right

pedigree and the right sire, the market will pay for that. Otherwise, it's pretty hard to make it breeding down low."

Lakin, 78, of Lake Forest, Ill., oversaw expansion of his family's Chicago rubber and tire recycling company, where he also placed emphasis on versatility. The company became a national leader in tire recycling under Lakin's guidance and opened facilities similar to the Chicago operation in Birmingham, Ala.

Lakin's family had owned horses, and he began buying some Thoroughbreds of his own to race in the mid-1980s. Always looking to diversify, he began pinhooking horses with Thomas in the early 1990s. His interest only grew from those years. The new opportunities in New York have energized Lakin.

"Obviously the breeding for me is what I like to do. But I like it all: breeding, buying, selling, pinhooking. And when we have a horse that I don't think is getting the right price, I enjoy racing them," Lakin said. "My interest is in breeding, but I do like to win. It's not an easy thing—they don't let you win much—so when you do it's a good feeling." 🐾

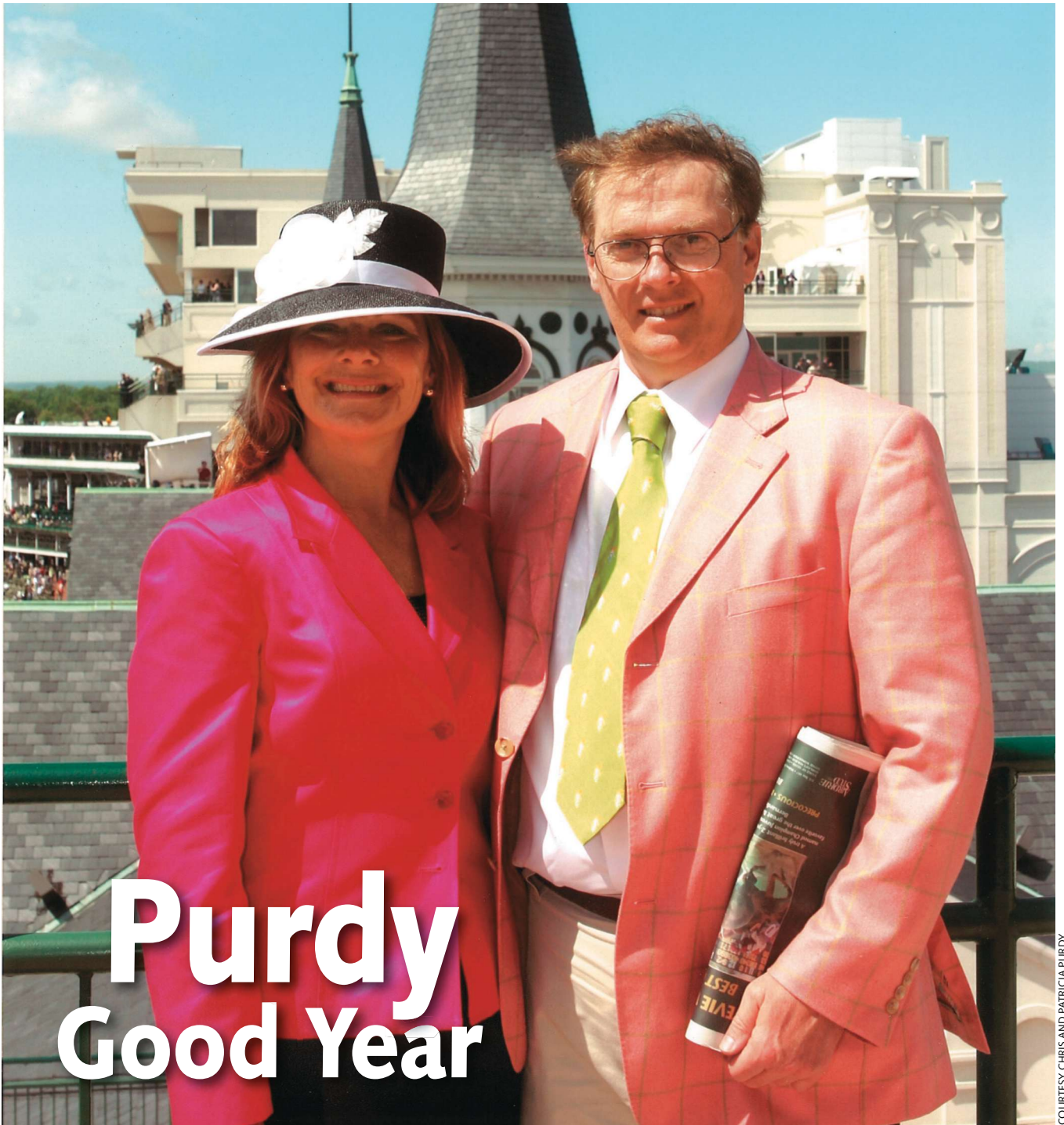

Purdy Good Year

The Purdys, Chris and Patricia, have whirlwind year as breeders of Willy Beamin

Chris and Patricia Purdy, who operate Ivy League Farm near Ithaca, hit the bigtime as breeders in the Empire State in 2012. Through early December they rank

fifth among New York breeders by progeny earnings and are the breeder of grade I winner Willy Beamin.

Willy Beamin, a colt bred in Patricia's name, fashioned a six-race win

streak that featured a score in the Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga Race Course on Travers day. That win came just three days after he won the Mike Lee Stakes for

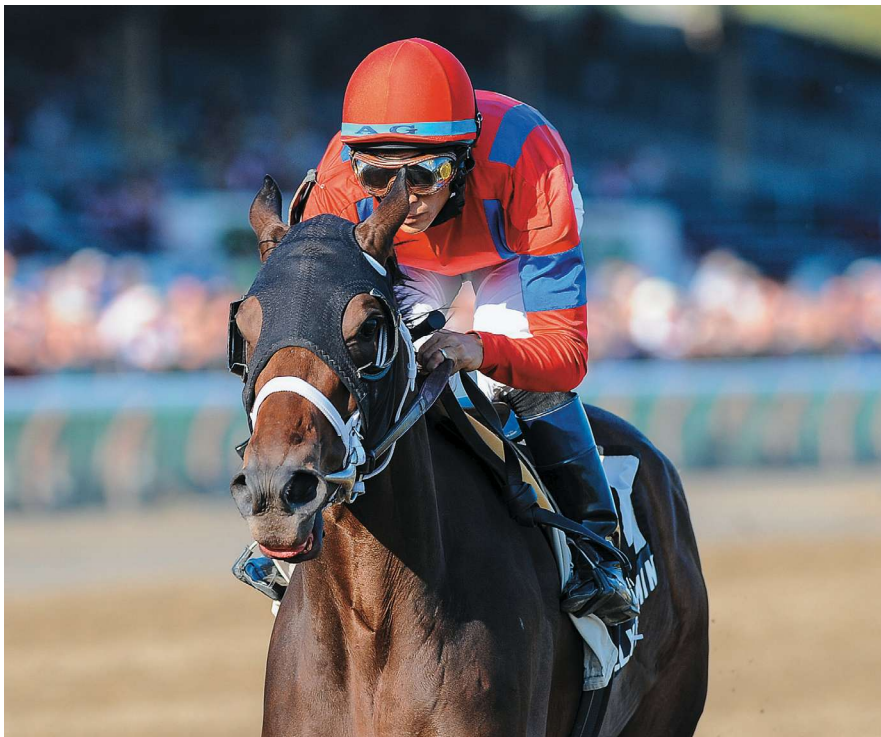
New York-breds at the Spa. The Purdys also are co-breeders—with Edwin and Mara Edelberg—of Karma Police, winner of the Niagara Stakes at Finger Lakes.

For the year, from just 45 starts, Purdy-bred runners have earned \$845,026.

Willy Beamin, by Suave out of the Gold Token mare Big Tease, began his win streak in March with a 5¼-length score at Aqueduct. His King’s Bishop win, worth \$300,000 to owner James A. Riccio, came over Fort Loudon and Unbridled’s Note.

“I didn’t see the race but saw the replay and started crying,” Patricia Purdy said about the seven-furlong King’s Bishop that Willy Beamin won in a handy 1:22.02. “I have a hard time watching our horses because I know how hard they try and have to work, and in Willy’s case I knew he had his work cut out for him. My first reaction was relief, and then, ‘Wow!’ ”

During his streak Willy Beamin also took a pair of stakes races for New York-breds: the \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes at Belmont Park and the \$150,000 Albany Stakes at Saratoga. Following the streak, he ran second in the \$400,000 Oklahoma Derby at Remington Park in late September and again ran second Nov. 17 in

the Discovery Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct. In his most recent outing he finished fifth in the Fall High-weight Handicap (gr. II) at Aqueduct on Thanksgiving Day under co-high weight of 133 pounds.

Named for a character in the 1999 Oliver Stone movie “Any Given Sunday,” Willy Beamin was raised at Ivy League. Chris Purdy had purchased Big Tease for \$6,000 at the 2008 Keeneland January mixed sale. At the time Big Tease, a stakes winner with earnings of \$197,308, had produced two foals, a Lion Heart filly and a Saint Liam filly, both of which were unraced at the time.

“We do our homework when looking for mares, but Big Tease was purchased mainly because of her name,” Patricia said. “She was tall and big and had a little conformation issue, but Chris liked the name because that was the way he was regarded by his family and peers.

“Chris is the bloodstock person,” Patricia added. “He’s been thinking about Sky Mesa and others as a mate for Big Tease in 2013. We pay attention to the fees because we can’t afford to get too fancy.”

Sky Mesa, who has sired 26 stakes winners, will stand in 2013 for \$25,000. He holds court at Robert N. Clay’s Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Ky.

Patricia Purdy’s penchant for horses began while she was growing up in Michigan. Born in Detroit and raised in nearby Grosse Pointe Shores, Patricia was a horse lover as a girl and began riding before her teen years. She met Chris while both were attending dental school at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. Following graduation in the mid-1980s, they moved to Ithaca, Chris’ hometown, south of Syracuse. Chris practiced dentistry and is now retired. Patricia, instead of practicing, has run the farm, which is close to Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine.

The Purdys, who operate with a

small staff and generally own about 12 mares, also play close attention to what they pay for broodmares and broodmare prospects.

“We don’t have a big budget,” Patricia said. “We take a look at young mares with potential and ones from female families that look up-and-coming. We can get that type of mare. But, like everyone knows, there’s a bit of luck.

“We like to see mares that have raced, but we know there are lots of things that have kept a mare from racing and they still have good potential. Whether it’s illness or lameness, we can be forgiving about that. We like good conformation, but some of our better mares are not the prettiest.

“We’re consistent about looking at stallions to try to see what would be a good match at a good price. That’s part of the fun.

“We also like a little outcrossing. We’ve bought a few mares out of the Tattersalls sales in England to try to inject some different blood. That isn’t the case with Big Tease, but we like that, mixing up the genes.”

Patricia credits the staff for much of the farm’s success. “With the small staff we have, we’ve been fortunate to have good people who are good to our horses,” she said.

Willy Beamin is Big Tease’s third foal.

“He was a feisty foal and so was his buddy,” Patricia said. “Colts can be tough at times. We’ve got a man working for us, but a lot of times he needed to do something else and left it up to us girls. I remember saying, ‘Whoa, boy,’ a lot when dealing with them. They weren’t poorly mannered, but I felt I needed to be more on my toes.”

Big Tease produced an Afleet Express filly this year and is in foal to Congaree off a late May cover.

Afleet Express, a son of Afleet Alex, stands at Gainesway Farm near Lexington, Ky. Congaree is being readied to stand his fourth season at Highcliff Stallions at Mill Creek Farm near Delanson, N.Y.

Willy Beamin isn’t the only star bred by the Purdys. The couple also bred New York champions Carson Hollow, Ibboeye, and Sharp Humor.

Carson Hollow was voted 2002 New York horse of the year and champion sprinter and 3-year-old filly after winning the Prioress Stakes (gr. I), the Floral Park Handicap (gr. III), and the Bouwerie Stakes and finishing second in the Test Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga. The daughter of Carson City was named state-bred champion older female in 2003.

The Purdys experienced Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) fever in 2006 with Sharp Humor, whom they raced with the Edelbergs in the Purdedel Stable name. By Distorted Humor, Sharp Humor won the Swale Stakes (gr. II) and then was beaten a half-length by Barbaro in the Florida Derby (gr. I). Sharp Humor contended early in the Run for the Roses but weakened and finished 19th.

“For a small breeder to experience all that was quite a thrill,” Patricia said.

Sharp Humor, a New York champion male at 2 and 3, began his stud career at WinStar Farm in Kentucky before heading to South Korea. Prior to leaving, he sired Hero of Order, who won this year’s Louisiana Derby (gr. II) at 109-1.

Ibboeye, by Medallist, was named New York champion 2-year-old male of 2009 after winning the Aspirant Stakes, the Damon Runyon Stakes, and the New York Breeders’ Futurity. He also was a stakes winner at 3 and 4 and was graded stakes-placed four times those two years.

Ibboeye has been reunited with one of his Ivy League handlers. He was purchased by Amelia Jean Proto for \$2,000 at the recent Keeneland November breeding stock sale. He was consigned by Paramount Sales, agent.

“Amelia worked here during high school and handled Ibboeye,” Patricia said. “She is now in Kentucky. She bought him as a stallion prospect and might use him as a show horse.”

Smooth Bert shines in the Damon Runyon;
Kelli Got Frosty continues with East View romp

“A queduct weather” was at its worst Dec. 9. A sloppy track, a leaden sky, and a cold, steady rain made conditions less than hospitable for the people and the horses on the last day of main track racing in New York in 2012.

None of that mattered to Smooth Bert, though, who splashed through the stretch to win the \$80,000 Damon Runyon Stakes in the final strides for his first stakes victory. And it didn't matter to the Farrell family as they got their picture taken with the 2-year-old son of Smooth Jazz—Little Bertie, by Devil His Due.

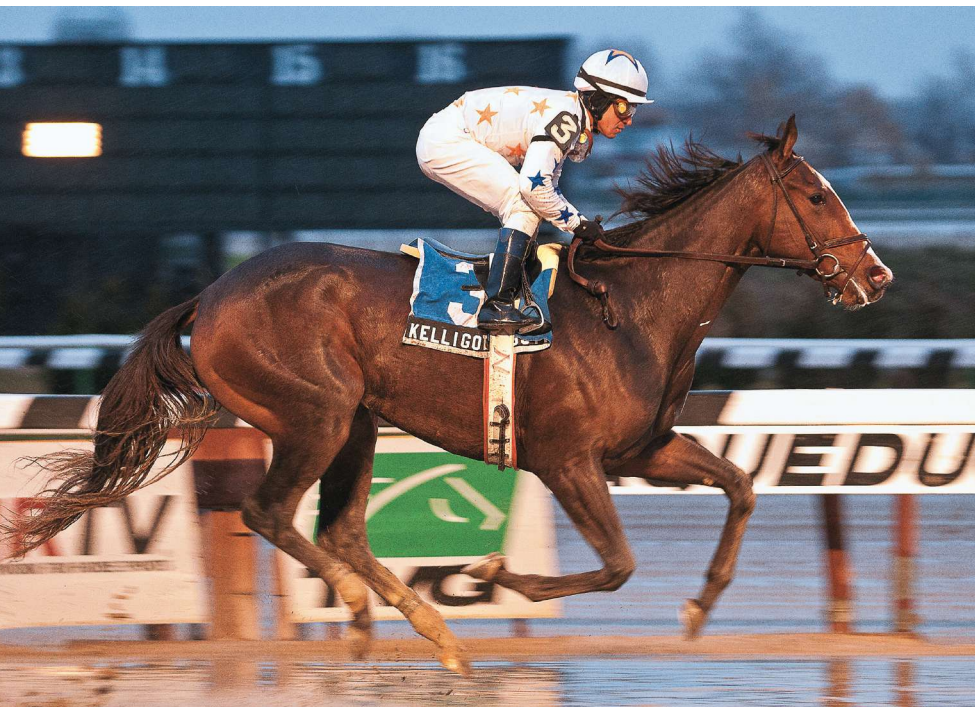

Kelli Got Frosty continues her winning ways in the East View Stakes

The Farrells are part of Bona Venture Stables, Smooth Bert's owners. This is their first venture in Thoroughbred ownership.

"It was a perfect opportunity," said Sean Farrell, at Aqueduct with his wife, Eileen, and daughters, Kara and Shannon. "And we got a great horse on our hands, so we're very excited. I've been a racing fan for a long time."

Bred by Allen Hallett and Briggs and Cromartie Bloodstock, Smooth Bert ran the mile in 1:39.70.

Dan Collins is the founder and manager of Bona Venture Stables. Originally from Glens Falls, N.Y., he and his family would occasionally attend both Saratoga Race Course and the nearby harness track. His interest in racing got serious when he covered racing for *The Saratogian* newspaper in college.

He bought his first horse in 1999, a bribe to his young daughters when he moved them from Chicago to Connecticut. They were reluctant to leave their home, but, said Collins, "We used to go out to Arlington Park, and they are big race fans. I told them if they'd stop complaining about mov-

ing, I'd buy some horses."

That, he said, silenced them...but only until they learned the horses would not, as they'd expected, be boarded in their backyard.

In 2005, Collins started Bona Venture Stables with a group of friends and fellow graduates of St. Bonaventure University in western New York. About half of the approximately 40 partners have direct connections to the university; the rest have come through the group's limited advertising—which includes commercials during St. Bonaventure's basketball broadcasts—and through word of mouth.

Four years ago Collins began working with Steve Venosa, a trainer; pinhooker; and bloodstock adviser; and it was he who selected Smooth Bert at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s 2-year-olds in training sales last April. Venosa also consigned the colt, whom Bona Venture purchased for \$60,000.

"His stride looked like he was walking on air," said Collins. "I immediately fell in love."

Trained by Leah Gyarmati, Smooth Bert will stay in New York this winter;

he is one of about 10 Bona Venture horses currently in training, most of which are New York-breds.

"We don't have the infrastructure to own more than about 10 or 12 horses," said Collins, "and we won't want more than about 40 or 50 partners. We're committed to knowing everyone involved and having some fun; we want people to be engaged. For a lot of our partners, these are the first horses they've ever owned."

Another Bona Venture runner, Summer of Fun, was third in this year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT), and while Collins fielded some heady offers off that finish, he turned them all down.

"For now, it's not a profit issue for us," he said. "We're trying to help build New York racing and get people to experience the excitement of the game."

There's been plenty of excitement for the connections of Kelli Got Frosty this fall. Since finishing fourth in her debut in September, the Frost Giant filly (out of Nick's Honor, by Jump Start) has won three of four starts, including two stakes victories, after a win in the \$80,000 East View Stakes Dec. 9.

"She's fabulous," said Eric Bishop, who manages Andrew Cohen's racing and breeding operations; Cohen bred the 2-year-old filly and owns her in partnership with Lee Sacks, Aubrey Flanagan, and Gary Tolchin.

"I guess next we have to try open company," he went on. "She's that good, and she's just getting better with every race. She obviously loves the slop."

At Belmont in October, Kelli Got Frosty broke her maiden in an off-the-turf muddy race by 14 lengths in just her second start. Her East View wire-to-wire score, by 9½ lengths, was nearly as dominating. She ran the mile in 1:39.19.

The filly's win boosted Frost Giant's progeny earnings to \$752,543, breaking Precise End's 2004 record of \$709,293 for a New York-based first crop sire. The 2008 Suburban Handi-

cap (gr. I) winner is first in earnings among New York freshman sires and sixth nationally.

The success of Frost Giant's first crop has kept Cohen busy this fall.

"It gets a little chaotic," he said. "But it's a good busy."

Frost Giant (Giant's Causeway—Takesmybreathaway, by Gone West) has 10 winners from 14 starters in his first crop, the latter a number Cohen expects to increase significantly in 2014.

"We've sent out more than 50 contracts already, and he's been getting a lot of interest," said Cohen.

Kelli Got Frosty's next race hasn't been determined, but Bishop said it will most likely be in New York.

Big A. Her only losses at the track came in the 2011 Gazelle Stakes (gr. I) and in a runner-up effort in the 2010 East View Stakes as a 2-year-old.

"She loves it here," said Christophe Lorieul, assistant trainer to Christophe Clement.

A homebred for Waterville Lake Stable, the Afleet Alex filly out of the multiple stakes-placed Miss Yiayia (by Gilded Time) was cutting back in distance from a mile to six furlongs, which was one factor in her connections' decision to run.

"There was an open company stakes going a mile next week," said Lorieul, "but we thought that by keeping her against New York-breds, we could probably get the job done."

foal," said Robinson, "but then she really blossomed. She was listed to be sold, but Waterville Lake liked her so much we didn't take her to the sale.

"As she grew up in the spring of her yearling year through the summer, she really just got lovely and looked like one that was worth keeping."

He noted her New York breeding was a "huge factor" in the decision. For the last two years Robinson has consigned the sale-topper at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred sale for Waterville Lake. They were a Tapit—Derriane, by Cozzene, colt he sold for \$330,000 in 2012, and in 2011, a Dixie Union colt out of Dash for Money (by General Meeting) brought \$250,000.

The 4-year-old Miss Valentine will take the winter off.

"We'll send her for a break in Florida," said Lorieul, "and she'll be back next year."

Out in the Open

New York-breds had a successful run in open-company stakes in December. At Laurel Park, Kaleem Shah's Brigand went wire-to-wire to capture the \$104,000 City of Laurel Stakes. The 3-year-old son of Flutter—Silence Please, by Quiet American, was bred by Berkshire Stud and was a \$925,000 juvenile sale graduate.

Locals bookended the stakes action at the Big A Dec. 15. First up was Francis Paolangeli's homebred Wildcat's Smile in the \$78,400 Sarcastic Stakes. The 3-year-old filly by Forest Wildcat—Serenity's Smile, by Dixie Brass, topped Morrow Cove by 2½ lengths. In the following race, Drawing Away Stable and trainer David Jacobson's Saginaw topped Royal Currier in the six-furlong \$71,250 Gravesend Handicap. Bred by Ted Taylor, Saginaw is a 6-year-old gelding by Peruvian out of the Devil's Bag mare Devilzene.

The win was the 10th on the year for Saginaw, putting him in a three-way tie for the most wins by a Thoroughbred in 2012. He's knotted up with fellow New York-bred Clean Jean and Winning Dubai. 🐾

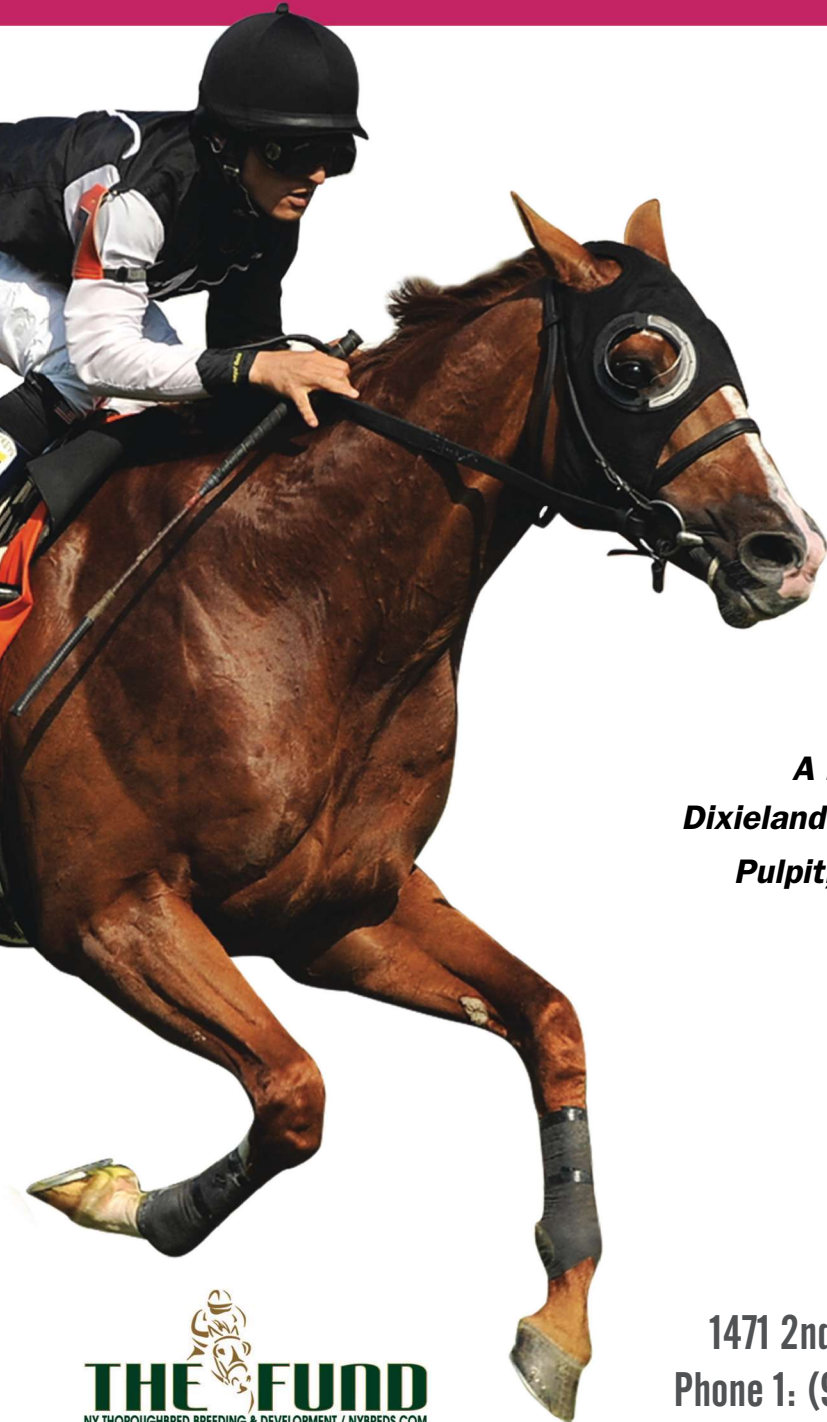

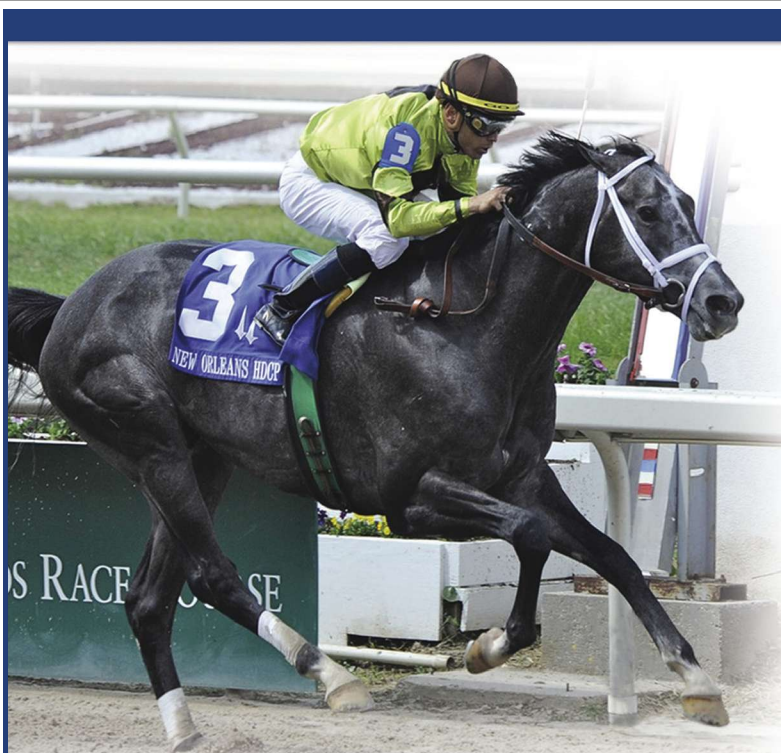

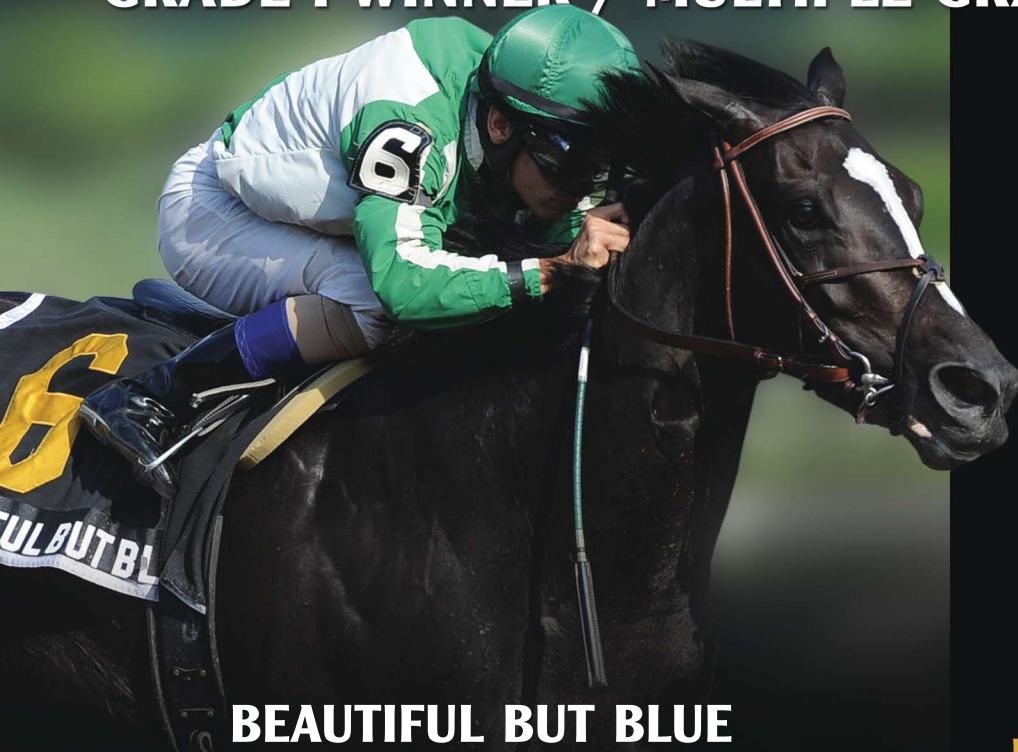
