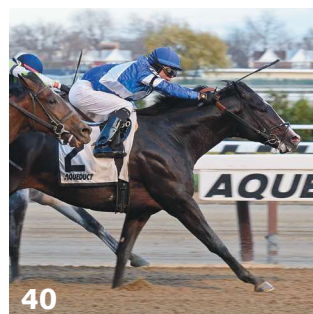

Breeding or Racing in New York? Put a 2016 NYTBA Membership on Your To-Do List

EVERY YEAR, as New York Thoroughbred Breeders embarks on its annual membership renewal drive, I feel enormous gratitude to our loyal members who support this organization year-in and year-out. Our members know, as New York-breds continue to earn unprecedented awards from the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, the resources of NYTBA are 100% allocated to the critical work of protecting the interests of the state's breeding and racing industries on which their businesses depend.

At this time of year, however, I think of others who have a stake in New York breeding or racing but are not yet members of NYTBA. This might be someone who is based out of state but has an in-foal broodmare at a New York farm. Or an owner who has purchased one or more New York-breds at a sale over the course of the last year because breeding and racing are thriving here. Or an individual who has an interest in a stallion that is standing in New York.

Everyone who has made an investment in the New York breeding and racing program should, by definition, be interested in protecting their investment. The organization responsible for doing just that is NYTBA.

Year-round, NYTBA pursues its critical mission of interacting with elected officials in Albany, advocating breeders' interests, working in collaboration with partner organizations such as the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, NYRA, NYTHA, Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack, the FLHBPA; and promoting New York-breds nationally. Non-members may not be aware that we also face many challenges in 2016 and beyond.

In addition to seeing some essential annual bills through the legislative process in Albany's next session, NYTBA is actively engaged in several critical initiatives.

We are committed to making sure Finger Lakes purses are held harmless by statute if the nearby Lago Casino is licensed and built. Finger Lakes is the cornerstone of our program's success: New York-breds earn 74% of all Finger Lakes purses and Finger Lakes generates the

largest number of breeders' awards (49%). The program will change radically if Finger Lakes is not protected for the future.

We are also preparing to advance new legislation in the event Belmont Park becomes the home to the video lottery terminals of Nassau/Suffolk OTB. Current law does not require these VLTs to contribute to awards or purses. We need to make sure any new VLTs at racing venues make the same revenue commitment to the breeding and racing industries as Genting does.

Finally, we are monitoring the future of NYRA. Nearly everything is still up in the air about NYRA's long-term plans for the future of its three racing facilities and the racing calendar. NYRA and the New York-bred program rely on one another and one of NYTBA's jobs is to ensure our program has a voice as these matters progress.

Joining NYTBA is not only good for the interests of your business, but makes sense also on a basic level: member discounts and benefits more than pay for the cost of annual dues.

NYTBA members receive subscriptions to the monthly *New York Breeder* magazine and the *New York Stallion Register*, free use of Werk Thoroughbred Consultants' MareMatch for all U.S. sires, a 20% discount to those enrolling stallions in Werk Thoroughbred Consultants' eNicks, and a variety of other discounts on products and services including group purchasing through NTRA. Finally, as a courtesy, the NYTBA membership pin guarantees free clubhouse entrance to any NYRA track and Finger Lakes as well as free admission to the National Museum of Racing in Saratoga Springs. Membership Categories & By-Laws

A. To be eligible for membership in the NYTB, a person shall be currently engaged in the thoroughbred industry as a breeder or stallion owner in the State of New York, lessees and lessors of mares and stallions domiciled in New York, or own property in the State of New York which is utilized for breeding thoroughbreds specifically for the pari-mutuel racing industry and/or others who have demonstrated an interest in furthering the purposes of the NYTB.

The following categories of membership shall have voting privileges and may run for the board of directors: Corporate Member (4 members, 1 vote), Joint Member (2 members, 2 votes) or Individual Member (1 member, 1 vote)

The following category of membership shall have all of the same privileges and benefits of membership however shall not have the right to vote or run for the board of directors: Associate Member (1 member, no voting rights)

B. Members in good standing shall include only those members who have fully paid their NYTB dues. Only members in good standing on November 1 shall be eligible to vote in NYTB elections. Only members in good standing shall be eligible to vote on amendments to these by-laws.

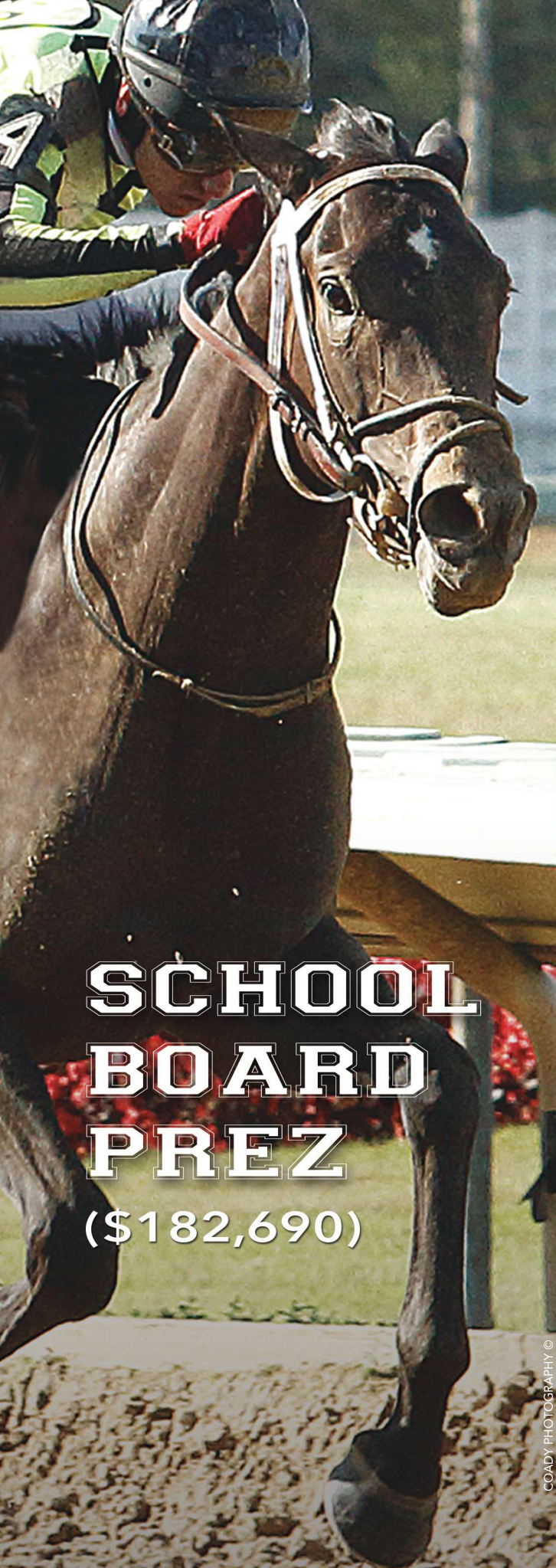

ROYAL POSSE SCORES IN CLAIMING CROWN

Royal Posse, a May-claim-turned-summer-stakes-winner, did his connections proud once again Dec. 5 when he captured the \$200,000 Jewel Stakes, the highlight of the \$1.1 million Claiming Crown at Gulfstream Park.

A 4-year-old gelding by New York sire Posse, Royal Posse was claimed May 31 for \$20,000 by trainer Rudy Rodriguez for Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith at Belmont Park. He began to exceed expectations immediately.

Following the claim Royal Posse finished second and first in a pair of state-bred second-level allowance optional claiming races, then became a Saratoga stakes winner in the Evan Shipman. The gelding followed up with a close second to Empire Dreams on Showcase Day in the Empire Classic.

Sent off the 9-5 favorite after drawing post 11 of 14, Royal

Posse won the nine-furlong Jewel by 2½ lengths in 1:50.77 over a sloppy and sealed track.

With his victory, Royal Posse improved his career record to six firsts and six seconds from 26 starts and boosted his earnings to \$442,245. Royal Posse will now get as much as eight weeks off before Rodriguez decides what lies down the road.

Bred by Richard J. Troncone and Richard J. Troncone Jr. and foaled at Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater, Royal Posse is out of Struckbylightning, an unraced Kentucky-bred daughter of Cryptoclearance. She has produced four winners from five foals to start, including stakes-placed Am-part Ridge, by Cactus Ridge, who earned \$176,000, and Fried by Freud, a nine-time winner of more than \$125,000. The mare’s most recent reported foal is a yearling filly by Desert Party.

Gov. Cuomo Announces \$25 Million Southern Tier Agricultural Industry Enhancement

Gov. Andrew M. Cuomo announced Dec. 15, 2015, the release of program criteria for the \$25 million Southern Tier Agricultural Industry Enhancement Program. The program will provide crucial funding for projects designed to help farms and agribusinesses expand and grow their operations, as well as increase environmental enhancements in Allegany, Broome, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Chemung, Chenango, Delaware, Schuyler, Steuben, Tompkins, and Tioga counties. Applications will be available beginning Jan. 19.

“New York’s agriculture industry is an economic engine in upstate communities—driving growth and expanding opportunity,” Cuomo said. “I’m proud to announce \$25 million in state funding which will provide vital support to all farmers and agribusinesses in the Southern Tier and keep New York’s agricultural economy growing.”

Projects that are awarded state funding may receive up to \$100,000 to help with expenses associated with construction, renovation, irrigation, drainage, environmental enhancements, fencing, trellis systems, and greenhouses. Eligible applicants that demonstrate an exemplary commitment to protecting or enhancing natural resources may also be entitled to an additional \$10,000 toward their project.

The Department of Agriculture and Markets will work in coordination with the County Soil and Water Conservation Districts to administer the program. The SWCDs will pre-qualify projects and oversee the implementation of awards. Awards will be made on a semi-annual basis for a period of two years or until funding is depleted. Applications will be available and filed locally through each respective county SWCD.

Applicants must meet the department’s definition of a farm operation and meet additional criteria, including participation in the New York State Agricultural Environmental Management program within the past three years or a commitment to participate in the program prior to being awarded.

The eligibility requirements are now available online at www.agriculture.ny.gov.

New York-Breds Knock Down 15 Graded Stakes in 2015

New York-breds earned more than their fair share of top races in 2015 as nine state-breds won 15 graded stakes in 2015. The wins came in four states—and one Canadian province—outside the Empire State and were spaced throughout the year with only August and December missing from the calendar.

Triple Crown trail hopefuls Upstart and International Star struck early with

the latter winning three graded stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots: the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III), Risen Star Stakes (gr. II), and Louisiana Derby (gr. II).

La Verdad and Effinex won three graded stakes apiece and both ran second in races during the Breeders’ Cup World Championships. Effinex and Princess Violet won at racing’s highest level in grade I competition.

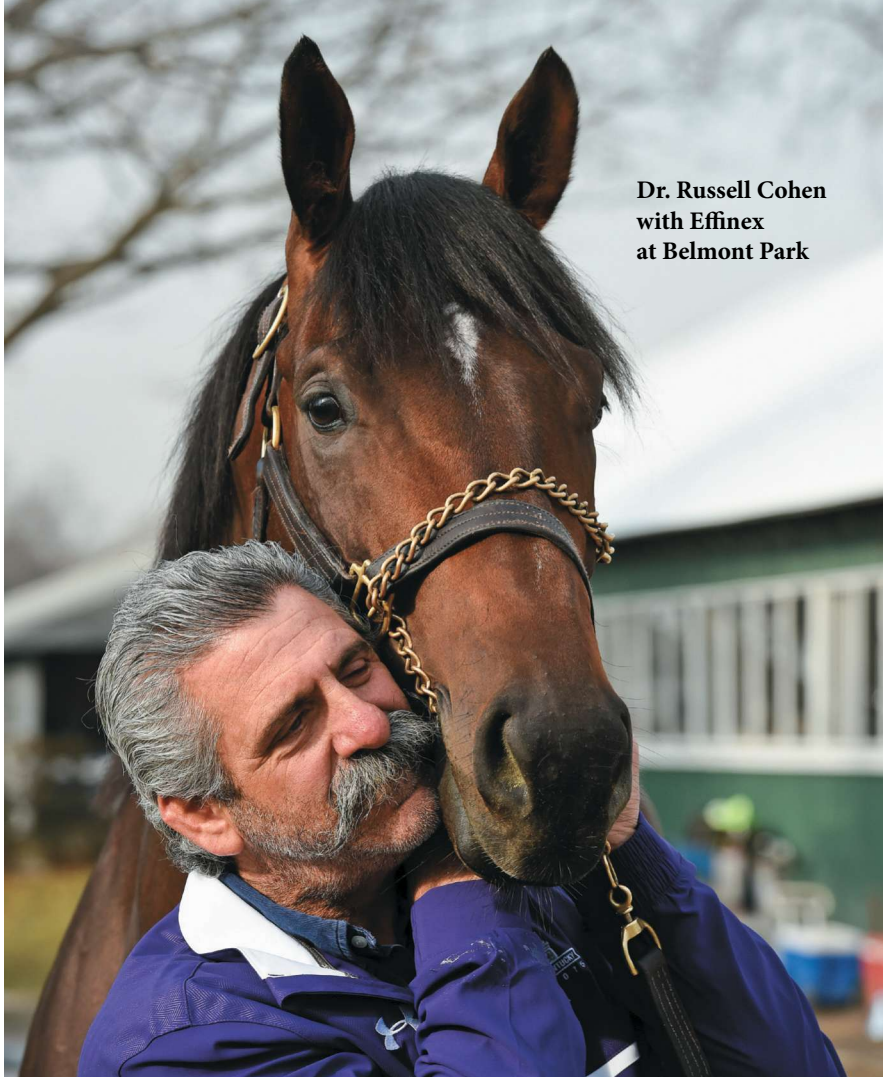

X-cellent Adventure

FOR DR. RUSSELL COHEN the memory of witnessing the death of his broodmare What a Pear still evokes feelings of sorrow.

Cohen, a veterinarian on the New York Racing Association circuit for nearly three decades and a breeder for just about as long, was by What a Pear's side April 15, 2011, at Hidden Lake Farm near Otisville, N.Y., when she died delivering what would be her only foal.

"It took me more than a year before I could even speak about it, because What a Pear meant so much to me," the 55-year-old Cohen said recently. "It was painful. I named her after a young lady I dated, who meant an awful lot to me. Either the foal put his foot through her uterus or the uterine artery. It was just horrible."

But something worth remembering did emerge that day, and it was a New York-bred son of Mineshaft who would be named Effinex. When Effinex won the Clark Handicap (gr. I) at Churchill Downs last November, he became Cohen's first homebred to win a grade I. The horse is owned by Cohen's 85-year-old mother, Bernice, and carries the silks of her Tri-Bone Stables. The *nom de course* is a reference to Bernice's three sons, who good-naturally call each other boneheads.

Effinex is currently being freshened for a 5-year-old campaign for the Cohen family and trainer Jimmy Jerkens. In 2015 the horse emerged as one of the brightest stars of the older horse division. In addition to the Clark, Effinex won Aqueduct's Excel-

sior Stakes (gr. III) and Belmont Park's Suburban Handicap (gr. II). He also ran tremendously well at Keeneland to finish second to American Pharoah in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) at odds of 33-1. He ended the season with earnings of more than \$1.7 million from a record of 4-1-1 in eight starts.

Effinex reached the races early in his 3-year-old season. After making two starts for trainer Richard DeMola, Effinex switched barns to David Smith. In his debut for Smith, he annihilated a state-bred field in a first-level allowance optional claiming race over Aqueduct's inner track by $6\frac{1}{4}$ lengths. The effort prompted his breeder to shoot for the moon for Effinex's next race, the Twin-Spires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I). He was difficult to load into the starting gate—a trait he still exhibits on occasion—and wound up finishing eighth.

After three more races while under the care of Smith, which resulted in losses, and an aborted start in the New York Derby at Finger Lakes, Cohen gave the horse to Jerkens to train.

Effinex began to blossom under Jerkens' direction. The highlight of his 3-year-old campaign came in Belmont Park's Empire Classic Handicap against New York-breds. He kicked home strongly for a neck victory at odds of 17-

1, covering the final eighth of a mile in less than :13.

Jerkens, a son of the late Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens, in many respects is a mirror of his father, who liked to watch horses race, whether they were his or not. Effinex caught the eye of Jerkens when the colt was put up in a maiden special weight for New York-breds in his second career start, following the disqualification of the first-place finisher for interference.

“I loved the horse from when he first started running,” Jerkens said. “You could tell he was a good horse.”

But there was a caveat connected to Effinex coming into Jerkens' care.

“Everybody knows what a character Russell is,” Jerkens said with a smile. “Russell is a good guy; I've known him ever since he has come onto the race-track. But he has strong opinions on things. When I agreed to take the horse, I said, ‘Russell, it's fine to be opinionated, but I've got a lot more experience training horses for races than you do

and if you want to have the horse in my barn, and you want me to train the horse, and my name is down on the program, (Effinex) is going to train my way.’ Russell was agreeable to that.”

Jerkens' edict, however, didn't mean Cohen's voice was completely silenced. Jerkens admitted he was on the fence about running in the Suburban, Breeders' Cup, and Clark. Because of Cohen's urging, Jerkens ran Effinex in those races, which the trainer said are probably the three best performances of the horse's career to date.

The concerns about running in the Suburban and Breeders' Cup were a result of Effinex's propensity for drifting out on the turns in some of his races. In the Brooklyn Invitational Stakes (gr. II), his start prior to the Suburban, Effinex blew the final turn and jockey Angel Arroyo eased him in the stretch. For the Suburban, Effinex was outfitted with a Houghton bit, which gives the rider more control without being too intrusive on a horse's mouth, and there were

no drifting out issues. To a lesser extent than the Suburban, Effinex drifted out on the final turn of the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (gr. I), his race prior to the Breeders' Cup, before finishing third. For the Breeders' Cup, Jerkens extended the outside cup of the horse's blinkers.

Cohen said Effinex is not a bad actor, but likes to believe he is in charge, and that jockey Mike Smith, who was partnered with the horse for the first time in the Breeders' Cup and then again in the Clark, understood that.

"Effinex has a mind of his own; much like his breeder, he marches to the beat of a different drum," Cohen said. "If you work with that horse, and don't do anything he doesn't want to do, he will do anything for you. Mike Smith recognized that immediately.

"In the Brooklyn, the rider fought him, and he responded the way he did," Cohen added. "Effinex knows exactly what he is supposed to do—he knows his job. If you allow him to do what he wants to do, and don't fight him, Effinex will be your best buddy. Even the groom will take him out of his stall and not even put a shank on him and Effinex will march around the shedrow with him. It's hysterical to watch."

Jerkens said after the Breeders' Cup he would have been fine with stopping

on the horse for season, but Cohen yearned for a grade I victory.

"I just didn't want anything to dampen him being second in the Breeders' Cup. I thought it would be great to end the year on a note like that," Jerkens said. "Russell said, 'It's our last chance this year for a grade I.' He said, 'It's this or the Hawthorne (Gold Cup, gr. II). He's running in one or the other.' I said, 'If that is the case, we're going to Churchill.'"

Cohen said the Clark victory was a great advertisement for Effinex's future stallion career, which likely will commence in 2017.

"He's going to get the chance to be a stallion and that is really what the Clark (win) has done, and his other races; they have put him on the national stage," Cohen said. "Here's a little New York-bred with humble beginnings and circumstances...it shows that a little guy can get to this level."

At one time, Cohen, a graduate of Tufts school of veterinary medicine in Boston, was that "little guy."

While working for renowned veterinarian Dr. William Reed, the breeder of Gone West, Cohen, who holds a master's degree in population genetics from Texas A&M University, became interested in the concept of breeding horses.

"I was still a greenhorn...In fact, some people may still think I'm a greenhorn," Cohen said. "I asked Dr. Reed (about becoming a breeder) and he said, 'Russell, you can't do this.' That was a big mistake. Don't tell me I can't do anything.

"I think it was a week or two after that that I purchased a horse, Oh How We Danced, who had run in New York for a long time and had fractured her

ankle and was done racing,” he continued. “She had an awful lot of pedigree. She was my first broodmare. Her third foal was Double Dee’s, a champion (New York-bred 3-year-old filly of 1996) and a graded winner.”

Cohen, who said he has bred 33 horses since purchasing Oh How We Danced, currently owns no broodmares, and Effinex is Tri-Bone Stables’ only runner.

“I’m tired of the shenanigans in the business,” Cohen said in answer as to why he’s not presently breeding horses. “I’m tired of the medication issues. I’m tired of running horses against horses

believes the anti-bleeding medication Lasix (or Salix) is hugely overused, and that less than 10% of the population of racehorses actually require it. Effinex, who is not a bleeder, did not race on Lasix until his sixth career start. Cohen, who believes Lasix is a performance enhancer, said he made the move with extreme reluctance.

to do their best, but the proponents of Lasix never talk about the side effects of it,” the trainer remarked. “It was unheard of horses getting the thumps (an electrolyte imbalance that causes spasms of the diaphragm) before Lasix came around. When a horse runs a head-scratching bad race, you’re like, ‘What happened?’ And then they come back and have the thumps—it’s because they had Lasix.”

Cohen’s bitter divorce is what led to Effinex receiving his name. A comic by both nature and trade—he performs stand-up routines at Gotham Comedy Club in New York City—Cohen loves to attach risqué names to his horses.

“For good or bad, if you’re significant in my life, there is a chance I will name a horse after you,” Cohen said with a wide grin that raised his trademark handlebar mustache up several inches. “The horse has allowed me to have a blast, so this is all gravy. The first time I saw his name in the program as a maiden, I laughed so hard, I cried. He owed me nothing after that point. The rest has just been a whirlwind blur. I am just so

honored he is that talented, and thrilled that he has won some of these famous races. The names of owners and horses in the history of this business are amazing, he is now on that list, and I’m on it, too, by extension of him.”

When asked what life would be like for Cohen after Effinex’s retirement, he answered as you would expect a comedian would.

“All know is there will be light, there will be darkness, and I will be single.” 🐾

who turn up positive (for illegal medication). And it’s really expensive, and I went through a really rough time (with a divorce). I don’t know what I am going to do in the future. It will be very difficult to walk away, because it’s a whole lot of fun and I’ve been very fortunate.”

Cohen employs a purist approach with Tri-Bone runners and the horses under his care in his veterinary practice: No medication unless a diagnosis dictates otherwise. In particular, he

Jerkens said he thinks Effinex would run just as well without it. Generally speaking, the trainer has no objections to the use of Lasix, although he commented those in favor of it rarely mention a very important component of its use.

“Obviously, some horses need (Lasix)

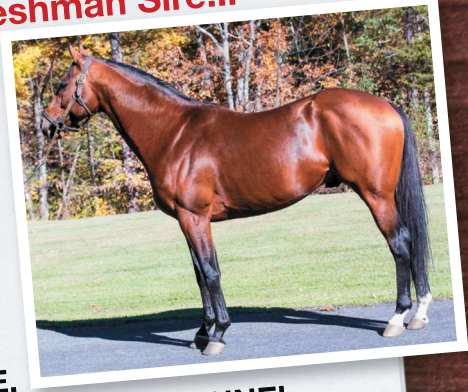

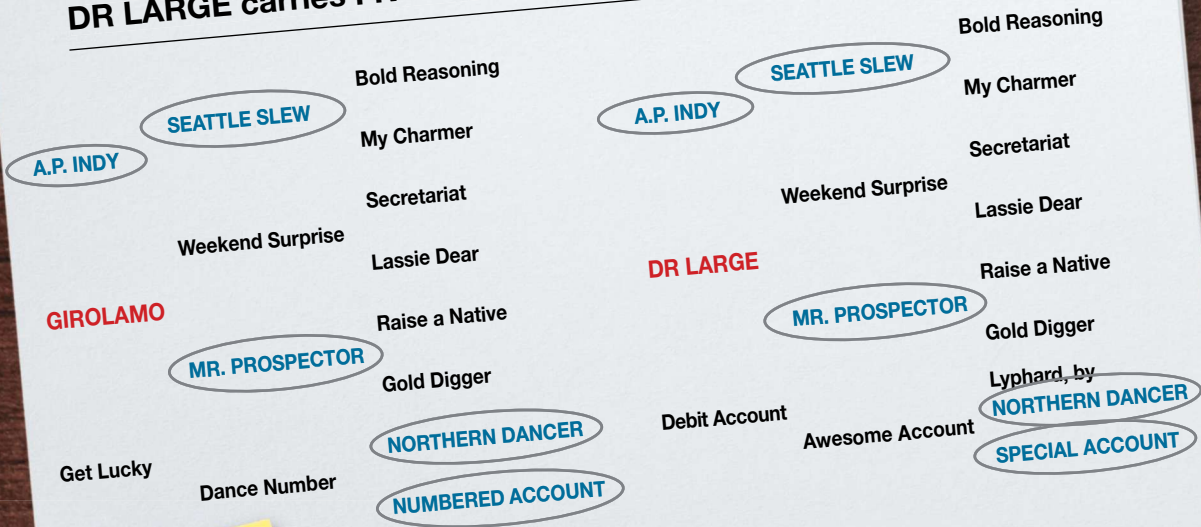

AT 47, OWNER/BREEDER MARK VONDRASEK has some early memories of being at the original Arlington Park in Chicago with his grandfather. Later on, both his father and brother owned Thoroughbreds. from the gate. She won a pair of races at 2 before injuring herself (cracked sesamoid) while on the front end in her 3-year-old debut, the six-furlong Ruthless Stakes at Aqueduct Jan. 6, 2008.

“It was bad. The vets thought they might have to put her down on the track,” said Vondrasek, a resident of Stamford, Conn. “They even took the screen out (to block the public’s view). We were given a 50-50 chance she’d survive, but we were blessed when she recovered. From there it was either send her to a farm or breed her. So we took a shot (breeding her) with Cuvee.”

The resulting foal was a colt named N. F.’s Destiny (referring to Noble Fire’s destiny to be a broodmare). After being weaned, the colt got nervous and had a serious accident with a barn door. Vondrasek was told the injured colt would probably never race. The neurological damage from the accident caused N. F.’s Destiny to keep his head cocked to the right. After spending extended time on the farm, however, his caretakers believed the colt was showing signs he belonged on the racetrack.

The fleet N. F.’s Destiny, a six-furlong specialist, was eventually gelded and went on to win eight of 23 starts (with nine seconds and a third) with earnings of \$335,670. He won the Kelly Kip Stakes at Aqueduct this year at age 6.

“(N. F.’s Destiny) was a straight-out sprinter. I wanted to get a little more length into Noble Fire’s next foal, so I went to Yes It’s True,” said Vondrasek.

That mating brought about a rather big filly, one whose size and speed begat plenty of outside interest.

One morning at Belmont Park, Vondrasek, who was still searching for a name for his equine Amazon, was describing the filly to jockey Ramon Dominguez who had just breezed N. F.’s Destiny. Vondrasek was trying to avoid choosing a cliché name with the word “true” in it. That’s when the superstar rider suggested La Verdad, “the truth” in Spanish. As soon as Vondrasek heard

it, he understood that he had something special.

“It’s a powerful name. And Jose Ortiz (her regular pilot) really connects to it because of his heritage,” said Vondrasek.

Other racetrackers were sensing something special in La Verdad, as well.

Though the sensationally fast filly finished fourth in her debut, La Verdad won her next three starts. Those victories brought a strong offer to purchase from an owner in the Todd Pletcher barn.

“Obviously, I needed to have her vetted,” said Vondrasek. “On the ultrasound it appeared that La Verdad had some leg issues. I asked Linda for her opinion and she said the X-rays were not good at all and that we should sell the horse. Linda also said that she had a buyer (of her own).”

That buyer turned out to be Sheila Rosenblum of Lady Sheila Stable. A deal was consummated, and the filly remained in Rice’s barn.

Over the next 2½ years La Verdad flourished under Rice’s tutelage, winning 12 more races and earning \$1,503,200 on the racetrack.

As a 4-year-old, La Verdad captured the Distaff Handicap (gr. II), her first graded stakes victory. The next year she defended her title in the Distaff, as well as adding the grade II Gallant Bloom Handicap and grade III Vagrancy Handicap to her résumé. Both of those events were contested at 6½-furlongs, stretching out her sprinter’s speed.

La Verdad also collected six consecutive stakes restricted to New York-breds,

dominating fields with an intense early foot that few runners could match.

The 5-year-old La Verdad punctuated her brilliant career on Oct. 31 with a hard-fought second-place finish in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I) at seven furlongs. The hardy speed merchant competed at Keeneland only seven days after annexing the Iroquois Stakes against state-breds at

collecting breeder incentives from the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. "I only wish she hadn't run a week before the Breeders' Cup. The decision to run in the Iroquois was a contentious one. I do think we should have rested her and gone into the Breeders' Cup Sprint on all cylinders. I wish we would have gotten that grade I. Wavell Avenue (finished second) to La

"I wanted to improve the quality of the sire, so I looked at some bigger names. I went to City Zip (a former Rice trainee) because he improves most of the mares that he covers."

The result was a filly born in March 2012 who was named Hot City Girl. She was also purchased privately by Rosenblum, who tabbed Rice to do the training.

Earlier this year the sophomore runner captured a pair of stakes, including the \$350,000 Charles Town Oaks (gr. III) in West Virginia and the Safely Kept Stakes at Laurel Park. In the Charles Town Oaks, Hot City Girl scored in gate-to-wire fashion beneath Ortiz. She cruised along on a pressured pace, before drawing clear through the lane for an impressive tally at seven furlongs.

Having visited the winners' circle in five of her 11 starts, Hot City Girl has earned \$455,150.

After having an aborted foal in 2013 (while in foal to Freud), Vondrasek again chose Freud for Noble Fire, who delivered a filly in May 2014. Currently, the mare is not in-foal.

As a breeder, Vondrasek is a model of what passion, desire, and diligence can achieve in this sport, especially beginning on a limited budget. Twice now Vondrasek has experienced the heartbreak of seeing his horses seriously injured. Not once, however, did he give up on their futures. He has also allowed a dominating New York-bred sprinter to slip through his grasp. Unfazed by that turn of events, he is one of La Verdad's most ardent supporters.

"For me, it goes beyond owning a Thoroughbred. It's not even about the economics," said Vondrasek. "It's amazing how somebody from the outside can affect racing (through breeding). I take a lot of pride in that. I would tell people who want to start out—I believe you need between \$80,000 and \$125,000 to get a good enough horse to limit your downside, even if you need to involve partners. I hope my (success with Noble Fire) can provide people with the same courage to enter the game." 🐾

Belmont Park. She turned for home in the Breeders' Cup leading her 13 rivals before eventually succumbing to Wavell Avenue inside the final sixteenth. Despite the fast fractions and turning away several challenges for the lead, she refused to relinquish the runner-up spot in deep stretch.

La Verdad (15-3-0 in 24 starts) is scheduled to retire to the breeding shed in early 2016.

"I have some regrets (about selling). In hindsight, I should have realized that if someone like Todd Pletcher was interested, there was probably a lot of talent there," said Vondrasek, who remains close to Rice and Rosenblum, cheering on La Verdad at every turn and

Verdad (in the Sept. 26 Gallant Bloom) and then rested for the Breeders' Cup and turned the tables on us. I think it's a good example of timing."

The breeder also wonders how La Verdad's career might have been different had he decided to sell to Pletcher's client.

"Linda is a terrific trainer. But Todd is a grade-I specialist and moves horses up in ways that many other trainers just can't," said Vondrasek.

When it came time to select another mating for Noble Fire, Vondrasek aimed his sights and budget somewhat higher.

"I gained a lot of confidence (in Noble Fire as a broodmare) from N. F.'s Destiny and La Verdad," said Vondrasek.

The Luck of Loki

David Greenhouse, Chris Boehning team up on three-time stakes winner Loki's Vengeance

FOR DAVID GREENHOUSE, Loki's Vengeance is something of a dream come true. Greenhouse purchased the dark bay or brown colt with partner Chris Boehning as a yearling in 2012, and on Nov. 29 at Aqueduct Racetrack, Loki's Vengeance made his sixth trip to the winner's circle when he took the \$125,000 New York Stallion Series Thunder Rumble Division, beating a field of state-breds for his third stakes victory.

Growing up in Latham, N.Y., not far from Saratoga Springs, Greenhouse would go to the harness track to watch his father's trotters run.

"I fell in love with horse racing," said Greenhouse recently from Colorado, where he now makes his home. "It's always been a passion and a dream to own horses myself."

Boehning remembers going to Saratoga as a child with his grandfather:

"That was my first taste," he said. "Then as soon as David and I became friends, we'd go to Saratoga Harness on Friday nights."

Greenhouse and Boehning race as Blue Bison Stable, named for the mascot at Shaker High School, their upstate New York alma mater, and though their stable is small—less than a dozen horses—it's also wildly successful, their horses having finished in the top three nearly 50% of the time since they began racing in 2009, earning just under \$625,000.

Nearly two-thirds of those earnings (\$393,409) have come from Loki's Vengeance, who in his three-year career has six wins from 17 starts, along with four seconds and two thirds.

Purchased for \$35,000 at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds, Loki's Vengeance is the first foal out of the During mare Subtle Sweetness. By Frost Giant and bred by Andrew Cohen, he made a lasting impression on Boehning and Greenhouse when they saw him before the sale.

Lere Visagie, now the owner and manager of Rockridge Stud near Hudson, N.Y., prepped the yearlings of the now-defunct Vinery New York, and the partners often served as test cases for the horses headed to the sales.

"That's where we first saw Loki," said Boehning. "Lere would pull them out to see how they'd do, and I still remember seeing Loki. We were impressed then, and he really stuck in our mind."

"He stood out," said Greenhouse. "He was very muscular-looking out of an unproven mare, so we took a flyer on him because of his athletic looks."

Making the Thunder Rumble his eighth start this year, Loki's Vengeance under Jose Ortiz made the lead with relative ease heading into the stretch of the seven-furlong race, but a stubborn Geaux Mets refused to yield, challenging him to the wire before Loki's Vengeance prevailed by a half-length.

"He's a fun, honest horse," said Greenhouse.

Loki's Vengeance is trained by Mike Hushion, who was diagnosed with leukemia earlier this year while with a string of horses in Florida. Though now recovered, he was away from the horses for an extended period, first in the hospital and then through treatment, but Loki's Vengeance never left Hushion's barn, running four times with a record of 1-1-2 through early summer.

"Loki was doing well, and full credit to Mike's assistant Lorena (Andersen)," said Greenhouse. "She never missed a beat. She impressed me just like Mike did, always with a plan for the horse, always aiming for something, always doing right by the horse. She did a phenomenal job."

A winner with their first horse, Shine Upon, by Congaree (co-owned with Stewart Hoffman)—who won her first three starts, including the Dreamy Mimi Stakes at Aqueduct—Blue Bison also became a winner when its first homebred, New York-bred Tiz Time to Shine (also co-owned/-bred by Hoffman), by Tiznow out of Shine Upon (by Congaree), won the 2014 Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes.

"Touch wood," said Boehning. "We've been on a pretty good roll."

He and Greenhouse don't limit themselves to New York-breds, but with roots here and Boehning living in New York City and Greenhouse in Colorado, they do focus on them. In 2014 they purchased a \$225,000 Tale of the Cat colt, named Storm Prophet, out of Andraste (by Pulpit), who broke his maiden at Belmont in October in his second start.

"All of our good ones are New York-breds," said Greenhouse. "And that's the truth." 🐾

Say 'Hey'

Saythreehailmary's, Frosty Margarita earn state-bred stakes scores

SAYTHREEHAILMARY'S MAY NOT HAVE needed divine intervention to win the \$100,000 Bay Ridge Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack Dec. 12, but her cheering section wasn't taking any chances.

"As soon as she took off, I said my three Hail Marys," said Filomena Guttilla, a devoted churchgoer and close friend of owner Joseph Gioia.

The win was the first stakes victory for the cleverly named 5-year-old homebred mare by Repent out of Just Call Me Angel, by Devil's Bag.

"It was a no-brainer," said Gioia of the name.

Saythreehailmary's sat a couple of lengths off the pace in the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Bay Ridge under jockey José Ortiz, who began working on her coming into the final turn. As pacesetter Carameway faded, they took aim at Sheriffa, who had beaten Saythreehailmary's by a length in the Nov. 15 Stallion Series Stakes, denying Gioia's filly the stakes win. This time, under steady urging, she gained steadily to hit the wire in front by 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths.

"This stakes win was very important," said Gioia, whose penchant for clever names extends to his *nom de course*, Very Un Stable. "We bred her, and we plan on breeding her at some point. We thought she'd get it a little earlier this year because she's been training great all year."

In addition to her second-place finish in the Stallion Series Stakes at Aqueduct, Saythreehailmary's was the runner-up—also to Sheriffa—in the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes for state-breds at Belmont Park in May and in a Stallion Series stakes race at Aqueduct last year.

Gioia purchased her dam for \$16,000 at the 2005 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s January mixed sale; in addition to Saythreehailmary's, whose Bay Ridge win pushed her earnings to more than \$375,000, Just Call Me Angel has thrown four other winners, including Afleet Alexandra (by Northern Afleet),

who won the 2008 New York Oaks at Finger Lakes and earned more than \$250,000.

"She's been a good producer," said Gioia, who also owned Quantum Merit, the 2004 New York-bred turf champion.

When Saythreehailmary's retires, she will join Gioia's small broodmare band at Sue and Gary Lundy's Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, but that won't happen any time soon according to the owner as the filly will remain in training with John Morrison next year.

"She loves to run and she loves to race," said Gioia, standing in the Aqueduct winner's circle. "You'll see us back here again, I hope."

Plenty Frosty

Coming off two wins at Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course by double-digit lengths, Behrnik's Bank was odds-on Dec. 20 at Aqueduct for the \$147,000 New York Stallion Series Fifth Avenue Division, but Frosty Margarita, the only other stakes winner in the field, pulled off the upset.

The two fillies made it virtually a match race, leaving their three foes behind as Behrnik's Bank maintained a slight advantage. But Frosty Margarita never let the pacesetter get more than a length in front of her and the 2-year-olds matched strides until Frosty Margarita edged ahead at the wire to win by a neck.

A Gabrielle Farm homebred out of the homebred mare Mango Margarita, by Not For Love, Frosty Margarita recalled other speedy 2-year-olds produced by her sire Frost Giant, such as Kelli Got Frosty, who like Frosty Margarita was trained by Rudy Rodriguez.

"Today was a good class test for her," said owner Chip Acierno. "She showed what she can do."

The filly fulfills the promise Acierno saw in her dam, who never made it to the races.

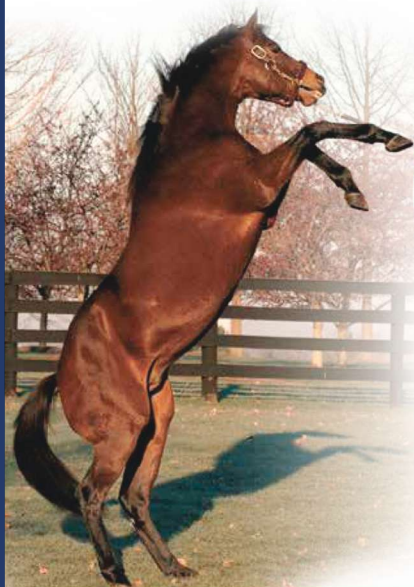
"She was really well-bred and she was absolutely gorgeous," he said. "I think she would have been a stakes winner, but then she got a knee. We hoped to get something good from her."

They thought they had "something good" with her first foal, a 2012 colt by Stephen Got Even, but he has proved disappointing. Now they've got a filly with three wins and three seconds in six starts, including two stakes wins, and earnings of \$285,800.

"It's so rewarding," said Acierno, "to get a good runner out of her." 🐾

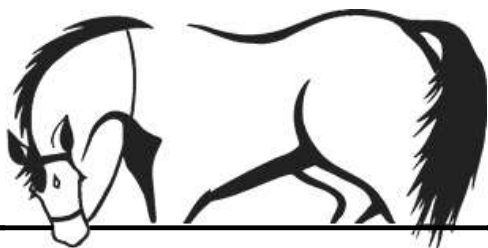
