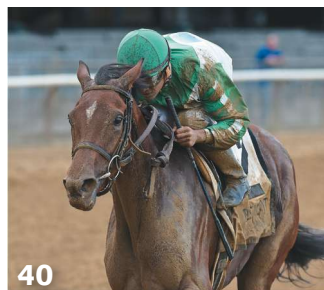

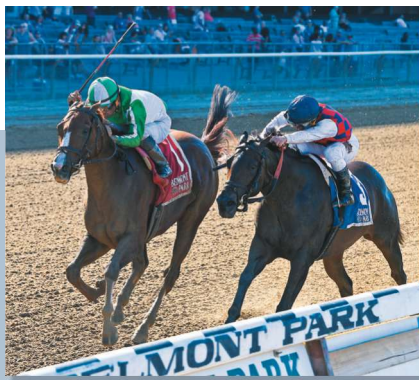

Award Distribution in New York: A Successful and Diverse Blend

I HAVE OFTEN BEEN STRUCK by the way the incentive awards from New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund (“the Fund”) are distributed in a diverse blend that contributes to the success of our program. I was reminded of this again recently, while reviewing the 2016 awards data in advance of our upcoming annual members’ meeting on Oct. 15.

Year-in and year-out, the profile of the Fund’s distribution of awards to breeders, stallion owners, and “open-company” owners is simple, but elegant.

The greatest *number* of incentive awards across-the-board are earned at Finger Lakes. By affecting the greatest number of individuals, the Finger Lakes awards give our program scope and breadth.

The greatest *amount of money*, however, is distributed to the connections of horses on the New York Racing Association circuit, which gives our program depth. To elaborate, the awards earned on the NYRA circuit are costlier, but add significantly more bloodstock value. NYRA awards (1) successfully incentivize breeders to keep raising the bar when it comes to breeding competitive and high-quality horses and (2) do a better job of enhancing the value of the “New York-bred brand.” Both factors strengthen the program as a whole.

To tell the story by the numbers, in 2016 Finger Lakes was responsible for 52% of individual breeder’s awards (2,097 of the 5,640 total). The Fund gets the biggest “bang for its buck” in Farmington because the monetary value of the Finger Lakes awards in 2016 amounted to only 22% of the total (\$2,387,607 of \$10,768,574). Aqueduct and Belmont impose a heavier financial burden on the Fund due to their large purses. Specifically, Belmont and Aqueduct together account for 64% of the money distributed by the Fund (or \$6,882,782 of \$10,768,574), but account for only 41% or 2,343 individual awards. Make no mistake, the elevated prestige and overall value

earned by New York-breds at the NYRA tracks is what translates into sales and program success which benefits every single stakeholder in the program in every county of New York State.

Saratoga is something of an outlier, as far as the data goes, due to the relatively limited number of race dates and huge purses, but at the same time the case of Saratoga highlights the point I am trying to make.

Strictly from the point of view of dollars and cents, Saratoga produces the least amount of breeder’s awards. Which again is logical based on the number of races being run. Saratoga is responsible for only 7% of the total number of breeder’s awards distributed (390), however, the Spa claims 14% of money distributed by the Fund in breeder’s awards. Essentially, 100% more money, or quality, then quantity. We all know that 30% of a \$85,000 purse is far more than 30% of a \$4,500 purse. Additionally, consider the following.

On Aug. 12, just hours before the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale began, Pure Silver—a New York-sired, New York-bred juvenile filly—romped in the grade 2 Adirondack Stakes. I can personally attest that for both days of the sale, there was buzz about this victory from the auctioneer’s podium, in the back yard, in the sale grounds dining area, and among the horsemen and prospective owners in the barns.

The awards that went to the connections of Pure Silver were substantial to be sure (Breeder’s Award: \$36,000; Stallion Owner’s Award: \$10,000; Owner’s Award: \$20,000), but the added value of this grade 2 win to New York-bred prestige and its effect on the sale is incalculable. I will just remind you that the already-successful New York-bred yearling action shattered records across-the-board this year.

Stallion owner’s awards and open company owner’s awards virtually replicate the profile of breeder’s awards: breadth and scope generated by the Finger Lakes awards, depth at NYRA, with Saratoga affording as the extreme example of high cost, but significant added value due to quality.

I will add one more point. Our incentive program, which is without peer in North America, will not work without all its components in place. Each one of four Thoroughbred tracks in New York plays an essential role in the success of our breeding and racing program. If one fails, we all do, and we all need to do our best to make sure nobody fails.

This brings me back to the urgency of finding and implementing long-term solutions for the problems of declining handle and field size at Finger Lakes. I remind my friends at Finger Lakes and beyond that solving the problem will probably take something dramatic like the introduction of a turf program and adjustments in the calendar. Still, something needs to be done and needs to be done soon. Fear of change or competition cannot and should not lead to inaction. Simply put, a slow demise at Finger Lakes translates into long-term and permanent negative implications for our entire program. 🍷

Highway Star Soars Higher in Gallant Bloom

Highway Star earns her third graded stakes of '17 in the Gallant Bloom

Highway Star's gutsy neck score over grade 1 winner Carina Mia in the Sept. 24 Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) was the 15th graded stakes win this year for a New York-bred. The win was preceded by Barry K. Schwartz' Stonewall Farm's Voodoo Song's victory Sept. 2 at Saratoga in the \$300,000 Saranac Stakes (G3T). The 3-year-old is a son of English Channel out of the stakes-winning Mystic Chant, by Unbridled's Song. Mystic Chant, a \$200,000 sale yearling, won Aqueduct's Open Mind Stakes in 2005 for Schwartz.

Highway Star, a homebred for Chester and Mary Broman, is responsible for two other graded wins this year in the grade 3 Distaff Handicap and grade 2 Ruffian Stakes. She was beaten a head in Saratoga's Ketel One Ballerina Stakes (G1).

Her Gallant Bloom win, earning \$180,000 as the 121-pound high-weight, puts her just short of millionaire status.

The victory seems to put Highway Star on the fast track for the Nov. 4 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) at Del Mar. The Bromans' homebred Artemis Agrotera ran in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) and after winning the 2014 Gallant Bloom competed in the Filly & Mare Sprint in 2014 and 2015.

The Bromans' involvement with Highway Star's family began when they purchased the Unbridled mare Unbridled Star for \$115,000 at the 2002 Keeneland November mixed sale from the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent. Unbridled Star was carrying a Cat Thief filly who would become stakes-placed Stolen Star, Highway Star's dam.

Unbridled Star, herself stakes-placed on both dirt and turf, would also produce Friend Or Foe when covered by the Bromans' Florida Derby (G1) winner Friends Lake. Friend Or Foe scored in the 2010 Empire Classic Stakes and the Mike Lee Stakes, and the 2011 Easy Goer Stakes. Star Grazing, by Sky Mesa out of Unbridled Star, took the 2014 Fleet Indian Stakes at Saratoga.

"Stolen Star is a big, strapping chestnut mare," said Jeff Raine, who managed her at the Bromans' Chestertown Farm in New York. "She's a raw kind of mare that produces big, strapping foals, and Highway Star was a leggy chestnut."

In addition to Highway Star, the Bromans have bred three other stakes winners this year: Held Accountable, winner of the Sept. 20 Joseph A. Gimma Stakes; Haul Anchor; and Bar of Gold, who ran second Sept. 18 in the \$400,000 Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes (G2). *(For more, see page 40)*

Penny Chenery: 1922-2017

The Thoroughbred world has been in mourning since Sept. 16 with the passing of Helen "Penny" Chenery at 95. Best known for running her family's Meadow Stable through Secretariat's Triple Crown run in 1973, Chenery also served the industry in many capacities.

She was among the first female members of The Jockey Club, was a two-time president of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, and tackled welfare issues through her work with the American Horse Council, Grayson Foundation, and the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation.

She also was a breeder of...New York-breds. Chenery bred Saratoga Dew, a two-time grade 1 winner at 3 in 1992, that year's Eclipse Award-winning 3-year-old filly, and the New York-bred Horse of the Year.

By Cormorant, Saratoga Dew is out of Super Luna, by In Reality. Super Luna is a daughter of Alada, a daughter of Riva Ridge out of Syrian Sea, a full sister to Secretariat. Riva Ridge won the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes for the Chenery family's Meadow Stable.

Saratoga Dew, racing for Charles Engel, won the grade 2 Comely Stakes, ran second in the Alabama Stakes (G1), and won Belmont's Gazelle Handicap (G1) and Beldame Stakes (G1).

Penny Chenery is the daughter of Christopher T. Chenery, also a member of The Jockey Club who served a key role in New York racing. He was among the group which organized and created the Greater New York Racing Authority (now NYRA) in 1955.

Paul Schosberg Dies at 79

Paul A. Schosberg, who had careers in journalism, politics, banking, and an avocation in the Thoroughbred racing and breeding industry, died Sept. 25 after complications from surgery and a long battle with cancer. He was 79.

A 1959 graduate of Middlebury College, Schosberg began his career as a reporter, eventually serving as bureau chief of Gannet's *Reporter Dispatch* in Westchester County, N.Y. He then became chief of staff for Rep. Richard L. Ottinger (D) and Rep. Herman Badillo (D). During this time he co-authored a book, "See How They Run: The Making of a Congressman" under the pseudonym Paul Allyn.

In 1974 Schosberg returned to New York from Washington, D.C., to head the New York League of Savings Institutions and in 1992 became CEO of America's Community Bankers.

His love of horses led to a two-term stint as president of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. He also served as a director for 12 years.

"Speaking for many of the board members who served under Paul we will certainly miss his spirit and dedication to the organization and program that he loved and dedicated a big part of his professional life to," said NYTB president Thomas J. Gallo. "Even after his tenure as president was completed in glowing leadership fashion he was always available to chime in with valued guidance, historical reference, and candid opinion that was, and still is, the reason we are today the leading state-bred organization in the country. Paul will be sorely missed."

Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of NYTB, added: "Paul was a symbol of class and a true gentleman. It is hard to summarize how much respect I had for him and his leadership. I often found myself searching 20-plus-year-old *New York Breeder* magazines to see how he handled situations and challenges in our industry. Ironically, we joked, they are often still the same. I am grateful for his life lessons."

Schosberg and his wife of 58 years, Jane (who survives him), established the successful breeding operation Pine Lane Farm near Katonah, N.Y., breeding stakes winners in the U.S. and abroad.

He was an outspoken believer in the maxim, "the best thing for the inside of a man is the outside of a horse."

Schosberg is also survived by his daughter, Dr. Jill Stoller, a pediatrician from Upper Saddle River, N.J.; son Richard, a Thoroughbred trainer from Syosset, N.Y.; three grandchildren, Jenna, Travis, and Ryan; and a brother, Peter, of West Palm Beach, Fla.

2017 LEADING SIRES IN NEW YORK

For stallions that stand, will stand, or stood (deceased) in New York (stallions that are dead or exported prior to 2013 are excluded), and have runners in North America. Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through September 24, 2017. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse per starter in 2016 is \$22,141 or 45% of the 2016 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 45% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 65%. 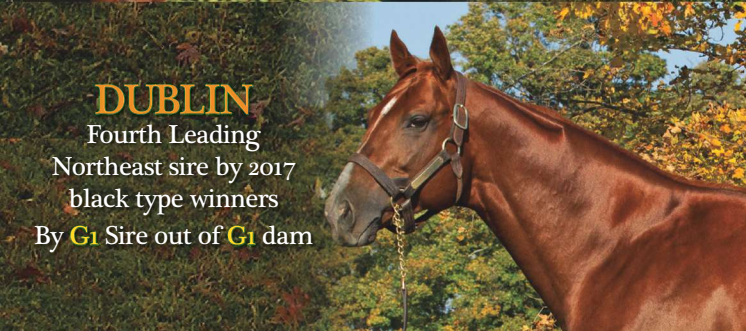

Mixing It Up

Strong yearling market offers hope for Saratoga fall sale

A STRONGER-THAN-EXPECTED yearling market in 2017—witness the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select sale, Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds, and Keeneland September yearling sale—suggests added interest as the calendar turns to the mixed sale markets. New York breeders get their opportunity to buy and sell Oct. 16 in Saratoga Springs at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga October sale.

"I think the (New York-bred) August sale was super strong," said Chris Bernhard of RFHF Bloodstock. "In previous sales the market was polarized; everybody was on the upper-end horses. In August and (Keeneland) September, the RNAs were lower and it seemed like there were buyers for everything.

"I watched the September sale and was in awe," he continued. "It was pretty wild. I don't want to say it was like it was back in the '90s again where people were just writing checks, but I would say if we're ever going to come as close to what we've watched many moons ago, it felt as healthy as healthy could be."

"The Fasig-Tipton fall sale is a criti-

cal outlet for New York breeders to offer their product," said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "It's become an early marketplace for weanlings, which provides breeders the fastest maneuverability, along with providing pinhookers a road map to flip these same horses as yearlings again in Saratoga.

"The quality of the pedigrees mimics the upward class New York-breds are riding. This summer we saw the best New York-bred pedigrees on record put to market at the preferred sale. This fall's sales catalog mirrors it.

"I would expect great participation in the sale from those looking to play

in this marketplace. Additionally, last year we saw active broodmare transactions taking place that is a positive sign for the overall breeding industry. I hope that will continue this year again."

Fasig-Tipton has cataloged 298 entries for the sale. Hips 1-90 will consist of broodmares and racing and/or broodmare prospects; hips 91-280 are weanlings; and hips 281-298 are all yearlings.

"We have good quality in this year's catalog," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr. "There are a number of mares in foal to leading national and regional sires that should draw significant interest. Additionally, this sale has developed into an excellent weanling market."

The weanling market is the strongest segment. Last year 65.2% of the revenue of the sale came from the 87 weanlings that were reported as sold.

Bernhard's RFHF Bloodstock was last year's leading consignor of weanlings, selling 16 of his 28 lots for \$535,700. His \$33,481 average was well above the \$20,851 average for the entire weanling market.

"I did a summary of my sales from last October and I figured from what I sold horses for—and I was satisfied with my prices last year as a whole—at the October weanling sale and what they were sold for as yearlings, people made more than \$1 million...so I would imagine those people will be back to look at the babies again this year," Bernhard said.

"The weanling-to-yearling market and even the weanling-to-2-year-old people are making money, so the market is healthy, and I anticipate a strong sale," he said. "This sale has been very good to us, and I've tried to be a big supporter." 🐾

The Long Run

Leonard Pivnick's Lubash retired at 10; won 18 of 54 starts, earning more than \$1.5 million

WHEN LUBASH'S RETIREMENT WAS ANNOUNCED in August, it was the end of an era in the Empire State. The Aliyu Ben J Stables homebred was already a solid competitor when owner Leonard Pivnick turned him over to trainer Christophe Clement in 2012 at the start of his 5-year-old season, but the bay son of Freud would go on to become a millionaire and one of the most popular horses on the New York circuit.

"When he was 4, we wanted to maximize the rest of his career, so we thought we could send him to a guy who was well known for getting the most out of turf horses, and (Clement) fit the bill," Pivnick's son Jonathan explained. "I didn't think he'd make it to 10."

According to Clement, there was no particular secret to Lubash's longevity.

"It has to come from the horse himself," Clement said. "One, he was a very sound horse overall, and two, Mr. Pivnick was willing to give him a break every winter. When you can give horses a break, they last longer and they stay sounder."

Under Clement's care, Lubash developed into a multiple graded stakes winner and notched wins in all of the major turf races for New York-breds. He finished 2016 with a win in the Tropical Turf Handicap (G3T) at Gulfstream Park West, but while he ran with credibility this year, he failed to win in three starts, and his connections agreed to call time on his eight-season career.

"He retired sound, and I'm very proud of that achievement," Clement said. "What was amazing about him was that he still

liked being a racehorse; he still had the will to win. He was very alive in his training, and he never stopped trying, but his last breeze wasn't as good as it needed to be for him to remain at stakes level, so we decided to retire him."

Lubash was the epitome of an honest racehorse, having won 18 of 54 career starts and placing in an additional 16 races. But while he was dependable in the afternoons, he required special handling on a daily basis.

"He was difficult to train because he had many idiosyncrasies," Clement noted. "He was a difficult horse to catch, he was difficult to put the bridle and saddle on, but we knew him and were very patient with him. He was very odd and peculiar, but we could manage him. We tried to keep the same groom and rider with him as much as we could."

Lubash left Clement's barn in August and has been turned out at the Equine Clinic at Oakencroft near Ravena, where he will remain for several months.

"I think he's going to enjoy life and do what he always wanted to do, which is to be a racehorse in the wild," Clement quipped.

By the end of the year, Lubash is expected to secure a permanent retirement home at Old Friends near Georgetown, Ky.

"He's still willing, but he's at a certain age and all of the little infirmities start to get to you," Jonathan Pivnick remarked. "We'd been saying this for years, because we were trying to prepare ourselves. But at some point we knew that there would be a last race and that we'd have to say, 'It's time.' At one time we thought someone might want to stand him (at stud), but as he got older, not a lot of people are going to want to invest their time and money in a horse that won't have those extra five years. We didn't want to send him off to another country where we wouldn't know what was going to happen to him. Old Friends had previously shown some interest in him, but didn't have any immediate opening for him unless he was a gelding, but we didn't want to do that to him now; he's made it this far."

"So we've sent him to Oakencroft for a few months and, hopefully, by November there will be a paddock for him at Old Friends."

Leonard Pivnick grew up in New Jersey as the son of a plasterer who developed a subcontracting company. Eventually, the

family business expanded to include real estate development and management. Through his sister, Audrey Berman, Pivnick met trainer James Ryerson and his interest in horse racing was piqued.

"She had a racehorse at the time (in the 1970s), and I was slightly affected by it," he said. "So I bought a horse who turned out to be a claimer."

Undeterred, Pivnick eventually decided to acquire several 2-year-olds in training in 1993. With the help of Ryerson and the late bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, Pivnick purchased a son of Meadowlake for \$105,000 and a Lost Code filly for \$55,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' February sale at Calder, as well as a daughter of Cure the Blues a few weeks later at Fasig-Tipton Florida for \$37,000. The bay colt turned out to be Meadow Flight, who won the Pennsylvania Derby (G2) and Flamingo Stakes (G3) and amassed \$526,936. His career highlights remain some of Pivnick's favorite moments in racing.

"He took us to the Kentucky Derby (G1)," Pivnick recalled. "I'd have to say winning the Flamingo was the highlight for me."

The Lost Code filly, named Codetogo, won once in eight starts, but was bred to Broad Brush and produced Cedar Knolls for Aliyu Ben J. That New York-bred filly was a stakes winner for Ryerson and earned \$312,648. She was bred to Seeking the Gold in the spring of 2002 and sold for \$800,000 later that year.

Pivnick dubbed the Cure the Blues filly Nasty Cure, and she would go on to outperform her price tag both at the races and in the breeding shed. The bay won five of 30 starts and \$153,122 and notched a third in the Miss Liberty Stakes as well as a fourth in the 1994 Monmouth Oaks (G2).

"She was the cheapest purchase of all of them, but she gave us Lubash," Pivnick pointed out. "At the time I was maybe hoping we would have something for the future, but not necessarily becoming breeders."

In addition to Lubash, Nasty Cure produced a pair of hard-knocking runners by Meadow

Flight: New York-bred Netcong, a stakes-placed earner of \$327,924; and Pine Brook, who won 13 races and \$196,304. Nasty Cure was boarded at Carapan Farm near Freehold at the time she foaled Lubash.

Pivnick's remaining horses are a pair of full siblings to the stable star, an unraced 5-year-old mare named Miriam as well as a juvenile currently in training.

"With Lubash gone, we've got two horses," Pivnick said. "(Miriam) colicked at 3 and was out of training for a few months. We brought her back, but then she had a tendon problem and Christophe didn't think it was a good idea to keep her in training. So we mated her to Malibu Moon and now we'll hope for the best."

The Pivnicks have boarded mares in New York since the beginning of their operation.

"We were always interested in the New York program," Jonathan Pivnick explained. "We were trying to breed New

York-breds because you had the restricted races and with the way the program was going, if you had a decent horse you could make quite a bit of money. It was a little bit different at that time (the 1990s); now it's a well-known thing with people sending mares out to top stallions and bringing them back. It didn't happen frequently back then, other than maybe Barry Schwartz. But I guess we're trying to do the same thing in sending (Miriam) to Malibu Moon."

Lubash was named in honor of Pivnick's childhood friend Arnie Lubasch.

"We played boxball and stickball," Pivnick recalled. "We started taking the train in to see the Yankees, even though I was a Cardinals fan back then. We even watched Babe Ruth say goodbye at Yankee Stadium (on June 13, 1948)."

Lubash began his career for Ryerson and won a trio of stakes as a 3-year-old, including a defeat of Little Mike in the Monarch's Maze Stakes at Aqueduct in November 2010. He built on that success with his later tenure under Clement and gave the Pivnicks many thrills, but it was a 2015 triumph that stands out. Lubash had finished second in the \$200,000 Mohawk Stakes three times and run fourth in another edition, but ran down long-time rival Kharafa to finally win the trophy and established a course record of 1:39.08 for the 8½-furlong event.

"I liked anytime he won," Pivnick said. "But my favorite was that October when he won the Mohawk and broke the course record. That was something else."

Lubash's combination of consistency and longevity made him a fan favorite, and the Pivnicks recognize that rarity.

"He gave us a lot of good races," Jonathan Pivnick said. "There was a string of races where he just ran; there wasn't a moment where you'd scratch your head wondering what happened. He would show up and run his race. It was incredible that he was able to do it over and over again. That's what I'll always remember most about him."

"That makes two of us," Leonard Pivnick added. 🐾

Second Act

Stakes star Icabad Crane
succeeding in his new career

ON JULY 25, 2011, AT SARATOGA RACE COURSE, Icabad Crane won his last race, the Evan Shipman Stakes, by a nose in a race that exemplified the then-6-year-old's determination and effort.

Six years later at the same track, another chapter in the New York-bred's life began by chance, in a casual conversation between Anita Motion and Jeff Cannizzo, the executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders.

Between races the two were talking about the Real Rider Cup, a new event that extends from the Retired Racehorse Project, which showcases retired Thoroughbreds successfully transitioning to new careers. Motion's husband, Graham, had trained Icabad Crane throughout the horse's 33-race career, and when the gelding retired in 2013, owner Earle Mack agreed to transfer him to the Motions.

"We had done this with a couple of other horses," said Anita. "We look to see where a horse ends up, and we buy them back if they're running for a low level and try to place them. We're friends with Phillip Dutton, and we always said that we wanted to place a Thoroughbred with him."

A two-time Olympic gold medalist in three-day eventing, Dutton has a farm in West Grove, Pa., not far from where the Motions live, and in Icabad Crane, they saw a horse that might be the one to partner with Dutton, raising the profile of retired Thoroughbreds in other equestrian sports.

They were right.

Bred by Marlene Brody's Gallagher's Stud, Icabad Crane (Jump Start—Adorahy, by Rahy) sold for \$65,000 at the Fasig-

Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings in 2006. Purchased by J.J. Crupi's New Castle Farm, he was pinhooked six months later for nearly double that, selling at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' February auction to Aaron Cohen's ARC Bloodstock for \$110,000. Cohen is Mack's racing manager.

Debuting in November 2007, Icabad Crane won his first start in a style that would become familiar to his followers: running well off the pace and just getting up at the wire, winning by a head. Four of his seven wins came by a half-length or less; he finished second four times by the same margins.

He got his first stakes win five months after his debut in Pimlico's Federico Tesio Stakes, then returned to that track to finish third in the 2008 Preakness Stakes (G1). He seemed to love Aqueduct Racetrack, both the main and the inner track, running there 15 times and finishing in the top three 14 times, compiling five wins at the track in Queens.

After finishing second by a head in the Alex M. Robb Stakes at Aqueduct on New Year's Eve 2011, Icabad Crane was sidelined by a tendon injury for a year and a half; returning in June 2013, he made three winless starts; competitive in none of them, he was retired sound by Mack and the Motions late that summer.

Three years earlier, Stuart Pittman had founded the Retired Racehorse Training Project (now the Retired Racehorse Project) in order to promote the training and use of Thoroughbreds after their retirement from racing. The first Thoroughbred Makeover was held in 2013, showcasing 26 trainers in 10 riding disciplines at Pimlico Race Course, and the following

year, Icabad Crane returned to the track at the site of his graded stakes debut to compete.

“We really wanted to promote Thoroughbreds,” said Anita Motion. “Icabad was the perfect horse for that.”

Dutton agreed.

“From an eventing point of view, he was initially not all that impressive,” said Dutton. “My first impression was that he was just a nice little put-together Thoroughbred, and I wasn’t too excited. But once I rode him, I realized that there’s a lot more to him than meets the eye.”

The guidelines of the Thoroughbred Makeover stipulate that horses can have no more than 10 months of training before participating, and Dutton agreed to put in the substantial time commitment to preparing for the event in October

2014, which was also held at Pimlico.

Ten horses competed to be America’s Most Wanted Thoroughbred, with fans having the opportunity to vote for their favorite horse at several points during the training period. Ridden over jumps at the competition by Dutton, Icabad Crane garnered the title by 121 votes.

“He was still a green horse then,” said Dutton, at whose farm Icabad Crane still lives. “For him to go back to Pimlico and perform on the racetrack and control his nervousness was a big deal.”

Helped by a Facebook page that has more than 4,400 likes, Icabad may well be more popular now than he was when he was racing. His fans avidly follow his new career, celebrating successes such as a win in a CIC1* event at Plantation Field in Pennsylvania, his first in a Fédération Equestre Internationale event;

a first-place finish in the Thoroughbred Series Novice division at Plantation Field last year under Olivia Dutton, Phillip’s daughter; and a third-place at Fair Hill in 2015, the same year his official fan club was launched.

Members of the Icabad Crane Fan Club pay \$50 to help fund the horse’s costs of competing and contribute to other off-track Thoroughbreds; in return, they receive Icabad Crane merchandise and videos and opportunities to meet the horse and Dutton at selected events.

In September Icabad Crane and a new rider, Lauren Cannizzo, participated in the inaugural Real Rider Cup, the result of that conversation between Cannizzo’s husband and Anita Motion in Saratoga.

“I was talking to Jeff about the event, and he said, ‘My wife would love to do something like that,’” Motion recounted. “We didn’t have a rider on Icabad, and this was a perfect match for New York Thoroughbred Breeders.”

An accomplished equestrian, Lauren Cannizzo grew up riding and training retired Thoroughbreds at her family’s farm in Massachusetts, which often took in horses from Suffolk Downs in Boston. While still in her 20s she took over the showing division of her mother’s work, competing in Wellington, Fla., in the winter, and traveling all over the East Coast and Europe buying and selling horses.

“That was my business until I got married five years ago and had kids,” she said. She, Cannizzo, and their young daughter and son live in Latham, near Saratoga Springs.

“The Real Rider Cup sounded like so much fun, and I wanted to be a part of it,” she said.

Comprised of four teams—veterinarians, owners, trainers, and jockeys—that competed against each other over show jumping fences, the Real Rider Cup showcased retired Thoroughbreds and their ability in the discipline of three-day eventing. Participants included Dr. Dean Richardson, Rosie Napravnik, Tim Keefe, and Dr. Stowe Burke. A fun-

draiser for Plantation Field and the RRP, the event raised more than \$20,000, said Motion.

The day before the competition, Cannizzo got on Icabad Crane for the first time, taking him through easy paces at Dutton's farm.

"We walked up to the ring, did a little walk-trot-canter, and jumped three jumps," she said. "He is so nice to ride. He's incredible and so much fun to handle."

As part of the fundraiser, Thoroughbred stables and owners sponsored horses and riders. Appropriately, Cannizzo donned silks sporting the logo of NYTB.

"It is critically important for our industry to find places and second careers for these horses along with demonstrating how successful they can be off-the-track," said Jeff Cannizzo. "The Real Rider Cup showcased big names and prominent figures to show that Thoroughbred horses can go on and compete."

Lauren Cannizzo and her teammates Erin Birkenhauer, Brianna Mott, Anne Moran, and Nuno Santos finished second behind the trainers, with Cannizzo and Icabad finishing fifth of 20 riders in the overall standings.

"He performed flawlessly," she said. "I couldn't have asked for more."

Though Cannizzo had watched videos of the horse's previous competitions, nothing prepared her for the reception she and her mount would get when they entered the ring.

"I went second of the 20 competitors," she said, "and it was kind of crazy to see people's reactions. There were a lot of people there just to see him, and he didn't blink an eye when they cheered him."

"The great thing about eventing," said Dutton, "is that there are so many levels, and we knew we'd find a place for him, depending on how far he wanted to go. He exceeded all of our expectations, and to see the following he has through the country is pretty inspiring."

Olivia Dutton's departure for board-

ing school this fall left Icabad's everyday saddle vacant, but in the spirit of keeping him in the family, Olivia's mother, Evie, stepped in, choosing Icabad on a recent family ride. As Dutton spoke, he watched her riding him at their farm. The Dutton family has been caring for their daughter Lee Lee, seriously injured in a riding accident earlier this

year, and Icabad has provided a welcome release.

"He's having an easy week," said Dutton. "Evie's giving him some exercise, and it's good therapy for her at the moment."

Icabad Crane's combination of determination and tractability, competitiveness and kindness, has endeared him to people in the show world and across the racing spectrum, at times uniting two groups that don't always find common ground, such as the man who spoke to Dutton at the Thoroughbred Makeover in 2014.

"A guy came up to me and said, 'Hey, man, I just love this horse,'" Dutton recalled. " 'Every time I put money on him, he won.' That kind of attitude, of trying every time, comes across in the show ring, too."

In an industry that over the last decade has made great strides in its attention to and funding for horses that can no longer race, Icabad Crane has become an ambassador and an exemplar of what Thoroughbreds can do when they are retired sound enough to be re-trained.

And thanks to NYTB (the publisher of this magazine), the Motions, the Cannizzos, and the Duttons, he further raised his profile Sept. 17, perhaps inspiring, to use Dutton's word, other owners and trainers to take an interest in their horses' life after racing, and other riders to get an OTTB (off-track Thoroughbred), for showing or jumping or pleasure riding, just a few of the ways in which former racehorses have been successful.

"It's a reminder that they are right up there and can compete with the best," said Lauren Cannizzo.

"That's why it's really important," added her husband. "The real message is that Thoroughbreds can have second careers and be really good at it. These Retired Racehorse Project horses are wiping the dust of the Thoroughbred in the sporting world and we must continue to showcase that." 🐾

WILLIS SHARPE KILMER

W.S. KILMER, A RESIDENT OF BINGHAMTON, N.Y., was a millionaire due to the immense pre-U.S. Food and Drug Administration popularity of his family-owned patent medicine called Swamp Root.

In 1916 he bought at auction a French-bred yearling called Sunday. He changed his colt's name to Sun Briar, and that colt became the champion 2-year-old male of 1917 and a multiple stakes winner who went on to be an outstanding sire for his owner. Kilmer built a lavish stud farm near Binghamton called, appropriately, Sun Briar Court, and until 1923, when he moved his farm to New Market, Va., he was a prominent figure in the world of New York-breds.

The first successful horse that Kilmer bred and raced, Sally's Alley (1920; Allumeur—Salvolatile, by Disguise) was not sired by Sun Briar, but by an obscure stallion owned by the Federal Remount Service. She began her racing career June 2, 1922, by finishing fourth in the Fashion Stakes at Belmont at 8-1. Six days later she broke her maiden in a 2-year-old filly allowance race, followed by a sixth in the Keene Memorial Stakes. On June 21 she won her first added-money race, Aqueduct's Clover Stakes for 2-year-old fillies. After off-the-board performances in the Adirondack Stakes and Spinaway Stakes at Saratoga, she won an allowance race at Belmont.

At this point she turned what had been an erratic season into one that brought her to the top of her class. She began by winning the rich Futurity Stakes at Belmont by three lengths as a 10-1 shot. Finishing second was Zev, the winner of the next year's Kentucky Derby and an eventual inductee into the National Hall of Fame. Sally's Alley's time of 1:11 for six furlongs set a stakes record that had previously been held by future Hall of Fame inductees Colin and Maskette, in 1907 and 1908, respectively.

Her next race was a throwout, as she finished eighth as the 2-1 favorite in Laurel's Manor Handicap when she was caught in the barrier at the start of the race. She redeemed herself by winning the second division of the Pimlico Futurity at 3-2 and in the process became the first horse to win the Belmont and Pimlico futurities. She ended her season on a down note when she finished second—and last—in the Pimlico Futurity Cup

to Martingale, who had finished second to her in the Pimlico Futurity.

At the end of the 1922 season Sally's Alley finished second in earnings for horses of all ages with \$94,847. Her winnings in the Futurity at Belmont (\$47,550) and the Pimlico Futurity (\$41,015) accounted for most of her total. Finishing first in earnings was Pillory, the Preakness Stakes and Belmont Stakes winner, with \$95,654. Third was Sally's Alley's more illustrious stablemate, Exterminator, with \$71,075.

The following year Sally's Alley joined a long list of precocious 2-year-olds that could not advance to the next level at 3. She won the first race of her sophomore season, an allowance race, then lost her next six starts.

Turf writers found excuses for her first two setbacks. Her first loss was in a Pimlico allowance race for 3-year-olds and up in which she conceded two pounds to the 4-year-old June Grass, who had to set a track record for a mile to beat her. In

her second loss, the Pimlico Oaks (now the grade 2 Black-Eyed Susan Stakes), she was left at the start as the 1-2 favorite. However, no excuses were found for her next start, the Preakness, in which she finished a no-mishap 11th. That race convinced her connections she did not belong in her next scheduled start, the Kentucky Derby. It was only a month before that Sally's Alley and the eventual Derby winner, Zev, had been co-favorites in the Derby future book.

After a 2½-month layoff she traveled to Saratoga, where she finished second against allowance company, second in the Alabama Stakes, and eighth in the Saranac Handicap. After she had regained some of her lost luster in Maryland by winning a handicap race and the Capital Handicap, she was pulled up in the Pimlico Serial Weight-for Age Race No. 1. It was later disclosed both tendons in her left foreleg were lacerated and torn and she was retired to be a broodmare.

Sunsini (1920, Sun Briar—Contessina, by Count Schomberg) was bred and originally raced by Kilmer but found success with another owner. His first four starts for Kilmer were off-the-board efforts, and in his next race, a 2-year-old claiming event on Oct. 25 at Empire City, he finished second and was claimed by Lilane Stable for \$1,650. He was sent to Oriental Park in Havana, Cuba, where he broke his maiden and won his next start. It was in between those two starts that he was gelded. He finished last in his farewell event in Havana when he pulled up lame.

In his first 10 starts in 1923, he won two claiming races and an allowance. When he arrived at Saratoga, he began to show more ability, winning in succession the Mohawk and Amsterdam selling stakes. After four moderately successful appearances downstate at Aqueduct and Jamaica, he won the Pierrepont Handicap at Jamaica and New Rochelle Handicap at Belmont, although he faced a total of three opponents in those two races. He ended the season by

losing three stakes races and a handicap in Maryland.

He began his 1924 season by competing in three major handicap races, finishing third to Zev in the Kings County Handicap, second to Rialto in the Excelsior Handicap, and third in the Long Beach Handicap at Jamaica. Although granted large weight concessions in those races, it was evident Sunsini was competing at an entirely new level.

After an unproductive trip to Canada,

where he finished eighth and last in the Toronto Cup Handicap at Woodbine, he returned to New York, finishing second in the Brooklyn Handicap while carrying a scant 102 pounds as a 20-1 outsider. Hephaistos, 106 pounds, was the winner at 8-1 while Zev checked in seventh as the 9-5 favorite while carrying 130 pounds.

After a sixth-place finish in Aqueduct's Brookdale Handicap, Sunsini rebounded to finish second in the Empire City

Handicap, with his fellow New York-bred Sting winning under 98 pounds. He followed this with a second in the Mount Vernon Handicap carrying 102 pounds, with Ordinance finishing first and future Hall of Famer Sarazen finishing sixth as the 120-pound highweight.

It was after he won his next race, the Yonkers Handicap as the 4-5 favorite, that Turf writers were beginning to notice the ex-claimer. The New York *Tele-*

Sunsini's next Saratoga bravado performance was a victory in the Merchants and Citizens' Handicap as the even-money favorite carrying 109 pounds. My Play, the 117-pound highweight, was second. Sunsini's summer at Saratoga gave him his last wins of the year. After a 2½-month layoff due to an illness, he traveled south to Maryland, where he finished second in the Merchants Handicap, sixth (and last) in the Bowie Handi-

ing ninth in the Great American Stakes at Aqueduct. That debacle was forgotten when he won his next four races, including the Whirl Stakes at Empire City, the United States Hotel Stakes at Saratoga, and the Saratoga Special Stakes.

A 2-year-old championship and a date in Louisville in 1925 were looming on the horizon. Sunny Man's road to Kentucky took a slight detour when he finished third to his stablemate Sunsard in the Grand Union Hotel Stakes at Saratoga. His heavy impost of 130 pounds was offered as an excuse, but his career took another downward turn when he finished sixth in the prestigious Hopeful Stakes at Saratoga.

Kilmer decided to give him a rest and bypass the rich Futurity at Belmont. On Nov. 3 he won a prep race for the Pimlico Futurity in impressive fashion. Not as impressive was his running in the Pimlico Futurity four days later as he finished fourth with no apparent excuse.

Despite his late season setbacks, *Daily Racing Form* still thought he would be a star in his 3-year-old season: "Sunny Man's lineage is purely foreign, and it would be hard to improve on his bloodlines...He was a speed marvel in the United States Hotel and Saratoga Special, and he looked like going on through the campaign. He was a good horse in the Hopeful though unplaced through having the worst of racing luck."

Sunny Man began his 3-year-old campaign with a second as the 17-10 favorite in an allowance race at Havre de Grace. Tragically, that was the last race of his career. Upon his arrival in New York April 30, 1925, his handlers noticed Sunny Man was sick, and he died the next day. Veterinarians determined the horse had been poisoned. Despite a reward and private investigations by Kilmer, the perpetrator or perpetrators were never found. 🐾

gram and Evening Mail enthused: “The Lilane Stable's little gelding showed today that he is a mighty formidable horse over such a distance (1¼ miles) and he is capable of running in the company of almost any of them at that distance.”

Following his success in the Yonkers, Sunsini returned to Saratoga where he proceeded to run the best races of his career. He began his stay at the Spa with an impressive second to My Own in the Saratoga Handicap, followed by a win in the Delaware Handicap at 3-1 under a 110-pound impost.

Although he finished second by a nose to Klondyke in the Champlain Handicap, Frank Ortell of the New York *Telegram and Evening Mail* was impressed: “Sunsini, as honest a little horse as we have ever seen, did his best fighting to the last gasp—but that was not enough to beat the speedy Klondyke.”

cap, third in the Pimlico Cup Handicap, 11th in the Gasden D. Bryan Memorial Handicap, and fourth in the Thanksgiving Handicap.

The results did not deter *Daily Racing Form* from calling him “one of the toughest campaigners in training.”

He finished his 1924 season with three wins, seven seconds, and three thirds in 19 starts, with earnings of \$26,950.

Sunsini's glory days were over. Although he won some stakes races in 1925, they were of the variety that today would be labeled ungraded or overnight. After one second and four off-the-board performances at Miami in 1926 and three losing efforts in 1927 the gallant gelding was retired.

A Kilmer homebred that turf experts had high hopes for was Sunny Man (1922; Sun Briar—Romagne, by Polymelus). He began his career June 28, 1924, by finish-

Bromans strike with Held Accountable, Highway Star

Double Time

THE BEST-LAID PLANS OF HORSEMEN often take interesting twist-turns. But when a Thoroughbred's foundation is solid and its connections are as insightful as breeder/owners Chester and Mary Broman, along with trainer Phil Serpe, those unexpected detours can lead directly to the winner's circle. That was the case with the

Bromans' homebred Held Accountable, a 2-year-old filly by Exchange Rate.

Prior to Held Accountable's debut, a winning one at 5½ furlongs on the turf Aug. 17 at Saratoga, Chester Broman and Serpe were watching as she put in an early-morning work from the gate to earn her gate card.

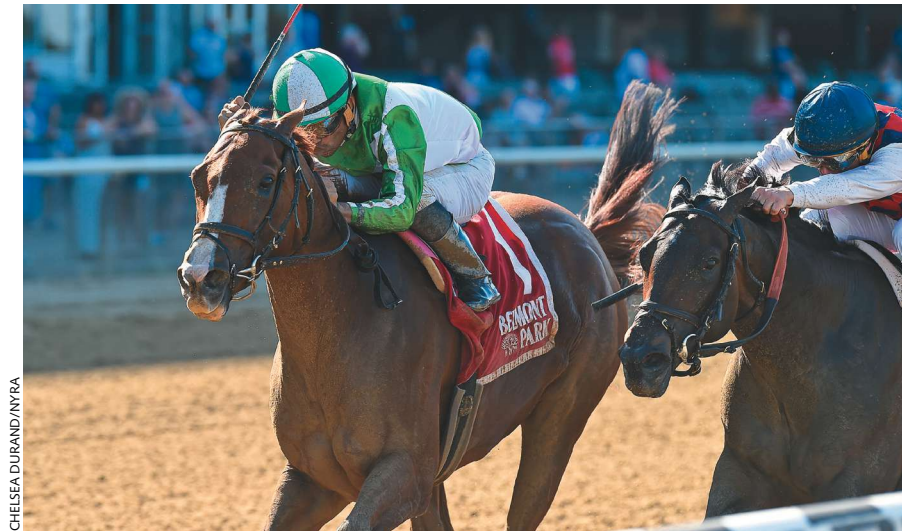
"She popped out of the gate (positioned on the dirt), and we watched her outwork two of our other 2-year-olds that were pretty nice horses (while still) in-hand," said Serpe. "We're all looking at each other, asking 'So, why are we running this filly on the turf first time out?' But, she had a turf pedigree, and we had another filly to run on the dirt."

Held Accountable got her chance

on Belmont Park's main track for her second start where she defeated a solid field of freshmen Sept. 20 in the \$150,000 Joseph A. Gimma Stakes at seven furlongs.

Held Accountable, who had raced a bit greenly in her grass debut, was the model of professionalism beneath Luis Saez. After rating comfortably in the early going, the filly willingly split horses in upper stretch before charging to the lead inside the final furlong.

Held Accountable, who is out of New Harmony (an unraced daughter of A.P. Indy), registered a 2¼-length victory in 1:25.27.

Robert Rosenthal and Bradford Bernstein's homebred Berning Rose (by Freud) was second with favored Newport Breeze finishing 1¼ lengths back in third.

The Bromans were back in the winner's circle four days later when their homebred Highway Star collected her fourth graded stakes win with a gutsy, hard-charging performance Sept. 24 in the \$300,000 Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) at 6½ furlongs.

Highway Star, who is out of Stolen Star (by Cat Thief), has risen from state-bred competition to the highest levels of the open ranks, finishing third behind Songbird in the Ogden Phipps Stakes (G1) June 10. She had previously scored in the Go for Wand Handicap (G3) in 2016, and the Ruffian Stakes (G2) and Distaff Handicap (G3) this year.

BONGARD BATTLE

Switching from turf-to-dirt after a winning debut became a trend for freshmen in state-bred stakes when Ken and Sarah Ramsey's Battle Station (by Warrior's Reward) captured the \$150,000 Bertram F. Bongard Stakes Sept. 22 going wire-to-wire in the male counterpart to the Gimma Stakes.

The anticipated speed duel between Battle Station and Gary Barber's What a Catch never materialized after the latter broke through the starting gate just prior to the race. An assistant starter, Miguel Ramirez, indeed made a great catch in holding onto the runner despite injuring his shoulder and having to be taken away in the trackside ambulance. The deft piece of horsemanship

reminded everyone of the essential yet often dangerous role the assistant starters play in racing.

Trained by Wesley Ward and ridden by Kendrick Carmouche, who excels at putting horses on the engine, the free-running Battle Station was able to transfer his sensational early turf speed to the main track. He raced a quick opening quarter-mile in :22.94 and a half-mile in :45.94.

In mid-stretch, though, Battle Station found an extra gear and impressively dashed away from his quartet of rivals.

Out of the mare Uriel (an unraced daughter of Unbridled), Battle Station stopped the timer in 1:24.83, registering a 9¼-length triumph.

"My horse triggered the gate (incident) because he just wanted to come out so bad. It just caused a chain-reaction with (What a Catch)," said Carmouche. "The good thing is both of them were OK."

Alan Brodsky's Inalienable Rights (by Mission Impazible) finished second and What a Catch was third.

TANGLED UP ON TURF

Older New York-breds took to Belmont Park's inner turf course Sept. 24 in a pair of twin \$125,000 stakes contested at 1¼ miles: the Ashley T. Cole and the John Hettinger stakes (females).

Ever since being transferred to the turf, Team D's Get Jets (by Scat Daddy) has finished first or second in all five grass starts, including a score Aug. 25 in Saratoga's West Point Stakes Pre-

sented by Trustco Bank. Considered the leader of the division in the state-bred turf ranks, the Tony Dutrow-trained Get Jets was the 9-10 favorite in the Cole, an event which would even further the colt's claim to the top slot.

Running in fourth position early in a pacesetter race featuring an opening half-mile in a pedestrian :49.06, Get Jets rallied wide into the grassy lane, setting

sights on the lead.

To his outside closed Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's Call Provision. Down on the inside rail, New York-bred stalwart Kharafa, owned by Paul Braverman and Timothy Pinch, was also in full stride.

It was the perfect scenario for Get Jets and jockey John Velazquez to be beaten. Only the gutsy colt would not be

denied, out-gaming runner-up Call Provision by a nose in 1:47.74.

"I like the feeling you get after your horse is giving it to you; they give a really good fight. And as soon as your horse puts a head in front, they're like, 'Nah-uh, you're not passing me,'" said Velazquez.

Bred by Pat Pavlish, Get Jets, out of Sunny (by Dixieland Band), recorded his sixth win from 11 starts.

Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith's Fourstar Crook (by Freud) returned to her winning ways in the Hettinger after her eight-race winning streak was stopped with a runner-up finish Aug. 25 in the Yaddo Stakes at Saratoga.

Turning for home in the Hettinger, the 5-year-old mare, out of Avril a Portugal (by D'Accord), trailed by more than a dozen lengths. But class held true through the stretch as Fourstar Crook surged late to post a 3½-length victory in 1:46.05.

"She has a big, strong kick and she got there in plenty of time. We thought about trying her against open company a couple of starts back and now it's time to try something big. We'll think about wheeling her back in the (G1T) E.P. Taylor (at Woodbine) in three weeks and then calling it a year for her," said trainer Chad Brown.

Fourstar Crook, piloted by Javier Castellano, has won nine of 13 starts and has earned \$649,050.

Mandaclair Stable and Bond Racing Stable's Tizzelle (by Tizway) finished second, a nose in front of Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners and Sheep Pond Partners' Ack Naughty.

Hettinger, of Akindale Farm, was a member of the board of trustees of the New York Racing Association, as well as a chairman emeritus of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation. Perhaps most importantly, Hettinger is remembered as being an advocate for the well-being of the Thoroughbred, earning him the Eclipse Award of Merit in 2000. Hettinger was once quoted as saying, "All of my best friends have four legs." 🐾



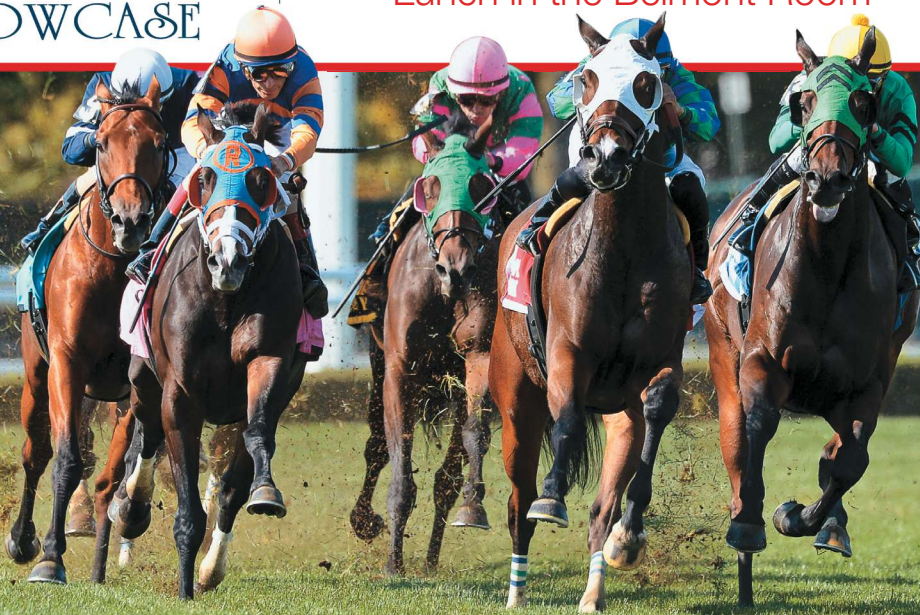

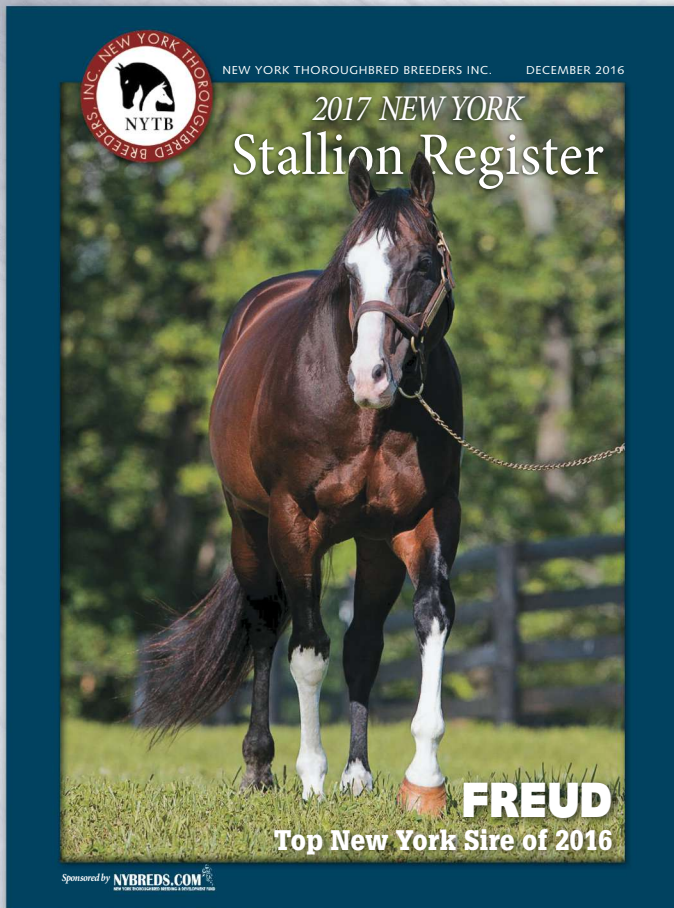
