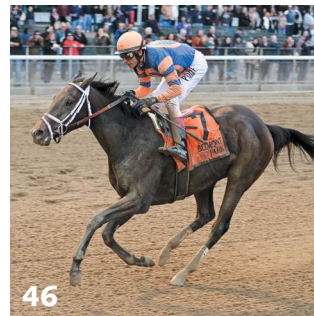
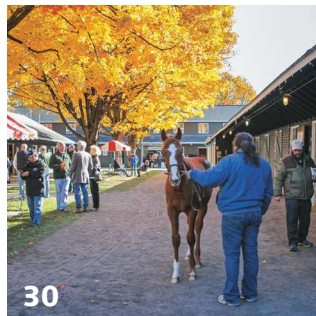
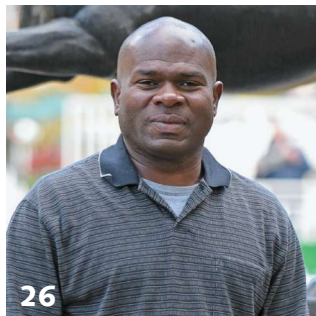

# New York Racing Circuit: Essential to Breeder Success, Success for NYRA & Beyond

**IF YOU ARE INVESTED** in any aspect of the Thoroughbred business in New York State, or across the country for that matter, the future of racing at the three New York Racing Association racetracks should be very much on your mind. Without question 2016 will be a year of transition. The NYRA reorganization board should be submitting its long-term plan to the state in the near future, and the current deadline for the government-controlled organization to return to a not-for-profit private entity will be at some point after the legislative session in 2016.

The future of NYRA will generate much dialogue and debate. Racing media and bloggers are already speculating. Three facts are beyond conjecture, however: (1) The preservation of a year-round racing calendar is essential for breeder success in the state; (2) NYRA depends on state breeder success to flourish year-round; and (3) NYRA's success bolsters the racing business coast-to-coast. In 2014 the NYRA all-sources handle (\$2,177,979,073) amounted to 20.64% of the \$10,552,214,930 U.S. handle nationwide.

In a nutshell, without year-round racing, breeders will scale back their businesses, the New York foal crop will decline, and NYRA will no longer be able to fill its fields and write handle-producing racing programs during the Belmont spring and fall meets and at Saratoga as it does now. Without year-round racing, breeders lose, NYRA loses, and, because NYRA racing is a huge economic driver from coast-to-coast, the national industry takes a hit.

I know all too well that few horsepeople welcome winter in the Northeast. We can count on challenging conditions on the farms, the racetrack, and the backstretch. We can also count on winter racing with all that winter racing implies.

Racing during the winter and early spring is not what it is in other seasons of the year. Not in New York. Not anywhere. The aesthetic backdrop, in the Northeast at least, is forbidding: snow-covered in-fields, muffled grooms and horses snorting steam. Even at scenic, warm Gulfstream Park, however, a mid-February weekday card is built around claim-

ing races at the \$12,500, \$10,000, even the beaten-\$6,250 levels. This is all a far cry from Saratoga in August. But in New York, some form of year-round racing opportunity is what makes the whole system work.

Let's simply allow the numbers to tell the story. In 2014 New York-breds accounted for an amazing 45% of ALL starters at NYRA tracks: 51% of all starts at Aqueduct (3,866 of 7,557), 44% of all starts at Belmont Park (2,951 of 6,755), and 34% of all starts at Saratoga (1,129 of 3,290). New York-breds are a staple of the NYRA product, and racing as we know it in the state would not exist without them.

So, the national racing scene depends on NYRA to flourish. NYRA depends on New York-breds to flourish. And New York breeders, who supply those New York-breds, depend on year-round racing to make their businesses work.

During the winter and spring of 2014, Aqueduct hosted 49% of NYRA's state-bred races (330 of 680), and New York-breds brought home 41% of all Aqueduct purses, or \$22 million. This also translates into breeders' awards that keep breeders' businesses thriving. Winter/spring racing at Aqueduct generated more than a quarter of all breeders' awards, 26% or 1,484 individual awards. Winter/spring racing also generated the largest dollar amount of breeders' awards generated by the four New York racetracks or \$4.27 million, which is 33% of all breeders' awards money distributed.

In other words, year-round racing is a big factor driving the racing opportunity and earning potential for New York-breds.

So, we come full circle. NYRA is important to racing nationwide. NYRA needs New York-bred participation to succeed, and New York-bred participation is founded on breeder success, which depends on the racing opportunity that year-round racing provides. It also doesn't take much to figure out many jobs and livelihoods are at stake as well.

This leads inevitably to the conclusion that New York-bred racing opportunity is the key to the landscape for New York breeders, on whom so much of the whole complex depends. 🐾

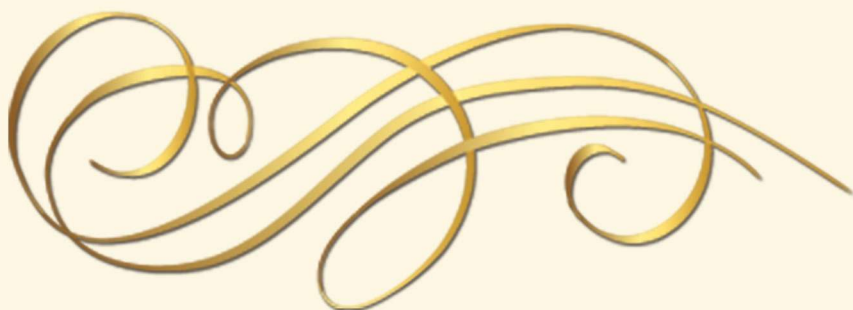

## GOLDEN TICKET TO STAND AT QUESTROYAL NORTH

Questroyal North has announced that 2012 Travers Stakes (gr. I) dead-heat winner Golden Ticket has been retired and will stand the 2016 breeding season at the Questroyal North stallion station near Stillwater.

Golden Ticket will stand for \$7,500, live foal, as the property of Carter Stewart.

Golden Ticket is a son of Speightstown out of the Deputy Minister mare Business Plan. He won stakes at 3, 4, and 5.

Golden Ticket placed in eight graded stakes, competed at 13 different tracks, and earned \$1,362,924. Among his more memorable performances were runner-up finishes in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I) at Santa Anita and the Stephen Foster Handicap Presented by Abu Dhabi (gr. I) at Churchill Downs. Golden Ticket was also second by three-quarters of a length in the Tampa Bay Derby (gr. II) and second by a head to Palace Malice in the Gulfstream Park Handicap (gr. II) and second in the Alysheba Stakes (gr. II).

Speightstown has career progeny earnings of more than \$64 million and he's been a top-10 North American sire for six consecutive years. He is the sire of 73 stakes winners, 13 in 2015, including grade I winners Force the Pass and the late Rock Fall. Speightstown is also emerging as a sire of

sires—his son Munnings is the leading second-crop sire and the sire of the 2015 multiple graded stakes-winning filly I'm a Chatterbox.

## MICROMANAGE TO ROCKRIDGE

Repole Stable and Rockridge Stud announced Sept. 28 that multiple stakes winner Micromanage will stand at Rockridge Stud near Hudson, N.Y., for the 2016 breeding season. His initial fee will be \$5,000 live foal.

By Medaglia d'Oro—Catnip, by Flying Paster, Micromanage won the Skip Away Stakes (gr. III) at Gulfstream Park, four other added-money races including this year's Jazil Stakes at Aqueduct, and placed in four graded stakes including the 2013 William Hill Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I) at Monmouth Park and last year's Brooklyn Invitational Stakes (gr. II) at Belmont Park.

Bred in Kentucky by Fiona Craig and Dermot Cantillon, Micromanage was a \$170,000 Keeneland September sale yearling in 2011. He broke his maiden as a 2-year-old in his first

start at Saratoga in maiden special weight company.

A winner from seven furlongs to 1¼ miles, Micromanage went 7-4-6 in 30 starts and earned \$790,551.

A half brother to grade III winner Indescribable, stakes-winning Elaflaak, and Catchofthecentury, the

dam of Del Mar Debutante Stakes (gr. I) second-place finisher Spring Awakening, Micromanage is out of Catnip, a half sister to Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Editor's Note and European champion Hold That Tiger.

"Micromanage had a great race career, excellent pedigree, and impressive conformation," Mike Repole said. "I'm excited to allow breeders to participate in Micromanage by selling a limited number of breeding rights under a 'Share the Upside' program. I plan to support him, as I do my other stallions."

Repole's stallions include leading first-crop sire Uncle Mo; Rockridge Stud's Giant Surprise, ranked 10th on the national first-crop sire list; Overdriven; Overanalyze; and Stay Thirsty.

The deal was brokered by Bowling Bloodstock.

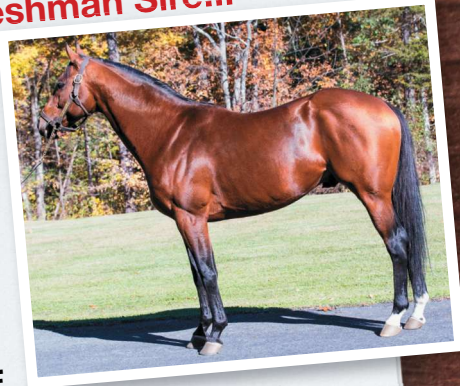

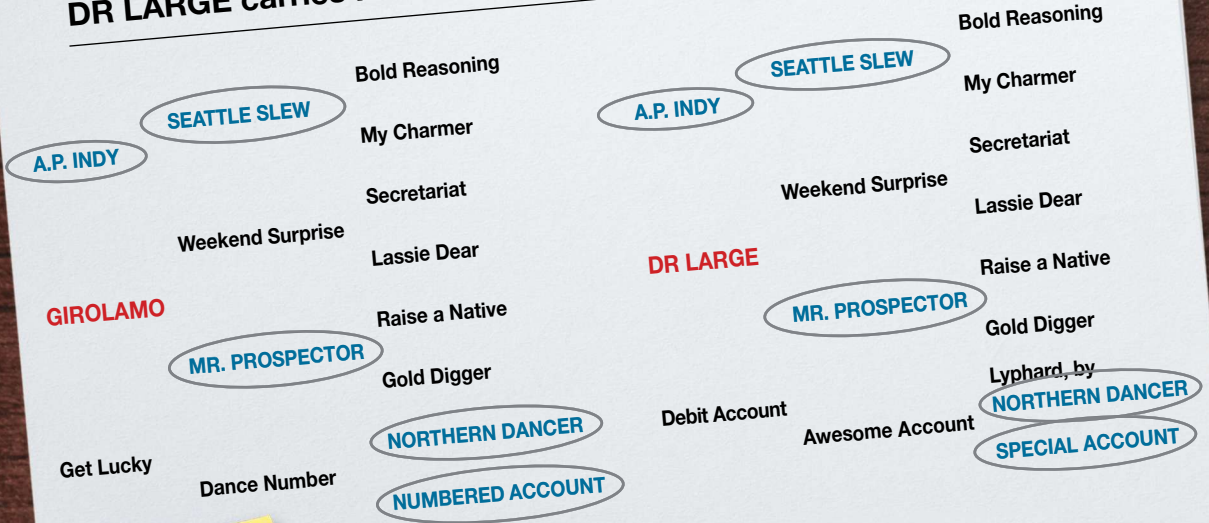

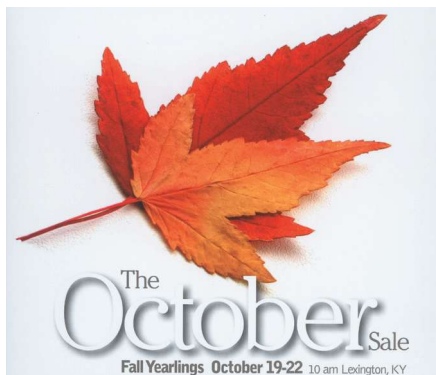

## State-breds 'Solid' at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Sale

New York-breds produced solid results during the four-day Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale in Lexington Oct. 19-22 while the overall results suffered slight across-the-board declines.

Of the 104 New York-bred yearlings offered, 68 sold for an average of \$28,215 with a median of \$15,000. The buy-back rate was 34.6%. Cumulatively the average for the general sale was \$34,390, while the median ended up at \$15,000. The cumulative RNA rate for the sale was 30.7%.

Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. said, "(The sale) was not dramatically different from 2014. The market for a horse below \$15,000



in terms of value is extremely difficult. From \$15,000 to \$50,000, it is sticky but still manageable, and once you get above

\$50,000 it is pretty dadgum good. It was almost like a three-tiered marketplace."

The top New York-bred yearling, who sold during the opening session, was a Candy Ride filly bred by The New Hill Farm, who was purchased by Conquest Stables for \$150,000.

In all, four New York-bred yearlings brought six figures. In addition to the top filly, a bay colt by Tapizar bred by Fred W. Hertrich III and dark bay or brown filly by Tale of the Cat bred by Pine Ridge Stables, brought \$125,000 and \$100,000, respectively, the second day.

On the final day of trade, a Stormy Atlantic filly, bred by Wellspring Stables, sold to Jim and Susan Hill for \$130,000.

### MAJOR GAIN TO McMAHON OF SARATOGA

Major Gain has been retired from racing and will stand the 2016 season at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. A son of internationally successful More Than Ready, Major Gain was bred by and initially raced for Gary and Mary West Stables.

"We are pleased to stand the first son of More Than Ready in New York," said Joe McMahon. "A graded stakes winner in his second start at 2, Major Gain offers breeders a successful precocious sire line in New York racing; plus, his full sister is grade I stakes winner Room Service."

In his second start at 2, Major Gain won the Arlington-Washington Futurity (gr. III) and was the favorite for Keeneland's Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I). Major Gain placed third in Churchill Downs' Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II).

Major Gain was weighted 115 pounds on the Experimental Free Handicap, equal to eventual Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Mucho Macho Man and Astrology, while being weighted above the grade I-winning Stay Thirsty and Caleb's Posse.

With a single start at 3, Major Gain was compromised thereafter. He won on turf and synthetic over one mile, as well as being grade II-placed on dirt.

More Than Ready has earned accolades in both hemispheres. His grade I-winning sons to enter stud include Verrazano and Daredevil, and in Australia his son Se-

bring is a highly rated young sire.

Out of stakes-winning, graded stakes-placed Dream Lady, a granddaughter of leading broodmare sire A.P. Indy, Major Gain is from the immediate family of grade/group I winners Aubby K and Zapata and grade III winners Lilly Capote and London Lil.

"His owners are offering several options to breeders; in 2016 Major Gain will stand for \$2,500 live foal," McMahon said. "Genomics assessed by ThoroughGen tell us his score of 91 is higher than many of the nation's leading sires and is the second highest score of any major sire in New York. Only Freud is higher at 94. He is currently being syndicated for \$5,000 per share at 50 shares. Shareholders will get three seasons for the first three years and one breeding thereafter, or a lifetime breeding right can be purchased for \$3,500."

## MIDAS TOUCH TO ROCKRIDGE

Group II winner Midas Touch will stand at Rockridge Stud near Hudson for the 2016 breeding season. The 8-year-old son of Galileo is relocating from War Horse Place in Kentucky to New York.

Midas Touch, out of the Darshaan mare Approach, won the Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial (Ire-II) at 3. He was multiple group-I placed at 3 and 4.

“Midas Touch adds a different sire line and physical type to our roster,” said Rockridge’s Lere Visagie. “He will be the only son of Galileo standing in New York and gives our breeders a great opportunity to bring in European bloodlines.”

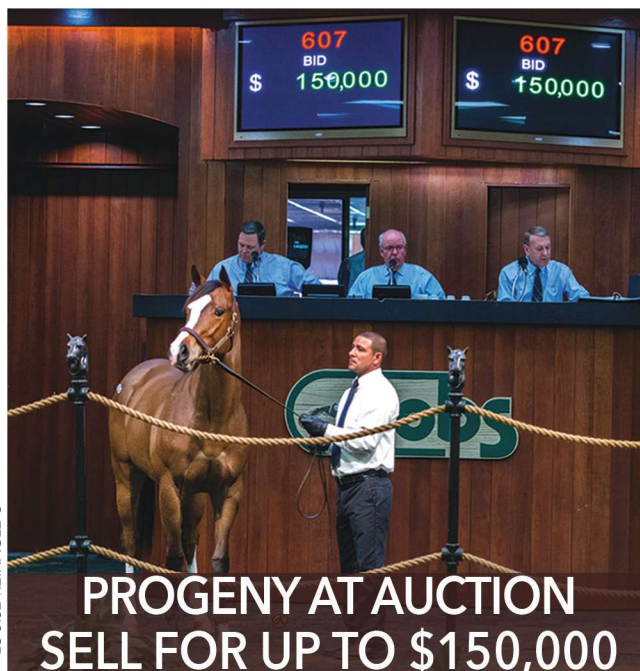

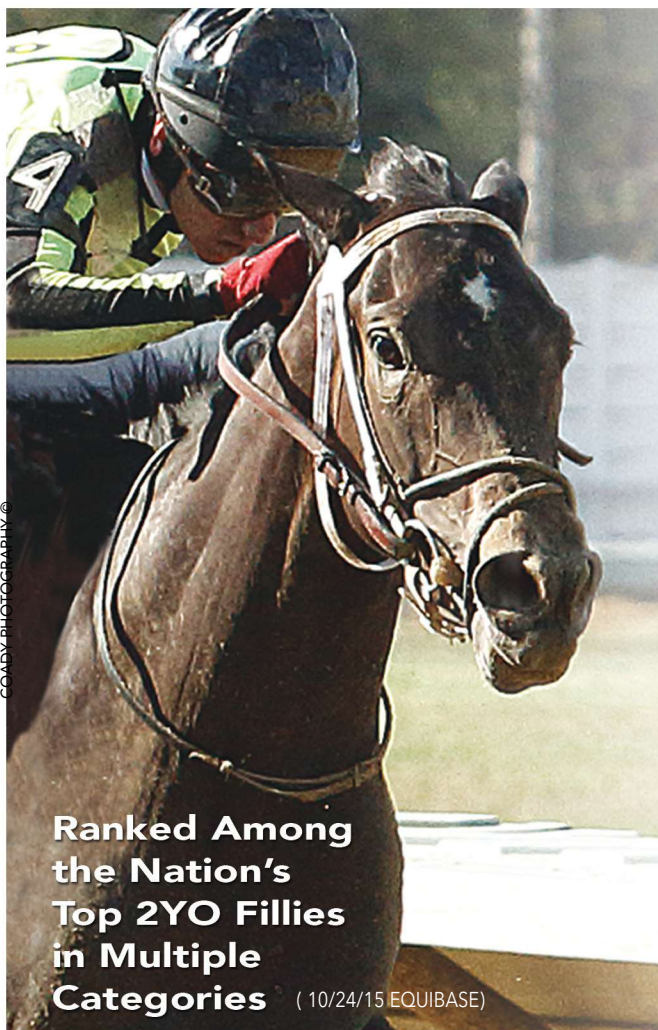

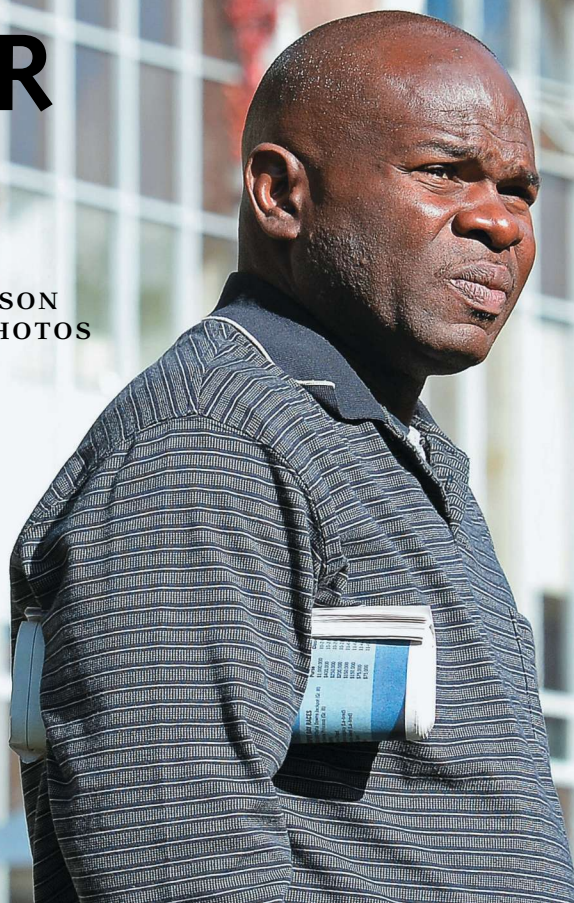

# BIGGER Things

## Trainer Charlton 'Charlie' Baker seeks to raise his profile

**ON A PICTURESQUE AUTUMN MORNING** at Belmont Park—the kind of day that energizes both humans and equines—the crisp air put a bounce in the horses' steps, and with that came a sense of urgency on their part to get on with their training, without interruption.

But trainer Charlton “Charlie” Baker wasn’t in the same hurry as his 2-year-old New York-bred Blugrascat’s Smile that October morning. As the gelding strained at the bit to exit Barn 43 for his training session, Baker noticed the blue nylon bridle was resting askew on the horse’s face.

Baker asked the exercise rider to stop, and then the trainer quietly approached Blugrascat’s Smile. With nimble fingers he loosened the throat latch, repositioned the bridle to his liking, refastened the buckle, and sent horse and rider on their way.

Everything about the trainer, who turns 50 Nov. 25, projects a gentle, thoughtful manner. It’s heard in his soft voice, which carries a lilting West Indian accent; it’s seen in his generous smile and observed in his methodical inspection of his horses.

Beneath the kindly exterior is an extremely motivated and competitive man who left behind the familiarity of his native Jamaica nearly 30 years ago to embark on a career in an unknown place. In the years since, Baker has distinguished himself as one of the leading trainers at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack in Farmington, N.Y. It is there that Baker reached the milestone of 1,000 career winners in 2011. He has trained top Finger Lakes’ runners such as Runaway Tiger, Top Shoter, and Johnnie Bye Night, and won an incredible five consecutive runnings of the George W. Barker Stakes at the Western New York oval.

Since 2004 Baker’s stable has surpassed \$1 million in earnings every season, and two years during that time frame, his runners topped \$2 million.

In recent years the horseman has been working on establishing a bigger presence on the New York Racing Association circuit, and his full-time division at Belmont Park of approximately two dozen horses is now as large as the one he

manages at Finger Lakes.

But there was a time not too long ago when the trainer struggled with the horses he brought to race at Aqueduct during the winter. Like the wicked wind that whips up from Jamaica Bay and blows through nearby Aqueduct, delivering cold slaps to the face, Baker faced the harsh reality that his Finger Lakes horses weren't up to par.

"The first couple of winters at Aqueduct, I didn't even stay the whole time...I lasted one or two months because my stock wasn't good enough...they didn't fit," Baker said. "I said to myself, 'This isn't going to work. I've got to get out of here.' When I started getting better stock, I stayed the entire winter."

It has always been in Baker's nature to reach for the stars. When he was 20 years old, he left his home island to come to New York, joining his parents who immigrated shortly before he did. Baker's father, Carl, was a jockey and then a trainer at Jamaica's only race-track, Caymanas Park, located just outside the island's capital and largest city, Kingston. Baker's father began training at Finger Lakes in the early 1990s, and several years later his son started his own stable there.

"When my dad left Jamaica for New York, he left a couple of horses, and I looked after them. I didn't know enough to train at the time, but I knew his sys-

tem and I was taking care of them for him after he left," said Baker, who lived across the street from Caymanas Park. "But, it was always my dream to come to the States."

Without any owners backing him at first, Baker had to break into the training business by opening his own wallet. A New York-bred daughter of Proud Appeal got the ball rolling for Baker.

"One of the first horses I bought was Peal Mea Grape. I bought her for \$1,000 off (trainer) Ralph D'Alessandro, who always likes to say he started me off," Baker recalled with a soft chuckle. "I gave Ralph \$200 down and paid him

\$100 every week. When she won, I claimed another horse for \$2,000, then \$3,000. So, I slowly started building. But my goal was always to try to get better stock and improve to the point where I was starting to win better races. I pretty much invested everything I made into buying more horses. Most of the horses I trained the first few years were pretty much ones I owned."

As he slowly started to build his stable and win races at Finger Lakes, Baker began attracting the attention of owners. One of his first clients came via Dan Hayden, who managed operations for New York-based breeder and owner Howard Kaskel, who owns Sugar Maple Farm near Poughquag.

"In 2001 when Sugar Maple wanted to send a few horses to Finger Lakes, I was watching the results there and trying to identify a trainer who was winning races," Hayden said. "Charlie stuck out to me.

"He is kind of like a throwback to the trainers of old," Hayden continued. "He gives horses the time when they need it; he keeps them sound. When they are with Charlie, horses stick around for a long time. He's also good with young horses who have issues.

"He's a very low-key guy," Hayden added. "That personality shows at the barn, which (operates) the same way. The atmosphere is very laid-back, and the horses seem to thrive in it.

“What I also like about Charlie is you can call him up and he really will go into detail about a horse. You really know where you stand with him. He will give you a very honest account of what you have in a horse.”

Hayden pointed to Baker’s willingness to become partners in horses with his owners, as well as the fact the trainer claims horses to race in his own name, as appealing traits.

“Charlie is one of these trainers who is not afraid to put up his own money the hard way—by claiming horses for himself,” Hayden said. “He understands the risk and knows when a horse is ready to move forward or move up (in class). He has survived in the game on his own merits.”

Baker said learning the business from the ground up aided him in making business decisions for himself.

“I understood the (financial) risk involved, and it was never a problem for me,” he said. “This is what I do. This is my career. Everything I’ve invested and I’ve got is from racing, so I’m all in. And the owners know I’m invested (in protecting their investment) because of that.”

Among the stakes winners currently in Baker’s care is Possessed, a 3-year-old New York-bred whom Baker co-owns with Hayden. Possessed, a son of New York sire Posse, won two divisions of the New York Stallion Stakes Series this year. Following a recent freshening, Possessed is now being prepared for a New York-bred stakes campaign in 2016.

Another New York-bred stakes earner in the barn is Albert Fried Jr.’s homebred Moonlight Song, a winner of this year’s John Morrissey Stakes at Saratoga and of last year’s Hudson Handicap on Empire Showcase Day at Belmont. Presently the 8-year-old, who has earnings of nearly \$500,000, is getting some down time on Fried’s farm but is expected to return to the races next year.

When the son of Unbridled’s Song came into Baker’s care as an unraced 4-year-old, the gelding was excessively anxious. Through patient handling by

one of Baker’s exercise riders, Ramdath “Harry” Harricharan, Moonlight Song was able to reach his full potential, the trainer said.

“When Moonlight Song walked into the barn, he was a big, good-looking horse. He (looked the part) of a racehorse,” Baker said. “But, at the time, the horses I was getting from Mr. Fried were meant for Finger Lakes, so I really didn’t know how much capability Moonlight Song had.

“When he started breezing, I saw the ability,” he continued. “But the one thing about him, he was very nervous and would get so sweaty. He was washed-out, soaking wet in the paddock for his first two starts, which he won. Nerves all the way. Once he started settling, his (speed figures) started to improve. He’s still a little bit on the muscle but a lot better than before. My man, Harry, is the best at getting a horse calmed down. I give all the credit to Harry.”

Jenny Carpenter, the farm manager for Fried’s Buttonwood Farm near Rhinebeck, said without Baker and Harricharan’s extreme dedication in dealing with the gelding, Moonlight Song would not be the horse he is today.

“I think Charlie did a lot more with

Moonlight Song than most trainers would have,” Carpenter remarked. “They schooled that horse non-stop. He’s not an easy horse. He is a tough horse to deal with because he pushes everybody around. The work Charlie did with him was the difference between him being an allowance horse and the stakes horse he became.”

Baker, whose stable composition is nearly all New York-breds, save for a couple of horses, knows the business from every angle—trainer, owner, and breeder. His first venture in the breeding end of the business has yielded him Sonic Surprise, an unraced 2-year-old daughter of New York stallion Giant Surprise, out of a mare Baker raced and owned, Sonic Sound.

“The New York-bred bonus program is great and the purses are super,” Baker commented. “You can’t beat it. You don’t have to have a great horse to make money. The program has improved a lot since I first became involved. The sires coming into the program, and the horses themselves, are a lot better. The rewards for owning a New York-bred are just super. When you get those bonus checks when you least expect it, it’s just super.”

Baker, who is single, makes weekly journeys between Finger Lakes and Belmont Park, which is about a 670-mile round-trip. Despite his busy schedule, he also finds time to be with his three children, Shayla, Naomi, and Anthony. He frequently returns to Jamaica for visits and has discovered that he has his very own cheering section at Caymanas Park.

“Yeah, I guess I’m kind of like (a celebrity) because they simulcast the races from Finger Lakes at Caymanas Park,” Baker said with a big grin. “They know my name, if not my face. I was watching a race at Caymanas Park from Finger Lakes and these guys next to me were talking about me... they were saying good things. Hey, you know, Jamaicans support Jamaicans—whether it’s track and field, soccer—we support each other.” 🐾

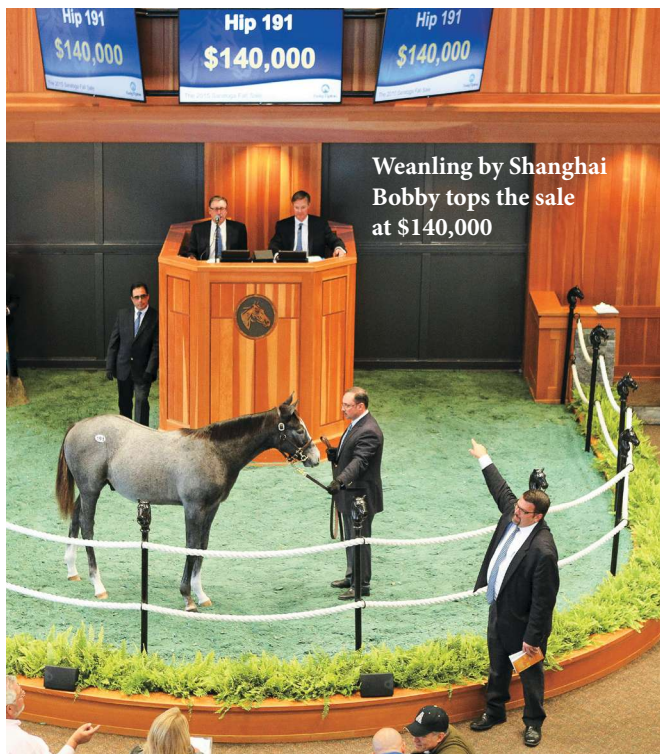

# Finding Its Stride

**A MATURING MARKET** for New York-breds and a maturing venue as the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall sale hit its fourth year saw a steady market Oct. 26 in Saratoga Springs. The overall sale saw the average price rise 5.3% from a year ago.

This year's sale offered one day of shopping and a reduced catalog of yearlings. Last year's two-day run—the first featuring an added yearling section—saw 193 horses sell for \$3,206,100 for an average of \$16,612. This year's sale had 162 horses changing hands for \$2,833,800, an average of \$17,493.

"The sale was consistent with the trends we've seen in recent years in New York and throughout the United States," said Boyd Browning, president and CEO of Fasig-Tipton. "There was significant demand for what was perceived to be the quality offerings whether it be foals, or mares, or even the yearlings. For the horses that didn't meet the demands of the horsemen or what the buyers were

looking for, it was not an easy sale.

"The market, for the most part, at the location below \$15,000, remains difficult," he said. "That was no exception at the sale whether you were talking about mares, foals, or yearlings. The sale was very well attended. There was

a lot of enthusiasm on the sale grounds for many of the horses. All in all, it was good, fair representation of the current marketplace."

The weanling market proved strongest as four New York-bred youngsters topped the six-figure mark. The day's top nine lots were weanlings.

As the sale has aged, the weanling market has served as a steady pipeline to the following year's preferred sale of New York-bred yearlings.

Topping the sale this year was a gray/roan colt from the first crop of champion 2-year-old male of 2012 Shanghai Bobby that went to Hunter Valley Farm. Bred by Hidden Lake Farm and Anthony Grey, the colt is out of New York-bred 2-year-old stakes winner Electric Shock (by Cure the Blues). Electric Shock won the 1998 Maid of the Mist Stakes, a race featured this year during Empire Showcase Day Oct. 24 at Belmont Park. The sale-topper is a half brother to four stakes horses including Fish Trappe

Road who ran second in the Sleepy Hollow Stakes, the Maid of the Mist's male counterpart also on Showcase Day. Fish Trappe Road had been a \$140,000 sale yearling at last year's preferred New York-bred August sale.

The colt was consigned by Rhapsody Farm's RF HF Bloodstock, agent, which also consigned the second-highest priced weanling as well as being the sale's leading consignor.

A colt by Curlin sold in the final few hips of the sale for \$120,000. The first foal out of the Bluegrass Cat mare Blue Catillac, the dark bay or brown colt sold to Baccari Bloodstock.

One hip before the Curlin colt, a near black son from the first crop of 2013 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Orb sold to F.U.N. Farm from the consignment of Questroyal North, agent. The colt, bred by Barry Ostrager, is out of French stakes winner and group II-placed Black Escort.

Earlier in the sale a son of first-crop stallion Justin Phillip, out of the Malibu Moon mare Influenced sold for \$100,000 to Saratoga Robin Racing from RF HF Bloodstock, agent.

Among the covering sires, some of the newer faces to New York had the best results. Mission Impazible, whose first foals are yearlings of 2015, had all four of the mares he covered listed as

sold, which was also the case with Big Brown (five) and first-year sire Central Banker (five).

Gemologist, who stands in Kentucky, had two of his in-foal mares sell for a sale-high average of \$42,500.

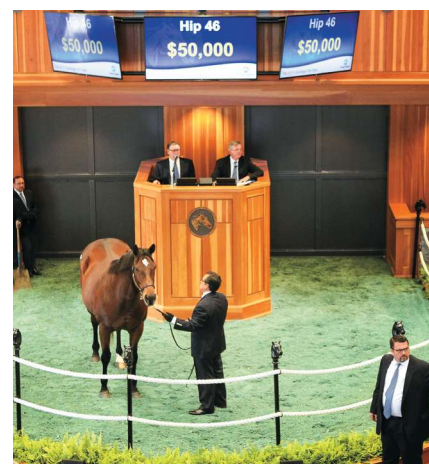
"A very fair marketplace," Browning said of the market for broodmares and broodmare prospects. "There was a lot of interest. I talked to several of the sellers on Sunday (Oct. 25) and they had shown their horses many, many times; probably much more than they had in the past couple of years, so that was a very positive sign."

Man Stuff, a 6-year-old mare by Belong to Me—Espresso Song, by Siphon, in foal to Gemologist, co-led the broodmare list, selling to J.J. Crupi, agent for St Elias, for \$50,000. Also selling for \$50,000 was Justenufappeal, a 7-year-old mare (Exchange Rate—Hasty Appeal, by World Appeal) in foal to Mission Impazible, who went to Michael Lischin and Nathan Lacombe.

Yearlings were introduced to last year's sale and 48 were sold for an average of \$12,717. This year's market was reduced with only 55 on offer and 17 reported as sold for an average of \$12,876. The highest lot, at \$40,000, was a filly by City Zip—Freud's Notebook, by Freud, that went to Three Diamonds Farm from Questroyal North, agent.

“There was a lot of interest” in the offerings, according to Fasig-Tipton’s Boyd Browning

The yearling market during the fall sale is a hit-or-miss proposition considering the majority of the state-breds have been offered earlier in the year at the preferred sale, the Keeneland September sale, or the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic and Kentucky fall yearling sales.

“The yearling market was very similar to what we’ve seen

at Kentucky’s October sale and the Midlantic sale—the buyers are very, very discriminating and there is not a tremendous demand for horses at the lower levels,” Browning said. 🐾

## Wonder Gal, Empire Dreams top Showcase Day's biggest races

# Big Dreams

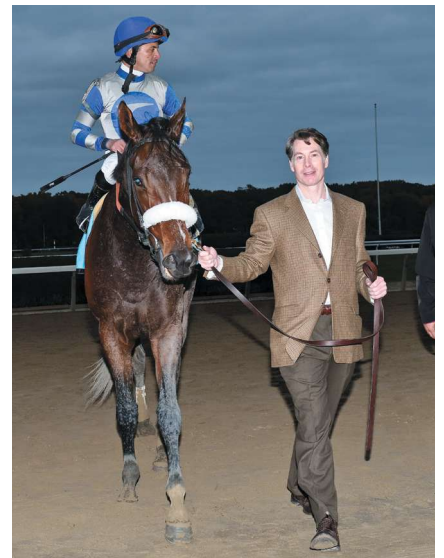

**IN JULY 2014 AT** Belmont Park, Jeff Treadway watched the newest addition to his stable make her first start. He and trainer Leah Gyarmati had thought enough of her to start her in a stakes race, the \$122,500 Lynbrook for 2-year-old New York-bred fillies, but, he said then, they didn't know whether six furlongs would be her distance or what her competition was.

Wonder Gal dropped far back in the early going that day, but as she strode into the far turn, she inhaled horses, passing them as she pleased, drawing off to win by 14½ lengths.

"Our jaws were on the floor watching her come down the stretch," said Treadway.

A daughter of Tiz Wonderful out of the Dixie Union mare Passe, Wonder Gal embarked on a campaign as rigorous as any other of her cohorts, running primarily in grade I races through her sophomore season, taking a shot in the occasional grade II. And aside from a couple of sub-par performances, she's been consistently competitive even as she's failed to make it

to the winner's circle, finishing in the top three in six of her previous eight lifetime starts. In both the Acorn Stakes and the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (both gr. I), she was third, beaten only a length in each.

On Oct. 24 in the \$250,000 Empire Distaff Handicap, Wonder Gal was back at Belmont Park, over a strip that she loves, back in state-bred company getting a little class relief, and wound up back in the winner's circle.

"We knew that her last race was a throw-out because she bled," said Treadway, referring to the Test Stakes (gr. I) in August at Saratoga. "We gave her some time off, and we knew that she's a legitimate top-notch 3-year-old filly.

"She was impressive today," he added, "because it was so fast up front and she was right close to the pace, but José (Lezcano) rode a great race."

The filly's best races have come when she has sat off the pace, but in the Distaff, Lezcano had her up closer, stalking a swift pace set by 7-5 favorite Hot Stones.

"The favorite was right up there, so she had to kind of go when she did," said Treadway. "But, boy, she dug in and really was fantastic. We were concerned about horses closing.

"She always seems like she digs in and comes back," he went on. "In the Distaff, it was from the front."

Treadway bought Wonder Gal, bred by Apache Farm, at last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March sale of 2-year-olds in training for \$210,000, but he admits that she wasn't one of the horses he and Gyarmati had initially picked out.

"You come in with a list of horses, and we were kind of striking out because everything was so expensive there. We didn't get any of our top 10," he said. "But you build relationships at the sales, and someone—a vet or a consignor—said, 'You should really look at this horse.'

"We saw her and thought, 'Wow, she's really fantastic,' and she did this fantastic 10 and 1 work really easily," he went on. "She was a big, beautiful filly, and I remember that there was some noise going on, and she was still slightly com-

posed. It wasn't until after we bought her that Tiz Wonderful became known as a really good, precocious sire."

On the strength of Wonder Gal and the multiple grade I winner Sweet Reason, Treadway had a career year in 2014 with purse earnings that edged over \$2 million, the first time he'd hit seven figures. He has also expanded his stable over the last several years, purchasing higher-quality horses and, perhaps drawing on his experience as a commodities broker, diversifying his stable.

"Out of all of our horses, maybe 25%

or 30% are New York-breds," he observed, "but we're looking for athletes more than anything. If they happen to be New York-breds, they give you a lot of options, and that's the key."

Being a New York-bred has certainly served Wonder Gal well, and Treadway is undecided whether she'll ship south this winter to take advantage of the good weather or stay north to take advantage of the New York-bred program. Either way, she'll get a bit of a break first.

"She always gives an enormous effort when she's good," he said, "and she really did it today."

### Dreaming On

The aptly named Empire Dreams captured New York's biggest race for state-breds when he won the \$300,000 Empire Classic Handicap, capping three years of steady performances in the state's stakes program.

"We love having 'Empire' in the names of our New York-bred horses," said Tom Bellhouse, chief operating officer of West Point Thoroughbreds, which bought the son of Patriot Act for \$35,000 at the 2013 OBS April 2-year-olds in training sale. "We do it whenever we can.

"He's a really cool story," Bellhouse continued. "I remember Erin calling me from the sales saying, 'Can you sell

(shares in) a Patriot Act?’ ”

Erin Finley, West Point's racing manager, was in Ocala with the partnership's buying team. Standing in New York at the time, Patriot Act was fairly new to the state.

"There were a couple of Patriot Acts out there," said Bellhouse, "so I told her, 'If you like him, get him. If he can run, I can sell him.'"

And run he could. After a fourth-place finish in his first start, the dark bay or brown horse out of Ascended Dreams, by Thunder Gulch, finished in the top three in his next eight races, capped with a win in the \$161,000 New York Derby at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack. A ninth-place finish in the Empire Classic last year is one of the few blemishes on the record of a horse who is 5-6-2 from 17 starts, 12 of which have come in New York-bred or stallion series stakes races.

The \$180,000 winner's share of this year's Empire Classic pushed the 4-year-old's earnings to \$674,001.

"I'm pretty confident we've got the best Patriot Act in training," said a beaming Bellhouse. Patriot Act was sold to stand in Saudi Arabia in 2013.

Acknowledging that Empire Dreams has a tendency to hang, Bellhouse pointed to the Saginaw Stakes in July in which his horse made the lead only to be caught late by Empire Classic rival—and last year's winner of the race—

Saratoga Snacks. Challenged late again after striking the front, Empire Dreams would not be denied this time.

"Snacks was closer to the pace than I anticipated today," he said, "but when we got to run, I got excited. Manny (Franco) did a great job riding him."

The West Point partners are an active bunch, showing up en masse for races at every level and vocally supporting their horses with cheers that can be heard from the finish line to the quarter pole. With a solid base of investors in New York, the partnership seeks New York-breds to include in its program.

"If we buy 25 horses in a year, I think we'd love to have four or five New York-breds to offer around here," said Bellhouse. "We're always looking to make

sure that we have a couple and support racing year-round here.

"He gives us thrills," Bellhouse went on, talking about Empire Dreams, who was bred by Pegasus Dream Stable and paid \$9.70 to win. "(Trainer) Tom (Albertrani) has done a wonderful job with him. When we won the New York Derby with him last year, it was a lot of fun—a lot of these partners went up to Finger Lakes to see it, and to come back to our home track and win the biggest race of the year in New York-bred racing is a thrill, I gotta tell you."

And while Empire Dreams is likely to get the rest of this year off, Bellhouse hopes that the 2015 thrills aren't quite over.

"We come every year to the championship races," he said, "and maybe this year we'll get a spot at the table at the awards banquet."

"Your odds of that are less than they were before today," joked Jeff Cannizzo, the executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders who presented West Point with the Empire Classic trophy. "That's a safe bet."

Gelded not long ago, Empire Dreams will be back next year to race at 5. An early goal, said Bellhouse, would be to repeat his victory in the Commentator Stakes this year.

"His pedigree is somewhat modest, but he's a kind horse, and a fun horse," said Bellhouse. "I'd like to think we'll be running in this race for years to come." 🐾

## Juveniles Get Jets, Super Surprise showcase their budding skills

# Get Going

**TWO-YEAR-OLDS GOT THEIR CHANCE** to shine during the Oct. 24 Empire Showcase Day at Belmont Park in a pair of one-mile main track events: the \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes and the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes for fillies.

When trainer Tony Dutrow saw Get Jets breeze at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale earlier this year, it wasn't the final clocking that caught his attention. Rather, it was the way the colt went about his business that signaled there was major potential in his stride.

"He was a 2-year-old in-training purchase," said Dutrow, who as part of Team D ponied up \$300,000 for the son of Scat Daddy—Sunny, by Dixieland Band. "He didn't breeze (overly) fast. But he was very steady and kept it going. He was a Scat Daddy out of a Dixieland Band mare, so we were comfortable that he'd like a distance of ground. He was a very athletic horse. And at that price I was about done. But I had a good feeling about this boy."

Dutrow's insightful opinion paid instant dividends on the racetrack when Get Jets won his six-furlong debut at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 19 by an eye-catching 4½ lengths after coming wide into the stretch.

The colt next appeared in the seven-furlong Bertram F. Bongard Stakes at Belmont Sept. 27 where he missed by a fast-closing neck to Repole Stable's undefeated Sudden Surprise (by Giant Surprise) who recorded his third straight victory.

So the extra eighth of a mile in the Sleepy Hollow appeared to be right in the even-money favored Get Jet's wheelhouse.

After the break Get Jets tracked the early pace on the outside from fifth position beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. After shying away from some kick-back, Get Jets, along with Sudden Surprise, advanced on the pacesetter Fish Trappe Road (by Trappe Shot) as the field of nine freshman runners turned into the sandy stretch.

Inside the final furlong, with the game Fish Trappe Road drifting out, Get Jets pinned his ears and went after the leader while shifting into the six-path for clear sailing. Get Jets then forged to the front before pulling away late to a 1½-length victory in 1:36.21.

Bred in New York by Pat Pavlish, the winner increased his earnings to \$223,800.

“It was a lot of money to pay for a New York-bred,” said Scott Akman, a part-owner with Team D. “He looked like he would really appreciate going long. He’s fulfilling that promise.”

“Claiming horses is one part of the game. But getting involved with 2-year-olds is another. That’s why I wanted to come in with Tony (Dutrow) and Scott,” said Wayne Cutler, a newer member of Team D, who grew up on Long Island near Roosevelt Raceway (now Roosevelt Fields shopping mall) where his dad was involved with Standardbreds. Cutler was also inspired by one of Team D’s early successes with In Trouble (winning the grade II Futurity Stakes in 2013 and finishing third in the grade III Gotham Stakes behind New York-breds Samraat and Uncle Sigh last year).

Martin Racing Stable’s Fish Trappe Road, from the barn of Bret Calloun, was the runner-up in the Sleepy Hollow by 1¾ lengths. Jump Sucker Stable and Oak Bluff Stables’ Governor Malibu (by Malibu Moon) rallied late to finish third, a neck better than Sudden Surprise, who checked in fourth.

## Super Stunner

Though Mike Repole’s homebred Sudden Surprise tasted defeat for the first time in the Sleepy Hollow,

the seemingly omnipresent barn came right back to upset the Maid of the Mist with a maiden runner, Super Surprise (17-1), also by Giant Surprise, and a \$55,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings.

“Well, I own the stallion (Giant Surprise). But I really liked this one at the sale, the way she looked,” said Repole. “She ran well her first three times (finishing third, second, and then fourth). But she had been on the inside each time. I talked it over with (trainer) Todd (Pletcher), and we thought she wanted to go farther. I told (jockey) Johnny (Velazquez) to save ground. But if she comes home, go outside...Giant Surprise had one start; he was undefeated...if (Super Surprise) wasn’t by Giant Surprise, I probably wouldn’t have even looked at her (at the sale).”

The fractions were swift and contentious in the Maid of the Mist. After an opening half-mile in :46.72, Gabrielle Farm’s homebred Frosty Margarita shook loose from her 11 rivals, establishing a clear advantage. The daughter of Frost Giant, sent out by trainer Rudy Rodriguez and ridden by Ortiz, turned into the lane in front of the 3-5 favorite She’s All Ready, who had finished third last time out in the Frizette Stakes (gr. I).

But true to Repole’s analysis, Velazquez had Super Surprise in high gear and closing willingly on the outside. Entering the final furlong, the ultra-game Frosty Margarita looked to be safe; however, Super Surprise made up several lengths late, getting up for a determined three-quarter-length victory.

The final time for the Maid of the Mist was 1:37.46.

Bred in the Empire State by Allen C. Hallett, Super Surprise, out of Miz Lynne Kelly (by Langfuhr), notched her initial triumph, boosting her earnings to \$204,800, and nearly quadrupling her purchase price.

“I thought she finally put it all together. We knew she was a talented filly,” said assistant Byron Hughes, who saddled her for Pletcher.

Repole, who first came to the track in New York at age 13 and was a super fan of Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Spend a Buck, supports his several stallions by breeding his mares to them.

“I have Uncle Mo, Stay Thirsty, Giant Surprise, Overanalyze, and Overdriven. They all mean a lot to me. And I own (a percentage) of all my stallions,” said Repole.

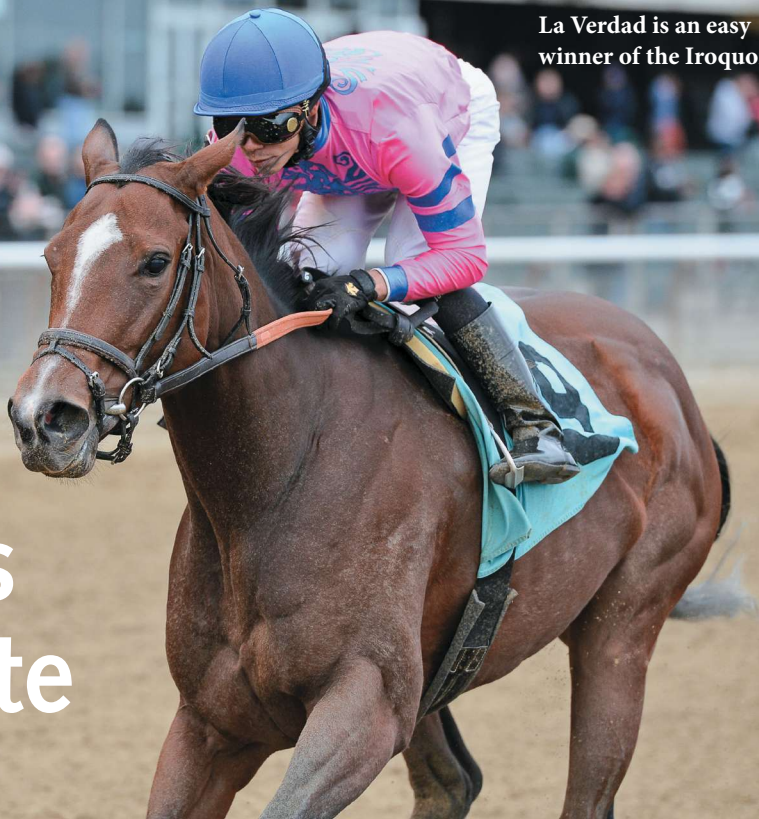

# Exemplars of the State

**ONE OF THE POINTS** of pride of the New York breeding program is the success of New York-breds in open company races, and if you need exemplars, look no further than Palace and La Verdad.

The Linda Rice-trained stablemates have done New York proud on the open stage over the last several years. A \$20,000 claim in 2012, Palace has gone on to win more than \$1.4 million and two grade I races: the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap and the Forego Stakes, at Saratoga in 2014.

A private purchase in late 2013, La Verdad has earned nearly an identical sum, winning five graded stakes—four at the grade II level—for Sheila Rosenblum’s Lady Sheila Stable.

But Rice is mindful of their state-bred roots and doesn’t hesitate to run them in restricted races—to get them a win, to tune them up...or in the case of Empire Showcase Day Oct. 24 at Belmont Park, to give them a possible audition for the Breeders’ Cup World Championships.

Entered in the \$150,000 Hudson Handicap and the \$150,000 Iroquois Stakes, respectively, Palace and La Verdad had been pre-entered in the Breeders’ Cup. Rice made the call to run them at Belmont going 6½ furlongs, though not for the same reason for each horse.

“Things haven’t unfolded well for Palace this year,” said Rice, “but he’s still a great horse and I opted to stay here and get a win under his belt. I think he’s capable of winning the (TwinSpires) Breeders’ Cup Sprint (gr. I) on a given day, but we just haven’t had a smooth ride this year.”

Said Rice of La Verdad’s Iroquois, “She was going to breeze Saturday or Sunday (Oct. 24 or 25), anyway, so we decided to run her.”

And after La Verdad won the Iroquois for the second year in a row, this time by 3¾ lengths geared down, the race did have the look of a public workout for her start in the Oct. 31 TwinSpires Breeders’ Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I).

But for all the similarities between the two horses—they were also both odds-on



favorites in their respective races—their paths diverged after their victories.

A series of minor health issues has led to a disappointing 2015 for Palace; he was winless on the season before the Hudson, a race he won in 2013, and it was time, said Rice, for him to begin his second career. It was announced last month that the son of City Zip would stand at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky in 2016.

“I wanted to find him a good home,” said Rice, who trained City Zip to a sweep of Saratoga’s juvenile graded stakes in 2000, “and this is the year that he needs to move on in order to be the next City Zip...or maybe better.”

Bred by The Peter J. Callahan Revocable Trust Dated 2/28/02, Palace is out of the End Sweep mare Receivership. He began his racing career in the barn of Bill Mott before Rice claimed him in 2012 for owner Antonino Miuccio.

Rice expects Palace to race one more time before he retires, but that race won’t come over the Belmont track the bay horse seems to love, with a record there of 5-2-1 in 10 attempts. He’ll point to either the Nov. 26 Fall Highweight Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct, which he won in 2013, or the \$350,000 Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash at Laurel Park Nov. 14.

“He’s a great horse,” said Rice. “It’s going to be hard to let him go.”

Miuccio wasn’t at Belmont to see Palace get back to the winner’s circle, but his stable pal Rosenblum represented him in the photo, one race before she headed back there to celebrate her own horse’s victory. La Verdad kept her 2015 record intact, a perfect six-for-six, while keeping Rosenblum’s Breeders’ Cup hopes alive.

“Everyone wants to win a Breeders’ Cup race,” she said. “Our options are open.”

But the Breeders’ Cup presented less-than-ideal options: enter the Filly & Mare Sprint and run seven furlongs, farther than the mare’s preferred distance; or enter the Sprint at six furlongs and run against males.

Rice opted to run against fillies and mares, in a race that might

mark the end of La Verdad’s stellar three-year career.

“It’s been a hectic week, trying to evaluate all our options. It’s been a very difficult decision, what do with her in the Breeders’ Cup,” said Rice. “We wanted to let the speed run away from her and see how she would do before we spent the money to run seven furlongs, and it went beautifully. As she’s gotten older, she’s rated better. It makes me feel better about running her the seven furlongs and Sheila feels better about it, too.”

Bred by Eklektikos Stable, La Verdad is by Yes It’s True out of the Hook and Ladder mare Noble Fire. The dam has thrown three foals of racing age, all of which are winners. La Verdad’s half sister, by City Zip, Hot City Girl (also owned by Rosenblum), won the Charles Town Oaks Stakes (gr. III) in September.

A resident of New York City, Rosen-

blum had begun the weekend in Philadelphia for parents’ weekend, visiting her daughter, a first-year college student. She planned to head back following the races, the weekend an encapsulation of the turn that her life has taken since she dove into Thoroughbred racing several years ago.

Rosenblum has nearly two dozen horses in training, but La Verdad is the stable star, the horse that she refers to as her third child. The 5-year-old bay is entered in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, and Rosenblum is clearly torn about selling her, aware of her value as a broodmare prospect yet not quite ready to make the leap into breeding herself at this point.

Neither Rice nor Rosenblum has any regrets about staying home to run in the Iroquois, even with the Breeders’ Cup and a grade I tempting them to skip it and head straight to Kentucky.

“It was a tough week; they weren’t easy decisions,” admitted Rice. “But one thing I know about horse racing—it’s not easy to win (especially) if you don’t take what’s right in front of you, and there’s nothing wrong with winning.

“La Verdad has accomplished so much in her career that she’s deserving of a grade I.”

She added, “If we could just get the right time and place.” 🐾

Lubash gets past Kharafa...this time

## Old rivals Lubash, Kharafa meet in Mohawk; full sisters run one-two in the Ticonderoga

**TRADITION WAS THE NAME** of the game in the \$200,000 Mohawk Stakes for older runners on the turf during Empire Showcase Day Oct. 24 at Belmont Park.

Owner/breeder Leonard Pivnick, 78, chose the name of his stable, Aliyu Ben J Stable, as a tribute to his father—using his dad's Hebrew name. Meanwhile, Pivnick's homebred, Lubash, an 8-year-old son of Freud, was busy carrying on his own tradition with another thrilling stretch duel against his longtime rival, the 6-year-old Kharafa (by Kitalpha).

The two elder statesmen of the New York-bred turf scene have hooked-up a dozen times in their careers, including finishing one-two in the 2014 edition of the Mohawk, with Kharafa prevailing.

The turf was rock hard (with the runners kicking up clouds of dirt) and the pace was hot in this year's Mohawk, contested at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$  miles on the inner turf course.

The opening quarter-mile was posted in :22.91 and the half-mile in :45.76, with Kharafa and jockey Javier Castellano up close, tracking from third-position. Lubash, however, ridden by Junior Alvarado and trained by Christophe Clement, was racing a reserved seventh in the field of nine runners.

Turning into the grassy stretch, Kharafa raced to the front, opening a one-length lead. Lubash was in behind, ready to roll. And when Kharafa drifted in slightly, Lubash seized the open seam and challenged the leader from his outside flank.

The pair battled valiantly through the lane with Lubash getting up by a head in the last strides.

"It's fun, the two horses. (Kharafa) is tough to catch with an eighth of a mile to go, but it worked out," said Clement. "Sometimes you get lucky and that's it. Nice horse(s)."

The final time was 1:39.08, breaking a course record that had stood for more than 23 years (Roman Envoy, 1:39.38 on May 23, 1992).

"I want to thank Mr. (Ed) Gregory," said Pivnick, who accepted

the winning trophy alongside his son, Todd. “Mr. Gregory is the one who said I should send the mare (Nasty Cure, by Cure the Blues) to Freud. He’s the one who bred and foaled (Lubash) and raised him until he was 2.”

Ed and Diane Gregory ran Carapan Farm near Freehold.

“Freud’s a (full) brother to Giant’s Causeway and a son of Storm Cat,” said Todd Pivnick, who is the football coach at Hanover Park High School in Morristown, N.J. “(Freud) was producing such stock that the value in New York was great. So (Ed Gregory) felt that going to him was a nice match.”

Though Lubash may be in the twilight of his career, the tradition will continue for the Pivnicks with Lubash’s unraced full sister, Miriam, who is named in honor of Leonard Pivnick’s mother. After battling some early issues, the 3-year-old is ready to begin her racing career under Clement’s tutelage.

Lubash recorded his 16th win from 45 starts, as the millionaire padded his earnings to \$1,356,849.

Ultra-game in defeat, Paul Braverman and Timothy Pinch’s Kharafa settled for the runner-up spot in the Mohawk. Bred by High Meadow Farm, the gelding is trained by Timothy Hills, who is assisted in New York by Raul Zaragoza. Kharafa’s lifetime record now stands at 11-9-4 from 31 starts as he closes in on the \$1-million mark in earnings (\$875,137).

Barry K. Schwartz’ Iron Power (by Mizzen Mast), who also hails from the Clement barn, finished third.

## Family Fun

The theme of family tradition continued in the \$200,000 Ticonderoga Stakes for older fillies and mares at the same trip on the turf as trainer Bruce Levine and Dr. James McGlenn’s Bloodlines Racing Partnerships ran one-two with full sisters by Invasor—Very Funny, by Distorted Humor: Invading Humor and Distorted Beauty.

Away from the gate, jockey Jose Lezcano got longshot Invading Humor (29-1), a 5-year-old mare, on a relaxed lead in the contentious field of 12 runners.

The early pace was moderate at best, over firm going with Invading Humor

sailing along through unpressured fractions of :23.83 for the opening quarter-mile and :47.42 for the half-mile.

As Lezcano held a hard grasp on Invading Humor, the millionaire even-money favorite Discreet Marq was tracking the pace from third-position along the rail.

Spinning into the stretch, Lezcano turned the remainder of the race into an all-out sprint, motivating Invading Humor beneath right-handed encouragement. Through the final furlong, Invading Humor distanced herself from a cavalry charge of onrushing rivals to register a convincing win.

“She broke good. Bruce (Levine) told

me to put her right on the lead. There’s not much to say. She just kept going,” said Lezcano.

Invading Humor stopped the timer in 1:40.09. She was 1¼ lengths clear of her 4-year-old sister Distorted Beauty, who rallied determinedly beneath jockey Jose Ortiz, to complete the family exacta that paid \$358.50. McGlenn bred both runners.

“I bred to Invasor because he was the best horse in the world, and for (his modest stud fee),” said McGlenn, whom bred and raced Arrrrr along with Robert Genovese, the runner with which Tom Durkin made his famed pirate-voiced race call. “Plus, I was just starting out (Bloodlines Racing Partnerships) and I figured (Invasor) would get us some attention.”

Invading Humor recorded her eighth win from 18 starts, with career earnings of \$500,944.

“She ran in the Yaddo (her previous race on Aug. 28 at Saratoga) and they went super-fast up there. They all just got cooked on a suicide pace,” said Levine. “We had her entered in the (John) Hettinger Stakes (Sept. 20) but had to scratch her the morning of the race. She got hurt in her stall, so it wasn’t by design that she had this much time off.”

Hidden Brook’s Neck of the Moon (by More Than Ready) finished third, while Discreet Marq labored through the stretch to finish 11th. 🐾

# Calling Shane

## Dr. Shane upends 3-10 favorite Championofthenile in the Breeders' Futurity

**DUTCHESS VIEWS FARM'S MICHAEL** Lischin kept the faith while running his homebred Dr. Shane in stakes company all summer long. The son of Freud held his own in stakes while hitting the board in state-bred added-money races at Belmont Park, Saratoga Race Course, and Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack from June to September.

Dr. Shane came through in a surprising way Oct. 17 at Finger Lakes, roaring past 3-10 favorite Championofthenile to win the \$206,963 New York Breeders' Futurity by two lengths. The win was not only worth \$124,178 for Dutchess Views, but being a homebred brought home another \$36,000 in the form of a breeders' award and \$10,000 in a stallion bonus for Freud.

Those kinds of incentives will have Lischin shopping the fall breeding stock sales for more mares to foal at the farm he owns near Pine Plains with Anya Sheckley.

Dr. Shane, who is named for Lischin and Sheckley's son, was a little on the small side as a yearling and bypassed the Fasig-Tipton preferred sale of New York-breds last year. Sent to Webb Carroll in South Carolina, the colt stood out in his early training.

"We called Webb when we were looking to breed the mare back," Lischin said. "I asked about Dr. Shane and if we should go back to Freud. Usually people don't say anything, but they unequivocally said 'yes.'"

Dr. Shane is out of the Dutchess Views mare French Link, a daughter of Orientate. French Link's 3-year-old, Esther the Queen (by Purim), broke her maiden at Belmont Sept. 30. In foal to Freud, French Link will likely return to



Freud again in 2016.

Dr. Shane was sent to trainer Nick Esler's barn where in less than two weeks after arriving he broke his maiden going five furlongs at Belmont Park May 29. Dr. Shane was wheeled right back June 5 in the 5½-furlong Tremont Stakes. Banging against the gate at the break, he faded against open company, finishing 11¼ lengths behind the good Coked and Loaded.

Dr. Shane made three more successive starts in stakes company against fellow New York-breds, running third in Belmont's Rockville Centre Stakes and Saratoga's Funny Cide Stakes, and then finishing second in the Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes before his run in the Breeders' Futurity.

The star of the Futurity was Lady Sheila Stable, Iris Smith Stables and Linda Rice's Championofthenile. The dark bay or brown colt starred earlier in the year at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds when Rice went to \$840,000 to bring him home. He broke his maiden second time out at Saratoga by six lengths and came to Finger Lakes off a third-place finish Sept. 27 in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes at Belmont.

In the six-furlong Futurity, Dr. Shane broke from the rail under Jaime Rodriguez, and was in fourth early as Saratoga Giro went the opening quarter in :21.93. Taken out to the fourth path as Championofthenile under Jose Ortiz Jr. went inside and took the lead on the turn, Dr. Shane was second at the top of the stretch but went past the son of Pioneerof the Nile and drew clear. Dr. Shane, sent off at 13-1, got the trip in 1:12.85.

The stretch run of the Futurity was marred by the breakdown of long-shot Sky Devil, who was making a bid from the back of the pack four wide at the head of the stretch. He was vanned off.

Lischin has mapped out the remainder of the year for Dr. Shane, who now has a 2-1-2 mark from six starts and \$220,328 in earnings. The Nov. 21 Notebook Stakes at Aqueduct and New York Stallion Series Great White Way Division (Dec. 27) loom to close out his juvenile campaign.

"We believe he is going to be even better on the turf," Lischin said. "He has a big foot. Nick rides all of his own horses in the morning, and he's a good judge. He thinks Dr. Shane will excel on turf, and he looks like he might be a really good turf sprinter." 🐾

# Sudden Stars

Sudden Surprise, by first-crop sire Giant Surprise, wins the Bertram F. Bongard

## Juveniles Sudden Surprise, Melodic earn rich stakes scores at Belmont

**MIKE REPOLE WAS QUITE SURPRISED** when he saw the entries for the Sept. 27 Bertram F. Bongard Stakes. His homebred stakes winner Sudden Surprise was to meet only four other 2-year-old New York-bred males, including a pair of flashy maiden winners Championofthenile and Get Jets, who had been acquired for six figures at auction.

But it was Sudden Surprise, a son of New York freshman sire Giant Surprise, who remained undefeated in three starts after springing a mini upset in the \$147,000 Bongard at Belmont Park. Running as the third choice, Sudden Surprise repelled a late charge from second choice Get Jets for a neck decision. Championofthenile, the

favorite, finished third, 1¼ lengths behind the runner-up. The Bongard was the second consecutive stakes win for Sudden Surprise who had captured Saratoga's Funny Cide Stakes in his second start.

"This race might have come up tougher than the Breeders' Cup (Juvenile, gr. I)," Repole said in the winner's circle after the Bongard. "I told someone this is the toughest New York-bred 2-year-old race in the history of New York-bred stakes. This is a grade I race. I was shocked when I saw Championofthenile and Get Jets in this race. I expected both of them to be in a grade I."

After witnessing Sudden Surprise's front-running score in the seven-furlong Bongard, both Repole and the colt's trainer, Todd Pletcher, considered running him in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Keeneland Oct. 31.

Repole owns Giant Surprise, who raced once for him, winning a maiden race at Saratoga in 2011. The horse injured himself that day and was retired. Sudden Surprise's dam, Ready



and Good (by More Than Ready), also raced for Repole and was retired after a single start. Sudden Surprise is Ready and Good's first foal. The dam also produced a New York-bred weanling filly by Stay Thirsty and a New York-bred yearling filly by Overdriven. She is currently in foal to Uncle Mo, the country's leading freshman sire.

Repole already knows to whom he is breeding Ready and Good, whom he keeps at Sugar Maple Farm near Poughquag, in 2016.

"She's going to Giant Surprise," Repole said without hesitation. "The stallion is off to a great start. I think within two or three years he's going to be the number one New York stallion."

A son of Giant's Causeway, Giant Surprise stood the 2015 season at Rockridge Stud near Hudson for a fee of \$2,500. In addition to Sudden Surprise, his first stakes winner, the sire's progeny includes the Repole-owned Surprise Cameo, a maiden winner at Saratoga who followed with a third in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes; and the stakes-placed Super Surprise.

Repole has ownership interests in several other stallions he raced in his silks, including Uncle Mo and Stay Thirsty, but Giant Surprise is the only sire he stands in New York. That is until 2016, when Repole's recently retired graded stakes winner Micromanage will join Giant Surprise at Rockridge Stud.

"When I first started, I just wanted to win races at Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga. I never really knew about the breeding game—I never really thought about it," Repole remarked. "Being in the game now 10 years, it's a really cool feeling not only to own mares but stallions, too, and race their babies.

"But it's not only about breeding New York-breds; I buy New York-breds," he added. "Every single year we probably have eight to 12 in the barn. I'm a New York guy, and I love and support New York racing. The state-bred stakes races are great. I think what you're finding out about New York-breds, that you didn't see five or 10 years ago, is they can win graded and open stakes and allowance races. It's such a great program."

## Melodic 'Seems Right'

Jeff Treadway's breeding operation is in its infancy, but as any breeder will tell you it's never too early to at least contemplate future additions to the broodmare band.

The Treadway-owned Melodic, a fantastically well-bred daughter of Tale of the Cat, out of the Unbridled's Song mare Christina's Melody, marked herself as a superb broodmare prospect with her three-length win in the \$147,000 Joseph A. Gimma Stakes at Belmont Park Sept. 27.

by Treadway for \$150,000 at this year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring 2-year-old sale.

"This is one I have to thank (bloodstock agent) Patti Miller from EQB for," Treadway said after the Gimma. "I didn't actually attend this sale. I sent Patti a list of pedigrees I liked. She selected this filly. Melodic being a New York-bred obviously helps us because our stable is in New York. I'm a big fan of Tale of the Cat, and she was out of this Unbridled's Song mare. The nicking seemed right."

Treadway, who has campaigned multiple grade I winner Sweet Reason and owns grade I-placed New York-bred Wonder Gal, winner of the Oct. 24 Empire Distaff, recently took his involvement in racing to another level and is now breeding New York-breds. His three mares are boarded at Stone Bridge Farm near Gansevoort.

"I'm just organically growing a broodmare band right now," Treadway said. "I have Well Kept, a nice sprinter by Henny Hughes, who is in foal to Yes It's True. I have two others who are not in foal. We tried to breed one of those mares to Freud this year, but she didn't get in foal. I will possibly breed Well Kept to a New York stallion next year. The other two will probably go to Kentucky sires next year, and then I will bring them here to foal and breed back to a New York-based stallion in (2017)."

The Gimma, a New York-bred race for 2-year-old fillies, was Melodic's stakes debut, following a victory at Saratoga in her career bow.

Bred in partnership by Mia Gallo with Dave Stack, Mary Kopley, Sam Palazzole, Bernie Ryan, and others, and foaled at Tom and Mia Gallo's Bluestone Farm near Cambridge, Melodic was purchased

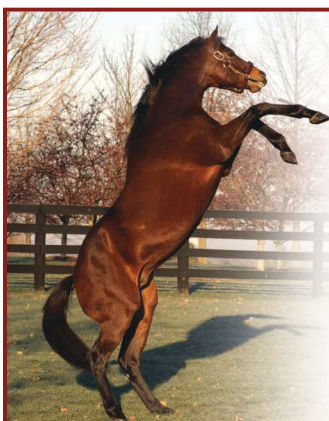
