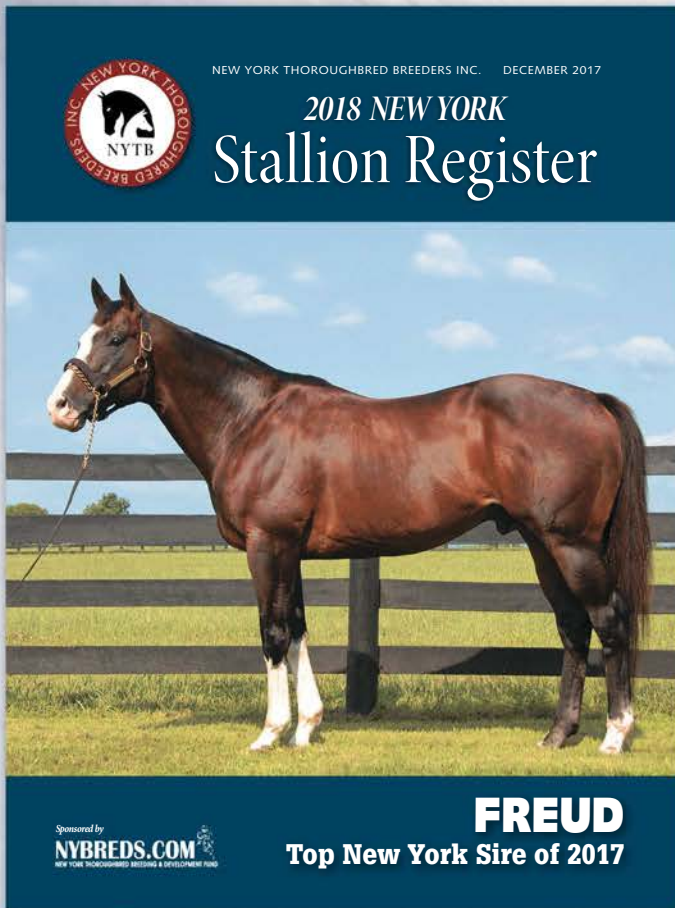

# NYRA's Starter Loyalty Program: the Best Is Yet to Come

**THIS SPRING** the New York Racing Association launched its innovative 2018-19 Starter Loyalty Program. A horse that makes at least five starts on the NYRA circuit during a 12-month period, beginning April 2, 2018, earns an ascending scale of purse bonuses from 5-15%, based on the number of starts. Just about seven months into the program, the data make one thing crystal clear: The program's biggest beneficiaries will be the breeders, owners, and trainers of New York-breds.

With its April-to-April window, the program is designed, like NYRA's \$300 per-start credit program, to increase field size and handle during the Aqueduct winter/spring meets and the racetrack operator will certainly be monitoring that data closely. At the same time, the program is intended to reward the "bread and butter" owners and trainers who support NYRA racing year-round. The overlap of this group and the owners and trainers of New York-breds is extensive.

Statistics for the Starter Loyalty Program through Oct. 19 reveal that so far 60% of the 536 participants (or 237 horses) are New York-breds. Moreover, the percentage of New York-breds receiving Starter Loyalty bonuses increases at each program level. At the "Silver" level, which awards 5% purse bonuses for horses making five and six NYRA starts, New York-breds account for 58.5% of the participants. "Gold" level New York-bred participants who earn 7.5% bonuses for starts seven through nine are 62.8% of the total. Ninety percent of "Platinum" level participants earning 12.5% bonuses for 10 and 11 starts are New York-breds. There are no horses yet eligible for the highest "Diamond" level, which carries a 15% premium.

The number of starts for program participants transfers when horses are claimed or otherwise change owners. Maiden races are not awarded purse bonuses but are counted as starts, so a horse who breaks his maiden in his fifth try will be a Silver member in its next, or sixth race. There are also a handful of safeguards for the welfare of participating horses. Bonuses are not awarded for any horse beaten 25+ lengths or placed on the vet's list for lame-

ness and unsoundness. The program limits the number of eligible starts within 30 days to two.

Translating the award percentages translate into actual awards. For a \$100,000 stakes race this fall at Belmont Park, a NYRA Silver member could receive an additional \$2,750 on top of the \$55,000 winner's share of the purse. For a stakes race at the same level during the Aqueduct Winter meet, a Platinum member could earn an additional \$6,875 above the \$55,000 winner's share.

NYRA has been vigorously promoting the Starter Loyalty program since its inception, reporting most recently that through Oct. 18, more than \$347,300 in purse bonuses had been distributed since the program was rolled out. Empire New York Showcase Day on Oct. 20 (not included in the data cited above) was such a big winner for the program that it earned a press release from NYRA Communications. Of the 89 horses entered in Showcase stakes, 40 were members of the Loyalty Program (34 Silver and six Gold). A total of \$47,185 in bonus money was awarded to horses for the whole card, which brought the program awards total to nearly \$400,000. Silver members Pat On the Back, Highway Star, Offering Plan, Fifty Five, and Bankit won stakes that afternoon.

Racing shifts to Aqueduct Nov. 2, and as I suggested in my title, the best is yet to come. Consider the following statistics for Aqueduct in 2017:

- New York-breds account for 53% of Aqueduct starts
- 33% of Aqueduct's races are restricted to New York-breds
- New York-breds earned 45%, or \$21,089,107, of the total purse money at Aqueduct (\$47,136,780)

New York-breds will be the big winners in the NYRA Starter Loyalty Program this winter, and we should all keep our fingers crossed that NYRA achieves its own goal in improving field size and handle this winter. As we know well, success of Aqueduct and winter racing is essential to the success of our breeding program, so let us hope the NYRA Starter Loyalty Program is just the tool the racetrack needs to achieve this goal. 🐾

## Grade 1 Wins, Breeders' Cup Tries on Tap for NYBs

### Flower Bowl winner Fourstar Crook bound for Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf

Fourstar Crook delivered a career performance Oct. 7 when she charged home from off the pace to win the \$501,000 Flower Bowl Stakes (G1T) on the inner turf at Belmont Park.

The win brings the list of 2018 grade 1-winning New York-breds to five, as she joins Audible, Diversify, Mind Your Biscuits, and Voodoo Song.

The Flower Bowl, a "Win and You're In" Breeders' Cup event, assures Fourstar Crook entry into the Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) Nov. 3 at Churchill Downs.

Trained by Chad Brown for owners Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith, Fourstar Crook is a 6-year-old millionaire by New York's leading sire, Freud (Sequel Stallions).

She's one of five state-breds pre-entered for the Nov. 2-3 Breeders' Cup

World Championships. Last year Chester and Mary Broman's Bar of Gold landed the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1T) at Del Mar. The Bromans' Highway Star was 11th in that race and has been pre-entered for this year's Filly & Mare Sprint off a neck score Oct. 20 in the 6½-furlong Iroquois Stakes on Empire New York Showcase Day (*see page 40*).

While Diversify won't contest the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), rival Mind Your Biscuits will. The 5-year-old son of Posse, winner of the Sept. 29 Lukas Classic Stakes (G3) under the Twin Spires, has the \$6 million race as his first preference and the TwinSpires Sprint (G1) as his second choice. Last year's New York-bred Horse of the Year was second to Diversify in the Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga and second in

the Runhappy Metropolitan Handicap (G1) after winning the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) for the second year in a row.

Patricia Generazio's homebred Disco Partner, sharp in a 4½-length win in Belmont's Belmont Turf Sprint Stakes Oct. 6, will tackle the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) for the second year in a row.

Trainer Christophe Clement said, "(Disco Partner)'s getting older, but he's still one of the best, if not the best sprinter, in New York, and I thought it was a very impressive performance."

Last year the son of Disco Rico closed from 11th to finish third going five furlongs at Del Mar. Churchill Downs' version will be contested at 5½ furlongs.

Pre-entered in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) is Sunrise Stables-bred Giant Expectations. The 5-year-old son of Frost Giant, a grade 2 winner in Southern California last year, was third last time out in Churchill Downs' Ack Ack Stakes (G3) at a mile. Racing for Exline-Border Racing, Gatto Racing, and Garrett Zubok, Giant Expectations is trained by Peter Eurton. Giant Expectations was sixth in last year's Dirt Mile.

New York will be well represented in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) with Somelikeithotbrown, who was sharp in a runner-up effort Sept. 29 at Belmont Park in the Pilgrim Stakes (G3T). Bred by Hot Pink Stables and Sand Dollar Stables, the bay colt is by Big Brown out of the Tapit mare Marilyn Monroan. Mike Maker trains for Skychai Racing and David Koenig's Sand Dollar Stables. Somelikeithotbrown was also second in Saratoga's With Anticipation Stakes (G3T).

## State-Breds Sell Strong in Regional Markets

The New York-bred contingent at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' October yearling auction (Oct. 9-11) saved its best for last. In the second of two open sessions following an opening day select session, colts by New York sires Giant Surprise and Central Banker established the high-water marks for the group.

The New York-bred yearling topper was a chestnut colt by Giant Surprise from the family of Disco Partner. Bred by Dianne Boyken and consigned by Kelli Mitchell, agent, the youngster was hammered down to Bladen Bloodstock for \$75,000. The colt is out of No Mo Magic (by Mo Mon), a New Jersey-bred stakes-placed homebred for Patricia and Frank Generazio.

Coming in a close second to the Giant Surprise colt was a colt from the second crop of Central Banker, who was hammered down to Champion Equine for \$72,000. Bred by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds and Spruce Lane Farm, the bay colt


nearly tripled his value after being purchased at the 2018 OBS winter mixed sale by Dark Star Thoroughbreds and I.C. Stables for \$24,000. The colt's dam Spirit of Rose is a stakes-placed New York-bred mare.

Overall, the New York-bred sale indicators outperformed the cumulative numbers at OBS October. The average New York-bred price of \$15,763 outperformed the \$13,164 overall sale average, as did the \$9,000 median compared to \$7,000 for the general population of the sale.

For stallions that stand, will stand, or stood (deceased) in New York (stallions that are dead or exported prior to 2014 are excluded), and have runners in North America. Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through October 21, 2018. As supplied to BloodHorse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2017 is \$22,593 or 47% of the 2017 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 47% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 15%; Singapore by 68%. # HORSEMAN, ADVOCATE RICK VIOLETTE DIES AT 65

**A TIRELESS ADVOCATE** for New York's horsemen and backstretch workers, trainer Rick Violette died Oct. 21 from complications relating to cancer at his home in Del Ray Beach, Fla. He was 65.

Despite his accomplishments as a trainer—36 graded stakes victories and more than \$44.5 million in purse earnings and conditioner of 2018 grade 1 winner Diversify—Violette was perhaps more well known for his industry work off the racetrack. He served as president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association for 10 years, retiring in 2017 after a quarter of a century on the NYTHA board.

"Rick Violette was one of a kind—

smart, tenacious, and indefatigable," said NYTHA president Joe Appelbaum. "His commitment to racing was unparalleled. From worker's compensation to the racing program to the welfare of our workers, there was no area on track that Rick was not deeply involved in. The last four years have been a great education for me. Working with Rick taught me so much—the history of the game (both on and off track), the inner workings of the backstretch, and the economics facing

the modern trainer. I will miss him."

Among the issues to which he turned his unflagging efforts and energy are NYTHA donations of millions of dollars to benevolence initiatives, including backstretch welfare and scholarships; leading NYTHA to financial stability; and uniform medication policies.

"There aren't enough words to adequately describe Rick's contributions to the racing industry," said Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association chairman Alan Foreman. "Simply put, he was a giant of our industry and a consequential force, both in New York racing and the industry as a whole. Horsemen's leaders are

often criticized. Rick was beloved.

"I had the privilege to work with Rick for more than a decade through many ups and downs in New York racing. He liked to use the term 'battles.' The reality is that he was the true warrior. His perseverance will never be matched," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "Rick did so much tirelessly on behalf of his fellow horsemen. Whether you agreed with him or not on an issue, I only hope people can appreciate the time and effort he put into every situation he was involved in. He never sold anything short and was truthfully honest, a true gentleman. Rick stuck to his morals and always kept to his beliefs, and I feel not many people can say that. I had the utmost respect for him and learned much from his proper demeanor.

"I'm glad the world was reminded this year again with how good a horseman he truly was," Cannizzo continued. "He was very good at his craft, and Diversify allowed him to prove it again. We tend to forget all of the ones from the past for what is present, and he had a laundry list of talented horses. Furthermore, he arguably was one of the best 2-year-old trainers of the modern era.

"It's proving to be difficult to lose someone you confide with on a weekly basis. I'm very happy we shared a few nice moments this past summer and got to reflect on the past 10 years. I made a few promises to him this past week that I will have to keep. They would be much easier if he was still around."

NYTHA noted that a few of the many accomplishments during Violette's presidency included

- Led NYTHA through the bankruptcy and reorganization of the New York Racing Association, protecting approximately \$25 million in purse money that was left exposed during the process and would have been lost without NYTHA's actions;
- Negotiated the horsemen's share of video lottery terminal revenue, fighting to get the share for purses from 5.5% to 7.5%, which nets about \$15 million in additional revenue to purses annually;
- Was a founding member of the THA in 1995. The THA established the Mid-

Atlantic Uniform Medication Program, which is now the National Uniform Medication Program;

- Secured legislation that mandates NYRA must have the agreement of the NYTHA and the New York Thoroughbred Breeders in making any changes to Aqueduct racing dates, ensuring the protection of year-round racing;
- Secured a seat on the NYRA board of directors for New York's horsemen and fought to get back the voting rights for horsemen and breeders;
- Worked with the New York State Gaming Commission to establish a split-sample program in New York;
- Led the reorganization and strengthening of the Backstretch Em-

ployee Service Team.

Violette was also an advocate for retired racehorses, serving as a founding member of the board of the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance and founding the NYTHA TAKE2 Second Career Thoroughbred Program and TAKE THE LEAD Thoroughbred Retirement Program.

Violette began training Thoroughbreds in 1977. A native of Worcester, Mass., he was first drawn to horses as a teenager. A graduate of the University of Massachusetts-Lowell, he said in an interview with the university, "We were driving back from the World's Fair in Montreal, my parents and I, when we stopped at this dude ranch-type place,

**New York-bred Upstart won the 2015 Holy Bull and took Violette to the Kentucky Derby**

somewhere in upstate New York. They were offering pony rides for kids. Well, I got on and rode one, half an hour or so. And that was all it took.”

An accomplished show rider, Violette took out his trainer's license shortly after graduating in 1975 with a degree in political science, saddling his first winner in 1978 at Rockingham Park.

He worked at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, Ont., for three years and as an assistant to trainer David Whiteley. He won his first graded stakes race, the Lexington Stakes (G3T), in 1989 with Coosaragga.

Among the most high-profile trainers on the New York circuit, Violette trained New York-bred Read the Footnotes (by Smoke Glacken) to wins in the 2003 Nashua Stakes (G3) and Remsen Stakes (G2) and 2004 Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) en route to a seventh-place finish in the Kentucky Derby (G1).

Another recent standout is fellow New York-bred Samraat (by Noble Causeway), winner of the 2014 Withers (G3) and Gotham Stakes (G3) and runner-up in that year's TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (G1). Owned by longtime client Leonard Riggio's My Meadowview Farm, Samraat finished fifth in the Kentucky Derby.

A year later Violette was back at Churchill Downs with a Derby contender, this one owned by Ralph Evans, a client for three

decades, and WinStar Farm. Upstart was a multiple graded stakes winner who retired with earnings of more than \$1.7 million.

Continuing his streak with New York-breds, Violette had as his most recent stable star Evans and Lauren Evans' Diversify, winner of the 2017 Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1). Diversify went on to win the Suburban Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park in July and followed it with a score in the Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course.

“Rick Violette embodied New York racing, and his commitment to the men and women who are the backbone of our sport was unparalleled,” said NYRA CEO and president Chris Kay. “Rick was a powerful advocate in Albany for the interests of horsemen and women across New York. Knowing how hard he worked, and the determination he showed throughout his life, it was particularly fitting to see the success Rick enjoyed over the past year with multiple grade 1 winner Diversify. On behalf of the New York Racing Association, we offer our condolences to Rick's family, friends, and colleagues.”

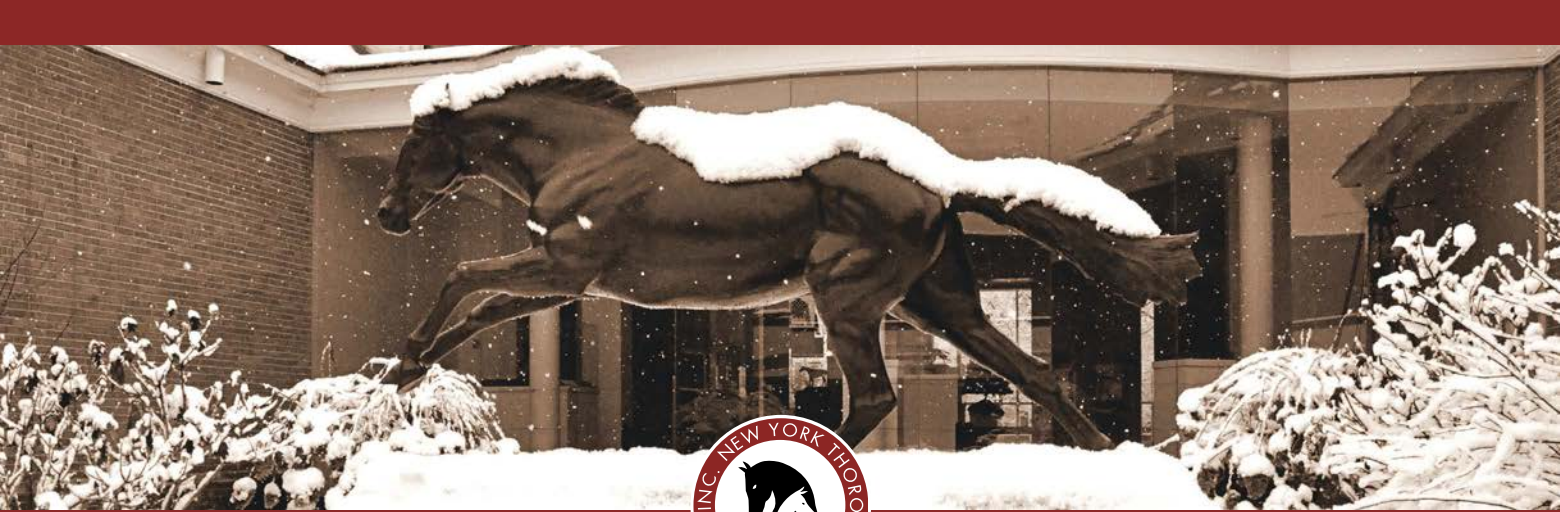

# HIGH AND TIGHT

Fewer hips, higher quality  
lift one-day Fall Mixed Sale

**A VASTLY REDUCED CATALOG** that put a premium on “commercially-viable” horses, a selection of mares from top breeders Chester and Mary Broman’s operation, and a robust market for weanlings lifted spirits as well as the average price and median at the Fasig-Tipton New York Fall Mixed Sale. The one-day auction, held Oct. 15 at the Humphrey S. Finney Sale Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, was considered a success from the sale company, to the sellers and the buyers.

Overall, 115 of the 170 that went through the ring sold for \$3,381,200 compared to 236 being offered last year, with 144 selling for \$3,265,000. The average price of \$29,402 was up 29.7% from the 2017 average of \$22,674, and the median rose 75%, from \$12,000 to \$20,000.

The market for weanlings was solid, lifted by the progeny of newcomers to the New York stallion scene: Laoban, War Dancer, and Central Banker, the leading first-crop sire

in New York this year and sixth on the national list (through Oct. 16).

A weanling colt by Laoban topped the sale at \$140,000, going to Bluewater Sales, agent, as part of Becky Thomas' Sequel New York, agent, consignment.

Machmer Hall, the Kentucky-based outfit run by Carrie and Craig Brogden, was the sale's leading buyer, spending \$370,000 for four lots (two weanlings and two mares).

"It's a great environment, and the program has continued to expand," Carrie Brogden said. "Even though we don't necessarily breed in New York, the two mares we bought we are keeping in New York to foal since they were year-round residents."

Machmer Hall purchased Bag of Tricks, a 5-year-old daughter of Bernardini—Wouldthisbemagic, by Clever Trick, in foal to Unified, for \$95,000 and went to \$50,000 for Back-

wood Bay, a 5-year-old mare by Girolamo—Arradoul, by Dixieland Band, in foal to classic winner Exaggerator.

Both were from Sequel New York's consignment of mares for the Bromans, and both had been stakes-placed runners in New York-bred company.

"Mr. Broman has been making a reduction of his mares for a while," Thomas said. "And now we're cutting into the cream. He's trying to get down to a number (of mares) he feels comfortable with."

"It's great to see the younger mares, with younger, fresh pages," Brogden said. "Those Broman mares helped the sale a lot. When they're handpicked by Becky Thomas, you know they are going to be some beautiful mares there, and that's truly what they were."

The RNA rate at the sale was 32.4%, down from 39% last year. The RNA rate for the weanlings tumbled from 44.8% to 30.3% while the broodmare/broodmare prospect RNA rate rose. There were 24 fewer broodmares offered in 2018.

"It was a consistent marketplace," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning. "It reflects the economic realities where the breeders have learned and improved and have put a greater emphasis on quality over quantity. The percentage of 'non-commercial' horses in the sale process now has diminished greatly from where it was a few years ago."

“What was encouraging was the strength of the mares. The mares that were commercially viable—by age, pedigree, and covering sire—there was significant interest and demand for them in a very healthy marketplace,” he said.

Laoban, a son of top sire Uncle Mo and winner of the Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) at Saratoga in 2016 for Southern Equine Stable and McCormick Racing, not only produced the sale-topper, but was the leading sire by volume—14 of 15 sold—and gross at the sale. Laoban stands at Thomas' Sequel Stalls New York for \$7,500.

“We couldn't have been more thrilled,” said Thomas. “The biggest thing is when you go to do these stallions in New York the biggest thing is support. What is the long-range plan? Southern Equine (who raced Laoban) stepped up. They bought a mare in foal to Laoban, and they bought two Laobans to race.”

As for the sale-topper, Thomas said: “He was a late April baby. He scared me to death. We didn't get to wean him until late, and we needed another month, but everybody could look through that.”

Bred by Thomas and Lyn Burleson, the weanling is out of

the Broken Vow mare Promising Vow.

The leading sire of weanlings by average (three or more sold) was Outwork, who stands at WinStar Farm near Versailles, Ky. Also by Uncle Mo, the grade 1-winning Outwork was raced by New York market supporter Mike Repole.

An Outwork colt, out of Bluegrass Ellie, by Bluegrass Cat, sold to Machmer Hall for \$125,000.

“This horse was exceptional regardless of what state he was bred in,” Brogden said. “But for him to be a New York-bred is an added bonus.”

The weanlings sold averaged \$30,576, the highest average posted at the sale that was first held in 2012. The median, \$23,000, was also a record.

The highest-priced weanling filly, a daughter of Freud—Just Say Hey, by Rockport Harbor, was hammered down for \$70,000. Purchased by Jonathan Thorne, she was bred by Mr. and Mrs. James Curran and Dr. and Mrs. John McDermott and was consigned by Logan Farm Sales, agent.

“It's indicative of the strength of the New York-bred program,” Browning said. “It's a great program for breeders and racing operations. There will continue to be significant demand for quality New York-breds, and that was seen earlier this week.”

“There is also quite a bit of demand for the new sires in New York. Laoban and War Dancer were both well represented by a significant number of weanlings, and the market received them well.” 🐾

## Two for Two

**TWO YEARS AGO NEARLY** to the day, Pat On the Back triumphed on Empire New York Showcase Day at Belmont Park, winning the Sleepy Hollow Stakes for 2-year-olds by 1½ lengths at odds of 20-1, the second-longest shot on the board.

On Oct. 20, he was back in the winner's circle on Showcase Day, winning the \$314,850 Empire Classic Handicap by an identical margin, but this time as the 2-1 favorite.

Stumbling slightly at the break, Pat On the Back broke from post nine under regular rider Dylan Davis and established position just off of Sea Foam and Mr. Buff (who finished fifth in that Sleepy Hollow two years ago). Staying to the outside, Pat On the Back dropped a bit farther back as Hit It Once More took advantage of space on the rail to claim third place.

Moving into the far turn, Davis began to ask Pat On the Back, maintaining his outside position and racing three-wide heading into the stretch. Sea Foam yielded with little resistance, but a determined Mr. Buff made Pat On the Back work in the stretch, staying on for the show spot while Can You Diggitt got up late for second. The final time for the nine furlongs was 1:49.76.

In nine starts at Belmont Park, Pat On the Back has three wins, three seconds, and two thirds.

“This horse has just performed so well in his last four races,” said Harold Lerner, who owns the horse with AWC Stables and Nehoc Stables. “I think his three losses were by less than a length combined. He tries hard all the time, and he loves the surface. Dylan did a great job with him. I always have to resist giving the jockey instructions in the paddock, but he knows what he has to do, and he did it perfectly today.”

One of those three losses came in the May 28 Commentator Stakes, when Pat On the Back finished a nose behind Diversify, who went on to win the Suburban Stakes (G2) and Whitney Stakes (G1) later in the summer.

“Dylan was able to put himself exactly where he wanted to be with this horse today,” Lerner continued. “I’ve seen too many races where a horse is a little tardy out of the gate, then you have to catch up a little bit, but we were in the right spot the whole race.”

Kenny McPeck trained Pat On the Back until May of this year, and it was he who selected the son of Congrats from

the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, purchasing the horse as agent for \$70,000. When McPeck opted not to have stalls at Belmont this fall, longtime client Lerner transferred Pat On the Back to Jeremiah Englehart, who trains a number of other horses for Lerner.

Out of the Awesome Again mare Accomplished, Pat On the Back was bred by Sugar Maple Farm. By far the mare’s most accomplished offspring, Pat On the Back is a half sibling to seven foals that raced, all of them winners.

“I’m big on the page, big on breeding,” said Lerner. “Congrats is a son of A.P. Indy, and he’s shown himself to be a really nice sire.”

“We’ve got another Congrats, Harvey Wallbanger, with Kenny in Kentucky,” said Wayne Cutler of AWC Stables, named for himself and his wife, Adriana. “Kenny deserves all the credit for picking out Pat On the Back, a \$70,000 horse that’s now earned more than \$700,000.”

The win was the second on the card for Lerner and Nehoc Stables, whose

Runaway Lute won the Hudson Handicap earlier in the day.

The Cutlers, Lerner, and Nehoc’s Jack Cohen have owned horses together for about six years. Lerner and Cutler met in Saratoga while attending a benefit for the Belmont Child Care Association.

“Harold sat at our table,” said Cutler, “and my wife invited him over to dinner, and he introduced us to Jack, and now we’re buddies.”

In addition to purse earnings, Pat On the Back was eligible for a bonus from the New York Racing Association Starter Loyalty Program, which offers extra money for horses who run regularly in New York, with several tiers of incentives. As a Silver level member for having made five starts on NYRA tracks since early April, Pat On the Back earned an additional \$8,250.

“We love the New York program,” said Cutler. “We buy New York-breds every year.”

“I’m so proud of this horse,” said Lerner. “He’s a hard-knocking, working-class hero as far as I’m concerned. He showed himself to have a lot of heart in the stretch.”

### **Bonita a Beauty**

The fifth running of the \$250,000 Empire Distaff Handicap was a thing of beauty, with favored Bonita Bianca cruising to a six-length win, her third in five starts this year.

Returning to dirt after an unsuccessful venture on turf in the John Hettinger Stakes at Belmont Park last month, Bonita Bianca broke from post 10 under Jose Lezcano. In no hurry to get inside, they ran a length off the lead as English Soul and Bluegrass Flag set the early pace, running an opening quarter-mile in :23.71. Settling in the three-path, Bonita Bianca joined the leaders, and the trio separated themselves from the field heading into the far turn.

Moving easily past her rivals coming around the turn, Bonita Bianca sailed to the lead, with Bluegrass Flag and English Soul both surrendering. Split Time and Tiznow’s Smile closed from well

off the pace to finish second and third, respectively. The final time for the 1¼-mile race was 1:43.18.

The 4-year-old Bonita Bianca was also a winner on Showcase day two years ago, when she got her first stakes win with a 5¼-length score in the Maid of the Mist Stakes. She was third in this race last year.

The chestnut filly is owned by long-time partners Michael Dubb, Michael Imperio, and Bethlehem Stables. She is trained by Jason Servis.

"She's really comfortable on the outside," said Dubb, calling her post position "favorable."

"She had everything to her inside, and that's her comfort zone, and she was in it today," he said. "Trying her on turf seemed like the right thing to do. She has a big foot, and we always had it on our mind. She didn't take to it, but she's by Curlin, so she'll go long, she'll go short, and she loves Belmont Park."

"She broke really good," said Lezcano. "When I asked her at the quarter pole, she went on...and she kicked home. She did everything right today to win the race."

Her impressive win earned her a 102 Equibase Speed Figure, the highest of her career and her first triple-digit figure.

Bonita Bianca is out of the multiple graded stakes winner Friendly Michelle (by Artax), who won the Prioress Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park in 2004. Two years later she sold for \$1.15 million to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings at the Keeneland November sale. Most recently Friendly Michelle brought \$42,000 at the same sale in 2013, in foal with Bonita Bianca. She was purchased by Steve Rowan.

Bred by Dormellito Stud, Bonita Bianca was purchased by Dubb for \$97,000 at the 2016 Ocala Breeders' Sales' March 2-year-olds auction. She's earned \$609,667 and has wins in five New York-bred stakes races. Eleven of her 14 starts have come in stakes, and the remarkably consistent filly has finished out of the top three only three times. As a juvenile, she was third in the Demoiselle Stakes (G2)

at Aqueduct.

She is nominated to the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale Nov. 4, and while her most recent win will no doubt enhance her value, Dubb said that no final decisions about her future have been made.

"We'll talk it over among the partners," he said. "We'll make that decision together."

Dubb and his partners have steadfastly stayed out of the breeding business, in New York and elsewhere, preferring to concentrate on racing, then offer his

most accomplished runners at auction. Should the owners elect to keep Bonita Bianca out of the sale, she could reasonably be expected to return to racing next year; Dubb's New York-bred Fourstar Crook began running at 2, and this year, at age 6, she won her first grade 1 race, the Oct. 7 Flower Bowl Stakes at Belmont.

Among the biggest supporters of the New York-bred program, Dubb had four horses entered on the Showcase day card, and he came away with two stakes wins; along with the Distaff, he won the Mohawk Stakes with Offering Plan, who came away with a dominant six-length win.

"It's really nice to see our New York brethren who work so hard come out and have the opportunity to compete," he said.

"When I go home tonight, I'll be looking at the calendar trying to figure out when Showcase day is next year. It's the greatest. There are probably more New Yorkers here than on any other day. The track is busy, and it's one of the best betting cards of the meet." 🐾

## Bankit, Surge of Pride prove best in juvenile tests

# Count On It

**IN 2002 SACKATOGA STABLE'S** Funny Cide, favored at 1-5, captured the Sleepy Hollow Stakes by a desperate neck over Spite the Devil. The very next year began a new chapter in New York-bred history when the sophomore son of Distorted Humor triumphed in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (both G1).

Every season since, the Sleepy Hollow (worth \$256,875 Oct. 20)—named for the legendary setting of author Washington Irving's story of a headless horseman—contested at a one-turn mile, places an ever-hopeful burden on the withers of the winner.

That 2018 mantle rests with Winchell Thoroughbreds and Willis Horton Racing's Bankit (by Central Banker), who rallied through the stretch to score a facile  $5\frac{3}{4}$ -length tally in the 2018 edition.

Out of Sister in Arms, by Colonel John, Bankit was bred in partnership by Hidden Brook Farm and Blue Devil Racing.

"We liked the fact there was very little inbreeding until you get to the 4x5 Mr. Prospector cross," said Dan Hall, a partner at Hidden Brook Farm. "Additionally you bring In Reality (through Relaunch), into the Mr. Prospector of Central Banker's pedigree, while bringing Hail to Reason (from Central Banker's dam's side). Physically we thought it was a good match, as the mare has good size and length, to complement the more (typical physical attributes) associated with the Speightstown line. Finally, we had purchased a share in Central Banker and claimed Sister in

Arms because we knew of her physical (attributes) and had raced her half sister Quiet Meadow. Commercial value-wise, it seemed like a good fit as well.”

A dozen freshmen broke from the gate in the Sleepy Hollow. Bankit, who had shown sharp speed in his quartet of career starts, was not among the leaders, however. Surprisingly, the Steve Assmussen-trained colt occupied eighth position beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr., after a fast opening quarter-mile of :22.88.

“We never thought he had to be on the lead,” said assistant trainer Toby Sheets.

Approaching the furlong marker, Bankit struck the front and quickly pulled away from the competition under left-handed encouragement.

“I was pretty confident he would get the distance today,” added Sheets. “We changed the way he gallops in the morning. We worked him in company behind horses after his last race. And the way he looked, we were confident he was going to run well. He showed today he’s got a little bit of talent. I’m very happy with him.”

The final time was 1:37.69.

bred by Dr. Jerry Bilinski and Witte, and is trained by Ollie Figgins III.

Louis Ulman’s Strive for a Cure (by Goldencents), from the barn of conditioner Dale Capuano, finished third.

### A Surge on the Dirt

Though he only raced a single season, Kantharos understood how to succeed on the racetrack. As a juvenile, the son of Lion Heart scored in both the 2010 Saratoga Special Stakes (G2) and the Bashford Manor Stakes (G3). That same precocity was evident in Kantharos’ 2-year-old filly Surge of Pride, who rallied late in the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes to score a 1¼-length victory in her dirt debut.

Owned in partnership by Grey Fox Stable and Mary and Chester Broman, who also bred the filly, Surge of Pride entered the New York-bred stakes contest with a maiden win at 5½ furlongs on “firm” going at Saratoga in late August and a fourth-place finish in Laurel’s Selima Stakes Sept. 22 over a “yielding” course for trainer Linda Rice.

Dirt was a question mark. But the purse money in the Maid of the Mist was substantial enough to invest the time and effort in searching for an answer.

“She trained pretty well on the dirt,” said Rice. “But there were things that made me think she might want to run on the grass. So I breezed her on the turf, and she breezed dynamite. Then all the wise guys and myself decided to put her on the turf in a maiden race, and she won impressively. Then she ran so-so at Laurel...I was a little disappointed in her effort. I then told (the Bromans), ‘We don’t know if she can run on the dirt, but for \$250,000 let’s find out.’”

Beneath Junior Alvarado, Surge of Pride rated along the rail in the early going, tracking an opening half-mile of :47.70 from eighth position in the field of 11 juvenile fillies.

Ever patient, Alvarado turned for home with a handful of horse. He had to wait twice before pushing the button—once when another runner took

Ortiz began to drive Bankit through an opening on the rail midway on the far turn, while saving precious ground.

Dugout (by Adios Charlie), winner of both the Funny Cide Stakes at Saratoga and the New York Breeders’ Futurity at Finger Lakes, sailed along on the lead through a half-mile in :46.57 as the 5-2 favorite.

Turning into the lane, the pacesetters faded while Ortiz swung Bankit to the outside.

“I got a perfect trip,” said Ortiz. “I thought there was a lot of speed in the race, and we have speed, but we didn’t want to be on the front and go head-to-head in a duel. We tried to relax through the first part of the race and then finish, and that’s what he did.”

Bankit won for the second time in five starts, increasing his earnings to \$249,625.

Darlene Bilinski and John Witte Sr.’s Bustin Hoffman (by Bustin Stones) put in a strong late run on the outside to capture the runner-up slot. The colt,

the open seam beside him and on a second occasion when a pair of fillies from behind got the jump on putting in their stretch runs.

Once clear, having tipped to the outside, Surge of Pride stormed past the competition with relative ease, appearing to relish the one-turn mile, and perhaps even more ground in the future.

The first foal out of the unraced Solar Surge, by Bernardini, the winner stopped the timer in 1:38.05.

Surge of Pride has won two of three starts and has earnings of \$184,750.

Elegant Zip (by Run Away and Hide) finished a solid second. The filly is trained by David Donk, who is a co-owner in partnership with Sean Carney, Michael McMahon, and Copper Beech Stables.

Treadway Racing Stable's Kept True (by Yes It's True), sent out by trainer Leah Gyarmati, finished third.

The original Maid of the Mist comes from an Iroquois legend of a bereaved

young woman who took her canoe over the falls, hoping to plunge to her death. She was caught by the god of thunder and taken to live beneath the roaring

waters. Today, tourists get to experience that same roar through the Maid of the Mist boat ride, feeling the power and spray of Niagara Falls. 🌊

## Speed on the 'Way'

**A YEAR AGO CHESTER AND MARY** Broman's homebred Highway Star was prepping for a run in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1), the cap on a year that saw her win three of eight races and place in three others. All three wins came in graded stakes.

It was another Broman filly, Bar of Gold, who won the Filly & Mare Sprint, and in retrospect, Highway Star's 11th-place finish, the worst in her career, might have been a harbinger of a tough year to come.

Coming into the 6½-furlong Iroquois Stakes on Empire New York Showcase Day Oct. 20 at Belmont Park, Highway Star had been winless in five starts, the runner-up in three of them. Trainer Rodrigo Ubillo made the call to give her some class relief, a decision that landed her back in the winner's circle.

Breaking alertly, the 5-year-old mare was immediately taken back by David Cohen, who was riding Highway Star for the first time. Racing just off the rail in fifth of the eight-horse field early on, they didn't stay there long. Heading up the backstretch, Cohen and his mount began to make up ground through early fractions of :22.60 and :45.64, and by the time they hit the far turn, they had moved up to fourth place, looming a threat to the pacesetting Royal Inheritance.

As the field hit the stretch, it looked as though Highway Star and fellow Broman-raced entrant Pauseforthe cause would duel to the wire, along with Dream Maker

Racing's Satisfy. Highway Star tangled with the two of them while slipping up the rail, getting herself a neck in front at the wire. Satisfy was second, three-quarters of a length to the good of Pauseforthecause. The final time for the race worth \$156,525 was 1:16.08.

"She showed a lot of heart going through, pushing through the hole, and fighting," said Cohen. "She earned it today."

The Bromans also won the Iroquois in 2005 with Seeking the Ante, who now has her own namesake race.

Highway Star is by Girolamo, who began his stud career at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson. Highway Star is from his first crop and out of the stakes-placed Cat Thief mare Stolen Star, who was fourth in the 2007 Iroquois. Highway Star's 3-year-old half brother, Fast Getaway (by Into Mischief), is trained by Linda Rice and has one win in three starts.

Highway Star came into the Iroquois off a sixth-place finish in the Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) in September, a race she won last year.

"She was too ready to run," said Ubillo of that race. "She hadn't run for months, she was rank, and she didn't really run her race. I was disappointed because if she'd have won, I probably would have said, 'Let's go to the Breeders' Cup.'

"David got her toward the inside today and moving pretty good. I told Chester she was going to win. She wasn't even running at the end; she was waiting for the competition, with her ears pricked."

The Bromans were typically taciturn with regard to Highway Star's future; on retirement she'll join their prodigious broodmare band, but they are undecided when that will happen.

"We never know," said Mary Broman with a laugh.

For Ubillo, who got his first graded stakes with Highway Star in the 2016 Go for Wand Handicap (G3), the win came as a relief.

"Nothing has been right since the beginning of the year," he said. "She got banged up in the stall, the weather last winter—it's been frustrating."

"But," he went on, "I'm always optimistic, and I know she's a talented horse. She keeps the dream alive."

Highway Star has been pre-entered for this year's Filly & Mare Sprint Nov. 3 at Churchill Downs.

### In the Purple

Harold Lerner and Nehoc Stables got their first of two stakes wins on the day when Runaway Lute held on to win the \$150,900 Hudson Handicap at 6½ furlongs.

The 4-year-old was making his first start since July 4, when he won a seven-furlong allowance optional claiming race for state-breds at Belmont Park by ¼ lengths. A similar race, one scheduled for a week before the Hudson, was the plan, but Runaway Lute forced his trainer to change plans.

"This horse is a trainer's nightmare," said a happy Gary Contessa, the trainer's expression belying his words. "He's been driving me nuts as far as keeping him healthy and sound. Thank God it all

came together today."

With Javier Castellano in the irons, Runaway Lute broke from the outside eight post, then moved quickly up to take on the early leader Eye Luv Lulu. Confidently taking the lead, he opened up by two lengths in the stretch and held on to win by three-quarters of a length in 1:15.70. A closing Gold for the King, the 2-1 favorite, finished second, with Celtic Chaos another three-quarters of a length back in third.

The victory gave Castellano a milestone 5,000th win.

"I've been riding here for 18 years," said the Venezuelan native. "so it's special to achieve this accomplishment in New York, especially with the strong colony we have here. Riders such as John Velazquez and the Ortiz brothers—just phenomenal talent. It keeps you sharp because it's very competitive here."

"To have Castellano's 5,000th winner, it's an honor," said Contessa.

Lerner purchased the dark bay son of Midnight Lute at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings for \$77,000 from McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. Out of the unplaced Waquoit mare Nikki Tootsie, he was bred by Windylea Farm and is a half brother to the multiple stakes winner Judy Soda.

"He was supposed to run in an allowance last week, but he got a foot bruise, or we wouldn't be here," said Contessa.

“Gary called an audible,” said Lerner, wearing a light purple shirt to reflect the colors of his silks. “It was a damned good one, and he ran it in for a touchdown.”

Lerner and Contessa selected Runaway Lute from the Saratoga sale—from which also came their Empire Classic Handicap winner Pat On the Back—and after the colt won his first two races, Lerner started dreaming big.

“I thought we were going to win the Kentucky Derby (G1) with him,” he said. “On his best day he’s a really nice horse.”

While that dream didn’t quite materialize, Runaway Lute has compiled a record of 4-1-2 from 12 starts and has earned \$276,805. The Hudson is his first stakes win since the Rockville Centre Stakes at Belmont Park in July 2016.

“I’m a very strong supporter of New York-breds,” said Lerner. “Every year we buy a couple. The New York-bred sale up in Saratoga is one that we want to participate in.

“I believe fully in the program. You see horses such as (grade 1 winners) Diversify and Mind Your Biscuits, and this horse may be ready to run in open company.”

If he behaves himself.

“He might be the record-holder for the number of times I’ve had to call an owner with bad news,” said Contessa. “He’s tough to train in the morning, but

he’s cool in the stall, and on the track, he’s all business.”

Runaway Lute gave an indication of his obstreperous personality in the winner’s circle, refusing to settle down to get his picture taken.

Lerner has had horses with Contessa for more than a decade, and he and

Nehoc’s Jack Cohen—sporting a purple tie—began owning horses in partnership with another owner. About five years ago they began buying horses together.

“It’s worked out really, really well,” said Lerner, adding with a laugh, “Jack knows he can’t tell me what to do. We’re having a really good time.” 🐾

# Brown All Around

**THERE'S A REASON HALL OF FAMER** Javier Castellano has reached the 5,000 win plateau—he's talented, meticulous in his approach, and imbued with an overwhelming desire to succeed. All of those qualities came into play when the Venezuelan-born rider notched victory number 4,999 aboard Offering Plan (by Spring At Last) in the \$208,700 Mohawk Stakes, contested over a "good" Widener turf course at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$  miles early in the Empire New York Showcase Day program at Belmont Park.

The ultra-consistent 6-year-old trained by Chad Brown and owned by Michael Dubb, Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith, had come up by a combined three lengths short of winning his last three starts, with a pair of runner-up finishes in state-bred stakes and a third-place finish in an open stakes event.

That simply didn't sit well with Castellano, who'd been aboard the deep-closer in all three contests.

"This time I really warmed him up well before the (Mohawk). I blamed myself a little bit (for those recent losses). He has spoiled me because he gives you that run all the time," said Castellano. "But he's getting more mature and smart. I think horses like this can really leap up.

"So I spoke to Mr. Brown before the race. We decided to do something a little different: Let him know he's going into a race. Get him a little more on his toes (with

a bigger warm up). We didn't want to chase the speed, but we didn't want to be too far back, either. And I felt he was a lot more focused today."

There was plenty of speed out of the starting gate as Mo Maverick and Black Tide, who had defeated Offering Plan in the Sept. 23 Ashley T. Cole Stakes, engaged in a serious speed duel, racing the opening quarter-mile in a stout :22.94 and the half-mile in :46.36.

Castellano and Offering Plan stalked the fast fractions in fourth position.

Offering Plan began to gather strong momentum while moving for the far turn. Then, on the latter portion of the turn, he simply shot past the tiring leaders, quickly opening up on the field.

The race was essentially over in upper stretch as Offering Plan romped home a six-length winner in 1:42.01.

Aisquith, who operates a school bus company, made the drive north from Reva, Md., to walk Offering Plan into the winner's circle.

"It's great to have horses to participate in this New York Showcase Day," said Brown. "It's a great program, and we always try to acquire as many New York-breds as we can, given that our base is here in New York. To have a horse like this that's good enough to win a race like this, on the big final day of the season is very rewarding."

Bred by C.W. Swann and Cygnet

Farm, Offering Plan recorded his eighth win from 23 starts (along with five seconds, four thirds), and pushed his earnings to \$758,423.

The winner is out of the mare Rosalie Road, by Street Cry.

The Mohawk runner-up was Marc Keller's Rapt (by Hat Trick). The 5-year-old gelding, who is trained by Bobby Ribaldo, closed strongly through the lane to put 7¼ lengths between himself and the third-place finisher in the field of eight.

Trinity Farm's Red Knight (by Pure Prize), from the barn of trainer Bill Mott, was third.

Post-race, fans cheered Paul Braverman and Timothy Pinch's Kharafa, who finished sixth. The 9-year-old millionaire was making his 52nd career start (13-13-9). Two races back Kharafa had upset the field in the West Point Stakes Presented by Trustco Bank at Saratoga for trainer Timothy Hills. Upon retirement, whenever that may be for this race-loving veteran, the gelding is scheduled to reside at Old Friends near Georgetown, Ky.

## FIVE AND CHANGE

Peter Brant's Fifty Five (by Get Stormy) might not be a fan of the tighter turns on the turf courses at Saratoga, but she certainly relishes the sweeping curves downstate at Belmont Park.

Brown and Castellano (win No. 5,001) again teamed-up—getting Fifty Five back to the winner's circle for the second straight time (she had easily annexed the Sept. 23 John Hettinger Stakes) in the \$208,400 Ticonderoga Stakes, staged for older fillies and mares at 1¼ miles over the "good" inner turf.

The 4-year-old's main rival was going to be Patricia Moseley's La Modena (by Freud), who determinedly outkicked Fifty Five to the wire Aug. 24 in the Yaddo Stakes at the Spa (Fifty Five was third; Lady Joan second).

After the Ticonderoga's unhurried opening half-mile of :49.12, Castellano and Fifty Five sat in sixth position in the field of seven, 3½ lengths from the coveted fore.

Moving around the far turn, La Moneda and Junior Alvarado got the jump on Fifty Five, advancing steadily toward the leaders, while occupying the four path.

As a result, Fifty Five was forced outside of that pairing, spinning into the stretch six-wide.

Under a rousing, hard-driving hand ride by Castellano, Fifty Five produced a faster turn of foot through the final furlong to edge clear from La Moneda and record a one-length victory on the wire.

After a final half-furlong in :05.88, the final time was 1:42.21.

"She's a nice mare. She really is," said

Brant, who has campaigned the likes of champions Waya, Gulch, and was a co-owner of Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes (both G1) winner Swale. “She’s been running in both New York-bred and open company. And these New York-bred runners are tough. There were a lot of good horses in this field. She really runs well here (at Belmont Park) and in Florida. We might keep her in open company. I love this filly. She’s one of my favorites. Alan Quartucci showed me this filly and acquired her for me.”

“(Fifty Five) had a wonderful race record to date prior to us purchasing her from her breeder (Empire Equines),” said Quartucci, founder of North Shore Bloodstock. “She won in her second start in New York, continued with a win at Gulfstream Park, and won a very key race at Tampa, winning the Florida Oaks (G3T). As Fifty Five was training at Palm Meadows, we knew she was an attractive filly and felt confident she was handled professionally by a very good trainer in Tom Bush. I was thrilled we were able to purchase her for Peter Brant.

“We all look forward to her running in top open company races next year.”

Out of Soave, by Brahms, Fifty Five notched her seventh win from 16 starts. She’s earned \$661,288.

La Moneda, who might appreciate a firmer turf, was a solid second in the Ticonderoga, hailing from the barn of trainer Thomas Morley. She finished two lengths in front of Alfonso Cammarota’s Conquest Hardcandy (by Candy Ride), who is trained by Jimmy Ryerson. 🐾
