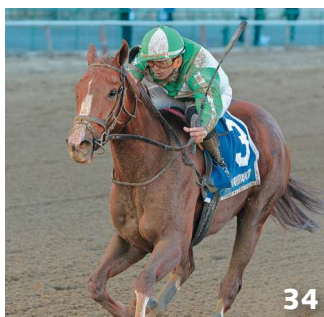

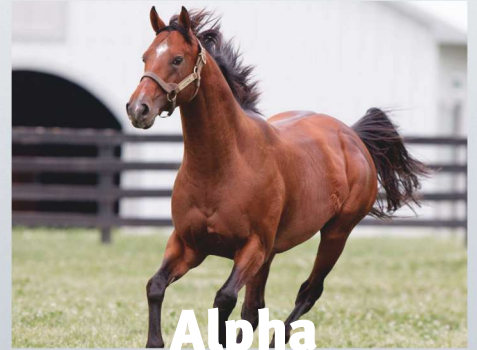

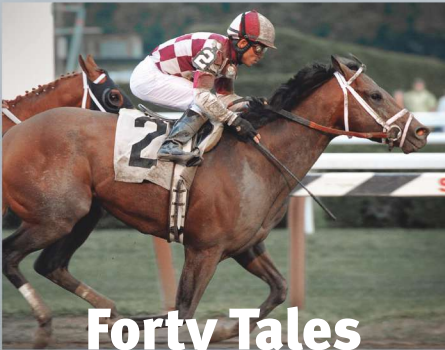

New York Stallion Ownership 101: NYSS Nominations

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO REGISTER A STALLION in New York for the 2017 breeding season, an item that should be near the top of your to-do list is this: Nominate to the New York Stallion Stakes (NYSS) series. Here are the main reasons stallion owners should be taking advantage of this opportunity.

All foals by stallions nominated to the NYSS are automatically eligible to enter the 10 series races run throughout the year at New York Racing Association racetracks. The series, worth more than \$1 million in purses, consists of six races for 3-year-olds worth \$100,000, two races for older horses worth \$125,000, and a pair of juvenile stakes at the end of the year worth \$150,000. Moreover, beginning with the foal crop of 2015, NYTB eliminated individual foal nominations so that stallion owners no longer need to depend on breeders or owners to take that extra step for their stallions' progeny to be eligible.

On to the benefits. First, nomination is an incentive for breeders to breed to your stallion and a selling point for buyers to buy your stallion's progeny. Breeders gravitate to nominated stallions because of extra opportunities to earn breeder's awards (\$27,000-\$18,000 or 30% of the winning purse for winners; \$13,500-\$9,000 or 15% of the purse for second- and third-place finishers). Savvy end-users are drawn to the progeny of nominated stallions at the sales because of the 20% open owner's awards for first through third place. The NYSS are technically "open" races because they are open to the progeny of nominated New York sires, even if they are foaled out of state.

For the stallion owner the NYSS races help increase the chances of the stallion improving his résumé with black-type progeny because the races are drawn from a much smaller pool of eligible horses than regular NY-bred stakes. In 2015, for example, the pool consisted of 55% of

the New York-bred foal crop plus the occasional New York-sired shipper that was foaled out of state.

As to stallion owner's awards, if a stallion owner thinks that only the progeny of "the usual suspects"—the top three or four sires in the state—win these races and generate awards, he or she should think again.

In a survey of 30 NYSS races run during a three-year period from 2014-16 (for races still to be run this year, we looked at the results from 2013-15), 14 different stallions had progeny winners. To be sure, the progeny of stallions who breed 60 or more mares in the relevant breeding seasons got their fair share of winners, but so did the progeny of stallions with more modest profiles.

In this time frame, 15 winners were sired by stallions who bred fewer than 60 mares, nine by stallions who bred fewer than 50 mares, and seven by sires who bred fewer than 40 mares. And it goes on with four winners being by sires who bred fewer than 30 mares and two by sires who bred fewer than 20 mares.

A stallion owner should also remember that a stallion's progeny can continue to generate awards even after the stallion has left the state or is no longer breeding. In this three-year window, eight of the 14 sires of winners are no longer active in New York.


In the end, nominating a stallion to the series should be an easy decision, and it is easy to do. For 2017 a stallion owner just needs to complete the NYSS Series Nomination Form for Series 2020 (Foals of 2018), and send the nomination fee (\$2,500, or advertised stud fee, whichever is higher) in two installments (due Feb. 15 and July 1) to NYTB, which administers the NYSS nominations. Nomination forms are available at nytbreeders.org and you can call the NYTB office at 518-587-0777 with any questions.

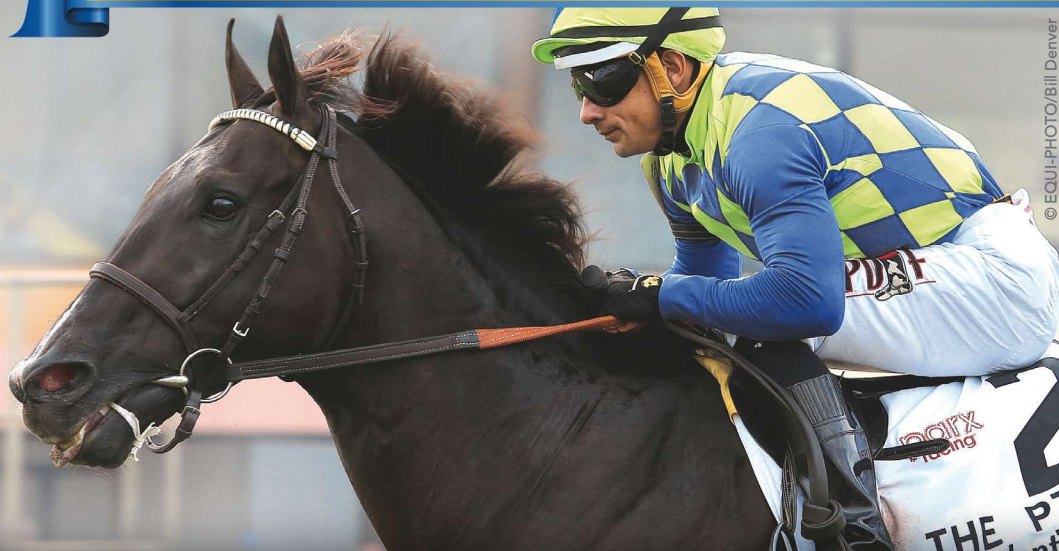

NYTB TO ADMINISTER NEW YORK STALLION STAKES SERIES NOMINATIONS

In 2016 the administration of the New York Stallion Stakes Series was transferred from the New York Racing Association to the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. Accordingly, stallion owners should be aware that beginning with the 2017 breeding season, all nomination forms and fees should be directed to NYTB (not to NYRA, as in the past).

For a stallion's progeny to be eligible for the Series, which consists of 10 stakes races worth more than \$1 million, the stallion must be fully nominated in the year of the foal's conception. For the 2017 breeding season the stallion owner should complete the NYSS Series Nomination Form for Series 2020 (Foals of 2018) and send the nomination fee (payable to "NYTB") to:

A stallion's nomination fee is \$2,500, or advertised stud fee (whichever is higher). Fifty percent of the nomination fee is due Feb. 15; the remaining fifty percent is due July 1.

Additionally, for the convenience of stallion owners, breeders, owners, and trainers, NYTB (<http://www.nytbreeders.org>) will maintain a NYSS web page with nomination forms and other useful material. The page, which can be accessed from the "Racing" drop-down menu, includes:

- a link to the stallion nomination form for the 2017 breeding season (Series 2020, Foals of 2018).

- lists of nominated stallions by year, beginning with Series 2012 (Foals of 2010) through Series 2019 (Foals of 2017).

- a list of NYSS Series-eligible horses through Series 2016 (Foals of 2014), which was the last year foals were nominated individually. From Series 2017 (Foals of 2015) forward, foals sired by nominated stallions became automatically eligible for all NYSS races without a nomination fee.

- dates, conditions, and purses of the races as soon as they are announced.

NY-Bred Mares Excel at F-T November Sale

A pair of New York-bred mares—one a grade I producer and the other a grade I winner—drew winning bids of seven figures at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale Nov. 7.

Proven producer Whatdreamsrmadeof, cataloged as Hip 100, was purchased by Summer Wind Equine for \$1,650,000. The 12-year-old chestnut daughter of Graeme Hall, who was

bred in New York by Sez Who Thoroughbreds and consigned by Brookdale Sales, agent for Casa Farms I, is the dam of star filly Curalina.

A daughter of Curlin, Curalina has won three grade I races for Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners at three different racetracks (the Acorn at Belmont Park, Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga, and the La Troienne at Churchill Downs). Twenty-three hips after Whatdreamsrmadeof was sold, Curalina commanded \$3 million, the November sale's second-highest price, when purchased by Shadai Farm.

Whatdreamsrmadeof, grade II-placed herself, sold in foal to Curlin on a March 11 cover.

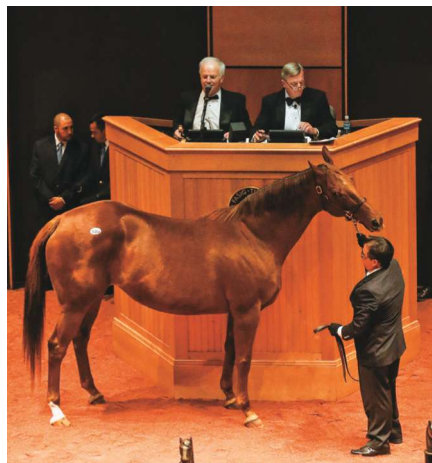
Gary Barber and Sequel Racing's 5-year-old Haveyougoneaway (by Congrats), Hip 142 offered by Sequel Bloodstock, agent, was purchased by Lake Villa Farm for \$1.1 million.

Bred by Andy and Susan Beadnell and foaled at Bead Land & Cattle Company near Pottersville, Haveyougoneaway had changed hands four times previously, but only for a fraction of this price.



...while her daughter, Curalina, sells for \$3 million

For Champion Racing Stable, Haveyougoneaway won or placed in eight stakes at Remington Park, Oaklawn, and Prairie Meadows and earned \$402,425. Last spring Sequel Racing purchased the mare privately to take advantage of the New York program, turning her over to trainer Tom Morley. Following a runner-up finish in the Critical Eye Stakes, Haveyougoneaway captured back-to-back-to-back wins in the Dancin Renee, the Honorable Miss Handicap (gr. II), and Ballerina Stakes (gr. I).

State-bred Yearlings Strong at F-T Kentucky October Sale

NEW YORK-BRED YEARLINGS made a strong showing at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale (Oct. 24-26) in Lexington. Cumulatively, the New York-bred average was virtually on par with the overall sale average while the New York-bred median slightly outperformed the sale's overall median price.

New York-bred median outperforms the market in Kentucky

The Empire state-bred toppers were a pair of standout colts that brought \$200,000. Repole Stable/ J.J. Crupi bought the first of the male co-toppers early in session three (Hip 862). The son of Curlin was bred by RF HF Mares Rule #3 and foaled at Hidden Lake Farm near Otisville March 25, 2015. The colt is the first foal out of multiple winner Blue Catillac, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Bluegrass Cat. The other \$200,000 co-topper was Hip 1116, a chestnut son of Kitten's Joy bred by Marlene Brody's Gallagher's Stud near Ghent. Consigned by Craig and Holly Bendoroff's Denali Stud on behalf of the breeder, he was purchased by Barry Berkelhammer, agent.

Fifty-eight of the 78 New York-breds offered at the Kentucky fall sale changed hands. The New York-bred average of \$31,814 was a tick below the sale average of \$33,065 while the New York-bred median, \$15,000, came in slightly above the \$14,500 sale median.

NY-BRED WEANLINGS OUTPACE MARKET AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

The New York breeding program was well represented during Keeneland's marathon November breeding stock sale (Nov. 8-20) in Lexington.

The market for New York-bred weanlings was remarkably strong. While short in numbers—25 of the 32 on offer were reported as old—the average of \$69,208 and median of \$45,000 were way above the overall figures of the sale: \$64,848 and \$28,000, respectively.

The top-priced New York-bred weanling came in Book 3, as a colt from the second crop of Violence, out of the Kentucky-bred mare Five Star Momma, sold for \$275,000.

The top-selling New York-bred arrived in Book 1, when 4-year-old open stakes winner Harlan's Honor, in foal to Liam's Map, brought \$300,000. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, she was purchased by John Malone's Bridlewood Farm, which is near Ocala, Fla.

New York-bred fireworks in the latter books of the sale included the top New York-bred racing prospect, Diversify, by Bellamy Road out of Rule One, a two-for-two *Thoroughbred Daily News* Rising Star sold to Ralph and Lauren Evans for \$210,000 in the concluding session of Book 4.

Another spot for breeders and consignors was the New York-bred clearance rate. The buy-back percentage ended up at 20.6%, which not only improved on last year's 25.2% RNA rate, but significantly outperformed the sale as whole where the closing buy-back rate for 2016 was 26.9%.

For stallions that stand, will stand, or stood (deceased) in New York (stallions that are dead or exported prior to 2012 are excluded), and have runners in North America. Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through November 20, 2016. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2015 is \$21,782 or 50% of the 2015 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 50% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 57%. Current year stakes winners include all N.H.-black-type stakes results from all available countries. *Fool counts include Southern Hemisphere. Cumulative stakes winners includes all countries. (A ♯ indicates a sire represented by his first crop to race).

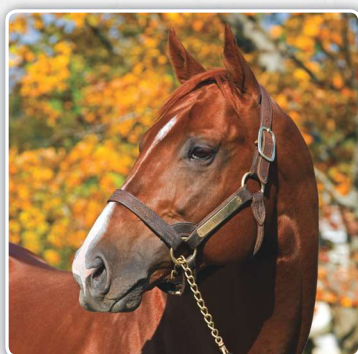

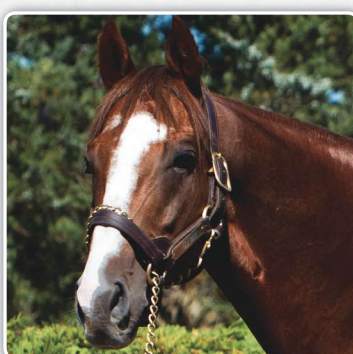

Right Engels

ON A RECENT SATURDAY afternoon Lois Engel took a phone call in her barn. Catching up on farm chores, she talked as she watched her 12-year-old daughter ride a retired Thoroughbred on the grounds of the family's Pucker Ridge Farm on a glorious late fall day.

"She absolutely loves the horses," said Engel of her daughter, Anna, seated on I'm So Classy, purchased by Engel 12 years ago and one of several broodmares on her farm near Warrensburg.

I'm So Classy, 16, is an adoption prospect—her broodmare career over—and Engel is making sure the chestnut mare hasn't forgotten what it's like to have someone on her back.

At nearly the same time, I'm So Classy's last foal, Classy Stones (by Bustin Stones), is expected to arrive at the farm on a van from Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack for a break before returning to the races next year.

I'm So Classy and Classy Stones are two of the 25 horses Engel and her husband, Paul, have at Pucker Ridge, which they purchased in 2004. It was Paul who reignited Engel's childhood passion for horses when he took her to Saratoga when they were dating.

"I grew up on Long Island, and my parents were teachers," Engel explained. "I always loved horses, but riding wasn't a cheap endeavor. I kept telling my parents

that I wanted a horse, and they told me, 'When you're old enough and make enough money, you can have one.'

Paul's family had owned horses, and when Lois told him that she wanted to buy one, he counseled her to educate herself before diving in.

"So I took some courses, and that's how it started," she said.

"It" started out with a membership in a horse-owning partnership, but before long Engel found herself interested in breeding, and she decided just owning horses wasn't enough: She wanted a farm. Three years after buying into her first horse, she purchased Pucker Ridge.

Engel's primary residence is on Long Island, where she has spent more than 30 years working in the communications industry. After being laid off earlier this year, she now works as a contractor and buys and sells real estate. She spends most weekends at the farm and is a hands-on owner, talking to the vets about her horses and interacting with the trainers. When she had horses with trainer David Prine, she helped him with his payroll every week, at times placing feed orders and assisting with entries.

Engel's got 11 broodmares at Pucker Ridge, and she brings that same immersion to their breeding. Though she has used consultants and purchased packages such as eNicks and TrueNicks, she also focuses on statistics, body types, and racing styles.

"And there's a good dose of gut feeling, too," she said. "Sometimes I think, 'I like this,' but I don't know exactly why."

Among her successes is Embrace Change, by Hook and Ladder out of Lightmywayhome, by Hansel, whom Engel purchased for \$2,000 as a broodmare.

"I had a real gut instinct, and I went with it," she said. "Embrace Change was in the third crop of Hook and Ladder, and she was stakes-placed."

The filly had been an RNA as a yearling at \$24,000, and Engel sold her as a 2-year-old for \$50,000 in 2009 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale. Purchased by Mike Repole, the bay filly had placed twice in stakes before break-

ing her maiden. An injury early in her 3-year-old year curtailed her career, and Repole returned her to Engel.

“She had a lot of potential,” said Engel. “Her second foal is a yearling (by The Lumber Guy), and I’m hoping her babies have that same potential.”

Pucker Ridge has also stood stallions, most notably the multiple stakes-placed Miracle Man, owned by Miracle Man Racing Partners.

“Lois is a knowledgeable horse person,” said the partnership’s Jeff Pearl. “We were novices, and she helped us out a lot. All our babies grew up on that farm, and I’ve got nothing but great things to say about her.”

“Initially, I figured we’d just have a bunch of mares and babies,” said Engel. “But we ended up getting involved with everything: stallions, babies, yearlings.”

Among Pucker Ridge alums is Big Business, the New York-bred that finished second in the 2014 Forego Stakes (gr. I) and earned nearly \$800,000.

“For a small operation,” said Engel, “we’ve had a huge percentage of babies born here that have gone on to race and do really well.”

Engel’s interest in breeding and in

the state’s breeding business led her to run for a spot on the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders in 2008. She has held that spot since and will run for re-election when her two-year term expires.

In 2008 the New York Racing Asso-

ciation was embroiled in a fight to retain the franchise to run Aqueduct Race-track, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course, and the state’s racing and breeding industries were still waiting for final approval of a contract to begin the installation of the video lottery terminals that had been approved as the decade began. A global financial crisis added to the industry’s financial instability. Breeders were moving their mares elsewhere; farms were closing.

“When I bought the farm, I found that breeders were very fractured,” she reflected. “They didn’t want to work together, and there was a lot of competition among the New York farms—not the cooperation that I thought there should be. I felt that people need to realize we shouldn’t be competing among ourselves, but with other state breeding programs.”

“I got involved because I was concerned we were being short-sighted,” she continued. “And I think that over the years we’ve seen more farms working together.”

The woman who educated herself before getting involved in racing now works closely with the NYTB’s education group, last year doing a presentation on

breeding a healthy foal and raising a quality yearling. She also helps coordinate the outfit's many events, including its holiday party, annual awards dinner, and cocktail party at the Fasig-Tipton sale of New York-breds in August.

At some of those events, she is assisted by her son, Michael, now 17. Like Anna, Michael is from the Ukraine. The Engels adopted both of them, Michael four and a half years ago, Anna last spring.

"Paul and I had been reading about kids in international orphanages," she said. "The older ones have no chance of getting adopted, and at 16, they get bounced out on their own. There's a high suicide rate, and drugs and prostitution are a major problem."

Some of those orphanages offer hosting programs in which the students travel to the United States to spend time in the summer or around the holidays with a family. Lois and Paul decided to see how they'd handle having children around.

"We hosted Michael and his friend one Christmas," she said. "We fell in love and decided to adopt them."

Though his friend ultimately elected to stay in the Ukraine, Michael joined the Engel family. Lois and Paul wanted to adopt a girl, too, so Anna came to stay with them in the summer of 2015 and became their daughter last April. She shares her mother's passion for the horses.

"I get some pushback when I ask her to clean her room or the kitchen," Engel said. "But she comes up here and sees dirty stalls and says, 'Not a problem. Let's do that.'"

I'm So Classy, Anna's mount as Engel talks, is an example of her commitment to taking care of her horses when a racing career is no longer their best option. She breeds to sell and race, but regardless of where her horses end up she takes them back and works to find appropriate homes for them.

"I've been working with some of the breeders and with Andy Belfiore to find homes for some of the horses that have come off the track," Engel said. Belfiore

is the executive director of New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and coordinates that organization's Take The Lead retirement program.

One of Engel's homebred fillies was retired through Take The Lead. The filly had a chronic knee injury and wouldn't be suited for a second career, so Belfiore called Engel.

"We reached out to see if she might be able to help find her a home," said Belfiore. "Lois didn't hesitate. She immediately offered to bring her home."

"My horses have a home for life," said Engel, "but if I can find somebody who would like them and can give them a good home, I'll move some of them along."

She screens prospective adopters, and some of her retirees have found new careers as trail horses in the Adirondacks. Much of Pucker Ridge's 400 acres are covered by trees, so her seven-person staff will often ride them on the farm's trails as they start to re-train when they come off the track. Engel doesn't adopt her horses out for financial gain, but to know they're safe and are doing well in another life.

Some of them, though, she elects to keep. Among the first horses she bred, 12-year-old Halation still lives on the farm. She rides him occasionally, and though she thinks he'd make an excellent jumper for someone, she's not interested in getting him adopted.

"I've got a soft spot for him," she admitted. "He gets doted on and he gets his mints, and he gets to play the king of the farm."

She has two horses in training now, Classy Stones and Our Nancy Rose. Three others are in Florida or headed there for their early training. While her first instinct is to sell the horses she breeds, she doesn't mind keeping them to race, either, like a lot of New York breeders.

"The New York program is the best one out there," she said. "Between the amount of the purses that horses run for and the tremendous racing program, and the checks that come in for breeders' awards, they can make or break a farm. We're not talking a few hundred; we're talking thousands of dollars.

"If a decent horse wins an allowance or two, you can make \$15,000 or \$20,000 back in breeders' awards, as much as you might have made if you sold the horse."

While Engel is as pragmatic as a woman in her position needs to be—you can't run a farm and own a couple of dozen horses without a keen awareness of financial considerations—it's also clear that money has never been the driving force in her involvement in racing. She's no longer that little girl that didn't have enough money to get the horse that she so desperately wanted, but the spirit that drove her then is the spirit that still drives her now.

"Coming up to this farm is my passion," she said. "It's a lot of work, but when you enjoy it, it's not really work." 🐾

UPSTART to Airdrie

Top New York-bred
to stand for \$10,000
in Kentucky

UPSTART, THE NEW YORK-BRED SON OF FLATTER who lit up the Triple Crown trail last season and was a graded stakes winner at 4, has been retired from racing and will set up his second career as a stallion in 2017 at Brereton Jones' Airdrie Stud in Kentucky. The son of the unraced Touch Gold mare Party Silks will stand for an initial fee of \$10,000.

Bred by Joanne Nielsen and purchased for \$130,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York preferred yearling sale, Upstart was among the best of his generation at 2, breaking his maiden and winning the Funny Cide Stakes for state-breds at Saratoga before running a game second in the Champagne Stakes (gr. I) and third in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) for Ralph Evans and trainer Rick Violette Jr.

"He is a horse we've been following for a long time," said Bret Jones of Airdrie. "We are a big fan of Flatter (by A.P. Indy; stands at Claiborne Farm) and he was not only a son of Flatter, but a precocious son of Flatter. He ran a '5' Ragozin number as an August 2-year-old at Saratoga, which is exceptional."

Upstart dusted Frosted by 5½ lengths in January 2015 in the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) to kick off his 3-year-old campaign. His follow-up efforts while prepping for the classics were sharp efforts: He finished first in the grade II Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes at Gulfstream Park, only to be disqualified and placed second; then ran second to Materiality in the nine-furlong Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I).

"After he won the Holy Bull, we reached out to Rick Violette," Jones said. "But we lost to WinStar Farm (also in Kentucky). They saw the same qualities in him as we did."

WinStar bought an interest in Upstart after the Florida Derby. However, the colt had an unsuccessful run in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I). He came back later in his 3-year-old year to place in the William Hill Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I).

At 4 he won Oaklawn's Razorback Handicap (gr. III) in March of this year and made three other starts, placing in the Mohegan Sun Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) and the nine-furlong Whitney Stakes (gr. I).

In all, he went 4-3-4 in 15 starts and earned \$1,732,780. Eight of his starts came in grade I competition.

Following Upstart's racing career, Airdrie approached WinStar about standing him, and with the offer to fully support him, a deal was made for him to stand there.

"He's just a beautiful, big horse," Jones said. "He was a \$130,000 yearling at a time when Flatter was just coming up the board, so that tells you what he looked like. He has a beautiful A.P. Indy head and is the kind of horse commercial breeders can get excited about."

Nielsen visited the farm in mid-November to take another look at her star horse. Not only did she enjoy her stay at Airdrie, but, according to Jones, she got down to business as well, booking three mares to him. 🐾

Highway Star zooms to win the Staten Island division of the NYSS

WHEN IT CAME TO THE RACING schedule for Chester and Mary Broman's Highway Star, trainer Rodrigo Ubillo didn't let taking a step backward keep him from moving forward.

Cutting the 3-year-old filly back to seven furlongs for the first time since her debut in May was not in Ubillo's plans, but when longer races on the dirt weren't available, he decided to take a shot in the New York Stallion Series Staten Island Division Nov. 13 at Aqueduct. And, as she had done in her first start, Highway Star cruised to victory, this time by $3\frac{1}{4}$ lengths.

Making her third start in a stakes race, Highway Star was ridden for the first time by Angel Arroyo, who kept her several lengths back of a hot pace set by longshot Rosie P. As multiple stakes winner Frosty Margarita commenced her bid from third heading into the far turn, Highway Star gave chase from fourth after a half-mile in :45.46.

Frosty Margarita opened up a three-length advantage, but, perhaps wearied by tangling with the leaders early, she allowed Highway Star to gain ground inside the eighth pole, and when Highway Star found another gear at the sixteenth pole, Frosty Margarita gave way, settling for second place in the \$125,000 race.

"I had a lot of horse left in the end," said Arroyo.

"I told him, 'Just let her tell you where she wants to be,'" said Ubillo. "She's pretty smart, and it worked out perfectly."

Ubillo had been running Highway Star at distances of a mile or more, including a fourth-place finish on the turf in the Stallion Series Statue of Liberty Division at Saratoga back in August, but when he couldn't find a race for her at a longer distance, he made the call to cut her back.

"I wanted to run her in a non-winners of two in open company," said the trainer, "but that race wasn't available, or it was run on the turf. It was either put her in as a 'main track only' runner or wait and run her here."

By Girolamo, who was standing in New York at Sequel Stallions when bred to the Bromans' multiple stakes-placed Cat Thief mare Stolen Star, Highway Star got her first stakes win in the Staten Island, her fourth win in six starts.

The filly's second dam is Unbridled Star, purchased by the Bromans at the 2002 Keeneland November sale for \$115,000. She has produced four six-figure earners, including the multiple stakes winner Friend Or Foe, whose victories include the 2010 Empire Classic Stakes. Friend Or Foe is by the Bromans' homebred stallion Friends Lake, winner of the 2004 Florida Derby (gr. I).

Friend Or Foe stands at Smallwood Farm in Virginia. His first crop of foals are 2-year-olds this year.

"She's still in the mix," said Bromans' farm manager Jeff Raine of Unbridled Star. "She's a sprightly 1996 model. And now we're breeding mares to Friend Or Foe."

Raine has worked at the Bromans' Chestertown Farm since 2004 when Stolen Star was a yearling.

"I always had faith in her, from the day I got here," he said. "I thought, 'She's going to do something for them,'" referring to the Bromans.

She came close on the racetrack, placing in four stakes races and earning more than \$210,000. Highway Star is her first stakes winner.

Raine was getting ready to sit down with Broman to plan the 2017 matings, with an equal number of mares heading to Kentucky and staying in New York to be bred. All the mares will foal in New York, many of them by New York stallions.

And while the Bromans weren't able to be at Aqueduct, Joe McMahon of McMahon Thoroughbreds was on hand to see the filly win, and the Bromans' spots were taken in the winner's circle and trophy presentation by Ubillo's family.

"Chester was very pleased to see that," said Raine. "That was good for Rodrigo, so it was a good day for all of us." 🐾

Gold for the King surges for the lead in the Notebook Stakes at Aqueduct

Frank Paolangelì's Gold for the King shines in the Notebook

King for a Day

AS FRANK PAOLANGELI'S HOMEBRED Gold for the King (by Posse) battled through the stretch Nov. 19 at Aqueduct in the \$100,000 Notebook Stakes, the hard-working Paolangelì was watching on his computer in Ithaca, N.Y., while tending to his business as a site contractor—primarily for building projects related to Cornell University.

"When it was over I watched the replay three times," said a satisfied Paolangelì, who witnessed his bay 2-year-old gelding win for the third time in five career starts. "I always liked Posse. He's a good sire. I liked the nick on him, and this mare, Gold for the Queen, was a good one for me."

Paolangelì and Gold for the King's trainer, Charlton Baker, have had a long and fruitful 17-year relationship.

"I remember Frank approached me around my second or third year as a trainer. Right after I started having some success at Finger Lakes," said Baker.

Like Baker, Paolangelì, who currently owns some 40 Thoroughbreds, weanlings, and broodmares, received his start in the game at the upstate track, approximately 25 miles southeast of Rochester.

Back in 1982 Paolangelì purchased his first horse while walking the backstretch at Finger Lakes with some friends who were already owners. He had \$1,400 in his pocket from hitting a big exacta in the final race on the card, when he approached someone walking with a horse that caught his eye. After some negotiation, Paolangelì paid \$800 cash for the horse.

“The horse’s name was Fixin,” said Paolangeli. “He had big, round knees, like an athlete. I thought that would make him a champion. But I was being superstitious, too. I knew that (actor) Jack Klugman had purchased Jaklin Klugman (who finished third in the 1980 Kentucky Derby, gr. I, behind Genuine Risk) for that exact price. But it didn’t work out. Fixin was something like oh-for-six for me, finishing dead-last most of the time.”

Over the succeeding decades, however, Paolangeli, along with his wife Jeanne—the couple has been together for nearly half a century—have made up for that initial experience by owning and breeding some quality runners. That list includes Johannesburg Smile and Wildcat’s Smile, both homebreds produced by Paolangeli’s Serenity’s Smile (by Dixie Brass, out of Distinctive Pro mare, Aggressivebynature).

In the Notebook, Gold for the King entered the starting gate with a new piece of equipment—a short cut pair of cheater-blinkers.

“He’s got speed. But he doesn’t always show it. That’s because he’s not always focused. It was especially true in his last race,” noted Baker, referring to a third-place finish in the Oct. 22 Sleepy Hollow Stakes at a mile over a sloppy-sealed track in which Gold for the King did his best running through the stretch.

Leaving from the sixth stall in the field of eight freshman New York-foaled runners in the Notebook Gold for the King broke on top beneath jockey Jose Ortiz as the 8-5 betting favorite in the six-furlong sprint.

The savvy Ortiz eased his mount just off the pace, as Bloom Racing Stable’s Sal the Turtle (the name was inspired by Sal Governale, a member of the Howard Stern radio show) scrambled for the lead with another runner.

The opening quarter mile was raced in a swift :22.46.

Ortiz gave Gold for the King his cue as the field moved for the far turn and the pair quickly ranged up alongside Sal the Turtle and jockey Rajiv Maragh, who is still searching for his first victory after returning from a lengthy injury, aboard the Michelle Nevin trainee.

Gold for the King, from the outside, poked a head in front after a half-mile in :45.73.

Turning into the lane the embattled pair were several lengths clear of their nearest competitor.

“Last time I rode him (in the Sleepy Hollow), he wasn’t comfortable behind horses, so I didn’t want to end up there today. He broke sharp and running so I got him in the clear, which is what I wanted. He put me in great position the whole way. The whole time I was waiting, waiting, and I knew when I turned for home, that I had to beat the horse on the inside of me so I tried to keep with him.”

Through the stretch, Gold for the King responded to Ortiz’ right-handed encouragement as Maragh went left-handed down at the rail. Surging away leaving the eighth pole, Gold for the King went on to register a 1¼-length win over Sal the Turtle.

The final time for the contest was 1:10.70.

“He was more focused today. But as far as the blinkers go, he sat a perfect trip on the outside,” said Baker. “I think we’ll know more about the blinkers when he has to battle inside of horses. For now I’m satisfied, and we’ll leave these (smaller) blinkers as they are.”

Gold for the King began his career with a maiden win over a good field at Saratoga Aug. 8. The gelding next checked in third behind the speedy Syndergaard, who finished fifth in the Sentient Jet Breeders’ Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Santa Anita.

And Frank Paolangeli can now officially smile over the \$800 he seemingly squandered on Fixin while roaming the Finger Lakes backstretch 34 years ago.

That’s because on Oct. 1 Gold for the King, under jockey Eric Cancel, won Finger Lakes’ richest race of the year, the \$219,613 New York Breeders’ Futurity, with a dominating performance as the even-money favorite. The victory came on the same day owner/trainer Baker sent out his former \$20,000 claim, Joking, to win the Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont.

Gold for the King, who was foaled at Thomas Dushas’ Pegasus Farm near Dover Plains, increased his earnings to \$280,568 with his win in the Notebook. He is the second foal and first winner of his dam, Gold for the Queen (by Gold Token), a New York-bred multiple stakes winner bred by Pegasus Farms. The dam, who has a weanling colt by Frost Giant, was raced by the connections of Paolangeli and Baker.

Sal the Turtle (by Caleb’s Posse) was a game runner-up in the Notebook. Bourbon Lane Stable’s Bourbon Empire (by Majestic Warrior), from the barn of trainer Mark Hennig, did his best running late to finish third.

Notebook was a New York-bred champion for owner Eugene Klein and trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Bred by Lee Eaton and Thorne, he won eight of 21 starts and earned \$584,630. Notebook (by Well Decorated), however, primarily made his mark as a stallion at Michael O’Farrell’s Ocala Stud Farm. He sired Booklet, Florida’s 2002 Horse of the Year, as well as multiple grade I stakes winner Spoken Fur. But perhaps Notebook’s premier progeny was the ill-fated filly, Three Ring, raced by Barry K. Schwartz.

“Notebook was a very solid stallion who produced a tremendous number of hard-knocking horses,” said Schwartz. “I had bred to him several times before. But Three Ring was the best horse I’ve owned in 37 years. She was a top-class Thoroughbred. Unfortunately, she got bumped coming out of the starting gate, and then the saddle slipped, in the (1999) Kentucky Derby (finishing 19th). But she came right back to win the Acorn Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont Park. I remember she had a great personality and was always very aware of what was going on around her.” 🐾

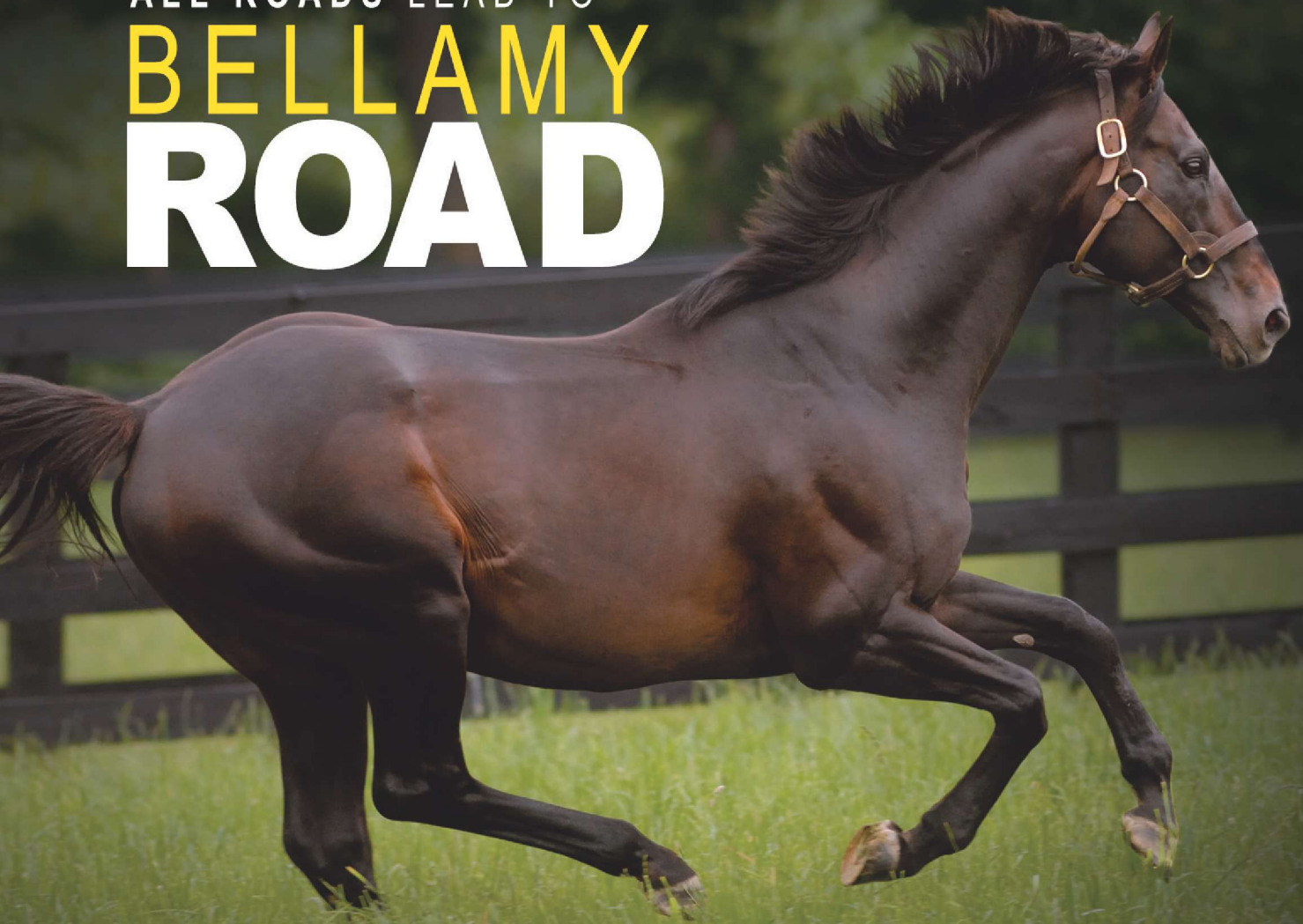
