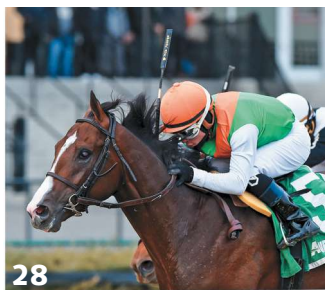

New York-Breds Have a Breakout Stand at Keeneland November

AS THE KEENELAND NOVEMBER breeding stock sale approached last month, I had some questions in mind that only the auction results could answer. Did the spectacular performance by New Yorkers at Fasig-Tipton’s fall mixed sale in October mean the critical mass of the New York breeding stock market had shifted from Lexington to Saratoga? Would there be corresponding declines at Keeneland? As it turned out, the two breeding stock sales were not an “either/or” proposition at all, but rather “both/and,” and the New York-bred contingent at Keeneland posted the best results we’ve seen in recent years. By far.

To review, the Fasig-Tipton fall mixed sale in October saw a record-breaking top-seller, a 17% increase in total sales over the prior year, a 34% increase in average price, and a 41% improvement in median.

A year-to-year comparison of New York-bred results at Keeneland produces even more spectacular headlines (see also the accompanying chart, which includes 2015 as a baseline). New York-breds at Keeneland in 2017 produced

- a 48.0% increase in total sales over 2016.
- a 45.1% increase in average price over the previous year.
- a nearly doubled median price (90.7% increase) over 2016.
- nearly double the number of six-figure horses seen last year (up to 31 from 16).
- increases at the very top of the market with

13 horses sold for \$200,000 and up (compared to eight in 2016) and four sold for \$300,000 (up from one horse last year).

The only indicator to head in the wrong direction was the buy-back percentage of 24.4%, which was a shade better than the New York-bred RNA rate at Keeneland in 2015, but increased 18.5% over 2016. It is not unreasonable to conclude that, so long as New York-breds continue to be popular commodities in the yearling and juvenile markets, owners/consignors will not be shy about setting solid reserves for quality horses.

It should be noted the Keeneland November sale was very strong on its own terms. The cumulative average price of \$83,342 was up 2.7% (from \$81,121 in 2016) and the median surged 22% to \$30,500 (from \$25,000 in 2016). The cumulative RNA was 24.7% (down from 26.9% a year ago). New York-breds, however, either held their own or exceeded these results. Most notably the New York-bred median, which came in at \$41,000, was a full 34.4% higher than the otherwise strong overall sale median \$30,500. Even the increased New York-bred buy-back rate (24.4%) outperformed the sale as a whole by a couple of ticks.

Moreover, if you refer to the chart on page 18, you will see that New York-bred weanlings, when considered on their own, dramatically outperformed the general weanling population in both median and average.

Bob Elliston, Keeneland’s vice president of racing and sales, observed “Buyers are positive about the economy and the horse industry, and they are enthusiastic to invest, often more than originally budgeted, in that outstanding individual.”

Others have noted the upward trends in the breeding stock market are a natural extension of this year’s strong yearling results.

I think that, for us here in New York, the main takeaway is that in the context of an otherwise strong marketplace, quality New York-breds are bringing home more than their fair share of the pie. New York breeders deserve congratulations for breeding such commercially attractive horses and, like most of you, I can’t wait to see what happens when the juvenile sales roll around! 🐾

CONTROL GROUP BRINGS NYB GRADED TALLY TO 18

Control Group

An astute claim for \$62,500 in January, Control Group has earned more than \$290,000 this year for Michael Dubb and David Simon and added a bonus graded stakes win Nov. 25 with a three-length score in Aqueduct's Discovery Stakes (G3).

The win marks the 18th graded stakes win for 2017 by a New York-bred (see next page).

The Discovery victory—as the 5-2 favorite—was the fourth win in the last five starts for Control Group, a 3-year-old son of Posse. The lone loss was a second-place finish to Twisted Tom in the \$300,000 Empire Classic Handicap on Showcase Day Oct. 21 at Belmont Park.

Out of the Victory Gallop mare We Kept Her, Control Group was bred by

Colts Neck Stable and Alan Goldberg and was foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag.

We Kept Her is a daughter of the stakes-winning Fit to Fight mare One Fit Lady, who produced seven winners from as many foals to race. Her stakes-placed daughter Eternal Grace (by Gilded Time) had three black-type runners, including Canadian grade 2 winner Bye Bye Bernie (by Bernstein). We Kept Her has a yearling filly by Courageous Cat and a weanling filly by Giant Surprise.

A \$15,000 pickup in 2016 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' June 2-year-old sale by trainer Gary Contessa, Control Group made his first five starts for Monty Foss and John Moirano.

Chris Englehart

Chris Englehart Inducted into Finger Lakes Hall of Fame

Perennial leading Finger Lakes trainer Chris Englehart was inducted into Finger Lakes Hall of Fame Nov. 18 at the 2017 awards dinner dance.

Englehart began his career at Finger Lakes Racetrack in 1967 as a hot walker. He began training in 1973 and earned his first training title in 1985. Since then he has earned an additional 14 titles and is the only Finger Lakes trainer to have more than 4,000 wins. Englehart was named New York-bred Trainer of the Year in 2011 by the New York Thoroughbred Breeders.

Englehart ranks 11th on the North American trainers list with 4,096 wins, is still active, and remains a respected member of the Finger Lakes community.

David Cassidy Passes at 67

The New York Thoroughbred racing community mourns the passing of David Cassidy, 67, who died Nov. 21 in a hospital in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., due to organ failure.

Cassidy, widely known for his role as Keith Partridge in the early 70s hit television show "The Partridge Family," was also active in racing. Cassidy was a passionate breeder and owner, an avid student of pedigree, and a generous ambassador for breeding and racing in New York. A feature on his life in racing will appear in the January issue of *New York Breeder*.

Forty Tales' First Winner

Sequel Stallions' **Forty Tales**, a 7-year-old grade 2-winning son of Tale of the Cat, was represented by his first winner Nov. 24 when his daughter Scintillation won the first race at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack. Scintillation, bred in New York by Hidden Lake Farm, has been knocking on the door of a victory since Aug. 23, having previously placed three times in six starts racing for Mark Valentine. Trained by Sal Iorio Jr., Scintillation is out of the Golden Missile mare Golden Miss.

IRISH HILL AND DUTCHESS VIEWS STALLIONS MERGE ROSTERS

In a merger of New York breeding operations, three of the four leading stallions based in the state by 2017 progeny earnings will stand next year under the management of Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions at

Irish Hill Century Farm near Saratoga Springs, N.Y. This will be the largest stallion station in the region.

Sunrise Stallions, which owns champion and 2015 leading New York sire Big Brown as well as re-

cord-breaking New York sire Frost Giant and 2017 freshman sire Heavy Breathing, will stand that trio at Irish Hill, which will also become the home of New York's second leading sire of 2017 Bellamy Road.

Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Big Brown (\$6,000; 2018 stud fee) has sired multiple grade 1 winner Dortmund in his first six crops of racing age, and his progeny, including 24 other black-type winners, have earned more than \$24 million. He ranks third among New York sires this year with \$3,139,363 through Nov. 27.

Frost Giant (\$5,000) sired New York-bred champions Kelli Got Frosty and Frosty Margarita in his first six crops and his grade 2-winning son Giant Expectations ran in the Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1).

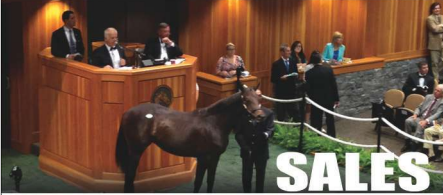
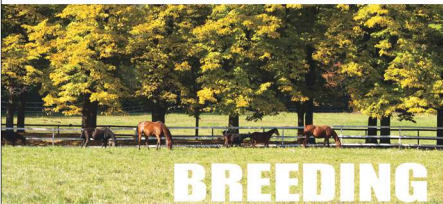
Bellamy Road (\$6,000) has sired the earners of more than \$24 million. He has 106 winners this season, including Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) winner Diversify.

"We are enthusiastic about standing our stallions with Irish Hill and Dutchess Views Stallions near Saratoga Springs and believe the new operation will offer breeders a first-rate experience and the best chance at getting an outstanding foal," said Sunrise Stallions' Andrew Cohen.

Michael Lischin and Anya Sheckley of Dutchess Views will handle the marketing and management functions of the combined operation, including contracts, service certificates, reports, and billing. They will join Rick Burke and Bill Leak in working with mare owners on matings and selling seasons. The new enterprise will be called Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions.

"We are excited about the potential of standing so many top-quality stallions and combining forces with Irish Hill," Lischin said.

For stallions that stand, will stand, or stood (deceased) in New York (stallions that are dead or exported prior to 2013 are excluded), and have runners in North America. Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through November 26 2017. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse per starter in 2016 is \$22,141 or 45% of the 2016 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 45% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 65%. Current year stakes winners include all Northern Hemisphere black-type stakes results from all available countries. *Foal counts include Southern Hemisphere. 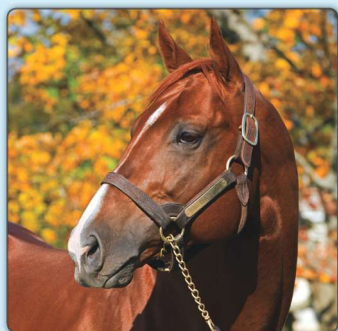

Trickmeister Brings Speed, Class, and Sire Power to NY

Sharlene Kenny of Bergen Stables had gotten to know Trickmeister over the course of the last year. Rather shy in the stall, the ten-year-old son of Proud Citizen was a little more outgoing in the field. "Outside, I could go right up to him, touch him, kiss his nose."

As she continued, her tone of voice took on a tone of awe. "Then, I saw him move, and I was interested in *him*. I couldn't believe what I was seeing in the field. I was just sitting there, and then he took off, and I stood up."

Behind Trickmeister's powerful physical impression lie the classy pedigree and versatile race record of a promising stallion. From a pedigree standpoint, Trickmeister brings the emerging Proud Citizen sire line to the state of New York. Other lines of Gone West are deepening their roots in the stud book, through sons of Speightstown, Elusive Quality, Zafonic, and Mr. Greeley. Proud Citizen, as one of the youngest prominent sons of Gone West, is only beginning to get his chance as a sire of sires.

A winner of six of his 16 career starts, Trickmeister earned \$437,968 on the track, ranking him among the top ten earners of Proud Citizen's progeny. With stakes-quality form at sprints, miles, and routes, Trickmeister showed the speed and the stamina to make a worthy heir to Proud Citizen's line.

Jerry Restel, also of Bergen Stables, saw a race record well in keeping with the speed Trickmeister still had a few years off the track. "I was attracted to the fact that he was unbeaten as a three-year-old, and a four-year-old. During his time, he ran with all the classy horses. He didn't duck anybody - he ran against anybody who was out there."

Trickmeister raced from ages three through seven in a



career defined by class and versatility. During that time, Trickmeister showed stakes quality at both sprint and route distances. At six furlongs, Trickmeister won twice and was twice stakes-placed. He could also carry his speed, and continued to prove his class as his he stretched out. He won four stakes between a mile and a mile and an eighth, and twice placed in graded company.

Trickmeister's crowning achievement on the track came May 17, 2012 at Belmont Park. He faced Grade 1-winning, Classic-placed Stay Thirsty in the Vanlandingham Stakes. Trickmeister exploded out of the gate, then settled comfortably in front. Stay Thirsty tried to press to his inside into Belmont's sweeping turn, but Trickmeister slipped clear once more. Down the stretch, though Stay Thirsty was asked for everything he had, Trickmeister had more. Well within himself, he prevailed by a length and three quarters.

Bergen Stables acquired Trickmeister on October 1. They moved him to Majestic Views Farm International, where he stands for the 2018 season. Between his powerful speed, sire line, and racing class, Trickmeister is an exciting new stallion prospect for New York.

RAISING THE BAR

Chester and Mary Broman land a Breeders' Cup win with Bar of Gold

SITTING IN EQUESTRIAN RESTAURANT NOV. 11, the normally reserved Chester Broman is acting in a way that might, for him, be characterized as ebullient. Grinning from ear to ear, eyes twinkling, waiting to watch one of his homebreds run in the fifth at Aqueduct, he is only too happy to sit down and talk about the previous weekend, the one he'd spent at sunny Del Mar with his wife Mary and a group of friends, the one that culminated with him hoisting a Breeders' Cup trophy in the winner's circle for the Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) with a horse that, until a week before, hadn't even been targeting the race.

"Of course," he said when asked if he'd expected to bring a trophy home to New York.

"That's what everyone was telling us," said Mary.

"But it was the other horse that was supposed to win," said her husband.

"The other horse" was Highway Star, a multiple graded stakes winner that had competed nearly exclusively in graded stakes company since last December, with a record of four wins, a second, and a third from seven starts and who prepped for the Breeders' Cup with a win Sept. 24 in the Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) at Belmont Park. In the run-up to the two-day World Championships at Del Mar in early November, it wasn't Highway Star that was the "other horse." She was the big horse.

Bar of Gold, who like her stablemate was bred by the Bromans in New York, had yet to win in open company despite multiple attempts in graded

stakes, with a handful of runner-up finishes, usually as the favorite, often by short margins. In May at Belmont, she went off as the favorite and finished second by a half-length...to Highway Star at 5-1.

But as Broman prepared to ship Highway Star to California with trainer Rodrigo Ubillo, he and John Kimmel, who trains Bar of Gold, pondered the 5-year-old mare's next start.

"I said to him," said Broman, "if this horse qualifies for the Breeders' Cup, why don't we go there?" He

looked at me and said, 'What, are you crazy?' Highway Star had beaten Bar of Gold three or four times."

Broman beams at the memory, though Kimmel remembers it a little differently.

"I was really disappointed after her race at Keeneland," said the trainer, referring to the Juddmonte Spinster Stakes (G1) in October, in which Bar of Gold finished sixth as the 9-5 favorite over a sloppy track. "After that I wanted to go to the Breeders' Cup. I never thought about the Distaff; I

always had the Sprint in mind.”

Bar of Gold breezed impressively over the Belmont training track Oct. 28, sealing the decision.

“We made up our mind that day,” said Broman. “She left on Sunday (Oct. 29), and we entered her on Monday.”

“We got the last cancellation spot on the plane,” said Kimmel. “There wasn’t even any room for the groom. We had to fly him commercially.”

Kimmel and the Bromans flew to California Nov. 1, and until then, the homebred by Medaglia d’Oro out of Khancord Kid (by Lemon Drop Kid)

was in the care of Tracy Brown Price, who worked with Kimmel for a dozen years before moving to Ocala, Fla. Price got on Bar of Gold in the mornings and sent glowing reports back east.

“She kept telling me, ‘She just feels unbelievable,’” said Kimmel. “You don’t have to worry about her liking this racetrack.”

The news didn’t surprise her trainer. The mare had shown ability on multiple surfaces and at multiple distances, and over the summer at Saratoga, jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. had worked her over the Oklahoma training track.

“He’s had a great relationship with her,” said Kimmel of the jockey that would earn his third Breeders’ Cup win on Bar of Gold. “He kept saying she was the best of any horse he’d breezed all summer, and that’s a pretty big statement coming from someone who breezes the horses he does.”

The betting public failed to see in Bar of Gold what Kimmel did on race day, sending her off at 66-1, the 11th choice in the field of 14. Breaking from post five, Ortiz took Bar of Gold back, making his way to the rail while the pacesetting favorite Unique Bella set sharp fractions of :21.84 and :44.35. As the pace up front began to collapse, Ortiz found a clear path on the outside and steadily gained ground, getting up at the wire to just nip Ami’s Mesa by a nose.

Kimmel and the Bromans had been escorted to the rail to watch the race near the finish line, and as Broman saw his green and white silks making a run on the outside, he started to yell for his horse...but the wrong one.

“We thought it was Highway Star. We couldn’t really see anything on the rail, so I had to watch on the screen. Then the announcer said, ‘Here comes Bar of Gold!’ Rodrigo was standing with us, and we were about 10 feet behind the finish line, so I couldn’t see who won. Rodrigo called it right away. ‘You won,’ he said. ‘You won.’ I said, ‘No, we didn’t.’”

“I was really excited,” said Kimmel,

who got his first grade 1 win since November 2006 with Premium Tap in the Clark Handicap. "It was a very emotional moment. He and Mary are getting on in years, and he's talked about reducing his involvement in the game, so this might have been his last chance to do something like this.

"Mary said, 'I'm so happy for my husband; he put his heart into this business,' then he reached down and kissed her," Kimmel continued. "It was one of those really special moments."

Bar of Gold paid \$135.40 to win, and Broman did indeed hold a winning ticket on her, along with one on

Highway Star (18-1) and an exacta bet on the two of them, hoping for the 1-2 finish the two had achieved in the Ruffian Stakes (G2) last spring at Belmont, when Bar of Gold was the 6-5 favorite.

"That would have been a wild payoff," he said, laughing. "These were the first bets I made all year. You own so many horses, and you think they're all going to win. You could go broke betting on them."

Back in 2004, Kimmel and the Bromans won the Florida Derby with 37-1 Friends Lake, giving the owners their first grade 1 win. Their partnership began in 1997, when Chester approached Kimmel at a sale at Keeneland in April, with an eye on a horse in the dispersal of Jack Kent Cooke.

"I went to Keeneland to buy Antespend," he remembered. "I didn't know John, but I knew he was going to train horses for me. I walked up to him and said, 'Are you John Kimmel? Would you come look at this horse with me?'"

Kimmel was apparently unimpressed with the filly Broman had selected on his own, without the help of any bloodstock professionals, but Broman bid \$900,000 to get her, then brought the ticket to Kimmel, who was standing at the bar.

"I said, 'John, what are we going to do? You're going to train this horse, right?'"

"He looked at me and said, 'You bought that horse?'" Broman mimicking the tone of incredulity in Kimmel's voice.

Antespend did her best running before the Bromans bought her, winning just an allowance in six starts for her new owners, though placing in three graded stakes. Earlier in her career, she'd won three grade 1 races: the Las Virgenes, the Santa Anita Oaks, and the Del Mar Invitational Oaks.

But in the breeding shed, the Spend a Buck mare out of Auspicante, by Practicante, more than rewarded Broman's confidence in her, producing Friends Lake and Seeking the Ante, a graded stakes winner that earned nearly \$400,000 and who in turn produced the

multiple stakes winner Mineralogist.

Bar of Gold is a second-generation Bromans homebred; her dam, Khancord Kid, won the Herecomesthebride Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Park in 2010. Khancord Kid is out of the Storm Cat mare Confidently, purchased by Broman for \$1 million in 2000 at the Keeneland January mixed sale.

With the win in the Filly & Mare Sprint, Bar of Gold will retire with earnings of \$1.5 million; she had just hit the \$1 million mark before the Breeders' Cup.

"She earned us a million dollars without winning an open race," said Broman. "Only in the New York program."

Bar of Gold is Khancord Kid's first foal; she has a yearling colt by Giant's Causeway and a 2017 weanling American Pharoah colt. She's expected to be bred back to Medaglia d'Oro in 2018, with the hope of producing a full sibling to Bar of Gold.

Land Mine, a 3-year-old half sister to Bar of Gold by Mineshaft, has won two of her last three starts, including an allowance at Aqueduct Nov. 8 by 2½ lengths.

Long a participant in the New York breeding program, Chester Broman is about to complete his final term on the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders (he will continue as director Emeritus), and he and Mary have been voted the state's leading breeders four times, in 2004, 2011, 2014, and 2016. He keeps about 45 mares at his farm near Chestertown, down from about 60 following a decision to downsize his broodmare band. He has 60 horses in training in New York with a handful of trainers, and it's been only in the past year that he's begun to sell horses that he's bred.

Retired immediately after the Breeders' Cup, Bar of Gold will join the Bromans' broodmare band, though 2018 breeding plans have yet to be finalized. Broman will work with pedigree consultant Alan Porter and Becky Thomas, owner of Sequel Stallions.

"Alan gives us a list of about five

stallions," said Broman, "then Becky looks at it. Then my farm manager and I look at it."

When it's time to name the horses born on the farm, the staff get together to pick the names, Chester and Mary having abdicated that responsibility long ago. They write the names on a

board in the office, the same office that will soon hold a Breeders' Cup trophy; having helped raise the babies, they all have pet names for them, and, said Broman, sometimes the name comes down to a flip of a coin.

In the case of Bar of Gold, they certainly got it right. 🐾

TRAINER JEREMIAH ENGLEHART CONTINUES to make his presence felt on the New York Racing Association circuit. On Nov. 24 the Finger Lakes-based conditioner sent out a talented pair of state-bred 2-year-old fillies, I Still Miss You (by Majestic Warrior) and Indy's Lady (by Take Charge Indy), in the \$100,000 Key Cents Stakes at six furlongs.

Assistant Axelle Angeliaume, a native of France, who two months ago gave birth to her first child (a boy named Julien), oversees Englehart's downstate string.

"Our 2-year-olds are like my babies. I've been with most of them since the beginning," said Angeliaume. "I had a lot of confidence in I Still Miss You. She showed in her first two races that she's a classy filly (a professional debut win followed by an open company triumph June 8 in the Astoria Stakes). After Saratoga, Jeremiah figured out some small issues with her. In her prior race (the Maid of the Mist Stakes at Belmont Park), we learned that she didn't want to go long (a sixth-place finish while wearing blinkers for the first time)."

I Still Miss You—owned by Gold Star Racing Stable, Matthew Hand, and Brian McKenzie—battled for the early lead beneath jockey Manny Franco through a brisk opening quarter-mile of :22.45.

After a half-mile in :46.15, I Still Miss You turned into the lane under confident handling, before edging clear of her seven rivals approaching the furlong marker.

Then, through the final 110 yards, the filly repulsed a serious bid from the runner-up Twin Creeks Racing Stables' Pure Silver to register a one-length victory on the wire (turning the tables on that one after losing a stretch duel to her in the July 16 Lynbrook Stakes).

"(My colt) was coming off his maiden win, and that time I learned that when another horse comes to him he gets game. So, last week, we worked him, and he worked the same way. He had a horse laying off of him, and he never let that horse get by," said Juarez. "Today that was the same strategy—just keep him right off the lead. When (the favorite) came to me at the quarter-pole, I thought he was going by, but Sea Foam dug in. Hats off to Christophe's team. They did a really great job."

Sea Foam, out of Strike It Rich (by Unbridled's Song), scored a one-length victory in 1:12.79 over the "fast" main track, reversing a Sept. 15 loss to Stoney Bennett, who'd triumphed in his debut in wire-to-wire fashion.

The winner, saddled for Clement by assistant Christophe Lorieul, has bankrolled \$131,600.

The Notebook's runner-up, Stoney Bennett, is owned by and was bred by Dr. Jerry Bilinski, Roddy Valente, Dr. Richard Alfred, and Darlene Alfred.

Morning Breez, owned by John Caputo, Lady Del Po, and The Boys Racing, finished third. 🐾

SANFORD STUD FARM

BY ALLAN CARTER

STEPHEN SANFORD WAS BORN May 26, 1826, in Mayfield, a village several miles northeast of Amsterdam, N.Y. After completing his higher education at Georgetown College in Washington, D.C., and West Point Military Academy, he returned to Amsterdam to help his father run the family's carpet mill. When the plant burned down in 1854, his father retired and General Sanford (he was known by that title for the remainder of his life although he never served in the military) rebuilt the mill, making it one of the most successful carpeting mills in the country.

Around 1880 he contracted dyspepsia, which today is known as indigestion, and his doctor suggested he buy a farm as a form of relaxation. He bought farms totaling more than 1,100 acres, which he turned into a horse center. The complex was originally called Hurricana in recognition of the stiff winds that blew through it.

Encouraged by the active, though supposedly secret, participation of his two sons in the sport of horse racing, in 1881 Sanford purchased the steeplechaser Postguard.

In 1882 his acquisition won the North American Steeplechase Handicap at nearby Saratoga while carrying a punishing 167 pounds. He also won his second Trouble Stakes, a steeplechase handicap at Saratoga in 1883, beating jumping stars Disturbance (who later raced for Sanford) and Rienzi.

After several years of racing horses bred by others, the General decided to breed his own, thus starting a tradition that lasted through three generations before concluding in 1975.

In 1897 Sanford purchased for stallion purposes the future National Hall of Fame inductee Clifford, a recently retired

horse by Bramble out of Duchess who had been one of the standout racers of his generation. The acquisition of Clifford was to be an important occasion for both Sanford Stud as well as New York breeding as he became one of the prominent sires of the early 20th century.

The first serious stakes winner bred and raced by Sanford was Rockton (1897; Meddler—Brown Princess, by Prince Charlie). He ushered in a 20-year period in which Sanford Stud became one of the most successful breeders in the country.

Rockton's initial stakes win came in the last race of his 2-year-old season, the 1899 Algeria Stakes at Gravesend as the 13-10 favorite. In 1900 he added the Madden Stakes at Saratoga and the Monarch Stakes at Gravesend to his collection of added-money wins.

Rockton's success was noted by track handicappers, and in his last race of the season he finished third in the Parkville Handicap at Gravesend. The chart writer noted that "weight (121 pounds) told on Rockton."

In 1901, his final year of racing, the 4-year-old Rockton established himself as one of the best handicap horses in the country.

Like all other Sanford horses until 1913, Rockton's racing season began at Saratoga. His first race was a win in the prestigious Saratoga Handicap at odds of 10-1. Among the horses he beat were 3-year-olds The Parader, winner of the Preakness Stakes, Withers Stakes, and Lawrence Realization Stakes; and Blues, winner of the Islip Handicap and later the Travers Stakes and Saratoga Cup.

Rockton's ability was noticed by the Brooklyn *Daily Eagle*: "The ease with which Rockton disposed of several of the best horses in training indicates that he is sure to be one of the best horses of the year." Rockton finished second in his next race, the Delaware Handicap, conceding 12 pounds to the winner, Blues.

Twenty-six days later he won the Champlain Handicap at the Spa. Rockton ended his career that fall with two

seconds at Sheepshead Bay. The first was in the 12-furlong Century Handicap, in which he conceded 11 pounds to the winner, 3-year-old Watercolor. In his last race he broke down badly while in the lead in the Champion (2¼ miles). Rockton retired to a stud career at Hurricana Farm, one of his get being the brilliant but star-crossed Mohawk II.

A colt born a year after Rockton would turn out to be one of the Sanfords' best New York-breds, and probably their only champion if there had been such a designation at that time. He was the sprinter Chuctanunda (1898; Laureate—La Tosca, by St. Blaise). He began his freshman season slowly, winning only a 2-year-old allowance race in his first four starts. However, in 13 days at Empire City, starting Oct. 22, he won four of six starts.

He began his streak with his first stakes win, the Woodlawn Handicap, followed two days later by a victory by disqualification in a 2-year-old handicap. The New York Morning Telegraph

displayed great foresight by commenting on that race: "(Chuctanunda) will doubtless turn out to be a horse of high class." Three days later he won an all ages handicap, followed by a third-place finish and a first in two 2-year-old handicaps, and, in his last race of the season, a second in the Chappaqua Handicap.

Chuctanunda's 3-year-old season was at best a modest success. Showing his alleged distance limitations, he lost all four races over one mile, including a sixth and last as the favorite in the 1½-mile Travers, a second in the 1¼-mile Merchants' and Citizens' Handicap against older horses, and a third in the nine-furlong Saranac Handicap. He lost five of his 10 races under a mile, but two of his wins were in the Belle Meade at Gravesend and the Autumn Highweight Handicap at Morris Park.

As a 4-year-old Chuctanunda won the unofficial title of champion sprinter in the country. He lost his only race in 1902 in his debut, finishing second to Dublin

in an all ages handicap at Saratoga.

After that first race he proceeded to close the season with six straight wins, none of the races over a mile. His first win came in an all ages handicap at Saratoga. Two days later he caught everybody's attention by winning the Delaware Handicap in easy fashion.

The *Daily Racing Form* was impressed: "Chuctanunda's performance in the Delaware Handicap on Saturday when he ran a mile in 1:38 was the talk of all turfmen here yesterday."

The chart writer was even more extravagant in his praise: "Chuctanunda... is probably the horse of the year."

After winning his last four races, the praises continued. The first three of that quartet came in all ages handicaps in which he carried top weight of 130 pounds twice and 135 once.

After winning one of the handicap races at Sheepshead Bay the *New York Press* commented: "The Dash was the feature of the card in anticipation, but the real incident of the day was Chuctanunda's brilliant run of seven furlongs with the Steeplechase weight of 130 pounds on his back. It looks as if the turf has a fair successor to the invincible Voter. If, indeed, he is not a more useful horse than Voter. The Keene colt shone only as a sprinter while it has yet to be proved that Chuctanunda will refuse a route. A mile has been asked of him, and he answered it with a new track record without being extended."

In his last race of the year, a seven-furlong all ages allowance at Morris Park, the runner-up was Blues, who earlier had won the Second Special at Gravesend and the Century Handicap at Sheepshead Bay.

At the end of the 1902 season, it was a virtually unanimous opinion of turf writers that Chuctanunda was the best sprinter in the country.

Typical was the comment of the *New York Morning Telegraph*: "(Chuctanunda) was easily the champion sprinter of last year and one of the great performers of the season...The Laureate colt

won the popular regard for his gameness, consistency and the unmistakable evidence he gave at weight carrying capacity."

He raced only once in 1903, winning an all ages allowance while breaking the track record for six furlongs at Saratoga. He later broke down while exercising and was retired to stud.

Caughnawaga (1899; Clifford—La Tosca, by St. Blaise) was a half brother to Chuctanunda, but his forte was distance. He was slow to develop, winning only two races from 26 starts in 1901 and 1902, one of those wins being in the 1½-mile September Stakes in 1902 at Sheepshead Bay.

In his 4-year-old season Caughnawaga began to show his true ability. After his usual slow start, with just one win from his first four races, he won the Russert Handicap at 1½ miles on the turf at Sheepshead Bay and an all ages handicap at Gravesend. It was after the latter race that the *New York Sunday Telegraph* commented: "Yesterday was Caughnawaga's greatest day. When he took up 126 pounds and won the handicap at one mile and a sixteenth, he accomplished what few Eastern turfmen or turf folk believed he was capable of accomplishing."

Caughnawaga closed his 1903 season with a win in Gravesend's Occidental Handicap, giving him a record of six wins, four seconds, and one third from 13 starts.

Caughnawaga began his 1904 season at Saratoga with two wins from four starts that included a third in the Saratoga Handicap and a fourth in the Saratoga Cup. The *New York Commercial Globe and Commercial Advertiser* commented on his win Aug. 17 in an all ages handicap as the highweight and the 2-1 favorite: "Before yesterday's race trainer Hyner asked permission of the stewards to work Caughnawaga out after he finished. With the request granted his jockey Odom went out and scored a handy victory; then he sent Caughnawaga alone. The mile race was won

in 1:38¾, but he rounded out the mile and a quarter in 2:05¾, and the mile and three furlongs in 2:19¾. This work made the trainers take a second glance at their watches, for it is nearly a second faster than the record for the course... The chestnut colt did not stop there, for he finished the mile and a half in 2:33¾. Then Odom eased him up, and a mile and five eighths was caught in 2:46¾. It was a grand performance, and stamps Caughnawaga as one of the best handicap horses in training."

On Aug. 31 Caughnawaga won his only stakes of the season in the Twin City Handicap at Sheepshead Bay and he finished the season with a win at Morris Park.

Caughnawaga opened the 1905 season by winning the Saratoga Handicap, which was the highlight of his career. Left in his wake were stablemate Molly Brant (sixth), whom Sanford declared would be the winner, and future National Hall of Fame inductee Beldame (third). Other standouts in the field were the filly Tanya, winner of that year's Belmont Stakes, and Wild Mint, who had previously won the Seashore and Test handicaps at Brighton Beach and the Crotona at Belmont Park. After a disappointing third as the 5-4 favorite in a 3-year-olds and up handicap and a fifth in the Merchants' and Citizens' Handicap, Caughnawaga rebounded to beat Beldame once again in the Saratoga Cup.

The Saratoga Cup would be the last win of his career. After his success at the Spa, he ventured downstate to record four seconds and one third at Sheepshead Bay, Gravesend, and Brighton Beach. After he pulled up lame in the Brighton Cup, he was retired.

The *Daily Racing Form* recorded that General Sanford believed Caughnawaga "to be one of the gamest and truest racers that ever wore a saddle." 🐾

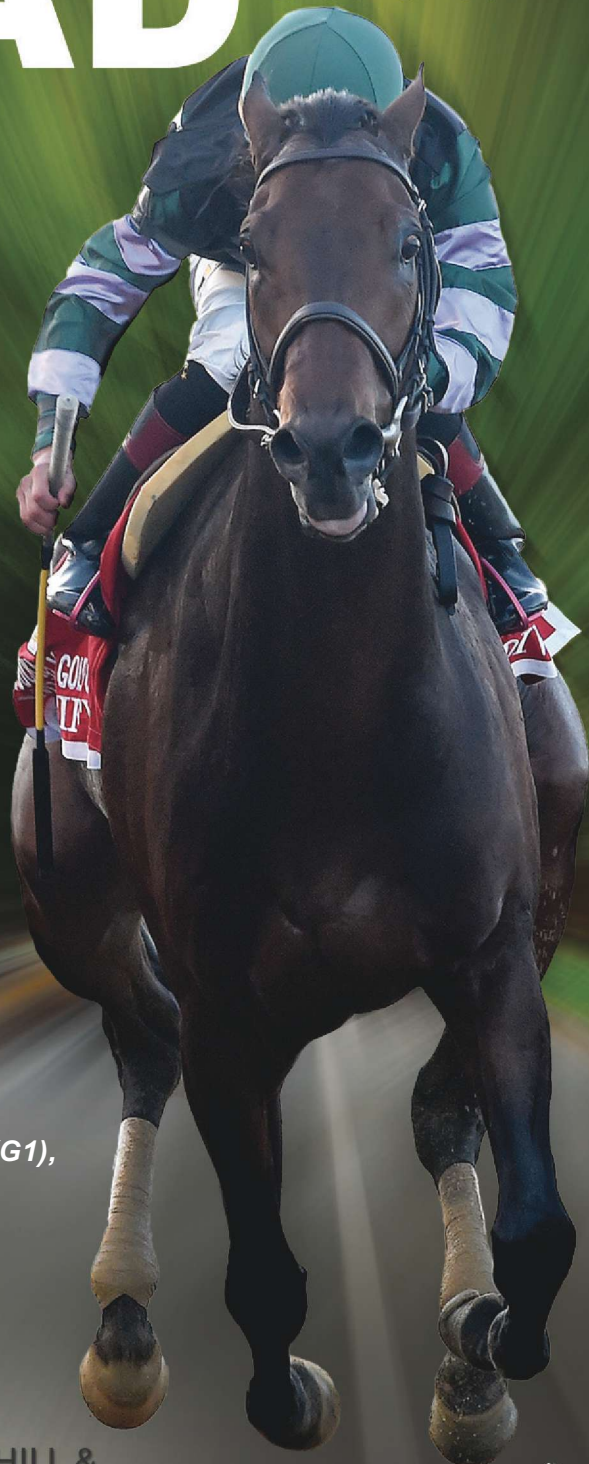
