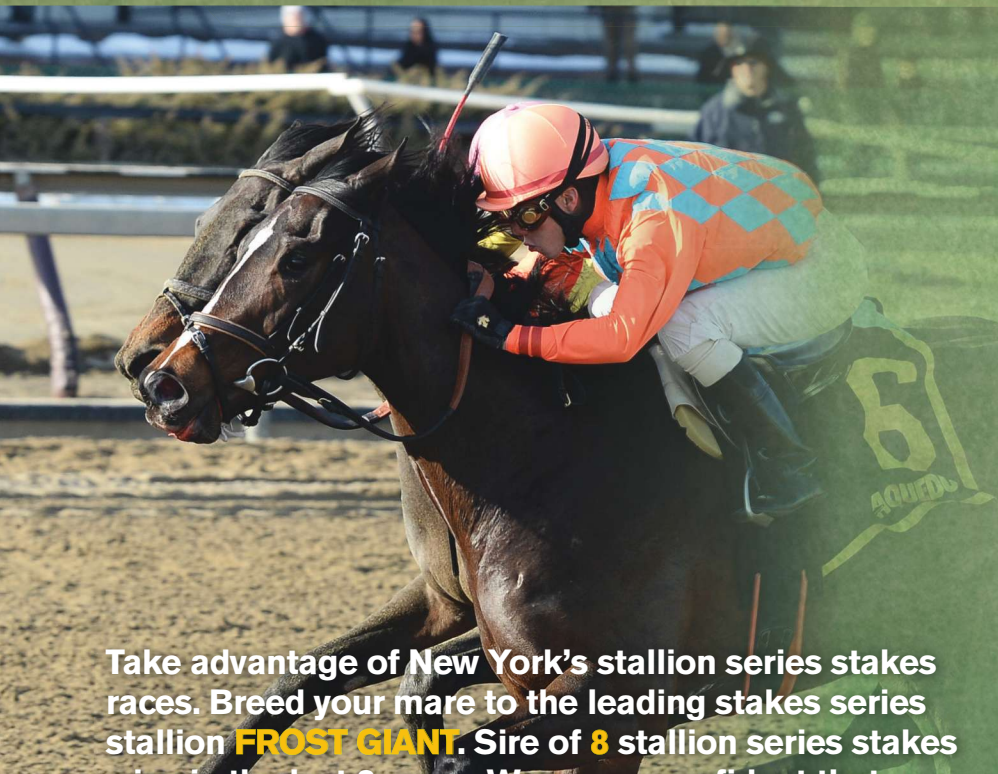

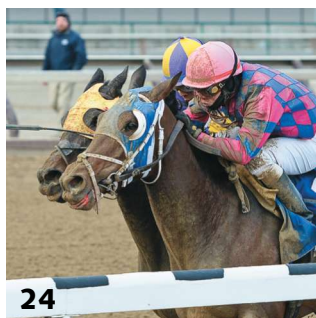

The War to Protect Finger Lakes Purses Wages On

IF you have been following this column for the last year, and especially if you read my update last month, you know that New York Thoroughbred Breeders and all its resources are fully engaged in an all-out battle to protect both the Finger Lakes Horsemen's purse account and the New York State Breeding and Development Fund from the anticipated adverse effects of the Lago Casino and Resort.

This new casino has been licensed by the state to open its doors for business less than a half-hour's drive down the road from the Farmington oval. The new facility is also projected to reduce the video lottery terminal business at Finger Lakes (Delaware North) by as much as 40%.

I would like to report on some recent developments and add observations. A brief review:

Delaware North, the Finger Lakes gaming operator, successfully sought for gaming tax relief to be included in the governor's 2016 executive budget proposal in order to compensate for an anticipated loss of 40% of its VLT gaming revenue.

Although the budget proposal will help Delaware North's profitability and bottom line, the gaming tax relief will not contribute or hold the Finger Lakes Horsemen's purse account or the Fund harmless from the projected 40% reduction in VLT business.

I have been dismayed to see that, even in the racing press, this crisis is poorly understood. Several articles have cited the Delaware North gaming tax relief as a "solution" to the problems of Finger Lakes racing. This is just plain wrong. Delaware North gaming tax relief is wholly independent of racing, breeding, and allied stakeholders.

A few writers in the general press in western New York, on the other hand, seem to understand the issue. A recent op-ed ran under the title of "Delaware North profits at the expense of horsemen." The author took the gaming operator to task for its legislative "attempts to fatten its own profits under false pretenses at the expense of its claimed partners: the horsemen who train and race at Finger Lakes Racetrack."

Following the publication of the governor's budget proposal, NYTB's first course of action was to attempt to include relief for Finger Lakes and the Fund in the Delaware North protection during the 30-day budget amendment period. It was highly unlikely that this would succeed, but it was clearly necessary. No modifications to any racing-related topics were included in the 30-day budget amendment.

NYTB's Plan B is now in full swing: to have the "hold harmless" legislation for Finger Lakes and Fund to be introduced by the Senate and Assembly during their part of the budget review process. This would represent a legislative "home run" for the industry. The Senate and Assembly budget revisions are due March 14.

After this process concludes, we will have more answers.

Failing this, NYTB also has a Plan C: self-standing legislation in the New York State Senate and Assembly to protect all racing stakeholders from the inevitable depredations of the Lago Casino & Resort. We actually introduced this legislation last year, but it did not advance simply because the new casino licenses were not yet determined and so much was still uncertain.

The proposed legislation is still in place, however, and has been reactivated. It also has the support of both Senate and Assembly racing and gaming chairs. Passing any new legislation is always an uphill battle, and this is no different. We are devoting all our resources to accomplish this difficult mission.

As NYTB pursues legislative action, it has also initiated some grassroots activity by launching an online petition in partnership with the New York Farm Bureau and Finger Lakes Horsemen's Benevolent Association in support of this proposed stand-alone legislation.

I cannot urge you strongly enough, whatever your stake in New York racing and breeding, to go online and sign this petition and otherwise to contact your legislators and let your views be known. I will continue to keep you posted as we continue the fight. 🐾

Champion Female Sprinter La Verdad Retired

La Verdad, the champion female sprinter of 2015, has been retired from racing and has already been shipped to Kentucky to be bred to Medaglia d'Oro.

La Verdad, winner of the Jan. 9 Interborough Stakes at Aqueduct, was scheduled to make a final start Feb. 13 in the seven-furlong Barbara Fritchie Stakes (gr. II) at Laurel Park for Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable.

"We decided to stop on her as opposed to running her one more time," trainer Linda Rice said. "We got her back to the winner's circle after the Interborough, she won the Eclipse Award, and we decided that was the best time to stop on her and get her on her way to her new career."

La Verdad, a 6-year-old New York-bred mare by Yes It's True—Noble Fire, by Hook and Ladder, was shipped to Gainsborough Farm in Central Kentucky Jan. 30.

La Verdad made her first four starts for breeder Mark Vondrasek's Eklektikos before

being sold privately to Rosenblum in late 2013. She won her first start for Rosenblum Dec. 19 of that year, then went 6-2-0 in 11 starts in 2014, winning the Distaff Handicap (gr. II) and four stakes for New York-breds, earning \$632,400.

In 2015—her championship season—La Verdad won five of eight starts and earned

\$722,500. She rattled off wins in the six-furlong Distaff Handicap, 6½-furlong Vagrancy Handicap (gr. III), and Dancin Renee Stakes for state-breds.

A win in Saratoga's Honorable Miss Handicap (gr. II) was disallowed following a positive test for clenbuterol. Wins in the Gallant Bloom Handicap (gr. II) and Iroquois Stakes for state-breds preceded a runner-up effort in the seven-furlong TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (gr. I).

In all, she went 16-3-0 in 25 starts—winning 11 stakes—and earned \$1,563,200.

Rice is looking forward to La Verdad's offspring, and other family members, joining her stable down the road. Rosenblum had entered her in last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale but withdrew her.

"She was in the November sale to give her the option to sell, but Sheila is pretty attached to La Verdad and she decided to keep her," Rice said. "I'm happy about that. I purchased La Verdad's dam for a client."

New York-bred Moanin

Moanin Sets Track Mark in Grade I in Japan

Moanin, a New York-bred son of Henny Hughes, set a track record of 1:34 for a mile with his 1¼-length victory in the February Stakes (Jpn-I) at Tokyo Racecourse Feb. 21.

Trained by Sei Ishizaka, Moanin has won six of seven starts, with one third in the Tokyo Chunichi Sports Hai Musashimo Stakes (Jpn-III) at Tokyo last November.

The winner was one of two non-Japanese-bred runners in the February Stakes, one of 15 graded races on dirt this year in Japan. Four-year-old Moanin is owned by Yukio Baba.

Bred by Empire Equines and foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag, the colt is out of Giggly, an unraced Kentucky-bred daughter of Distort Humor.

The colt was purchased as a yearling by Pete Bradley's Bradley Thoroughbreds for \$90,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Preferred New York-bred sale in Saratoga.

The top New York-bred juvenile offering at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March selected sale of 2-year-olds in training at \$335,000, Moanin was purchased by Narvick International, agent, from the consignment of Eddie Woods.

DUBB DOUBLES WITH 'GUS,' COURT DANCER

Owner Michael Dubb, trainer Rudy Rodriguez, and jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. were having a good day at Aqueduct Feb. 21 by any measure when they sent out Court Dancer to victory in the Broadway Stakes, the card's fifth race.

Three races later the day became twice as nice when the trio's 4-year-old Good Luck Gus (by Lookin At Lucky) got up to win the inaugural running of the co-featured \$100,000 Haynesfield Stakes at 1¼ miles. As icing on the cake, Royal Posse, also going out for Dubb and Rodriguez, ran second.

Good Luck Gus came into the Haynesfield no stranger to black-type victories. Fed on a steady diet of stakes races ever since he broke his maiden at Saratoga in the slop second out July 28, 2014, the colt won the New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes and the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct as a juvenile. He added the Albany Stakes at Saratoga at 3.

Dubb who is the sole owner of Court Dancer, owns Good Luck Gus in partnership with Bethlehem Stables and Stuart Grant's The Elkstone Group. Dubb purchased the colt for \$97,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Preferred New York-bred

yearling sale from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.

Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III and foaled at Majestic View Farms near Gardiner, Good Luck Gus is one of two winners out of Tacticmove, a daughter of Deputy Minister out of multiple grade I winner Strategic Maneuver.

Court Dancer (by War Chant), a Saratoga debut maiden breaker in 2013 for trainer George Weaver, and claimed last Oct. 25 for \$40,000 by Rodriguez for Dubb when dead-heating for victory, won her first stakes while leading every step of the way in the \$100,000 Broadway for state-bred fillies and mares.

Bred by Akindale Farm in Pawling where she was foaled, Court Dancer is one of five winners out of Gosh All Get Out. A placed daughter of D'Accord bred by John Hettinger, Gosh All Get Out is a full sister to stakes winner Jay's Crown.

Court Dancer was originally purchased by Daniel Collins at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Preferred New York-bred yearling sale for \$35,000.

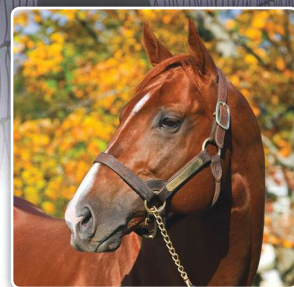

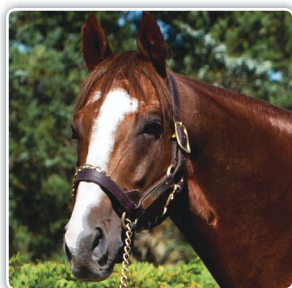

Storied Lady's love of the inner track shows in the Biogio's Rose; Governor Malibu pulls away in the Gander

Winter Rose

TRAINER JOHN HERTLER HAS forged a life in the sport of Thoroughbred racing. He began walking hots for Hall of Fame trainer P.G. Johnson at the age of 14. In 1984, six years after establishing his own barn, Hertler saddled one of the best Thoroughbreds in the world as Slew o' Gold swept the Whitney Handicap, Woodward Stakes, Marlboro Cup Invitational Handicap, and Jockey Club Gold Cup (all gr. I). The latter three races were tied to a \$1 million bonus.

Currently in his thirty-eighth year as a conditioner, Hertler is perhaps better known today for his strong string of New York-bred runners—among them Tri County Stables' homebred Storied Lady (by Read the Footnotes), who annexed the inaugural running of the \$100,000 Biogio's Rose Stakes Feb. 7 with a determined stretch run.

The 5-year-old Storied Lady, out of Wide Barrel, by Broad Brush, has now recorded all five of her wins, including the 2014 Bay Ridge Stakes, over Aqueduct's inner track.

Out of the starting gate in the Biogio's Rose, Storied Lady settled near the back of the six-horse field beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. Racing well in-hand for the opening

six furlongs, the mare rode the rail on the far turn, gathering momentum as the runners straightened into the stretch.

Storied Lady's chief competitor, Very Un Stable's (Joseph Gioia) Saythreehailmary's, was rallying boldly, five-wide off the turn. Saythreehailmary's came into the contest having won two consecutive stakes—the Bay Ridge and the Ladies Handicap—for trainer John Morrison.

Ortiz found a seam along the rail and Storied Lady burst through. Headlong into the final furlong, Storied Lady and Saythreehailmary's, who had shifted inside to occupy her rival's outside flank, competed in pitch battle. But with 100 yards remaining, Storied Lady pushed her head to the fore and was able to maintain that margin to the wire.

"Storied Lady came into the race in excellent shape. She fit with those other horses. In lots of these races, it comes down to who gets the best trip," said Hertler. "Irad (Ortiz) gave her a fabulous ride. She got through that opening at the rail, and when she grabbed the lead, I was saying, 'Give me that wire.' She loves the inner track. But I believe she could easily win on the main track at

Belmont. She usually starts to get good as the winter approaches, and that's inner track season."

Storied Lady completed the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles in 1:45.64.

The mare notched her fifth win from 24 starts and boosted her career earnings to \$355,651.

"I really liked the way Read the Footnotes looked as a stallion. At the time, he was standing in New York at Keane Stud. That meant I could take advantage of all the incentives of the New York-bred program," said Charlie Goldberg (Tri County Stables), who in retirement coaches girls' high school track and field. "We had Wide Barrel and two other mares already boarding at Keane, so I sent the three of them to Read the

Footnotes. Wide Barrel has also produced to stakes winner Love Abroad and stakes-placed Barrel of Love."

Saythreehailmary's, a 5-year-old daughter of Repent, continued her consistent winter campaign with a solid second-place finish, despite having to take the overland route home.

Perfect Freud, Jc's Shooting Star, In Spite of Mama, and Sheriffa completed the order of finish in the Biagio's Rose.

Alfred and Joseph Nastai's homebred Biagio's Rose (1994) reached the winner's circle 16 times in 52 starts beneath the tutelage of trainers Kay Erik Jensen and Bobby Ribaudo. The daughter of Polish Numbers captured the 2000 editions of the Rare Treat Handicap (gr. III) and Next Move Handicap (gr. III).

Governor Malibu wins the Gander Stakes by 2½ lengths

Governor's Gander

Heading into the \$98,000 Gander Stakes on Feb. 6, trainer Christophe Clement and his New York assistant, Christophe Lorieul, read the setup of the race exactly right. The heady pair of Christophes understood there probably wouldn't be a strong pace in the field of five 3-year-olds. So they instructed jockey Manny Franco to keep Jump Sucker Stable and Oak Bluff Stables' Governor Malibu (by Malibu Moon), who was adding blinkers for his sophomore debut, within striking distance of the lead.

The pace turned out to be glacial. Repole Stable's Sudden Surprise (by Giant Surprise) seized the early initiative, sauntering an opening quarter-mile of :25.37 and a half-mile of :50.29 for the mile, 70-yard test. Every step of the way, however, Governor Malibu was tracking just to his outside.

Midway on the far turn the relaxed front-runners became contentious, pulling away from the remaining competitors.

Through the stretch Governor Malibu, who shifted about more than once, responded to a series of left-handed encouragement from Franco to grab the lead at the sixteenth pole. Then, with an impressive burst of late speed, Governor Malibu drew off inside the final 100 yards to post a 2½-length victory.

"When I saw they walked early and he was up front right next to the leader, I thought that was perfect. He was on the outside with momentum and

just had to pick it up from there," said Lorieul. "Christophe (Clement) talked to me about this race in early January and he told me, 'I will prep him down in Florida, but I'll send him to you here for the Gander.'"

"Since his last race (a maiden victory Nov. 14 at Aqueduct going a mile), he had been a bit lazy. So we added the blinkers to put him a little more in the race and get him closer, especially on the inner track."

Governor Malibu, bred in the Empire State by Richard Leahy's Oak Bluff Stables, got the trip in 1:44.78, collecting his second win from five starts and increasing his earnings to \$149,600.

"I wanted to give Akilina (Governor Malibu's dam) a good chance," said Leahy of the mating with Malibu Moon. "I looked at the pedigree and Equix did a physical matching. I like to breed similar body types to one another."

Sudden Surprise was the runner-up in the Gander, followed by Taoiseach, Vincenzo, and Cards of Stone.

Gatsas Thoroughbred's Gander (1996), a gray gelding by Cormorant bred by Angela Rugnetta, won six stakes races, including the 2001 Meadowlands Cup Handicap (gr. II) and the 1999 and 2002 Empire Classic Handicaps. He earned \$1,824,011 and was named New York Horse of the Year in 2000. 🐾

Snow King

Drama King kicks clear to capture a snowy Hollie Hughes

CUTTING BACK FROM 1¼ miles to six furlongs, 4-year-old Drama King kicked past five of seven rivals in the stretch to earn his first career stakes victory in a contentious renewal of the \$100,000 Hollie Hughes Stakes for older New York-breds on a snowy Feb. 15 at Aqueduct.

Trained by Rudy Rodriguez for Michael Dubb and partners Bethlehem Stables, Michael Imperio, and David Simon, the colt by Nobiz Like Shobiz came into the Hollie Hughes looking to post his second win of the year over the inner track and was poised to win three straight going back to Nov. 29. Bettors, confident Drama King was sitting on a big race, bet him down to the 2-1 favorite off his 10-1 morning-line price.

On or near the lead in his last two winning efforts, but “squeezed a little at the break,” according to jockey Junior Alvarado, Drama King sat off the pace in the early stages of the one-turn Hollie Hughes while the speedy Bond Vigilante, pressed by Marriedtothemusic, covered the opening quarter-mile in :22.70 and a half-mile in :46.03.

Edging out into the two path midway on the turn, Drama King was angled wide in upper stretch, but still sixth, before he came barreling down the center of the track.

The colt blew past four rivals in midstretch and collared leader Eye Luv Lulu in the final stages, kicking clear to a 1½-length victory in 1:10.89.

Eye Luv Lulu finished second while Between the Lines edged Possessed for the show spot. Completing the order of finish were Bond Vigilante, West Hills Giant, Escape to the Moon, and Marriedtothemusic. Ostrolenka, Towering Moon, and Crafty Dreamer were scratched.

“I knew the speed was probably going to go away from me early,” said Alvarado. “He broke good, I got

squeezed a little at the break, and I just tried to settle a little bit. The only thing they told me was, ‘Make sure when you’re turning for home that he’s in the clear on the outside. He won’t run much if he’s inside of horses.’ He was pretty much helping me the whole way. When I asked him at the three-eighths pole to get room and then move out, he was there for me. After that I knew he was going to get there.”

Imperio offered, “It was the perfect trip. The only instructions to Junior were to keep him outside turning for home because he doesn’t like to pass horses on the inside. I think coming out of the route race back to sprint they went a pretty fast, :22 and change, but he rode her perfect. He got him out in time and flying down the stretch.”

Drama King adds his sixth career win and first stakes victory to three seconds and two thirds, including placing in last year’s Rego Park Stakes. He has earned \$285,020 from 16 starts.

Foaled at Keane Stud near Amenia, the colt is the second foal out of Winters Bell, a winning Iowa-bred daughter of Winter Glitter. Her first foal Mighty Zealous has earned more than \$170,000.

Drama King was bred by Gerald Reid. As a weanling Drama King RNA’d for \$8,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November breeding stock sale as part of the Kildare Stud consignment. He sold to Lady Luck Stable for \$13,000 at the 2014 Ocala Breeders’ Sales Co.’s June 2-year-old sale as part of the 30-30 Ranch consignment. 🐾

Frosty Margarita
wins two-turn
Maddie May

Frost on Top

FOR CHIP AND MARIA ACIERNO, the journey as Thoroughbred owners feels intensely personal. Their stable name, Gabrielle Farm, was inspired by the couple's now grown daughter, Gabrielle. And though the pair has been blissfully married for 29 years, Chip Acierno is aware his family's connection to racing reaches even further back in time.

"When I was in the 11th grade, I cut school at Manhasset High (on Long Island) and came to the racetrack. I felt comfortable here, right at home," said Chip Acierno. "Then I found out that about 100 years ago my family had stagecoaches in Italy. They raced them. When (my wife and I) got into the racing game, my grandfather gave us our family's silks (from Italy). They're not the same as silks nowadays, more like (banners) draped over the horses. Ours are red and state that we won the Primero race in Naples. So it's in my blood. We have those silks framed and hanging in our house."

"Actually, we bought a horse before we bought a house," added Maria Acierno.

The couple's first Thoroughbred was Churkin, a modest claimer in the mid 1990s. The Aciernos, however, quickly vaulted into stakes company as one of the original owners of the fast filly sprinter Carson Hollow (by Carson City), who captured the 2002 Prioress Stakes (gr. I) and missed by a nostril in the memorable 2002 Test Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga behind You (widely regarded as one of Tom Durkin's 10 greatest race calls). Carson Hollow was named 2002 New York-bred Horse of the Year, bankrolling \$500,110 in her 10-start career (6-3-0).

Now Chip and Maria have a brand-new stable star: homebred Frosty Margarita (by

Frost Giant), who on Jan. 31 captured her third straight New York-bred stakes—the inaugural running of the \$100,000 Maddie May Stakes contested at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles over Aqueduct’s “fast” inner track.

Moments before the race the Aciernos took up a position at the rail, along with trainer Rudy Rodriguez. The white-hot trainer also had another filly in the race; the promising Katniss the Victor (by Midnight Lute), owned in partnership by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Michael Imperio.

The two groupings of owners embraced each other as the field of six 3-year-old fillies loaded into the gate. They laughed and joked over the impending contest with the type of good-natured banter and respect that reflects the very best of the close-knit New York-bred community.

When the latch sprung open, Frosty Margarita rocketed to the front beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. The expected battle for the early lead with the fleet Absatootly (by Mineshaft), owned by Newman Racing, never materialized. Instead, Frosty Margarita found herself free-wheeling on an uncontested lead.

The opening quarter-mile was soft, raced in :25.54. At the half-mile mark, posted in :49.65, Frosty Margarita was in front by a half-dozen lengths, threatening to turn the Maddie May into a romp.

Frosty Margarita, however, had never won at a distance beyond 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs, despite a solid second-place finish in the one-mile \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes (Oct. 24) behind Super Surprise.

From the start Katniss the Victor had been tracking the pace three-wide under jockey Jose Otriz, Irad’s younger sibling.

Midway on the far turn, Katniss the Victor, who had won her lone previous start (at this 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile distance) with a green but impressive rally, was beginning to gather serious momentum.

Straightening into the lane, it was obvious Rodriguez would be unsaddling the winner. Only which set of owners would be celebrating with him?

Frosty Margarita was game. But her lead was shrinking steadily as Katniss

the Victor was in high gear, gobbling up the ground with long-reaching strides. It was an absolute chasm back to the rest of the field.

Irada Ortiz was at a disadvantage aboard a filly that disdained the whip. So he was forced to hand-ride to the finish. A stride before the wire, Jose Ortiz made one last lunge at the leader with his fast-closing filly.

The vantage point from the rail left both groups of owners uncertain as to which filly had won.

“I hope it’s a dead heat. That’s how much I respect you guys,” said Chip Acierno, as the owners and Rodriguez waited for the results.

The win photo showed Frosty Margarita got her nose on the wire first though Katniss the Victor rallied past on the succeeding stride.

“It was only her second race. She has a big future ahead,” said co-owner Dubb of the runner-up, who received her name from Libby Imperio (Michael Imperio’s wife), a huge fan of “The Hunger Games.”

“When you train these horses and they both perform the way you expect, it’s very satisfying,” said Rodriguez, who calls his barn a “family affair,” acknowledging the support of his team of workers, several of whom are his relatives.

Frosty Margarita, out of Mango Margarita (by Not For Love), notched her fourth win from seven starts (4-3-0), increasing her earnings to \$345,800.

The final time for the Maddie May was 1:44.91.

“Her breeding was suggested by Dan Barraclough,” said Chip Acierno. “He told me the nick (wasn’t substantial) but that the crosses were good.”

Kathy and Dan Barraclough own Saratoga Glen Farm. The 77-acre, 42-stall establishment is located just 12 minutes from Saratoga Racetrack.

“I liked the fact that there was some in-breeding. There was a lot of Mr. Prospector and it came through some very sound lines. Not For Love and Gone West have produced some durable types,” said Dan Barraclough. “I don’t use nicks as my sole tool or a determining factor. Nicks are just one more tool in my tool box. I believe that horses can make their own nicks.”

Maddie May (1997; by Not For Love) was bred by Roger Toffolon. She raced for So Madcapt Stable under the tutelage of Todd Pletcher, winning eight of 19 races and earning \$408,551. Her trio of New York-bred stakes conquests are the 1999 Maid of the Mist, 2001 Iroquois Handicap, and 2002 Schenectady Handicap. 🐾

John 'Chip' Acierno III enjoys racing's 'unbelievable experience'

Pouring It On

IT'S BEEN 13 YEARS since owner and breeder John "Chip" Acierno III attended the New York Thoroughbred Breeders' annual awards dinner. He was there in 2003 as part of the ownership group that campaigned Carson Hollow, who was recognized that evening as the Empire State's Horse of the Year, champion 3-year-old filly, and top sprinter for her brilliant racing season in 2002.

When Acierno takes his seat at this year's award banquet—April 4 at the Saratoga National Golf Club in Saratoga Springs—it will be with a horse he bred and owns solely. Acierno's Frosty Margarita, a daughter of New York stallion Frost Giant, is among the nominees for the 2015 champion 2-year-old filly title. Based on her 2015 past performances—3-3-0 in six starts, with two restricted stakes victories, in the Key Cents Stakes and a New York Stallion Series Stakes—Frosty Margarita stands an excellent chance of earning her owner another championship. And she added the Maddie May Stakes earlier this year (see page 30).

Acierno, a 54-year-old native of New York, had

been in the business several years when he and a few friends became part of a multiple partnership that purchased Carson Hollow. Following her win in the Prioress Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont Park during her 3-year-old season, Frank Stronach bought controlling interest in Carson Hollow.

While Acierno describes his association with Carson Hollow as “an unbelievable experience,” he noted that as a fairly new owner it might have given him unrealistic expectations.

“When we sold interest in Carson Hollow for a couple of million (to Stronach), we were like, ‘This is easy,’” Acierno said. “I can’t remember if I’ve had many profitable years since then, but it was thrilling to be a part of that experience.”

What has always been a comfortable notion and came instantly to Acierno, who owns and operates one of the largest corporate car services in New York City, was giving his heart to horse racing.

“I’ve always been in love with horses,” said Acierno, who grew up in Brooklyn. “I cut school once in 11th grade and went to Belmont Park. I was like, ‘Oh my God, I love this.’ I’ve never been a big gambler—\$20 or \$50, a race, at the

most. But I just love the pageantry, the color, and the smell of the horses.

“About 15 years ago I found out that my ancestors, who operated stage-

coaches in Italy, raced horses, so it was definitely in my blood,” he continued. “The minute I stepped foot on the track, I loved it. You know, you either love it or you don’t love it. It’s hard to learn how to love this business...you either have it or you don’t.”

Acierno’s first foray as an owner came in October 1995, when he and his father, John Jr., and a couple of friends, ponied up \$16,000 to claim Churkin, who raced at New York Racing Association tracks and was trained by Rick Dutrow Jr.

It was Dutrow who trained one of Acierno’s first homebred stakes winner, Margies Smile, who was named for the late Marjorie Clayton Cordero, who went to the same Long Island high school as Acierno and was the wife of Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr. On the theme of six degrees of separation, when Margies Smile won the 2007 Ruby Rubles Stakes for New York-breds

at Aqueduct, she was ridden by Rudy Rodriguez, who is Frosty Margarita’s trainer.

Acierno, whose horses run under the *nom de course* Gabrielle Farm, which is named for his daughter, currently owns two broodmares, including Frosty Margarita’s dam, Mango Margarita. The mating of Mango Margarita and Frost Giant—who, coincidentally, provided Rodriguez with his only graded stakes win as a jockey in the 2008 Suburban Handicap (gr. I)—came about when Dan and Kathy Barraclough of Saratoga Glen Farm, where Acierno boards his mares, possessed a free season to the stallion.

“I had nobody to breed to that year, and Dan and Kathy told me they had a free season to Frost Giant,” Acierno recalled. “I said, ‘Let’s do a nick.’ The nick came up a ‘D.’ I said, ‘Dan, are you crazy?’ But Dan is really smart, and he is really good with the crosses and told me it was a really good one, and that I was going to get a really good baby.”

Acierno bred and owns both of Frosty Margarita’s younger sisters—a yearling by Teufflesberg and a 2-year-old by Freud.

Mango Margarita will produce a foal by Central Banker this year. Acierno’s other broodmare, Saltamontes, has a yearling filly by Bellamy Road and is currently in foal to Dublin. Each of those stallions is based in New York.

“It’s always been about New York-breds and New York stallions for me,” Acierno said. “I really support the program. I didn’t have enough money to breed to Kentucky stallions. I really

like the New York-bred program and its bonuses and the stallions standing here. The bonuses can make the difference in a year between losing \$50,000 to \$100,000, or making some, or breaking even. Frosty Margarita is the perfect example of what can happen when you’ve got a good horse, running for good purses from the casino revenue and earning breeder awards.”

But Acierno, who also has horses at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack with trainer Jeremiah Englehart, doesn’t view this endeavor only as a moneymaker. In addition to his home in Westchester County, he and his wife, Maria, own a residence in Saratoga Springs and are frequently there during the track’s off-season to visit their mares and babies at Saratoga Glen Farm.

Through Acierno’s love affair with horses, Maria developed her own and loves to ride her pleasure horse.

“For me, this whole thing is a lifestyle,” he said. “If I can break even or not lose too much money and have all the friends and relationships I’ve developed in racing, and once in a while get a good horse, like Frosty Margarita, it’s all worth it to me.” 🐾

It makes sense, of course, that they're rooting for the team with the horse as a logo, and it makes sense, too, for them to be rooting for Manning, whose family football lines run deep. Long-time breeders in New York, Taylor and Wilmot know a little something about pedigree, and about how you need the perfect combination of skill and luck to produce a winner.

Their names have been linked in New York's equine industries for decades, but the paths that brought them together began in very different places.

Though he grew up in central New

York, Bill spent his summers at the home of his aunt and uncle in Louisiana. His mother was from a farming family in the state, and he was first introduced to horses at the farm owned by his aunt and uncle.

"We went to those little country tracks every weekend for the match races," he said. "Those are the tracks that produced jockeys like Kent Desormeaux."

The son of William "Wee" Wilmot, a commercial real estate developer, Wilmot didn't head directly to a life at the racetrack. Instead, he went to the nation's capital to study American gov-

ernment at Georgetown University... and then he went to the track. "I went home to Finger Lakes," he said. "I considered becoming an attorney, but instead I was a hotwalker and a groom, and then I took out my trainer's license in the '70s."

He trained for nine years, winning the 1975 Met Mile (gr. I) with Gold and Myrrh, beating, among others, Forego, who finished third. Gold and Myrrh, a son of Damascus, equaled the stakes record in his victory.

Two years later, after seeing Billy Turner get fired months after winning the Triple Crown with Seattle Slew,

years, but beyond hearing about Triple Crown winners, I had no exposure to racehorses."

After graduating from Connecticut College with a degree in zoology, she became one of 42 students in the first class of veterinary students at Tufts University, which published little biographies on each of the students it had accepted.

"I read the blurb on Bill early on," she said, "before I knew him, and I thought, 'That's really interesting: he trained horses, he had a grade I winner...he beat Forego!'"

Following stints in Kentucky under the mentorship of Dr. Jim Klyza, who developed their interests in mare reproductive health, Taylor and Wilmot, who got married in 1984, settled in Saratoga Springs, working as general practitioners. Wilmot had started going to the track there with his parents as a child; his father was an avid racing fan who later became an owner and breeder, and Wilmot had purchased land in Saratoga in the early '80s, at a time when, Taylor recalled, the New York breeding program was flourishing.

"There were a lot of forward thinkers involved then," she said. "They saw great potential."

The Oklahoma training track had only recently been opened for off-season training, and with a couple of mares of their own, two sons, and a thriving veterinary practice, Wilmot and Taylor found themselves busier than they could handle, reaching a point where they had to decide to expand or contract their veterinary business.

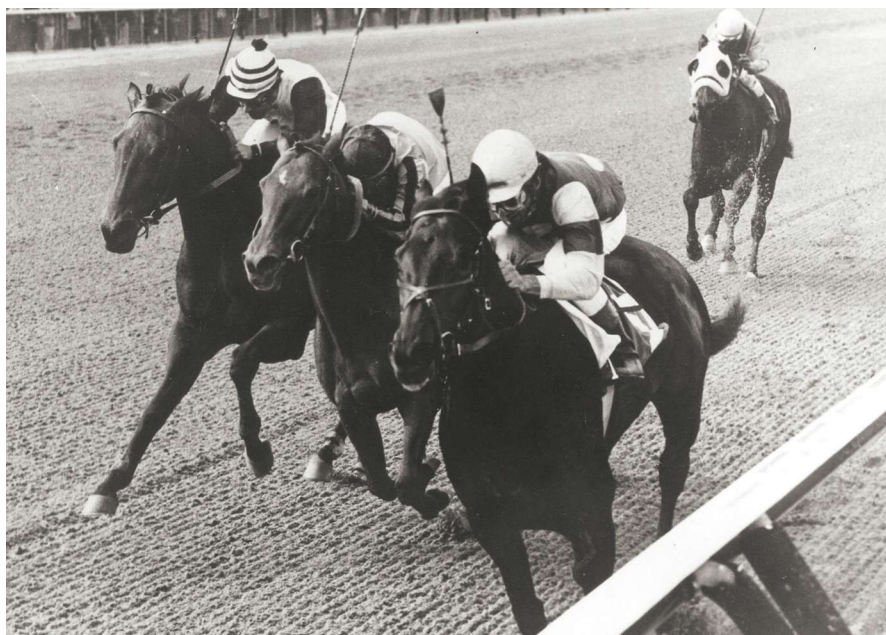
"There was a downturn in the industry in the late '80s," said Wilmot. "So we decided to get smaller and concentrate on breeding."

They generally kept about a dozen mares on their Stepwise Farm, all their own; they seldom took in boarders and practiced almost exclusively on their own horses.

"It was great," said Taylor. "We got to be the resident vets on our own farm."

But there were also, she pointed out, challenges in an upstate New York

Wilmot decided that he'd had enough, increasingly uneasy about the lack of control he felt as a trainer.

"I still liked horses," he said. "So I decided to go to vet school to become a better horseman."

Taylor took no such detours. Like Wilmot, she grew up with horses, but she was riding on the Mid-Atlantic show circuit, far from the bush tracks of Cajun country, and she knew from a young age that she wanted to be a veterinarian.

"I loved science, and I loved veterinary medicine," she said. "I worked for vets for much of my teenage and college

equine landscape that looked very different from today's.

"Until recently there was very little infrastructure here," said Taylor, referring to the lack of equine medical facilities upstate. "A lot of times Bill and I would be standing there looking at a mare and realizing that it would be up to us to get that foal safely out. Every gray hair I have is from times like that.

"Now," she went on, "there are some very good referral facilities here, and that's exciting because it will allow people to have a bigger investment in New York breeding."

She also noted the current prevalence

of women practicing veterinary medicine, another big change from when she started out.

"Everyone was nervous about women being vets back then," she said. "Everyone was really nice to me, but I was definitely an oddity. And on some interviews the men would explain to me why women couldn't be vets, then ask me out for a date."

Taylor and Wilmot have only three mares on their Stepwise Farm these days; like much of the rest of the industry, they scaled back in 2008, keeping mares with proven records from families that have done well for them.

Sadly, their Naughty Natisha (by

Known Fact), dam of 2007 New York-bred Horse of the Year Naughty New Yorker, winner of multiple stakes for state-breds and the 2006 Red Smith Handicap (gr. III), was found dead in her paddock the morning of Feb. 24.

"She was my favorite broodmare," said Taylor of the 2007 New York Broodmare of the Year. "She was 22 and since her first foal, she had done everything right."

"She had been a great broodmare for us," Wilmot said. "She was such a cool horse. She was demure and self-contained. Nothing excited her. She set the tone for our broodmare band. She had all those little things."

Wilmot and Taylor are eagerly await-

ing the debut of Naughty Natisha's 2014 Tapizar colt (named Carthon), for whom they have high hopes.

The colt had been sold as a weanling to Vivien Malloy, who entered him in last summer's Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings. An RNA at \$95,000, he was sold privately to trainer Gary Sciacca for Bill Parcells, who coached the New York Giants to two Super Bowl wins.

"We're hoping some of that Super Bowl luck rubs off on him," said Wilmot.

Naughty Natisha is expecting a May foal by Bodemeister.

Joining Naughty Natisha on the farm is Miss Turlington (by Seattle

Slew), who also foaled a New York-bred Horse of the Year for the couple, Incurable Optimist in 1998. She joined their broodmare band in 1994, when Taylor and Wilmot purchased her for \$100,000 at the Keeneland November sale of breeding stock.

Producer of a string of six-figure horses at auction, she is also the dam of Tiffany Twisted, one of several Stepwise horses named for songs by the Eagles (Naughty Natisha's 2006 Yes It's True filly was called Thin Disguise, from the song "Lyn' Eyes"). Tiffany Twisted foaled a 2013 Ghostzapper filly that RNA'd for \$37,000 as a yearling and then sold to Mike Repole for \$105,000 at last

year's Fasig-Tipton Midatlantic sale of 2-year-olds in training. Named Chocolate Smoothie, she placed in her first two starts early this year.

In 2001 Taylor and Wilmot purchased a 4-year-old filly by Deputy Minister out of the Pleasant Colony mare Seewillo for \$300,000. Six years later Doyenne foaled a colt by Ecton Park that sold for \$25,000. Named Most Happy Fella, he went on to earn more than \$400,000 before recently being retired through New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Take the Lead program.

"We're very happy about it," said Wilmot. "He was retired largely through the efforts of (NYTHA's) Rick Schos-

berg. He was instrumental in making it happen, and it was very satisfying to see that. His father, Paul, and my father were pioneers in the breeding industry in New York.

"It's nice to see those generational things happening," he continued, "and it's great to see aftercare becoming an issue front and center. It's not solved, but I see some good people doing some good things, and it's a start."

"It's wonderful when you breed horses like Incurable Optimist, or Time's Mistress, or Naughty New Yorker," said Taylor. "It's also wonderful when you breed a horse like Most Happy Fella, who goes out and wins the hard way. My hat's off to those warriors."

Though they've downsized their commercial breeding business, both Wilmot and Taylor remain active in the industry. He serves on the board of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeders' Development Fund; she was elected to the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders after being appointed last year to fill the spot vacated by Barry Ostrager, who resigned after being appointed to the Civil Branch of the New York state Supreme Court.

Taylor is also designing a series of

educational seminars for the state's breeders.

"It's a nice way to help give back to the industry," she said. "We've got some very experienced people in the state, and this is an opportunity for them to share their knowledge."

Sponsored by the Breeders' Development Fund and NYTB, the first seminar, on foaling mares, was held in December

at Fasig-Tipton's Humphrey S. Finney sales pavilion in Saratoga Springs. The next is scheduled for April 30 and will focus on raising horses from foals to yearlings.

"We try to do timely topics related to what's going on in the breeding industry at that time of year," Taylor explained. "The first one was very well attended."

With decades of success as commercial breeders behind them, Taylor and Wilmot know what it takes to breed and raise a foal that will sell well, but it's that experience that has tended to keep them humble.

"You always need luck," said Taylor. "You can't ever think you know it all. You can do everything right and things still don't work out. It's an unbelievable gauntlet, from the time you make the decision to breed a mare to picking the stallion to when the hammer falls. It's always great when your horse goes to the sale looking great and has learned to walk and behaves and is well-received. It's rewarding for the whole staff."

On that Sunday night in early February, Taylor and Wilmot watched as Peyton Manning was himself the beneficiary of some luck, as Cam Newton's Carolina Panthers failed to mount the expected challenge and Manning's Broncos won the Super Bowl 24-10, his experience perhaps the difference in what may have been his final game.

Up on Fitch Road near Saratoga Springs, there's plenty of game left in Stepwise Farm. Wilmot and Taylor will welcome foals this spring and get yearlings ready for sale. They'll follow the horses they've bred through their racing careers, and they'll breed their mares, hoping for another Naughty New Yorker, another Incurable Optimist, another Most Happy Fella.

And they'll continue to contribute to the industry that drew them both in, pulling them away from successful careers as veterinarians to take their places among the state's most established and respected breeders.

"We're trying to do things to be a positive force," said Taylor. "In the industry, and in the world." 🐾

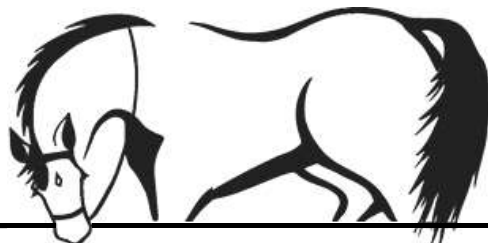

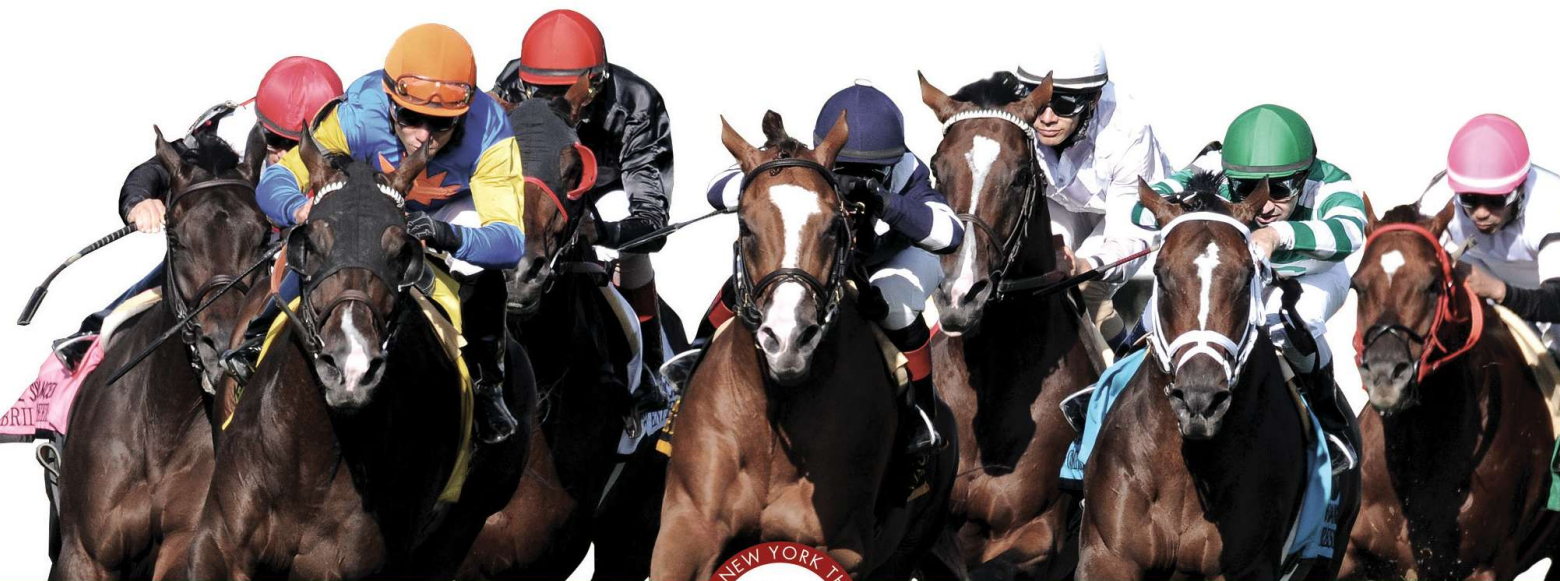
