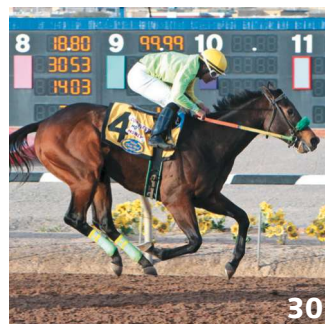

Done Deal(s) in Albany

THIS YEAR'S NEW YORK STATE BUDGET ran a week past the April 1 deadline, but for breeders, horsemen, and anyone else with a stake in the state's breeding and racing programs, it was well worth the wait.

New York Thoroughbred Breeders embarked on the budget process with, arguably, the most ambitious and challenging agenda ever. Issues material to the interests of the equine sector included restoration of the New York Racing Association to private control after five years of operating under the aegis of the state; provisions for the racing calendar; a proposed expansion of powers of the Franchise Oversight Board over NYRA finances; and a new model for financing equine drug testing.

Offsetting the challenges of making sure that decision-makers took breeders' interests into account in their negotiations, NYTB adopted a new MO for the budget process this year: Get a seat at the table early and make sure to stay in constant touch with the legislature and governor's office throughout the process. The results exceeded expectations.

The most hotly debated racing and gaming issue of the budget was the composition of the new NYRA board. The outcome included a big win for the horsemen and breeders and was as good as could be expected regarding the distribution of private and state appointees.

The new 17-member NYRA board will comprise

- eight members appointed by the executive committee of the current NYRA reorganization board
- six state appointees (two each by the governor, senate majority leader, and assembly speaker)
- the NYRA CEO (ex officio)
- one NYTB appointee to represent the breeders
- one New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association appointee to represent the horsemen.

Except for the CEO, who has no term limit, board members will serve three-year terms, but can serve no longer than nine years.

The big-ticket item for us is that all board members will have equal voting rights, which restores the voting privileges breeders and horsemen enjoyed before the governor's appointment of the NYRA reorganization board.

By contrast with the complexities of NYRA governance, a deceptively simple-sounding budget provision has even greater ramifications for our program's future. It is now codified in statute that winter race dates at NYRA may not be reduced below 95 days without written permission from NYTB and NYTHA, in addition to approval by the gaming commission.

With veto power over any radical changes to winter racing, breeders and horsemen now have the power to preserve one of the most important engines driving the success of the program overall. This legislative achievement is monumental.

Other victories for the equine sector include scaling back some of the more draconian aspects of the governor's proposal to expand FOB powers over NYRA finances, including the power to impound racing support payments unilaterally in the event of two consecutive years of "material losses." Also, the state opted not to eliminate a requirement that equine drug testing be conducted by approved New York State college. Moreover, the final budget spelled out how costs for drug testing—now to be covered by stakeholders—will be distributed, annual race-track assessments, and per-start fees for owners and trainers.

With the budget in the books, one outstanding legislative issue will occupy the lion's share of our attention for the remainder of the session: reversing the unintended negative consequences of Genting's operation of Nassau County OTB's video lottery terminals at Aqueduct. Several elected officials agree with our contention that the situation needs to be rectified as soon as possible, and we have been informed Genting does have applications with the state to install new machines to replace the ones taken out of circulation for racing and breeding revenue.

Finally, as you know, the once-imperiled Finger Lakes meet is now underway with the help of a two-year agreement (with the option for a third year) to supplement the horseman's purse account with monies from the state's Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, Delaware North, and del Lago. NYTB continues to collaborate with all interested parties on a plan to make Finger Lakes racing sustainable in the long term, and I will keep you informed as our work develops. 🐾

Highway Star takes Aqueduct's Distaff Handicap

Send It In wins the Excelsior

New York-breds stepped way out into open company during April and brought home some of racing's biggest prizes. Five graded stakes, from Gulfstream, to Oaklawn, to Aqueduct were won by state-breds, and two others appear headed to the Preakness Stakes (G1), the second jewel of the Triple Crown.

April Fool's day was no joke for breeder/owners Bill Parsons and David Howe as their Summersault stepped up in Gulfstream's Orchid Stakes (G3T). To read their story, go to page 20.

Aqueduct's big weekend, April 8, featuring the Wood Memorial Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (G2), was fertile hunting ground for state-breds with a pair of New Yorkers proving their mettle on the undercard. The following day Chester and Mary Broman's Highway Star—already a grade 3 winner of last year's Go for Wand Handicap—added the Distaff Handicap to her expanding résumé.

The Broman's month got started off on the right foot when Highway Star was named champion 3-year-old filly for 2016 and the Bromans added a fourth award as the top breeders in the state.

Highway Star, who has now won six of nine starts, began her career at three with back-to-back victories at Belmont last May and July. Unplaced in her first stakes try, the Statue of Liberty division of the NYSS at Saratoga, she finished third in the Fleet Indian at the Spa before reeling off wins in a second-level allowance race, the Staten Island and Go for Wand. Highway Star has earned \$464,000.

The chestnut filly out of Stolen Star, a multiple stakes-placed homebred for the Bromans, who is also a half sister to their multiple stakes winner and sire, Friend or Foe.

Highway Star's sire Girolamo, a grade 1-winning son of A.P. Indy owned by Darley, began his stud career in 2012 at Becky Thomas and Dennis Narlinger's Sequel Stallions New York before relocating to Kentucky.

Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables' Long Haul Bay made his way to the winner's circle following the seven-furlong Bay Shore Stakes (G3) in just his second career start. The backstory to his being an RNA can be found on page 24.

Paul Pompa Jr. continues to build on his success, and the success of New York-based sire Big Brown with Send It In. A two-time stakes winner against state-breds, the 5-year-old gelding ran an excellent 2:02.07 for 10 furlongs in taking the Excelsior Stakes (G3). Send It In was foaled at Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm near Hyde Park and is the first foal out of Sharp Instinct, a daughter of Awesome Again whom Pompa purchased as a yearling for \$275,000 at Keeneland September in 2008.

The biggest winner of the month was Randy Howg's Inside Straight, who roared to a two-length score in the \$750,000 Oaklawn Handicap.

SF Bloodstock bred the 4-year-old gelding by Super Saver—Dance Alexa, by Southern Halo. He was foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag. Dance Alexa was an \$80,000 purchase at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. She's also the dam of Kentucky-bred Dance Daily, winner of the 2006 Santa Ynez Stakes (G2). Inside Straight's full sister, New York-bred Conquest Superstep, ran second in the 2015 Fleet Indian Stakes.

Inside Straight made his first 10 starts in New York for Win-

Star Farm and trainer Todd Pletcher, running third to Love That Jazz and Dr. Shane in the 2015 Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes. He has now earned \$752,889 with seven wins from 20 starts.

PREAKNESS PICTURE

The Preakness, run May 20, is traditionally limited to 14 starters and this year two might be New York-breds, based on the outcome of the April 22 Federico Tesio Stakes at Laurel Park.

Cobra Farm's Twisted Tom won the nine-furlong Tesio to go along with his wins in an allowance optional claimer at Aqueduct in January and Laurel's \$100,000 Private Terms Stakes at 1 1/16 miles on March 18.

Twisted Tom was a decisive 2 1/4-length winner in 1:53.60 over a sealed track for trainer Chad Brown.

Bred by Dr. William Wilmot and Dr. Joan Taylor and foaled at Gallagher Stud, Twisted Tom earned a "Win and You're In" invitation to the Preakness, where he may be joined in the gate by fellow New York-bred Conquest Mo Money (see page 30).

Twisted Tom is from the first crop of Creative Cause and is the Kentucky-based sire's leading earner so far in 2017 with \$169,200. Twisted Tome is out of Wilmot and Taylor's Tiffany Twisted, by Thunder Gulch. Tiffany Twisted is a half sister to New York-bred champion Incurable Optimist. Both have C.C.A.

Oaks (G1) winner Class Play as their second dam.

In the race prior to the Tesio, another New York-bred, Newman Racing's home-bred Absatootly, pulled off a 10-1 upset in the six-furlong Primonetta Stakes for trainer Charlton Baker. Bred by the late Donald Newman, Absatootly (by Mine-shaft—So N So, by Freud) was foaled at Fawn Ridge Farm near East Nassau.

The 4-year-old filly had previously shown an affinity for Laurel, winning open allowance races there in March 2016 and this February. In New York she won the \$100,000 East View Stakes in December 2015. She's also stakes-placed at Belmont, Finger Lakes, and Mahoning Valley Race Course in Ohio.

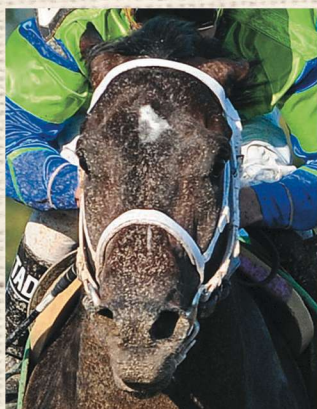

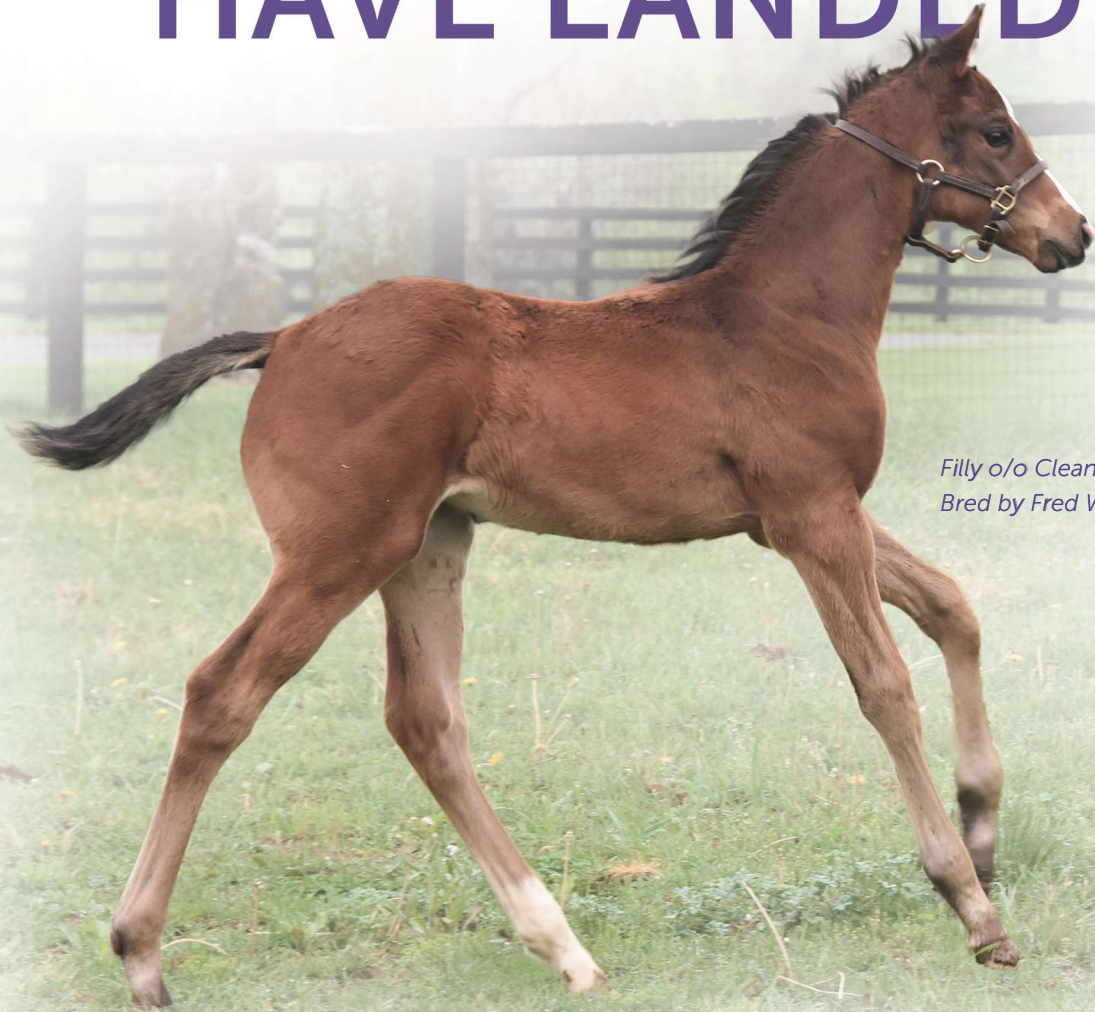

HEAD OVER HEELS

Bill Parsons and David Howe's Summersault is on a roll

ON APRIL 1, XPRESSBET FLORIDA DERBY day at Gulfstream Park, owner Bill Parsons stood on the steps leading to the horsemen's area. Nearby was his trainer Mark Hennig, along with Hennig's wife, Rosemary, and two of Parsons' friends, watching as the horses loaded for the Orchid Stakes (G3T). Parsons' Summersault, co-owned and -bred with his partner David Howe, was the longest shot in the five-horse field at 9-1.

"I'm not sure she fits," Hennig had admitted the day before at his barn. But he had decided to take a shot with the 5-year-old New York-bred mare by Rock Hard Ten out of Saratoga Summer, by Smart Strike, hoping that the field might come up light with some of the high-powered turf trainers pointing their horses to races later in the month at Keeneland.

Heading into the Orchid, Summersault was two-for-two over Gulfstream's firm turf course, both of those wins coming in allowance optional claiming contests. The Orchid was her graded stakes debut, and she was facing a multiple graded/group stakes winner in Olorda and the multiple graded stakes-placed stakes winner Quiet Kitten.

Summersault and jockey Paco Lopez raced well back of the pacesetter in the early going, and Parsons watched intently but calmly as the field made its way past the grandstand for the first time. But as the dark bay or brown mare began to make her move heading into the far turn, both Parsons and Hennig became more animated, and, situated perfectly to see her overtake the leader, exulted when she crossed the wire three-quarters of a length in front of favored Olorda.

"She ran just great," said Parsons a few weeks later. "She's a homebred, and we didn't really know if she could get the distance (1 $\frac{3}{8}$ miles). To watch her run down the favorite—what a thrill."

It was a thrill Parsons nearly didn't get to experience. When Hennig headed south in the late fall, he was admittedly stymied by what to do

with Summersault. Though competitive in two races just before going to Florida, she hadn't won since April 2016 and had little value as a broodmare. Running for a tag at Gulfstream was one option; so was selling her.

Then Hennig decided to go south early in the Gulfstream season. He expected the Gulfstream turf to be firm—Summersault had shown a demonstrated aversion to ground with any cut in it—and by arriving early, he might avoid competition from the perennial top turf trainers.

“So we got her down there right away and ran her in mid-December, and it made a big difference having her back on a regular turf course,” said Hennig. Summersault won Dec. 16 by a half-length and came back to win by an identical margin in early February before her win in the Orchid.

Hennig has trained horses for Parsons and Howe for more than a decade; the more gregarious of the duo, Parsons is the face of the partnership, with Howe preferring to take a more retiring role.

A retired attorney, Parsons began to get seriously involved in horse racing when he was introduced to Cot Campbell in the 1980s. Though he went to the track occasionally, he hadn't really considered ownership, thinking it beyond his budget, but the accommodating Campbell offered to sell Parsons a half-share in two ownership groups.

“The hook,” said Parsons, “was set.”

Within a few years Parsons had bought into another partnership with the syndicate, this one called Dogwood Classic.

“There was a small colt in there,” he said. “His name was Summer Squall.”

Second in the Kentucky Derby (G1), Summer Squall won the Preakness Stakes (G1) for Dogwood in 1990, and while Parsons owned what he called the equivalent of the horse's left rear hock, the size of his investment was hardly proportional to the pleasure he took in the experience. He remained involved with Dogwood until he and Howe went out on their own in 1998.

“We were both on the board of the Buckley School in Manhattan,” Parsons explained, “and we were talking before

one of the board meetings. We discovered that we were both interested in horse racing, so we said, ‘Let's do something together.’ We do everything 50-50.”

Hennig started training for Howe and Parsons in 2001, and the two are among the trainer's longest-standing clients. Hennig trained their first graded stakes winner, Merry Meadow, who won the Sugar Swirl Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream in 2014 and went on to win three other graded stakes.

“Mark is an extremely good trainer, and I trust him enormously,” said Parsons. “When I was looking for a trainer, I called the barn at Saratoga and this very nice person answered the phone and said she'd be glad to see me come around.

“That turned out to be his mother, Pat. It turned out that she and I have the same birthday, and we ended up becoming friendly with her. If you have a mother like that, you've got to be good.”

“We went through a few rough years together,” said Hennig, “but they've been patient and communicated well, and they've got a nice group of mares and a good breeding program. They're really hitting on all cylinders.”

Initially buying colts, Parsons and Howe were more interested in the racing side, not breeding, but an A.P. Indy mare named Lunar Colony changed that. The Will Farish and W.S. Kilroy homebred raced in England and made

one start in the U.S. before being offered at the 2004 Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

“We thought A.P. Indy was going to be a great broodmare sire, and that was the beginning of our breeding program,” Parsons said.

Through agent McMahon Bloodstock, Howe and Parsons bought the mare for \$180,000, and she produced five foals for them, four of them New York-breds. Two of them, Lunar Victory and The Tea Cups, are multiple stakes winners, the former selling for \$350,000 as a yearling.

“We start off with our love of the animals,” Parsons said. “We love our horses, but if you want to stay in the game, you have to have a plan. Our plan has been to sell colts and keep one or two fillies.”

It's a plan that seems to be working.

At the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky winter mixed sale in 2010, the partners purchased a Maryland-bred mare named Merryland Monroe in foal to Henny Hughes for \$75,000. A month later she delivered Merry Meadow, who went on to earn more than \$850,000 for the partners. A year later she had an Exchange Rate filly that Howe and Parsons named Blithely. Stakes-placed, she earned \$310,000 and is now part of their small broodmare band, which they keep at Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains.

In 2015 they made the hard decision

to sell Merry Meadow. She'd won the Princess Rooney Stakes (G2) that summer, then finished seventh in the Ballerina Stakes (G1) and sixth in the Twin-Spires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1), and her owners had entered in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale.

"She sold the day after the Breeders' Cup, and she ran just great," Parsons said. "But there was a residual value, and you have to decide what you can keep. It was a very hard decision. We

fund awards are terrific. Even if we sell a horse that goes on to race, we still get breeders' awards. I think we were one of the earliest people to do strictly New York-breds, and it's turned out terrifically."

Parsons makes the decisions for the breeding end of their business in consultation with Mike McMahon of McMahon Bloodstock who purchased Saratoga Summer, Summersault's dam.

"He was the person on the scene" at

along with the black type that adds value to her prospects as a broodmare. She'll remain in training this year, though Hennig isn't sure where she'll run next, particularly given her pronounced propensity for firm turf.

"We have to play the weather card," said the trainer. "New York-bred Showcase Day at Belmont (May 29) is a possibility, and so is the Robert G. Dick Memorial (G3T, July 8) at Delaware Park. Could be New York-bred, could be open—anywhere she fits best.

"We're committed with her to making sure that we don't subject her to (soft) surfaces that we occasionally did in the past."

"We'll find a spot going a route where the track is hard," said her owner. "She's thrived on having six or seven weeks between races, and we're not going to rush her. She's been extremely sound her entire career; she's really a beautiful filly, and Mark just takes such good care of the horses."

In addition to Summersault, Hennig also trains 3-year-old Bartleby (Lemon Drop Kid—Kaleidoscope, by Elusive Quality) for Parsons and Howe and is expecting the imminent arrival of a pair of 2-year-olds, both by Flatter: Cartwheel, Bartleby's half sister; and Puffery, a filly out of Celestial Sweep.

Summersault has a 2-year-old half sister by Broken Vow named Summer Squeeze; Saratoga Summer also has a yearling Mineshaft filly and is expecting a foal by Union Rags.

Nearly as excited as Parsons himself when Summersault won the Orchid, Parsons' friends that afternoon at Gulfstream were racetrack rookies.

"They hadn't been to the races before. I told them that it's not always that easy," said the man who was a part owner of a classic winner in his first few years in the business.

"Bill's a fun guy to win for," said Hennig. "When you train for good people, it's fun to win for them. They're not just clients; they're friends, and it means more to share it with people that you're close to." 🐾

loved her, and she was a wonderful, wonderful horse to own."

Merry Meadow sold for \$480,000, consigned by Hidden Brook near Paris, Ky., where Parsons and Howe keep their mares and foals when they're in Kentucky.

Merry Meadow was the rare Kentucky-bred for the partners, though they regularly breed to Kentucky stallions. Part of their business plan, said Parsons, is to have all New York-breds.

"There are obviously two major advantages," he explained. "New York-bred restricted races and the breeders'

the Keeneland January mixed sale in 2009, Parsons said. "I wasn't there. He advises me on all of these things, and he's absolutely excellent."

Saratoga Summer's first foal for the partnership, by Corinthian, sold for \$100,000 as a 2-year-old. Named Summer Place to Be, he broke his maiden at first asking at Saratoga, his namesake track, and earned more than \$160,000 before being retired to New Vocations, an adoption and retraining facility. He was adopted in December.

With her win in the Orchid, Summersault has earned just shy of \$375,000,

“It doesn’t always work out this way, but you are going to be a much better commercial breeder if you can afford to race a few,” Bell said. “It keeps you in control of your broodmares’ destinies in a lot of ways.”

Clay also has raced New York-bred Ancient Secret, winner of last summer’s Lake George Stakes (G2T) at Saratoga. Bred by Lambholm, she was a \$225,000 purchase at the 2015 OBS spring sale. The daughter of Kantharos has been training steadily at Palm Meadows Training Center in South Florida for her 2017 debut.

Long Haul Bay, by Lane’s End’s Quality Road, is the sixth foal Clay has bred out of the French Deputy daughter and grade 3 winner French Satin, whom he bought for \$400,000 in foal to Hard Spun out of the 2008 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. The mare, a half sister to multiple grade 1 winner Lion Heart, was consigned by Blackburn Farm.

Good luck with French Satin came early as her in utero Hard Spun colt grew up to be graded-placed, black-type stakes winner Midnight Transfer. She has produced four additional winners including Long Haul Bay.

Clay, now a Florida resident, has more often than not sent French Satin to Kentucky to be bred but has her foals drop in New York to take advantage of the state-bred incentives. She delivered an April 7 colt by WinStar Farm’s Fed Biz and will be bred back to Quality Road.

Bell described French Satin as a nice, neat, and correct mare who doesn’t produce a horse of appreciable size, despite the best efforts to infuse some size.

“When we’ve bred her to size, it hasn’t seemed to make much of a difference, so we have learned to accept that,” Bell said. “At this point we just try to match her up with a sire that will help her get a racehorse. We got that with Long Haul Bay, who is not overly big but he is well balanced and strong.” 🐾

‘Long’ on State-Breds

Jon Clay strikes with RNA Long Haul Bay

OWNER/BREEDER JON CLAY got into Thoroughbred breeding with a clear objective—to produce horses to sell, not to race.

The market, however, has not always agreed with Clay regarding what his homebreds are worth, and in those incidences the New York native won’t hesitate to prove his horses on the racetrack.

“When Mr. Clay came into the business, his plan was to be a commercial breeder. He buys his mares with the intent of selling what they produce, and he’s executed on that plan,” said Reynolds Bell Jr., who is Clay’s adviser on bloodstock purchases and matings. “He values them realistically, but if they don’t bring that price, then he is happy to race them.”

So far, Clay’s Plan “B” has been working extraordinarily well.

His most recent success with a homebred buy-back came in the Bay Shore Stakes (G3) April 8 at Aqueduct where New York-bred Long Haul Bay earned the mantle of graded stakes winner in his second lifetime start.

Clay offered Long Haul Bay through the Mill Ridge Sales consignment at Fasig-Tipton’s 2015 Saratoga select yearling sale where he bought him back for \$120,000. Clay tried again to sell the colt the following year at the Ocala Breeders’ Sales March 2-year-olds sale where Long Haul Bay got a lot of attention but developed a chip in a knee after his pre-sale work and had to be scratched from the sale.

After the chip had been removed, Clay sent the colt to New York-based trainer Chad Brown.

Clay has had even better luck with a Kentucky-bred daughter of Bernardini—Summer Raven, by Summer Squall, named Lewis Bay, who was a \$170,000 buy-back at the 2014 Keeneland September sale. She had a reserve of \$200,000.

Racing for Clay’s Alpha Delta Stables, Lewis Bay went on to win the Demoiselle Stakes (G2), Gazelle Stakes (G2), and the Turnback the Alarm Handicap (G3). She placed in the Longines Kentucky Oaks and Mother Goose Stakes (both G1) and was off the board only once in 10 starts and earned \$805,600.

Raising the Flag

WHEN IT COMES TO RACING, Thomas Albrecht is a man of faith, especially concerning his broodmare No More Flags (by Personal Flag) and stands by the concept of breeding to the best and hoping for the best. That faith was amply rewarded in the form of No More Flags' fourth foal, Bluegrass Flag, a fast and talented daughter of Bluegrass Cat whom Albrecht co-bred and co-owns.

"At the time, Bluegrass Cat was one of the better stallions in New York, and we wanted to stay in New York. He was a son of Storm Cat and had a good race record. Although it wasn't that great of a match on the nick, we took a shot with it. And it's really paid off," said Albrecht, who owns Bluegrass Flag in partnership with his friend Vincent Fusaro. "Her first foal, One More Chief, could run a little bit (winning four of 14 starts). But he had some physical issues. Right now we have two on the farm (from No More Flags), a (2-year-old colt by) Posse and a (yearling colt by) Dublin."

Bluegrass Flag arrived in the starting gate for the \$100,000 Park Avenue Division of the New York Stallion Stakes April 22 having won two of her four career races, punctuated by a handy last-out stakes tally in the open Cicada Stakes. The main competition for the Thomas Morley-trained 3-year-old filly in the NYSS appeared to be Noble Freud (by Freud), out of the well-accomplished mare Noble Fire, who had previously produced Eclipse Award winner La Verdad (by Yes It's True) and the fleet Hot City Girl (by City Zip).

Noble Freud had galloped in her lone start, a front-running score at

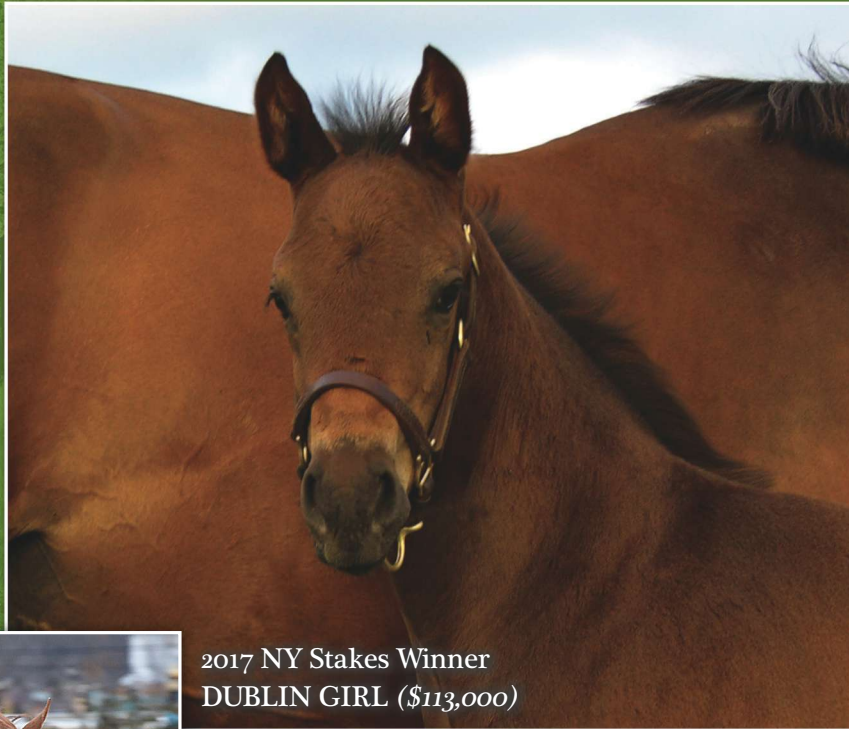

Oaklawn Park, before owner Dwight Pruett (Xpress Thoroughbreds) of Texarkana, Ark., sold 75% of her to New York interests, including Head of Plains Partners. The filly (trained by Jinks Fires) was then transferred to the care of trainer Chad Brown, and the bettors at Aqueduct established her as the heavy 1-5 favorite.

Away from the gate, jockey Kendrick Carmouche, who has been a dominant force in New York over the winter and spring due to his aggressive riding, immediately seized the lead upon Bluegrass Flag from the projected front-runner Noble Freud and never relinquished it.

Bluegrass Flag raced an opening quarter mile in 22.71 and a half-mile in 45.48. She appeared to be doing it well within herself and was never really threatened by the favorite, who was always on the chase.

In the lane Bluegrass Flag found another gear and strode away from her six sophomore rivals, registering her second straight six-length victory.

“My filly ran a gorgeous race today,” said Carmouche. “What a good job by Thomas Morley and his team. All I had to do was sit on her and get her around and make her look good.”

Morley was occupied in Ocala, Fla., with the Ocala Breeders’ Sales April sale. His assistant Ron Breed did the saddling. The trainer was also represented by his wife, New York Racing Association analyst Maggie Wolfendale, who excitedly sprinted into the winner’s circle, hugging her team and shouting, “Yes! Hell, yes!”

Bluegrass Flag stopped the timer for the 6½-furlong event in 1:16.67.

“We had made this trip coming over here on the van five times (from Bluegrass Flag’s Belmont Park stall to Aqueduct). This is also our fifth race. That gave us a big experience edge on the favorite who had never run in New York before,” said Albrecht.

Susanne and James Hooper are the co-breeders of Bluegrass Flag, who has earned \$173,220.

Noble Freud, also co-owned by Michael Kisber and Medallion Racing, secured the runner-up spot in the Park

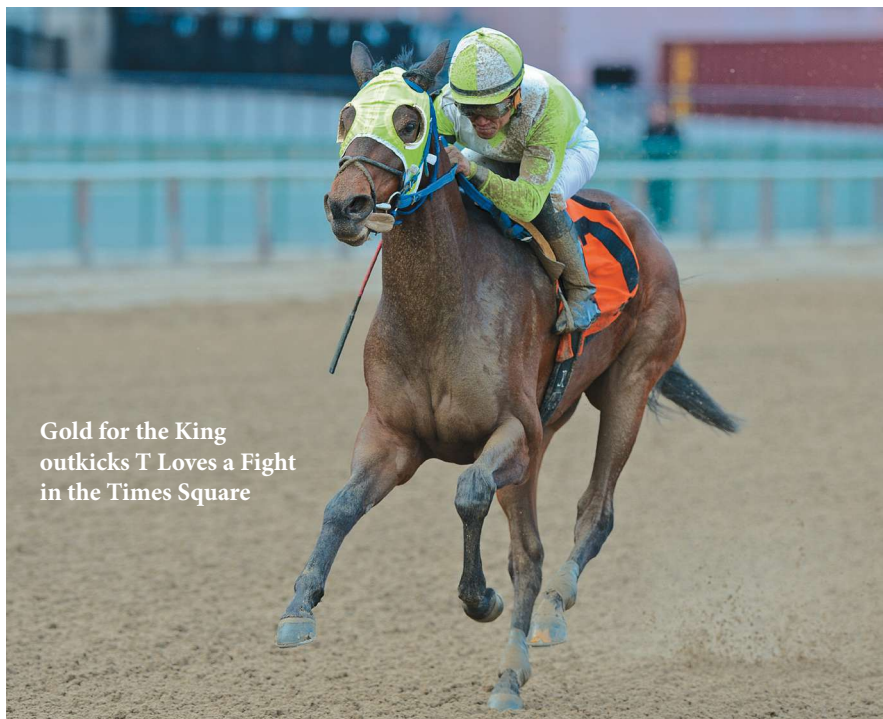
Avenue. Sackatoga Stable’s Frosty Gal (by Frost Giant), from the barn of trainer Barclay Tagg, rallied smartly through the stretch to finish third.

MORE GOLD

Francis Paolangeli’s homebred Gold for the King (by Posse) was a dominant force in the state-bred sprint division at 2. He captured two races, including the New York Breeders’ Futurity at Finger Lakes, while banking more than

front-running bias over the inner track. He finished second that day to Bavaro (by Freud), despite putting in a sweeping and monstrously threatening run on the far turn. The switch back to the main track for the Times Square only aided his closing style as Gold for the King swung four-wide into the lane beneath jockey Joel Rosario, after a contested opening half-mile in 45:27.

Through the final furlong Gold for the King outkicked a resolute runner-up

\$310,000. If the gelding’s comeback race as a 3-year-old in the \$100,000 Times Square Division of the New York Stallion Series April 23 is any indication of what’s to come this season, then his rivals in restricted, and possibly open company as well, will surely have their hands full with the consistent and talented Charlton Baker-trained runner.

“He’s a nice horse, and he can overcome anything,” said Baker, not only alluding to his trainee’s four-month layoff, but also the shoe repair he encountered in the paddock prior to the race. “This year we may have to venture out a little bit (into open races).”

Last Dec. 17 in the New York Stallion Series Stakes, the late-running Gold for the King was inhibited by a strong rail/

in Hoffman Thoroughbreds’ homebred T Loves a Fight (by Girolamo), who was making his stakes debut after three consecutive victories.

Gold for the King scored by 1¾ lengths, getting the 6½ furlongs in 1:16.53.

“He has a big long stride, so once he got going he was clear,” said Baker.

Out of the Gold Token mare Gold for the Queen, the gelding’s race record stands at 4-1-2 from seven starts and earnings of \$370,568.

Runner-up T Loves a Fight, who has finished first or second in his last five races, is ably trained by Mike Hushion. West Point Thoroughbreds’ Reason to Soar (by Soaring Empire) finished third. 🐾

NYBREDS START WITH AN ADVANTAGE

Mo Money May Try Preakness Conquest

For the time being Funny Cide will remain as the lone New York-bred to win the Run for the Roses

THE OWNER OF NEW YORK-BRED CONQUEST MO MONEY, clearly one of the top 3-year-olds in training based on his last two outings, opted not to pay a \$200,000 supplement to start in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) but is serious about making a run at the May 20 Preakness Stakes (G1).

Conquest Mo Money, bred by Steve Davison and Randy Gullatt's Twin Creeks Farm and racing for Tom McKenna's Judge Lanier Racing, moved up the sophomore ladder in his last two efforts.

On March 26 the son of Uncle Mo finished a solid second behind Hence in the \$800,000 Sunland Derby (G3). Reddam Racing's Irap was fourth in the Sunland Derby and he came back to shock the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) field at Keeneland. Conquest Mo Money came right back three weeks later and nearly pulled off a major upset in the Arkansas Derby (G1). He finished just a half-length behind juvenile champion Classic Empire at Oaklawn, which pressed McKenna and trainer Miguel Hernandez toward the Triple Crown although the colt was not nominated.

McKenna held a press conference at Sunland Park April 18.

"The decision I've made on (Conquest) Mo Money—what I thought about more than anything else is how many people I am going to disappoint if I don't run in the Derby, and everyone in the industry dreams about the day that you can get to the Derby," he said.

"I made the choice on what I think is best for the horse...I really believe the best

choice for Conquest Mo Money is the Preakness."

A supplemental fee of \$150,000 will have to be paid for the colt to make a start in the Preakness.

"The reason I wore this hat up here was to pass the hat for donations," McKenna joked of his cowboy hat.

Twin Creeks purchased Conquest Mo Money's dam Stirring, in foal, for \$80,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. The purchase was made to help support New York-based stallion Mission Impazible. Stirring has been covered by last year's leading first-crop New York sire the last three years. Mission Impazible, by Unbridled's Song, stands at Sequel Stallions New York for \$7,500.

Stirring has an impeccable pedigree. She is a daughter of the stakes-winning Daijin, who ran third in the 1995 Test Stakes (G1) at Saratoga and produced Canadian champion Serenading and the stakes-winning Handpainted. Daijin is also the second dam of Blue Grass winner Brilliant Speed and grade 2-placed stakes winner Souper Speedy.

Daijin is a full sister to 1997 Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Touch Gold and a half sister to Canadian Horse of the Year With Approval. Also in her immediate family is New York-bred Haynesfield, winner of the Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational Stakes (G1).

A sharp yearling, Conquest Mo Money brought \$180,000 as a yearling at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton New York preferred sale but slipped through the cracks as part of Conquest Stables' dispersal the following year at the Keeneland November sale. McKenna's Judge Lanier Racing was able to pick him up for \$8,500.

The colt has three wins and two seconds in five starts, with earnings of \$508,900. Before the Sunland and Arkansas Derbys, he had won Sunland Park's Riley Allison Stakes by 11 lengths and the Feb. 26 Mine That Bird Derby.

Funny Cide is the only Empire State-bred to win the Kentucky Derby, but the quality of the program is such that it might not be long before he has company. In 2015, three New York-breds made the gate under the Twin Spires, and two runners made the field in 2014. 🐾

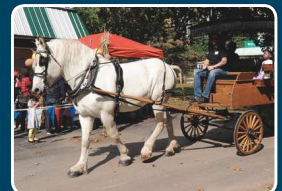
