Bring on the Yearlings

WHILE ONE MORE IMPORTANT AUCTION on the 2-year-olds in training calendar remains—the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June sale of 2-year-olds and horses of racing age June 16-19—it is not too early to start talking about yearlings, especially against the wider backdrop of the New York-bred bloodstock market.

First, though, I'd like to say a few words about this year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-old sale. In its own terms this auction produced some pretty stunning results, best illustrated by a year-to-year comparison.

In 2014 more New York-breds participated in the Midlantic 2-year-old sale than in 2015 (101 offered compared with 80, down 21%), which resulted in the sale of fewer individuals (77 in 2014 compared with 61 in 2015, down a matching 21%), but total sales of New York-breds increased 28.6% from \$3,799,500 in 2014 to \$4,885,000 in 2015.

The increase in total sales was precipitated by a dramatic rise in the New York-bred average, up 62.3% (from \$49,344 in 2014 to \$80,082) and median, up 23.3% (from \$30,000 in 2014 to \$37,000). We also saw an expansion at the top end in 2015. In 2014 there were 11 six-figure sellers. In 2015, despite fewer horses offered, there were 12. In 2014 three individuals fetched \$200,000 or more, and this year six reached that threshold. The top seller in 2014 went for \$400,000. The New York-bred topper in 2015 brought \$840,000.

All that being said, honestly I am not as inter-

ested in the obvious headline of "growth" from year-to-year in this particular sale as I am in the more significant message for New York-breeders: Going forward for the foreseeable future, you can rely on "strength and stability" in the overall market.

Ever since the New York purse and awards structures were revamped—in other words from late 2011—the market for New York-breds at auction has burgeoned. The yearling market was the first to catch fire, but the 2-year-olds have followed suit, especially on the heels of an expanded juvenile stakes program on the New York Racing Association circuit.

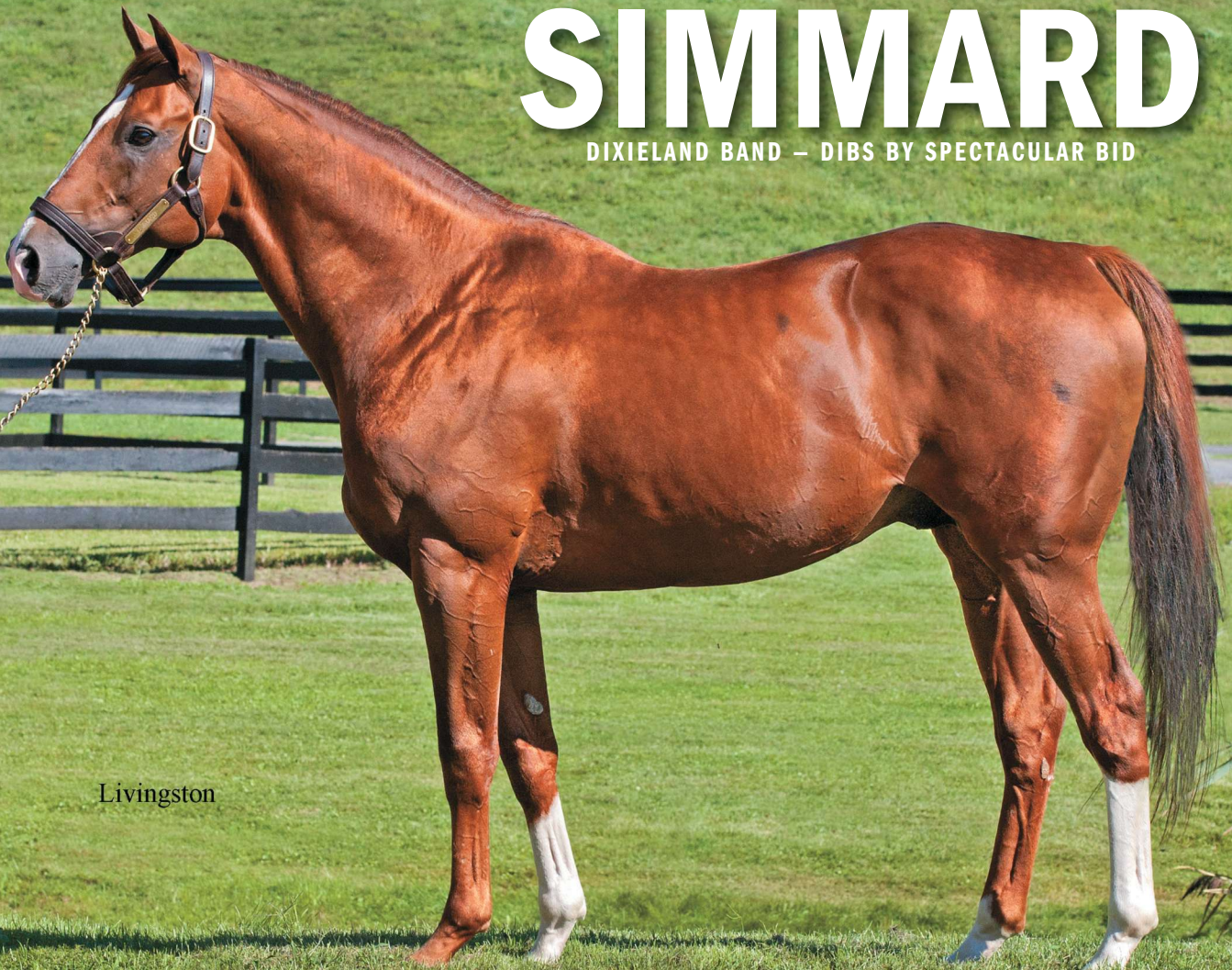
This has been going on for several years now. What began as pleasurable surprise in seeing the growing marketplace for New York-breds post-2011 has transformed into a quiet confidence that on the New York breeding scene quality matings are regularly paying off, both in the sales ring and on the racetrack.

This state of affairs is not going to change anytime soon, and I encourage New York breeders to continue investing in their businesses with confidence.

All this is good for breeders, pinhookers, horsemen, and associated businesses throughout the state, which are job-creators. This is not to say we do not have challenges. NYRA's future is in flux, and Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack needs various kinds of revitalization to increase handle and field size. For the time being though, I think we can all look forward to a productive season of New York-bred yearling sales. 🐾

\$840K NY-BRED 2YO HIGHLIGHTS FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC SALE

Once the dust had settled after two days of trade at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic's 2015 sale of 2-year-olds in training, New York-bred juveniles sat near the top of the heap and generated an average price that approached the record-setting sale average.

Overall the benchmark renewal of the sale generated an \$88,859 average, which was up 49.1% from a year ago (\$59,578). The New York-bred average was \$80,081. The sale median was up nearly as much, 45.2% to \$45,000 (from \$31,000). The New York-bred median was \$37,000. The population of New York-breds at the auction produced 12 six-figure horses, six selling for \$200,000 and above.

During the first session of the sale (May 18), a New York-bred colt by Pioneerof the Nile was purchased for \$840,000 by trainer Linda Rice on behalf of Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable Two syndicate. The price would be the second-highest for the sale.

Bred by All Gold Racing and foaled at Four Seasons Farm near Bullville, the colt benefited from the timing of the Triple Crown bid by Pioneerof the Nile's most famous offspring American Pharoah, but he is a standout individual in his own right. The colt generated considerable pre-sale buzz after working a quarter-mile in :21½ during the under tack show. He is also flattered by his pedigree page.

Out of Lantern Glow, an unraced daughter of Mineshaft, he is a half brother to last year's Remsen Stakes (gr. II) winner Leave the Light On (by Horse Greeley) and to the stakes-winning Harlan's Pure (by Harlan's Holiday).

"It's a great time to have a Pioneerof the Nile, especially one with a pedigree like his that worked like he did," said consignor Nick de Meric prior to the sale.

De Meric purchased the colt for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale; as a weanling, the youngster had brought \$135,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

Rosenblum, whose partnership also includes Rice and Iris Smith, was the driving force behind landing the colt. Said Rice, "Sheila really wanted this one. Every time I went to stop, Sheila said to keep going. When I shook my head

no, she said one more bid."

"Let's pray that little bit more pays off one day, hopefully," Rosenblum said.

The second top-selling state-bred was Hip 400, a colt by Bluegrass Cat out of Unbridled Melody, who went to Jacob L. West, agent, from the consignment of Raul Reyes' Kings Equine, agent, for \$450,000 after breezing a co-bullet :10 flat for an eighth of a mile.

Bred by WinStar Farm and foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag, the colt is a full brother to stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Michael With Us and a half brother to stakes winner and grade I-placed Tourist (by Tiznow). Bluegrass Cat, a former leading New York sire, stood at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple in 2012 and 2013 and at Rockridge Stud in 2014 before relocating to California.

Purchased by Reyes for \$90,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, the colt RNA'd in March for \$160,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale. Before the Midlantic auction Reyes said, "He has changed quite a bit since the Florida sale. He looks a lot better now. He looked dull in Miami. I think he didn't like the heat. He breezed good down there, but he didn't look the best." *By Sarah Mace*

POSSE TO SHUTTLE TO URUGUAY

Rockridge Stud in Hudson announced New York's leading stallion (by winners, co-leader by SWs in 2015) Posse will shuttle to Haras Rapetti in Uruguay, begin-

ning with the 2015 Southern Hemisphere season through 2017, in a deal brokered by Michael Miller and Miguel Ezcurra in Uruguay.

Posse, a 15-year-old son of Silver Deputy—Raska, by Rahy) will stand alongside stallions Honour and Glory and Alexander

of Hales. Posse has been a top stallion in New York since his arrival in 2010. All but one year in the Empire State, he has been the top stallion by number of winners. He is supported by a syndicate that unanimously voted to shuttle the stallion for the first time in his career.

Willcox Inn Dies Following Paddock Accident

First-year stallion Willcox Inn had his stud career cut short when he had to be euthanized after being injured in a paddock accident May 24. The 7-year-old son of Harlan's Holiday was wrapping up his first season at Suzie and Dr. C. Lynwood O'Cain's Saratoga Stud near Stillwater, N.Y.

Bred in Kentucky by Dr. John A. Chandler, Willcox Inn was out of the multiple graded stakes-performing Gone West mare De Aar, a half sister to millionaire grade I turf runners Cetewayo and Dynaforce. He was trained by Michael Stidham and co-owned by Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stable and All In Stable, a partnership including Marette Farrell, John Adger, Jack Hodge, Marty Nixon, and Ron and Al Lepinski.

On his way to becoming a millionaire and a multiple graded stakes winner, Willcox Inn generated a lot of excitement for this group.

"We have had many exciting moments in racing, a lot of them were with Willcox Inn," Jackson said after the horse's retirement from racing.

Many of the other partners felt the

same way and enthusiastically joined the stallion syndicate.

Suzie O'Cain had become strongly attached to Willcox Inn.

"He was developing into such a beautiful stallion," she said. "This spring and summer he has been filling out and looking 100% like a first-class sire."

"This is so sad, not only for the connections and for breeders in New York but for the breed as a whole," said O'Cain. "A few weeks ago we saw a son of the late Harlan's Holiday sire a (Longines) Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner in his first crop (Lovely Maria, by Majesticperfection). This is turning out to be a

significant sire line, and there aren't going to be too many more of them."

Willcox Inn retired with earnings of \$1,015,543 and a 6-4-4 record from 22 starts. A debut winner as a 2-year-old, defeating eventual Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner and champion 3-year-old male Animal Kingdom, he then finished third in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) at Keeneland and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IIT) at

Churchill Downs.

As a 3-year-old, he captured the American Derby (gr. IIT), Hawthorne Derby (gr. IIIT), and the Arlington Classic Stakes. Second to Wise Dan in the 2012 Shadwell Turf Mile Stakes (gr. IT) at 4, Willcox Inn raced as a 5-year-old to finish in the money in five graded stakes. He won the Washington Park Handicap (gr. III), finished second in the Dixie Stakes (gr. IIT) and Mervin H. Muniz Jr. Handicap (gr. IIT), and was third in the 2013 Shadwell Turf Mile and John B. Connally Turf Cup Stakes (gr. IIIT).

Dream Trip

West Point Thoroughbreds’ Empire Dreams takes Big Apple Showcase day’s main event

ON MEMORIAL DAY, MAY 25, the New York Racing Association featured six stakes races for state-bred runners at Belmont Park—the crown jewel of those races being the \$200,000 Commentator Stakes for 3-year-olds & up at a mile. And if a name can contribute in any way to celebrating the goal of raising outstanding stock within the confines of New York State, it could indeed be viewed as meaningful that West Point Thoroughbreds’ Empire Dreams hit the finish line first and, for the moment, carries that substantial banner.

The 4-year-old, recently gelded son of Patriot Act, out of the Thunder Gulch mare Ascended Dreams, was clearly on the comeback trail, after a ninth-place finish in last October’s Empire Classic Handicap.

“(Empire Dreams) was basically distanced in that race (17 lengths behind the winner Effinex),” said West Point Thoroughbreds’ president and CEO Terry Finley. “So we sent him to the New Bolton Center. He was lucky. He didn’t need any surgery. It was just a deep bone bruise, something that needed time to heal. Bruce Jackson had him down at Fair Hill before he came back to us about two months ago.”

In his return prep race Empire Dreams was a fast-closing second, sprinting in the May 3 Affirmed Success Stakes. The result for trainer Tom Albertrani and his tal-

ented assistant Pedro Mateo was a race-horse primed and ready for a one-turn mile on Belmont Park's wide, sweeping bend.

Out of the starting gate in the Commentator, the 6-year-old Readthebyline (by Read the Footnotes) took his usual tack and jetted to the early lead. Favored Saratoga Snacks (by Tale of the Cat), who is now owned and trained by Gary Sciacca, fell into a solid stalking position, tracking the leader from third on the outside. Meanwhile, Empire Dreams, who had bumped soundly at the start with another runner in the field of six, raced wide and unhurried in fifth beneath jockey Javier Castellano.

The opening quarter-mile was run in a controlled :23.44. But then things started to heat up on the front end with a succeeding sub-.23 second quarter (reaching the half-mile mark in :46.15). Castellano had settled Empire into the two-path entering the turn, lightly coaxing him to close the gap on the front-runners.

Turning for home, Castellano gave Empire Dreams his cue, and the response was immediate. The pair fanned five-wide into the sandy stretch with an explosion of energy. Saratoga Snacks had confronted Readthebyline in earnest, and the two were sparring on the lead when Empire Dreams joined the fray with the best momentum.

Castellano then hustled his mount to the lead, driving to the finish line ahead of his two closest rivals who never stopped running. At the wire Empire Dreams had registered a three-quarter-length victory in 1:35.42 over a surface labeled "fast."

"I believe it was a good setup today. There was a lot of speed in the race, and I think he had the perfect trip today," said Castellano, who celebrated in the winner's circle with a myriad of West Point Thoroughbreds' partnership owners. "He's an off-the-pace horse, and they went pretty quick with a decent pace so I took advantage. He gave me a good run in the last part of the race. I

was looking forward to the last kick, and he gave it to me."

Empire Dreams notched his fourth win from 13 starts. Bred by Pegasus Dream Stable and acquired by West Point Thoroughbreds for \$35,000 at the 2013 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale from Crupi's New Castle Farm consignment, the winner increased his earnings to \$463,667.

"He came out of the right program (when we first acquired him). Jimmy Crupi sold (Empire Dreams), and we'd had great success with other horses we'd bought from him—Macho Again (winner of the Stephen Foster Handicap, gr. I, and second to Rachel Alexandra in the grade I Woodward Stakes), Awesome Gem (winner of the Hollywood Gold Cup, gr. I), and King Congie (third in the grade I Toyota Blue Grass Stakes)," said Finley. "The guy who bred him was getting out of the business, so he went through the ring without a reserve. We knew he'd bring a moderate price being by Patriot Act. He was good-boned, had average size, and breezed well (at the sale)."

Of course, other eyes were on Empire Dreams at that sale as well. And a pair of them belonged to future West Point Thoroughbreds' owner Larry Pitsch.

"I tried to acquire him when I viewed

him at the sale," said Pitsch, whom Finley outbid for Empire Dreams. "I look at a horse by how it runs, and he ran well. I liked the stride-analysis. I liked the cardio. I thought the pedigree was pretty good, and I liked the conformation."

So, in a classic case of if you can't outbid them, join them—Pitsch bought 10% of Empire Dreams by becoming a partnership owner with West Point Thoroughbreds.

"I've been (a part-owner) in five horses, all with Terry (Finley's group). I like that partnership. I like what they stand for. I like the fact they take a very technical approach to selecting horses. In this business you can do a lot better if you do a really thorough, scientific job," said Pitsch, who lives outside of Manchester, N.H.

Do wins like this one in the Commentator help West Point Thoroughbreds recruit new owners into the sport?

"Anytime you win a big race it's good (for business)," said Finley, whose partnership stable brought together 14 owners to race Empire Dreams. "Maybe not necessarily today, but six months from now (someone looking to enter as an owner) will remember who won this race."

Vincent Scuderi's Readthebyline, from the barn of trainer Michelle Nev-in, claimed the runner-up spot in the Commentator by a nose over Saratoga Snacks who finished third.

Readtheprospectus (by Read the Footnotes), Summer Place to Be (by Corinthian), and Sinistra (by Stonesider) completed the order of finish.

The Commentator is named for Tracy Farmer's scintillatingly fast and gritty New York-bred runner. Trained by Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito and bred by Michael Martinez, the gelded son of Distorted Humor, out of Outsource (by Storm Bird), won 14 of 24 starts and earned \$2,049,845. His accomplishments include winning the Whitney Handicap (gr. I) in both 2005 and 2008, as well as being named New York horse of the year in 2005 and 2008. 🐾



Eye on the Prize

ABOUT THREE YEARS AGO Antonino Miuccio showed up one morning at Linda Rice's Saratoga barn. She'd never seen him before, and he told her, "I want to claim some horses."

He obviously went to the right place.

On May 25 at Belmont Park, Sheriffa, claimed by Rice last fall, became Miuccio's second claimer-turned-stakes winner when she won the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes on Big Apple Showcase Day. The 4-year-old filly follows, albeit modestly, in the footsteps of stablemate Palace, the horse Rice claimed for Miuccio for \$20,000 and turned into a multiple grade I-winning millionaire.

Sheriffa has a long way to go to reach those heights, but she's earned more than \$200,000 since the September claim, \$120,000 of it in her first stakes victory.

Sent off as the sixth choice at 9-1 in a 10-horse field, Sheriffa zipped right to the front under jockey Jose Ortiz to set a daunting pace of :22.99 and :45.77 for the opening quarter- and half-mile. They opened up a seven-length lead at the eighth pole, a lead diminished as they neared the wire, but the filly hung on to win by 2¼ lengths, running the mile in 1:37.32.

"She was acting up in the starting gate last time," said Rice, "and (jockey) Cornelio (Velasquez) told me he thought she should have won the race but she broke poorly, and stumbled away from there, so we spent a lot of time schooling at the gates. She's a high-strung,

high-energy horse, and I think we had her nerves under control today.”

The win was Sheriffa’s third in her last four races. She’s hit the board in 13 of her 16 lifetime starts.

Sheriffa was bred in New York by Richard Santulli’s Colts Neck Stables. A daughter of Posse out of the Unbridled’s Song mare Smileforamile, Rice claimed her for \$16,000.

Rice won the Critical Eye last year with odds-on favorite La Verdad, a horse she considered entering this year, too, even though she was coming off a win in the May 16 Vagrancy Handicap (gr. III).

“I considered putting La Verdad in on short rest,” she said. “But our goal with her is to try to win the grade I Ballerina at Saratoga, so I told (owner) Sheila (Rosenblum) we were going to pass this year.”

“And I had this filly and she’s really training well, and she likes a route of ground. So it was a surprise—but we’ll take a surprise this year.”

Originally from Sicily, Miuccio moved to the United States in the 1950s, operating Nino’s Bakery in Albany. He started going to the races at Saratoga shortly after emigrating and first owned horses about 20 years ago. He says he learned to read past performances before he learned to speak English.

“He’s a brilliant handicapper,” said Rice.

Even so, he leaves most of the claiming to her, in most cases deferring to her advice on what horses to claim and what horses to offer.

“He’s terrific,” she said. “He fights with me a little bit, but when I’m firm, he says, ‘OK, do whatever you want to do.’”

“She works with me,” said Miuccio by phone from Albany.

He admitted that he, too, was surprised by his filly’s win. “There were really good fillies in that race,” he said.

Miuccio wasn’t on hand for Sheriffa’s victory, but Rosenblum represented him in the winner’s circle. When Rice was wrapping up her post-race phone call with Miuccio, she handed the phone to Rosenblum.

“He wants to talk to you,” she said, then added that Rosenblum and Miuc-

cio’s friendship had developed from their mutual racing interests.

“They’re at my barn all the time,” Rice said.

Rice claimed Sheriffa because she thought the filly was a bargain at \$16,000, admitting she had no thoughts of adding another stakes winner to her barn.

“I was just looking to try to get as many purse earnings as possible,” she said. “I didn’t have stakes in mind, and now we have a new problem: I can’t run her for a claiming price.”

Which is not, given Sheriffa’s performance in the Critical Eye, a bad problem to have at all. 🐾

Higher Levels

Ostrolenka, Quezon establish their spots atop the sophomore ranks on Big Apple Showcase day

STATE-BRED 3-YEAR-OLDS got their spot on the stage at Belmont Park May 25 on Big Apple Showcase day in a pair of \$125,000 races—the Mike Lee and the Bouwerie stakes, both contested at seven furlongs. And the winning owners both know a thing or two about having their runners compete at the highest levels of the sport.

Eric Fein co-owned Musket Man (by Yonaguska) who finished third in the 2009 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) and BlackBerry Preakness Stakes (gr. I). He had even higher hopes for Musket Man's son, Ostrolenka (out of Pumpkin's Pride, by Louis Quatorze), which he bred and owns with Christopher McKenna. This winter at Aqueduct, however, Ostrolenka couldn't find his groove, and the Triple Crown trail eluded him (running 13th in the grade II Remsen Stakes in late November and fifth in the Jan. 3 Jerome Stakes, gr. III). A return to Belmont Park—where he broke his maiden by 14½ lengths and captured the \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes—has accompanied a renewal to his best form as he powerfully annexed the Mike Lee by two lengths in seemingly facile fashion.

"I'm not sure if it's Belmont Park that he loves, or if he just didn't like Aqueduct this winter," said Fein. "Unfortunately, Aqueduct was the proving ground for him to go on to bigger things (such as the Kentucky Derby). So we had to start over."

That new start was an eye-catching one as the Todd Pletcher-trainee, in the hands of Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, sat reserved in second position, just 1½ lengths off of blazing fractions.

The opening quarter-mile was raced in :22.09 and the half-mile in

:44.86. As the front-runner faded at the top of the lane, it would have been understandable for Ostrolenka to have been softened up as well. But Velazquez still had a handful of horse. And when he hit the accelerator, Ostrolenka opened up on his eight rivals.

Ostrolenka stopped the timer in 1:23.65.

“He’s got the heart of Musket Man. I knew if any of his children inherited his heart, they’d be OK,” said Fein. “He’s so big. We didn’t think he was going to have that kind of speed. But he does. Now that we’ve won the first leg of the Big Apple Triple, we’ll probably go to Finger Lakes (for the \$150,000 New York Derby July 3).”

The \$250,000 Albany Stakes Aug. 28 at Saratoga is the third jewel in that trio of races.

Ostrolenka has now won four of eight starts and increased his earnings to \$322,292.

“(Cutting back to seven furlongs) helped him and it was also very impressive in how he did it,” said assistant Byron Hughes, who saddled Ostrolenka for Pletcher. “Not too many horses can keep up that kind of speed and run like he did (at the end).”

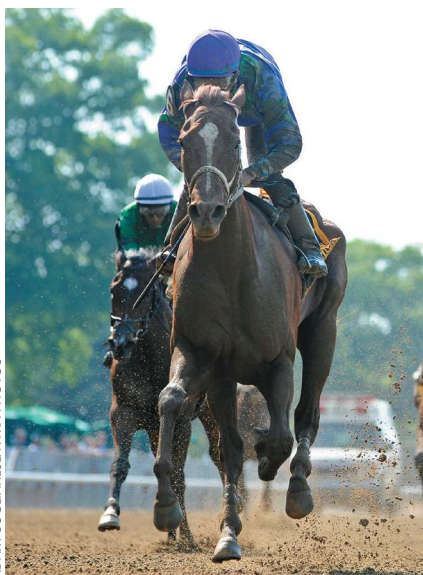
The feisty Good Luck Gus, owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and The Elkstone Group, put in a solid late rally to capture the runner-up spot. The son of Lookin At Lucky, from the barn of trainer Rudy Rodriguez, was coming off a five-month layoff after capturing the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct.

Doubledown Stables’ Battle of Evermore, a Chad Brown-trainee, finished third.

The Mike Lee is named in honor of the former sports editor of the Long Island Press for more than 40 years. Lee was known among his colleagues as an outstanding sports writer and humanitarian.

Quezon and On

Owner Marc Keller and trainer Bobby Ribaldo have a long and successful history together. Keller owned Bribron (winner of the 2009 Shadwell Metropolitan Handicap, gr. I) and Grand

Couturier (winner of the 2007 and 2008 Sword Dancer Invitational Stakes, gr. IT). Both of those star runners were trained by Ribaldo. Now the connections are ready to begin a new chapter. This time in the New York-bred ranks with Quezon (by Tiz Wonderful) who registered a dominant 3¼-length victory in the Bouwerie.

“I used to have a bias against the stallions that stood in New York,” said Keller, who now wishes that he had acquired more New York-breds sooner. “I’m born and raised in New York. This is my home track. The New York-bred program is a great program. The purses are terrific, and we have a lot of fun. If you’re going to race in New York (as a new owner), you should probably start with a New York-bred.”

Quezon, who is out of Kalloukan Dancer, by Olympio, was coming off nearly a six-month layoff.

“She got herself ready (for this race),” said Ribaldo, after overcoming a series of minor setbacks with the filly this winter in Florida. “The first time we ran her I thought she was going to be short (a six-length victory in maiden company last September). Four weeks later we

ran her in a stakes and I thought she was going to be short (a second six-length win, this time in the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes). And I even thought she was going to be short today. But she’s a good worker and good horses get themselves ready.”

Indeed, Quezon rallied impressively from off the pace behind fast fractions beneath jockey Manny Franco. The pair swung five-wide into the Belmont stretch and grabbed the lead just inside the final furlong before pulling away late, stopping the timer in 1:23.17.

Bred by Apache Farm, the filly, who was purchased at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds for \$90,000, has won three of four starts (her only loss being a fourth-place finish in the grade II Demoiselle Stakes) and has earned \$288,200.

“I think this is probably her best distance (seven furlongs), up to a mile,” said Keller. “Before the year is over, we’ll do something in open company with her.”

Is there a higher ceiling for the talented Quezon? Apparently so, with one small tick to solve.

“She’s never changed leads in the heat of battle,” said Ribaldo. “She’s changed leads in the mornings but not in a race.

She finished today on her left lead.”

Anthony P. McCarthy and Our Sugar Bear Stable’s Lakeside Sunset (by Belamy Road), a Bruce Brown-trainee, finished second after cutting out a swift pace. Mark Stanley’s Temper Mint Patty, from the barn of trainer Jeremiah Englehart, was two lengths back in third. 🐾



Keeping It Green

Invading Humor, Lubash showcase their talents on the turf

INVADING HUMOR HADN'T RACED since last November, and following a seven-race campaign in 2014 that saw her ring up a four-race winning streak, she finished her season with two clunkers, finishing eighth and ninth.

But neither the layoff nor her disappointing recent efforts diminished owner Dr. James McGlinn's confidence in the 5-year-old, a confidence she rewarded with an off-the-bench win in the \$125,000 Mount Vernon Stakes at Belmont Park on May 25, Big Apple Showcase day for New York-breds.

Over a firm turf course, Invading Humor rated patiently in fourth through the early stages of the one-mile race. Guided inside by jockey Rajiv Maragh coming around the final turn, she sneaked up the hedge to pass horses and win by two lengths in 1:32.87.

"We knew she would run well," said McGlinn after the race. "She was feeling well, and she ran well last year off a layoff."

"She was pretty fit," said trainer Bruce Levine. "I leaned into her; I knew she was running a mile, and we had this planned for a while."

The dark bay or brown mare was bred by McGlinn and is owned by his Bloodlines Racing Partnerships. She's earned \$379,844 with seven wins from 15 starts.

By Invasor out of the Distorted Humor mare Very Funny, Invading Humor has a 4-year-old full sister, Distorted Beauty, who had a similarly successful 2014 campaign. She, too, came off a six-month layoff to win at Belmont May 15. The sisters are the only horses McGlinn currently has in training.

Bloodlines Racing partners Ed and Miriam Castredge were among those celebrating in the Mount Vernon winner's circle. New to Thoroughbred racing, the couple owns interests in Invading Humor and Distorted Beauty.

A Philadelphia-area native who characterizes himself as someone who used to be "a hard-core bettor," Ed Castredge

saw McGlinn being interviewed on television and checked out Bloodlines Racing's website, then traveled to Delaware Park for a meet-and-greet with McGlinn.

"Now that I'm past 60," Castredge said, "owning a horse is a bucket list kind of a thing, and I was intrigued by the fixed-cost opportunity."

Not that either he or his wife imagined that they'd end up partners in two fillies that together won nine races last year.

"I got back-to-back birthday gifts," said Miriam of the fillies' wins this month. "My birthday was on the 19th."

Invading Humor and Distorted Beauty are Very Funny's first two foals; she has three others, all by Freud, the eldest a 2-year-old whose early training was interrupted by an injury.

"Freud's the best sire in New York by far," said McGlinn. "He's good at turf and dirt, and that's why I bred to him."

Based in Vermont, where he spent a brutal winter while his fillies enjoyed the Florida sunshine, McGlinn keeps his mares at Sickle Pond Farm near Stillwater, N.Y. He singles out Very Funny as the best of his small broodmare band.

McGlenn said he'd contemplate running Invading Beauty in open company.

"I don't want her to go anywhere where she's going to be 30-1," he said. Levine mentioned the Yaddo Stakes (for state-breds) at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 28 as a possible target, with a prior race to be determined.

And if the filly continues her winning ways, the Castredges will be among those celebrating her success.

"My head's exploding," said Ed. "I've loved horse racing since I was 10 years old, and it would have killed me if I'd never done this. We own 1% of the horse, but we get 100% of the fun."

Lubash Still the Kingston

Nobody in New York racing is having more fun than the Pivnick family, whose 8-year-old Lubash got his ninth stakes win in the \$125,000 Kingston Stakes on Showcase day.

"He looked real beautiful out there," said Todd Pivnick, son of owner Leonard Pivnick, who races in the name of Aliyu Ben J Stables. "Even in the paddock I

was saying to my brother how sharp he looked. You'd never know he was that old."

The bay homebred was making his second start of the year, following a third-place finish in the Danger's Hour Stakes at Aqueduct in April. Facing familiar rivals such as fellow stakes winners King Kreesa and Kharafa, who have taken turns beating each other over the last few years, Lubash raced behind those two for most of the one-mile turf race, bursting past them under jockey Junior Alvarado in the final furlong to win by a length. Kharafa was second, with King Kreesa a neck behind in third. The final time of the race was 1:33.07.

"It's great for the New York-bred program," said trainer Christophe Clement. "They're three really nice horses and are all very consistent. It's nice that they last because fans get to know the horses and it's fun for them."

Lubash closed his campaign last year with a rare start outside of New York, winning the Tropical Turf Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Gulfstream Park West in November for his second graded stakes victory.

Leonard Pivnick, now 78, purchased Lubash's dam, Nasty Cure, as a 2-year-old in 1993, paying \$37,000 for her at the Fasig-Tipton Florida February sale. The stakes-placed daughter of Cure the Blues enjoyed a modest racing career and produced several six-figure earners, including two by Meadow Flight, Pivnick's multiple graded stakes winner who ran in the 1994 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and finished second to Holy Bull in the Haskell Invitational Handicap (gr. I).

"Meadow Flight was a 3-year-old star," said Todd. "He had more talent, but as a horse that gives everything, Lubash is the best we've had. No one has this horse's heart."

By Freud, Lubash has a 3-year-old full sister and a 2015 full brother, but the 24-year-old mare died foaling the latter earlier this spring.

"I miss her already," said Leonard, his voice full of emotion.

"When Lubash ran in his last race, we were kind of hoping to say that was a little bit of a tap to the mother," said Todd. "But now, with this win, I feel like we could say that about this race, that his mom passed and maybe this is his way of honoring her."

"She ran courageous like this horse

does," added Jonathan. "She didn't have the talent this horse has, but she always gave it her all. This horse does that every time out, and that's why you got to love him so much."

Though Lubash has raced successfully in graded stakes, the Pivnicks expect he'll continue in the New York-bred stakes ranks.

"He's a nice horse; it's not like he's just a New York-bred," said Clement. "I took him to Florida last year and he won a grade III. He can compete in open company. It just tells you the New York-bred program has stepped up dramatically over the past few years." 🐾

Retirees thrive at the
Old Friends at Cabin

Friendly Confines

THREE YEARS AGO BARBARA NIEMAN retired from teaching at-risk children. After that she cared for a sister who had been diagnosed with a brain tumor.

When her sister passed away, Nieman said she was “lost for what I was going to do.”

The “loss” turned into a gain for retired at-risk Thoroughbreds living out their lives among the pine trees and fields at Old Friends at Cabin Creek, the Bobby Frankel Division near Greenfield Center, about 20 miles northwest of Saratoga Springs.

The 40-acre farm is owned by JoAnn and Mark Pepper, who opened the retirement home in 2009 after discussions with Michael Blowen, founder of Old Friends near Georgetown, Ky.

A tall, sturdy woman whose compassion shines through her actions and words, Pepper, a former groom for Nick Zito, had dreamt of owning a horse farm since she saw an ad for one in Kentucky when she was 9.

“I guess it stuck with me all these years,” she said, reflecting on her profession. “Then I had my children, and 20 years just flew by.”

Now there are more “children” to care for, as the empty nest has been transformed into a peaceful home for 12 retired Thoroughbreds, the majority New York-breds. Nieman and a couple of dozen volunteers regularly muck stalls, groom and feed the horses, mind the land, and, in general, look after their welfare 24/7.

When it opened, Cabin Creek was named for the late trainer although he never knew about it. The agreement to call it the Bobby Frankel Division was made by Old Friends the weekend in November 2009 that Frankel died in California. While alive,

the trainer was a generous donor to Old Friends and left some \$150,000 to the organization in his will.

Though Frankel was unaware of the honor, his presence permeates Cabin Creek.

Blowen said the plan is eventually to open a small Bobby Frankel Museum at Cabin Creek to display several trophies Frankel also donated to Old Friends, including those won by multiple graded stakes winners Ginger Punch and First Defence.

Frankel's dignity and wry sense of humor are reflected at Cabin Creek in two mementos. Cabin Creek has the original plaque from his 1995 induction into the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame. It read "Bobby Frankel," but the trainer insisted it be recast to read "Robert J. Frankel" and the farm was the lucky recipient of the first one.

A handwritten sign, "Robert Frankel Parking," is also tacked on the wall of the barn, recalling the summer that Frankel posted it on the white fence in front of his barn, S-72, at Saratoga's Oklahoma Training Track. On the back of the parking sign is an official New York Racing Association sign warning against washing horses in the storm drains.

One of Frankel's horses, Watchem Smokey, is at Cabin Creek; several others are at Old Friends in Kentucky.

Watchem Smokey, a temperamental 15-year-old Oklahoma-bred, who, unlike

his more staunch colleagues, heads for his stall at the first snowflake, was trained by Frankel (and later Steve Asmussen) and is owned by the Bobby Frankel Trust. Watchem Smokey, sired by 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Alphabet Soup, out of Karon's Dream, by Geiger Counter, had a brush with death, but, as is the case with the stories of so many of these horses after their racing careers, a combination of luck and compassion gave him a second chance.

Having broken his maiden in his debut for a \$25,000 claiming tag in Louisiana in June 2002, Watchem Smokey won his first six races while under the care of trainer Cecil Borel, jockey Calvin Borel's

brother. Frankel spotted him, purchased him privately for Edmund Gann, one of his most prominent owners, and turned him into a grade III-winning sprinter who would go on to earn more than \$500,000 in 50 starts.

He was claimed at Keeneland in April 2005 for \$100,000, but eventually age and injury took their toll and he slid down the class ladder. In 2009 he tore ligaments in his front leg and his new owner, Kelly Benjamin, was told euthanasia was inevitable. But Benjamin knew Watchem Smokey was a fighter (after a horse fell on him during a race at Santa Anita, he still won three more minor stakes races), and with the financial aid of the Oklahoma Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, Watchem Smokey was rehabilitated, but his racetrack days were over. In 2010 he was shipped to Old Friends.

The first horse to retire at Cabin Creek was Moonshadow Gold (Golden Gear—Wacky Miss, by Miswaki), a now 16-year-old New York-bred, who faced a slaughterhouse in New Jersey until his looks and charm attracted the attention of a woman who bought him for \$250—a happy ending to a story that would have ended in certain tragedy.

Kentucky-bred Behrens (Pleasant Colony—Hot Novel, by Mari's Book), a multiple grade I winner with earnings of more than \$4.5 million, lived at Old Friends, courtesy of trainer James Bond and other connections, until he passed

away in September 2014 at age 20. Key Contender, bred in Virginia by Paul Mellon (Fit to Fight—Key Witness, by Key to the Mint) and who set track records at Saratoga and at Belmont, is also buried at Cabin Creek, having died there at age 24 from colic.

But not all Cabin Creek horses are stakes winners. One, in fact, never won anything. Not a maiden, not a bottom-level claimer, not an allowance. Nada. That would be Zippy Chippy, who became a national anti-hero for losing 100 straight races. According to Old Friends' notes on Zippy, his owner/trainer, Felix Monserrate, had an emotional attachment to the losing horse, whom he had acquired by trading an old pickup truck. In order to prevent Zippy Chippy from being claimed, Monserrate entered him in races over his ability, and Zippy rewarded him by continuing to avoid the winner's circle.

Also on the Cabin Creek website is a poem about Zippy written by Bill Littlefield of National Public Radio's "Only A Game" weekly radio show. In a few lines, Littlefield makes it clear he gets Zippy and he gets Cabin Creek:

Zippy Chippy lives today upon a lovely farm

And there he doesn't do a single living creature harm

The people come to visit him and some of them conclude

That Zippy Chippy is a joke, and I would find that rude

Zippy was ornery on the track. Often he'd just stop in the middle of the race or not leave the gate at all. According to Pepper he's still grumpy although he loves treats and visitors. But his message is: "Don't ask me to do anything," such as stand still to be groomed. And, when he was on the track: "Don't ask me to run."

Thoroughbred owner Mike Repole has donated four horses to Cabin Creek, including New York-bred Driven by Success (Precise End—Afleet Closer, by Afleet), nicknamed Mike; Maryland-bred

Roaring Lion (Lion Hearted—Smartly, by Horatius); and Ontario-bred Cool N Collective (Ruhmann—Panther Run, by Cox's Ridge). A fourth is on his way. On May 17 Repole claimed New York-bred Be Bullish (Pure Prize—Smart Holly, by Smarten), a 10-year-old gelding, after a winning effort in a \$16,000 claiming race at Belmont Park with the intention of turning the million-dollar earner over to JoAnn Pepper and her crew.

Blowen said Repole has been one of Old Friends' biggest supporters for years, especially Cabin Creek.

"He really cares about the horses," he said.

"I'm very happy that I was able to help Be Bullish get his well-deserved and well-earned retirement," Repole said. "He's truly an amazing horse, and I'm confident that he will enjoy his retirement."

Repole said his connection with Cabin Creek "comes down to the horse. I'm very impressed with not only JoAnn and what she does for the horses, but the many volunteers that give up their time. I've been very blessed to have a few of my horses retire at Cabin Creek."

These days the name attraction is Will's Way, the James Bond-trained Kentucky-bred (Easy Goer—Willamae, by Tentam) who won the 1996 Travers Stakes (gr. I) and the 1997 Whitney Handicap (gr. I). He is a favorite of Saratoga race fans, who flock to see him during Saturday open houses each summer at Cabin Creek.

He's also a favorite of volunteer Dan McManamon, who lives in Clifton Park, and has been dubbed "Dan the Banana Man" because he brings the fruit to Will's Way when he shows up.

A cross country runner his last year at Union College (his son is on a track schol-

RUMBLING ON

The first time I saw Thunder Rumble, the snow had iced the field and fir trees at Old Friends at Cabin Creek near Greenfield Center, N.Y., just a few miles from the place he celebrated his greatest achievements, Saratoga. It was a frigid day in December 2009 when he stepped off the van to the applause of a handful of fans, who remembered vividly his 1992 Travers Stakes (gr. I) victory, the first New York-bred in a quarter of a century to achieve this distinction.

This cold morning, flashes of the former brilliance of this nearly jet black stallion returned as the now 20-year old fellow ran the rails, snorting and looking every bit as fit as the graded stakes winner I had witnessed more than a decade earlier. Occasionally he'd stop and nod at the visitors there to welcome him back home. I reached out and felt his prickly whiskers, stroked his oddly shaped star that picked up the white of snow and sky.

Each summer I visited Cabin Creek for one reason or another—but I knew it was to see Thunder. My latest visit, however, was not as celebratory. Thunder Rumble (Thunder

putting me in mind once again of that crisp, cold December day when we met. Whereas he was once my friend in the flesh, today he is my constant companion through the magic of technology.

Puddles—Lyphette, by Lyphard) died Jan. 6 of colic complicated by a heart murmur, three days after more than 300 people had turned out for his 26th birthday party. That day he was his chipper self, racing around and enjoying the attention.

As he lay dying, Cabin Creek owner JoAnn Pepper was the only human he allowed in his stall. In his final hours she rubbed and spoke softly to him as he crossed over.

He is buried on a gentle hill near the pine trees at the back of his pen where he used to spend much of his time. There are plans to plant a garden at the burial site. The farm will also adopt the motto "Rumbling On" to honor him.

Even though I won't ever see Thunder dashing around his paddock or leaning over a fence, I remain in daily contact with him. Whenever I turn on my laptop, his photo pops up on my home page,

arship at Duke University), McManamon said there's a cross over between those athletes and Thoroughbreds in the way they prepare for, train, and rest between races, so there was a natural affinity.

"They're both such tremendous athletes," he said.

For his wife's birthday, McManamon

bought her a \$100 sponsorship share in Will's Way's care. She is also a volunteer.

The volunteers, most of whom have had little experience with Thoroughbreds, are a close-knit group, have each other's backs, and love the serene, quiet atmosphere of Cabin Creek. Many of them are retired; still active and wanting

to do something useful, they turned to helping out these other retirees adjust to their new lives.

McManamon said he enjoys watching the horses finally learn to relax after a career at the track.

"When they first come here, they wonder what they're supposed to do," he said. "It takes them a while."

When Driven by Success came to the farm in 2012, he was terrified and didn't trust anyone. That didn't last long.

"Now he's relaxed and loving," he said.

"They've worked so hard, so they're really thankful to be outside," Pepper said. "At first they seem to be waiting to go to the track. Then they realize 'I think it's over.'"

For Nieman, being part of Cabin Creek has been life-changing.

"It was karma," she said when she decided to volunteer after touring the farm a few summers ago.

"It was kind of like I was lost and then I was found," Nieman said.

Like so many of the horses whom she takes care of. 🐾
