Some Answers on Deck about Finger Lakes and NYRA

BY the time you read this column, some—possibly most—of the questions it raises may be answered, but it is important for breeders to know what is at stake for our industry on the eve of decisions that will shape our future.

June 16 marks the end of the current legislative session in Albany, and lawmakers are working on issues that will affect the futures of both Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack (FLGR) and the New York Racing Association (NYRA).

Regular readers of both this column and industry publications already know the outlines of the issues faced by FLGR. Both the racetrack and stakeholders in the breeding and racing industry statewide are at risk of suffering serious consequences when the del Lago Resort & Casino opens in Tyre early next year.

In 2015 New York-bred horses accounted for 70% of starts at FLGR. By some estimates the new casino could siphon off as much as 40% of FLGR gaming revenue on which purses depend. None of the new casinos to be licensed in the last wave of gaming expansion were supposed to affect existing facilities, but a legislative oversight (where geography did not match up with zoning restrictions) created this unforeseen and unwelcome result.

NYTB and other interested parties have pursued legislation to protect the purses of FLGR's horsemen, and it is by no means clear what the outcome of these efforts will be. To assist the cause, members of the Finger Lakes Horsemen Benevolent Protective Association (FLHBPA) recently launched a media campaign calling on state lawmakers to take action. The campaign uses a combination of television and radio spots and a FLHBPA action website: "Faces of the Finger Lakes." Some upstate news outlets have also publicized the issue.

Also on the legislative docket is a second racing issue that is equally significant for all of us: the future of NYRA. The current state-controlled NYRA and its "reorganization" board were put

in place in 2012 by Gov. Andrew Cuomo and were to last for three years, but in 2015 the governor delayed re-privatization for a year. While it is possible the decision could be deferred again, there is legislation in the works in both houses that provides for return of NYRA to private control with a new board, effective Oct. 18.

State Sen. John J. Bonacic, chair of the Senate Racing Committee, proposed a bill that calls for a 15-member board to replace the current 17-member NYRA reorganization board. Two members are to be appointed by the governor; one each by the leaders of the Assembly and Senate, and the breeders and the horsemen will have one member each. The NYRA CEO will be a board member, and the governor has the power to appoint the first board chair. Of the seats controlled by NYRA, three would be required to be filled by a resident each of Queens, Nassau, and Saratoga counties, the locations of NYRA's three tracks. Assemblywoman Carrie Woerner has introduced a "same as" bill in the Assembly.

There is another wrinkle. Although the governor has not officially released any proposal of his own, Concerned Citizens for Saratoga Racing has criticized an alternative plan that it heard from "various sources" was being circulated by the governor. This plan could include a diversion of video lottery terminal revenue allotted to NYRA for capital improvements into the state's general fund.

Rumors abound, and right now it is impossible to predict the outcome. Will both houses be able to pass the bills and, if so, will the governor sign the legislation into law or exercise a veto? There could also be some other twists and turns in the process that we cannot foresee.

By June 16 the situations of FLGR and NYRA should be clearer. In the meantime we are preparing responses to the possible outcomes. Depending on what happens mid-month, I will devote this space in the July issue of *New York Breeder* to outlining the ramifications of all developments. 🐾

SEVEN NY-BREDS BRING SIX FIGURES AT F-T

An expanded catalog for the May 23-24 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale made for some rough sailing for some consignments. With 40% more horses offered from a year ago, the average price from the sale fell 22.7% from \$88,859 to \$68,654, while the median sagged from \$45,000 to \$32,000.

As for New York-breds nearly the same amount were offered, 83, compared to last year (80) and just three fewer sold (58 to 61). The average price of a New York-bred at the sale fell from \$81,066 to \$40,810—quite a wide gap—but an extraordinary price a year ago is the culprit for the skewed figures.

At last year's sale in Timonium, Md., trainer Linda Rice and Sheila Rosenblum went to \$840,000 for Champion-of-thenile, a son of Pioneerof the Nile—Lantern Glow.

This year's top-selling state-bred was \$165,000 for a filly from the first crop of Boys At Tosconova. Out of Miss Trudy, the filly was bred by Rhapsody Farm. A \$60,000 purchase as a weanling at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton fall mixed sale at Saratoga by Turtle Hatch Farm, she was purchased during the first day at Timonium by Kentucky-based Cromwell Bloodstock for BSW Bloodstock and Liz Crow.

"Hopefully she's winning a New York-bred maiden special weight race at Saratoga when the owners can be there in eight weeks," said Cromwell Bloodstock's Gatewood Bell. "If she does everything you hope she can do, you can pay for her by September."

FLIPCUP STARS IN ARLINGTON'S MATRON

Flipcup, already a stakes winner over Woodbine's Polytrack, took her game to another level May 28 in holding off No Fault of Mine to win the \$100,000 Arlington Matron Stakes (gr. III) over Arlington's Polytrack surface. The New York-bred 5-year-old mare by Milwaukee Brew is now 5-1-1 in seven starts on synthetic surfaces.

Flipcup, with Chris Emigh up, drifted out in the lane and had to survive a jockey's objection before being declared the winner.

Bred in New York by Saratogans Shirl and Mary Ann Penney, Flipcup races for Team Penney Racing, Wachtel Stable, and Brous Stable. Trained by Hall of Famer Bill Mott, Flipcup has won or placed in six stakes against state-breds in her 19-start career, including a victory in the 2014 New York Oaks.

"She's close with our kids, our family," Shirl Penney said after the Matron. "We've been close with her ever since she was a baby."

Flipcup was foaled at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham. She is out of the Touch Gold mare Dream Affair. Team Penney Racing purchased Dream Affair for \$11,000 at the 2007 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s winter mixed sale. Dream Affair delivered a colt by Cross Traffic earlier this year.

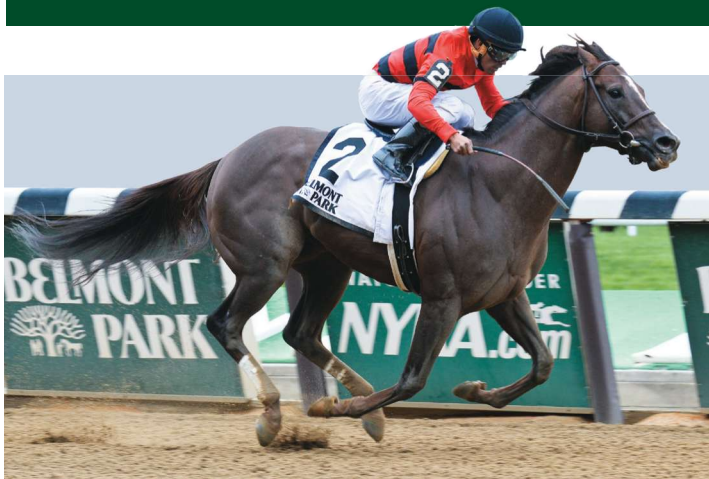
Too Discreet Wins Paradise Creek

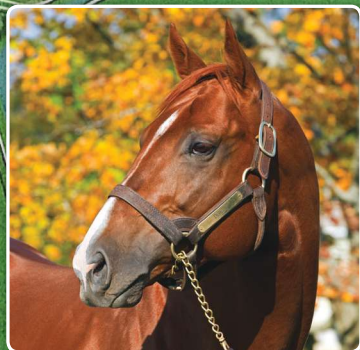

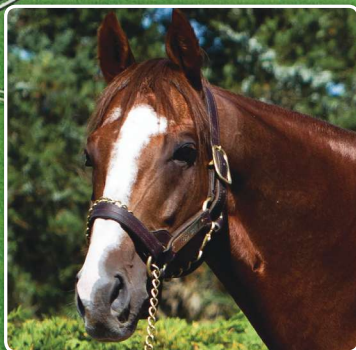

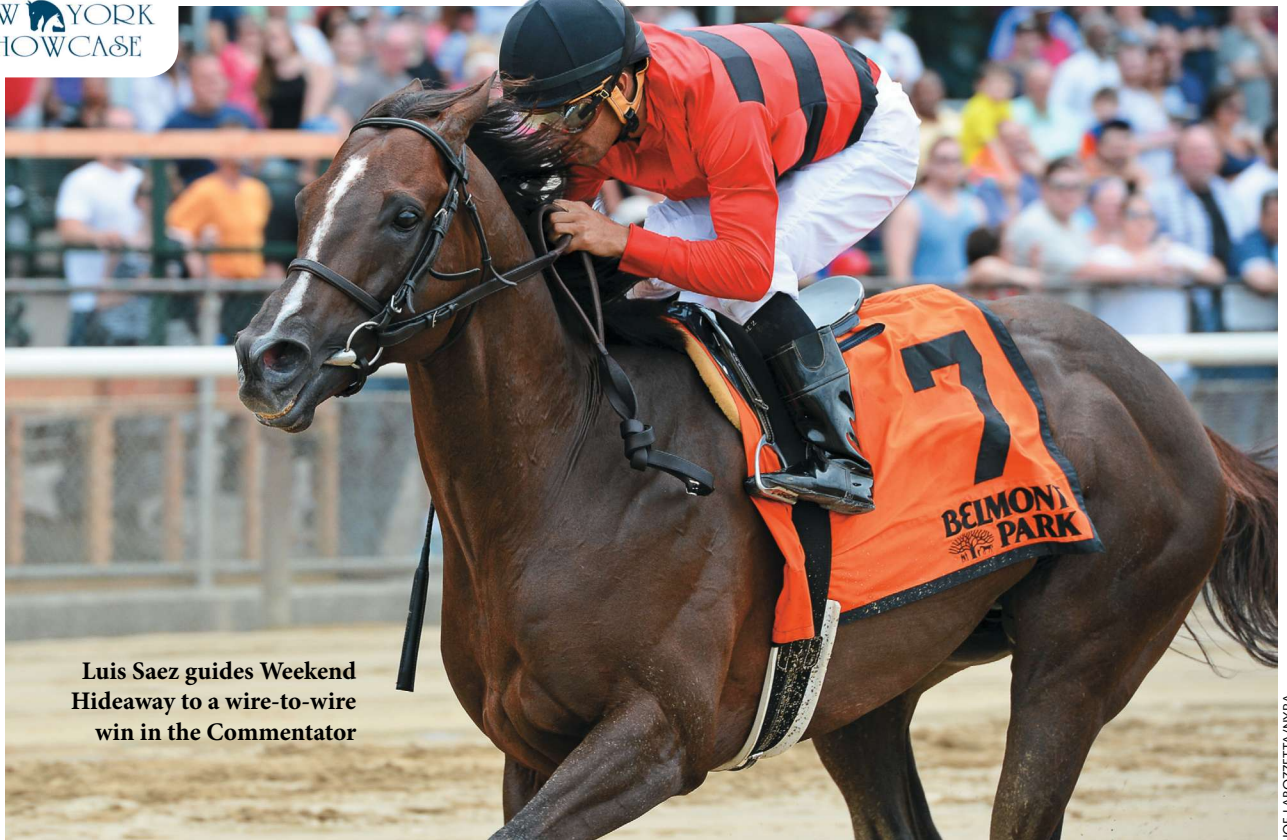

Luis Saez guides Weekend Hideaway to a wire-to-wire win in the Commentator

Weekend Hideaway racks up another win, this time in the rich Commentator

Holiday Weekend

BY TERESA GENARO

ON MAY 30 MIKE HOFFMAN stood in the winner's circle at Belmont Park. His Weekend Hideaway had just won the \$196,000 Commentator Stakes, and he was waiting for his two daughters, Siobhan and Shannon, to walk the horse in to have their picture taken.

Hoffman had stood in the same spot, waiting for the same horse, just a month earlier, when the 6-year-old son of Speightstown had won the \$100,000 Affirmed Success Stakes. Win photos for stakes races may have become a common occurrence for the Hoffman family—Weekend Hideaway has won seven stakes in his 31 lifetime starts—but commonplace, they are not.

Hoffman races in the name of Red and Black Stable, and in 2011 he purchased four yearlings from the Flying Zee Stable dispersal at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky, following the death of Carl Lizza. Weekend Hideaway is the only one still racing, and the only one that

notched a win for the Hoffman family.

The Commentator was Weekend Hideaway's 10th lifetime win, and he handled the muddy Belmont surface effortlessly, going to the lead early under jockey Luis Saez. After holding off the stalking Sioux in the early going, Weekend Hideaway drew off to win by 3¾ lengths, running the mile in 1:35.95.

"He didn't wait for me and pulled me right to the lead," said Saez. "When we came to the stretch, he was gone."

Though several of Weekend Hideaway's rivals had also shown affinities for off going, Hoffman and his daughter Siobhan admitted that they were hoping for rain after seeing their chestnut horse romp in the slop at Gulfstream Park West last November.

Said trainer Phil Serpe, "I hate to ruin everyone's Memorial Day, but I was very happy that this rain came along."

Also on hand at Belmont were Hoffman's wife, Maggie, and their son, Michael, and given the longevity of their relationship, Serpe and his assistant Lisa Bartkowski could be considered part of the family, too.

Hoffman and Serpe were introduced to each other more than 15 years ago by another Serpe client, Tom Moran, and Hoffman has never used another trainer. Serpe claimed Hoffman's first horse, Truly Topflight, at Saratoga in 1999, and as Lizza's longtime trainer and breeding consultant, he advised Hoffman at the dispersal sale.

"Phil bought Weekend Hideaway for us and has done such a great job with him," said Hoffman.

Out of the Wiseman's Ferry mare Apocalyptical, Weekend Hideaway was making his second start off a rare lay-off in the Commentator. His win in the Affirmed Success was his first start in nearly five months, following a 2015 campaign that saw him compile a record of 2-1-1 in 10 starts.

"He's a remarkably sound horse," said Serpe. "I knew these guys wanted to win a race at Saratoga and he hadn't had a break in a while, so we sent him to Donna Freyer in South Carolina."

Running beyond seven furlongs for only the second time—he finished third in this race two years ago behind Zivo and Big Business—Weekend Hideaway was tested by the Commentator's distance. Serpe hasn't decided where he'll run next, though the plan is to run at Saratoga this summer, where Weekend

and his daughter speak of their emotional attachment to the horse.

"He's my favorite," said Siobhan. "He has a great attitude, and it was awesome getting to walk him in again."

"This horse has done miracles for my family," said her father. "The joy and the hope that's come out of this experience—there's a lot behind it."

"We've had some challenges in the family," he went on, "and Weekend Hideaway has brought us together for some joyful moments."

Hideaway has three wins from seven starts. Weekend Hideaway made his debut there in 2012, winning two in a row at the meet, including his first added-money race, the David Stakes.

A student at The New School in New York City, Siobhan Hoffman is poised to follow in her father's footsteps. Describing herself as his partner, she works alongside Mike at the company he co-founded, Changing Our World, and she's been learning the racing business from him, too.

"I love horses, and I used to ride," she said. "Once I graduate and have more free time, I definitely want to work with him."

The whole family shares Hoffman's passion for the sport, and in a business that can wear people down, emotionally and financially, Weekend Hideaway has provided a lift in both respects. He's earned \$751,532, and both Hoffman

Weekend Hideaway is the most successful horse Hoffman has owned, but the horse's value goes far beyond his earnings. The Hoffmans travel together from their Westchester County, New York, home to watch his races, and this summer, they'll be at Saratoga together, too.

And in a business that's not always known for professional partnerships of long duration, Hoffman prizes his relationship with Serpe and Bartkowski, whose joy in Weekend Hideaway's successes rivals that of the Hoffmans.

On May 30 Hoffman stood in the winner's circle at Belmont Park, soaking in another stakes victory, surrounded by his family and friends, looking ahead to the summer, but also fully immersed in the moment.

"I'm so proud and happy for the New York breeding program," he said. "It doesn't get any better than this." 🐾



Golden Touch

Chester and Mary Broman strike again with Bar of Gold

OWNER/BREEDERS CHESTER AND MARY BROMAN have deep roots in the New York-bred program. The couple has been named top New York breeders several times and captured the grade I Florida Derby with Friends Lake (by A.P. Indy) in 2004. The Bromans were the leading owners at the 2009 Belmont Park fall meeting with all nine of their winners having been homebreds from their 300-acre Chestertown Farm, located on Friends Lake Road near Chestertown.

With those types of accomplishments on their racing résumé, it's apparent that the Bromans haven't been shy about sending their runners into competition against some of the best horses in training.

The Bromans had been doing exactly that with their talented 4-year-old homebred filly Bar of Gold (by Medaglia d'Oro), who competed in seven consecutive open-company graded stakes—hitting the board in four of them—topped by a solid runner-up finish behind Cavorting in last summer's Longines Test Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga.

That impressive, yet winless streak, came to a happy end in the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes Memorial Day, May 30, at Belmont Park, as the John Kimmel-trained dark bay or brown filly asserted her class over eight state-bred rivals.

"We're extremely proud of her," said Chester Broman. "But after losing seven races in a row, it was about time she got back to the winner's circle."

Coming into the contest, Bar of Gold, out of the Lemon Drop Kid mare Khancord Kid, was three-for-three on off tracks. So the muddy (sealed) oval presented little obstacle for the 3-2 betting favorite.

Bar of Gold broke last from the gate from the tricky 1 post in the Critical Eye. But jockey Junior Alvarado quickly settled her into third position, racing at the rail.

The early pace was a swift one, as the pairing of Perfect Freud and Jules N Rome battled through splits of :22.23 for the opening quarter-mile and :44.83 for the half-mile.

As the leaders began to wilt from their early efforts, Alvarado was gearing up aboard Bar of Gold, who raced covered-up along the inside. When the leaders both floated wide on the latter portion of the far turn, Alvarado was suddenly presented

with an open pass to the front.

Bar of Gold charged to daylight, spinning three-wide off the turn for better footing.

Meanwhile, Sequel Racing's Haveyougoneaway (by Congrats), with Jose Ortiz in the irons, followed Bar of Gold's move, swinging one path wider into the lane.

The muddy stage seemed set for a stretch duel through the final furlong. But despite the good energy displayed by the Tom Morley-trained Haveyougoneaway, Bar of Gold had something in reserve.

Beneath steady right-handed encouragement Bar of Gold maintained her advantage and was never seriously threatened, registering a 1½-length win on the wire.

The final time for the one-turn mile event was 1:36.83.

"That's the way John (Kimmel) planned the trip," said an elated Chester Broman. "He told Junior to ride with patience, and he did."

The Bromans maintain a tight-knit team when it comes to breeding. They are aided by consultant Alan Porter, who has consulted on the matings of more than 300 stakes winners (including the Bromans' Friends Lake and grade I winner Artemis Agrotera); and the manager of Chestertown Farm, Jeff Raines.

"Medaglia d'Oro is a great horse and sire. Khancord Kid was an above average filly for sure. She liked the grass and won the Herecomesthebride Stakes (gr. III in 2010 at Gulfstream Park)," said Raines. "(Before breeding) we have input from Alan Porter. Then we have our discussions and decide which way to go. John's (mostly) been the guy on the racing end. We raise them on Chester's farm and then send them off. Right now there are about 60 (horses) there. This year we foaled 35, and bred 47 mares."

Bar of Gold won her fourth race

from 11 career starts. The consistent filly has hit the board in eight of those contests. Her earnings currently stand at \$509,500.

Though Bar of Gold hadn't raced since a third-place finish in the Distaff Handicap (gr. III) April 17 at Aqueduct, a bullet five-furlong work at Belmont May 16 had several New York clockers singing her praises.

"She's been a tremendous work horse. You have to gauge her down a bit because (she'll work like that) all the time," said Kimmel. "So actually that was an average, easy work for her, although it looks fast. She has the ability to go quicker when asked. She's doing it by herself, and I'm in radio contact with her (exercise) rider. I'm telling him, 'Easy now; easy.' We're communicating. I'm telling him what the splits are. (For

that particular work), I remember she galloped-out in 11-and-change and went seven-eighths in 23-and-change."

Besides being an outstanding trainer (Friends Lake, Hidden Lake, Better than Honour, Elusive Lady, Premium Tap, just to name a few) and a veterinarian, Kimmel has also made a splash over the years, along with his father, owner Caesar Kimmel, for giving Thoroughbreds titillating names, the most well-known of these being Bodacious Tatas. The phrase is borrowed from a line in the film *An Officer and a Gentleman*.

"The Jockey Club really scrutinizes

my (name) submissions now," said Kimmel, with a wry smile. "Bodacious (Tatas) was turned down twice before we got it (approved)."

Chester and Mary Broman recently made a splash at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale in Timonium, Md., when trainer Linda Rice purchased an Uncle Mo filly for a sale-topping \$1 million for them (see page 8).

"That's going to be our Uncle Mo," said Chester Broman of the still unnamed freshman.

In her first start for new trainer Morley (previously trained by Allen Milligan), the 5-year-old Haveyougoneaway, bred by Andy and Susan Beadnell, ran a strong second in the Critical Eye. Morley was the first one onto the muddy track after the race to give his pupil a loving pat on the neck for her efforts.

Michael Dubb's Literata (by Read the Footnotes), from the barn of trainer Rudy Rodriguez, closed through the stretch to garner the minor spoils in third.

Marc Keller's Quezon (by Tiz Wonderful), who was the second choice in the betting and had convincingly won a pair of off-track races, checked in a non-threatening fourth. Jules N Rome, Perfect Freud, Carameway, Storied Lady, and Sheriffa completed the order of finish.

Critical Eye earned two New York-bred championships. The daughter of Dynaformer, out of the Dr. Blum mare Critical Crew, was a homebred for Herbert T. Schwartz. He owned her in partnership with his wife, Carol, while the couple's son, Scott Schwartz, did the training. Critical Eye won 14 of 38 career starts and earned \$1,060,984. She won five graded stakes, highlighted by victories in the 2000 Gazelle Handicap (gr. I) and the 2001 Hempstead Handicap (gr. I). Deservedly, Herbert T. Schwartz, who participated in racing for five decades, was named 2001 New York breeder of the year. 🐾



Bust Another surprises in the Mike Lee at 19-1

Bing Cherry Racing's Bust Another wins the Mike Lee; Flatterywillgetyou takes the Bouwerie

Ripe for the Win

ON BIG APPLE SHOWCASE DAY at Belmont Park May 30, it was Memorial Day Monday with a cherry on top for owner Scott Zimmerman.

One of two partners in Bing Cherry Racing—the other is Anthony Como—Zimmerman named his stable after his Brooklyn produce operation, and the partnership's light blue silks sport a Bing cherry emblem on both front and back.

And those silks got plenty of camera time when Bing Cherry's Bust Another was the upset winner of the \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes at 19-1.

Content to sit 3½ lengths behind dueling pacesetters Sudden Surprise and Championofthenile through testing early fractions, jockey Eric Cancel passed the fading leaders in the stretch of the seven-furlong race for 3-year-olds, putting them safely away to win by 3¼ lengths in 1:23.94, having no trouble with the muddy surface despite lacking off-track

experience. It was the first stakes win for the son of Waldorf Farm's stallion Bustin Stones.

Bust Another made his first start in stakes company in April, running in the New York Stallion Series at Aqueduct and finishing fourth behind Sudden Surprise and Lucky Lurie, two of his rivals in the Mike Lee.

Zimmerman claimed Bust Another in January from a partnership group headed by Kuehne Racing and trainer Michael Mareina after watching the horse overcome troubled starts in his first two races, winning the second one. He'd had horses with trainer Michael Pino at Parx, losing them to claims before that track closed for two months this winter.

"We had some extra money, and I told my partner I want to claim a horse for \$32,000. He told me I was out of my mind," Zimmerman said in the winner's circle at Belmont. "I told him to look at this horse's races and call me if he wanted him. He called me back and said, 'Let's take him.'"

Zimmerman claimed Bust Another out of an open company race and admitted his state-bred status wasn't a real factor in the claim, because he liked what he saw in the horse on the racetrack.

The Brooklyn native and Long Island resident has, though, bred in New York in the past, in the name of PZ Racing Stable. His homebred Brockolini is in training with Jeremiah Englehart and working for a summer return to the races after having been off since December.

In addition to Brockolini, owned in partnership with his produce partner Phil Penta, and Bust Another, Zimmerman has two other horses in training.

Bred by Casey Newick, Bust Another has won three of five starts for his new connections, his earnings since the claim topping \$170,000.

"He's a racehorse, that's what he is," said Zimmerman. "I thought he had a future and we took a shot. We won a four-way shake to get him. I liked the way he tried."

Zimmerman was introduced to horse

racing by former jockey Nick Santagata.

"He's my best friend," said Zimmerman. "We went to high school together; we bowled together. I became interested in horse racing, and it's in my blood now."

The bay gelding is out of the Intidab mare I Drink Alone, a half sister to three six-figure earners, including the stakes-winning graded stakes-placed Pavo (by Marquetry). Bust Another is a full brother to Bustin It, winner of the 2014 Rockville Centre Stakes, and a half brother to stakes winner May Shares (by Stone-sider). May Shares won the 2013 Island Sun Stakes at Belmont, going a mile on the turf. While Bust Another hadn't ventured beyond 6½ furlongs prior to the Mike Lee, Zimmerman doesn't rule out running him longer.

"We'll keep experimenting," said Zimmerman. "He's a nice little racehorse that tries all the time."

Flatterywillgetyou's Bouwerie

Not to be outdone in the silks department, owner Avram Freedberg donned

replica jockey silks when he joined his 3-year-old filly Flatterywillgetyou in the winner's circle for the \$125,000 Bouwerie Stakes, the filly companion race to the Mike Lee.

Bright yellow and adorned with the

image of a Boykin spaniel, the silks honor Freedberg and his wife Rhoda's dog, Cricket, who also gives her name to their stable, Everything's Cricket Racing.

And everything was indeed cricket for the Freedbergs when their filly got

her first stakes win in the Bouwerie and fourth win in a row, from five starts.

Flatterywillgetyou and jockey Cornelio Velasquez stalked pacesetter Bag of Tricks, splitting horses at the top of the stretch to win comfortably by a length,

running the seven furlongs in 1:23.42 and proving that her win on a sloppy track in January was no fluke.

"We didn't care (about the surface)," said Avram. "We just wanted her to be safe and do the best she could, and she did." The Freedbergs are celebrating their 10th anniversary in racing this year. A 2005 attempt to buy into a partnership didn't work out, but that experience led him to Linda Rice, who trains all of their horses except one that they own in partnership. And while her first attempt to buy horses for him was also not successful, Rice impressed Freedberg when she came back from the sale empty-handed.

"She was going to buy us one or two, and she came back with zero," he said. "She told me that she thought the prices went too high, and I was impressed that although she had an open checkbook, she didn't just spend it."

The Freedbergs purchased Flatterywillgetyou as a weanling for \$75,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga mixed sale in 2013. Out of the French Deputy mare Tres Chaud, she was bred by First Class Thoroughbreds and has earned \$193,900.

"I saw her and I said to Avram, 'We have to have this one,'" said Rice.

The Flatter filly is a half sister to D' Sauvage (by D'wildcat), a regular on the New York circuit who earned \$143,302, and she has, according to Avram, a lot to live up to.

"We went up to the sale to buy either Lochte or Valid," he said, "and they're both graded stakes winners."

Said Rice, "We spent all our money on the weanlings before the older horses came in."

Given the name of their stable and the design of their silks, it's obvious the Freedbergs dote on their animals, both canine and equine, and references to their first horse, the multiple stakes winner Ahvee's Destiny, frequently pepper their conversation.

"She's the same color (as Ahvee's Destiny)," said Rhoda of their latest stakes

Ahvee's Destiny was retired from racing in 2011, and the Freedbergs kept her to breed. Her 2-year-old by Girolamo, named Ramon Dominguez after the retired jockey who will be inducted into the Hall of Fame this August, is expected at the races this fall.

It was Rice who bought Ahvee's Destiny, who is now the Freedbergs' lone broodmare. In addition to Ramon Dominguez, she has a yearling by Lonhro and a foal by City Zip. She was bred last month to Honor Code.

Connections of Tapitation, The Tea Cups praise the state-bred program following turf wins

Digging the 'Program'

OWNER/BREEDER MANDY POPE has been making her presence felt, pure and simple. A North Carolina native and resident of Citra, Fla., Pope and her Whisper Hill Farm have been dominant forces at Thoroughbred auctions in recent years, acquiring broodmare prospects such as Horse of the Year Havre de Grace, champion Groupie Doll, and the grade I-winning Plum Pretty.

Surprisingly, Pope has only now registered her first stakes win in New York. That victory came in the \$125,000 Kingston Stakes on Memorial Day, May 30, with Tapitation, a 5-year-old gelded son of Tapit—Derrienne, by Cozzene.

In some sense the horse and owners were party crashers, stealing the thunder of longtime New York-bred rivals—the 7-year-old King Kreesa (by King Cugat), 7-year-old Kharafa (by Kitalpha), and 9-year-old Lubash (by Freud). Among them this iron-constitution trio had won the previous three editions of the one-mile Kingston on the turf.

“We go every year and buy some yearlings out of the (Fasig-Tipton) New York-bred sale,” said Pope, who started as a show jump rider before cutting her teeth

in the Thoroughbred business by working with broodmares at Kinsman Stud near Ocala, Fla., which was owned by the late George Steinbrenner. “Last year we bought three by Mission Impazible (by Unbridled’s Song). The first one is up here in training, and we have another one about ready to come. We love the New York-bred program.”

Away from the starting gate in the Kingston, which was contested over a “yielding” Widener turf course due to some heavy morning rain, Trinity Farm’s front-running Macagone (by Artie Schiller) assumed the lead as expected.

Tapitation, trained by Ralph Nicks, broke last in the field of nine with jockey Joel Rosario in the saddle.

King Kreesa and Iron Power tracked the early pace of Macagone, who set quick fractions of :22.60 for the opening quarter-mile and :45.35 for the half-mile. Meanwhile, Rosario had Tapitation bidding his time at the tail-end of the pack.

Midway on the far turn Rosario gave Tapitation his cue. The pair gained substantial ground on the lead runners

while hugging the hedge.

On the latter portion of the turn, Rosario angled Tapitation out before the duo stormed five-wide into the stretch.

King Kreesa and Kharafa were doing battle on the lead. But track announcer Larry Collmus called attention to the onrushing Tapitation with, “Here’s a

gray streak in the center of the course.”

Rosario employed a vigorous hand-ride in the latter stages as Tapitation wore down the competition late, pulling away to 1¾-length victory.

The final time for the Kingston was 1:35.62.

Bred by Waterville Lake Stables, Tapitation has won five of 11 starts and has earned \$264,130.

Whisper Hill Farm acquired the winner in August 2012, and he made six starts from January 2014 to that July. He then spent more than a year on the sidelines before returning as a gelding.

“He was a bit of a stall-walker, studish, a talker. When we took him home, he was muscle-sore and a little thin,” said Pope. “So we gave

him some time off and gelded him when we started back. Now you can pet him and love on him where before he was so mouthy...It’s helped him a whole lot. But he likes his time off. Obviously, he loves the course here. He doesn’t care if it’s fast or wet. Joel rode him sensationally.”

The runner-up in the Kingston turned out to be the consolation prize for bragging rights of the state-bred turf standardbears as Gerald and Susan Kreesa’s King Kreesa won a tight bob on the wire, edging out Paul Braverman and Timothy Pinch’s Kharafa by a nose.

Aliyu Ben J Stable’s Lubash displayed a mild kick in the lane to finish fourth.

Along with the horses’ respective owners, trainers David Donk (King Kreesa), Timothy Hills and his assistant Raul Zaragoza (Kharafa), and Christophe Clement (Lubash) deserve high praise for keeping these older runners healthy and ready to race, creating this New York-bred rivalry.

Pope, however, didn’t display much remorse at stopping the beloved trio from running one-two-three, minus her winning Tapitation.

“I think we’re very lucky and blessed that New York has kept (this breeding program) together, so we can continue buying horses from y’all and winning,” she said.

The Tea Cups Runneth Over

The \$125,000 Mount Vernon Stakes for fillies and mares at the same mile trip on the Widener course came two races later after the Kingston.

Trainer Jeremiah Englehart is humble in both his approach to training Thoroughbreds and his treatment of the people he encounters on his path to success.

Englehart, who hails from a family of gifted horsemen, acquired Kendel D. Standlee’s The Tea Cups when trainer Joan Allen was looking to ship her to

Saratoga for an opportunity to take on New York-breds.

“Joan asked me if I had room in my barn for her to ship (The Tea Cups) up, and I said, ‘Yes.’ People have been good to me in this business, and I always want to return the favor,” said Englehart. “Her turf races got rained off a few times, and Joan said, ‘Why don’t you just keep her and I’ll introduce you to the owner.’”

The Tea Cups, a 6-year-old daughter of Hard Spun, out of Lunar Colony, by

A.P. Indy, excelled under Englehart’s training style, which is basically to allow the Thoroughbred to tell the trainer what it needs to succeed.

“I try to find out what makes them happy, whether it’s (a schedule) of gallops or jogging. I treat them all as individuals,” said Englehart. “But this horse was in great shape when I got her from Joan. I think a lot of (The Tea Cups’) success has to do with the New York-bred program. The owner has also given me

the reins and been very patient.”

Last year the devout closer won the Yadoo Stakes at Saratoga and finished second in the John Hettinger Stakes at Belmont Park.

Heading into the Mount Vernon and making her first start since last October, The Tea Cups had been slowed in her training due to an iron deficiency in her blood, which was addressed with different supplements. Englehart knew she was doing better but wasn't completely sure that the mare would fire her best shot.

The pace in the Mount Vernon was exactly to The Tea Cups' liking—hot (an opening half-mile in :46.75).

The mare, who raced last in a full field of 12 early on, rallied wide through the stretch beneath jockey Luis Saez.

She surged to the front inside the final 100-yards to score a half-length victory in 1:36.40.

Bred by William Parsons Jr. and David Howe, The Tea Cups notched her sixth victory from 23 starts (23-6-4-4), increasing her earnings to \$332,285.

Bloodlines Racing Partnerships' Invading Humor (by Invador), who won the Mount Vernon last year, finished second for trainer Bruce Levine. Hidden Brook Farm's Neck of the Moon (by More Than Ready), from the barn of trainer Chad Brown, finished third. 🐾
