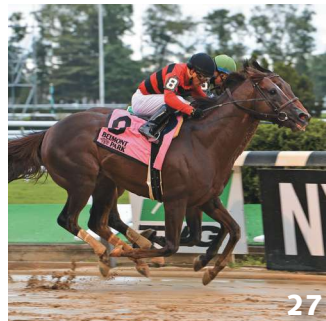

Around the Ovals: Taking Stock

BIG APPLE SHOWCASE—now the Memorial Day fixture at Belmont Park—punctuates the first part of the racing year for New York-breds and is a good time to take stock of where our horses stand after the first five months of 2017.

It is not hard to get an initial impression that 2017 is shaping up to be exceptional. March was highlighted by Mind Your Biscuits’ powerful victory in the group 1 \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News. A string of graded and open stakes victories by New York-breds in April got Turf writers buzzing.

The data for New York-bred stakes achievements over the same period for the past few years bear out the impression of special success in 2017. As the numbers indicate, New York-breds are on an upward trajectory in this department and could be on the path to one of the best racing years of the modern era (i.e. post 1973, the inception of Fund incentives).

Over the past four years the number of stakes races won by New York-breds in the first five months of the year has risen steadily. In 2014 New York-breds won 25 stakes from January through May. In 2016 the number was 31. This year New York-breds have already won 38 stakes. Moreover, quality performances are being spread among more horses. In 2014 we had 18 individual stakes winners by this point. This year 32 New York-breds have won stakes.

The number of state-bred stakes races, New York Stallion Stakes (NYSS), and various types of out-of-state restricted races for which New York-breds are eligible is pretty constant (rang-

ing from 14-17). The growth is coming in open stakes competition. In the first five months of 2014, Empire State-breds won only eight open stakes races. This year to date New York-breds have won 22 open stakes.

Success in open competition also translates into a dramatic increase in purse money earned. In the first five months of 2014 New York-breds took home the winner’s share of \$3,375,000 in stakes purses. This year during the same period, they ran for \$7,250,000. Even when we subtract the anomalous purse of the Dubai Golden Shaheen, the \$5,250,000 that remains is still 55.6% higher than in 2014.

Finally, just a word about the promise of the upcoming generation. Three New York-breds were designated “TDN Rising Stars” from 2013-15. Three more followed in quick succession in 2016 at the height of the racing year (July-September). This year we already have a “TDN Rising Star” right out of the blocks: 2-year-old colt Mo Diddley, by Uncle Mo, who earned his “star” in his May 18 debut at Churchill Downs.

I’ve said before that New York-bred racetrack performance is the best advertisement for the New York racing and breeding programs, but it bears repeating. This upward trajectory in stakes performance in recent years—not to mention the prospect of a record-breaking year in 2017—means that you, the breeders, are keeping up your end. The quality performers you are breeding are what keep New York-breds in the spotlight at home and abroad and make our regional program the envy of the nation. Just keep doing what you are doing, and the sky’s the limit. 🐾

BROMANS' RUFFIAN EXACTA BRINGS NY-BRED TOTAL TO EIGHT

Chester and Mary Broman's pair of Highway Star and Bar of Gold pulled off an unique double for New York-breds May 13 when they ran one-two in the \$250,000 Ruffian Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park. Both fillies were accomplished in open company prior to the Ruffian, with Highway Star capturing the grade 3 Distaff Handicap a month earlier at Aqueduct. Bar of Gold ran second in the 2015 Longines Test Stakes (G1) and has five other graded stakes-placings prior to the Ruffian.

Both were foaled at the Bromans' farm near Chestertown. Highway Star, trained by Rodrigo Ubillo, is by Girolamo out of Stolen Star (by Cat Thief), while Bar of Gold is by Medaglia d'Oro out of the grade 3-winning Lemon Drop Kid mare Khancord Kid and trained by John Kimmel.

Highway Star's win in the Ruffian marks the eighth graded stakes win by a New York-bred in 2017 (through May 26).

F-T MIDLANTIC SALE COMES ON STRONG

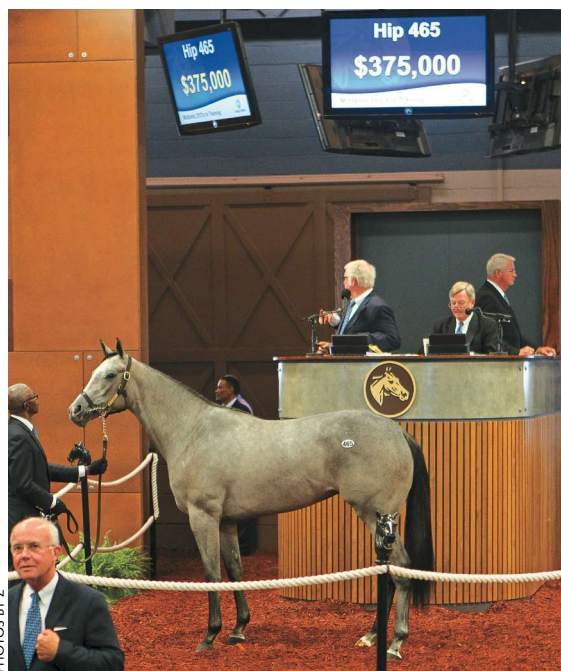
An Into Mischief filly, who is a half sister to multiple graded stakes winner Run Away and Hide (out of Jilted), was the top-priced New York-bred 2-year-old at the May 22-23 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic juvenile sale. She brought a final bid of \$375,000. The top-priced colt, by Shanghai Bobby out of Canaryinacage, whose second dam is a multiple graded stakes winner, was hammered down for \$210,000.

Offered once before, the filly was a \$165,000 buy-back at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale in Saratoga last August. Mike Ryan was the winning bidder in Timonium.

The male New York-bred topper (Hip 287) was a bay from the first crop of Shanghai Bobby bred by Mina Equivest and foaled March 17, 2015. He went to Mark Stanley from the consignment of Scanlon Training & Sales.

In all, of the 98 New York-breds offered over the two-session auction, 76 sold (including seven private sales). The New York-bred average price was \$46,507 and the median came in at \$25,000. Seven juveniles brought six figures.

Tolchin Gets Dream White Foal

A mostly white colt from the last crop of Lucky Pulpit was foaled May 19 at Stone Bridge Farm near Gansevoort. The foal is a fulfillment of a dream sparked in breeder/owner Gary Tolchin when he attended races with his father as a youth.

The colt was delivered by the white mare, Passionforfashion (by Old Fashioned), whom Tolchin acquired privately last year after a lengthy search for a white Thoroughbred.

“I always wanted a white horse after I saw one at Aqueduct with my father—Sam Tolchin—when I was growing up. My goal is to continue breeding white horses,” Tolchin said, adding that he intends to keep the newborn colt and eventually place him in training for racing.

Tolchin, who is based in New Jersey and is active in the New York and Kentucky breeding programs, has owned or co-owned many prominent runners, including champion Big Brown, winner of the 2008 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1).

After an unsuccessful attempt to buy another white mare at public auction, Tolchin fortuitously found Passionforfashion through social media. She was located by one of his agents, bloodstock and media consultant Michele MacDonald, in a Facebook posting by trainer Doug O’Neill’s operations manager, Sharla Rae Sanders, and soon purchased from previous owners.

Tolchin arranged the mating with Lucky Pulpit, California’s leading sire in 2016 and sire of record-setting, two-time Horse of the Year California Chrome. After Passionforfashion was safely in foal, he shipped her to Stone Bridge Farm.

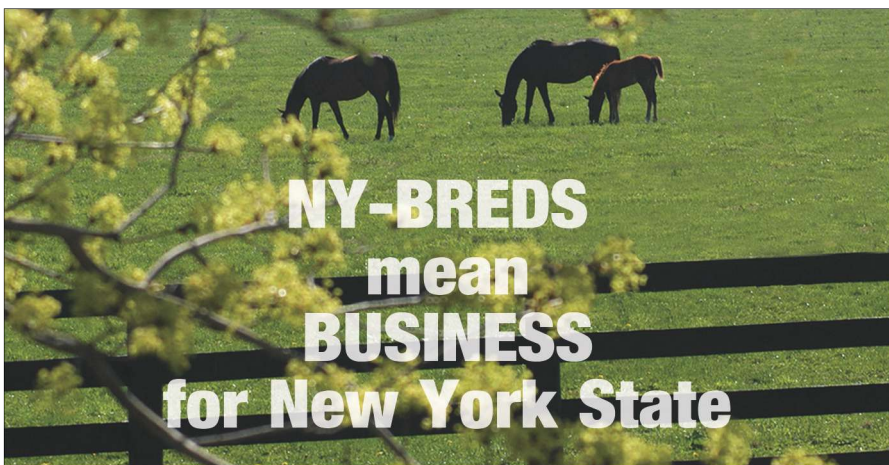
The colt’s birth came three months after Lucky Pulpit died of an apparent heart attack when covering his first mare of the 2017 season.

“We think he’s great,” Stone Bridge Farm manager Heidi Fischer said of the colt, who has a sturdy frame and good bone.

Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through May 28, 2017. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse per starter in 2016 is \$22,141 or 45% of the 2016 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 45% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 65%. Current year stakes winners include all Northern Hemisphere black-type stakes results from all available countries. *Foal counts include Southern Hemisphere. CLASSIC CONQUEST

Conquest Mo Money galloping at Pimlico prior to the Preakness

New York-bred Conquest Mo Money made a good run at the Preakness Stakes

ON THE MORNING OF THE PREAKNESS STAKES (G1), Tom McKenna made a stop at Barn A at Pimlico Race Course, where the horses running in that afternoon's second leg of the Triple Crown were stabled. On a gray, blustery morning, he wanted to check in one last time with Conquest Mo Money, the New York-bred 3-year-old he'd purchased for a song last November, before heading to his seat in the Maryland Jockey Club tent.

McKenna and his team were confident as they prepared to run the horse in the biggest race of their lives, and they seemed unperturbed by being asked to break from the far outside 10-post.

"There won't be as much pressure to get up there now," said George Hernandez, son of trainer Miguel Hernandez. "I think (No. 9 Lookin At Lee and No. 8 Senior Investment) are going to drop back, and that should give us an open lane to get in outside Classic Empire and Always Dreaming."

"Have you looked back at his last races?" asked McKenna. "(Outside posts) are all that we get. We're destined to run from the outside, and we adjust."

The bay colt had broken from post #12 and #11 in the Sunland Derby (G3) and the Arkansas Derby (G1), respectively, races in which he'd finished second, in the latter just a half-length behind Classic Empire, last year's 2-year-old champion and the second betting choice in the Preakness. That finish at Oaklawn Park earned Conquest Mo Money a spot in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), a spot McKenna declined.

"It's very simple," he said, standing just inside the horsemen's entrance to Pimlico, hours before the Preakness post time. "Number one: He's a 3-year-old, and

there are only (three) weeks between the Arkansas Derby and the Kentucky Derby, and number two: The Kentucky Derby doesn't appeal to me from a horseman's standpoint. From a fan's standpoint, from a grand pageant standpoint, being part of history...but I'd much rather see my horse in a race with 10 or 12 horses than in a race with 20. Because it's not the best horse (that wins); it's the best trip.

"The combination of those two things made us decide to wait and come here."

McKenna and his wife, Sandy, live in New Mexico, which is where their racing operation is based. But at last November's Keeneland November mixed sale, the unraced state-bred Conquest Mo Money, from the Conquest Stables dispersal, caught his eye, even as he thought that the horse was likely to be out of his price range.

Bred by Twin Creeks Farm, Conquest Mo Money (Uncle Mo—Stirring, by Seeking the Gold) sold as a yearling at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds.

Ernie Semersky's Conquest Stables paid \$180,000 for the colt selected by trainer Mark Casse.

"I like his breeding," Casse said. "He was a big, beautiful horse."

Casse had him for about a year, and like many young horses, Conquest Mo Money bucked shins during his early training, and after a couple of breezes that resulted in some filling in his ankles, Casse elected to give him some time off. In the meantime, Semersky had decided to dissolve his racing stable.

"From the very first, his disposition was what I liked the most," said McKenna. "He's fundamentally balanced well, and he's got depth and length and all the things you look for in a racehorse, but the disposition is the key thing."

Expecting the horse to sell for far

beyond his price range, McKenna was "flabbergasted" when he was able to get him for \$8,500.

"I couldn't believe it," he said. "I guess everyone else sat on their hands. I believe God plays a big hand in everything you do. He has in my life, and I call this a blessing from God because I think that's exactly what it was."

McKenna initially campaigned the horse at his home state track of Sunland Park, with Conquest Mo Money break-

ing his maiden first out by a neck, then winning two straight stakes races by a combined 13 lengths. In the Sunland Derby he finished second to Kentucky Derby contender Hence and then ventured out of New Mexico to race in the Arkansas Derby, where he showed that disposition that had so attracted McKenna.

"You'd have thought he was an 8-year-old with 40 races under his belt," said McKenna. "In Hot Springs there were 65,000 people, and that was a new experience for him. I thought, 'How's he going

to handle it?'

"You could have put a 2-year-old kid on him," he continued. "In the stable, in the saddling paddock—nothing bothered him. He's got a wonderful head, and he's easy to train."

Conquest Mo Money reportedly trained well over the Pimlico surface in the week leading up to the Preakness.

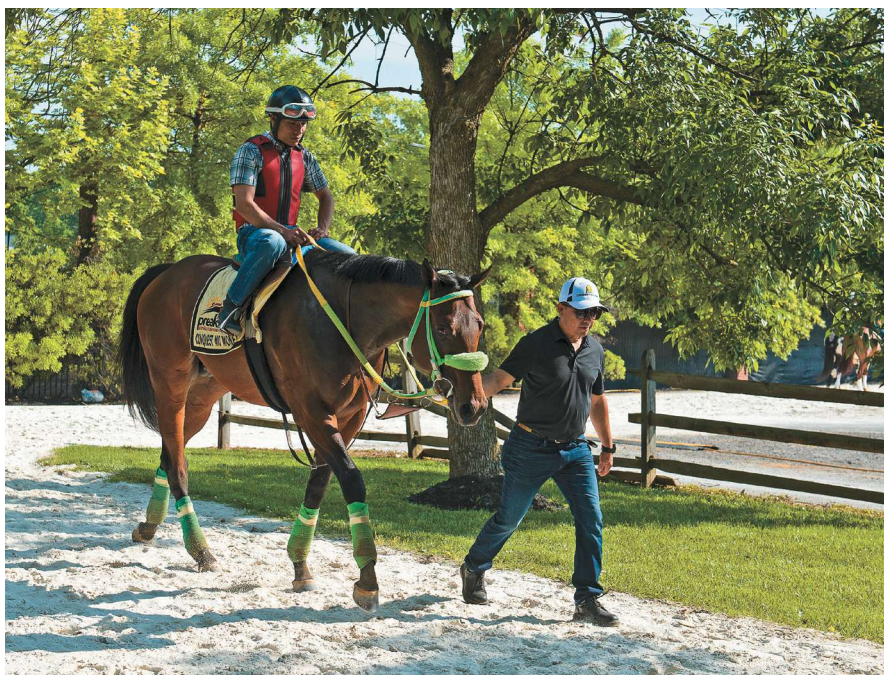
"The jockey stated that he got a real good hold of the track," said George Hernandez. "He's doing great.

Conquest Mo Money, seventh in the Preakness, will be based on the East Coast

“How lucky can you get? The Preakness. This doesn’t happen often. We’ve been in the racetrack industry forever; we grew up on the track. Being here this week is just awesome.”

An inveterate front-runner, Conquest Mo Money bobbled briefly out of the gate in the Preakness under jockey Jorge Carreno and didn’t get either to the inside or to the front, running several lengths behind the horses he was supposed to contend with early. Despite running gamely, he finished seventh.

“It’s a horse race,” said McKenna philosophically. “It happens. He didn’t get out of the gate well and (Carreno) had to hurry him a little bit to get him back where we wanted to be. We wanted to be sitting closer to the front.”

Though McKenna hesitated to run Conquest Mo Money in the Kentucky Derby on three weeks’ rest, the Belmont Stakes (G1) does remain under consideration. But running in the third leg of the Triple Crown or not, Conquest Mo Money’s days in the southwest are over, and the New York-bred is coming east for the next stage of his career. In June the horse will take up residence in the Fair Hill barn of Tres Abbott.

“I did an analysis of quite a few trainers,” said McKenna. “I was looking for one who thinks out of the box, who’s innovative, and who has a European or Australian background. I think their training techniques are superior, and the use of drugs isn’t as rampant. I’m old-fashioned.

“Tres thinks like I do,” he went on. “He trains the individual, and it’s hard to find

someone like that. It’s what I wanted, it’s what he does, and here we are.”

The prospect of his New York-bred finally getting a chance to run in New York is good news for breeder Randy Gullatt of Twin Creeks Farm. Though based in Kentucky, Gullatt stands Mission Impazible at Sequel Stallions near Hudson, N.Y., where he also keeps some of his mares.

“We thought she had an outstanding pedigree,” he said of Stirring (out of the Deputy Minister mare Daijin), whom he purchased in foal at the 2013 Keeneland November sale, paying \$80,000 for the unraced mare.

“She was in foal to a good horse, and we thought we got a good discount because at the time she hadn’t produced any stakes winners. She was excellent value with that pedigree.”

Stirring is in foal now to Graydar, a Twin Creeks stallion standing at Taylor Made Stallions near Nicholasville, Ky., and has a 2-year-old filly by Mission Impazible.

“New York is a regional market with a great breeders’ awards program, so it’s a perfect venue for Conquest Mo Money,” said Gullatt.

Owning a horse such as Conquest Mo Money is a novelty for the McKennas; though they’ve owned horses for 14 years and have about 50 on the track, this is the first that has taken them to this level of racing.

“I’m not in any hurry to take this horse to the breeding shed,” said McKenna. “I’m a lot different from most of the owners in the Kentucky Derby that have one thing in mind. That’s not good for the industry, but it’s being done. I’d love for him to run until he’s 7 years old before I take him to the breeding shed.”

While Conquest Mo Money is likely to run primarily in New York this summer, his owner isn’t at this point inclined to take advantage of the lucrative purses for New York-bred horses.

“There are a lot of good races in New York,” McKenna observed. “He’s a 3-year-old graded stakes horse, and we’re going to campaign him that way.” 🐾

Wise Takes the Prize

EVERY NOW AND THEN the phrase “with ease” gets shaded with new meaning in a Thoroughbred race. That vocabulary footnote happened again May 29 when Lawrence Goichman’s homebred Kathryn the Wise (by Uncle Mo) simply toyed with her 10 rivals in the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes.

The Critical Eye, contested at a one-turn mile over Belmont Park’s “sloppy (sealed)” main track, was Kathryn the Wise’s third trip postward. The 4-year-old filly’s previous two races resulted in a pair of dominating wins, totaling 17½ lengths between her and the nearest competition. But those two encounters were run at six and 6½ furlongs. Would the stretch-out to eight furlongs and the presence of several other early-speed types hinder her chances? The answer was a resounding “no.”

After breaking from the outside post, Kathryn the Wise was prompted through a speed-laden opening quarter-mile of :22.62 and a half-mile of :46.36. She held the lead by just a half-length, when she suddenly stepped away from her competition while racing on the latter half of the far turn.

Turning into the lane Kathryn the Wise had opened up on the field by 7½ lengths. At that point the race had been essentially put to rest.

During the final stages of the contest, jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. geared down the winner, who resides in the barn of trainer Chad Brown.

The margin on the wire was 8¼ lengths, though it could have easily been more. “This horse has always been a runner; a great foal; good-looking. Chad loved

her from the beginning. She's named after Kathryn Boor, the dean of the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences at Cornell University," said Goichman. "I chose Uncle Mo for my mare (Shea d'Lady, by Crafty Prospector) after due consideration. That was the right stallion. It was the first year he was at stud. I didn't know he would be this great a stallion."

The final time was 1:38.70.

"She had some issues as a young horse where we just stopped on her and let her get over them," said Brown, who won three stakes on the Big Apple Showcase program. "Mr. Goichman has been very patient. He's owned horses for a very long time and knows the game. He gave the horse plenty of time to receive the best care, and here she is. She trains and runs like a horse that can run in open company. We thought that this was a good race for her developmental wise, a stakes against fellow New York-breds. But if she keeps developing and training well, you'll definitely see her against open company."

Kathryn the Wise increased her earnings to \$187,200.

Read the Footnotes sired both the

second- and third-place finishers in the Critical Eye. Michael Dubb's Literata closed from well back in the field to grab the runner-up spot. Check Mark Stables' Bee Noteworthy was third.

Critical Eye earned two New York-bred championships. The daughter of Dynaformer, out of the Dr. Blum mare Critical Crew, was a homebred for Herbert T. Schwartz. He owned her in

partnership with his wife, Carol, while the couple's son, Scott Schwartz, did the training.

"I remember watching the (1993) Breeders' Cup with my dad. There was a horse running named Blumin Affair (finished second in the Juvenile, G1, and third in the 1994 Kentucky Derby, G1). He was a Dynaformer out of a Dr. Blum mare. I said to my dad, 'We have a Dr. Blum mare. Maybe that's the right nick,' " said Scott Schwartz. "Critical Eye was very durable and very versatile. She could run long, short, and on the grass—any distance from six furlongs to a mile and a quarter. And she was competitive from age 2 to 5."

Critical Eye won 14 of 38 starts and earned seven figures. She won five graded stakes, highlighted by victories in the 2000 Gazelle Handicap (G1) and the 2001 Hempstead Handicap (G1). Deservedly, Herbert T. Schwartz, who participated in racing for five decades, was named 2001 New York Breeder of the Year.

DOUBLE WEEKEND

After saluting our nation's veterans on Memorial Day, many Americans like to kick back and relax with a beverage and a barbecue. That doesn't apply to Red and Black Stable's Weekend Hideaway, a 7-year-old son of Speightstown, out of Apocalyptical (by Wiseman's Ferry). For the second year in a row over a rain-soaked surface, the game competitor scored a victory in the \$200,000 Commentator Stakes. And this year's edition was hard fought to the last jump.

Trained by Phil Serpe, Weekend Hideaway instantly shot to the lead in the Commentator beneath jockey Luis Saez, who was aboard the runner for the 10th consecutive time.

The opening fractions were swift,

Weekend Hideaway edges Diversify in the Commentator

with the free-running Weekend Hideaway, who had the lead by a length, racing the opening quarter-mile in 23.04 and the half-mile in 46.04 over the “sloppy (sealed)” main track.

Weekend Hideaway opened up a two-length advantage at the eighth pole, but gathering serious momentum behind him were a pair of talented rivals. Both Diversify (by Bellamy Road) and Governor Malibu (by Malibu Moon), who were bred to relish the off going, were gaining substantial ground.

Stubborn through the stretch, Weekend Hideaway found more and kept reaching for the finish. He appeared home free in the final 50 yards when Diversify ducked to the inside beneath jockey Jose Ortiz, effectively shutting off Governor Malibu. Diversify kept coming and made a last-gasp lunge at the wire, leaving the crowd and connections unsure of the outcome.

“I had a feeling that we won the race, but we came back and saw it wasn’t official,” said Saez. “That was a little scary, anything can happen. But I had a little feeling that we got there (first). He ran so hard. When we came through the stretch, he gave me everything.”

The photo finish showed Weekend Hideaway was the winner by a nose.

“We got him for \$40,000 at the (Flying Zee Stable dispersal). He just went over one million in earnings. So it’s

been fantastic,” said co-owner Anthony Smith, who owns Weekend Hideaway in tandem with Mike Hoffman. “Being by Speightstown was the key to it. I believe that’s what Phil (Serpe) really liked about him.”

How prudent a purchase was it? Weekend Hideaway is the only horse still

in training from the 2011 dispersal sale.

Bred by Carl Lizza’s Flying Zee Stables, Weekend Hideaway stopped the timer in 1:37.34 for eight furlongs, while recording his 12th victory from 39 starts, with earnings of \$1,004,632.

“Horses like him are just great to be around. This horse is 7 years old. He’s been winning races in New York since he was 2, and he’s still going strong,” said Serpe, who twisted his knee making his way to the winner’s circle. “Does he struggle a little bit trying to get the one mile distance? He does. But things went his way today and he deserves this victory.”

The stewards, seeing Phil Serpe hobble around the winner’s circle, called his assistant moments after the race. They jokingly informed her the trainer would be placed on the vet’s list—referring to when a horse appears injured and must pass a vet’s exam before being reentered.

The hard luck and resolute runner-up in the Commentator was Lauren and Ralph Evans’ Diversify, sent out by trainer Rick Violette Jr. The 4-year-old gelding, who was sent off as the favorite in the field of nine, has won four of seven starts with a pair of second-place finishes.

Jump Sucker Stable and Oak Bluff Stables’ Governor Malibu, bred by Richard Leahy’s Oak Bluff Stables, finished third. Last year Governor Malibu competed in a pair of grade 1 contests—the Belmont Stakes (finished fourth) and Travers (finished fifth).

Tracy Farmer’s Commentator was a gelded son of Distorted Humor and trained by Hall of Famer Nick Zito. Bred by Michael Martinez and foaled in 2001, Commentator won 14 of 24 starts while earning \$2,049,845. He won eight stakes, including the grade 1 Whitney Handicap at Saratoga in 2005 and 2008. Commentator was named New York Horse of the Year in 2005 and 2008. 🐾

Colorful Pair

BIG APPLE SHOWCASE DAY featured a pair of grass stakes—the \$125,000 Mount Vernon Stakes and the \$125,000 Kingston Stakes—each at a distance of a mile and contested over a “yielding” Widener turf course. The pair of highly competitive races turned out to be mirror images of each other, with co-owner Michael Dubb and trainer Chad Brown standing in the winner’s circle at the conclusion of both.

Fourstar Crook, a 5-year-old daughter of Freud, out of Avril a Portugal, by D’Accord, had won her last six races, mostly in dominating fashion. The day’s sizable hurdles, however, were that the mare was coming off an eight-month layoff and the Mount Vernon, on paper, looked like a race with little pace to suit her preferred closing style.

“With Chad, layoffs don’t really matter,” said Dubb. “Whether it’s three weeks or a year, he knows how to have them ready.”

Soon after the break jockey Javier Castellano had Fourstar Crook racing in fourth position in the field of seven older fillies and mares after an opening quarter mile in :24.14. But by the time the runners had completed a half-mile, Fourstar Crook had been shuffled to the back of the pack, with the pace moderating slightly to :48.81.

Fourstar Crook, the 6-5 favorite, seemed to be idling behind a wall of horseflesh as the field turned into the lane. Then came a slight seam, and Castellano guided her out into the five-path. It wasn’t an enviable position and not exactly a prototypical winning trip, but none of that would dissuade this classy mare.

Through the final furlong Fourstar Crook displayed her winning profile. She

lengthened her stride, passing runners one-by-one and surged to the lead. Yet her work wasn't done. In the last 100 yards Fourstar Crook held off the determined charge of stablemate Ack Naughty (by Afleet Alex).

Against most other rivals, Ack Naughty's late turn-of-foot would have made her a winner. But Fourstar Crook wouldn't be denied her seventh straight triumph, as she held sway with eye-catching proficiency, registering a three-quarter-length victory on the wire.

"She's unstoppable. She's really a special horse. Gary Young picked her out at the Timonium sale, and she took time to develop," said Dubb. "At some point we have to look at graded stakes for her because she's earned it."

"I remember she worked very well at the sale," said Young, a clocker and bloodstock agent. "She was a very well put together medium-sized filly. Freuds tend to get better as they get older. But who would have thought she'd turn into this kind of racehorse."

The winner, also owned in partnership by Michael Caruso's Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith, stopped the timer in 1:37.33.

Bred by Kathleen Feron, Fourstar Crook collected her seventh win from 10 starts, increasing her earnings to \$424,050.

After being defeated in her first three starts, Fourstar Crook, once tasting victory in her fourth trip postward, has since refused to lose.

Sheep Pond Partners and Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners' Ack Naughty, who was ridden by Joel Rosario, was a solid second.

Freudie Anne (by Freud), owned by Marc Detampel, Fergus Galvin, Jayne

Doi Johnson, and Adrian Mansergh Wallace, finished third after being saddled by trainer Thomas Morley.

SIMILAR PLAN

The winning game plan by Dubb and Brown from the Mount Vernon seemed to carry over to the Kingston. Much like Fourstar Crook, Offering Plan (by Spring At Last) was also coming off the bench after an eight-month layoff. And with Castellano in the saddle, the 5-year-old found himself trailing the field of eight older males early, before swinging five-wide into the stretch. Sound familiar?

Gerald and Susan Kresa's King Kreesa (by King Cugat) had raced a comfortable opening half-mile in :49.40 and turned into the lane with the lead. But Offering Plan displayed a keen turn-of-foot through the final furlong. With clods of damp turf flying backward behind him, Offering Plan hunkered down and kicked it into high gear. He surged to the front inside the final sixteenth with Castellano only resorting to a pair of brief right-handed reminders as he cleared King Kreesa, registering a one-length victory.

"It never gets old (collecting the trophy)," said Dubb. "We purchased him as a yearling, Sol Kumin (Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners) and I. We knew he was a New York-bred and going to Chad Brown. At the time, Spring At Last seemed like he was showing promise as a turf stallion."

Bred by C.W. Swann and Cygnet Farm, the winner got the trip in 1:37.40.

Offering Plan, also owned in partnership by Bethlehem Stables and Aisquith, notched his fifth victory from 13 starts, moving the earnings needle to \$382,800.

Dubb's outstanding success as an owner is no accident. It is the result of

relentless hard work and passion for the game. For example—the night before the Kingston, Dubb had sent Brown a text stating that if he didn't like the condition of the wet turf to scratch, because the owner had spotted another race a week

later in the condition book that fit Offering Plan's eligibility status. And with the added money of being a New York-bred, the purses would be relatively equal.

"It's a lot of work. I do most of it myself," said Dubb, who puts in approximately two hours a night scouting horses and opportunities. "I use (bloodstock agents) Kim Valerio and Gary Young for yearlings and 2-year-olds in-training. But everything else is me. It's about really looking—often looking at condition books and trying to think out of the box.

"It's like business. You get up every morning and make a lot of decisions. They can't all be right. You have to understand that you're going to make a lot of mistakes. A lot of people are slow to accept that in this game. I've learned that your first loss is your best loss. I've also learned to look at my horses like a stock portfolio, hoping that the good choices can more than compensate for the bad ones."

The 8-year-old gelding King Kreesa, from the barn of trainer Linda Rice, finished a game second in the Kingston while making his 38th start (11 wins, \$1,413,554). Aliyu Ben J Stables' homebred Lubash (by Freud), a 10-year-old, finished third in the contest. King Kreesa and Lubash (53 starts, 18 wins, and \$1,510,639) have totaled 91 starts, mostly on the New York Racing Association circuit, between them. It was appropriate that these two veteran "warhorses" met yet again on Memorial Day.

As part of their Memorial Day festivities, NYRA recognized a decorated real-life warhorse named Staff Sergeant Reckless. The chestnut mare who was purchased from a racetrack in Seoul, Korea, earned two purple hearts and several other citations while serving as a pack horse carrying supplies into battle for the U.S. Marine Corps during the Korean War. A statue of Staff Sergeant Reckless, which contains a lock of her tail hair, was dedicated in 2013 and stands at the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Triangle, Va. 🇺🇸

T Loves a Fight tops Syndergaard in the Mike Lee

Fighting Chances

THREE-YEAR-OLD T LOVES A FIGHT showed his mettle in earning his first stakes win during Big Apple Showcase Day May 29, taking the seven-furlong Mike Lee Stakes. The last-to-first victory came over a “sloppy (sealed)” track at Belmont Park.

In his second stakes start, the bay gelding was sent off as the 9-5 second choice behind even-money favorite Syndergaard, a narrow runner-up in last fall’s Champagne Stakes (G1). While the favorite went to his customary place on the lead, T Loves a Fight and jockey Kendrick Carmouche raced well back of the pacesetter and just off the rail.

Carmouche urged T Loves a Fight coming into the far turn, and he easily passed rivals, splitting horses to take aim at Syndergaard. He ran with him neck-and-neck in the lane before drawing off to win by 2¼ lengths in 1:25.06.

Earlier in the day Carmouche had been presented with the Mike Venezia Award by the New York Racing Association. The award, voted on by the public, goes to a jockey who exemplifies extraordinary sportsmanship and citizenship and is named for the jockey killed in a riding accident at Belmont in 1988.

The win was trainer Mike Hushion’s third in the Mike Lee. He won consecutive runnings in 2013-14 with Amberjack and Captain Serious, respectively.

A homebred for Hoffman Thoroughbreds, T Loves a Fight is out of the Broken Vow mare Worth Fighting For and sired by Girolamo, who stood at Sequel Stal-

lions in New York in 2012-13. The son of A.P. Indy currently stands at Darley in Kentucky for \$10,000.

Stewart Hoffman purchased Worth Fighting For at the 2007 Keeneland January sale for \$80,000. After she failed to produce anything of note, Hoffman tried to sell her—twice. The first time, the auction company discouraged him from entering her, noting her produce record would make her an undesirable auction prospect.

“Lere Visagie, manager of Rockridge

Stud, said, ‘Why don’t we breed her to a hot new stallion?’ ” recalled Hoffman by phone after the race.

The plan then was to sell the mare in foal, in the hopes that the offspring of a new stallion would up her value.

“So we went to Girolamo and we put her in the (2013 Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale),” said Hoffman. “It cost us \$15,000 to go to Girolamo, the best offer was \$19,000, and she had a reserve of \$20,000.”

Undaunted, Hoffman and Visagie de-

ecided to keep the foal and race him, a decision that didn’t look so hot after T Loves a Fight failed to break his maiden in his first five starts, including maiden claiming races.

That changed Jan. 26, when he won a \$40,000 maiden claimer by a nose, and then, said Hoffman, “all hell broke loose.”

Named for Hoffman’s cousin’s wife, a “feisty Irishwoman” named Teresa, T Loves a Fight won his next two starts easily before finishing second in his stakes debut in a New York Stallion Series race at Aqueduct in April.

Before the gelding’s success, Hoffman gave the mare to Visagie, who bred her twice to Paynter, producing fillies in 2016 and 2017.

“I texted him after the race,” said Hoffman. “He’s over the moon. This is a nice thing to happen for him.”

EVERY DAY’S A HOLIDAY

A nice week for breeders Drs. Joan Taylor and Bill Wilmot got even better. Their homebred mare Thin Disguise got her first stakes winner when 3-year-old Holiday Disguise won the \$125,000 Bouwerie Stakes in the finale on Big Apple Showcase Day.

Earlier in the week they had learned that Twisted Tom, a horse they bred, will run in the Belmont Stakes (G1) on June 10.

Owned by Lady Sheila Stable, Holiday Disguise made her stakes debut in the Bouwerie, and partner Sheila Rosenblum felt like she hit an exacta of sorts as she watched her filly run down Noble Freud, a half sister to Rosenblum’s Eclipse Award winner La Verdad and graded stakes winner Hot City Girl, in the final strides.

“I was hoping for us to win and have Noble Freud be second because that brings up the bloodlines of La Verdad and Hot City Girl,” she said. “It worked out perfectly for us.”

La Verdad had her first foal this year; a filly by Medaglia d’Oro. Hot City Girl has

made four starts this year, winning one.

Much like T Loves a Fight, Holiday Disguise raced well off the pace and off the rail, but while T Loves a Fight was able to save ground, jockey José Ortiz took the bay filly out to the middle of the racetrack, persistently urging her to make up ground on Noble Freud. The willing filly won by 1¼ lengths, running the seven furlongs in 1:25.19.

“I decided to go wide because that was the only shot I thought I had to win,” said Ortiz. “When I saw I had (Noble Freud) in my sights at the eighth-pole, I knew I was going to pass her. My filly was moving well, and I knew I was going to get there.”

By Harlan’s Holiday, Holiday Disguise is out of Thin Disguise (by Yes It’s True), a half sister to graded stakes winner Naughty New Yorker. Their dam, Naughty Natisha, died last year at age 22.

“We can see Naughty Natisha in her with that big blaze,” said Taylor. “It all comes back and it’s so touching, and we’re so happy for (trainer) Linda (Rice) and Lady Sheila.”

Originally purchased as a weanling at the Keeneland November sale in 2014 by John Greathouse, agent, Holiday Disguise was purchased by Rosenblum at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds for \$220,000. She is joined in the partnership by friends Debra Wasser and Dottie Herman.

“Linda thought she had a beautiful walk,” said Rosenblum. “She was a little bit chubby when we got her, but she’s come into herself and proven herself.”

Holiday Disguise made her first start on a “good” track, finishing a well-beaten fourth, then won two straight comfortably over “fast” strips.

“We didn’t know how she’d do in the mud,” admitted Rosenblum. “I think Linda just wanted to give it a shot, and now we’ve figured out she’s OK in the mud.”

A perennial purchaser at the Saratoga New York-bred sale, Rosenblum doesn’t exclusively buy New York-breds, but, said Rice, “We’re making a serious play to recognize the strength of the New York-bred program.”

And recalling her success with New York-bred La Verdad, Rosenblum added, “I’m loyal.”

Having run her first four races against fellow state-breds, Holiday Disguise might face open company next, with Rice contemplating the Victory Ride Stakes (G3) at 6½ furlongs at Belmont July 9.

“That would be graded open company on this track, and the distance would

be suitable for her,” said the trainer.

Long involved in New York racing and breeding, Taylor and Wilmot are downsizing and selling their Stepwise Farm near Saratoga though they will continue to breed horses, just with a little less responsibility and maybe a little more fun.

“We’re enjoying this,” said Taylor with a grin. “The gods are smiling on us this year.” 🐾

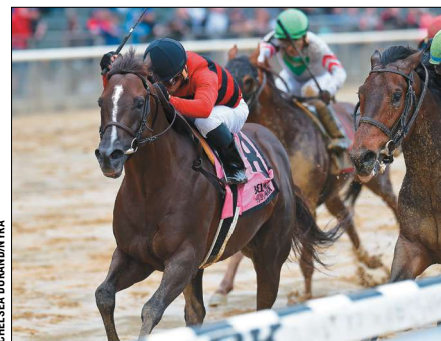

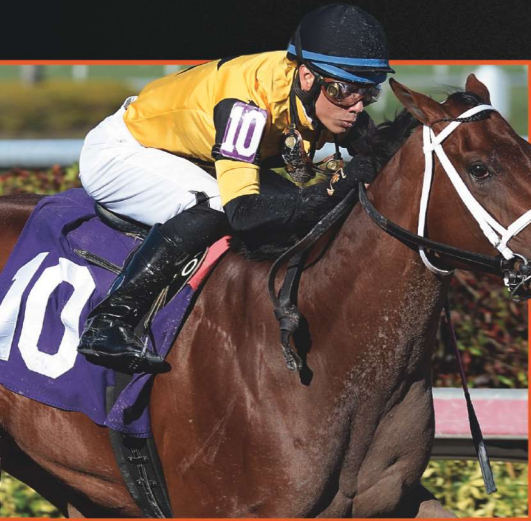
