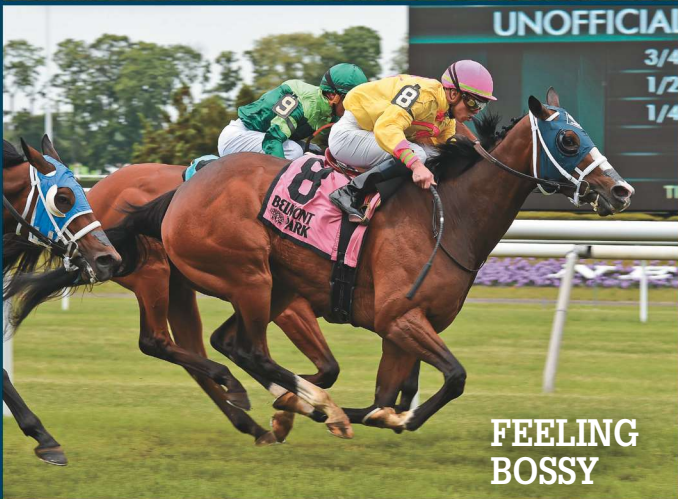

Town Hall Takeaway

ON MAY 12 the New York State Breeding and Development Fund (the Fund) hosted a town hall meeting in Saratoga Springs to give stakeholders the opportunity to debate the pros and cons of the current awards structure and program rules. It is simple to summarize the upshot of the meeting. The majority of attendees—like the majority of people who’ve communicated via phone, email, or the Fund survey—favor the status quo. However, it is important to dig deeper.

I want every program participant to understand the underlying reasons for opening the discussion at all and to respect the legitimate concerns of those—mostly those in the stallion business—who advocate for change. I would also like to propose some ways we can address their concerns without involving risk to the program as a whole.

First, the case for the status quo. Among the greatest strengths of New York’s breeding program are its consistency and integrity. Program participants can count on the Fund’s advertised award levels and adherence to published rules from year to year. The supporting racing infrastructure is guaranteed by state statute. Consider, by contrast, with the way less well-protected programs, such as Pennsylvania’s or New Jersey’s, have, at times, become pawns in political battles. Breeders, on average, make a three-year investment in each horse and need to feel confident about what the future holds. Our program’s credibility depends on its consistency.

On the other hand, the stallion sector is under legitimate pressure. The breeding business in the state has become highly competitive due to those entering the program and will stay that way for the foreseeable future, given a booming sales market that has not yet, I believe, reached its ceiling. Competition for mares is fierce, and there is pressure on stud fees. The landscape and polarization of the commercial marketplace make it harder for New York-sired horses to succeed at the most prestigious sales as only 18% (300 of 1,700) of the foal crop make it into the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings. Of those 18%, or 300 foals that are accepted, the average stud fee is three times the amount of the average New York-sired advertised fee. In a sense, the stallion sector is paying the biggest price for the New York program’s phenomenal successes.

Why should this matter to breeders? I believe a viable stallion population is essential to the identity and longevity of our program. The stallion constituency owns and operates the state’s largest farms, helping us fulfill the 1973 mandate of our program “to preserve New York’s irreplaceable farmland.” Stallion businesses support a disproportionate number of jobs due to the large number of people involved in stal-

lion support and promotion and in the maintenance of a large broodmare population. The larger stallion farms also generate the most revenue in their local communities by utilizing all the equipment and services required for maintaining a large farm.

Revenue, job creation, and preservation of greenspace make up the case we take to lawmakers every time we go to Albany to advocate on behalf of breeders. I believe the New York program would lose its credibility at every level and its clout if New York should become merely a foaling station without a thriving stallion business.

As far as appearances go, it is also important to recognize that nearly 47% of the Fund’s total awards money (\$7 million out of \$15 million) leaves New York to residents of other states.

Of course, ancillary, or trickle-down, economics brings some of that revenue back to New York boarders via mares thereby contributing to our growth, increased competitiveness, and commercial appeal. On the face of it, though, the specter of money going out of state is difficult to square with the picture of our industry we paint for lawmakers. For all these reasons it is vital to address the current woes of the state’s stallion businesses by incentivizing New York sires.

One obvious route is bonuses. The 37%, or \$7,000 bonus, for New York-sired maiden special weight winners at Finger Lakes begun in 2017 is already popular. In the future the Fund could earmark purse enrichment money or any annual surpluses for bonuses for other conditions at Finger Lakes and at the New York Racing Association. Another idea is expanding the current New York Stallion Stakes Series, both at Finger Lakes and NYRA. Yet another avenue is convincing NYRA to institute a “preferred entry” model for New York-sired horses at some or all of the meets. Whatever combination of measures is adopted, the Fund should promote the measure with aggressive marketing campaigns highlighting the benefits of breeding to New York stallions. All of these racing-focused incentives create end user demand for New York-sired foals, and it’s my belief we need to focus on that side of the business as much as possible. As much as our industry doesn’t acknowledge it, we truly don’t have a foal shortage, but rather an owner shortage that is immediately becoming more pressing for all constituents of the sport.

What we all need to keep in mind is the New York breeding program does not “belong” to anyone—not to breeders, not to stallion owners, not to anyone. The program is everybody’s program, and, as such, everybody needs to understand everyone’s challenges and support efforts to make the program work for all. Circumstances demand we put a focus on ways to foster a thriving population of quality stallions so we can all succeed. No matter what we do or don’t do, the key is not negatively affecting one entity of this ecosystem with quick-minded decisions and at the same time recognizing the issues our stallion constituents have today and helping address them. 🐾

New York-Bred Brings \$925,000 at F-T Midlantic

Union Rags—Tanglewood Tale colt worked an eighth of a mile in :10

New York-bred 2-year-olds were front and center at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, headed by a Union Rags colt that at \$925,000 had the sale's second-highest price.

Of the 430 head offered during the May 21-22 sale near Timonium, Md., 109 were bred in the Empire State, representing 25.3%. Eighty-four New York-breds sold for \$5,605,000. The \$66,726 average for the New York-breds was within the 89.3% of the sale's overall \$74,680 average, and the group's median of \$30,000 was 78.9% of the \$38,000 sale median.

Named Tangled Union, the Union Rags colt was purchased by Michael Lund Petersen from the Bobby Dodd consignment.

Bred in New York by Avanti Stable, the colt had been purchased for \$90,000 by Brad Grady's Grand Oaks from Paramount Sales' consignment at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds. The bay 2-year-old is the second foal out of the winning Tale of the Cat mare Tanglewood Tale. He is a full brother to winner Big Thicket and a half brother to a yearling filly named Lemolina. Tanglewood Tale foaled a colt by Tiznow in 2018.

Not only was the colt a standout in the sale ring, but he also sizzled during the under-tack show, with his eighth-mile in :10, the fastest of the pre-sale workouts and the only sale entrant to post that time.

"I was expecting him to bring the upside of \$500,000," an overwhelmed Dodd said. "I didn't think we'd get that close to a million, but I did think we'd get \$650,000, maybe \$750,000. But you know, you never know when lightning is going to strike in this business. That's why we do it."

New York-based trainer Linda Rice was the leading buyer of New York-breds, with four acquired for \$860,000. Among Rice's purchases was a Tiznow colt out of stakes-placed Southern Charmer bought for \$425,000, second-highest price paid for a New York-bred at the sale.

From the family of grade 3 winners Power Play and Frac Daddy, the second-place finisher in the 2013 Arkansas Derby (G1), the colt was bred by Thomas Mina and consigned to the Midlantic sale by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds. The colt had been purchased by Hartley/De Renzo for \$250,000 from Summerfield's offerings at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale at Saratoga.

New York-breds were also popular with buyer Mike Ryan, who picked up three for a total of \$635,000, and Korean-based K.O.I.D., which paid \$280,000 for its four youngsters. *By Ron Mitchell*

Flipcup Retired; To Be Bred to Speightstown

Popular New York-bred Flipcup, bred by Team Penney Racing and raced by Team Penney Racing, Wachtel Stable, and Brouss Stable, has been retired after six seasons of racing and will be bred to sprint champion Speightstown.

“Some horses are extra special to us as owners and breeders—the ones you truly fall in love with and count as part of your family,” said Shirl Penney. “Flipcup was one of those horses for the Penney family. From being there when she was foaled, to her racing career in many states over many surfaces, and now onto her next career as part of our broodmare band, she is what this sport is all about to us: fun with family and friends and about building special bonds with our horses.”

Penney, his wife, Mary Ann, and their daughters, Ann Clare and Townsend, have been along every step of the way of this accomplished racemare’s career.

By Milwaukee Brew, Flipcup is out of Dream Affair, a Kentucky-bred Touch Gold mare purchased by Penney for \$11,000 at the 2007 Ocala Breeders’ Sales’ January mixed sale. Foaled March 29, 2011, Flip-

cup was prepared for her racing career by Kenny Lejeune in Florida (who also broke Penney’s grade 2 stakes winner Sweet Vendetta) and burst onto the racing scene as a juvenile. At 2 she won three of four starts, including the East View Stakes for New York-breds.

Flipcup went on to win at least one stakes race in each of the next three years and each of those years her success was rewarded with a nomination for a New York-bred divisional championship (champion 3-year-old filly in 2014 and older dirt female in 2015 and 2016).

She won or placed in 19 stakes, including victories in the Arlington Matron Stakes (G3), and the Maple Leaf Stakes (G3). She won seven of 36 starts and earned \$691,732. Flipcup retires sound but experienced a minor issue after her last race April 2 (an \$85,000 allowance optional claiming

race at 1¼ miles on turf at Aqueduct).

“We retired her as her ankle was a little sore, and we talked to (trainer) Bill Mott and just decided we could still breed her this year,” Penney said. “We decided to stop on her as we would never risk anything with her. While she has been second in stakes on grass, we wanted that (turf stakes) win to make her a rare mare, having won stakes on all three surfaces.”

For the pregnancy and foaling Penney is thinking of bringing Flipcup back to Jerry Bilinski’s Waldorf Farm in North Chatham where she and Sweet Vendetta were foaled.

Reflecting on Flipcup’s place in the family, Penney said, “She was a fun ride winning stakes at 2, 3, 4, and 5 and being full of heart. Mary Ann and I and our daughters visited her daily at Mott’s barn (from our house on the Oklahoma training track) and will miss her.”

NY-BREDS START WITH AN ADVANTAGE

Mind Your Biscuits Sold to Shadai

Shadai Farm had been eyeing international grade 1 star sprinter Mind Your Biscuits as a stallion prospect since last summer. The son of Posse sealed the deal in March when he won the Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) for the second consecutive year and in track-record time.

Mind Your Biscuits has earned more than \$3.7 million

“When we went back to Dubai, they were impressed at what we were able to do running Lasix-free. They made us a very nice offer,” said trainer Chad Summers, who initially found the colt as a yearling after he was a \$47,000 buy-back at the Fasig-Tip-

ton Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale.

Shadai recently completed an outright purchase of Mind Your Biscuits, who will continue racing through the rest of 2018 and is expected to enter stud in Japan next year. Shadai leased back 50% of the horse to the previous ownership group, which includes J Stables, M. Scott Summers, Daniel and Hope Summers, Head of Plains Partners, and Michael Kisber. Mind Your Biscuits will continue racing in Shadai’s silks.

“Shadai is a big proponent of medication-free racing. It is the purity of the horse that’s out there,” Summers said. “Also, the farm wants to introduce more speed into their pedigrees. I’m excited that they believe Mind Your Biscuits can be a top-tier stallion. They are not just taking a chance on him.”

Like Mind Your Biscuits, Posse excelled as a sprinter. The grade 2-winning son of Silver Deputy won the Riva Ridge Breeders’ Cup Stakes (G2) and Lafayette Stakes (G3), both at seven furlongs, and finished third in the grade 1 Vosburgh Stakes going 6½ furlongs. Posse, a four-time leading sire in New York, now stands in Uruguay.

Mind Your Biscuits is out of the unraced Toccet mare Jazzmane. She has produced four winners out of seven foals; Mind Your Biscuits is her only black-type performer. Jazzmane’s dam, Alljazz (by Stop the Music), finished off the board in two career starts. Her best runners include multiple stakes winner Kimchi (by Langfuhr) and stakes-placed winners Deputy Jazz (by War Deputy) and King of Jazz (by K One King).

Mind Your Biscuits’ speed has put him in the winner’s circle of five graded/group stakes: two editions of the Golden Shaheen, Malibu Stakes (G1), Belmont Sprint Championship Stakes (G2), and Amsterdam Stakes (G2). With earnings of \$3,719,286, he is the richest New York-bred in history.

Mind Your Biscuits was bred by Samantha Will Baccari’s Jumping Jack Racing.

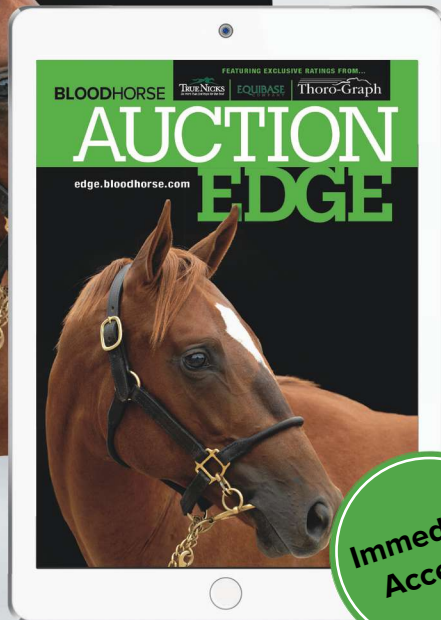

Stars Brighten Showcase

BEFORE THE COMMENTATOR STAKES at Belmont Park May 28, 5-year-old Diversify had run over “Big Sandy” six times, with four wins and two seconds, and \$639,200 in earnings.

Small wonder, then, that he was made the 2-1 favorite in the one-mile Commentator, and he ran to his odds and to his record, boosting the latter at Belmont to five wins from seven starts and earnings of \$759,200. In a 13-race career he has earned \$934,425.

In the last of six stakes for New York-bred horses on its annual Big Apple Showcase Day, Diversify broke from post eight under Jose Ortiz, stumbled a bit at the start, quickly righting himself to head toward his customary place on the lead. He ceded that spot to Jewel Can Disco, who was followed closely by Mr. Buff, with Diversify sitting a length back as the field moved down the backstretch.

Racing in the clear in the three-path, Diversify and Ortiz maintained a steady pace through fractions of :22.57 and :45.22, a pace that took its toll on both Jewel Can Disco and Mr. Buff. Coming around the final turn Diversify swept to the front.

But there was still running to be done—an eighth of a mile—and Diversify had to work for the win. A late challenge by Pat On the Back nearly had him nailed inside the sixteenth pole, but Diversify dug in, holding off his rival by a nose at the wire.

"I thought we won it, but then I

watched the replay and said, 'Whoa,' " said trainer Rick Violette Jr.

"At the three-eighths pole I went after them," said Ortiz, "and when he made the lead, he pricked his ears, so I knew he had something left in the tank. Pat On the Back ran a very good race. Any other day, we would've won by 10."

The close finish didn't do much to allay the nerves of Lauren Evans, who co-owns Diversify with her father, Ralph. Though she has often seen the horse run, before the Commentator she had never seen him win.

Diversify was purchased as a yearling

at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds. Maverick Racing (WinStar Farm) paid \$150,000 for him and campaigned him with Violette for his first two races, both wins. When WinStar Racing offered Diversify at the 2016 Keeneland November mixed sale, longtime client Ralph Evans bought him for \$210,000 on Violette's advice.

Out of the Street Cry mare Rule One, Diversify is by grade 1 winner Bellamy Road, who now stands for \$6,000 in New York at Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions near Stillwater, N.Y. He ranks third on the state's sires list behind Freud and Frost Giant. He was second to Freud on the 2017 sires list.

After winning the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) at Belmont last fall, Diversify turned in two clunkers, a fourth-place finish in the Clark Handicap Presented by Norton Healthcare (G1) at Churchill Downs and a distanced seventh in the Charles Town Classic Stakes (G2) in April. Prior to the Clark, Diversify had finished worse than second only once in 10 starts, winning seven of those races.

"Obviously," said Ralph Evans wryly, "he's not a good shipper. And he loves Belmont Park."

In the winner's circle for the first time

as an owner, Lauren ceded most post-race responsibilities to her parents but was candid about her nerves headed into the race. Unable to attend the Jockey Club Gold Cup because of professional commitments in Arizona, Lauren recently relocated to Washington, D.C., putting her within easy driving distance of the Commentator and the Charles Town Classic.

"It's good to know that it's not my presence that makes him run not well," she said, only half kidding. "This race meant a lot to his record and to prove himself after Charles Town. I think both my father and I were very nervous."

"Ralph feels even more added pressure when we're the favorite. He feels kind of an obligation (to the bettors)," Violette said.

"Yes, I did," concurred Evans with a chuckle.

Violette has his eye on the Suburban Stakes (G2) July 7 at Belmont Park (where else?), at the same 10-furlong distance as the Jockey Club Gold Cup, for a possible next start for Diversify. And if all goes as planned, Lauren will be right back there with her parents Ralph and Judith.

"I'm thrilled," she said, "to be able to participate even more and be here."

HOLIDAY NAIL-BITER

In a nail-biter of a finish between two graded stakes-winning New York-breds, Lady Sheila Stable's Holiday Disguise just got up to win the one-mile Critical Eye Stakes over Chester and Mary Broman's Highway Star.

The only two graded stakes winners in the field ran to their past performances, with Highway Star under Angel Arroyo saving ground along the rail after break-

ing from post 2, and Holiday Disguise and Irad Ortiz Jr. settling into the three-path just behind her. They let Verdant Pastures, Bluegrass Flag, and Frost Wise duke it out on the lead in the early going, and it was Highway Star that made the first move, ranging up heading into the far turn, with Holiday Disguise never letting her increase her one-length lead.

Highway Star got the advantage heading into the stretch, and then the race was on. She and Holiday Disguise left the field in their wake, save for a resolute Playinwiththeboys on the inside. Inside the sixteenth pole it looked like Playinwiththeboys might vanquish both the leaders, but they hit the wire together, Holiday Disguise getting her nose down first. Playinwiththeboys was 1¾ lengths back in third.

"I wasn't sure until they made it official," said trainer Linda Rice, "but the

crowd made it seem she won. She's such a gritty filly."

"Highway Star is a fighter; she always tries hard," said Ortiz. "When we got close, I knew my filly would fight, too, so I just kept riding."

The win was the third in the Critical Eye for Rice, who won in 2015 with Sheriffa and in 2014 with Lady Sheila's La Verdad, who went on to win an Eclipse Award as champion female sprinter in 2015.

Holiday Disguise was bred by Drs. Bill Wilmot and Joan Taylor, and Sheila Rosenblum purchased her at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, paying \$220,000. In nine races, five of them already this year, the filly has earned \$469,150 and finished out of the top three only once, in her debut.

By Harlan's Holiday, Holiday Disguise is out of the Yes It's True mare Thin Disguise, who was also bred by Wilmot and Taylor. They purchased her dam, Naughty Natisha, for \$150,000 at the 1998 Keeneland November sale of breeding stock. In addition to Thin Disguise, Naughty Natisha is the dam of New York-bred millionaire Naughty

New Yorker (by Quiet American) and four six-figure earners. She died at Wilmot and Taylor's Stepwise Farm in 2016 at age 22.

Thin Disguise has a 2-year-old Verazano colt with Niall Brennan that is "showing promise," according to Taylor; a Tiznow yearling filly, and a 2018 Bodemeister filly. She'll be bred this year to Gun Runner.

In January Wilmot and Taylor sold Thin Disguise at the Keeneland horses of all ages sale; she was purchased for \$100,000 by McMahon & Hill Bloodstock, and wisely, her owners retained a 25% interest in her. Two races after the Critical Eye, Holiday Disguise's younger half sister Midnight Disguise (by Midnight Lute), owned by Wilmot and Taylor along with son Devin, won the Bouverie Stakes for 3-year-old fillies, which Holiday Disguise won last year.

"This is spectacular," said Rosenblum. "She's tough. She would be the tough girl that's not going to take crap from anyone. How she did this against such great, talented horses says it all."

Holiday Disguise was running back 16 days after finishing third in the Vagrancy Handicap (G3) at Belmont May 12 and stretching

back out to a mile after having won the Distaff Handicap (G3) at Aqueduct in early April.

"The opportunity was right for this race," said Rosenblum. "It was a decision Linda made, and I agreed with it. The filly does more than maintain her weight; she's even a little chubby! And she was saying, 'Let me race again.'

"She's a strong-willed horse, and she's been breezing and training well."

Wilmot and Taylor joined Rosenblum in the winner's circle for the Critical Eye, and two races later Rosenblum joined them after Midnight Disguise won.

"I have such respect for them as breeders," said Rosenblum. "They've been mentors."

Holiday Disguise's next start might come in the seven-furlong, \$500,000 Kettel One Ballerina Stakes (G1, Aug. 25) at Saratoga, a race that Rosenblum, a former dancer, has always wanted to win.

"She's a fighter, and she's darn good," said the owner. "If she comes back as sound and as wonderfully as she has, we've got big plans." 🐾

Feeling Bossy goes wire to wire in the Mount Vernon

Michael Dubb
takes both Showcase
turf stakes in very
different manners

Many Ways

OWNER MICHAEL DUBB SWEPT the turf races for older horses at Belmont Park's Big Apple Showcase for New York-breds May 28, but the wins couldn't have come in more dissimilar ways.

He won the Mount Vernon Stakes with a mare he recently claimed. Dubb then won the Kingston Stakes with a horse purchased at auction as a yearling. One was a tight finish, the other by a comfortable margin. He won one with a longshot, the other as the favorite; one on the lead, one with a closer. He owns one of his winners outright, the other in partnership.

Regardless of the circumstances, Dubb won three of the four stakes races he entered, and his turf-farmers brought him two of them.

In the one-mile Mount Vernon, run on a "good" Widener turf course, 8-1 third choice Feeling Bossy and Irad Ortiz Jr. went to the front and got to the rail, leading the field of seven through leisurely fractions of :24.26 and :48.77, establishing a two-length lead over War Canoe. The graded stakes-winning Fifty Five, the even-money favorite, set up mid-pack with jockey Javier Castellano unhurried through the early going.

As Feeling Bossy's lead diminished in deep stretch, Castellano tried to get Fifty Five inside, making a bold move between horses that caused his mount to check and lose some momentum. As the field headed to the wire, Fifty Five was able to gain steady ground on Feeling Bossy, but the latter held on in a "where's the wire?" finish

by a diminishing neck.

“Of course, I was nervous,” said Dubb in the winner’s circle. “That was the horse to beat. I thought she was in a league of her own.”

Dubb claimed Feeling Bossy for \$62,500 at Belmont last October, running her once—in the Ticonderoga Stakes during the fall’s Showcase Day—before giving her the winter off.

“I wanted to freshen her up for New York-bred turf stakes,” he explained. “I was specifically looking for a filly to run

in New York-bred turf races. I thought she was going to need a race, but credit to Irad: He saw the opening, and he saw that nobody went for the lead. She was fit enough to gut out a mile against a really good horse.”

He credited Ortiz and trainer Jason Servis for the horse’s win.

“All I did was point and click,” he said. “Jason and Irad did the work.”

“She doesn’t rate,” said the rider. “She took charge and took me the whole way; she made me feel like she’d work the

whole way, and when I asked her turning for home, she was there for me.”

“We also got some racing luck,” added Dubb, noting Fifty Five’s trouble coming around the turn.

Bred by Emily Wygod, Feeling Bossy is out of the Kris S. mare Keep the Feeling and by New York-based stallion Courageous Cat, who stands at Questroyal North for \$6,000. Grade 1-winning Courageous Cat was campaigned by Wygod’s parents, Marty and Pam Wygod.

Feeling Bossy is a half sister to two six-figure earners.

“She’s a hard-hitting New York-bred,” Dubb said of the veteran of 16 races lifetime, seven of them wins. “They put her in a claimer in October thinking nobody would take her, but I’m very patient and it worked out great.”

An added bonus was her sire, said Dubb.

“I go to the New York-bred dinner every April, and there’s a real camaraderie,” he said. “It’s good to keep it all in the family, and I’m so proud of the job she did.”

PLAN COMES THROUGH

As the horses headed into the far turn in the one-mile Kingston, there was concern in announcer Larry Collmus’ voice as he noted that odds-on favorite Offering Plan was last and being urged by Castellano.

He needn’t have worried.

Breaking from post six, 6-year-old Offering Plan raced just off the rail and near-last for much of the race, at times a dozen or more lengths off the pace. Castellano has ridden the horse in 10 of his last 12 races, and while he seemed well aware of what the son of Spring At Last was capable of, Offering Plan didn’t exactly win the race the easy way.

Making up ground speedily, Castellano and Offering Plan swung six-wide coming into the stretch, joining a van-guard of horses that suggested a blanket finish. Offering Plan was having none of that, though, pulling ahead in the final

strides to win by 1¾ lengths.

“Just break and let him be comfortable,” said Castellano of the instructions trainer Chad Brown’s assistant Whit Beckman gave before the race. “I don’t want you to drag him back, and I don’t want you to send.’ That’s what I did.”

“It’s a little bit nerve-racking at the three-eighths pole,” said Beckman. “He looked like he wanted to back up, but as soon as he got over and switched leads, I knew he had a clear dead aim on them with the pretty salty fractions up there.”

Dubb owns Offering Plan in partnership with Sol Kumin’s Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith. Dubb and Kumin purchased Offering Plan as a 2-year-old at the 2014 Ocala Breeders’ Sales’ April auction, paying \$135,000 for him. He had sold as a yearling for \$32,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale in 2013, purchased by Summer Mayberry. Bred by C.W. Swann and Cygnet Farm, he’s out of the unraced Street Cry mare Rosalie Road. Offering Plan is her only foal to race.

With the Kingston win, Offering Plan has a record of 7-3-3 from 19 starts and has earned \$572,923. He’s won at 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 and won his first race off his winter layoff every year.

His connections considered running him at Pimlico two weeks ago but on the advice of Brown decided to keep him at home where he’d be the favorite.

“We leave everything to him,” said Dubb. “I just show up and take pictures.”

Though Offering Plan is graded stakes-placed, Dubb sees him staying in state-bred company for the time being and hopes to keep the horse running for the foreseeable future.

“Really good trainers can campaign a horse and get you a half-dozen quality starts,” observed the owner, “and leave some soap on the bar, as Woody Stephens used to say.”

Though Belmont had been pelted by rain the previous day, Dubb was unconcerned about the condition of the turf,

given Offering Plan’s success in running on good or yielding tracks. He won the Kingston last year over yielding ground.

Describing as “surreal” winning three stakes races on the day, Dubb seemed as pleased to win on Showcase Day at Belmont as he is winning graded stakes races. Last month he and Kumin (along with The Elkstone Group and

Bethlehem Stables) teamed up to win the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) with Monomoy Girl, and Dubb said Offering Plan was among the first horses Kumin bought when he got into racing.

“I’m not invested at the level he is, but we have a lot of fun together,” said Dubb. “We’ve had a grand old time from the very beginning with horses like this.” 🐾

Midnight Disguise gets second win for mare Thin Disguise; Michael Dubb strikes with Analyze the Odds

Round Midnight

THE HUSBAND AND WIFE TEAM of Dr. Joan Taylor and Dr. William Wilmot not only have an astute eye for putting a Thoroughbred together but also understand the tell-tale signs of their runners on the racetrack.

As the field for the seven-furlong \$125,000 Bouwerie Stakes moved midway on the far turn, Taylor and Wilmot were already clued in to the fact their homebred Midnight Disguise, a 17.2-hand daughter of Midnight Lute, was about to make her presence felt, despite racing in eighth position in the field of nine New York-bred sophomore fillies.

Spinning six-wide into the stretch—after tracking an opening half-mile in :45.34—Midnight Disguise took the better part of a furlong through the lane to get her immense frame into high gear. But the moment she did, beneath jockey Jose Ortiz, everyone else at Belmont Park knew what her breeder/owners had surmised some 400 yards prior—that this talented filly was going to win in freight train-like fashion.

Midnight Disguise rumbled through a final eighth in :12.53 to post a dominating $\frac{3}{4}$ -length victory in 1:22.86.

Less than an hour earlier, her half sister, Holiday Disguise (by Harlan's Holiday), also bred by Taylor and Wilmot, had captured the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes by a fast-closing nostril.

Out of the Yes It's True mare Thin Disguise, both fillies are trained by Linda Rice.

"I'm feeling absolutely elated," said Taylor, while en route to the winner's circle. "This wasn't her best distance. But she's versatile—six furlongs, seven furlongs, a mile, over a mile. What a filly! A real Horatio Alger story (of perseverance). We never thought she'd make the races because she's so big. I'm just so proud of her. I know her personally and raised her on the farm. So I feel like I can talk to her in the paddock to calm her down. She's really smart."

Earlier this year Midnight Disguise, who wore blinkers for the first time in the Bouwerie, triumphed in the open company Busher and Busanda stakes, before running fourth in the Gazelle Stakes (G2).

Devin Wilmot, the breeders' son, also

owns part of Midnight Disguise, who has won five of seven starts and has earned \$347,600.

"We got a patient ride today and didn't get her bottled-up. That's the secret to this filly. She's got such a big stride it doesn't feel like she's going fast. But as (jockey) Jose (Ortiz) said,

'She covers a lot of ground. That she's a force,'" said Bill Wilmot, who as a trainer captured the 1975 Metropolitan Handicap (G1) with Gold and Myrrh. "I think the blinkers really sharpened her up, kept her a little more in touch with the field. It feels like she's back (to her best). Hopefully, with some luck, we're looking at the Mother Goose (Stakes, G2, June 30) next."

Zilla Racing Stables' English Soul (by English Channel), from the barn of trainer Ray Handal, was second. Tic Stables' Split Time (by Take Charge Indy), another Rice-trainee, finished third.

The Bouwerie (original spelling) is named in honor of the Bowery—a street and neighborhood in the southern portion of the borough of Manhattan. Bouwerie is derived from the Dutch word for "farm." The famed Bull's Head Tavern, where Gen. George Washington stopped for refreshments on his way to watch British troops sail home, was in the Bowery—which rivaled Broadway as New York City's main thoroughfare up until the late 19th century.

Perfect Analysis

If you hear people talking about the smartest guy in the room, you don't need to search too hard. They're probably referring to owner Michael Dubb.

Dubb again displayed his dutiful work ethic (he studies races for two hours most nights) and brilliance for scouting horse flesh when he claimed Analyze the Odds (by Overanalyze) from owner Mike Repole for \$80,000 April 20.

"I thought this horse wanted to go long," said Dubb. "I claimed him for the Saratoga two-turn race (the Aug. 24 Albany Stakes), and the Finger Lakes two-turn race (the July 21 New York Derby). He was doing well enough (for new trainer Jason Servis), so we figured what the hell. Let's take a shot in (the Mike Lee)."

The trio of races constitute the Big Apple Triple. Last year Analyze the Odds won the New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes, showing a definite affinity for the track.

In the \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes, a seven-furlong event for sophomores,

Analyze the Odds sat a reserved trip in seventh-position early on, after breaking alertly beneath jockey Junior Alvarado. The opening half-mile was raced in a

contentious :45.67, before Analyze the Odds, who found himself forced six-wide into the sandy stretch and suddenly trailing his seven rivals, began to gather

serious momentum.

Morning Breez (by Morning Line)—owned by John Caputo, Lady DelPo, and The Boys Racing—forged to the lead at the eighth pole for Javier Castellano and opened up a daylight advantage on the field.

But Analyze the Odds, under a full head of steam, unleashed a furious late rally. Covering significant ground with a succession of long and powerful strides, Analyze the Odds surged to the front in the shadow of the wire to post a three-quarter-length victory.

“The assistant (to Jason Servis) told me he was probably going to break sharp,” said Alvarado. “He told me, ‘I don’t want you to send. If you send, he’s probably going to stop. Just break and let him be comfortable.’ So that’s what I did. And in the end when I asked him for run he was there for me.”

The final time was 1:22.58.

Bred by Lansdowne Thoroughbreds, Analyze the Odds, who is out of The Sense Angel, by Mineshaft, has won four of 11 starts with earnings of \$328,706.

“We just wanted to get a piece today,” said Dubb. “I never dreamed that piece would be the big piece. Jason Servis has really done an incredible job with this horse.”

Morning Breez, trained by Carlos Martin, was the solid runner-up in the Mike Lee. Bred by Hart Farm & Rhapsody Farm, the consistent colt has hit the board in eight of nine starts (9-2-3-3), including five state-bred stakes.

My Purple Haze Stables’ Retonova, a gelded son of Boys At Tosconova, finished third for trainer Chris Englehart.

For the second consecutive outing, Sunrise Stables’ homebred A True Giant (by Frost Giant), an impressive winner in his lone start, was a temperamental scratch at the gate.

The Mike Lee is named for the former editor and sportswriter of the Long Island Press, a position which he held for more than 40 years. Lee was also recognized as a humanitarian and community advocate. 🐾

STARS OF THE 'EARLY FUND' YEARS

New York-bred Fio Rito winning the grade 1 Whitney in Saratoga

THE NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE passed a law in 1973 which for the most part pertained to Off-Track Betting. Included in this legislation was the establishment of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

The Fund provided for the encouragement of breeding in the State, funded by “horse racing associations or corporations, 10% of the breaks derived from on track wagers or off-track wagers, as the case may be...”

Although through the years this law has been extensively amended, it nevertheless remains one of the most important statutes in the history of Thorough-

bred racing in New York.

The first prominent horse to benefit from this law was Fio Rito (1975; Dreaming Native—Seagret, by Sea Charger), bred and owned by Ray Le Cesse and trained by Mike Ferraro.

Le Cesse was a building contractor from Rochester who originally got involved in racing Standardbreds with his brother as a hobby. Eventually he began

concentrating on cheap Thoroughbreds, running at nearby Finger Lakes Race Track. He asked his brother to go in with him, but his brother declined.

Le Cesse purchased 28 acres of land about one mile from Finger Lakes and built a racetrack to be used as a training center. One day a friend asked Le Cesse if he could use his training complex to conduct an auction of New York-breds. Le Cesse agreed and went to the auction to observe the sale. He occasionally made bids to drive up the price, and unfortunately, or so it seemed at the time,

he was the high bidder of \$2,300 for a mare named Seagret who was in foal to the deceased stallion Dreaming Native. Both the dam and the sire were former \$1,500 claiming horses. The resultant foal was named Fio Rito after Le Cesse's friend, who was a band leader.

For the first four years of his racing career, Fio Rito made a considerable amount of money by racing in New York-bred races at Finger Lakes and New York Racing Association tracks, enriched by money from the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. Although he had a slow beginning as a 2-year-old in 1977, winning just once in nine starts and earning \$11,325, he became a money machine during his next three years, earning \$64,056; \$55,240; and \$192,309 from 1978-80, respectively.

All his stakes wins were races restricted to New York-breds, including the 1978 Albany Handicap and New York Derby; the 1980 Genesee Valley Breeders' Handicap, Hudson Handicap, Bertram F. Bongard Handicap, and Wadsworth Memorial Cup; and the Joe Palmer Stakes and Alex M. Robb Stakes.

The Wadsworth was notable because he was assigned a punishing 138 pounds and won by 5½ lengths.

In his open company stakes debut, he was entered in the Queens County Handicap at Aqueduct on Nov. 27, 1980, as the 7-2 favorite. He finished fifth but was the highweight at 120 pounds, conceding eight pounds to the winner, Fool's Prayer.

In early summer 1981 Fio Rito's name was known to few race fans outside of New York State. This changed dramatically on the first of August when he won the Whitney Handicap (G1) at Saratoga as a 10-1 shot. Among the horses he faced were Rokeby Stable's Winter's Tale, the 3-2 favorite and highweight at 121 pounds; Ring of Light; The Liberal Member; and Noble Nashua.

Fio Rito's chances dimmed when he broke out of the gate prematurely. Luck-

ily for Fio Rito's handlers and fans, assistant starter Jim Tsitsirgos held onto the reins, and after dragging Tsitsirgos several yards, Fio Rito stopped and was reloaded into the gate. With regular rider Leslie Hulet in the irons, he led the field in his usual front-running style and held off the hard-charging Winter's Tale to win by a neck.

Writing in *The Blood-Horse*, Larry Owens stated: "Not since the upstart New York Mets won the championship of baseball have the sports enthusiasts of the Empire State had as much reason for provincial pride."

Two weeks later Fio Rito won against open company again, taking the Michigan Mile and One-Eighth Handicap (G2) at Detroit as the 4-5 favorite.

All fairy tales have to come to an end, and Fio Rito's ended Sept. 5 when he finished seventh in Belmont Park's Wood-

when he started falling back. It was later disclosed that he had injured an ankle during the race, and he was retired to what turned out to be an unsuccessful career as a stallion.

NASKRA'S BREEZE

Naskra's Breeze (1977; Naskra—Tropical Heat, by Tropical Breeze), a gelding, was bred by Chester C. Davis' Milfer Farm near Unadilla. Davis, an attorney, served as the legal counsel for the New York Thoroughbred Breeders' Association. Naskra's Breeze's owner was Dr. Joe Crotty and Joe Morrissey's Broadmoor Stable, and he was trained by Hall of Famer Phil Johnson.

After placing in his lone start in 1979, Naskra's Breeze had a successful 1980 season, winning five of 12 outings, all against New York-bred competition, and earning \$112,832.

ward Stakes (G1). Facing him were such stars as Pleasant Colony, the winner as the 9-5 favorite; Amber Pass; the mare Relaxing; Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Temperance Hill; and Winter's Tale.

Fio Rito led until the half-mile pole,

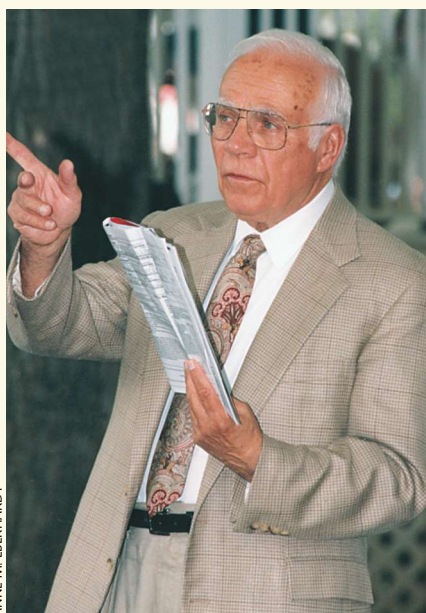
Midway through his 1981 season his career took a sharp turn upward when he won his first stakes start on the turf, the West Point Handicap for New York-breds at Saratoga. Although many would credit Johnson for the switch to

grass, Johnson explained that he came to Saratoga looking for long races on the dirt. When the right race never came up, he decided, on a whim, to try the turf.

Naskra's Breeze had found a new home. He followed his successful turf debut with a win in Belmont's Brighton Beach Handicap (G3T). The purse money was taken away 16 months later, and Johnson was suspended for 60 days, following a highly disputed ruling by the State Racing and Wagering Board that a tranquilizer had been found in Naskra's Breeze's system. After the Brighton Beach, Naskra's Breeze lost his last three stakes races of the season, ending the year with earnings of \$139,207.

In his 5-year-old campaign Naskra's Breeze showed his ability on the turf that had been hinted at the year before. After winning the Kingston Handicap for New York-breds, he traveled to Atlantic City to run in the United Nations Handicap (G1T). Despite what *The Blood-Horse* correspondent Don Zamarelli had described as "one of the best assembled fields for it," Naskra's Breeze, ridden by regular jockey Jean-Luc Samyn, won by five lengths at 5-1.

His next race was an eighth-place finish in the Budweiser Million (G1T) at Arlington on a hard surface that the *New York Times*' Steve Crist stated was not to the gelding's liking. On Sept. 19 he finished second in the grade 2 Manhattan Handicap, six lengths behind Sprink,

conceding six pounds to that rival. Two weeks later he snapped his modest two-race losing streak by winning the Man o' War Stakes (G1T), as the 2-1 favorite, narrowly defeating Sprink while taking advantage of equal weights and an extra furlong. Finishing third was fellow New York-bred and second favorite at 3-1 Thunder Puddles.

After the Man o' War, Crist declared that Naskra's Breeze had become "the first New York-bred horse with a legitimate chance of winning an Eclipse Award" (New York-bred Silent Screen had been named the best 2-year-old male

of 1969, but that was two years before it was named the Eclipse Awards).

Dreams of an Eclipse Award vanished when Naskra's Breeze ended his season, and his career, by finishing second in the 12-furlong Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) at Aqueduct, 10th as the 3-1 second favorite in the second division of the Hollywood Turf Cup, and second in a handicap race at Aqueduct. His 1982 record was seven wins and two places in 14 starts, with earnings of \$448,793.

CUPECOY'S JOY

Cupecoy's Joy (1979; Northerly—Lady Abla, by Alsina) was a filly bred by Robert Perez, a native of Argentina who owned an asphalt manufacturing business in Queens. She was foaled at Anna Lisa Coleman's Leeward Farm near Stanfordville, a hamlet approximately halfway between Albany and Poughkeepsie. Cupecoy's Joy was owned by Perez and his racing partner, Robert de Filippis, under the name Ri-Ma-Ro Stable. She was trained by Alfredo Callejas, another Argentinian.

Her 2-year-old season was limited to New York-bred races, with her only stakes win coming in the East View at Aqueduct. She began the 1982 season Jan. 1 by finishing second against open company in the six-furlong Rosetown Stakes at Aqueduct. After two wins and two places in sprint stakes, she stepped up in both class and distance when she traveled to Latonia Park to race in the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Jim Beam Spiral Stakes for Triple Crown hopefuls. Her gritty third-place finish was enough to encourage Perez to enter her in the Kentucky Derby (G1). The only filly in the 19-horse race, she was one of the field horses at 8-1. She led for a mile before fading to finish 10th. Finishing 14th was another New York-bred, Royal Roberto.

Despite her showing in the Derby, Perez had planned to enter her in the Preakness Stakes (G1), but she was scratched when Perez resented the attitude of Maryland Jockey Club officials.

Two and a half weeks after the Derby,

Cupecoy's Joy finished second against New York-bred males in the Albany Handicap. Five days later she got the attention of racing fans outside of New York when she won the one-mile Acorn Stakes (G1), the first leg in New York's Filly Triple Crown. Facing most of the leading 3-year-old fillies in the country as an 8-1 chance, she won by 2¾

lengths, leading all the way under her regular jockey Angel Santiago. Her time of 1:34½ was the fastest in the 54-year history of that event.

Her next race was the second leg of the Filly Triple Crown, the 1½-mile Mother Goose Stakes (G1). Bettors took heed of her outstanding performance in the Acorn and made her the 6-5 favor-

ite. She justified those odds, winning by three-quarters of a length without being extended by Santiago.

William H. Rudy, enthused correspondent of *The Blood-Horse*, wrote: "Cupecoy's Joy again had made a parade out of a major contest between the best fillies in training in New York."

Befitting her fame, she was on the cover of the June 26 issue.

The last leg of the Filly Triple Crown, the 1½-mile Coaching Club American Oaks (G1), was on June 26. An item in the June 5 New York *Times* cautioned that "Cupecoy's Joy, as brilliantly fast as she is, may have a great deal of trouble stretching her speed over a mile and a half in the Oaks. Christmas Past would probably have passed her in another eighth of a mile...(in the Mother Goose)."

The article was particularly prescient, as Cupecoy's Joy lost the Oaks to Christmas Past by six lengths.

The Oaks was the last win of her career while Christmas Past, whom Cupecoy's Joy had beaten in the Acorn and in the Mother Goose, would go on to win the Eclipse Award for 3-year-old fillies.

On July 24, with Antonio Graell aboard, Cupecoy's Joy finished last in the second division of the Sheepshead Bay Handicap (G2T). Despite the fact she had never run on the turf and was facing older horses, the bettors made her the 2-1 favorite. After the race it was discovered she had sustained a severe cut to her left foreleg that required surgery. She raced twice more that fall, finishing last in the grade 2 Meadowlands Cup and sixth against New York-breds Nov. 24 in the one-mile Iroquois Stakes.

Her 1982 record was four wins, five seconds, and one third from 14 starts, with earnings of \$286,146.

In April 1983, Perez announced Cupecoy's Joy had never fully recovered from the injury she had sustained in the Sheepshead Bay, and she was retired from racing. She went on to produce one stakes-placed runner from her 11 named foals, Sicilian Boy, by Perez' Senor Speedy. 🐾

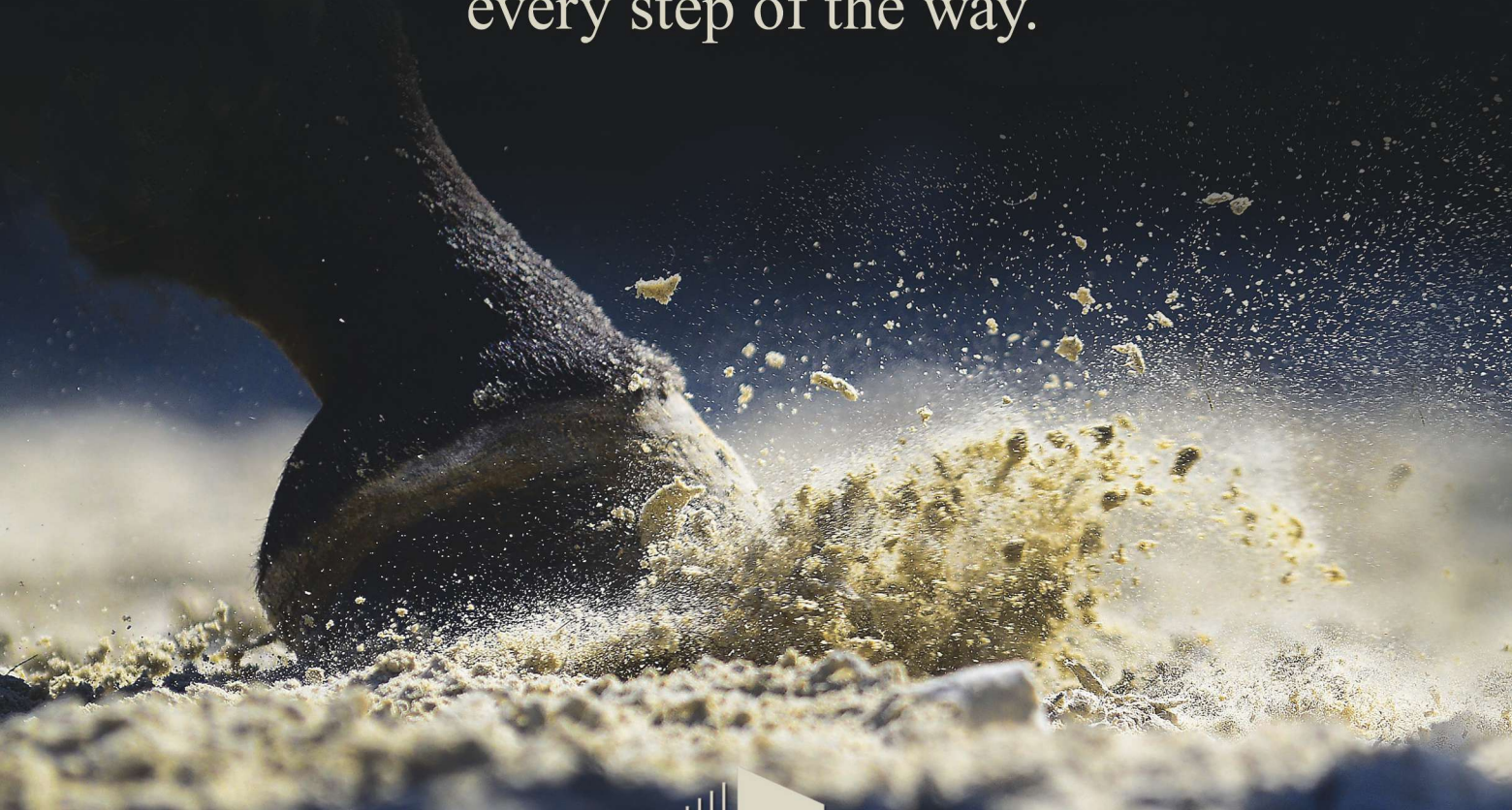
