I'm happy and proud to report that both of New York Thoroughbred Breeders' breeders' bills passed both houses of the legislature before the end of the current session in Albany. They now will be sent to the Governor for his signature this summer.

These pieces of legislation—for convenience the “Fund Cap Extender” and “Purse Enrichment” bills—represent modifications of Fund law. Given all the other headline-grabbing activity in Albany surrounding the governor's legislation on expanded gaming and other issues, it seems worthwhile to take a little time to highlight the background of these bills and their significance. First the “Fund Cap Extender” bill.

The law that brought the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund into being four decades ago mandated a “cap” on breeders' awards, permitting the Fund to distribute only (up to) 50% of its revenue on this category of award. Changes in the industry ultimately made this cap insufficient.

While on-track pari-mutuel wagering steadily declined over the years leading to a reduction in the Fund's revenue stream, New York-breds kept earning more and more in awards, in part due to an increase in the number of restricted races. Inevitably the Fund began to struggle to pay breeders' awards at the advertised rates. In 2008, for example, there was a \$1.6 million gap between what the Fund could pay

and the advertised rate of awards, leaving breeders with only 80.89% of what their horses had earned.

Several years ago NYTB went to the legislature to get the 50% cap on breeders' awards raised to 65%, which would allow the Fund to pay advertised breeders' awards in full. Lawmakers passed the bill but scheduled it to sunset after one year due to anticipated video lottery terminal revenue. In the VLT era, however, pressure on breeders' awards still exists, mainly because awards have increased along with purses. Therefore, each year from 2010 to the present, NYTB has lobbied successfully to have the “Fund cap” extended by another year. Ideally the change would become permanent, but lawmakers are unwilling to do this.

The “Purse Enrichment” bill, for its part, will create new opportunities for New York-breds to benefit from Fund revenue. Every year, by law, the Fund board of directors may vote to distribute money to the New York race-tracks for purses, with 60% of the total going to Finger Lakes and 40% to NYRA. This money must be used by the tracks exclusively for New York-bred restricted races. On average the Fund distributes \$1.5 million in purse enrichment.

Purse enrichment makes a meaningful contribution to racing at Finger Lakes by funding their state-bred stakes program. Many of you remember that in 2011, when the Fund was unable to pay purse enrichment to the tracks, Finger Lakes was forced to cut nine stakes from the racing program. At NYRA on the other hand, where \$30 million is distributed every year in purses for restricted races from

a \$150 million purse account, the Fund's \$600,000 is just a drop in the bucket. For several years NYTB and NYRA have been seeking a way to use this money in a substantive and meaningful way.

The Purse Enrichment Bill, which passed the Assembly in 2012 but made it through both houses in 2013, allows the Fund's purse enrichment money to be used with no restriction on the type of race involved. These Funds may be used, for example, to add New York Stallion Stakes races and/or offer bonuses for New York-breds running in open company. In other words, this tweak will give us the opportunity to give breeders and owners real bang at NYRA for the Fund's purse enrichment buck.

Finally, one provision of the recently passed expanded gaming legislation to be presented to voters as a referendum in November represents a huge win for breeders. A percentage of wagers made by New York State residents using out-of-state advanced deposit wagering outlets such as TwinSpires, TVG, and Xpressbet (ADWs), is now earmarked for the breeding industry. Based on an estimated \$400 million in handle annually, the Fund would receive \$1.2 million each year. This legislation, which has been a long time in the making, in effect creates a new revenue source for the Fund.

The NYTB lobbyists and I have been working with lawmakers and their staffs in Albany since the beginning of the year to get these bills passed and breeders' interests looked after, and I find it extremely gratifying to see all that hard work come to fruition in ways that will benefit everyone. 🐎

**LEGISLATIVE
UPDATE:****NYTB's Initiatives
Make Good**

Both of New York Thoroughbred Breeders' major initiatives for 2013 met with success, passing both houses during the session that ended June 21.

For the fourth consecutive year lawmakers passed NYTB's Fund Cap Extender Bill, which extends for another year the ability of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund to utilize 65% of its revenue on breeders' awards. The measure, which was scheduled to sunset Oct. 28, ensures that the Fund continues to keep pace with the advertised of rates breeders' awards.

Both houses also passed NYTB's Purse Enrichment Bill, an entirely new piece of legislation. Currently the \$1.5 million of purse enrichment money allocated to the racetracks by the fund goes into the tracks' purse accounts for use in restricted races. The bill opens up the option of making this money available for a variety of uses at the fund's discretion, including, for example, additional New York Stallion Series races and/or additional bonuses for New York-breds.

"The NYTB lobbyists and I have been working non-stop with lawmakers and their staffs in Albany since the beginning of the year to get these bills passed on behalf of breeders and owners," said NYTB executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo. "It is extremely gratifying to see all that hard work come to fruition with results that will benefit everyone."

**Christopher Kay Named
CEO of NYRA**

Christopher Kay, a former chief operating officer for Toys 'R' Us, was hired as chief executive officer of the New York Racing Association after a unanimous vote of the board of directors June 18.

Kay, who took over July 1, fills a spot that has been vacant for about a year. Former CEO Charles Hayward was fired in 2012 in connection with NYRA's failing to follow a state-mandated reduction in the pari-mutuel takeout race on some exotic wagers.

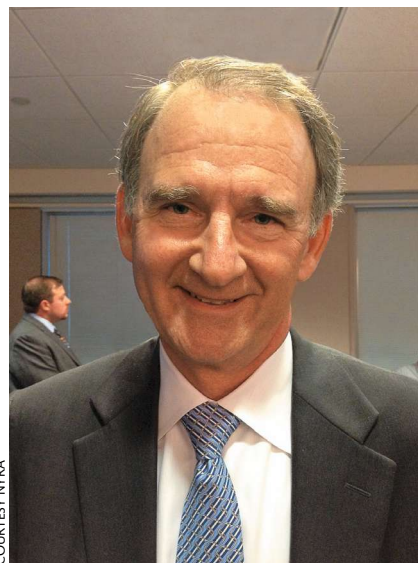
NYRA board chair David Skorton called Kay a "dream candidate" and praised his high ethical standards, creativity, and "even-keeled" temperament. Skorton said Kay had demonstrated effectiveness in "finding solutions in complex situations."

Issues facing NYRA include the future of Aqueduct Racetrack, the re-privatization of the organization following a three-year state takeover, and the possible opening of full-scale casinos in the state.

The 60-year-old Kay comes to NYRA most recently from The Trust for Public Land, where, as COO, he oversaw the operations of the land conservation organization's headquarters and 37 field offices.

Previously Kay had been a consultant to Universal Parks & Resorts, serving as managing director of international business development. From 2001-06, he was COO for Toys 'R' Us, and prior to that he was the retailer's executive vice president of operations and general counsel.

While Kay has never worked in the racing industry, he said he "fell in love" with the sport when he went to the track for the first time at age 19. A graduate of the University of Missouri and the Duke University School of Law, Kay attended

high school in St. Louis, Mo., and made frequent summer trips to Cahokia Downs, which was located across the river from St. Louis.

Approximately 100 candidates had been considered for the job, according to John Keitt of RSR Partners, the firm the board engaged to conduct the search. NYRA's search committee comprised Skorton and board members Bobby Flay, Stuart Janney III, Earle Mack, and Jane Rosenthal.

Kay said one of his priorities is to hire someone with racing experience to oversee day-to-day operations. Other projects are enhancing the experience for customers at the track and recruiting new fans; working with board members and state government on re-privatizing the organization; and improving the purses and quality of racing at Belmont Park, Aqueduct, and Saratoga Race Course.



Gambling Expansion Bill Passes

Legislation legalizing commercial casino gambling in New York was passed after a flurry of negotiations involving lawmakers and the administration of Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

The bill, which requires approval by voters in a statewide referendum this fall, seeks to ensure some order of protection for racetrack casinos in the state through a complex series of tax breaks, revenue-

sharing formula changes, and creating a floor set at 2013 levels for payments to purse and breeding fund programs.

The plan calls for four full casinos in three upstate regions and two video lottery terminal parlors on Long Island. Senate Racing Committee chairman John Bonacic said lawmakers are committed to not undermining the nine racetrack casinos scattered around the state.

The Cuomo administration said the measure includes a provision that would let one VLT facility in each of three upstate regions if the November referendum is rejected by voters statewide.

No precise locations were announced for the Long Island facilities, but they would be operated by the off-track betting corporations owned by the Suffolk and Nassau county governments. Each facility would be limited to a maximum of 1,000 VLTs.

The casino portion of the bill allows four casinos in three upstate regions: the southern tier area near Binghamton, the

greater Albany area including Saratoga Springs, and the lower-to-mid Hudson Valley including the Catskill Mountains. No region can have more than two of the total of four authorized casinos, and most officials believe the Catskills could end up with two of the facilities.

The agreement includes language authorizing racing associations, franchises, and OTB corporations to apply to the gaming commission to offer advance deposit wagering. The entities can also enter into partnerships and joint ventures for account wagering programs.

The casinos would pay the state 37%-45% of gross gaming revenue. The levels vary depending on which geographic area a casino locates.

Those numbers are up from the 25% Cuomo originally proposed. An upfront franchise fee payment, as well as which developers win casino rights, will be left to a selection panel that will report to the gaming commission.

Purse Increase for N.Y.-Breds, Stakes

Purses for races restricted to New York-breds will receive a \$5,000 purse increase for the final two weeks of the meet, June 26 through July 14.

Also, all overnight stakes will get an increase to \$100,000 for the final two weeks. Those races had been worth \$85,000 or \$90,000 depending on distance. Purses for open company races will remain the same.

Lovely Syn Injured, Retired

Joemar Racing Stables' homebred Lovely Syn, an unbeaten New York-bred 3-year-old filly, suffered a career-ending injury at Belmont Park June 22. The daughter of Freud—Lemon Drop's Love, by Lemon Drop Kid, underwent successful surgery the following day.

Lovely Syn fractured a sesamoid bone in her left foreleg during a half-mile workout over the main track.

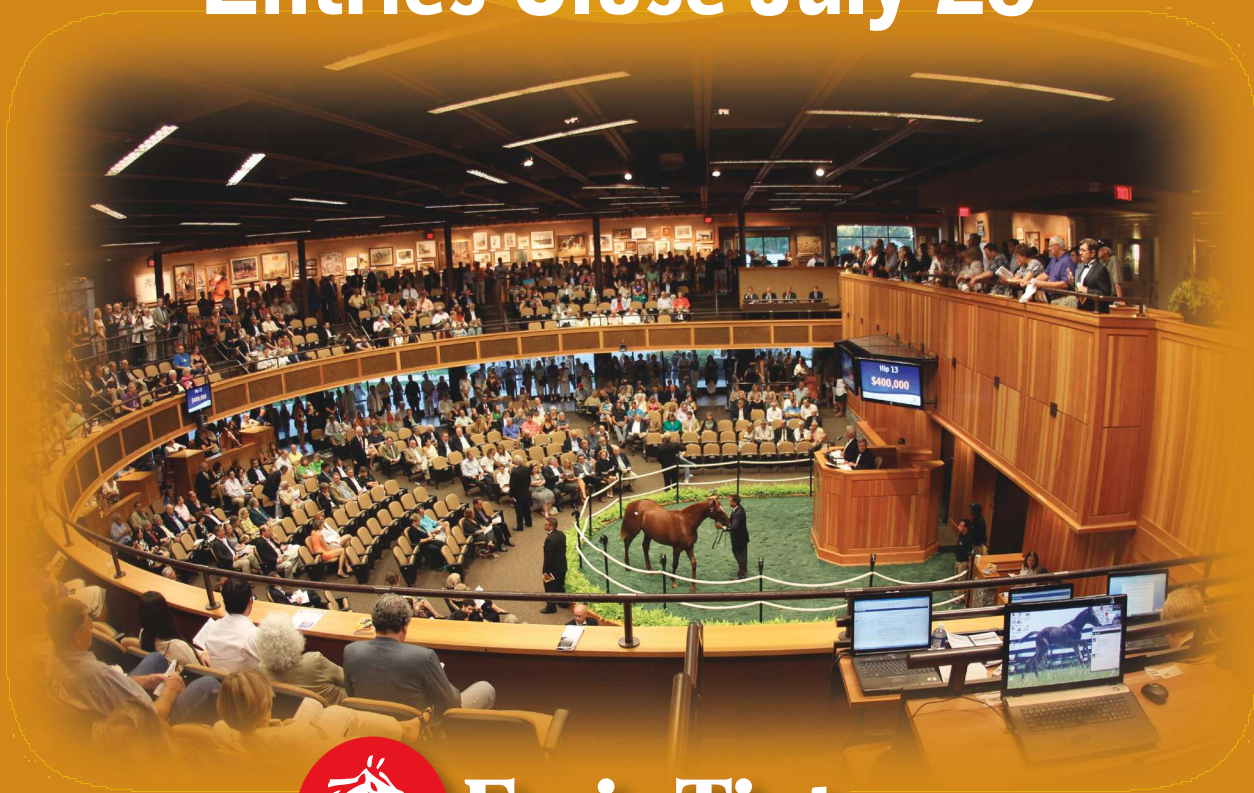

A Quick Read

Streaking Readtheprospectus runs off with the Commentator

Ranked among the most accomplished New York-breds in recent memory, Commentator won Saratoga's Whitney Handicap (gr. I) in 2005 and in 2008 for owner Tracy Farmer and trainer Nick Zito. The chestnut gelding by Distorted Humor was retired in 2009, his final start a third-place finish in an attempt to earn a third Whitney win at age 8.

A fan favorite, Commentator was honored with a race worth \$150,000 in his name at Belmont Park June 1, the headline race on the inaugural

Big Apple Showcase card, a spring counterpart to the popular and successful New York Showcase Day in the fall at Belmont. Both events feature a day of stakes races for New York-breds.

Commentator won his first stakes start, the Perryville Stakes at Keeneland in October 2004, and fittingly, his namesake race was won by another New York-bred making his stakes debut. Readtheprospectus notched his sixth consecutive victory in winning the 1¹/₁₆-mile Commentator Handicap, and before summer's

end he may well be on his way to following in Commentator's footsteps to contest an open company graded stakes race at the Spa.

Though the owners of the 4-year-old bay gelding have their sights set on another state-bred stakes race, the \$250,000 Empire Classic Oct. 19, they know that he's likely going to have to take on graded stakes company to get there. William H. Lawrence, who owns Readtheprospectus in partnership with Klaravich Stables, joked after the Commentator win, "They're not going to write a

non-winners of seven for him.”

Purchased by Patrice Miller for Klaravich and Lawrence, Readtheprospectus is a son of Read the Footnotes out of the Affirmed mare Near Bethany; he cost \$30,000 at the 2011 Ocala Breeders’ Sales Co.’s April sale of 2-year-olds in training. After breaking his maiden in his fourth attempt, he has done nothing but win, a streak Lawrence attributes to Chad Brown’s skillful training.

“Chad’s the story on this horse,” said Lawrence. “He’s doing to horses what maybe a handful of trainers can do—taking a good horse, keeping him good, and making him better.”

Both Lawrence and Brown are originally from upstate New York, Lawrence from Latham and Brown from Mechanicville, which is also the hometown of the breeder of Readtheprospectus, Howard Nolan.

A New York State senator for 20 years, Nolan is a member of the board of directors of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. A longtime owner and breeder, he purchased the dam of Readtheprospectus privately from Questroyal Farm when she was in foal with the Commentator winner.

“I was looking at that time to buy a mare or two,” said Nolan, “and Questroyal had sent out a list of horses they had for sale. I went to the farm to look in particular at five or six of their broodmares.

“Near Bethany had a very good pedigree, and she was a big, good-looking mare, very well-made.”

Near Bethany is out of the multiple stakes winner Choose a Partner, a half sister to Star Choice, who won the 1983 Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) and three other graded stakes. While Nolan had reservations about the mare because she had not to that point produced any successful offspring, her pedigree and her looks convinced him to purchase her.

In the years since the purchase, Near Bethany’s 2007 foal, Rascal

Flatter (by Flatter) has earned nearly \$190,000 from 36 starts; the win in the Commentator pushed Readtheprospectus’ earnings to \$304,280.

Near Bethany is currently in foal to second-year stallion Here Comes Ben (by Street Cry), who won the 2010 Forego Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga, and Nolan has a 2013 half brother to Readtheprospectus by Giant Surprise, whose first crop is on the ground this year.

“He’s a big, good-looking colt,” said Nolan of the foal.

Lawrence indicated Readtheprospectus’ next start is likely to come in the Evan Shipman Handicap for New York-breds July 22 at Saratoga. The challenge will come after that, as there are no other New York-bred stakes races for older horses on the calendar between that and the Empire Classic.

“If he runs well in the Evan Shipman, we’ll think about taking a shot in a bigger race,” said Lawrence. “He looks good for the Empire Classic and he’ll be tough to beat there, but we might try him in a \$750,000 or \$1 million race in the second half of the year. We feel confident with a horse that’s gotten to the winner’s circle so many times, and we think he has a chance to get there with a bigger purse.”

Lawrence is proceeding with caution, though, declining to name any specific races as possibilities, and adding, “We don’t want to run him over his head.”

Lawrence and his partner Seth Klarman purchased the then-colt specifically to take advantage of the New York-bred program.

“We were making a little push to buy New York-breds for obvious reasons,” Lawrence explained. “The purses have finally gotten better in New York, and even better for New York-breds, so that was definitely a factor.”

It’s fair to say that Readtheprospectus has gone beyond his owners’ expectations; even heading into the

Commentator and riding a five-race winning streak, Lawrence was surprised at the public’s response to his horse, who backed him heavily.

“He went off a pretty big favorite, and I didn’t think that would be the case,” Lawrence admitted. “There were some horses in there with better pedigrees and back class, but the bettors were correct.”

The 6-5 favorite tracked the leaders up the backstretch in the Commentator, tangled briefly with Spa City Fever in the stretch, and held off a late-running So Scott to win by 1¼ lengths in a final time of 1:41.17.

“Winning is great and he’s a fun horse,” said Lawrence. “And if he’s healthy, there’s nothing to do but race him because he’s a gelding. Hopefully, he’ll just keep getting better.”

Lawrence isn’t the only one having fun with Readtheprospectus: his breeder is enjoying the ride, too, showing up at several of the horse’s recent starts.

“I had met him a few times,” said Lawrence, referring to Nolan. “He’s probably been in more winner’s circle photos than I have.”

“I tried to follow the horse’s career after I sold him,” said Nolan. “I lost track of him for a while, and then I heard Chad Brown was training him.”

Nolan lives for much of the year in Florida, and in March 2012, he introduced himself to Brown and has followed the horse’s success ever since. Though Klarman and Lawrence were unable to be there for Readtheprospectus’ Commentator win, Nolan was there, in the winner’s circle with his wife.

“He’s probably as excited as we are,” said Lawrence. “The horse is obviously on a nice streak.”

A streak that his connections hope he can maintain, through the summer and the stiffer competition he’s likely to face.

“He’s going to have to tackle the big boys at some point,” Lawrence said. 🐾

Jacked UP

Amberjack wins the first leg of the Big Apple Triple; Lovely Syn brilliant, but career cut short by injury

Peachtree Stable's John Fort admits that he isn't usually in the market for New York-breds, but he also knows a good horse when he sees one. He knew he saw one on the sale grounds prior to the Fasig-Tipton New York preferred sale in August 2011.

“He just towered over all the others in the sale,” said Fort of Amberjack, the chestnut son of Indygo Shiner whom he purchased for \$185,000 from consignor Darby Dan Farm. “He didn’t look much different then than he does now: he’s just a big, strapping, beautifully put-together horse.”

Bred by Dixie Farm and out of the Crafty Friend mare Free as Tristan, Amberjack—named for a type of fish of which Fort is particularly fond—won the first leg of the Big Apple Triple June 1 at Belmont Park, the \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes at seven furlongs.

Amberjack rallied from fifth early to power to a 1³/₄-length win in the Mike Lee, getting the trip in 1:21.64. Weekend Hideaway was second, a length ahead of Smooth Bert.

Earlier this spring the New York Racing Association announced a \$250,000 bonus to the connections of any horse that sweeps the Big Apple Triple: the Mike Lee; the \$150,000 New York Derby at Finger Lakes July 20; and the \$150,000 Albany Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 21.

“Indygo Shiner is a beautiful horse himself from a conformation standpoint,” said Fort, “and this horse looks a little bit like him.”

Winner of four races from 12 starts, including the 2001 Jefferson Cup Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill Downs, Indygo Shiner was hot in early June, with his progeny hitting winner’s circles at Churchill Downs, Golden Gate Fields, Fort Erie, San Isidro, and Hipodromo Argentino de Palermo in the first 10 days of the month.

A half brother to the grade I-placed Associate (Wando), who earned nearly \$250,000 on the track, Amberjack has

three wins from five starts, for earnings of \$158,875. His only off-the-board finish came on New Year’s Day at Gulfstream Park, when he finished 10th.

“That race is a throw-out,” said Fort emphatically. “I don’t know whether he had a reaction to Lasix or he tied up—prior to the race nothing was obvious, but something was wrong internally with him that day. The jockey (Corey Lanerie) said the horse felt really weak under him.”

Eased in that race, Amberjack was off for several months before returning at Belmont in May, where he won a state-bred allowance race going a mile.

“He’s never been sick, never been lame,” said Fort. “There was just something wrong that day in Florida.”

While Fort intends to run the colt next in the New York Derby, he thinks Amberjack is talented enough to compete in open company as well.

“He looks like he’s going to be a fun horse to own,” said Fort. “We’ll see where we can go with him.”

Fort went back to the New York-bred sale in Saratoga last year, coming away with a \$200,000 Awesome Again colt out of Andraste (by Pulpit). Like Amberjack, that colt is trained by Mike Hushion.

And while Fort will be spending

much of the summer at his ranch in Montana, he's got some travel plans for August, with a trip to Saratoga on the itinerary.

"I'll be there," he said, "for the New York-bred sale."

Lovely Freak

Lovely Syn wasn't a hard horse to pick out on the racetrack. First, the 3-year-old bay filly has a striking, nearly all-white face, making her a standout in any crowd.

Second, she was the one about half a racetrack in front of everyone else.

Lovely Syn remained unbeaten when she crushed four rivals by 10¼ lengths in the \$122,500 Bouwerie Stakes on Big Apple Showcase Day. Sadly, though, she suffered a career-ending injury during a workout June 22. She had won her four races by a combined 28¾ lengths.

On the day of the Bouwerie, owner Michael Parisi was at his family's farm in New Jersey, celebrating the end of foaling season with the hard-working farm staff; their last Standardbred foal had been born the night before, and they watched the Bouwerie on television.

"We're thrilled," said Parisi. "Everybody loves that white face."

Parisi breeds and races in the name of Joemar Racing Stables, which was started by his grandfather and named for Parisi's father and aunt, Joe and Marie. Originally a Standardbred farm operator, Parisi's father branched out into Thoroughbreds, and while Parisi himself focuses on Standardbreds, he decided to keep the Thoroughbred part of the business going after his father died in 2008.

Parisi's father bought Lovely Syn's dam, Lemon Drop's Love, as a yearling in 2003 for \$125,000. She raced only once, but her three raced offspring have all won; Lemon Tiger, her 2007 filly by Hold That Tiger, earned \$176,816, and the Bouwerie win pushed Lovely Syn's earnings to \$202,200.

Blazingly fast, Lovely Syn set fractions of :21.95, :44.34, and 1:08.15, running the seven furlongs of the Bouwerie in 1:21.58.

"We think she's a freak," said Parisi after the race. "She's just a standout in New York right now, and I'm really happy with that."

So happy, in fact, that he continued to resist all offers for his homebred filly, even those that came in the

high six figures.

"She's not for sale. Dom doesn't even forward the calls to me anymore," he said, referring to trainer Dominick Schettino.

He intended to keep her in statebred company in 2013, with an eye toward open company for her 4-year-old campaign.

"The money's there," in the statebred program, Parisi said.

Instead, Lovely Syn will begin her broodmare career a tad early.

Parisi said that Schettino was close to his father, and to this day, Parisi and the trainer keep the blinkers that his father's horses wore.

"Our horses still wear them," he said. "They say JSP, for Joseph Salvatore Parisi, so the horses always have a little piece of my father."

Lovely Syn didn't wear the family blinkers, and she didn't need them for people to know who she is. She was the filly with the big white face, the one way out in front of all the rest. 🐾

Saginaw rallies late to win the Affirmed Success Stakes

Show Stealer

Saginaw, the ‘People’s Champion,’ does it again

There’s little doubt who holds the title of the “People’s Champion” on the New York Racing Association’s circuit. It’s Drawing Away Stable and David Jacobson’s Saginaw, who notched his 20th victory in the \$98,000 Affirmed Success Stakes June 1 as part of Big Apple Showcase Day.

A rousing round of applause greeted the 7-year-old gelding at Belmont Park as he was led into the winner’s circle by Ed Boden of Drawing Away Stable. The win was Saginaw’s fourth consecutive victory by a half-length

or less, adding to the excitement and further cementing his will to win in the minds of his fans, competitors, and those who would dare wager against him.

“What a terrific horse. (Jockey) Junior (Alvarado) knows him really well, and gets him to relax out there,” said Boden, whose stable currently has 42 runners and approximately 130 owners across the country. “Last March we claimed him for \$30,000 from Richard Dutrow. We had tried to claim him previously (but lost the shake). David (Jacobson) said we have to go after him again. He’s won



13 of 16 for us and even carried 130 pounds (in his previous race). He's just awesome. The fans here in New York love him. We get phone calls about him and messages on Facebook. He's a horse for the people. He just wants to win."

Saginaw's fortitude was absolutely tested in the 6½-furlong Affirmed Success. Breaking from the tricky rail position in a field of five, the son of Peruvian, out of Devilzene (by Devil's Bag), raced in third position in the early going while being bottled-up on the inside.

Turning for home, Saginaw had slipped back to fourth, racing behind a wall of horses. From that trio of runners to his fore, Fiddlers Afleet (by Northern Afleet) seized the lead with good energy. But Saginaw and Alvarado muscled their way through a small seam to find themselves outside of that one. Through the sandy stretch, Saginaw picked up the pace

to get on even terms, wresting away the lead in the final 70 yards.

The final time was 1:15.39 over a fast track.

Bred by Ted Taylor, Saginaw raised his earnings to \$914,690 in 39 career starts.

"I bred Devilzene to Peruvian every year, because at the time I owned both the mare and the stallion," recounted Taylor. "Saginaw had a full brother, Sipsey (2004), that also looked promising."

Michael Dubb, Michael Imperio, and Gary Aisquith's Fiddlers Afleet finished a game second in the Affirmed Success. Mary and Chester Broman's Mine Over Matter collected the minor spoils in third.

On hand for the trophy presentation were Affirmed Success' connections, owner Al Fried Jr. and trainer Richard Schosberg.

"When you look up Affirmed Success' past performances, it's hard to

come up with a horse with such a diverse running style at that class level," noted Schosberg. "He won grade I turf routes and dirt sprints, and was effective from 3 until he was 9. We're honored to have a race named after him."

Pasaj to the Winner's Circle

Sometimes the best laid plans don't come to fruition—they work out even better, over an entirely different surface. When AnJes Farm sent their Danzig mare, Saintly Scholar, to Smoke Glacken, they were probably hoping for a fast turf sprinter. But after a pair of unplaced starts on the grass, the resulting progeny, Clear Pasaj, is now five for 11 on dirt (including five second-place finishes) after taking the \$100,000 Dancing Renee Handicap for older fillies and mares at seven furlongs.

"She's the first winner out of Saintly Scholar who has brought a lot to

our farm and really helped to solidify our racing program,” said Brinn Dimler, representing AnJes Farm in the winner’s circle. “I think they were hoping to have a turf horse with the Danzig side. But now she’s running on dirt. Her broodmare is the only one we have right now. We have two Scat Daddy fillies out of this mare, and we also have a Rock Hard Ten from this year. (Saintly Scholar) is being bred now to Congrats.”

Saddled by trainer Bruce Levine, Clear Pasaj went gate-to-wire under jockey Jose Ortiz, racing the opening three-quarters of a mile in a pressured 1:09.98. In deep stretch the 4-year-old filly showed she is about more than just speed. She dug in, holding off a furious late charge by Lady On the Run to win by a head in a final time of 1:22.60.

Owned by Jeffrey Tucker and several partners, Lady On the Run, who rallied from last in the field of six, finished second in the Dancing Renee. She has now hit the board in 18 of



her 22 starts. Chester and Mary Broman’s homebred Beautiful But Blue checked in third.

Dancin Renee herself had won 14 of her 21 career starts.

“She deserves a race to be named for her,” said Sanford Bacon, her owner who presented in the winner’s circle. “As a mare she produced a great record. And next year we’d like to bring (her offspring) Risky Rachel back to the races (currently undergoing stem cell work at Ocala) as a 7-year-old and win this one with her.”

NYRA commentator and former jockey Richard Migliore rode both Dancin Renee and Affirmed Success to major stakes wins.

“Dancin Renee had so much natural speed she would put you right into the race. And if you were in front turning for home, she was going to be very tough to get by,” said Migliore, who recently visited both New York racing legends at Michael Blowen’s Old Friends Farm in Kentucky. “Affirmed Success never liked me. He’d try to kick or bite me around the barn (during his racing days). That’s probably because I had to get into him so much to make him run, because I rode him when he was older. But when I saw him there (at Old Friends), he’d forgotten about it.”

Affirmed Success is now 19 and Dancin Renee, 21. 🐾



Two for the Turf

Shakeira, King Kreesa make hay on the green

Big Apple Showcase Day presented by the New York State Breeding and Development Fund June 1 was the brainchild of New York Racing Association's vice president/director of racing P.J. Campo.

"Our second-biggest day in the fall, behind the Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I) program, has been our Fall Showcase Day for New York-breds," Campo said. "We already had some key races for them in our spring/summer meeting. So we added a few more (making seven in total). We thought it would be a great segue between our Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) weekend and

the Belmont Stakes (gr. I). I think the fans and the racing community have been really receptive to it."

The pair of one-mile turf races on the June 1 card, the \$125,000 Kingston Stakes for 3-year-olds and up and the \$125,000 Mount Vernon Stakes for fillies and mares 3-year-olds and up, highlighted the competitive diversity among owners in the Empire State. The Mount Vernon was won by Michael Dubb and Bethlehem Stables' Shakeira. Dubb, who has multiple racing interests, was NYRA's leading owner in 2010 and 2012, as well as being a member of NYRA's board of directors. On the other end of the ownership spec-

Shakeira became the odds-on choice in the Mount Vernon when Chester and Mary Broman's Kibosh was a vet scratch at the starting gate. The late-running Shakeira, a 5-year-old daughter of New York's second-leading sire Freud, out of Cerita (by Magesterial), however, still faced the hurdles of the event's distance (shorter than she's used to racing) and potential lack of pace.

Bumped from both sides leaving the gate, Shakeira settled into sixth position in the field of eight while racing well off the hedge.

After a controlled opening half-mile of :48.44 by the pacesetters, the Chad Brown-trainee came under serious urging by jockey Rajiv Maragh on the far turn, swinging four to five wide into the stretch.

Gallagher Stud's homebred Inimitable Romanee had seized the lead at the eighth pole, before being confronted on her outside flank by Shakeira. Through the final furlong Shakeira lengthened her long, powerful stride and proved a neck better than her rival at the wire.

The final time was 1:35.75 over the firm turf.

"She just knows where the wire is.

trum, the Kingston was captured by Gerald and Susan Kresa's King Kreesa. Relatively new to the racing game, the Kresas own just two horses, both homebreds.

There was the distance and slow pace to overcome, but she really tried hard today," said Dubb, who more than a year ago nudged his trainer into making the claim for the mare at \$50,000. "Chad and I always keep our eyes open for New York-breds. We were in Florida when we saw her in December. We claimed her Jan. 1, 2012. Chad said to me, 'Mike, she'll have to sit in the barn for four months (until the New York turf season started).' I told him, 'People breed horses and wait three years (to get them to the races). They buy yearlings and wait 18 months. What's four months compared to that?' So I had to push Chad a little on this one. I saw the consistency in her form.

"She is by Freud, and everyone knows how they can perform on the turf. And Chad has a great turf program. So I had little doubt. But that's what claiming is all about. You look for the upside in claims and, hopefully, there's a lot of it."

The Mount Vernon was Shakeira's seventh win from 18 starts. Bred by Joda Farm, she has finished off the board only once in her career. Her earnings now stand at \$382,922. And she has won six of nine starts for her present connections.

Inimitable Romanee (by Maria's Mon), from the barn of trainer H. Graham Motion, finished a game second with Jose Espinoza in the irons.

It was another 2½ lengths back to Lawrence Goichman's Elusive Rumour in third position.

Still the King

With some assistance from trainer Jeremiah Englehart, Gerald Kresa walked his victorious homebred King Kreesa into the winner's circle moments after the Kingston. That was nothing new for the owner, who has had lots of help from his trainer in getting a small but promising racing stable a leg-up.

"We were interested in racing and started off in a partnership. Then we decided to go off on our own

(with Susan Kresa). We've been very lucky so far and have had lots of help from Jeremiah along the way," said Kresa, who manages a maintenance company.

King Kreesa, a 4-year-old gelding by King Cugat out of the Storm Creek mare Storm's Advance, registered a 2¼-length, gate-to-wire win in 1:33.99.

Though the opening fractions were moderate—a half-mile in :47.71, King Kreesa held off a pair of hard-charging horses in the lane for an impressive victory.

Those stretch challenges came from Lawrence Durocher Jr.'s Khara-fa (by Kitalpha) and Aliyu Ben J Stables' homebred Lubash (by Freud) who finished second and third, respectively.

"(Jockey) Irad (Ortiz) said he still had a lot of horse," said Englehart of

his charge. "When they come up to him, he finds another gear."

Indeed, King Kreesa flew home the final quarter mile in :22.74, defeating his seven rivals.

The Kingston gave King Kreesa his fourth win from 13 starts, boosting his career earnings to \$344,370. He previously had finished third in back-to-back grade III grass stakes (Fort Marcy and Appleton). And in October 2012, the gelding had finished second, beaten a half-length by King David, in the Jamaica Handicap (gr. IT) at Belmont Park.

"The two were an A-plus on the nick rating," said Gerald Kresa on his decision to breed Storm's Advance to King Cugat (by Kingmambo) under the *nom du course* Horse Partners. "We also have Lady Kreesa (by Stonesider out of Storm's Advance). She's a 2-year-old in training now." 🐾

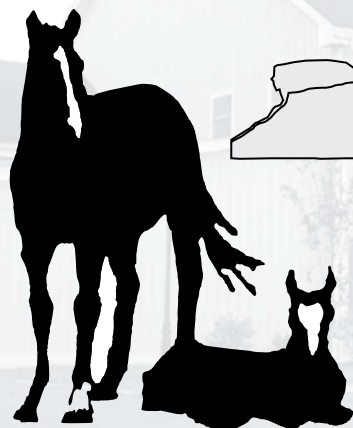

- **New York Thoroughbred Breeders PAC:** The New York Thoroughbred Breeders Political Action Committee supports elected officials in Albany who are committed to promoting the welfare of the Thoroughbred industry in New York and assisting in the passage of legislation that will protect and foster the growth of the state's breeding and racing industries
- **Educational programs** such as seminars on a variety of topics and farm tours, and breeders' dinner meetings for networking and educational purposes
- **Annual Divisional Championships for NY-breds** and awards ceremony with specially designed statues for the breeders of the winners in each of the 11 categories, along with the Broodmare of the Year, Breeder of the Year, Horse of the Year, Trainer and Jockey of the Year awards

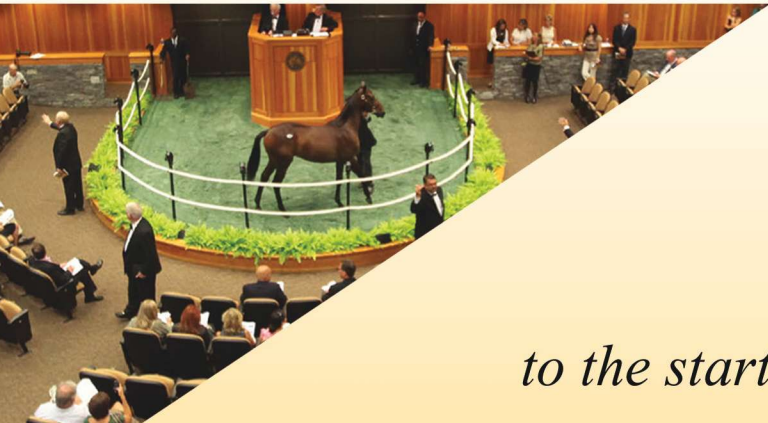
