Fund Cap Extender Passes Both Houses. *Next Stop: Fund Board*

I AM PLEASED AND PROUD to announce that New York Thoroughbred Breeders has once again accomplished its most important piece of business in Albany for the year: seeing the “Fund Cap Extender” bill through the legislative process. The bill now awaits Gov. Andrew Cuomo’s signature...and one other important ratification.

To refresh your memory, the “Fund Cap Extender” bill is an important and necessary modification of the law that brought the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund into being four decades ago.

Originally, Breeding Fund law mandated a “cap” on breeders’ awards, permitting the Fund to distribute only (up to) 50% of its revenue in this category. Over time, as the Fund’s revenue from handle decreased and the amount of breeders’ awards earned increased and because of the stipulated cap, the Fund began to struggle to pay the awards at the advertised rates. For example, in 2008 there was a \$1.6 million gap between breeders’ awards earned and the 50% threshold, which meant that the Fund was able to pay breeders only 80.89% of what their horses had earned in the program. The cap also meant that the money left over from unearned stallion owners’ and owners’ awards could not be diverted to breeders.

In order to close the gap, in 2010 NYTB pushed the passage of a bill raising the 50% cap on breeders’ awards to 65%. On the one hand, NYTB was successful in convincing lawmakers that the bill was essential, but lawmakers, for their part, stipulated that the provision would sunset after one year. Therefore, each year from 2010 to the present, NYTB has lobbied (successfully) to have the “Fund Cap” increase extended. Each year lawmakers have resisted the idea of making the change permanent.

Recently both houses of the legislature unanimously passed the 2014 Fund Cap Extender. The senate bill (S.7019), sponsored by Sen. John J. Bonacic, chair of the Senate Committee on Racing, Gaming and Wagering, passed May 28; the Assembly bill (A.9410) sponsored by Assemblyman J. Gary Pretlow, chair of the Assembly Racing & Wagering Committee, passed June 9.

Gov. Cuomo is fully expected to sign the bill into law, but one additional process remains. In order for the Fund to disburse 65% of its revenue in breeders’ awards (rather than 50%), a two-thirds majority of the Fund Board (eight of 11 members) must vote in favor. Historically this has not been an issue, and, once again, we hope that when it meets next month, the Fund Board will put the definitive stamp on NYTB’s legislative achievement so that breeders can continue to be paid as promised by the program. 🐾

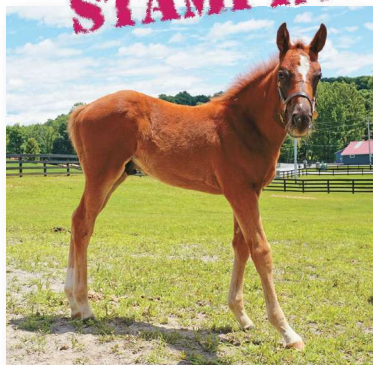

Hot Stones' Grade III Win a First for Sire Bustin Stones

A top-notch sprinter just like her sire, Hot Stones got up in the final stride to capture the \$150,000 Bed o' Roses Handicap (gr. III) by a nose June 21 at Belmont Park. With the victory, the 4-year-old daughter of Bustin Stones gave her New York-based sire his first progeny stakes winner and her hot-handed jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. his fifth score on the card.

Hot Stones, owned by Roddy Valente, Charles Casale, and Darlene Bilinski, is the first New York-bred to win the race since Rightly So in 2010.

Bred in partnership by Jerry Bilinski and Roddy Valente, Hot Stones is the top earner for her third-crop sire Bustin Stones, an undefeated grade I winning sprinter who stands at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham for a 2014 stud fee of \$5,000.

Bustin Stones is the second-leading third-crop sire in New York in 2014. He has 13 winners from 26 starters, and his runners have earned nearly \$520,000. The winner of the 2008 Carter Handicap (gr. I) and General George Handicap (gr. II), Bustin Stones is by City Zip out of the Prospectors Gamble mare Shesasurething.

Hot Stones is out of Steamed Up, an unraced New York-bred daughter of Freud bred by Thomas-Lakin-Kintz. Steamed Up is a half sister to New York Stallion Park Avenue Stakes winner Like a Rose (by Hook and Ladder). Steamed Up's only other foal to start is also a winner, and she has two full sisters to Hot Stones, a 3-year-old named Stonely Heart and a yearling named Two Stonesrbetter.

Trained by Bruce Levine, Hot Stones served notice in her last start she was developing into a force to be reckoned with. Making her stakes debut in the Critical Eye Stakes for older New York-bred fillies and mares May 31 during the Big Apple Showcase program, she closed to within a half-length of top sprinter and grade II winner La Verdad while under pressure in the stretch, for which she earned a career-high Beyer Speed Figure of 92. The seven-furlong Bed o' Roses also appeared to be right in the wheelhouse of a filly who had won five times at distances ranging from six furlongs to a mile.

Hot Stones was a 6-1 chance in the Bed o' Roses.

"I said, 'If La Verdad is in (the Bed o' Roses), she's 4-5. Why wouldn't I take a shot?'" said Levine. "I was worried a little about the 21 days (between the Critical Eye and the Bed o' Roses), but she came back bouncing. When fillies are doing good, you have to take a shot."

With blinkers on for the first time and breaking from post five in the competitive field of 10, Hot Stones sat in fifth position early, several paths off the rail, while Ultimate Shopper showed the way with Merry Meadow in hot pursuit through sharp early fractions of :22.79 and :45.66.

Hot Stones began her serious rally three-wide at the head

of the stretch, setting her sights ultimately on Merry Meadow, who inherited the lead. Edging closer with every stride in the final sixteenth, Hot Stones got her nose down first in the final jump. Calistoga finished third, four lengths behind the winner. Hot Stones' time for seven furlongs was a speedy 1:21.98.

"She always likes to fight a little bit when you get close to the wire," said Ortiz. "I started asking her early, and she had something for the end. Thankfully, she got her head in front at the wire. I figured there would be a lot of speed in the race, but I had to move a little earlier."

"I'm just doing the same thing," Ortiz said about his multiple-win day. "Winning five (races) on the day is very exciting for me, and that's all I can say."

Ortiz was honored by New York Thoroughbred Breeders as the top rider of New York-breds in 2013.

Hot Stones has finished first or second in nine of 11 starts and has earned \$363,607. A maiden-breaker second out at Saratoga, Hot Stones ran through her state-bred and open allowance conditions at Belmont and Aqueduct through the fall and early winter and was freshened before the Critical Eye.

"Cutting back from a mile to seven (furlongs), I think the blinkers kept her a little closer," Levine said. "I didn't know if she was going to get there; Merry Meadow really dug in and tried hard."

Inspired by his filly's performance, Levine has a number of attractive options for her next start.

"We were thinking about going in a New York-bred (stakes) going long. Now we have to rethink it, maybe even point to the Ballerina (Stakes, gr. I, Aug. 23 at Saratoga) with something in between."

FALL SALE AT SARATOGA TO INCLUDE NY-BRED YEARLINGS

Fasig-Tipton will add another component to its fall mixed sale at Saratoga Springs Oct. 7 with an open session of New York-bred yearlings.

"Through the inspection process for our selected yearling sales, it became clear New York breeders are producing more and higher-quality horses," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning. "We expect to see increased numbers in our mixed offerings and horses of racing age, and stabling on our grounds at Saratoga will likely be at capacity. Thanks to an agreement with the New York Racing Association, we will have access to additional stalls within the Oklahoma training facility, just across the road from our own property. This will allow us to accommodate yearlings in the sale and better serve the marketplace."

The fall mixed sale will close July 25, and entry forms are available online at the company's website and from all Fasig-Tipton offices.

The New York-bred preferred yearling sale is set for Aug. 9-10 at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion.

Kevin Whitley Inducted into Finger Lakes Hall of Fame

Retired jockey Kevin Whitley was officially inducted into the Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack Hall of Fame by the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association June 23. The nine-time leading rider was in attendance and performed the presentation for the eighth race.

A dominant force at Finger Lakes during the 1980s, Whitley was the leading rider for five consecutive years from 1986-90. Between 1982 and 1983 he visited the winner's circle 507 times, the most ever by any Finger Lakes rider in two consecutive seasons.

On Aug. 27, 1989, he won six races on the card at Finger Lakes, including the \$222,500 New York Derby aboard Packett's Landing.

Whitley won five stakes with Frattare, including the Finger Lakes Breeders' Cup Handicap July 3, 1989, for trainer Chris Englehart. "He's the best jockey that hung his hat here," said Englehart. "This is long overdue."

Whitley completed his career with more than 3,200 victories—2,617 wins came at Finger Lakes.

Utopia to Relocate to Turkey

New York-based sire Utopia has been purchased by Turkish bloodstock agent Tarik Tekce on behalf of Serdar Kemal Ozcolak, who will stand him in Turkey.

A 14-year-old son of Forty Niner—Dream Vision, by Northern Taste, Utopia is scheduled to ship from the United States in mid-September to stand at the Jockey Club of Turkey's Karacabey National Stud near Bursa. He began his stud career in 2008 at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds and stood the 2014 season for a \$5,000 fee.

Utopia is the sire of five stakes winners including Matchmadeinheaven, a three-time stakes winner and \$206,217-earner.

A four-time grade I winner in his native Japan, Utopia won graded/group stakes in the U.S. and Dubai. He posted a career line of 9-5-3 from 34 starts while earning \$4,913,585. His record includes victories in the 2006 Jebel Ali International Hotels Godolphin Mile (UAE-II) and 2007 Westchester Handicap (gr. III).

Utopia will spend 30 days in quarantine at trainer Mu-

BLUEGRASS CAT TO SHUTTLE TO URUGUAY

Bluegrass Cat, New York's leading sire of 2013 and atop the list again for 2014, will shuttle from Rockridge Stud to Norman Fox's Haras Lacala in Uruguay for the upcoming Southern Hemisphere breeding season in a deal negotiated by TBS Agency of Brazil and Wynrose Equine.

"Bluegrass Cat has an exceptional pedigree and has proved his ability to

sire precocious stock, and we couldn't be happier to be bringing him to Uruguay this season," said Fox.

An 11-year-old by Storm Cat—She's a Winner, by A.P. Indy, Bluegrass Cat won the grade I Haskell Invitational Stakes in 2006 and ran second in the Kentucky



Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) and Belmont Stakes (gr. I). He is the sire of 19 stakes winners and has already shuttled three seasons in South America. He served stud duty in 2011-13 at Haras Don Alberto in Chile.

Galiana Wins Delaware Park's Dashing Beauty

Galiana came out of the gate running at Delaware Park June 12 and never looked back, winning the six-furlong \$58,000 Dashing Beauty Stakes at 7-1 to run up her record at the Wilmington oval to four for six.

A maiden-breaker for a \$7,500 tag at first asking at Delaware Park last June and winner of Delaware Park's Tax Free Shopping Distaff Stakes for Delaware-bred or certified fillies and mares in September, 4-year-old Galiana came into the Dashing Beauty off a starter allowance/optional claiming win. She won the Dashing Beauty by two lengths in 1:10.92. She has since run second in a starter allowance/optional claiming event June 26, finishing second by a neck.

Owned and trained by Rodolfo Romero, Galiana has now won seven of 12 starts, including a pair of back-to-back victories in state-bred allowance competition at Saratoga last summer and a turf sprint at Atlantic City April 29 in her 2014 debut. She has earned 222,040.

A daughter of Stonesider, who stands at Saratoga Stud near Stillwater, N.Y., for a 2014 fee of \$3,500, Galiana was bred by John T. Behrendt and Charles Marquis and foaled at Anne Morgan and Tim Little's Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater. Galiana is the only winner to date out of Baby Jess, an unraced Argentinian-bred daughter of Interprete.

Five Questions for...

Kevin Whitley

Jockey Kevin Whitley rode for 25 years (1976-2001) before an injury cut his career short. The rider was a dominant force at Finger Lakes during his prime and led the standings there nine times. The New York City native recorded 2,617 of 3,264 wins at Finger Lakes. Recently inducted into the Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack Hall of Fame, Whitley (center of photo) took some time to chat with Evan Hammonds of *New York Breeder*.

How did you find out about your Hall of Fame entry?

I was up here at Finger Lakes two years ago to celebrate the track's 50th anniversary, and I was told by somebody there were no more inductees into the Hall of Fame. Maybe it was a rumor. I thought I belonged in it in years past, but now I said to myself, 'I'm never going to get in.' To my surprise, my agent called and said they voted me in. It started out as a three-person journey: myself; my wife, Nancy; and my son. I went to a birthday lunch last October with my siblings and I happened to share it and everybody said 'I'm in.' They all insisted they wanted to be with me. My sister sent out e-mails to other family members, and we wound up with about 50 family members up here for the ceremony. There were people from New Jersey, Florida, Texas, Virginia, Vermont, New York, Long Island, Boston...just everywhere. It was amazing.

What was the best thing about riding in the Finger Lakes region?

The trainers and owners that I rode for. I was born and raised in New York City in the Aqueduct area. I rode at Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga for my two years of apprenticeship. I also rode in New Jersey for three years. I rode for some very prominent people, but it was very businesslike. I came up here and it was country living, which I wasn't used to—and I had to adjust to—and the people were friendly and farm-like. We played a lot of softball, and there was a lot of picnicking and cookouts. That lifestyle was a big pleasure and key for me for my success.

You recorded a six-win day on Aug. 27, 1987 that included a win in the New York Derby. Was that the highlight of your career?

I think that was. Jerry Bailey and some other New York riders had shipped in to ride a couple of stakes races we had that day. After I had won about four or five, Bailey came up to me, looked at me, and said, 'I'm impressed.' I had always been impressed with him because I rode against him in New York and at Monmouth Park, so I had always been respectful of his style of riding. He came up to me in my hometown and told me how impressive I was, which meant a lot to me. That was also 'New York-bred day' at Finger Lakes, so every race was a New

York-bred race, which had bigger pots, and my finale was winning the New York Derby on Packett's Landing. That was the best day of my whole career financial-wise.

How has the business changed from the late 1980s to today?

It's even more commercial. The biggest thing I see is the racetracks getting the casinos and the slots. It kind of depresses me. I see that it jacks up the purses, but it takes away some of the "people" side of the racetrack with live racing. If you go to the racetrack today, the parking for the casino is about 80% and the parking for the horsemen was like 20%. To me that's a downer. There's nobody sitting in the seats.

What are you 'tacking' these days?

I've been retired for 13 years now. Without the injury I'd still be riding every day. I miss it a lot. My current weight is still my riding weight: 105 pounds. I've always been programmed about it. I do a lot of working out and cardio. I live in Tampa. When Tampa Bay Downs is running, I get a job with trainer Jamie Ness as a hotwalker. I like doing that to stay connected to the horses, and it's also a good cardio workout for me in the morning. Half of the week I do volunteer work at a rescue farm in my area. The other half of the week I do volunteer work at the ASPCA shelter, working with dogs. 🐾

Sales of New York-bred 2-year-olds in training at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June sale June 17-20 ended on par with the overall sale's major indicators. The top-selling New York-bred was a well-bred and talented Medaglia d'Oro filly who sold in session three.

Over the four sessions 66 New York-bred juveniles sold for \$2,011,500 for an average of \$30,477, just under the sale average of \$31,093. The median price for a New York-bred was \$20,000, which equaled the overall sale median. The New York-bred buy-back rate was 22.4%, slightly higher than the 21% of the sale's general population.

Bob Feld, acting as agent for Kevin Plank's Sagamore Farm, went to \$260,000 in session three for a New York-bred Medaglia d'Oro filly (Hip 798), which made her second highest-priced juvenile in the session and fourth top-seller overall. Bred by Gallagher's Stud and consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, agent, the filly is out of Hostess, by Chester House, a multiple graded

stakes winner who set the current course record for 1³/₈ miles over the Saratoga inner turf. Marlene Brody had purchased Hostess for \$650,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale.

The January filly, who turned in a furlong breeze in :10²/₅ at the under tack show, sold as a yearling to Sarazen & Talus Stable for \$170,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale.

The top-selling New York-bred colt went under the hammer in the last session, when Hip 1030, a bay colt by City Zip bred by Barry Ostrager, sold to Mike Recio, agent for Matt Schera, for \$140,000. He was consigned by Wavertree Stables (Ciaran Dunne), agent. A \$47,000 short yearling at the 2013 Keeneland January sale, he was purchased by Phase II Thoroughbreds for \$100,000 in the summer at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred sale in Saratoga. Ostrager had purchased his dam, graded stakes-placed Morethanaprincess, by More Than Ready, at the 2011 Keeneland November sale for \$42,000.

Sheila's World

Sheila Rosenblum,
owner of La Verdad,
sets out to conquer
Thoroughbred racing

ON A SATURDAY AFTERNOON—the last day of May—at Belmont Park, Sheila Rosenblum stood in the clubhouse boxes. Tall, dark-haired, surrounded by people sitting down, dressed completely in red, she stood out, her brightness prominent in the late afternoon shadows. A former dancer and model accustomed to being an object of observation, she was oblivious to everything except her 4-year-old filly La Verdad, who was making her way to the starting gate for the Critical Eye Stakes on Big Apple Showcase Day.

La Verdad has won seven of her nine lifetime starts and was coming off a decisive win in her first graded stakes attempt, the April 19 Distaff Handicap (gr. II) at Aqueduct; she was returning to state-bred company, but she was also stretching out to a mile for the first time. As the race unfolded and La Verdad went to her customary place on the lead, Rosenblum watched, folding her arms, then standing arms akimbo, finally sinking to sit on the steps and cover her face with her hands before daring to watch as her filly held off a late charge to win by a half-length over Hot Stones.

"I was nervous as hell," she admitted in the winner's circle. "I'm petrified and I'm high-strung, anyway, and I want them to stay sound and come out of it well."

Watching her horses race seems to be about the only thing that can throw Rosenblum off her confident, self-possessed game. She has a knack for re-invention, for embarking on endeavors that would daunt the less enterprising, and the latest world she has set out to conquer is Thoroughbred racing.

Born in Switzerland, Rosenblum moved to Miami as a child, then left home as a teenager to study ballet, first in New York, then in London. Back in New York in her early 20s, she modeled for the high-profile Ford and Wilhelmina agencies; too short at 5'7" for runway work, she did magazine shoots, working in the name of Sheila Barcelle.

Her relationship with horses began a little later when she took up jumping and dressage. After breaking a

shoulder during a riding mishap, she decided she might be better off owning horses than riding them, but marriage and motherhood intervened and the dream of owning a Thoroughbred was deferred until four years ago, when her two children had reached their teens.

Returning to the saddle then, Rosenblum rode a Grand Prix Schoolmaster for the first time, marveling at how easy it was to ride such an accomplished horse. Her husband, Daniel Rosenblum, a commodities trader, offered to buy her one, but she demurred.

"I didn't want to be a person who just jumps on a horse and gets off," she explained. "I live in New York City, the kids are in New York City, and the great riding facilities are not here.

"So I said, 'Buy me a racehorse instead. Or a couple.' And he did."

She ran her first horse, Neon Light, in the Pin Oak Valley View Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Keeneland in 2010—except that Neon Light was apparently not really Rosen-

blum's horse: after a private purchase the horse's original owner contested the sale, and Neon Light reverted back to her original ownership after just one start.

Rosenblum didn't have much luck with the second horse she got to the track, either; owned in partnership with trainer Kenny McPeck's Magdalena Racing, Karma Shield was winless in eight starts for her and was euthanized after breaking a cannon bone in a race at Belmont Park.

But the woman whose toes used to bleed daily from hours of practicing en pointe wasn't going to let some bad beginners' luck get in her way. So with a string of pricey yearlings, not all of which were developing into money-earning racehorses, she put her disappointments behind her, changed trainers, and started over.

"Pretty much all the turnaround has happened since I've been with Linda," said Rosenblum, referring to trainer

Linda Rice. "I've been with her about 15 months, and it's all because of her tutelage."

Rice cast her shrewd eye on Rosenblum's stock, paring it down through retirement or claims, and advised Rosenblum to shift her focus from yearlings to 2-year-olds in training. Some of those original purchases, like the two named for Rosenblum's children, Kara's Match Point and Erik the Red, remain; both have made it to the winner's circle and regularly hit the board.

It was Rice who encouraged Rosenblum to purchase La Verdad; Rice had been training the New York-bred filly for owner/breeder Eklektikos Stable, who decided to sell her last fall. In six starts since the purchase, La Verdad has won five times, losing the Barbara Fritchie Handicap (gr. II) at Laurel by a length.

Rice also signed on for Rosenblum's latest venture, Lady Sheila Stable Two, a partnership Rosenblum hopes will consist primarily of women. Rice has

already picked out and purchased three 2-year-olds for the enterprise—two of them New York-breds—and in addition to buying and training the horses, Rice will also be a part-owner as a member partner.

The buy-in is \$100,000 for an interest in several horses, and the partnership is structured so that investors will receive no bills for the first two years. Acknowledging the relatively high price point, Rosenblum said she's seeking a small number of committed investors; she currently has two partners and is advertising in both racing and lifestyle publications, targeting Saratoga and the Hamptons.

"There have to be other women out there like me," she said, "who want the excitement of owning a racehorse. I can't be the only one that actually enjoys watching one's horse. And the purses are great in New York."

"I've done so much of the dirty work," she went on, referring to her early troubles in the game. "Now the excitement can be there for someone else, but they don't have to go through the pitfalls I did."

Now separated from her husband, with whom she has remained friendly, Rosenblum is energized by being a single woman trying to break into a male-dominated industry.

"Danny gave me my start and my ability to buy racehorses," she said, "and I owe him a lot for turning a dream into something tangible. Without his having done that, there would not be this story. I've been doing this solo for a few years now, and it makes each and every experience very gratifying."

In addition to the three partnership horses, Rosenblum has about eight of her own horses in training, and she's expecting La Verdad's half sister by City Zip to join the stable shortly at Belmont, where Rosenblum is a frequent visitor.

"The horses are like my other children," she said. "I like having them close by, so that I can go visit, and I like watching them. I like them being right where I can enjoy them. I go out when it's zero

degrees, when it's pouring, whatever."

Active on the Manhattan social and philanthropic scenes, Rosenblum is a board member for the March of Dimes and a member of the Leadership Circle for Green Chimneys School in Brewster, N.Y., which offers academic, behavioral, and emotional support to students who have struggled in traditional schools. She emphasized that she focuses her charitable work on children, and it's impossible for her to get through more than a few sentences without mentioning one of her teenagers, both of whom were at the races with her for La Verdad's most recent win.

She names Barbara Banke of Stonestreet Farms—another woman who has named racehorses after her children—as a role model, noting Banke took the helm of Stonestreet's prodigious racing and breeding operation as a single woman after the death of her husband Jess Jackson. She also acknowledges she might be seen as something of a dilettante or an arriviste in an industry founded by old families with old money, but she's determined to make a go of a venture that began as a passion and

has evolved into a business.

"My determination—or maybe my stupidity, too," she said frankly, "has made me sort of a superstar to my kids, by showing them my guts and my passion. I had enough funds to withstand my huge errors, and it's all been a massive learning curve. The kids thought their mom would get out of it and everyone treated it a little bit like a joke, but I didn't, and Linda didn't."

She continued, "It's a business. The accountants tell me that, and the lawyers tell me that, and if you've got a group of horses, one or two of them might be carrying the rest, but eventually they've all got to perform a little bit."

Her background, her experiences, and her Park Avenue lifestyle tinge everything Rosenblum does with an element of the grand, and that extends to the name she races in. Her husband once named a boat "Lady Sheila," and when it came time to pick her racing name, she decided to transfer the name to her stable.

"Someone said to me, 'It sounds so glamorous.' I said, 'I think it sounds so obnoxious,'" she said with a self-deprecating laugh.

There's no doubt that Rosenblum is glamorous; she maintains the fitness instilled in her by years of ballet and modeling, and she cuts a striking figure, whether she's freezing in the winner's circle at Aqueduct or standing in a stall in the Belmont paddock...or sitting on the edge of her seat watching her star filly notch another victory.

But as seriously as she takes this new business, she not infrequently pokes fun at herself and points to the Lady Sheila moniker as an example.

"It's tongue-in-cheek," she said matter-of-factly. "One has to be able to laugh at oneself." 🐾

Old School

Old Harbor draws clear in Cupecoy's Joy; Bromans strike with Mark My Way

AS POST TIME APPROACHED for the New York Stallion Series Cupecoy's Joy division June 22 at Belmont Park, the toteboard didn't convey an awful lot of confidence in Old Harbor. The 3-year-old filly was making her fourth start of the year, and though she had finished a competitive third in her last race, June 1, she hadn't returned to the winner's circle since her maiden win at Saratoga last July and had a nine-month gap from that start until her sophomore bow in May.

But even though the betting public saw fit to make Old Harbor only the fifth betting choice at odds of 6-1, her breeder/owner Joseph Birnbaum wasn't at all surprised by his filly's clear-cut victory in the \$100,000 event.

"I did (expect it)," he said. "She hadn't been running to her ability, and I expected her to be winning more races before, but she was still green, still learning. She finally did it nicely in this race: She rated; she did everything."

Old Harbor settled on the rail under jockey Angel Arroyo, racing in fifth before coming off the fence to be four-wide around the final turn. Spurting forward willingly when asked, Old Harbor demonstrated a little of that greenness, ducking in but without losing momentum to put away her rivals easily, winning by 4½ lengths. She ran the seven furlongs over the Widener Turf Course in 1:20.97.

Based in New Jersey, Birnbaum purchased Old Harbor's dam, Royal Mast (by Roy), as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic mixed sale in December 2001 for \$8,500. A winner at 4, Royal Mast produced her first foal in 2006, Shipwreckstreaure. A nine-time winner in six seasons on the track, the Service Stripe gelding earned \$254,336 and placed in the Miracle Wood Stakes at Laurel Park and the New Jersey Juvenile Stakes at the Meadowlands. Three more winners followed and then came Old Harbor.

By the New York-based (Sugar Maple Farm) sire Raffie's Majesty (third in the 1998 Travers Stakes, gr. I, behind Coronado's Quest and Victory Gallop), Old Harbor developed bad shin splints last year, leading Birnbaum and trainer Russell Cash to

proceed cautiously.

“She had a half sister who got shin splints who ended up breaking down,” explained Birnbaum, referring to Strategic Command (by Strategic Mission), who was euthanized after racing at Monmouth Park in September 2012. “We are very, very conservative, and we just don’t take any chances.”

Birnbaum has about 18 horses in training, all with Cash, and half a dozen mares, four of which he breeds each year. As the breeding industry has declined in New Jersey and taken off in New York, he has moved his breeding operation to the Empire State; Old Harbor was born at Rockridge Farm near Hudson and has a yearling half brother by Girolamo, Royal Mast’s last foal; the mare died from colic last year.

Old Harbor ran her first three races on the dirt, and despite her success on the grass—Shipwreckstreasure also won two races on the turf, and finished second in two others—Birnbaum thinks she’ll run as well on dirt, over which she broke her maiden.

“She was just green,” he said of her losses. “Now, she’s not fighting the jockey as much.”

“(Taking blinkers off) might have helped her relax,” said Cash. “She’s just been unfortunate. Her last race was good and in the two races before that she had

bad trips. She’s always been good. I’m very happy for Dr. Birnbaum; he puts a lot of money into breeding these horses, and he should be rewarded.”

Though he and Cash haven’t picked out her next race, Birnbaum is considering a race at the upcoming Saratoga meet, likely in New York-bred company.

“I hope,” he said, “that New York keeps the state-restricted races and encourages the New York-bred stakes program.”

Earlier on the June 22 card the colts took to the grass for the seven-furlong Spectacular Bid division of the Stallion Series. Part of a coupled entry of Chester and Mary Broman, Noonmark-sired homebreds trained by Linda Rice, Mark My Way saved ground on the hedge after a stumbling start while stablemate A Marked Man set the pace.

A patient Cornelio Velasquez kept Mark My Way to the inside, moving out to the two-path in the stretch to pass a tiring A Marked Man and hold off a charge by Free Mugatu, winning by a half-length as the 8-5 favorite in a final time of 1:22.19.

“Our horse has been closing every race,” said Chester Broman after the \$100,000 race. “I heard Linda tell (A Marked Man’s) jockey, ‘Don’t worry about the entry.’ There were a couple of other speed horses in there.”

“I kind of expected that he’d be off

the pace, coming from 1½ miles to seven furlongs,” said Rice. “That really worked out fine because my other two horses were pressing the pace, so I was happy to have somebody closing. I thought he ran really professional for a horse who has only had four starts.”

The win was Mark My Way’s second from five starts.

Finalists for the 2013 New York Breeder of the Year, the Bromans purchased Mark My Way’s dam, Whichwaydidshego (by Storm Cat), for \$425,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November sale. She was in foal to Unbridled’s Song. The resultant foal, a filly named Soul Safari, was winless in five races.

In addition to Mark My Way, the Bromans have a 2012 half sister, Hard to Stay Notgo, by More Than Ready, who is with trainer Jimmy Jerkens, and a 2014 colt by Bernardini that arrived Feb. 12.

The Bromans were partners in Noonmark when he stood at Sequel Stallions in New York, but when his first few foal crops were disappointing, he was sold and now stands at SC Stockfarm in the Philippines.

“When you don’t come up with a graded stakes winner within the first couple of years, you can’t get anybody to breed to him,” said Broman.

Noonmark won the 2008 Mr. Prospector Handicap (gr. III) and placed in the Swale, Woody Stephens Breeders’ Cup Stakes, and Churchill Downs Stakes (all gr. II) and the grade III Aristides Stakes.

The Bromans were named New York Breeder of the Year in 2004 and 2005 by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, and they were the New York Thoroughbred Breeders’ Breeders of the Year in 2004 and 2012. They won the Belmont owners’ title in 2009, but as Chester pointed out wryly in the winner’s circle, Mark My Way’s victory was their first of this Belmont spring/summer meet.

The Bromans have approximately 50 horses in training at Belmont with a variety of trainers, with about a half-dozen with Rice. They live in Babylon on Long Island, but their racing and breeding operation is based on their farm in upstate Chestertown. 🐾

Classic Cide

Funny Cide shows the way under the Twin Spires in May 2003

Remembering Funny Cide and the New York-bred's run through the 2003 classics

BARCLAY TAGG WAS THE proverbial fish out of water as he campaigned his New York-bred gelding Funny Cide on the 2003 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) trail, which was uncharted territory for the then 65-year-old trainer, whose biggest successes had come on the grass with Miss Josh and Royal Mountain Inn, not exactly household names.

For Tagg, the Twin Spires might just as well have been on another planet. He did not seek them out and certainly was not prepared for the fact he was only one step away from his first Kentucky Derby as he placed the saddle on Funny Cide's back before the Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I).

A couple of months earlier all Tagg knew was that he had a talented New York-bred gelding for a bunch a high school buddies from the tiny town of Sackets Harbor, N.Y., and considering no New York-bred had ever won the Kentucky Derby and no gelding had captured the Run for the Roses since Clyde Van Dusen in 1929, one could understand why Tagg was not exactly burning up with Derby fever that winter and spring.

Prior to the Wood, Tagg, whose boots had been hardened by too many campaigns in Maryland, said of Funny Cide, "He's a fighter, and he's not going to quit. Whether he handles the mile and an eighth and the mud I don't know, but I can't wait to find out so I'll know whether to stop all this foolishness or go on with him."

Funny Cide did not win the Wood, but his game second to Kentucky Derby favorite Empire Maker pretty much sealed his, and Tagg's, fate. It was on to Louisville for this unlikely pair and unlikely group of owners, as they headed to Churchill Downs in an attempt to rip the history books to shreds.

By late May/early June, Funny Cide, Barclay Tagg, and Sackets Harbor were household names. Tagg had become the reluctant hero, thrust into a strange new world with hordes of photographers and reporters shoving cameras and microphones in his face and receiving exposure on national television and in magazines. Funny Cide was even the subject of a book, written by Washington *Post* journalist Sally Jenkins.

But let's back up a little bit. The story of Funny Cide's rise to stardom begins On Memorial Day, 1995, on the Sackets Harbor front porch of optician J.P. Constance. There Saratoga resident Jack Knowlton, who had grown up in Sackets Harbor, arranged to have his buddies put up \$30,000 to purchase a racehorse. They would spend \$20,000 on the horse and keep \$10,000 for training expenses. They eventually brought in four of Knowlton's friends from Connecticut and Saratoga, and Sackatoga Stable was born.

Their goal was a modest and realistic one—to break even and have some fun.

That is just what they did for the next several years, until Tagg and his assistant Robin Smullen spotted a chestnut ridgling by Distorted Humor, out of Belle's Good Cide, in late 2001 at Tony Everard's farm near Ocala, Fla., where Tagg's yearlings were broken. Everard had purchased the WinStar Farm-bred for \$22,000 at Fasig-Tipton's preferred New York-bred yearling sale at Saratoga.

Funny Cide's breeding was a joint

venture between WinStar and McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. WinStar would supply the mares and the McMahons would supply the breeding and handle routine care and vet care. One of the mares they sent was the Oklahoma-bred Belle's Good Cide. When her foal (Funny Cide) was a few days old, Rich Decker from WinStar called the McMahons asking to buy back Belle's Good Cide and her foal after Kenny Troutt had researched her pedigree further. The McMahons agreed and in exchange, they

Although Tagg and Smullen liked the horse when they saw him at Everard's farm, they had no buyer who could put up the \$40,000 asking price. As the horse progressed, his price escalated, and by the following spring Everard was asking \$75,000 for the now gelding. That is when fate stepped in. On March 6, 2002, Sackatoga Stable's 6-year-old mare Bail Money was claimed for \$62,500 at Gulfstream Park. When Knowlton saw how much Tagg liked the Distorted Humor gelding, he convinced his partners to use

were given full ownership of one of the other mares and her foal that they eventually sold for \$105,000.

the \$62,500 from the claim to buy him.

They thought they had bought a nice, useful New York-bred with whom they could have some fun and perhaps make some money. What they purchased, however, was a piece of history.

Funny Cide showed his ability in the mornings and caught the attention of Mike Sellitto, agent for jockey Jose Santos, one of the top riders of the 1990s who was attempting a comeback but finding it difficult getting good mounts.

One morning Sellitto told Santos,

“Go over and work this horse for Barclay Tagg. He’s supposed to be a good one.”

Tagg told Santos to work a half in :49, and Santos was surprised to learn he had gone in :47½. He felt the gelding was as classy as any other 2-year-old he’d even been on. The two would team up 21 times over the next 2½ years.

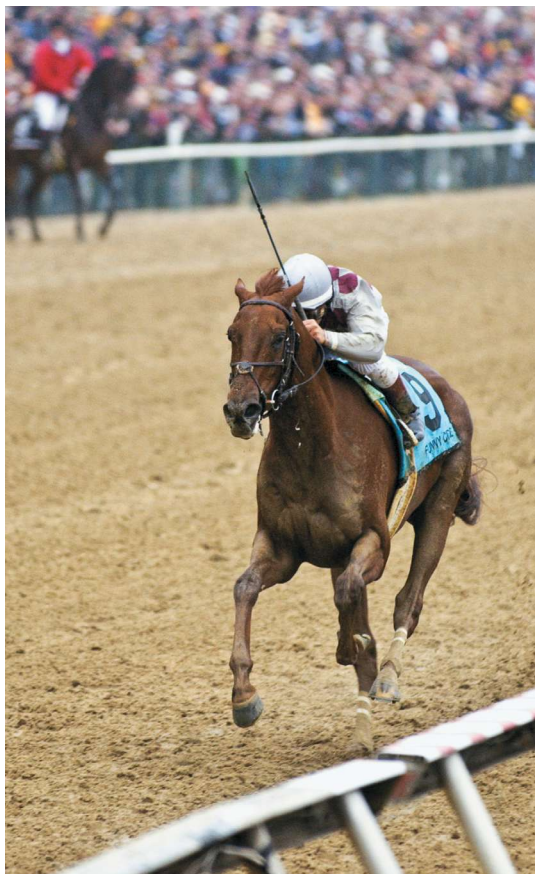
Funny Cide won his first three career starts, including the Bertram F. Bongard and Sleepy Hollow stakes for New York-breds, after which he was out for three months with a chronic lung infection that had clogged up his trachea. At 3 he finished a better-than-it-looked fifth in the Holy Bull Stakes (gr. III) and then followed that with a game third to the highly regarded Peace Rules in the Louisiana Derby (gr. II) (Funny Cide was placed second by the stewards when Kafwain was disqualified). Sent off at 5-1 in the Wood Memorial, Funny Cide battled Empire Maker to a half-length decision, earning a sizable 110 Beyer Speed Figure.

Following the Wood, Smullen was in tears, but they were tears of pride after seeing how hard the horse had tried and how far he had moved up in the world.

Funny Cide was the last horse to arrive at Churchill Downs, coming to Louisville the Thursday before Derby Day after having worked five-eighths under Smullen in :58¾ at Belmont Park.

Although he had the credentials to be a legitimate Derby contender, having held his own against Empire Maker, he was sent off at 12-1 at Churchill Downs, with Empire Maker bet down to 5-2 favorite, followed by Peace Rules, Ten Most Wanted, Buddy Gil, and Atswhatimtalknabout, all of whom were under 10-1.

The walkover to the paddock on Derby Day was not what Tagg and Smullen had expected. Funny Cide lost his composure in front of the massive and noisy crowd and was nearly out of control.

Smullen, out of desperation, brought the horse to the inside rail as far away from the crowd as possible.

“Funny, what are you doing? You’re letting me down; don’t let me down here,” she pleaded with the horse.

In the tunnel he was even worse, and it was a question of whether he had already lost the race. But as soon as he emerged from the tunnel and into the paddock, he settled and was a perfect gentleman the rest of the time.

As history shows, Funny Cide became sports’ new Cinderella story when he defeated Empire Maker by 1¾ lengths in the Kentucky Derby, writing one of the great fairy tale chapters in racing lore. Tagg, who was as far from the celebrity type as any other high-profile figure in memory, tried to downplay it all and just concentrate on the Preakness Stakes (gr. I), but was besieged by the media, who tried their hardest to penetrate Tagg’s

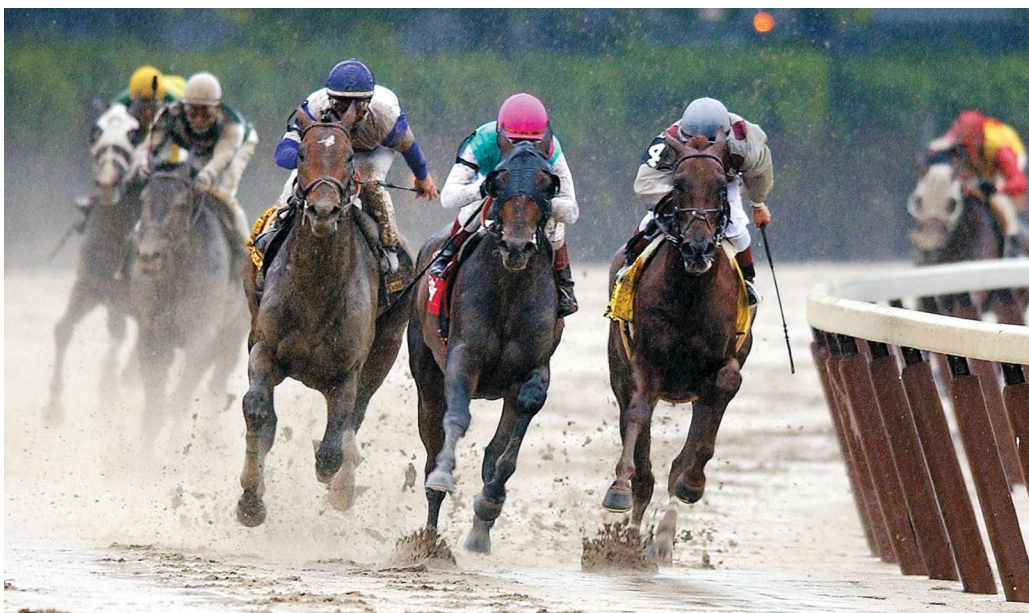
stone face and abrupt, but honest, demeanor.

Tagg was a trainer first and foremost and wasn’t going to let the media stand in his way of training his horse. As for Sackets Harbor, the town had not seen that much excitement since the British attacked its shipyard during the War of 1812. Once again the town was invaded: this time by TV news crews and reporters.

The joy of victory, which resulted in a celebration at the state capitol in Albany, was tempered a bit when an article in the *Miami Herald* suggested Santos was carrying a battery. Santos sued the newspaper for libel and eventually settled the lawsuit. A full investigation by Churchill Downs’ stewards cleared Santos, too, but not before his name had been dragged through the mud. The controversy deeply affected his wife, Rita, and their four children. He was determined to set the record straight and rode the tar out of Funny Cide in the Preakness, winning by 9¾ lengths. At the wire Santos held up two fingers, signifying two legs of the Triple Crown, and then an open hand, showing the world there was nothing there.

But Santos’ exuberance in driving Funny Cide to the wire didn’t sit too well with Tagg, who wanted to save something for the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) in three weeks.

Those three weeks were unlike anything seen in New York in quite a while. The media used Tagg’s barn as Town Hall, gathering around at all hours. Tagg, meanwhile, did all he could to keep Funny Cide away from photographers and the hordes of onlookers intent on following him to the track. Tagg’s announcement that Funny Cide would have his final work for the Belmont on the Wednesday before the race at 8:30 brought out crews from CNN, Fox, and all the other major networks and publications. But when they arrived they were told Funny Cide had worked at 5:30.

Tagg can laugh about it all today. “He could be high-strung, and I didn’t want to risk upsetting the horse by having all those people running after him,” Tagg said, “I know that didn’t make me very popular.”

Like so many others before and after him, Funny Cide came up short in the Belmont, which, amazingly, drew more than 100,000 enthusiastic fans, despite a cold, rainy, and downright miserable day. The gelding set the early pace in the slop but tired at the top of the stretch, finishing third behind a fresh Empire Maker, who had skipped the Preakness.

Although disappointed, Sackatoga partner Dave Mahan, a caterer from Connecticut, put it all in perspective following the race.

“It could be worse,” he said. “I could be back home stuffing chickens.”

Funny Cide would have a long up and down career, winning the 2004 Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I) and several lesser stakes, and placing in a number of grade I and grade II stakes. When he ran in the 2004 Saratoga Breeders’ Cup Handicap (gr. II), he brought out a record crowd of more than 70,000, which brought traffic around Saratoga to a standstill for miles.

Funny Cide was never the same horse the nation fell in love with in the spring

of 2003, suffering from back and respiratory problems, but he concluded his career with an emotional victory in the 2007 Wadsworth Memorial Handicap at Finger Lakes, which was as close as he’d ever get to Sackets Harbor. In August 2007, the New York Racing Association held a “Funny Cide Retirement Party” at Saratoga, as the gelding paraded around the paddock and on the track to

the cheers of his fans. He retired from racing having amassed more than \$3.5 million in earnings.

The horse who stole America’s hearts wound up being a pony for Tagg and was often seen tied up on the path behind Tagg’s barn, all by himself. Years earlier you couldn’t get anywhere near the horse. He has since made appearances at Churchill Downs on Kentucky Derby week, spent some time as a guest at Cabin Creek Farm, the New York division of Old Friends, during which time he visited Saratoga Race Course, and currently resides at the Kentucky Horse Park, where he’s been since 2008.

In April 2010, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders voted Funny Cide the New York–bred Horse of the Decade.

In August 2012, a statue of Funny Cide was unveiled in Saratoga. On his saddle towel is the number 6, his saddle towel number when he won the Kentucky Derby. 🐾
