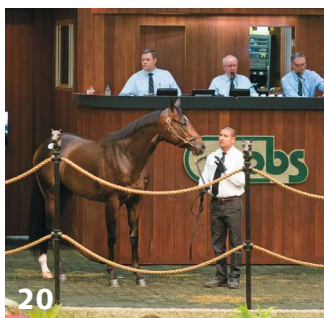

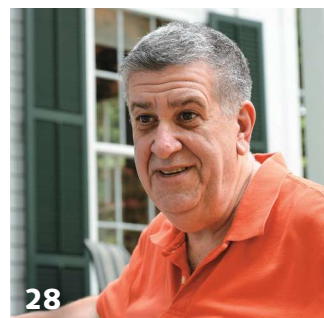

Legislative Session Wrap: NYTB Fund Cap Extender Bill Set, Future of NYRA & FLGR Open-Ended

THE recently-concluded legislative session in Albany produced one familiar, yet essential provision for the welfare of New York's breeders: passage of the Fund Cap Extender. On the other hand, at session's end, the picture of the long-term future of the New York Racing Association and Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack still remains murky.

New York Thoroughbred Breeders' Fund Cap Extender bill has passed the legislature six straight years. This may seem like old news, but this provision is essential for the fiscal well-being of our breeding program and should not be taken for granted. The law raises an originally mandated cap on Fund breeders' awards of 50% to 65% to ensure breeders can receive all the money their horses earn so that our program remains viable. NYTBA first lobbied successfully for the passage of this bill in 2010, and each year the legislature has passed it, but scheduled the law to sunset after one year. Each year NYTBA has pushed this one-year extender through the legislative process.

As to the future of NYRA, although both houses of the legislature passed matching bills outlining a board structure to replace the state-mandated NYRA Reorganization Board, the legislation failed to find favor with Gov. Cuomo, who proposed a different model whereby the state would retain greater influence than proposed in the Senate/Assembly bills and take millions from NYRA's capital and operations VLT revenue. Ultimately, the governor cut the knot by announcing the tenure of the current NYRA Reorganization Board would be extended for a second time, until Oct. 18, 2017.

I assure you, NYTBA won't just be sitting around waiting to see the outcome of next year's legislation.

We have started work on Day One to make sure that, once again, NYTBA and the horsemen (New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association) play a central and active role in discussions about NYRA's future as the issues play out over the coming year.

I am convinced the industry would benefit from a truly privatized NYRA, where owners, breeders, horsemen, and invested interests con-

trol the majority of the board. The key is that the industry's principle stakeholders are able to develop long-term plans. By definition, these are the right people to make the major decisions about capital development at the three racetracks, racing operations, wagering and simulcasting, future technology, new owner development, hospitality, and the exploration of strategic off-track wagering models in New York City.

In the western part of the state the Finger Lakes Horsemen's media campaign to lobby for needed purse protection after the upcoming opening of the del Lago Casino was successful, to a point. Although there was no legislation in play, del Lago felt the pressure of the advertising and approached NYTBA with a proposal: del Lago would commit to pay the sum originally budgeted for Tioga Downs (now a full-fledged casino) to the Finger Lakes horsemen (Finger Lakes Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association) to bolster purses (upward of \$500,000). The condition (reasonable) was that the Tioga arrangement could be ratified formally by legislation. This offer, which came in the waning hours of the legislative session, could at least mark the beginning of substantive negotiations with Delaware North about the possibility that, given the estimated \$13 million in gaming tax relief granted to this gaming/racetrack operator by the state, they could ante up the remainder of what would be lost to horsemen's purses from the opening of del Lago.

NYTB conveyed the proposal to the FLHBPA. In an emergency meeting on the final scheduled day of the legislative session the FLHBPA board voted to reject del Lago's proposal. The group hopes, instead, that it can negotiate a better agreement with del Lago and Delaware North on their own. We will continue to advise and assist the FLHBPA any way we possibly can. I'm hoping their strategy produces results.

So, at the end of this stormy session, many questions remain but, for NYRA at least, we can continue to exert all our best energies, with the support of the board and NYTBA members, to carve out a path for the future that will work to the advantage of our breeders, our horsemen, and our industry. 🐾

SILVER MISSION TOPS TREMONT

Silver Mission, from the first crop of New York stallion Mission Impazible, improved upon his stellar maiden win April 21 with a 6¼-length victory June 10 in Belmont Park's Tremont Stakes for 2-year-olds. The gray/roan colt is trained by Todd Pletcher for Twin Creeks Racing Stables (Steve Davison and Randy Gullatt) and Sequel Racing (Becky Thomas), the breeders of Silver Mission.

Mission Impazible stands at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson for \$7,500.

Silver Mission took command of the 5½-furlong Tremont from the start, zipping through a :22.99 opening quarter-mile under John Velazquez, and a half-mile in :45.89 on his way to a final clocking of 1:03.78. The complete order of finish behind Silver Mission was Hey Mike, Pachi Cruze, and Saratoga Two Step.

"It was pretty easy," Velazquez said. "He's pretty quick for a little guy. He's also pretty talented for as little as he is."

"Silver Mission is a smaller colt that is very quick with a humongous heart," Gullatt said. "He is incredibly professional. He's been like that from day one."

"Any time that there is 'drama' in a race its going to play into his favor," he said. "On that day there was a horse that acted up in the gate, and they had to reload, and that's right up his alley because it's not going to blow his mind. He's going to run his race. Those are the little intangibles that Mission Impazible is passing on to his foals, which is a huge thing, especially with 2-year-olds."

Taking full advantage of the New York-bred program's bonuses as the breeder, owner, and stallion operator, Gullatt noted Silver Mission took home a total of \$174,300 following the score. Silver Mission earned \$92,000 in his maiden win April 21 at Aqueduct including breeder's award, open company owner's award, and stallion owner's award. Owner and trainer bonuses were also paid.

"The purse was \$200,000 and we ended up with \$174,300," Gullatt said. "That's between the stallion bonus, the breeder's awards, the owners bonus, and the purse. Is that not incredible?"

In two starts Silver Mission has earned \$161,000 in purses and \$93,300 in breeders, owners, and stallion owner awards from the New York Thoroughbred Breeding Fund.

Mission Impazible (by Unbridled's Song) won the Louisiana Derby (gr. II) at 3 and the New Orleans Handicap (gr. II) at 4 for Twin Creeks. An earner of \$1,284,949, he may have pocketed significantly more, considering he ran second in three grade I events.

It's early, but Mission Impazible—who has 48 named 2-year-olds—is the nation's leading first-crop sire (through June 16) with \$185,540 in earnings with two winners. His Kentucky-bred Proud Mission broke her maiden first time out in May at Lone Star Park. His Paz the Bourbon, second in her debut at Belmont May 26 for Bourbon Lane Stable and trainer Mark Hennig, is being pointed toward the July 17 Lynbrook Stakes for state-breds.

"With 2-year-olds you can never count your chickens until they hatch; things happen," Gullatt said of the sire's quick start. "But when they happen like this, it's pretty awesome."

According to the Report of Mares Bred issued by The Jockey Club, Mission Impazible bred 105 mares in 2014 (yearlings of 2016).

"I think the yearling crop looks better, some of the individuals, than his 2-year-old crop, so we're really excited about what he can do," Gullatt said.

While Mission Impazible's number dipped to 60 during his third season (a stallion's most difficult), Gullatt reports the phone kept ringing following Silver Mission's debut win and that Mission Impazible will wind up breeding around 100 mares in 2016.

Uncle Mo Colt Tops State-Breds at OBS June



New York-bred Uncle Mo—Surrender colt working a quarter mile in :21½ at OBS June

He is the first foal out of Surrender, by Stormy Atlantic, and was bred by Fred Hertrich III. He purchased Surrender in foal to Uncle Mo at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky winter mixed sale.

A bay colt by red-hot sire Uncle Mo selling during the final session of the four-day Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June sale topped the New York-bred offerings by going for \$240,000. Breeze Easy was the listed buyer and the colt, who went a quarter-mile in :21½ during the under tack show, was sold by Thoroughbred Champions Training Center.

State-breds held their own, as they have throughout the juvenile sale season. At the June sale 53 New York-breds were reported as sold for an average of \$26,606 and a median of \$14,000. The overall sale's average was \$29,675, and the median was \$13,000.

A filly by Pure Prize—Firm Affair also brought six figures, selling for \$105,000 from the Costanzo Sales consignment to E. L. R. Corp. Bred by Barry Ostrager, the filly had been a \$33,000 Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale weanling in 2014.

Fingerpainter Colors Niagara at 18-1

Fingerpainter (by Nobiz Like Shobiz), sent off at 18-1, got up by a head in front of 1-4 choice Absatootly to annex the \$50,000 Niagara Stakes June 20 at Finger Lakes. The 3-year-old filly raced the six furlongs in 1:11.35.

Fingerpainter, who is owned and trained by Timothy Murphy, had tried stakes competition at the Farmington oval twice at 2, finishing well back in the Lady Finger Stakes last Septem-

ber, and, after breaking her maiden in an intervening start, running a close second in the Shesastonecoldfox Stakes in November. Before the Niagara, she made a pair of conditioned allowance starts two weeks apart at Finger Lakes, finishing off the board May 16 and second over good going May 30.

Fingerpainter was bred by Richard and Kay Zwirn and foaled at their Rainbow Fields Farm near Gansevoort.

She is one of four winners from five foals to start out of Twinkie Zone, a New York homebred for Very Un Stable. The Zwirns purchased the multiple winner for \$1,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton New York mixed sale. The mare currently has a 2-year-old filly by Cosmonaut.

With a record of three wins and two seconds from nine starts, Fingerpainter has earned \$71,627. *By Sarah Mace*

ANCIENT SECRET STEPS OUT IN WILD APPLAUSE

Stepping out of state-bred company for the first time Ancient Secret rallied to win Belmont Park's Wild Applause Stakes June 19 by a head. The New York-bred 3-year-old filly is by Kantharos—Privacy, by Notebook. She got the one mile on turf in 1:33.92.

Trained by Chad Brown, Ancient Secret races for Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables. In her two previous starts Ancient Secret topped state-bred maidens by three lengths going six furlongs on the turf last October and won a seven-furlong state-bred allowance by ¼ lengths on the turf.

Three for three, she's earned \$139,200.

Bred by Lambholm and foaled at Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, Ancient Secret was prepped by de Meric Sales, agent, for the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale and was purchased by Steven W. Young, agent, for \$225,000.

Privacy's second dam is grade II sprint winner Funistrada, the dam of top runners Conte Di Savoya and Kri-sada, along with the dams of graded winners Spring Venture, Rahystrada, and Lone Star Sky. She is the third dam of Ahh Chocolate, winner of this year's Allaire DuPont Distaff Stakes (gr. III).

For example, the average North American purse in 2015 is \$21,782 or 50% of the 2015 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 50% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 57%. Hooked on Horses

ON THE MORNING OF MAY 30, Big Apple Showcase Day for New York-breds at Belmont Park, Joe Appelbaum sat at a table overlooking the track's picturesque paddock. The view was a familiar one.

"I grew up in Manhattan, born and bred on the tough streets of the Upper East Side," he said with a smile. "A group of friends and I used to go to the races together, primarily in Saratoga and then here pretty much every weekend, from late teens into my early 20s. We're still friends to this day."

To hear Appelbaum tell it, his life as a young adult revolved around the racetrack. Working at a summer camp not far from Saratoga, he and his fellow counselors would head to the track on their days off...or sneak off to get in a few races early in the card. During college and in the years immediately afterward, he and his race-track crew would settle themselves into the backyard at Belmont for a day's racing, then head out for the evening of post-race socializing.

"That was pretty much our weekend activity," he said.

It was one of those weekends that led him directly to Thoroughbred ownership.

"One of my friends went to Skidmore (College), and Saratoga's always been kind of a focal point for us," he said. "In 2001 when Dr. Kashnikow won the Fourstardave (Handicap, gr. IIT) at Saratoga, we hit quite a large Pick 6, and three of us took

the money and claimed our first horse, back at Aqueduct. The horse's name was Country Only, and we hired Leah Gyarmati, who was just starting out then, as our first trainer."

The trainer they claimed from was Carlos Morales, who had come to the United States to train after a successful career in his native Venezuela. Before long Morales was no longer a rival: a year after the Venezuelan lost Country Only to Appelbaum, the two founded Off The Hook, a partnership to breed, develop, race, and sell Thoroughbreds.

Among their early ventures was putting together a small partnership and buying a yearling filly by Siphon for \$60,000. Morales picked her out, and though they initially planned to race her, the partnerships decided to try to pinhook her. She sold for \$500,000, to Aaron and Marie Jones.

Easy game, right?

"That was in about 2004," Appelbaum said. "Little did I know that the market was going to peak in 2006. It's not as lucrative anymore—it's much work and there's too much risk."

Appelbaum, Morales, and their other partners seldom pinhook these days, and about a decade ago they bought a farm and training facility near Ocala, Fla. They've got 15-20 broodmares that drop their foals in either Florida or New York, and the foals are raised, broken, and trained there, under Morales' supervision.

"He runs the farm and does a lot of our bloodstock work, and he evaluates the babies," said Appelbaum.

One of their first ventures into breeding was with the stallion True Direction (a son of French Deputy). Purchased in 2000 as a yearling and raced by longtime New York breeder Moreton Binn, with whom Appelbaum would later partner, he won the Fall Highweight Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct in 2002 and retired

with a record of 8-3-2 in 19 starts, earning \$348,570.

In 2007 Off The Hook purchased American Skipper (by Quiet American) at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$47,000. Tom Coleman, one of Appelbaum's partners, bred her to Binn's True Direction, and the first foal she produced for them was the multiple stakes-winning New York-bred Zivo, winner of the Suburban

Handicap (gr. II) in 2014.

Now standing at Irish Hill Century Farm near Stillwater, N.Y., for \$6,000, Zivo covered his first mares this year. Appelbaum estimates Zivo's first book was about 40 mares, a dozen or so of them from the mares Appelbaum owns in various partnerships.

"We'd love to breed more to him," he said, "but unless you're Freud or maybe Big Brown, the reality of the New York sire market is that it's extremely competitive. You have to price yourself accordingly and be incredibly aggressive about discounting to get the mares you need."

The recent out-of-the-gate successful stallion careers of fellow New York sires Frost Giant and Giant Surprise offer Appelbaum not only reason for hope but also a model for launching Zivo's career.

"We'll support our stallion, and we'll race a number of those foals. We think that's important," said Appelbaum, pointing to Mike Repole's success last year with Giant Surprise's first crop.

Off The Hook generally keeps about 10% of the foals it breeds to race, and while they may make an exception for Zivo's early foals, Appelbaum is also optimistic about the foals' chances at auction, given the bloodlines that trace to both Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (UAE-I) winner Well Armed and Japanese Horse of the Year

Symboli Kris S on his dam's side.

"We all know that going to the racetrack with a horse is the poorest decision from a straight economic perspective," he admitted with a rueful smile. "That's the secret we're not supposed to tell anyone.

"We look to maximize our horses' economic potential," continued the man who graduated from Yale with degrees in political science and economics. "We can sell a mare in foal, sell a weanling, sell a yearling, sell a 2-year-old. We can sell horses of racing age off the track, or we can run like we did with Zivo, and we were very fortunate there. We're agnostic as to when we sell, but we're in a business to pay boarding and the feed bill and our staff.

"We keep an affordable number to race, which allows us to keep a hand in the game while supporting our breeding program."

Among the New York-bred successes they've bred or raced are Tamberino, who won the Staten Island division of the New York Stallion Stakes in 2007, and Mighty Eros, winner of the Park Avenue division of the series in the same year. The latter retired with two wins from only six lifetime starts and earnings of \$95,577, but her 2014 filly by Ghostzapper brought \$720,000 earlier this year at the Ocala Breeders' Sales

Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training.

"She's with Bob Baffert right now, and we wish them all the luck," said Appelbaum. "We're rooting for them."

Other horses he and Morales are keeping their eyes on are Grand Tito, a multiple graded stakes winner, most recently of the Mac Diarmida Stakes (gr. IIT) at Gulfstream in March, for their Venezuelan clients Grupo 7C Racing Stable, and the New York-bred Melodic, a rare recent pinhook whom they purchased for \$50,000 as a yearling and sold as a 2-year-old for \$150,000 to Jeff Treadway. Trained by Gyarmati, Melodic (by Tale of the Cat) won the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes at Belmont last September and was second in the Key Cents Stakes at Aqueduct in November.

Corner Three, owned in partnership with Coleman and Doheny Racing Stable, won three of five last year for trainer Chad Brown before being injured, and Appelbaum hopes to see her return to the races later this year.

After forays into a couple of other careers, Appelbaum is now involved in racing and breeding full time. He and his wife, Lindsey Douglas, a pediatrician at The Children's Hospital at Montefiore in the Bronx, have two young daughters, and before turning to racing and breeding full-time, Appelbaum spent a number of years working with young people,

including co-founding Oasis Children’s Services, which brought summer camp experiences and after-school programs to New York City children who might not otherwise have such opportunities.

“I’m very proud of it,” he said. “My family had been in that business for a long time, and Oasis started a camp for 500 kids in Brownsville, Brooklyn. They were swimming two or three times a week, and we also provided academics and sports. A lot of people told us we couldn’t do it.”

Appelbaum’s father, Ben, who died in 1996, had owned summer camps and started a number of businesses, and he was committed to supporting and fostering the entrepreneurial spirit in other people.

“He helped launch a bunch of people,” explained Appelbaum, “not so much with money but by giving them a less than subtle nudge in the backside. He loved to engage people who were starting their own businesses and trying to take control of their own lives.”

To honor his father’s memory and continue his legacy, Appelbaum was one of several people who founded the Ben Appelbaum Foundation, which works with people of varying backgrounds and

economic classes. Aware of the privileges of his own life, Appelbaum wanted to continue to help people who don’t get a chance, as he put it, to go to Harvard Business School.

“We provide technical assistance, mentoring, and networks of support that they might not be able to find ordinarily,” he said.

After playing football at Yale—“a little,” he said. “Not as much as I’d have liked”—Appelbaum began his professional life by coaching the sport at the college level. During a stint at Hofstra University, he coached Wayne Chrebet, who played for the New York Jets for 11 years, and he recruited the Giants’ Victor Cruz to the University of Massachusetts, though the racetrack lured him away before he had the chance to work with Cruz on the gridiron.

A member of the board of directors of New York Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association, Appelbaum has spent his adult life seeking the potential in others, at first humans—football players, children, entrepreneurs—and now horses, developing talents and interests in others that build on passions in his own life that date back decades.

No doubt that Ivy League degree has

contributed, if only indirectly, to Appelbaum’s success. But undeniably, it is those weekends spent betting in the backyards of New York’s racetracks, combined with the entrepreneurial spirit he received from his father, that have enabled him to build a business with bases in two of the country’s most important racing and breeding markets.

“Carlos’ background as a trainer and mine as a handicapper give us a perspective that not everyone has and that we use to find spots for our horses,” he said. “I think that gives us a competitive advantage.”

Later this summer Appelbaum and his friends will be back at Saratoga. These days they rent two houses to accommodate spouses and children and friends, and Appelbaum spends more time sitting in the clubhouse, the sales pavilion, or meeting rooms than he used to in the backyard.

Which doesn’t mean that Saratoga is any less meaningful now as it was when the track represented a youthful escape from responsibility.

“It’s always a place for us to re-congregate,” he said. “We might not get the whole 40 days, but we still get weekends.” 🐾

Breeder Elliott Masie's first foray into breeding delivers the showstopping Miss Matzoball

WHEN BROADWAY PRODUCER and investor Elliott Masie made the leap from horse owner to breeder, his background in the theatre prepared him to be patient as he waited for the curtain to rise on his newest Thoroughbred venture.

"Broadway shows and horses have a lot in common because they are ultimately about performance and they are both filled with risks," Masie said. "With horses you send them off for matings, but you don't race their offspring for a few years. A lot of Broadway shows, like a lot of horses, might be wonderful but not make a lot of money. You have to go into it with that passion for the performance. If it all comes together and you make money, it's wonderful. And like horses, when a Broadway show is successful, it helps pay for the next Broadway show.

"Boy, it's nice when we get those New York-bred bonus checks in the mail," he added. "That's very exciting."

Masie, 66, and his wife, Cathy, have choreographed hits on the stage and on the racetrack. The couple, whose company Masie Productions has been involved in several popular musicals, including the Tony Award-winning *Kinky Boots*, are the breeders and owners of New York-bred Miss Matzoball, their first stakes winner solely owned by them, as well as the first horse they bred.

A daughter of Smoke Glacken, Miss Matzoball won the \$75,000 Captiva Island Handicap going five furlongs on the turf at Gulfstream Park in March. The Captiva Island came on the heels of a victory in an allowance optional claiming race a month earlier at the Florida oval. Trained by Roy Lerman, Miss Matzoball also made a good account of herself at Pimlico Race Course, where she finished fourth in the \$100,000 The Very One Stakes on this year's Preakness undercard at the same five-furlong trip. An earner of \$188,171, the 4-year-old grass specialist has a record of 4-2-1 in 13 starts.

The Masies, Saratoga Springs, N.Y., residents who became involved in racing as owners in 2002 by dabbling in a few partnerships, decided several years ago they wanted their ownership involvement to reflect a more hands-on approach. One of the initial horses they privately purchased to run in their silks was Miss Matzo, a Maryland-bred daughter of the 1990 Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) winner Royal Academy.

Miss Matzo raced only once, finishing fourth in a maiden special weight at Saratoga Race Course in 2009 for trainer Seth Benzel. The filly subsequently

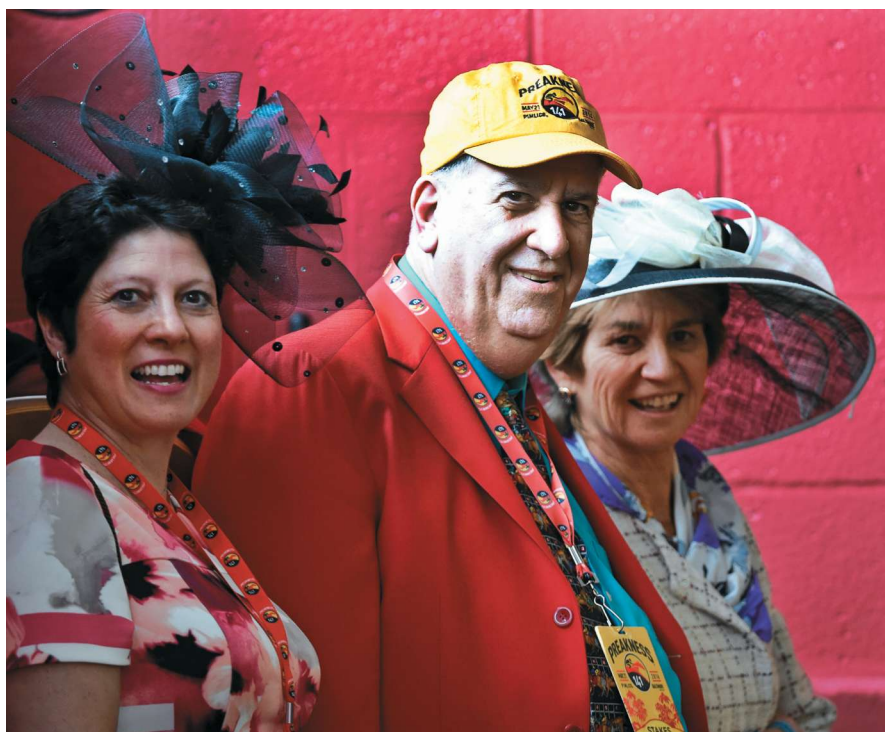

had a nasty encounter with a swarm of bees while on the farm and injured her leg when she fell to the ground during the attack. The Masies retired her and decided the time was right to begin breeding their own racing stock with Miss Matzo as their foundation mare.

Miss Matzoball is the first foal out of Miss Matzo and the dam's first winner.

Miss Matzoball has two half sisters, both by Girolamo, Moonshine Cate, who is nearing a return to the races after finishing a close-up fourth in her career debut last year at Saratoga, and Kinky Sox, an unraced 2-year-old who is expected to be introduced to the races later this year. There is also a Proud Citizen yearling filly, Citizen Matzo.

This year Miss Matzo gave birth to another filly, who has been named Matzo Bella, and is by multiple Eclipse Award winner Gio Ponti. The mare is currently in foal to Lookin At Lucky, the 2010 Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner and champion 2-year-old and 3-year-old.

"We are deeply committed to being New York breeders and owners," said Masie, who owns the Saratoga Springs-based MASIE Center, an international think tank. "We are entrepreneurs—I've helped start other businesses in New York. We have a day job—we run a

industry, was appealing to us.

"The other thing I feel strongly about is New York's agricultural industry," he continued. "I identify with that as a Saratogian. You can look at the racetrack in Saratoga and it's incredible, and then you drive six miles out, and you just see horse farm after horse farm. It was the idea that we could be involved in a vibrant part of New York State's economy that appealed to us. We're all in."

Masie grew up in Washington Heights, a neighborhood situated in the northern portion of the borough of Manhattan. He said the nearest he ever came to a horse as a kid was when the vegetable grocer canvassed Masie's street in his horse-drawn cart.

But now that Masie has a familiarity with horses, he can't get enough of being around them.

By now, she has it down to a science. Baby kicks out, and three hours later we can be at the barn, and Miss Matzo is like, ‘Come on in and see your new kid.’”

Little did the Masies know that their first “kid” would draw rave reviews.

“(Recently) when Miss Matzoball ran, someone said to me, ‘Who would have thought that your first attempt at breeding would end up with you having a horse who runs in stakes.’ So really this whole experience is just a wow feeling. We had never dreamed that, but we’re so enjoying it.” 🐾
