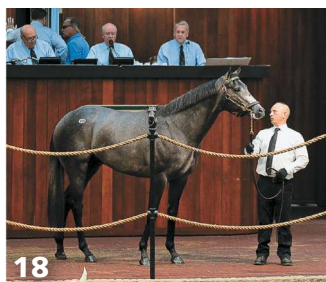

Gate Scratch of New York Sports Betting: a Blessing in Disguise?

SHORTLY BEFORE THE STATE Legislature ended its 2018 session June 21, both houses abandoned efforts to bring matching bills on legalized sports betting to the floor for a vote. While some are lamenting a “missed opportunity” for the Empire State, there is a good argument to be made that tackling the issues afresh in budget negotiations next January or even through the (admittedly longer) process of a state-wide referendum will produce a better outcome, both for the racing sector and the state.

New York legislators began working on the issue early this year in anticipation of a United States Supreme Court decision that would clear the way for legalized sports betting nationwide. When the decision came down May 14, activity in Albany reached a fever pitch. At that point there were fewer than two months remaining for legislators to formulate a comprehensive sports betting bill for New York and only 15 session days.

The chairs of the Racing and Wagering Committees of both houses (the retiring Sen. John Bonacic and Gary Pretlow of the Assembly) should be commended for spearheading the efforts to produce legislation in their respective houses, but the efforts foundered, in the end, due to the extreme complexity of the issues.

Here is where we stand. The 2013 constitutional amendment authorizing the construction of four new casinos included a sports betting clause that was automatically activated by the Supreme Court’s May decision. It thus became legal in New York for a person to place a bet on sports, but only under certain circumstances. He or she must be physically present in one of the following four cities: Tyre (del Lago Resort and Casino), Schenectady (Rivers Casino and Resort), Nichols (Tioga Downs and Casino), or Kiamesha Lake (Resorts World Catskills).

Not only are these conditions circumscribed, but as a matter of fact none of these casinos can actually accept sports betting right now because they are awaiting necessary rules and regulations of operation from the New York State Gaming Commission. The commission has spoken of putting forth regulations in the “near term.” We need to note, however, that Daily Fantasy Sports gambling was legalized two years ago, but the relevant companies are still operating with only temporary licenses because the Gaming Commission has not completed the rule-making process.

As reflected in the bills proposed by legislators this session, a comprehensive sports betting plan for New York needs to incorporate mobile wagering, accommodate exclusivity claims of tribal casinos, and articulate a concrete, well-defined link to the horse racing industry (OTBs and racetracks). An extra stumbling block in this session’s work was the need to formulate an unwieldy “workaround” whereby racing entities would need to become “affiliates” of one of the four casinos to accept sports bets.

The state needs a clean, clear, and comprehensive introduction of sports wagering into the landscape of the state’s gaming industry, and racing needs a place in the mainstream of the legislation rather than participating only through some kind of backdoor affiliation with a “stranger” casino.

I think it is to everyone’s advantage to wait for better legislation in the off-session that would be introduced into the budget process, or even go through the referendum process whereby legislation would need to pass two consecutive legislatures before a state-wide vote. These routes would at least provide complete clarity and transparency about the position tracks would hold in landscape of sports betting.

Finally, I would like to address a common misconception about the likely impact of sports betting on the racing sector. Sports books have relatively slim profit margins compared to casinos, racetracks, and OTBs. Whatever slim percentage racing could receive from sports betting through the legislative process will be, in my opinion, relatively, immaterial when divided among dozens of entities.

The biggest boon for racing will come from “cross-pollination” of the sports bettors and horse players. In addition is the expanded and new exposure racing will receive via the simulcast and various in-house signals broadcast throughout all the sports betting facilities.

Ideally, racetracks, OTBs, and online wagering sites will offer opportunities for sports betting and vice versa. This could be a huge win for racing, and the earliest data suggest that far from cannibalizing wagers on horse racing, sports betting can significantly increase racing handle by exposing more potential players to the racing product.

On Father’s Day at Monmouth, the first weekend that sports betting was offered at the track, racing numbers were up across the board (8% in in-house simulcast handle, 17% in handle on the live racing program, and 21% in attendance). Lines were reported at both sports betting kiosks and pari-mutuel windows. More people were at the track doing both kinds of betting.

Patience is required, but I have no doubt that, whatever route New York takes to reach the goal, racing and sports betting will be an excellent fit and racing will be a winner by being brought into the mainstream of sports wagering nationally. 🐾

second, to win the Kentucky Oaks after Paradise Woods handed her an 11 1/4-length thrashing in the Santa Anita Oaks (G) — their final prep for the filly classic. Bettors sent her off at 9-1 odds, and she appeared to be running worse than those when she trailed her 13 rivals early over the sloped (banked) track. But when Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith alighted her out to wide for a grinding rally after Paradise Woods flew through opening fractions of :22.70 and :46.54, Abel Tasman proved her mettle.

Her Kentucky Oaks was probably one of the most exciting I've had in a long time. It was a thrilling win," Baffert said. "We didn't really expect it. She had everything going against her... Usually we're the heavy favorite, so when we do win, we're just relieved everything went well. But for her to win that race—especially considering how she was last down the backside, to hope at all—for her to win, it was special."

At the end of 2017, after she missed the Breeders' Cup Distaff by

a half-length to Forever Unbridled, Abel Tasman was given turnout time. Baffert brought her back in as a rush, with a plan that most of her 2018 campaign would take place in the second half of the season. He called the filly a seasonal favorite, not only because of her surprising Kentucky Oaks win but because of her gentle nature.

"She will tend your heart. She is just so sweet," he said. "She's got a great mind on her, and she's fun to be around. She's one of my favorites."

"I hope they loved her to the American Pharoah. (But the fan) would probably be so nice, it wouldn't want to run."

The 10-month-La Troienne seems an easy enough spot to get Abel Tasman's season started. None of her rivals in the right-bros' field have won a grade 1.

The morning-line second choice in grade 1 winner Sable, who finished a length behind Abel Tasman in the Acorn and came in third in the Coaching Club and

MAE NEVER NO IS FIRST WINNER FOR SIRE, DAM

Mae Never No becomes Irish freshman sire No Nay Never's first winner May 3 at Belmont Park.

Irish first-crop sire and group 1 winner No Nay Never picked up his first winner May 3 at Belmont Park, where Ice Wise Stable bombarded Mae Never No captured a free-frothing maiden special weight in her debut by 1 1/4 lengths.

Trained by Wesley Ward and bred in Ireland, Mae Never No is the first foal of grade 1 bloodstock winner Sweet Shirley Mae. Ice Wise Stable partners Dave Reid and Frank Amosson bought the mare—a daughter of Broken Vow—April 2017, by Ruby—for \$60,000 out of the Longfield Farm consignment at the 2011 Keeneland September yearling sale. She won four races and placed second in the Spanghaney Stakes (G) and third in the Breeders' Cup Distaff Sprint.

Ice Wise Stable also campaigned No Nay Never in partnership with Coolmore connections. They acquired the son of Fast Dubby—Cot's Eye Witness, by Elusive Quality, after Coughlin Bloodstock bought him for \$95,000 at the 2012 Keeneland September yearling sale from Paramount Sales. He was medaled at a win victories in the Norfolk Stakes (G) and the Dewey Park Money (G). At 3, he won the Woodford Stakes Presented by Keeneland Select (G) and finished second in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G) at Santa Anita Park.

The stallion was retired to Coolmore stud in Ireland with a 4-2-0 record out of six starts and \$677,999 in earnings. No Nay Never stands for \$25,000.

DREAMING DIAMONDS FIRST WINNER FOR CROSS TRAFFIC

Dreaming Diamonds gave Speedyhart Farm's grade 1-winning freshman sire Cross Traffic his first check mark in the winner's column May 3 when she captured a 4 1/2-length maiden special weight at Churchill Downs in near gate-to-wire fashion by 2 1/4 lengths.

The filly out of the 17-wildcat daughter and stakes winner Kumbi got her first win in her second start for her second set of owners, Rob Auerbach and Marc Winston. Taylor Made Sales Agency offered Dreaming Diamonds through the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Omaha yearling sale, where she sold for \$1,000 to Tony Battaglia. She wound up in the barn of trainer and former jockey Toney Young, who placed third with her at Keeneland.

Dreaming Diamonds, bred in Kentucky by Jitta Young Thoroughbreds, made that first start for Young and owners Diane Karl and David Hebert before she was moved to Tom Amos' barn. The filly has earned \$34,800. Cross Traffic, a son of Unbridled's Song—Stop Traffic, by Care for the Blues, won the Whitney Instational Handicap (G) and finished second in the Metropolitan Handicap (G) for owner GoldMark Farm and trainer Todd Pletcher. He retired with a 3-0-0 record from six starts and earned \$687,967.

Breeders interested in Cross Traffic had the opportunity to earn lifetime breeding rights to the stallion through Speedyhart's "Share the Upside" program. The stallion stands this year for \$7,500.

DISCO PARTNER DOUBLES DOWN IN JAIPUR

A year ago, Frank and Patricia Generazio's homebred Disco Partner set a world record for six furlongs on the turf (1:05.67) in the Jaipur Invitational Stakes (G2T) at Belmont Park. It took the 6-year-old horse a little longer than a second in the 2018 running June 9 at Belmont Park (1:06.74) but the galloping gray got the job done, earning \$220,000 in the process.

The New York-bred's stablemate, Pure Sensation, finished third in the Jaipur, one of the top turf sprint stakes in the country. Pure Sensation won the Jaipur in 2016.

"My first feeling when you win these kind of races, it's a great credit to Mr. and Mrs. Generazio," said winning trainer Christophe Clement. "They have a wonderful program and they are great owners and breeders to work for. I'm just a lucky guy to train those kind of horses."

Disco Partner, who won four open stakes last year and was

third (beaten a half-length) in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) at Del Mar, passed the \$1 million mark in earnings with his second Jaipur score.

Disco Partner is a third generation star for the Generazios, who also bred the grade 1-winning New York-bred Discreet Marq. Patricia bred his dam, Lulu's Number, in New Jersey, and second dam Mary Lou's Magic in Florida. The late Disco Rico, the sire of Disco Partner, was a multiple graded stakes-winning son of Citidancer who sired 11 other stakes winners.

The Jaipur win, along with Fourstar Crook's score in the New York Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2T; see page 26) and Mind Your Biscuit's narrow

runner-up effort in the Runhappy Metropolitan Handicap (G1) during Belmont Stakes (G1) weekend, proves New York-breds are able to compete, and win, on the world's largest Thoroughbred stages.

SARATOGA GIRO STRIKES IN GEORGE W. BARKER

Henry Steadman and Paul Barrow's Saratoga Giro, a 5-year-old son of former New York sire Girolamo, scored a decisive victory June 4 in the 34th running of the \$50,000 George W. Barker Stakes while getting the better of his 6-year-old rival Breakin the Fever for the second time this year.

Breakin the Fever had won both the 2016 and 2017 Barkers.

Saratoga Giro, the 4-5 choice, faced four other horses in the 2018 Barker. The second choice at 3-2 was Belmont-based Mighty Zealous while Breakin the Fever was 3-1.

Bounding out of the gate from his outside post, Saratoga Giro was the first to show the lead and crossed over. Shortly he was joined by Breakin the Fever to his inside, who grabbed the rail from post four. The pair raced together along the backstretch through an opening quarter in :22.15 while Mighty Zealous stalked two lengths back in third.

Saratoga Giro put a head in front on the turn while clocking a half-mile in :44.76. Opening his lead to one length by the head of the stretch and setting down for the drive, Saratoga

Giro kicked clear and went on to win by 1½ lengths without an anxious moment for jockey Jeremias Flores.

Manipulated finished well in the center of the track to grab second, leaving Mighty Zealous three-quarters of a length farther back in third. The time was 1:11.20.

Bred by Mendean Jonath and trained by Barrow, Saratoga Giro has been a consistent runner on the New York Racing Association circuit and at Finger Lakes. The Barker is his first stakes victory, but in each

of the prior years he has picked up placings in the Ontario County Stakes and Leon Reed Memorial Stakes. In 26 starts the dark bay has won 10 races with six seconds and one third and earned \$295,202.

Saratoga Giro is out of the Silver Deputy mare White Slippers, who has produced three winners from three starters. A two-time veteran of the sales ring, Saratoga Giro was purchased by Woodford Sales at the 2014 Ocala Breeders' Sales' August yearling sale for \$27,000. He brought the same price in 2015 when purchased by Steadman at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-old sale.

DISANTO PLAQUE DEDICATED JUNE 9

A plaque honoring the late trainer and breeder Glenn DiSanto was dedicated June 9 at the Oklahoma Training Track in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., where it was affixed to the outside rail.

DiSanto died Jan. 14, 2017, after a battle with cancer. He was 62.

DiSanto, a veteran of the New York Racing Association circuit, was one of the first to use the Oklahoma track during the off-season at Saratoga Race Course.

“After the passing of Glenn DiSanto in January 2017, a few of his former

owners thought a memento would be appropriate,” said John G. Veitch. “A plaque was decided upon, and NYRA was generous in covering all costs and work involved. The owners contributed the equivalent cost of the plaque to B.E.S.T. (Backstretch Employee Service Team) in September 2017.”

DiSanto was also known for his advocacy for retired Thoroughbred horses and his support of the non-profit ReRun Thoroughbred Adoption.

FIRST WINNER FOR CENTRAL BANKER

Gabe Grossberg's Subsidiary, trained by Mark Casse, aced her Woodbine debut June 2, a 4½-furlong maiden special weight race, to become New York freshman sire Central Banker's first winner. Ridden by Gary Boulanger, the chestnut stopped the clock in :53.53 over the synthetic surface.

Subsidiary was bred in Ontario by James and Janeane Everatt and Arika Everatt-Meeuse. Her dam, Wouldthisbemagic (by Clever Trick), is a half sister to graded winner Street Magician (by Street Cry), and is a graduate of Chester and Mary Broman's broodmare band. Consigned by Sequel Stallions New York on the Broman's behalf at the 2015

Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale, Wouldthisbemagic was purchased with Subsidiary in utero for \$16,000.

Subsidiary was purchased by Gabe and Jess Grossberg for \$70,000 at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale and later RNA'd at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' March sale for \$95,000.

Central Banker stands at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in Saratoga Springs for a 2018 stud fee of \$7,500. A grade 2-winning sprinter by Speightstown out of multiple stakes winner Rhum, Central Banker won or placed nine times in 13 starts at nine different racetracks.

TRF to Benefit from Aug. 14 David Cassidy Tribute Show

David Cassidy will be remembered at a special David Cassidy Tribute Concert Aug. 14 at the Horseshoe Inn, at 9 Gridley Street, in Saratoga Springs.

The concert will run from 8-10 p.m. and will benefit the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, which is celebrating its 35th anniversary.

Cassidy passed away last November at 67. Cassidy had a passion for Thoroughbred racing and was a summer fixture at Saratoga. Cassidy frequented the barns in the morning, the races in the afternoon, and made friends all over town. As an owner, breeder, and fan, Cassidy was ardent in his support of TRF and its mission of saving former racehorses from abuse and neglect.

The tribute show was organized in his memory by Linda de Ambrosio, a lifelong Cassidy fan.

"David certainly inspired parts of my life," de Ambrosio said. "And a lot of people who went through dark times were inspired by his music. Horses were so important to him, as was the work done by the TRF. We felt that a tribute concert was the right way to honor him. We're excited because while there are a lot of tribute bands out there, there aren't too many that have the actual band members in them."

"(The TRF) was very close to David's heart," said drummer Teri Cote. "He deeply cared about the aftercare of Thoroughbred horses once they were no longer able to compete on the racetrack."

The Right Choice

Wise decision at sale reaps rewards on track

IN THE SPRING OF 2015, Kennesaw Mountain Racing's Bill Poston tried to sell a 2-year-old filly that he'd purchased nine months earlier at Keeneland for \$27,000. His primary interest in racing is pinhooking, but every once in a while he ends up taking home a horse he'd intended to sell, and when the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale of 2-year-olds in training was over, that's exactly what he did with Picco Uno, who brought a final bid of only \$34,000.

"We didn't want to let her go cheap," he said.

And he was right: After the mare who brought little interest in the sale won the Dancin Renee for New York-breds June 16 at Belmont Park, her earnings jumped to just under \$414,000, 15 times the amount he had paid to purchase her.

Ridden by Manuel Franco in the Dancin Renee, Picco Uno jumped right to a lead she never relinquished, dominating the six-furlong race on a fast track with a four-length win. Heavily favored Holiday Disguise, a graded stakes winner, never fired, and, unchallenged on the lead, Franco and Picco Uno were able to zip through fractions of 22.25 and 45.23, hitting the wire in 1:09.60 for her second stakes victory.

"We're very excited," said Poston of the partnership that owns the mare, speaking from Marietta, Ga., where the business founded by his family, Traton Homes, is based. "(Trainer) Jason (Servis) said she ran a 96 Beyer, and that's very good for her."

By Macho Uno out of the Western Express mare Piccola Isola, Picco Uno was bred by Topsmeade and Adena Springs Farm. She is the first foal out of the mare.

Picco Uno came to the race off a two-month layoff following a fifth-place finish in the Distaff Handicap (G3) at Aqueduct in April. Her most recent win came at Saratoga last summer in the Union Avenue Stakes.

"Two months ago, (this race) wasn't even on the radar," said Servis. "She had some issues this winter and it took a long time to get her going. But she really started to turn around the last couple of weeks, and she had a really good breeze the other day, so we thought we'd take a shot."

Kennesaw Mountain Racing comprises six friends from Georgia, the partnership taking the name of a local landmark and the site of a major Civil War battle.

"We all live right around the base of it," said Poston. "I'd been involved in racing for about 20 years, and we all decided to go into it together."

The partnership generally has eight to 12 horses, nearly all destined to be pinhooked. What they can't sell they keep to race, but, said Poston, they've no inclination to get into the breeding business.

"When her racing year is over," he said of Picco Uno, "she'll go to Fasig-Tipton or Keeneland and be sold as a broodmare."

At the sales they keep their eyes out for New York-breds and annually attend the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings in Saratoga.

"The purses (for New York-breds) are so nice," he said. "It's a little advantage, and we usually buy a couple in Saratoga each year."

The group had been planning to spend just a week in Saratoga this year, around the time of the sales—good timing, as the sale ends Aug. 12, just four days before this year's Union Avenue, which Picco Uno will attempt to win for the second straight year.

"You always wonder what will happen when you get one back," said Poston. "You always wonder whether they'll be the next stakes winner. It's exciting." 🐾

Stepping Up

Trainer Jason Servis strikes paydirt with recent state-bred pickups

A TASTE OF THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL can sometimes change a trainer's perspective toward the claiming game, but don't number Jason Servis among that group.

Even after a busy winter and spring filled with Triple Crown preps and hopes, the ever-humble 61-year-old trainer remains true to his roots in races for New York-breds and high-priced claimers.

Servis notched his first grade 1 win last October when Mr. Amore Stable's Firenze Fire captured the prestigious Champagne Stakes at Belmont Park. Afterward he took owner Ron Lombardi's homebred to the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) and all four of the New York Racing Association's monthly stakes for 3-year-olds, capped by a fourth-place finish in the Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2).

Firenze Fire earned a spot in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) and finished 11th, but afterward what mattered most to Servis was not his first start in the Run for the Roses, a race his older brother, John, so famously won in 2004 with the then-undefeated Smarty Jones. Instead, he was happy that Lombardi was finally able to experience the unique thrill of watching one of his horses carry his silks in the Kentucky Derby.

“Running in the Derby didn’t have a great meaning to me,” Servis said. “What made me happy was that Ron was happy. There are 20,000 foals in any given year, and Ron felt he beat 19,980 of them to get there and that was the important thing. Whether or not I believed the horse could get a mile-and-a-quarter, Ron and his family were ecstatic about being in the race and that made it rewarding.”

Hours after winning the Champagne, Servis was not sipping bubbly. True to his nature, he was at Meadowlands, claiming a horse for \$5,000. In that same vein, right after the Derby, after Servis had plotted a rest for Firenze Fire, he returned to his favored tasks. Once again he was scouring condition books for spots and mining opportunities in the New York state breeding program.

All of those elements came to the fore May 28 in the popular New York Showcase Day for state-breds at Belmont Park. Servis once again worked his magic with claimers and state-breds, winning two of the six stakes for New York-breds with horses owned by Michael Dubb who were making either their first or second starts for their new connections.

“Jason does a phenomenal job. He doesn’t go to the well too often,” Dubb said. “His horses are usually fresh and fit. He’s a great communicator and an all-around gentleman. I can’t say enough good things about him.”

Dubb picked out both claims with thoughts of taking advantage of the generous purses available in races and stakes for state-breds, yet Servis’ work was instrumental in that one of the state-breds won after a seven-month lay-off and the other bounced back quicker

than anticipated from a poor effort.

The New York-bred stakes spree started with Feeling Bossy’s neck victory in the \$125,000 Mount Vernon Stakes, a mile turf stakes for fillies and mares, and continued with a three-quarter-length triumph by Analyze the Odds in the \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes, a seven-furlong test for 3-year-old males on the main track.

Feeling Bossy was claimed by Dubb for \$62,500 Oct. 8, a day after Firenze Fire’s win in the Champagne. She pre-

vailed by a nose that day in the allowance optional claimer for breeder/owner Emily Wygod and trainer Jimmy Jerkens. The Courageous Cat runner then tired 13 days later in the Ticonderoga Stakes for state-breds, finishing seventh, and promptly headed to the sidelines until the spring as Servis patiently returned her to top form following some freshening.

“The trainer (Jerkens) was running her in October with the idea of turning her into \$100,000. He got a New York-

bred bonus, the purse, and the claim money. He did right by his owners,” said Dubb, NYRA’s year-end wins leader in six of the last eight years. “I, on the other hand, knew that my Fourstar Crook was going to run in open company this year, and I was looking for a New York-bred filly for that division and thought if this horse was well-rested and fresh, she would benefit from going into superior

hands with Jason. It paid off.”

The payoff in purse money for the 5-year-old mare’s victory over the favored Fifty Five was \$75,000, covering the hefty claiming tag and giving Dubb back-to-back Mount Vernon wins. Fourstar Crook, who captured last year’s Mount Vernon for Dubb, partners Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith and trainer Chad Brown, added a second

2018 graded stakes win to her résumé when the New York-bred daughter of Freud won the New York Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2T) June 8 at Belmont Park.

“It usually doesn’t work out like that when you plan ahead,” Servis said.

Analyze the Odds, a 3-year-old Over-analyze colt, was claimed for \$80,000 April 20 at Aqueduct while finishing fifth, beaten 9¼ lengths, for owner Mike Repole and trainer Todd Pletcher in a 6½-furlong allowance optional claimer.

“Analyze the Odds reminded me of Good Luck Gus, who won a lot of similar races for me like the New York Breeders’ Futurity at Finger Lakes (in 2014) and the Albany (2015),” said Dubb, who won a third state-bred stakes on the Showcase Day card (as co-owner) with Offering Plan in the \$125,000 Kingston Stakes. “I thought (Analyze the Odds) wanted to go long and needed a freshening after a tough winter campaign. I claimed him with the intention of running him around two turns at Finger Lakes in July and at Saratoga in August in the Albany, but the horse was doing so well Jason felt we should take a shot.”

Servis’ assessment of Analyze the Odds was spot-on as the 3-year-old, bred by Lansdowne Thoroughbreds, overcame the odds by rallying from last and scoring a 20-1 upset.

It was a noteworthy training job, but don’t expect Servis to take a bow for it, unless you intend to twist his arm like a Mixed Martial Arts fighter seeking a tap-out.

“I can tell you about the noses I lost by and the bad trips, but I don’t dwell on winning,” said Servis, whose father, Joe, was a steward at the old Waterford Park in West Virginia. “I guess I’ve had a good year. If I was 30, I might look at it differently. I didn’t start training until I was 40, so I guess I went to school for 25 years to learn how to be a trainer. I saw a lot of people come and go in the business and tried to learn from their mistakes.”

Servis already has eight wins this year with New York-breds through June

19—including a four-length victory by Picco Uno in the \$125,000 Dancin Renee Stakes at Belmont Park June 16—and that total figures to jump with horses for owners like Dubb and Lombardi in his New York/New Jersey-based summer-time operation. Lombardi, in particular, has five 2-year-old New York-breds that are heading to Servis with high hopes attached to them.

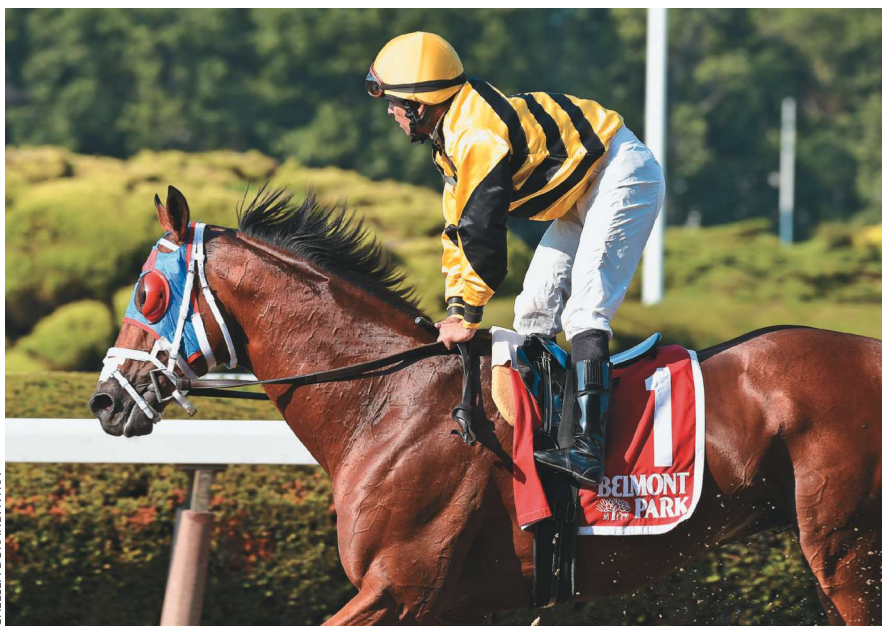
“It should be an interesting 2-year-old campaign,” Lombardi said. “I’ve been with Jason since I bought my first horse in 2008, and it’s been great. He is always looking forward and is a great manager of the stable. What makes Jason so successful is he’s very patient with his horses. He doesn’t bring them back unless they’re ready. Off the claim he’ll often wait six or eight weeks to come back with them. He doesn’t push things. He makes sure his program is in place and that the horse is ready to go.”

Like Lombardi, Servis has become actively involved in the New York state breeding program and has his first mare, Indian Splendor, at Mahoney Eden Manor near Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

“The New York state breeding program is a great asset for us,” Servis said. “I claim a lot of horses, and I like getting the bonus for running them in open company. I’m looking forward to getting more involved with it with some young horses.”

In the meantime, as those young, untested runners prepare to take their first fledgling steps at a racetrack, you can expect to see Servis’ name on numerous claim slips as he searches for more rags-to-riches stories. In a training career that started in 2001 and has featured 1,024 wins through June 14, Feeling Bossy and Analyze the Odds were just the latest claimers to enter Servis’ barn and blossom into stakes winners.

Tightend Touchdown was probably Servis’ most noteworthy work as he was claimed for \$35,000 and went on to earn \$746,184 for Servis and Lombardi while winning the

Parx Dash Handicap (G3T) in 2015 and finishing in a dead heat for second in the 2013 GEICO Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint

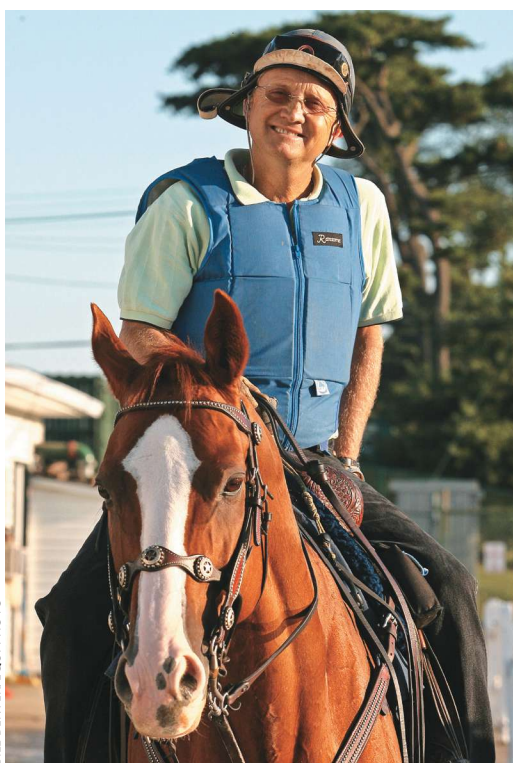
(G1T). He also claimed Ribo Bobo for \$8,000 for Lombardi and turned him into a multiple stakes winner who earned \$521,852 for them.

Yet that same skill could also be seen in Servis’ patient handling of Hangover Kid, a New York-bred who climbed up the allowance ranks before he became a graded stakes winner in his 24th start by taking the Bowling Green Handicap (G2T) in 2014.

None of those horses generated huge headlines, which is just fine with Servis. Even as the trainer’s visibility has grown in recent years, he remains content to let others do the speaking for him.

“Jason is a hands-on guy who limits the amount of horses in his barn. He isn’t looking for a lot of press or fanfare,” Dubb said. “He loves what he does and is always in the barn. His results speak for themselves.”

And lately, especially on New York Showcase Day, what his owners and the results have to say about a soft-spoken trainer has been rather loud indeed. 🐾

Right Track

Owner Michael Dubb rides hot streak with his New York-breds

AS A TEENAGER, MICHAEL DUBB worked cutting lawns, not uncommon for kids growing up in the suburbs. For most of them, the time behind the mower wasn't a gateway to a life in Thoroughbred racing, but one of Dubb's clients was the inventor of the Kelco Calculator, an early handicapping tool.

"I'd be out mowing the lawn," Dubb reminisced, "and they'd call me inside and say, 'Bet the three horse in the sixth race.' I got friendly with them, and they took me to the racetrack."

The following year Dubb got in the van he used for his landscaping business and drove to Saratoga, his first visit to the track at which he would later win multiple owner's titles, including four straight beginning in 2014.

Dubb owns about 70 horses, some on his own, most in partnership with people he's met through racing. He claims, he buys yearlings, he buys 2-year-olds in training, and on two big days at Belmont in May and June, he and his partners wore a path to the winner's circle, notching three stakes wins on New York-bred Showcase Day on May 28 and three more during the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival June 8-9.

"I don't even know what to say," he said. "I'm speechless by all the good fortune."

Dubb builds his stable carefully, crafting a combination of New York-breds and horses bred elsewhere, of turf and dirt horses, of sprinters and routers. The claims he researches himself; at the sales he works with bloodstock agents Kim Valerio, Liz Crow, and Gary Young.

It was Crow and BSW Bloodstock that selected Monomoy Girl, who on Belmont Day got her third straight grade 1 in the Acorn Stakes, following wins in the Central

Bank Ashland Stakes at Keeneland and the Longines Kentucky Oaks. If not for a neck loss in the Golden Rod Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs, she'd be perfect in her eight-race career. Dubb's partners in the Tapizar filly are Monomoy Stables, The Elkstone Group, and Bethlehem Stables.

Dubb's other grade 1 win that weekend came in the Longines Just a Game Stakes with A Raving Beauty, purchased privately after beginning her career in Germany, where she was bred. She is undefeated in two starts for Dubb and partners Madaket Stables and Bethlehem Stables, both in graded stakes.

But it was a grade 2, the New York Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets, that best exemplifies Dubb's racing program. He won it with longtime partners Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith, and he won it with a New York-bred by a New York sire: Fourstar Crook (Freud—Avril a Portugal, by D'Accord—also a New York stallion).

"I support the New York-bred program," he said. "It was a tough go for many years, and it's so important to support all the hard-working people in the program."

"She's my favorite horse of all time," he continued. "She has the biggest ears of any racehorse on the track, she doesn't know who she's racing against, and she just runs her eyeballs out every time."

It is 6-year-old Fourstar Crook's talent in open company that led Dubb to claim Feeling Bossy, winner of the Mount Vernon Stakes on Showcase Day.

"I was specifically looking for a filly to run in New York-bred turf races," he said. "I want to have horses that can run in a variety of races."

Dubb also scored on Showcase Day with another claim, Analyze the Odds, making his first start for his new owner and getting his second stakes win in the Mike Lee Stakes. He capped the day with a win by Offering Plan, purchased as a 2-year-old and owned with Nantucket Thoroughbred Partners, Bethlehem Stables, and Aisquith. The son of Spring At Last out of Rosalie Road, by

Street Cry, won the Kingston Stakes for the second straight year.

"I work hard at the game to try to make the right decision," said Dubb. "Obviously these two days are a streak the likes of which I've never had and probably never will again."

Despite his success Dubb shies from getting into breeding, preferring to sell his successful fillies and mares as broodmare prospects—not a fate he immediately envisions for Fourstar Crook.

"I had offers to sell her last year," he said, "but I felt like she really loves her job, and we haven't seen the best of her yet."

"She's special, so why not race her? I'll race her at 7 if she's still interested. We need to do more of that, to race horses when they're older."

Away from the track Dubb is a tireless advocate for backstretch workers.

He is one of the founders of the Belmont Child Care Association and serves as chair of its board; he built Anna House, the daycare/early childhood education facility on Belmont's backstretch, and its expansion at no cost to the non-profit. As a member of the board of directors of the New York Racing Association, he exhorts his fellow board members to keep the backstretch in mind as they formulate their yearly goals, and he has overseen dormitory renovation and construction at Belmont and at Saratoga.

"People who work on the backstretch are hard-working and honest," he said. "They're trying to make a difference, by sending money back home or working to do better for their kids, and they'll succeed. All of the success on the track comes second to trying to make a difference."

That commitment is all the more impressive, given the success that Dubb has had in a little more than a decade as an owner. Handicapping and research, while taxing, also provide him with a kind of relaxation after a day at work, handicapping and research that have him at the top of the standings at the current Belmont meet by a considerable margin.

"I really enjoy the challenge of trying to make right decisions," he said. "I make a lot of decisions, and they can't be all right, but as long as enough are, I can do OK." 🐾

STARS OF THE '80s: WIN, SLEWPY, AND AT THE THRESHOLD

THE GELDING, WIN (1980; Barachois—Par Ci Par La, by Buckpasser), was bred by Robert G. Wehle on his farm near Scottsville, N.Y. He was purchased from Wehle's North Cliff Farm dispersal by his trainer, Sally Bailie for \$8,000 at Saratoga in August 1982.

Win made 12 starts for Bailie as owner, and in September 1983, Bailie was joined in partnership by Fred Ephraim, a clinical psychologist, and handicapper Paul Cornman.

After an off-the board effort in his only start in 1982 and a series of mostly un-

successful races on dirt in 1983, at the suggestion of Cornman it was decided that, based on breeding, Win should be switched to the turf.

The result was dramatic, when on Sept. 18 he finished second in the 1½-mile Lawrence Realization Stakes (G2T) for 3-year-olds on the turf at Belmont,

followed on Sept. 29 by a victory in the first division of the 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ -mile Rutgers Handicap (G2T) at the Meadowlands. Win closed the season with a fourth in the first division of the Knickerbocker Handicap (G3T) at Aqueduct. His 1983 record was five wins, four seconds, and one third from 15 starts, with earnings of \$177,633.

In 1984 Win became one of the top turf runners on the East Coast and arguably the most accomplished New York-bred since Questionnaire and Mr. Right.

Win's first stakes try of the year came in the 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile Red Smith Handicap (G2). In the off-the-turf race he finished a distant second to Paul Mellon's Hero's Honor, whom he had defeated in the Rutgers the previous fall.

Following a fifth-place finish in the Bowling Green Handicap (G1T) at Belmont, Win took three graded stakes out of his next four starts. Victories came in the July 1 Tidal Handicap (G2; taken off the turf), Saratoga's Bernard Baruch Handicap (G2T; Eclipse Award-winning Cozzene was third) Aug. 12, and the 12-furlong Manhattan Handicap (G1T) back at Belmont.

Although he didn't win another stakes that year, he was still competitive. On Sept. 8 he finished second to multiple

graded stakes winner Majesty's Prince in the grade 1 Man o' War Stakes at 11 furlongs. Two weeks later he again finished second in a grade 1, the Turf Classic Stakes at Belmont Park. In what might have been the best effort of his career, he lost by a neck at equal weights to two-time Horse of the Year, four-time turf Eclipse Award winner and future Hall of Fame inductee John Henry. Finishing third was Majesty's Prince, and fourth was another future Hall of Famer, the filly All Along.

John Henry's (and Win's) final time of 2:25 $\frac{1}{8}$ for 12 furlongs was just two fifths of a second off the course record set in 1973 by Secretariat.

Win closed the year with a third in the \$400,000 Ballantine's Scotch Classic Handicap at the Meadowlands at odds of 7-2. Although the race was ungraded because of its inaugural running, it also included the 3-5 favorite John Henry; the winner of the Arlington (G1T) and Kelso (G3T) handicaps, Who's for Dinner, second at 10-1; the winner of the Bougainvillea Handicap (G2T), Four Bases, fourth at 55-1; and Hero's Honor, winner of the Fort Marcy (G3T), Red Smith (G2T), Bowling Green (G1T) and United Nations (G1T) handicaps, seventh at 7-1.

He traveled to Japan where he was

unplaced in the Japan Cup but picked up \$32,280.

Win's 1984 record was four wins, three seconds, and one third, with earnings of \$545,085.

Because of a dispute among the three owners over who would be the managing partner, only one of Win's first four starts in 1985 was a stakes, that being the Tidal Handicap, in which he finished sixth. A trip to Saratoga proved to be the cure for his previous mishaps when he repeated in the Bernard Baruch Handicap by a neck over Cozzene.

According to *The Blood-Horse*, the Bernard Baruch would be some solace for not being invited to the Budweiser-Arlington Million (G1T). Cornman complained, "I can't believe a horse that won or placed in six graded stakes last year and was beaten a neck by John Henry at level weights in the Turf Classic was not even named on the list of alternatives."

The next stop for Win was the Sept. 1 Manhattan Handicap at Belmont Park. The winner, however, was Cool, who enjoyed a 14-pound advantage over the New York-bred, who was the favorite. Three weeks later Win once again finished second in a grade 1 race as the favorite, this time in the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile Turf Classic. The surprise winner was Noble Fighter, the only 3-year-old in the race whose record of one win in eight starts in France was reflected in his 55-1 odds.

The two hooked up again Oct. 12 in the Man o' War Stakes, with both Win and Noble Fighter going off at 2-1. This time Win prevailed, winning by a neck over Bob Back, a Kentucky-bred who had previously won the Premio Presidente della Repubblica (G1) in Italy. Far back in sixth was Noble Fighter. The Man o' War victory made Win a millionaire and underlined the statement of Russ Harris in *The Blood-Horse* that "If there is a top grass runner in the United States this year, many New Yorkers think it is Sally Bailie's Win..." On Nov. 3 Win won the first division of the inaugural running of Aqueduct's one-mile Shergar

Stakes as the 126 pound highweight and 3-5 favorite.

The Shergar was Win's last victory in 1985, but his last two races of the year did little to diminish his reputation. A heavy rain was the culprit in his finishing a badly beaten fifth in the Washington, D.C., International Stakes (G1T) over a soft course at Laurel that was not to his liking. In what would be the last race of 1985, Win finished second in the 12-furlong Hollywood Turf Cup (G1T) at odds of 7-1. The winner was 23-1 Zoffany, whom Win had beaten by 14 lengths in the Man o' War. Checking in third, a neck behind Win, was Vanlandingham, the winner of the International.

Win's record in 1985 was four wins and three seconds with earnings of \$645,186, not bad for a horse who went into the Bernard Baruch on Aug. 11 with one allowance win in four starts.

Win was scheduled to race in 1986, there being no other options for a gelding, but an ankle injury sustained in a workout led to his semi-retirement. He returned in 1989 to post one win in five starts, earning \$41,076. He amassed career earnings of \$1,408,980.

SLEWPY

Sleppy (1980; Seattle Slew—Rare Bouquet, by Prince John), a colt, was bred by Seminole Syndicate and owned by Equusequity Stable, both partner-

ships formed by Seattle Slew's owners, Jim and Sally Hill and Mickey and Karen Taylor. He was trained by Sid Watters Jr.

When Sleppy broke his maiden in his first start, a 2-year-old maiden special weight at Belmont June 21, he became the first winner for 1977 Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew. Many more winners followed, as the son of Bold Reasoning became one of the most prolific sires of the last half of the 20th century.

Sleppy won his next race, taking the Empire Stakes for state-bred juveniles. After off-the-board performances in Saratoga's Hopeful Stakes (G1), Belmont's Cowdin Stakes (G2), and Keeneland's grade 2 Breeders' Futurity, he won his first open company stakes by taking the Young America Stakes (G1) at the Meadowlands. Finishing fourth after engaging in a speed duel was the previously undefeated Copelan, who had beaten Sleppy when he won the Hopeful. Sleppy's record in 1982, after a fifth-place effort in the Remsen Stakes (G1), was three wins from seven starts, with earnings of \$244,140.

After an allowance win in his 1983 debut at Gulfstream Park, Sleppy was third in the Louisiana Derby (G2) at Fair Grounds. Back in New York he was second in an allowance race in early April before running fifth in the Wood Memorial Stakes (G1). A runner-up effort against state-breds in the 1¼-mile

Kingston Stakes set him up for a 15th-place finish in the Epsom Derby (G1) in England.

His first stakes win of the year came Oct. 27 in the Meadowlands' Paterson Handicap (G2).

On Nov. 17 he once again showed his affinity for the New Jersey track when he improved his record there to four wins in four starts by taking the grade 1 Meadowlands Cup for 3-year-olds and up over Deputy Minister. Sleppy's record for 1983 was four wins, two seconds, and one third in 10 starts, with earnings of \$418,868.

Sleppy had one win in four starts in 1984, the Kingston Stakes for New York-breds. A suspensory ligament sustained in that race led to his retirement, with career earnings of \$710,248.

Sleppy stood at stud in Kentucky and California, where he sired 27 stakes winners. He died December 2001. His daughter, grade 1-placed Verbasle, is the dam of grade 1 winner High Fly and stakes winner Smokey Mirage, the dam of Oklahoma stallion The Visualizer.

AT THE THRESHOLD

Although he was a New York-bred, At the Threshold (1981; Norcliffe—Wilver, by Vertex) was sold as a yearling in Kentucky and spent most of his 2-year-old season racing in that state. He was bred by Raymond Karlinsky and Arthur

Levien, two businessmen who lived in South Florida. Originally owned by H.E. Bishop and trained by W.C. "Smiley" Adams, At the Threshold was purchased by W. Cal Partee for \$150,000 in the fall of 1983 and was trained for the rest of his career by Partee's personal trainer, Lynn Whiting.

When he was purchased by Partee, he was shipped to New York, where he ended his season by winning the Ashley T. Cole Stakes for 2-year-old New York-breds. The wisdom in that change of venue was shown by the \$70,200 he won in the Ashley T. Cole, compared to the \$27,435 he had earned in his eight races in Kentucky, including third-place finishes in the Kentucky Special Stakes at Latonia and the Iroquois Stakes at Churchill Downs. Obviously, since the passing of the 1973 legislation, it paid to run a New York-bred in New York State.

When his 1983 season was concluded, At the Threshold was sent to Arkansas to rest and train toward his 3-year-old season.

After a win going six furlongs and a third-place finish in the mud at a mile in a pair of overnight handicaps at Oaklawn, At the Threshold was shipped back to Kentucky to compete in the \$300,000 Jim Beam Stakes (G3) at Latonia on April 1. His stature among the country's 3-year-olds rose when he won the

Jim Beam with Pat Day on board at 7-2 against 11 opponents.

Following the Jim Beam, he returned to Arkansas to compete in the toughest race of his career, the April 21 Arkansas Derby (G1) at nine furlongs. He finished a respectable fourth at 7-2, with the filly Althea, who would be the favorite in the Kentucky Derby (G1) as part of an entry, winning by seven lengths. Finishing third was Gate Dancer, the 8-5 favorite.

At the Threshold's next race was the Kentucky Derby, where he finished an impressive third at odds of 37-1, with the ill-fated Swale the winner at 3.40-1. Rather than continue him on the traditional Triple Crown trail by racing in the Preakness Stakes (G1), Whiting elected to take him to Keystone Park May 28 to compete in the \$200,000 Pennsylvania Derby (G2), where he lost by a head as the 7-5 favorite to the 8-5 Morning Bob. It would turn out to be the last defeat of his career. Although Whiting had planned his next race to be the Belmont Stakes (G1), the Pennsylvania Derby was more strenuous than he had expected, and the Belmont was scrapped in favor of the June 16 Ohio Derby (G2) at Thistledown, which he won by three lengths as the 9-10 choice.

From Ohio, At the Threshold traveled to Chicago, where on June 30 he

won the nine-furlong Arlington Classic (G1) for 3-year-olds, despite conceding 12 pounds to the other seven horses in the field. Although the weight assignment bothered Whiting, it did not deter the bettors, who wisely sent him off at 2-5. Three weeks later he won the grade 1 American Derby at Arlington in a dead heat with 24-1 High Alexander. As in the Classic, he was the 2-5 favorite, and highweight with 126 pounds, with Day aboard.

After the race Whiting discovered that At the Threshold had bled, and he was sent to Kentucky to recover. Although At the Threshold was scheduled to race in the Sept. 22 Super Derby V (G1) at Louisiana Downs, Partee decided to retire him to stud duty at Southland Farm near Ocala, Fla.

At the Threshold's 1984 record was five wins, one second, and two thirds from nine starts with earnings of \$598,295. He earned \$695,930 in his two years on the track.

At the Threshold also stood at Celestial Acres in Oklahoma and in Texas, Iowa, and Indiana. He died in March 2002. The sire of eight stakes winners, including Partee's 1992 Kentucky Derby winner Lil E. Tee, At the Threshold's bloodlines today can be found in Kettle Corn. The grade 2 winner by Candy Ride is out of a Lil E. Tee mare. 🐾

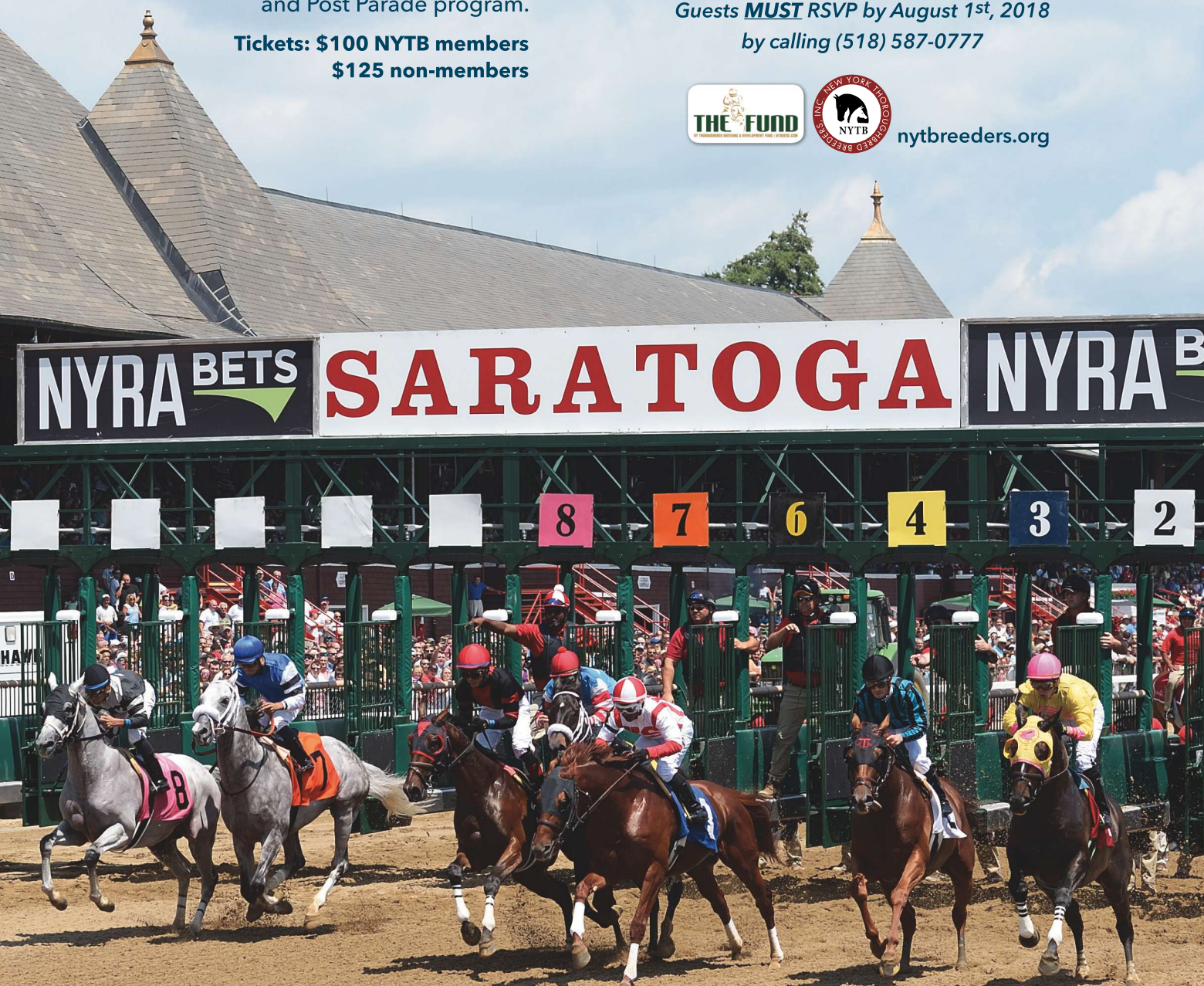
