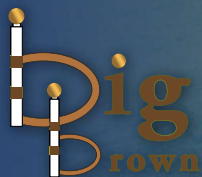

Finger Lakes 2017: Playing a Tough Hand

FINGER LAKES GAMING AND RACETRACK has been dealt an extremely challenging hand for 2017. The prospective opening of the del Lago Resort and Casino in Tyre early next year is projected to cannibalize from 20% to 40% of Delaware North's gaming revenue, which, in turn, is responsible for roughly 70% of the horsemen's purse account. Delaware North has been compensated legislatively by tax relief. The horsemen, to date, have no protections at all.

It is hard to overstate the importance of a healthy Finger Lakes to the success of the New York breeding and racing programs state-wide. In 2015 New York-breds accounted for 69.9% of the total starts at the racetrack (6,530 of 9,344) and took home a proportionate amount of the purse money. Finger Lakes accounts for roughly half of the number of breeders awards distributed by the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

Right now it is impossible to forecast what will happen to the Farmington oval in 2017, but, because I have been involved in this issue actively for nearly two years, I am prepared to engage in some educated speculation.

Some options involving negotiation and/or legislation remain on the table for 2017, but the prognosis for success is poor:

- The Finger Lakes Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association will again try to bring del Lago and Delaware North to the table to negotiate a way for two gaming operators to cooperate in compensating horsemen for lost purse money. They tried this in 2016. It did not work.

- NYTB and FLGR could convince the governor and/or legislature to address the problem of purse protection during the budget process (Jan. 1-April 1). We tried this in 2015 and 2016. It did not work. There is little reason to imagine any different outcome in 2017. The key players have not changed.

- NYTB and FLGR could convince the legislature to initiate stand-alone legislation during the April-June session. We tried this in 2016. It did not work. Again, I cannot imagine 2017 will be any different.

Once del Lago opens, we will be better able to estimate the real effects on Delaware North's gaming business and, consequently, on FLGR purses. In 2015 the horsemen's purse account was worth roughly \$17 mil-

lion. Of that total, \$11 million was derived from video lottery terminals. Should del Lago divert 40% of this gaming revenue from the racetrack, the hit to the purse account will be roughly \$4.4 million. With a more optimistic estimate, there will be a 20% reduction of VLT business at the racetrack, in which case purses will be reduced by roughly \$2.2 million. I proceed with the (reasonable) assumption that FLGR will lose 30% of its business once del Lago opens. In that case FLGR will be faced with finding some way to spread a slightly more than \$3 million reduction in the purse account in 2017 over the course of the racing calendar they choose to adopt.

In 2015 FLGR raced 153 days with a distribution of purses that averaged roughly \$115,000 a day. Currently, the track runs five days a week.

Suppose that during a May to November season (28 weeks) the track ran four days a week. This would reduce overall purses by the requisite \$3.22 million (\$115,000 daily purse distribution times 28 days).

Another thought is to continue racing five days a week, but reduce the number of races per day from nine to eight. The elimination of one bottom level race (\$9,000 purse) every day for 153 days would reduce the stress on the purse account by almost \$1.4 million. Some combination of these strategies (and others) may close the gap.

Of course, all this is triage. FLGR will be faced with hard choices in 2017 and will need to devise the best plan to deal with their constraints. But this fact remains: We need to make long-term plans.

The fundamental reason FLGR purses have become so dependent on VLT revenue is declining handle. It doesn't hurt to repeat the numbers. Of the \$17 million FLGR purse account, \$11 million comes from VLTs and only \$6 million from handle. It is shocking to realize that from the \$115,000 in purses distributed each day, the FLGR purse account gets back only roughly \$15,000 a day from wagering. In the long run this will not work.

That brings us to the heart of the problem. We need to think creatively about how to improve the racing product at Finger Lakes in order to revitalize its handle long term. A turf course perhaps? Other options? But that is the subject for another letter. The near-term survival of the racetrack is on our minds today, but near-term survival is—and must be—only the first step. 🐾

NEW YORK DERBY A 'HIT'

August Dawn Farm's Hit It Once More landed the rich (\$164,150) New York Derby July 23 at Finger Lakes, his third win in his last four outings. The son of Hard Spun won the 1½-mile Derby by 6½ lengths in 1:43.02 under Kendrick Carmouche

Bred by JMJ Racing Stables, the New York-bred sophomore was a \$105,000 purchase by Kirkwood Stables from Burleson Farms at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale. Trainer Gary Sciacca purchased him for \$90,000 from Kirkwood at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds. Winless in five tries at 2, Hit It Once More has won three of four starts this year, earning \$179,190.

The Derby winner is out of the Sunday Break mare Sunday Geisha, who won the Trenton Stakes at Monmouth Park for Dennis Narlinger's JMJ Racing Stables and trainer Bruce Levine. She also placed in two other added-money events. Sunday Geisha's second dam is grade III-placed One Night Affair.

In the \$75,000 New York Oaks, third choice Super Allison won by a head over Mecke's Madalyn. Favored Katniss the Victor closed but could only finish third.

The winner, a daughter of Super Saver trained by Carlos Martin, races for Matthew Schera and is the second foal out of Richiegirgonewild, by Wild-

cat Heir. Richiegirgonewild won the 2010 Old Hat Stakes (gr. III) at Gulfstream Park. She has been bred to Orb for 2017.

Bred by Doug Branham and Felicia Branham, Super Allison was a \$190,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York preferred sale yearling (fourth-highest-priced filly at the sale), going to Florida pinhooker Nick de Meric from Hidden Brook, then selling to Schera for \$230,000 from de Meric Sales at the same Midlantic sale as Hit It Once More sold.

Facing strictly state-bred company, Super Allison is 3-2-0 in eight starts and has earned \$145,434.

New York-Bred Brings \$185,000 at F-T Ky July Sale

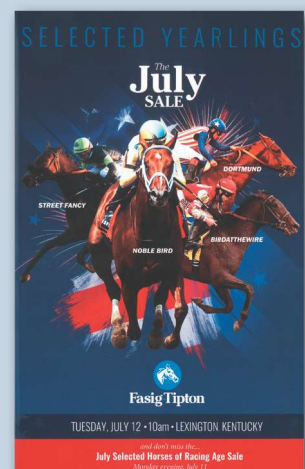
Zayat Stables, with EQB acting as agent, purchased a colt by New York-based Mission Impazible, the nation's leading freshman sire, at the July 12 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July selected yearling sale for \$185,000.

Hip 192, who was sold by Sequel New York, agent, was bred by a partnership of Sequel Thoroughbreds and Twin Creeks Farm—the same connections who brought out Mission Impazible juvenile standout and Tremont Stakes winner Silver Mission.

The gray or roan colt, who was foaled April 9, 2015, is out of Deputy Reality, an unplaced daughter of Halo Reality, whose dam is graded stakes-placed Halo Reality. Deputy Reality is a half sister to graded stakes-placed A. P. Reality and stakes performer Can't Stop the Kid.

Deputy Reality has produced four winners, topped by Teeth of the Dog (by Bluegrass Cat), who won the 2012 Dwyer Stakes (gr. II) and earned more than \$400,000.

The Mission Impazible colt brought more than twice the sale average, which was \$86,101. Mission Impazible (by Unbridled's Song) stands at Sequel Stallions New York, where his 2016 stud fee was \$7,500.

Fasig-Tipton Sale Plays to State-Breds' Strength

While the overall figures of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sales might have been a bit of a disappointment to some, the sale company's sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, to be held Aug. 13-14 in Saratoga, figures to play to the strength of the program. Racing for more than \$60 million in purses and awards from the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund does add a premium to the 306 horses cataloged to the sale.

The enhanced purse structure for state-bred runners figures to shore up the middle segment of the sale, an area that showed softness in this year's juvenile marketplace and at the Kentucky sale.

The catalog is slightly larger than last year's sale that saw 182 yearlings sell for more than \$14.8 million—the highest gross in the sale's history. Last year's average, \$81,739, was also a record. Thirteen of the yearlings brought a minimum of \$200,000.

As the breeding program strengthens in New York, so, too, does the sire power in the sale. Uncle Mo, the runaway leading juvenile sire and first-crop sire with a Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner in Nyquist this year, has nine New York-breds cataloged in the two-session sale. New

York-based Mission Impazible, this year's leading first-crop sire, has 18 on offer, with Freud, the state's perennial leading sire, having 19 in the catalog.

First-crop sires Shanghai Bobby (six) and Take Charge Indy (10) are well represented, as well as the New York-based Emcee. The grade I-winning son of Unbridled's Song has seven yearlings making the cut into the preferred book.

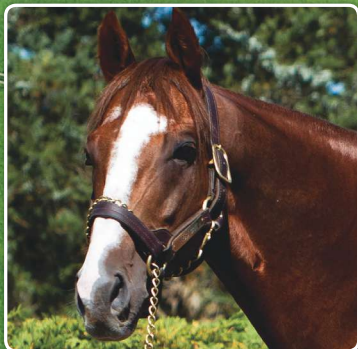

NY-BREDS RAISE THE BANNER ON THE STARS & STRIPES PROGRAM

The New York Racing Association put a lot of effort, and money, into its summer "Stars & Stripes" program July 9 at Belmont Park, and it was the New York-breds that helped raise the banner, running one-two in the Suburban Handicap (gr. II) and winning the historic grade II Dwyer Stakes for 3-year-olds.

Tri-Bone Stables' Effinex, the defending New York-bred horse of the year and defending Suburban winner, took the \$500,000 race with Len Riggio's My Meadowview Farm's Samraat running a game second, bringing home \$100,000 second-place money.

Effinex, the 122-pound high-weight, came back to New York off a sixth-place finish in Churchill Downs' Stephen Foster Handicap

(gr. I). The win, which added \$275,000 to his \$2,962,950 in earnings, places him third on the all-time list of leading New York-breds behind only Funny Cide (\$3,529,412), and the Japan-raced A Shin Forward (\$3,416,216).

In the Dwyer, Martin Racing Stable's Fish Trappe Road won the one-mile Dwyer in 1:34.84. He became the first graded stakes winner for his sire, Trappe Shot, and is out of the stakes-winning Electric Shock, by Cure the Blues. He was bred in partnership by Jon Davis and Rhapsody Farm, near Plymouth.

A \$140,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred preferred sale yearling, Fish Trappe Road was purchased the following year at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March sale by Martin Racing Stables for \$95,000.

ANCIENT SECRET STARS IN LAKE GEORGE

Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables has amassed a lot of graded stakes hardware in a short period of time with Afleeting Lady, Devil's Cave, and Lewis Bay, and he's got another solid runner in Ancient Secret, the unbeaten winner of the Lake George Stakes (gr. IIT) July 22 at Saratoga.

Off her three wins, all on turf, she was the 2-1 favorite for the Lake George and she was clear by 1¼ lengths, getting the 1¼ miles in 1:40.35 under Irad Ortiz Jr.

"She's a remarkable horse," said winning trainer Chad Brown. "She always trained like a really quality animal, we just gave her little incremental goals and she's hit them all. I was curious to see what she was go-

ing to do when the gates opened and she passed the test."

Bred by Lambholm and foaled at Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, the 3-year-old filly Ancient Secret sold on the opening day of the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale to bloodstock agent Steven Young, on behalf of Clay for \$225,000. By Kantharos, Ancient Secret is out of Privacy,

a winning Florida-bred mare by Notebook also bred by Lambholm. Privacy's second dam is Funistrada, a grade II-winning Fappiano mare who has also produced grade II-placed Conte di Savoya and the dam of millionaire Rahystrada, Lone Star

Sky, and the dam of Ahh Chocolate.

Privacy has a colt by Afleet Alex that arrived March 16 and she's been bred to Lookin At Lucky for 2017.

2016 LEADING SIRES IN NEW YORK

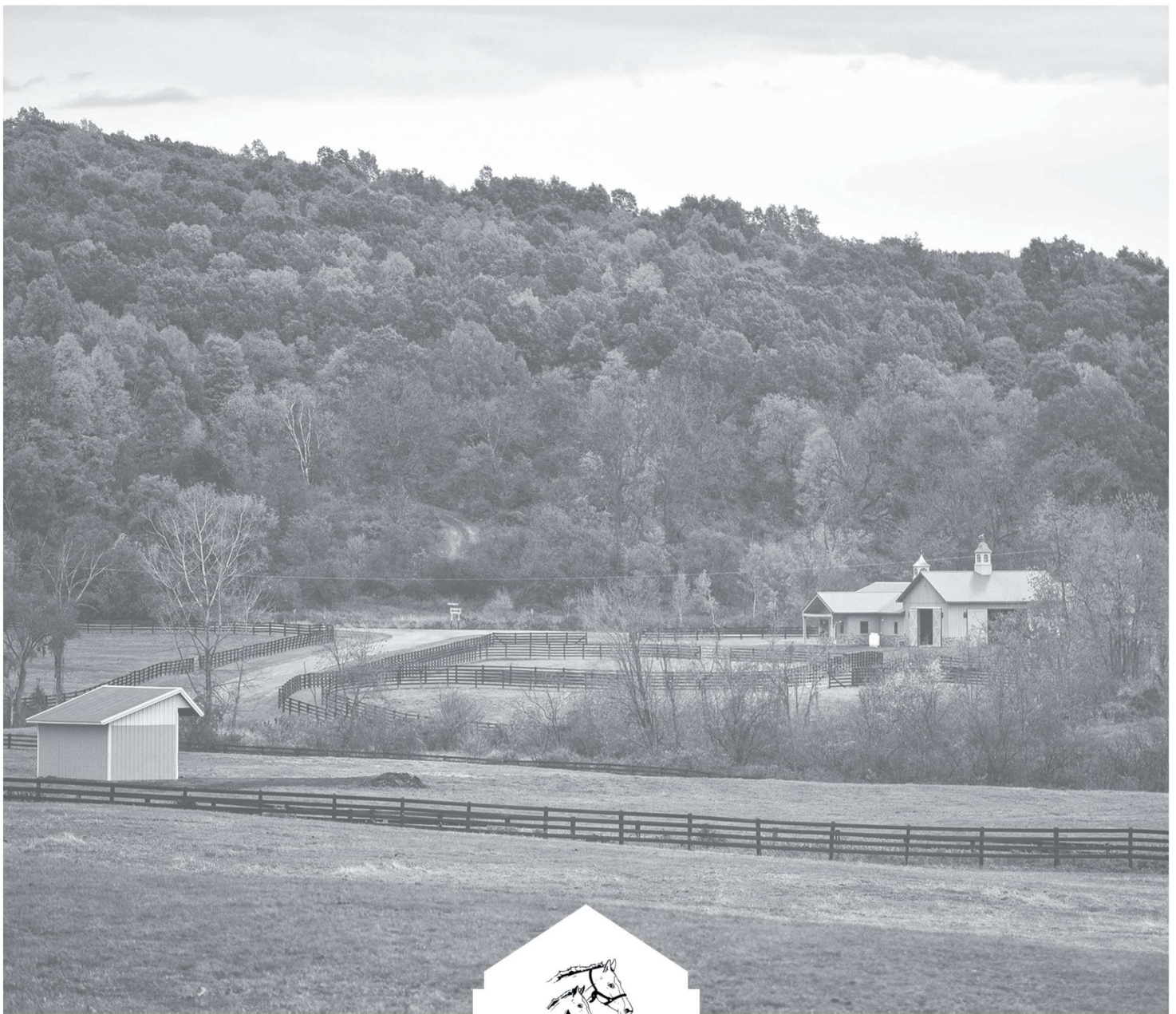

Juvenile Season Ends on Tough Note

BY EVAN HAMMONDS

INTEREST FOR THE FASTEST of the fast at the under-tack shows sold well, but overall the market for 2-year-olds in training was off the mark in 2016. The average price for a sale juvenile fell for the first time in five years, dropping 2.1% from \$77,189 to \$75,590. The average price of New York-bred 2-year-olds dipped 14.4% from \$71,225 to \$60,998. To soften

the blow, the 2016 average price is still more than \$10,000 higher than it was in 2013.

The buy-back rate for state-breds rose from 23.9% to 31.7%, a figure that always needs the explainer that there is added value to New York-breds and the money they can make on the track with breeder and owner awards.

Nick de Meric was the leading con-signor of New York-bred juveniles, selling all 11 he had to offer for \$1,446,000—good for an average of \$131,455, but with a median of \$50,000. His figures were buoyed by the top-priced state-bred juvenile of the season, a filly by Twirling Candy that sold to agents Alex Solis II and Jason Litt on behalf of the Roth family’s LNJ Foxwoods for \$825,000 at the Ocala Breeders’ Sales Co.’s March sale.

“There is no question that the sales did taper off toward the second half of the season and the action on the lesser lights was noticeably diminished over years past,” de Meric said. “There were lumps for a lot of people. My principal pinhooking group had the best year it’s had in 15 years. We did a lot of our selling in the first half of the season.”

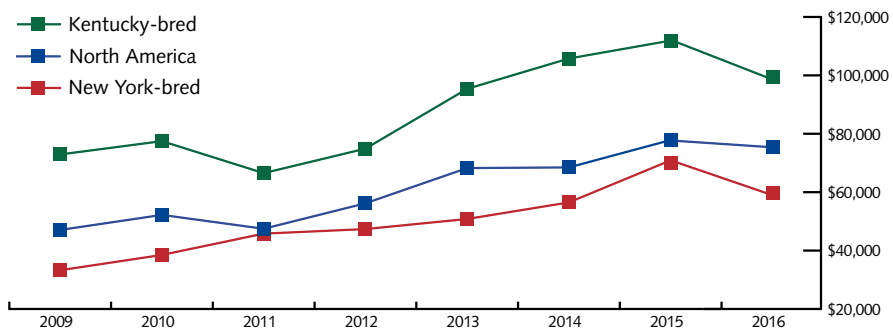
The state-bred topper had been a \$50,000 pinhook from the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York fall sale.

As for the general market, de Meric failed to pull any punches, but thinks the end results create opportunities for the upcoming yearling sales.

“I’ll be the first to tell you that it wasn’t easy this year,” he said. “The second-tier 2-year-olds were noticeably harder to market than they have been in the past. For one thing, supply outdid demand a bit but some of our buying blocs had changed their buying formats.

“It may create some opportunities in the yearling market because there will be some people pulling back,” he said. “The temptation is to sit tight for a year. I’m unlikely to do that because this is what I do. It might be a great year to step in boldly and have some inventory.”

On the buying end, the Solis/Litt team led all buyers off the one purchase. While not at a juvenile sale, Payson Stud went to \$550,000 to buy Summer Sweet, a New York-bred 2-year-old filly by More Than Ready—Summer Solstice, by Caerleon, at the Keeneland January sale. The filly, a half sister to two stakes winners and a grade I-placed winner, was bred by Sarah J. Leigh and was part of her dispersal. She made her debut July 3 at Belmont Park finishing fourth in a six-furlong maiden special weight. 🐾

in Thoroughbred
breeding and racing

Son on the Run

THE REINS WERE HANDED from father to son more than 30 years ago in the Wachtel family, a clan of successful horsemen who breed and run horses throughout the country but whose first loyalty is to New York.

Since he was 10 years old, Adam Wachtel attended the races with his father, Ed Wachtel, a prominent New York owner and breeder who died in December 2012 at 81. In the early 1980s Adam began partnering with his dad, a connection that has led him to the top of the New York Thoroughbred industry.

"I think about him all the time," Wachtel said. "When I go to the track, there are people that ask about him that loved him. From those behind the betting windows to other owners to the parking attendants—they all love to bring him up."

Adam Wachtel could have chosen another tension-filled, yet rewarding profession since he has a law degree from Emory University and passed the New York Bar in 1989, but he knew then that the law was not in his future.

"My father's partner thought it would be a good idea for Members Only," he said of the successful men's clothing manufacturer they owned. "So I went to law school, but after two years they sold the company. It still was an invaluable education that has helped me along the way."

Wachtel has 40 horses in training spread throughout the country, but at least half are in New York. Bill Mott has most of his horses; Chris Englehart has some New York-breds and Peter Miller is his West Coast trainer.

Wachtel's stallion, Al Khali, a 10-year-old son of Medaglia d'Oro who banked more than \$1 million, just wrapped up his first season at Keane Stud near Amenia. Six of Wachtel's mares are in foal to him at that breeding farm where the family has done business for decades.

"With his pedigree and looks, I thought it would be great for me to stand him in New York," said Wachtel who co-owns him (and other horses) with Nils Brous.

"The New York program was always something that meant a lot to my dad," he said. "It is tremendous, and the purse structure makes it the most enticing breeding program in the sport. It's such a tough sport to make money in, but it helps you supplement costs of being a breeder."

Keane Stud farm manager Philippe Lasseur said Wachtel is "one of the best clients here," a relationship first established by his father in 1990 and maintained with the boarding and foaling of countless Wachtel-owned New York mares over the years.

"He is very professional and easy to deal with," said Lasseur, who has been farm manager at Keane since 1987. "He understands things can go bad and is good about that. He is gentleman-like and always pleasant on the phone and takes good and bad the same way."

Wachtel is pointing several of his horses to the Saratoga meet, including Flipcup, a 5-year-old New York-bred mare (Milwaukee Brew—Dream Affair, by Touch Gold), trained by Mott. She won the May 28 Arlington Matron Stakes (gr. III) on the Polytrack in Chicago and has earned \$533,266 from a 7-4-5 mark in 19 starts from 2012-16.

Being pointed to Saratoga's Fourstar-dave Stakes (gr. IT) Aug. 13 is Tourist (Tiznow—Unbridled Melody, by Unbridled's Song), a classy, multiple grade I-placed turf runner with earnings of \$670,340.

Take the Stand, a 5-year-old Argentinean-bred turf runner, whom Wachtel owns with Brous and Earle I. Mack, will also probably run at the Spa. Take the Stand won the 1½-mile Muniz Memorial Handicap (gr. IIT) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots in March for his

first graded stakes score.

Several New York homebreds are also pointed to the Saratoga meet, including 3-year-old colt Born to Run (One Nice Cat—Ms. Emma, by Claramount), 2-year-old filly Right of Approval (Rule—Proven Right, by Vindication), and 4-year-old gelding Hundred Percent (One Nice Cat—Marian B, by Smokin Mel).

Ron the Greek did a 180 and ended up earning more than \$2.7 million, including victories in the 2012 Santa Anita Handicap (gr. I) and Stephen Foster Handicap (gr. I) at Churchill Downs, as well as the 2013 Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont Park.

Wachtel's most successful runner to date has been Ron the Greek, whom he owned in partnership with Brous.

"He was the most talented horse I've ever been around," he said.

It took a few tries to pry him loose from his original owner and finally, when the Florida-bred son of Full Mandate was struggling at 4, he succeeded in the purchase and gave him to Mott who told Wachtel he had a couple of things that needed fixing.

"If you're not in a rush, let's see if we can turn this horse around," Mott told the new owner.

Wachtel was in no hurry.

said. "A lot of people believe that when a horse runs a big effort, they'll bounce, especially a stakes horse. We really try to lay out a campaign where we give them plenty of time between races.

"It's unrealistic to expect victory every time," Wachtel continued. "You can't get too high or too low. If you have a game plan, a loss is just a loss."

Said Mott: "Some people are more aggressive and want to run because they don't understand sometimes a horse needs time or a vacation. But I would say he's very patient.

"We all get excited about a good horse, always looking for that next

race,” he continued. “But if a horse is not doing well, he never tries to force a horse to run when they shouldn’t. If I tell him we need to go back a step, he’s usually willing to go along with it.”

Mott said through partnerships, Wachtel has been “very good for the business because he’s brought new people that have become more active.”

He called Wachtel a “very smart horseman who is very methodical in the way he goes about purchases. He tries to evaluate a horse’s ability and a lot of what he does is based on speed figures, sheets, that kind of thing. He analyzes trainers, jockeys, horses—the whole thing.”

Although Ron the Greek was a no-brainer, Wachtel landed on him the way he lands on most of his other purchases—by studying their past performances on the sheets, and other data sources.

Instead of purchasing at auction or yearling sales, “what I really focus on is buying ‘made’

horses off the figures,” he said. “When I’m looking at a horse, they’ve already run at least once. The sheets tell me if they’re fast, but I also look at the pedigree to see if they have a future.”

Wachtel owns a piece of Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Exaggerator, a

good example of buying into a horse in training although “it didn’t take a genius because he was such a good 2-year-old,” he said.

“He’s a very smart horseman, and he’s a little more unusual than most because he’s been successful at two different fronts of owning horses,” said Englehart.

“He has a real ability to evaluate young horses after they start running and tries to purchase horses who look promising in their first few starts. He’d rather spend extra money for a proven runner than go to a sale and buy prospects,” he added.

The young Wachtel learned things in addition to patience from his father—such as going to a betting window and laying down a few bucks on a horse.

When Wachtel thinks back on his horse racing life, he recalls a 10-year-old kid, tagging along to Belmont and Saratoga with his dad and his dad’s entertainer friends, comedian Jack Klugman and Telly Savalas, the bald, gravelly-voiced actor best known for his role as the New York television detective, Kojak. (Savalas’ horse, Telly’s Pop, named because of Kojak’s love of lollipops, won four grade II races in California in 1975-76.

“Saratoga became important to our family life,” said Wachtel, who has three siblings, none in racing. It was his father’s favorite track. At first the family rented a place for a weekend, but eventually they rented a house on Saratoga Lake for the entire meet.

Ed Wachtel grew up in Panama, near a racetrack. He always said “if I have enough money, I’m going to buy a race horse,” Adam recalled.

That day finally came in 1973 when he purchased a few inexpensive runners and turned them over to New York trainer Howie Teshler.

“He got off to a bad start—nothing went right, but then during one Christmas break Dad got his first win with Doctor Pink. I

remember how excited he was,” he said.

“Initially when he first got started, trainers picked horses out for him. Then he got involved with figures and started learning more about handicapping. He started bringing me into the loop when I got out of law school in 1988, and we started analyzing figures and buying better horses.”

Ed Wachtel’s first real success was with 1989 New York-bred Horse of the Year Claramount, a multiple graded stakes winner who earned \$482,057 from 41 starts between 1986-90. Now deceased, he was retired to The Stallion Park near Millbrook, N.Y., where he enjoyed a successful career for both father and son.

Other stakes horses owned by Ed Wachtel include Stalwart Member, Smokin Mel, Bit of Puddin, Penny’s Re-shoot, and Dashboard Drummer.

A Claramount victory by double-digit lengths in the 1988 West Point Handicap at Saratoga taught the son a valuable lesson about horse racing etiquette.

He and his father were watching the race at an OTB parlor in Suffern, N.Y., and when Claramount crossed the finish line 20 lengths ahead of the rest of the field, a teenaged Adam Wachtel started cheering and getting very excited.

“Dad, who was a very cool character, gives me a hand signal to keep it down. ‘We’re in a public place,’ he told his son. ‘We’ll cash our tickets, and we’ll celebrate when we get home.’

“When I watched Exaggerator crossing the finish line in the Preakness, I’m not jumping up and down like the other partners. I’ve learned to keep things in balance,” Wachtel said. “I’ve had too many tough beats to know that when you think you’re going to cross the finish line first, someone comes along and nails you.”

Exaggerator also brought back another memory of his dad, touched off by the 2015 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), in which Adam Wachtel’s Bolo ran. (He finished 12th.)

“I got to the track very early and stood in the brand new trackside box

that Churchill Downs created for each Derby entrant,” he said.

Wachtel was the only person in the section at the time, a lone figure, gazing out at the track that represents the pinnacle of horse racing, and thinking about his father.

“I remember standing there and thinking how much of a thrill it would have been for Dad to have been there with me. The same thoughts went

through my head this year waiting for Exaggerator to run in the Derby, and I was definitely thinking about him on my way to the winner’s circle at the Preakness.”

When it was clear his son was pointing to a life in the barn and not the bar, Ed Wachtel turned a few horses over to him. He ran them under his own name to differentiate his stable from his father’s, but there were strong connections, particularly in the breeding area.

But in another way as well.

Adam Wachtel’s silks are essentially the same pattern as his father’s whose jockeys wore jackets with a gold background, brown panel, and gold hoops. The son runs in colors that have a black background, gold panel, and the same gold hoops.

Among the Thoroughbreds he got from his father was a homebred whom Adam named Gus’s Memory, in honor of Ed Wachtel’s father. Gus Wachtel wasn’t a horseplayer—he operated a fruit stand in Panama—but Adam’s great-grandfather on his father’s side was a horse trader in Russia.

Although its investments in horses might have once spanned two continents, in the Wachtel family it’s clear the Big Apple doesn’t fall far from the tree. 🍎

at Sequel Stallions New York

Mission Impazible's improbable hot start at stud

WITH BATED BREATH, Randy Gullatt and Becky Thomas sat together at the 2016 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring 2-year-olds in training sale and watched Aqueduct's April 21 opener.

There was a lot riding on the outcome of the 2-year-old open maiden special weight race for Gullatt and Thomas, the owners and breeders of one of its entrants, New York-bred Silver Mission. Their homebred is a son of Mission Impazible—this year's current leading first-crop sire—who was campaigned by Gullatt and his partner in Twin Creeks Racing Stables, Steve Davison. The 9-year-old son of Unbridled's Song stands at Thomas' Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson, and Silver Mission was the sire's initial starter.

Silver Mission, who is out of the Canadian graded stakes-winning mare Nashinda (by Silver Deputy), had been consigned to the OBS sale but was withdrawn to run at Aqueduct on the day before he had been cataloged to sell.

It's atypical for Thomas, a yearling-to-juvenile pinhooker, to send horses to the racetrack, but she, Gullatt, and Davison agreed it would be good advertising for Mission Impazible to have a first-out winner. The Todd Pletcher-trained Silver Mission was showing signs of precociousness in his training, which was not entirely surprising given his father won his 2-year-old debut seven years earlier at Keeneland.

Sighs of relief—and some intense cheering—were to follow from Gullatt and Thomas. Silver Mission won by three-quarters of a length while displaying intense focus, a trait not always associated with a young horse, to repel a prolonged challenge from the race's runner-up, Fuhrlong.

"You would have thought by our reaction that we had won the Kentucky Derby (gr. I). We were beside ourselves," Thomas said. "It's the first time in 15 years that I intentionally sent a horse to the racetrack. I've sent horses to the racetrack for various reasons—because they missed the sales, and for that kind of purpose—but this colt we sent to be able to win that first baby race."

A month later, at Lone Star Park, Proud Mission, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Mission Impazible who was purchased by Twin Creeks as a yearling, won her career debut.

For Gullatt, Silver Mission's maiden win and the one that would follow seven weeks later in the Tremont Stakes, represents the proverbial "cherry on top" scenario, on an already multi-layered tale of how the New York sire came into Twin Creeks' possession.

A former trainer, Gullatt conditioned Mission Impazible's dam, La Paz, for Davison. The daughter of Hold Your Peace won a pair of stakes on the Northern California circuit in the early 1990s and later became the foundation mare for the Twin Creeks' broodmare operation at its farm near Nonesuch, Ky. La Paz' third foal, Forest Camp, was bred and raised by Twin Creeks and sold for \$675,000 as a yearling. The son of Deputy Minister became a stakes winner in his second start in the 1999 Del Mar Futurity (gr. II).

Twin Creeks sold La Paz in foal to Storm Cat at the 2000 Keeneland November mixed sale for \$1.6 million to Jane Lyon of Summer Wind Farm. Eight years later a yearling son of La Paz by Unbridled's Song bred by Summer Wind appears in the catalog of the Keeneland September sale. Eager for the chance to reconnect to La Paz through one of her family members, Gullatt and Davison acquired the colt for \$200,000, brought in some partners, including NFL Hall of Famer Terry Bradshaw, and had their first Kentucky Derby starter, Mission Impazible, the race's ninth-place finisher in 2010.

An earner of more than \$1.2 million, Mission Impazible captured the 2010 Louisiana Derby (gr. II) and 2011 New Orleans Handicap (gr. II). Grade I victories eluded him, but only narrowly. The Pletcher-trained Mission Impazible was denied elite status by finishing second in the 2012 Donn Handicap (a nose loss) and the 2011 Stephen Foster Handicap (a neck loss).

Two weeks before finishing fifth in his final career start, the 2012 Clark Handicap (gr. I), it was announced that Mission Impazible would stand in New York at Sequel. It was uncharted waters for Gullatt and Davison, who would be

standing their first stallion. (Kentucky-based sires Graydar and Constitution would later follow for Twin Creeks.)

They gave considerable thought to where they wanted Mission Impazible to land. They intended to support the young stallion heavily with their own mares, and because of that, Gullatt and Davison were bullish on New York and its enticing breeder awards that are one of the many perks associated with the state-bred program. Additionally, there are incentives for stallion owners.

"We thought about where the best place would be to give us the most ben-

efits for supporting him with mares," Gullatt said. "If he stands in Kentucky, I don't think there is as much benefit for a breeder compared to New York, so if we're going to breed 20 of our own mares and we can get a 30% breeders' award, standing in New York is a lot more beneficial. I also think that New York makes Mission a bigger fish in a small pond versus Kentucky."

When Gullatt approached Thomas about standing Mission Impazible at Sequel, his inquiry initially was met with circumspection.

"Becky was guarded," Gullatt said. "I begged her, and I said, 'This is the one. This is a horse we are going to get behind and we're going to go all in on. I truly believe in the horse.'"

Thomas' reticence had its roots in the knowledge of the difficulties associated with getting the career of a new stallion off the ground, and the need to get behind a young sire by supporting him with mares.

Thomas is well-versed in the sire-making business and has built the 223-acre Sequel, along with partner Dennis Narlinger, into one of North America's elite stallion stations. It has been the residence for many years to the prolific Freud, who is among the Empire State's perennial leading sires. The internationally renowned Darley operation put its trust into Sequel by sending grade I win-

ners Alpha and Emcee, and grade II winner Desert Party, the leading first-crop sire in earnings in New York in 2014, to stand there.

"I've been in New York a long time and it is a very big commitment to stand a stallion, so I argued with Randy on all the reasons we shouldn't," Thomas recalled. "The risk is high, but the reward is obviously great. But Randy and Steve are just phenomenal horsemen, and I had known Randy for a long time and he was very determined.

"I don't take horses that I'm not all in on," she added. "The privilege of standing these horses comes with the responsibility of putting everything we can into making them. It's a joint effort on every single stallion we have. We are just not standing a horse for someone for the sake of standing him. When I stand the stallions for somebody, I'm all in, and stand the stallion with a large mare support from our own farm."

With Twin Creeks and Sequel's collective support, and outside interest in Mission Impazible, who stood for \$7,500 in 2013-16, there are 48 named 2-year-olds from his initial crop. He covered 105 mares in his second season, now yearlings of 2016, and 60 in 2015. He bred close to 100 mares this season.

"One of my biggest goals was to find horses to breed to him that we thought would result in horses that had chances of racing as 2-year-olds," Gullatt said. "We found mares that raced well as 2-year-olds or produced 2-year-olds. A large number of the horses we bred were like that, and I think that really has helped.

"Once we learn in a few years what Mission's niche truly is—is it going to be 2-year-olds or is it going to be older horses—we can adjust the kind of mare who will truly fit him," he continued. "I think in time we will learn that. But right now, we feel these horses are very precocious, athletic, have good minds, and want to run, so we can take advantage of the 2-year-old program that really brings

out the best in him."

In his second start, Silver Mission won the \$181,000 Tremont Stakes against open company June 10 at Belmont Park. Under a hand ride by Hall of Famer John Velazquez, the pacesetter Silver Mission captured the 5½-furlong race by 6¼ lengths.

"We've been fortunate enough to win some pretty big races, but winning a

stakes with a horse that we bred and had that whole family, was like winning one of the biggest races of our career. That is how much it meant to us," said Gullatt, who shared an agonizing defeat with his partner, Davison, the day after the Tremont, when their Destin was beaten a nose in the \$1.5 million Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I).

"It was very tough to lose the Belmont with Destin because we felt he ran a winning race, and we're very proud of him. Silver Mission winning the Tremont did help, for sure...it took off some pressure."

Silver Mission will continue to target stakes and was scheduled to run in the \$125,000 Rockville Centre Stakes for New York-breds at Belmont Park July 16. The following day, another Mission Impazible-sired 2-year-old, Paz the Bourbon, was expected to make her stakes debut in the \$125,000 Lynbrook Stakes for New York-bred fillies.

Paz the Bourbon was also bred by Twin Creeks and Sequel Thoroughbreds, but was sold by Sequel Bloodstock as a

2-year-old at the OBS March sale and bought for \$150,000 by McMahon & Hill Bloodstock to race in the silks of Bourbon Lane Stable. Paz the Bourbon finished second in her career debut against state-breds May 26 at Belmont.

Jamie Hill, who, along with partner Mike McMahon, manages operations for Bourbon Lane Stable, said when they were scouting horses at the OBS sale the daughter of Silver Mission checked all the boxes they require to make a purchase.

"She breezed well, and we liked her gallop out," Hill said. "She fit the bill on the track and then when we went to do the visual inspection, she was just what we were looking for.

"We went specifically to buy a New York-bred," he added. "The program is spectacular now and the money is great. Our racing partnership is really about providing returns to our partners, and the New York-bred program really gives you the ability to get a return on your investment.

"The stallions are also being upgraded and the breeders have been working hard to do that. I give Becky high marks. She's partnered with Darley on several stallions and has given New York breeders the opportunity to breed to those stallions standing at Sequel. I also think partnering with Twin Creeks was a brilliant move. Randy and his team support their stallions and do everything the right way."

As the year goes on, more New York-bred Mission Impazible 2-year-olds from Twin Creeks' collaboration with Sequel will reach the races, and there are also the yearlings who are showing up in the catalog pages at the sales.

"I think it gives the breeders confidence and the buyers at these yearling and 2-year-old sales confidence when they see the fast start Mission got off to," Gullatt remarked. "The reality with the stallion business is that you don't truly know how they are going to be as stallions until you see the offspring run. The sooner you can see that ability out there, the sooner you are going to get returns." 🐾

Freeze Frame

Miss Freeze, Runaway Lute ice their first stakes tests at 2

NOT MANY FIRST-TIME STARTERS win stakes races, but **Miss Freeze** did July 17 in Belmont Park's Lynbrook Stakes. The \$125,000 race for New York-bred juvenile fillies was a companion race with the July 16 Rockville Centre Stakes won by Harold Lerner and Nehoc Stables' Runaway Lute.

Miss Freeze was bred by Anthony Bruno and foaled at Rick Burke's Irish Hill Century Farm. She races for Joseph Bulger, Michael Imperio, and DJC Racing Stables, and is trained by David Cannizzo. The win in the Lynbrook was the New York-born and -raised trainer's first stakes victory.

On getting his first stakes win, Cannizzo said, "It was a great feeling; it was a blessing to get that off our shoulders. A lot of people try and some never get there.

"Hopefully, we'll get some more. I've got some high-dollar, nice-pedigreed horses now. We won with Miss Freeze and got our first win in our first start at Saratoga. There is plenty of blue sky ahead."

Cannizzo has a stable of 40-plus horses, a vast majority of which are 2-year-olds.

Cannizzo opted for the Lynbrook over a maiden special weight because he knew he had a talented filly and thought he'd catch a smaller field in a stakes race. With Jose Ortiz up, Miss Freeze was fifth early in the six-

furlong Lynbrook before moving toward the lead and getting a two-length advantage at the eighth pole. She coasted home by 6¼ lengths in 1:11.98.

"She lost some position for a bit, and my heart sunk for a moment, thinking 'maybe she's not as good as I thought,'" he said. "When given her cue, though, she just exploded. It was great to see her gallop out."

Bloodstock agents Nick Sallusto and Hanzly Albina picked up Miss Freeze for \$150,000 out of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring 2-year-old sale this April. She had been a \$57,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York preferred yearling sale by Webb Carroll Training Center from the Hidden Brook consignment.

The daughter of Frost Giant—Reata's Vision, by Sligo Bay, earned \$75,000 for the stakes win and Cannizzo has his eye on the \$200,000 Seeking the Ante Stakes for state-bred juvenile fillies on Showcase Day, Aug. 26.

Runaway Lute also went through the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sale, selling to Lerner for \$77,000, with trainer Gary Contessa acting as agent. He was consigned by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

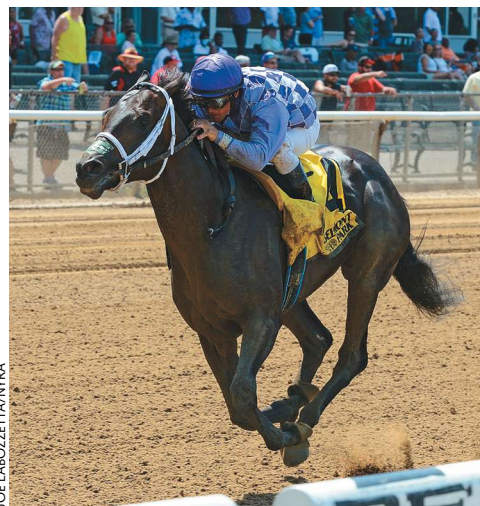
Bred by Windylea Farm and foaled at Tender Loving Care near Slate,

Runaway Lute was perhaps just as impressive as Miss Freeze in his maiden voyage, topping state-breds by 12 lengths going five furlongs May 28. Sent off at 7-5 in the Rockville Centre, he powered home by 8¾ lengths in 1:10.82 for the six furlongs.

Contessa may advance right to open company with Runaway Lute next time out.

"Now we'll take the next step forward, maybe the (grade II) Saratoga Special (Aug. 14) or the Hopeful (Stakes, gr. I, Sept. 5), but we're definitely going to go to open company because I think he's that good."

Cloud Control wins the Spectacular Bid division over Bust Another

The Bromans' Cloud Control, Louisville First earn NYSS victories

In Control

THE \$100,000 SPECTACULAR BID division of the New York Stallion Stakes, contested June 26 at Belmont Park, was a tale of two pairs of owners—Chester and Mary Broman, and Bing Cherry Racing's Scott Zimmerman and Anthony Como.

The Bromans celebrated in the winner's circle with their homebred Cloud Control (by Freud) while Bing Cherry Racing's duo looked forward to the promise of tomorrow with their astute claim, Bust Another (by Bustin Stones).

"I've bred to Freud a few times now. This is my first good one by him," said Chester Broman. "I'm going to breed back to Freud because he's a winner."

Cloud Control, who didn't race at 2 due to an injured hock, broke his maiden (May 22 at Belmont) via a disqualification. In the Spectacular Bid, a seven-furlong

grass event for 3-year-olds, the colt was first under the wire, charging through the lane beneath jockey Angel Arroyo to collar Bust Another—a resounding winner of the Mike Lee Stakes four weeks earlier—in deep stretch.

Joining the Bromans' elated party was trainer John Kimmel, who also saddled the couple's New York-bred champion Friends Lake to victory in the 2004 Florida Derby (gr. I).

"(Chester's) a really good guy. I'm his first trainer," Kimmel said. "I've been with him longer than anybody. He's given me a great opportunity to work with his horses. We've had a good year so far. This was our 12th win of the year (together). I trained the mother (Cloud Control's dam, Amiga Del Sol, by Friends Lake). She was an ordinary filly and was not very big. But this colt is big and stout.

"Once you have these (young horses) on the

grounds and see them, you start looking at the breeding to see whether they'd be better on the grass or dirt. I had Cloud Control in Florida and took him out on the Palmetto turf course. He showed me that he was probably going to be more useful on the grass."

The disappointment of Bust Another's being nailed in the late stages in his turf debut quickly turned to a sense of pride and promise for the owners of the runner-up, whose stable name, Bing Cherry Racing, comes from Zimmerman's Brooklyn produce market.

"In midstretch I thought (Bust Another) was the winner. But we're happy. Now we know he can run on the turf," said Zimmerman, who received his introduction to racing through former jockey, and now New York Racing Association valet, Nick Santagata. "He's my best friend. I've known Nick for 40 years, growing up in Brooklyn. We were on the same bowling team."

Zimmerman and Como claimed Bust Another in January for \$32,000, winning a four-way shake and then sending him to trainer Michael Pino. Since the claim the gelding has won three of six starts, with two seconds, and has earned \$190,800.

"We've made money with this horse, and I think he'll win at Saratoga," said Como.

Cloud Control got the distance in 1:21.85 over a firm course, registering a length victory. Cloud Control has won two of three starts and \$96,172.

Giddyup Stables' Go Go Lucky (by Roaring Fever), from the barn of trainer Mike Maker, finished third.

The Joy of Being First

Four races later on the June 26 card nine sophomore fillies received their opportunities at the same trip on the Widener turf in the \$100,000 Cupecoy's Joy division of the New York Stallion Stakes.

Jockey Eric Cancel, a 20-year-old native of Puerto Rico, who had piloted Bust Another to a runner-up finish in the Spectacular Bid division, reached the winner's circle with a stellar stretch-rallying ride aboard RAP Racing's Louisville First (by Girolamo), trained by George Weaver.

"She really felt prepared. I didn't have to ask her early because I knew I had a lot of horse," said Cancel, whose parents were jockeys in Puerto Rico, and who is currently mentored and represented by Hall of Famer Angel Cordero Jr.

Louisville First scored a thrilling half-length victory over the David Cannizzo-owned and-trained Little Bear Cat (by Bluegrass Cat). It was a nose back to the third-place finisher Frosty Margarita (by Frost Giant).

The winner stopped the timer in 1:21.97, while making her initial start on the turf.

Bred by Mr. and Mrs. James G. Bell, Louisville First, who is out of Move Clickly, by Cherokee Run, has won two of seven starts and has earned \$133,360.

Like so many other trainers who run

multiple strings around the country, Weaver is aided by top-flight assistants. In New York that assistant title belongs to the hard-working Blair Golen.

"I did showjumpers for years, and I kind of got burnt out with it," said Golen, a native of Chicago. "A friend finally said to me, 'You should come to Hawthorne and learn how to gallop a racehorse.' So I did and never went back (to the showjumpers). By the way, Hawthorne is a scary place to learn because it's so crowded on the track in the mornings."

Cupecoy's Joy (by Northerly), bred by Robert Perez and raced in partnership with Ri-Ma-Ro Stables, was among the first New York-bred grade I winners. In 1982 the 3-year-old filly captured two thirds of the New York Triple Crown for fillies in Belmont's Acorn Stakes (gr. I) and Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I). That was one year after Fio Rito captured the 1981 Whitney Handicap (gr. I) at Saratoga to become the first state-bred grade I winner.

Perez and trainer Alfredo Callejas also raced Cupecoy's Joy in the 1982 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) where she finished 10th of 19 entrants, after flashing her brilliant speed for the opening mile.

The filly won five stakes and placed in 10 others. She retired after her 3-year-old campaign with six wins in 22 starts and earnings of \$377,960. 🐾

Good to Be Back Home

State-bred Haveyougoneaway making hay in New York

A LONG, WINDING ROAD led Haveyougoneaway back to her roots, but the wait was worth it for all involved after the 5-year-old won her first New York stakes, the \$100,000 Dancin Renee Stakes for state-bred older fillies and mares at Belmont Park July 3 for Sequel Racing.

Bred in New York by Andy and Susan Beadnell and foaled at their farm near Pottersville, Haveyougoneaway is a daughter of Congrats out of the unraced New York-bred Wiseman's Ferry mare One Wise Cowgirl.

Haveyougoneaway originally sold for \$50,000 as a weanling and was purchased by John Greathouse Bloodstock from the McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds consignment at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. Consigned by Four Star Sales for the Greathouse family's Glencrest Farm, she went through the auction ring the following year at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale. Tayloe & Greathouse were listed as the buyers after the hammer fell at \$105,000.

Rick Cundiff's Champion Racing Stable acquired the filly in 2013 for \$1,200 when Four Star Sales offered her as an unraced 2-year-old at Keeneland's November breeding stock sale. Trained by Allen Milligan on the Southwest circuit, she became a multiple stakes winner and earned \$402,425 for her former connections.

Becky Thomas, the owner of Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson, is a pinhooker and usually is the one offering racehorses for sale. But when she

heard through a friend that Haveyougoneaway was for sale, she and one of her pinhooking groups, who were looking for a broodmare prospect, stepped in and bought her in April.

“This is not my normal agenda,” Thomas said. “We’re very strong in supporting our stallions and spend a lot of money in mare support—but hardly ever buy racehorses.”

Sent to trainer Tom Morley, Haveyougoneaway finished second to graded stakes-placed Bar of Gold in her first start representing the Sequel Racing silks: the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes for New York-breds at Belmont Park May 30.

Next up was the six-furlong Dancin Renee, which Haveyougoneaway won by 2¾ lengths over Quezon. Hot City Girl, the 7-5 favorite in the field of seven, set the pace before tiring and finished third. Haveyougoneaway’s Dancin Renee’s win provided the 33-year-old Morley with his first career stakes victory.

By partaking in New York’s state-bred program, Haveyougoneaway made a quick return on the investment made by Thomas and her partners, who received owner awards on top of purse money from her two starts. The mare also provided the Beadnells with breeder awards, something they weren’t eligible for when she raced out of state.

“It’s a great pinhooking story,” Thomas commented. “Champion Racing and Rick Cundiff bought her (inexpensively) and won a lot of money with her. She wasn’t inexpensive when I bought her, but she is certainly helping with defraying her purchase price, and if we can get some graded black type, she would be worth quite a bit more. Everyone has accomplished their purpose for what they were doing with her.

“Who is really benefiting is the Beadnells, who are Sequel New York breeders, and I couldn’t be happier for them,” she added. “They are benefiting on having their New York-bred back in New York and are able to capitalize on the New York breeding program.”

From Saginaw to Malibu

It took a few times to fill, but the \$100,000 Saginaw Stakes for older state-

bred at 1¼ miles went July 8 with a cast of five. Taking the field wire-to-wire in 1:40.39 was Saul and Max Kupferberg’s Wake Up in Malibu. The 5-year-old set a quick pace, going the opening half-mile in :45.12 and six furlongs in 1:08.71 but was well clear in the lane, holding a 4½-length lead at the eighth pole that diminished to 2¾ lengths at the wire. The runner-up was 4-5 favorite Royal Posse.

Bred by Vivien Malloy’s Edition Farm near Hyde Park, Wake Up in Malibu

is one of four winners and the second black-type winner out of the Cure the Blues mare Wake Up Kiss, a multiple stakes winner bred by John Hettinger who was voted New York-bred champion turf female in 2003.

Edition purchased the mare in foal to Forest Wildcat for \$380,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale.

Wake Up in Malibu is a Keeneland September yearling sales graduate, where he was purchased by Jim and Susan Hill for \$100,000. The bay gelding raced for the Hills and trainer George Weaver until he was claimed last August at Saratoga for \$35,000 by trainer John Parisella for the Kupferbergs. Wake Up in Malibu won an open allowance optional claiming race to polish off his 2015 campaign.

The Saginaw was his second start of the year, having finished second in an open allowance race at Belmont June 11.

“I have to give (retired trainer) John Parisella the credit,” Saul Kupferberg said. “He found the horse at Saratoga and recommended we claim him. I was a little nervous when I saw the (fast) fractions, but it looked like he had plenty left. We’d like to look at some stakes in Saratoga, but it’s up to (trainer) Charlie (Baker). He’s the boss.” 🐾

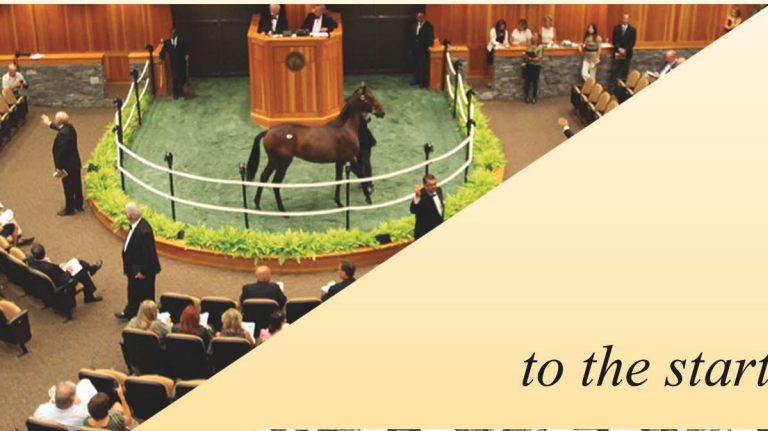
