Saratoga Musings

COMING TO SARATOGA has been a part of my life for nearly 40 years. My life's experiences at Saratoga started with the 1982 Travers Stakes (G1) when Runaway Groom beat three classic winners (I was 3). Fourstardave in the late 1980s was our household name. As there have been so many great races over this period of time, two that stick in my mind are Point Given's 2001 Travers and You's 2002 Test Stakes (G1). Both races nearly brought the grandstand down. The stretch run of You and Carson Hollow is what horse racing is all about. The movement of the wooden floor beams against the roar of the crowd is what I remember the most; it was remarkable and like nowhere else on earth. For me, that is Saratoga. Back then my focus wasn't on New York-breds, so I will admit I had the exacta straight (You—Carson Hollow).

I feel that the most important piece in discussing Saratoga is the main reason it's here: racing. It's the core of what makes Saratoga...Saratoga. In 1990, nationally we had a foal crop of 40,000 with 89,000 starters in 73,000 races averaging 7.94 starts with average field sizes of 8.91. Fast forward to today, and we have 20,000 foals with 50,000 starters in 40,000 races averaging 6.21 starts with average field sizes of 7.7. Essentially almost two fewer starts per horse (-22%) and 1.25 fewer horses per race. The pressure on race conditions and stakes programs looms even at meets like the mighty Saratoga.

Field size is the key to the equation, both for the customer and the track. After all, that is what makes Saratoga a jewel: Competitive racing with playable, desired odds. You cannot have that without full fields.

Saratoga works because it's the perfect blend of quality mixed with the appropriate quantity. In my opinion, field size is the one obstacle Saratoga faces and could be most pressing, keeping field size up while remaining competitive with the various obstacles that surround everyday racing and the sport in general. After all, it is everyday racing that needs the most help and should be the industry's focus. The highest levels of our sport are healthy and we prove it time and time again on every big Saturday. Unfortunately, in general racing conditions and the typical everyday card is struggling to be filled. Just ask any of the smaller barns.

Rather than just being backstretch conversation, we need every racing day to be the frontside conversation. There are many intricate challenges we face when it comes to everyday racing. In the old days horses ran. Today they breeze four times between races and might make a start every month and a half. As reported, horses are averaging 6.21 starts per year. If we can work as an industry to get that number up a half-horse (.5), the subsequent economics of racetracks would change dramatically.

This year the New York Racing Association instituted the "loyalty program," rewarding horses and their connections who run in New York. It's a tangible way of adding value to horsemen. There need to be dozens of other measurable efforts done or regulated to address our everyday challenges.

Saratoga's handle per betting interest is best, bar none. On average, Saratoga yields \$200,000 per betting interest, making it one of the leaders, if not the leader, in the country. Having an extra horse per race goes a long way to lead back to profitability for NYRA and the purse account itself. Additionally, \$1 of purses distributed at Saratoga yields on average a 16.5 ROI from handle, a figure essentially unmatched in our industry. To put this in perspective, if Saratoga increases its field sizes by a half-horse with an average \$100,000 a race in added handle, it would equate to roughly \$1 million in additional handle a day. Obviously, this is the full extreme for racing versus smaller meets across the country. However, this is how our industry sustains itself, grows purses, expands on capital race-track projects, and has funds for marketing and promotion.

Other challenges we face in New York that involve Saratoga, are workers' compensation and the general cost of doing business in this State. Both have inflated at astronomical proportions. These challenges discourage participation in everyday racing and have led to a reduction of out of town starters and added horsemen in New York. The results are smaller fields and races failing to fill.

The good news is that both NYRA and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA) have long-term strategies to reduce workers compensation for backstretch employees. The need to reduce costs for horsemen and owners further is absolutely necessary.

If we could reduce the cost of each day, via outside-the-box feed and purchasing co-ops for simple products such as hay, straw, grain, etc., the results would be significantly positive economically for owners and trainers. Just because you're operating in New York City doesn't mean the cost of agricultural products you're buying (from rural places) should be quadrupled. The price of hay and straw downstate is 70 to 90% more than that in upstate New York.

New York-bred Yearlings Stand Out at F-T Kentucky July

A New York-bred filly and colt brought \$250,000 and \$220,000, respectively, during the July 10 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's July Yearling Sale in Lexington.

Results from the auction were strong overall, with across-the-board gains, but as added testimony to the strength of the New York sales marketplace, the five New York-breds in the sale outperformed the general population in both average and median prices.

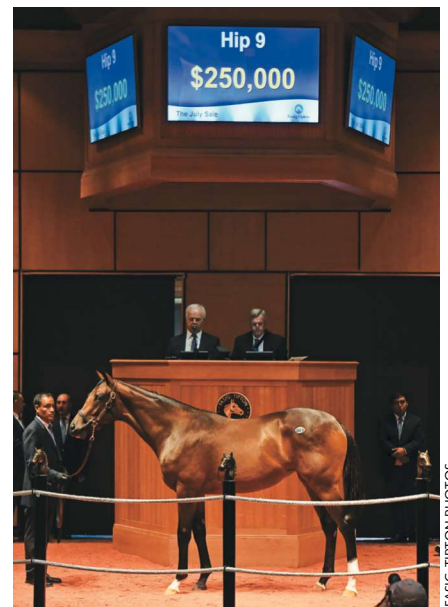
The top-selling Empire State-bred (Hip 9) was a bay filly by Palace Malice bred by Bill and Jane Moriarty's Apache Farm near Mount Morris, where she was foaled March 27, 2017. Agent Steve Young signed the \$250,000 ticket. Consigned by Perrone Sales, the filly is out of *Passe*, an unraced Kentucky-bred daughter of *Dixie Union*. *Passe's* lone foal to race is New York-bred multiple stakes winner *Wonder*

Gal, an earner of \$904,800.

The New York-bred male topper, Hip 289, a bay *Into Mischief* colt, was hammered down to Dime Box Stable.

Bred by Woodford Thoroughbreds and foaled at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson, the colt is out of the young stakes-placed *Bernardini* mare *Kimono*. *Kimono's* 2-year-old filly *Just a Whim*, by *Warrior's Reward*, owned by *Runaway Point Farms* and trained by *Mark Shuman*, has won once in three starts. The mare foaled a *Laoban* filly Jan. 28.

All five New York-breds to go through the sales ring found new homes (including one private sale). The quintet sold for an average of \$122,823 and a \$101,000 median, which outperformed the overall results of the sale where the average was \$100,829 and the median was \$75,000.

Awesome Debate is First Winner for Honorable Dillon

Charlton Baker's homebred *Awe-some Debate* became the first winner for *Rockridge Stud's* freshman sire *Honorable Dillon* July 23 at *Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack*, where the juvenile filly won her first start by two lengths.

Baker, who is both owner and trainer;

bred *Awe-some Debate* out of the winning *Freud* mare *Healthy Debate*. The New York-bred filly is the third winner produced by *Healthy Debate* from as many foals to race.

Honorable Dillon was represented by both a win and a place in the five-furlong

maiden special weight at *Finger Lakes* because his daughter and first-time starter *Honorable Rose* finished third for owner/trainer *Jeremiah Englehart*.

A grade 2 winner, *Honorable Dillon* is an 8-year-old son of *Tapit* who stands at *Rockridge Stud* near Hudson for \$5,000.

STATE-BRED STAR SAY FLORIDA SANDY DEAD AT 24

Say Florida Sandy, a multiple graded stakes winner and one of the top New York-breds of all time, died due to an apparent heart attack July 11, Old Friends Thoroughbred Retirement Farm announced July 13.

A full necropsy is pending for the 24-year-old stallion, who was retired with Old Friends near Georgetown, Ky.

Bred by Sanford Bacon, the son of Personal Flag out of the Sweet Candy mare Lolli Lucka Lolli was a star of the New York racing circuit for much of his eight-year career. He won several New York-bred championships, including three New York champion sprinter titles and New York Horse of the Year honors for 2001 and 2002.

Raced by Bacon before being lost for \$70,000 in a claiming race in 1997, Say Florida Sandy had several owners and conditioners but won the lion's share of his races for trainer Juan Serey and owner John Rotella.

The dark bay stallion won 19 stakes during his 98-race career, including the 2001 True North Handicap (G2), the Gravesend Handicap (G3) in 1998 and 2000, and the 2001 Philadelphia Park Breeders' Cup Handicap (G3). He retired from racing in 2003 with 33 wins and earnings of \$2,085,408.

Say Florida Sandy entered stud in



Say Florida Sandy earned \$2,085,408

2004 at Buckridge Farm near Kinderhook, N.Y., where he stood for 10 years. As a sire, he is best represented by stakes winner Say Toba Sandy, who won the

Finger Lakes Juvenile Fillies Stakes in 2007.

Say Florida Sandy was pensioned by his syndicate and retired to Old Friends in 2014.

"It's been a privilege to retire one of the top New York-breds of all time," said Old Friends founder Michael Blowen. "Sandy was a very sensitive stallion, so he was placed at Hurstland Farm in Midway, Ky., under the watchful eye of owner Alfred Nuckols, who took the great-

est care of him. We are grateful to breeder Sanford Bacon and to Walter Downey, who managed Sandy's syndicate, for allowing us to care for their champion."

SEA FOAM RISES TO OCCASION IN NEW YORK DERBY

Waterville Lake Stable's homebred Sea Foam ran gate-to-wire to win the \$150,000 New York Derby July 21 at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack.

Sea Foam drifted out on the final turn and made brief contact with Spectacular Kid at the top of the lane before he kicked clear to win by 3¼ lengths in 1:46.19 for the 1¼ miles. An objection was lodged by Spectacular Kid's rider, Andy Hernandez Sanchez, but the result was not changed.

The victory was the first for the son of Medaglia d'Oro since he closed his freshman season with a win last November in Aqueduct's Notebook.

Sea Foam at Finger Lakes

Foaled at Berkshire Stud near Pine Plains, the colt is out of the grade 3-winning Strike It Rich by Undbridled's Song, who was purchased by trainer Christophe Clement for John

Meriwether's Waterville Lake Stable for \$350,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale.

Trained by Christophe Clement, Sea Foam improved his record to 3-3-0 from eight starts, with earnings of \$236,070.

One race later in the \$75,000 New York Oaks, Tic Stables' Split Time impressed in the final furlongs, overtaking the leaders with a surge from the outside to win the 1¼-mile dirt test in 1:47.

Boxed in at the quarter pole, Split Time was checked by Junior Alvarado before she was angled out three wide. The Take Charge Indy filly seized her opening in late stretch and drew off to a two-length win. Crashing Connie finished second, with English Soul a nose behind in third.

Bred by Sequel Stallions New York out of the Not For Love mare Speed Dating, Split Time earned her third black-type win this year. The 3-year-old broke her maiden Jan. 18 at Aqueduct and entered the Oaks off a win in the Alma North Stakes at Laurel Park. This was her fifth win of the year in six starts.

Split Time was purchased for \$62,000 by trainer Linda Rice from the Sequel New York consignment to the Fasig-Tipton Preferred New York-Bred yearling sale. She has a 5-1-1 record from seven starts, with earnings of \$240,700.

One thing that has changed in the last decade is the importance of the New York-bred program to the Saratoga meet. The two most important ingredients in a racing program's recipe for success are field size and handle. New York-bred races are outperforming their open counterparts virtually across the board here in New York.

For the 406 races run at Saratoga in 2017, the average field size for open races was 8.05 horses. The average field size for New York-bred races, on the other hand, was 8.88, or .83 more horses. Although less than an entire racehorse might not sound like much, in reality it is substantial, and in terms of percentage it means that New York-bred fields are 10% larger than those for open races.

In 2017 New York-breds won 135 of the 406 races (33%) at Saratoga, earning \$9.8 million of the \$41 million (24%) total purse money. Furthermore, New York-breds made 1,151 of the 3,349 starts (34%) during the 2017 Saratoga meet.

These figures might appear astonishing to some, but the expansion and success of our state-bred program should be a shock to none. At the same time, if open company racing doesn't succeed, it all crumbles. We need full fields across the

board, and in some circumstances there's a point at which New York-breds need to compete in open company. It's a larger ecosystem to make racing healthy. As the numbers show, without New York-breds there would be one-third fewer starts than we have today, which would collapse it all.

All in all, we'd like every meet and every track experience to be Saratoga. Unfortunately, that's not reality. Saratoga will always be here. In order to keep it special, we must strengthen our everyday racing, which feeds its boutique ability. With 50% fewer foals than 20 years ago and horses making 22% fewer starts each year, something has to give. I believe we all see it giving a little more each year throughout the country. The 71 stakes worth \$19 million; or 40% of purses at Saratoga; generate 25% of the handle. Eighty-three percent of the various other overnight races generate the remaining 75% of handle. Nationally, stakes are only 2% of racing, with 1% of them being graded. The vast majority of horses and races are not and cannot be at the top. The top is what drives our sport, and there is no question about it. However, it's what's directly underneath that will help keep Saratoga, and perhaps all racing, intact as we know it. 🐾

The Force of July

LA FUERZA WAS DEFINITELY with owner Barry K. Schwartz July 14 at Belmont Park.

Named for a California wine that translates to “The Force,” the 2-year-old homebred colt has lived up to his name in his two starts, breaking his maiden first-time out by $7\frac{3}{4}$ lengths June 22 and following that with a $4\frac{1}{2}$ -length win in the \$98,000 Rockville Centre Stakes over a fast track.

Under jockey Manuel Franco, the son of Flatter broke from post 2 and settled at the back of the five-horse field. Running patiently into the far turn, Franco took the chestnut colt wide coming into the stretch and cruised easily to the wire, running the six furlongs in 1:12.27.

“The timing was right,” said Schwartz of the decision to run La Fuerza at Belmont instead of holding him for Saratoga after the impressive maiden-breaker.

Out of the Proud Citizen mare Jonata—the name of a wine produced in California at a vineyard that Schwartz has visited—La Fuerza is trained by Todd Pletcher, and it was his idea to run in the Rockville Centre.

“I second-guessed Todd once,” joked Schwartz, “and it didn’t turn out too well. He was right.”

Both the Saratoga Special Stakes Presented by Coors Light (G2) Aug. 12 and the Funny Cide Stakes for state-breds Aug. 24 are possibilities for La Fuerza’s next start. With both races worth \$200,000, Schwartz is inclined toward the latter.

“Why look for heroics?” asked Schwartz. “The (Funny Cide) will be an easier spot, and it’s \$200,000.”

As the holder of a share in Flatter, Schwartz has often bred to the stallion, with, he admitted, little success. Though that has changed with La Fuerza, he was unable to sell Mystic Chant, the dam of Schwartz' second winner on the day, Voodoo Song, in foal to Flatter at the Keeneland January sale earlier this year.

"One more tick," said Schwartz. "I put what I thought was a fair reserve on her of \$125,000, and the last bid was \$120,000."

The winner of four races at Saratoga last year, Voodoo Song will have to wait a bit to make his first start upstate, following his win in the \$150,000 Forbidden Apple Stakes a few races after La Fuerza won the Rockville Centre.

Running on firm turf, Voodoo Song led his six rivals through the mile race with early fractions of :23.29 and :46.30. Untested, the 4-year-old chestnut colt held off some late challenges to win by a length in 1:31.67, his first stakes victory since the Saranac Stakes (G3T) at Saratoga last September.

"You run horses when they're ready to run," said the owner of the choice to eschew the Saratoga "horse for the course" angle. "That idea of saving a horse for Saratoga—things can happen and then they don't make the start."

Trainer Linda Rice is considering the Aug. 11 Fourstardave Handicap (G1) at the Spa for Voodoo Song's next start, as well as the \$150,000 West Point Stakes Presented by Trustco Bank for state-breds Aug. 24, the day of the Saratoga New York Showcase.

The Forbidden Apple win brings Voodoo Song's earnings to \$581,685, and a lot of satisfaction to the horse's many fans.

"A kid set me up on Twitter, and I can see all these comments about Voodoo Song," said Schwartz with some surprise. "I can see how much everybody likes him."

And as for Mystic Chant (by Unbridled's Song), she delivered a "good-looking" Flatter filly that Schwartz is likely to keep, along with her 16-year-old dam.

"It's tough to sell mares the older they get," he said. "And it's nice to have a young filly."

If Schwartz, as a veteran breeder and owner, is well-acquainted with the highs and lows of horse racing, first-time owner John Irwin could be forgiven for thinking this is a pretty easy game.

Three months ago he and his partners Pines Stables, Paul Zysset, and Sam Arci, purchased two horses on the recommendation of trainer Gary Contessa. One of them was a filly by Revolutionary out of the Eddington mare Alpha Charlie.

On July 15, again on Contessa's advice, they ran that filly in the \$100,000 Lynbrook Stakes. And the first-time owners with the first-time starter became first-out winners when Maiden Beauty, the longest shot in the eight-horse field at 22-1, closed forcefully under Joel Rosario to break her maiden and win a stakes race by 3¼ lengths.

"It was so exciting," said Irwin. "It

was crazy. We had 35 friends and family members there. I was so excited I forgot to go to the winner's circle."

The six-furlong Lynbrook was run over a sloppy track, which concerned Irwin.

"But," he said, "I follow Gary's lead."

Rosario positioned Maiden Beauty in between horses in the middle of the pack, not often a place that a 2-year-old first-time starter might be comfortable.

But as the leaders began to tire and come back to him, Rosario swung Maiden Beauty wide at the top of the stretch, and with a clear path to the wire, the bay filly easily passed her rivals.

"I was on the inside a little bit and was just looking for room to go outside," said the jockey. "She was a first-time starter but very professional. She finished very strong, and it looks like she can go a bit farther."

"I was very nervous," said Irwin. "Everyone was there, everyone was supporting her... and then when she came down the stretch, it was unbelievable. It was so exhilarating."

Maiden Beauty was purchased by Cicada Stable for \$15,000 as a weanling at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Fall Mixed sale. Entered in this year's Ocala Breeders' Sales' April sale of 2-year-olds, she failed to meet her reserve and was purchased privately by Contessa for \$40,000. 🐾

BACK FOR MORE

Diversify, a grade 1 winner last year, rolls in the grade 2 Suburban

DIVERSIFY DID IT AGAIN. The 5-year-old New York-bred gelded son of Bellamy Road, owned by Lauren Evans and her father Ralph M. Evans, captured his second graded stakes.

Last year Diversify won the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1), defeating six rivals in a gate-to-wire one-length score. That was surely impressive. His most recent win, the \$700,000 Suburban Stakes (G2) July 7, however, was positively eye-opening. The Richard Violette-trained runner blew the doors off a highly competitive field of nine rivals, which included six other graded winners, posting a 6½-length victory.

Out of the mare Rule One, by Street Cry, Diversify was bred in the Empire State by Fred W. Hertrich III and John D. Fielding. That same pairing is also

responsible for breeding such notables as Catholic Boy, who succeeded in the Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes (G1T) less than a half-hour after Diversify won the Suburban, and Rushing Fall, winner of last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T).

Hertrich, also the current chairman of the Breeders' Cup, purchased Rule One in foal to War Front for \$57,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. The mare, who earned just shy of \$18,000 without ever visiting the winner's circle, made six starts in her racing career. Five of those starts came in

Canada, where Hertrich's partner, Fielding, is an equally important breeder in the Standardbred industry.

After not being bred for 2012, Rule One was sent to Bellamy Road (by Concerto) for 2013. Winner of the Wood Memorial Stakes (G1) and runner-up in the Travers Stakes (G1) at 3, the stallion banked more than \$800,000 on the racetrack. Bellamy Road, who stands at Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions near Stillwater, was New York's leading sire of winners in 2017 and holds that same ranking in 2018.

"We breed all of our mares with the same philosophy," Hertrich said. "We know their conformation, any faults or shortcomings—whether they need more size or bone mass. Then we breed to a stallion (that can counterbalance those faults) and produce an athlete.

"Yes, we're commercial breeders, so we breed horses that will physically appeal to people. But we don't breed horses to win a beauty contest. We breed horses for performance, winning performances."

Michael Lischin, the co-owner of Dutchess Views Stallions, understands why both owners and breeders of all means want to be involved with the New York-bred program.

“Restricted (New York-bred) races enable you to run your horses for larger purses and breeders’ awards,” Lischin said. “If you’re a breeder, you can sell your horse on the potential of these future earnings. And if you’re a small breeder with limited resources, the program allows you to have a horse that can become a star in the New York-bred program and beyond.”

Lischin also knows what Bellamy Road brings to the table as a stallion.

“He’s physically big (almost 16.2), really well-boned and passes that along,” he said. “Strong-boned and muscled. He also passes along a quickness. Bellamy Road is that miler-type of sire. But he really sits in that sweet spot (producing runners that excel) from six furlongs to a mile. Or you might get a fast horse such as Diversify that can carry their speed further.”

Violette has witnessed that possibility coming to fruition on the racetrack firsthand.

“It’s pretty spectacular to win at this level,” said Violette, who considers Diversify to be among the best dirt runners he’s trained. “Yes, the cherry on top is that he’s a New York-bred. But, it’s extra special on its own merit. New York-breds have come a long way in my lifetime. We don’t need to qualify it anymore. New York-breds are on par with horses (bred) anywhere.”

Diversify made his first two starts for WinStar Farm and Violette. Diversify was purchased by Lauren and Ralph Evans for \$210,000 during the horses of racing age portion of the 2016 Keeneland November Mixed Sale and kept him under Violette’s care. Violette had had strong prior success with the Evans’ Upstart (by Flatter), a fellow New York-bred who competed on the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) trail as a sophomore in 2015, winning the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (G2) and placing in the Besilu Stables Florida Derby (G1).

Diversify’s regular rider is Irad Ortiz Jr.

Mirroring the gelding’s winning ride in the Jockey Club Gold Cup, Ortiz took Diversify directly to the front in the Suburban where they dispatched a pair of early pace rivals through an opening

half-mile of :46.18.

That put Diversify on a clear and uncontested lead, racing the initial six furlongs in a quick 1:09.65.

“For horses racing from a mile-and-a-quarter to a mile-and-a-half, he’s just gone early. He’s got that high cruising speed that sets him apart,” said Violette.

Diversify turned into Belmont Park’s sandy stretch with a five-length advantage. Ortiz was still riding confidently. And to the discerning observer, the outcome was already in the books.

“My plan was to break and go,” said Ortiz. “I broke good. I sent him, and he took me the whole way. He was traveling perfect. I just went from there and started moving, and he responded very

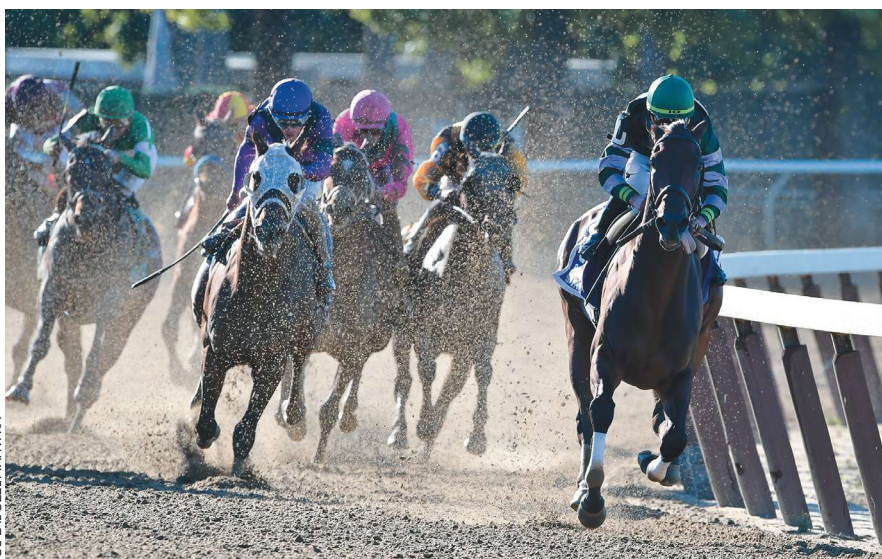
well. He went fast, and he gave me another gear at the quarter pole.”

The winner raced the length of the lane without so much as a borderline threat to his forward position in a front-running tour de force. The final time for the 1¼-mile contest was 1:59.84 over a “fast” main track.

Diversify notched his ninth victory from 14 starts and pushed his earnings to \$1,309,425.

The gelding is the second New York-bred millionaire for the Evans clan as Upstart finished his career banking \$1,732,780. Upstart stands at Airdrie Stud near Midway, Ky.

Currently 50 New York-breds have surpassed the \$1-million plateau in earnings. 🐾

MOVING FORWARD

New York-bred sale figures to continue upward trend

LAST YEAR'S FASIG-TIPTON SALE of Preferred New York-Bred Yearlings was a record-breaker across the board: record gross, record average, record median, and record high price. Can the 2018 version—Aug. 11-12 at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs—top that? With a larger catalog this year, and continued demand, there is little reason to say, “Why not?”

“It’s repetition now, but the Preferred Yearling Sale keeps getting more preferred,” said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. “The sale has 326 of the most well-bred New York-bred foals in it, which is 19% of our 1,705 foals from 2017. The sale is offering the cream of the crop. I fully expect the sale to once again be the strongest regional sale in the world.”

“This is the biggest catalog we’ve had for the New York-bred sale,” said Boyd Browning Jr., president of Fasig-Tipton. “We’ve added a small barn and are able to accommodate a few more horses. Honestly, we’re very optimistic heading into the sale.

“As you chart the success of the sale...how long can you sustain the growth that has taken place over the last five years? It continues to trend in the right direction, and we have every reason to believe there will be lots of demand for New York-breds for 2018.”

In addition, 12 of the 255 yearlings cataloged for Fasig-Tipton Saratoga’s Select Sale are New York-breds.

The keys to the steady growth of the New York-bred sale are the current purse structure at the New York Racing Association tracks and the fact New York-based breeders, due to stiffer competition, are bringing a better level of horses to auction.

“The quality of horses continues to improve each and every year in the New York-bred program,” Browning said. “As a result, the quality of horses in the yearling sale improves as well. You look at the cover of the catalog and you see horses such as Audible, Diversify, Fourstar Crook, Mind Your Biscuits, and Holiday Disguise... those are all extremely talented and extremely valuable racehorses. That’s indicative of the horses the New York-bred program is developing now days.”

“As the buyer of a horse at public auction, if you have that maiden special weight and non-winners of one ‘other than’ conditions to run for before you have to face open company, you’ve got a legitimate shot of making north of \$100,000,” said Chris Bernhard of RFHF Bloodstock. “Why wouldn’t you pay a premium for that opportunity?”

“It’s gotten more and more difficult for breeders to enter this

sale, and the reason is quite simple: The bar keeps being raised by the people entering New York,” Cannizzo said. “The average price for stud fees to the mares in the sale is at an all time high. The female families are most impressive. The quality of the broodmares that have been having foals in New York is unparalleled with other regional programs.”

Last year’s sale was topped by a Cairo Prince—Garden City, by Carson City, colt that brought \$500,000 from Waves Bloodstock. The sale-topper, bred by Hidden Lake Farm and 3C Joint Ventures, was consigned by RFHF Bloodstock, agent.

Bernhard is bullish on this year’s consignment as well.

“I would tell you the mood is very good,” he said. “We have a strong group of physicals for this year and have some very significant updates for our consignment.

“Last year we topped the sale, and we had several other horses that were strong. I think you do get a premium for a horse that ‘ticks all the boxes,’ but you still have to do that.”

Bernhard notes that Saratoga, especially during the race meet, is the best venue to sell New York-breds.

“All of the people you want looking at your horse, that are going to run in New York and give you the opportunity to make that mare, are here. It’s the right place to put those horses.”

Those buyers will be on the hunt for runners. As Cannizzo points out: “State-breds accounted for 46% of the starts made at NYRA tracks in 2017 and earned 33%, or \$52 million, of the available purse money. Simply put, it’s too lucrative not to own a New York-bred these days.” 🐾

REWARDS in the *RIDE*

Patricia Moseley continues the journey
with state-bred La Moneda

PATRICIA MOSELEY, along with her husband, James Moseley, began their Thoroughbred odyssey in the late 1960s—at a time when Lyndon Baines Johnson was the President of the United States and Neil Armstrong had yet to walk on the moon. That satisfying journey continues today for breeder/owner Patricia Moseley. Her fleet homebred grass filly, La Moneda (by Freud), is currently flashing winning form in New York-bred allowance ranks beneath the keen tutelage of trainer Tom Morley.

La Moneda, who is out of Jade Palace, by Jade Hunter, scored a visually impressive victory on the turf in the opening race carded on Belmont Stakes day June 9. That win was followed three weeks later by an even more impressive open-lengths tally June 30 at Belmont Park. Both events were contested at a mile.

La Moneda, named after a Chilean palace, is being pointed toward the Yaddo Stakes at Saratoga on New York Showcase Day Aug. 24.

“Almost everything I race now is a homebred. I take great pride in that. Breeding is the best. It’s special having homebreds,” she said.

Moseley focuses on racing and breeding in New York since her home state of Massachusetts has far fewer events for state-breds.

“La Moneda was bred in New York,” she said. “But she was raised in Hamilton (Mass.), in the field outside my window. In New York there are a lot more opportunities and rewards, particularly if you’re a breeder.”

The Moseleys’ equine journey has

its roots at the Saratoga sales pavilion in 1967, where they were seated behind Arthur B. “Bull” Hancock Jr., a friend and mentor of the couple, who to that point hadn’t had any luck in the racing business on their limited budget. That’s when Hancock signed a \$47,000 ticket for a bay daughter of Round Table, out of Zonah, by Nasrullah. He turned to the young couple, handed them the ticket, and then arranged for a partner to share the expenses with them.

That filly was Drumtop, who earned

\$493,738 (17-9-3 in 44 starts) while winning 10 stakes, highlighted by the Canadian International Championship Stakes, and regularly beating the boys, including Hall of Famer Fort Marcy (in the Bowling Green and Hialeah Turf Cup handicaps in 1971). It’s important to note that during that time period there were much fewer grass stakes base on gender, and the Eclipse Award had no separate category for female turf runners.

Drumtop was trained by Roger Lau-

rin, the son of Secretariat’s conditioner, Lucien Laurin. And as Drumtop prepared for a trip to California, the Moseleys received an interesting and flattering request.

“It was Penny Chenery (Secretariat’s owner). She asked, ‘Would you mind if I came to California with you?’” she said. “The most famous horsewoman in the world wanted to come watch Drumtop race. Imagine that.”

The Moseleys, like Chenery, would lose a significant coin toss.

In Chenery’s case, a 1969 coin toss lost to Ogden Phipps (interestingly enough, witnessed by Bull Hancock) would lead to her securing an as of yet unborn Secretariat in 1970. In the Moseleys’ case, Paul Mellon, who bought out their original partner (Alice Chandler) on Drumtop on the filly’s way to the breeding shed, was now in a position to alternate possession of her offspring.

“Mellon owned Fort Marcy, so he was happy to come in as partners with us,” she said. “I remember him saying—‘If you can’t beat them, join them.’”

Mellon, however, won the coin flip to secure Drumtop’s first foal in 1973.

“I was devastated at the loss,” Moseley said. “But that next foal turned out to be Topsider. So that was extremely lucky for us.”

Topsider (by Northern Dancer) went

on to win eight of 18 starts (including the 1978 Sports Page Handicap), under the guidance of trainer Thomas Kelly. The colt also set a track record of 1:14 $\frac{3}{8}$ for 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs at Saratoga. Post racing, Topsider stood at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky and sired a pair of champions—North Sider (1987 champion older female) and Salse (champion 3-year-old in France in 1988).

The Moseleys reinvigorated racing in Massachusetts when James Moseley (along with partners) purchased Suffolk Downs, which had been shuttered since late December 1989. The track reopened under the Moseley's stewardship on New Year's Day 1992.

In 1995 the Massachusetts Handicap was again the highlight of the state's racing calendar, after six years of being unscheduled. Hall of Fame runner Cigar won the race in both 1995 and 1996, drawing sizeable crowds to the East Boston venue (22,000 spectators in 1996). Those races represented Cigar's eighth and 15th wins in his streak of 16 consecutive victories, equaling the mark of Citation.

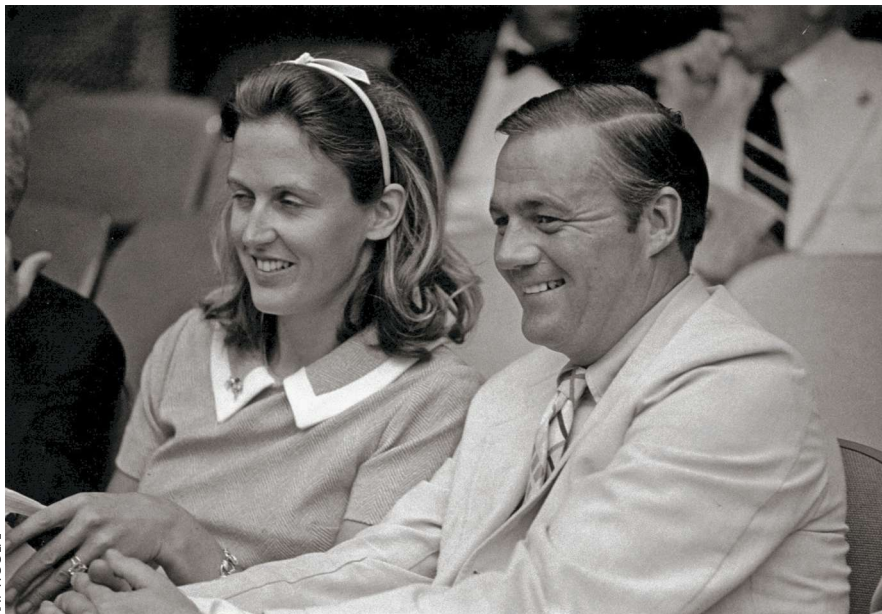
Sadly, James Moseley passed away in 1998. That suddenly made Patricia Moseley the track's chairwoman.

"I inherited the position, but I was totally involved with (Suffolk Downs) since the beginning," she said.

She eventually sold her shares in the track, which has closed twice since that time and is scheduled to close for good in August 2018 to be redeveloped as a housing and shopping district. The iconic property was also chosen as one of 20 finalists for Amazon's second headquarters.

"James had lots (of equine) interests and supported many things, such as the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, as well as helping to establish the Tufts (University) School of Veterinary Medicine," Moseley said.

Earlier this year Moseley continued her homebred suc-

cess with the Brendan Walsh-trained Proctor's Ledge (by Ghostzapper), who won the Longines Churchill Distaff Turf Mile Stakes (G2T) at Churchill Downs and then recorded a runner-up finish in the Longines Just a Game Stakes (G1T) at Belmont a few races after La Moneda had won.

Last summer Proctor's Ledge, named after a cliff in Salem, Mass., where suspected witches were pushed to their deaths, captured both the Lake Placid Stakes (G2T) and the Lake George Stakes (G3T) at Saratoga.

Of course, Proctor's Ledge is a proud result of Moseley's sterling chain of homebreds. Drumtop had a 1983 filly

by Mr. Prospector, Aliata, a foaling in which Drumtop died. In 2003, Aliata gave birth to a filly by Arch named Archstone (stakes-placed), who would later become the dam of Proctor's Ledge.

It was the relationship with Walsh that inspired Moseley to engage Morley to condition La Moneda.

"Tom's a good friend of Brendan. Whenever Brendan ships (his horses) into New York, they're usually stabled with Tom Morley. So I decided to give him an opportunity with this New York-bred grass filly," Moseley said.

Moseley also owns the farm Ardboe West near Fort Edward, N.Y., managed by Bush Thompson, where she cultivates New York-breds. Currently the farm is home to 15 mares, seven foals, and approximately 10 rescue horses.

"It's been very rewarding to be in the racing game for such a long period of time," said Moseley. "Besides all the hard work, it takes a lot of luck. Things could have easily gone the other way."

But thanks to the incredible passion Moseley brings to the things in life that mean the most to her, little has gone the other way in her pursuits for more than a half-century. 🐾

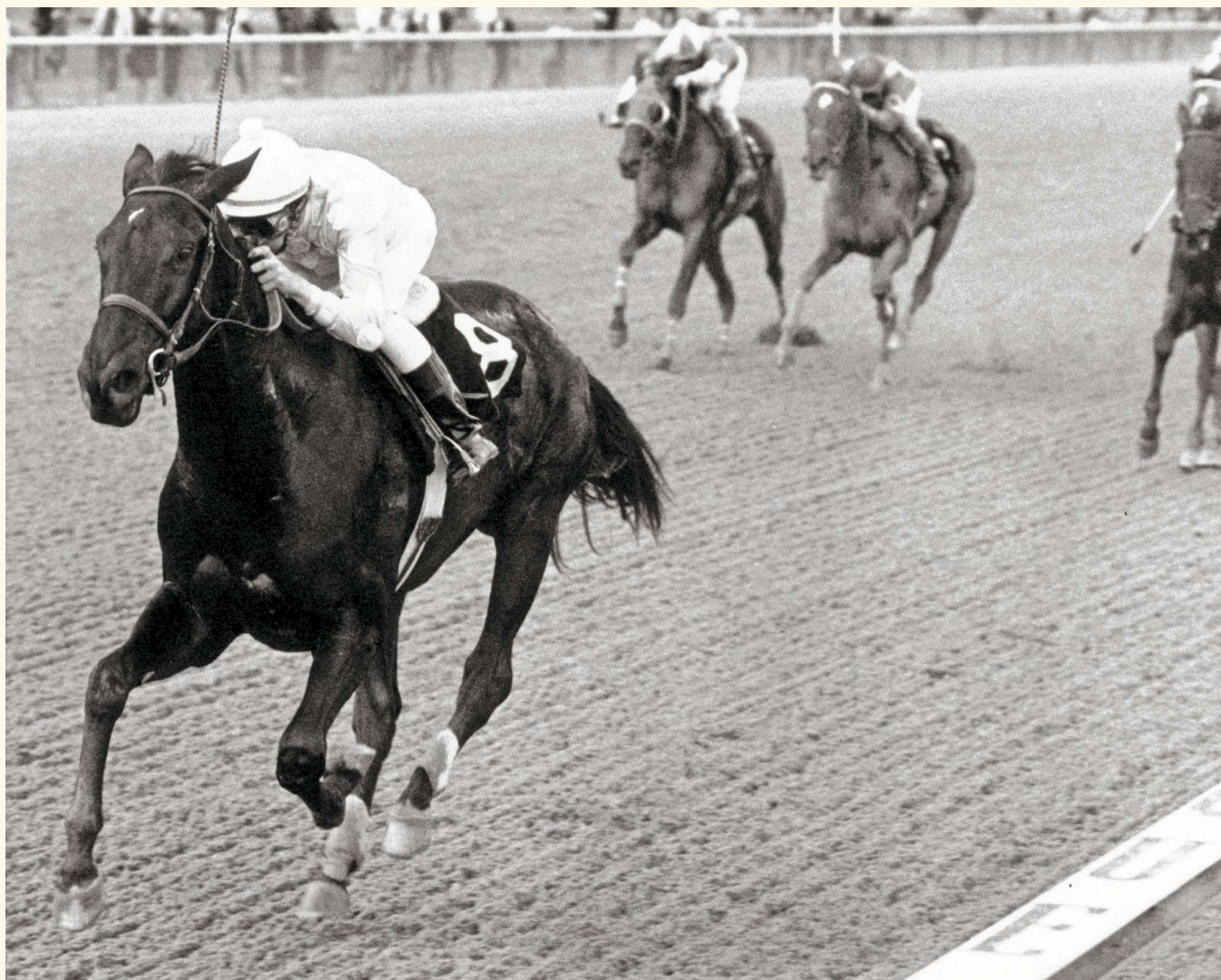

NEW YORK-BREDS IN HISTORY: 1980s-90s

QUEEN ALEXANDRA (1982, **DETERMINED KING—VICTORIA BEAUTY**, by Bold Native) was a New York-bred that had her career enhanced dramatically when she was moved out of her native state. She was bred by Ocala Stud, owned by Rosalind Rosenthal, and trained by Hall of Famer P.G. Johnson (1984-85) and George M. Baker (1986-88). She was purchased by Rosenthal's husband, Morton, as agent, for \$13,000 from her breeder at a 1984 Fasig-Tipton sale of 2-year-olds in training at Saratoga.

At ages 2 and 3 she raced mainly in New York-bred events, her only stakes win coming in the 1984 East View Stakes at Aqueduct in late October.

Queen Alexandra won three races from 15 starts in 1984 and 1985, with all her wins coming in her 2-year-old

season. In December 1985, she moved from Johnson's barn to Baker's shed-row. Baker, another trainer connected with the Rosenthals, believed she would do better in the South and Midwest. This judgment is one small illustration why Johnson is in the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame, for that decision turned Queen Alexandra from a useful horse who paid her expenses and was known only to the most studious New York horse fans to one of the most respected fillies and mares in the country.

Apparently it occasionally pays not to race a New York-bred in New York State.

In 1986 she won stakes at Hialeah Park in Florida, Churchill Downs and Ellis Park in Kentucky, and Fairmount Park and Arlington Park in Illinois. After finishing second in the Latonia's Breeders' Cup Stakes in March, she won two of three at Hialeah, including scores in the Coral Gables Stakes and Key Largo Stakes, both at nine furlongs. After a fourth-place finish in Churchill's Locust Grove Handicap May 31, she won five stakes in a row, beginning with the \$75,000 Fleur de Lis Handicap (now G2) June 21 in Louisville, followed by the Ellis Park Budweiser Breeders' Cup Stakes, the \$100,000 Budweiser Handicap (G3) at Fairmount Park, and the \$100,000 Coca Cola Centennial Handicap at Ellis Park.

The Blood-Horse noted that in the Fleur de Lis "Queen Alexandra scored revenge over four rivals which had beaten her in prior stakes, Zenobia Princess, Tide, Glorious View, and Gypsy Prayer."

She stepped up in class Aug. 30 and won the grade 2 Arlington Matron Handicap. After finishing fourth in the grade 1 Spinster Stakes at Keeneland, she polished off her 1986 campaign with a score in Churchill's Falls City Handicap (G3) in late November.

She ended her 1986 season with 10 wins and two seconds from 17 starts with earnings of \$464,706, not one cent coming from the New York Thorough-

bred Breeders' Development Fund. She finished nine pounds behind Horse of the Year and future Hall of Fame inductee Lady's Secret in the DRF Free Handicap weights.

Queen Alexandra won a pair of minor stakes to start 1987, taking Tampa Bay Downs' Wayward Lass Stakes and the Birmingham Inaugural Stakes in Alabama, before shipping to Oaklawn Park, where she finished second in the Pippin Handicap and Oaklawn Budweiser Breeders' Cup Handicap and third in the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1). In the last two she finished behind North Sider, that year's champion older female. She ended her losing streak by winning her first stakes of the year, the \$50,000 Louisville-Budweiser Breeders' Cup Handicap at Churchill Downs, with North Sider finishing fourth. She followed that by taking the \$210,550 Sixty Sails Handicap (G3) at Sportsman's Park in Chicago, winning by six lengths as the 7-5 favorite under high weight of 123 pounds.

Her season ended prematurely, June 14, when she stumbled out of the gate in the Fleur de Lis, wrenching her ankle and suffering a slight tear of a suspensory ligament. Her record for the season

was four wins, two seconds, and two thirds, with earnings of \$344,129. She also finished two pounds behind North Sider in the 4-year-old and up fillies and mares division of the DRF Free Handicap weights.

Queen Alexandra had an abbreviated 1988 season, with a repeat score in the Wayward Lass and in an allowance race at Oaklawn from eight starts.

She retired with earnings of \$1,034,144, making her the second New York-bred after Win to become a millionaire.

ALLEZ MILORD

Although one might think it odd Queen Alexandra could shun New York State tracks and their New York-bred incentives and still thrive, the example of Allez Milord (1983, Tom Rolfe—Why Me Lord, by Bold Reasoning) is even stranger.

He never raced in the United States until near the end of his 4-year-old season, and the only race he ran in his native state was an open company grade 1 event.

Allez Milord was bred and owned by Jerry Brody's Gallagher's Stud, near Ghent in Columbia County. Brody was the owner of a string of restaurants in

Manhattan, the most famous being Gallagher's Steakhouse. Allez Milord was trained for most of his career by Guy Harwood, and for his last three races by John Gosden. Brody purchased Why Me Lord for \$60,000 at the 1983 Keeneland January mixed sale from Wimborne Farm while she was pregnant with Allez Milord.

Impressed with European training methods, Brody sent Allez Milord to England when the colt was a yearling. After winning his only race in England as a 2-year-old, at 3 he became a group 1 winner by taking the Puma Europa Preis in Germany in late September, and was named that country's champion 3-year-old male. Allez Milord ended his year by finishing second by a nose to the England-based Jupiter Island in the rich Japan Cup (G1) in Tokyo. According to Equibase, his record in 1986 was four wins and one second in eight starts, with earnings of \$380,636.

In 1987 he won the 10-furlong Gordon Richards E.B.F. Stakes (G3) at Sandown, finished second in the group 3 Brigadier Gerard Stakes, and made group starts at York and Goodwood in England before he was shipped to the United States to finish his racing career.

His first start in the United States

was a homecoming of sorts in New York in the grade 1 Turf Classic Stakes at 1½ miles over a soft course. The even-money favorite in the six-horse field (the horse that might have been the favorite, Manila, had been injured before the race and was retired) was the future Hall of Fame inductee and that year's champion male turf horse Theatrical, with Allez Milord going off at 5-1. The English expatriate took a commanding lead despite jockey Greville Starkey's efforts to restrain him. By the final turn he was collared by Theatrical, who continued to a ¾-length win, while Allez Milord labored home, finishing last. It was later discovered that he had bled in the race, and he was shipped to the West Coast to be trained by Gosden.

Allez Milord's first race in Southern California was the 12-furlong Oak Tree Invitational Handicap (G1T) at Santa Anita, which he won by 2½ lengths at 7-1 under Chris McCarron.

The colt then tested the waters of the Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) at Hollywood Park. Brody had to pay the \$240,000, which he had won in the Oak Tree Invitational, as a supplemental entry fee. There was no grand payday as Allez Milord finished eighth at 7-1, with Theatrical once again proving best. The

chart stated that Allez Milord "moved through along the inside to reach a striking position approaching the stretch but gave way under pressure."

A final outing came in the Dec. 13 Hollywood Turf Cup (G1T) where he finished 11th.

His 1987 record was two wins, one second, and one third in eight starts with \$286,398 in earnings. As befitting his globe-trotter status, he was shipped to Japan to begin stud duty at Shadai Stud.

PATCHY GROUNDFOG

Patchy Groundfog (1983, Instrument Landing—Tea At Five, by Olden Times) had a long career that, except for one year and one race, was not particularly noteworthy. He was bred in New York by Wooden Horse Investments, which was another equine syndicate put together by Mickey and Karen Taylor and Dr. and Mrs. James Hill—the same group that partnered on 1977 Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew.

Patchy Groundfog's career stretched from 1985 through 1994. He was based in New York state from August 1985 through October 1987, and the rest of his career on the West Coast. Although he earned \$67,660 in 1986 and \$64,870 in 1987, those amounts reflect the generosity of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund rather than his prowess on the track. His five wins during those two years did not include a stakes victory.

His career took an upswing when his venue changed to California. He was restricted to claiming races from November 1987 through November 1988. On Jan. 28, 1989, he won his first stakes race when owner David Sofro and his trainer, Julio Canani, who had claimed him for \$80,000 at Hollywood Park July 21, 1988, entered him in the \$100,000 Turf Paradise Handicap on the turf. After a third-place in the Arcadia Handicap (G2T) at Santa Anita, he won his first graded race when he took the grade 3 San Francisco Mile Handicap on the turf at Golden Gate Fields. Although he didn't

win another stakes race that year, Patchy Groundfog did manage to finish second in the El Rincon, Morvich, and the grade 3 San Gabriel handicaps, all on the turf. He pulled in \$270,600 for the season.

He did not have a single win in 11 starts in 1990, most of those races being of the claiming variety. However, one race that year gave him nationwide notoriety. On Feb. 3, 1990, he finished fourth in the \$100,000 Legend's Last

toga, he was sold for \$55,000 to trainer Richard O'Connell, who was representing the newly formed Poma Stable of James Meceda, Judson Posa, and Rose Aprea. The new owners were quickly rewarded when their acquisition won his first stakes by taking the first division of the West Point Handicap for New York-breds on the turf at Saratoga. That was his only stakes win of the year, but he still managed to win \$136,506.

Alysheba in the previous year's Triple Crown races.

After finishing fourth in the Daryl's Joy Stakes (G3T), third in the Bernard Baruch Handicap (G1T), and second in the Longfellow Handicap (G2T), Wanderkin closed out his 1988 season by taking the Cliff Hanger Handicap (G3T) at Meadowlands, defeating the favorite, Salem Drive, by a neck, and setting a course record of 1:39 $\frac{3}{8}$ for 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles.

Ride Handicap at Santa Anita. It was the last race in the illustrious career of his jockey, Bill Shoemaker. He was the favorite in the race, but most tickets were bought to keep as souvenirs.

The rest of Patchy Groundfog's career was not so notable. He managed wins in two minor stakes at Golden Gate Fields. Three years later, at the age of 11, he finished off the board in a pair of mid-level claiming races at Hollywood Park.

WANDERKIN

Another New York-bred who enjoyed success on the turf in the 1980s was the gelding Wanderkin (1983, Dewan—Plum's Sister, by Quadrangle). He was bred and originally raced by Carl Lizza and Marie Hochreiter's Flying Zee Stable. Wanderkin did not race at 2, and at 3 had three wins in eight starts. At an August 1987 dispersal sale at Sara-

Wanderkin's best racing year was in 1988. After finishing second in the New York-bred Kingston Stakes at Aqueduct and off the board in the grade 3 Fort Marcy Handicap, he won an overnight handicap for his first victory of the year. On June 10 he won his first open stakes of his career when he took the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Blue Larkspur Stakes at Belmont Park. On July 4 he won his third race in a row, and his first graded stakes, when he took the Poker Stakes (G3T) at Belmont. Finishing second was the Irish-bred King's River, who had also finished second in the Blue Larkspur.

Two weeks later Wanderkin ran what might have been the best race of his life when he finished second, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths behind Equalize, in the United Nations Handicap (G1T) at Atlantic City as the 5-1 fourth choice. Finishing third was Bet Twice, famous for his duels with

His record for 1988 was five wins, three seconds, and a third from 14 starts with earnings of \$313,916.

Various ailments left him on the shelf for most of the 1989 season, leaving him with a record of two wins from five starts and \$108,902 in earnings.

Wanderkin began his 1990 season at Gulfstream Park, finishing third in the Appleton Handicap (G3T), first in the Fort Lauderdale Handicap, and second in the Canadian Turf Handicap (G2). The Fort Lauderdale would be the last stakes win of his career. His record in 1990 was two wins, two places, and five shows from 14 starts, with earnings of \$173,054.

Wanderkin continued to race for three more years, winning one of 14 starts in 1991, and one from 13 starts in both 1992 and 1993. He made 99 trips to the post, earning \$937,517. 🐾

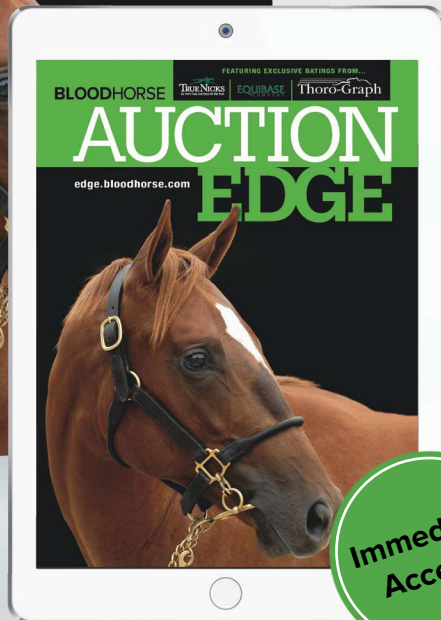

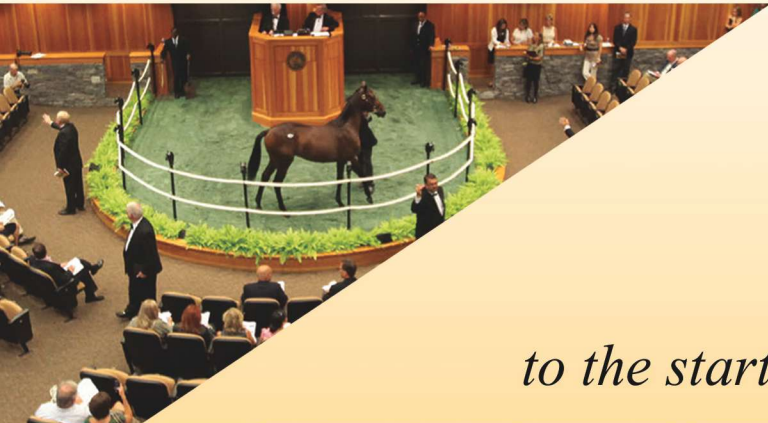
