Showcase Day: Build Up

Originally appeared in the The Saratoga Special, Aug. 28, 2015.

THE AUG. 28 SARATOGA SHOWCASE is one of three such events during the year. The others are run at Belmont Park—the Big Apple Showcase in the spring and the flagship Empire Showcase in the fall. Tom Law, managing editor of *The Saratoga Special*, caught up with New York Thoroughbred Breeders' executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo during Aug. 28 Saratoga Showcase to discuss the event, the current status of the state-bred program and the future.

SS: Today is the second Saratoga Showcase. Last year's inaugural couldn't have gone much better with winners such as Upstart, Dayatthespa, and Artemis Agrotera on the card. How would you rate last year's Saratoga Showcase?

JC: Saratoga Showcase Day—designed to round off Travers week with a bang—did just that. It was very effective for keeping our program in the national spotlight at a time when all eyes are fixed on Saratoga. Apparently it was also good business. The day after the Travers in 2013, attendance was 18,706; last year the New York Racing Association reported a figure of 24,843 with handle of \$16 million. We set a very high bar for performance by New York-breds who went on to achieve some of the greatest accomplishments in New York-bred history. Those same three New York-breds all went on to start in the Breeders' Cup World Championships and one of which, of course, won (Dayatthespa). Showcase Day in Saratoga is important because it was a very good stepping-stone for our highest-caliber horses to go on further in open company down the road and it helps establish divisional champions.

SS: This year's event was the day before the Travers. What are the positives and negatives to having it the day before in 2015?

JC: It was interesting to see the differences of having the races Friday versus Sunday. The day after Travers has historically been a "come down" day after the big Saturday in August, and the Friday before was always a "build up" day. So in theory this change to Friday may in fact yield further interest to the big weekend unfolding. This year, NYRA did \$16.4 million in handle on Friday which was a 3% (\$500k) increase over 2014. Clearly, having American Pharoah here with his public viewing Friday enhanced this day 100%. There were 15,000 casual fans and people who've never set foot on

the racetrack who came Friday to see Pharoah during his public appearance. Some of those same casual goers stayed for the races that day and saw firsthand the value of owning New York-breds who ran for more than \$1 million. That is powerful advertising. People convert to ownership by experience and most importantly exposure, and I believe Showcase Day is a tool to accomplish just that.

SS: Where on the calendar would the Saratoga Showcase be in a perfect world?

JC: I would love to see NYRA place the day around the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred yearling sale weekend. You have everyone involved with breeding, selling, and owning New York-breds here that weekend. It would be a natural fit to "Showcase" everything that surrounds the New York-bred program.

SS: The Saratoga Showcase is one of three blockbuster days for state-breds per year, and you mentioned last year the possibility of making it a quarterly event. Any progress on that concept?

JC: NYRA is evaluating the overall stakes schedule and what is working and not working based on time of year for each division. The key is driving field size and participation. I wouldn't be surprised to see tweaks done over the next year.

SS: Nuts and bolts, where do the purses for the Showcase Day events come from?

JC: The purses come from the same sources and pool as all other races at NYRA and made available out of the general purse account. The stakes schedule is made by NYRA and approved by their racing committee with approval of the horsemen and collaboration from the breeders. Essentially, the state-bred stakes program is an investment by NYRA into the breeding industry, which in return gives back to NYRA in the form of starters. Interestingly enough, 54% of all starters in New York last year were New York-breds. That's quite remarkable, given it's our leanest foal crop in years.

SS: Demand for New York-breds at the sales is flourishing. Can you explain why?

JC: Ever since the New York purse and awards structures were revamped—in other words from late 2011—the market for New York-breds at auction has burgeoned. The yearling market was the first to catch fire, and the 2-year-olds have followed suit, especially on the heels of an expanded juvenile stakes program on the NYRA circuit. *(continued on page 8)*

Going into the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred yearling sale, breeders had seen exponential growth in the marketplace from 2010 to 2014: a 283% increase in gross revenue (from \$3,676,000 to \$14,099,000), a 105% rise in average price (\$39,106 to \$80,108), and a 141% increase in median (\$27,000 to \$65,000). Of 252 yearlings offered, 182 found new homes. The number was up from 176 sold from last year's larg-

er catalog and translated into an improved buy-back rate of 28.7%, down from 35.3% in 2014. Gross sales at the 2015 auction increased to \$14,876,500 from \$14,099,000 last year, and the average price was up 1.9% to \$81,739 from \$80,108 in 2014, which was, in its own right, 11% higher than in 2013. The median held steady at last year's record mark of \$65,000.

Simply put, all of these incredible fig-

ures are based on the value of New York-breds on the racetrack. It's done through opportunity by having more than 800 restricted races worth \$44.5 million with 65 stakes worth \$8.5 million. If you add in the owners' awards and \$20 million of total incentives, it's absolutely lucrative to own a New York-bred. Not to mention New York-breds are racing in 26% of the races at the worlds' greatest meet here in Saratoga.

SS: What are the main priorities for the NYTB for the rest of 2015 and beyond?

JC: NYTB is focused on protecting the interest and landscape of the New York breeding industry. Immediately we have an interest in protecting the landscape of Finger Lakes racing. This year NYTB introduced legislation to hold Finger Lakes purses harmless should a casino be built in nearby Tyre. We need to pursue the passage of that legislation in 2016. As you also know, the racetrack is coping with the long-term challenges of declining handle and attendance. Finger Lakes generates the widest distribution of Fund resources to the greatest number of people with 49% of the number of breeders' awards distributed by the Fund. In 2014 this translated to a total of 2,874 individual awards in the amount of \$2.79 million. Although this only adds up to 22% of the total breeders' awards money disbursed, it means that awards earned at Finger Lakes are reaching an enormous number of breeders and stallion owners across the state, helping them maintain their businesses and, by extension, the whole program. And there's more. Even though only 11% of the races at Finger Lakes are restricted to New York-breds (versus 32% at Aqueduct), our state-breds have a huge strike rate in Western New York. New York-breds earn 74% of the available purse money at Finger Lakes and make 69% of the track's starts.

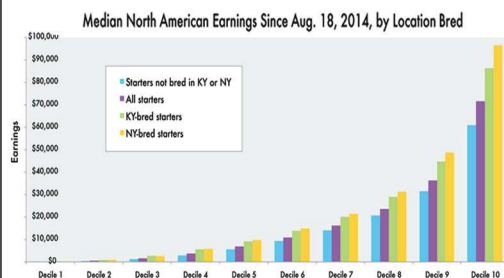
NYTB is also focused on the re-privatization of NYRA. The stability and long-term planning for the future of New York breeding and racing are dependent on that act. Long-term strategies for growing the fan base, establishing a global betting exchange, the future of Aqueduct and Belmont, and how video lottery terminal funds for capital improvements shall be used for the best interests of all stakeholders have our full attention and interest. 🐾

STATE-BRED FILLIES RULE IN SELECT SALE

The growing strength of the state-bred breeding program was on full display during the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale Aug. 10-11 when New York-bred fillies topped the distaff ledger during both sessions.

In total, 12 New York-bred yearlings of 16 offered found new homes, selling for a heady average of \$302,083 and a median of \$220,000. All but one Empire State-bred brought six figures, and three sold for \$500,000 and up.

The top filly of the opening session was Hip 104 by War Front, bred by Gallagher's Stud and purchased by Glen Hill Farm for \$570,000. During the second night bloodstock agent Steven Young signed the ticket for \$800,000 on behalf of an undisclosed client for Hip 170, a New York-bred filly by Malibu Moon, who became the best-selling filly of the auction. The bay

topper was bred by Newtown Anner Stud, foaled at their Millbrook farm on March 16, 2014, and offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. Her dam Red Hot Bertie, a winning Kentucky-bred daughter of Tabasco Cat, has produced five winners, including multiple stakes

winner and \$234,401-earner Red Hot Buddha.

"She was at the top of our list," Young said. "She basically sold herself every time I went and saw her. She's smart, she's a very good mover, and I couldn't be happier with her."

Gallagher Stud's top-selling filly, at \$570,000, was one of two fillies for the farm to bring a half-million dollars or more. Through Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud, agent, they also sold a filly by Malibu Moon—Tulipmania, by Empire Maker, for \$500,000 to James J. Crupi's New Castle Farm, agent.

The War Front filly was foaled Feb. 6, 2014, and is the third foal out of the Chester House mare Hostess, a multiple graded stakes winner who holds the 11-furlong inner turf mark at Saratoga in winning the Glens Falls Handicap (gr. IIIT) in 2008.

John Nerud Dies at 102

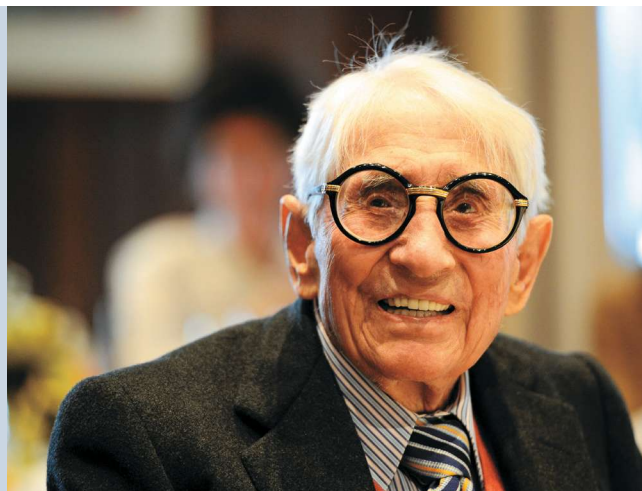
John Nerud, Hall of Fame trainer and advocate for all things Thoroughbred, died Aug. 13 at age 102 at his home in Old Brookville, N.Y.

Nerud served as a director and officer of New York Thoroughbred Breeders in the 1990s and was a director *emeritus* of the organization until his death. Long active on the New York breeding, racing, and stallion management scene, and instrumental in the shaping of the New York breeding and racing program as we know it today, Nerud was honored by NYTB with a special Lifetime Achievement Award in 2013.

Nerud's influence nationally was far-reaching. As a trainer, he was inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in 1972. He retired from training in 1978.

He served as trainer, president, and general manager of William L. McKnight's Tartan Farms near Ocala, Fla., where he developed Dr. Fager into a four-time champion in 1968. Dr. Fager was named champion sprinter, turf horse, handicap horse (older male), and Horse of the Year.

Nerud also trained champions Intentionally, Ta Wee, and Dr. Patches. He saddled Gallant Man to a runner-up effort in the 1957 Kentucky Derby. As an owner, he won the 1985 Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) with Cozzene, who was trained by his son, Jan.

He was owner and/or breeder of influential stallions Fappiano and Cozzene, among others.

Nerud also was instrumental in the early days of the Breeders' Cup as a founding member. He served as chairman of the marketing committee for Breeders' Cup in its first few years.

Established by Joanne Nielsen to honor her late husband Gerald A. Nielsen

Sr. and by Vivien Malloy to honor her late daughter Debby Malloy Winkler, the \$5,000 scholarships recognize a full-time student enrolled in an equine-related course of study at an accredited college or university in New York State.

Receiving the 2015 Gerald A. Nielsen Sr. Scholarship was Tate Morris. Originally from East Lyme, Conn., Morris graduated magna cum laude from the University of Vermont as a community entrepreneurship major. After completing his vet-med prerequisites at the University of Connecticut, he attended Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine and graduated this spring.

Morris now seeks a year-long veterinary internship at either a university or in a private practice to continue his education, then hopes to pursue a residency in equine surgery or sports medicine and rehabilitation.

The Debby Malloy Winkler Scholarship was awarded to Courtney O'Connell, who has just completed three years of course work at Cornell University College

of Veterinary Medicine and will begin her clinical rotations in the fall.

A native of Ithaca, N.Y., and a graduate of the St. Paul's School in Concord, N.H., O'Connell graduated with a double major in biology and French from Mount Holyoke College, where she was a Mary Lyon Scholar. An accomplished rider with extensive experience in the world of show horses and Thoroughbreds, O'Connell has worked as a veterinary student technician and research assistant at Cornell.

Safe at Home

Showcase Day sees four of the six stakes go to horses by New York-based sires

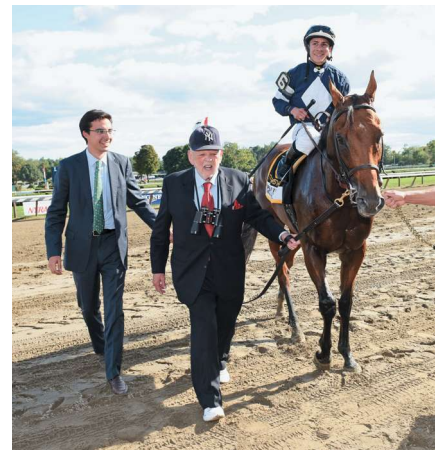
ON THE DAY BEFORE the Travers Stakes (gr. I), the spotlight was on New York-breds, as Saratoga Race Course hosted the second showcase day at the upstate track, offering six state-bred stakes races worth \$1.15 million.

And as it turned out, the spotlight was also on New York stallions, as four of the six winners on the day were sired by stallions that are standing, or stood at the time of conception, in the state.

Freud, last year's leading sire in New York and currently second to Big Brown, added to his list of accomplishments when Aliyu Ben J Stable's homebred Lubash took the \$147,000 West Point Stakes, a race he won in 2012 and was second in last year.

The remarkably consistent horse, who has finished no worse than third in his last 14 starts, and no worse than fifth only once in his 43 races, got a bit of a break when his regular rival Kharafa scratched, but that still left graded stakes winner King Kreesa to contend with. The three of them battle each other regularly on the New York-bred turf circuit.

"It was nice that we didn't have to deal with both of them," said Todd Pivnick, son of the horse's owner Leonard, "but you always like to run against the best."

Out of the Cure the Blues mare Nasty Cure, purchased by Leonard Pivnick in 1993 for \$37,000, Lubash was raised at Diane and Ed Gregory's Carapan Farm, and Pivnick emphasized their role in the 8-year-old's success. The Pivnicks lost the mare earlier this year but have two full siblings to their stakes winner, one a weanling, the other recovering from colic surgery and expected to make the races next year.

And the Pivnicks' equine medical troubles didn't stop with the mare and her filly: After winning the Kingston Stakes at Belmont Park in May, Lubash got loose on the backstretch from trainer Christophe Clement's barn. Initial reports suggested the horse wasn't seriously injured, according to Jonathan Pivnick, Todd's brother, but he didn't recover as quickly as expected.

"We thought he was fine," said Pivnick, "but then we talked to Christophe, and he was still sore. We were really worried, but day by day he got a little better."

In a year that saw American Pharoah win the Triple Crown, the Pivnicks are shooting for what they're calling "The Quadruple Crown of New York turf racing:" the Kingston, which they won in May at Belmont, the West Point, the (Sept. 20) Ashley T. Cole Stakes, and the (Oct. 24) Mohawk Stakes.

"We've won every one so far at some point except the Mohawk," said Todd. "And this year we've got two of the four."

Sudden Star

Owner Mike Repole had high hopes in 2011 for his 2-year-old Giant Surprise, and the colt didn't disappoint in his first start, on July 30 in Saratoga, winning by 4¼ lengths. But excitement quickly turned to sorrow when he was pulled up after the wire and vanned off, his racing career over.

Sent to stud at Vinery New York in 2012 and standing now at Rockridge Stud, Giant Surprise got his first stakes winner when 2-year-old Sudden Surprise won the \$196,000 Funny Cide Stakes, the first race on the Showcase Day card. He had broken his maiden earlier in the meet, four years to the day after his sire had.

Out of a Repole mare who was also retired after her only start—a runner-up performance at Saratoga in 2010—Sudden Surprise is only one of several Giant Surprise progeny that Repole owns. In addition to breeding to his stallion, he's also buying his offspring at auction.

"I want to help the New York-bred program," said the Queens native. "And for this horse to win on New York-bred day—that's pretty special."

"Todd likes him," continued Repole, referring to trainer Todd Pletcher's assessment of Sudden Surprise. "He's super talented, and he's got an incredible pedigree and great conformation."

Accompanying Repole and his wife, Maria, in the winner's circle was their newborn daughter, Gioia Mia, which in

Italian means "my joy."

"It's her first trip to the track, it's the first race, and she gets to the winner's circle," Repole joked. "She doesn't fool around."

Ready and Able

She's All Ready was exactly that in her stakes debut, following an 8¼-length maiden score with a three-length win in the \$200,000 Seeking the Ante Stakes for 2-year-old fillies, a bittersweet victory for owner Michael Salerno, who races in the name of Nirvana Stables.

Standing with his cousin, Elizabeth Walsh, in the winner's circle, an emotional Salerno said, "Her husband, Peter Walsh, picked out this filly last August, and unfortunately he's not with us anymore."

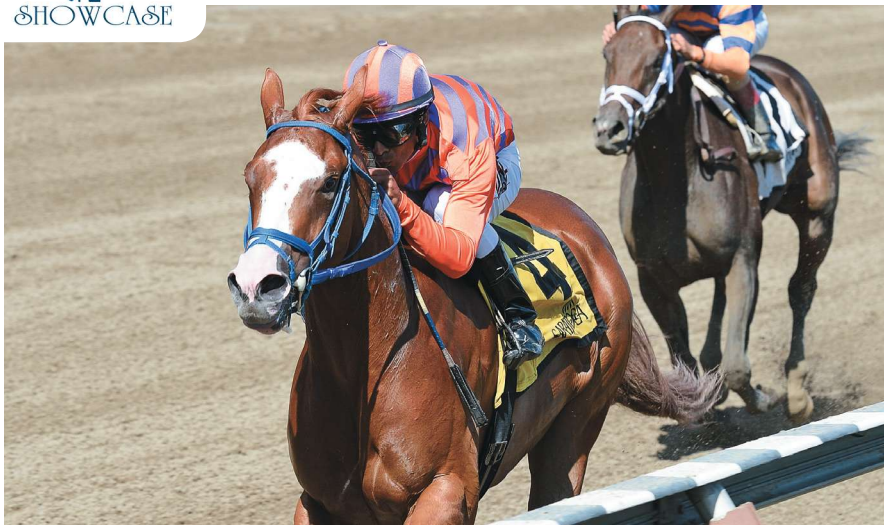
Walsh passed away earlier this year, and he had purchased the filly, which was bred by Kings and Queens Farm, for \$37,000 at last summer's Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds. Following Walsh's death in February, the Girolamo filly was entered in the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds in training in May, and Salerno bought her back for \$45,000.

"This is more than a win," he said. "This is an accomplishment."

Girolamo stood at Sequel Stallions near Hudson, N.Y., before moving to Darley in Kentucky in 2014. She's All Ready is out of the El Prado mare Prominent.

Salerno credits Walsh for getting him involved in Thoroughbred ownership.

"Many years ago somebody tried to sell me a syndication, and my mother said, 'Talk to Pete,'" Salerno recalled. "He goes, 'What are you, crazy? You and I will partner up,' and we've been buying horses together for the last 15 years. We did well, but nothing like today.

"You get a horse with some ability and some luck," he continued, "and you put it together. My cousin is up there pushing us further and further."

'Star' Rises in Fleet Indian

New York lost a stallion when Miracle Man, who stood at Lois Engel's Pucker Ridge Farm near Warrensburg, died earlier this year, but he left his own-

ers a filly that tempered the sadness of losing him when she broke her maiden in the \$196,000 Fleet Indian Stakes at nine furlongs.

Bred by Miracle Man Racing Partners, which races in the name of Shooting Star Stable, Jc's Shooting Star had shown a proclivity for finishing second before finally breaking through at Saratoga.

Childhood friends John Seyford, Vincent Formato, and Jeff Pearl grew up in Queens, and it was Pearl's idea to start the maiden in the stakes race, but even he was a little in awe of the outcome.

"I don't know what to tell you," he said. "I'm speechless."

The partners purchased the filly's dam, American Passage, specifically to breed to their stallion Miracle Man; she

had already produced One Quiet Cat, who earned \$319,129.

"She was a Quiet American mare and she was 3x3 to Fappiano with our stallion," Pearl explained.

"We had five winners out of him," said Seyford. "We knew he was a good horse, and we hoped he'd be a good sire. He's produced a lot for us."

"He's our little Kitten's Joy," Formato chimed in. "Nobody wanted to breed to him."

"New York racing is doing a fantastic thing," Seyford added. "The breeders' awards program is great, and it makes it possible for people like us to be involved and help support the expenses.

"It's ultra-exciting, and hopefully more people will do something like this."

Gus Proves Best in Albany

The partnership of Michael Dubb and Bethlehem Stables' Michael Caruso has yielded a series of horses whose names honor their friends and family, Billypays-the-bills and Diannestillworks among them, both named for people involved in their racing operation, both named by Caruso.

But Dubb took a cue from his partner in naming their 2012 Lookin At Lucky colt, and he looked no further than the horse's barn and Gustavo Rodriguez, the brother of their trainer Rudy Rodriguez.

"Gus is Rudy's right-hand man," said Dubb. "And this horse has been the real deal since we got him."

Also owned in partnership by The Elkstone Group, Good Luck Gus picked up his third stakes win and first since returning to the races in May after a five-month lay-off when he won the \$250,000 Albany Stakes for 3-year-olds.

"He had a hell of a more impressive résumé than anybody else in the race," said Dubb, "so I was surprised that he was so discounted."

Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III, the bay colt out of the Deputy Minister mare Tacticmove paid \$9.10, the third choice in the six-horse field. A win in the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct last December had the partners contemplating open company races for the horse early this year, but a rigorous 2-year-old campaign and a couple of minor issues altered their course, and set their sights on the Albany. Good Luck Gus has won or placed in five New York-bred stakes in 10 starts.

"We thought he had a lot of ability, and last winter we thought we had asked a lot of a 2-year-old and we'd give him a little more time," said Dubb.

"(Bloodstock agent) Kim Valerio picked him out, and the fact he was a New York-bred made him more attractive," continued Dubb, who with his partners paid \$97,000 for him. "He's earned more than a half-million dollars, and that's pretty good money."

Right Cup of Tea

Kendel Standlee's The Tea Cups didn't race in New York until her 16th

start, but she sure seems to like it here: Three of the 5-year-old mare's five wins have come at Belmont and Saratoga, the most recent in the \$150,000 Yaddo Stakes at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles on the turf.

An \$8,000 purchase claimed by Standlee for \$16,000 at Tampa Bay Downs in early 2014, The Tea Cups boasts an impressive family. Bred by William Parson Jr. and David S. Howe, she's by Hard Spun out of the A.P. Indy mare Lunar Colony and, therefore, a half sister to 2012 Empire Classic Stakes winner Lunar Victory (by Speightstown), who began his career in Europe for Juddmonte.

"I loved her bloodlines, top and bottom," Standlee declared in the winner's circle. "I'm thrilled to death."

President of the equine mortality division at Great American Insurance, Standlee grew up going to Oaklawn Park in Arkansas. He has about 20 horses total and a half dozen mares in Florida, Kentucky, and Louisiana.

"First came the gambling," he said. "Then the equine insurance, then the owning horses."

The Tea Cups had raced primarily in the Midlantic and Florida before Standlee claimed her, and she won her first start in the state in which she was bred nearly a year to the day before her first stakes win in the

Yaddo, over the same Saratoga inner turf course.

"I thought she'd be in the top three," he said, watching the replay on the in-field screen. "Then she broke last and she was so far back I thought, 'Oh, my God, what's he doing?'"

But jockey Luis Saez knew exactly what he was doing, and although he and The Tea Cups trailed by so much that they were at times off the screen entirely, he rode her patiently and confidently, timing a late, measured rush perfectly to get the win by a length.

"I'm very happy," he said. "And I'll probably keep her to breed." 🐾

median saw no change from last year at \$65,000.

Leading the sale was Hip 416, a filly by Tiznow out of the multiple graded stakes winner Acey Deucey (by Abiginone), purchased by McMahon & Hill Bloodstock on behalf of client Sheila Rosenblum, who partnered with 2006 and 2010 New York breeder of the year Vivien Malloy.

Rosenblum has campaigned several New York-breds since she began buying horses five years ago, including the multiple graded stakes-winning mare La Verdad. She has shied away from buying yearlings, but the chance to team with Malloy was an opportunity she couldn't pass up.

"She's one of the great authorities on New York-bred horses," said Rosenblum, "and I'm very excited."

"She's a beautiful filly," said Malloy, beaming. "It's a wonderful family; she's probably two turns, and she's a New York-bred. She's everything good."

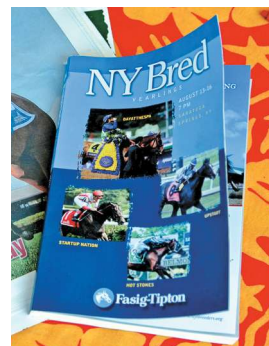
"A trainer of mine said, 'You better step up because they're getting really good.'"

Rosenblum and Malloy paid \$350,000 for the filly, one of 13 yearlings that sold for \$200,000 or more this year, up from eight last year. They also partnered on Hip 490, a Broken Vow filly out of the unraced Distorted Humor mare Giggly from the consignment of Hidden Brook, agent, paying \$150,000 for her.

On her own Rosenblum bought Hip 385, a Harlan's Holiday filly out of Thin Disguise, who is a half sister to New York-bred millionaire Naughty New Yorker, for \$220,000.

Mike McMahon also signed the ticket for Hip 380, a filly from the first crop of multiple grade I winner To Honor and Serve out of the stakes winner Tale of a Dream (Tale of the Cat). Consigned by Preferred Equine, agent, the filly brought a final bid of \$300,000 on behalf of Maggie Seidman.

"She was our top pick for a filly in that price range, so we're really excited about it," said McMahon. "Mrs. Seidman has made a real big commitment. She's been

Maturing Market

A SMALLER, MORE SELECT catalog; an infusion of new buyers; and the increasing quality of New York-bred horses led to gains at this year's Fasig-Tipton preferred sale of New York-bred yearlings in Saratoga Springs Aug. 15-16.

The catalog for last year's sale reflected the growth in interest of the New York-bred market in recent years. As revenue from the video lottery terminals at the Resorts World Casino New York at Aqueduct Racetrack bolstered the state's racing and breeding programs, the foal crops

have increased, and the 2014 sale reflected that, with cataloged horses up by 100—approximately 50%—since 2011.

The 2014 catalog led to hefty gains in both average and median over 2013 and had an RNA rate of 35.5%.

Improved product, new buyers help keep the preferred yearling sale moving forward

This year's sale saw a 10% reduction in the number of horses in the catalog but an increase in the number of horses sold, from 176 last year to 182 this year; a 5.5% increase in gross to \$14,876,500; and a buy-back rate that fell to 27.8%.

"This year's preferred sale was 10% smaller which further emphasized its 'preferred' model," said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "The competition and bar for horses being selected continues to rise. Not surprisingly the sale averages reflects those points as well."

The average for the two-night sale was \$81,739, up 2% from \$80,108 while the

in the business for a long time, but she's decided to play with the big boys now."

"We really like what we've seen from To Honor and Serve," McMahon added.

Asked what he liked about the filly, he said, "Everything. You don't buy a horse like that and not like everything."

Another familiar face in action at the sale was David Stack of Saratoga Springs, who, in partnership with Parting Glass Racing, campaigned the multiple stakes winner Dave. Though he's no longer breeding horses, Stack teamed with agent Doug Cauthen to purchase consecutive hip numbers during the sale's second session, paying \$220,000 for Hip 482, a Proud Citizen half sister to graded stakes winner Musket Man

out of the stakes-placed Fortuesque (by Fortunate Prospect), consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent.

"Doug and his group do all their due diligence, and we do heart scans," said Stack. "She came back very high on the heart scan, and that's what sold us." Stack also purchased Hip 483, a Lemon Drop Kid filly that is a half sister to stakes winner Amberjack, out of Free as Tristan (by Crafty Friend). That filly was consigned by Marshall Silverman, agent, and brought \$80,000.

"We bought three really good New York-breds here last year," he said, "and, hopefully, we just got a couple more."

Other familiar faces active at this year's sale were LRK Stable, which

races as Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence. The partnership comprising Seth Klarman and Lawrence bought six horses, including a Flatter colt out of Ontario-bred River Nore (by Archers Bay) for \$290,000.

But buyers new to the New York program also made their presence known. Trainer Mark Casse purchased three horses on behalf of owner John Oxley, including a \$300,000 Speightstown filly from the consignment of Denali Stud, agent. Out of a state-bred mare by Medaglia d'Oro, the filly is Casse's first purchase at the Saratoga New York-bred sale.

"We don't buy horses just because they're New York-bred," he said. "We

buy them because we like them, in the hopes they can run anywhere.

"I had a conversation last night with Ernie Semersky of Conquest Stables, and I said, 'You know, Ernie, these horses aren't second to anybody,'" Casse continued. "These horses have as good a shot as being California Chrome or American Pharoah as anybody."

Another first-time buyer at the sale was Don Little of Centennial Farms, who purchased a son of Hard Spun out of Ruly (by A.P. Indy).

"I like his being by Hard Spun," said Little, who campaigns another son of Hard Spun, the multiple graded stakes winner Wicked Strong. "He's a big, strong individual, and he looks like he'll get a classic distance."

Outbid on several horses at Fasig-Tip-

ton's select sale earlier in the week, Little said that it "didn't hurt to look" at the New York-breds, and was pleasantly surprised at what he found and the prices.

"We might have gone a little higher," he said after he had secured the colt for \$200,000.

Little and Centennial also purchased a colt from the first crop of Gemologist for \$92,000, acknowledging the downward pressure on the New York-bred sale after the strength of the open sale.

"This market's gone up, too," he observed. "But that's good. It's a healthy market, and that's good for the horse business."

"It was a good sale," agreed Francis Vanlangendonck of Summerfield Sales. "If you had a horse that looked like an athlete, people were paying good mon-

ey for them."

Summerfield sent 10 horses through the ring, selling eight, including the sale-topper. Three horses failed to meet their reserve, with one being sold privately.

Vanlangendonck pointed out that an RNA at this particular sale might not necessarily be seen as a negative.

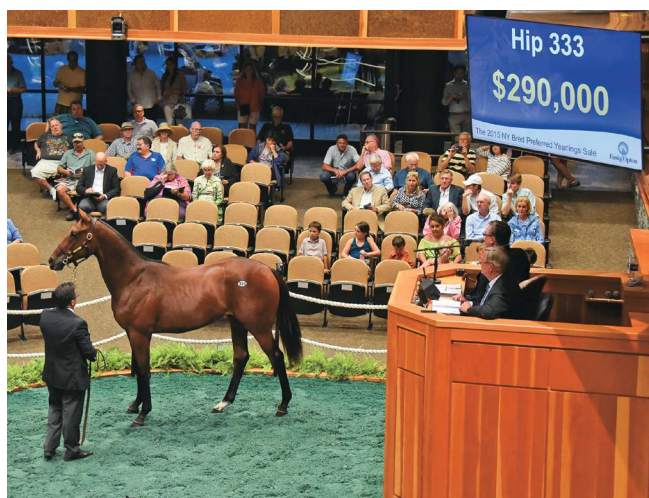
"Some people buy their horses back because they can race them," he said. "It's not so much misjudging the market as it is what the horse is worth to them."

"Given the purses in New York," he went on, "the owners sitting here might say, 'If I can only get \$30,000 or \$40,000, heck, I can get that on a win.' So they'll race the horse and have fun."

Carl McEntee, sales and bloodstock director of Darby Dan Farm, remarked that even with the smaller catalog, the

number of New York-breds also made selectivity possible.

“There’s a fantastic racing and breeding program here in New York,” he said. “And the thing about this sale is that it’s all New York-breds, so people looking for them have a large selection to choose from.”

And while Kentucky stallions continued to dominate the sale, especially at the high end, not everyone was giving credit strictly to the sire.

“Commercially, people are buying what’s appealing, and that’s dictated by the marketplace,” said Cannizzo. “But it’s based on mare quality, too. It’s not just sires.”

Casse agreed.

“The New York program has come so far, and they have a really good bunch of mares,” he said.

“It’s all physical,” said Vanlangendonck. “It doesn’t matter where it’s born, who it’s by, or who it’s out of. If it’s a good individual, you can sell it.”

“The physicals are outselling themselves,” said Bluewater Sales’ Meg Levy, “and the pedigrees don’t have to match. But if you put it all together, the fact that it’s New York-bred gives it probably 25%

more price-wise. It will encourage reinvestment by breeders and pinhookers.”

“Breeders who brought the right individuals through the ring were rewarded,” said Cannizzo. “The most important part of the sale was that a buyer existed for every horse that checked the right boxes.”

In 2010 the average price for a yearling at this sale was a shade over \$39,000, the median \$30,000. This year’s figures represent increases of 109% and 117%, respectively.

“The growth and progress in this marketplace have been remarkable over the last five years,” said Fasig-Tipton’s president and CEO Boyd Browning.

And while both he and Cannizzo are realistic enough to acknowledge that that rate of growth is unlikely to continue, they are optimistic that both desire for and prices of New York-breds will increase.

“This was a very, very successful sale,” Browning said. “It should provide confidence to breeders that if you breed a quality mare, breed to a quality stallion, and raise a good yearling, you’ll be rewarded in the marketplace. And the quality is going to improve.”

“My hope was that 2015 was going to simply bring stability and consistency for New York breeders in the market,” said Cannizzo. “The numbers from this year’s sale went above and beyond stable with increases in gross and average, along with a dramatic improvement in the buy-back rate while the median held steady.”

“We can’t have double-digit growth every year, and I think the reality is having a stable market here in New York is the most important thing, and this sale is proving that’s definitely the case.”

“We’re able to average \$80,000 in a state-bred sale,” said Browning. “That doesn’t happen anywhere else in the world.” 🐾

Connections thrilled to win Stallion Series stakes at Saratoga

MARK VALENTINE HAS RACED horses since 2003. He's a breeder and an owner and last year his horses earned nearly \$750,000 on the track.

However, on Aug. 10 at Saratoga Race Course, Valentine hit two milestones: his first win at the historic upstate track and his first stakes victory.

"It's unbelievable," he said, exulting in the winner's circle after the \$100,000 New York Stallion Series Stakes for 3-year-olds. "It's un-freaking-believable."

Making his second start on the grass, Ex Ex Ex went to the lead under jockey Jose Lezcano and never looked back, drawing away at will coming into the stretch and holding off a fast-closing Amazing Anne to win by a half-length.

The son of Read the Footnotes ran the mile on the inner turf course in 1:36.95.

Out of the Honor Grades mare Stelluchella, the bay colt was bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds, A. Lakin and Sons, and Hidden Lake Farm. Valentine purchased him last year for \$52,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale from Sequel

Bloodstock, agent, and he's now two-for-two on the grass.

"I listened to Gary," said Valentine, referring to his trainer, Gary Contessa. "He picked this horse out. It was his idea to try him on the turf, and when he got on the turf for the first time, he was a different horse."

"I thought, 'God, we're going to have a lot of fun with this horse,'" said Contessa. "I thought he'd probably go a route of ground and that he'd be a better 'later on' horse."

Contessa was right but not exactly in the way he'd imagined.

Bucked shins delayed Ex Ex Ex's first start until March of this year, when the colt failed to live up to his connections' expectations on the dirt after three un-

successful sprint attempts and a runner-up try at 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles against \$40,000 maiden claiming foes. Contessa tried the turf in a last-ditch effort.

"It was kind of desperation," he admitted. "I thought, 'I gotta find out if this is the horse I thought he was or if he was just counterfeit.'"

"And on the grass it was like, 'Hallelujah!' The light came on."

Valentine is a diamond dealer who lives in Connecticut, and the colt's name is a reference to the quality of a particular cut of the precious gem.

"The best cut diamond would be considered 'Triple Excellent,'" he explained. "I tried a couple of variations and they were all taken, so I came up with Ex Ex Ex."

"I do not," he was quick to add good-naturedly, "have three ex-wives. But I had a horse called Diamond District a while ago, and that was a nice horse, so I think I'm going to stick to jewelry-related names."

Valentine's breeding operation is based at his farm near Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack in central New York, where he focuses on horses bred in New York.

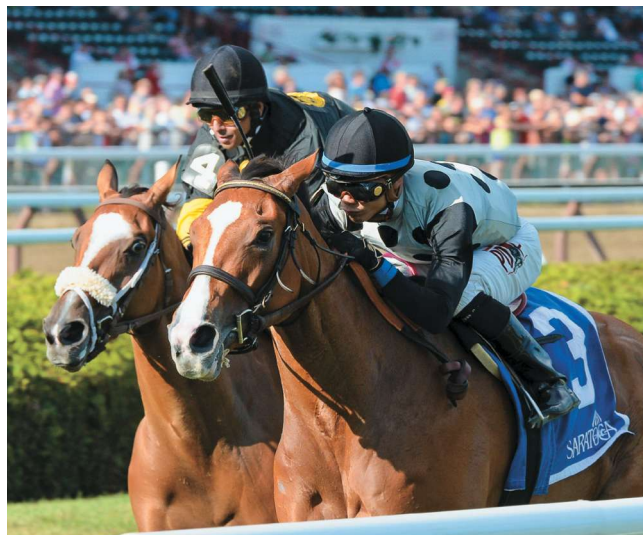
"I breed and I claim, and there's no reason not to have New York-breds," he said. "Ex Ex Ex is a nice horse, but does he ever win a stakes if he's not a New York-bred?"

"I have a lot of horses in training," he went on. "But a stakes win has always eluded me, and I can't tell you how good it feels. This is incredible. This is why I have New York-breds."

Anne's Back

The winner's circle for the filly division of the Stallion Series Aug. 13 had an international flavor when Freudie Anne took the \$100,000 Statue of Liberty division.

The filly is owned by Marc Detampel, Fergus Galvin, Jayne Doi Johnson, Adrian Mansergh Wallace, and trained by Eddie Kenneally, a group with several

people with roots in Irish racing and connections to both Coolmore and French highweight No Nay Never, who won the Darley Prix Morny (Fr-I) at Deauville in 2013.

But the filly herself is a New Yorker through and through, sired by Freud, who consistently ranks among the top stallions in the state, and out of the New York-bred mare Lake Toccet (by Toccet). Four days after Freudie Anne's win, the filly's half brother by Giant Surprise was sold by Vinery Sales, agent, at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds for \$60,000.

Sent to the lead in the Stallion Series race by jockey José Ortiz, Freudie Anne

was tracked closely before pulling away coming off the final turn to win by a length and a quarter, running the mile in 1:35.56.

Bred by Delaney Stable, Freudie Anne was purchased as a weanling by Salford Bloodstock at the Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale in 2012 for \$14,000, then unsuccessfully pinhooked for \$9,000 at the 2013 Keeneland September yearling sale. Consigned by Hunter Valley Farm (owned by Galvin and Adrian Regan), she was purchased by Doi Johnson, co-breeder of No Nay Never.

"We re-sold her at Keeneland, and she just kind of went through a big growth spurt," said Galvin. "She was a tall, leggy filly, always really athletic, so I put together a small group with Adrian, Marc, and Jayne and said, 'Let's go to New York and do some racing.'"

And race they have, with Freudie Anne winning five of nine starts and earning nearly \$250,000. The win in the Stallion Series gives Freudie Anne stakes wins on two surfaces as she had won the East View Stakes over Aqueduct's inner track in December.

"She seems pretty versatile," observed Galvin. "She was wildly impressive when she won the East View, and at some stage she will go back on the dirt. I think what she doesn't want to do is sprint on the dirt. She kind of gets into a rhythm out in front, and things happen a little quickly for her when she's sprinting."

Eased in the Rachel Alexandra Stakes (gr. III) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots in February, Freudie Anne finished fourth and fifth in her last two Stallion Series attempts, at Aqueduct in April and at Belmont in June.

"Today was important because she didn't run very well last time," said co-owner Wallace. "I wanted to see her come to her old self."

"This was the perfect race for her," said Detampel. "A mile on the turf."

"She's done nothing wrong on turf," he added. "And you can't beat winning at Saratoga." 🐾

The Summer Place to Be

TOP-LEVEL RACING TAKES PLACE at Saratoga from mid July through Labor Day weekend. While state-breds had their biggest day Aug. 28 on Showcase Day, big wins by New York-breds in open and restricted stakes were sprinkled liberally throughout the meet.

Against top-level open company Lady Sheila Stable's **La Verdad** continued her mastery of the filly and mare sprint division with a four-length score July 29 in the Honorable Miss Handicap (gr. II). The daughter of Yes It's True is unbeaten in four starts this year—three in graded races—and has earned \$390,000 for Sheila Rosenblum and trainer Linda Rice.

Patricia Generazio's homebred **Too Discreet** stepped out of state-bred company Aug. 21 to capture the 5½-furlong Schenectady Stakes on turf. The 2-year-old colt by Discreet Cat—To Marquet, by Marquetry, earned \$60,000 while topping the Wesley Ward-trained Bruised Orange by a neck. Too Discreet is a half brother to grade I-winning Discreet Marq, who has earned \$1,268,400.

Albert Fried Jr.'s homebred **Moonlight Song** won his third added-money event after going wire-to-wire in the slop July 30 in the \$98,000 John Morrissey Stakes for New York-breds. The 8-year-old gelding by Unbridled's Song, out of the Capote mare Moonlightandbeauty, had finished fifth in the Morrissey in 2014.

Hot Stones, a 5-year-old mare by Bustin Stones—Steamed Up, by Freud, was a front-running winner of the Aug. 17 Saratoga Dew Stakes. The nine-furlong race, worth \$100,000, went in 1:49.87 as Hot Stones won by 9¼ lengths. Bred by Jerry Bilinski and Roddy Valente, Hot Stones is owned by Valente, Charles Casale, and Darlene Bilinski. A two-time stakes winner, Hot Stones has earned \$511,689 in a three-year racing career.

Donald Newman's **Tricky Zippy** was a 4¾-length winner of the \$100,000 Union Avenue Stakes Aug. 20 at the Spa. The 3-year-old filly by City Zip zipped the 6½ furlongs in 1:15.78 under Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez. The homebred, who was making her stakes debut, is out of the Phone Trick mare Honky Tonk Trick. 🐾

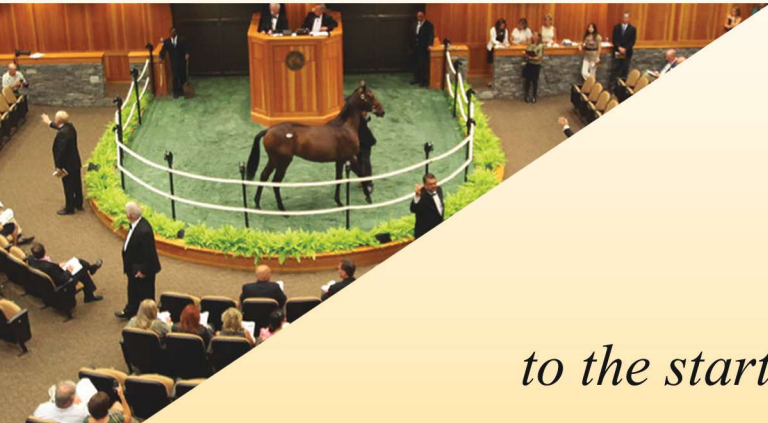
