

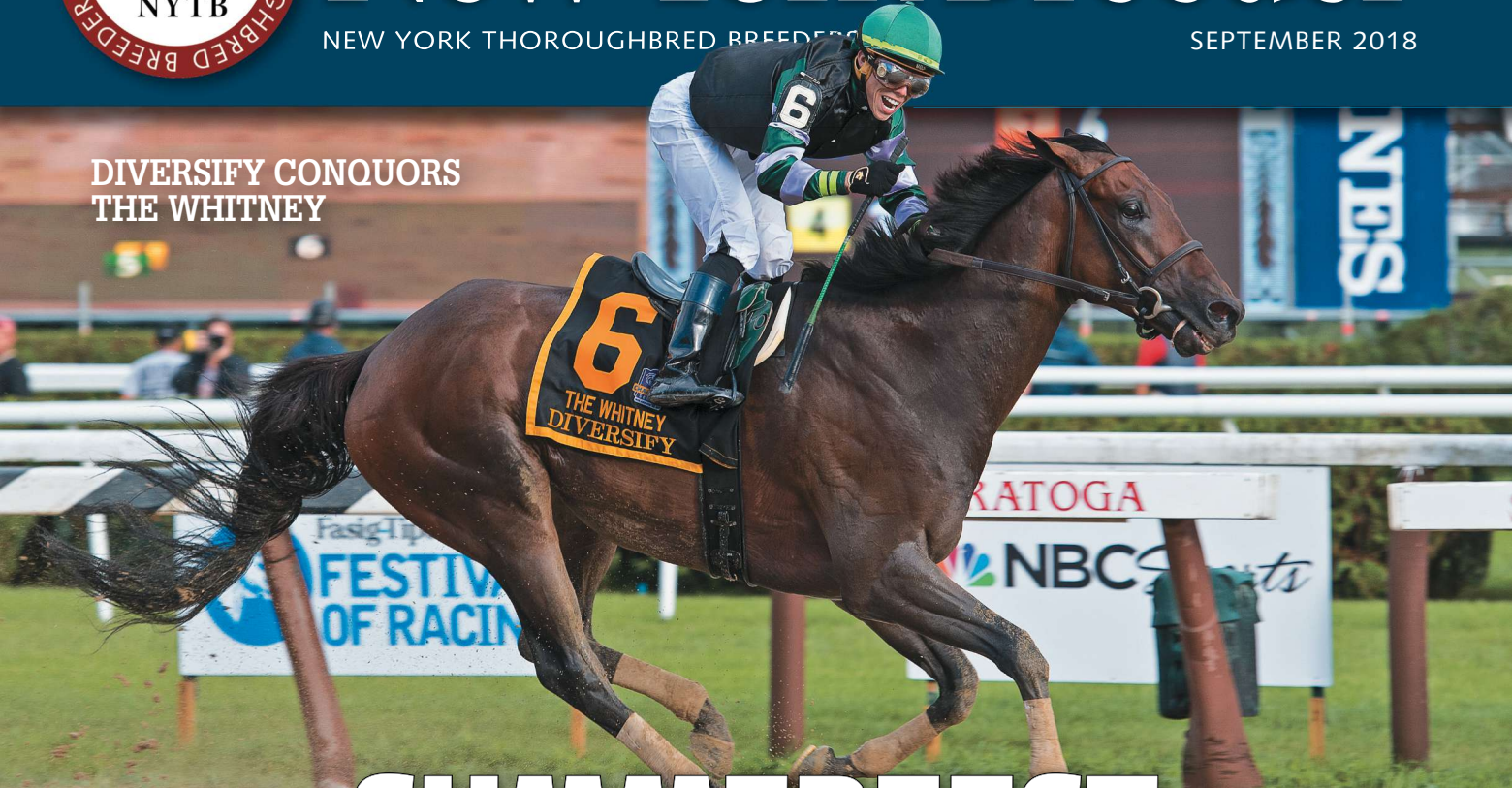

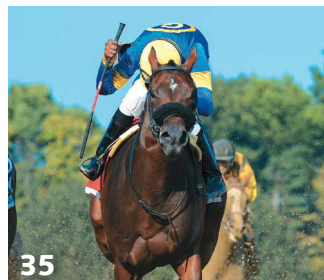
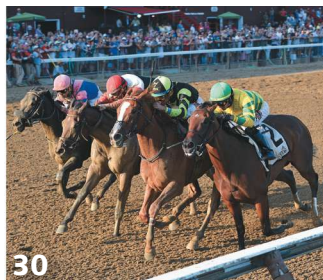

NYTB Membership Update: Continuity and Strength through Change

EVERY JANUARY when we kick off NYTB's annual membership renewal drive, I remind members that they are the backbone of the organization. My team and I would simply not have the resources to work full time year-round on behalf of New York's breeders without member support. Full stop. This year the NYTB board and I have voted to change our membership structure in a way that I believe will strengthen members' roles in our organization.

Nearly 10 years ago the board and I agreed to create a new category of membership—the Associate Member—with the idea of attracting a fresh population of NYTB members into the large end of the funnel.

Associate Members would enjoy all benefits of Individual, Joint, and Corporate Members, but without the right to vote in board elections. The hook was a 33.3% discount on the annual "Individual" membership fee. The theory was that, over time, Associate Members would discover the value of transitioning into fully fledged and committed, life-long voting members of the sort that form the core of our membership roster.

I've conceded that this plan was not a success. Every year we would expend time and effort recruiting a score of new members. Typically, people would join for one year and then disappear. Each year we would repeat the process, recruit another score and lose them in turn. Ultimately, the time and energy invested on these kinds of revolving-door members were not well spent. It did not turn out that such transitional members added strength to our organization, but in many cases simply wanted to profit from the member benefits—mostly free admission to the NYRA tracks—and move on. We always had a spike in brand new Associates in the weeks before the Saratoga meet or right before the Belmont Stakes.

NYTB seeks continuity and commitment in its membership roster—individuals who take an active interest in the importance of the organization, its leadership, our core values, the advocacy and lobbying, our working partnerships, and the promotion of our program.

I first proposed to the board last October that we should eliminate Associate memberships at NYTB. As set forth in NYTB By-Laws, such a change requires ample time for consideration and discussion before it can be adopted, as well as a revision in the by-laws themselves. That process and amending took place according to our by-laws.

Specifically, the board had to consider and discuss the amendment at two scheduled meetings, then vote on the measure at least 30 days later. In our most recent board meeting (June 13), the board voted unanimously in favor of "eliminating the 'Associate' category of NYTB membership beginning in 2019" and making the related changes in the by-laws.

I believe this is a positive move for our organization. Our membership roster will be stabilized from year to year, and we will really know who our dedicated and committed members are. The whole membership, moreover, will be united in having a stake in our always-important board elections.

The first words of NYTB's mission statement are "New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. is a membership organization founded in 1974..." As a membership organization first and foremost, NYTB's focus should fall on fully committed members—those who realize that their livelihoods are impacted directly by NYTB's efforts to advocate for breeders' interests in Albany and promote New York-breds nationally.

This year, of course, the horses you have bred—from Diversify, Mind Your Biscuits, Voodoo Song, and Sue's Fortune to seven-figure sales horses—have done the most to boost your businesses. But our job is to work on issues that can't be resolved on the racetrack or in the sales ring. We need to have a committed population of members at our back to help the cause.

AMERICAN PHAROAH COLT BRINGS \$1M AT F-T SELECT

Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga select yearling sale hit new heights Aug. 6-7, posting a record gross of \$62,794,000 and a second-highest average, \$369,376. Every year several high-end New York-breds are in the sale, with breeders and consignors having to weigh their options in the select venue or in the sale for preferred New York-breds a few nights later.

It looks like the ones who opted for the select sale prospered.

Of 12 New York-breds offered at the Fasig-Tipton sale, eight sold for an average price of \$350,000. The median price for a New York-bred came in at \$257,500. The highlight was Sunnyfield Farm's American Pharoah—Party Silks colt that brought seven figures.

Joanne Nielsen has been breeding Thoroughbreds for 40 years. She's never had a night like Aug. 6 when the colt, out of her grand mare Party Silks (the dam of Upstart), sold to trainer Bob Baffert and M.V. Magnier for \$1 million.

"It's a little embarrassing; I had no expectations until it happened," she said. "I don't even know how to explain it. I'm thrilled beyond...the beyond."

With Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield representing Nielsen, the breeder then saw another American Pharoah yearling she bred top the first session of the New York-Bred preferred yearlings sale when the filly consigned as Hip 329 sold to Hartley/De Renzo for \$450,000 (see page 24).

Of the million-dollar New York-bred, Baffert said: "Of the ones I've seen, I really liked him. He's a late foal; he's going to change a lot and it should be for the better, so I'm excited about it."

The top-selling New York-bred filly of the opening session of the select sale was Hip 23, a daughter of Carpe Diem purchased from the Mill Ridge consignment by Rob Masiello in partnership with West Point Thoroughbreds and Manganaro Bloodstock for \$375,000. Bred by Gentry Stable, the Feb. 4, 2017, filly is out of Lemon Splendor, by Lemon Drop Kid, a stakes-winning mare bred in New York by Gallagher's Stud and out of stakes winner Karakorum Splendor.

Lemon Splendor, who sold to Arch Bloodstock at the 2013 Keeneland January sale for \$10,000, is the dam of Mo Maverick, a stakes winner and multiple stakes performer by Uncle Mo.

The most noteworthy buy-back of the opening session was Hip 19, the first foal out of Lady Sheila Stable's New York-bred Eclipse champion female sprinter La Verdad. The bidding stopped at \$775,000 for the Medalgia d'Oro filly.

In the concluding session New York-breds continued a strong run led by a \$350,000 Carpe Diem colt. Also changing hands were a pair of \$250,000 youngsters by Flatter and Bayern.

Tuesday's top-selling New York-bred was Hip 175, a chestnut colt from the

first crop of Carpe Diem bred by Tom Ryan's SF Bloodstock. Consigned by St George Sales, Agent III, Thomas Haughey signed the ticket for PTK. The colt was a pinhooking success, having been previously purchased by Brookstone Farm at the 2017 Keeneland November sale for \$215,000.

The Carpe Diem colt's winning dam is Florida-bred Betty's Solutions, by Eltish, who was purchased by SF Bloodstock at the 2015 Keeneland November sale for \$300,000 in foal to Proud Citizen.

Hips 197 and 242 each brought \$250,000. Hip 197 by Flatter was bred by Newtown Anner Stud and foaled March 1, 2017. The dark bay colt is out of the stakes-performing Florida-bred mare Cold Awakening, by Dehere

and was consigned by Blake-Albina Thoroughbred Services. Sallusto and Albina purchased the mare for \$50,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November sale. Solis and Litt teamed to sign the ticket on behalf of Jaime Roth's LNJ Foxwoods.

Hip 242, a gray colt from Bayern's first crop, was bred by Hunter Valley Farm. He went to Sam Herzberg/Sterling Racing from the Paramount consignment. He is the second foal out of winner and stakes performer Holy Dazzle, by Holy Bull. Hunter Valley Farm purchased the mare with the sale colt in utero for \$37,000 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale. As a weanling, Hip 242 brought \$180,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

ANNUAL NYTB NIELSEN & MALLOY WINKLER SCHOLARSHIPS PRESENTED AT SARATOGA

The New York Thoroughbred Breeders presented its two annual scholarships, the Gerald A. Nielsen Sr. and Debby Malloy Winkler Scholarships, in the winner's circle at Saratoga after the fourth race July 27.

Established by Joanne Nielsen to honor her late husband, Gerald A. Nielsen Sr., and by Vivien Malloy to honor her late daughter, Debby Malloy Winkler, the \$5,000 scholarships recognize a full-time student enrolled in an equine-related course of study at an accredited college or university in New York State.

The scholarships are intended to foster the education and development of individuals who show the promise of making a positive contribution to the Thoroughbred industry in New York and beyond.

Receiving the 2018 Nielsen Scholarship was Lauren DeGennaro, who recently completed her third year at Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine. Nielsen and Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, made the presentation.

Valedictorian of the class of 2009 at Sacred Heart High School in Waterbury, Conn., DeGennaro went on to graduate cum laude from Boston College in 2013 as a biochemistry major with a minor in theology. DeGennaro expects to complete her graduate work at Cornell in 2019.

DeGennaro is active in community service, working as a student clinician at the Southside Cornell Healthy Pet Clinics, which serve clients below the federal poverty line, and as a volunteer at Hidden Acres Therapeutic Riding Center in Naugatuck, Conn.

ship,” DeGennaro said. “Equine theriogenology (i.e. reproduction) is an aspect of equine medicine that I have become interested in, especially from my clinical rotations at Cornell and from what I have seen and learned during my various externships. This scholarship is a wonderful gift that will definitely help me achieve my professional goals to become a competent and compassionate equine practitioner.”

Selected to receive this year’s Malloy Winkler Scholarship was Rudy Weitze, who will be a junior next year at Cobleskill College.

A native of Kingston, N.Y., Weitze is an agricultural business major at Cobleskill with an interest in agricultural marketing, in particular stallion promotion. An active participant in the Agricultural Business Club as its vice president, Weitze has also worked at Racebrook Stables in Esopus for four years. He hopes to establish his own breeding operation in New York and is interested some day in running for the state senate, where he would “work for the advancement of the Thoroughbred industry.”

“I’m grateful to be receiving this scholarship from the Debby Malloy Winkler family and the New York Thoroughbred Breeders,” said Weitze. “This award will allow me to continue my education and achieve my end goal of becoming a Thoroughbred breeder in New York.”

Weitze also has his mind on recruiting new racing fans.

“Thoroughbred racing truly means the world to me,” he said. “If you bring someone to the racetrack for a day, you can make them a fan for life. This scholarship opens up doors not only for myself, but for those around me. I hope to become a leader who will work for the greater good of the industry and set new standards of excellence in Thoroughbred breeding.”

Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2017 is \$22,593 or 47% of the 2017 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 47% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 15%; Singapore by 68%. 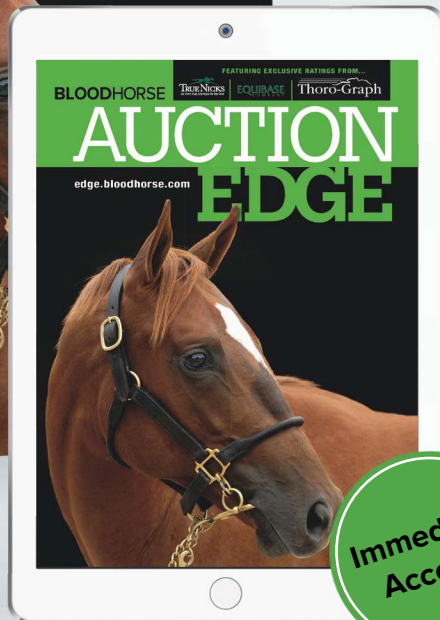

New York-breds peak
at the right time at Saratoga

A SLEW OF UNFORGETTABLE MOMENTS has helped to create a thriving breeding industry in New York State.

You can start with Aug. 1, 1981, when the upstart state-bred Fio Rito defeated Rokeby Stable's grade 1 winner Winter's Tale in the prestigious Whitney Handicap (G1) at Saratoga Race Course.

There was also May 3, 2003, when Funny Cide captured the Kentucky Derby (G1) and two weeks later when he prevailed in the Preakness Stakes (G1).

Yet in the proud, 45-year history of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, there have never been back-to-back weekends jammed with as many milestone events as the recent days from Aug. 4 through Aug. 12 at Saratoga.

Diversify shows the way around the first turn at historic Saratoga Race Course

Filled with grade 1 wins and record-breaking results at the yearling sales across the street at the Humphrey S. Finney pavilion, New York-breds played unusually prominent roles on national stages in the sport's leading races and sales.

"This," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, the executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, "has been the best week the program has ever had."

A historian would be hard-pressed to dispute Cannizzo's claim.

For in the span of just eight whirlwind days, New York State-breds dominated the headlines in an unprecedented manner.

In the famed \$1.2 million Whitney at Saratoga on Aug. 4, Diversify and Mind Your Biscuits produced a 1-2 finish for state-breds.

A week later Barry Schwartz' Voodoo Song gave the state breeding program back-to-back wins in Saturday feature races at the Spa by winning the one-mile Fourstardave Handicap (G1T). Later Aug. 11, the New York State-bred Fourstar Crook, owned by Michael Dubb, Michael Caruso's Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith, finished second against some of the world's best female

turf runners in the \$600,000 Beverly D. Stakes (G1T) at Arlington International. Earlier on that day's Saratoga card, Fortune Farm's Sue's Fortune advanced from a maiden win over state-breds to a half-length triumph in the open Adiron-

dack Stakes (G2) for 2-year-old fillies.

In between, at Fasig-Tipton's The Saratoga Sale Aug. 6, two-time Triple Crown-winning trainer Bob Baffert signed the \$1 million sale ticket on behalf of owner M.V. Magnier for a son

of American Pharoah bred by Joanne Nielsen's Sunnyfield Farm, making the colt the most expensive New York-bred ever purchased at the sale.

Finally, on Aug. 12 after two days of selling at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, records were set for gross sales (\$18,492,000), median price (\$76,000), and average price (\$107,512).

Without question, it was a time that will be remembered as the "Week That Was"—plus a day—for New York state-breds.

"It was just great to see. I don't know if there's a ceiling anymore, glass or otherwise for New York-breds," said Rick Violette, who trains Diversify for Ralph M. Evans and his daughter, Lauren Evans. "I think you can now breed a very, very good horse in New York without any reservations. It used to be that people would turn the page in a sales catalog on a New York-bred, but now you do that at your own peril."

Diversify's 3½-length victory in the Whitney was hardly surprising as the 2017 Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) winner was the 8-5 favorite in the "Win and You're In" stakes that earned the 5-year-old gelding an expenses-paid berth for the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) at Churchill Downs.

There were also high expectations for the runner-up, Mind Your Biscuits, the 3-1 second choice who owns international wins in the last two editions of the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored By Gulf News (G1).

"To have two New York-breds as the top two choices in one of most prestigious races in our country and they finish 1-2, it was a storybook finish to that day," Cannizzo said. "When Fio Rito won the Whitney in 1981, he was an anomaly. He was known as the underdog, a New York-bred from Finger Lakes who came in and shocked everyone. Fast forward to this year, and they are two of the top 10 horses in training. They were third (Diversify) and seventh (Mind Your Biscuits) in this week's (National Thoroughbred Racing Association-

tion) poll, and I can't recall seeing two state-breds that high in the same poll. No one was really shocked by what happened. Every weekend you have New York-breds entered in and doing quite well in major races."

As reflecting in the betting odds, the order of finish in the Whitney was hardly a glitch. Each of the top two finishers came into the race as a proven, high-class grade 1 winner.

Mind Your Biscuits, owned by Shadai Farm, J Stables, Sol Kumin's Head of Plains Partners, Scott Summers, Daniel Summers, Chad Summers, and Michael Kisber and trained by Chad Summers, is the all-time leading earner among New York-breds with a gaudy \$4,159,286. Diversify is eighth with \$1,959,425.

"People shouldn't be surprised, but some are," Violette said. "The Whitney was knocked before-hand. People called it a weak edition of the race, and that was short-sighted. I'd like to see someone do an analysis and see how many grade 1 races have three grade 1 winners running in it. It doesn't happen that often. But because two of the grade 1 winners were New York-breds some people look at it with a jaundiced eye and that's not giving the horses their just due."

Voodoo Song improved to a perfect five-for-five over Saratoga's turf course and completed his ascent from a \$40,000 claimer to a grade 1 winner by prevailing in the Fourstardave for breeder/owner Schwartz and trainer Linda Rice.

"Voodoo Song is the definition of game and heart. Every time you think he's eyeballed or headed in the lane, he fights back. It's a spongy, soft turf course at Saratoga, and he's going wire-to-wire in fast time for that kind of course. It's a testament to just how good he is," Cannizzo said.

For Rice, there was great satisfaction in generating a grade 1 win for Schwartz with a 4-year-old colt bred by his Stone-wall Farm near Granite Springs.

"It was real exciting for Barry and (his wife) Sheryl, his farm and staff as well," Rice said. "It's been a tremendous meet

for state-breds, and Barry is a credit to the program.”

Cannizzo said there was also a special satisfaction in seeing a seven-figure reward for Nielsen's long-standing commitment to the Empire State's breeding program.

"Joanne Nielsen is on our board of directors and a stalwart supporter of the program. Her late husband (Gerald) was instrumental in setting this all up as a former NYTB president. They were responsible for a lot of the things we are

seeing now," Cannizzo said.

Of course, Nielsen might need to travel to Del Mar or Santa Anita instead of Saratoga to see the record-breaking colt on the racetrack.

"It's a shame to lose a good young horse to California," Rice said, "but being in Bob Baffert's barn is not too shabby."

No, it's not. Just like it's not too shabby to run 1-2 in the Whitney, or win grade 1 stakes on consecutive Saturdays at Saratoga, or...

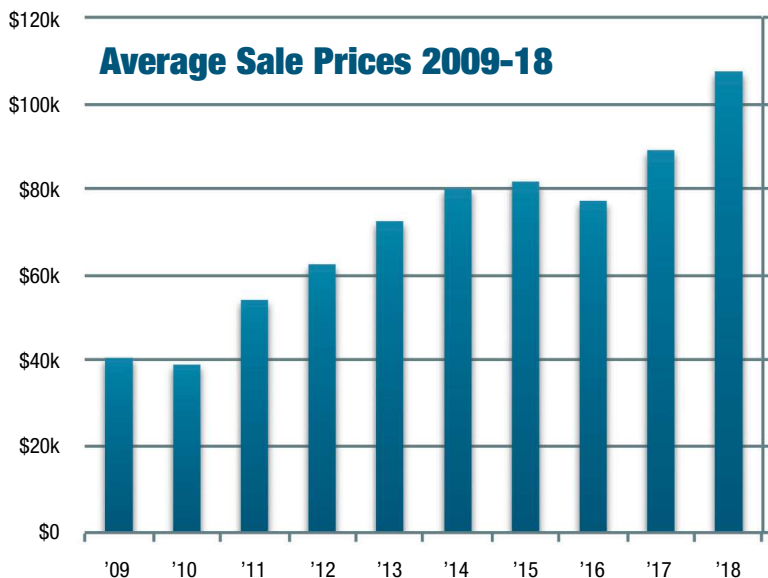

Got It Covered

New York-bred sale,
with three grade 1
winners on the cover,
continues to arc higher

ON THE FIRST NIGHT of the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, consignor Thomas J. Gallo III stood on the buyers' balcony of the Humphrey S. Finney sales pavilion. Beverage in hand, he was visibly exuberant, and all too happy to talk about Hip 384, which had minutes before brought a final bid of \$400,000, the second-highest price of the session. "We got a lot of vet action," Gallo said. "So I was hoping for \$250,000, \$300,000. This is your dream, when something comes together like this. It exceeded my expectations."



Gallo first began bringing horses to this sale 30 years ago, and he is one of several longtime New York breeders and consignors that saw patience, persistence, and loyalty rewarded at this year's Saratoga sales, both the New York-bred sale Aug. 11-12 and the open sale for select yearlings Aug. 6-7, which saw a New York-bred colt by American Pharoah bring \$1 million, the fourth-co-highest price in the auction.

When the two-night New York-bred sale ended, every major indicator showed an increase. Thirty horses sold for \$200,000 or more, leading to record sales of \$18,492,000, an increase of 14% over last year's record, and a record average of \$107,512, up 20.7% over 2017. The median price of \$76,000 also set a standard, rising 9.4% from the prior sale's.

"It was really cool to see those gains posted," said Boyd Browning Jr., president and CEO of Fasig-Tipton. "We saw diversity amongst buyers, and

new names active in the New York-bred marketplace.”

A number of buyers and consignors observed that many of the players who had been active in the select sale had stayed around to buy or sell New York-breds. But when the final gavel fell, late on Aug. 12, the top seven sellers had all been bred by people who

have been breeding and racing in New York for years.

The sale-topper, a Pioneerof the Nile colt, was purchased in utero by Jonathan Thorne, the breeder of record, and is out of the A.P. Indy mare Score. The \$600,000 brought by the colt set a record for a horse at this sale.

“I feel very lucky to have bred such

a beautiful horse, such an intelligent horse. I've loved every minute of being around him," said Thorne. "It's a very hard thing to do. All of us in this business are trying to do the same thing, and it's very rewarding when that happens. The record sale price is great, but he deserved it. He's a fantastic horse. The people that got him got a really good horse."

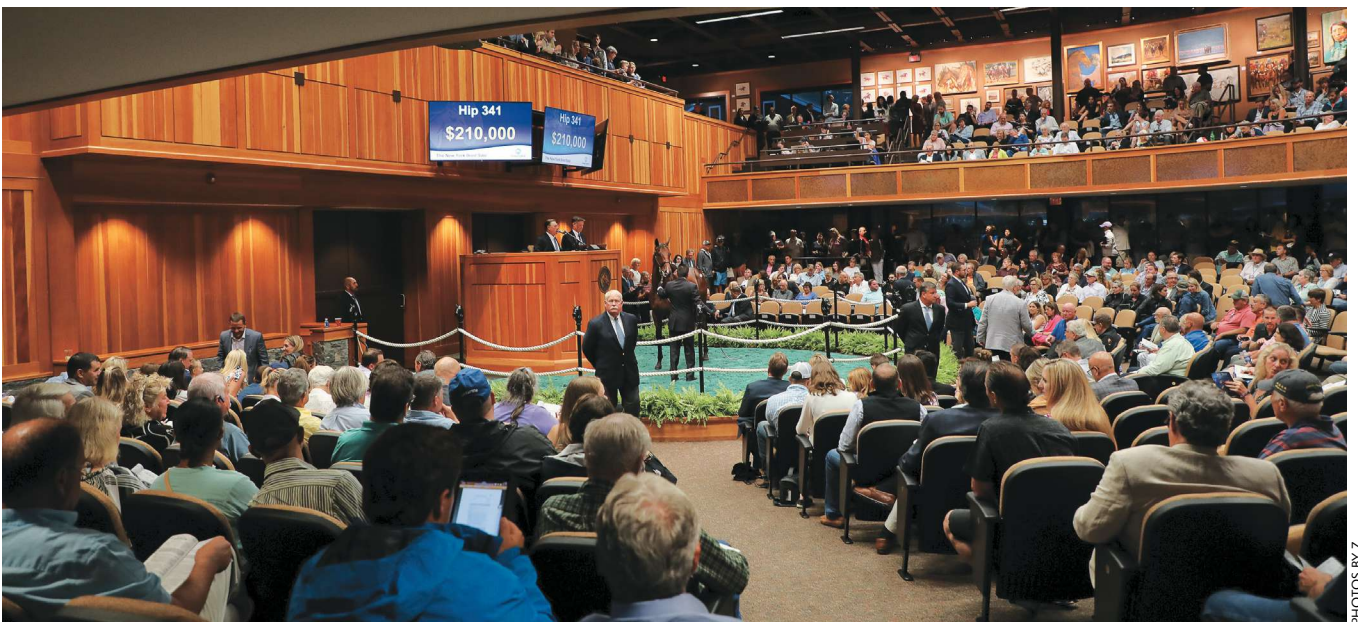
"The price wasn't higher than I expected, not for that pedigree," said Shortleaf Stable's Ed Anthony, who purchased the colt for his father to race.

"That's about what I figured, and I knew we'd have competition. If you're looking for stallion prospects and want to be relevant on the Triple Crown trail, you've got to pony up."

Breeder Joanne Nielsen sold two of the top five sellers in the New York-bred sale, an American Pharoah filly out of the Distorted Humor mare Visions of Annette for \$450,000 and an Into Mischief colt out of Silken Lily (by Grand Slam) for \$320,000, the latter from the family of Party Silks, dam of Nielsen's

\$1 million American Pharoah colt from the select sale. All three yearlings were consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield as agent for Nielsen's Sunnyfield Farm.

"It would be a good trivia question, who's been breeding in New York longer than the Niensens or the Thornes," said Browning. "It's a testament to their commitments to the overall Thoroughbred industry and the New York program, and to producing quality horses. They've been richly rewarded as a result."

“You always hope to get a bargain, but for me, I think at the end of the day, I think this will end up being like a bargain for one of his,” said Randy Hartley of hip 329, the American Pharoah filly he bought to pinhook. “His babies are looking fantastic. This is the one we really wanted. There’s so much upside.”

One way in which the New York-bred sale has become a victim of its own success is in the perennially high buy-back rate, which Fasig-Tipton contemplates with an almost matter-of-fact resignation. This year 91 horses failed to sell, for an RNA rate of 34.6%, up from last year’s rate of 25.4%.

“It’s higher than we’d like,” Brown-ing acknowledged, “and probably due to a combination of factors. It’s a selective marketplace. New York owners and breeders have significant alternatives if they don’t get what they think is a fair price to control the destiny of their horse with regard to its racing career.”

“Breeders and consignors here have high expectations,” said horseman Nick de Meric. “The reserves are a little higher than they should have been, and as someone who is a seller at 2-year-old sales, I know that you have to be light on your feet and adjust quickly to the market. I think some breeders and consignors are hanging on a little too long.”

De Meric purchased just one horse at this year’s preferred sale, a \$100,000 daughter of Majestic City out of the Southern Image mare Landing My Way. She was bred by Barry Ostrager

and consigned by RFHF Bloodstock as agent.

“To see the sales average break \$100,000 is a very big deal,” said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. “It’s also a very good thing that the buy-back rate on the second night dropped significantly.”

Fifty-six horses failed to meet their reserve on the first night, while only 35 horses were bought back on the second night.

“I think some of these horses, and certainly some of ours, had reserves that were a little higher because the racing in New York is so good, and breeders do enjoy racing,” said Francis Vanlangendonck. “If they can get a certain amount

of money, fine. If not, they’ll race. They’re not desperate to sell and they don’t misjudge the horse’s true value. They know what it’s worth to them.

“The market wasn’t horrible because a horse can break its maiden in New York and make more than what it would have sold for.”

Other long-time participants in the New York-bred market that saw success were Sanford Bacon, who sold an Into Mischief filly out of the multiple stakes winner Risky Rachel (by Limehouse), consigned by Paramount Sales, agent, for \$350,000; and Waterville Lake Stables (John Meriwether, Richard Leahy, and Tim Tully), who sold an Uncle Mo colt out of Pulpit’s Andraste for \$310,000, consigned by Don Robinson’s Winter Quarter Farm. Gallagher’s Stud’s Malibu Moon filly offered by Denali Stud as agent went for \$300,000. The Tulipmania (by Empire Maker) yearling was sold to Peter Brant’s White Birch Farm.

“We’ve been involved in New York breeding since 1980,” said Thorne. “It’s amazing how good this program has become. Just look at the horses out there running.”

New York-bred horses advertised themselves masterfully in the week leading up to the sale. On Aug. 4, Diver-

sify and Mind Your Biscuits, both of which came out of the New York-bred sale, ran 1-2 in the Whitney Stakes (G1). The next day Sandy's Slew won the Troy Handicap (G3T). The following weekend, on the day that the sale began, Voodoo Song notched his first grade 1 win in the Fourstardave Handicap and Sue's Fortune won the grade 2 Adirondack Stakes.

"I think that long-term that helps New York-bred sales because we keep talking about all these performances in graded and group races," said Cannizzo. "That has legs. Short-term, it doesn't hurt that New York-bred horses won graded stakes just as we were offering 325 New York-breds that are viewed as the top 18 or 19% of the foal crop."

"The breeders in the state have stepped up and invested more money in mares, in the industry, and that's why you see this sale continue to rise every year," said Thorne. "The New York Racing Association does a great job and the racing is top-notch. It's fantastic for New York and it's fantastic for the whole Thoroughbred industry. It's a win-win."

I feel for some of the New York breeders who may be a notch below that on pedigree or physical because there isn't as much depth as you'd perhaps like to see to support them."

"It's still a polarized market," said Browning. "Every horse doesn't get lifted up."

Nonetheless, celebrating the highest selling horse in his career as a consignor, Gallo offered some institutional memory of how far this sale has come.

"In 1986 or 1987," he said, "I topped the sale here. "The horse sold for \$40,000."

And as a result, buyers come to the sale knowing that the bargains will be few and far between and that the top end of the market will be robust, as it has been at most sales in recent years. They acknowledge that it's hard to buy the highest-quality horses, and both consignors and buyers acknowledge that it can be tough to sell horses that don't quite reach that top threshold.

"The top half of that sale is super strong," said de Meric. "As a buyer it's difficult to buy horses you really want.

Gracing the cover of this year's New York-bred catalog were Diversify, Mind Your Biscuits, Audible, Fourstar Crook, and Holiday Disguise. All are graded stakes winners; the first three have all won grade 1 races.

Breeder/consignor Thorne hopes the yearling he sold will soon be in that elite company.

"I look forward to watching him down the road," he said. "I can't wait. Hopefully this horse will go on to do what I think he can do, and he'll be on the cover of this catalog someday." 🐾

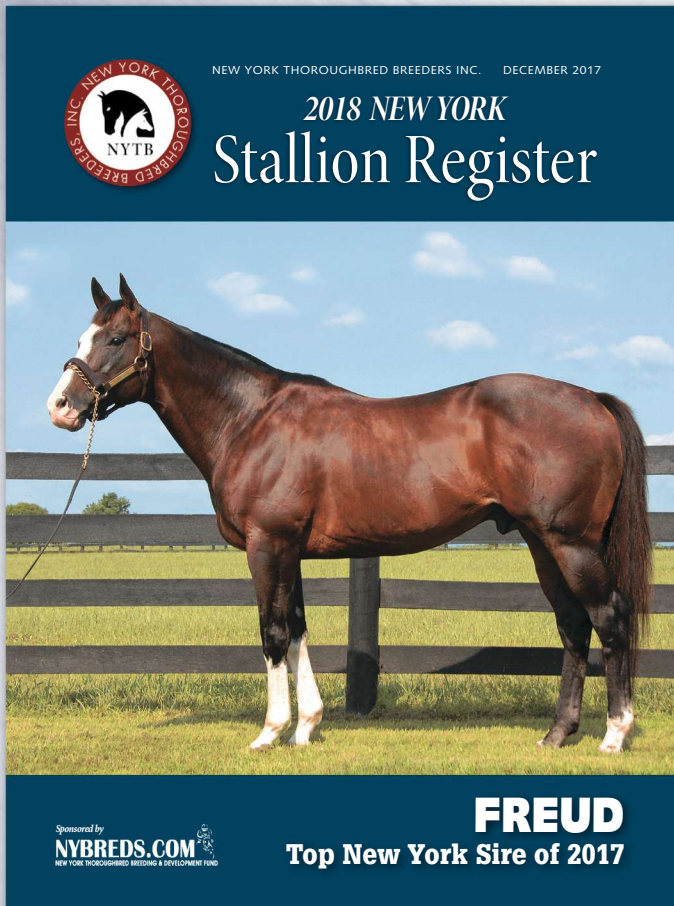

High Seas

Sea Foam, English Soul take down top 3-year-old events

RICHARD LEAHY AND HIS PARTNERS in Waterville Lake Stables, John Meriwether and Tim Tully, don't ordinarily keep the colts they breed, but in the case of Sea Foam, Plan B might well have been better than Plan A after the colt's gate-to-wire win in the nine-furlong Albany Stakes.

The Albany, worth \$250,500 and for 3-year-olds, was the highlighted event of the Aug. 24 Showcase Day at Saratoga for New York-breds.

Stretching out beyond 1¼ miles for the first time, favored Sea Foam broke from post six and raced wide into the first turn while setting the pace under Joel Rosario. The early splits were :23.53 and :47.51. Dropping into the two-path a length in front of Spectacular Kid and Singapore Trader, the bay colt extended his advantage heading into the far turn, but a dogged Singapore Trader stayed after him, eventually holding on for third. A fast-closing Evaluator made a run at Sea Foam, just falling short as the son of Medaglia d'Oro prevailed by three-quarters of a length over a fast track in 1:50.24.

Though Sea Foam didn't win his first race until his fourth start, he'd been a runner-up in first three attempts. He won his first foray into stakes company, taking the six-furlong Notebook Stakes for state-breds last November at Aqueduct, after which he was off for six months, returning in the seven-furlong Mike Lee Stakes at Belmont in May. He had been scheduled to run in the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct in early January; the race was cancelled because of bad weather and his connections elected not to run him when the race was rescheduled.

"We just gave him a rest," said Leahy. "We couldn't find the appropriate race for him."

Sea Foam came to the Albany off a ¾-length win in the July 21 New York Derby at Finger Lakes Gaming and Race Track. He's finished off the board just twice in nine starts.

The Albany winner is out of the graded stakes-winning Strike It Rich (by Unbridled's Song), purchased by Christophe Clement for Waterville Lake for \$350,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. Clement trained her to a win in the 2010 Boiling Springs Stakes (G3T) at Monmouth

Park; Sea Foam is her third foal to race and her second winner.

Leahy and his partners had intended to sell the colt, but a minor injury kept him out of the auction ring.

“The week before the (Keeneland September yearling) sale he kicked himself and cut himself,” said Leahy. “It was superficial, but it wouldn’t have looked great, so we decided to keep him.”

It appears to have paid off, considering Sea Foam has earned \$373,570.

“I’m delighted because Waterville Lake Stables has supported me forever,” said Clement. “It’s pretty usual for them to keep their fillies and sell their colts, and they didn’t with Sea Foam because of an early issue, and I’m delighted it worked out.”

SOUL TO SOUL

The partners in Zilla Racing Stables whooped their way to the winner’s circle when their 3-year-old filly English Soul got her second black-type win, the 1¼-mile Fleet Indian Stakes later on the Showcase Day card.

Dozens of partners crowded into the winner’s circle after English Soul had eked out a nose win in the \$200,000 race for 3-year-old fillies, running down a tenacious Take Charge Aubrey, who had set a :23.67, :48.66 pace on the front end over a fast track.

English Soul and Manuel Franco joined the fray early after breaking from post 11, sitting in the three-path less than a length behind Take Charge Aubrey and Cause We Are Loyal. Never

letting the leaders get too far ahead, English Soul edged closer as Cause We Are Loyal faded, but the winner had a harder time getting past 5-2 favorite Take Charge Aubrey, who hung on for an impressive runner-up finish.

“I was a little concerned when I saw her four-wide into the first turn,” said trainer Ray Handal. “That was definitely not ideal.”

Standing in the winner’s circle after the picture was taken, Zilla founder Mike Piazza, who grew up in the Albany area, smiled at the partners’ reaction.

“It’s amazing to win here,” he said. “And I get more emotional because I know what it means to the partners.”

English Soul was bred by Mia Gallo, Dave Stack, and Arlene Wilkins and sold for \$40,000 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton

Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds. Zilla purchased her for \$55,000 at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-old sale. Out of the *Belong to Me* mare *Soul Possession*, the *English Channel* filly is a half sister to two six-figure earners.

“Ray deserves most of the credit,” said Piazza. “Oracle Bloodstock made a short list; I looked it over and made it shorter, and Ray narrowed it down to two. If he didn’t do that, she’s not here today.”

A graduate of nearby Siena College with a degree in accounting, Piazza grew up in a gambling family: His father played the horses, and his mother played poker. He credits both his upbringing and his education for his success with Zilla.

“The analytical part of poker and the horse racing on my dad’s side, combined with my accounting degree, allowed me

to learn the business side,” he said. “I think I’d struggle without any of that.”

But even as Piazza talks about the financial end of the business, he says being a Zilla partner is about a lot more than that.

“It’s good for the venue,” he said. “People come to the track. They’re here betting and buying drinks. And they’re making relationships. There’s so much more value beyond purse money.”

The partnership has 15 horses in training, and Piazza said they keep their eyes open for New York-breds, acknowledging that buying them has gotten more challenging over the last few years.

“A couple of years ago, we thought we could become a bigger fish in a smaller pond,” he said, suggesting that the partnership could become New York-bred specialists, “but a lot of people have caught on, and it’s really tough now to buy a good New York-bred.” 🐾

**Kharafa, 9, lands the West Point;
La Moneda wins the Yaddo**

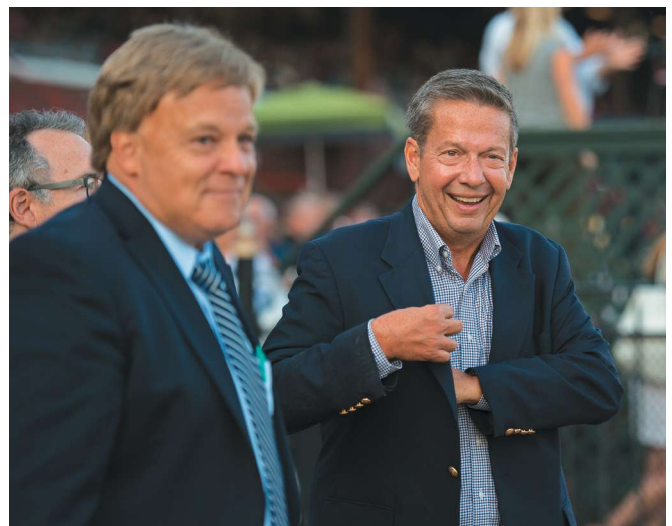
ON A DAY FULL OF IMPRESSIVE PERFORMANCES and emotional owners, the best might have been saved for last on New York-bred Showcase Day, Aug. 24, at Saratoga Race Course.

The \$150,450 West Point Stakes Presented by Trustco Bank was the last added-money race on the six-stakes card and attracted a field of 10 veteran turf routers.

None was more experienced than the 9-year-old Kharafa, making his 50th start and trying to get to the winner's circle for the first time since beating state-breds in the Ashley T. Cole Stakes at Belmont Park in September 2016.

Sent off at 17-1, Kharafa was running to his backing as he trailed the leader by 11¼ lengths in the early going of the 1¼-mile race on firm turf. Rider Dylan Davis raced along the hedge for as long as he could, inching his way forward up the backstretch. He came out to the two path on the turn and farther out at the head of the lane where he split horses.

Kharafa responded to Davis' urging by getting to the lead at

the eighth pole, then was able to hold off the odds-on Offering Plan late to win by a half-length.

Kharafa, bred by High Meadow Farm, races for Paul Braverman and Timothy Pinch.

"I ask him all the time if he wants to retire," said Braverman, "and he always comes out of the winter and says 'No.'"

Trained by Tim Hills and by Kitalpha out of the King of Kings mare Exquisite Cassie, Kharafa has earned more than \$100,000 in seven consecutive seasons with a total bankroll of \$1,235,997.

The 2018 running of the West Point was Kharafa's fourth try and first win to go along with a second (2016) and two thirds (2013, 2017), a record that exemplifies his consistency. His lifetime line is: 13-13-9.

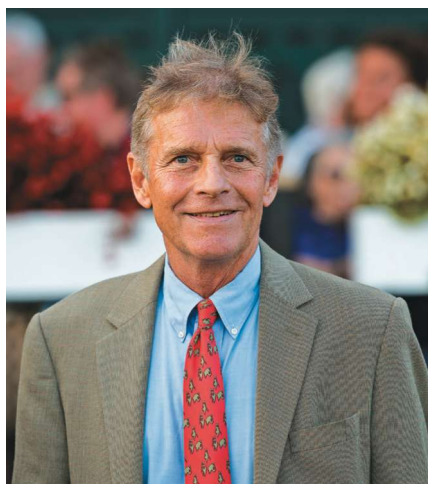
"Dylan did exactly what we told him to do," said Braverman. "He made his move early enough so when (Offering Plan) started coming, we had enough lengths against him. He wasn't going to last much longer."

Kharafa has a home at Old Friends when he retires, but that home might have to wait a little while.

"We've been talking about retirement," said Hills, "and maybe his vote is to keep doing what he's doing, so we'll see. We'll go through the rest of the New York-bred series and see what happens."

Next up in the series is the \$125,000 Ashley T. Cole Stakes at Belmont Park Sept. 23, a race in which Kharafa has run five times—winning three times and finishing third twice.

"I'm so proud of him," said a choked-up Braverman. "I wanted him to win so bad. I'm really proud of Tim and the horse. We raced him less, and he gives us more, every time."

5-year-old mare's great-granddam. However, La Moneda is a New York-bred through and through...and now a stakes winner, too.

Sitting nine lengths off the lead in the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Yaddo Stakes, Junior Alvarado and the bay hugged the hedge before moving out into the three-path coming around the final turn. In midstretch, pace-setting Lady Joan looked as if she might be home free, but La Moneda accelerated and made a determined run, nailing Lady Joan just before the wire for the neck win. Even-money favorite Fifty Five was a nose back in third.

La Moneda is out of Jade Palace (by Jade Hunter) and by New York stallion Freud and is a third-generation Moseley homebred. La Moneda is a full sister to stakes-placed Palace Dreams, who earned \$170,427. La Moneda has won six of nine races for earnings of \$312,769.

"I've been breeding to him for a long time," said Moseley. "I've always loved Freud."

Moseley recently purchased a farm just outside of Saratoga Springs, where she keeps 20 to 30 horses, including "a lot of retirees."

She had based her breeding program in her home state of Massachusetts, raising foals on her property, but what she characterized as the death of the indus-



try there led her to shift her operation to New York.

La Moneda runs for both Tom Morley and Brendan Walsh, who share training responsibilities, making her last four starts, all wins, for Morley.

"Brendan told me before she debuted here last year, 'I think I have a New York-bred in my barn who can win a graded stakes.' We've taken our time and picked our spots, but she just keeps getting better and better," said Morley.

He added, "Brendan gets her fit at the beginning of every year, and then I just put the tack on her. Really, it should be Brendan standing here in the winner's circle."

La Moneda had been winless at the Yaddo distance in all but one of her attempts at it.

"A mile has always been her thing," said Moseley. "She had to go get this one, and she was all heart. We're thrilled." 🐾

FUTURE IS NOW

Juveniles Dugout, Party Like Grandma strike at the Spa

THE 6½-FURLONG FUNNY CIDE STAKES, worth \$194,000, turned into a match race for 2-year-olds when Dugout and Bankit ran head-and-head, leaving their three rivals behind in a stretch duel that could have gone either way. It was Dugout that got the bob, winning by a nose Aug. 24 at Saratoga Race Course. The final time was 1:16.43.

The gray colt is owned by Patricia's Hope, Richard Ravin, and trainer Larry Rivelli; the latter two bred him and though Rivelli's training operation is based in Illinois, Dugout will be staying in New York.

Dr. Jean White, whom Rivelli calls "the driving force behind the breeding operation," selected Dugout's dam, Rooney Doodle (by Lit de Justice), to come to New York for the partnership's first Empire State breeding venture. Dugout is sired by Florida stallion Adios Charlie, a son of Indian Charlie.

"Richard campaigned several horses before he began breeding," said White. "They were out of Lit de Justice mares crossed with the In Excess line. We liked the mare because of that even though she had very little pedigree."

Dugout is a half brother to three six-figure earners and a full brother to stakes-winning Jean Elizabeth, who won an allowance optional claiming

race at Arlington International the day after Dugout's win to push her earnings to \$166,222.

"She's been a really good mare for us," said Rivelli. "We've been fortunate."

A veterinarian, White has worked for some time with Ravin and Rivelli and is based at the Ocala Equine Hospital. The young horses on which she advises go to the nearby Webster Training Center for their early training and then to Rivelli.

"Richard and I have been breeding horses together for 10 or 12 years," said Rivelli. "We were in Saratoga for the sales and every horse there was selling for a half-million dollars, so we said, 'Let's drop one in New York.'"

Dugout was foaled at Sequel New York, which had come highly recommended by a friend of White's.

"I wanted the highest-quality place I could find," said the veterinarian. "I didn't want to take any chances." She obviously made the right call, as their first New York-bred is two-for-two, with Rivelli cautiously thinking about a major open company race down the road.

"Right now we're planning on the race at Finger Lakes Gaming & Race-track Sept. 29," he said, referring to the \$200,000 New York Breeders' Futurity at six furlongs.

"We may have some bigger dreams," he added. "We'll run him in New York to see if he might be capable of running in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint. This is the first homebred we've had, and we dropped him in New York and he won, so it's exciting."

PARTY ON

Christopher Meyer was definitely doing some celebrating after his Party Like Grandma led every step of the 6½-furlong Seeking the Ante Stakes, giving the owner his first win at Saratoga. The race for 2-year-old fillies was worth \$200,000.

"We were on the Derby trail this year with Magicalmeister, but this is the epitome," said Meyer. "My grandfather worked as an accountant for the New York Racing Association, and more than

the Breeders' Cup, more than the Kentucky Derby (G1), I've always wanted to win anything at Saratoga. This is even more exciting than Magicalmeister."

"The speed (Collegeville Girl) scratched, so I figured I was the only other speed," said jockey Andre Shivnarine Worrie. "I went on with it, and she got brave and just kept going."

The score came by 1¼ lengths over Maiden Beauty, with favored She's Trouble finishing third. The time was 1:17.59.

Owned in partnership with

Flower City Racing and trainer Jeremiah Englehart, the bay filly is by Desert Party, who stands at Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions in New York, and was purchased as a weanling by Englehart for \$8,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed sale. She was bred by Patricia Calandro and Susan Georgas and is out of the Salt Lake mare Grandma Lu. Unbeaten in two races, Party Like Grandma has earned \$128,400.

"It sounds funny because she was a weanling," said Englehart, "but she just looked like a racehorse."

"He found the right one," said Meyer. "It's a good fit."

Englehart chose the filly's name,

which plays on pedigree but carries a deeper meaning for the trainer.

"My Grandma Reed, God rest her soul, always had a great time," he said.

Party Like Grandma romped in her debut at Finger Lakes July 12, winning with Worrie in the saddle by 11½ lengths, and Englehart is excited by the development he sees in her.

"She showed even more today in the paddock than ever before," he said.

He's also looking forward to this year's Fasig-Tipton mixed sale in October; a sale that was revived in 2012.

"Now that I'm a resident here, it's even easier for me to get there," he said.

"I'm excited for it." 🐾

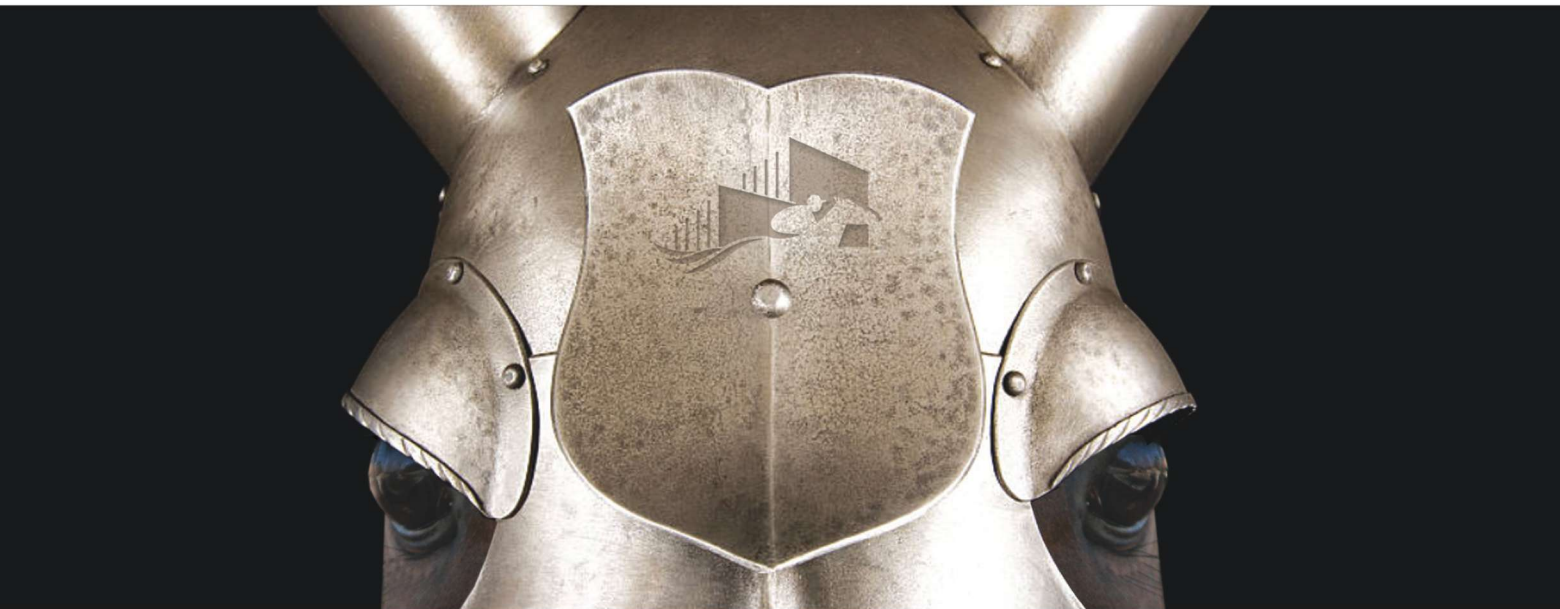

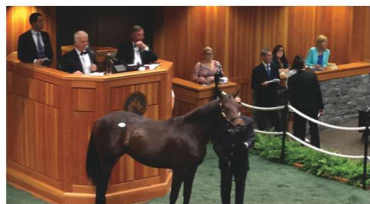
