

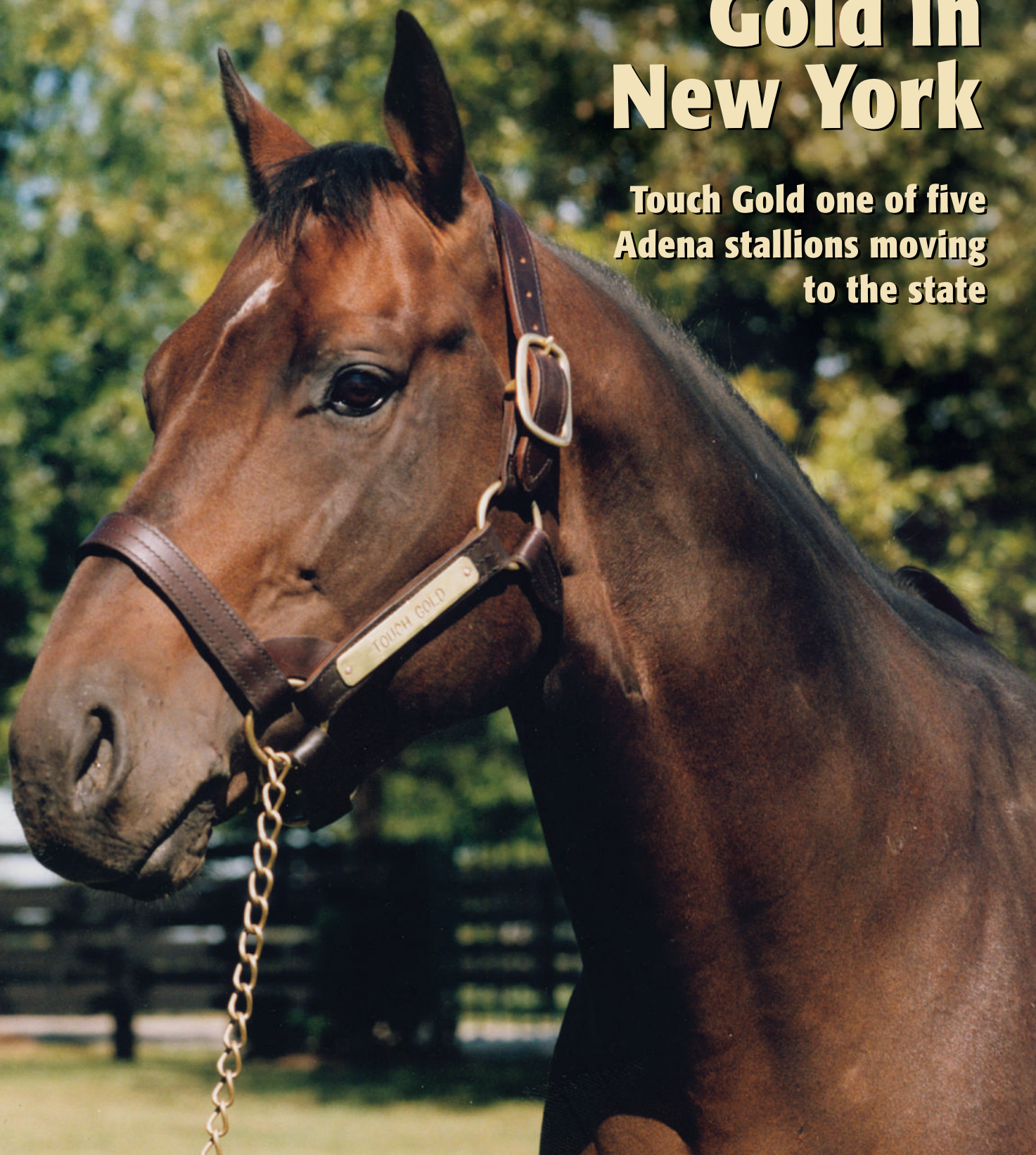

Looking back on the year, I cannot help but feel proud of everything that New York-breds have achieved in 2010. I think of the exciting performances of Grade 1 winners Franny Freud, Rightly So, and Haynesfield, who captured headlines across North America through their triumphs.

I think of graded stakes winners Get Serious, Silver Timber, and Khancord Kid, and of the many, many graded stakes performers that have come out of the New York-bred ranks this year.

If this is what New York-breds can achieve in the sales ring and at the racetrack at the climax of this extended period of severe stress to the New York-bred program, just think of the promise our future holds as those challenges begin to recede!

Think how different the outlook appears from this time last year.

As I write, Genting New York is busy building the Aqueduct racino, which will infuse much-needed revenue into our New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund awards program. The New York City OTB bankruptcy is working toward a resolution—and even though it is not yet quite clear what that resolution will be, some fixed resolution will be better than the limbo we've experienced in 2010.

Stallions are coming into our state, and people are calling our office to ask about the program: "I'm planning to bring some of my mares to New York. What can you tell me about ...?" People are excited about breeding in New York, and I was overwhelmed by how many people wanted to talk to me about our program as I traveled this fall to the sales and to the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

Breeders have many struggles ahead, and I will be talking to you about them. But please take a moment to look back with me on a memorable year of New York-bred achievements, and join me in looking forward to a new year with eager anticipation of even greater things to come.

## New York-bred Grade 1 winners sold at Fasig-Tipton

Two New York-bred Grade 1 winners, Rightly So and Franny Freud, were sold for high prices during the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky selected fall mixed sale on November 7 in Lexington.

Rightly So, the program-line favorite for the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1) who was scratched on the morning of the November 5 race because of lameness, sold for \$600,000, the 13th-highest price of the sale. Franny Freud, winner of this year's Prioress Stakes (G1), was the next-highest price at \$560,000.

By New York-based stallion Read the Footnotes, Rightly So earned her Grade 1 laurels in Saratoga Race Course's Ballerina Stakes. Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, the four-year-old filly was sold to Patinack Farm, an international operation based in Australia.

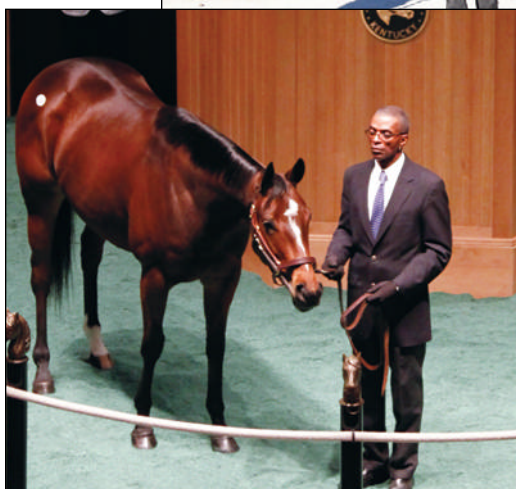
Owned by Zayat Stables, Rightly So set all the pace in winning the Ballerina and earlier won the Bed o' Roses Handicap (G3) on July 5 at Belmont Park for trainer Tony Dutrow. Her earnings totaled \$480,050.

By Freud, Franny Freud was consigned by Hidden Brook as agent and sold to Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm in Japan. Bred in New York by Anthony Grey, the three-year-old filly was last year's New York-bred champion two-year-old filly and had an even better season in 2010.

Trained by John Terranova II, she won four of five starts this season, including the Prioress and Beaumont (G2) Stakes, for owners Paul Pompa Jr., Stephen Yarbrough, and Grey's Winter Park Partners. Franny Freud was retired after sustaining a ligament injury while preparing for Saratoga's Test Stakes (G1). She won \$686,029 in two seasons.

## Harry Malloy, Edition Farm co-owner, dies

Henry L. "Harry" Malloy, co-owner of Edition Farm with his wife, Vivien, died on October 22 at his Waccabuc, New York, home after a months-long battle against esophageal cancer and diabetes complications. He was 79.

A retired insurance executive, Harry Malloy was an avid golfer and skier who came to share his wife's and children's love of horses, breeding, and racing.

"He loved being a breeder," Vivien Malloy said. "He was very proud of the horses we bred."

Vivien Malloy developed a reputation as a skillful handicapper as a youngster after spending afternoons at Empire City racetrack with her grandfather, Bergdorf Goodman owner Edwin Goodman, and her husband took pride in her skills. He said he would follow her to the betting windows and double up on her bets. Vivien Malloy said her husband also became a skilled handicapper as he became more deeply involved in the sport.

"He was always excited about it," she said. "He understood how important it was and really got into it when we started racing and breeding." Edition Farm in Hyde Park marked a milestone in its history when

a horse it bred, A Shin Forward, became a millionaire in Japan last year.

The son of Henry T. and Ellen Neville Malloy, Harry Malloy was born in New York City and graduated from Mamaroneck High School in 1948. He attended Colby College before graduating from Villanova College with a degree in economics in 1953. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1953 to '55, rising to the rank of lieutenant. He and Vivien married in 1957.

He spent most of his working career at Republic Hogg Robinson, currently Wells Fargo Insurance, and became a vice president in property and casualty coverage. He was a former member of Westchester Country Club in Rye and active member of Waccabuc Country Club, Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southampton, Stratton Mountain Country Club in Stratton, Vermont, and the Turf and Field Club.

In addition to Vivien, he is survived by five children: Andrew of Castle Rock, Colorado; Debby Winkler of Warendorf, Germany; Kenneth of Rye; Mark of Los Angeles; and Vivi Hanson of Chicago.

# Ground broken for Aqueduct's racino

Long-delayed project to be partly opened in six months  
and will employ 800 permanent workers

It's official, finally. Construction of Aqueduct's video lottery terminal (VLT) casino, which carries with it the promise of renewal for New York Thoroughbred racing and the state's breeding industry, is now under way.

In what may prove to be one of his final major actions as New York's governor, David A. Paterson presided over a ceremonial groundbreaking on October 28 at the Queens track with K. T. Lim, chairman of VLT franchisee Genting New York's parent company.

The racino, which will be known as Resorts World New York, is expected to create 800 permanent jobs in addition to employing 1,300 construction workers and is expected to generate more than \$300-million in annual revenues for the state. The first phase of the project is expected to open in the spring and will begin the flow of revenues into race purses and breeding incentives.

Genting officials said that within six months of the groundbreaking, a significant portion of 4,525 VLTs will be operational. Six months after the first-phase launch, all the VLTs will be in operation and all interior work will be complete. Within 18 months, all interior and exterior renovations, including an enclosed bridge from the "A" subway station to the casino's entrance, will be completed.

Genting plans job fairs to recruit the 800 permanent employees.

"This is one of the proudest days in the history of the Genting organization," Lim said. "Working alongside our elected officials, union representatives, and our neighbors in the South Queens community, we will deliver a world-class tourism and entertainment facility that all New Yorkers can be proud of."

Malaysia-based Genting is one of the world's largest gaming companies, with 35,000 employees. It operates the world's most profitable casino in Singapore and is a partner in Monticello Casino and Raceway's VLT operation near Port Jervis.

Genting New York's investment in Aqueduct is estimated at \$1.3-billion, including a \$380-million upfront franchise fee paid to the state in late September. In addition, Genting has pledged to support New York Racing Association operations through a \$25-million line of credit until the VLT revenue begins to flow into its coffers.

Under the memorandum of agreement developed by the New York Lottery and accepted by Genting, NYRA is to receive 7% of the VLT operation's net revenues, after VLT players are paid, while another 6.5% will flow to purses, with that portion increasing to 7.5% in year three. Breeders will get 1% percent to start, increasing to 1.5% in year three.

NYRA Chairman C. Steven Duncker noted the long, frustrating process of getting VLTs into Aqueduct. The New York General Assembly authorized the Lottery to license VLT racinos in the aftermath of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on Manhattan's World Trade Center, and all other non-NYRA state tracks have had VLT operations for several years.

"This day has been in the making for nine years, and it is one that we are very excited about," Duncker said. "Genting has been a terrific partner, and we are looking forward to working with them for many years to come. Their Resorts World New York casino will help New York racing reach new heights for horsemen, breeders, and fans."

Politicians attending the groundbreaking hailed the benefits to the larger community.

"The economic benefits of this project—from the more than \$300-million a year in state revenue to the more than 2,100 jobs

created—are tremendous," said Assemblywoman Audrey Pheffer, whose district includes the track. "With so many New Yorkers needing work, Genting has answered our community's need for jobs. I am confident that Resorts World New York at Aqueduct will be an overwhelming success."

Missing from the groundbreaking were political leaders other than Paterson who were at the center of a failed bid to award the VLT franchise to politically connected Aqueduct Entertainment Group last winter. Among the missing were state Sens. Malcolm Smith (D-Queens) and John Sampson (D-Brooklyn), who said they were involved in election campaigns.

The state's inspector general, Joseph Fisch, issued a 308-page investigatory report on October 21 that criticized Paterson and legislative branches but took aim at the politicized effort in the Senate to select AEG. Fisch, who forwarded his findings to federal and state prosecutors as well as the New York State Commission on Public Integrity, said the bidding process generated more than \$100-million in political contributions and was tainted by Senate officials leaking confidential bidding information to AEG lobbyists.

"Although all four of these competing vendors [for the VLT franchise] made significant contributions designed to curry favor with perceived decision makers, the inspector general determined that AEG, in particular, marshaled funds at the behest of the Democratic Senate Campaign Committee to be dispensed to senators across the state at the direction of the committee," the report said.

"This coordination, which one AEG official characterized as a 'fund-raising effort' for the Senate, casts a taint on the motives behind the Senate leadership's support of AEG as such activities are completely divorced from proper considerations toward selecting the most qualified bidder and are only intended to further individual political interests."

Fisch's findings also revealed that AEG did not have the additional \$100-million to raise its upfront payment to the state to \$300-million—as required by Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver as a condition of his support—and little prospect of being able to raise the money.—Don Clippinger

# Adena standing five stallions in New York

Newcomers will be based at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds for 2011 season

Even before the first Aqueduct video lottery terminal (VLT) is installed, New York breeding is reaping the benefits of expanded gaming at the Queens racetrack.

Industrialist and perennial leading breeder Frank Stronach is relocating five Adena Springs stallions to New York for the upcoming breeding season.

To be based at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in Saratoga Springs are Touch Gold, Alphabet Soup, Tiago, Silent Name (Jpn), and recently retired Harlem Rocker.

Adena Springs officials, in announcing the operation's first significant move into New York breeding, said the prospect of higher purses and breeder awards from VLT revenues played a major role in the decision.

"Naturally, the slots initiative in the state of New York is very compelling," said Dermot Carty, Adena Springs' director of sales. "The prospect of improved purses as well as stallion and breeder awards was a strong motivation for Adena Springs Farm to support the New York state program with our stallions."

While no stallion fees were announced immediately, Carty said they would be affordable for New York breeders.

"They will be reasonably priced to attract the strong support of New York breeders and to attract mares that will be bred back in state in order to fulfill New York-bred requirements," he said. "We will also support our New York stallions with Adena Springs' mares."

McMahon's owners said they were thrilled to welcome the Adena Springs stallions.

"In my 45 years in the New York industry, there has never been a group of Grade 1 horses assembled like these," said Joe McMahon, who owns the farm with his wife, Anne. "This is a grand opportunity for breeders to qualify their foals for what will arguably be the best purses and awards available anywhere in the United States."

As soon as the move was announced, McMahon received both congratulations and preliminary commitments.

"No need to ship to Kentucky this year," said one farm owner. "We will have a breeding or two for you this season."

Stronach, founder and chairman of auto-parts giant Magna International Inc., has accumulated Eclipse Awards as both owner and breeder. He was the outstanding owner for three consecutive years, 1998-2000, and in 2008. He has been voted North America's outstanding breeder in his own name or that of Adena six times, in 2000 and from 2004-'08. He also is the chairman of MI Developments Inc., a real estate company that owns racetrack properties Gulfstream Park and Santa Anita Park, among others.

## Sire development

The stallions moving to New York represent a part of Stronach's effort to develop top sires from his racing operation and from acquisitions. Of the four stallions who stood at stud this year, Touch Gold and Tiago were based at the Adena Springs Kentucky property near Paris, while Alphabet Soup and Silent Name stood at Gardiner Farms in Ontario.

With Stonerside Stable, Stronach owned Touch Gold, who denied Silver Charm's bid for the Triple Crown with a powerful surge to win the 1997 Belmont Stakes (G1). Touch Gold also won that year's Buick Haskell Invitational Handicap (G1) at Monmouth Park and the Lexington Stakes (G2) at Keeneland Race Course.

Touch Gold represents prized bloodlines with a Canadian flavor. He is by Deputy Minister, the 1981 champion juvenile male for Canadian interests who is one of Northern Dancer's leading grandsons at stud. Through a distinguished career in Maryland and Kentucky, Deputy Minister sired 90 stakes winners, including Stronach's Awesome Again, winner of the 1998 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and a leading sire at Adena Springs Kentucky.

The new New York sire is out of Passing Mood, by Buckpasser, a Canadian Broodmare of the Year and also the dam of 1989 Canadian Triple Crown winner With Approval, who sired more than 50 stakes winners through a long career in the U.S. and England.

Touch Gold's top foals include Seek

Gold, winner of the 2006 Stephen Foster Handicap (G1), and Composure, who took the Santa Anita Oaks (G1) in 2003. His sons Midas Eyes and Mass Media won Saratoga Race Course's Forego Handicap (G1) in 2004 and 2005, respectively.

His son Medallist, winner of the 2004 Dwyer (G2) and Withers (G3) Stakes, is the sire of 2009 New York-bred champion two-year-old male Ibboeye and of New York-bred Glory Game, winner of this year's Colin Stakes at Woodbine.

The other veteran Adena stallion heading for McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds is Alphabet Soup, winner of the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic. The Cozzene horse, now 19, has sired 39 stakes winners, including Our New Recruit, winner of the 2004 Gulf News Dubai Golden Shaheen (UAE-G1). He stood most recently at Gardiner.

### Giacomo's half brother

Tiago is a half brother by Pleasant Tap to 2005 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Giacomo, who stands at Adena Springs Kentucky. At three in 2007, Tiago won the Santa Anita Derby (G1) and came back from a third-place finish in the Belmont to take the Swaps Breeders' Cup Stakes (G2) and the Goodwood Stakes (G1). At four, he won the Oaklawn Handicap (G2) and finished third in the 2008 Breeders' Cup Classic. He stood his first season at Adena's Kentucky farm this year.

Silent Name, who was based at Gardiner this year, raced successfully on two continents. The son of Sunday Silence won two listed stakes in France at three in 2005 and won two U.S. Grade 2 races—Santa Anita's 2006 Arcadia Handicap and the Commonwealth Breeders' Cup Stakes at Keeneland the following year. He also finished third in the 2006 Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile Stakes (G1) and the 2007 Frank W. Kilroe

Mile Handicap (G1). Silent Name's first foals will reach the race-track next year.

Harlem Rocker, a son of Stronach's 2000 champion two-year-old male Macho Uno, was bred by Adena Springs in Ontario and raced for Stronach Stables. He won the 2008 Withers Stakes before shipping to Fort Erie Racetrack to win the Prince of Wales Stakes, the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown. He also finished first in the 2008 Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1) but was placed second.—Don Clippinger

# A Serious pedigree

New York-bred stakes winner Get Serious shares family ties with Nijinsky II

by Don Clippinger

Get Serious has established himself as the undisputed ruler of Monmouth Park's turf course this year. His trainer and part-owner, John Forbes, would no doubt love to be able to run the horse at Monmouth year-round.

The six-year-old New York-bred gelding started five times in the abbreviated Monmouth season and won four races, three in Grade 3 races. His only loss occurred in the Betfair/TVG United Nations Stakes (G1), in which his front-running speed failed to carry him 1 $\frac{3}{8}$  miles.

While his success appears to be localized, Get Serious has a very serious international pedigree, and his lineage traces to the stud of Canadian brewing magnate E. P. Taylor, who reinvigorated his homeland's racing industry and gave the sport his finest product, Northern Dancer.

Get Serious' fifth dam was Flaring Top, a daughter of 1937 champion juvenile male Menow out of Flaming Top, by Omaha. Although a winner on the racetrack, Flaring Top always will be best known as the dam of Flaming Page, who was a champion, the dam of two champions, and the grandam of a champion from her three foals.

Sired by Bull Page, Taylor-bred Flaming Page won the race that all Canadian owners and breeders aspire to win, the Queen's Plate. She also captured the 1962 Canadian Oaks. Second in the

Kentucky Oaks, she was voted Canada's champion three-year-old filly.

Her first champion was the Taylor-bred Nijinsky II, the son of Northern Dancer who in 1970 became the last English Triple Crown winner for owner Charles Engelhard. The platinum miner bought him for a record \$84,000 as a yearling, and Nijinsky II's

success as a racehorse and sire helped to ignite a worldwide passion for Northern Dancer and his offspring.

Flaming Page's final foal was Minsky, also by Northern Dancer and Ireland's champion two-year-old male in 1970. Her first foal in 1964 was stakes-placed Fleur, dam of England's 1977 Horse of the Year, The Minstrel, and stakes winners Far North, Pilgrim, and Flower Princess.

## Little luster to Gleam

A half sister to two-time champion Doubledogdare, Flaring Top also produced Gleam, by the unraced and undistinguished sire (four minor stakes winners from 95 foals in ten crops) \*Tournoi, by Tourbillon. Even by 1950s measures, Gleam was a modest racehorse, with two wins and earnings of \$2,700, but she was successful at stud, although certainly not on the same level as her half sister Flaming Page.

Her 1965 filly, Evening Bag, by Bagdad, won the Orchid Handicap at age seven, but, undoubtedly, Gleam's most productive offspring was unraced filly Coz O'Nijinsky. Her Raja Baba colt Royal Ski won the 1976 Laurel Futurity (G1) and Remsen Stakes (G2) before becoming a sire in Japan. Coz O'Nijinsky's unraced daughter My Niche produced Keystone Race Track stakes winners Utmost Celerity and Thunder Runner.

Gleam's 1970 filly by \*Pappa Fourway, Tomorrowland, made no impression in her one racetrack start and produced five modest winners, one of whom was Why Me Lord, by Bold Reasoning.

At stud, Why Me Lord produced Allez Milord for owner-breeder Gallagher's Farm. The Tom Rolfe colt was successful on two continents—Germany's champion three-year-old in 1986 and winner of the '87 Oak Tree Invitational Handicap (G1) for trainer John Gosden. Allez Milord also finished second in the 1986 Japan Cup and retired to a stud career in Japan with career purses of \$673,273, all of it earned on the grass.

His half sister Java Gal, by Java Gold, did not play at the same level. Bred by Gallagher's, she was unraced at two in 1995 and won a maiden race late in her three-year-old season in the colors of Jerome Brody, the late Gallagher's co-owner. She raced three more times with no success and retired with purse earnings of \$11,410. She was bred in 1997 to Buddy, and the resulting winner, Spirit of Mike, earned \$137,033.

Bred to Langfuhr in 1998, Java Gal was offered for sale at that year's Keeneland November breeding stock sale and fetched \$75,000. Her Langfuhr colt, Gourmet Japan, won \$234,649 in Japan.

Pinhooked into the 1999 Keeneland November sale while not in foal, Java Gal sold for \$25,000 to Morgan's Ford Farm. Her 2002 foal by Cape Town, Java Warrior, placed in a Delaware Park stakes race, and Get Serious, bred by Morgan's Ford, came along in '04.

### **Plenty of Zip**

His sire, City Zip, was by Mr. Prospector's son Carson City and was out of the Relaunch mare Baby Zip. Bred by Frank Stronach's Adena Springs, he was sold as a short yearling for \$9,000 at the 1999 Keeneland January horses of all ages sale to Carl Bowling's Straightaway Farm. Offered by Straightaway at the 2000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. sale of selected two-year-olds in training, City Zip was bought back on a final bid of \$80,000.

Placed in the hands of Linda Rice, City Zip quickly blossomed into one of the year's top juveniles. Racing for Bowling and Charles R. Thompson, City Zip zipped through two graded New

York stakes races, and Lakland LLC bought half-interest in him before he won the Saratoga Special Stakes (G2).

In his next start, he finished in a dead heat for the win with Yonaguska in the Hopeful Stakes (G1). He finished first in Belmont Park's Futurity Stakes (G1) but was disqualified to second for bothering Burning Roma in the stretch.

He tailed off for the remainder of his two-year-old season but came back at three to win four stakes, two of them graded, including the 2001 Amsterdam Stakes (G2) over future champion sprinter Speightstown.

Retired to Contemporary Stallions in New York, City Zip made a strong start at stud with two juvenile stakes winners in his first crop. His second crop contained four stakes winners, and one of them was undefeated New York-bred Bustin Stones, winner of the 2008 Carter Handicap (G1) at Aqueduct and now at stud in New York at Waldorf Farm. City Zip's 2004 crop also included Get Serious.

City Zip was relocated to Lane's End in Kentucky for the 2005 season, before his first two-year-olds went to the track. The stallion represented precocity and durability (he made 23 starts in two seasons), and he was part of Baby Zip's family. Her colt by Adena Spring's Awesome Again, Ghostzapper, won the 2004 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) for Stronach and was voted Horse of the Year.

In the aftermath of his male family's rise to prominence, Get Serious was offered at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern fall yearling sale and was purchased by Forbes for \$130,000, which tied for the 12th-highest price at the Maryland sale. Get Serious races for owners James M. Dinan, Jacques J. Moore, and Forbes' Phantom House Farm.

The City Zip gelding eased over \$1-million in career earnings in his most recent Monmouth Park start, the Red Bank Stakes (G3), which he won by a neck for the second consecutive year. He also has two victories in the Oceanport Stakes (G3) at Monmouth, each by a neck.

The native New Yorker has proved that summers are a pleasant—and profitable—time to spend at the Jersey Shore.

## An affinity for Kentucky

Silver Timber pays a return visit to Keeneland and collects a second Woodford

Silver Timber loves New York, but the seven-year-old Prime Timber gelding really loves Kentucky. He scored his third victory at Keeneland Race Course on October 9 as he closed powerfully through the stretch to overhaul pacesetter Central City and capture the 5½-furlong Woodford Stakes (G3) for a second consecutive year.

A New York-bred owned by Michael Dubb and High Grade Racing Stable, Silver Timber broke a two-race losing streak and punched his ticket for a start in the \$1-million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G2) on November 6 at Churchill Downs, where the gelding had won the five-furlong Churchill Downs Turf Sprint Stakes (G3) in course-record time on April 30. He finished fifth as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

Under the Woodford's allowance conditions, Silver Timber carried the 124-pound high weight based on his two previous graded stakes wins in 2010. Before the April 30 Churchill race, he had won Keeneland's Shakertown Stakes (G3). He had won the 2009 Woodford in his first venture into Kentucky.

Silver Timber went off as the 4.30-to-1 third betting choice in part because of the two defeats, a second in Monmouth Park's John McSorley Stakes on July 11 and a troubled fifth in Saratoga Race Course's Troy Stakes on August 18. Another factor was the presence of last year's Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner, California Flag, the 1.70-to-1 favorite who pressed Central City's early pace and faded to finish last of 11 starters.

Jockey Julien Leparoux and Silver Timber broke sharply, but Leparoux took a hold of him and had him in seventh in the early going. Silver Timber surged into the stretch on the outside and drew within 1½ lengths of Central City at the furlong pole be-

fore easing away to a half-length victory in 1:02.30 on firm turf. "He has a nice kick at the end, so that was good," Leparoux said. "I didn't really ask him."

### Autumn in New York

On a bright, lustrous fall afternoon at Belmont Park, the New York Showcase highlighted some of the year's most talented state-born runners on October 23. The day's richest race was the \$200,000 Empire Classic Stakes, in which Chester and Mary Broman's homebred Friend Or Foe proved that Belmont is his friendly confines.

The three-year-old colt by the Bromans' Friends Lake has been beaten only twice in his six career starts, both at Saratoga Race Course in graded stakes—fourth in the Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) and sixth in the Travers Stakes (G1).

Back at Belmont, where he previously won an allowance race and the Mike Lee Stakes, Friend Or Foe went to the lead immediately under Alex Solis and never looked back in registering an impressive five-length victory.

Earle Mack's Icabad Crane, who had left the starting gate in a tangle, closed ground in the final furlong to collect second money. Wishful Tomcat, who had been second at the furlong pole, held on to finish third.

Sent off as the Empire Classic's 1.30-to-1 favorite in a Broman-owned entry with Mine Over Matter (sixth), Friend Or Foe ran the Empire Classic's 1½ miles in a swift 1:46.94 on a fast track.

Solis said he intentionally put Friend or Foe on the pace for the first time.

"I've been working him in the morning, and all along I've felt like he's one of those horses who can give you an easy :22, :45, and keeps going as long as you keep him in a rhythm. I just wanted to put him in the race right away, break as sharp as we could, put him in the bit, and let him do his own thing," Solis said.

"He's so deceiving. He feels like he's going so slow, but he has that high cruising speed. At the five-eighths pole, he switched leads and that horse [Ruffino] came next to him, he got back in the bit. From then on I just sat, and got on him at the three-sixteenths and let him go."

Trainer John Kimmel said he would consider the \$250,000 Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (G1) at Aqueduct on November 27 for the colt's next start.

### **Bandbox strikes again**

Hillwood Stable's Bandbox remained unbeaten when he overcame a poor start in the \$100,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes for two-year-olds and swept to a 1¼-length victory over Luxury Appeal. Making his first start in New York-bred company, Bandbox went off as the 0.65-to-1 favorite and ran the Sleepy Hollow's seven furlongs in 1:24.38.

Although he usually stalks the pace, the Tapit colt stumbled at the start and was 4½ lengths off the lead through a half-mile in :46.84. He made a winning move into the stretch, collared Luxury Appeal inside the furlong pole, and came home under a hand ride.

Bred by Aron Yagoda and New Dawn Thoroughbreds, Bandbox made his winning debut at trainer Rodney Jenkins' Laurel Park base and then won the Charles Town Juvenile Stakes by 9½ lengths on September 18 at the West Virginia track.

In the day's other two-year-old stakes, J Z B Racing Stable's Sentimental Lass made all the pace and tussled with Saltamontes through the stretch before edging away to a one-length victory in the \$100,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes. Rajiv Maragh rode Sentimental Lass, a Freud filly bred by Windhorse Thoroughbreds. She went off as the 1.65-to-1 favorite; Saltomontes was 1.75-to-1.

Trained by David Duggan, the winner completed the seven furlongs in 1:24.64 and ran her record to two wins in three starts. Second in her career debut at Saratoga, she won a Belmont maiden special weight race by 10½ lengths on September 26.

### **Pocketing the Mohawk**

Scott Schwartz does everything for four-year-old Pocket Cowboys.

He bred the four-year-old Wild Event gelding out of the Thunder Puddles mare Lotsa Sprinkles, owns him, and trains him. Edgar Prado did the rest in the \$125,000 Mohawk Stakes on Belmont's inner turf course. Never far back in the 1½-mile Mohawk, Pocket Cowboys wore down 6-to-5 favorite Straight Story to win by 1¼ lengths.

Richard Santulli's Straight Story, who defeated Pocket Cowboys in Saratoga's West Point Stakes on August 19, went straight to the lead under Javier Castellano but was pressed on the front by Midnight Billy to midstretch. "We knew the favorite, Straight Story, would go for the lead," Schwartz said. "Somebody pressed him a little, and we got the trip. It worked out nicely."

Sent off at 5-to-1 after second-place finishes in the West Point and Ashley T. Cole Stakes at Belmont on September 12, Pocket Cowboys ran the Mohawk's 1½ miles in 1:48.44 on firm turf.

"We've got the best of both worlds: the father's stamina and

the mother's speed," Schwartz said. "It worked out perfectly."

In the corresponding race for fillies and mares, Craig Bernick's You Go West Girl picked up her second victory in the \$125,000 Ticonderoga Stakes with a late charge that carried her to a two-length win over Chorus Music, who had set a contested pace with third-place finisher Exclusive Scheme.

You Go West Girl, a six-year-old Mr. Greeley mare bred by Gallagher's Stud, was a lukewarm 3.20-to-1 favorite despite going winless since last year's Ticonderoga. "She got a good trip today," said jockey Jose Lezcano. "There was a lot of speed in the race, so I sat in the back and made my move. She came running."

### **Winning on the front**

In the afternoon's two sprint races for New York-breds age three and older, horses racing on or close to the pace scored victories in the Iroquois and Hudson Stakes.

In the Iroquois for fillies and mares, Ramon Dominguez broke Meese Rocks sharply from the tenth starting stall, and the five-year-old Rock and Roll mare rocked on the front end, winning by 2¼ lengths over R Betty Graybull. My Dinah finished third. Owned by Henry, Joseph, and Jamie Terranova, Meese Rocks set solid fractions and completed the Mohawk's seven furlongs in 1:23.64.

"We were able to get in front, and she's pretty gutsy. She tries very hard," Dominguez said. "The fractions weren't really all that slow for people to say she got away on the lead. She ran very hard, and she's got a lot of heart."

The Hudson was run at six furlongs, and General Maximus pressed the early pace of Be Bullish before taking over after a half-mile in :45.40. The three-year-old Freud colt opened a length at the furlong pole and won by 1½ lengths over Be Bullish. Raynick's Jet finished third.

Owned by Goldmark Farm, Michael Imperio, and Elizabeth Loftus, General Maximus went off at 5.10-to-1 and ran the Hudson's six furlongs in 1:08.84. It was General Maximus' second stakes win of the year following a victory in the New York Stallion Times Square Stakes at Belmont on May 2. He subsequently finished second to Friend Or Foe in the Mike Lee.



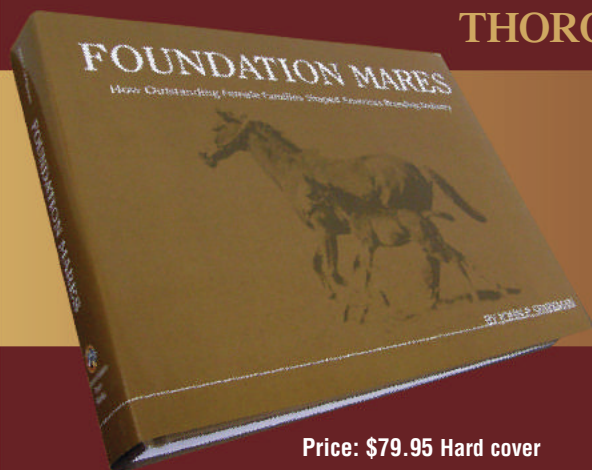

## Breeding Rules

To qualify for registration as a New York-bred, the mare must foal in New York state and meet the following domicile requirements:

**Resident Mares:** Must be continuously in residence in New York state from within 90 days after last cover in the year of conception and thereafter remain in residence until foaling the following year, with no breed-back required.

**Non-Resident Mares:** Must foal in New York state and be bred back to a registered New York-based stallion and remain for a continuous period of 90 days after foaling.



# New York State Breeding and Development Fund NY-Breds Award Program

**Breeder, owner, and stallion owner awards are based on purse money earned (1st through 3rd) while competing in pari-mutuel races run in New York state.**

## **BREEDER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$6,300,452 to breeders of registered New York-breds. A breeder is the owner of the mare at the time the mare foals in the state of New York. Breeder awards are determined by covering stallion. If the New York-bred is by a registered New York-based stallion, the award is up to 20% of the purse earned for a first-place finish and up to 10% for a second- or third-place finish.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% for a first-place finish and up to 5% for a second- or third-place finish. All breeder awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

## **STALLION OWNER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund distributed \$2,370,035 in stallion owner awards. Stallion owner awards are paid to owners of registered New York-based covering stallions (at time of conception) at up to 7% of earned purses from 1st through 3rd positions. All stallion owner awards are capped at \$10,000 per horse per race.

## **OPEN OWNER AWARDS**

In 2009, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund paid \$1,107,667 to owners of registered New York-breds who earned purse money in open-company races. Owner awards for registered New York-breds sired by a registered New York-based stallion is up to 20% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward, with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

If the New York-bred is by an out-of-state stallion or non-registered stallion, the award is up to 10% of purses earned from 1st through 3rd positions in races run for a claiming price of \$30,000 and upward with a cap of \$20,000 per horse per race.

## **NEW YORK-BRED RACES**

More than 52 stakes races exclusively for registered New York-breds are run at New York Racing Association racetracks (Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga Race Course) and Finger Lakes racetrack with total purses worth nearly \$5-million. In 2009, more than 900 overnight races exclusively for registered New York-breds were held at the four New York racetracks.

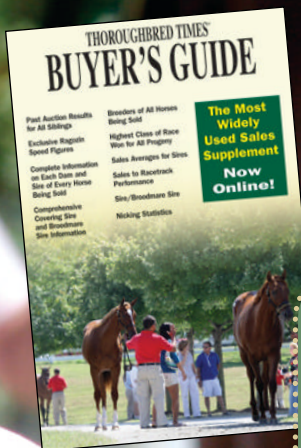
