New Year 2014: Turning the Page

irst things first: On behalf of all of us at New York Thoroughbred Breeders, I would like to wish you and your families a happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year!

As we embark on 2014, I think we can all reflect with satisfaction on a highly successful year for the New York breeding program. New York-breds participated in a robust slate of restricted races from day-to-day, competed successfully at the highest levels in open company, and earned unprecedented awards for breeders, owners, and stallion owners. In all, New York-breds won 31 graded stakes last year, led by grade I winners Discreet Marq and Artemis Agrotera. June also saw the inaugural edition of a second Showcase day at the New York Racing Association that drew special attention to our program the week before the Belmont Stakes (gr. I). Meanwhile, all year long your horses enjoyed great success at auction in a bullish market.

As you know, our program reached a long overdue milestone in 2013 when grade II Breeders' Cup Marathon winner London Bridge became the first New York-bred to win a race at the Breeders' Cup World Championships. This achievement generated a lot of positive press nationally and even captured the attention of Gov. Cuomo, who sent a letter of congratulations to breeders Chris and Patricia Purdy.

The turning of the New Year brings a number of annual rituals to NYTB: production of the new *Stallion Register*, board elections, voting on the year's divisional champions, the NYTB/NYTB PAC Stallion Season auction (Jan. 10-13), and our most important New Year's ritual of all: the NYTB annual member renewal drive. The stallion season auction certainly helps us with our mission, but the real reason NYTB can pursue the ongoing work of protecting the interests of the breeding and racing industry in Albany is the continued support of our members. NYTB is a small, not-for-profit organization with big responsibilities, and we depend on your help. As I outlined in this space last month, important work lies ahead as we strive to protect the advantages New York breeders now enjoy. Last year marked the most productive session in Albany that NYTB has ever had. With your help we can keep the momentum going in 2014, when we may need it most.

To show our appreciation for our members' support, I am constantly on the lookout for new benefits. Last year we were able to add new advertising opportunities with the *TDN*. NYTB WEBSITE UNVEILS ENHANCED INTERACTIVE LEADERBOARDS

New York Thoroughbred Breeder has rolled out redesigned leaderboards for its website, nytbreeders.org.



The leaderboards ranking the top 50 New York-bred horses,

owners, breeders, trainers and jock-

eys-always popular with users-are fully interactive.

The leaderboards occupy their own page. The basic information on each leaderboard (starts, number of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd finishes, and total earnings) is enhanced with new reports: earnings per start, win percentage, number of top three finishes, and percent of top three finishes.

Every column of information on each leaderboard is sortable.

The name of each horse, owner, breeder, trainer, and jockey now links directly to the individual's profile page on equibase.com.

The new "Additional Horse Reports" feature enables users to generate a variety of custom leaderboards, such as "2-YO Male" or "Turf Female" from an easy-to-use drop-down menu.

NYTB executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo said, "I think breeders and owners will really appreciate all the new reports and functionality we've imported into the leaderboards. They will be a great resource for everybody and add a lot of value to our site."

The leaderboards will be updated weekly on Mondays after the conclusion of the weekend's races.

FORTY TALES TO STAND AT SEQUEL FOR 2014

Becky Thomas and Joe McMahon announced that multiple graded stakes winner Forty Tales will stand at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson. His 2014 fee will be \$6,500 stands and nurses.

Forty Tales will be the first joint venture participation between Dennis Narlinger and Thomas of Sequel New York, and Joe Mc-Mahon of McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

The bay colt by Tale of the Cat—Forty Love, by Forty Niner, retires with five wins from 11 starts and earnings of \$666,789.

Forty Tales, bred in Kentucky by the Randal Family Trust and raced by Perretti Racing Stable, broke his maiden in his only start at 2 by $2\frac{3}{4}$ lengths at Aqueduct Nov. 24, 2012.

Last year at 3 he quickly advanced to the stakes ranks, placing in the seven-furlong Hutcheson Stakes (gr. II) at Gulfstream in his third career start. After a fifth-place effort in the Swale Stakes (gr. III), Forty Tales went on a three-stakes tear, topping grade I winner Capo Bastone in the one-turn mile Derby Trial Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill Downs, then winning a pair of important stakes in New York: the seven-furlong Woody Stephens Stakes (gr. II) on the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) day undercard and the Amsterdam Stakes (gr. II) at 6½ furlongs at Saratoga. Later in the year he would place in the seven-furlong Bold Ruler Handicap (gr. III) at Belmont Park.

"We are so excited to be able to offer our clients this exciting prospect and hometown hero and to add to our stellar roster," said Thomas in a release. "We are particularly excited to partner with McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds as well as Chester and Mary Broman to stand the first stallion venture, offering a limited number of shares to our breeders in New York as well as to out-ofstate clients.

"The expansion of the New York breeding program has allowed

many more opportunities as New York-breds have increased substantially in value on the racing front as well as in the sales ring."

Twenty-year-old Tale of the Cat, by Storm Cat, is the sire of 98 stakes winners and has several young sons moving the breed forward. Three-time champion Gio Ponti and multiple grade I winners Lion Heart and Tale of Ekati are some of his progeny off to promising starts at stud.

Forty Tales' female line is heavy with black type. His second dam, Footy (bred by the Claiborne Farm-associated Cherry Valley Farm and The Gamely Corp.), won Churchill Downs' La Troienne Stakes and produced grade I-placed stakes winner Footing, herself the granddam of Banned, a three-time graded stakes winner.



Speightstown's quick son Bridgetown sets up shop at Questroyal North

hese are heady days for breeders in New York: Growing purses at New York Racing Association tracks, growing breeders awards from the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund, and a growing base of New Yorkbred horses. Four new stallions have been added to the ranks for the 2014 breeding season, including the exciting Bridgetown.

Few horses make their way to the breeding shed having shown

both brilliance and durability, but Bridgetown certainly fits the bill. A son of 2004 champion sprinter Speightstown (by the undervalued Gone West), who also just so happens to be among the leading sires of 2013, Bridgetown was a stakes winner in four of five seasons while in training including a win in the Summer Stakes (Can-IIIT) and a runner-up effort in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IIT) at 2.

Bridgetown, out of the Tabasco Cat mare Ellesmere, was bred and raced by Eugene Melnyk, who, along with his wife, Laura, also raced mighty Speightstown. Ellesmere is out of the unraced Empress Aly, a full sister to 1991 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Strike the Gold.

Melnyk, who has raced several top runners and stood horses such as Flower Alley and Graeme Hall, has reduced his equine holdings in his Thoroughbred portfolio of late but remains bullish on Bridgetown as he has retained six breeding rights in the promising stallion. "I believe in Bridgetown, and I'm going to support him," Melnyk said. "Anytime you have a horse that is the fastest son of a leading sire, with a bottom line that includes a sister to a Kentucky Derby winner, you've got something exciting."

Clark Brewster, a trial lawyer based in Tulsa, Okla., heads the group that will stand Bridgetown at Barry Ostrager's 285-acre Questroyal North Farm near Stillwater.

Brewster has homes in Tulsa and in upstate New York, where he and his wife, Deborah, spend most of the summer. While they own a 4,200-acre cattle ranch in Oklahoma and got interested in racing at Oaklawn Park and later when Remington Park opened in 1989, the Brewsters have been active in trying to run horses at Saratoga and Belmont Park. Clark Brewster's runners landed five races at the Saratoga Race Course meet in 2013, which tied him for sixth in the meet standings.

"The last few years we've also sent mares to New York to be part of the program," he said. "This stallion might allow us to make a larger incursion into that."

Brewster stands stallions in Oklahoma, including one of the

state's leading sires, Omega Code, but saw promise and value in presenting Bridgetown in New York.

"He's such a great sire prospect, I thought New York would be better," Brewster said. "He would be exposed to a better pool of mares and have a better chance to be what he can be."

Melnyk, Brewster, and Ostrager president of New York Thorough-

bred Breeders—have the Thoroughbred business in their blood and share a common bond in the belief Bridgetown will help move the New York breeding program forward.

Raising Bridgetown

Few people know Bridgetown better than Phil Hronec, farm manager at Melnyk's Winding Oaks Farm near Ocala, Fla. Hronec helped breed, raise, and break the colt at the farm, and he noted from the beginning that Bridgetown was an exceptionally fast horse.

"I've never trained a horse with such a high cruising speed," Hronec said. "You could work him and he'd be going in :12, :12, and :12, and then you'd ask him the last part...there were a couple of times I saw him go in :10 and change for the last eighth of a mile. He'd go in :36 and finish up in :46 and 4; just amazing."

On the track Bridgetown was precocious to say the least. He moved from maiden winner at Saratoga in August 2009 to graded stakes winner in Canada to Breeders' Cupplaced by early November while being trained by Kenny McPeek. In ensuing years, while under the

"He had his aches and pains," Melnyk said. "He was running the best he could, but he was finishing second and third to horses he should have been beating. A bloodstock agent approached us about buying him, and he put a couple of proposals together. We took the one from Clark."

"Bridgetown looks a lot like Speightstown," Hronec said. "Bridgetown is about 15.3 (hands) and very well put together; he's correct. He reminds me a lot of City Zip. They are close physicals.

"I've seen a lot of Speightstowns; we've bred a lot of them. I've seen them come in all shapes and sizes but he does one thing: He throws runners."

Speightstown has sired 56 stakes winners to date and has 24 addedmoney winners in 2013. He has sired the winners of more than \$11.9 million this year with 154 winners. He stands at WinStar Farm in Kentucky where he'll command an \$80,000 stud fee in 2014. Bridgetown will stand at Questroyal for an introductory fee of \$4,500.

"Bridgetown is a blazingly fast horse with a very good female line, and he's the only son of Speightstown in New York for the 2014 season," said Ostrager.

"We've gotten a phenomenal response to the horse. Immediately after it was announced in *The Blood-Horse*, people started calling and soon as TrueNicks became available, people started signing contracts to breed to him. He's an A++ nick to a lot of Storm Cat-line stallions."

Breeders in New York will do well with Bridgetown if they bring "the right kind of mare," according to Hronec. "I know what works for Speightstown if you want a distance horse—a Deputy Minister mare, a Theatrical mare—stuff like that. Breed him to something that has a little bit of size."


A Bridge to the Future

Bridgetown's arrival in New York, and at Questroyal North in particular, is another chapter in the revival of the breeding industry in the Empire State. Ostrager purchased the former Sez Who Farm a year and a half ago and poured a lot of time and money into refurbishing the facility. Ostrager reports the farm's 120 stalls are completely filled.

"It's all because of Gov. (Andrew) Cuomo's commitment to allowing the New York state breeding industry to prosper with VLT (video lottery terminal) revenue and greatly increase breeder and stallion awards," he said. "The farm, which at one point was the leading farm in New York five of the seven years it was operated by Mr. (Richard) Simon, is fully restored and

is a very active place, and getting Bridgetown will be a great complement to Courageous Cat and Boys At Tosconova."

Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, concurs.

"Gov. Cuomo's efforts to create an environment in which the New York Thoroughbred breeding industry will thrive and drive job creation and the economy in upstate New York is clearly evident at Questroyal North, where a previously abandoned 285-acre farm is now flourishing with fully occupied stalls and an exciting new stallion prospect like Bridgetown in the stallion barn."

Adding exciting stallion prospects by prominent owners to the sire ranks in New York will only strengthen and help expand the program.

"Getting Mr. Melnyk to participate is further vindication of the attractiveness of the New York program," Ostrager said. "It is really exciting to walk on the farm and see virtually every one of the paddocks filled with horses and see the stallion barn active during the breeding season and the scores of foals. It's really quite exhilerating." The

The Sequel

A new stallion barn, home to seven for the 2014 breeding season, rises at Sequel Stallions

n Dec. 11 at Aqueduct, a 5-year-old New York-bred named Socialsaul won the first race, an allowance/optional claimer, getting his fifth career victory. The steady performer has finished in the top three in 13 of his 25 starts; the win boosted his earnings to more than \$384,000.

A thousand miles away in Ocala, Fla., Becky Thomas was smiling. She and Dennis Narlinger, along with A R Properties, bred Socialsaul, a gelded son of Read the Footnotes, the stallion she owned until a little more than a year ago; her quick calculation put their earnings from Socialsaul's victory at around \$16,000.

"We had a field day today," she said.

Thomas' excitement may be a mirror of the general mood around New York racing and breeding these days, but it wasn't all that long ago that frustration and futility, not enthusiasm, pervaded the state's breeding industry. More than a decade of uncertainty had forced breeders, Thomas among them, to adapt their business models, but four years after closing her farm near Hudson, N.Y., she's back, along with an industry-wide optimism.

Tangible evidence of that optimism is rising on the grounds at Sequel Stallions in the form of a new stallion barn nearing completion. Thomas knows that to attract quality mares and breeders to New York generally and to her farm specifically, she and partner Narlinger need a facility that can compete with the finest in the country, and they have invested in infrastructure accordingly.

"Before we opened in 2011, we spent more than \$1 million on the farm," she said. "We had to decide how this farm would serve as the best business model to get done what I wanted to get done, which is provide a stallion base to the breeders of New York that represented a commercial stallion. I needed to be able to have the comfort of Kentucky or Florida or Pennsylvania or Maryland breeders, so that when they saw the farm, they would feel comfortable with the facility."

In addition to the new barn, the farm is developing 70 acres that had been out of production for a decade. Other projects include fencing, paving, and building employee housing.

"We still have quite a bit left to do," said Thomas, "but we're taking steps forward."

Thomas was hesitant at first to undertake major projects without knowing that the state program was on firm ground; two years of video lottery terminal revenue from the Aqueduct casino and the support of Kentucky breeders such as Darley, Twin Creeks, Brereton Jones, and Ben Walden Jr., who have, she said, all sent mares to Sequel, have provided that confidence.

"We need to have a facility that is representative of what they're expecting, and I want to try to demonstrate that quality," she said.

She also pointed to the recent New York expansion of Kentucky's Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital. Though the hospital is near Saratoga Springs, the practice's Dr. Scott Ahlschwede is based in Hudson to provide ambulatory care.

"In Lexington and Ocala," Thomas said, "we have literally thousands of resources available to us at any given time—vets, farm managers, grooms with years of experience. In New York there's no real breeding hub, and you don't have the same kind of veterinary care.

"Kentucky breeders bringing out-of-state mares are very comfortable with the name Rood & Riddle. It's been a huge plus for us for people shipping in to have that comfort level."


Thomas said that breeding inquiries this year are up over the same point last year and expressed confidence in the increasing quality of the New York-bred. She pointed out that New York got its first Breeders' Cup winner in 2013 when London Bridge annexed the Marathon (gr. II), and

she also noted the success of Artemis Agrotera, winner of the Frizette Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont in October.

"Times are changing in New York," she said. "We're getting more graded stakes winners, and the competition has gotten tougher and tougher.

"The bottom line is that I'm not just bringing a horse to sell for \$5,000," she said. "I try to breed to be at the top of the commercial market. I want to take away that asterisk—'That's a really nice horse...for a New Yorkbred.'"

To be at the top of the market,

Thomas knew that she'd have to attract high-quality mares to Sequel, and to do that, she'd need high-quality stallions. Within days of announcing the farm would re-open in November 2011, Thomas and Narlinger announced that a grade I winner would stand at Sequel for the 2012 breeding season.

"I felt it was very important to bring a commercial stallion to New York to be able to use to breed back horses for people outside the state of New York. Darley gave us the opportunity that I'd always dreamed of," Thomas explained.

That opportunity came in the form of Girolamo, winner of the 2010 Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) and 2009 Jerome Handicap (gr. II).

"He's a horse that could have stood commercially anywhere," she said.

The son of A.P. Indy—Get Lucky, by Mr. Prospector, stood for two years in New York, establishing a relationship between Sequel and Darley that continued this year, when it was announced that Emcee, winner of the 2012 Forego Stakes (gr. I), would stand his first season at Sequel, as Girolamo relocated to Kentucky. Darley's Desert Party joined the Sequel roster for his first season at stud in 2012.

"I'm a big Desert Party fan," said Thomas. "I had seen him as a 2-yearold at Fasig-Tipton Calder and was thinking I had a nice set of horses until that horse breezed by and he was phenomenal."

Thomas bred some of her own mares to Desert Party while he was standing at Darley, foaling them in New York, and she was so impressed with his progeny that she asked Darley if she could bring him to New York.

"After the first year, Girolamo stood for \$15,000, which is a high price for New York," she said. "I felt like I wanted to be able to offer the New York breeders a more midpriced stallion."

Desert Party stood at Sequel for \$7,500, as will Emcee.

"We think Becky's efforts in New York are exemplary," said Charlie Boden, head of sales at Darley. "We're big fans of her and Dennis Narlinger."

Already heavily invested in New York, with a training center near Saratoga and a significant racing presence on New York tracks, Darley is, said Boden, "committed to New York State and the New York State program. We want to send horses that are significant stallions that could make a difference in helping New York breeders."

He went on, "Emcee is a Darley homebred and certainly could have stood in Kentucky; he's a beautiful horse with a good pedigree, one that we hope New York breeders will appreciate."

In addition to the partnership with Darley, Sequel has also joined breeding forces with West Coast-based Bloom Thoroughbreds. A former jockey, Jeff Bloom headed West Point Thoroughbreds' California division before establishing his own partnership in 2010; he and Thomas teamed to buy 13 mares at the recent Keeneland November sale, specifically to bring them to New York.

"I've known Becky for a while," said Bloom. "During a visit to her Florida farm, we were talking about expanding some of Bloom Racing's ventures, and this was perfect timing to take advantage of the great incentives in the New York breeding program."

Among the horses racing in Bloom's partnership is a 2011 Old Fashioned colt co-bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds and Hidden Lake Farm; he was so impressed, he said, by Thomas that he decided to expand his business to include breeding. The 13 mares they purchased will all come to New York to foal and then be bred back to New York stallions.

Sequel will stand seven stallions for 2014: incoming stallion Forty Tales (see page 12), Noble Causeway, Noonmark, Freud, and Mission Impazible in addition to the two Darley horses. Multiple graded stakes winner Mission Impazible joined the Sequel roster for the 2013 season.

Mission Impazible's owner, Twin Creeks Racing Stable, decided to stand him at Sequel for two reasons, said Randy Gullatt, the stable's racing manager.

"The main reason," he said, "was the trust we have in Becky and in her farm manager, Wally Burleson. The second is the breeders and stallion program, which is very attractive.

"Becky's known the horse and fol-

lowed his whole career," Gullatt continued. "We thought this was a great fit, and we're looking forward to having him with someone we trust and we felt good enough to give our horse to."

Twin Creeks bred 24 mares to Mission Impazible in 2013 and expects to breed at least 20 to him this year, selling some of the foals and keeping others to race.

"We think we're going to make a lot of money by his horses performing well because of the New York rewards program," said Gullatt. "He's the perfect fit."

"You couldn't get a heartier warrior," said Thomas of Mission Impazible, a now 7-year-old son of Unbridled's Song, out of La Paz (Hold Your Peace). "And I'm a huge Unbridled's Song fan."

If the closing of Sequel reflected a low point in New York's equine economy, its reopening and expansion reveal renewed optimism, not just for racing and breeding but for the ancillary businesses that support them.

"I'm the poster child of re-opening a shuttered piece of property and revitalizing it," she said. "It's not just the construction; it's blacksmiths, vets, feed, hay...all the local services."

And while she appreciates the lucrative financial rewards of the New York breeding program, they are not, she said, why she does what she does.

"My goal isn't to earn breeders' awards. That's gravy," she declared. "My goal is to breed to a good horse to race and to sell. My goal is to win races." A

Win was the first New York-bred to earn \$1 million

T n 1981 Fio Rito provided the first major boost for the New York Breeding and Development Fund, which was founded in 1973, when he captured the prestigious Whitney Handicap (gr. I) at Saratoga.

Most people looked at it as a fluke. A New York-bred winning the Whitney had to be an aberration, not likely to happen again in the foreseeable future.

Well, that foreseeable future turned out to be a quick two years later, and it was not a one-shot-deal like the Whitney shocker. This time a New York-bred emerged as a bona fide star, winning graded stakes after graded stakes.

The name of that horse appropriately was Win, bred by Robert G. Wehle, whose family owned and operated the Genesee Brewing Co. From 1983 to '85, Win became one of the leading turf stars in the United States, defeating eventual Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) winner Cozzene and battling the great John Henry right down to the wire in the 1984 Turf Classic (gr. IT).

Win's exploits that year earned him the title of New York-bred Horse of the Year, and his trainer and partowner, Sally Bailie, the Outstanding Trainer award from a panel of New York racing secretaries and turf writers. Both would go on to win the same awards the following year.

Win's career transcended the realm of New York-breds, as he captured graded stakes in 1983, '84, and '85, winning 14 of 44 career starts and earning \$1,408,980. In all, he won six graded stakes, including grade I scores in the Man o' War Stakes and the Manhattan Handicap, and two listed stakes, and placed in five other grade I stakes.

Not bad for a horse Bailie had bought as a 2-year-old for \$8,000.

As a gelding, Win was unable to pass on his extraordinary talents, but he did pave the way for future New York-breds to go on to successful stud careers.

The son of Barachois—Par Ci Par La, by Buckpasser, made his first big splash at the end of the 1983 season, as a 3-year-old, when he captured the grade II Rutgers Handicap at the Meadowlands and finished second in the grade II Lawrence Realization at Belmont Park.

He began to be taken seriously in July, 1984, when he romped by 11 lengths in the grade II Tidal Handicap at Belmont. Following a poor effort in the Sword Dancer Handicap (gr. IT) over soft ground, he won back-toback stakes, defeating Cozzene in the Bernard Baruch Handicap (gr. IIT) in a sharp 1:47¹/₅ for the 1¹/₈ miles, and easily winning the Manhattan Handicap in 2:00% for the 1% miles.

He followed that up with a game second to the top-class Majesty's Prince in the Man o' War Stakes, while again finishing ahead of Cozzene.

Sent off at 9-1 against the legend-

ed to Japan, where he finished a respectable fifth of 14, beaten only 3½ lengths, in the rich Japan Cup (Jpn-I). Bailie became the first female trainer to run a horse in Japan's richest race.

Given the following winter and most of the spring off, Win took a

ary John Henry in the Turf Classic, he battled the future Hall of Famer stride for stride for the final quarter mile and was coming back at him in the final strides to be beaten a neck, while coming home his final quarter in a swift :23³/₂.

Despite having made 10 starts in 1984, Win was far from done. He came back three weeks later and finished third to John Henry in the new Ballantine's Scotch Classic Handicap at the Meadowlands, and then headwhile to get back in form, finishing unplaced in a pair of allowance sprints on the dirt, and sixth, beaten 2¼ lengths in the Tidal Handicap, in which his rider, Tony Graell, lost his whip.

That's when Bailie decided to make a rider change and went with the young up-and-comer Richard Migliore, who had broken Steve Cauthen's records as an apprentice but was still looking for that one big mount to help launch his career. He thought he had it that year with Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I) winner Eternal Prince, but the colt got left at the gate in the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and lost all chance.

"I not only rode Win in 1985, I actually rode him when they brought him back to the races four years later in 1989," Migliore recalled. "I won first time on him in an allowance race and then we beat Cozzene again in the Bernard Baruch. I tried to get them to supplement him to the Breeders' Cup Mile, but it probably wasn't the prudent thing to do financially. But Cozzene (who won that year's Breeders' Cup Mile) never would have beaten him going a mile.

"I had won the Meadowlands Cup (gr. I) the year before on Wild Again, but they named Pat

Day to ride him in the Classic. When I won the Wood Memorial on Eternal Prince in '85, I think that helped me land the mount on Win. Paul Cornman and his partners owned majority interest in Win, and Sally Bailie, who became a good friend later on, didn't want me on Win. She wanted to stay with Graell. Win was a very difficult horse, especially when he was younger; he was a rogue as a 2-year-old. When nobody else wanted to ride him, Graell agreed to ride him, so she was just being loval to the guy who stuck with him through his roughest period. She didn't think it was right to take him off when he had proven himself to be a top grass horse. But the partners put their foot down.

"I remember the first day I went to work him. I had to be there at 5:30 in the morning, and I was sitting outside the barn at 5:20 because I didn't want to give her any reason to be upset that I wasn't there exactly on time.

"I won the first two times I rode, and then he was second in the Manhattan on good ground and got beat fair and square by Noble Fighter in the Turf Classic. He came back and

beat Bob Back and Baillamont in the Man o' War and won the Shergar the day after the Breeders' Cup."

Win then finished fifth in the Washington, D.C., International (gr. IT) over a soft course he didn't care for. Still feeling they had a shot at the Turf championship, they sent him to California for the Hollywood Turf Cup (gr. IT), and he finished second, 21/2 lengths behind Zoffany, with Vanlandingham a neck back in third. That probably cost him the Eclipse Award, which went to Cozzene, whom Win had defeated earlier in the Bernard Baruch, giving him four pounds. It was the third time Win had finished ahead of Cozzene.

"Win was a very, very good horse," Migliore said. "I remember the first time I rode him the grass was very long and I was by myself in second out in the clear and his stride was so perfect on the grass you could actually hear him topping the ground with that 'whoosh' sound as he went over it. He just brushed the top of the grass. One of the great training feats of all time came after he bowed his tendon and he was sent up to Tanrackin Farm where he basically was retired. He ran around up there for four years, and they would turn him out in the snow in the winter.

"They were afraid he was going to hurt somebody, he was so full of himself. He even broke Sally's leg one day in the paddock when he struck her and broke her femur. He was a handful; he was tough as nails. She went up to the farm to look at him and his tendon was perfect. It was tight and totally healed. She brought him back and put him in training and gave him two runs on the dirt, and then he won going 1¼ miles on the turf."

The 9-year-old then finished a close fourth in the Red Smith Handicap (gr. IIT) and concluded his career finishing third in a three-horse photo in an allowance race.

"Sally was a tremendous horse trainer, and I'm glad we later became friends and I was able to ride for her the rest of her life," Migliore said.

As for Win, he became the first New York-bred to earn \$1 million, and although he had been gelded at a young age, he never totally lost his roguish tendencies.

But as Migliore said, "Boy, could he run." 🖪

Samraat takes Damon Runyon for Leonard Riggio

he infield was covered with snow and the temperature barely cracked the freezing mark, but that didn't stop Leonard Riggio from taking a midweek trip out to Aqueduct.

"I don't usually come to the races," he said, "but this was a good day."

Good, indeed, if "good" can adequately describe a day in which your 2-year-old homebred wins his third straight race, this one by 16³/₄ lengths.

Re-scheduled from Dec. 15 because it didn't fill, the \$100,000 Damon Runyon Stakes for New York-breds was run on Dec. 18, and Riggio's Samraat crushed a field of six to keep his unbeaten streak intact.

Stretching out to a mile and 70 yards, the son of Noble Causeway from Riggio's My Meadowview Farm again led gate to wire and has yet to be headed in his three races.

"That was a pretty smart race for him," observed Riggio. "It wasn't a world-beater in terms of the times, but he had a lot left in the tank and hopefully he'll advance from here."

Samraat set crawling fractions of :24.55 and :49.73, stopping the clock in 1:44.09.

Riggio campaigned Samraat's sire, having purchased him as a yearling at the Keeneland September sale in 2003 for \$1.15 million. Noble Causeway earned \$360,010 with three wins, six seconds, and a third; he was graded stakesplaced twice, including a second in the 2005 Florida Derby (gr. I). Samraat is out of the Indian Charlie mare Little Indian Girl, purchased by Riggio for \$150,000 at the Keeneland November sale in 2007. He and bloodstock manager Lincoln Collins of Kern Thoroughbreds purchased about 30 mares to breed to Noble Causeway, who began his stud career in 2008.

Little Indian Girl had thrown several successful runners, including Original Fate, who earned almost \$800,000 racing in Japan. She was in foal to Malibu Moon when Riggio purchased her; that foal, Charlies Swell, earned more than \$108,000.

"We were looking at pedigree and conformation [when we bought her]," said Collins, "and a variety of mares that would seem to suit Noble Causeway.

"When you're trying to get a stallion going," he continued, "you obviously have to pick out a variety of both physical and pedigree types that you think might work."

Samraat is Little Indian Girl's fourth foal for My Meadowview and by far the most successful; his win in the Damon Runyon pushed his earnings to \$133,200. Little Indian Girl has a 2-year-old filly by Harlan's Holiday but died foaling last year, losing a foal by Bellamy Road.

On Dec. 15, another Noble Causeway homebred 2-yearold, Noble Cornerstone, was second by a neck in the Remington Springboard Mile Stakes at Remington Park; he had broken his maiden by 51/2 lengths at Aqueduct in November.

In October at Belmont, My Meadowview's Canal Six (Noble Causeway—Prom Dancer, by Touch Gold) finished third in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes; from four starts, her record is 1-2-1.

"Hats off to Mr. Riggio to do this," said Collins. "It takes long-term faith, and Noble Causeway's first crop didn't look so good, but two years later, here we are, and [Samraat] was very impressive."

Riggio, who is chairman of Barnes and Noble and sits on the board of the New York Racing Association, said that he likes to see his horses get to the warm weather in the winter, but that he'll leave the decision to trainer Rick Violette. Violette suggested after the race that a planned next start in the Jan. 4 Jerome Stakes (gr. II) at Aqueduct might have been derailed by recent bad weather; he's also considering the Withers Stakes (gr. III) Feb. 1.

For now, Samraat will stay in New York, stabled in Violette's barn at Aqueduct, just a couple of hours west of where he was foaled, at Riggio's My Meadowview Farm in Southampton, N.Y., on eastern Long Island, one of the tony Hamptons frequented by the well-heeled summer crowd. From such auspicious beginnings, it is perhaps no surprise that he's begun his racing career so impressively.


