

Membership Categories & By-Laws

A. To be eligible for membership in the NYT B, a person shall be currently engaged in the thoroughbred industry as a breeder or stallion owner in the State of New York, lessees and lessors of mares and stallions domiciled in New York, or own property in the State of New York which is utilized for breeding thoroughbreds specifically for the pari-mutuel racing industry and/or others who have demonstrated an interest in furthering the purposes of the NYT B.

The following categories of membership shall have voting privileges and may run for the board of directors: Corporate Member (4 members, 1 vote), Joint Member (2 members, 2 votes) or Individual Member (1 member, 1 vote)

The following category of membership shall have all of the same privileges and benefits of membership however shall not have the right to vote or run for the board of directors: Associate Member (1 member, no voting rights)

B. Members in good standing shall include only those members who have fully paid their NYT B dues. Only members in good standing on November 1 shall be eligible to vote in NYT B elections. Only members in good standing shall be eligible to vote on amendments to these by-laws.

Fox Rules Named Finger Lakes Horse of the Year

Fox Rules was named 2014 Finger Lakes horse of the year at the annual Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association awards dinner Dec. 6. The now 6-year-old New York-bred owned by Langpap Stables won all three of his 2014 starts at Finger Lakes.

Fox Rules achieved all of his 2014 victories under the guidance of jockey Pedro Rodriguez. He earned \$59,040 at Finger Lakes this season. Trained by M. Anthony Ferraro, Fox Rules has 10 career wins with seven of them coming at Finger Lakes.

Ferraro's barn took home five awards, three were for horses owned by Langpap Stables. Fox Rules also took the honor for best older male. Alwaysinstiletto was voted best 3-year-old filly.

Track photographer, Tom Cooley, was inducted into the FLGR Hall of Fame during the event. The native of Canandaigua, N.Y., has taken more than 63,000 photos of winning horses at Finger Lakes. He was recognized for his many years of exceptional work and professional service.

NYRA SETS SPRING MEET FOR THE BIG A

The \$1 million TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I) highlights Aqueduct's "Spring Showcase" meet when racing moves to the main track April 1, it was announced earlier this month by the New York Racing Association.

New York's traditional prep for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), the 1 1/8-mile Wood Memorial is one of five stakes to be run April 4 including the \$400,000 Carter Handicap (gr. I) at seven furlongs, \$300,000 Gazelle Stakes (gr. II) for 3-year-old fillies at 1 1/8 miles, \$300,000 Bay Shore Stakes (gr. III) for 3-year-olds going seven furlongs, and the inaugural \$100,000 Danger's Hour Stakes for 4-year-olds and up

AQUEDUCT®

at one mile on the grass.

Other additions to the Big A spring meet include two 6 1/2-furlong New York Stallion Series races for 3-year-olds on April 26: the \$100,000 Times Square and the \$100,000 Park Avenue for fillies.

Racing will be held Wednesdays through Sundays, with the exception of Easter Sunday, April 5. Stall applications for the Aqueduct spring meet and Belmont Park spring/summer meet are

due Feb. 26.

Overnight purses will increase during the Aqueduct spring meet with maiden special weight purses rising to \$70,000. Purses for first-, second-, and third-level allowance races will rise to \$72,000, \$74,000, and \$78,000, respectively.

"Overnight races comprise the backbone of our racing schedule, and the purses will rise in accordance with the new focus on this special meet," said NYRA's senior vice president of racing operations Martin Panza, who noted that the only "Spring Showcase" races that will not receive a hike in purses are claiming races that already are at their statutory limits.

First-Year Stallions of 2015: Alpha/Willcox Inn

THE MALE LINES OF A.P. Indy and Storm Cat are among the most popular in North America, and the burgeoning regional market in New York is attracting its fair share of both. Among them are Alpha, a grandson of A.P. Indy, and Willcox Inn, a great-grandson of Storm Cat. Both are first-year sires with much more to recommend them than their male-line descent.

“I really feel fortunate to be able to stand Alpha,” said Becky Thomas of Sequel Stallions New York. “With Girolamo having returned to Kentucky, we didn’t have a top A.P. Indy-line stallion in New York. I honestly thought that Alpha might have been beyond reach after he picked up his second grade I win, but I’ve been blessed to have a good relationship with Darley, and Sheikh Mohammed is a very benevolent breeder with a commitment to improving the Thoroughbred around the world and to finding the best fit for his stallions. Alpha is just a beautiful individual, medium-sized and elegant, and I think he’ll do well here.”

Second to Union Rags in the 2011 Champagne Stakes (gr. I), Alpha was one of the best 3-year-olds of 2012. He opened his campaign by winning the Count Fleet Stakes and the Withers Stakes (gr. III), both at Aqueduct, before running second by a neck to then-unbeaten Gemologist in the Resorts World Casino New York City Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I). He finished 12th in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) but redeemed himself with a wire-to-wire romp in the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II) and a dead-heat victory in the Travers Stakes (gr. I).

Following the Travers, Alpha was away from the winner’s circle until the 2013 Saratoga meeting. He made his only win of the year a big one, taking the Woodward Stakes (gr. I). At 5, Alpha raced only three times before retiring with six wins from 22 starts and \$1,815,667.

Alpha is the second-leading earner for his sire Bernardini, who won an Eclipse Award as the best 3-year-old male of 2006. A beautifully made horse, Bernardini

has a pedigree to match his looks and race record as he is by two-time leading sire A.P. Indy out of 1995 Hollywood Starlet Stakes (gr. I) winner Cara Rafaela, a daughter of the good sire and broodmare sire Quiet American and a half sister to multiple grade III winner Abaginone.

The distaff side of Alpha's pedigree is equally deep. A half brother to French listed winner Mystic Melody (by Seattle Slew), Alpha is out of Munnaya (by Nijinsky II), a listed winner in England and a half sister to French listed winners Sheer Reason (by Danzig) and Mall Queen (by Sheikh Albadou). Munnaya, in turn, is out of 1986 Princess Margaret Stakes (Eng-III) winner Hiaam (by Alydar), a half sister to 1984 Canadian champion 3-year-old male Key to the Moon (by Wajima) and to grade I winners Gorgeous (by Slew o' Gold) and Seaside Attraction (by Seattle Slew). Hiaam is also a half sister to Jood (by Nijinsky II), dam of 2001 European Horse of the Year and champion turf male Fantastic Light (by Rahy).

Hiaam is out of Kamar (by Key to the Mint), the 1990 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year. A winner of the Canadian Oaks, Kamar is one of four stakes-winning and stakes-producing fillies bred by E.P. Taylor from his homebred 1973 Canadian champion 3-year-old filly Square Angel.



In addition to two grade I stakes, Alpha also won the grade II Jim Dandy Stakes

Any time E.P. Taylor breeding is part of a pedigree, it's often wise to look for water in the same well. In Alpha's case this points to Storm Bird and Vice Regent as good targets for line breeding to Northern Dancer, as both were products of Taylor's program along with Nijin-

sky II, broodmare sire of Alpha. Stallions with Nijinsky II in their pedigrees have typically done well with both of these strains, and the Deputy Minister branch of Vice Regent looks particularly promising. Bernardini has six stakes winners—including grade I winners To Honor and Serve, Angela Renee, and A Z Warrior—from mares returning Vice Regent, and five of the six—including all three grade I winners—have dams tracing to Vice Regent through Deputy Minister. Based on favorable crosses with multiple strains in his own pedigree, Alpha may also do well with line breeding to Northern Dancer through Danzig, Nureyev, and Dixieland Band.

Historically, the male line of A.P. Indy has done well with Mr. Prospector (the paternal grandsire of Quiet American). As Alpha is free of Mr. Prospector on his dam's side, he appears ripe for crosses back to this line. Bernardini has done very well with Carson City mares so far, getting four stakes winners from 11 foals of racing age, and this seems to be a good choice for Alpha, balancing his pedigree tilt toward stamina. Other strains of Mr. Prospector that have been compatible with multiple strains in Alpha's pedigree include Forty Niner, Miswaki, Woodman, Smart Strike, and the Unbridled branch of Fappiano. Alpha may also do well with mares whose pedigrees return Broad Brush, Relaunch, Halo, Secretariat, Blushing Groom, His Majesty, and Buckpasser, based on crosses that have worked well with his sire and broodmare sire.

Willcox Inn

A son of the late Harlan's Holiday, Willcox Inn comes from one of the less-common branches of Storm Cat, the one descending through 1994 Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) winner Harlan. Grade I-placed on both turf and Polytrack, Willcox Inn scored his biggest victory in the 2011 American Derby (gr. IIT) over 1½ miles. He also won the 2011 Hawthorne Derby (gr. IIIT) and 2013 Washington Park Handicap (gr. III) and ended his career having won six of 22 starts and \$1,015,543.

"He's an absolutely beautiful horse," says Suzie O'Cain of Saratoga Stud,

where Willcox Inn will stand the 2015 season. "Medium-sized, very athletic, and correct. And he has a great mind, very sensible, and willing. We are very fortunate to have him here. John Adger had a lot to do with that; he's been involved with other stallions we've managed, and he's part of the racing syndicate that owned him with Roy and Gretchen Jackson. Everyone who was in on Willcox Inn's ownership as a racehorse is staying on as part of his breeding syndicate, so he should have good mare support right from the start."

Multiple grade I winner Harlan's Holiday (Harlan—Christmas in Aiken, by Affirmed) has already shown promise as a sire of sires thanks to his sons Into Mischief, currently fourth on the third-crop sire list and the sire of millionaires Goldencents and Vicar's in Trouble; and Majesticperfection, currently fifth on the freshman sire list. Harlan's Holiday is also

the sire of 2012 champion juvenile male Shanghai Bobby, whose first crop will come to the races in 2017.

De Aar (by Gone West), the dam of Willcox Inn, is a grade III-placed half sister to multiple grade I winners Cete-wayo (by His Majesty) and Dynaforce (by Dynaformer). She is also a half sister to 2003 Sky Classic Handicap (Can-IIT) winner Bowman Mill (by Kris S.); to stakes winner Ntombi (by Quiet American); to group I-placed Fort Nottingham

(by Alleged); and to grade II-placed Bryntirion (by Bering) and Thabazimbi (by Empire Maker). De Aar's winning full sister Somerset West is the dam of 2009 Dallas Turf Cup Handicap (gr. IIIT) winner Seaspeak (by Mizzen Mast).

Willcox Inn's second dam Aletta Maria (by Diesis) is a full sister to 1990 Lancashire Oaks (Eng-III) winner Pharian and a half sister to the quick juvenile Raah Algharb (by Gone West), winner of the 1994 Tripleprint Flying Childers Stakes (Eng-II). Overall, this is a female line promising durability and stamina but not devoid of speed, making Willcox Inn a good choice for infusing stamina into the progeny of speedier mares.

Like Alpha, Willcox Inn should have a good chance of doing well with mares from branches of Northern Dancer developed by E.P. Taylor. Because of Willcox Inn's own orientation toward stamina, however, Vice Regent is probably a better option than Nijinsky II. The need for more speed in the mare also points toward Danzig, a branch of Northern Dancer that has crossed well with the Storm Cat tribe and even better with Willcox Inn's broodmare sire, Gone West. Based on results with multiple strains in Willcox Inn's ancestry, Nureyev is another good possibility for crossing back to Northern Dancer, as is Sadler's Wells.

Given the increasing number of good horses inbred to Mr. Prospector, the cross of the great Claiborne sire three generations back in Willcox Inn's pedigree should be no barrier to using mares returning Mr. Prospector provided that the conformational matchup is good. From a pedigree standpoint the best Mr. Prospector branches for Willcox Inn appear to be Forty Niner, Fappiano, Carson City, Kingmambo, and possibly Seeking the Gold. Other pedigree elements that have done well with multiple strains in Willcox Inn's pedigree include Blushing Groom, His Majesty, Secretariat, and Halo. 🐾

Firing Away

Eric Fein hit with Musket Man, now shooting to make him a stallion

GROWING UP IN DOUGLSTON, Queens, Eric Fein didn't have anyone to take him to the racetrack. He didn't come from one of those families that went to the races; his father didn't teach him how to handicap. But that didn't stop him.

"We didn't go to school," he said. "We went to the racetrack."

It started at Roosevelt Raceway, the harness track that closed in 1988 and that Fein called his "neighborhood social hangout," a five-minute drive from his house.

"It was pretty devastating when it closed," he said. "That was the end of harness racing for me."

But he still had Thoroughbreds, and he learned to handicap by watching the older gamblers at the track.

"Obviously," he says now with a laugh, "they weren't great because I was never very good at it. There's a lot more to it than handicapping; it's about money management, too."

Though he wanted to make a living at the track, he didn't have the connections

to make that happen, so he headed to Queens College in his home borough and ended up with what he calls “a real job.”

Now, he owns EAM Land Services, a title insurance company on Long Island, where he lives. In 2003 he made his first foray in horse ownership with the New York-bred Rogue Agent; a little more than a decade later he’s run two horses in the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and one in the Breeders’ Cup World Championships; he stands a graded stakes-winning stallion; and his New York-based breeding program is producing stakes winners.

Not bad for a man who, he says, “didn’t really have anyone to guide” him in the racing business.

Fein owned Rogue Agent, claimed for \$30,000 at Saratoga, in partnership with a half-dozen other people. The horse ran for six more years after the claim, earning nearly a half-million dollars and placing in multiple graded stakes.

While Rogue Agent was racking up earnings on the racetrack, Fein had turned from claiming races to auctions, purchasing primarily 2-year-olds. One of them, a New York-bred by Hook and Ladder for which Fein paid \$90,000, was his first stakes winner, and the horse that brought him to his first Run for the Roses.

“Big Truck had all the qualities of a great horse,” said Fein this fall. “He had some issues...should he have run in the Kentucky Derby? I don’t know. It was a decision that my trainer and I made, and it panned out crummy.”

A neck winner in the 2008 Tampa Bay Derby (gr. III), the Barclay Tagg-trained Big Truck ran 18th in that year’s Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands and never won another race.

“It’s hard to stomach some of these things,” Fein admitted. “I like to win. I learned after that that you don’t go just because you can.”

In the midst of what he called “a little depression” over the Derby, Fein got a phone call later that May from his other trainer, Derek Ryan, who was checking out horses at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in-training sale in Timonium, Md.

Actually, he got a lot of phone calls.

“He kept leaving me voice mails about a horse he loved,” Fein remembered. “I didn’t call him back.”

That horse didn’t meet his reserve, bringing a final bid of \$35,000, but Ryan ended up with him, anyway: Vic Carlson, who had bought the horse as a yearling for \$15,000, liked him so much that he decided to keep him and gave him to Ryan to train.

“I’d call Derek and ask him how my horses were doing,” said Fein, “and every time he’d say, ‘You should have bought that horse. He’s a freak.’”

After months of such calls, Fein called Carlson and became the majority owner in the horse named Musket Man, purchasing him for about \$170,000.

“I made peace with myself,” said Fein of paying much more than he would have had to at auction a few months earlier. “The more I knew from Derek having him for a few months, the more I knew the horse was real good. The extra money was worth the wait.”

Musket Man brought Fein a second win in the Tampa Bay Derby, but after the experience with Big Truck,

that win—also by a neck—wasn’t enough to have him buying tickets to Louisville. Big Truck had faltered after the win at Tampa, finishing 11th in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I) at Keeneland, and Fein wasn’t going to make that mistake again. Musket Man headed to Hawthorne, to the Illinois Derby (gr. II); his performance in that race would determine whether he would be Churchill-bound.

“I was thrilled after the Tampa Bay Derby,” Fein said. “But I wasn’t going to the Kentucky Derby unless I belonged there. (At Hawthorne) he proved he belonged, and he ran an amazing race.”

A two-length win at Hawthorne was followed by third-place finish under the Twin Spires at Churchill Downs; Musket Man was beaten a nose for second behind longshot winner Mine That Bird and Pioneer of the Nile.

At 4 Musket Man won one of eight starts, but ran in five grade I events, running second to Quality Road in the Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I), third behind Blame and Quality Road in the Whitney Handicap (gr. I), and ran in the Breeders’ Cup Classic (gr. I).

In the meantime, Fein and his brother Scott had begun a modest breeding operation in New York, claiming the mare Pumpkin’s Pride in Scott’s name in 2003. With either Scott or Eric the breeder of record, the Louis Quatorze mare has produced five winning foals, including the stakes-placed Great Gracie Dane.

Fein had intended to race Musket Man as a 5-year-old, but when the horse wrenched an ankle that would require a few months off at the end of his 4-year-old campaign, Fein changed his mind, standing him first in Florida, then Louisiana, where his sire Yonaguska had topped the sire list. Among the mares Fein bred to him that first year at stud was Pumpkin’s Pride, and the resulting

colt, trained by Todd Pletcher, gave Musket Man his first stakes winner, Ostrolenka.

Named for Fein's father's hometown in Poland, Ostrolenka was sent to Ian Brennan at Stonestreet Farm's Florida facility to begin his training.

"When he first came in, I thought he was too big," admitted Brennan, who has consulted with Fein on sales and bloodstock matters for years. "Then we got him going, and he's very athletic for a big horse. He's great mentally, too."

"We sent another horse with him when he first went down to Ian," said Fein. "Ian said to me, 'One of them's a Thoroughbred; I think the other one's a Clydesdale.'"

Ostrolenka disappointed first-time out in the mud at Saratoga this past summer; then aired in his next start at Belmont, winning by 14½ lengths. An easy winner of the \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes at Belmont on New York Showcase Day, the bay colt challenged open company in the Remsen Stakes (gr. II) at Aqueduct, a task that grew more daunting first at the draw when the front-running Ostrolenka drew post 11, then on race day over a track with an obvious inside speed bias.

"The post wasn't ideal to begin with," said Pletcher, "and it got less ideal as the day went on."

The bettors' second choice, Ostrolenka finished 13th after racing wide through much of the race over a surface on which he never seemed comfortable.

"We know he's better than that," said Pletcher.

"If you look at his pedigree," said Brennan, "he should be even better as a 3-year-old."

Fein keeps his handful of mares at Waldorf Farm in New York and has a weanling half sister to Ostrolenka by Malibu Moon for which he's already getting offers.

"She's getting a lot of hype," said Fein. "A lot of people are calling in regard to whether she's for sale."

He added emphatically, "She's not."

He expects to breed Pumpkin's Pride back to Musket Man next year, hoping for a full brother to Ostrolenka in 2016.

Musket Man will stand at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham for 2015; Fein wanted to bring his only stallion to New York from the start but recognized that his graded stakes winner needed some success at stud before that was a reasonable possibility.

"We think Ostrolenka is the real deal," said Fein. "So why not bring him here?"

Though he bypassed the breeding stock sales, Fein is purchasing mares privately specifically to breed to Musket Man, consulting with Brennan on pedigrees. And in a hearkening back to his purchase of Musket Man, Fein knows that his cautious approach is likely to cost him.

"Now that the sales are over, we're probably going to have to get them for extra money because I procrastinated quite a bit," he acknowledged. "But sometimes I'd rather pay more and do it right. Sometimes when I think about it longer, I make a better decision."

Fein may not have been able to get into the racing business as soon as he'd have liked, but perhaps, true to his form, waiting paid off, given the success of his racing and breeding operations. Despite that success he still gets nervous when he goes to the track, much more so now than when he went as a bettor.

"It's much more nerve-wracking now," he said. "When I gambled, it was just money. Now, there's a lot more on the line."

Though he still likes the handicapping and wagering elements of the business, he doesn't often have the time for either these days. Instead, he's trying to breed a horse that will take him back to the Derby and the Breeders' Cup, and while Ostrolenka's wins have provided a tantalizing glimmer of hope, Fein proceeds with customary caution.

"It's hard," he said, to think about how good his horse might be. "But I think that's the enjoyment of the game."

"The dream of having a really nice horse come spring—that's what gets you through the winter in New York." 🐾

Fleeting Year

New York-bred Fleet Indian was champion older female of 2006

SOMETIMES, GOOD FORTUNE CAN smile upon you just because you're in the right place at the right time. But once in a while, you have to make your own luck.

Paul Saylor, who had been a partner in Starlight Racing for several years and raced the Hall of Fame filly Ashado, just happened to be walking in the lower barn area at Keeneland prior to the 2006 Keeneland January sale when he looked up on the hill and noticed a horse that immediately caught his eye.

"I looked up and there's this large horse who had been body-clipped and obviously not a broodmare and not a large yearling, so I went, 'Wow, who the hell is that?' he recalled. "She had this outstanding body and was just standing there with her ears pricked looking down the hill at me. I thought, 'OK. I'm intimidated, I have to find out who this is.' I did a little bit of quick homework and found out she was a New York-bred 5-year-old by Indian Charlie—Hustleeta, by Afleet, named Fleet Indian and figured the people who were selling her were either selling for all the right reasons or maybe had given up on her. I was banking on option two. I had to leave right away, so I had a guy bid on her for me."

Saylor, who paid \$290,000 for Fleet Indian, had recently severed his partnership with

Starlight but still owned a third interest in the young stallion Purge, who had attracted breeders by winning the grade I Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap in his final career start in November 2005.

"We did enough vet work on her to know she wasn't crippled, and that maybe we'd get a couple of races out of her in New York-bred company and then breed her to Purge," Saylor said. "I still owned a part of Purge, and, as far as I knew, he was going to be a great sire. So, I bought Fleet Indian for two reasons. First, I didn't know if she had more good races in her, but I was hoping she did. And second, based on her physical attributes and her breeding, I thought she'd

be a good mare to breed to Purge. Fortunately, we never got that far.”

Fleet Indian, bred by Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin, was already a veteran of the sales ring, having been sold at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale at Saratoga for \$40,000 in 2002 and again the following year at 2 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-olds in training sale for \$230,000.


Racing for owner Stan Fulton and trainer Jimmy Toner, Fleet Indian began her career with four consecutive victories at Aqueduct and Belmont Park but could only finish a well-beaten fifth in her stakes debut, the Alabama Stakes (gr. I) in 2004. Three more defeats followed, including a fourth-place finish in the state-bred Iroquois Handicap at Belmont. But she bounced back in form, winning three of her next four efforts, highlighted by a five-length victory in the Montauk Handicap for New York-breds.

After winning an allowance race at Philadelphia Park by 5½ lengths, saddled by Clifford Sise Jr., she was put in the Keeneland January sale, where her career took a dramatic turn.

“I sent her to Todd (Pletcher), and he put her in the (grade III) Next Move Handicap at Aqueduct,” Saylor recalled. “He had just gotten off a plane from Dubai and Johnny Velazquez wasn't available, so we dusted off Jose Santos.”

Fleet Indian would never have any other rider on her back.

She won the Next Move by a length and then was sent to Hawthorne Race Course for the Sixty Sails Handicap (gr. III), which she easily won by 12½ lengths. When she won the \$100,600 Obeah Handicap at Delaware Park by 7½ lengths as a prep for the prestigious

Delaware Handicap (gr. II), Saylor knew he had struck gold. It had become pretty obvious that her date with Purge would have to wait.

But even with her three impressive stakes scores, Saylor still didn't realize just what he had and what Fleet Indian had turned into. The best was yet to come.

Sent off at 2-5 in the Delaware Handicap, she again dusted her opposition, winning wire-to-wire by 5½ lengths, running the 1¼ miles in a solid 2:02.08.

She continued going from strength to strength, establishing herself as the best older filly or mare in the country. In the grade I Personal Ensign Stakes at Saratoga, she again went to the lead and easily defeated the top-class Balletto by 4¼ lengths, winning back-to-back 1¼-mile races.

Dropping back to one turn in the Beldame Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont, she was outrun early but made a big sweeping move from fourth to open

a two-length lead at the eighth pole. This time, however, she didn't pull away and found herself having to dig in to hold off the late-charge of Balletto. She showed a new dimension and her ability to prevail in a dogfight by turning back Balletto to win by a head in a sharp 1:48.69 for the nine furlongs.

In the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I) at Churchill Downs, Fleet Indian was sent off as the 5-2 favorite but never made it to the finish line. Turning for home, she was pulled up in distress, and at first it was believed she had suffered a life-threatening injury.

"Here I was in a suit and coat jogging up the stretch over a deep track to see what had happened and somehow Pletcher beat me there," Saylor said. "(Assistant trainer) Mike McCarthy had a hold of her, and Jose said, 'I think she broke her ankle.' We got her back to the barn, and we found out it was a tissue and not a bone issue, although it was a fairly severe injury and she had to be in a cast for a while."

Saylor had already consigned Fleet Indian to the Keeneland November sale, but she was withdrawn from the auction. When she was ready to be bred, Saylor bred her to Storm Cat and put her in the 2007 Keeneland November sale.

"Starlight and I were done at the time," Saylor said. "But I kept four or five shares in Purge and felt Fleet Indian would be one of the mares I would breed to him the following year. I was the last or next-to-last person to pay the full Storm Cat stud fee when I bred her to him. So she went in the sale in foal to Storm Cat."

Fleet Indian, with Taylor Made Sales Agency acting as agent, just missed making her reserve and Saylor bought her back for \$3.9 million.

"The reserve was very close to her final live bid, and I knew who was on her and who wasn't," Saylor said. "There were a couple of people live on her for not much less than that, so I told the Taylor Made guys, 'I have a long drive back to Atlanta, so please get her sold by the time I get there.' They sold her pri-

vately (to Summer Wind Farm) within three hours of the sale."

Fleet Indian, who earned the Eclipse Award as champion older female for 2006, never was bred to Purge, Her Storm Cat colt sold at the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale for \$2,050,000 but had a breathing problem and never amounted to much, earning less than \$9,000. In 2011 her yearling filly by Distorted Humor sold at Keeneland September for \$500,000 but earned only \$35,000. Jerry Hollendorfer trains

stakes-placed Medaglia d'Oro filly out of Fleet Indian named Fleet of Gold who has won one of 13 starts for earnings of a little more than \$100,000.

In October 2011, Fleet Indian died at Summer Wind from complications due to colic.

"I got a call one morning before it went public saying she had died the previous night," Saylor said. "Before Starlight I had horses on my own, but they weren't of the same quality. I got spoiled with Ashado, who's now in the

Hall of Fame. Then to have 100% of Fleet Indian the next year and follow the same kind of path to an Eclipse Award was surreal. A filly like her makes you forget about all the horses you wish you had never owned or all the money you wish you had never laid out. Fleet Indian was a wonderful surprise, and she gave us a wonderful year." 🐾

Two for Two

Juveniles Good Luck Gus, Freddie Anne stretch out in two-turn state-bred stakes

DAMON RUNYON (1880-1946), THE FAMED NEWSPAPER MAN and author, made his mark in the 1920s and '30s with his short stories that celebrated the world of Broadway in New York City. The writer of *Guys and Dolls* created streetwise characters such as Nathan Detroit, Harry the Horse, Good Time Charley, and Dave the Dude. The writer would have undoubtedly been pleased when the Runyonesque-named Good Luck Gus (by Lookin At Lucky)—owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and The Elkstone Group—captured the 63rd running of the \$100,000 Damon Runyon Stakes for 2-year-olds bred in the Empire State, Dec. 14, at Aqueduct.

Of course, Dubb, who seriously thought about scratching the colt because of his poor post-position draw (the 11 post in a field of 11), is thankful he let trainer Rudy Rodriguez make the final call to race.

“I liked this horse so much that I wanted to run him (in the Jerome Stakes, gr. III, \$200,000) on Jan. 3,” said Dubb. “This horse by Lookin At Lucky wants to go two turns. When we drew the (extreme outside post), I told Rudy, ‘I’d be fine with waiting because I have that much confidence in this horse.’”

But Rodriguez was confident as well. He instructed jockey Ruben Silvera to lie close to the pace on the outside, without letting Good Luck Gus take too much dirt to the face. It was a paddock plan that came together brilliantly on the racetrack, going a mile and 70 yards over Aqueduct’s “fast” inner track.

Good Luck Gus took the first turn four-wide while stalking an opening quarter-mile of :23.21 and a half-mile of :48.17. Then, moving into the far turn, the yellow-blinkered colt advanced powerfully on the pacesetters, surging to the front just outside of the quarter pole.

It appeared as if Good Luck Gus were going to distance himself from his 10 rivals, but he began to idle a bit in upper-stretch.

“When he made the lead, he almost tried to stop, like he was waiting on horses,” observed Dubb. “Some horses are like that. And that becomes a challenge for the jockey.”

Accordingly, Silvera supplied his mount with some right-handed encouragement through the final furlong. And inside the final sixteenth, after the fast-closing compe-

tition found itself on the leader's heels, Good Luck Gus lengthened his stride once again.

The winner hit the wire clear by 1½ lengths, stopping the timer in 1:45.80.

Bred in New York by Fred Hertrich III, Good Luck Gus is out of Tacticmove, by Deputy Minister. He recorded his third win from seven starts, increasing his earnings to \$330,059.

The partnership acquired the colt at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds for \$97,000. Bloodstock agent Kim Valerio recommended the runner.

"He really struck me (at the sale). He was so good-looking and had a great eye. And Lookin At Lucky was one of my favorites," said Valerio. "It was a great pedigree, a really deep family for a New York-bred. I look for depth. Lookin At Lucky was a champion at 2 and 3. The mare is a half (sister) to Cat Fighter (grade II winner of the La Canada Stakes) and to Irish group III winner Ishiguru.

Gary Barber's Bullheaded Boy (by Bullsbay), from the barn of trainer Todd Pletcher, rallied late to claim the runner-up spot. That one just edged out GoldMark Farm's Tizquick (by Tiz Wonderful), a John Kimmel-trainee, who garnered the minor spoils in third position.

Rising Sun Racing Stables' Masons Dream (by Super Saver) finished ninth in the field. His dam, African Violet, was sired by Lemon Drop Kid, a name shared by the famed protagonist of a Damon Runyon story set in Saratoga. So much for the insights of the well-read hunch-player.

East View Anne

Freshman fillies had their counterpart event in the \$100,000 East View Stakes. Marc Detampel's Freudie Anne (by Freud) simply toyed with her five rivals, posting a dominating 9¾-length victory.

How athletic is Freudie Anne? Athletic enough to overcome any conformation flaws in her front legs.

The winner was purchased at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale for a mere \$9,000. Detampel's racing manager, Fergus Galvin (part owner of Hunter Valley Farm near Versailles, Ky.), was responsible for urging

the owner's winning bid.


"We bought her as a weanling at a New York sale for a pinhooking group. We paid \$14,000 for her (at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed sale)," said Galvin. "So we put her through (the) September (sale). She was a big, pretty filly, but unfortunately, her front legs went a little bit back on us as a yearling. She didn't draw a lot of attention (at the sale). We really liked her on the farm as a yearling, though, despite her not-so-straight front legs. I called up Marc and said, 'You've got to buy this one. She's

Freudie Anne powered away from her competition and the contest was essentially over nearing the furlong marker.

The final clocking for the mile and 70 yards was 1:44.50.

Bred in New York by Delaney Stable, Freudie Anne is out of Lake Toccet, by Toccet. She has now won three of her four starts, boosting her earnings to \$141,500.

"(Freudie Anne) has really improved. She's done a lot in a short amount of time," said Kenneally. "She took to the two turns on the inner track perfectly. She's very well-bred by one of the leading sires

going to come pretty cheap, but she's worth it.' Her athleticism has probably off-set her flaws. The first time (trainer) Eddie (Kenneally) breezed her, he said, 'This filly has really got an engine.' Eddie thinks she could be as good, if not better, on the turf (where she broke her maiden in her only grass attempt)."

On paper the East View appeared to present a contentious pace up front, with four of the six fillies having flashy early speed in their past performance lines. However, jockey Jose Ortiz and Freudie Anne found themselves cruising along, unchallenged on the lead through soft fractions of :24.02 for the opening quarter-mile and :49.11 for the half-mile.

"I thought I would have to go :23 and :47 to get the lead. But everyone else took back," said Ortiz. "My filly relaxed very well. And when I asked her to go, I had a lot of horse."

On the latter portion of the far turn,

in New York. He was a great horse himself, Freud. So yeah, she seems to have it all. Jose rode her with a lot of confidence. She was certainly best today."

Lady Sheila Stable's Hot City Girl (by City Zip), a half sister to the ultra-speedy New York-bred grade II winner La Verdad, finished second in the East View after breaking her maiden in her second start.

"She's built more like a route horse than La Verdad," said trainer Linda Rice. "I started her out on the turf. Being a City Zip, and that she was a little immature, I thought (the grass) would be kinder to her. I was getting her to the races gently. She trained well on it. But it looks like the dirt's all right, too."

Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's second-choice Building Permit, a Chad Brown trainee, was third after her closing style of running was compromised by the pedestrian fractions. 🐾
