#### 2017 - A Way Forward

**HAPPY NEW YEAR** to all! Just as you are embarking on the serious business of foaling and breeding at your farms, we at New York Thoroughbred Breeders begin the year by focusing on two of our most important annual rites: kicking off our annual membership renewal drive and ramping up work on the legislative challenges that our industry will face in the coming year.

When you receive your annual NYTB membership renewal notice in the mail, I urge you to remember that NYTB—which is the only organization solely dedicated to giving New York breeders a voice in Albany—could not work full-time and year-round on behalf of New York's breeding program without the support of its members. Moreover, in 2017 NYTB will be more active in Albany than ever.

For the first time NYTB has secured a seat at the table this year for the budget process, which puts us in a much better position to advance breeders' interests proactively rather than having to deal with issues after the fact. Equally important, our organization is slated to participate directly in upcoming negotiations about the New York Racing Association's re-privatization, which will have ramifications for all. Meanwhile, NYTB is fully prepared once again to assist the Finger Lakes horsemen in ongoing negotiations with representatives of Delaware North and del Lago Casino involving purse protection.

There is one more extremely high-profile item on NYTB's legislative agenda. We are committed to seeking relief/protection for the Fund and purses from the effects of a new relationship between Genting and Nassau OTB. Last year Genting's Resorts World re-assigned 460 of its VLT machines to Nassau OTB, which means that

these machines no longer contribute to racing or breeding revenue in the same way. Conceivably, in the coming year the number of machines could climb to 1,000. NYTB will do everything in its power to make sure breeders do not lose out in this new arrangement. Finally, in addition to monitoring any other emergent issues impacting breeding and racing over the course of the upcoming legislative session, NYTB will seek to renew, for the seventh consecutive year, the essential "Fund Caps" bill, which allows the Fund to pay 65% of its revenue to breeders' awards.

To come full circle, once again I urge you to support all this work by renewing your membership today. NYTB, for its part, strives to reward members with valuable benefits, including free clubhouse admission to Finger Lakes and the NYRA tracks, a free subscription to the monthly *New York Breeder* magazine, the annual New York *Stallion Register*, free classified advertising on the NYTB website, and discounts on various services. The "member benefits" page on our website contains a full listing. Renew early to avoid letting these benefits lapse or expire in the weeks ahead.

So, please complete and return the renewal notice you will receive in the mail, use the membership application included in this month's issue (see page 8), or renew easily and quickly online at www.nytbreeders.org. Also, you should alert new clients that, as participants in the New York breeding program, their best interest is served by joining the organization.

Until next time, I wish you the best of luck with your mares and foals, and, once again, extend my personal thanks for your continued support.








#### **Neck of the Moon Hits the Beach**

Hidden Brook Farm's multiple stakes-placed Neck of the Moon nailed down her first stakes score Dec. 17 at Gulfstream Park when she won the \$100,000 South Beach Stakes, a 71/2-furlong two-turn turf contest.

A consistent performer—she'd hit the board in 16 of 21 starts prior to the South Beach including four stakes-placings—the 6-year-old daughter of More Than Ready had found her initial stakes victory elusive.



"We spotted her well all season and she just had very unfortunate trips," said trainer Chad Brown before the race. "A couple of those races she could have won. She always gives her best."

Neck of the Moon was last seen finishing second by a length in the onemile River Memories Stakes Nov. 5 at Woodbine.

In the South Beach Neck of the Moon saved ground early before making her way between horses on the far turn. She found clear running room at the head of the lane, where she passed three rivals under a hand ride, then outgamed Sandiva by a neck in 1:31.


"Today she got the trip she needed," Brown said after the race. "We told (jockey) Paco (Lopez) a few things about her, particularly her affinity to get outside if possible in a big field, and he executed it perfectly. I'm proud of the filly for the effort she gave."

Brown is unsure whether Neck of the Moon, a \$402,312 earner, will continue racing or prepare for life as a broodmare with her black-type win under her belt. "I'll speak to the management at Hidden Brook and see what happens."

Bred by Stone Bridge Farm near Gansevoort, where she was foaled, Neck of the Moon is out of stakes-placed Kentucky-bred Cotopaxi, by With Approval, who was purchased by Stone Bridge owner Jeffrey Tucker at the 2006 Keeneland November sale for \$120,000. She has produced four stakes winners (three in Mexico) and one other winner from five foals to start and relocated to Mexico in 2010.





















**LAST YEAR'S GOLD RUSH** of nine new stallions to the New York market has slowed this year to a more manageable six, but it's not a matter of volume. With increased interest in the New York breeding program, the stallion operations have had to "up their game," and they continue to do so with the new players of 2017.

Two of the new stallions have proved their mettle against the best of the best while being grade I stakes winners. Another is by War Front, who, along with Tapit, has the most sought-after bloodlines in the commercial weanling and yearling market. The versatile runner has a propensity for throwing both turf and dirt stars. There is also a member of Uncle Mo's exciting first crop and a pair of hard-knocking New York-breds by Northern Afleet and Warrior's Reward added to the mix.

The highest-priced incoming stallion outside of Central Kentucky is the strapping 5-year-old **Effinex**. He's also at the head of the list as far as earnings—\$3,312,950—and introductory stud fee—\$10,000. Effinex takes up residence at Questroyal North near Stillwater. He's no stranger to New York in that he was bred here and he's last year's New York-bred horse of the year.

"Effinex is the most accomplished sire to start his career in New York, hands down," said Barry Ostrager, the owner of Questroyal North. "When a horse is a multiple graded stakes winner of nearly \$3.5 million and has beaten Honor Code,

Tonalist, Hoppertunity, and Melatonin—the very best handicap horses in America and has run 11 triple-digit Beyers, there is no question about his authenticity."

Effinex, by Mineshaft, made 17 starts in graded stakes company, and he won or placed in nine of them. His signature win came in the 2015 Clark Handicap (gr. I). He also won the Oaklawn Handicap (gr. II), back-to-back Suburban Handicaps (gr. II, 2015-16), and the Excelsior Stakes (gr. III).

In the 2015 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), Effinex was second to Triple Crown winner and Horse of the Year American Pharoah.

Dr. Russell Cohen, who bred Effinex and raced him in the name of his family's Tri-Bone Stables, said he had been negotiating with some of the country's biggest stud farms and had many offers from outside the country, but in the end he wanted to keep the horse close to home.

"Part of it is sentimental," said Cohen, a native New Yorker and a practicing veterinarian for 30 years. "He is not just a New York-bred, he's third generation. And despite all he's done for me, I owe him more. I want him here where I can keep an eye on him."

Cohen said Effinex attracted major breeders in both New York and Kentucky.

"His female family—the Best in Show family—is the most productive of the great matriarchal families, in my humble opinion," Cohen said. "A lot of great sires have come out of that family."

Effinex is out of E Dubai's stakeswinning daughter What a Pear. Effinex's fourth dam is Best in Show.

Cohen also believes Effinex is attractive to breeders because he never trained on medication with the exception of Lasix while racing 28 times in three seasons.

"That soundness element is really important to racing," he said. "This is a dynamic, durable, and fast horse."

"As spectacular as the New York program has been, there has been a perceived void, and the owners of high-quality mares have shipped them to Kentucky to be bred, believing—I think wrongly—that there were no New York stallions of equal quality," Ostrager said. "With the arrival of Effinex, resident mares can now be bred to a stallion that successfully com-

quist. Nyquist enters stud this year for \$40,000 at Darley near Lexington and another son, Outwork, will stand at WinStar Farm in Kentucky for \$15,000.

From that same first crop comes **Laoban** to Sequel Stallions near Hudson for an entry fee of \$7,500.

Laoban will be syndicated by a joint venture between Southern Equine Stables, Sequel Thoroughbreds, Mc-Mahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, and Woodford Thoroughbreds.

Laoban offers a unique breed back option for our Kentucky clients as well as a perfect reason for our New York breeders to stay home."

New York's other grade I winner is **V. E. Day**, who scored in the 2014 Travers Stakes (gr. I). He will stand for \$6,500 at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham.



Trained by Jimmy Jerkens, V. E. Day nosed out stablemate Wicked Strong in the 10-furlong Travers in just his third start on dirt. He also topped classic winner Tonalist and grade I winners Mr Speaker and Bayern in the "Midsummer Derby."

V. E. Day was bred by Brad Kelley's Bluegrass Hall and is from the Deputy Minister mare California Sunset, dam of five other winners. Her dam, Our Dear Sue, is a sister to champion grass horse Sunshine Forever.

A \$105,000 Keeneland September

ginia Derby (gr. IIT) and in 2014 took the Louisville Handicap (gr. IIIT). He finished second in the grade I Man o' War Stakes at Belmont Park in 2015. He retires with six wins and 10 placings out of 30 starts and with earnings of \$1,068,925.

"He is very correct. He's got a great body—good shoulder, good hip," said Erin Robinson, stallion director for Rockridge. "If he throws the physical type that he is, he's going to have some wonderful-looking babies. Even though he ran on turf, he doesn't look turf-y. He probably takes more after War Front in general who can throw both dirt and turf horses. He's got a lot of scope, and he's going to be a very nice addition to New York."

War Dancer was bred in Kentucky by Cherry Valley Farm and Stuart S. Janney III. He is out of the grade II-placed winner Deed I Do, a daughter of Alydeed, who produced seven winners from eight foals of racing age. "He retired sound," Robinson said. "His mother was a dirt runner; she was a good racehorse. There are a lot of War Front sons out there at stud...but there are only three who have won more than \$1 million and he's one of them."



Long on experience—Fiddlers Afleet made 40 starts in a six-season racing career—the New York-bred son of Northern Afleet won from 5 1/2 to nine furlongs.

As a 2-year-old, he ran second to Haynesfield in the Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct. At 3, after spending the early part of his campaign in Southern California, he returned to New York to win Saratoga's Albany Stakes, then stepped back outside restricted company to win Remington Park's \$400,000 Oklahoma Derby. He won two additional stakes, placed in five more, and earned \$773,128.

American Tango, the dam of Fid-

dlers Afleet, won Ellis Park's six-furlong Magnolia Breeders' Cup Stakes in just her fourth career start. The daughter of Quiet American placed in two other stakes and compiled a 5-4-2 mark in 31 starts. American Tango is the second dam of \$350,030-earner Afternoon Tango, a three-time stakes winner in Louisiana.

Philip Birsh's homebred **Tencendur** sets up shop at Mill Creek Farm near Saratoga. The son of Warrior's Reward will stand for \$2,500.

Out of the Hennessy mare Still Secret, Tencendur made eight of his starts around two turns, breaking his maiden second time in the mud at Aqueduct going a mile and 70 yards in

January of his 3-year-old year.

By April of that year he was grade I-placed, running second to Frosted (who will stand for \$50,000 in 2017) in the TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I). That set the colt up for a run at the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), where he finished unplaced behind Triple Crown winner American Pharoah.

Tencendur was able to bounce back in his next start, dropping a nose decision to Mr. Z in the \$500,000 Ohio Derby.

Tencendur made one start at four this summer at Saratoga and retires with \$368,500 in earnings and a 1-3-1 mark.



Trinity Farm strikes open stakes company twice with state-bred Macagone

**FOR THE HUSBAND AND WIFE TEAM** of Jaye and Tom Egan, the majority owners of Trinity Farm, breeding and racing horses in the Empire State has not only been an intense passion, but a rather personal extension of their lives together.

This past August, Jaye, who is bravely battling a serious illness, gathered her strength and led the couple's 5-year-old homebred Macagone (by Artie Schiller) into the winner's circle at Saratoga Race Course, one of her favorite places, after an allowance optional claiming victory on the grass. Macagone, who is out of the Skip Away mare Isabel Away, has also shone on the Aqueduct turf by taking the \$100,000 Danger's Hour Stakes in April and the \$150,000 Artie Schiller Stakes (named for his sire) in November, both in open company.

"Jaye is one of the most optimistic people in the world," said Tom Egan, her husband of 21 years. "She could light up a room with that optimism. One day we hope to have a horse with her incredible determination."

Tom Egan's journey to becoming a breeder/owner was seeded during the 1970s when he started as a hotwalker for the powerful Phipps Stable, working beneath trainer John Russell and assistant Bruce Johnstone. During that time Egan had the opportunity to be hands-on with a pair of potent turf runners—Landscaper and Fluorescent Light.

Years later Egan would go on to pass the bar exam and become a practicing lawyer. He saved his money and eventually approached trainer H. James Bond about getting into the racing game.

"I've got one-hundred thousand dollars. I understand that we're not going to find a Kentucky Derby horse for that. But I'm looking for a horse good enough to win an allowance race in New York," Egan told Bond upon their initial meeting.

Equally as excited about the prospects of becoming a first-time owner, Jaye asked her husband, "What exactly are we looking for physically in a horse?"

"We want a horse that looks like an athlete," replied Egan. "One that seems enthused about being on the track."

Jaye took that advice to heart, and along with help from Bond-associate Paul Smith, the pair assessed yearlings together at the 2003 Keeneland September yearling sale. It was Isabel Away who caught Jaye's eye, and the filly was acquired for \$60,000.

She won just once from 11 starts, finishing second four times and third once. But in her lone win, the ever-optimistic Jaye saw something in the filly's young French-born rider Julian

Leparoux, who had notched his fourth victory in the U.S. aboard Isabel Away.

"I remember Jaye showing Julian the photos of all the famous jockeys on the walls in a Keeneland restaurant," said Tom Egan. "She told him, 'Keep working hard. That's going to be you one day."

Though Isabel Away, who was prone to streaks of nastiness with her handlers and owners—the filly once bit Jaye's arms causing a painful injury—wasn't overly impressive on the racetrack, she eventually excelled in the breeding shed, producing Birchwood Road (by Pure Prize) in 2010 (\$223,800 in earnings) and Macagone in 2011.

Pure Prize (by Storm Cat) was bred and raced by the Phipps Stable.

"After getting my start working for the Phipps, It felt special to breed to one of their horses," said Egan. "Almost like a circle had been completed."

The Egans' partners in Trinity Farm are also named Egan—Liam and Mary. The couples are not related, though both are of Irish-heritage and can trace their roots to Galway.


In fact, Liam, who speaks Gaelic, is responsible for suggesting the name Macagone, (pronounced Ma-kay-gun) which translates as "son of Egan."

It was a very meaningful name to Tom Egan, who had lost his adult son, Jes (from a previous marriage), to brain cancer just a few months before the colt was foaled in upstate New York.

"I'll always make the connection between the two of them, and Macagone reminds me of Jes in so many ways," said Egan. "It's one reason why this horse will always be special to me."

Former New York Racing Association track announcer Tom Durkin had been mispronouncing Macagone's name during race calls. So when Tom Egan learned that Durkin would soon be picking up a jacket at a tailor shop on Broadway in Saratoga, he left a handwritten note for the announcer with the shopkeeper on how to pronounce it correctly.

Having their horses succeed in open company has always been a major goal for Trinity Farm. But Macagone, who (continued on page 48)

had been a one-way speed type for most of his career, may have learned his most valuable racing lesson in the Mohawk Stakes for New York-breds, which had been taken off the turf and contested over a sloppy Belmont Park main oval in late October.

"I always wondered if Macagone could come from off-the-pace. I think the Mohawk had a lot to do with teaching him that. He didn't come out of the gate well. He took a lot of kick-back in that race. But mentally he survived it. I


think he learned something important that day," said Egan.

Heading into the Artie Schiller, Macagone was expected to be one of a crush of horses battling for the early lead, part of the reason the gelding was 34-1. But jockey Kendrick Carmouche, who unexpectedly found himself aboard when Chris DeCarlo was thrown from his mount a race earlier, was able to rate the Bill Mott trainee in fourth-position. After a near perfect stalking trip in the one-mile event, the pair launched a six-wide rally turning for home, before striking the lead in mid-stretch and holding sway late for a three-quarter-length victory in 1:36.66.

It was Macagone's seventh win from 23 starts, increasing his earnings to \$462.167.

The gelding is currently scheduled to winter in Florida and take a break from racing.

It's one reason why Jaye and Tom Egan moved from Connecticut to Palm City, Fla., back in 2005. Their runners spend every winter at Don Brown's 60-acre farm, near Payson Park, rejuvenating for the spring schedule ahead beneath the steady hands of exercise rider Rudy Wolfendale. It's a relaxed (continued on page 50)

time in which Tom Egan often tends to his horses as a self-appointed groom.

Though Macagone is by a Kentuckybased sire, there was never any doubt in Egan's mind that he wanted his runner to be a New York-bred.

"It's a very attractive breeding program in New York," said Egan. "It doesn't make any sense not to have a

New York-bred. Why wouldn't you? Breeding to a Kentucky stallion and then coming back to New York made all the sense in the world."

In 2014 Isabel Away produced a New York-bred full brother to Birchwood Road named Red Knight. The colt trained sensationally at Saratoga this summer, and the Egan clan is anxiously anticipating his debut. She also has a 2015 colt by Colonel John, which Tom Egan plans on naming Celtic Knight.

Currently, Isabel Away, who is boarded at Keane Stud, has a weanling filly by Freud and is in foal to Freud. It is a pairing that Tom Egan couldn't be more pleased about.

"Freud is a solid sire," said Egan. "I think one day he could absolutely be the equal to his brother (Giant's Causeway). Right now one of the main differences between the two is the quality of mares they get. If Freud was getting the same number of grade I-winning mares, his runners and stats would be even more impressive."

How did the Egan Clan and Trinity Farm, which consists of one broodmare and four runners, wind up with Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott?

Earlier in their racing careers both Macagone and Birchwood Road were ably trained by Michelle Nihei, who mostly operates out of Palm Meadows in Florida. Nihei, the consummate professional, upon being informed that Trinity Farm desired a New York-based trainer, actually lobbied Mott via a pair of phone calls to take them on as clients.

## Weather Or Not

Loki's Vengeance takes to the cooler temps in the Thunder Rumble; Filibustin unbeaten after the Key Cents

BY TERESA GENARO

**HEADING INTO THE SARATOGA MEETING** this past summer, Loki's Vengeance had earned only two of his six lifetime wins during warm weather. The 5-year-old had yet to get to the winner's circle in four starts earlier this year, so trainer Mike Hushion and owners David Greenhouse and Chris Boehning decided to skip a summer

campaign and wait to run him at Aqueduct, the track at which he had won and finished second four times each.

On Nov. 25, back at the track he favors best, Loki's Vengeance won his first race of the year in a 71/4-length romp in the \$125,000 New York Stallion Series Stakes Thunder Rumble Division, taking the race for the second year in a row, this time off a four-month layoff.

"It was nice to see that dominant of a performance," said Greenhouse, who with high school friend Boehning runs in the name of Blue Bison Stable.

"He seemed sluggish in his race in July," said Greenhouse of a fifth-place finish at Belmont Park. "Mike suggested giving him some time off, and, hopefully, we'll have a successful fall/winter campaign."

Now a resident of Colorado, Greenhouse was there to walk the horse into the winner's circle while New York City's Boehning had to watch via the New York Racing Association HD app on his phone while at a business dinner in London.

"I had to ask the restaurant for the secret WiFi code," he said with a laugh. "Nothing better than winning a race in that style before you sit down to dinner."

Under jockey José Ortiz, Loki's Vengeance maintained a short lead throughout much of the seven-furlong race, opening up at will in the stretch and hitting the wire in 1:23.20.

Bred in New York by Andrew Cohen, Loki's Vengeance was purchased by Blue Bison for \$35,000 at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings in Saratoga in 2012 from the Vinery consignment. The

dark bay or brown horse by Frost Giant out of Subtle Sweetness (by During) has earned \$492,201 in 22 starts.

"He's such an honest horse," said Boehning. "I have to say, the minute I first saw him, I fell in love with him, when Lere (Visagie of Rockridge Stud) brought him out of his stall."

Named after a Marvel Comics character that was found hidden among the Frost Giants, Loki's Vengeance reminds Boehning of the filly that got Blue Bison started; all of Shine Upon's five victories came at Aqueduct, and it's to Aqueduct that Loki's Vengeance will return this winter, with both the Gravesend Stakes on Dec. 18 and the Hollie Hughes Handicap

in January on the tentative schedule, the latter a race Hushion has won five times, more than any other trainer.

"We'll try," said Greenhouse, "to get him another one."

Later in the program, 2-year-old filly Filibustin became the second wire-to-wire stakes winner on the day when she ran off with the \$100,000 Key Cents Stakes, keeping her undefeated record intact with a three-length win going six furlongs.

Filibustin didn't have it quite as easy

as Loki's Vengeance; she and jockey José Lezcano were hounded by longshots but shook them off at the eighth pole and pulled clear to give the daughter of Bustin Stones a second straight stakes victory.

Out of the Western Cat mare Sweet Aloha, Filibustin is owned by Alan Cook, who bred the filly in the name of Luck Be a Lady Racing off the gift of a stallion season by J.J. Crupi, at whose farm Cook's horses get their early training. Cook claimed Sweet Aloha out of a race at the Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races for \$10,000; she went on to win four races for him.

Filibustin won at first asking, winning a maiden claimer Sept. 4 at Monmouth Park by 8¼ lengths. She's trained by the Monmouth-based Greg Sacco, whose cousin Johnny took care of the filly when she was on Crupi's farm.

"Our plan was to run her at Saratoga, but she missed a couple of works due to being sick," said Sacco. "I was a little concerned about running her in a \$40,000 claimer the first time out, but it worked out well enough."

And while the filly was tested for the first time in the Key Cents, that was fine by her owner.

"We wanted to see what she had if she got challenged," said Cook. "We wanted to see if she'd back down."

She didn't, and while she may stay in New York-bred company for the time being, both owner and trainer expect an open company start in 2017.

"We're in the driver's seat against state-breds at this point," said Sacco. "Next summer is a different ballgame, and we'll step up to the plate again. We'll cross the bridge into open company stakes in her 3-year-old season, certainly."

## Big Hit BY PAUL VOLPONI

WHEN FORMER NEW YORK GIANTS head coach and member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Bill Parcells (August Dawn Farm) named a 2-year-old New York-



bred Bavaro, honoring one of his cherished players—Mark Bavaro-insiders had an inkling the colt could run. That deduction turned out to be true in spades as the gray/roan son of Freud, now unbeaten in a pair of starts, scored an impressive frontrunning victory in the \$150,000 Great White Way division of the New York Stallion Series Stakes Dec. 17.

Trainer Gary Sciacca selected the colt at the

Trainer Gary Sciacca with jockey Manny Franco after the **Great White Way**  Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds in August 2015 for \$85,000.

"He was a big, tough-looking son of a gun," said the Brooklyn-born Sciacca, who will always be remembered in the annals of state-bred racing history for conditioning Saratoga Dew to an Eclipse Award in 1992 as top 3-year-old filly. "He looked like a bull, and believe me, nothing bothers this horse."

Despite Sciacca's confidence in his colt he was weary of the presence of Francis Paolangeli's homebred Gold for the King (by Posse), who had won three of five career starts, including the \$219,613 New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack and the Notebook Stakes at Aqueduct.

Out of the gate in the Great White Way, Bavaro streaked to the lead and raced a strong opening half-mile in :46.59 over an inner track labeled "good" that was producing times on the slow side.

Sciacca's guarded optimism was tested as Gold for the King made a serious run at the leader on the far turn.

"I thought he might go right by us," said Sciacca. "But my horse had something left and this time (unlike in his debut) he changed leads."

Parcells was watching the action from Florida, and Mark Bavaro from Boxboro, Mass., alongside his uncle, a racing enthusiast, as the equine Bavaro sailed through the stretch beneath jockey Manny Franco.

The equine Bavaro registered a 3¾-length victory, racing six furlongs in 1:11.16.

Gold for the King, from the barn of trainer Charlton Baker, was clear from the rest of the four freshman entrants by 8½ lengths as the odds-on favorite. Sean Shay's homebred Remstin (by Frost Giant) garnered the minor spoils in third position.


The winner has bankrolled \$123,000.

Bavaro, who is out of Chantess (by Unbridled's Song), was bred by Chris Bernhard's Hidden Lake Farm, Gunston Hall Farm, and Anthony Grey.

"Chantess was a very fast mare that

I acquired from Becky Thomas and Sequel Thoroughbreds," said Bernhard, who at the time of Bavaro's victory was in the midst of moving close to 200 horses to his new home of operations, Quest-royal North near Stillwater. "I remember Becky saying that Unbridled's Song mares are a great match with Freud. I'd achieved that once before with a yearling I'd gotten \$100,000 for. When things like that work out on paper, on the track, and in the market-place, I tend to stick with it."

#### **TOOLS TIME**

Questroyal North also figured prominently in the running of the filly division, the \$150,000 Fifth Avenue the following day, when the operation's owner (and former board president of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders Association) Barry Ostrager, bred the winner. The 2-year-old filly Toni Tools is a daughter of Roaring Fever out of Patine (by Smart Strike), and is owned in partnership by St. Elias Stable, MeB Racing Stables, and Brooklyn Boyz Stables.

St. Elias Stable is run by Vincent Viola, who was appointed to president-

elect Donald Trump's cabinet as secretary to the Army.

The Fifth Avenue was a tale of two races—one contested early on in the six-furlong event over a muddy and sealed track, and another which unfolded in the shadow of the wire.

The 4-5 favorite, Alan Cook's Filibustin (by Bustin Stones), and the second-choice, Chester and Mary Broman's homebred Catcher in the Sky (by Noonmark), pushed each other through scintillating fractions early on.

With Filibustin holding a slight advantage over Catcher in the Sky, the pair zipped

through an opening quarter mile in :22.07 and a half mile in :45.83.

The undefeated Filibustin, who was three-for-three for trainer Gregory Sacco, shook clear in the stretch. But the demanding pace took its toll through

the final furlong as Filibustin shortened stride.

Rallying on the outside under Franco was the determined Toni Tools. And down at the rail, making up ground steadily, was The Elkstone Group's Passporttovictory (by Frost Giant).

Toni Tools surged to the fore in the final yards registering a half-length victory in 1:14.43.

"She got up in time. It was a very dramatic win. She seemed to handle the (muddy track) well," said assistant Byron Hughes, who saddled for trainer Todd Pletcher. Toni Tools has now won her last three since joining the Pletcher barn. Overall, the winner is 3-1-0 in five starts and has earned \$164,172.

For several minutes after the contest, the New York Racing Association announced that Passporttovictory had dead-heated for second with Filibustin, even though it was apparent to the naked-eye that Passporttovictory had gotten her nose on the wire ahead of that rival. The mistake, however, was rectified before any payouts, and Passporttovictory was solely awarded the place slot.

## Go-Go Star

WHEN CHESTER AND MARY BROMAN'S homebred Highway Star pulled off a mild 7-1 upset in the Dec. 3 Go for Wand Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct, she marked the first graded win for the year for the power couple that own Chestertown Farm near Chestertown.

The lone sophomore in the cast—and one of three New York-breds—she edged High Ridge Road by a nose. The Bromans also had the 7-10 favorite in the field, state-bred Bar of Gold, who finished fourth.

Bar of Gold had been the Bromans' chief earner this year prior to the Go for Wand with two stakes wins over state-bred company on New York Showcase days in the May 30 Critical Eye Stakes and Oct. 22 Empire Distaff Handicap, good for \$270,000 in state-bred earnings. She placed in three graded

starts and all told this year has earned \$361,500 off a 2-0-3 mark in eight starts.

Highway Star, by Girolamo out of Stolen Star, won a division of the New York Stallion Series prior to the \$250,000 Go for Wand. She earned \$369,000 in 2016.

Taking home \$150,000 first prize in the New York-bred's first step into open company was strong, but the chestnut filly comes from good stock.

The Bromans' Chestertown Farm purchased Unbridled Star, the granddam of Highway Star, in foal to Cat Thief for \$115,000 at the 2002 Keeneland November sale. The foal she was carrying turned out to be stakes-placed Stolen Star, the dam of Highway Star.

"Carson Asbury picked her out for the Bromans," said Chestertown farm manager Jeff Raine. "Give him all the credit. That was one of the Bromans' first big buys.

"Stolen Star is a big, strapping chestnut mare," he continued. "She's a raw kind of mare that produces a big, strapping foal. Highway Star was a leggy chestnut; she wasn't scrawny at all."

The Bromans, who have been named New York breeders of the year on multiple occasions, appear to be on their way to another title (see page 18). The Bromans have a clear lead as well in the owners list by New York-bred earnings (see page 20).

A.P. Indy is the sire of Girolamo, the sire of Highway Star, and the Go for Wand winner is from his first crop. The grade I winner stood his first two seasons at Sequel Stallions in New York before moving on to Darley in Kentucky for the 2014 breeding season.

Bloodstock adviser Alan Porter suggested the mating. Porter has made a short list for the Bromans as to who to breed Stolen Star to in 2017, and the list includes fellow A.P. Indy sons Bernardini and Malibu Moon, along with Pioneerof the Nile, Candy Ride, and More Than Ready.
