

Letter from the President

BARRY OSTRAGER President

n the midst of this watershed year for the New York breeding and racing program, I want to take this opportunity to focus your attention on the vital role played by the New York Thoroughbred Breeders (NYTB) and our exceptional executive director Jeff Cannizzo in the renaissance that the New York racing and breeding industry has been experiencing.

First some statistics. Most of you already know that NYTB spent years lobbying for the implementation of the video lottery terminal (VLT) legislation that now provides for enhanced purses at the New York Racing Association racetracks and dramatically increased funding for incentive awards to New York breeders and stallion owners from the New York Breeding and Development Fund ("the Fund"). Significantly, commencing next month, the Fund's share of VLT revenue will increase from 1.25% to 1.5%. And, because the Resorts World Casino has been so wildly successful, in 2014 the Fund should be able to distribute almost twice as much money in breeder, stallion owner, and owner awards as it distributed in 2011.

Not only are New York-breds earning incentive awards at an unprecedented level, New York-bred racehorses are now competing for the most lucrative purses in the nation in both open company and races restricted to New York-breds. At the recently concluded Saratoga meet, NYRA ran 95 races restricted to New York-breds, including 13 stakes. The purses for these New York-bred races totaled \$7,257,000, which was more than \$1 million in purses for each week of the Saratoga meet. New York-breds won 28 additional races in open company and either won or placed in six graded stakes during the meet. There is no doubt that Saratoga was "the summer place to be" for New York-bred racehorses. At the Saratoga meet alone New York-breds earned literally millions of dollars in breeder, owner, and stallion awards.


The earning potential of New York-breds has been reflected in the auction marketplace. Last month seven New York-breds sold for six figure numbers in the main sessions of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. The following week, the yearlings in the expanded New York-bred preferred yearling sale shattered records, generating double-digit increases in average, median, and gross sales for the third year in a row.

NYTB's lobbying efforts are ongoing. This year NYTB assumed a leading role in securing the passage of legislation on advanced deposit wagering (ADW) outlets. The recently passed legislation provides that a percentage of wagers made by New York State residents using ADWs will be allocated to the Fund for breeder, owner, and stallion awards. Based on an estimated \$400 million in handle annually, the Fund could receive an additional \$1.2 million a year. This represents an entirely new and significant source of revenue that the Fund can distribute in breeder incentive awards.

One of the reasons NYTB has had success in our legislative initiatives in Albany is that we have been able to collaborate effectively with the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, as well as NYRA and other industry groups. We have worked hard with the various industry constituents to present a united front in our interactions with the legislative and executive branches of New York State government and with the public. One of NYTB's most productive recent collaborative efforts was with the New York Horse Racing and Agriculture Industry Alliance, which produced a promotional video and a 2012 New York State Equine Industry Economic Impact Study that demonstrated the New York breeding and racing industry is responsible for 33,000 jobs and is a multi-billion dollar driver of the New York State economy. This message has resonated with Gov. Andrew Cuomo and the New York legislature as our elected representatives are properly concerned about job creation and the New York State economy.

In sum, I am proud to report our organization has had a significant impact on pocketbook issues that affect all breeders. As NYTB president, I want to give a particular shout out to executive director, Jeff Cannizzo, who has worked so tirelessly and effectively on behalf of our expanding membership. We will continue our efforts to assist New York breeders to recover from a period of distress and to enjoy a genuine golden era. The coming year promises to be very exciting for our membership as there truly has never been a better time to be a participant in the New York breeding industry.

New York Stallion Stakes Series Starts New Era with Foals of 2015

The New York Stallion Stakes Series will embark on a brond new 2 will embark on a brand new era beginning with the foal crop of 2015. Beginning with the 2014 breeding season, all foals by stallions who are nominated to the New York Stallion Stakes Series will automatically be eligible for all of the New York Stallion Stakes Series races without a nomination fee.

already in motion, such as Series 2014 (foals of 2012, yearlings of 2013), Series 2015 (foals of 2013, or weanlings of 2013), and Series 2016 (foals to be born in 2014), will be subject to the current rules under which a nomination fee must be paid for both stallion and foal. The change in rules, where the stallion only must be nominated, takes effect cracks because a breeder or buyer forgot to nominate a foal, and there will be a bigger pool of horses to draw from when the races come up, which will make for a better series.

"Breeders and owners should be aware of exactly when this change takes place," Cannizzo said. "Current horses of racing age, 2-year-olds, yearlings, weanlings, and foals in utero are subject to the former rules and must be nominated individually. The new system only takes effect beginning with the foals conceived during the 2014 breeding season."

As in the past, stallions will be required to be nominated to the series by mid-February. The minimum stallion nomination fee will remain at \$2,500, or the stallion's advertised stud fee (whichever is higher), but beginning with foals of 2015 (Series 2017), any foal sired by a nominated stallion will automatically be eligible for the series at no charge.

Breeders should note that any series

Cluster of Stars Runs Off in Gallant Bloom

Making her first start since a commanding victory in the April 13 Distaff Handicap (gr. II) at Aqueduct, New Yorkbred Cluster of Stars rolled to a five-length score Sept. 21 in the \$300,000 Gallant Bloom Handicap (gr. III) at Belmont Park. The win was her sixth in as many starts.

Owned by Harvey Weinstein's Turtle Bird Stable, 4-year-old Cluster of Stars was making her Belmont debut in the 6½-furlong Gallant Bloom having won her first five starts at Aqueduct.

Cluster of Stars broke from the rail under Javier Castellano as 3-1 third choice in the contentious field of eight, which included 2-1 favorite and grade I winner Dance to Bristol.

Cluster of Stars, whose first two starts came against state-breds, broke her maiden by 5½ lengths in February 2012 before returning 11 months later to win an allowance by 6½ lengths. In her stakes debut in the Correction Handicap last February, the filly upset multiple graded stakes winner Nicole H. The filly's three subsequent wins have all come by daylight: 9½ lengths in an allowance-

optional claimer, 2¾ lengths in the Distaff, and five lengths in the Gallant Bloom. Cluster of Stars has now earned \$459.600.

A daughter of Greeley's Galaxy, who stood at Susan and Howard Kaskel's Sugar Maple Farm from 2007 to 2010 before relocating to Louisiana, and her sire's top earner, Cluster of Stars was bred by Michael McPoland and Sean Finn and foaled at Rockmount near Saugerties.

She is one of two winners from four foals to start out of Babyurthegreatest, a Floridabred six-time winner by Hon-

our and Glory Cluster of Stars' second dam, a multiple winner, is a half sister to multiple stakes winner Portentum, by Fast Gold. Babyurthegreatest has only one more reported foal, a 3-year-old gelding by Defer named Gentle Jim, who is a placed runner and also bred by Michael McPoland.

LANGPAP STABLES HOME-BREDS SWEEP LABOR DAY STAKES AT FINGER LAKES

Labor Day at Finger Lakes was a triumph for the breeding program of Dennis and Deborah Petrisak, whose Langpap Stables homebreds Fox Rox and Alwaysinstilettos, offspring of homebred half sisters, won the co-features. Both 2-year olds are trained

by Michael A. Ferraro and were ridden to victory by jockey Pedro Rodriguez.

Fox Rox (Officer—Shesastonecoldfox, by Foxhound) won the Aspirant Stakes for 2-year-olds getting six furlongs in 1:12.01. Breaking her maiden in the \$120,925 stakes boosted her career earings to \$90,055 from three starts.

Alwaysinstilettos (Bandini—Always Belong, by Belong to Me) won the \$121,275 Lady Finger Stakes, getting the six furlongs in 1:13.33.

The Lady Finger was Alwaysinstilettos' second start, after just getting edged out of second behind rising star Artemis Agrotera at the Spa Aug. 16. She has earned \$79,765.

"We knew they both had talent," said Dennis Petrisak of Langpap Stables. "With babies (2-year-olds) it's hard to tell what will happen in a race."

The second dam of Fox Rox and Alwaysinstilettos, who were both born and raised at Tom and Mia Gallo's Blue Stone Farm in Cambridge, is Morgans Raider, a stakes-placed multiple winner by Giboulee bred in New York by Raymond E. Karlinsky and Arthur N. Levien and campaigned by Langpap Stables.

A producer of 12 winners from 12 starters, Morgans Raider's most successful foal is 2001 New York-bred champion 2-year-old filly Shesastonecoldfox. *By Sarah Mace*

NOONMARK SIRES FIRST WINNER

Freshman sire Noonmark was represented by his first winner Sept. 7. Noonmark, a grade III-winning son of Unbridled's Song, stands for \$5,000 at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson, N.Y.

Juvenile Noon Shadow justified his 7-5 favoritism at Suffolk Downs, scoring by a length after traveling five furlongs in 1:01.13. Bred by Sequel Stallions New York and Thomas Dushas, Noon Shadow RNA'd for \$1,700 at the Fasig-Tipton Eastern fall yearling sale near Timonium, Md. The son of the Polish Numbers mare Overdue Number races for Christopher Trakas and Arlene M. Falk.

Noonmark, a \$1.15 million RNA as a Keeneland April 2-year-old, earned his signature win in the 2008 Mr. Prospector Handicap (gr. III) at Gulfstream. He also placed in six stakes and retired with a record of 4-5-3 from 19 starts and earned \$354.090.

Noonmark is out of the Storm Cat mare In the Storm, a half sister to multiple grade I-winning millionaire Formal Gold.

LIVE FOAL REPORT: THE JOCKEY CLUB REPORTS 36.2% INCREASE IN N.Y.-SIRED FOALS IN 2013

The Jockey Club's annual report of the number of state/province-sired live foals of 2013 showed that New York experienced a 36.2% increase this year.

As of Sept. 9, 2013, 971 live foals were reported to The Jockey Club on Live Foal Reports, compared to 713 at this time last year. This data is not a count of the live foals born

in each state or province (i.e. a count of the 2013 New York-bred foal crop) but a count of live foals by conception area, regardless of where the foals were born (i.e. a count of the 2013 New York-sired foal crop).

According to the 2012 Annual Report of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, the number of registered New York stallions stayed constant from 2011 to 2012 at 64. The same report shows that over the last five years the percentage of New York-bred foals by non-New York-based stallions has ranged between 40%-46%.

Among the 10 states and provinces in which stallions covered at least 1,000 mares in 2012, only Florida and New York stallions produced more live foals in 2013 than in 2012 as reported at this time last year. The increase in Florida was 6.6%.

With the number of live foals reported so far approximately 90% complete, the overall reporting of live foals of 2013 is down 2.2% from last year at this time. Ultimately, the 2013 registered foal crop is projected to reach 23,000. The number of stallions declined 8.7% from the 2,620 reported for 2011 at this time last year, while the number of mares bred decreased 4.8% from the 39,838 reported for 2011.

NEW YORK-BRED CHAMPION HESSONITE RETIRED

William J. Punk Jr. and Philip DiLeo's multiple New York-bred champion and nine-time stakes winner Hessonite has been retired from racing at age 5 and will be offered for sale at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, as reported by *Daily Racing Form*.

Trainer David Donk noted fan-favorite Hessonite is sound, but her summer campaign, which included two races 17 days apart in July, took its toll.

"I knocked her out with those two races," Donk said. "Any other horse I'd turn her out for a couple of months and bring her back. But I don't have that luxury with her being in the sale. She wasn't quite the same, so it was my advice to the owners not to press on." Added Donk, "She's been great to me; there's not any more to gain. She's going to make somebody a heck of a broodmare."

Hessonite was bred by

Berkshire Stud in partnership with John Meriwether's Waterville Lake Stables. A daughter of perennial leading New York turf sire Freud (Sequel Stallions New York) and a half sister to two stakes winners, she is out of Lakab, a winning daughter of Manila. Hessonite was purchased by Punk as a 2009 Keeneland September yearling for \$27,000.

With nine stakes victories and four stakes-placings in 22 career starts, Hessonite has put up a 11-3-1 mark and has earned \$879,644.

Withdrawn from last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale to race at 5, Hessonite captured the Beaugay Stakes (gr. IIIT) in her 2013 debut. The blaze-faced chestnut also went out a winner, taking the On the Bus Stakes for state-breds at Saratoga July 19.



emand for yearlings was certainly high as the Sept. 9-21 Keeneland September yearling sale moved forward, seeing a gain of 17% in average to \$102,220 and an 11.1% bump in median from \$45,000 to \$50,000. There was also a substantial increase in the interest in New York-bred yearlings as witnessed by the strong bidding on state-breds throughout the sale.

In all, 114 New York-bred yearlings were cataloged, with 97 of them going through the ring—more than twice as many state-breds as in last year's sale. Seventy-six yearlings found new homes while grossing \$6,162,700. The number sold rose 124% and the gross skyrocketed 173% from 2012. The average price of \$81,088 was 22% higher than a year ago and the median of \$45,000 was an advance of 39%.

Keeneland reformatted its sale for 2013 and offered a

four-day, 875-horse catalog of Book One, representing the "cream of the crop" of North American yearlings. Seventeen New York-breds made their way into Book One based on the quality of their pedigree and the correctness of their conformation. With two outs and a pair failing to meet their reserves, 13 yearlings found new homes, selling for \$2,990,000, good for an average of \$230,000.

At the upper reaches of the spectrum, a son of red-hot sire War Front out of My Dear Annie sold to Coolmore bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne for \$450,000. The dark bay or brown colt, bred by Michael J. and Patricia Palenscar, was consigned to the sale by Padraig Campion's Blandford Stud, agent.

Book Two of the sale at Keeneland, which took place over the weekend of Sept. 14-15 saw brisk selling. Twen-

ty-six registered New York-breds were among the 848 yearlings cataloged. Fifteen sold for \$1,820,000, which worked out to an average of \$121,334. Two were withdrawn from the sale and nine (37.5%) RNA'd.

Nine of the 15 sold reached six figures, headed by a \$200,000 Hard Spun filly out of Comacina that was purchased by John Fort from the VanMeter Sales consignment. The half sister to juvenile stakes-placed runner Lake Dancer was bred by Our Sugar Bear Stable.

Books Three through Five showed solid results with a few standouts: A Super Saver—Dattcatsgotrhythm filly sold for \$100,000 in Book Three from the Select Sales, agent, consignment; in Book Four a Kitten's Joy—Esther Got Even colt sold for \$185,000, and a Warrior's Reward—Twin Appeal filly brought \$110,000.

The Sequel

Year II of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed sale figures to build on last year's success

In the movies, rarely is the sequel better than the original. In the case of Thoroughbred sales, however, Fasig-Tipton New York's Saratoga fall mixed and horses of racing age sale Oct. 7 figures to exceed the results from last year's auction.

With a growing demand for young New York-breds and breeding stock in the Empire State, Fasig-Tipton officials, along with New York breeders, put together the first fall mixed sale in upstate New York for the first time in nearly a decade in 2012. Wary of how the sale would be met by the marketplace, it seems most everyone was pleased with the outcome.

In all, 119 horses were sold from the 201 that went through the ring. The gross of \$1,933,600 worked out for an average of \$16,249. Fifty-seven of the 88 weanlings offered were reported as sold for an average of \$16,256, and 48 broodmares were sold for an average of \$14,683.

"Last year was the starting point for reestablishing a market for weanlings and broodmares in the fall and it allowed us to see where our progression was going," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "The weanling market last year was fairly strong, but more importantly it was consistent. There were consistent prices throughout the sale and that showed us it wasn't just a few people buying horses in New York but it was many people getting involved with the process. That's our success factor—having many people involved with ownership of New York-breds."

Now comes "Saratoga Fall Mixed Sale: Part II" to the Humphrey S. Finney sale pavilion.

In the last 12 months, momentum in the overall Thoroughbred bloodstock market has picked up steam. Sales of 2-year-olds in training in the early months of 2013 was brisk as every major venue saw advances in average and median. "Strong trade" might be underselling the strength seen in the yearling markets in Kentucky, Florida, and the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select sale so far this year.

The thirst for New York-breds has gotten stronger based on many factors. With purses continuing to soar at the New York Racing Association tracks, a stagnant number of statebreds available, and a higher quality New York-bred being produced, demand has soared.

"Optimistic? Obviously we had a tremendous New York-bred (yearling) sale this past August," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr. "The interest in the program continues to grow. The quality of the horses in the program continue to improve each year. We're optimistic we'll have a strong sale."

Figures from the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Preferred sale Aug. 10-11 tell the tale: the gross rose 64.6% over a strong 2012 sale; 58 more yearlings were sold and the average advanced 15.9%; and the median climbed 10% from \$50,000 to \$55,000.

Expectations are running high for round two of the mixed sale, which

has cataloged 110 weanlings, 103 broodmares, and 25 potential broodmare prospects among the 279 cataloged for the sale.

Weanlings on offer are by the top stallions standing in New York and by some of the world's leading sires. From New Yorkbased sires in the catalog, five are by Bluegrass Cat; a pair by Congaree; eight by D' Funnybone; four by firstyear sire Dublin; 10 by perennial leading sire Freud; four by last year's runaway juvenile sire leader Frost Giant; six by Here Comes Ben; four by Noonmark; four by Posse; and two by Utopia.

Broodmares in the catalog are in foal to a wide array of top stallions, from Alphabet Soup to Tizway. Some of the best selection of sire power can be found in the three mares in foal to Courageous Cat; four to Desert Party; six to Girolamo; four to Mission Impazible; three to Pomeroy; three to Rule; and nine to first-year sire Soaring Empire.

A building block for the entire state-bred program has been the upgrade in quality of pedigrees that have surfaced in sale catalogs this year. That is evident in both the weanling and broodmare (and covering sires) line-up.

"The pedigrees are improving every year; that was evident in the yearling sale," Browning said. "There was evidence of the job the New York breeders have done, showing continued improvement."

"This sale is following suit of the summer's yearling sale in terms of upgrading the quality of the catalog," Cannizzo said. "The weanlings in this sale are by commercial stallions. There is a commercial feel to the horses being sold based on those pedigrees and that ultimately will help the sale."

Return of the Pinhookers

Another thing that will help the

2013 version of the Saratoga mixed sale is the success that was found by some venturesome weanling-to-yearling pinhookers who bought foals out of the first sale last year and wound up landing some pretty nice prices in the preferred yearling sale in August.

"The pinhookers did well and they'll come up in droves for this year's sale," said Derek MacKenzie, director of public sales for Vinery Sales & Millennium Farms. Last year Vinery Sales was the leading consignor, selling 28 horses for \$478,200. That was good for an average of \$17,079—5% higher than the sales average.

At the August sale a Congrats colt brought \$200,000 after selling for \$37,000 at the fall mixed sale; a Freud colt that was a \$33,000 weanling sold for \$110,000; and a Yes It's True colt, a \$25,000 weanling purchase, sold for \$75,000.


"The people who pinhooked weanlings into yearlings did very well," Cannizzo said. "Based on that fact, you'll see a few different people buying. You'll see those same types of pinhookers who did well, and other people looking to get into the New York program. You'll see a variety of people involved in the sale," he said. "A diverse group of people including end-users and breeders that are retooling, more so than at any of the other sales we've had."

The signs are in place for a success-

ful sale: increased demand for state-bred runners on the track, improving quality in pedigrees and bloodstock, and a wider net of buyers on the grounds.

Based on the past performances, this year's box office should be busier.

"This is not year one, this is year two," Cannizzo said. "Fasig-Tipton has done a very good job of building this sale, and I'd like to believe year two will be better than year one."



A Good Read

Readtheprospectus the latest big thing in the breeding career of Howard Nolan Jr.

or Howard Nolan Jr., Thoroughbred racing has been a nearly 70-year love affair, one that began in Saratoga in 1946 and was a case of love at first sight.

"I was a fan from day one," he said in June, not long after a horse that he bred, Readtheprospectus, had won his first stakes race, the \$150,000 Commentator Handicap for New York-breds at Belmont Park.

Nolan had sold the son of Read the Footnotes—Near Bethany, by

Affirmed, as a 2-year-old at the 2011 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale; he was purchased by bloodstock agent Patrice Miller for Bill Lawrence and Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables for \$30,000, and his six wins in nine starts have netted more than \$300,000. Nolan may be his biggest fan.

"He's been in more winner's circle photos than I have," said Lawrence with a laugh after the Commentator win. "He gets as excited as we do when the horse wins."

Listening to Nolan talk about his horses it's easy to forget that racing is not his primary business. A graduate of the College of the Holy Cross, Nolan earned a law degree from Albany Law School of Union University in 1957 and practiced law in Albany, not far from his hometown of Mechanicville, N.Y. In 1964 he and Mark Heller opened a law firm in their names, and in 1974 he was elected to the New York Senate, where he

served for 20 years.

He bought his first Thoroughbred two years later, and nearly four decades after that purchase, with the leisure time of retirement at his disposal, he can devote himself fully to the sport he loves.

He and his wife, Shannon, spend the summers at their Albany home, attending the races nearly every day during the Saratoga season, welcoming guests to their front-row box inside the sixteenth pole. They winter in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., within easy reach of Gulfstream Park, and on a recent September afternoon, he was headed first to Lexington to the Keeneland September yearling sale, and then to Ocala, to see some of his young horses as they begin training.

Unless, that is, Readtheprospectus races at Belmont, in which case Nolan may well forego a few days in Kentucky for a return trip north.

"I'm selling a horse at Keeneland," he said, "but I'd rather watch the race."

The win in the Commentator was Readtheprospectus' sixth in a row; four had come in allowance/optional claiming races, and his owners had been considering an open stakes race for him this summer before a minor injury led to a brief layoff. He returned to serious training in the barn of trainer Chad Brown in August and made his first start since June a winning one Sept. 19 in the one-mile Spite the Devil Stakes for state-breds in preparation for a planned start in the Empire Classic on New York Showcase Day Oct. 19.

Nolan purchased Near Bethany privately from Questroyal Farm when she was in foal with Readtheprospectus.

"She had a good pedigree," said Nolan, "and she was a big, good-looking mare. The only thing I didn't like was that she hadn't, to that point, produced anything particularly good."

Near Bethany is out of grade II stakes winner Choose a Partner, a half sister to Star Choice, a multiple graded stakes winner who won the 1983 Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) and finished second to Royal Heroine in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT). Near Bethany's 2007 foal, Rascal Flatter, earned nearly \$200,000 in 38 starts, primarily in allowance races; he was her most successful foal until Readtheprospectus came along.

Nolan usually keeps his fillies and sells his colts, racing the fillies and adding them to his broodmare band, which currently numbers 12. Though he has owned three farms, he has sold them all and now boards his mares at H & H Farm near Fort Edward, owned by Ann Hayes and Joan Harris.

"They're former show horse people and as most show horse people are," he said, "they're very good for horses. They're very dedicated, and I'm getting too much gray hair to

own a farm."

All 12 of his broodmares had live foals this year, and he expects that he'll sell 10 of them, some as weanlings, some as yearlings. One of his 2013 foals is a half brother to Readtheprospectus, from the first crop by New York-based Giant Surprise.

Nolan has two other half siblings to Readtheprospectus, a 2012 colt by Utopia that he intends to sell at Ocala in April, and a 3-year-old filly by Bellamy Road, Fortheluvofbethany, that he intends to race.

"She's showing some promise," he said of the latter. "She's a great big, rangy filly, and she's had some problems as she's gone through her growth cycles, but she's back training well in Ocala, and I hope that she'll start by the end of the year."

As interested as Nolan is in breeding and racing, his commitment to

horses doesn't stop there. His first farm was near Goshen, N.Y., and on his way to work in Albany in the early 1980s, he'd drive past the Wallkill Correctional Facility. On the board of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation at the time, he noticed that the facility wasn't using a big part of its farm land.

"We were looking for ways to be able to take care of retired horses and it dawned on me one day," he explained, "that the farm would be a great place to board horses, and that we could train prisoners to work with horses so that when they got out of prison, they'd have a skill that they could use in the racing business or on a farm."

Nolan was in the state senate at the time and knew Tom Coughlin, the commissioner of corrections, who agreed to meet with him to discuss the idea.

A staunch supporter of the New York breeding program, Nolan calls it "by far the best in the country."

"Fortunately," he said, "the commissioner was a very progressive kind of guy and caught right on to the idea."

The result was the first Thoroughbred retirement farm at a correctional facility, one that has served as a model for other facilities across the country. Wallkill is currently home to 29-year-old Quick Call, a multiple graded stakes winner who won the Forego Handicap (gr. II) in 1988 and 1989, along with dozens of other horses, including Globalization, also owned by Klaravich Stables, which contributes to his care at Wallkill.

Nolan currently serves on the board of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, and he's a past president of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. In the late 1990s he was a member of the Center to Preserve Racing, a non-profit group that studied issues in racing such as the New York Racing Association franchise, casino gambling, and off-track betting.

A staunch supporter of the New York breeding program, Nolan calls it "by far the best in the country," especially since the influx of revenue from the Genting casino at Aqueduct. In his early 80s, he shows no signs of slowing or of lessening his involvement in the sport.

Through his broodmares and their progeny, and through his work in the industry's various organizations, Nolan has ensured his imprint on New York racing will be deep and long-lasting. But even when he stops breeding and racing, his legacy will live on in the generations of horses and humans who get a second chance at Wallkill and at other farms like it, farms that might never have existed had Nolan not pressed for their creation.

"It's a win/win situation for retired horses and for prisoners," he said, "and for the prison, to use that land.

"But my primary goal," he added, "was to find a home for retired racehorses." 70

Fabulous Finishes Discreet Marq earns second in grade I Garden City; other state-breds shine

ne of the more impressive recent performances by a New York-bred didn't end up in the winner's circle, but Patricia Generazio had nothing but accolades for Discreet Marq, her 3-year-old homebred filly, after her second-place finish in the Garden City Stakes (gr. IT) Sept. 14 at Belmont Park.

"She's got a big heart," said Generazio. "We're proud of her."

Over an inner turf course labeled firm despite recent deluges, the daughter of Discreet Cat out of stakes-winning To Marquet (Marquetry) led for most of the 1% miles under jockey Garrett Gomez before being caught at the eighth pole to lose to Alterite by 11/2 lengths.

"I think the racetrack was a little wet," said Generazio. "She loves firm turf and it was a little bit mushy at Belmont. Chris

walked the turf course in the morning and thought it was a little soft, so for her to try like she did on a surface she disliked was just amazing to us."

"Chris" is trainer Christophe Clement, who began training Discreet Marq earlier this year and who also trained her dam for Generazio. In four starts for Clement, Discreet Marg has won three times, including the Sands Point Stakes (gr. IIT) and Del Mar Oaks (gr. IT).

She is the latest in a line of homebreds from this family for Generazio and her husband, Frank, who claimed Discreet Marg's third dam, Turn to Mommie, specifically to breed her.

"She was racing in Boston and we were standing a stud, Concorde Bound, for the first time," said Generazio. "She was a hard-knocking mare, she always tried, and we loved that she was white. She was a foundation mare for us."

Five of Turn to Mommie's 11 foals have gone on to earn more than \$100,000,

the most successful of which was multiple graded stakes winner Unreal Turn. Discreet Marq's second dam, Pretty Momma, was a multiple stakes winner, while her daughter To Marquet earned nearly \$200,000 before becoming a successful broodmare for the Generazios. Discreet Marq is a half sister to the stakes-placed Marquet Cat (Cat Thief) and stakes winner Marquet Madness (Pico Central), earners of \$386,881 and \$226,994, respectively.

Though the Generazios and Clement haven't decided where Discreet Marq will race next, it won't be at the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

"There's no straight 3-year-old race, and we just don't feel as though she can (go against older horses) right now," said Patricia. "Maybe next year."

As for this year Generazio described it as "fabulous," her excitement undiminished by her filly's runner-up finish. "She fought to the end," she said. "Her ears were pinned back, and she knew why she was out there."

Patsy Symons' Effie Trinket had also been entered in the Garden City, but was scratched by trainer Rick Violette Jr. to run the following day in the \$150,000 John Hettinger Stakes for New York-breds. After a gutsy neck victory, Violette wondered aloud whether he'd made the right call, but Symons had no reservations about her trainer's choice.

"I always leave everything up to Rick," she said. "He's done such a wonderful job."

Racing wide throughout the 1½ miles under jockey Luis Saez on a firm inner turf course, Effie Trinket sat behind a slow pace and closed inside the sixteenth pole to get up in 1:50.39.

"I usually try to go, but I couldn't get up there this weekend," said Symons from Florida. "I was so excited to see her win."

Bred by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds and purchased as a yearling by Antigo Farms for \$4,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s January sale in 2011, Effie Trinket (Freud—Maya's Note, by Editor's Note) caught Symons' eye a year later at the OBS April 2-year-old sale.

"She was just wonderful looking," she said. "I like Freud as a sire very much,

and if you look at her, she's just almost perfectly built. She's got a beautiful top line and nice muscles, and she's a good size for a filly. She's what we were looking for, and we were lucky to get her."

Purchased by Symons for \$130,000, Effie Trinket has earned \$312,150.

"I like to buy New York-breds, but it's getting harder," she said, referring to the prices. "Everyone wants them."

An inveterate reader, Symons continued the tradition of her multiple stakes winner Gitchee Goomie, naming Effie Trinket after a character in *The Hunger Games*.

"I read a lot," she said. "Gitchee Goomie came from the poem 'Hiawatha,' and in *The Hunger Games*, Effie Trinket was one of the chaperones. She wore lots of pink

and in the movie she had green hair. My colors are green and pink, and I thought it would be a great name for a horse."

Sent off as the second choice in the field of 10, the equine Effic Trinket lived up to her namesake's oft-quoted line, "May the odds be ever in your favor."

Gitchee Goomie was also trained by Violette, whose barn Symons visits nearly every day in Saratoga in the summer, a practice that has deepened

her appreciation of the work of Violette's staff.

"He has the most wonderful crew," she said. "I know all of the grooms, and I treat them like family, because they are. It's a big deal when they win."

Shortly before Effie Trinket's victory, Kate Durocher met trainer Tim Hills in the racing office. Her father's horse, Kharafa, was running in the \$150,000 Ashley T. Cole Stakes, and Durocher was there to transfer ownership of the horse from the name of his estate. An hour later, she was standing in the winner's circle with tears in her eyes, having watched Kharafa win his first stakes race, not quite four months after her father's death.

"He worked with Timmy for a long time, and this was his dream," she said. "This is a great, amazing testament."

Lawrence Durocher Jr. bred the son of Kitalpha in the name of High Meadow Farm; horse racing was, said his daughter, not his profession, but his passion.

"I spent my life at the track being a part of it with my dad," she said.

A 4-year-old gelding out of the King of Kings mare Exquisite Cassie, Kharafa had placed in all three of his previous stakes attempts. Watching the replay of the victory with Durocher, Hills said, "I'm getting goose bumps."

Sent to the lead by jockey Javier Castellano from the rail, Kharafa was a wire-to-wire winner, holding off a late charge by the grade III stakes-winning Lubash to win by a head, running the 1½ miles on a firm inner turf in 1:49.21.

Durocher is expected to disburse her

father's stable, which includes Kharafa's dam and half sister. "That's what Mr. Durocher wanted," said Hills.

Interposed his daughter with a smile, "Unless one of us suddenly becomes a horse nut."

Added Hills with a nod to the replay, "We're working on it."

"This feels like a continued connection with my dad," said Durocher. "It's amazing to be here and be a part of that memory."

Saratoga Send Off

Last month, Saratoga wrapped up its New York-bred stakes series with the \$100,000 Union Avenue Stakes Aug. 19 for fillies and

mares and the Saratoga Dew Stakes Aug. 26, the latter offering arguably the most popular win of the meet when trainer Allen Jerkens won his first race of the meeting with Go Unbridled.

"It means a lot more to win at Saratoga," he said in an emotional winner's circle, listening to the applause of the crowd.

Racing well off the pace under jockey Junior Alvarado through the early stages of the nine-furlong race, Go Unbridled commenced a bit on the far turn and took command at the sixteenth pole, drawing off to win by 2% lengths in 1:51.68.

A 6-year-old bay mare, Go Unbridled got her first victory of the year in the

Saratoga Dew, a race she won last year. Bred by Thinking Cap Stable and owned by Howard T. Whitbred, the daughter of Unbridled Jet out of Reign Or Shine (Majesty's Time) has earned \$392,910. Jerkens has also trained both of Go Unbridled's half siblings.

"I took a chance and worked her like we used to work the horses (seven furlongs in 1:28.19 on Aug. 21 and seven furlongs in

1:29.78, Aug. 16), and I was going to be open for a lot of criticism, but I didn't care," said Jerkens. "She worked really good. It always makes it special, when people have confidence in you and keep the horses with you. You feel great."

The 5-year-old mare Willet (Jump Start—Katina K, by Distinctive Pro) had made only 10 starts in her three-year career prior to the \$100,000 Union Avenue, but trainer James Iselin said in the Saratoga winner's circle that's been by design.

"If you race hard in the winter time in New York," he explained, "the money is there but you're not going to really have a chance in the big races. You can't run all winter long and then expect to do well at Saratoga. It's too tough."

His strategy seemed to work, as the horse he co-owns with Charlotte Assoulin and Eli Gindi has a record of 5-4-1 with earnings of \$329,900.

Bred and originally owned by Michael Martin, Willet was purchased by Iselin and his partners following Martin's death.

"Michael Martin was one of my best friends, and his father was a partner of my father's in the Jets and Monmouth Park," said Iselin. "He died early, and Rick Violette was nice enough to sell her to me. It worked out well, right?"

The senior Iselin was at one time presi-

dent of both Monmouth Park and the New York Jets, while Martin was on the board of directors of the racetrack and an owner of the football franchise.


"This race is for all the small trainers at Aqueduct," said Iselin, whose horse has two wins and a second at the track in Ozone Park. "Never, ever give up, because there's always a chance."




