## New York-breds Loom Large on Big Sandy; Big Sandy Looms Large for the Program

**AT THE HEIGHT** of the 38-day Belmont fall meet, now known as the Belmont Fall Championship Meet, and at the approach of one of its anchors—New York-bred Empire Showcase Day on Oct. 24—it is illuminating to take a look at the fundamental inter-relationship between the Belmont race meets in both spring and fall and the overall profile of the New York-bred racing and breeding program.

In a nutshell, statistics reveal that, on the one hand, New York-breds are critical to the New York Racing Association's ability to construct race cards and fill races at both Belmont race meets. On the other hand, we find that racing at Belmont is an essential component for the success of the New York breeding program in terms of racing opportunities, purses, breeders' awards, and a combination of intangibles that lead to breeder success in the sale ring.

Last year NYRA carded 28% of 874 total races run at Belmont (or 250 races) for New Yorkbreds. Even more striking is the overall level of New York-bred participation at the Belmont meets in terms of individual starts. State-breds accounted for 44% of the 6,755 total number of Belmont starts—2,128 starts in restricted races and 823 starts in open company. Clearly, New York-breds play a predominant role, not only in the way Belmont race cards are written but also ensuring a robust field size from day-to-day that is attractive to bettors.

If New York-bred participation is essential to the success of the Belmont meets, by the same token state-breds are also carrying home a healthy share of Belmont's lucrative purses.

Total purse money disbursed by NYRA at Belmont in 2014 amounted to more than \$72 million. New York-breds earned 30% of this or nearly \$22 million, taking home \$16.8 million in restricted races and \$5.2 million in open company.

The large number of New York-bred starts

and significant purse earnings translate into immediate dividends for breeders. In the context of the program as a whole, 31% of all breeders' awards by dollar amount were earned at Belmont, nearly \$4 million. The great majority of this, roughly \$3 million, was earned in non-claiming races.

Which brings me to my last point: quality. Because New York-breds win 66% of their Belmont purse money in allowance or stakes races, this means that state-breds are making not only lots of starts at both Belmont meets—a bonus from NYRA's point of view—but lots of quality starts, which speaks volumes for New York-breds in the sales ring.

Thoroughbred sales company executives now refer regularly to the "improved quality" of New York-breds at auction. Aside from the individual attributes of a yearling or weanling, sire power and nicks, buyers are scanning the catalog page for quality racetrack performances and earnings from the dam and siblings. The more of these elements that make their way onto the catalog pages of our sale horses, the greater the value to the individual, and, by extension, to the New York-bred population as a whole. There is no doubt that a lot of this is taking place on the track known as "Big Sandy."

Each NYRA meet—Belmont, Saratoga, Aqueduct—in combination with Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack, makes a unique and important contribution to the success of the New York racing and breeding program. At Saratoga, arguably, the accent is on quality; at Finger Lakes and Aqueduct, probably more on quantity and broader distribution of awards. In the end, Belmont seems to contribute a unique blend of both quality and quantity that plays an ongoing and important role to the program's profile from sale ring to shedrow.

### HOT CITY GIRL GRABS GRADE III GLORY

Lady Sheila Stable's Hot City Girl, was perhaps best known as the promising half sister to multiple grade II winner and millionaire La Verdad. The talented New York-bred 3-year-old filly made her own headline Sept. 19 when she broke through in front-running style in the \$350,000 Charles Town Oaks Stakes (gr. III) in West Virginia.

The victory makes her the eighth New York-bred to win a graded stakes in 2015.

The Linda Rice-trained daughter of City Zip added blinkers, perhaps tipping her hand she would use her speed as her main weapon under jockey Jose Ortiz for the two-turn, seven-furlong tilt at the Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races.

Winner of a state-bred allowance optional claimer in January and placed just once during a steady diet of four stakes races since, Hot City Girl ended up as the fifth betting choice in the field of six at 7-1. Breaking from post three, Hot City Girl darted toward the front and took possession of the rail by the time the field had entered the first turn. Pressed by Toutsie Rules through an opening quarter-mile in :22.96 and a half-mile in :46.74, Hot City Girl kept at least a neck ahead of her rival through the far turn. She cleared the field at the top of the stretch, hitting the wire a 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-length winner in 1:23.80.

Repole Stable's Temper Mint Patty completed a New York-bred exacta, closing from third to nose out Toutsie Rules.

"We're thrilled," Rice said. "I'd scratched her out of the Prioress (Stakes, gr. II, at Saratoga) when she drew the 1 (post) in a large field, and I didn't like the way the race set up for her. She was 6-1 in here, so it wasn't like she was a big favorite or something, but Jose rode a beautiful race."

"We had been trying to get her graded

placed or a graded win," Rice continued. "I've trained for Mrs. (Sheila) Rosenblum for a while, so this is special."

Bred by Eklektikos Stable, and foaled, like La Verdad, at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm near Chestertown, Hot City Girl is another feather in the cap of her dam Noble Fire, a stakes-placed runner bred by the Bromans and also trained by Rice.

Rice bought Noble Fire for Eklektikos for \$115,000 at the 2007 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds in training. In addition to stakes winner La Verdad and Hot City Girl, Noble Fire's stakes-winning first foal, the speedy eight-time winner N. F.'s Destiny, has earned more than \$300,000.

With three firsts and two seconds from nine career starts, Hot City Girl has earned \$344,150. *By Sarah Mace*

#### New York-Breds Stand Out at Keeneland September

Through the first three books of the Keeneland September yearling sale, New York-breds have posted impressive numbers, outperforming the general population of the sale in median and just 2.6% off on average.

At the top end of the market are a pair of New York-breds—a colt and a filly—that brought \$500,000. (Last year's state-bred topper was at \$400,000.)

Both were bred by Newton Anner Stud near Millbrook and sold through Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency.

The filly is a Malibu Moon half sister to grade I winner I Want Revenge. She was purchased by Castleton Lyons. The colt, by Unbridled's Song— Graciously Soft, by Vindication, was purchased by Teruo Ono.





## Making the Cut BY TERESA GENARO

Jeweler Mark Valentine's Ex Ex Ex gains him entry to stakes company **IN 2002 MARK VALENTINE** was working in his jewelry store in Milford, Conn., when a wedding band salesman came in to do a little business.

But before the salesman displayed his wares, he asked Valentine if the store had Internet access and then directed Valentine to a racing website.

"I wasn't really into horse racing," said Valentine. "I was kind of a casual, 'bet a few races' kind of guy."

But after watching the video of the salesman's Eye of the Comet win the 2001 Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct, Valentine changed his tune.

"'Are you kidding me?'" he remembered asking. "'How can I get a horse like that?'"

In a scenario that might recall one of Runyon's plots, the salesman noted that his trainer, Sal Iorio, "just happened" to have recently purchased a yearling that needed an owner, and the next day, for a \$2,500 investment, Valentine bought his first horse.

It took that horse, Forever Flawless—the first but not the last of Valentine's horses named to reflect the diamond business—10 starts to break her maiden, but it was the beginning of a relationship with Iorio that lasts to this day and of a racing/breeding business that has expanded over the last decade, often under Iorio's influence.

"Over time," explained Valentine, "Sal and I got a couple of horses, and when we started shipping them back and forth, he said, 'If we owned our own trailer, I could save you all that shipping money.'

"So after Forever Flawless broke her maiden at Aqueduct, I took the money and bought a trailer."

As his stable expanded and his horses needed boarding away from the racetrack, Iorio said to him, as Valentine recounted, " 'We're renting space all over the place. If we only owned our own farm ... '

"So I bought some land next to the track at Finger Lakes, and I built a little barn."

That was followed by a big barn, and then a stallion, and then some broodmares.

"I have that kind of personality," Valentine admitted. "I can get a little obsessed."

Curiosity, if not obsession, led Valentine into the jewelry business nearly 30 years ago, in as accidental a way as he got involved with Thoroughbred racing. In the jewelry district in Manhattan with his parents, who worked in real estate, he became absorbed as he watched a jeweler resize a ring. Working as a bartender then, he said to his mother Shirley, "That's pretty cool. How can I do that?"

She found a jewelry training program for him, and after he had worked in the business for a few years, he and his parents opened a store, Valentine's Diamond Center, in Milford. He expanded the original space five years ago, nearly doubling the square footage during a year-long construction project.

"It's grown into a monster," he said. It's also given rise to Valentine's naming meme. In addition to Forever Flawless, Valentine has also campaigned New York-bred Diamond District, a horse he bought as a yearling for \$25,000 and who earned \$326,581, and more recently Ex Ex Ex.

Named not for past marriages—Valentine's been married only once—but for the highest quality of diamond, Ex Ex Ex won the Cab Calloway division of the New York Stallion Series at Saratoga in August, giving Valentine his first stakes win and his first Saratoga win after more than 10 years in the business.

"It's un-freaking believable," he said in the winner's circle that day. "I can't tell you how good it feels."

Valentine got into the breeding side of the game—with partner Iorio, of course—in 2004 after he bought into a horse trained by Iorio and owned by his brother Carmine. Don Corleone, a son of Incurable Optimist, upset the New York Derby that year at 59-1, and while he went winless in two other starts before being retired—the only two starts in which Valentine was a partner—he became Valentine's first stallion.

"He was a big, good-looking horse," Valentine said. "His dam, Twice Forbidden, was the 2008 New York broodmare of the year."

In addition to producing Don Corleone, Twice Forbidden also foaled Tin Cup Chalice, the 2008 New York-bred 3-year-old champion male, and 2009 Withers Stakes (gr. III) winner Mr. Fantasy.

"Don Corleone was no superstar, but

there was enough talent in the family to give it a shot," said Valentine. "It was kind of a money pit and we stopped on him, but one of his 3-year-olds, who might be the most promising of his offspring, just won."

That horse, Four Black Even, finished sixth in his debut at Saratoga in early August but came back 10 days later to win with Iorio at Finger Lakes.

"I plan on staying with breeding, but with better-bred mares and more proven stallions," said Valentine. Down to one mare at his Central New York farm, he expects to shop at the Fasig-Tipton fall mixed sale at Saratoga later in the month, looking specifically at in-foal mares.

Valentine has purchased sparingly at sales in recent years, and while he might have an eye for a valuable gem, he learned the hard way that his eye for a valuable Thoroughbred isn't quite as sharp.

"It didn't work out too well, picking out my own horses," he said with a rueful laugh, recalling the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale. "I bought seven horses, six I liked, one the trainer liked. The horses I liked did nothing, and the one the trainer liked, Diamond District, won a lot of money. So I gave up on that."

When it comes to claiming, he does the initial research, picking out horses

based on numbers and available conditions, then leaves it to the trainer to do due diligence on the horse's soundness.

"I don't want to claim the best horse," said Valentine. "I want to claim the horse I can make the most money with, which isn't always the same thing."

"Look at Ex Ex Ex," he pointed out. "He doesn't have to be a superstar, and he's already made a lot of money. He's a New York-bred and he's eligible for the Stallion Series."

Valentine has about 15 horses in training with various trainers on the East Coast, and while they're not all New York-breds, he said that horses bred here are "his thing," given the variety of levels of competition offered at the state's racetracks.

"I breed in New York and I claim in New York," he said. "Ex Ex Ex is a nice horse, but does he ever win a stakes race if he's not a New York-bred?"

Valentine purchased three New Yorkbreds out of this year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June sale of 2-year-olds in training; one of them, Rock Garden, was second by a head at 51-1 at Saratoga last month and is entered to run back at Belmont in late September.

Valentine's passion for racing isn't shared by his immediate family; his wife, Theresa, and three children, who range in age from 17 to 20, like it when the horses win but otherwise don't pay a lot of attention.

"My wife wasn't too thrilled when I bought the first horse," he said. "And that's a nice way to put it."

Shirley, who passed away last year, is another story.

"A couple of weeks after I bought Forever Flawless," he said, "she jumped in the car and drove to Delaware Park

with me to claim another one."

They had been partners in the jewelry business since his father's murder in 1988, in an armed robbery at the store they had opened the previous year. And while they ultimately became successful enough to undertake the expansion, those early years weren't always easy ones.

"It had been a real struggle," Valentine said. "So she told me, 'You work hard. If this is what you want to do, I'll take a ride with you.' She was my biggest fan, and the biggest racing fan in the family."

He purchased Ex Ex Ex and two other horses when his mother was ill, and when it came time to name them, he honored both Shirley and his grandmother, who recently turned 100.

"Both Palm Beach Shirley and Little Nell won at Finger Lakes, and I have their win pictures next to each other," he said.

While the jewelry business is still Valentine's primary vocation, he's found himself increasingly immersed in the equine world, recently building himself-and trainer Iorio-homes on the farm near Finger Lakes.

"The horse business and college tuition keep me working," he said. "I can't give up either one of those things, or I might go off into the sunset.

"The horses have been doing very well the last few years," he continued with appreciation. "You can't always count on that, but they've been supporting themselves, and that's a blessing."

## SOARING Interest

New York-bred Shared Interest: grade I winner and grade I producer IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY, New York was a major center of Thoroughbred breeding. It had not only good land but proximity to the centers of the nation's fi-

**IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY**, New York was a major center of Thoroughbred breeding. It had not only good land but proximity to the centers of the nation's financial, social, and racing elite. Nonetheless, more favorable land prices and tax structures in Kentucky, combined with the lingering effects of the racing blackout of 1911-13, caused many breeders to leave the state or the business entirely. The remainder existed in what had become a breeding backwater, even though racing in New York soon regained its reputation as America's best.

That began to change with the inception of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund in 1973, a program designed to attract breeders and better breeding stock to the state by providing incentives for the breeding and racing of horses bred in the state.

As the saying is, "Money makes the mare go," and by the early 1990s enough good mares—and breeders—had gone to New York that the state could boast of its first state-bred national champion in more than two decades, thanks to 1992 champion

3-year-old filly Saratoga Dew.

Robert S. Evans was among the breeders operating in the state by then, and he was just the type the fund's developers wanted to attract. Well-heeled and with excellent family connections in the breeding world (his father, Thomas Evans, was the owner/breeder of 1981 champion 3-year-old male Pleasant Colony and had been operating Virginia-based Buckland Farm since 1956), Evans could afford to breed the kind of horses that would add cachet

to the words "New York-bred." Among them was Shared Interest, a mare who would have been a jewel in the record of any state breeding program.

Foaled Jan. 30, 1988, Shared Interest had an excellent pedigree. By Pleasant Colony, already an established stud success at the time of her conception, she was the fourth foal produced from Surgery, a Dr. Fager mare who had produced multiple stakes winner Left Court (by Valdez) as her first foal and two-time Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) winner Sewickley (by Star de Naskra) as her second. The second dam of Shared Interest, Bold Sequence (by Bold Ruler), was a stakes-

other progeny of Pleasant Colony, Shared Interest did not race until April 6 of her 3-year-old season, breaking her maiden over seven furlongs at Aqueduct. She

Star and the high-class Lite Light in the Coaching Club American Oaks (gr. I), then at 10 furlongs. A substantial jump in both distance and class was too much for the Evans filly, who finished more than 17 lengths behind Lite Light in fourth. After running a good second to Hollywood Oaks (gr. I) winner Fowda in the Monmouth Oaks (gr. II) two weeks later, Shared Interest was away from the races for nearly three months before popping up to take the one-mile Burlington County Stakes at Meadowlands.

At 4 and 5, Shared Interest continued developing, though it took until October 1992 before she finally nailed her first graded win, the seven-furlong First Flight Handicap (gr. II). This was at the expense of multiple grade I winner Missy's Mirage, who was conceding 10 pounds. On speed figures this was the best performance of Shared Interest's career, and she bounced in dismal fashion three weeks later in the Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I), finishing 11th behind Pas-

eana. In retrospect, this may have been a little more distance than she really wanted as well, as she never won beyond  $1\frac{1}{6}$  miles.

Returned to the track as a 5-year-old, Shared Interest at last claimed a grade I win in the Ruffian Handicap Sept. 19. She scored at the expense of 1993 Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner Dispute, who was conceding her one pound in actual weight and five by the scale. With a fivepound swing in her favor, Dispute reversed the decision four weeks later in the Beldame Stakes (gr. I), and Shared Interest closed her career with a thirdplace finish in the Nov. 6 First Flight Handicap (gr. II). She ended her career with 10 wins and eight placings (including four in grade I events) from 23 starts.

As a racemare, Shared Interest was a

consistent intermediate-distance type a little short of the top class. Gifted with better early speed than her sire, she fared best when able to stalk the pace and assume command early in the stretch. She lacked the turn of foot to put her rivals away with a sharp burst but was game and determined when set down for the drive.

If Shared Interest's form was not quite good enough to put her in contention for an Eclipse Award, it was more than good enough to secure entrance to the courts of the best stallions in Kentucky. After producing a foal that died in 1995, Shared Interest threw a handsome bay colt to the cover of Storm Cat in 1996. Showing the influence of his dam, the colt had more leg and scope than most Storm Cats and sold for the sale-topping price of \$1.5 million to Aaron Jones at the 1997 Keeneland July yearling sale. Named Forestry, he won the 1999 King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) and became a successful sire best known for the brilliant miler Discreet Cat, 2011 Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Shackleford, and The Green Monkey, who at \$16 million was the highest-priced 2-year-old in training ever sold at public auction.

Shared Interest's next foal was a filly by Seeking the Gold, who was also offered at Keeneland July and was the most expensive filly of the 1998 sale. Purchased for \$1.2 million by Padua Stables, the appropriately named Cash Run won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I) at 2 and two grade II races at 3, helping lift Shared Interest to the title of Owner-Breeder International's 2000 broodmare of the year. Cash Run made headlines again in 2003, when John Magnier of Coolmore paid \$7.1 million for her, then in foal to Storm Cat, at the 2003 Keeneland November mixed sale. The foal Cash Run was carrying, Gstaad, managed to win only two of 17 starts, but Cash Run has since produced stakes winners Great War Eagle (by Storm Cat), Step In Time (by Giant's Causeway), and Move Your Vision (by Galileo).

After producing the Storm Cat filly Intense Interest, who neither raced nor

produced foals, Shared Interest produced the A.P. Indy filly A. P. Interest in 1999. A. P. Interest won one race in four starts for Evans before joining his broodmare band, where she produced 2008 Carry Back Stakes (gr. II) winner Golden Spikes (by Seeking the Gold) and stakes winner Al Muhtasib (by Distorted Humor). Both of these horses were sold as yearlings, but her 2011 Street Cry filly, Street Interest, was retained and became a winner.

The next of Shared Interest's foals, a full brother to Forestry, died after being a \$3.8 million buy-back at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale. He was followed by the unraced Kingmambo filly King's Interest, also a member of the Evans broodmare band and the dam of three winners from five foals of racing age. Another full brother to Forestry, Interest Rate, was next, arriving in 2003; after winning one of five starts, he went to stud in Louisiana in 2008.

Shared Interest died of complications of foaling on March 10, 2005, and her final contribution to the bloodstock world was Shared Hope, a 2005 Gone West daughter who never raced and so far has produced one winner from three named foals of racing age. Thus, her final produce record stands at seven named foals, of which four started and won, including two grade I winners and a grade II producer. While one might like to see more consistency as well as better production from her unraced daughters, Shared Interest's broodmare record can stand without apology.

For owner/breeder Evans, Shared Interest was a success in every sense of the Shared Interest was a success in every sense of the word few mares can boast of having accomplished more

word—as a racemare, as a producer of winners, and as a multi-million-dollar sales producer. She was also a success for the New York-bred incentive program, helping keep its public image and momentum building on the heels of Saratoga Dew's championship season. Few mares can boast of having accomplished more.



Trainer Jeremiah Englehart won 11 of 44 starts at this year's Saratoga stand

## Saratoga Streak BY KAREN M. JOHNSON

New York-based trainer Jeremiah Englehart has Saratoga meet to remember

#### TRAINER JEREMIAH ENGLEHART

had just won the fifth race with Twice Mike on closing day of the 2015 Saratoga Race Course season. He paused leaving the winner's circle on that sultry summer afternoon, whisked away beads of sweat pooling at his brow, and remarked, "Whew. What a meet. I'm sad it's over."

Englehart, 38, was white-hot throughout the boutique six-week stand at the upstate New York track, winning with 11 of his 44 starters to secure the eighth spot in the trainer standings.

"I didn't expect the Saratoga I had at all," commented Englehart, who was 0-for-58 at Saratoga until winning his first race there in 2014. "I always tell people, if you can win one race at Saratoga it's great. Five wins last year was phenomenal, 11 this year is...wow. The

amount of support, and the congratulatory remarks I've had from my peers, friends, and everybody is surreal."

It's not the first time in his 12-year training career that Englehart evoked "surreal" to characterize events on the racetrack. He used the word when describing the 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I), which he won with the 32-1 Ria Antonia. Englehart's filly lost the race by a whisker but was elevated to first place upon the disqualification of She's a Tiger. It was the trainer's first win in a grade I. "The whole experience of the race going on...it felt like the longest race of my life," Englehart said. "I remember jumping up and down and screaming, and I never do that. It was truly a surreal moment.

"I looked at the replay and Ria was bumped hard and I thought we would be put up," Englehart added. "I said a little prayer to my Uncle Leon, who had died in 2005. 'I don't ever ask for much when it comes to racing, but if you could ever get me into the winner's circle, this would be the time to do it.'"

Englehart is the eldest of six children born to Finger Lakes-based trainer Chris Englehart and his wife, Sheila. The Englehart name has been synonymous with racing at the Farmington, N.Y., track since Chris, who has won more than a dozen training titles there, began his career in the early 1970s.

Jeremiah Englehart has fond recollections of canvassing the rural roads of western New York State while in the backseat of his parent's '82 Pontiac Bonneville, sitting shoulder to shoulder with his siblings, after a morning working at the family's farm.

"We went to the farm in the morning before school," Englehart said. "When we were probably 6 or 7, we were putting feed and water in the buckets, walking horses around the barn. With having both my parents in the business it was really special considering the ways things have turned out, and we still hold onto those memories that we had when we were a young family in racing. To be able to learn from the both of them, I was pretty lucky."

Sheila, who Jeremiah says never receives enough recognition for her role in her husband's stable as his assistant, also ponies horses in the afternoon at Finger Lakes. The Englehart's secondyoungest child, Jeffrey, took out his trainer's license in 2013. Jeremiah's uncle, Steve Englehart, is his assistant at his Finger Lakes barn.

Jeremiah apprenticed in his father's barn, and later in the shedrows of Mike Hushion and Ken McPeek. While with Hushion, Englehart said he was lucky to be able to observe a trainer "who, till this day, is the best manager of people and horses that I've ever seen." From McPeek, Englehart said he learned to develop an eye for young horses.

But perhaps the most important takeaway from his early schooling on the track came from his father.

"Know when your horses are right, my father instilled in me," said Englehart, whose number of winners over the last seven years checks in at a solid 22%. "When I first started training, I don't think I was as good with the condition book as I am now. I would always get too high on my horses and put them in spots where they didn't belong. It was one thing my dad hammered home with me is that I had to get my horses in the right races."

Englehart has divisions at Finger Lakes and New York Racing Association tracks. His stable numbers approximately 95 horses and is loaded with New York-breds, which he estimates reflects "60 to 70%" of the roster. Of the 96 races Englehart won through mid-September of this year, 67 were won by New York-breds.

"Obviously, it helps my business being both at Finger Lakes and (NYRA) tracks because sometimes you need a place for the New York-breds to go that are not NYRA quality and Finger Lakes has done a decent job (facilitating that)," Englehart said. "The breeders and everyone with the (New York Thoroughbred and Breeding Development) Fund have done a decent job making sure they have a place to go at Finger Lakes and have decent purses to run for there.

"I'm on the board at Finger Lakes (as a trainer director), and we're trying to make it better for breeders, and I'm really trying to work hard to bring some nicer horses to Finger Lakes," he continued. "To do that, we need to have better purses. I'm hoping someday with the cooperation of Finger Lakes and the Fund we can do that, and bring some breeders and owners back to the local area of Finger Lakes.

"I love the New York-bred program because they are always bringing new stallions to New York, because it's such a lucrative opportunity for their owners to make money," Englehart added. "From the stallion standpoint, I think we have a good, solid group of horses, and I think it will only continue to head in a positive direction."

One of Englehart's newest clients is Joseph Bucci who owns the 300-acre Bucci Farm, that is situated about 45 miles from Finger Lakes. Bucci has

six horses with Englehart, including a 2-year-old homebred colt, by Afleet Alex, who is named My Boy Dillon. The New York-bred, whom both Englehart and Bucci have high hopes for, is scheduled to make his career debut this fall.

"Jeremiah is full of ambition," said

Bucci, whose company, American Rock Salt, is the largest rock salt distributer in the United States. "He is very good at evaluating horses and putting them in the right races at the right time."

Owner Richard Nicolai has been with Englehart since the start of his training career in 2003. Nicolai, whose runners compete under the *nom de course* Fortune Farm, has 16 horses, primarily New York-breds, with the trainer, including some owned in partnership with Chris Dunn.

"I had horses with Jeremiah's father, and I liked the way Jeremiah handled horses when he was working for his dad," Nicolai said. "When he went out on his own, I moved a few horses to him. Our relationship has bloomed since.

"Jeremiah has a very good eye for a horse," he added. "He can look at a horse's conformation and eye one up very quickly. He's quick to recognize the ability in horses, and if they have it, he can bring it out. In a short time, he can get a horse on the right track. Just about every horse he has trained for me he's been able to get a little bit more out of. He would tell me when we claimed or purchased one, after the horse had been in the barn for a few weeks, 'This horse is going to be OK. There is a lot I like about this horse.' And little by little, the horse would just constantly improve. He can determine if they are a keeper or not, and that's what I like."

Englehart recommended to Nicolai that he claim New York-bred Summer Breezing for \$40,000 this past May at Belmont Park. The 6-year-old won his first start for Nicolai and Dunn in a state-bred allowance optional claiming race at Saratoga, and then followed with a third-place finish against open company in Saratoga's Troy Stakes.

"We claimed Summer Breezing off Christophe Clement," Nicolai said. "That was a very bold move because

Clement is one of the best trainers in the business. But Jeremiah felt that Summer Breezing had a little bit left in him, and we claimed him at a good price."

One of the New York-bred stakes runners currently in Englehart's barn is Kendel Standlee's The Tea Cups, who won the Yaddo Stakes at Saratoga this summer and ran second as the favorite in the Sept. 20 John Hettinger Stakes. Serendipitous circumstances delivered the turf filly to Englehart's doorstep in 2014. She had previously been trained by Joan Scott, while competing in races at Woodbine and Tampa Bay Downs.

"I got The Tea Cups by luck," Englehart recalled. "Last year Joan Scott sent her to me to run at Saratoga to take advantage of the New York-bred program. Twice we had to scratch because the races came off the turf. Then Joan said, 'Do you want to keep the filly?' I said, 'OK!' I got lucky because she was training really good when Joan had her, so it was a turn-key situation for me. She has fit very well in the New York-bred ranks." While gaining an unexpected horse is always welcome news, that's not the case when a trainer loses a horse to another trainer. On the same day in February 2014, Englehart learned the owners of Ria Antonia and New York-bred King Kreesa, whom the trainer conditioned to

two New York-bred championship titles in 2013, were removing their horses from his barn. Ron Paolucci, who owned Ria Antonia, was unhappy that Englehart could not spend three weeks in California by the filly's side as she prepared to run in the Santa Anita Oaks (gr. I), and Gerald and Susan Kresa, the owners of King Kreesa, preferred a trainer with a smaller operation.

"I was hurt," Englehart admitted. "I felt like I wasn't given a fair shot. But you know what, the first thing my dad said was, 'Learn from this, and know that you're going to be fine and that you'll have

good horses again.' I sulked for about 24 hours and then I just moved on. I concentrated on the horses I had and the clients that had been with me through thick and thin. I made sure they understood how appreciative I was of them."

On the home front, Englehart's gratitude runs deep for his wife of seven years, Robin, the mother of his five young children, including twins. He said, "I couldn't do what I do, particularly going back and forth weekly between Finger Lakes and (NYRA tracks), without Robin's help."

When Englehart met his future wife, she was a racing neophyte. One day she accompanied him to the races with a horse he saddled to victory. She asked Englehart what the win meant, and he responded, "It means you get a new washer and dryer."

Given that Englehart is on target this season to surpass his career-best 115 wins obtained in 2014, there are probably many more trips to the appliance store in his future.

# Golden Moments BY TERESA GENARO

Gregorian Gold, Love That Jazz both break their maidens in six-figure stakes **GREGORIAN GOLD MAY HAVE LOST** her first start, but the man who owns, trains, and bred her wasn't discouraged that she didn't make it to the winner's circle. A 13-1 shot on Aug. 24 in a maiden special weight at Saratoga Race Course, she finished a good second, beaten 1½ lengths but was four lengths clear of the rest of the field.

On Sept. 18 at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack in the 119,613 Lady Finger Stakes, the 2-year-old rewarded both her trainer's and the bettors' confidence, cruising to a  $4^{1}$ -length victory as the 8-5 favorite.

"I knew right away that she was special," said Richard Lugovich. "The first time she breezed with two other horses, I knew what she was. She was already going better than they were."

A third-generation homebred, Gregorian Gold is by Touch Gold out of the Phone Trick mare Gregorian Jest. Lugovich purchased Gregorian Gold's third dam, Regal Joanie, on the cuff about 15 years ago.

"It was a strange situation," he said by phone from his Fair Hill, Md., base. "A

trainer I knew offered her to me. She was already a winner, but she was barred from the gate in New York, so I said, 'Nah.'"

After a look at her past performances, though, Lugovich changed his mind, earning back well over that conditional purchase price when the daughter of Regal Embrace— Super Katie, by Super Con-

corde, won five races for him.

He was prepared to sell her as a broodmare but backed off after his wife did a little research into her family, another decision that looks like genius, considering that Regal Joanie has produced two six-figure earners for Lugovich, including Regal Chant, winner of the 1996 Damon Runyon Stakes and runner-up the next year in both the Count Fleet and the Whirlaway stakes and the New York Derby.

"Nothing beats luck," he said with good-natured appreciation of both the mare and his good fortune.

A native of Bridgeport, Conn., Lugovich got hooked on horses as a teenager, when he made his first trip to Aqueduct.

"I went with my brother," he said. "And I said, 'How can I own one of these before I die?'"

He's ended up owning way more than one, and he's a one-man operation, training only the horses he owns and breeds. He has about eight horses in training; he keeps his mares just outside Saratoga at his farm near Stillwater, run by his son.

Gregorian Gold popped a splint in the Lady Finger and will be out of training for about 10 days, and while Lugovich has no specific plans for her next start, he's eying New York Showcase Day at Belmont in late October.

"We've got plenty of time," he said. "She's got a very good attitude, and she just tries to please you.

"I don't train her," he added. "She trains me."

#### **Old-time Jazz**

For breeder Dan Barraclough of Saratoga Glen Farm near Schuylerville, N.Y., Love That Jazz' maiden win in the \$115,749 Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes was bittersweet. He'd become accustomed to seeing the offspring of Val's Jazz make it to the winner's circle, but tempering his happiness was the knowledge that Love That Jazz was her last foal.

"We went out to feed her one morning, and she'd just died of old age," he said speaking by phone from the Keeneland September yearling sale, his voice rich with emotion. "She was my pet."

Barraclough had purchased her at the 2006 Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$5,000. She had yet to throw anything that had earned black type, but he liked what he saw and decided she was worth taking a chance on, even though she was 11 years old.

"She was a big, fancy mare with a pretty good walk," he said. "Love That Jazz is her third stakes horse."

By Not For Love, Love That Jazz was purchased last year for \$57,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of New York-bred preferred yearlings by Patrice Miller/EQB acting as the agent for Kenia Lezcano's Happy Face Racing Stable. Miller picks out all of the horses for Happy Face, whose stable numbers a half-dozen, trained at Finger Lakes by



Mike Ferraro and at Belmont by Steve Asmussen.

"Love That Jazz was a very friendly foal," remembered Barraclough, "very correct, and very strong and healthy.

"His dam was the sweetest mare," he continued, "and she threw that to her foals—they were docile and eventempered. She was a great mom and she taught her babies well. They all had great minds and are good, hard-trying horses."

Love That Jazz just barely lost his first start, getting caught late in a maiden special weight at Belmont Park in June. Jumping up to stakes company, he was fifth in the July 18 Rockville Centre Stakes before running second at Saratoga in August. Lezcano expects him to return to Finger Lakes for the Oct. 17 New York Breeders Futurity.

Love That Jazz is also among the last foals by Not For Love, who was pensioned earlier this year.

"I always loved him," said Barraclough. "I always thought he was one of the more underappreciated stallions."

He paused, reflecting on the colt's pedigree.

"He's from two old-timers," he said. "He's kind of a last hurrah." 🏠

# Long Green

WHEN PAUL BRAVERMAN PURCHASED KHARAFA privately in 2013, the horse's status as a New York-bred was a perk, but it was not what drew him to the gelding. But now the success Braverman and his partner, Timothy Pinch, have enjoyed with Kharafa has led to a deeper appreciation and involvement in New York's homegrown product.

Following Kharafa's win in the \$122,500 Ashley T. Cole Stakes for New Yorkbred turf males at Belmont Park Sept. 20, Braverman said in the winner's circle, "I love the New York-bred program. I have started moving in that direction and will be pushing more in that direction."

Braverman, whose ownership interests have included graded winners Cairo Prince and Soldat, purchased Kharafa in the fall of 2013 after he had won the Ashley T. Cole for the estate of his breeder, Lawrence Durocher Jr., a former publisher of *Rolling Stone* magazine.

"It's a bittersweet story because on his death bed, Larry said to his daughter Kate, 'You have to (disperse) all of the horses,' " Braverman said. "Kate really didn't want to sell Kharafa, but she wanted to follow her father's wishes. Hopefully, Larry is still following the fortunes of the horse and it's a happy day for him."

Timothy Hills trained Kharafa for Durocher and recommended his purchase to Braverman, who has had horses with Hills since he entered the business as an owner in 1979.

"Tim Hills said you have to buy this horse. He told me, 'He's not one that I want to put up for sale,' " Braverman recalled.

Kharafa's two-length victory over Runaway Posse in this year's Ashley T. Cole brings his stakes victories to five for his current connections. He has also won outside of New York this year, taking the \$83,500 Elkwood Stakes at Monmouth Park and an allowance race at Keeneland. Last year Kharafa won Belmont's Mohawk Stakes on the Empire Showcase card.

With his win in the Ashley T. Cole, Kharafa boosted his earnings to \$835,137. His record is 11-8-4 from 30 starts. Kharafa is a son of deceased sire Kitalpha, a full brother to Kingmambo, and the unraced mare Exquisite Cassie (by King of Kings).

"All of his wins are special," said Braverman, a retired investment manager. "This is a very tough group <sup>66</sup> All of his wins are special. This is a very tough group of horses, with the likes of Lubash and King Kreesa, in the New York-bred turf division.<sup>99</sup> — Paul Braverman

of horses, with the likes of Lubash and King Kreesa, in the New Yorkbred turf division."

Kharafa's archrival Lubash, the 2014 Ashley T. Cole winner and the favorite to defend his title in this year's edition, finished fourth in the field of five. King Kreesa, the 2014 runner-up, passed the race in favor of Keene-land's Shadwell Turf Mile Stakes (gr. IT).

"Timmy Hills has done a phenomenal job of getting this horse ready for this race," Braverman remarked. "We had to race off a seven-week layoff. We were going to run in the West Point Stakes at Saratoga, and he came up with some mucus the day of the race."

Braverman, who owns approximately 30 horses of racing age, is hoping a pair of 2-year-olds in his stable, Get Jets and Gehrig, also will earn acclaim in the New York-bred program. Bruce Levine is readying Gehrig, a

son of Ghostzapper, for his debut this fall. Braverman bred the gelding on a cover with his mare Captivating Cathy. The Tony Dutrow-trained Get Jets, a son of Scat Daddy, owned in partnership by Braverman with Team D, won his career debut in smart fashion at Saratoga in August.

#### Harboring Value in NY-Breds

Joseph Birnbaum said when he plans matings for his small broodmare band, he typically looks no further than New York State.

"There are a lot of good stallions in New York with good pedigrees," said Birnbaum, who currently has mares in foal to Freud, Heavy Breathing, Posse, and Soaring Empire. "When you look at (progeny) statistics for many New York stallions, you'll discover there is a tremendous amount of value to be had there."

When Birnbaum was sussing out New York sires to breed his mare Royal Mast to in 2010, he chose Raffie's Majesty, a son of the venerable New York stallion Cormorant, whose stud fee was \$3,000. The resulting foal was Old Harbor, the winner of the \$125,000 John Hettinger Stakes at Belmont Park Sept. 20.

Racing as the fourth choice in the field of seven state-bred turf fillies and mares, Old Harbor won the 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub>-mile Hettinger by 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths over the 2-1 favorite, The Tea Cups.

With the victory Old Harbor elevated her earnings to \$395,405 and extended her career record to 5-4-3 in 16 starts. It was the second stakes win for Old Harbor, who captured last year's New York Stallion Series Cupe-


coy's Joy Stakes at Belmont.

Birnbaum, an endocrinologist from Toms River, N.J., raced Old Harbor's dam, Royal Mast, whom he acquired at auction when she was a yearling for \$8,500. The mare died in 2013 after foaling a Girolamo colt, who is expected to reach the races later this year for Birnbaum. His name is New Harbor and he is trained by Russell Cash, who conditions 4-year-old Old Harbor.

"Royal Mast was a very good mare; it was a shame she colicked and couldn't be saved," said Cash, whose 15-horse stable is solely composed of Birnbaum-owned runners. "Royal Mast was the same size, 17-hands or so, but maybe a

little thicker than Old Harbor. She won at Monmouth first time out and raced a couple of more times for us. She ended up chipping a knee, and we didn't race her again.

"It means a lot to me to have trained Royal Mast and now to have her daughter," he continued. "A 5-year-old kid could walk Old Harbor; she is that kind. Her mother was the same way. But when you get Old Harbor on the track, she is a different kind of horse. When she gets her head out in front, she just extends that huge stride of hers. Now we're looking for New Harbor to race before the end of year. We've got high hopes for him."
