

# ‘Breakin’ the Stereotype

**I AM INSPIRED THIS MONTH** to write about a truly wonderful horse, who is, at the same time, “the quint-essential New York-bred.”

These days when we follow New York-breds on the major circuits, we are, for the most part, aware that we are not watching our grandfather’s or father’s New York-bred in action. By the same token, there is a perception that the dramatic improvement in our breeding program over the past few years has not permeated to horses unless they are racing in nationally televised graded stakes on Saturday afternoons. I write today about a horse with an emphatically New York-bred profile who is not on the New York Racing Association circuit but has been excelling in exactly the types of races that are the essence of our program.

Consider the following facts about this horse:

This horse is out of a New York-bred mare.

He is New York-sired.

He was bred by a New Yorker.

He is owned and trained by that same New Yorker.

His first dam is also the offspring of a New York-bred mare and a New York-based sire.

He is based at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack.

Now consider this:

This horse is a multiple stakes winner with three stakes wins this year at Finger Lakes and Belmont Park.

He may well be among the finalists in the sprint and older male categories at our New York-bred Champions Awards Event next April.

He is likely to be honored as the 2016 Finger Lakes Horse of the Year.

I am talking about Debra Breed’s Breakin the Fever. In the Hudson Handicap on Showcase Day, this 4-year-old gelding waged an epic battle with multiple stakes winner and multiple graded stakes-placed runner Weekend Hideaway—the 2-5 favorite and an earner of nearly \$900,000—and won. The triumph of the horse from upstate was not lost on race announcer Larry Collmus. After both horses completed the thrilling and gutsy stretch drive, Collmus concluded his call with a flourish:

“Breakin the Fever, the Finger Lakes Flash did it!”

A few details on his pedigree: Breakin the Fever is by Roaring Fever (a son of Storm Cat) who entered stud in New York at Metropolitan Stud in 2005 before relocating. The gelding is currently the stallion’s second highest career worldwide earner with a bankroll of \$445,721. Breakin the Fever’s dam is winner Breakers West, a New York-bred, New York-sired homebred for Francis Casey out of a winning New York-bred mare Ruthie’s Relic, also bred by Casey. The sire of Breakers West, Rodeo, retired to stud at Gus Schoenborn Jr.’s Contemporary Stallions in 1999 before relocating. All of this makes Breakin the Fever about as New York-bred as you can get.

Meanwhile, as a New York-bred, Breakin the Fever has been able to accumulate substantial awards from the New York program. In 24 starts from 2 to 4 he has raced only three times out of state. Otherwise, he has started at all four tracks in New York: 13 times at Finger Lakes, four at Aqueduct, three at Belmont, and once at Saratoga. A consistent and well-spotted performer, he has steadily collected healthy program awards: \$119,199 in Breeders’ Awards, \$41,936 in Stallion Owner’s Awards, and \$9,576 in Open Owner’s Awards from open allowance races at Finger Lakes.

Breeder/owner/trainer Breed, for whom Breakin the Fever’s first stakes win, the 2015 Ontario County Stakes at Finger Lakes, was also her first stakes win as a trainer, said after the Hudson on Showcase Day: “He has a lot of guts. He puts himself out there.” Added Breed, “He’s always been like that. He’ll run until he can’t run anymore; we’re very blessed.”

Breakin the Fever is such an inspiring horse on so many levels. He should inspire breeders. He should inspire owners and prospective owners. He should inspire trainers. He surely inspires all of us who simply love to root for an outstanding, hard-trying New York-bred gelding. Most of all, he should inspire all who are struggling to keep their dreams alive in Farmington.

The message sent by Breakin the Fever is “Keep fighting the good fight.” 🐾

## FIRST WINNERS FOR ENCAUSTIC, BOYS AT TOSCONOVA, AND SOARING EMPIRE

D'yer Mak'er

Encaustic got off on the right foot Sept. 27 while getting his first winner from his first starter. Rogers Dream won a 5½-furlong maiden claimer at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack gate to wire under Rodolfo Ignacio. He crossed the wire a length the best in of 1:07.96. The juvenile gelding is raced by owner/trainer Jeffrey Englehart and William Molloy.

Bred in New York by Banahan Farms, Rogers Dream is out of the winning Yonaguska daughter Shesadreamcatcher.

Encaustic is a stakes-winning son of leading sire Broad Brush. He is also one of five stakes winners produced by the blue hen mare Illeria, the dam of grade I winner and sire Include and graded stakes winner Magic Broad—both full siblings to Encaustic. All of Illeria's foals were bred by Robert Meyerhoff or under the name of his Fitzhugh Farm. Meyerhoff raced Broad Brush.

As a racehorse, Encaustic won five of his 14 starts in black-type stakes. He stands at Foggy Bottom Farm near Geneseo, N.Y., for \$2,000.

Soaring Empire picked up his first winner Oct. 1 when D'yer Mak'er drew off in the stretch in the 11th race at Belmont Park, a maiden special weight test for state-bred 2-year-olds. Out of the Dixie Brass mare South Wing, Six String Stables' D'yer Mak'er completed the one-mile test in 1:39 on a muddy track to secure his first victory in his third start. D'yer Mak'er is trained by Nick Zito and was ridden by Javier Castellano.

A grade III-winning son of classic winner Empire Maker, Soaring Empire stood the 2016 season for \$3,500 at Rockridge Stud near Hudson. Soaring Empire won the 2011 Hal's Hope Stakes (gr. III) at Gulfstream Park and two stakes races at Monmouth Park.

Out of winning A.P. Indy mare Flying Passage, Soaring Empire is a half brother to grade II winner Hungry Island.

In just her second start Sisella became the first winner for

Boys At Tosconova by drawing away from a maiden-claiming field by 10¾ lengths on a sloppy track at Laurel Park.

Danny Limongelli's Sisella, ridden by Angel Serpa, sat just off the pace three-wide and then took the lead about a quarter-mile from the wire. The filly defeated a field of nine for trainer Hugh McMahon after finishing seventh in her Aug. 24 debut at Saratoga.

Bred by Howard Nolan in New York, Sisella is out of the unraced Golden Missile mare Countyourblessings.

Lightly raced Boys At Tosconova won the Three Chimneys Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) as a 2-year-old and went on to finish second in the 2010 Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) behind that year's 2-year-old male champion Uncle Mo. Boys At Tosconova retired as a 4-year-old and entered stud in 2013 at Questroyal North near Stillwater, where he has stood since. The son of Officer, out of the Coronado's Quest mare Little Bonnet, stood in 2016 for \$2,500.

## New York Breeder Elise Browne Dies

Elise Benedict Browne, 75, of Tampa, Fla., died Sept. 22. An early member of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Browne raised New York's first national champion, helping establish New York as a respected source of quality Thoroughbreds. A lifelong participant in the business, Browne became a recognized breeder of winners at prominent tracks throughout North America and Europe,

annually bringing some of the finest yearlings to the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. Browne placed the lifelong care of Thoroughbreds and welfare of equine industry employees well above the value she placed on winning races.

Browne's passion for the health and wellness of others extended beyond the equine realm, and she led fundraising efforts that supported her belief in and

commitment to helping those in need.

## RIP LOVES MAIZE WINS THE SHESASTONECOLDFOX

Old First Ward Stable's Rip Loves Maize earned her first stakes win Oct. 24 by taking Finger Lakes Gaming & Race-track's Shesastonecoldfox Stakes. The score was a first for her trainer Linda Dixon; the first stakes win for jockey Dean Frates since 2009; and the second for her New York-based sire, D' Funnybone.

The head decision over Gonna Be Morgan in the \$50,000 race came in 1:13.56 for the six furlongs. Rip Loves Maize paid \$26.40 in the seven-horse field.

Bred by Robert Simonick, Rip Loves Maize is out of Simply Fancy, by Pentelicus. Simply Fancy was an 11-time winner on the track in an eight-season campaign. She is also the dam of stakes-placed Simply Mas.

D' Funnybone, who stood the 2016 breeding season at Rockridge Stud for \$2,500, is also the sire of Uno Emayo, a New York Stallion Series stakes winner earlier this year at Saratoga. D' Funnybone, a five-time grade II winner, is a 9-year-old son of D'wildcat—Elbow, by Woodman.

## Gold for the King Shines in Breeders' Futurity

Francis Paolangeli's homebred Gold for the King brought home a pot of gold after winning the \$219,613 New York Breeders' Futurity Oct. 1. The race was the richest of the year at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack.

Favored at 11-10 in the six-furlong Futurity, Gold for the King came into the race off a pair of strong starts at Saratoga. He broke his maiden at first asking Aug. 8 then ran third behind Syndergaard and Bobby On Fleek in the Funny Cide Stakes on Saratoga Showcase Day.


Gold for the King got the trip in 1:10.95 for trainer Charlton Baker.

Foaled at Thomas Dushas' Pegasus Farm near Dover Plains, Gold for the King is by Posse and is the second foal out of Gold for the Queen, a New York-bred multiple stakes winner bred by Pegasus Farms, who was also campaigned by Paolangeli and trained by Baker. Gold for the Queen currently has a weanling colt by Frost Giant.

Gold for the King has earned \$195,568.







"Godolphin's plan is to be able to offer New York breeders mares in foal to their sires. They're trying to give New York a program similar to what they offer in Kentucky, supporting their stallions and providing good mares so that the commercial market benefits, in the best interests of everyone."

Broman also purchased two weanlings from the first crop of Central Banker (Speightstown—Rhum, by Go for Gin), who stands at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.


From a catalog of 319 horses, 164 horses sold for a total of \$2,780,600 and an average of \$16,955, both down slightly from 2015, when 375 were cataloged and 162 sold. The 2016 median of \$8,500 was down from 2015's \$10,000.

The number of horses that didn't meet their reserves fell 30%, from 138 to 97, with roughly the same number of horses—48—failing to get the minimum bid of \$1,000.

"It's a consistent marketplace, indicative of the current conditions in the Thoroughbred industry," said Boyd Browning, Fasig-Tipton's president and CEO. "The highest-quality horses, mares, and weanlings sold very well and met with a great deal of enthusiasm from a broad cross-section of buyers."

"It was a typical sales market," echoed Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "Lots of horses found homes, which is a good thing. The buy-back rate was down from a year ago (37.2% from 46%), which is probably one of the most important pieces when you look at this sale specifically. We had a larger crowd here looking than we did last year, and the sale followed the same course as every other North American sale: The top horses sold well, and there's a lack of a middle market."

The top sellers this year went to end users, with Broman

adding to his broodmare band and the top weanling going to trainer Linda Rice and owners Sheila Rosenblum and Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm, who purchased an Into Mischief filly out of Roses Plus for \$125,000.

"I hoped she'd be a stand-out up there," said Chris Knehr of Catalyst

Bloodstock, which consigned the filly. "That's part of why we decided to take her up there. She looked great and got a lot of positive feedback, and her price exceeded our expectations."

Knehr usually brings less than a dozen horses to this sale, but his consignment this year comprised twice that many.

"I thought the action was really good," he said, "and there was a good aftermarket."

In addition to the Into Mischief filly, Knehr sold a Freud weanling colt to My Purple Haze stable for \$11,000 and a First Samurai filly to trainer Christophe Clement for \$50,000.

"To have three trainers buy horses from me is great," said Knehr. "They'll all end up back in New York, which is fantastic for the breeders themselves because they've got a great shot at being able to get breeders' awards."

Yet despite the vitality at the top end of the sale the lack of a market beyond that is a concern, and not just in New York, said Sequel's Thomas.

"This is the first of the bloodstock sales," she said, "and the market is polarized. We're going to see the same thing in November. We don't have enough buyers for the product that we've got on offer to sell."

"The horses at the top end, whether mares or babies from our consignment, sold better than we would have thought," she continued. "But mares that should have found good, solid homes did not. The traffic on the top mares is very much improved, but that traffic isn't spread overall. The buyers are very discerning, focusing only on the top lots."

# Classic Royalty

**OWNER MICHAEL DUBB** has earned the reputation as an astute Thoroughbred owner. The professional builder finds approximately two hours per day to study the racing scene and horses available at sales and via private purchase worldwide. Sometimes, though, the best and most affordable acquisitions are right in his own backyard, available to almost anyone. But just be aware, the sharp-eyed Dubb will probably beat you to that horse.

Dubb snapped up the New York-bred Royal Posse (by Posse) last May via the claim box for \$20,000. Along with partners Bethlehem Stables (Michael Caruso) and Gary Aisquith, they placed the then 4-year-old gelding into the care of trainer Rudy Rodriguez. The results not only have been astounding but remarkably consistent.

Since the claim Royal Posse has made 13 starts, finishing either first or second in all. There have been six stakes wins, including back-to-back scores in the 2015 and 2016 editions of the Evan Shipman Stakes at Saratoga, and a victory in open company in the Mr. Sinatra Stakes at Aqueduct.

Fittingly, the crowning jewel of that achievement came Oct. 22 at Belmont Park during New York Showcase Day as Royal Posse scored a rousing 3½-length victory in the 41st running of the \$300,000 Empire Classic Handicap over favorite Governor Malibu, who had finished fourth in this year's Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I).

"A horse like this comes along once in a lifetime. He's so honest, so hard-hitting," said Dubb. "We loved that he's by Posse. We're all about New York. It means a lot to us. Along with Freud, Posse is one of the benchmark New York stallions."

The crowd around the winner's circle braved the wind and rain showers to cheer for this Everyman's horse who embodies the hard-working spirit of New Yorkers so well.

Royal Posse, with jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. aboard, raced the nine furlongs over the sloppy sealed track in 1:52.15.

Bred by Richard Troncone Sr. and Richard Troncone Jr., the gelding, out of

Struckbylightning, by Cryptoclearance, has won 10 of 33 starts and has collected earnings of \$901,245.

Royal Posse has returned to his current ownership more than \$750,000 for their investment.

Jump Sucker Stable and Oak Bluff Stables' Governor Malibu (by Malibu Moon), from the barn of trainer Christophe Clement, rallied through the

stretch to finish second.

"Governor Malibu has some of the traits of his mother (Akilina, by Langfuhr)," said breeder/co-owner (with Oak Bluff Stables) Richard Leahy. Governor Malibu has finished second in a pair of grade II events this season (Jim Dandy and Peter Pan stakes). "He tries really hard all the time. I love horses like that."

West Point Thoroughbreds' Empire Dreams (by Patriot Act), who won last year's Empire Classic over Royal Posse, garnered the show slot for trainer Tom Albertrani.

### **The Best, Bar none**

As the expression goes if you blink, you might miss it—in this case that instant when a horse race can be blown wide open. However, there was good news for race fans who may have had their eyes closed for a brief second. Because that moment of domination and extreme acceleration would be on display for a furlong or so through the sloppy stretch as Chester and Mary Broman's homebred Bar of Gold completely engulfed her five rivals in the \$250,000 Empire Distaff Handicap.

On the latter portion of the far bend, the 4-year-old daughter of Medaglia d'Oro, out of Khancord Kid, by Lemon Drop Kid, had settled into stride and was still on hold beneath jockey Joel Rosario, as the pair tracked the early leaders from fifth-position along the rail.

That's when a small seam appeared between runners. Rosario dropped his hands, and Bar of Gold stepped away from the field. And that turn of incredible foot didn't diminish until the rider geared her down late approaching the wire.

The final result was a jaw-dropping 18-length win, in which Bar of Gold covered the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$  miles in 1:43.10.

Rushing into the winner's circle, as-

Assistant trainer Loretta Lustig exclaimed: “I have goose bumps. I can’t remember the last time I had goose bumps watching a horse run.”

Prior to the race, trainer John Kimmel appeared as confident as a conditioner could possibly be.

“Don’t send her. Let her settle,” Kimmel had instructed Rosario in the paddock. That game plan played out to perfection.

“This is the result of a patient ride,” said Kimmel, who believed that Bar of Gold should have won her previous race—the Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes (gr. II) at 6½ furlongs, in which she rallied seven-wide through the lane to finish third, beaten just a half-length.

“We always had a question about her distance capabilities. I got to think more and more about it, trying to get this filly off the pace and giving her a chance to

settle was always what I’ve been targeting for her.”

Rosario smiled broadly, demonstrating how he gave the winner her cue with his hands, as if he had just painted a masterpiece in the saddle.

Bar of Gold is now five for five on off-tracks.

“She’s beautiful. This is nice,” said Chester Broman. “When you go to Medaglia d’Oro, you’re hoping for a good one. I think we have that.”

The Empire Distaff was Bar of Gold’s fifth win from 15 starts and increased her earnings to \$716,500.

Around the Kimmel-barn, the affable winner, whose favorite treats are sweet potatoes and peppermints, is known as a people horse that you can love on. Khan-cord Kid was a solid grass performer, winning Gulfstream Park’s Herecomes-thebride Stakes (gr. IIIT) in 2010. With Bar of Gold’s strong showing on synthetic at Presque Isle, the turf may eventually be in her future.



## Debra Breed's Breakin the Fever breaks through in the Hudson

# A Breed Apart

**WHEN TRAINER DEBRA BREED** arrived at Belmont Park Oct. 22 from her base of operations at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack in Farmington, N.Y., she was in search of something that had eluded her in the past—a stakes win on the New York Racing Association circuit.

Later that evening Breed returned home, not only a stakes-winning trainer in the big leagues of New York racing but also a celebrated owner and breeder on the Empire Showcase Day card, courtesy of Breakin the Fever's victory in the \$142,500 Hudson Handicap.

Ridden by Finger Lakes local Nazario Alvarado, Breakin the Fever set the pace in the 6½-furlong Hudson to win by a half-length over post-time favorite Weekend Hideaway, who loomed a threat in the stretch but could not get by the resilient and wet-track-loving Breakin the Fever. It was Breakin the Fever's 14th career win from 24 starts and his fifth in a stakes. He is now undefeated in five starts over wet tracks.

The Hudson winner is a 4-year-old son of former New York-based sire Roaring Fever, who was standing at Questroyal Stud near Stillwater before being sold and relocating to Saudi Arabia in 2013.

Breakin the Fever, among the nominees for New York-bred champion male sprinter last year, provided Breed with her initial stakes win in the 2015 Ontario County Stakes at Finger Lakes.

"He's always been a good-trying horse," said Breed, who was flanked in the winner's circle by her husband, Ronald, and two of their young grandchildren, who are twins. "He runs his heart out. We're very blessed. This being our first stakes win at

NYRA is very exciting for us. It's just huge for us."

Breed, a trainer since 1986, began breeding horses eight years ago. Her first mare was Breakers West, the dam of Breakin the Fever. Breakers West won once in seven starts with Breed as her trainer. Upon Breakers West's retirement, Breed privately purchased the filly, who was sired by the former New York-based stallion Rodeo, from her breeder, Francis Casey.

"We liked Breakers West, and she won at Aqueduct in her first start, so when we decided we would take a shot at breeding horses, we started the operation with her," Breed, who currently owns five broodmares, explained. "Before Breakin the Fever, she produced a couple of allowance horses. The mare has had a lot to do with this win today; she's a really nice black-type mare."

Breed said she was attracted to Roaring Fever, a son of Storm Cat who entered stud in 2005, because she admired the consistency of his progeny.

"Roaring Fever was a hard-knocking sire," she remarked. "Whether you run his horses low (in claimers) or in allowance races, his runners always seem to do well. Actually, right now, my last Roaring Fever (before he left New York) is a full sister to Breakin the Fever, so we're hoping she is just as good."

The aforementioned is the 2-year-old filly Clara's Gone West, who is unraced. Breakers West, now 14, was bred this year to New York sire Hold Me Back, who stands at Irish Hill Century Farm near Stillwater.

### Quezon puts the 'Q' in Iroquois

The stakes action on the Empire Showcase Day card got off to a late start while track management and jockeys discussed the safety of the main track, which was rendered a sea of slop after numerous periods of rain and showers inundated the area for the 24 hours leading up to the New York-bred extravaganza.

Scheduled to go off at 1:28 p.m. EDT as Race 3, the \$142,500 Iroquois Stakes for New York-bred filly and mare sprinters was delayed by 16 minutes while harrows took another spin around the track to ensure the welfare of both horses and riders.

The weather had already taken a hit on the Iroquois with the defection of Hot City Girl, the 6-5 morning-line favorite, from a small field of six entered to begin with. Hot City Girl, whose older half sister, the retired La Verdad, won the race the last two years, was scratched when her connections decided they were leery of running her on a wet track because of a foot issue she had been battling in the lead-up to Showcase Day.

But Marc Keller, the owner of the 25-100 winning favorite Quezon, said after the Iroquois he was confident that had Hot City Girl run, his filly would have beaten the 2015 champion New York-bred 3-year-old filly.

"I felt we were the best horse in this race," stated Keller, who purchased Quezon, a 4-year-old daughter of Tiz Wonderful, for \$90,000 from the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of

preferred New York-bred yearlings.

With her win in the Iroquois, Quezon has now won a stakes in each of her three seasons of competition. At 2 she captured the Maid of the Mist Stakes on the Empire Showcase Day card and then won the restricted Bouwerie Stakes at Belmont the following year.

Quezon, who was ridden to her 5/4-length Iroquois victory by Javier Castellano, is trained by Bob Ribaud. Ribaud and bloodstock agents Ian Brennan and Mike Ryan picked out the filly for Keller at the New York-bred sale.

Bred by Apache Farm, Quezon is produced from the Olympio mare Kalookan Dancer. It is because of her dam that Quezon earned her name, which is a city in the Philippines, located near Kalookan City.

"I try to put the letter 'Q' in all of my fillies' names, and this actually isn't as far-fetched as when I have to make up names with 'Qs' in it," Keller said with a chuckle.

Winning for the fifth time in 10 career starts, Quezon entered the Iroquois following a second-place finish in Belmont's Galant Bloom Handicap (gr. II) Oct. 1.

"We'll keep her in training next year, and I think she will win a graded stakes before she is retired," a confident Keller remarked. 🐾

# Back to Back

**DAN HAYDEN SPENT A DECADE** working beside legendary horseman John Nerud as farm manager of Sugar Maple Farm, attempting to soak up the Hall of Famer's voluminous knowledge. Today he's a bloodstock agent and general manager of Vinery New York, which leased Sugar Maple Farm several years ago.

Hayden was instrumental in planning the mating of Pat On the Back, by Congrats, out of Accomplished, by Awesome Again, which was bred beneath the banner of Howard Kaskel's Sugar Maple Farm.

On New York Showcase Day Oct. 22, the chestnut colt scored an upset front-running victory in the \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes for state-bred 2-year-olds, annexing his second stakes in five starts.

"He was always a very straightforward, good-minded horse," said Hayden, a native of County Kildare, Ireland. "To me what stood out about him was his athletic ability. He had a great walk with a beautiful swagger, accompanied with great balance. He was a very willing horse and always seemed eager to please."

Those sterling qualities were also apparent to Harold Lerner, Wayne Cutler (AWC Stables), and Dale Cohen (Nehoc Stables), who ponied-up \$70,000 for the runner last summer at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings.

"Kenny McPeck saw him at the sales a year ago. He's a terrific bloodstock agent (and trainer)," said Cutler. "The Congrats had done well, especially on the filly side. I remember Harold (Lerner) told Kenny, 'Look

for something that can run.' He's been a tremendous surprise for us. And he's the only horse that raced today (in the Sleepy Hollow) without Lasix."

Sent out by McPeck (along with assistant Jeff Odintz) and ridden by Dylan Davis, who also rode the colt to victory Sept. 10 in the Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack, Pat On the Back assumed the lead out of the starting gate in the Sleepy Hollow. He raced an opening half-mile in :47.45, before shaking loose from his early challengers.

The colt then swung three-wide into the stretch and held sway in the lane, registering a 1½-length win and racing the one-turn mile in 1:40.08 over the sloppy sealed track.

Pat On the Back recorded his third victory from five starts, all with Davis aboard, and boosted his earnings to \$300,020.

Tellmeafookystory (by Tale of Ekati), owned by Brooklyn Boyz Stables and several others, closed stoutly through the stretch to gain the runner-up spot. Francis Paolangeli's homebred Gold for the King (by Posse) was third as the 5-2 favorite.

In 2002 Sackatoga Stable's Funny Cide (by Distorted Humor) was victorious in the Sleepy Hollow before going on to win the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (both gr. I) in 2003.

## Maid to Win

Michael Dubb again showed his savvy as an owner in acquiring 2-year-old filly Bonita Bianca (by Curlin) earlier this year at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March sale for \$97,000. That price may seem moderate, considering she is out of Friendly Michelle (by Artax), a grade I-winning mare (2004 Prioress Stakes). But there is a substantial backstory.

The filly was bred by Antonio Francesco (Dormellito Stud), who had gone to Curlin previously with his mare.

"(Bonita Bianca) had been the best one produced so far. She was a gorgeous filly, very well put together," said Francesco, whose filly didn't breeze particularly well for her potential bidders. "(Unfortunately), she got trapped

in a small stall the night before the sale, kicking her front and back legs to get free. So (the next day) she had a little heat in her shins."

Bloodstock agent Kim Valerio was well aware of these circumstances.

"Others probably knew, too. That's what kept the price down. But I went to Michael (Dubb) hoping he would (bid) and then give her time to heal," said Valerio. "She was a big horse. I come from a show jumping background, and I like a big horse. She had a lot of her sire's physical qualities. I was hoping she'd also have the speed of her dam."

Dubb teamed up with Michael Imperio and Bethlehem Stables (Michael Caruso) to acquire Bonita Bianca.

"The credit goes to Kim for picking this filly out," said Dubb. "In this situation I was willing to take a shot because

en victory going six furlongs.

Heading into the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes on New York Showcase Day, Bonita Bianca seemed the perfect candidate to stretch-out successfully to the mile distance. Hence, she was favored in the deep field of nine juvenile fillies.

That forethought came to fruition as Bonita Bianca, beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr., chased the early pace over the sloppy footing, which she might not have relished. But turning for home she got the leaders in her sights and surged to the front in upper-stretch, drawing off to win by 5¼ lengths in 1:40.19.

The filly is now two for two and has earned \$186,000.

"Her father won the (2007) Breeders' Cup (Classic, gr. I) in the slop, and I thought the distance fit," said Rodriguez. 'She's a nice, long filly. Everything

I believed the filly had value as a broodmare (prospect), more than what we paid for her. Also, a ton of credit goes to Bruce Jackson at Fair Hill for doing a tremendous job with her."

The gamble that the owners assumed began to pay off at Belmont Sept. 22 when Bonita Bianca, who'd been put into the care of trainer Rudy Rodriguez, scored an impressive maid-

has looked like she'll be a quality horse, and so far so good. I think she's going to get better. She looks like she's still learning, and she's much more comfortable on a fast track."

## Brother O'Connell, Old Harbor secure stakes scores in the slop

# Long on Talent

**WHEN JERRY CRAWFORD**, the president of the Donegal Racing partnership, purchased a New York-bred yearling son of Giant's Causeway out of a Seeking the Gold mare at Keeneland's September yearling sale in 2013, he gave the colt a name that was in keeping with his stamina-infused pedigree.

Brother O'Connell, who is named for an Irish priest who went to East Africa nearly 40 years ago to teach Kenyans how to become dominant in long-distance track and field events at the Olympics, didn't become a distance runner, but he is long on talent.

The 4-year-old, who was bred by the late Broadway theatrical agent, Sarah Jane Leigh, won for the fourth time this year by capturing the \$196,000 Mohawk Stakes at Belmont Park Oct. 22. The 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile Mohawk, which was originally scheduled to be run at the same distance on Belmont's inner turf course, marked Brother O'Connell's first stakes win.

Rain pounded the New York metro area for a full 24 hours prior to the Mohawk, which resulted in the 38th running of the New York-bred stakes for 3-year-olds and up being moved to the main track, which was listed as sloppy and sealed. There were a flood of notable scratches, including the 5-2 morning-line favorite, Kharafa, the Mohawk runner-up in 2015; and Lubash, last year's winner.

Only five of the original nine entered made the starting gate, with the post-time favorite's role going to Tapitation. The Tom Morley-trained Brother O'Connell, ridden by John Velazquez, used pacesetting tactics to steal the race. It looked like Tapitation

had Brother O'Connell's measure in the stretch, but the favorite never was able to gain enough momentum to pass his rival and had to settle for second, a neck behind at the wire.

Crawford and several of his partners were on hand for the win, braving the blustery, wet conditions that persisted throughout the afternoon on Empire Showcase Day at Belmont.

"I was so excited when we bought this horse at Keeneland," Crawford said of his \$125,000 purchase. "He was bred to go a mile and a half or (just under), and Donegal loves stamina horses. Unfortunately, he had a little bit of an airway problem and had to have a little bit of procedure—nothing major—yet it has turned him into a mile-and-a-sixteenth, mile-and-an-eighth kind of horse."

Crawford said he had taken time out of a hectic schedule to come to New York from Iowa to watch Brother O'Connell run.

"I'm on sensory overload with my two-legged racer and my four-legged racers," Crawford, an attorney, remarked, before explaining that he is helping Democratic presidential nominee Hillary Clinton with her campaign.

Morley said New York-bred company is not in Brother O'Connell's immediate future, as the trainer plans on bringing him to the Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots, where he will have a division this winter.

"The stakes program down there lends itself to a horse like him," Morley said. "We'll target the state-bred stakes when we come back up (to New York)."

Brother O'Connell is the third foal and first black-type winner out of Shared Dreams, a stakes winner for Leigh, who died in 2015, and her brother, Robin. The mare was sold in foal to Ghostzapper at the 2014 Keeneland November sale and was purchased for \$105,000 by McMahon & Hill Bloodstock, acting as agent. Following the Ghostzapper colt born in 2015, Shared Dreams produced a Noble Mission filly this year.

## THE AGONY OF VICTORY

There were two distinctly different endings to the \$200,000 Ticonderoga

Stakes for New York-bred fillies and mares that left the connections of the race's winner, Old Harbor, in the throes of joy and despair.

Following Old Harbor's 6¾-length victory in the Ticonderoga, which, like the Mohawk, was moved from the turf to the sloppy main track, the 5-year-old was pulled up on the gallop-out by jockey Manny Franco who felt she wasn't moving comfortably. Dr. Joseph Birnbaum's homebred was subsequently placed in the equine ambulance. Later in the evening of Oct. 22, Old Harbor, who was diagnosed with filling in her left foreleg,

was transported back to trainer Russell Cash's barn at Monmouth Park.

The day after the Ticonderoga, Birnbaum reported the daughter of former New York sire Raffie's Majesty likely suffered a bowed tendon. He said once the swelling diminished, an ultrasound would determine whether the initial diagnosis was correct.

"This might be a career-ending injury," said an emotional Birnbaum, who watched the Ticonderoga from his home in Toms River, N.J. "Otherwise, she is in good spirits and not in pain."

If the injury does prove to be career-ending, Old Harbor will join Birnbaum's

small New York-based broodmare band. An endocrinologist, Birnbaum owned and raced Old Harbor's dam, Royal Mast, whom he acquired for \$8,500 at auction when she was a yearling. Sparingly raced before her racing career ended due to an injury, New York-bred Royal Mast died in 2013 while foaling a New York-bred Girolamo colt, New Harbor, who has failed to reach the winner's circle in five starts thus far.

This was Old Harbor's third start in the Ticonderoga, after previously finishing second in 2014 and sixth last year. She began her career in 2013 and broke

her maiden in her second start, against state-bred company at Saratoga Race Course. A multiple stakes winner, Old Harbor carried Birnbaum's vibrant green and pink silks to victories in several restricted stakes on the New York Racing Association circuit, including the 2015 John Hettinger Stakes. This year the dark bay with a tiny splash of white on her forehead won an open company stakes, the George Rosenberger Memorial Stakes, at Delaware Park.

Old Harbor's victory in the 36th running of the Ticonderoga Stakes elevated her earnings to \$607,585 and her record to 8-4-4 in 25 starts. 🐾

## Love of the Game

**THE ROAD TO THOROUGHBRED OWNERSHIP** was a pretty standard one for Tony Malatino. He grew up in the Albany area, and he had a friend whose father owned harness horses, stabled not far from Saratoga Springs.

“He talked me into getting a job at the racetrack,” said Malatino, speaking from his home in Saratoga. “I don’t think I’d ever touched a horse, but he said, ‘It’s easy. Don’t worry about it.’”


He ended up working with trainer Howard Parker—“the class of the track,” Malatino calls him—and he learned how to groom, to clean tack, to pack feet. Before long, some friends of his claimed a horse that he went in on, ran him a few times, lost him to a claim.

“And that was it,” said Malatino. “I graduated; I went into the Navy; I went to graduate school. I had nothing to do with horses.”

But that, of course, didn’t last. And once again, it was a friend that lured him back in, a friend that had owned some Thoroughbreds and was thinking of purchasing a yearling privately from a Hudson Valley farm.

“He asked if I was interested in taking a look at the horse with him,” Malatino recounted. “How much do they want for him?” I asked. “\$22,000,” he said.

“I saw him in the paddock and said, ‘Offer him \$19,000 and I’ll be your partner.’ So we bought the horse.”

That horse was Well Well Well, a New York-bred by Ends Well out of the Damascus mare Damascat. He won the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes at 2 in 1990 and earned nearly \$150,000.

“I was going to quit my day job,” he joked.

He didn’t, and, in fact, when Well Well Well was retired, Malatino took another hiatus from horse ownership. And when he got back in, it wasn’t a friend that beckoned. This time it was his wife.

In 1992 Robin Malatino (then Robin Prever) was one of a group of investors, including Tony, that purchased Saratoga Mineral Water, which had, under various ownership groups, been bottling the spring water that has flowed underneath the city since the 19th century. A native of Manhattan who had grown up in Florida, she knew little of upstate New York and had never been to Saratoga, but as CEO and chairperson of Saratoga Beverage Group, she, along with Tony, whom she’d begun dating in 1989 (they married in 2000), began spending a lot of time in the Spa City, time that inevitably led them back to the racetrack, and, one night in 2003, to the Fasig-Tipton yearling sale.

“I’d go with him to the races to watch the horses he owned with a couple of buddies,” she said. “That was my

entire exposure. I had no exposure to Saratoga. I didn’t even know where it was. But around the year 2000, I read *Seabiscuit*. Tony said, ‘I’m not sure you’re going to like it. It’s about horses.’

“But I read it, and it changed my life. I was mesmerized. I was enthralled with this horse.”

A few years later, she and Tony were in Saratoga and decided, on something of a whim, to go to the sales before heading out to dinner. They never made it to the restaurant.

The savvy businesswoman who had sold Saratoga Beverage Group for \$58.5 million in 2000 walked past a stall in which a filly by Lemon Drop Kid was lying down, rising when Robin approached. “I knew nothing,” she said. “I thought her name was Lemon Drop Kid; that’s how naïve I was. But I had learned in *Seabiscuit* that horses don’t usually lie down, and Seabiscuit did, so I thought, ‘She’s going to be a winner.’

“I said to Tony, ‘I need to buy her.’”

Multiple conversations and about \$150,000 later, the filly was hers. Within a day they’d engaged Ken McPeck as their trainer, and before they were done, they’d purchased a colt that had caught

each of his first five starts, winning once, then was retired with a foot injury. After four years away from the track, he embarked on a brief steeplechase career, racing in jump races in Virginia and Maryland, winning a timber race a few years ago at age 11. Now retired, he lives on the Malatinos' farm near Saratoga.

"We sent a van down to pick him up, and he's the lord and master of the farm," said Tony. "He teaches the young horses how to behave."

The Malatinos spend about half the year in Florida, where they both work for Morgan Stanley, and half in Saratoga, on the farm they purchased in 2005, initially with resistance from Tony.

"After we started buying horses," said Robin, "I quickly learned about rescues and slaughter, and I said, 'We need to have a farm. Now that we have horses, we need a place to retire them.'"

None too keen on the idea, Tony agreed, with one stipulation: that she

Tony's eye in the auction ring the night before and that had, unbeknownst to them, been bought by McPeck.

"The van had already left and was in Albany, and Ken told the driver to turn the van around and bring him back," said Robin. "Off walks the horse that had roared at Tony the night before. That night started it all for us, this amazing journey."

That journey included purchasing several more horses in the name of Diamond M Stable, the best of which is the multiple graded stakes winner War Dancer, who ran his last race, a winning one, in the Sept. 10 PTHA President's Cup Stakes at Parx. The 6-year-old son of War Front—Deed I Do, by Alydeed, will begin his stallion career at Rockridge Stud near Hudson, N.Y.

"Everyone we talked to said that (Rockridge owner) Lere Visagie is as good as there is in the state," said Tony. "I think the program in New York is a good one for stallion owners and breeders; I don't see the need to stand him anywhere else. He might draw some at-

tention here if we can support him and see what he can do."

Though that yearling filly they bought, named Sugar Plum Girl, didn't turn out to be an incarnation of Seabiscuit, the colt, Belarion, hit the board in

find a farm within Saratoga's city limits. No easy task, but he should have known that his wife was up to it.

Within a couple of miles of Saratoga Race Course, she found a farm of about 80 acres. It was perfect—except that someone was living on it.

"I knocked on his door," said Robin, "and I said, 'I need to buy your property. I have horses, and I need a farm.'"

"He said, 'It's not for sale.'"

Eight months and \$1.56 million later, the farm was theirs. They and their horses—including mares and foals—moved on to the property in the summer of 2015.

This year Tony Malatino has established a new partnership, Saratoga Seven, comprising people he's met over his years in the racing business. They purchased three horses at August's Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, including a colt by Dialed In, whose Gunnevera had won the Saratoga Special Stakes (gr. II) earlier that day, for \$260,000. They also purchased a Paynter colt at the select yearling sale in Saratoga for \$255,000.

The Malatinos have four mares that will foal next year in New York, and Tony said he expects to purchase a few more to breed to War Dancer in 2017.

"I prefer to be racing in New York," he said. "The racing program is great, and the breeders' awards are so good, not to mention the purses."

And now that she's got her farm, where she can retire her own horses, Robin has set her sights higher.

"My purpose in this industry is to be part of the solution to this problem of retiring horses," she said.

She'd like to see a mandated Social Security-type program that would require donations—and significant ones—at every point in a horse's life.

"Nobody likes paying Social Security," she said. "But it's mandatory, and we do it because we like living in this country. The same thing has to happen with horse racing."

Seabiscuit inspirations aside, her business principles govern her approach to horse racing, and five months

before War Dancer begins his stud career, she's carefully preparing a strategy to make him successful, one that involves courting the best mares she can find for a book that will ideally reach 100. But her pragmatism doesn't mean that she's immune to the magic of horse racing, or unwilling to immerse herself fully in the venture begun by accident on the Fasig-Tipton grounds more than a decade ago.

"It's the most addicting thing," she said. "We were sitting around the other night, and we were talking about the best nights in our lives. I've had a lot of good nights, but two of them had to do with horses. They are magical animals; they're spiritual. When you're around them, you feel something you've never felt before." 🐾




