

Big Numbers for New York-Breds at the Big A

IT HARDLY SEEMS POSSIBLE that just two short months ago we were wrapping up the Saratoga season. Now, having completed the whirlwind Belmont Fall Championship Meet, we follow the New York Racing Association to Aqueduct Racetrack for the final transition of the 2017 racing calendar. In August in this space. I presented a statistical overview that showed the surprisingly robust participation of New York-breds in Saratoga racing in 2016. In September I presented comparable data for Belmont, which revealed an even more conspicuous New York-bred presence. With the move to the Big A, the timing is right to complete this mini-series, so here I present the 2016 numbers for Aqueduct.

I'll start with the basics. New York-breds made more than half, or 52% of all starts at Aqueduct Racetrack in 2016. Just for reference, considering that only 36% of Aqueduct's races are restricted to New York-breds, state-breds are obviously participating vigorously in NYRA's open races in Ozone Park. The most revealing numbers relate to field size and handle.

As at Saratoga and Belmont, New York-bred races at Aqueduct outperform the open races in both categories. Open races at Aqueduct (all surfaces) averaged 7.16 horses while New York-bred races averaged 7.70, or 7.3% more horses. Next, the 7.3% larger New York-bred fields handled 7.4% more money than open races. The accompanying charts show the data broken down by surface.

The upshot is that the numbers for all three NYRA tracks verify objectively that New York-breds are crucial to NYRA's bottom line. The importance of having this data at hand cannot be overstated. I will make sure it is front and center in all discussions with NYRA concerning the racing calendar down the road.

I have one concluding observation about Aqueduct. As you know, the return to the Big A this year comes with a twist. NYRA has extensively renovated the Aqueduct main track for year-round racing, and the one-mile inner winterized track has been replaced by a second "outer" turf course to take advantage of the popularity of grass racing and its ability to draw larger fields.


I am extremely eager to see how this major renovation pans out, both in terms of field size and handle and for the New York-breds that spend the fall, winter, and spring at the Big A. Currently, breeders earn 32% of all breeders' awards at Aqueduct—equal to the percent they earn at Belmont. Will Aqueduct inch ahead after the changes? Will the renovation make any changes in the profile outlined above of New York-bred starts at Aqueduct? Will the field size and handle be affected? We will all need to stay tuned to find out, and when the numbers come in, I will let you know.

DIVERSIFY WINS JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP IN FIRST GRADED STAKES START

Partners and longtime friends Fred Hertrich III and John Fielding mined a diamond in the rough when they found the Street Cry daughter Rule One in the 2010 Keeneland November sale.

Purchased for only \$57,000 in foal to

then-freshman sire War Front, Rule One would go on to produce grade 1 winner Diversify, who captured the Oct. 7 Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park. The Gold Cup was the first graded stakes start for the New York-bred son of

Bellamy Road, who is raced by Lauren and Ralph Evans.

Diversify is the third New York-bred

Diversify is the third New York-bred to win the Gold Cup this century, following Funny Cide in 2004 and Haynesfield in 2010.

Rule One was a half sister to graded stakes winner Lady Digby (by Grand Slam), but she had only placed once out of six starts as a racehorse when Hertrich and Fielding acquired her.

"She is definitely a bargain now, but I thought she was a bargain when I bought her," said Hertrich. "We look for certain types of mares, and one of the broodmare sires we thought would be climbing the ranks was Street Cry. We were so involved with Street Cry through the best foal in his first crop, Street Boss. We were looking for well-conformed Street Cry mares, and she happened to be very, very good-looking."

Because the partners breed six to eight New York-breds annually out of their program based at Hertrich's Watercress Farm near Paris, Ky., Rule One was bred to grade 1 winner Bellamy Road and sent to New York to foal.

The resulting colt, Diversify, brought

\$150,000 at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of New York-bred preferred yearlings, making him the highest-priced Bellamy Road yearling at the sale.

"You can imagine how good-looking he was to bring \$150,000," Hertrich said. "Bellamy Road was not well received (commercially) at the time, but he did produce a lot of racehorses."

WinStar's Maverick Racing purchased Diversify and won two races with him before rolling him back through the 2016 Keeneland November sale as a racing prospect where Lauren and Ralph Evans bought him for \$210,000.

"He had a big speed figure (97 Equibase) in his second start and won easy, so we thought he would bring \$400,000-\$500,000 because it looked like he had a lot of upside," Hertrich said. "I thought he was a bargain for the people who got him. Trainer Rick Violette Jr., who had the horse, got another client to buy him because he thought he was undervalued. Everyone made money with this horse."


The Evanses have won three stakes with Diversify and netted more than \$700,000 in earnings since they bought him. Prior to the Gold Cup, Diversify finished second in the Commentator Stakes and then took consecutive vic-

tories in the Saginaw Stakes and the Evan Shipman Stakes, which he won by a scorching 11½ lengths.

"Even without the grade 1, Diversify was already a very successful racehorse," Hertrich said. "We have done very well selling New York-breds, and they don't have to be great stakes horses. A horse like Good Luck Gus earned more than \$600,000 and rarely left the state. It has been a very successful program for us."

The Gold Cup is a "Win and You're In" race for the Nov. 4 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1). Diversify has been pre-entered for the \$6 million race.

Effinex Dies from Ruptured Pulmonary Artery

Grade 1 winner Effinex, who entered stud in 2017, died suddenly Oct. 18 due to a ruptured pulmonary artery, according to owner/breeder Dr. Russell Cohen.

"It is not a business to me. This is a passion," said Cohen, who is a veterinarian. "He is the

kind of horse every owner should have at least once in their life. He filled a huge void in my life."

The New York-bred son of Mineshaft was relocated to McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds from Questroyal North about a month

and a half ago.

Cohen, a practicing veterinarian for 30 years and a New York native, was committed to standing his homebred star in New York.

"He is not just a New York-bred. He's third generation," Cohen said when the horse was retired a year ago. "And despite all he's done for me, I owe him more. I want him here, where I can keep an eye on him. There's just a lot of emotion."



Dr. Russell Cohen with Effinex at Belmont Park


Cohen said Oct. 19 that 103 mares were confirmed in foal to Effinex this year.


"Last year's book was great. This year's was twice as good," he said. "I feel badly for the industry because this horse brought soundness. He also had a pretty special pedigree and was just a cool horse."

Joe McMahon agreed Effinex's death was a big loss to the New York breeding program. The farm held an open house in early October in conjunction with the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed sale, and 25 separate groups of breeders from Maryland, Pennsylvania, Florida, and Kentucky showed up to see the stallion.

"It is a huge loss," McMahon said. "We have not had opportunities recently with horses of this caliber."

"But as bad as it is for us, it is a huge personal loss to Russell," McMahon continued, noting that Cohen drove straight to Saratoga from his home on Long Island as soon as he

heard the news and arrived at the farm at 1 a.m. Oct. 19. "He has worked hard as a veterinarian all his life and bred this really nice horse, and he was so incredibly proud of him. He never raced him on Lasix or (phenylbutazone) or anything, even when he had the opportunity to do it. He was his life's work."

Effinex will be buried at the farm next to grade 1 winner Personal Flag, who stood at McMahon of Saratoga from 1999 through 2003.





"Life goes on, but not so easily. Certainly not with the enthusiasm of only two days ago," Mc-Mahon said.

Raced by Cohen, Effinex ran from ages 3 through 5 and compiled a 9-3-4 record in 28 starts. He won the 2015 Clark Handicap (G1) at Churchill Downs, the Suburban Handicap

(G2) twice at Belmont Park (2015-16), and the 2016 Oaklawn Handicap (G2). He also ran second to Triple Crown winner American Pharoah in the 2015 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1). Effinex, trained through the majority of his career by Jimmy Jerkens, retired with \$3,312,950 in earnings.

Will Take Charge Filly Brings \$150,000 at OBS October

A filly by freshman sire Will Take Charge bred by Pine Ridge Stables topped the 52 New York-breds who were sold during Ocala Breeders' Sales' October yearling sale.

Consigned by Stuart Morris, agent, the dark bay filly sold to Three Diamonds Farm at the opening session of the two-day auction for \$150,000. She emerged as the co-seventh top-seller of the sale and third top-selling filly overall.

The New York-bred average price came in at \$14,183, lower than the \$20,001 sale average. The New York-bred median of \$6,250 was similarly below the \$8,000 sale median. The 75 New York-breds at the sale turned in a 30.7% buy-back percentage, higher than the sale buy-back rate of 26.9%.

The top state-bred lot was clearly a standout. She was foaled at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham April 23, 2016, and had been offered last month at the Keeneland September yearling sale, but RNA'd for \$72,000.

The filly is the second registered foal out of Choice Pearl, a Kentucky-bred placed runner by Any Given Saturday, who was purchased by Pine Ridge Stables at the 2013 Keeneland November mixed sale for \$165,000. Choice Pearl, out of

stakes winner Horns Gray, is a half sister to grade 1 winner Awesome Humor and her half sister Surf Club is the dam of grade 1 winner and sire Emcee.

Big Foals, Big Future For New York Stallion Make Reservations

In 2016 Bergen Stables bred six mares, all winners on the racetrack, to Make Reservations. These mares were half of their twelve-mare broodmare band.

Bergen Stables got the opportunity to purchase Make Reservations while the mares were still in foal. Even though they were not originally planning to own a stallion, they took the chance. Bergen Stables bought Make Reservations and brought him and all of their mares to Majestic Views Farms International. They purchased him even though he had no foals born yet: their mares were carrying his first crop.

He had already proven that he had heart. In his only start, Make Reservations drew the rail and fought on to finish third in a maiden special weight at Aqueduct, despite coming out of the race with a career-ending injury.

He had pedigree, too. In addition to being by super-sire and budding sire of sires Tapit, he is out of Formal Reception: a daughter of preeminent sire Unbridled, from the female line of multiple graded stakes winner and black type-producing New York sire It's Acedemic.

Unbridled is emerging as a damsire of stallions, as he is the damsire of Shackleford, Orb, and Tapit himself. And, Tapit

crossed back closely with the Unbridled line has been responsible for serious racing class: Grade 1 winner Sweet Loretta and Grade 2 winners Unique Bella and West Coast Belle are all by Tapit out of Unbridled's Song mares.

The first proof of Make Reservations's quality at stud would come when the six mares foaled. The big, well-built foals meant their faith in Make Reservations was well placed. Says Sharlene Kenny of Bergen Stables, "I was, after all the foals were born, ecstatic that we had him. Seeing them grow up, we made the right decision."

This year, Bergen Stables bred two of their own mares back to Make Reservations, and he bred several outside mares as well. 





PAUL SCHOSBERG

(1938-2017)

Influential leader a top breeder in New York-bred programs

BY TERESA GENARO

A FEW YEARS AFTER Jeffrey Cannizzo became executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, he reviewed old copies of this publication, going back decades.

One could argue that little about racing and breeding now resembles those industries 40 years ago, but Cannizzo found something that hadn't changed: the influence of Paul Schosberg, whose name appeared over and over in the magazine's pages.

"He was such an influential voice for so long for breeders and owners," he said. "He and I joked that decades later we're still talking about a lot of the same issues."

Schosberg died Sept. 25, following complications from surgery and years of treatment for cancer. Despite health issues that had been recently exacerbated, his death came as a surprise to some.

"I saw him shortly before he died," said Richard Ottinger, a former member of the United States House of Representatives and now a professor emeritus at Pace Law School. "We spent two hours together, and he was sharp as a tack. He seemed so well that I thought he would recover. It was a shock."

Ottinger had brought Schosberg from his home state of New York to Washington, D.C. Schosberg had been working at *The Reporter Dispatch* in White Plains as a reporter, editor, and bureau chief when Ottinger contacted him.


"A good friend of mine was a PR person," said the law professor. "He knew of Paul and contacted him on my behalf."

That contact led to Schosberg and his young family moving south, where he served as chief of staff for Ottinger and later for Herman Badillo before returning to New York in the early 1970s.

"He was marvelous," said Ottinger. "He was so bright and such a capable leader that I'd never have been able to do half of what I did if he hadn't been at the helm. I encouraged him to run my Senate campaign, but he thought it was too much for him. If he'd accepted, I think I'd be in the Senate now."

The Schosbergs first lived in Georgetown, then moved west of the District to a farm near Herndon, Va., at 12225 Thoroughbred Lane. Both Schosberg and his wife, Jane, had ridden horses, Jane extensively, but the family breeding business at that time was German shepherds.

"We were a Jewish family in Virginia," said Schosberg's son, Rick, whose Thoroughbred training operation is based at Belmont Park. "The choice was, do I get

a bar mitzvah or do we buy a pony and get a farm? And that was really the decision. That was it. We got a farm."

Jane and Paul had met as teenagers in Scarsdale and stayed in touch through college, he at Middlebury, she at Bennington. They married in 1958, and while Paul worked on Capitol Hill, Jane taught riding to representatives and senators in Great Falls, Va.

Schosberg returned to New York to be CEO of the New York League of Savings Institutions, and shortly after that, the Schosbergs established Pine Lane Farm near Katonah. Their daughter, Jill, had become an accomplished equestrian, and they went shopping for a new horse for her.

"I guess I was the impetus for the whole Schosberg horse industry," said Jill, laughing.

"We bought a racehorse to be a show horse," said Jane recently. "She was very fast and a little head-screwy, so I bred her. She delivered her baby all by herself, and we sold her as a weanling for \$1,200 at the Waterford sale in Virginia to a guy with a Budweiser in his hand.

"She came back and won over \$50,000. That started it all."

The mare, Dot in Spot, was bred to Oh Say in 1985, resulting in a filly the family named Tim's Lady. The stakes-placed chestnut mare was one of Rick's first

horses when he started training on his own.

"She was my favorite," said Jane. "She lived with us until she was 29 years old; we had to put her down last year. She was tough; nothing really bothered her, she was never sick, she never did anything wrong."

Tim's Lady's most successful offspring was Mellow Roll (by Distinctive Pro), who earned more than \$500,000 for Stuart and Anita Subotnick's Anstu Stables and trainer Todd Pletcher.

Other breeding successes included Cyanea, a chestnut filly by Cyane out of Go Cap (by Groton), who won two stakes for New York-breds and in nine starts had a record of 3-1-2. Trained by LeRoy Jolley, she was a New York-bred champion.

Bix (Restless Native—Nashua's Polly, by Nashua) won the New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes in 1982. He, too, would be a New York-bred champion.

At the time of Schosberg's death, the Schosbergs were still breeding horses

in Jane's name and with her expertise determining the mating. She spoke affectionately of their early days, waiting for the equine babies to arrive.

"My favorite part is when they'd stand up and take their first drink of milk," she said, "and he loved that part, too. I'd night-watch from 10 until 5 or 6, and on weekends; he would watch all day. If I was alone in the barn delivering, I'd go get him so he could help."

Schosberg served on the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders for 12 years and served two terms as president, then stayed on as a director emeritus, with the focus on "director" and not on "emeritus."

"He wanted communication from us," said Cannizzo. "He wanted to know what was going on, and he called into and attended board meetings. He's one of the few historians behind our association, and his historical knowledge was critical for us."

"To me, he was a hero," said Vivien Malloy, a current member of the NYTB board. "He never opened his mouth without something wise coming out. He was an advocate for quality and improving the breed, and Jane's a wizard at finding the perfect yearling. They were a great pair."

Schosberg also served as president

and CEO of America's Community Bankers, and his business experience became a point of connection between him and Jill when her pediatric practice in New Jersey joined a medical "supergroup" of which she is president and CEO.

"He guided me a lot on business decisions," said Jill, who practices in her married name of Stoller. "He was a really, really phenomenal executive."

And a phenomenal grandfather to her two children and to Rick's son, Ryan, with his wife, Dawn.

"He was very, very involved," said Stoller. "He'd come to any event. He loved reading their schoolwork, and he had a really good relationship with them." If father and daughter bonded through business, father and son bonded through horses. Rick continues to train for his mother, and Paul regularly came to Saratoga during the summer meeting; any conversation with him inevitably led to the breeding and racing industries, and he remained as well-informed as anyone else in the business.

"He was one of the smartest people I know," said his son, "on any range of topics. But I've got pictures from 1972 at Charles Town with my dad as owner of a racehorse. He was proud that we won a \$5,000 claimer. Race horses were definitely his thing."

FASIG-TIPTON'S SARATOGA FALL SALE established new benchmarks Oct. 16 with a \$170,000 Into Mischief weanling colt spearheading a record average price and equaling the previous best median price. The Into Mischief colt, offered by RFHF Bloodstock, agent for Hidden Lake Farm and Kingsport Farm as Hip 200, was purchased by Mahoney Eden Manor and Classic Bloodstock. It was the highest price ever recorded at the auction, which had been inaugurated in 2012. Of the 236 head offered, 144 sold for a gross of \$3,265,000 at an average price of \$22,674. The median price was \$12,000.

"I thought it was very good trade overall, especially for weanlings," said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning Jr. "We've seen a robust market for weanlings in Saratoga in recent years, and we saw that continue this week. With the mares, we've seen the same issues as in the past with some that have some age on them or haven't had much success in their produce record—the market is pretty difficult on those. But it's been a nice addition to the calendar. It gives New York breeders a convenient, close-to-home place to sell their mares and their foals, and as the New York-bred program continues to show such strength, there's going to be interest in the New York-bred foals."

Five horses surpassed the \$100,000 barrier. The highest-

priced mare was High Pitch, consigned by Sequel New York as agent. She sold for \$150,000 to John Kimmel, agent for John McClutchy. A 4-year-old daughter of Medaglia d'Oro, High Pitch, a winner at 2 and 3 for Godolphin was offered in foal to Darley stallion Hard Spun. She is a daughter of French stakes

winner Mystic Melody, a Seattle Slew half sister to multiple grade 1 winner Alpha.

The RFHF Bloodstock consignment was responsible for the top two weanlings sold at the one-day auction. In addition to the sale-topping Into Mischief colt, the local operation also sold Hip 108, a daughter of Tiznow for \$150,000 to Triple A Thoroughbreds. Both weanlings, offered on behalf of the partnership of Hidden Lake Farm and Kingsport Farm, were produced by mares that had been purchased at Keeneland last November. Darling Mambo, a Broad Brush mare who had already produced the stakes-placed Darling Sky, was picked up for \$75,000 while Raesunbridledfaith, a stakes-placed daughter of After Market, was secured for \$60,000. For Hidden Lake's Chris Bernhard, the Fasig-Tipton fall sale has provided an ideal venue to feature his stock.

"I've been going to Keeneland for a long time to buy mares, and for years I would sell the babies in Kentucky or I would hold on to them until the yearling sale," Bernhard explained. "When they brought this sale here and I could sell them in my back yard, from a cost basis, it is cost-effective. We're an entirely New York-based operation. We want to participate in the New York program, and I know it's a bad analogy, but big fish, little pond. I don't have the big players and the financing behind me, so I've got to try to find that niche market and try

to outdo everyone else in that spot. I try to do that the right way by going up with proper horses by stallions that people can get excited about. When I buy, I try to avoid as much risk as possible."

Both Darling Mambo and Raesunbridledfaith will be bred to Bellamy Road, who stands at Dutchess Views Farm near Pine Plains.

"My partner at Kingsport Farm, Yehuda Cohen, purchased a 60% interest in Bellamy Road two years ago," Bernhard added. "He wanted to bring an established horse to New York to breed mares back to, as opposed to these other horses that just weren't proven. Bellamy Road had some 2-year-olds that sold really well—Constellation went for \$800,000—so the horses that he and I own together all went back to Bellamy Road. I think those babies will probably go back through this sale next October, now that people know who the mares are and have liked the offspring. I own the mares 100% now; we've dissolved our partnership for that group of horses, so I'll probably breed both of them back to Kentucky horses (in 2018)."

Bernhard, who previously worked at Questroyal Stud before striking out on his own 15 years ago, has tried to bring a pragmatic approach to his operation at Hidden Lake, which teamed up with Elaine Peck's Rhapsody Farm.

"For my program and how it works for me, there's a price

point that I'm comfortable with, and I don't usually exceed it," he explained.

"I like to buy a young mare that's in foal to something I can get excited about, and I look at it as a multi-year project. I try to concentrate on mares that are on earlier covers so that I'm not pushing the envelope to breed her back if she's due in May."

Bernhard and Peck sold the sales-topping \$500,000 Cairo Prince yearling colt at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds in August, but have begun to target the fall sale to achieve an earlier return on their investments.

"Elaine and I have really tried to support this sale in a big way and have predominantly put most of our babies back through the sale," Bernhard added. "Obviously, there's lots to say about our good ones, but we also had some stuff that we had good money tied up in that didn't get sold. Some of them may need more time, or you just need to be patient with them. But this sale has been good to us, and it's important to me to support the market.

"I have to give Darley credit; they put some nice mares in the sale. And Sequel had some nice mares, too, and that worked. There were some mares in foal to Cairo Prince, so people are starting to acknowledge that this isn't just a weanling venue and you can sell a mare, too."

The leading buyer at the fall sale was Atlantic Bloodstock, which signed the ticket on six weanlings, topped by Hip 191, an \$80,000 Cairo Prince colt from the RFHF Bloodstock draft.

"It's really become quite a good spot for pinhooking," Bernard noted. "When we sold the record-priced Cairo Prince (at the preferred sale in August), I said that we had made people close to a million off of us (by reselling the weanlings purchased), and I don't think that was an exaggeration. So it's in the public forum that people can buy these horses and sometimes can make money, and New York breeders are stepping up and rais-

Stepwise-bred Twisted Tom takes Empire Classic; Verdant Pastures wins the Distaff

Classic Tale

THERE'S SOMETHING TO BE SAID about having experience in breeding a certain mare, especially when that experience belongs to the husband and wife team of veterinarians Dr. Joan Taylor and Dr. William Wilmot. The couple, who together own and operate Stepwise Farm near Saratoga Springs, have bred several New York standouts over the years, including state-bred Horse of the Year Incurable Optimist (by Cure the Blues, out of the Seattle Slew mare Miss Turlington) and Naughty New Yorker (by Quiet American).

So when it came to finding the right match for their broodmare Tiffany Twisted, Taylor and Wilmot considered the physical makeup of her past foals.

"That's the advantage of owning a mare for a long time," said Taylor. "Tiffany Twisted looked exactly like Thunder Gulch (her sire). She had perfect conformation, a good throat, and a great disposition. What the family needed was speed. But some of her past foals were short-legged. We went to Creative Cause because he was rangy. We were hoping he'd put a little leg into her (offspring) and speed."

The result of that pairing was Twisted Tom, who left his breeders wondering if they'd put too much leg into this huge foal who kept on growing.

Twisted Tom, now a gelding, calls the barn of trainer Chad Brown home, where the stable help refer to him as "Grande."

On Oct. 21, the 3-year-old entered the starting gate as the even-money favorite

in the \$300,000 Empire Classic Handicap, his first assignment against older foes.

Owned by Sol Kumin (Head of Plains Partners), Gary Biszantz (Cobra Farm), and Roger Weiss (R R Partners)—the trio took the advice of agent Steve Young in acquiring the gelding for \$150,000 from his previous owners, after Young was duly impressed by his maiden win on the turf.

Twisted Tom's turf career lasted just one more race until Brown switched him to the dirt. That's where the gelding had proved victorious in five of his previous six starts heading into the Empire Classic. That streak included wins in the Albany Stakes and New York Derby (both state-bred affairs) and versus open company in the Federico Tesio Stakes and the Private Terms Stakes at Laurel. The gelding's lone defeat in that span was a sixth-place finish in the Belmont Stakes presented by NYRABets (G1).

In an effort to gain the gelding's attention, Javier Castellano resorted to the whip while midway on the far turn of Twisted Tom's off-the-pace win in the Albany. In the Empire Classic, however, Castellano wasn't going to gamble on the gelding losing focus during any part of the nine-furlong affair.

As a result the pair came away from the gate running, settling into second just outside of the early leader, Michael Dubb and David Simon's Control Group (by Posse) in the field of nine.

The opening half-mile was contested in an ordinary :48.08. There was scant change in the running order, which included Governor Malibu (by Malibu Moon), the fourth-place finisher in the 2016 Belmont, who'd have to launch a bid in the Empire Classic from last (eventually finishing fifth).

Castellano was high in the saddle with Twisted Tom moving effortlessly

beneath him, waiting to be turned loose as they made the bend into the far turn.

"He's the kind of horse you can put wherever you want," said Castellano. "He's very straightforward."

With little urging Twisted Tom sidled up to Control Group during the latter portion of the turn.

Spinning into the sandy stretch, Castellano dropped his hands and Twisted Tom accelerated, lengthening his stride. Control Group was game, with jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. aboard. But the classy Twisted Tom began to edge away.

Castellano supplied right-handed encouragement inside the furlong marker and Twisted Tom opened up, leaving little doubt as to the outcome through the final furlong. Twisted Tom hit the wire three lengths clear in 1:49.38 over the fast main oval.

"He has a high cruising speed and the other horses weren't going that fast," said Brown. "I loved Javier's decision early to put him into the race and just get him into a nice rhythm there down the backside. It looked like he had (Control Group) measured. I'm just extremely pleased with his effort."

Twisted Tom has won seven of 10 starts (six of seven on the dirt) and has earned \$680,131.

"The horse has done everything correctly for us, just like he ran today. Not one stubborn step," said Weiss. "He'll close. He'll run on grass. He'll run on mud. He'll run on the dirt. He'll do everything you want him to do. I'm proud of him. Any time you win six out of seven, that's pretty good."

Control Group, trained by Rudy Rodriguez, finished a game second, with Chester and Mary Broman's homebred Can You Diggit (by Tiznow) rallying for third.

Verdant Victory

Though breeder/owner Frank Paolangeli rarely makes it to the track to watch his horses run, he is no stranger to the winner's circle. His homebreds Ridden in Thestars, Serenity's Smile—and her offspring, stakes winners Johannesburg Smile, Stormy's Smile, Atlantic's Smile, and Wildcat's Smile—have all ably stood in for Paolangeli, bearing his lime green and white colors. So have his trainers—Dominic Galluscio, who sadly passed away in 2014; and Charlton Baker, who started with Paolangeli at Finger Lakes and now trains all of his stock.

In the \$250,000 Empire Distaff Handicap, two things had a high-certainty of occurrence—Paolangeli's homebred Verdant Pastures (by Colonel John) would make the pace, and she wouldn't be allowed the kind of relaxed fractions on the lead that resulted in a 14¾-length triumph in her allowance win Aug. 9 at Saratoga.

Both came true.

Verdant Pastures was hounded on the front-end by 41-1 longshot Might Be through a demanding opening halfmile in :46.09.

Midway on the far curve, the frontrunners pulled clear of their seven rivals. Turning for home, Might Be gained a slight lead and appeared ready to spurt clear with a huge upset in the offing. However, jockey Manuel Franco, supplying left-handed encouragement, roused Verdant Pastures and regained the lead before edging clear late.

The winner, who is out of the Stormy Atlantic mare Stormy's Smile, raced the 11/16-mile distance in 1:43.65.

"I thought she could handle being pressured. She does that in the mornings, but I was a little worried heading into the race that she'd be 100%. Following her Saratoga (victory), she had some minor issues but thankfully she was able to come back and perform today," said Baker, a native of Jamaica and third-generation horseman.

Verdant Pastures has won three of

seven starts and has earned \$231,466.


Fortune Farm's Might Be, trained by Chris Englehart, was a surprisingly strong runner-up in the Empire Distaff. Bred by Colts Neck Stables, the 3-year-old filly broke her maiden at Parx Racing May 9 (her only win to date), where she was claimed by Fortune Farm from her breeder for \$30,000.

Favored Bonita Bianca, owned by Michael Dubb, Michael Imperio, and Bethlehem Stables, and last year's state-bred champion juvenile filly, finished third.

Longshots Berning Rose, Evaluator score in 2-year-old stakes

Price Points

ROBERT ROSENTHAL COULD BARELY CONTAIN his happiness Oct. 21 at Belmont Park when his 2-year-old homebred (co-bred and co-owned with Brad-

ford Bernstein) filly Berning Rose won the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes on New York Showcase Day.

"I'm over the moon," he said.

Breaking from post 8 under Kendrick Carmouche, Berning Rose made the early lead in the one-mile race, then was joined by three other fillies that raced on even terms until they hit the far turn. Despite having run wide throughout the race through early fractions of :22.84 and :45.99, the dark bay filly easily drew away and held off the closing Held Accountable by 1½ lengths in 1:37.76.

Trained by Dominick Schettino, Berning Rose had broken her maiden by five lengths at Saratoga and had finished second in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes at Belmont last month.

"Kendrick gave her a great ride," said Rosenthal. "He and Dominick don't get enough recognition."

Out of the Flying Chevron mare Peach Flambe, Berning Rose is a daughter of leading sire Freud, a fact to which Rosenthal drew attention in the winner's circle.

"I'm really proud of the fact that she's a homebred, and that she's a Freud," he declared. "I've been a New York breeder for

30 years, and I believe there should be more in the program for New York stallions. We've got to support them."

Both Berning Rose—named for Rosenthal and Bernstein—and oddson favorite Pure Silver looked to be the speed of the race on paper, and while they did knock heads early, Rosenthal wasn't worried.

"We thought with her breeding, she would go long," he said. "The favorite is a great horse, but we didn't think she'd get the distance."

Berning Rose was the third betting choice at 7-1 and paid a generous \$16.80, given the relative ease with which she won.

Rosenthal has three mares in New York, all stakes winners, two of them homebreds; they foal at Jan Durrschmidt's Indigo Farm near Stanfordville.

"She's foaled all of my babies since Galloping Grocer," he said, referring to the New York-bred runner-up in the 2004 Remsen Stakes (G2) and 2005 Gotham Stakes (G3). Rosenthal bred Galloping Grocer with the late Ira Waldbaum.

Thrilled to be back in the winner's circle for a stakes race, Rosenthal took particular pleasure in his filly's breeding.

"I'm absolutely delighted," he said.
"A New York stallion, a New York mare, and New York connections did the job today."

Berning Rose's upset win looked mild compared to \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes winner Evaluator, who lit up the tote board at 19-1.

Breaking from post 11, jockey Manuel Franco took the chestnut colt well off of the pacesetting second choice Battle Station, racing 12¼ lengths off the lead down the backstretch of the one-mile Sleepy Hollow. Inching his way forward heading into the far turn, Franco swung seven-wide coming into the stretch and wore down his rivals before hitting the wire in a photo to eke out a nose win in 1:38.38.

Evaluator is owned by R and H Stable, the initials standing for the first name of partners Rick Higgins



and Howard Read (who are joined in ownership by Stu Richel). Higgins was on hand at Belmont for Evaluator's first stakes win in his first race on dirt.

"This is very exciting for us," he said exuberantly. "We've all been doing this for many years, and it doesn't always work out."

By Overanalyze—this year's leading first-crop sire—out of the More Than Ready mare Show Me the Carats, Evaluator was bred by EKQ Stables. Higgins paid \$30,000 for

him at last year's Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings. He is trained by Michael Dilger.

"Michael picked him out," said Higgins. "I liked him because he was big. He looked like he was going to have a big stride, and he grew into that exactly."

Evaluator began his career on the turf, breaking his maiden by four lengths in his debut at Saratoga. He faltered in his next two races, the With Anticipation Stakes (G3T) and the Pilgrim Stakes (G3T), finishing seventh in both.

"Mike said we ought to give him a shot on the dirt," said Richel. "We were

always hopeful, but this is a surprise."

The win in the Sleepy Hollow is the partnership's first in a stakes race. They own three racehorses and one mare in foal to Golden Ticket, who stands at Questroyal North near Stillwater.

"We buy mostly New York-breds," said Higgins. "The program is so good; how can you not?"

While Higgins and his partners can hope for another good one to come their way, they're reveling in what their freshman accomplished this weekend.

"He's clearly got talent," said Higgins, "and when you have a 2-year-old that has talent, all you can do is cross your fingers."

IT TOOK 34 RACES—and the confidence of trainer David Cannizzo and owner Brian Ivery—but Black Tide got his first black-type victory Oct. 21 in the \$200,000 Mohawk Stakes during New York Showcase Day.

Undeterred by his outside post, jockey José Lezcano took Black Tide to the lead, racing well ahead of the field for the 1½-mile race on the inner turf. Allowed to get away with an easy pace, Black Tide rolled home to win by 1½ lengths over 3-5 favorite Offering Plan.

In the name of Ivery Sisters Racing—named for his three daughters—Ivery claimed Black Tide last November. Two starts later, on New Year's Eve, he was claimed away, but after just one start for his new connections, Cannizzo and Ivery claimed him back. He's won five of eight since.

Ivery ran the horse for a \$25,000 claiming tag just after claiming him, risking losing him again.

"I had been struggling and not winning races," explained Ivery, "and I said, 'I need to win a race.' Dave tried to talk me out of it."

Black Tide won by 71/4 lengths, and no one dropped a slip.

Black Tide was bred by Snow Lantern Thoroughbreds. Out of the Theatrical mare Turn the Tide, he is sired by Hold Me Back, who stands at Irish Hill Century Farm near Stillwater.

The 5-year-old gelding has earned \$450,832, approaching the nearly \$537,000 earned by his graded stakes-winning half brother Avanzare.

The Mohawk is also Ivery's first in a stakes race.

"He's turning into a hell of a horse," said Ivery. "I've been kicked in the teeth in this business several times, and to get a horse like this for Dave and me is great. Dave's figured him out. He's kind of a nervous horse, and it's hard to get him to relax. He's the first out in the morning because he just wants to get out."

"I don't want to say he's a simple horse to ride," said Cannizzo, "because you have to have trust in him that he'll keep going. But you have to let it rip. José gets him to finish better than anyone."

Black Tide will likely run in the Claiming Crown at Gulfstream Park in December, then have the winter off.

"He's a special horse," said Ivery.
"When you claim a horse, this is pretty
much the stuff you dream about."

Double Nickels

Fifty Five might have been accused of breaking the speed limit at Belmont Park when she kicked into high gear in the stretch to win the \$200,000 Ticonderoga Stakes by a length.

After racing 6½ lengths off the lead at the back of the eight-horse field, Javier Castellano called on the 3-year-old Get Stormy filly, who responded with a late run to win the 1½-mile turf race in 1:41.65.

Fifty Five is trained by Chad Brown and owned by Peter Brant, who purchased the filly privately from her breeder Empire Equines earlier this year after she had won the Florida Oaks (G3T) at Tampa Bay Downs.

When Fifty Five failed to meet her reserve at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale, breeder John Crowe of Empire Equines kept her to race, and she won three of her first five starts, finishing third in the other two.

"Mixed feelings," said Crowe about watching the filly win at Belmont. "I

didn't really want to sell her, but people like us can't afford to stay in the business and race everything we have."

When owned by Empire Equines, Fifty Five raced for trainer Tom Bush, and it was Crowe's relationship with him that led to the filly's breeding.

"I'm a big fan of Get Stormy," said Crowe. "I thought it was a good match from a pedigree and a physical standpoint." Get Stormy had also been trained by Bush. Fifty Five is out of the Brahms mare Soave, who had also been bred by Empire Equines. She died during foaling earlier this year.

"Part of the reason Fifty Five wasn't desirable (at the sale) is that people don't like turf horses quite as much, though that's changing," Crowe said. "Get Stormy was one of those horses that developed slowly, then raced for a long time, winning graded stakes at ages 3, 4, 5, and 6, and grade 1 races at 5 and 6. I hope he's going to turn out to be

successful at stud."

In the Ticonderoga, Fifty Five made her first trip to the winner's circle since the Florida Oaks. She returned to state-bred stakes after racing in graded races throughout the summer, and Brown said she's likely to be given a break until spring.

Fifty Five, the 5-2 favorite, won the Ticonderoga by a length over Flipcup, who edged Ancient Secret by a head.

Absolutely Fast

THE SPORT OF THOROUGHBRED RACING and breeding is always evolving. As a consequence, stables also must evolve in their approach to succeed and be relevant. One such stable that is currently making an impact on the New York-bred scene is Newman Racing—the brainchild and passion of breeder Donald Newman. Though Newman is no longer with us—a victim of cancer at the age of 85—his family, led by sons Adam and Richard, are carrying the banner of his vision.

"My dad, probably to a fault, would keep all of our mares when their racing days were done," said Adam Newman. "But as the years went by, we learned to be more selective and bridge to some better stallions, even going outside of New York State."

"We're experiencing the fruition of that with our current crop of runners," added Richard Newman. "We've evolved from a claiming stable to a breeding operation, and our dad would have been tickled to see its success."

Absatootly, a 4-year-old filly by Mineshaft, out of Newman Racing's Freud mare So N So, is a prime example of the stable's vision.

Coming off a fourth-place finish in the Sept. 24 Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) behind fellow New York-bred Highway Star, the Charlton Baker-trained Absatootly, who sports a stakes win in open company at Laurel Park, returned to state-bred competition Oct. 21 in the \$150,000 Iroquois Stakes at Belmont Park on Empire Showcase Day.

An 11-1 rank outsider in the field of five, Absatootly trailed the field by 6½ lengths after a swift opening half-mile in :45.68.

Marc Keller's Quezon (by Tiz Wonderful), the defending Iroquois champion from the barn of trainer Bobby Ribaudo, stalked the pace and moved strongly to the front at the top of the lane. However, Joe Bravo was gathering serious momentum aboard the late-running Absatootly, deftly cutting the corner off the far turn and pulling even with Quezon in upper stretch.

The pair battled throughout the stretch with Absatootly, along the inside, edging clear in the final sixteenth to register a half-length victory on the wire.

"She ran a great race, and it was a beautiful ride," said Baker. "She always trains great, but she was hanging. Today she came through with her run."

The final time for the 6½-furlong contest was 1:16.04.

Absatootly has won 6 of 17 starts (17-6-4-3), boosting her bankroll to \$385,107.

"So N So was one of our better fillies and an exciting racehorse (a stakes winner at Saratoga in 2009). Hence, we went to Mineshaft with her," said Adam Newman.

Quezon, bred by Bill and Jane Moriarty's Apache Farm, was the strong runner-up. The Moriartys (transplanted upstate New Yorkers) also bred 2014 2-year-old filly champion Wonder Gal.

Frank Paolangeli's homebred Cozzy Spring, also from Baker's barn, finished third after making the early pace.

Fleet Ostrolenka

Trainer David Jacobson reached into the claim box for himself in January, ponying up \$62,500 for hard-hitting sprinter Ostrolenka (by Musket Man). One of the previous owners, Eric Fein, who is also the breeder of Ostrolenka, knew all the best qualities of Musket Man, who raced in Fein's colors.

During his sophomore season in 2009 Musket Man finished third in both the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1, behind Mine That Bird and Pioneerof the Nile) and Black-Berry Preakness Stakes (G1, behind

Rachel Alexandra and Mine That Bird). Prior to that the colt had captured both the Illinois Derby (G2) and Tampa Bay Derby (G3). So it was little surprise when Fein chose Musket Man as the stallion for his Louis Quatorze mare Pumpkin's Pride.

Heading into the \$150,000 Hudson Stakes, Jacobson had sent Ostrolenka to the post eight times as a 5-year-old in 2017. Though the horse had only managed one victory during that span (an

allowance optional claiming race at Monmouth Park that Jacobson described as a "confidence booster"), Ostrolenka was coming off a trio of consecutive sharp runner-up finishes, including a neck loss in Saratoga's John Morrissey Stakes.

An ultra-competitive field of 10 broke from the gate, as Michael Dubb's Eye Luv Lulu shot to the lead. After a demanding opening quarter-mile of :22.82, Ostrolenka, beneath a hard hold by Bravo, rallied into second position to track the leader.

After a half-mile in :46.16, Ostrolenka confronted Eye Luv Lulu. The pair battled the length of the long Belmont stretch before

Ostrolenka got his neck in front in the final strides.

The time for the 6½ furlongs was 1:16.75, giving Ostrolenka his seventh win from 31 starts and earnings of \$622,689.

Runner-up Eye Luv Lulu was bred by Newman, who also bred Iroquois winner Absatootly.

Pat On the Back, owned by Harold Lerner, AWC Stables, and Nehoc Stables, finished a fast-closing third.

JAMES BUTLER

JAMES BUTLER WAS BORN IN COUNTY KILKENNY.

Ireland, Feb. 4, 1855. He came to America with his parents in 1875 and used his savings to open a grocery store. More stores were added, and eventually he became a millionaire with more than a thousand stores. After dabbling in harness racing, in 1900 he bought the Empire City harness track in Yonkers.

After years of negotiation and litigation with The Jockey Club the track was opened for Thoroughbred racing in 1907 and was an instant success.

Butler's estate near Tarrytown, in Westchester County, called East View, was the scene of his Thoroughbred breeding operation. He bought 36 yearlings from the estate of James R. Keene for \$60,000 to be the basis of his New York-bred undertaking.

Butler's first successful New York-bred was the colt Sting (1921, Spur-Gnat, by Voter). Sting began his career with three losses at Empire City before winning a 2-year-old maiden special weight race on July 21. Five days later he won his first stakes race, taking the Wakefield Handicap at Empire City as the 4-5 favorite. He was off for two months, and after losing two stakes races he finished his freshman season Oct. 20 at Empire City with a win in an all ages handicap.

Sting ran only three times in 1924 due to quarter crack issues, but having finished fifth in the Rennert Handicap at Pimlico and 11th in the Preakness Stakes, he gave a hint of what was to come in 1925 when he won the 1¹/₄-mile Empire City Handicap at 8-1, with the favorite Mad Play, who had run third in the Preakness, finishing third. His effort resulted in a track record of 2:03 for the distance.

Sting had a dream season in 1925, establishing himself as one of the best handicap horses in the country. After finishing fourth in the Kings County Handicap at Jamaica, he won five straight races. He began his streak by winning the 11/16-mile Excelsior Handicap at Jamaica at 8-1 while carrying 106 pounds.

Sting's constant competitor, Mad Play, the 8-5 favorite and highweight under 124 pounds, finished third.

Six days later, on May 15, Sting won the overnight Montana Handicap at Jamaica while setting an American record of 1:41½ for the one mile and 70 yards. As befitting his new stature, he went off as the 1-3 favorite and was the 124-pound highweight. *Daily Racing Form* called him "the best handicap horse now racing in this part of the country."

Sting was then ready to move into what we now call grade 1 company. His next conquest, one week later, was the one-mile Metropolitan Handicap at Belmont Park, going off at 2-1 while carrying 114 pounds. The even-money favorite, future Hall of Famer Sarazen, finished seventh with an impost of 128 pounds. The *Daily Racing Form* could hardly contain its enthusiasm: "The son of Spur and Gnat fairly smothered his company with his electrical speed and at the end he was the winner by two lengths.

"While many excuses could be offered for Sarazen, none could take anything away from the startling performance of Mr. Butler's colt, and he proved himself worthy of his place among the best of the winners of the famous old handicap."

Five days later Sting beat two other horses as the 1-12 favorite in a 3-year-olds and up handicap. His next race, June 6, was the 1¼-mile Suburban Handicap,

the second leg of what would later be called the Handicap Triple Crown. Once again the country's new handicap star was up to the occasion. The *Form* was once more impressed:

"James Butler's Sting...just about clinched his right to the top of the handicap division when he was a brilliant winner of the Suburban Handicap at Belmont Park this afternoon. He took up 122 pounds, set all the pace, and nosed out the Greentree Stable's Cherry Pie, a 5-year-old with only 108 pounds in the saddle...The race added just \$11,300 to Sting's earnings, but it added immeasurably more in fame when the character of his victory is taken into consideration."

Other horses Sting beat in the Suburban included, as usual, Mad Play and Altawood, who earlier had won the overnight Select Handicap as well as the 1924 Pimlico Cup and the Bowie Handicap and Latonia Cup.

Nine days later Sting's winning streak came to an end when he finished second by two lengths to Mad Play in the ninefurlong Brooklyn Handicap while conceding four pounds to his old rival.

Six days after that it was disclosed that Sting had sustained a quarter crack in the Brooklyn, possibly accounting for his second-place finish. Although it was believed he would be ready for the Saratoga meeting, Sting never raced again.

If Sting had not had his foot problems, he might have been one of the best handicap horses of his generation. However, Sting's retirement was not a total loss because three years later he sired a horse that became just as talented as his father.

Like his sire, Questionnaire (1927; Sting—Miss Puzzle, by Disguise) took some time before he showed his true ability. A Butler homebred, he lost his first four races in 1929 before breaking his maiden June 10 in a 2-year-old allowance race at Belmont, and he ended his freshman season with an unimpressive record of two wins and four places from 14 starts.

Although he lost his first three starts in 1930, one of his losses was a thirdplace effort in the Metropolitan Handicap at 20-1, with the 11-20 favorite Jack High finishing first and setting an American record of 1:35 for the mile. After winning a nine-furlong 3-year-old allowance race, Questionnaire had another impressive losing effort, finishing third in the Belmont Stakes to Triple Crown winner Gallant Fox. Finishing second in the Belmont was the 1929 2-year-old male champion Whichone. On June 25 Questionnaire won his first stakes race, taking the 11/16-mile Broadway Handicap for 3-year-olds at Aqueduct as the 4-5 favorite. After the race the Daily Racing Form called Questionnaire the third-best 3-year-old male in the country behind Gallant Fox and Whichone.

The Broadway Handicap began a

seven-race win streak for Questionnaire. Other races in that skein included the Vernon Handicap at Empire City, with the 9-10 favorite Flying Heels finishing second; the Mount Kisco Stakes at Empire City in a field of two; and the 1¼-mile Empire City Derby as the 3-10 favorite.

The streak ended Sept. 6 when Questionnaire lost by a head to Gallant Fox in the 1%-mile Lawrence Realization Stakes for 3-year-olds at Belmont Park. Although most modern race fans who are used to watching distance-challenged Thoroughbreds would be shocked to read of 3-year-olds running such a long race, the Lawrence Realization was at that time a prestigious event that had previously been won by such stars as Hamburg, Sysonby, Fair Play, Johren, Man o' War, Zev, and Reigh Count.

Despite its notable history, the 1930 edition might have been its most memorable. The weights were almost equal, with Gallant Fox at 126 and Questionnaire at 123. Although the recent Triple Crown winner was the favorite at 7-10, many upstate dollars made Questionnaire the second choice in the four-horse field at 17-10.

Questionnaire jumped out to a quick lead and extended it to two lengths for most of the race until Gallant Fox began to draw equal to his opponent as the two headed for home. Neil Newman described the race at this juncture: "It was a stern chase and a bitter one, but inch by inch the Fox of Belair forged up on the leader—they were past the mile and a half in 2:28%, which is a fifth of a second better than the American record for that distance. Finally he drew level and poked his head in front...Once in front Gallant Fox maintained his narrow lead and prevailed by a head...This was the greatest race ever run by Gallant Fox and entitles him to be ranked with the immortals of the American turf."

Bryan Field of the New York *Times* described the excitement of the race: "When it was over, turf veterans who had seen many champions in thrilling finishes lowered their glasses, trembling

with excitement."

Despite the second-place finish, and the successful races he ran the next two years, the Lawrence Realization might also have been Questionnaire's greatest accomplishment.

Five days after the Lawrence Realization Questionnaire won the Twin City Handicap for 3-year-olds and up as the 7-10 favorite. However, he followed that with five consecutive losses in the Jerome, Edgemere, and Havre de Grace handicaps and the Laurel Stakes and Maryland Handicap. He was the favorite in four of those races, with future Hall of Famer Sun Beau being the 140-100 favorite in the Havre de Grace Cup.

Although he finished the year by winning the Scarsdale and Yorktown handicaps, Neil Newman argued the Lawrence Realization took too much out of Questionnaire, and that he should have been retired for the season after that race,

Questionnaire's record for 1930 was 11 wins, three places, and four shows from 31 starts and earnings of \$44,800.

After he began his 1931 campaign by winning an allowance race, Questionnaire emulated his sire by taking the Metropolitan Handicap in an effortless performance at 3-5. However, he lost his next start, the Suburban, as the 3-5 favorite to Mokatam, who had finished

second in the Met Mile. *Daily Racing Form* was nevertheless appreciative of his effort: "In one of the most thrilling races in its long and glorious history, Harry F. Sinclair's Mokatam was winner [sic] of the Suburban Handicap...James Butler's Questionnaire, the top weight and popular choice with an immense crowd, was a close second."

Ouestionnaire's connections grouped and prepared their charge for the Brooklyn Handicap which had eluded Sting, and he did not let them down. Daily Racing Form was impressed: "Questionnaire...gave a marvelous exhibition of speed and stamina when under the burden of 127 pounds he scored a magnificent victory in the old Brooklyn Handicap...Questionnaire's performance was doubly meritorious for the reason that he raced the nine furlongs in just three-fifths of a second slower than the record for course held by Peanuts and hung up under a weight of 114 pounds."

On July 11 Questionnaire won what would be his last race of the season when he thoroughly outclassed two other opponents, one of whom was a maiden, in the Empire City Handicap at odds of 1-12. While working out in preparation for the Arlington Handicap and Arlington Gold Cup he injured a heel, and he was retired for the rest of the year. His record for the year was four wins and one placing in five starts, with earnings of \$30,185.


Due to various injuries Questionnaire only raced twice in 1932, winning the Paumonok Handicap as the 3-5 favorite and the Kings County Handicap as the 1-6 favorite. According to *Daily Racing Form* James Butler had agreed to start him in a special race against Equipoise and Mate, but an unspecified injury forced him on the shelf for the rest of the year.

He lost all three of his starts in 1933 and was retired after a brilliant career. b






