The Casino Amendment and More: What Lies Down the Road?

s you all know, last month New York voters passed the constitutional amendment to expand casino gaming in the state. Elsewhere in this issue of the *New York Breeder* you can read about the vote in detail and the specific provisions of the new law (see page 16). I want to focus here on spelling out the short-term implications of the amendment for breeders and then discuss some other issues we will be facing down the road.

The most important points to bear in mind about the casino amendment are (1) when gaming does expand in the state, the law states that no casinos can be built in the New York metropolitan area and its suburbs for at least seven years, and (2) no casinos will be built at a Thoroughbred racetrack.

In other words, the passage of the casino amendment should have no immediate impact on the revenue stream coming to the Breeding Fund and the New York Racing Association purse account from the Genting video lottery terminals. The law does provide for two VLT-only casinos, each with up to 1,000 machines to be run by the off-track betting corporations in Suffolk and Nassau counties, but, if they have any negative impact


on business at Genting, these casinos must fully compensate the Fund and NYRA purses. Overall, the Breeding Fund has never been in better shape. Taking into account the third and final annual increase in percentage of VLT revenue for the Fund, which took place in October, Fund revenue is projected to be \$21 million in 2014, an all-time high.

All that being said, breeders need to be aware of some factors that could affect the status quo in the next several years.

First, even though the new amendment states that no casino can be built in the New York metro area before the expiration of the sevenyear exclusivity period for Genting, it is not unrealistic to imagine that in some future session the legislature could modify that law to allow expanded gaming to enter the New York metro market sooner. We will have ample warning if any such modification is in the works and advocate to legislators that breeders' interests need to be protected accordingly.

Next, we need to keep an eye on the work of a subcommittee of the NYRA board (the long-term planning committee), which is charged with making recommendations to the full board about the future of NYRA and racing in the state. The committee is looking at the re-privatization of the organization following the three-year state takeover, race dates, racing surfaces, pari-mutuel wagering, simulcasting, and the future of all three NYRA racetracks.

NYTB's most important job, once again, is to make sure that consideration of all these important issues takes into account the interests of New York breeders and owners. We have demonstrated that a thriving breeding industry works for NYRA and works for the state and must now use that leverage to protect our current advantages as effectively as possible in the months to come.



#### **Locations of Destination Gaming Resorts:**

- The legislation authorizes up to four upstate destination gaming resorts to enhance tourism development.
   Destination gaming resorts will be selected competitively based on the economic development impact of the resort.
- » Destination gaming resorts are authorized in three regions of the state: the Hudson Valley–Catskill area, the Capital District-Saratoga area, and the Eastern Southern Tier. One region may have up to two casinos if determined by the state siting board.
- » No destination gaming resorts can be authorized in Westchester, Rockland, Putnam, New York City, Long Island, or Indian exclusivity zones. There will be a seven-year exclusivity period during which no further destination gaming resorts will be licensed by the State.

# Six Stallions On the Move to Rockridge

Vinery New York announced that six of its stallions standing at Sugar Maple Farm in 2013 will be moving to Lere Visagie's Rockridge Stud near Hudson beginning with the 2014 season. Also, Rockridge announced the addition of the Eclipse Award-winning sprinter and Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) winner Trinniberg to the roster.

Rockridge is on the former 200-acre property that was Empire Stud and then Vinery North.

"I'm stoked to say the least," said Visagie, who has been working with stallions for more than 20 years. "The news in New York is very upbeat and there is plenty of excitement. It used to be a tough sell up here, but now it seems business is slowly building."

Visagie is out on his own for the first time after work-

ing in New York for Empire Stud, Sugar Maple Farm, and Sequel Stallions. In Kentucky he was associated with Lane's End Farm and Taylor Made Farm.

Former Vinery president Tom Ludt said of the move, "With Dr. Simon winding down all of his North American operations, and following the sale of the Kentucky farm, it made sense to move the stallions in New York. We appreciate the care and great effort that Dan Hayden and all of the staff at Sugar Maple have given the stallions over the past few years very much and we know that will continue with Lere. Dr. Simon retains an interest in many of these horses and has every reason to see them succeed."

As for adding a champion to the roster, Visagie said, "Trinniberg is a great horse for New York. We are happy to of-



fer breeders the opportunity to purchase a limited number of shares in the horse as well."

In addition to the Breeders' Cup Sprint, Trinniberg won the Woody Stephens Stakes (gr. II), Swale and Bay Shore stakes (both gr. III). The 4-year-old retired with \$1,553,086 in earnings.

### STATE-BREDS PERFORM WELL AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER SALE

New York-breds sold well at the 10-session Keeneland November breeding stock sale Nov. 5-14 in Lexington as 92 New York-bred weanlings and broodmares/broodmare prospects were reported as sold for a total of \$4,910,200. Forty-three weanlings sold for an average price of \$50,591 and 49 broodmares averaged \$55,812. The \$37,000 median for all the New York-breds sold outperformed the overall sale median of \$35,000.

Seven New York-bred weanlings brought at least six figures, led by a bay filly by Lonhro that was purchased by Hubert Guy Bloodstock, agent, for \$185,000 during the sale's second session

The top New York-sired weanling was a bay colt from the first crop of Girolamo (Sequel Stallions NY 2012-13). Bred by Dr. William B. Wilmot and Dr. Joan M. Taylor and foaled at Gallagher's Stud near Ghent, the Jan. 23 colt was purchased by Sal Fontino for \$150,000. Consignor Denali Stud acted as agent for Stepwise Farm.

With a resurgence in the broodmare market, nine New Yorkbred broodmares/broodmare prospects met or exceeded the \$100,000 threshold. Yushun Co. went to \$225,000 to buy the 4-year-old Pure Gossip (Pure Prize). Bred by Nustar Breeding and campaigned by Flying Zee Stable, Pure Gossip won the Miss Grillo Stakes (gr. IIIT) in 2011.

#### AGAVE KISS, HESSONITE LIGHT UP FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER SALE

A pair of state-bred champions lit up the bid board at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's November sale Nov. 4, as Flying Zee Racing Stables' multiple stakes-winning sprinter Agave Kiss—in foal to top sire Tapit—was sold to Kiki and Louise Courtelis' Town & Country Farm for \$1.5 million and DATTT Stables went to \$750,000 to buy Hessonite.

Agave Kiss was one of 24 horses to bring seven figures during the one-night sale and ended up as the sale's 12th topselling broodmare.


Selling from the Gainesway consignment, last year's champion New Yorkbred female sprinter Agave Kiss was retired in March with a record of 6-1-1 from 10 starts and \$339,400 in earnings. A four-time stakes winner she won the Cicada Stakes (gr. III) and ran third in the Prioress Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga.

Bred by Nustar Breeding, a partnership headed by the late Carl Lizza, and foaled at Highcliff Farm in Delanson (now Highcliff Stallions), Agave Kiss is by Lion Heart out of Salty Romance, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Salt Lake purchased by Lizza for \$320,000 in 2003.

William J. Punk Jr. and Philip DiLeo's graded winner Hessonite, who was sold by Suzi Shoemaker's Lantern Hill Farm, agent, was champion New York-bred turf female of 2011 and champion older New York-bred female in 2012.

Retired this past September at 5, the chestnut daughter of Freud won nine stakes and placed in four other ones for trainer David Donk, compiling a career record of 11-3-1 from 22 starts with \$879,644 in earnings. Topping her stakes victories, all of which came at Belmont Park and Saratoga, was the Beaugay Stakes (gr. IIIT) in her 2013 seasonal debut.

Hessonite was bred by Berkshire Stud (where she was foaled) and John Meriwether's Waterville Lake Stables Limited, and purchased by Punk as a 2009 Keeneland September yearling for \$27,000.

# **Moving Forward**

ew York voters on election day approved a sharp expansion of casino gambling, but key questions—from when to where—still remain to be resolved in the coming year.

The change in the state's constitution to permit commercial casino gambling was approved 57% to 43% Nov. 5, opening the door to New York awarding licenses to private companies to develop up to seven casinos.

The next step for the state is formation of a request for application, or RFA, which is the document casino developers will have to submit to outline their proposals that must include everything from a show of New York voters approve expanded gambling by a wide margin; application process is the next step

local support to the amount they are willing to pay New York state in an upfront franchise fee.

The RFAs, though, can't go out until after a five-member selection panel is created, a step that can't be taken before Jan. 1. That panel, which is supposed to include individuals with some level of expertise in real estate, finance, and legal matters, can release the bidding packets within 90 days after being formed by the state Gaming Commission. Gov. Andrew Cuomo, who proposed the casino expansion, believes decisions regarding gambling hall locations and winning bidders will be made in the second half of 2014.

The constitutional amendment approved by voters calls for up to seven casinos offering real slot machines and table games, such as poker. A separate enabling bill envisions the first four being built in three geographic areas of the state: the Catskills/Mid-Hudson Valley, southern tier near Binghamton, and the Albany/Saratoga Springs region. Most observers believe that the Catskills likely will end up with two of the four casinos.

Though there are some possible loopholes, the law seeks to prevent full-blown casinos from locating downstate, including parts of New York City, for at least seven years in order to give the upstate facilities time to get legs with bettors. The law also permits the Nassau and Suffolk off-track betting corporations, which are owned by the local county governments, to open one facility each with 1,000 video lottery terminals.

Multiple casino companies already have announced plans for the southern Catskills and southern tier areas, including from the owners of harness tracks at Monticello and Tioga Downs. Voters in those areas overwhelmingly sided with "casino yes" votes on election day, including Sullivan County in the Catskills, where the referendum won with 76% of the vote, the most in the state.


Uncertain, though, is the future of a casino in the Albany and Saratoga Springs area. That's because one component of the approval process calls for a showing of local support for a casino, though the law does not specify what that means. A majority of voters in five counties in that area, including both Saratoga and Albany counties, voted against the referendum; in Saratoga County, 54% voted "no" and in the city of Saratoga Springs opposition to the referendum reached 57%.

State officials, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the Nov. 5 vote will not necessarily decide the issue of "local support" when it comes to granting a casino license in that region. Owners of the harness track in Saratoga Springs, already home to a successful VLT casino, have long said they want to have their facility become a full-blown casino with slots and table games and they are already planning an expansion whether or not one of the casino licenses is obtained.

Though the referendum won with a healthy margin statewide, those voting against it formed a diverse philosophical mix of voters; a majority of voters in more conservativeleaning western New York and parts of central New York, regions where new casino development is barred because of gambling exclusivity deals with local Indian tribes, joined with liberal Manhattan voters to go against the casino expansion. hotel workers to firefighters.

Barry Ostrager, president of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders said he understands the opposition to a casino for Saratoga, saying the community is one of the economic bright spots of upstate and "is not broken and so they don't need to be fixed," like some of the other upstate communities in line for possible casino locations.

While no one can say yet whether New York and the rest of the Northeast has reached the gambling satu-



The casino measure passed comfortably, though, thanks to healthy margins in other areas of New York City, the northern suburbs and Long Island, where 67% of Nassau County voters said yes. NY Jobs Now, a group that pre-election disclosure reports show raised nearly \$4 million from would-be casino developers and unions, focused its efforts heavily on downstate voters with a round of television commercials and intense, get-out-the-vote efforts by the state AFL-CIO and other labor groups representing everyone from ration point, Ostrager said he agrees with Cuomo's logic that creating new casinos in the Empire State will help stem the flow of gambling dollars going to nearby states, including Connecticut, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania.

"My understanding and belief is that the governor and his staff are fully conversant with the importance to the New York state economy of the New York breeding industry, and they're not going to do anything to adversely impact the New York breeding industry," Ostrager said.



A sk a friend to talk about Chris and Patricia Purdy of Ivy League Farm, and the report is a glowing one.

"They don't blow their own horn, but they deserve a lot of credit," said Dave Kamp, who co-owns multiple mares with the couple. "They're real good people, and they're honest as the day is long. Their reputation is well-known."

The Purdys became even betterknown Nov. 1, when their graduate London Bridge became the first New York-bred to win a Breeders' Cup World Championships event. The sophomore colt by Arch rallied from off the pace to top nine other contenders in the \$500,000 Breeders' Cup Marathon (gr. II), going 1¾ miles in his dirt debut to win by a length over Blueskiesnrainbows. It was his ninth start over a ninth different racetrack. "They were over the moon to have this happen; I remember watching it and going nuts for them," Kamp recalled. "I'm not involved in the horse at all, but this is absolutely amazing. Patty should be breeder of the year in New York; it doesn't matter how much money or races other breeders have won. The Purdys accomplished this feat first, and that really trumps everything."

The eventful life of London Bridge began at Ivy League near Ithaca, N.Y. There, Patricia—the 2002 New York breeder of the year—and Chris, a retired dentist who plans the pedigrees of their produce, run a modest yet successful operation. In business 25 years the Purdys estimate they've bred more than 200 runners including grade I winners Carson Hollow and Willy Beamin, grade II winner Sharp Humor—who was champion male in New York at 2 and 3—and 2009 New York champion male Ibboyee. Now they've produced a history-making Breeders' Cup winner as well.

"Patty is very dedicated in the way she takes care of the horses; she lives and breathes these horses, and it's incredible the amount of work and time she and Chris put into this," said Kamp. "Twe come to appreciate that the breeders don't get enough respect."

Patricia Purdy vividly recalls the night London Bridge was foaled in early April because she was alone to make the delivery. His dam, the Indian Ridge mare Kindness, moved quickly through labor. Comforted by the knowledge that the mare was a good foaler who would get the job done, Purdy brought the colt into the world and helped him stand, a nice-sized bay. He grew up to be well-mannered and went off to sales prep as one of the eight-to-10 youngsters the New York operation produces every year. He was purchased for \$130,000 from the 2011

Keeneland September yearling sale when agent Cecil Seaman signed the ticket from Three Chimneys Sales, agent. The thought of him becoming a Breeders' Cup winner never really entered anyone's mind.

Three years later, tuning in with her husband and Erin Meyers—a fourth-year student from a nearby college who helps on weekends at the couple's 55-acre spread—Purdy watched their graduate grind home for Australian owner Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds in the deep stretch of the Marathon, sternly kept to the task by Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith to finish in 2:58.32 at odds of 9-1.

London Bridge became stakes winner No. 50 for Arch. Purdy said credit for the pedigree work goes to Chris Purdy, who actively seeks outcross mares for their breeding program. Late Irish bloodstock agent Brian Grassick secured Kindness, bred in Great Britain by Queen Elizabeth II out of the Easy Goer mare Kissing Gate, after she was an RNA at the 2005 Tattersalls December sale.

"I am more the caretaker; I spend a lot of time in the barns," Patricia Purdy said. "(Chris) has always been very keen in trying to shake up the genes a little bit, and that was one reason he liked Kindness, being an Indian Ridge mare. He thought she was a very interesting possibility as a broodmare, so we brought her over from England. We like to see those outcrosses a little bit; we think it might help strengthen the breed."

"I've always liked Arch," Chris Purdy said. "I always thought he was underutilized. American horses are getting too much inbreeding to the Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector lines, so I like to outcross to get out of that line."

Kindness, who produced the unraced Consolidator colt Easy N Free in 2007 and a winless Flower Alley filly, English Ivy, in 2008, is in foal to Paddy O'Prado on an April 22 cover. One of 15 broodmares at Ivy League, she has a 2-year-old Ghostzapper filly, Letterfromamerica, who is racing in Europe for trainer John Patrick "J.P." Shanahan and owner Thistle Bloodstock Limited, as well as an unnamed yearling colt by Rockport Harbor who was purchased by Michael Dubb for \$40,000 from this year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga preferred New York-bred sale.

The Purdys contemplated attending the Breeders' Cup but stayed home because Pat had foal care duties to attend. They have only been to the World Championships once, when Carson Hollow ran in the NAPA Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) in 2002.

"She's down there on every foal during the delivery, she hasn't taken a vacation in four years," Chris Purdy explained. "At one point I think she said, 'Hey, what if we hop on the plane and go out there and watch him run?' But she's got a couple of babies she's treating every so often in the evening to give them their

meds, and we felt like we couldn't go away like that."

"If you have truly a worthy horse, it seems like the opportunity is here in New York," Purdy said. "I think we can raise as good a horse here as they do in Kentucky. Our winters might be a little more severe and our ground a little rockier, but we're in the right place for us here."

"It took quite a bit of time for a New York-bred to finally shine on Breeders' Cup weekend, but as our numbers have continued to grow in terms of participation in the event, our performances have started to shed light on how far our program has come," said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "In saying that, I really believe you're going to see more New York-breds winning and performing well on Breeders' Cup weekend from here on out. It's a sign of what's going on in the New York state breeding program, something that's turned into significant quality." 🕅

# O'Cains, Rick Burke team to create Saratoga Stud

ike spotting the ideal stakes for a peaking racehorse and then finding the winner's circle, timing is everything. So it's been with a partnership recently formed between Rick Burke and Dr. C. Lynwood O'Cain and his wife, Suzie. The timing is perfect.

Sharing similar personal and professional ethics, Burke and the O'Cains joined forces to create Saratoga Stud, a new stallion complex that will complete a full-service Thoroughbred breeding operation at Burke's Irish Hill Century Farm near the town of Stillwater, just 15 minutes from the main gate at Saratoga Race Course.

Burke wanted to upgrade his farm

to include a full-service Thoroughbred breeding facility. The O'Cains wanted a permanent home for their stallions, with room to grow. All three were eager to take advantage of the recent boom in the New York state racing program.

"We all just felt like it was a great opportunity, a great location, a great partnership, and it just needed to be done," Suzie O'Cain said. "We're excited about it. I think the timing is right."

A mid-December opening is scheduled for Saratoga Stud, which will combine the expertise of the O'Cains, who oversaw the entire breeding operation, including stallion promotion and development, of Highcliff Farm near Delanson for 23 years, with that of Burke, a fifth-generation farmer whose family has lived and worked on the land since 1883.

O'Cain, a licensed veterinarian, and his wife are highly regarded industry veterans, renowned for their work ethic and passion for horses, particularly in New York, while Burke is a rising star in the business. For the past decade, Burke has specialized in broodmare care and foaling, while also providing Thoroughbred sales preparation, boarding, and transportation from his 300-acre spread.

Until now Burke said his operation has been largely "below the radar," just quietly focused day-today on getting mares bred, foaling out broodmares for clients and getting horses ready for the sales.

"Now with the stallions, I call it a one-stop shop," he said. "If owners want to breed to these stallions, they don't ever have to leave the farm. They've got everything right here.

"Every year, it's just growing bigger and bigger," Burke continued. "Now, we're definitely on the radar."

Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, feels the new venture is a further reflection of the marked upswing in the state's breeding and racing program, rejuvenated by revenue from the casino at Aqueduct Racetrack, which opened in October 2011.

"Seeing a breeding facility expand and invest a significant amount of capital in New York State, specifically in Saratoga County, is such a positive sign of the times," Cannizzo said. "The stallion business is evolving for the better in New York.

"Now there is another avenue for stallion owners to diversify very close to Saratoga Race Course with the opening of Saratoga Stud. Due to the positive bloodstock market shifts, people are again investing in land and property here. That is a testament to how strong the program is today."

Saratoga Stud could be the first of many new operations looking to take advantage of this newfound optimism.

"This is a business that's expanding due to the New York breeding program, and the racing and the money that is now available to us," said Suzie O'Cain. "People want to come to New York and participate in it, and we're there with a brand new facility to welcome them. I'm not aware of any program that is as strong as ours."

The creation of Saratoga Stud ends a transitional phase for the O'Cains, who ran the operation at Highcliff Farm since it was founded in 1989 by prominent New York owner and breeder Carl Lizza with partner Joe Bartone. Following Lizza's death in July 2011, Highcliff's six stallions—Bob and John, Congaree, Cosmonaut, Maybry's Boy, Smart Bid, and Stonesider—moved to Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater, under the O'Cains' direction.

At the invitation of longtime friends and fellow breeders Joe and Anne McMahon, the Highcliff stallions were moved again to join the roster at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds—best known as the birthplace of 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (both gr. I) winner Funny Cide—for the 2013 season. All six will now reside at Saratoga Stud. where we were kind of doing our own thing, like we always had been.

"Rick had always had a desire to become a full operation, meaning not just a breeding farm but also a stallion complex, and this kind of satisfied his needs and ours. It was a real good business opportunity. There's no question, it's very exciting for us. We're really looking forward to doing it again, being there in the center of it all. It's going to be wonderful for me

"When Highcliff closed and we had that little interim period, wisely we decided to kind of just relax for a year and get our bearings, and then move forward with our new plan," Suzie O'Cain said. "The McMahons were very gracious to take care of our horses while we were going through this transition. Our goal was always to try and get back to a situation to be part of that every day and for Doc. It's going to be home."

It was during their transition that Burke got to know his new partners. Dr. O'Cain was a regular visitor to Irish Hill to tend to his clients' horses on the farm, and he and Burke began discussing the idea of combining their knowledge and resources in a united venture.

"Some of his old clients had come to my farm and Doc was doing the vet work, and I got to know him better," Burke said. "I knew they were looking for a more permanent home for their stallions. Back in September, he asked me if I was still interested and wanted to do something with him.

"I was starting to look into doing something like that myself, and they were looking for a more permanent home, so the timing was perfect. It

works good because I've got a broodmare population here. I've got a lot of horses on the farm to help support the stallions."

Burke estimated that he has a total of 150 animals on the farm, which is nearly double what he had prior to the rejuvenation of the New York breeding and racing program.

"The last two years with the slot machines and the purses growing bigger, I've been steadily growing here," Burke said. Prior to the Great Recession's start in 2008, most of Burke's clients raised horses to sell at auction. Burke estimated that 80% of his owners sold their horses commercially versus keeping them to race. When the industry and the economy went into a tailspin, Burke said no one could sell a horse for more than what had been invested, so his owners started racing.

"They all went into racing, and they're happy doing that," Burke said. "They're making money on the racetrack, and the horses are producing for them. Now, the bulk of the animals that are raised here go to racing. I don't have as many going to the sales anymore."

In addition to Irish Hill's existing structures—two broodmare barns and a yearling barn—a brand-new, expansive 10-stall stallion barn has been constructed, and large, lush paddocks surrounded by five-board fencing were installed, all on land not previously used by horses.

The new barn will include a breeding shed, tack room, and offices and storage for both the veterinary practice and stallion promotion and development. Highcliff's stallion manager and broodmare manager are also making the move to Irish Hill.

"We felt like there was going to be a need to have more (facilities) in the Saratoga area because there's got to be expansion coming, and Saratoga's going to be the place where they're going to look," Suzie O'Cain said. "The industry outside of New York, as much as New Yorkers themselves, they look at Saratoga as being the epicenter of New York breeding. To have something very close to the racetrack, a new facility, I think is

very appealing to someone who stands a stallion and is either already in New York or would like to come to New York. I think it's a very positive option for stallion owners."

Having weathered the difficult times, the O'Cains and Burke are excited about what the future holds, both for the industry and Saratoga Stud.

"I think people are going to be surprised with what we're able to do between myself and Doc and Suzie here in New York," Burke said. "It's going to be pretty great."

### Four new stallions set to make the grade in the Empire State

here's no questioning that the breeding industry has the pedal to the metal in New York state. Proof positive is the continued influx of mares into the upstate region to take advantage of the program and the addition of new stallions and sire lines. For the upcoming breeding season of 2014, four fresh faces will be available for New York breeders.

#### Emcee

Grade I-winning Emcee, a son of the late Unbridled's Song, makes his way to Becky Thomas' Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson. The Darley-bred colt, raced by Godolphin Racing, joins fellow Darley stallion Desert Party.

On the track Emcee didn't make

many starts, but he made them count. He won four of eight races and ran third twice in graded company, earning \$479,900 in an all-too-brief two-season campaign.

"He's the kind of horse who will sell himself on the end of the shank," said Charlie Boden, Darley's director of sales. "He's got plenty of bone and substance, and breeders will love him once they get to see him."

Trained by Kiaran McLaughlin, Emcee broke his maiden at first asking in September of his 3-year-old year, getting six furlongs in 1:09.74 at Belmont Park. Wintering in South Florida at 4, Emcee ripped through an allowance cast in early February of 2012 on the front end, winning a seven-furlong race by six lengths. Shipped back to New York, he finished third, beaten only a length, by Calibrachoa in the six-furlong Tom Fool Handicap (gr. III).

Following a fourth-place effort in the Carter Handicap (gr. I), he topped an allowance/optional claiming crew at Belmont Park in early May. Later that summer at Saratoga he was on the lead only to tire late in the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap (gr. I), missing by a half-length to Poseidon's Warrior and Justin Phillip. He avenged that defeat less than a month later by winning the Forego Stakes (gr. I) at the Spa by 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths, getting seven furlongs in a sizzling 1:21. His racing career concluded with a cross-country trip and an unplaced effort in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I).

Unbridled's Song, who was euthanized in July after he had an inoperable tumor in his sinus that caused neurological problems, is the sire of 103 stakes winners and is posthumously having an exceptional year. His son Will Take Charge won the Travers Stakes (gr. I) and missed by a scant nose in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) to older horse Mucho Macho Man. Unbridled's Song also sired 2013 grade I winner Graydar and grade II winners Noble Tune and Rookie Sensation. Unbridled's Song is building a strong reputation as a sire of sires, represented by the late Rockport Harbor, Even the Score, Eurosilver, and Songandaprayer, and by upstarts Zensational and fellow New Yorker (at Sequel Stallions) Mission Impazible.

"Unbridled's Song has been beaten up a little bit by the market," Boden said. "But the better bred ones are the ones that will make it as stallions and those are just coming on."

Emcee is out of Surf Club, by Storm Bird's son Ocean Crest. Surf Club is out of multiple stakes winner and multiple stakes producer Horns Gray, the dam of Spinaway Stakes (gr. I) winner Awesome Humor. His initial fee will be \$7,500.

#### Bridgetown

Few sires on the planet are hotter than Speightstown, North America's second-leading sire of 2013 by progeny earnings, who resides at WinStar Farm near Versailles, Ky. Riding that wave is his multiple graded stakeswinning son Bridgetown, who will stand his initial season at Questroyal North near Stillwater, N.Y., for a fee of \$4,500.

Bred and raced by Eugene Melnyk, who raced champion Speightstown, Bridgetown made 23 starts in a fiveyear campaign and won or placed in 18 of those. Possessing brilliant speed with an affinity for turf, Bridgetown should be familiar with breeders in New York as he won four times at Saratoga Race Course.

Trained by Todd Pletcher throughout his racing career, Bridgetown came to hand quickly, winning twice at 2, breaking his maiden at Saratoga going 5½ furlongs in mid-August 2009 and winning the one-mile Summer Stakes (Can-IIIT) at Woodbine in mid-September. Trying to take the field wire to wire in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IIT), he was caught late by Pounced but was only beaten three-quarters of a length in the \$1 million race.

He landed the Latham Stakes at

three major turf sprint events.

Speightstown, a son of Gone West, was North America's champion sprinter in 2004 after winning five top sprint races including the Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I). Speightstown is out of Storm Cat's stakes-winning Silken Cat, making him inbred 3x4 to Secretariat, 4x5x4 to Bold Ruler, and 5x5 to Tom Fool. While Bridgetown,

5½ furlongs at Saratoga at 3, along with setting a course record in Monmouth Park's Gilded Time Stakes at the same distance and finished his sophomore campaign with a fourthplace finish in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (gr. IIT). At 4 Bridgetown won back-to-back starts in Florida to kick off his campaign, then was second in the ultra-competitive Twin Spires Turf Sprint Stakes (gr. IIIT) Derby weekend at Churchill Downs prior to making an unsuccessful run at Roval Ascot. He bounded back with the first of two scores in the Troy Stakes at Saratoga. He was most successful in 2012, having hit the board in five of six starts-all stakes with victories in the Troy and Woodford stakes (gr. IIIT) at Keeneland. Bridgetown made three starts at 6 this year, placing in out of Ellesmere (by Tabasco Cat), is a half brother to seven-furlong stakes winner Carnacks Choice (by Carson City) and Clement Rock (by Strong Hope), there is some routing ability in the pedigree: His second dam, Empress Aly, is a full sister to Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Strike the Gold (by Alydar).

Buzz is building for Bridgetown. Melnyk has retained a stake in the horse, and the syndicate managing his breeding career is headed by Clark Brewster, who is planning on shipping in 10-12 mares to support him.

#### Trinniberg

The latest announced addition to the New York stallion ranks for 2014 is Trinniberg, the brilliantly fast colt

who won the 2012 Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) and was named champion sprinter. The dark bay or brown son of Teuflesberg will set up shop at Lere Visagie's Rockridge Stud near Hudson, along with six stallions that stood last year at Tom Simon's Vinery New York (see page 8).

Trinniberg's tale on the racetrack is a true Cinderella story. The Parboo family plucked him out of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training for \$21,000, and he went on to race in a classic and earn an Eclipse Award.

Trinniberg is the second foal out of Bella Dorato, who was good enough to earn black type while placing in the Finger Lakes Juvenile Fillies Stakes in 2005. Bella Dorato-a granddaughter of Crafty Prospector, the sire of 93 stakes winners-is part of a well-heeled family that has displayed plenty of speed and precocity. She is a half sister to three stakes horses: Eddie White Sox, a Deputed Testamony gelding, ran second in the Genesee Valley Breeeders' Handicap; Jovana (by Minardi; who has Mr. Prospector as his broodmare sire), was runnerup in the Finger Lakes Juvenile Fillies Stakes in 2007; and Dream of Kaylee (by Cactus Ridge) ran third behind Run Away and Hide in the Kentucky Stakes (gr. III) in May 2008 while making his racing debut.

Teuflesberg, a son of 2-year-old champion Johannesburg, was as hardy as they come in today's era. He won the Sugar Bowl Stakes while making 11 starts as a 2-yearold in 2006 and won the Woody Stephens Stakes (gr. II) at 3 while making 10 starts. Five of his starts came in grade I events, with four of those coming around two turns, which perhaps wasn't his strong suit.

Trinniberg's game was sprinting. He also won the seven-furlong Woody Stephens Stakes, and the Bay Shore, and Swale stakes (both gr. III) during his championship season last year. In 2013 things didn't really go his way. He did make a run at the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (UAE-I) and ran second in the Smile Sprint Handicap (gr. II) during Calder Casino & Race Course's Summit of Speed. Trinniberg ended his racing career with a ninth-place finish in a repeat bid in the Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 2 at Santa Anita. His initial fee is \$7,500.

#### **Heavy Breathing**

The biggest story in the New York breeding industry in 2012 was the record-breaking year by first-year sire Frost Giant. The grade I-winning son of Giant's Causeway—Takesmybreathaway, by Gone West, had 12 winners from 15 starters who earned a state-record \$760,633 for a juvenile sire. His two stakes winners, West Hills Giant and Kelli Got Frosty, were both able to mix it up in open company, with the former running a gallant second in the Gotham Stakes (gr. III) in March 2013 and earning \$424,149 so far.

Success brings competition, so Frost Giant's full brother, Heavy Breathing, will stand his first year at stud at Dutchess Views Farm near Pine Plains for a group consisting of Frost Giant's co-owner Andrew Cohen's Sunset Stables, Gary Tolchin's Golden Goose Enterprises, and Well Found Management. His fee has been set at \$2,500.

Heavy Breathing, who will be 5 in 2014, began his racing career at Gulfstream Park in 2012, breaking his maiden Feb. 8 by 7<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths going 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> furlongs. He followed that up with a 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length score going nine furlongs in early March.

He was pitched into graded stakes company by trainer Todd Pletcher and was a solid third behind Went the Day Well in the Vinery Racing Spiral Stakes (gr. III) over Turfway Park's Polytrack layout. Off the board in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I) at Keeneland, Heavy Breathing returned that summer to run second on the turf at Monmouth Park in the 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>16</sub>-mile Lamplighter Stakes.

"Our goal is for Frost Giant and Heavy Breathing to achieve the same level of success," said Sunset Stables manager Eric Bishop.

I) winner Super Saver, champion Rhythm, sires Private Account and Not For Love, and grade I winners and sires Bluegrass Cat and Girolamo.



hen the economy crashed in 2008, so did the New York breeding business. Encouraged by the approval of video lottery terminal legislation earlier in the decade, breeders had invested in stallions and mares and farms, but years of legislative stagnation had prevented progress on construction of the Aqueduct casino, and the financial crisis was for some breeders and farms the final blow.

But for Keane Stud near Amenia, N.Y., that financial crash was a cloud with a silver lining.

In 2006 the farm's original owner, James Edwards, sold Keane to developer Jeffrey Stark and a partner. According to Keane's farm manager Philippe Lasseur, they also bought an adjoining farm and planned to build high-end housing and an equestrian center on some of the farm's land.

Lasseur laughed lightly when he recalled the plan.

"Then the economy went downhill, which was good for us, really," he said.

Those houses were never built, and Keane remains intact, spread across

275 acres in the Hudson Valley not far from Millbrook.

Even during the grimmest parts in the recent history of New York racing and breeding, Keane has fared relatively well.

"Our clients were mostly small owners based in the New York program, and we had a lot of them," Lasseur explained, his voice still heavily inflected with the French accent of his native country, despite 26 years of residence in the United States.

"And when Becky Thomas closed her farm (Lakland North) in 2009, she moved her stallions here. So when a lot of farms were struggling, we were lucky to have stallions come in. And they were very good commercial horses, so we got lucky that way, really."

Keane's clients say that luck had nothing to do with it, despite Lasseur's modest claims. Keane's success, they say, is due not to good fortune but to the work of Lasseur and Dr. Win Stevens, Keane's general manager and longtime veterinarian.

Lasseur has been Keane's farm manager since 1987, when he came to New York after a stint at Gainesway Farm in Kentucky. A third-generation horseman, he intended, he said, to travel internationally to get a global perspective on the racing industry, first going to work at the Irish National Stud, then planning a trip to New Zealand to work there.

"It didn't quite work out that way," he said, with the quick laugh that frequently punctuates his conversation. "I never did get to New Zealand."

Instead, he went to Kentucky and then to New York, where he's been ever since.

Stevens came to Keane not long after Lasseur. A native of Florida, he earned degrees in animal science and equine reproductive physiology at Colorado State University, then worked at Pillar Stud near Lexington before earning a degree in veterinary medicine at Auburn University.

Moving to Millbrook in the mid 1980s, he served as Keane's veterinarian and a principal at the Millbrook Equine Veterinary Clinic. But when Edwards retired and sold Keane in 2006, Stevens jumped at the chance to lease Keane and become its general manager, in large part because of Lasseur.

"Philippe is a huge reason for Keane's success," said Stevens by phone from Florida. "So when the opportunity presented itself, I thought it was a no-brainer. I never would have done it if Philippe and I hadn't had a long relationship."

Stevens and Lasseur have built on Keane's existing success since 2006, shepherding the farm into the video lottery terminal era, which has boosted significantly the financial incentives for racing and breeding in New York State.

"Things have definitely increased and improved," said Stevens. "One of the great things about Keane Stud is our core of loyal clients who have been with Keane for a number of years, but we've also gotten involved with some different stallion owners and we've got some more mares coming."

Among those new stallion owners is Spendthrift Farm, who purchased the grade I-winning Dublin in 2011 and is standing him at Keane Stud.


"It was a good fit because of their approach," said Ned Toffey, general manager of Spendthrift Farm. "Win said, 'We'll handle the care and you handle the marketing.'

"Win's expertise as a reproductive vet from the stallion side of things was a huge part of it," he added. "When you don't have that horse on your own farm, you really worry about the level of care, and you worry that things can go wrong. Win's strength was a big factor for us."

Joining Dublin last year was Frost Giant, on the heels of the stunning success of his first crop of foals. The grade I winner

set a record for progeny earnings for a first crop by a New York stallion and ranked sixth on the national first-crop list with progeny earnings of \$760,633.

Eric Bishop manages Frost Giant's stallion career for owner Andrew Cohen, and, like Toffey, identified Keane's management structure as one of the reasons they chose to stand Frost Giant at Keane.

"It was a good fit for us because Mr. Cohen and I were going to undertake the marketing and the broodmare contracts on our own," said Bishop. "When we interviewed with Win and Philippe, they said, 'We kind of shy away from that stuff. We're not big into the marketing game—we're horsemen.'

"And that's what they are," Bishop

continued. "They're true horsemen, and we have nothing but the utmost admiration for them. They're just true professionals."

"It's a good partnership," said Stevens. "We've always aimed to be involved with owners or groups who want to be active in the management of their stallions. Neither one of us is pedigree-oriented; we're not bloodstock agents; we're not big into marketing. It's just not what we do.

"We take care of horses and try to get mares in foal."

While Dublin and Frost Giant are represented by major players in racing and breeding, Keane's smaller clients get the same attention and care. Michael Michalisin bought his first mare, Day Trading (by Capote), in 2005 for \$22,000. He sold her 2012 Freud colt as a weanling for \$33,000, and it was pinhooked at this summer's Fasig-Tipton New Yorkbred preferred sale at Saratoga for \$110,000.

"Her first foal for me, born in 2006, wound up winning a race at Saratoga," Michalisin said. "Her winner's circle picture is on the wall in the office. That was kind of cool."

Michalisin was at Keane to visit his mare Quiet Honor; he'd brought several family members, and they wandered around the paddocks and the barn, clearly feeling welcomed and at home.

"I came here because of the farm's reputation and the people," he said. "Philippe is the best farm manager in the world, and Dr. Stevens is amazing. It was obvious that our horses

were going to be really well cared for.

"I'm a relatively small-time breeder, but these guys, they just give me the best attention in the world. I think this is as good a farm as anywhere in the world, including Kentucky. It's just beautiful."

Michalisin has boarded three mares at Keane and bred 12-15 horses there.

"I think the winters up here are really good for the horses," he said. "They get a little bit hardier."

Longtime client Joe DiRico keeps a handful of mares on the farm and owns Disco Rico, the third stallion who stands at Keane Stud. He remembers the first time he saw the farm.

"I opened up a magazine and there was this picture of the beautiful brick gates," he said. "It had to be 15-20 years ago. The ad caught my eye so I went up there, and it's gorgeous gorgeous pastures; big, airy stalls."

His appreciation for the place has only deepened since he brought his horses there.

"Win is a great reproductive vet," he said. "And Philippe is such a hard worker and a very detailed guy. The horses get 24-hour care, and it's just a well-run farm and a beautiful facility."

Neither Stevens nor Lasseur is looking to bulk up the farm's stallion ranks, though, with space to accommodate several studs, they'd look seriously if the right horse came along. Stevens indicated that he doesn't want the financial success of the farm to be tied up in a stallion, but he pointed out, having a variety of stallions can offer clients complementary, not competitive options.

"If you've got good-quality stallions with variation in pedigree," he said, "one's not going to overshadow another. If anything, if you've got good stallions, clients might come to look at one and notice that they've got a mare that might cross with another one, which could lead to

more business."

The farm currently boards between 70-80 mares, and while Stevens is optimistic about both the present and the future of New York breeding, his knowledge of the history here injects a note of caution.

"Right after New York passed the approval for the VLTs, we saw a jump, and then nothing happened. The legislature shot itself in the foot by arguing. I hope the New York government doesn't do anything now that's going to hurt the breeding program," he said.

Lasseur, too, drew on history to observe the positive changes in the New York breeding program, recalling the days when New York mares had to be bred to New York stallions every other year.

"A mare bred to Seattle Slew one year would be bred to a \$2,000 horse the next year," he recalled. "When that was changed, you had betterquality mares coming to New York, but VLTs made the big difference. The difference is huge from when I started here until now. The number of mares has increased dramatically, and there are so many more people here from out of state now."

Despite the farm's growth and relatively recent new ownership, both longtime and recent clients talk about the consistency and the quality of the care their horses get, and of the attention and expertise of Stevens and Lasseur. Their clients expect a lot, but as Bishop put it, "What we got was beyond our expectations—way beyond our expectations." The

## Piece of the Action

hen breeder Tony Grey asked trainer Linda Rice to help him find partners in his 2-year-old Freud filly earlier this year, Rice didn't hesitate.

"The only way to get her in my barn was to take a piece of her, and I wasn't letting her get away from me," said Rice in the Aqueduct winner's circle Nov. 23, after Miss Narcissist ran her winning streak to three with a victory in the Fifth Avenue division of the New York Stallion Series, one of four stakes for the progeny of nominated New York sires who have also been nominated to the series on the card.

Out of the Good and Tough mare Mighty Good, Miss Narcissist is owned by Rice, Grey, and father and son John Bianco Sr. and Jr., who race as Acqua Nova Stable.


"We had raced a nice horse named Sleepy Freud together," Rice said of Acqua Nova. "Unfortunately, we lost him to laminitis, and so I spoke to them about (Miss Narcissist) and they said, 'Well, if you'll take a piece, we'll go,' and we went."

Where they've gone is uncharted territory for the Biancos.

"We've never had a stakes horse," John Bianco Jr. said. "She's phenomenal."

Miss Narcissist sat just off the pacesetter in the six-furlong Fifth Avenue, prevailing by a head in a final time of 1:11.60 as the even-money favorite.

"It's nice to have a horse that wins three in a row in her 2-year-old year," said Bianco. "We're looking forward to next year."



West Point Thoroughbreds won how the first Stallion Series race of the day, the six-furlong Great White Way for 2-year-olds, with the aptly named in T

New York-bred Empire Dreams. "Once he got clear, he looked like he'd win by maybe a head, but in his last two jumps, he just extended," said West Point chief operating officer Tom Bellhouse. Empire Dreams drew off to win by 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths in 1:11.16.

Bred by Pegasus Dream Stable, the son of Patriot Act out of Ascended Dreams, by Thunder Gulch, is a half brother to two earners of more than \$100,000.

"He looked like a nice, useful horse," said West Point founder and president Terry Finley, who purchased him for \$35,000 at this year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training. "We didn't think he was going to be this solid or precocious."

A former claimer became a stakes winner when Vicki's Dancer took the Staten Island division, getting up by a neck in the final strides. Owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith, the 4-year-old daughter of Disco Rico was claimed by Dubb two races ago specifically to run at Aqueduct.

"She looked like a good inner dirt

horse," he said.

Out of the Glitterman mare Love That Glitter, Vicki's Dancer was bred in New York by Robert Jarras, who raced her until the recent claim. She ran the seven furlongs in 1:24.71.

She has a record of 2-2-1 from six starts on Aqueduct's inner dirt surface, which will open next month.

"We'll race her back here in a stakes race next month," said Dubb. "I can't wait for the inner dirt. She loves it."

Comandante closed out the Stallion Series races with a win in the Thunder Rumble divison for the Pennsylvania-based Three Diamonds Farm. From Frost Giant's first crop, he is out of the Slew Gin Fizz mare Slew Motion. It was his breeding that initially attracted Three Diamonds' Kirk Wycoff, who purchased him at the 2012 OBS April sale for \$35,000. He was bred by Andrew Cohen, IEAH Stables, and partners.

"He was by a first-year sire that nobody knew, and he just seemed to have all the parts," said Wycoff. "We take a shot on first-year sires, and now we've got three Frost Giants."

Garnering his first stakes victory, Comandante took command in the stretch to win by 1½ lengths in a time of 1:22.66 for the seven furlongs.


