# Weanlings work their way into the spotlight

**FOR** the past few years the media has highlighted the spectacular growth of the New York-bred yearling market. Now I think it's high time to take a look at the sales of New York-bred weanlings, which have started to grab their own share of the spotlight at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

At the marathon sale in 2012, a total of 39 New York-bred weanlings sold for an average of \$38,544 and a median of \$27,000. This year the group realized an average price of \$56,621, up 46.9% from two years before, and a median price of \$40,000, which represents a 48.1% rise over 2012. These numbers speak for themselves. To be sure, fewer individuals sold this year, 29 in all. Another thing to notice is this year's high buyback rate of 32.6%. On the other hand, a handful of pricey weanling RNAs this year suggests sellers may feel confident they have better options down the road; five individuals failed to meet their reserves while drawing bids ranging from \$55,000 to \$120,000.

My last observation is that the ceiling on weanling purchases appears to be on the rise. In 2012 the top weanling price at Keeneland was \$175,000. For each of the past two years, the toppers have brought \$200,000. I thought it would be interesting to take a look at the profiles of these top sellers to find common elements, if any.

In 2012 the top New York-bred weanling at the Keeneland sale was a \$175,000 colt bred by SF Bloodstock from the first crop of Super Saver. The colt was also the first foal out of the precocious and speedy Kentucky-bred, California-based mare Broadway Hennessey (by Hennessey), whom SF Bloodstock had purchased toward the end of her racing career at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. Winner of a minor stakes race and a 4½-furlong track record-setter at Golden Gate Fields at 2, Broadway Hennessey had the additional appeal of having a half brother who was a stakes winner and graded stakesplaced. The weanling, which had been purchased at Keeneland by WEF Stable, resold as a vearling at the 2013 Keeneland September vearling sale to owners Jim and Susan Hill. As both of the mare's subsequent offspring are registered

New York-breds, it seems as if her owners have brought her into the program for the long haul.

The top-selling New York-bred weanling of 2013 was a \$200,000 colt by proven sire Harlan's Holiday bred by Fred W. Hertrich III and John D. Fielding out of the relatively young Kentucky-bred mare First Grade. A winning (but not stakes-winning) turf runner by Smart Strike, First Grade is, however, a half sister to a stakes winner and her second dam is multiple graded stakes winner Recognizable (by Seattle Slew). Recognizable's half brother Awe Inspiring, was a multiple grade I winner. First Grade was purchased by Hertrich for \$50,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale and, while her first foal in 2012 was not foaled in New York, she was brought into the program the following year. Again the weanling topper was not purchased by an end-user but turned around as a yearling, in this case selling to Shortleaf Stable for \$250,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga's select yearling sale.

This year's Keeneland November weanling topper was a colt from the second crop of Sidney's Candy purchased by BG Stables for \$200,000 and, like the 2012 topper, bred by SF Racing. In this case the weanling was out of a proven dam, Evrobi, a winning daughter of Tabasco Cat who produced juvenile grade I winner Tell a Kelly (by Tapit). Evrobi has produced nine foals, but the colt is only her second registered New York-bred. Her 2013 New York-bred Super Saver filly sold for \$125,000 at this year's Keeneland September yearling sale.

On the face of it, this group displays some variety, but also a few common elements. In each case the mare was a stakes winner, stakes producer, or owner of solid (generally graded) black type in the first through third generations. All the mares, moreover, are relative newcomers to the New York-breeding program. Here is more evidence—if more were needed—that the bar is being raised with the injection of quality bloodstock into the program. As more breeders aspire to this bar, there will be no limit on what New York-breds will achieve in sales rings and on racetracks in coming years.

Inspired by Simmard's majestic beauty, power, and impressive pedigree, I decided to run a slew of genetic tests on him - and on his first crop foals as well - to find out what this horse is really made of. The results are astounding... though I can't say that I'm surprised. One of the most impactful pieces of data that came from the testing was the evidence that Simmard is passing on pure speed to his progeny and in a big way. As the record-breaker of the 12 furlong Louisville Handicap (G3), Simmard breaks the mold and shows us that he's got both speed and staying power.

Looking at his first crop, we can easily say that Simmard is stamping his foals at a near perfect rate of 98%...that's not something that can be claimed by very many stallions today. And now, with further evidence that Simmard will generously mark his foals with his mighty speed, I would strongly urge you to consider what this can mean for you. Do not lose your hard earned dollars following the crowd and breeding to in-fashion stallions. It's time to put the evidence to work and start deliberately designing pedigrees.

In the written words of Alan Porter, pedigree master, "often the best winner by a sire is the result of what appears to be a very deliberately and cleverly constructed pedigree." In light of this, we at Dormellito Stud have not only inbred Simmard to Nijinsky II, but also to Round Table and Princequillo via Meadowlake, and the results are outstanding.

In my last letter to you, I spoke about the power that inbreeding to Nijinsky II has to produce unbelievable classic winners. I have listed some examples below.

Successful Inbreedings to Nijinsky II:

Tapitsfly Tale of Ekati Tapit Tapicat Larah

Satans Quick Chick Madame Chiang Holy moon by (Hernando)


If you look at the pedigrees of Tapit, Broken Vow ,Tale of the cat, Scat Daddy, Declaration of War, Rubiano, Blame, Carson City, Union rags, Strawberry Road, Warrior's Reward, Malibu Moon, Maplejinsky, Sky Beauty, Silvano... all have NIJINSKY II in common. If you were to mate grandsons by daughters of Nijinsky II, to granddaughters of son's by Nijinsky II, or vice versa, I bet you that miracles will happen!

Over the next coming months, I'll be sharing more results of the genetic testing that

was done on Simmard and his first crop foals...stay tuned!

## BIG BROWN TO STAND IN NEW YORK FOR 2015

Big Brown, champion 3-year-old male of 2008 when he won the first two legs of the Triple Crown and a leading third-crop sire, will stand the 2015 season in New York at Dutchess Views Farm near Pine Plains.

A majority interest in the 9-year-old son of Boundary—Mien, by Nureyev, the sire of 12 stakes winners, has been acquired by Andrew Cohen's Sunrise Stables and Gary Tolchin's Golden Goose Enterprises. Both were involved in the ownership of Big Brown during his racing career.

Big Brown will stand his first season in New York for an introductory fee of \$8,500.

"Some of his most successful performers have been New York-breds and/or from New York-bred connections," Cohen said.

Big Brown is tied for second behind Curlin among all third-crop sires in North America with his nine 2014 stakes winners, and his progeny have earned \$3,414,825 this year, ranking him seventh among his peers.

#### **DR LARGE TO BANAHAN**

Stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Dr Large will relocate from Indiana to New York for the 2015 breeding season. The 8-year-old son of A.P. Indy—Debit Account, by Mr. Prospector will stand at Banahan Farms near Bethlehem for a fee of \$2,500.

Winner of the Capital City Stakes at Hollywood Casino at Penn National and placed in the Kent Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Delaware Park in 2009, Dr Large was a five-time winner and earned \$215,821 in 19 starts. A full brother to the stakes-winning Lomaki, Dr Large's third dam is a full sister to champion Numbered Account.

## TAPIT'S HONORABLE DILLON TO ROCKRIDGE

Honorable Dillon, winner of the 2013 Hutcheson Stakes (gr. II), will stand in 2015 at Lere Visagie's Rockridge Stud near Hudson. Honorable Dillon, a son of runaway leading sire

Tapit, raced for New Yorker Joe Bucci. His fee will be \$5,000.

"We are excited to stand such a high-caliber race horse and the son of North America's number one stallion, Tapit, at our farm in New York," said Visagie.

Honorable Dillon is out of the Shy Tom mare Shy Greeting. He won three of 15 starts and earned \$233,649.

The deal was brokered by Mersad Metanovic Bloodstock.

"The owners have announced two ground-breaking incentive programs," Metanovic said.

The first incentive, known as the "REAL Award" program, passes on 100% of the New York Stallion Awards earned to the breeders if their mare is booked prior to Jan. 1, 2015, for the 2015 breeding season. The second, "Real Profit" program, guarantees breeders \$20,000-\$30,000 for healthy weanlings they breed from graded stakes-winning or -producing mares.

#### SANTIVA TO QUESTROYAL NORTH

Grade II winner Santiva will relocate to New York for 2015 and will stand at Questroyal North near Stillwater for \$2,500.

The son of Giant's Causeway—Slide, by Smarten, won the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II) and placed in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) at 2 in 2010. At 3 he placed in the Risen Star Stakes (gr. II), finishing second to Mucho Macho Man, winner of the 2013 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I).

Santiva retired after 10 starts and earning \$266,097. His dam is out of Safely Home, a half sister to champion sprinter Safely Kept.

Santiva stood his first season at War Horse Place in Central Kentucky and last year at Swifty Farms in Indiana.


### CENTRAL BANKER TO McMAHON OF SARATOGA

Central Banker, a 4-year-old son of Speightstown—Rhum, by Go for Gin, who was a recent purchase at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale, will stand the 2015 breeding season at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. He will stand for \$7,500 live foal.

Central Banker won the Churchill Downs Stakes (gr. II) in May and was second in the 2013 Malibu Stakes (gr. I) and third in the Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I). He concluded his racing career with a 4-3-2 record from 13 starts and earnings of \$598,786. McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds purchased him for a session-topping \$400,000.

Joe McMahon's son Mike added, "Central Banker showed his versatility by winning or placing nine times in 13 starts at nine different racetracks. We love his 1¾ Ragozin. That is freakishly fast!"

Bred by WinStar Farm, Central Banker raced for Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence and was trained by Al Stall Jr.

#### **NYTB's Stallion Season Auction** to be held January 12-14

New York Thoroughbred Breeders' annual stallion season auction will be held on Starquine.com beginning Jan. 12, 2015, and ending Jan. 14. The auction raises funds that enable NYTB to carry on its two-fold mission of promoting New York breeding and racing and protecting the welfare of industry stakeholders.

Past proceeds from the NYTB Stallion Season Auction have helped secure the purses and incentives that exist in the state today, making New York's regional breeding program the strongest of its kind in the nation. Approximately \$8.6 million in purse money is distributed each year in stakes restricted to New York-breds, and the New York Breeding and Development Fund is worth \$21 million.

In 2014 the following New York farms donated seasons to the NYTB auction: Dutchess Views Farm, Keane Stud, McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, Questroyal North, Rockridge Stud, Saratoga Stud, Sequel Stallions New York, and Darley at Sequel Stallions New York.

The auction has also attracted sponsors from out-ofstate: from Kentucky, Adena Springs, Darby Dan Farm, Darley, Millennium Farms, Pin Oak Stud, and WinStar Farm; from Pennsylvania, Penn Ridge Farms and Pin Oak Lane Farm; and, from Maryland, Adena Springs at Heritage Stallions.

#### **FERRARO HITS FOR 3,000 WINS**

Trainer Michael S. Ferraro notched his 3,000th career win Nov. 12 when Sweet Sweet Afleet scored a 23/4-length victory in the eighth race at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack under jockey David Lopez.



Ferraro, from Buffalo, N.Y., began his career in 1971 at Fort Erie and won his first title at Finger Lakes in 1975. He has been the leading trainer at Finger Lakes a record 18 times.

"You have to respect

(Ferraro); he's been a constant for 30 years," said trainer James Acquilano. "He's still at the barn every day and does everything right."

"He is the best horseman on the grounds," said trainer Sal Iorio Jr. "I always knew turning for home I would have plenty of horse."

Ferraro has notched 2,869 of his 3,000 wins at Finger Lakes. Iorio was formerly a jockey who won 137 races for Ferraro.



Not only have New York-bred weanlings been selling better at Keeneland over the last few years, but the buyers' "ceiling" appears to be rising incrementally. This year saw the first \$200,000 New York-bred weanling in three years.



#### New York-Breds Excel in Breeding Stock Auctions

This year's cumulative results from the Keeneland November breeding stock sale revealed a meaningful overall trend: The value of New York-bred weanlings is decidedly on an upward trajectory.

At the end of 11 sessions of trading (Nov. 4-14) at Keeneland, 29 New Yorkbred weanlings of the 43 offered sold for

an average of \$56,621 and a median of \$40,000. The average is up 4.8% from a year ago (\$53,986), and the median was up 3.9% from \$38,500 last year.

Some high-priced RNAs—there were six that failed to sell that drew bids from \$50,000 to \$120,000—suggest that sellers are confident they have better options down the road.



Discreet Marq

In all at Keeneland, 89 New York-breds were reported as sold of the 121 offered (26.4% buy-back) for an average of \$52,181 and a median of \$30,000. The figures are down somewhat from last year when 93 New York-breds sold of 112 offered (17.0% buy-back) for an average of \$54,948 and a \$37,000

High-end New York-bred broodmare prospects Dayatthespa and Discreet Marq lit up the bid board Nov. 3 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale.

Dayatthespa, just days removed from her historic victory in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT) sold to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings for \$2.1 million. The 5-year-old mare by City Zip—M'Lady Doc, by Doc's Leader, was bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, Cracchiolo, and Goldsher (see page 28).

Next in the ring was the 4-year-old Discreet Marq, winner of the Ticonderoga Stakes for New York-breds on Showcase Day in her final outing prior to the sale, went for \$2.4 million. A third-generation homebred for Patricia and Frank Generazio, the grade I winner sold to Moyglare Stud. She will remain in training with Christophe Clement.



Now an impressive freshman sire: Stakes winners Heart's Song and Party Pooper, plus G3-placed Can't Happen Here, are early stars. Stock have made up to \$425,000 in the ring.

# **Great Eight**

Breeders in New York will have seven new stallions to choose from in 2015 **THANKS TO ITS STRONG** state-bred incentive program for breeders, New York state continues to be an attractive place to start a stallion's career, and three new sires are already slated to make their 2015 debuts in the Empire State. In addition, the state will welcome dual classic winner Big Brown, who brings a terrific race record and some intriguing possibilities to the table; multiple graded stakes winner Musket Man, a transfer from Louisiana; and grade II winner Santiva, who is moving to New York after standing in Kentucky and Indiana.

**ALPHA** (Bernardini—Munnaya, by Nijinsky II) will enter stud at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson at an advertised fee of \$8,500. He showed high-level ability at ages 2 through 4. Second in the Champagne Stakes (gr. I) behind eventual Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Union Rags, Alpha dead-heated with Golden Ticket in the 2012 Travers Stakes (gr. I) after winning the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II) at the Spa in the summer of 2012. Earlier in the year he annexed the Withers Stakes (gr. III) as well as running then-undefeated Gemologist to a neck in the Resorts World Casino New York City Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I). At 4 Alpha added the Woodward Stakes (gr. I) to his résumé. He retires with six wins from 22 starts and \$1,815,667 in earnings, making him the second-leading runner by earnings for his sire Bernardini.

A tail-female descendant of the great Canadian foundation mare Square Angel, Alpha comes from the immediate family of 1984 Canadian champion 3-year-old male Key to the Moon (by Wajima), 1990 Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner Seaside Attraction, and multiple grade I winner Gorgeous. Other members of this family include 2001 European Horse of the Year Fantastic Light, 1995 champion juvenile filly Golden Attraction, multiple group I winner Swain (a divisional highweight in England and Ireland), and grade I winners Cape Town, Cuddles, and Tap to Music.

Alpha's pedigree reveals multiple sources of classic stamina, making him a good choice for breeders seeking to stretch out the progeny of speedy mares. From Seattle Slew onward, his male line has crossed well over Mr. Prospector, who comes from the same female line as does Slew. Alpha has only one fifth-generation cross of Mr. Pros-

pector in his pedigree, so he would seem a natural for continuing this strategy. Speedy Northern Dancer strains such as Danzig (especially through Danehill) and Storm Cat also seem worthy of consideration.

After five seasons at Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Ky., **BIG BROWN** (Boundary—Mien, by Nureyev) is moving to Dutchess Views near Pine Plains as the property of Andrew Cohen's Sunrise Stables and Gary Tolchin's Golden Goose Enterprises. He will stand for an introductory fee of \$8,500. He will be coming in off a very good year in 2014: Currently seventh on the third-crop sire list, he has sired nine 2014 stakes winners and has more than \$3.4 million in progeny earnings through Nov. 20.

On race record there is little for which Big Brown can be faulted. After winning his only start as a juvenile, Big Brown won six of seven at 3 to claim an Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old male. His victories included a tour de force in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (from post 20), as well as impres-

sive scores in the Florida Derby, Preakness Stakes, and Haskell Invitational Stakes—all grade I races. He was also unbeaten in two starts on turf.

A paternal grandson of Danzig from the family of 1997 champion older female Hidden Lake, Big Brown stayed better than most others from Danzig's male line, and he has gotten stakes winners up to 10 furlongs. Nonetheless, as a stallion he seems to be throwing more of the miler types suggested by his pedigree. He is also fulfilling some of the promise he showed as a runner on grass, getting his biggest winners so far—group III winners

Darwin and Big Wildcat—on turf.

Big Brown has a pedigree inbred to Northern Dancer but free of Mr. Prospector and Seattle Slew, making him a natural outcross for these lines. To date he has had his best successes with Mr. Prospector-line mares, getting six of his 11 Northern Hemisphere stakes winners from this line. He also has two stakes winners from mares tracing to Bold Ruler through sources other than Seattle Slew, and two that add a third cross of Damascus via a son to the 3x4 inbreeding through Damascus daughters found in Big Brown's own pedigree. As neither male-line Bold Ruler (except through Seattle Slew) nor sons of Damascus are particularly widespread in modern pedigrees, these results are worth a further look.

Bred for speed, **CENTRAL BANK- ER** (Speightstown—Rhum, by Go for Gin) delivered during his racing career by winning the 2014 Churchill Downs Stakes (gr. II), defeating grade I winners Shakin It Up and Sahara Sky while earning a 107 Beyer Speed Figure. He also won the 2013 Smirnoff Sorbet Quick

Call Stakes at Saratoga and placed in the 2013 Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) and Malibu Stakes (gr. I). A good traveler, he won or placed in stakes races from New York to California and south to Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

Central Banker's sire Speightstown—a top-10 sire for the last four years—needs little introduction. Central Banker is a half brother to Gantry (by Pulpit), whose seven stakes wins to date include the 2012 Smile Sprint Handicap (gr. II), and to multiple stakes-placed Song of Pirates (by Unbridled's Song). Their dam, Rhum, could also run, winning the listed Rosenna Stakes at Delaware Park and the restricted Ticonderoga Stakes at Belmont Park at 5. She is a half sister to 2002 Arkansas Derby (gr. II) winner Private Emblem and to four stakes-placed runners.

While Central Banker has plenty of zip in his pedigree, he also has a Kentucky Derby winner as his maternal grandsire and Halo as sire of his second dam. These elements suggest that, like his sire, he should be able to blend his speed with more stamina-oriented mates. He will stand at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds at an advertised fee of \$7,500.

Stakes-winning **DR LARGE** will make the move from Indiana to New York for the 2015 breeding season. The 8-year-old son of leading sire A.P. Indy, out of Debit Account, by Mr. Prospector, stood his first four seasons in the Hoosier state, the last year at Carmalley Valley. He relocates to Banahan Farms near Bethlehem where his fee will be \$2,500.

Bred by WinStar Farm, Dr Large proved to be a solid middle-distance runner for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farms and trainer Larry Jones, winning the one-mile Capital City Stakes at Hol-

lywood Casino at Penn National and placing in the grade III Kent Stakes on the turf at Delaware Park in the summer of 2009. He later was trained by Tony Dutrow and in 2010 was owned by Carmalley Valley Farm.

In all he went 5-1-5 in 19 starts and earned \$215,821.

Dr Large's female line traces back to the Phipps family's grand Numbered Account as his third dam is a full sister to the 1971 champion 2-year-old filly and dam of top sire Private Account and the grade I-winning Dance Number, who produced champion Rhythm, top Maryland sire Not For Love, and Get Lucky, the second dam of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner and hot first-crop sire Super Saver.

Dr Large is a full brother to grade III winner Lomaki and a half brother to stakes-placed Global Force, a son of Giant's Causeway.

With Tapit easily the hottest stallion in North America, it was only a matter of time before New York got one of his good sons. It falls to **HONORABLE DILLON** (Tapit—Shy Greeting, by Shy Tom) to become the first graded stakes winner by Tapit to stand in the Empire State. He will enter stud at Rockridge Stud, near Hudson, and will stand for an advertised fee of \$5,000.

Honorable Dillon has only one stakes win to his credit, but it was a good one. In taking the 2013 Hutcheson Stakes

(gr. II), the colt defeated a solid field that included Forty Tales, Undrafted, Singanothersong, Pataky Kid, and Really Sharp, all graded stakes winners during their careers. As for the others in the race, Merit Man became a grade I-placed multiple stakes winner and Weekend Hideaway became a multiple stakes winner. Adding to the impressiveness of his effort, Honorable Dillon won in 1:22.53 after racing wide throughout and remaining on the wrong lead down the stretch.

A scion of an Argentine female family that includes the great Forli and 2014 Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) winner Texas Red, Honorable Dillon

is out of stakes-placed Shy Greeting, also the dam of 2004 Argentine champion juvenile filly Forty Greeta (by Roar). A half sister to Forty Gregaria (by Roar), dam of 2007 Estrellas Juniors Sprint (Arg-I) winner Greco Tom (by Shy Tom), Shy Greeting is out of the Groovy mare Greevy, a half sister to 1987 Fayette Handicap (gr. II) winner Good Command (by Top Command). The third dam of Honorable Dillon, Gioconda, a multiple group I

winner in Argentina, is also the second dam of 2000 Premio Maipu (Arg-I) winner Impression (by Rubiano) and of 2003 Premio Cyllene (Arg-II) winner Imperial Roy (by Roy).

Shy Greeting's sire Shy Tom (a Blushing Groom half brother to grade I winners Hennessy and Pearl City) is also worthy of mention. A versatile horse, he won grade III races on both dirt and turf before being exported to Argentina, where he was among the top five sires in 1998 and 1999. While Shy Tom set a course record for 11 furlongs at Gulfstream, Honorable Dillon's immediate female family tends more toward speed, so it will be interesting to see which influences are most dominant in his progeny.

MUSKET MAN (Yonaguska—Fortuesque, by Fortunate Prospect) is transferring to New York after standing his last three seasons at Elite Thoroughbreds near Folsom, La., but he already has a New York-bred stakes winner in Ostrolenka, winner of the Oct. 18 Sleepy Hollow Stakes on New York Showcase Day. The current leader of the Louisiana freshman sire list and 18th on the national list, Musket Man will stand the 2015 season at Waldorf Farm near North Chatham for an advertised fee of \$2,500.

The winner of six of his 16 races, Musket Man captured the 2009 Illinois Derby (gr. II) and the Tampa Bay Derby (gr. III). He also placed in five grade I races, including the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness, and was out of the money only twice in his career.

Musket Man is the top earner for his sire, 2000 Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) winner Yonaguska, who is in turn a son of 1994 champion sprinter Cherokee Run. Prior to his export to Turkey in 2010, Yonaguska also sired New York-bred Yawanna Twist, winner of the 2012 General George Handicap (gr. II) and \$525,467. This is a male line that has done well with mares from a variety of sire lines, suggesting some degree of genetic versatility.

On the distaff side Fortuesque, the dam of Musket Man, is a stakes-placed full sister to Flambé, dam of multiple grade I winner Ron the Greek (by Full Man-

date). Her sire, Fortunate Prospect, won the 1984 San Vicente Stakes (gr. III) and was a consistent sire of tough, hard-knocking winners. Fortuesque's dam Flambeau (by Dixieland Band) never raced but is a half sister to listed stakes winners Miami Slick (by Baldski) and Cielo Otono (by Conquistador Cielo; second dam of 2013 Donn Handicap, gr. I, winner Graydar). Flambeau is also a half sister to Bubbles Darlene (by Fappiano), dam of multiple English stakes winner Elrafa Ah (by Storm Cat).

SANTIVA (Giant's Causeway—Slide, by Smarten) is moving into a very competitive market for his male line, as nine of New York's top 20 sires of 2014 are direct descendants of Storm Cat. With the relocation of two-time state leading sire Bluegrass Cat to California and the death of fourth-ranked Noble Causeway, however, there may be room at the top, and Santiva will be priced competitively at \$2,500 at Questroyal North near Stillwater. He will be a freshman sire of 2016.

The first son of Giant's Causeway to win a two-turn graded stakes as a 2-year-old, Santiva won the 2010 Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II) on dirt, defeating Iroquois Stakes (gr. III) winner and eventual Preakness third Astrology in a game performance. He also ran second in the Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) on Polytrack. At 3 he was second to eventual multiple grade I winner Mucho Ma-

cho Man in the Risen Star Stakes (gr. II) and turned in a solid performance when sixth in the Kentucky Derby before ankle trouble forced him into retirement.

A three-time leading sire, Giant's Causeway has plenty of New York connections. His full brother, Freud, currently leading the 2014 New York sire list, has been a top-five New York sire annually since 2007 and led the state in 2008. Giant's Causeway's sons Noble Causeway and Stonesider occupy the third and sixth positions on this year's general sire list, and his son Frost Giant is New York's leading

third-crop sire in 2014 and led the state's second-crop list in 2013.

On the distaff side Santiva is also well connected. A full brother to grade II-placed Her Majesty and a half brother to grade II-placed Take Arms (by Honour and Glory), he is out of Slide, a half sister to champion sprinter Safely Kept (by Horatius) and to 1997 Kentucky Cup Sprint Stakes (gr. II) winner Partner's Hero (by Danzig). Another half sister to Slide, Safe Salute (by Hail Emperor), is the dam of listed stakes winner Sea Dub (by Sea Hero) and the second dam of stakes winners Dreamintowin and Snappy Girl.

Santiva's pedigree is free of both Mr. Prospector and Seattle Slew, making him an outcross to both lines. He may also appreciate mares returning Bold Ruler through a daughter, as his 5x4 inbreeding to Bold Ruler is through two sons.

Last but not least among the sires currently known to be coming to New York for 2015, WILLCOX INN (Harlan's Holiday—De Aar, by Gone West) is also a Storm Cat-line horse but from a different branch than Santiva. For Willcox Inn, the connecting link is 1994 Vosburgh Stakes (gr. I) winner Harlan, who before dying in 1999 sired multiple grade I winner Harlan's Holiday in his fourth crop. Harlan's Holiday was also short-lived, dying at age 14, but led the juvenile sire list in 2012 thanks to his son Shanghai Bobby, the champion juvenile male

of that year.

A graded winner and grade I-placed on both turf and Polytrack, Willcox Inn scored his biggest win in the 2011 American Derby (gr. IIT) at 1½ miles. He also won the 2011 Hawthorne Derby (gr. IIIT) and 2013 Washington Park Handicap (gr. IIIT) and ended his career having won six of 22 starts and \$1,015,543.

De Aar, the dam of Willcox Inn, is a grade III-placed half sister to multiple grade I winners Cetewayo (by His Majesty) and Dynaforce (by Dynaformer). She is also a half sister to 2003 Sky Classic Handicap (Can-IIT) winner Bowman Mill (by Kris S.); to stakes winner Ntombi (by Quiet American); to group I-placed Fort Nottingham (by Alleged); and to grade II-placed Bryntirion (by Bering) and Thabazimbi (by Empire Maker). De Aar's winning full sister Somerset West

is the dam of 2009 Dallas Turf Cup Handicap (gr. IIIT) winner Seaspeak (by Mizzen Mast).

Willcox Inn's second dam Aletta Maria (by Diesis) is a full sister to 1990 Lancashire Oaks (Eng-III) winner Pharian and a half sister to the quick juvenile Raah Algharb, winner of the 1994 Tripleprint Flying Childers Stakes (Eng-II). Overall, this is a female line promising durability and stamina, making Willcox Inn a good choice for infusing stamina into the progeny of speedier mares. He will stand at Saratoga Stud at a fee of \$5,000.

**BLOODSTOCK AGENT PETE BRADLEY** might have walked away from one of the smartest purchases of his career at a Central Florida 2-year-old in training sale if the promising chestnut filly he was eyeing had been foaled anywhere but New York.

Dayatthespa, who on Nov. 1 wired the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT) field to win by  $1\frac{1}{4}$  lengths, is offset a bit in her knees and walks a bit wide. But on the Ocala Breeders' Sales track prior to the 2011 March 2-year-olds-in-training sale, the daugh-

ter of City Zip glided an eighth of a mile in a brisk:10%.

"She had a really good stride on the (synthetic) Safetrack at OBS, and I have a bit of a propensity for turf horses anyway," said Bradley. "She was a lanky, pretty typical City Zip in the front and wasn't the greatest walker. But she looked great on the track and they don't have any walking races, so I told (trainer) Chad (Brown) we should take a chance on her."

Dayatthespa becomes second New York-bred Breeders' Cup winner in two years

A big part of the attraction was her New York-bred status. Bradley was putting together racing partnerships to take advantage of the growing New York program.

Florida pinhooker Niall Brennan had offered Dayatthespa at OBS. He had purchased her for \$50,000 out of the 2010 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred sale because he saw raw talent in the filly that had been bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, John Cracchiolo, and Scott Goldsher (see next story).

"She is not perfect in front and what you saw walking at you was not a reflection of the filly's ability," Brennan said. "City Zip is offset through his knees, but he was very sound. She was quite typical of the sire, and I just really liked her. She had presence and class and great balance in the way she moved."

The future champion's imperfect conformation apparently worked to Bradley's advantage. Her knees and a touch of immaturity prevented her from getting the attention Brennan thought she deserved, so he withdrew her from the sale.

"I think she had gotten overlooked," Brennan said. "In hindsight if she were at the April sale, she would have stood out, but she was under the radar. We are sellers, but

we are not going to give horses away."

Bradley and his partner Steve Laymon jumped on the opportunity and bought Dayatthespa privately.

Dayatthespa broke her maiden at Saratoga in her first start, winning by four lengths at 5½ furlongs on the turf. She rolled right into the grade III Natalma Stakes at Woodbine where she finished second to Northern Passion by 1½ lengths and beat Stephanie's Kitten, who was third.

The filly's performance in the Natalma suddenly made her a live Breeders' Cup World Championships contender. But she had not been nominated, so Bradley and Laymon went looking for another partner to help cover the nominating fee. They attracted New York native and Tony Award-winning Broadway producer Jerry Frankel, whom Bradley had done business with for several years. Frankel bought 50% of Dayatthespa and then brought his brother and co-producer. Ron, into the partnership. (They are not related to the late trainer Bobby Frankel). The filly finished ninth in the 2011 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs.

As a 3-year-old year Dayatthespa won five consecutive stakes, racing at a mile or 1½ miles. Her connections skipped the

next two Breeders' Cups because they felt the Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) probably suited her best but didn't see an advantage in running against eventual two-time Mile winner and two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan.

In 2014 the owners and Brown felt they'd seen the 5-year-old Dayatthespa finish strongly enough at two turns to try the 1½-mile Filly & Mare Turf. She would be the only contender in this year's Filly & Mare Turf coming into the race off back-to-back victories, having won the Yaddo Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 24 followed by a win in the First Lady Stakes (gr. IT) at Keeneland Oct. 4.

"There were some questions about the extra eighth of a mile," Bradley said because Dayatthespa had never tried the distance. "But when you let her take control, she is almost unbeatable."

Dayatthespa's victory in the Breeders' Cup gave her a 10th stakes win and her third grade I. Her career stakes wins include two other grade Is and a couple of grade IIIs.

Her performance in the Filly & Mare Turf also is an indicator of how far the New York breeding program has come in a short time, considering she is the second New York-bred to win a Breeders' Cup race in as many years. London Bridge, a son of Arch bred by Patricia Purdy, became the first in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Marathon (gr. II).

Following the Breeders' Cup, Dayatthespa was on a plane bound for the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale near Lexington where her star appeal shone as brightly as it had when she stood in the Santa Anita winner's circle draped in a floral blanket of yellow and purple. The filly sold for \$2.1 million to Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings.

"It worked out the way it was supposed to; she went to great owners and to the right trainer," Brennan said. "We know many jewels come in different shapes and sizes."

#### NEW YORK-BRED DAYATTHESPA

**WAS** named for Saratoga Race Course, but the chestnut mare's Saratoga connections go deeper than that.

Five of her 18 starts came at Saratoga Race Course, where she broke her maiden by four lengths in her debut in 2011. She lost there only once, finishing second in the Fasig-Tipton De La Rose

Stakes early in this summer's meet, and trainer Chad Brown's barn at the Oklahoma training track was her home base for much of her racing career.

"She thrives at the Spa," said partner Peter Bradley of Bradley Thoroughbreds,

who purchased Dayatthespa privately after she had been withdrawn from the 2011 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-olds in training sale. Joining Steve Laymon and Bradley in the partnership were Jerry and Ronald Frankel.

The first New York-bred to win a grade I Breeders' Cup race, Dayatthespa was born at the now-defunct Empire Stud near Hudson, N.Y., founded by Jamie La-Monica and Kurt Butenhoff in 2003.

"We were trying to get stallions that

would be attractive to the New York marketplace," explained LaMonica, who has since left the New York breeding business to establish The Stallion Company near Lexington, Ky. In the early 2000s the prospect of casino revenue flowing into New York purses and the breeders' fund had made the state an attractive place to breed horses, and LaMonica and his

partners set up shop in the Hudson Valley.

LaMonica had owned a part of multiple graded stakes winner City Zip during the horse's racing career, purchasing him outright to syndicate as a stallion with Gus Schoen-

born. Long-time LaMonica client Scott Goldsher was part of the original syndication, but the stallion was only part of the breeding equation. To which mare would they breed him?

"John Greeley had some mares for sale," LaMonica recalled. "We were good friends, and I went to see one of them that John said was really fast and incredibly talented. Unfortunately, a fracture had caused her to pull up short on her career."

Though winless before the injury, M'Lady Doc (by Doc's Leader) had a full brother, Phi Beta Doc, who had won the 1999 Saranac Handicap (gr. IIIT) and earned nearly half a million dollars.

"Her pedigree had some nice things to offer," said LaMonica, "and she looked like she'd throw a pretty foal, so we bought her."

LaMonica had met John Cracchiolo at the Breeders' Cup in California, and, knowing that Cracchiolo was interested in getting involved with horses, LaMonica contacted him about becoming a partner in M'Lady Doc.

Her first named foal, a colt by Quiet American, earned more than \$125,000; the second, by Wiseman's Ferry, didn't do nearly as well. In 2008 LaMonica, Goldsher, and Cracchiolo sent her to City Zip, and on Feb. 17, 2009, M'Lady Doc foaled a chestnut filly with a blaze.

"She was absolutely lovely," LaMonica remembered, a sentiment echoed by the man who raised her while she was at Empire, Bertrand de Brevedent.

"She was purely beautiful," de Brevedent said recently. "We foaled about 60 foals a year at Empire and from day one, I knew she was special."

Dayatthespa spent about 10 months at Empire, strengthening de Brevedent's impression of her promise. An Illinois resident, Goldsher vacationed in Saratoga with his family and stopped by to visit when she was a weanling. De Brevedent escorted the Goldshers out into the field to see the

little filly with the big personality.

"I took a picture of her when she wasn't even two weeks old," said the former trainer. "She's galloping behind her mother in a small paddock, and that's how I knew she was special: she was a beautiful mover."

De Brevedent was not unaccustomed to being around good horses: he'd worked for trainer Christophe Clement for nearly a decade, then trained on his own before managing Empire Stud. The grade I-winning We Miss Artie is among the horses that have been in his care, but even among the stars he's seen, Dayatthespa stood out.

"Some of the horses took me a month, six months, a year to realize they were going to be something special," he observed, "but she was a hit from the get-go. She was smart, and she had a perfect disposition and conformation. She was the whole package."

From Empire, Dayatthespa moved north, about 15 miles from the track for which she'd later be named. Heidi Fischer of Jeffrey Tucker's Stone Bridge Farm said that Ryan Bardin, who helped

prep the filly, remembered her as "tough but classy."

The primary person responsible for her care was farm manager Sue Vitro. After battling cancer, Vitro passed away Nov. 3, two days after Dayatthespa's Breeders' Cup win.

"She did a great job prepping the filly," said LaMonica. "We didn't have a sales consignment at the time, and she was very kind to me when I came up there.

"All the work that the people on the farm do," he continued, "and no one ever talks about them. They are the unsung heroes; without those really talented farm managers and caretakers of the horses, in adverse weather conditions—there's no way you'd be able to raise a champion."

Cracchiolo and Goldsher breed to sell, and, despite her potential, Dayatthespa was no exception, though LaMonica thinks that she might have been had she not been born in the thick of the financial crisis. Goldsher refuses to look back with seller's remorse.

"We've sold plenty of horses that have done nothing," he said philosophically. "It's cool to have one that wins."

And win this one did, three grade I races among her 11 victories, worth \$2,288,892—a lot more than her yearling sale price of \$50,000 when she was purchased by Sarazen Stable in 2010 at the Fasig-Tipton sale of New York-breds at—where else?—Saratoga.

Bradley won't disclose how

much he paid for her the next year, though it was, he allows, "a bargain."

By that point LaMonica's connection to Dayatthespa had diminished; Cracchiolo and Goldsher were the breeders of record, and she'd been away from Empire Stud for more than a year. But when it was Bradley who took the filly home in March 2011. LaMonica couldn't have been more pleased.

"Pete Bradley was really kind to me when I was a young kid," he said. "He let me tag along and follow him around. When he ended up with her, I was really happy."

Given Dayatthespa's accomplishments, and the \$2.1 million she brought at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's recent No-

vember sale of breeding stock, Bradley must have taught LaMonica well, and given their early relationship, it's perhaps no surprise that the two ended up with similar horse sense, with Bradley buying the filly whose breeding LaMonica had arranged, though Bradley emphasized that the purchase was a pure business decision.

"I was looking for a New York-bred, and she had a great way of moving on the track," said Bradley.

The mare that has pushed the status of New York-bred horses to a new level will, with her sale to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings as a broodmare prospect, leave the Empire State behind and make a home in the Bluegrass.

"She was the freak of M'Lady Doc's foals," said Goldsher. "She did really well. The broodmare was nothing special until Dayatthespa came along."

And Dayatthespa will remain M'Lady Doc's finest progeny, as the mare was put down after hurting herself in her paddock while in foal.

"That," said Goldsher, relating the incident with sadness, "was worse than selling Dayatthespa."

As Dayatthespa closed her career with her most prestigious win, her former connections from around the country were watching: Goldsher in Illinois, de Brevedent in upstate New York, LaMonica in Central Kentucky.

"I'm surprised they didn't hear me out there," given how loud he cheered, said LaMonica. "It's extremely gratifying: My friends bought her dam and let me pick her out, and it's the culmination of City Zip growing up into an elite sire."

He also noted that the Illinois-bred Work All Week gave City Zip a second Breeders' Cup win this year, in the Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I).

"Dayatthespa is an exceptional example of what a New York-bred should be," LaMonica declared. "She's what we were always striving to do: raise a great horse that could be an open company horse."

Dayatthespa is that.

WITH THE RECENT PASSING of the great Cigar, many people have gone to Youtube.com to watch some of his most memorable races, of which there are many.

But if you watched the 1995 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), or the Dubai World Cup and the Woodward Stakes (gr. I) from the following year, you might have caught a familiar sight out of the corner of your eye. In all three races, there was a white-blinkered horse either alongside him or behind him who was running his heart out in his futile chase of the mighty Cigar.

While Cigar battled back to defeat fellow American Soul of the Matter in the inaugural Dubai World Cup, few noticed the battle going on behind them, as the white-blinkered horse, who had been passed on the outside by the classy British horse Pentire, was also fighting back gamely to finish third and secure a 1,2,3 American finish. This was after he had looked Cigar in the eye for a quarter of a mile before giving way in the final furlong.

That was the story of L'Carriere's career, at least a good part of it, as the gutsy New York-bred gelding kept giving his

#### New York-bred L'Carriere, the 'gallant horse who tried'

all, but having to settle for second behind Cigar in the Classic and Woodward and third in the Dubai World Cup. In those three defeats alone, L'Carriere earned \$1.160.000.

It was unfortunate that L'Carriere never got a chance to meet Cigar at Saratoga, for that was where the horse thrived the most after being turned over as a 4-year-old to trainer H. James Bond by breeder/owner Virginia Kraft Payson in the spring of 1995.

In his five starts at Saratoga for Bond, L'Carriere won the 1¼-mile Saratoga Cup Handicap (gr. III) in back-to-back years by seven lengths and 3½ lengths and was second in the Whitney Handicap (gr. I). He also captured a nine-furlong allowance at the Spa in his third start for Bond.

The son of Carr de Naskra—Northern Sunset, by Northfields, had been trained by Roger Attfield for the first 10 starts of his career.

"Needless to say, that's when horses

were warriors; those were real horses," Bond said. "He was a true racehorse who went out there every time and chased his heart. Those kinds of horses always put on a show for everybody.

"He really started my career, especially with him coming along in only the second or third year I worked for Mrs. Payson. In fairness, it was Roger who had him gelded. That's what he really needed. I remember seeing him run early in his career. I had what I thought was a pretty nice Mr. Prospector colt in the race, and I remember seeing L'Carriere and thinking, 'Boy, I hope that one comes to me some day.'"

When Bond, who had been based at Finger Lakes Racetrack and working with New York-breds began having success for Payson, she decided to send him the gelding to run in state-bred races, but it didn't take the horse long to make the huge leap from New York-bred races to grade I company.

In only his fourth start for Bond, L'Carriere found himself in the prestigious Whitney Handicap.

"I had just started working for Mrs. Payson, and I got kinda lucky the first year," Bond recalled. "Some of the horses ran pretty good for us. She had this New York-bred, and Dick Lundy, her old trainer, was long gone. For whatever reason I was just fortunate that she sent me the horse, and he just thrived after getting up to Saratoga."

So, Bond inherited a horse whose sire had won the Travers Stakes (gr. I) and the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II) and had placed in four grade I stakes, and whose dam had already produced a pair of milliondollar earners—Budweiser Irish Derby (Ire-I) and King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond Stakes (Eng-I) winner St. Jovite and seven-time stakes winner Salem Drive—and \$800,000 earner Lac Ouimet. L'Carriere would out-earn them all and enabled Northern Sunset to be voted Kentucky Broodmare of the Year in 1995.

"He certainly had the pedigree," Bond said. "His dam was unbelievable. I think you could breed her to a duck and get a racehorse. She was just an incredible mare. You just had a different, stronger pedigree back then. And credit to Mrs. Payson; she had both the stallion and the mare. I have horses with good pedigrees, but when you push on them, it just breaks your heart.

"L'Carriere was over in the knees and when he stood on the track he kinda buckled at the knees a lot of times. But he went out there and ran every time."

Bond put L'Carriere in the Whitney off an allowance victory at Saratoga, and he ran a big race to finish second to Unac-

counted For at odds of 10-1.

"I had Joe Bravo on him, and I told him, 'Joe, this horse likes to be there and wants to be on the pace,' Bond recalled. "He just got squeezed coming out of there and couldn't get free. But, boy, he still ran a hell of a race that day. He showed up strong."

L'Carriere proved that race was no fluke by romping in the Saratoga Cup, with Unaccounted For a distant third. After a fourth in the Meadowlands Cup Handicap (gr. I), L'Carriere ran his heart out in the





Breeders' Cup Classic, battling on the front end the whole way and still finishing a strong second to Cigar at odds of 51-1, with the 1¼ miles run in a swift 1:59.58 in the mud. Behind him were Unaccounted For, Soul of the Matter, two-time group I winner Halling, and other grade I winners Star Standard, Peaks and Valleys, Tinners Way, and the previous year's Classic winner Concern.

L'Carriere had proved himself to be one of the leading horses in the country. Although he finished fourth in the Gulfstream Park Handicap (gr. I) in his first

> start of 1996, it was decided to send him to Dubai for the inaugural World Cup and a rematch with Cigar.

> "Billy (Mott) was stabled right across from me at Payson Park, and we were both headed to Dubai," Bond said. "Cigar was in the second stall across the way from us, and I had to keep looking at him. All I kept saying was, 'We're gonna get him this time.' And I really thought I had



But Bond has since second-guessed himself regarding one aspect of the trip.

"I think we went over too early with him; I believe it was three weeks before the race," he recalled. "But this was a maiden adventure for everybody. It was the first time anyone had gone over there, and L'Carriere got some fungus on his heels, possibly from the shavings or the racetrack. And you couldn't use anything, so I went out and bought some aloe vera plants and kept soothing him all day long. It helped a lot and got it going and I thought, 'Man, we got a chance to win this.'

"I'll never forget that experience. I remember getting off the plane at 3:30 in the morning and we're surrounded every five feet by security people with guns and my wife said, 'Something must have happened on CNN. We're not going to see our children anymore.' They rushed us through this area, and after my wife came out of the ladies room she said, 'I don't know where you brought me, but I'm not going anywhere without you.' But I have to say Sheikh Mohammed and everyone there were awfully good to us. It was nothing but the best for my help, for myself, and for the horse. They did everything in their power to try to make us comfortable.

"I remember Mrs. Payson saying one night, 'Win, lose, or draw, this is a magic carpet ride. There are a lot of things I can afford to do, but I can't afford to be in this spot, and you and this horse brought me this far and I thank you.' It was pretty special for her to say that."

It took L'Carriere a couple of races to get back in form after the Dubai trip. He was third, beaten 7¼ lengths, in the Suburban Handicap (gr. I) after battling head and head on the lead the whole way and then was fifth, beaten 3½ lengths, in the Whitney. Stretching out to his favorite distance of 10 furlongs again, he won his second straight Saratoga Cup, beating Peaks and Valleys and Whitney winner

Mahogany Hall.

Then came another meeting with his nemesis Cigar in the Woodward. Cigar had just had his 16-race winning streak ended in the Pacific Classic (gr. I), and he relished a return to Belmont Park. L'Carriere pressed the pace through testing fractions of :46.23 and 1:10.47 and again ran his heart out in the stretch only to finish second to Cigar in a swift 1:47.06 for the 11/8 miles.

Following the Woodward, L'Carriere suffered an ankle injury that ended his career. "He had wear and tear in the ankle," Bond said. "You can only push a horse so far."

L'Carriere was retired to Payson Park, where Mrs. Payson kept an area for retired horses in the back of the property.

He retired as the leading money-winning New York-bred of all time with earnings of \$1,726,175.

"Mrs. Payson and I lost a little bit of contact after she let me go and I went off to Palm Meadows, so I really don't know as much about him after that as I'd like to know," Bond said. "When she let me go, I was doing good for everyone but her. I had a bunch of St. Jovites for her at the time, but, unfortunately, he wasn't

much of a sire and I just couldn't do anything with his offspring, and that was a major part of our breakup.

"I'll never forget the doors she opened for me in my life. She said something to me I'll never forget. The first time I ever met her face to face at Payson Park I had had horses for her for about six months to a year at Finger Lakes. She said, 'It's 99% management and 1% luck. That gate does have to open. But you can control a lot of your own destiny.' And I'll tell you what, hard work and luck do go hand in hand, and you got to do the homework to succeed. That's something I took away from working with Mrs. Payson. She was awfully good to me throughout those years. It was a very, very good relationship."

And it was L'Carriere who also helped open those doors for Bond, taking him to the Breeders' Cup Classic and Dubai and never once running a poor race in the 13 races he ran for him.

"I sure do miss him; I can tell you that," Bond said. "Watching all the replays of Cigar's races recently, I kept saying, 'If I only could have beaten him. Wow, that really would have been something.' Unfortunately, we were just a little short of him, but he sure was a gallant horse who always tried. Bless him."

# **Stakes Feast**

AQUEDUCT RACETRACK KICKED OFF its autumn program for New York-breds with two races for juveniles Nov. 16.

The \$100,000 Key Cents Stakes for 2-year-old fillies was won by The Lewis Dinner, owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith. The speedy filly by Posse out of Nick's Honor (by Jump Start), a half sister to the stakes-winning Kelli Got Frosty who shares her take-the-lead running style, played "catch me if you can" under jockey Manuel Franco through fractions of :22.52 and :46.47, running the six furlongs in 1:11.04.



Bred by Jamie LaMonica, Lee Sacks, Soave Stables, and Posse Syndicate, The Lewis Dinner was purchased by Dubb at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training for \$50,000. Calling her "a bargain," Dubb said that buyers were put off by the filly's reputation as a "head case."

"We noticed she was quick," said Dubb, "but the problem was that nobody could get near her. (Trainer) Rudy (Rodriguez) walked in her stall and everybody said, 'Don't do that!,' but in one minute the horse bonded with Rudy, so I bought her. I knew she was meant to be with Rudy."

The Lewis Dinner was named by partner Michael Caruso of Bethlehem Stables, who has a penchant for naming his horses after personally significant people and events. A three-time national wrestling champion at Lehigh University, Caruso named this filly for the annual end-of-season team dinner begun in 1924 by Roy Lewis, a manager at Bethlehem Steel whose sons were members of the wrestling team. Generations of the Lewis family have supported the dinner and the team as wrestlers and coaches; more recently Caruso has contributed to making sure the men have their fill of chicken and waffles and ham and eggs, the customary fare for the celebration.

Caruso, who still lives in Bethlehem (where Lehigh is located), couldn't be at the race, but Dubb said The Lewis Dinner will race in New York this winter, giving Caruso other opportunities to see the filly in action. Dubb, who lives on Long Island,

visits her regularly in Rodriguez' barn and can't get over her transformation.

"Rudy said when he first got her, it took a half hour to get the bridle on her," said Dubb. "Now when I go to the barn and visit her, she's so much calmer and easy to be around."

While The Lewis Dinner may have grown out of her early obstreperous behavior, Regal Minister, who took the \$100,000 Notebook Stakes for 2-year-olds later on the card, still has a ways to go.

Regal Minister was scratched from his debut after kicking jockey Javier Castellano in the paddock. He came back Oct. 8 and won at first asking.

The chestnut colt was better behaved in the paddock for the Notebook, but gave his handlers a tough time while being unsaddled after getting his picture taken.

A DATTT Farm homebred—the initials are those of Tom and Diana Ryan and their three children—Regal Minister is the first foal out of the unraced Dattts Regal (by Mr. Greeley).

"Dattts Regal was injured as a yearling," said Craig Bandoroff of Kentucky's Denali Stud, who consults with the Ryans on their breeding decisions. "She was unable to be sold, but she was very good-looking, and we decided to move her to New York and put her in the New York-bred program."

Dattts Regal is one of a few mares that the Ryans keep at Gallagher Stud in upstate New York.

Regal Minister's win gave stallion Posse, who stands at Rockridge Stud near Hudson, a sweep of the stakes races. The colt is trained by Mark Hennig and, like The Lewis Dinner, was ridden by Franco to a front-running victory in 1:12.27 for the six furlongs.

"He's a neat kind of horse," said Hennig, who has trained a number of DATTT horses, including some from Regal Minister's family. "He's willing to go easy, but when horses come to him, he's competitive."

# **Dance Steps**

**OWNER MICHAEL DUBB IS** renowned for his ability to play the claiming game. Last year he claimed Vicki's Dancer, a daughter of Disco Rico, from a turf race at Belmont Park with the intention of running her on the dirt. She quickly returned dividends, justifying Dubb's opinion by winning the 2013 edition of the \$125,000 Staten Island division of the New York Stallion Series stakes. However, her eight starts since had not produced another victory, even though she had hit the board in six of those contests. So for her title defense in the 2014 NYSS, Dubb told trainer Rudy Rodriguez he believed adding blinkers might help Vicki's Dancer return to the winner's circle.

As the 5-year-old broke from the gate Nov. 22, both Dubb and Rodriguez, who were watching the race trackside together, shouted words of encouragement to each other as the usually slow-starting Vicki's Dancer was up on the early pace.

"It's the blinkers. Definitely the blinkers," was their elated exchange.

Beneath jockey Irad Ortiz Jr., Vicki's Dancer remained in perfect stalking position until the field of nine older females spun into the Aqueduct stretch. That's when Vicki's Dancer, out of Love That Glitter, by Glitterman, assumed the lead. With a furlong remaining Ortiz peeked back for the competition before shaking up Vicki's Dancer under left-handed encouragement to record a determined 1½-length victory in the seven-furlong stakes.

"I won't be taking out my trainer's license," said Dubb. "We tried the blinkers hoping they'd put her more into the race (early), and they did. I always liked Disco Rico. From a limited number of starters, he's put out some fast horses."

#### Vicki's Dancer wins the Staten Island division of the NYSS

Vicki's Dancer got the Staten Island division trip in 1:25.12 over a fast track producing moderate timings most of the day. Bred in New York by Robert Jarras, and owned in partnership with Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith, Vicki's Dancer notched her sixth win from 26 starts, increasing her earnings to \$439,025.

"When claiming a horse I look for consistency," Dubb said. "I also look for effort and versatility...and I try to plan ahead. I knew (Vicki's Dancer) was a stallion series horse when I claimed her."

Very Un Stable's Saythreehailmary's rallied from off-thepace to finish second. J and M Racing Stables' Uncle Southern, who set the early fractions, held on for third.

#### **Clever Byline**

In the \$125,000 Thunder Rumble division of the NYSS, Vincent Scuderi's Readthebyline, a 5-year-old gelding by Read the Footnotes, registered a dominant 2¾-length gate-to-wire victory. Trained by Michelle Nevin and ridden by Jose Ortiz, Readthebyline set fractions of :22.84 for the opening quartermile and :45.70 for the half-mile. Then, as the field began to close on the pacesetter, Readthebyline found another gear and pulled away late, getting the seven furlongs in 1:23.85.

Scuderi had reclaimed Readthebyline for \$40,000 in his previous start (an eighth-place finish on the turf) after the gelding was lost for \$25,000 back in early May.

"We weren't particularly pointing to this race (after the claim), it just happened to come up," said Nevin. "He does have a ton of speed coming out of the gate. So I was just hoping nobody else would go out with him too soon."

Bred by Gavin Murphy and Catherine Donavan, Readthebyline recorded his seventh win from 35 starts, boosting his earnings to \$413,335.

Favored West Hills Giant, owned by Long Island Racing Stables, Sunrise Stables, and EBX Racing Stable, was the runner-up in the Thunder Rumble. Gold Square's Geaux Mets finished third.

A liyu Ben J Stables' homebred Lubash, a New York-bred horse by Freud, became the 26th



state-bred millionaire Nov. 22 when winning the grade III Tropical Turf Handicap Nov. 22 at Gulfstream Park West. The score was the eighth stakes win for the 7-year-old out of Nasty Cure, by Cure the Blues. His \$311,720 in earnings this year has helped propel Freud to the top spot on the state's sire list.




