

A Holiday Gift for all New York Breeders, NYSS-Style

NEW YORK THOROUGHBRED BREEDERS, in partnership with the New York Stallion Stakes Series (NYSS), has a holiday gift for breeders in 2015 that was long in the making. After an extended period of planning and coordination with the New York Racing Association, the long-time administrator of the NYSS, NYTB was able to announce in September 2013 that beginning in 2015 the series would embark on a new era. That time is now.

> Beginning with this year's foals (current weanlings), ALL offspring of stallions nominated to the NYSS are automatically eligible for all the races with NO nomination fee. This means that at year-end in 2015, when breeders typically would write checks to nominate eligible weanlings to the NYSS, they can...well, they can do whatever else they need to do with their time and money. Nothing falls through the cracks because a breeder or buyer forgot to nominate a foal, and the benefits to the series as a whole down the road are incalculable due to increased participation from a larger pool of nominated progeny.

> Breeders should note, however, that the new dispensation begins only with foals of 2015. In other words, yearlings of 2015 (2014 foals or Series 2016) who were not nominated last year still fall under the old system. A nomination fee of \$1,000 is due by Dec. 31 for these yearlings to be eligible. If foals of 2014 are not nominated by the end of this year, the nomination fee for eligible 2-year-olds jumps to \$5,000, which is due by Sept. 1, 2016.

Seven of the 10 2015 NYSS races, which carry

combined purses of more than \$1 million, have been contested so far. A snapshot of this year's results presents a good spread among nominated sires. Boasting rights at this point go to Posse with three wins and two winners (Possessed, Times Square, and Spectacular Bid stakes; and Sheriffa, Staten Island Stakes) and Freud with two winners (Dreamboat Annie, Cupecoy's Joy Stakes; and Freudie Anne, Statue of Liberty Stakes). Also picking up winners were Sir Whimsey, sire of Take Issue (Park Avenue Stakes) and Read the Footnotes, sire of Ex Ex Ex (Cab Calloway Stakes).

Last year we saw an even broader division of the NYSS spoils among New York-based sires: Disco Rico (two winners), Posse (two winners), Noonmark (repeat winner Mark My Way), Frost Giant, Raffie's Majesty, and Read the Footnotes.


I expect that in coming years we will see an even greater diversity among the sires of the NYSS winners. The new system is more inclusive, the fields will be fuller, and the races more exciting. The NYSS series overall will be transformed.

There is no reason for a stallion owner not to nominate to the NYSS. The deadline is mid-February and the fee remains at \$2,500, or the stallion's advertised stud fee (whichever is higher). The earnings potential for the owner in stallion awards and increased value for their progeny is simply good business.

So, happy holidays from all of us at NYTB and catch you in the New Year! \square

ZIVO TO IRISH HILL CENTURY FARM

Thomas Coleman's homebred grade II-winning New York-bred Zivo has been retired to stud at Irish Hill Century Farm near Sarato-

ga Springs. His first-year fee will be \$6,000.

Trained by Chad Brown, Zivo (True Direction—American Skipper, by Quiet American) was a nine-time winning millionaire, whose career-defining win came in the Suburban Handicap (gr. II), where he defeated graded stakes winners Moreno, Micromanage, Last Gunfighter,

and Vyjack. He then went on to run second in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (gr. I) behind the classic-winning Tonalist.

Important New York stakes wins include the Whodam and Kings Point stakes, and the \$200,000 Commentator Handicap in 2014. In Zivo's career of 19 starts, 18 were in New York with the lone start out of New York taking place in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) at Santa Anita.

"Zivo is one of the most durable and talented horses I have trained to date," Brown said. "He raced year round in New York throughout his career, all of his starts on the dirt. I can't wait to see what his offspring can do."

Zivo is from a deep female family represented by two-time Horse of the Year and perennial leading sire, Symboli Kris S, as well as Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (UAE-I) winner Well Armed.

Zivo will be the lone stallion standing stud at Rick Burke's Irish Hill Century Farm. He will be supported by mares from Coleman's broodmare band, Irish Century Hill, and the commercial breeding operations of The Club and Off The Hook.

Majestic City to Questroyal North

Jeffrey Bloom of Bloom Racing Stable has announced multiple graded stakes winner Majestic City (City Zip— It'schemistrybaby, by Meadowlake) will stand the 2016 breeding season at Questroyal North near Stillwater. The stud fee for the syndicated stallion has been set at \$3,500 live foal.

"Questroyal is thrilled to stand a stallion with the speed, class, and durability of Majestic City," said Barry Ostrager.

"We've been pursuing him (as a stallion prospect) for many months, and we will heavily support him with our own mares."

Precocious at 2, Majestic City broke his maiden with an impressive wire-to-wire victory in his debut at Betfair Hollywood Park. In his next two starts Majestic City

captured the Willard L. Proctor Memorial Stakes by 3½ lengths, followed by a 2¼-length score in the Hollywood Juvenile Championship Stakes (gr. III). He then fell a neck short of Drill in the grade I Del Mar Futurity and was later disqualified and placed third. In Keeneland's Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) he finished second by three-quarters of a length.

Majestic City has earned \$579,960 and has finished in the top four in 11 graded stakes.

"Majestic City has provided spectacular experiences for our racing program and partners," said Bloom. "His physical attributes are remarkably stunning, and we are thrilled to partner with the Questroyal team."

Hot City Girl Wins \$100,000 Safely Kept Stakes

Hot City Girl stayed hot Nov. 14 at Laurel Park by toying with the field of the \$100,000 Safely Kept Stakes for 3-year-old fillies. She won the seven-furlong race by 8¼ lengths as the 1-2 favorite.

Trained by Linda Rice for Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable, the half sister to multiple grade II winner La Verdad, Hot City Girl won the Charles Town Oaks Stakes (gr. III) Sept. 19. Then, just 16 days before shipping to Laurel for the Safely


Kept, she trounced open company in a sprint allowance at Belmont for a

career-top Beyer Speed Figure of 92.

From her fifth career win and second stakes victory, in addition to two second-place finishes, Hot City Girl's earnings stand at \$455,150.

Bred by Eklektikos Stable, and foaled, like La Verdad, at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm near Chestertown, Hot City Girl is another feather in the cap of her dam Noble Fire, a stakes-placed runner bred by the Bromans and also trained by Rice.

NEW YORK-BREDS COME UP BIG AT BC

State-breds ran well at the Oct. 30-31 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland with a pair of New Yorkers running second in seven-figure stakes.

Lady Sheila Stable's La Verdad was caught in deep stretch by Wavell Avenue after setting the pace in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I) at seven furlongs just one week after coming from off the pace to romp in the Iroquois Stakes at Belmont Park.

In the \$5 million finale, the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), Dr. Russell Cohen's Tri-Bone Stables' Effinex ran a surprising race to finish second to the first Triple Crown winner in 37 years and picked up \$900,000 for the runner-up spot.

"I was happy to see him sitting second early and not being rank," said trainer James Jerkens. "American Pharoah started pulling away on the backside, but he stayed second. It was unbelievable."

"He's sound as a dollar; we could enter him back this week," Cohen said Nov. 1. "He ran against perhaps the best horse to run in 100 years. For him to be in contention with Pharoah the whole way, I'm pretty proud of him. He may run again this year, but he will definitely run again next year."

State-bred Results Mirror National Figures at Keeneland November

The Keeneland November sale, held Nov. 2-13 in Lexington, posted increases in gross and average, but a decline in median signaled a strong but selective marketplace. New York-breds fit squarely into this picture of solid results in the context of selectivity.

Of 115 New York-breds offered, 86 sold resulting in a 25.2% buy-back rate, identical to that of the general population of the sale, where the cumulative buy-back percentage rose this year to 25.2% from to 21.8% in 2014.

The New York-bred average of \$50,716, as is typically the case for this sale, did not match the cumulative average of the sale, which was \$85,033, the highest since 2007 and up 3.7% from last year's \$81,966. The New York-bred median matched the sale median at \$30,000.

The top New York-bred weanling, a filly by Tale of the Cat—Nick's Honor, by Jump Start, that sold in the fourth session of trading, realized \$175,000.

The dark bay or brown filly bred by James Lamonica, Lee Sacks, and Soave Stables and foaled on April 5, she is a half sister to stakes winners The Lewis Dinner and Kelli Got Frosty.



Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through November 22, 2015. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2014 is \$21,617 or 45% of the 2014 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 45% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 19%. Singapore by 54%. Current year stakes winners include all N.H.-foaled stakes winners worldwide and any S.H.-foaled horses that won a N.H. stakes. "Foal counts include Southern Hemisphere. 

Growing market brings nine new stallions to the state for 2016

Nine on the Line

THANKS TO THE LUCRATIVE New York breeding program, the Empire State continues to be an attractive place for well-bred young stallions. This year the state's stallion roster is adding nine new faces, seven of them first-year sires for 2016: Al Khali, Golden Ticket, Japan, Majestic City, Major Gain, Micromanage, Midas Touch, Normandy Invasion, and Zivo.

Two of the stallions in this group—Al Khali and Japan—are the full brothers (Medaglia d'Oro—Maya, by Capote). While they offer the same glittering pedigree, they were different types as racehorses.

A staying turf runner, millionaire **Al Khali** offers breeders proven grade I-level ability, stamina, and a sharp turn of foot. His race record shows wins in the 2009 Saranac Stakes (gr. IIIT) and the 2010 Bowling Green Handicap (gr. IIT) along with seven placings in grade I turf races at ages 4 to 6. He enters stud at Keane Stud near Amenia for an advertised fee of \$2,500.

Japan, on the other hand, excelled on dirt. Highly regarded as a 3-year-old, the big, handsome colt won the listed WinStar Farm Easy Goer Stakes on the undercard for American Pharoah's Belmont Stakes presented by DraftKings (gr. I) and ran second in the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II). He will begin his stud career at Waldorf Farm at an advertised fee of \$7,500.

The brothers are from the excellent family of the Blushing Groom mare Too Chic. The winner of the 1982 Maskette Stakes (gr. I) and runner-up in that year's Alabama Stakes (gr. I) during her own racing days, Too Chic produced two grade

I-winning daughters by Mr. Prospector in 1991 champion older female Queena (dam of Early Times Hollywood Derby, gr. IT, winner and sire Brahms, by Danzig) and 1987 Ashland Stakes (gr. I) winner Chic Shirine.

Chic Shirine, in turn, produced grade II winners Tara Roma (dam of 2001 Go for Wand Handicap, gr. I, winner Serra Lake, by Seattle Slew) and grade II winner Waldoboro, both by Lyphard. Chic Shirine is also the dam of Chic Corine (by Nureyev), whose daughter Somali Lemonade (by Lemon Drop Kid) won the 2014 TVG Diana Stakes (gr. IT), and of Enchanted Rock (by Giant's Causeway), dam of multiple grade I winner Verrazano (by More Than Ready).

Mayan Maiden, a full sister to Tara Roma and Waldoboro, failed to show the same form as either a racehorse or producer but has two graded stakes producers to her credit. One, Maya (by Capote), is the dam of the two incoming stallions; the other, Mesa Fresca (by Sky Mesa), is the dam of 2015 JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (gr. IIIT) winner Harmonize (by Scat Daddy).

As a review of the brief family sketch above shows, this family has produced

top horses to stallions from a variety of sire lines, suggesting Al Khali and Japan have the genetic background to work with a wide variety of pedigrees in their mates. Broodmare sire lines that look particularly promising include those of Mr. Prospector (especially through Forty Niner and Gone West), Kris S., and Danzig.

Golden Ticket (Speightstown—Business Plan, by Deputy Minister) punched his ticket as a potential stallion by deadheating with Alpha for the 2012 Travers Stakes (gr. I). A stakes winner in 2013 and 2014 and graded stakes-placed in 2013-15—including runner-up finishes in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and Stephen Foster Handicap Presented by Abu Dhabi (both gr. I)—Golden Ticket retires with six wins from 33 starts and earnings of \$1,362,924. He will stand for \$7,500 at Questroyal North near Stillwater in 2016.

Golden Ticket is from the family of Sin Igual, a full sister to 1946 Triple Crown winner Assault. Her daughter Mono (by Better Self) was a good producer, throwing three stakes winners including grade III winner A Sure Hit (by Ack Ack). She also produced the winning Mr. Prospector filly Mine Only, dam of graded stakes winners Academy Award (by Secretariat), Good Mood (by Devil's Bag), and Statuette (by Pancho Villa, dam of 2002 Irish champion 2-year-old male Tomahawk (by Seattle Slew). Mine Only produced Chosen Lady (by Secretariat), dam of 1998 Ash-

land Stakes (gr. I) winner Well Chosen.

Aside from Golden Ticket's dam, Business Plan, Good Mood is the dam of stakes winner Grand Royale. She is also the dam of Magical Mood (by Forestry), dam of 2012 Barbara Fritchie Handicap (gr. II) winner Magical Feeling (by Empire Maker), and of stakes producer Attitude (by Capote).

Speightstown has done surprisingly well with mares returning Mr. Prospector and Raise a Native, considering that they are his paternal grandsire and great-grandsire, respectively. He has also done better than expected with Secretariat (to whom he is inbred). Given that the distaff side of Golden Ticket's pedigree carries only a fourth-generation cross of Mr. Prospector (which, by extension, means a fifth-generation cross of Raise a Native), there seems no particular reason to avoid further crosses of Mr. Prospector provided the conformational matchup with the mare is good. An even better cross, however, may be A.P. Indy, who brings in Seattle Slew as an outcross as well as providing another cross to Secretariat. Another pedigree element to look for in Golden Ticket's mates may be Cure the Blues, an important sire in New York breeding who traces to Secretariat's immediate female family.

New at Questroyal Stud for 2016, **Majestic City** (City Zip—It'schemistrybaby, by Meadowlake) follows in the hoof prints of his sire, who also began his stud career in the Empire State. Like City Zip, he showed substantial ability at 2, winning the 2011 Hollywood Juve-nile Championship Stakes (gr. III) and placing in two grade I races. He trained on to win the Lone Star Park Handicap (gr. III) as a 6-year-old.

A half brother to stakes-placed Backstreet Hero (by Street Hero), Majestic City is out of the winning Meadowlake mare It'schemistrybaby, whose dam Not So Pleasant (by Pleasant Tap) is a half sister to multiple stakes winner Vashon (by Seattle Dancer). The next dam in the tail-female line, Go for Bold (by Bold Forbes) is a half sister to five stakes winners including 1990 Arlington Million Stakes (gr. IT) winner Golden Pheasant (by Caro) and grade/group III winners Trial By Error (by Caro) and Seewillo (by Pleasant Colony).

Although he is a grandson of Mr. Prospector, City Zip has done well crossed over mares returning Mr. Prospector or his sire, Raise a Native. Continuing this strategy with Majestic City will need some caution with regard to soundness because he carries Raise a Native as the damsire of Meadowlake, but daughters close third in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II) on dirt.

Major Gain is a son of 2010 leading juvenile sire More Than Ready, who captured the Sanford Stakes (gr. II) and Tremont Stakes (gr. III) and placed in the Futurity Stakes (gr. I) at 2. At 3 he won the seven-furlong King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) and Hutcheson Stakes (gr. II) and stretched out to be grade Iplaced over nine furlongs. More Than Ready, in turn, is by 13-time Argentine

or granddaughters of Unbridled's Song may work well, both because this represents the atypical Mr. Prospector line of Fappiano and because the broodmare sire of Unbridled's Song is Caro, who did well with Majestic City's female family. Other pedigree elements to look for in possible mates for Majestic City may include Storm Cat and Blushing Groom.

Like Majestic City, **Major Gain** was also a precocious juvenile. In just his second start, he showed a flash of what might have been had he stayed healthy by gamely running down future Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I) winner Caleb's Posse to win the 2010 Arlington-Washington Futurity (gr. III). He was also a leading sire or broodmare sire Southern Halo, a great sire of juveniles, sprinters, and milers.

Major Gain is the first foal of grade III-placed turf stakes winner Dream Lady (by Old Trieste) and is a full brother to Room Service, winner of the 2014 American Oaks (gr. IT) and Central Bank Ashland Stakes (gr. I). Dream Lady, in turn, is a half sister to listed stakes winner Zeta (by You and I), dam of Argentine group I winner Zapata (by Hat Trick), while her dam Lil's Gate (by Gate Dancer) is a half sister to grade III winner Lilly Capote, dam of 2013 Humana Distaff Stakes (gr. I) winner Aubby K (by Street Sense). Aubby K sold for **Impressive speed** Emcee's a fast-time G1 winner.

\$2.4 million at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale and her weanling colt, by Tapit, sold for \$600,000. This is a family that has consistently thrown horses excelling in the range of seven to nine furlongs.

While Major Gain has the potential to suit a wide variety of mares, examination of his pedigree suggests that crosses to mares with Storm Cat close up may be particularly beneficial. More Than Ready has done well with this line, and Verrazano, his best American-bred son, is out of a mare by Storm Cat's champion son Giant's Causeway, whose full brother Freud is a leading New York sire. Another pedigree element pointing to Storm Cat as a natural complement for Major Gain is A.P. Indy, paternal grandsire of Dream Lady.

Major Gain will stand his first season at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in 2016. His advertised fee is \$2,500.

The winner of five stakes races including the 2014 Skip Away Stakes (gr. III), grade I-placed **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro—Catnip, by Flying Paster) was a durable sort by modern standards as his career spanned four years and 30 starts. He was also versatile, winning at distances from seven to 14 furlongs. While best as an older horse, he came to hand quickly enough to win a maiden special weight at Saratoga as a juvenile.

Micromanage's strength as a potential sire is a strong female family having its origins in the legendary Whitney breeding program. A half brother to four-time grade III winner Indescribable (by Pleasant Tap), to English listed stakes winner Elaflaak (by Gulch) and to multiple stakes producer Catchofthecentury (by Carson City), Micromanage is out of stakes winner Catnip (by Flying Paster), a half sister to 1996 Belmont Stakes winner Editor's Note (by Forty Niner) and 2002 European champion 2-year-old male Hold That Tiger (by Storm Cat).

Also a half sister to multiple European stakes winner Catfriend (by Capote), Catnip is out of grade II-placed stakes winner Beware of the Cat (by Caveat), a half sister to 1983 Pan American Handicap (gr. IT) winner Field Cat (by Herbager) and South African group II winner Springing Leopard (by Hawaii). Produced from the Tom Cat mare T. C. Kitten, Beware of the Cat is also a half sister to grade I-placed Island Kitty (by Hawaii), whose four stakes winners include 1995 Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) winner Hennessy (by Storm Cat), 1997 Ballerina Handicap (gr. I) winner Pearl City (by Carson City) and grade III winner and successful Argentine sire Shy Tom (by Blushing Groom).

Beware of the Cat is also a half sister to Sharp Kitty (by Blade), dam of 1985 champion juvenile filly Family Style (by State Dinner) and 1987 Del Mar Futuri-

ty (gr. I) winner Lost Kitty (by Magesterial). As this brief family outline shows, this is a versatile female line that has produced horses capable of excelling under a wide variety of conditions.

Both Medaglia d'Oro's history and that of Micromanage's female line suggest Micromanage will do well with mares tracing to Forty Niner, Storm Cat, and/or Blushing Groom.

Micromanage enters stud at Rockridge Stud near Hudson at an advertised fee of \$5,000, and owner Mike Repole has already announced that he intends to support the horse with some of his own mares.

After three seasons at War Horse Place in Kentucky, **Midas Touch** (Galileo—Approach, by Darshaan) will stand the 2016 season at Rockridge for \$3,500. Like Al Khali, Japan, and Micromanage, his male line goes back to the great European sire Sadler's Wells, but rather than tracing through Medaglia d'Oro and his sire El Prado, Midas Touch is a son of Sadler's Wells' best sire son Galileo.

Already a six-time leader of the English/Irish general sire list, Galileo has excelled in getting top-level European runners in the range from one mile to 1½ miles. As a group II winner over 10 furlongs in Ireland, Midas Touch was, thus, fairly typical of Galileo's stakes-class progeny. Midas Touch was also second in the 2010 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby (Ire-I) and Ladbrokes St. Leger (Eng-I) and offers New York breeders the opportunity to produce the kind of youngster that may have European appeal.

A daughter of 1984 French champion 3-year-old male Darshaan, Midas Touch's dam Approach is a stakeswinning half sister to Aussie Rules (by Danehill), winner of the Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French Two Thousand Guineas, Fr-I) in France and the Shadwell Turf Mile Stakes (gr. IT) in the United States in 2006. The dam of Approach and Aussie Rules, Last Second (by Alzao), won two group II races at 10 furlongs in England and is a half sister to 2001 GNER Doncaster Cup (Eng-III) winner Alleluia (by Caerleon) and to group I-placed stakes winners Arrikala and Alouette, both by Darshaan.

Given his sire line and the history of his immediate female family, Midas Touch looks like a natural cross for speedy mares with Danzig (the sire of Danehill) up close in their pedigrees. He may also do well with quick mares tracing to Mr. Prospector, particularly if their pedigrees provide supporting inFarm and will be part of Spendthrift's "Share the Upside" program.

A son of 2014 leading sire Tapit, who is virtually certain to repeat in 2015, Normandy Invasion is from the family of 1963 Pageant Handicap and 1964 Gallorette Stakes winner Gay Serenade (by Royal Serenade). The dam of 1975 Vineland Handicap (gr. IIT) winner Gulls Cry (by Sea-Bird), dam of mul-

breeding to other top-quality elements in Midas Touch's background.

The eighth of this year's new New York stallions, Normandy Invasion (Tapit-Boston Lady, by Boston Harbor) was well-regarded if luckless as a racehorse. After finishing second by a nose to Overanalyze in the 2012 Remsen Stakes (gr. II), Normandy Invasion was second to the high-class Verrazano in the 2013 Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I) and a good fourth in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I). Repeated physical issues short-circuited the remainder of his racing career, but he set a track record of 1:33.13 for a mile at Gulfstream Park as a 4-year-old. He will stand his first season at Keane Stud for \$6,500 as the property of Spendthrift tiple Irish group II winner Nemain (by Alleged), and 1979 Little Silver Handicap (gr. IIIT) winner Gala Regatta (by Hoist the Flag), Gay Serenade is also the dam of group III-placed stakes winner Tom's Serenade (by Tom Rolfe) and stakes-placed Herald Angel (by Hail to Reason), dam of grade I-placed stakes winner Imah (by Gate Dancer).

Gay Serenade's 1982 foal is the winner Gay Senorita (by Raise a Native), whose daughter Boston Lady produced Normandy Invasion. Gay Senorita is also the dam of Stormy Gal (by Storm Cat), dam of 2003 Martha Washington Breeders' Cup Stakes (gr. IIIT) winner Derrianne (by Cozzene).

Although Tapit is inbred 4x3 to Mr. Prospector, he has done well with mares

returning Mr. Prospector in their own pedigrees, a strategy that looks viable with Normandy Invasion provided that mares of proven soundness are selected for him to offset the unsoundness sometimes associated with inbreeding to Raise a Native (Mr. Prospector's sire, and the sire of Normandy Invasion's second dam). An even more promising strategy is to use mares tracing to Storm Cat, another stallion that Tapit has crossed very well with and the sire of a grade III winner from Normandy Invasion's immediate family. Finally, mares with Pleasant Colony in their pedigrees look like a viable option for breeders seeking two-turn runners, following the pattern seen in the pedigree of Belmont Stakes winner and two-time Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (gr. I) winner Tonalist.

And finally, there's Zivo, winner of the 2014 Suburban Handicap (gr. II). He is slated to stand for \$6,000 at Irish Hill Century Farm and will be receiving mare support from owner/breeder Thomas Coleman, Irish Century Hill, and commercial breeders The Club and Off the Hook, which should help Zivo get off to a strong start.

As consistent a racehorse as could be

desired with only three out-of-the-money finishes in 19 starts, Zivo also proved a quick miler, winning the 2015 Commentator Handicap in a brisk 1:34.11. His combination of speed and stamina reflects his bloodlines. Sired by the good sprinter True Direction (French Deputy-Ms. Paragon, by Tank's Prospect) out of two-turn winner American Skipper (Quiet American-Tri Skipping, by Skip Trial), he should be able to infuse stamina into speedier mates without being too stamina-oriented to be useful with staying mares.

Zivo also boasts a solid female family, as his dam is a half sister to 2003 Fifth Season Stakes (gr. III) winner Patton's Victory (by Patton) and stakes winner Santina Dond (by El Prado). His second dam, Tri Skipping, is a winning half sister to 1994 Martha Washington Stakes (gr. III) winner Tee Kay (by Gold Meridian), dam of two-time Japanese Horse of the Year Symboli Kris S. (by Kris S.), and to listed stakes producers Lady Argo (by Gold Meridian) and Trithenia (by Gold Meridian).

As a Deputy Minister-line stallion out of a Quiet American mare, Zivo looks like a promising cross for daughters and granddaughters of A.P. Indy and his sons. Breeders may also want to consider mares returning bloodlines from the families of Cequillo and Iltis, two female lines that are prominent in Zivo's pedigree. 🗖

Mike Repole's freshman stallion **Giant Surprise** takes off

Pleasant Surprise

MIKE REPOLE SEEMS TO LIKE pretty much everything about Thoroughbred racing. Growing up in Queens, N.Y., and hanging out at Aqueduct Racetrack, he absorbed the flavor of the track, reveling in its grittiness and its beauty, its excitement, and its challenges.

Now an owner and a breeder, Repole's enthusiasm is undiminished, perhaps heightened by his success at all levels of the sport, undaunted by the setbacks and the challenges. He's known for the dozens of family members and close friends he herds into the winner's circle, and a Repole horse can often be easily identified by its name-those "Nonna" horses, the namesakes of his cherished grandmother, and the ones named for his wife, Maria—and by his distinctive blue and orange silks which represents his favorite team, the New York Mets.

Over the last six months, a new name has emerged as a Repole trademark, surprising no one more than the owner himself.

On July 30, 2011, Repole was at Saratoga Race Course primarily to see his Stay Thirsty run in the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II), the colt's first start since a close second to Ruler On Ice in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I). But before the Jim Dandy-which Stay Thirsty won-Repole had a 2-year-old running in a maiden special weight race, the second race on the day's program.

A \$130,000 yearling purchase at the 2010 Keeneland September yearling sale, the son of Giant's Causeway out of the A.P. Indy mare Twisted Sis had been purchased, like many Repole horses, in consultation with his team: "conformation guy" J.J. Crupi, "pedigree guy" Ed Rosen, racing manager Jim Martin, and trainer Todd Pletcher.

A bay bred by George and Charles Bolton, the colt did not immediately impress.

"He was working OK, not great," said Repole, recalling that summer. "And then one morning Todd worked him out of the gate and said, 'Mike, he worked incredible. You have to name him because we've got a race for him in two weeks.'

"So I named him Giant Surprise because no one was expecting him to work like that."

For better and worse, that was not the last surprise the colt would have in store for his owner.

He won by 4¼ lengths that day at Saratoga, but Repole's entourage didn't get to have their picture taken with him. Steps after passing the wire, jockey John Velazquez pulled Giant Surprise up. He was vanned off with a non-displaced condylar fracture, later diagnosed as careerending.

"We were so excited about this prospect, and then he wins, and then he never even makes it back to the winner's circle," said Repole. "It was terrible."

Nearly two months to the day after that race, and just weeks after the official announcement of Giant Surprise's retirement, the Genting Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct held its grand opening. After delays of more than a decade, gaming money would infuse both the purses of the New York Racing Association and the New York Thoroughbred State Breeding and Development Fund.

"We loved Giant Surprise's breeding; we loved everything about him," said Repole. "And because of the slots, Vinery was coming to New York.

Giant Surprise stood his first three seasons at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple prior to moving to Rockridge Farm for the 2014 breeding season.

"I love this game," he went on. "Whether it's a \$5,000 claimer or a grade I stakes, I love this game. I knew that Uncle Mo (Repole's champion 2-year-old male of 2010) was going to be a stallion, I knew that Stay Thirsty was going to be a stallion. So I talked to some people, and I figured that I could breed a half-dozen mares to Giant Surprise, and maybe with his breeding and standing in New York, he'd get some mares."

Admitted Repole, "I didn't know what to expect. It was the first time I'd done anything like this."

It would be safe to say that he didn't expect that, as the end of 2015 approaches, two of his stallions—he maintains a minority interest in the multiple grade I-winning champion Uncle Mo, who

stands at Ashford Stud—would be in the top 10 on the national list of first-crop sires. Uncle Mo tops that list, with Giant Surprise coming in at No. 7, his progeny having earned \$660,170 (through Nov. 22).

"It's pretty cool," said Repole.

Leading the list of Giant Surprise's earners is the Repole homebred Sudden Surprise, with four wins in five starts, including three stakes wins in the Funny Cide, Bertram F. Bongard, and Nov. 21 Notebook stakes (see page 40). Sudden Surprise, an earner of \$326,300, is out of the More Than Ready mare Ready and Good.

Super Surprise, a filly out of the Lang-

fuhr mare Miz Lynne Kelly that Repole purchased for \$55,000 at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings, comes in next with earnings of a little more than \$200,000.

Taken by Surprise, bred by Repole, and Surprise Cameo, purchased by him, both broke their maidens this fall.

"I almost get more excited with the Giant Surprise winners than I did when Nyquist won the (Sentient Jet) Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I)," Repole said. Nyquist tops the list of Uncle Mo progeny with earnings of more than \$1.6 million.

When Repole decided to stand Giant Surprise, he was bereft of broodmares, and he knew he'd have to support his stallion if he had any chance of being successful. When Ready and Good, one of his 2-year-old fillies, was retired after one start, Repole bred her to Giant Surprise, producing top earner Sudden Surprise.

Now owner of a broodmare band that numbers about a dozen, he boards his mares in Kentucky at WinStar Farm and in New York at Sugar Maple Farm.

And he supports his stallions at the sales as well as in the breeding shed. Of the 15 foals by Giant Surprise offered at auction, Repole has purchased seven; he's also bought offspring of Uncle Mo and Stay Thirsty.

"When I go to the sales, I don't look at the foals by my stallions that much differently," he said, "but when it comes down to a horse that Crupi, Martin, and Rosen like, and it happens to be by, say, Stay Thirsty, I'm going to have more al-

legiance to him than I would to Union Rags or Bodemeister."

"Mike's done a great job of getting him going" as a stallion, said trainer Todd Pletcher, who trains several Giant Surprise offspring for Repole. "He's supported him with his mares, but he also went out and purchased them at the sales. It's great for breeders to know that someone like Mike is going to support his stallions, and he's also going to help breeders by purchasing some of the horses."

Giant Surprise will stand for \$5,000 next year, Uncle Mo for \$75,000, and Stay Thirsty, who like Uncle Mo is at Ashford Stud, for \$10,000.

"The stallion income is paying for my horse purchases," said Repole.

Characterizing himself as a "giant fan" of Giant Surprise, Pletcher said, "He's off to a remarkable start. He's exceeded everyone's expectations. He's gotten big, strong, good-looking horses, and they come out running. They've run well on dirt and on turf, in sprints and routes."

He also sees in them, given their early success, something of their grandsire, the legendary stallion Storm Cat.

"I've been around the Storm Cat line for a long time," he said, "going back to my early days with D. Wayne Lukas, when Storm Cat was just getting started.

"We found that a lot of Storm Cats, especially colts, would work average, then get much more competitive when they were in a race situation. Part of what made Storm Cat such a remarkable stallion was that they had that natural instinct to compete."

After breeding to 50 mares in his first year at stud and getting 35 foals, Giant Surprise saw his numbers decrease to 13 mares for 2015, a decline Repole expects to be arrested with the stallion's success this year.

"He's had his fans since the very beginning despite the low numbers," said Erin Robinson, Rockridge's stallion manager, "and that's because everything that's gone through the sale has sold really well. You don't expect a \$2,500 New York stallion to sell an \$80,000 2-year-old."

The 10 Giant Surprise offspring that have sold at auction as yearlings have averaged \$29,170.

"That got him a little following," said Robinson. "And they're well received because they're usually such fantastic physicals."

Robinson, who previously worked at Maryland's Country Life Farm, compared Giant Surprise's potential with the horse currently at No. 10 on the general stallion list.

"He could very well be the next Malibu Moon," she said. "He's the best value standing in New York right now, he's moving mares up, and there's little doubt that he'll get as many as he can breed. And he'll do very well."

"Rockridge is already sending out

contracts for 2016," Repole said. "I'd be disappointed if he didn't breed to 100 next year."

Repole, who also has horses in New York with trainers Bruce Levine and Gary Gullo, acknowledges that he may have gotten a little lucky, given the influx of slots revenue into the state's breeding program just as the opportunity for him to begin breeding arose, but he pointed out that that money has also increased the quality and competitiveness of the horses bred in the state.

"Look at New York-bred races," he said. "They're tougher than some open company races. Championofthenile, Sudden Surprise, Get Jets—these are great horses, no doubt. These are powerful years for New York-breds.

"I love the program," he went on. "I'd rather run at Aqueduct than at Churchill or Del Mar; I'd rather run a horse here for \$100,000 than in another state for more money. It's more fun winning here, watching and going to as many races as possible."

As he did with Giant Surprise, Repole not uncommonly delays naming his young horses until they're ready to run; though Pletcher, who good-naturedly bemoaned Repole's new proclivity for including part of the stallion's name in all of his progeny, Repole has no such scruples when talking about the last few years.

"There have been," he said, pun fully intended, "a lot of surprises." \mathbf{n}

New Dimension

Speedy Sheriffa comes from off the pace to win the Staten Island



FOR THE \$125,000 New York Stallion Series Staten Island Division Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack on Nov. 15, the plan for Sheriffa was the same as it's always been: go to the lead and use her speed.

On paper, who could argue? The filly's best races had come as the pacesetter, and she was the lone speed in the eight-horse field.

But there's that old saying about the best-laid plans, and when the gates opened, seven runners broke well, and the one who didn't was the one who was supposed to lead the field to the wire.

"I was sick to my stomach," said trainer Linda Rice.

But jockey Cornelio Velasquez, who had ridden Sheriffa to an off-the-pace runner-up finish against open company at Belmont in May, kept his cool, gathering the 4-year-old chestnut filly and easing her into the race, avoiding the temptation to rush her up into position.

"She backed up right before the gate opened," he said. "I had no choice but to run her behind the 3 (Old Harbor) at that point."

Keeping her well clear, Velasquez let Vicki's Dancer, who won this race last year, set the pace through the opening half-mile of the seven-furlong race, making steady progress into the far turn. As the leader tired, the filly he'd kept in reserve unleashed a kick to get the win by a length over the closing Saythreehailmary's. The final time was 1:23.57.

"I thought my filly was the best filly in the race," Velasquez said. "When she got to the lead, she galloped."

Bred by Colts Neck Stables, Sheriffa was

claimed by Linda Rice for owner Antonino Miuccio for \$16,000 in September of 2014. In nine races since, the daughter of Posse out of the Unbridled's Song mare Smileforamile has finished out of the top three only twice and won her first two stakes races; she's earned just shy of \$300,000 for Rice and Miuccio.

"She's been a great claim," said Rice.

A resident of Albany, Miuccio has about a half-dozen horses with Rice, all of them acquired through the claiming ranks. In a lot of barns Sheriffa could be the highlight of a trainer's claims, but this filly has to defer that title to stablemate and fellow New York-bred Palace, also owned by Miuccio, who claimed him for \$20,000 and watched him become a multiple grade I-winning millionaire.

"He likes pedigree," said Rice of her owner, "and so do I. We have the same taste, and we're a good match."

Her stomach settled by the time the winner's circle photo had been taken, Rice acknowledged the bad break-given that it led to victory-might have given her filly a chance to show a different dimension.

"When you win, it's a nice fortuitous thing that happens," she said. "She's run some really nice races on the lead. She's got a lot of natural speed and that was our intention.

"But things just don't always go the way they're supposed to, and it's kind of nice to know that she can run off the pace, too."

In addition to having to adjust to the bad break, Sheriffa might also, Rice noted, be growing up.

"Often as horses get older and more mature, they learn to do a few things they didn't do before," she observed. "I like to think that's the case with her, too."

A virus and subsequent case of pneumonia earlier this year has left Sheriffa relatively lightly raced in 2015; she was off from May to September, and though she threw in a rare bad effort last out at Belmont in her first start off the layoff, Rice likes what she sees now and has no plans to give her a break.

"We freshened her last winter, and she came back doing really well," said the trainer. "But I think she's had plenty of time this year and she's in great form now. She's been training fabulous, and I'm going on with her." 🔊

Sudden Surprise bounces back in Notebook; Frosty Margarita wins Key Cents **OWNER MIKE REPOLE BEAMS** with pride whenever his stallion Giant Surprise is the focus of conversation. Not only is Repole stoked by the son of Giant's Causeway's first crop of runners, which includes Super Surprise (winner of the \$250,000 Maid of the Mist Stakes), but also by his decision to stand Giant Surprise, who resides at Rockridge Stud, after an injury-shortened career consisting of a single maiden victory at Saratoga (see page 34).

"I think a lot of people thought I was crazy, when you have a horse that only has one start (and you send him to stud). If you want to succeed at this game you have to take risks, take chances. This was a big risk," said Repole, clad in blue and orange sneakers—the colors of Repole Stable's silks inspired by his beloved New York Mets.



"I'm blessed to own (champion and leading firstcrop and juvenile sire) Uncle Mo with Coolmore. I get as excited about Giant Surprise as I do Uncle Mo. It's more impressive that Giant Surprise is the number seven first-crop sire than Uncle Mo is the number one sire. That Giant Surprise would even be in the top 20 was probably (odds of) a thousand to one."

The odds were considerably lower, however, on Repole Stable's homebred Sudden Surprise (by Giant Surprise), the 1-5 favorite in a field of six New York-bred 2-year-olds Nov. 21 at Aqueduct in the \$100,000 Notebook Stakes at six furlongs.

Turning back from a fourth-place in the onemile Sleepy Hollow Stakes (Sudden Surprise's first defeat in four starts after three sprint tal-

lies), the colt dispatched his rivals in the Notebook on sheer talent alone, posting a 1³/₄-length win in 1:11.27.

Yet the scene in the winner's circle afterwards was less of a celebration and more of a revelation on why the trio of trainer Todd Pletcher, Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, and Repole have become such a force in racing.

As soon as Velazquez dismounted, Repole had some essential concerns in mind. He asked Velazquez if the horse wanted to go longer. That seemed to be among the rider's own thoughts as well, indicating that his mount didn't want to take over the lead early on and was content to sit outside the competition. Then the pair discussed their opinions with Pletcher, and the idea of running Sudden Surprise back at a mile and possibly adding blinkers was brought up.

"He's not going to be a six-furlong horse," said Repole. "I don't know if he's going to be a mile-and-a-sixteenth horse. But I think his last race (the Sleepy Hollow) was (misleading). He didn't break very well. He was three lengths behind at the start and three lengths (3½) behind at the finish. I think he wants to be in the game (more).

Sudden Surprise, out of the More Than Ready mare Ready and Good, also has state-bred stakes victories in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes and Funny Cide Stakes, with earnings of \$326,300.

"This year's crop of New York-breds is the strongest I've seen in a while," said Pletcher. "You know these races are going to be competitive, but I was pleased with the effort."

Dutchess Views Farm's Dr. Shane earned the runner-up spot in the Notebook, finishing a neck ahead of Happy Face Racing Stable's Love That Jazz.

Notebook, a son of Well Decorated, was a New York-bred champion for the late Eugene Klein. Bred by Eaton and Thorne, Notebook captured eight of 21 starts (\$584,630) for trainer D. Wayne Lukas. He sired 49 stakes winners including grade I winners Delaware Township, Three Ring, Booklet, and Spoken Fur.

Frosty First

As an ex-jockey, trainer Rudy Rodriguez is more than capable of taking a hands-on approach to the Thoroughbreds under his tutelage. He did exactly that with Gabrielle Farm's homebred Frosty Margarita, even before the 2-year-old's time in his barn began.

"I got a call from the owners, one of the best owners in my barn, about the filly. So I went up to their farm to gallop her. Right away I knew she was going to be a good one."

The daughter of Frost Giant out of the Not For Love mare Mango Margarita, entered the \$100,000 Key Cents took it home," said Rodriguez. "(Cutting back to six furlongs) is the best thing we did. Hopefully, next year we can stretch out to a mile."

The consistent Frosty Margarita has finished first or second in all five outings, (2-3-0) and has earned \$195,800.

Treadway Racing Stable's Melodic (by Tale of the Cat), winner of the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes, was a clear second in the Key Cents, while Repole Stable's Surprise Cameo (by Giant Surprise) finished third.

Key Cents, a daughter of Corridor Key, was a New York-bred divisional champion—named the top older female of 1998. She was bred by Charles

Stakes Nov. 22 while coming off a pace-making second-place finish (losing by three-quarters of a length to Super Surprise) in the Maid of the Mist.

Jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. sent the juvenile filly directly to the lead in the six-furlong Key Cents after breaking from the rail and was never seriously threatened by her six rivals.

Frosty Margarita scored a three-length gate-to-wire victory in 1:11.85.

"She got a nice comfortable lead and then she switched (her) leads and




