



New York Stallion Stakes Series: America's Richest Stallion Stakes Races

AS WE recently announced in conjunction with the New York Racing Association, the purse value of the New York Stallion Stakes Series will double in 2019 from \$1,150,000 to \$2,300,000 (see page 8). Our breeding and racing program in New York are flourishing by every measure, but challenges are always on the horizon. The NYSSS series upgrade is intended to address specific issues our industry faces while, at the same time, deliver both immediate and long-range benefits to a wide range of New York stakeholders.

The 10-race series, administered by New York Thoroughbred Beeders, is restricted to the progeny of nominated New York stallions and contested on NYRA racetracks. Purses for all 10 NYSSS races will increase in 2019, but the crown jewel of the series will be a pair of seven-furlong races for 2-year-olds worth \$500,000. The Great White Way Stakes for males and the Fifth Avenue Stakes for fillies to be run at Aqueduct in December 2019 are now the richest sire stakes races in the country. Funding for the enhanced NYSSS purse structure comes from the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund (the Fund), which annually disburses "Purse Enrichment" money. The plan's implementation was the result of diligent collaboration between NYTB, the Fund, and NYRA.

Immediate benefits from the doubled purse value of the NYSSS will accrue to owners, breeders, and stallion owners in the form of enhanced program awards. Owners of New York-sired horses, who already derive added value from the racing opportunities afforded by the NYSSS, will see an increase in their bottom lines, both from bigger purses and larger "Open Owner's Awards" from the Fund in 2019. By the same token, breeders who elect to breed to New York stallions and New York stallion owners themselves will also receive more in incentive awards.

An additional \$1,150,000 in quality black-type earnings on the table could

also be a game changer for the landscape of New York's stallion business. Starting with the 2019 breeding season, breeders in New York, the neighboring states, and elsewhere will have an even bigger incentive—beyond already existing awards and racing opportunities—to look more closely at New York stallions as they finalize their breeding and foaling plans. The hope is that this will drive more traffic to New York breeding sheds. New York-sired, New York-breds already earn double the breeders' awards compared to horses sired by stallions out of state, and the enhanced stallion series races only up the ante.

The progeny of New York sires should also get a *significant boost* in the bloodstock market. In the first few months of 2019, New York-bred juveniles will have a greater built-in added value when they enter the sale ring due to the \$500,000 purses up for grabs next December, and the effect should spread to the yearling and mixed sales. It also certainly didn't hurt that all six New York-bred Breeders' Cup contenders this year were sired by six current or former New York stallions.

Finally, the upgraded NYSSS program might well induce more owners to consider standing stallions in New York. The racing opportunities, purses, and awards for a stallion's progeny in the state are second to none. Attracting more quality stallions to the state will provide a stronger magnet for attracting quality mares to New York.

This leads us full circle to our industry's current challenge: field size. Our foal crop has been, and is becoming, more and more important to NYRA. The foal crop in New York needs to increase to help offset the national decline and to support racing year-round. A variety of measures are needed to help reverse the current trends, but one like this that starts in the breeding shed is certainly the right place to start.

NY Stallion Stakes Series Purses to Double in 2019



The New York Racing Association, in conjunction with the New York Thoroughbred Breeders and New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, announced Oct. 31 a dramatic increase in purse values for the New York Stallion Stakes series.

Purses for the 10-race series restricted to the progeny of nominated New York stallions and contested on NYRA racetracks will double in 2019 from \$1.15 million to \$2.3 million.

Purses for all 10 races will see increases. The Great White Way Stakes for juvenile males and the Fifth Avenue Stakes for juvenile fillies, to be run at Aqueduct Racetrack in December 2019, will become the richest sire stakes races in the country, with purses of \$500,000 each.

"This purse enhancement is the result of a diligent process with our partners in New York racing, and I appreciate the leadership of John Poklemba of the Fund and Jeff Cannizzo from the NYTB to get this over the finish line," said Martin Panza, NYRA's senior vice president of racing operations. "Continuing to find new and innovative ways to incentivize the owners and breeders who fill our races is paramount to the ongoing success of New York racing."

Funding for the enhanced NYSSS purse structure comes from the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, which distributes "Purse Enrichment" annually.

Cannizzo, the executive director of the NYTB (which administers the NYSSS), said, "I sincerely want to thank the Fund and NYRA for agreeing to this proposal, which dramatically enhances the Stallion Stakes series and creates the most lucrative sire stakes for 2-year-olds in the country. Directing the Fund's 'purse enrichment' to New Yorksired horses will, I believe, have both immediate and long-term positive effects on the state's breeding and racing industries."

The purse hike will benefit all participants in the New York breeding and racing programs, starting with the owners of New York-sired horses, who already derive added value from the racing opportunities afforded by the NYSSS. Currently, New York-sired horses who finish first through third in open races, and races such as the NYSSS, which are not otherwise restricted to New York-breds, earn 20% on top of purse earnings.

Other increases include the Times

Square Stakes and Park Avenue Stakes divisions for 3-year-olds of both sexes (at 6½ furlongs) to be run at Aqueduct (from \$100,000 to \$200,000); four turf races for 3-year-olds run in pairs at Belmont Park and at Saratoga Race Course (from \$100,000 to \$150,000); and a pair of sprints for older horses run at Aqueduct (from \$125,000 to \$150,000).

Breeders of New York-sired New York-breds and stallion owners will also benefit from the opportunity to earn increased fund awards.

New York-sired New York-breds earn 30%, 15%, and 15% in breeder's awards for first-, second-, and third-place finishes, which is 50% more than the breeder's awards for out-of-state-sired New York-breds. Stallion owner's awards are allotted at 10% each for progeny that finish first through third.

"Doubling the purse value of the New York Stallion Stakes series through the Fund's 'purse enrichment' money will benefit owners, breeders, and the bloodstock market, starting immediately. Having an additional \$1.15 million in quality black-type earnings on the table could also have a wide-ranging effect on the landscape of the stallion business in New York," Cannizzo said.

Weekend Hideaway to Irish Hill/Dutchess Views Stallions

Grade 1-placed stakes winner Weekend Hideaway has been retired from racing and enters stud under the management of Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions near Saratoga Springs, N.Y. The son of Speightstown will stand for \$2,500.

Racing for Michael Hoffman's Red and Black Stable and trained by Phil Serpe and Lisa Bartkowski, Weekend Hideaway won black-type stakes in New York for six years, primarily on dirt but also on turf.

"The recent great news that the New York Stallion Stakes Series purse values have doubled for New York-based sires' progeny makes a precocious sire

like Weekend Hideaway especially attractive," said Michael Lischin with Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions. "His 2-year-olds will be eligible for purses of up to \$500,000 per race and millions

of dollars of enriched restricted purses thereafter."

Weekend Hideway won three of his five starts at 2 and did not finish off the board during his freshman season. He raced from 2 to 8 and claimed victories in nine black-type stakes, with his top performances enhanced by third-place finishes in the Vosburgh Stakes (G1) and Futurity Stakes (G2). He was retired with a 13-7-10 record from 49 starts and career earnings of \$1,144,922.

Flying Zee Stables bred Weekend Hideaway in New York out of

the Wiseman's Ferry mare Apocalyptical. Weekend Hideaway is from the family of grade 1-placed, graded stakes winner and one-time New York sire Crafty C. T.





Classic-Placed Destin to Sequel Stallions



Destin is a grade 2-winning full brother to Creative Cause

Destin, a full brother to grade 1 winner and top sire Creative Cause, will stand at Sequel Stallions New York for 2019. The 5-year-old son of three-time leading sire Giant's Causeway will have a fee of \$6,500 live foal stands and nurses.

Destin, who raced for Twin Creeks Racing Stables and Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, will stand as the property of Gainesway, Twin Creeks, Eclipse, and Sequel.

"I look forward to working with Gainesway Farm, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, as well as Twin Creeks Farm in standing Destin at Sequel Stallions New York," said Becky Thomas of Sequel New York. "Creative Cause was a special horse for me,

having bought him as a yearling in addition to having stood Freud, the King of New York, at stud for so many years. I am truly Giant's Causeway's No. 1 fan. Destin's good looks and pedigree are certain to get the breeders' attention."

Destin won five of 15 starts, placed four times, and earned \$947,800. A nose away from being a classic winner in the 2016 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1), he won three graded stakes, including a record-setting performance as a 3-year-old in the Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby (G2) when he ran 11/16 miles in 1:42.82.

One start before the Tampa Bay Derby, Destin scored in the Sam F. Davis Stakes (G3) and later ran sixth in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). He finished third in Saratoga Race Course's Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) just after his Belmont Stakes effort. At 4 Destin won the 1¾-mile Marathon Stakes Presented by TAA (G2) during Del Mar's Breeders' Cup World Championships meet.

Destin is out of grade 1 millionaire Dream of Summer, who won the 2005 Apple Blossom Handicap (G1). Dream of Summer is a multiple graded stakes-winning, graded stakes-producing mare with more than \$2.3 million in progeny earnings. Destin is also a full brother to recent Rood and Riddle Dowager Stakes (G3T) winner Vexatious.

"Destin's beautiful body, great bone, and ability to go a distance of ground will be an easy match for much of the mare population," Randy Gullatt of Twin Creeks said. "I think New York is a perfect fit based on the influence Giant's Causeway has had on both turf and dirt. We are excited about the support Destin will have getting started as a stallion."

Green Gratto to Total Bloodstock Farm

Grade 1 winner Green Gratto has been retired from racing and will stand stud at Robert Wright's Total Bloodstock Farm near Fort Edward, N.Y. The 8-year-old son of Here's Zealous will stand for \$2,000.

'We are excited to add a horse with the quality of Green Gratto to the New York stallion program," Wright said. "He is an absolute stunner at 17 hands with elite balance and athleticism for his size, and as a racehorse he was a true warrior. He had speed to burn, and we love that he was a sound horse, able to start 65 times against the best competition. He will add toughness and quality to the breeding program."

The stud deal was brokered by agent Peter-John Parsard.

Raced by owner/trainer Gaston Grant and Anthony Grantalong with Basil Greene for the first half of his career—Green Gratto came into his own as an older horse and won or placed in six graded stakes. He delivered his best in 2017, when he won the Carter Handicap (G1). He compiled a 9-9-9 record out of 65 starts and earned \$1,149,202.

Bred in New Jersey by Kaz Hill Farm, Green Gratto is out of the winning Smokester mare Starship Smokester.

Grade 1 winner Fourstar Crook Brings \$1.5 Million

Katsumi Yoshida went to \$1.5 million to buy star New York mare Fourstar Crook (by Freud) during the Nov. 4 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. Winner of the Flower Bowl Stakes (G1T) Oct. 7 for Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith, Fourstar Crook ran seventh in the Nov. 3 Maker's Mark

Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) at Churchill Downs.

Beginning in the state-bred ranks and graduating to graded competition at the highest level this year, she leaves the track with 12 wins, four seconds, and a third from 20 starts and earnings of \$1,624,566.

Also at the Fasig-Tipton sale, multiple stakes winner and dual graded stakes performer Quezon (by Tiz Wonderful), offered as Hip 127 by Valkyre Stud, agent, was purchased by Bridlewood Farm for \$700,000. The New York-bred mare is in foal to Horse of the Year Gun Runner on an April 16 cover.

War Dancer Relocates to Irish Hill/Dutchess Views

War Dancer, a multiple graded stakes winner and millionaire by top sire War Front, will move to Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions at Irish Hill Century Farm near Saratoga Springs for the 2019 breeding season. War Dancer, who won or placed in nine graded stakes, will stand for \$7.500.

"We're pleased to have the opportunity to stand War Dancer. He checks all the boxes for breeders looking to get their mare to a top son of War Front," said Michael Lischin, managing member of Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions.

The facility currently stands eight stallions, including four of the leading stallions in New York and is located just minutes from Saratoga Race Course.

"We are excited about having War Dancer stand closer to home, not only for the convenience of breeding our own mares, but to accommodate mare owners looking to breed to him," said Robin Malatino, president of War Dancer LLC.

War Dancer covered nearly 200 mares in his first two years at stud.

Filly Out of La Verdad Drives NYB Weanling Market

Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm teamed with Three Chimneys Farm to buy the second foal out of 2015 champion female sprinter La Verdad for a sale-topping \$800,000. The partners signed the ticket for the flashy grey/roan filly by Tapit, which was the top price for a weanling during Book 1 of the Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

Co-bred by Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable and Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm, where she was foaled March 15, the filly was supplemented to the Keeneland sale Oct. 18 and consigned by Eaton Sales.

La Verdad (Yes It's True—Noble Fire, by Hook and Ladder) was bred by Eklektikos Stable and foaled at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm near Chestertown. La Verdad was purchased privately by Rosenblum following her second allowance optional claiming victory in November 2013. She won 11 stakes

races for trainer Linda Rice, led by back-to-back victories in the grade 2 Distaff Handicap, a win in the grade 2 Gallant Bloom Handicap, and a runner-up finish to Wavell Avenue in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1). In 2015 La Verdad was also voted champion New York-bred sprinter and older female.

"She could not go to a better place,"

Rosenblum said. "This is wonderful for La Verdad. I'm thrilled. It was a big decision to try and sell her as a weanling, but she just looked that good.

"She was beautiful, and she came out looking like a muscular colt, and everything was pretty bright. This is my first introduction into selling a weanling!

"I had no idea what to expect," Rosenblum continued. "It was horrendously difficult to watch her go. Anyone who says racers don't love their horses, a lot of us really, really do. La Verdad brought me here, and now I'm going above and beyond."

In all, 35 New York-bred weanlings were reported as sold during the 12-day mixed sale for an average of \$94,571, which was higher than the \$67,384 average for the sale.

A STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWD CELEBRATED the life of Rick Violette on Monday evening, Nov. 26, at Belmont Park.

A cold, blustery, unrelenting rainstorm battering Long Island didn't keep people away—except for travelers whose flights were delayed—and as several of the speakers at the two-hour service observed, the weather was a fitting corollary for an event that, while often funny, warm, and positive, couldn't help but be pervaded by a sense of mournfulness and melancholy.

Decked in the blue and black colors of Violette's stable, the Belmont Café was packed to overflowing with the trainer's family, friends, employees, clients, and colleagues. They traveled from California, from Florida, from Kentucky, from upstate New York, and from the Midlantic region to share a meal, toast with libations from an open bar, and share memories of a man who was a force in Thoroughbred racing virtually until the day he died Oct. 21 at age 65.

He was remembered as funny, smart, compassionate, and combative, and as a man who used all of those qualities in service of the sport, the people, and the animals he loved.

As president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Violette often found himself at odds with Chris Kay, the New York Racing Association's president and CEO. Kay flew to Florida last month for Violette's funeral, and he was among the first speakers at Monday night's memorial, paying tribute to the trainer's passion and pugnacity.

"He loved NYRA, on certain days," quipped Kay. "He fought for you. I can show you X-rays of where I've been concussed by butting heads with him."

Said Anthony Stabile, a NYRA racing analyst, "He fought with us but more importantly he fought *for* us, and we can't thank him enough for that."

Luis Chiari, an exercise rider who worked with Violette going back to their days with trainer David Whiteley, observed that what at first might look like Violette's

intransigence not uncommonly gave way to his generosity, particularly in support of riders and backstretch workers.

"Our arguments were like a head-on collision," recalled Chiari, sharing the story of a fellow exercise rider who had died in an accident on the track. "I said to Rick, 'We need to build a safety rail.' He said, 'It's too much money, Luis. I can't do this.'"

But eventually, Violette relented, helping to fund not only the safety rails but also vests and helmets for riders.

"He was a fierce, untiring advocate for what he believed in," said Paul Ruchames, executive director of Backstretch Employee Service Team (B.E.S.T.), on whose board Rick served. "He was relentless and determined and incredibly well-prepared. The three NYRA tracks—Belmont, Aqueduct, and Saratoga—have some of the finest services for backstretch workers of any track in the United States, and there is no doubt that Rick Violette was at the center of it all.

"Rick and I and others received many, many calls and brain-stormed about how to help people," Ruchames continued, "and often, the call would be about helping people whose suffering was invisible to so many other people. The status of the person was irrelevant to Rick, just the suffering, and the need to help and show kindness."

Unmarried and without children, Violette himself often invoked his lack of family responsibilities in explaining his willingness to put his time into so many of racing's organizations and causes, a boon for the people he served and for whom he advocated.


At one point bringing necessary laughter and lightheartedness, Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, said he established a special ring tone for Violette's

calls, in order to be prepared for regular evening conversations.

It was with horses bred in New York that Violette found much of his recent success, two of them owned by longtime client Ralph Evans. In 2015 Violette and Evans went to the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) with Upstart; two years later Evans got his first grade 1 win after 30 years of owning horses when Diversify, co-owned with his daughter, Lauren, won the Jockev Club Gold Cup Stakes at Belmont Park. Evans and Violette were back in the grade 1 winner's circle at Saratoga in August, both of them emotional when Diversify won the Whitney Stakes, under a literal rainbow after an extended delay because of a downpour.

Those latter two races were featured prominently in a memorial video at Violette's service.

"I am totally blown away," said Evans, "by the number of people that are here tonight to honor Rick."

Sharing his appreciation for his role in Violette's accomplishments, he added, "What a grand time for Rick at the end."

Yet despite the emotion Evans brought to his remarks, he couldn't resist a little levity at the trainer's expense, joking about the times Violette would call him to talk over a particularly contentious issue.

"'I could agree with you, Rick,'" he remembered saying to him, "'but then we'd both be wrong.'"

A longtime Violette friend, colleague, and ally, Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association president and CEO Alan Foreman said he had never "met someone so devoted to people on the backstretch, people on the front side, horses, and the best interests of racing."

He recited a list of Violette's accomplishments, which included restoring financial responsibility to NYTHA, which made possible charitable contributions and

millions of dollars in scholarships and health and welfare programs for back-stretch workers. He was on the front lines of the negotiations for money from the video lottery machines installed at Aqueduct Racetrack. He was instrumental in establishing the medication reform that became known as the National Uniform Medication Protocol. He founded the Take2 and Take the Lead Thoroughbred retirement programs that operate from NYTHA's office, working with NYTHA executive director Andy Belfiore and NYTHA board member Rick Schosberg.

"Rick devised a network of classes in horse shows especially for Thoroughbreds, and it took off," said Schosberg, noting that there are now 350 shows across the country that feature Thoroughbred classes.

Anna Ford, Thoroughbred program director at New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program, remembered a conversation she had had with Violette at an Ocala Breeders' Sale a number of years ago.

"I told him that we'd been taking in a number of New York-breds, and he said, 'OK, what do you need?'

"I gave him a number, and he said, 'I can't promise to get you that, but now that I know what you need, I'm going to see what I can do.'"

Less than a year later, she said, Take the Lead was started, a program that Ford characterized as "one of the best aftercare programs in the country for working with horsemen to get their horses into accredited (retirement) organizations." "We all learned from what he taught us," Schosberg continued. "I'm grateful for what he did for New York racing and for me personally."

"Though other trainers had more horses, he had no equal in this country," observed Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "No other trainers have the drive and the soul of Rick Violette."

Sal DeBunda, president of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, prefaced his remarks by saying, "I promise I won't talk for as long as it took me to get here tonight," then added that serving as the vice-president of the THA under Violette's presidency made him lose sleep at night.

"Suppose I have to be president?" he

said he'd ask himself. "How am I going to replace Rick?"

That is a question that many in the New York and nationwide racing community are now asking themselves, a question for which Foreman has a succinct response.

"There will never," he said, "be another Rick Violette."

But Foreman and the THA hope to come as close as they can and to carry on Violette's legacy. Earlier this year during the Saratoga meeting the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association held a celebration for Violette, honoring his quarter-century of service to the organization, serving on its board and from 2008 to 2017 as its president. At that time, establishment of the Rick Violette Award, to be given annually to a member of the racing industry who, as Foreman put it Monday night, "stands for the integrity of racing, for fairness of competition, for the best interests of the health and welfare of the horse, and all the good things racing is all about.

"We were hoping Rick would help to select the winners of the award," said Foreman. "We'll comb the industry to find people who will honor Rick's memory."

"It is said that people don't die if we, the living, are committed to keeping their memories and values alive in us," said Ruchames. "That is my hope tonight, that part of Rick will live on in each of us."

Thanks to the THA award and to the affection and respect of the hundreds of people who turned out to honor Violette, that seems like a sure bet.

Highway Star cruises in Staten Island after Breeders' Cup run

TRAINER RODRIGO UBILLO watched intently Nov. 11 at Aqueduct Racetrack as the seven-furlong New York Stallion Series Staten Island Division unfolded.

His 5-year-old mare Highway Star was making her third start in 23 days, an unusual move for the trainer. A little more than a week before the Stallion Series, Highway Star had finished eighth, beaten 5½ lengths, in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) at Churchill Downs. Two weeks before that she had eked out a neck win in the \$156,525 Iroquois Stakes at Belmont Park.

Ubillo was admittedly tense, and his body language showed it: He leaned forward; he snapped his fingers; he encouraged his stable star. He was finally able to sit back when Highway Star—the 1-2 favorite—opened up on her opponents inside the eighth pole.

"I feel so much relief," he said on his way to the winner's circle. "A lot of peo-

ple have been giving me bad press, running the filly in three races in 23 days."

Sitting in ninth place in the 11-horse field after breaking from post eight, Highway Star and Irad Ortiz Jr., in the saddle for the first time, were in no hurry to challenge the pacesetting longshot Bluegrass Flag, who ran through early fractions of :22.72 and :46.32. Heading into the far turn from the three path, Highway Star glided past her rivals with little effort, splitting horses coming into the stretch to take the lead.

The surface was labeled "fast," but heavy rains earlier in the weekend had left some moisture in the track, and three pairs of goggles proved insufficient for Ortiz to make it through the race. Heading to the wire with impeded vision, he glanced back several times to make sure that no horses were coming late.

They weren't. The chestnut mare kicked clear to win by four lengths over Starlite Mission in 1:25.58.

"I couldn't see anything with my right eye from the three-eighths pole on, so I had to turn around big time to look with my left eye to watch for the competition," said Ortiz. "Once I realized I was OK, I saved something (for next time)."

"I know it sounds crazy because it was a Breeders' Cup race," said Ubillo, "but it was like she didn't even run in Kentucky. She didn't like the track at Churchill, and that's why she didn't perform the way I know she can run."

Bred and owned by Chester and Mary Broman, Highway Star is by Girolamo, who was standing at Sequel Stallions New York when he was bred to Stolen Star (by Cat Thief). In 23 starts Highway Star has been worse than third only six times, with a record of 10-5-2 and earnings of \$1,326,813.

"I didn't really want to run her back," admitted Ubillo. "That's not my style, and she's too precious to me to do that."

Highway Star brought the trainer his first graded stakes win two years ago in the Go for Wand Handicap (G3) at Aqueduct. She's added three more graded stakes to his résumé since, and in 2017 at Saratoga Race Course, she fell a head short of adding a grade 1 to that list in the Ketel One Ballerina Stakes.

Her behavior this week convinced Ubillo to enter the race.

"I get on her every day," he said, "and by the second day back on the track, she was jumping and acting up, and that's her way to say, 'I'm good, Daddy.'"

Highway Star is eligible for bonuses as part of the New York Racing Association's Starter Loyalty program, but Ubillo said that didn't factor into his decision to run her.

"I do this for the horse," he said. "I love horses, and the money comes second. I felt the pressure, and I wanted to deliver for the owners and for the horse. I'm very happy, and now I can sleep in peace."

Still Golden

OWNER/BREEDER FRANCIS PAOLANGELI runs a construction company in Ithaca, N.Y., so it's easy to see that building is one of his natural strengths. Along with the help of trainer Charlton Baker, Paolangeli has done a terrific job assembling the foundation of a strong Thoroughbred stable, which includes Verdant Pastures (Colonel John—Stormy's Smile by Stormy Atlantic), winner of the 2017 Empire Distaff Handicap.

Paolangeli's first Thoroughbred purchase was an impulse buy. He'd won \$1,400 at the track one afternoon and went back to the Finger Lakes barn area with a friend who owned a horse. A runner heading back toward the barn caught Paolangeli's eye, and after a brief negotiation and an exchange of \$800, Paolangeli was a Thoroughbred owner. Though that initial purchase didn't prove particularly fruitful, Paolangeli continued to hone his eye for evaluating horseflesh.

In 2007 Paolangeli acquired Gold for the Queen (by Gold Token) for \$2,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern fall yearling sale. The transaction was made for him by Leonard Short of Mile-Away Farm in Southern Pines, N.C. At the time, however, Paolangeli was anything but pleased.

"I really gave him heck about it," said Paolangeli. "I told him, 'I don't need a cheap horse like this. I'm willing to spend some money for quality.' But he was absolutely right about her."

The fleet filly paid dividends by earning black-type with her score in the 2009 New York Oaks at Finger Lakes. The following year she recorded a front-running victory in Finger Lakes' Susan B. Anthony Handicap in 1:09.89 for six furlongs after dueling through a contested opening half-mile of :44.41.

Gold for the Queen went on to earn \$239,136 for Paolangeli. As a broodmare, she produced Gold for the King, who entered the \$126,376 Thunder Rumble Division of the New York Stallion Series as the 35-100 favorite Nov.18 at Aqueduct.

The 4-year-old gelded son of Posse had scored by an impressive 7½ lengths in the previous edition of the Thunder Rumble beneath jockey Joel Rosario, who was aloft again this year.

In his effort prior to this year's renewal, Gold for the King ran a solid second, despite a five-wide trip around Belmont Park's far turn, to Runaway Lute (by Midnight Lute) in the 6½-furlong Hudson Handicap Oct. 20, New York Showcase Day.

Out of the starting gate in this year's Thunder Rumble, Rosario, clad in Paolangeli's lime green and white silks, settled Gold for the King into third position in the field of five runners. The pair fell into an easy and relaxed beat as Red Storm Stable and Gerard Stuchbury's Tribecca (by Bustin Stones), from the barn of trainer Rudy Rodriguez, scrimmaged for the front with state-bred stalwart Loki's Vengeance (by Frost Giant), owned by Blue Bison Stable and trained by Linda Rice.

The opening quarter-mile went in :23.06.

"He broke well, and it looked like a couple of them were trying to challenge for the lead a little bit," said Rosario. "I just wanted to be in a stalking position."

Rosario asked Gold for the King to increase his cadence moving for the turn. The response was immediate as the favorite simply sidled up outside of the pacesetters. Without being asked for his best, the gelding dragged Rosario to the lead. Gold for the King clocked the half-mile in :46.07, while still waiting to be turned loose.

"I took control in the turn. Before

turning for home, he just took the lead by himself," said Rosario.

Gold for the King pulled away from his quartet of rivals in upper stretch while under a snug hold. Through the final furlong, however, Rosario let the gelding stretch his stride. Hence, the gap between the leader and the rest of the competition widened all the way to the wire.

"He did it comfortably, which I think he was supposed to do," said Baker. "He pretty much had this field over a barrel. We thought he was OK for this, and if he was healthy, he would win. Thankfully, it worked out...He needed this race to get in the swing of things. After his defeat in the Hudson, we wanted to get his confidence back. He's always dependable."

The winning margin was 9¼ lengths, and he covered the seven furlongs in 1:24.25.

The gelding reached the winner's circle for the seventh time in 18 career starts and increased his earnings to \$658,559. He now has five stakes triumphs.

Char-Allie Stable and Kathy Haers' Winston's Chance (by Roaring Fever), from the barn of conditioner Debra Breed, was the runner-up in the Thunder Rumble, finishing three-quarters of a length ahead of Bran Jam Stable's Sudden Surprise (by Giant Surprise).

The Thunder Rumble is named in honor of the colt who won the 1992 edition of the Travers Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Racecourse. The Braeburn Farm homebred, campaigned by Konrad Widmer and his daughter Ursula, was the first New York-bred to take the Midsummer Derby in 125 years—since the filly Ruthless, owned and bred by Francis Morris, captured the event in 1867. Thunder Rumble (by Thunder Puddles) was trained by Richard O'Connell and ridden by Herb McCauley. The bay colt banked \$1,047,552 in his career.



SARATOGA DEW, A IN SOCIOLOGY, L'CARRIERE, AND PERFECT ARC

IT WOULD NOT BE DIFFICULT to argue that Saratoga Dew (1989; Cormorant—Super Luna, by In Reality) was one of the best New York-bred fillies to set foot on a racetrack. She was bred by Helen "Penny" Chenery, who managed the racing career of Secretariat following the death of her father, Christopher T. Chenery, and was trained by Gary Sciacca. Saratoga Dew was originally owned by former pro football star Sam Huff, Carol Nolan, and Charles Engel, who had purchased her for \$10,000 while Chenery was reducing her breeding operation in 1990. Engel eventu-

ally bought out his other partners after Saratoga Dew won the Over All Stakes in March 1992.

Saratoga Dew raced only one season—her 3-year-old year—but her run was spectacular. She won eight of 11 starts, winning two grade 1 races and losing another by a nose. She finished out of the money twice—one of those due to a serious injury.

She began her career by breaking her maiden and scoring in an entry-level allowance against New York-breds in sixfurlong races. A win in the seven-furlong Over All Stakes brought her total winning margin tally to 21 lengths. Her first true test came March 28 in the Comely Stakes (G2) at one mile at Aqueduct. She justified her 4-5 odds by winning by one length despite being in tight quarters for most of the race under Herb McCauley, the first graded win for both the filly and her trainer. She stretched her winning streak to five when she took the June 3 Hyde Park Handicap for New York-breds by a neck. The streak ended when she ran an inexplicably poor race in the one mile, 70 yards Post-Deb Stakes (G2) at Monmouth, finishing sixth as the 5-2 second choice, 934 lengths behind the 23-1 winner Diamond Duo.

Saratoga Dew rebounded from her subpar performances by winning the New York Oaks at Finger Lakes by 6½ lengths as the 2-5 favorite. She then had three outstanding efforts in grade 1 races, losing the 10-furlong Alabama Stakes by a nose to the late-blooming Allen Jerkens-trained filly November Snow at Saratoga and winning the Gazelle and Beldame handicaps at Belmont by 1¼ lengths and six lengths, respectively.

The stage had been set for the most important race of her career, the 1992 Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) at Gulfstream Park. *The Blood-Horse* stated that "never in its previous eight runnings...had quality run so deep."

Leading Saratoga Dew's competition was the entry of Sidney Craig-owned Paseana, a future Hall of Fame inductee who had won five grade 1 races that season, and Exchange; along with Versailles Treaty, winner of four grade 1 races in 1991-92, as well as runner-up to Dance Smartly in the 1991 Distaff. Surprisingly, the bettors made Saratoga Dew the 2-1

favorite, with the Paseana-Exchange entry at 5-2, and Versailles Treaty at 7-2. Other notables in the 14-horse field included Lite Light, Meadow Star, Fowda, and the New York-bred Shared Interest. As expected, Saratoga Dew took the early lead, but Paseana took over near the stretch and won by four lengths over Versailles Treaty. Saratoga Dew tired badly, finishing 12th.

One of the two horses she beat was Diamond Duo, who had beaten her in the Post-Deb. Sensing something was wrong with his filly, Sciacca rushed to the finish her with \$541,580 in earnings for her one year of racing. In 1995 Osamu Yasuda of Japan paid \$850,000 for her at the Keeneland November sale. In Japan she produced stakes winner Al Kazan, a colt by Dance in the Dark.

line and discovered that Saratoga Dew had grabbed a quarter during the race; blood was streaming from her heel.

The Eclipse Award voters named Saratoga Dew the champion 3-year-old filly for 1992. On the other hand, the *Daily Racing Form* assessed her 121 pounds in the Free Handicap for 3-year-old fillies, two less than November Snow and one less than Jolypha and Turnback the Alarm, none of whom had run in the Distaff.

Saratoga Dew was prepping for her 1993 season at the Middleburg Training Center in Virginia when she suffered an unspecified career-ending injury, leaving

Winless in three starts in 1992, he broke his maiden in his second attempt of 1993 on May 20 against fellow New York-breds on the turf at Belmont Park. He won his first graded stakes in his first attempt, taking the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Stakes (G2T) at Saratoga at odds of 13-1. He followed the Hall of Fame with a sixth-place finish behind Awad in the Secretariat Stakes (G1T) at Arlington Park and a fourth-place finish in the Kelso Handicap (G3T). The Kelso winner, Lure, was a two-time winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) and a future inductee into the National Hall of Fame, and the place

horse, Paradise Creek, was the 1994 turf male champion. For the year A in Sociology had a record of three wins from eight starts with a pair of seconds and a third. He earned \$132,780.

His best season was in 1994, with wins in the Daryl's Joy Handicap (G3T) at Saratoga and the second division of the Jaipur Stakes (G3T) and the Belmont Budweiser Breeders' Cup Handicap (G3T) at Belmont. The last-named, with Jean Luc-Samyn aboard, featured a New York-bred exacta, with Fourstars Allstar finishing second. A in Sociology also finished third in the Kelso Handicap (G3T) behind Nijinsky's Secret and Lure. His 1994 record was four wins and two thirds from 10 starts, with earnings of \$201,435.

After losing his first four starts in 1996, he was retired with career earnings of \$357,856.

L'CARRIERE

L'Carriere (1991; Carr de Naskra—Northern Sunset, by Northfields) was a Virginia Kraft Payson homebred and was trained by future Hall of Famer Roger Attfield and James Bond. Unraced at 2, L'Carriere started 10 times in 3 in 1994, winning at

Gulfstream Park in South Florida and at Pimlico and Laurel Park in Maryland. He earned \$51,835 while participating in maiden and allowance ranks. Thus far he had raced in comparative anonymity, making an insignificant amount for his breeder/owner.

Two changes were made before the start of his 4-year-old season. Attfield was replaced by Bond, a young trainer

who had previously conditioned Mrs. Payson's horses at Finger Lakes, and L'Carriere was gelded. Whether it was his new trainer, his equipment change, or maturity, or a combination thereof, L'Carriere went from being a nondescript New York-bred to a force to be reckoned with in the handicap division. He began the year by winning two allowance races and making his stakes debut, losing by a neck in the July 3 Evan Shipman Handicap for state-breds, On Aug. 5 he appeared in his first graded stakes, finishing second in the Whitney Handicap (G1) at Saratoga, 134 lengths behind Unaccounted For, who had won the previous year's Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) at Saratoga. Three weeks later L'Carriere met Unaccounted For again in the listed \$200,000 Saratoga Cup Handicap, this time winning by seven lengths at 3-1 on a clever ride by Jerry Bailey.

After a month's layoff L'Carriere traveled to New Jersey to compete in the Meadowlands Cup Handicap (G1), finishing fourth at 2-1 to Peaks and Valleys. It should be noted that he finished only a nose behind the 8-5 favorite Concern, who had won the previous year's Breeders' Cup Classic (G1).

L'Carriere ended his 1995 season with the best and most lucrative performance of his career, finishing second in the Breeders' Cup Classic by 21/2 lengths behind the legendary Cigar, both carrying 126 pounds, at odds of 51-1. Checking in behind him were such notables as his old foe Unaccounted For (third), Soul of the Matter (fourth), Peaks and Valleys (sixth), Tinners Way (seventh), and Concern (eighth). In addition to earning \$650,000, with an additional \$50,000 from the New York State Breeders' Fund, it established him among the best handicap horses in the country who were not named Cigar. His record for 1995 was three wins and three seconds from seven starts, with earnings of \$928,840.

Although L'Carriere lost his first four starts in 1996, including the grade 1 Gulfstream Park, Suburban, and Whitney handicaps, his third-place finish to Cigar and Soul of the Matter in the inaugural Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba netted him \$400,000. His only win of the year came in his second consecutive Saratoga Cup Handicap at the Spa, with Peaks and Valleys second. He ended his racing career Sept. 14 by finishing four lengths behind Cigar in the Woodward Stakes.

L'Carriere's earnings in 1996 were \$745,000, giving him a career total of \$1,726,175 from 23 starts.

PERFECT ARC

The filly Perfect Arc (1992; Brown Arc—Podeica, by Petronisi), was bred by Delehanty Stock Farm, owned by Paul Sorren's Brazil Stable, and trained by Angel Penna Jr. She was purchased for \$22,000 at the 1993 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale.

Her debut was inauspicious, finishing a badly beaten third in a New York-bred maiden special weight sprint. After winning a maiden race for New York-breds at Saratoga going six furlongs, Perfect Arc was put on the shelf for the remainder of the season with bucked shins.

Her first race as a 3-year-old, a March 2 allowance at Gulfstream Park, was also her turf debut. Her win ensured she would never run on dirt for the rest of her career. After consecutive wins in the \$31,200 Bal Harbour Stakes at Hialeah, a Belmont allowance in May, and the Sands Point Handicap in June at Belmont, she made her graded stakes debut a successful one, winning her sixth race in a row by taking the Diana Handicap (G2T) over older horses at Saratoga in her usual front-running style as the 3-1 second choice. The 3-1 favorite, the Irish-bred Memories, finished eighth.

After her sixth straight win of the season, the Rare Perfume Handicap, (G2T), she ended her season by taking the prestigious Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (G1T) at Keeneland, giving her a perfect seven-for-seven record, all on the turf, with earnings of \$449,510.

Penna decided to keep her out of the Breeders' Cup Mile because of her age. She lost the Eclipse Award for turf female to the older Possibly Perfect.

Perfect Arc's 4-year-old season was a disappointment compared to her previous one, even taking into consideration that it is hard to beat a perfect season.

She began by extending her unbeaten streak to nine when she won an allowance race at Belmont Park. Her streak ended July 24 when she finished fourth by 1¼ lengths as the 4-5 favorite to the 49-1 Powder Bowl in the Vinery Matchmaker Stakes (G2T) at Atlantic City. Factors that might have figured in her loss were the 10 pounds she was conceding to the winner and the length of

the race, 1%6 miles, was the farthest she had ever run. She also lost her next race, the 1%6-mile Beverly D. Stakes (G1T) at Arlington Park, finishing second to the Irish-bred Timarida by 2½ lengths. However, the winner, whom Marty McGee described in *Daily Racing Form* as "one of the world's premier turf fillies," was the 8-5 favorite with her entrymate Khalisa while Perfect Arc was the 4-1 second favorite. She ended her season and her racing career by taking the Noble Damsel Handicap (G3T) at Belmont as the 2-5 favorite. Her career earnings were \$668,230 from 13 starts.

As a broodmare she produced eight foals, none of which were stakes performers.
