

### SEQUEL STALLIONS SECOND TO NONE

Which stallion is the perfect fit for your mare? This is the question on the minds of Thoroughbred owners as stallion farms prepare to reopen their doors for the 2013 breeding season. While conformation, bloodlines, and talent all play a central role in the decision-making process, another variable that has come into focus recently is location.

Although central Kentucky's Bluegrass region has historically been the primary source of high-class stallions, international operations such as Darley, have recognized the tremendous growth potential in New York's market and have teamed with Sequel Stallions to offer breeders an unprecedented selection of both quality and quantity.

"We feel like New York is an important part of the regional options out there in the breeding world," said Charlie Boden, Darley's Head of Sales. "And the fact that we are a landowner and a stakeholder so to speak in that state, we wanted to support the industry."

"I think Darley's decision to stand stallions in New York really validates all the hard work everyone has put in over the years," added Becky Thomas, owner and



operator of Sequel Stallions. "New York is an exciting place to be right now, and we're proud of the roster we have to offer breeders in 2013. The Darley partnership means a lot, not only to us, but to the entire New York market."

"We are certainly enamored with the job Sequel has done, and the stallions they have stood in New York," said Boden. "We've been a patron of Becky's sales business for many years and have been happy with her ability to represent quality."

This commitment to quality is what sets Sequel apart. And the roster they have assembled for 2013 is second to none, offering breeders a slew of exciting new opportunities.

#### A GROWING ROSTER OF QUALITY STALLIONS BRINGS EXCITING NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR NY BREEDERS

Last year, Darley added GIROLAMO, the impeccably-bred winner of the Grade 1 Vosburgh Stakes, G2 Jerome, and A.P. Indy's fastest son.

"We wanted to stand a horse that we thought could be significant from a standpoint of quality, which is why we chose Girolamo to go there," said Boden. "He certainly is a horse who could have stood in Kentucky and been very popular here."

#### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

This year, Darley added DESERT PARTY, who brings a Street Cry sire line to Sequel's offerings, along with considerable commercial success. He himself sold for \$2.1 million as a juvenile—making him his sire's

highest-priced sales horse—and his firstcrop weanlings averaged nearly five times his 2013 stud fee. An impressive 3 1/2 length winner of the G2 Sanford Stakes at Saratoga, he went on to win Group/Graded stakes at 2, 3 and 4, while earning nearly \$1 million on the track.

"We wanted to give breeders a variety," said Boden. "We have seen a good number of mares travel from Kentucky to New York to breed to Girolamo and wanted to offer them a Darley horse to breed back to besides him. We've been very happy with Desert Party's foals and thought he'd be an exciting option for people in New York."

#### IMAGINE THE PAZIBILITIES...

Another exciting addition to Sequel's roster this year is Twin Creeks Racing Stable's popular racehorse, MISSION IMPAZIBLE, a multiple G2 winner and G1 performer, who won or placed in nine graded stakes from 4 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/8 from ages 2 to 5. Winner of the Louisiana Derby (G2) and New Orleans Handicap (G2), he was also runner-up in the Clark (G1), Donn (G1), and Stephen Foster (G1). He defeated classic winners Drosselmeyer, Ruler On Ice and

Shackleford and retired sound with earnings of nearly \$1.3 million in 21 career starts.

Thomas credits the influence of slots for the farm's fast-filling stalls and stallion books, along with the addition of these talented new sires to their existing roster of proven stallions.


Centerpiece sire, FREUD, is a full brother to champion sire Giant's Causeway. Freud has proven his own mettle at stud, siring G1 winners, Franny Freud and Giant Ryan. He has topped the New York charts as the leading sire of stakes winners every year since 2008, was NY's leading sire by yearling average in 2012, and has sired Graded Stakes winners on dirt, turf, and synthetic in four different countries, ranging from 5 1/2 furlongs to a mile and a half.

Also holding down the fort at Sequel is NOONMARK, the precocious and durable son of Unbridled's Song. At 2, broke his maiden impressively by 10 lengths at Belmont and went on to win the G3 Mr. Prospector Handicap at age five. His first-crop 2-yearolds will be showcased in the upcoming select sales at Barretts and OBS March. His first-crop yearlings brought nearly four times his stud fee.

As the buzz in New York continues to grow louder, Sequel Stallions has taken center stage, determined to offer a growing roster of talented sires to breeders seeking the perfect exacta of blue-blooded quality with hefty state-bred incentives. ■

For the newcomers I would like to take a moment to talk about our organization and explain why it is important for all stakeholders—old and new—to get involved.

> As the official authorized representative of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in New York State, NYTB has as its primary mission a full-time, year-round commitment to act as an advocate for New York breeders on the legislative front and beyond. Two years ago we were at the forefront of efforts to bring the video lottery terminal impasse in Albany to a successful conclusion. As you know, VLT revenue from the Resorts World New York City Casino at Aqueduct has led to dramatic purse hikes at the NYRA tracks and a 50% increase in incentive awards from the New York State Breeding and Development Fund. Today, however, more critical work lies ahead.

Elected officials in Albany continue to work on Gov. Andrew Cuomo's proposed amendment to the state constitution to permit up to seven full-fledged casinos in New York. The mission of NYTB, in partnership with the racetrack operators and the horsemen, is to ensure that legislators include the breeding and racing industries in any future gaming decisions.

As a charter member of the New York Horse Racing & Agriculture Industry Alliance, NYTB has spearheaded two major projects in the last six months: a new and up-to-date "New York State Equine Industry Economic Impact Study" and a 10-minute informational video with dozens of spot interviews highlighting the importance of breeding and racing industries in New York. The study and video are powerful and persuasive tools for our mission and are already acting as effective "calling cards" in our meetings with legislators.

None of this could be possible without the support of our members. By the same token, NYTB is able "give back" in the form of some exclusive member benefits that more than pay for an individual \$150 membership: subscriptions to the monthly *New York Breeder* magazine, digital subscriptions to *The Blood-Horse MarketWatch*, the annual *NYTB New York Stallion Register*, and advertising opportunities, as well as the various discounts and other benefits. Joining NYTB is a win-win proposition for all.

### New York-Breds Sell Well at Keeneland January

**P**atsy Symons' Gitchee Goomie helped to get the 2013 Keeneland January horses of all ages sale off to a strong start when Frank Stronach's Adena Springs went to \$250,000 to acquire the 6-year-old daughter of City Zip as a racing or broodmare prospect from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment.

Wth a record of 7-9-2 from 22 starts and earnings of \$680,520, Gitchee Goomie won five stakes races on turf for trainer Rick Violette Jr., including last year's Dr. James Penny Memorial Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Parx Racing. Her other stakes victories came both in open company (Topicount Stakes at Belmont) and in the top turf stakes for New York-bred fillies and mares—back-to-back renewals of Belmont's Mount Vernon Stakes in 2011-12 and Saratoga's Yaddo Stakes in 2011.

Runner-up twice in the Beaugay Stakes (gr. IIIT), Gitchee Goomie also finished third in the Garden City Stakes (gr. IT) in 2010. She also placed in four other stakes races. Gitchee Goomie's popular rivalry with Hessonite, the other standout competing in the state-bred female turf ranks, enlivened the entire 2012 racing season in New York. Both Gitchee Goomie and Hessonite are finalists for top New York-bred older female and turf female of 2012 (see page 14).

### DON'T CROSS ME TO AT LIBERTY FARMS

Don't Cross Me, a winning son of Yonaguska, has been retired from racing and will stand the 2013 breeding season at At Liberty Farm near Fort Salonga, N.Y. The property of a partnership, he will stand for \$2,500 live foal.

A registered New York-bred, Don't Cross Me is out of the In Reality mare Deftly. Deftly, is a half sister to blue hen Homewrecker, the dam of graded stakes winner and world record equaler Honor the Hero. Homewrecker is also the dam of three other graded stakes winners including grade I winner Prenup.

Yonaguska, by Cherokee Run, won the 2000 Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) and two other graded stakes.



Farm in Pine Plains, Gitchee Goomie is out of Riotous Miss, a stakes-placed Florida-bred daughter of Brief Ruckus, all of whose 13 victories came on turf (\$382,310). Riotous Miss retired in 2004 after 87 starts. The dam of one other winner, Miss Rapture (by Gulch), Riotous Miss has also produced an unnamed 2-year-old full sister to Gitchee Goomie and a yearling filly by Patriot Act. She was bred back to City Zip last year.

The session-topper on Jan. 11, the final day of the weeklong run of the sale, was a short yearling colt by 2004 turf male champion Kitten's Joy. One of the last to come under the hammer, the chestnut New York-bred (Hip 1850) was purchased by Greendale Bloodstock for \$100,000 from the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent.

Bred by N.Y. Kitten Foals, the March yearling is the second foal from Esther Got Even, a winning daughter of Stephen Got Even and a full sister to multiple stakes-placed Debbie Got Even. The colt's third dam, Via Borghese (by Seattle Dancer), a multiple graded stakes winner (\$679,657), won the 1994 edition of the Diana Handicap (gr. IIT) at Belmont Park. The colt is Breeders' Cup nominated. By Sarah Mace



### OWNER/BREEDER ED WACHTEL DIES AT 81

Ed Wachtel, a successful New York owner/breeder, died Monday, Dec. 31, from stomach cancer. He was 81.

Wachtel raced numerous stakes winners alone and in partnership, including such graded winners as Barbara O'Brien, Dashboard Drummer, Penny's Reshoot, Stalwart Member, and Claramount, who was the 1988 New York-bred horse of the year. Claramount also developed into a successful stallion in New York. Stalwart Member, a homebred and a multiple graded stakes winner, was one of Wachtel's favorite horses. Campaigned for a time with Sidney Port, Stalwart Member was beaten a neck by Canadian champion sprinter Langfuhr in the 1997 Carter Handicap (gr. I).

Wachtel's first stakes winner, Hinterland in 1975, raced in the name Exeter Stable.

"Exeter was the name of the first horse my dad bet on while growing up," said his son, Adam, a successful owner himself who races in the name Wachtel Stable and won the 2012 Santa Anita Handicap (gr. I) with Ron the Greek as a member of a partnership. "After Exeter my dad raced for a time in the name E. W. Racing."

Ed Wachtel, who was the founder, CEO, and president of Members Only, an apparel firm, was a close friend of Hollywood actor Telly Savalas.

"The first horse race I ever

won betting, I was a kid and was with my dad, Telly, and (actor) Jack Klugman (who died Dec. 24)," Adam Wachtel said. "The horse was named Shady Character. Wanting to emulate my dad later on, I thought about using the name Shady Character as a name for my racing stable. But I realized a name like that wouldn't go over too well."

Wachtel is survived by three other children, 10 grandchildren, and four great grandchildren.



### 'SUNNY' NEW YEAR

Saul and Max Kupferberg's Sunny Desert made it six wins in a row Jan. 6 when the 4-year-old New York-bred filly scored a one-length victory over open company in the \$67,500 Cat Cay Stakes at Aqueduct.

The chestnut broke her maiden at Aqueduct in March 2012 by 15<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths and hasn't lost since, winning three stakes in the process including scores in the New York Stallion Park Avenue Stakes, Judy Soda Stakes, and New York Stallion Series Stakes.

Bred by Breed of Characters, Sunny Desert is by Wild Desert out of the Louis Quatorze mare Hoping For Sun. She's earned \$311,750.

### WEANLING HALF SISTER TO UNBRIDLED COMMAND TOPS F-T DECEMBER MIXED

New York-breds closed out the 2012 North American sales year on a high note when a weanling half sister to Unbridled Command (by Master Command), winner of the Nov. 25 Hollywood Derby (gr. IT), topped the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale in Timonium Dec. 3. Another New York-sired, New York-bred weanling by Bluegrass Cat shared the honors for second-highest seller of the day.

Bred by Rhapsody Farm and Jon Davis, and foaled at Rhapsody Farm near Plymouth, the sale-topping filly (Hip 156) was purchased by Mc-Mahon/Hill on behalf of Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm from the consignment of Rhapsody Farm and Hidden Lake Farm (agents) for \$100,000.

Foaled April 15, 2012, the filly—gray like her famous half brother—is by former New York stallion Read the Footnotes, sire of New York-bred grade I winner Rightly So. Read the Footnotes stood at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson from 2006-11 before relocating to Oklahoma.

The filly's dam, Unbridled Betty, an unraced daughter of Unbridled's Song, is out of Timotara (by Secretariat), a winner who produced two stakes winners and three stakes producers, including Astaire Step, dam of multiple grade I winner Manistique (by Unbridled), who earned more than \$1.3 million.

Malloy plans to resell the filly next summer at Saratoga.

"It is what I call my personal pinhook," she told the *Thoroughbred Daily News*. "I do a couple of personal pinhooks a year. I don't get sentimental or attached to them as much as I possibly can because I want to keep a lot of the ones I breed, even though sometimes I shouldn't. And this way I know that I have some that I will sell. This filly, if she never steps on a racetrack, is a half sister to a grade I winner, and she is still valuable." By Sarah Mace

### New York Breeding Fund at Historic Levels

The New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund Corporation voted at its Jan. 18, board meeting to keep awards at historically high levels.

Breeder member Joseph McMahon said support for a second year of awards at the high levels signals that "the comeback in the state's Thoroughbred industry that began three years ago is picking up momentum."

McMahon, best known for operating the birthplace of Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Funny Cide at his McMahon Thoroughbreds in Saratoga, was voted unanimously by his fellow board members to serve as acting chairman in the wake of the recent resignation of John Sabini.



The two top sires were also atop the winners list in 2011, with Posse responsible for 107 winners to Bluegrass Cat's 106. Both Posse and Bluegrass Cat stand at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple Farm. Posse's fee for 2013 will be \$12,500, and the Vinery team is looking forward to a busy season in the breeding shed with him. He will be standing his fifth season in New York after getting his stud career underway at Vinery Kentucky, so his first crop of New York-conceived 2-year-olds will be hitting the track shortly.

"We're expecting good things," said Dan Hayden, manager of Vinery New York. "A lot of breeders are looking forward to them running because they should be fast, so they'll be ready for March and April and get them out there early.

"Posse's a beautiful-looking horse," Hayden continued. "He has a lot of class about him. He's a speedy type; big hip, big shoulder, and a lot of bone to him. He fits New York very well."

Posse did well in 2012 with four stakes winners. None was more impressive than the Bob Bafferttrained 2-year-old Rolling Fog, winner of the seven-furlong Del Mar Futurity (gr. I) over the Polytrack in early September.

"They were looking to get him on the dirt, which didn't happen," Hayden said. "He bucked shins, but we're all looking forward to him coming back on the dirt this year."

His three other stakes winners were three-time stakes winner In the Fairway, Comedero, and Law Enforcement. In the Fairway rolled to consecutive stakes scores at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races, at 4½ furlongs, 6½ furlongs, and seven furlongs. Comedero, a stakes winner in each of four seasons of racing, took Oaklawn's Nodouble Breeders' Stakes at six furlongs, and Camelia Casby's New York-bred Law Enforcement won the Hollie Hughes Stakes at Aqueduct for his fourth stakes win in six years in training.

Posse's leading earner of the year was Caleb's Posse, who raced for Don McNeill and Everett Dobson's Chevenne Stables. Caleb's Posse made three starts in 2012 and lost tight photos in each one. He earned \$270,000 but would have won a lot more. He dropped a neck decision to Calibrachoa in the six-furlong Tom Fool Handicap (gr. III), then was beaten a nose by Jackson Bend in the seven-furlong Carter Handicap (gr. I). In what would be his final start he just missed catching Shackleford by a nose in the mile Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I).

The previous year Caleb's Posse had hit the jackpot, winning five of 10 starts and earning more than \$1 million following his score in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I)

the Eclipse Award for top sprinter.

A promising stud career awaits Caleb's Posse, who hails from a Seattle Slew-line female family—at the Clay family's Three Chimneys Farm in Kentucky where his initial fee will be \$10,000 this year.

#### Fast Start

Posse was a looker from the get-go. The fourth foal out of the Rahy mare Raska, Posse was bred in Kentucky by Robert and Lawana Low, who raced the grade I-winning Capote Belle and Posse's half brother Green Fee, and was entered in the 2001 Keeneland September yearling sale. Consigned by Denali Stud, agent, the bay yearling was purchased by Heiligbrodt Racing Stable for \$115,000.

Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt, best remembered in Thoroughbred circles for their quick-starting 2-yearolds, knew speed when they saw it, and Posse delivered quickly on their investment. He broke his maiden at first asking, at Keeneland in early April 2002, drawing off to win by 13<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths in a 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-furlong race.

He was a graded stakes winner before Memorial Day, having landed Churchill Downs' Kentucky Breeders' Cup Stakes (gr. III) at 5½ furlongs. He placed in two other stakes that year and earned \$184,415. He would prove to be even stronger at 3.

Second in the grade III Swale Stakes at seven furlongs at Gulf-

stream Park in mid-March 2003, he would then rattle off three successive stakes wins: the Lafayette Stakes (gr. III) at Keeneland; Churchill Downs' Matt Winn Stakes; then on Belmont Stakes day would rally to catch Midas Eyes by a nose in the sevenfurlong Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup Stakes (gr. II).

By summer's end Vinery had purchased an interest in Posse, and it was announced that would be his new home at the end of his racing career.

While he would record only one more victory, he did test the nation's best sprinters in four grade I events, finishing a good fourth in that year's Breeders' Cup Sprint in Southern California.

Posse would stand his first six seasons at stud at Vinery Kentucky near Lexington. to the recession.

He was among the leading thirdcrop sires in the fall of 2009 when it was announced he'd be moving to New York, and he's been the leading sire in the Empire State ever since.

### Speed to Lead

It's no surprise that as quick as Posse was on the track, that speed is

finding its way to his offspring. It's his body type and his pedigree, being a son of Silver Deputy, who has sired 88 stakes winners including 1998 2-year-old filly champion Silverbulletday. Silver Deputy is also the sire of Spring At Last, who ranks second nationally on the 2012 first-crop sire list by progeny earnings.

"What intrigues New York is speed," Hayden said. "I think they like Silver Deputy up here. He's a good outcross for a lot of mares, so he appeals to the masses. It's also a happening sire line right now."

Posse has sired 17 stakes winners and has a champion on his ledger in the form of Kodiak Kowboy, the Eclipse Award-winning sprinter of 2009 and Canadian champion 2-year-old male of 2007. Kodiak Kowboy won three grade I sprints during his championship season: the Carter Handicap, Vosburgh Stakes, and Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap. From a female family that boasts grade I winners West by West and Little Missouri, Kodiak

> Kowboy will soon begin his fourth year in Kentucky at WinStar Farm.

> Meanwhile at Vinery at Sugar Maple, Hayden is busy preparing for what figures to be a blockbuster breeding season with the explosion of the New York program. Posse, along with six other stallions, is on the roster this year.

> "The program is just great," Hayden said. "The awards are amazing as everyone knows. You can't afford not to be in the program. If you're in Kentucky, Florida, wherever you are, you don't have to put everything up here, but you need to have a few mares up here to take advantage of the program. It's hard enough to make money in this game, might as well take advantage of what you can when it's available."



Many of the new shooters are aware of the opportunities for breeders being created by added-money generated by the Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct, but Lizza saw opportunity in the Empire State well before the arrival of slot machines. Lizza, who lived in Rockaway, N.J., until his July 2011 death at age 73, registered his first victory as a Thoroughbred owner at Aqueduct in 1976. In 1989 he purchased the 800-acre Highcliff Farm near Delanson, N.Y., as his base for his extensive breeding operation.

In recent years Lizza bred and raced horses under the Flying Zee Stables banner. He finished as leading owner by wins in New York in 2004, 2005, and 2011. He finished in the top 10 of the owner's standings each year from 2004-11, and many of those horses were homebreds for the late owner of construction companies in New York and South Carolina.

Widow Viane maintained a scaled-down Flying Zee racing stable in 2012. Most of the Flying Zee race horses and mares were sold, but the family continues to stand Cosmonaut—a favorite of Viane's—who won multiple grade III stakes for Flying Zee. Cosmonaut stands at Highcliff Stallions at Mill Creek Farm, which is run by the longtime Highcliff managers, Suzie and Doc O'Cain.

The O'Cains enjoyed a close relationship with Lizza, Viane, and their family over the years in which Lizza's light blue Flying Zee Stables silks—adorned with the familiar

double zees-became a fixture at New York racetracks.

"He's been gone for 1½ years, and every time you look you see how well horses he bred or raced are still doing.

> It's amazing," said Suzie O'Cain. "I don't know how many owners are left like he was."

> Leading the way for Lizza as a breeder in 2012 were stakes winners Weekend Hideaway and Sportswriter.

> Sportswriter showed versatility in his 3-year-old season, winning the New York Stallion Series Stakes Thunder Rumble division on dirt at Aqueduct Nov. 14. That stakes was the final race of the season for the versatile Maybry's Boy gelding, who had earlier won the New York Stallion Series Stakes Cab Calloway division on the turf at Saratoga. Sportswriter also placed in four other stakes as he earned \$256,184 in 2012.

dispersal at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale. Trained by Rudy Rodriguez, Dubb and Michael Imperio campaigned Sportswriter in 2012. Javier Castellano guided him in both stakes wins.

After the Thunder Rumble, Rodriguez said it is clear Lizza bred a top New York-bred in Sportswriter, who is out of the Point Given mare Point Spread. Flying Zee had purchased Point Spread at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Calder select 2-year-old sale for \$185,000.

"He's been very good since we got him, and he's always trained very, very good," Rodriguez said after the Thunder Rumble. "We were very lucky to buy him. He's as solid as they come and tries every time. If they go easy on the lead, he can be on the lead, or he can stay behind.

In his 2-year-old season, Weekend Hideaway, by Speightstown, won three of five races including victories in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes at Belmont Park and the David Stakes at Saratoga. Weekend Hideaway earned a graded stakes-placing with his third-place finish in the sixfurlong Futurity (gr. II), before closing out the year with an easy, 2½-length score over other New York-bred juveniles in the sevenfurlong Bongard.

Red & Black Stable went to \$40,000 to land Weekend Hideaway at the Flying Zee Stables dispersal at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in October 2011. After the Bongard, winning trainer Philip Serpe, a long-time trainer for

Lizza, said the victory carried extra meaning because the horse was bred by the late owner.

"Fortunately, Mike Hoffman of Red & Black Stable stepped up and bought four of the yearlings (at the dispersal)," Serpe said. "This is one of them."

Lizza had purchased Weekend Hideaway's dam, Apocalyptical, by Wiseman's Ferry, for \$60,000 at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale. Weekend Hideaway is her first foal. Lizza campaigned dozens of stakes winners, notably Wayward Lass, who won the Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I) and grade I Coaching Club American Oaks and earned an Eclipse Award as the nation's top 3-year-old filly in 1981. Lizza also campaigned two-time grade I winner Noble Nashua. Other stakes winners include Street Game, Key Contender, Screen King, Thunder Achiever, I Lost My Choo, Golden Commander, and Keyin's Decision.



# **First FROST**

### Frost Giant's first crop sets record for earnings

BY TERESA GENARO



n Jan. 13, a chilled crowd gathered near the stallion barn at Keane Stud near Amenia, N.Y. A low gray sky and stubborn fog enshrouded the 275acre farm, dampness penetrating the jackets and fleeces of those who had come out to the farm's stallion show.

"We wish we could have had a warm and sunny day for you," Dr. Winslow Stevens, Keane's veterinarian and general manager, told those assembled near pastures dotted with vestiges of snow.

True, the visitors might have preferred warm and sunny to cold and cloudy, but there was something appropriate about the weather, given how many had made the trip to the Hudson Valley farm to see Frost Giant, who belied his name with a sizzling performance as a record-setting freshman sire.

Frost Giant's first crop of 2-year-

olds hit the races in 2012 and by year's end had set a record for progeny earnings for a New York-based freshman sire. From a crop of 31, his 15 runners produced 12 winners and two stakes winners for earnings of \$840,633.

It wasn't the year that his connections had anticipated.

Purchased for \$600,000 by Coolmore bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne at the 2004 Keeneland Septem-

ber yearling sale, the son of Giant's Causeway out of the Gone West mare Takesmybreathaway began his racing career abroad. He broke his maiden in his second start, going seven furlongs in the Killavullan Stakes (Ire-III) at Leopardstown, then notched a second group stakes victory, this one at 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles. At 3 he came to the United States to run in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational Stakes (gr. IT) for owners Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith, finishing fifth.

The chestnut colt made his next start in the Hollywood Derby (gr. IT), for new owners: IEAH Stables et al. Among the "et al." was Andrew Cohen, at the time a relative newcomer to racing.

Through the next two years Frost Giant won on turf and on dirt. He was unable to duplicate his European stakes success until July 2008, when at age 5 and at odds of 40-1, he upset the 10-furlong Suburban Handicap (gr. I), coming back in the stretch in a gutsy, half-length victory.

"That was when things got interesting," said Cohen.

When Frost Giant was retired several months later, Cohen bought out the other partners to gain sole ownership, asking Eric Bishop to manage the horse's stallion career. Bishop

accepted enthusiastically.

"I said I'd get involved because I'm a believer in Frost Giant," he said. "I love his bloodlines, and I've always looked at horses that have stamina and turf over sprinting types."

Despite his keenness, Bishop knew success with a new sire wasn't going to be easy. He and Cohen expected to wait several years before seeing any success.

"As a stallion owner, doing it by yourself, you have to wait for the

2-year-olds to hit the ground running, and we didn't anticipate Frost Giant's offspring lighting up the track at 2; we were thinking they'd be better at 3 and going farther," said Bishop.

"I've never been so happy to be so wrong."

Cohen is no stranger to racing success. In addition to Frost Giant's Suburban, he and IEAH won six other grade/group I races between March and August 2008: the Gulf News Dubai Golden Shaheen with Benny the Bull; the Maker's Mark Mile with Kip Deville; and the Florida Derby, Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands, Preakness Stakes, and Haskell Invitational Stakes with Big Brown, in whose stallion career Cohen retains an ownership interest.

While his race record will never have the prestige of his dual classicwinning stablemate, Frost Giant does have bragging rights on the freshman sire list. His earnings were good enough to rank him sixth nationally among first-crop sires; Big Brown came in at No. 11 with \$588,363 from more than twice as many runners (33 to Frost Giant's 15).

Among Frost Giant's standouts in 2012 were West Hills Giant and Kelli Got Frosty, both winners of stakes races for New York-breds. West Hills

Giant is his sire's top money earner with \$192,153, boosted by a victory in the \$247,338 New York Breeders' Futurity.

Kelli Got Frosty is close behind with earnings of \$175,944 off three wins from five starts, including victories in the New York Stallion Series and East View stakes. She's expected to make her next start in open company, but according to Cohen and Bishop, she won't stray far from home.

"I grew up around New York racing," said Cohen. "I'm from Brooklyn, and I love New York and New York racing."

Cohen owns both West Hills Giant and Kelli Got Frosty in partnership, and he'll continue to breed his own mares to Frost Giant this year; he expects to send 10 mares to Keane in 2013, keeping some foals to race while sending others to the sales.

Thirty-four of Frost Giant's progeny have so far been offered at auction; 25 have sold, for an average of \$29,000. The highest price came last year at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds when Winter Wish sold for \$100,000 to Jim and Susan Hill.

Trainer Dominic Galluscio has two Frost Giant fillies in his barn, both stakes-placed. He's pointing Nonnie Connie and Zekes Surprise to New

York-bred allowance races this winter and targeting state-bred stakes races later in the spring.

"They're both very willing, very eager horses," said Galluscio. "It honestly surprised me. Any time you deal with a freshman sire you're a little wary, to see if they'll come out running early."

Zekes Surprise sold for \$23,000 as a yearling at the Saratoga New Yorkbred preferred sale; out of the Marquetry mare Marquet Rate, she was purchased by Anthony Melfi and has already earned \$58,700.

Nonnie Connie (out of Sly Isabella, by Majestic Light) failed to meet her reserve at the Saratoga sale but was

purchased by Winning Move Stable as a 2-year-old last April at Ocala for \$82,000; she's earned \$55,180 in four starts.

After beginning his career at Empire Stud, which was later sold to Vinery, Frost Giant moved to Keane last fall, where he'll stand for \$7,500 in 2013, a \$2,500 increase from last year. He's already booked to approximately 60 mares, doubling his previous contracts.

"He'll have a huge surge in quality mares this year," said Keane's Stevens. "I'll be surprised if we don't get to 100 mares."

Cohen said his stallion is attracting interest from all over the country and abroad; he's considering a deal that will send Frost Giant to Australia for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season.

For now, though, he's enjoying Frost Giant's success and looking forward to seeing his 2013 foals drop this spring, as well as to the continued success of Kelli Got Frosty, West Hills Giant, and the rest of the stallion's impressive first crop as they make their first starts as 3-year-olds.

Former jockey Richard Migliore, who hosted the Keane Stud stallion show, thinks their best performances may be yet to come.

"Frost Giant did his best running as an older horse," he observed, "so the thought that his offspring will get better with age, as precocious as they were at 2, is almost scary."




