

On the Western Front

THE FOLLOWING TEXT is a letter that has been sent to each member of the New York State Legislature and to each member of the New York State Gaming Commission stressing the importance of the purse structure and racing in general at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack in western New York. Racing at FLGR is vital to the well-being of the horsemen and breeders in New York State, and any negative impact to the racing product would be detrimental to the New York-bred program.

Dear Member of the Legislature:

The New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. (NYTB) is deeply concerned about the Gaming Facility Location Board's preliminary recommendation to place the Lago Casino & Resort in Tyre, N.Y. NYTB is concerned about the potential impact on the purses at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack and on the NYS Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund ("Fund") if a casino is located in Tyre.

NYTB is the official authorized representative of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in New York State; the unified voice of Thoroughbred breeders in the State of New York for purposes of communicating the advantages and rewards of breeding Thoroughbreds in the State and for the purposes of conducting and coordinating activities with breeding and racing associations and agencies. Additionally, NYTB lends its support to activities which aid in the development of the breeding and racing industries in New York State in particular, and the nation in general.

The negative impact that Lago Casino will have on the Thoroughbred racing industry is immeasurable. Simply put, Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack is vital to the survival of the horse racing industry of New York State.

As you know, the casino-enabling legislation

provides that if a casino is located in a region that also has a racino, the competing casino must guarantee the gaming revenue at the 2013 levels for the horsemen and breeders at the racino track. Due to the exclusivity zone, Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack is not in a region where a casino can be located. It would, however, be the closest racino should a Finger Lakes-region casino be built. This means that, even though a Finger Lakes Casino in Tyre will certainly negatively impact gaming revenues, there is no statutory obligation for that competing casino to honor the "hold harmless" provision that would otherwise protect Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack. Without such a guarantee, it is very likely that in a short period of time it would close its operations, jeopardizing the well-being of the horsemen and breeders in the State.

As stated, the health of Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack is critically important to Thoroughbred breeders and horsemen. The statistics tell the story. In 2013, New York-breds were responsible for 71% of the total starts at Finger Lakes and earned 75% of all purse money distributed, winning 76% of the 1,456 races run. Furthermore, races at Finger Lakes generated 52% of the number of breeder awards paid by the Fund in 2013. Therefore, the purse structure and awards at Finger Lakes is central to the New York Thoroughbred Breeding Program.

As promised by the Thoroughbred industry, the influx of VLT revenue has revolutionized the New York purse structure and the Fund incentives, making New York the preeminent place to be for all sectors of the Thoroughbred industry. The New York-bred foal crop continues to grow, New York-bred sales continue to rise, farms are opening in the state, and industry participants from



Kentucky, Florida, and all across America are coming to New York to breed and race. Lastly, the New York-bred program is producing more quality runners than ever before as evidenced by grade I stakes wins and participation in the Breeders' Cup.

The infusion of Video Lottery Terminal revenue from Aqueduct and Finger Lakes has revived New York's racing and agricultural industries, preserving greenspace and creating jobs. Preserving this revenue stream for the Thoroughbred industry as the State heads toward full-scale casino gaming is critical to continued success and further growth.

In 2012 the New York State Equine Industry Economic Impact Study determined that the equine industry has a \$4.2 billion effect on the State's economy and contributes to the local economies of every one of New York's 62 counties by generating \$187 million in state and local taxes. The industry also preserves 1.3 million acres of precious farmland in our state. In addition to the 2,300 breeding, training, and racing facilities across the state devoted to Standardbreds and Thoroughbreds, there are 23,000 family-owned farms and stables.

Most important, New York equine industry generates 33,000 full-time jobs. Every 100 racehorses are responsible for the creation of 80 jobs. Enclosed you will find this study outlining these positive economic developments.

NYTB is not taking any formal position about who should be awarded a casino license, but wants to ensure that if a casino in Tyre is approved, a mechanism should be put in place to hold the Thoroughbred racing industry interests in the area surrounding the casino harmless.

Please contact me if you have any questions about the Thoroughbred industry's concern about the prospect of a casino being built in the Finger Lakes region and the imperative necessity that, if a casino should be built in the region, that Finger Lakes Raceway & Casino be held harmless.

As a member of the Legislature and supporter of the State's racing and gaming industry, you will, I hope, ensure that intent of the casino legislation to hold the Thoroughbred industry harmless is realized.

DAYATTHESPA EARNS ECLIPSE AS TOP TURF FEMALE

ayatthespa, the first New York-bred to win a grade I Breeders' Cup World Championships race, continued the dream run for her owners when she was named the Eclipse Award winner for top turf female Jan. 17 at Gulfstream Park.

Pete Bradley was specifically looking for New York-breds when shopping the 2-year-old sales back in 2011 because the casino bill had passed the New York legislature and racing and breeding in the state were about to experience significant upticks. Bradley Thoroughbreds, Steve Laymon, and Ron and Jerry Frankel ultimately partnered in the ownership of Dayatthespa.

"It was a happy occasion and a wonderful conclusion to the career of a mare of a lifetime," Laymon said of the Eclipse Awards ceremony at Gulfstream Park. "It was a celebration of her, allowing us to come together and have a good time based on her career. I was at every one of her races," said the North Carolina-based optometrist. "I found a way to be there.

"Being the first (gr. I) New York-bred Breeders' Cup winner is such an honor. That's something that will always stand. We'd love to get a race named after her. She's got the right name for it (named after Saratoga Race Course).

My wife came up with the name and said in exchange for that she wanted a day at the spa. I told her she could sit in our box at Saratoga any time she wanted to."

Added Bradley, "The Eclipse ceremony couldn't have been any more fun. It's extremely special to be honored with a champion. You have to work hard, and you also have to get lucky to get a filly like that. She took us on quite an exceptional journey. We sort of expected it (the Eclipse) because she dominated the division late in the season, but still it's a relief when you hear her name called. You get up on the stage and all of a sudden you realize you have a champion."

INTERNATIONAL STAR RISES IN GRADE III LECOMTE

For the second consecutive year, Ken and Sarah Ramsey have a Lecomte Stakes (gr. III) winner with whom to pursue the classics. Last year it was Louisiana-bred Vicar's in Trouble. This year New York-bred International Star took the \$200,000, mile and 70-yard Lecomte at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

The 3-year-old son of Fusaichi Pegasus—Parlez, by French Deputy, was bottled up early along the fence, but once he found running room was able to draw clear in the stretch, topping War Story by 2½ lengths. The 9-1 chance got the trip in 1:43.62 under jockey Miguel Mena.

The Lecomte winner—a grade
III winner last year in Canada—was
bred by Marylanders Katharine Voss



and Bob Manfuso, who operate Chanceland Farm near West Friendship west of Baltimore just off I-70. They sold him to the Ramseys through Patrice Miller/EQB, agent, for \$85,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall yearling sale.

"He was just a really nice colt—you couldn't find anything wrong with him," Voss said. "He's a well-balanced

horse. He's not too big; just a nicely put together horse.

"We have a good relationship with (Dr.) Doug Koch (veterinarian and former president of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders) and for several years we'd send a couple of mares to New York," Voss said. "We sent two mares up each year for a few years. We figured a New York-bred Fusaichi Pegasus would be worth more than a Maryland-bred Fusaichi Pegasus. We bred the mare back to Girolamo, who was in his first year there in New York. We love him, so that was kind of killing two birds with one stone."

Now a two-time graded stakes winner, International Star has earned \$320,979 with three wins and two seconds from seven starts.

The New York Thoroughbred Breeders announced the nominees for the New York-bred divisional champions of 2014. New York Turf writers, handicappers, chart callers, and racing analysts will vote on the winners in each division. The voters will also choose the 2014 New York-bred Horse of the Year.

The 2014 New York-bred divisional champions and Horse of the Year will be announced at NYTB's annual awards banquet Monday, April 6, at the Saratoga National Golf Club in Saratoga Springs. Also to be honored at the banquet will be champion steeplechase horse, broodmare of the year, champion trainer, champion jockey, and outstanding breeder.

NY-bred Thunder Rumble Dies at 26

New York-bred millionaire and Travers Stakes (gr. I) winner Thunder Rumble died Jan. 6 following complications from an episode of colic at Old Friends at Cabin Creek: The Bobby Frankel Division near Greenfield Center, N.Y. The son of Thunder Puddles was 26.

Out of the Lyphard mare Lyphette, Thunder Rumble was bred by Dr. Konrad Widmer and raced under the Braeburn Farm name (Widmer and his daughter Ursula).

Thunder Rumble, who was trained for the majority of his career by the late Richard O'Connell, captured three stakes races in the winter and early spring of 1992 at Aqueduct before a virus sent him to the sidelines during the classics. He returned for the major summer events at Saratoga Race Course, sweeping the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II) and the Travers.

An injury sustained while finishing seventh in the 1992 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) cost Thunder Rumble the 1993 season. He returned in 1994 to win the \$150,000 Saratoga Cup Handicap, retiring at the end of that season with eight wins from 19 starts and earnings of \$1,047,552. At the time of his retirement, he was the second-leading New York-bred earner of all time behind only Irish classic winner Fourstars Allstar.

Thunder Rumble entered stud in New York, where he stood his first four seasons before moving to Albemarle Stud near Free Union, Va. He returned to New York in 2002 to stand at Keane Stud near Amenia, until he was pensioned in 2006. He arrived at Old Friends at Cabin Creek, a satellite for Georgetown, Ky.-based retirement organization Old Friends, in December 2009.

Thunder Rumble has sired 56 winners that have earned more than \$3.9 million combined, led by stakes winner Frisky Thunder and stakes-placed On the Fan, Rumbling Girl, Deputy Shaker, Burning Rambo, December Thunder, and The Roscoe Rumble. He also sired Dominican Republic champion Real Charmer.

Thunder Rumble was buried at Old Friends at Cabin Creek.

"He was the most magnificent stallion I have ever met and am so thankful to have known him and loved him," Cabin Creek's JoAnn Pepper wrote on the farm's Facebook page. "He is buried here, in his favorite place, under his pines. Be free, my friend, till we meet again."

NEW YORK-BREDS COME UP BIG AT KEENELAND JANUARY SALE

Led by a Harlan's Holiday colt who commanded \$185,000 during the sale's opening session Jan. 12, New York-bred short yearlings made a strong showing at Keeneland's four-day January sale, not only outperforming their counterparts in the same sale last year but also doing better this year than the yearling population sale-wide.

In all, 24 of 36 New York-bred yearlings offered were reported as sold for an average of \$32,767 and a median of \$19,500. While the average represents a 22.1% increase over their 2013 average at the same venue (\$26,873), more importantly, both average and median outperformed the results for the overall yearling segment. For the sale 324 yearlings sold for an average of \$31,847 with a median of \$15,000.

The top New York-bred yearling was Hip 344, a dark bay or brown colt bred by Dr. Jonathan Davis' Milfer Farm near Unadilla, who sold to L & D Bloodstock from the Legacy Bloodstock consignment. The colt is out of Kaileysgal, a mare purchased by Milfer Farm in foal at the 2013 Keeneland November sale for \$105,000. A placed daughter of Unbridled's Song, Kaileysgal is out of Warside, a graded stakes-placed multiple black-type winner by Lord At War who is the dam of the Cat Thief stakes winner Tensas Cat.

North Face Bloodstock went to \$90,000 to procure a son of City Zip—Exclusive Woman, by Cat Thief, who was bred by Barry R. Ostrager and consigned by Pope McLean, agent. Ken and Sarah Ramsey purchased a son of first-crop sire Bodemeister out of Eleganter, by A.P. Indy, from James M. Herbener Jr., agent, for \$75,000. He was bred by Eaton & Thorne.

WEEKEND HIDEAWAY ZIPS IN FLORIDA SUNSHINE MILLIONS SPRINT

With Gulfstream Park's Florida Sunshine Millions program opened to horses bred in Florida, New York, Pennsylvania, and Maryland, trainer Phil Serpe thought the \$100,000 Sprint Stakes at six furlongs would be just right for Red and Black Stable's Weekend Hideaway. The 5-year-old son of Speightstown obliged Jan. 17 with a resounding four-length victory under Javier Castellano.

After stalking 4-5 favorite Happy My Way through an opening quarter-mile in :22.76 and a half-mile in :44.96, Weekend Hideaway began his winning bid at the top of the stretch and took command with a furlong to go, drawing off in 1:08.64. Grand Shores got up for second with Happy My Way holding for third.

Serpe explained that as soon as he heard about the expanded en-

tries for the Millions, it seemed like the right move: "It was kind of a no-brainer. We were actually looking for a spot for him. It all worked out well for us."

Weekend Hideaway is now a five-time stakes winner with a record of seven wins, three seconds, and three thirds from 20 starts and earnings of \$507,332.

Bred by the late Carl Lizza's Flying Zee Stables, for whom Serpe was a longtime trainer, and foaled at Highcliff Farm



near Delanson, Weekend Hideaway is the first foal and only starter out of Apocalyptical, an unplaced New York-bred daughter of Wiseman's Ferry. Weekend Hideaway was purchased by Michael Hoffman's Red and Black Stable for \$40,000 in the yearling portion of the Flying Zee dispersal in October 2011.

DONALD NEWMAN DIES AT 85

Longtime Thoroughbred breeder/owner Donald Newman, of Roslyn, N.Y., died Dec. 23, 2014, after a brief illness. He was 85.

Newman was a sportswear manufacturer who purchased his first racehorse in 1974. He subsequently went on to campaign a number of stakes horses, including Mucchina, winner of the 1978 Ashland Stakes (gr. III) at Keeneland, First and Only, who took the 1993 Longfellow Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Monmouth, and So N So, winner of Saratoga's Lucy Scribner Stakes in 2009.

Among the trainers he employed through the years were Tom Bush, Jose Martin, Hall of Famer Frank "Pancho" Martin, and most recently, Carlos Martin.

His horse racing legacy will be carried on by his family, according to his his son, Richard.

"In the past few years he concentrated on breeding New York-breds, so we have a number of homebreds that are getting ready to run," said Richard Newman.

Newman is survived by his wife, Gail; a daughter, Rebecca, and two other sons, Matthew and Adam.

Willet Wins the Interborough

Willet kicked off her 7-year-old campaign by posting her fifth career stakes victory, and the first New York-bred stakes score of the year, when she won Aqueduct's \$100,000 Interborough Stakes Jan. 17 for older fillies and mares.

The daughter of Jump Start got back to the winner's circle for the first time since topping state-breds in a conditioned allowance sprint at Saratoga last July 30. Since that victory she had put up a series of strong performances behind female sprinter Eclipse Award finalist Artemis Agrotera in two graded races and finished second to New York-bred graded stakes winner La Verdad in the Iroquois Stakes on Empire Showcase Day.

Willet races for James Iselin, David and Charlotte Assoulin, and Eli Gindi.

Breaking from post three (of six) as the 2-1 favorite, Willet was reserved early while Bridge-hampton carved out early fractions of :22.57 for the opening quarter and :45.41 for the half.

Willet swung widest of all at the head of the stretch and steadily picked off rivals under Irad Ortiz Jr., eventually getting to the wire $1^{1}/2$ lengths ahead of Aireofdistinction. The final time was 1:10.65.

Only three times out of the top three in 23 starts, Willet's record stands at 9-7-4 with earnings of \$746,900.

Bred by the late Michael T. Martin and foaled at Highcliff Farm near Delanson, Willet is out of Katina K, a winning daughter of Distinctive Pro out of New York-bred grade III winner Darlin Momma. Katina K's most recent reported foal is a yearling filly by Majestic Warrior.





DISCO RICO — 1997-2014

New York stallion Disco Rico was euthanized Dec. 18, 2014, after fighting a battle with laminitis for a couple of years.

"He had such a will to live; it was amazing," said owner Joe DiRico of the 17-year-old Disco Rico. The multiple graded stakes winner had repeatedly fought back from close calls with the disease particularly over the past year.

"I thought we would lose him three months ago, so I went to visit him and gave him peppermints and carrots, and we just hung out," DiRico said. "When I got home, the vet

called me and said he had improved and was walking much better."

The son of Citidancer—Round It Off, by Apalachee, was deeply admired and respected by DiRico, who bought the colt with his father, Alfred, as a 2-year-old for \$82,000 at the 1999 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-olds in training sale.

Disco Rico would go on to win nine of 17 starts and finish in the top three 15 times. He won seven stakes, including the Maryland Breeders' Cup Handicap (gr. III) at Pimlico Race Course and the Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup Stakes (gr. III) at Monmouth Park. He also placed third in the grade II General George Handicap and second in the grade III Amsterdam Stakes. The colt retired after three seasons of racing with \$532,244 in earnings.

"On race day he'd sit in the corner of his stall and have his game face on," DiRico said. "You didn't dare go by his webbing or he'd charge you."

DiRico had Disco Rico enter stud in Maryland, where he had been bred by C. Oliver Goldsmith. He stood at Murmur Farm for six years.

"He was such a gentleman in the breeding shed," DiRico said. "When he was at Murmur Farm in Maryland in 2002, the first mare he covered he licked for about 30 minutes. Boy, he was in love. He didn't cover the mare, so they took him back to the barn where he went nuts knocking all of the buckets around in his stall. She was the love of his life!"

DiRico moved Disco Rico to Keane Stud near Amenia in 2008 based on the growing state-bred program. Out of 190 starters, Disco Rico sired 11 stakes winners and 24 stakes horses.

His most successful progeny included multiple stakes winners At the Disco, who was his leading earner with \$545,658, and six-time stakes winner Pure Disco. Both were homebreds raced by Patricia Generazio.

"The horse never owed me anything," said DiRico. "He was a cool horse. He liked jelly and lemon donuts, and he liked to drink beer. My trainer could lie on his stomach when he was resting. They are all heartbroken at Keane."



Freud, a fixture in New York for a decade, is the leading sire of 2014 **FREUD, AN IMPORTANT SIRE IN NEW YORK BREEDING** since he covered his first mare in 2002 at Sequel Stallions New York, earned his second leading sire title in the Empire State in 2014, adding to the championship he earned in 2008 when he had only four crops of racing age.

In the five years between titles, he finished second by progeny earnings four times and third once, in 2012. Three of those sire titles went to Posse, who had previously stood in Kentucky. Bluegrass Cat, last year's leading sire, also had Kentucky-bred foals on the track while taking the top prize.

Freud wasn't a killer on the racecourse—he won only one of 12 starts racing in Europe—but he packed a genetic punch. By Storm Cat out of Mariah's Storm, by Rahy, Freud is a younger full brother to Giant's Causeway, the "Iron Horse" of 2000 and a three-time leading sire in North America. Giant's Causeway stands at Ashford Stud in Central Kentucky for \$85,000.

While obviously sharing the same genes, they are different types of stallions, providing different traits to their offspring.

"Freud can throw much more of a Storm Cat appearance into his foals," said Becky Thomas, who has stood Freud at her Sequel Stallions since the start. "His progeny all have really good hips and good balance. I hate to use the word 'sprinter,' and Freud is not a 'sprinter' sire even though his babies can win at 5½ furlongs, but they have more of a Storm Cat look to them than the ones by Giant's Causeway.

"Giant's Causeway's offspring have more of a two-turn, leaner look that is more representative of the Rahy and Blushing Groom lines," Thomas said. "They just don't have as strong a hip overall."

Freud was bred by Orpendale, an arm of the Coolmore operation,

Freud's leading earner in 2014 was the grade III-winning New York-bred Lubash

and was raced by the Coolmore team of Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier. However, with his weak race record Freud wasn't cut out to start a stallion career in Ireland and Kentucky. The New York breeding program was "something

new and interesting for Coolmore to try," according to Thomas and after several negotiation meetings with Coolmore's Paul Shanahan, they gave Sequel a try.

Whereas Thomas partnered with Coolmore early, over time shareholders have purchased the majority of Freud.

It's a venture that has proved to be worthwhile. And as popular as he has been in New York, Freud has been able to step outside his regional market and is one of the few non-Kentucky-based sires to have shuttled to the Southern Hemisphere. In 2010 and 2013 Freud covered mares at La Leyenda in Argentina.

In New York, Freud delivered three stakes winners in his first crop and five from his second crop. With the New York Racing Association's racing program providing a significant amount of turf racing at all three of its tracks, Freud's runners had ample opportunity to shine...and they have.

Freud is the sire of 41 stakes winners. His leading earners have come from his grade I winners: Giant Ryan, a foal of 2006, and Franny Freud, from his 2007 group. In 2014 his leading earner was Aliyu Ben J Stables' homebred Lubash, who earned \$311,720 while winning four

times and running second three times in seven starts. Lubash has earned \$1,010,599 during his racing career.

A turf specialist for trainer Christophe Clement, Lubash was second in the one-mile Kingston Stakes and 1½-mile West Point Stakes for state-breds before topping King Kreesa by a neck in the nine-furlong Ashley T. Cole Stakes at Belmont. Second on Showcase Day in the Mohawk Stakes on the turf, Lubash finished the year on a high note with a big win against open company in the Tropical Turf Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Gulfstream Park West.

Lubash is a typical hard-knocking Freud runner...a horse who has been racing since he was 3 and was still going strong at 7 in 2014.

"Freud is popular as a breed-back stallion, but he is also popular with the guys in New York who breed to race," Thomas said. "He's their guy. With the breeders' awards, here's a stallion whose runners win at 2 and 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7."

And the stallion and breeders awards help the whole program go, and Freud is a poster child for the state's industry.

"He's popular," Thomas said. "It's been important for the New York breeders to show what he's brought in in stallion awards... and, of course, they don't earn anything unless they are one, two, or three (in a race). The awards have been a factor that has influ-

enced a lot of breeders from outside the state to come and look at the program.

"Many, many times you shouldn't say 'horse' and 'business' in the same sentence," she continued. "There are lots of people who learn that the hard way, but there are also a lot of people that do make their living in this business. I look at that and that is why we breed in New York. The business of breeding horses here makes sense with the program we have."

And for New Yorkers, breeding to Freud continues to make sense. His fee for 2015 will be \$10,000.

NEW YORK-BREDS AT AUCTION

Looking Below the Surface

In reviewing the final auction figures for 2014, it may appear as those interest in New York-bred weanlings and yearlings was flat, but that was hardly the case. While the average price of a state-bred sale weanling declined 5.5% from \$33,590 to \$31,740, and the average New York-bred yearling fell 4.6% form \$52,293 to \$50,068, the medians in both categories remained the same and the average price of a state-bred sale 2-year-old rose 9% from \$51,202 to \$55,949. In both the weanling and yearling stats the numbers sold declined.

The figures point strong demand for the finished product—the juvenile ready to go into training—and that breeders weren't willing to part easily with their younger New York-breds, knowing their value will rise as they get closer to the racetrack.

Upstart kicks off his 3-year-old campaign with a 5½-length romp in the Holy Bull A YEAR AGO SAMRAAT and Uncle Sigh carried the banner for the New York-bred program on the Triple Crown trail, making their way to Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May. This year two New York-breds have made waves in the 3-year-old ranks...in January.

On Jan. 17 International Star won the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots. On Jan. 24 Ralph M. Evans' Upstart ran away with the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) at Gulfstream Park.

Upstart was making his seasonal bow after a super juvenile campaign that saw the son of Flatter break his maiden at first asking at Saratoga in mid August, top state-breds in the \$196,000 Funny Cide Stakes on Saratoga Showcase Day at the Spa, and run second to Daredevil in the Champagne Stakes (gr. I). Tested against the best 2-year-olds in training, Upstart ran a solid third in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Santa Anita Nov. 1 in his seasonal finale.

Upstart came into the \$400,000 race for Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I)-minded sophomores after putting in a strong six-furlong move in 1:12 Jan. 18 at Palm Meadows, a work that told his trainer, Rick Violette Jr., he was ready to roll after his 84-day break.

Bet down to 2-1 second choice at post time behind 3-2 favorite Frosted, Upstart was reunited with regular rider Jose Ortiz.

Though forwardly placed from post eight (of nine) after the break, Upstart was still hung three-wide through the first turn, as he tracked Bluegrass Singer and First Down through a moderate opening quarter mile of :24.52 and a half-mile in :48.82. After First Down weakened, Upstart drew even with Bluegrass Singer and gained the lead through the turn, entering the lane in full control.

Upstart drew off confidently in the stretch to a 5½-length victory. Godolphin Racing's Frosted, who was bumped at the break and raced in fourth early, finished well for second while Bluegrass Singer held for third. After six furlongs in 1:12.49 and a mile in 1:37.06, the final time for the 1½6 miles was 1:43.61.

"The horse broke very well, and I was in the position where Rick (Violette) and I planned to be," Ortiz said. "It was perfect. By the half-mile pole, I let him go and said, 'Let's see what we have here,' and when we turned for home, we rolled.

"He jumped into the bit, and I knew he was ready," Ortiz said. "I want to

congratulate Rick and the owner. Rick did a tremendous job, and I want to thank them for giving me the opportunity to ride this amazing horse. When I saw him today in the paddock, I was very surprised because he looked so much bigger and so much stronger. I think he wants to go a mile and a quarter, so we will hopefully make the Kentucky Derby with him."

Violette's first reaction was, "I thought it (the pace) would be much quicker. But one speed horse scratched (Dom the Bomb) and Kiaran (McLaughlin)'s horse (Frosted) was between a rock and a hard place. They were coming off the bench, too. When they went :24, I said, 'We're in a good spot.' When they went :48, I said, 'We're in exactly the right spot.' You couldn't have asked for a better ride."

Violette, who trained Samraat to the Run for the Roses last year off wins in the Withers and Gotham (both gr. III) stakes at Aqueduct, has a clear game plan for Upstart.

"That's one of the advantages of running today—you have two weeks to play with," he said. "We can go up to the Gotham (March 7 at Aqueduct) or we can come back here in four weeks in the (Besilu Stables) Fountain of Youth (Stakes, gr. II, Feb. 21). There is a cushion there if we came off the bench a little strong. We got some points today. If we ran in the Withers (Feb. 7 at Aqueduct), we would have been locked in to four weeks, four weeks, four weeks, and there is no

wiggle room. So this is a good spot.

"It could be that we'll stay here (for the grade I, \$1 million Besilu Stables Florida Derby March 28) to give us the extra two weeks going into the (Kentucky) Derby," Violette continued. "That might be the thing to do. It's nice to have that option."

From his three wins, a second and

third in five starts, Upstart has earned \$701,880.

Upstart was purchased by Evans on Violette's advice at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale from the Summerfield consignment for \$130,000.

"He just had a great shoulder, really well-balanced," Violette said last summer at Saratoga. "He looked like he was going to be a decent size, and he's actually gotten bigger than we anticipated. He was pretty correct; he had a decent family. As they say 'he checked all the boxes,' which he did."

"He's New York-bred, so that clearly was the hook. I liked the pedigree," the 77-year-old Evans said. "I generally pick out 10 pedigrees that I like that I think I can afford. Rick goes to the sales, and I frequently go with him. Generally speaking, the ones that I pick out don't pass muster with him.

"This particular horse, I liked the pedigree, and it was one of the rare horses Rick liked as well. Clearly, I never would buy a horse without Rick and the vet in agreement."

A Cleveland native, Evans became successful working on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange. He began owning horses in the mid 1960s.

Bred by Mrs. Gerald A. Nielsen and foaled at her Sunnyfield Farm near Bedford, Upstart is the first winner for his dam Party Silks, an unraced daughter of Touch Gold also bred by Nielsen.

Party Silks, a half sister to grade II stakes winner Josh's Madelyn (by Ouiet American). was produced from the stakes-placed Housebuster mare Intend to Win, whom the Nielsens purchased for \$120,000 the at 2001 Keeneland November breeding stock sale in foal to Honour and Glory.

Intend to Win was another in a long line of stakes-producing horses tracing to 1955 Italian champion 3-year-old filly Theodorica (by Owen Tudor), who won the Oaks d'Italia, Gran Premio d'Italia, Premio del Piazzale, and Premio Regina Elena (Italian One Thousand Guineas). Intently (by Drone), the second dam of Party Silks, not only won stakes but produced grade III winner Gone for Real (by Gone West) and stakes winner Crafty Buzz (by Crafty Prospector).

The mating of the Touch Gold mare with Flatter that produced Upstart is another in a long line of successful horses bred on the cross of A.P. Indy with Deputy Minister. Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Touch Gold is a son of Deputy Minister while Flatter is a son of Belmont Stakes winner A.P. Indy.

With the victory in the Holy Bull, Upstart moved into third place in the "Road to the Kentucky Derby" points standings with 16, behind El Kabeir and International Star, who are tied with 21 points.



First-Year Stallions of 2015: Central Banker and Honorable Dillon

In the January edition of New York Breeder, first-year stallions Alpha and Willcox Inn were featured. This month it's Central Banker and Honorable Dillon.

LIKE ALL OTHER STALLION MARKETS, New York's depends on both a core of stallions from solidly fashionable lines and stallions that represent possible outcross lines or the "new kids in town." This year the state is adding two first-year sires that fall in the latter category: Central Banker, whose sire Speightstown is working on establishing his own branch of Mr. Prospector's line through Gone West, and Honorable Dillon, a son of the red-hot Tapit. Both were speedy horses who should add some zip to New York pedigrees.

Bred for speed, Central Banker delivered during his racing career. He registered a Beyer Speed Figure of 107 while winning the 2014 Churchill Downs Stakes (gr. II), defeating grade I winners Shakin It Up and Sahara Sky. He also won the Smirnoff Sorbet Quick Call Stakes going 5½ furlongs on the turf at Saratoga and placed in the 2013 Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) and Malibu Stakes (gr. I). He will stand at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds at an advertised fee of \$7,500.

"Speed is really the biggest selling point for this horse," said John McMahon, the

farm manager and son of owners Joe and Anne McMahon. "We feel very lucky to have him as he was the focus of a lot of interest when he sold at Keeneland November last fall (for \$400,000). He's a beautiful, well-balanced individual, correct, and with a powerful shoulder and hip. He's not an extreme in anything, so he should be a good physical fit for a lot of the mare population."

Central Banker draws much of his speed from Speightstown, the champion sprinter of 2004. A top-10 sire for the last five years, Speightstown is represented at stud by grade I winners Haynesfield, a freshman sire of 2015; Jersey Town, whose first foals are now yearlings; and Poseidon's Warrior, whose first foals are arriving this year. He is also represented by grade II winner Munnings, who finished fourth among 2014's freshman sires.

Central Banker's maternal connections also suggest speed. He is a half brother to Gantry (by Pulpit), whose seven stakes wins include the 2012 Smile Sprint Handicap (gr. II), and to multiple stakesplaced Song of Pirates (by Unbridled's Song). Their dam Rhum could also run, winning the listed Rosenna Stakes at Delaware Park and the Ticonderoga Handicap for New York-breds at Belmont Park as a 5-year-old. She is a half sister to 2002 Arkansas Derby (gr. II) winner Private Emblem and to four stakes-placed runners.

While Central Banker has plenty of zip in his pedigree, he also has Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Go for Gin as his maternal grandsire and Halo as sire of his second dam.

These elements suggest that, like his sire, he should be able to blend his speed with more stamina-oriented mates to get horses that can carry their speed beyond sprint distances.

Central Banker is inbred 4x4 to Storm Bird, and this suggests that other branches of Northern Dancer arising from E.P. Taylor's breeding program—Nijinsky II, Vice Regent, and The Minstrel may work well with him, as these horses all had significant genetic overlap on the dam's side of their pedigrees. Of these, Vice Regent (particularly the Deputy Minister branch) looks most promising. Other strains of Northern Dancer that have worked well with multiple elements in Central Banker's pedigree include Danzig, Lyphard, Sadler's Wells, Sovereign Dancer, and (to a lesser extent) Dixieland Band and Nureyev. Rather surprisingly, Speightstown has been doing well with inbreeding back to Storm Cat, so this may be another possible angle.

Generally speaking, Speightstown has not crossed well back over his own male line of Mr. Prospector, but because of favorable crosses with other elements in his pedigree, Central Banker may work with mares returning Mr. Prospector through Forty Niner, Seeking the Gold, Gulch (particularly via Thunder Gulch), Kingmambo, Conquistador Cielo, and Fappiano. Other bloodlines that have combined favorably with multiple elements in Central Banker's pedigree include those of Caro, Seattle Slew, Stop the Music (particularly through Cure the Blues), Buckpasser, Relaunch, Blushing Groom (particularly through Mt. Livermore), Holy Bull, and possibly Roberto. Inbreeding to Secretariat has been working well with Speightstown, and inbreeding to Halo or His Majesty may also be viable provided the conformation match with the mare is good.


Honorable Dillon won only one stakes, but in taking the 2013 Hutcheson Stakes (gr. II) he defeated a solid field that included present or future graded stakes winners Forty Tales, Undrafted, Singanothersong, Pataky Kid, and Really Sharp. The only other horses in the race, Merit Man, became a grade I-placed multiple listed stakes winner and Weekend Hideaway, a multiple stakes winner with a grade II placing. Honorable Dillon will stand his first season at Rockridge Stud at an advertised fee of \$5,000 and is the first graded stakes winner by Tapit to stand in New York.

"Honorable Dillon is a very well-balanced horse and has a laid-back disposition," said Rockridge Stud owner Lere Visagie. "He should suit a good variety of mares, particularly those from the Storm Cat line that has been so popular in the state. His ownership group has a clear vision of where they want to go with this horse and will be giving him good support."

According to Erin Robinson, who is in charge of marketing stallion seasons at Rockridge, support for Honorable Dillon includes two private incentive programs. The first, called "Real Awards," will pass the state-bred 10% stallion awards on to the mare owners for foals born in 2016. The second, called "Real Profit," will guarantee a minimum price of \$20,000-\$30,000 for weanlings of the 2016 crop produced from graded stakeswinning or graded stakesproducing mares, with the exact amount depending on the mare's credentials.



After a year in which he set a North American record for progeny earnings, Honorable Dillon's sire Tapit needs little introduction. The winner of the 2004 Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I), Tapit was represented by 17 stakes winners during 2014 including likely champion 3-year-old filly Untapable, Belmont Stakes (gr. I) and Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I) winner Tonalist, and Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I) winner Constitution. The stallion is still unproven as a sire of sires but has a number of promising young sons at stud in North America, among them Tapizar, Concord Point, Trappe Shot, and Flashback.

Bred in Kentucky by Robert B. Trussell Jr., Honorable Dillon is a half brother to 2004 Argentine champion juvenile filly Forty Greeta (by Roar) and is out of stakes-placed Shy Greeting, whose sire Shy Tom (by Blushing Groom) is a half brother to grade I winners Hennessy and Pearl City. While he was not a top-class horse, he won grade III races on both dirt and turf and set a course record for 11 furlongs at Gulfstream Park. His presence close up in the pedigree suggests Honorable Dillon

may be able to sire horses that stay better than he did.

Shy Greeting is a half sister to Forty Gregaria (by Roar), dam of 2007 Gran Premio Estrellas Juniors Sprint (Arg-I) winner Greco Tom (by Shy Tom). The siblings are out of Greevy, a daughter of 1987 champion sprinter Groovy and a half sister to 1987 Fayette Handicap (gr. II) winner Good Command (by Top Command). The third dam of Honorable Dillon, Gioconda (by Good Manners, a leading sire in Argentina), is a multiple group I winner in Argentina and is also the second dam of 2000 Premio Maipu (Arg-I) winner Impression (by Rubiano) and 2003 Premio Cyllene (Arg-II) winner Imperial Roy (by Roy). Further back, this is the family of the Argentine champion and important sire Forli.

In spite of his own 3x4 inbreeding to Mr. Prospector, Tapit has done well with further returns of Mr. Prospector. This strategy looks good for Honorable Dillon as well, both because his dam is free of Mr. Prospector and because his female family has had success with Mr. Prospector-line sires. Aside from Forty Niner (the sire of Roar) and Fappiano

(the sire of Rubiano and Roy), the most promising branches of Mr. Prospector for this breeding pattern look to be Seeking the Gold, Smart Strike, Gone West, Kingmambo, Woodman, Conquistador Cielo, and possibly Carson City.

With only a 5x6 cross to Northern Dancer in his pedigree, Honorable Dillon can be treated more or less as if he were an outcross to this bloodline. Based on previous results with multiple key elements in his pedigree, he should have a good chance of success with the Northern Dancer branches through Storm Bird (particularly via Storm Cat), Sadler's Wells, Vice Regent, possibly Danzig, Nijinsky II, Nureyev, Dixieland Band, and Sovereign Dancer. Other favorable elements to look for in his mates' pedigrees include His Majesty (particularly through Pleasant Colony), Broad Brush, Secretariat, Relaunch, Valid Appeal, Rahy, Key to the Mint, Halo, Caro, Stop the Music, Buckpasser, Hoist the Flag, Roberto, and possibly Holy Bull. Inbreeding to Seattle Slew may also be a viable approach provided the conformation match with the mare is good.

Pair of Posse 2-year-olds finish '14 with NYSS scores **ON DEC. 28, 2014,** Posse, a son of Silver Deputy standing at Rockridge Stud, closed the year with a rush when his offspring Chasing Bubbles and The Lewis Dinner captured a pair of \$150,000 stakes for New York-bred 2-year-olds. The scores allowed Posse to finish the year as the state's second-leading sire.

"It was pretty awesome to see that, and it was well deserved on (Posse's) part," said Lere Visagie, owner and farm manager of Rockridge Stud near Hudson. "This is his first crop in New York, and we're especially pleased to have this happen right before breeding season."

"(His offspring) have been big, good-looking horses. Solid racehorses and very well-balanced," said Visagie, a native of South Africa who started in the horse industry in Kentucky at Taylor Made Farm in 1994. "Posse has already produced some sires himself, such as Caleb's Posse."

Chasing Bubbles is a Windhorse Thoroughbreds' homebred (co-bred with Mallory Mort). Owner Patty Lavelle was more than pleased her fleet freshman colt made it to the racetrack at all.

"He had hernia surgery (as a yearling) and was recuperating on our farm (in Middleburg), when two hours after the surgery he impaled himself on a fence post," recalled Lavelle. "The wound was so big, the vet could put her whole fist in there. I thought we were going to lose him. But, luckily, it missed all of his vital organs. The wound couldn't be stitched. It had to heal from the inside. So twice a day (for months), we had to stick a garden hose in there to clean it out. It left a scar (on his underside) that I can still see today."

Chasing Bubbles seemingly has no residual fear of fence posts. In fact, the running lines for his last two races, including the Dec. 28 Great White Way division of the New York Stallion Series, resemble a picket fence—1-1-1—as he took both contests in wire-to-wire fashion.

Trained by Ken McPeek, Chasing Bubbles was sent off at 16-1 mostly due to the

presence of Patricia Generazio's heavily favored Disco Partner, from the barn of trainer James Ryerson.

Contested over Aqueduct's inner track, which was labeled "fast," Chasing Bubbles outbroke his seven rivals from the gate and secured the valuable rail path for the six-furlong event.

With Israel Rodriguez in the irons, the free-wheeling Chasing Bubbles recorded an opening quarter-mile in :23.95 and a half-mile in :47.63, while racing with a two-length advantage on his nearest competitor.

Turning into the lane, Disco Partner, who had raced well back in sixth position after an eventful start, cut the corner and took dead-aim on the leader with a furlong to go. However, Chasing Bubbles was more than up to the task, repulsing that threat with a burst of late energy.

Chasing Bubbles hit the wire 1½ lengths clear and stopped the timer in 1:12.65.

Out of the Cherokee Run mare Scottish Bubbly, Chasing Bubbles is a half sibling to New York-bred stakes-winning Sentimental Lass, who captured the 2010 Maid of the Mist Stakes. He is also the fourth winner from as many

starters from his dam.

Chasing Bubbles has won two of six starts and has earned \$124,597.

Basically (Scottish Bubbly) had done well (mating) with the Storm Cat-line. She has a stakes winner by Freud (Sentimental Lass)," said Lavelle. "This time we decided to go with Posse (who shares Rahy in his lineage with Storm Cat)."

The unlucky Disco Partner (by Disco Rico), who was knocked sideways and stumbled at the break, claimed the runner-up spot. It was another half-length back to Sea Gull Associates' Clockwork (by Noonmark) who found his best stride late to be a fast-closing third in the Great White Way.

Dinner Plans

Every April owner Michael Dubb takes trainer and former jockey Rudy Rodriguez with him to the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds.

"I basically bring Rudy along to climb aboard my unraced babies (boarding there) that are ready to head up north and to give me his opinion on them," said Dubb, who currently owns approximately 50 horses in training and 25 yearlings. "Barry Eisaman had a string there at the sale, so I asked him to show me some of the better ones. We stopped outside the stall of a Posse filly (The Lewis Dinner). Barry said, 'She's going to work fast, but she's crazy.' That's when Rudy decided that he was going to go into the stall with her. Barry screamed something like, 'Tm not kidding, don't go in there! She's crazy!' But in 10 to 20 seconds Rudy had that filly's head on his shoulder. I wound up bidding \$50,000 for her. I figured that it was good value (because her disposition would keep the price low) and Rudy seemingly had a connection with her."

Some eight months later The Lewis Dinner has become more than good value for Dubb, who owns the filly in partnership with Bethlehem Stables and Gary Aisquith. Out of the Jump Start mare Nick's Honor, The Lewis Dinner has won her last three starts, including the Fifth Avenue Division of the New York Stallion Series, already amassing \$229,500 in earnings.

A huge filly, The Lewis Dinner dwarfed her four rivals in the Fifth Avenue in both stature and ability. After breaking fourth in the field, The Lewis Dinner was breathing down the neck of the early leader, Saluda, while still on hold beneath jockey Manny Franco, after an opening quarter mile in :23.12.

Midway on the far turn Franco asked the Rodriguez trainee to run, and the race for the winner's circle was essentially over. The Lewis Dinner, the overwhelming 3-10 favorite, cruised past the half-mile marker in :46.68.

Through the stretch Franco peeked back a trio of times for the competition that never seriously materialized. The winner was appropriately geared-down through the final 100 yards, eventually stopping the timer in 1:12.46.

Bred in the Empire State by James Lamonica, Lee Sacks, and Soave Stables & Posse Syndicate—the consistent filly has now hit the board in all six of her career starts, boasting a record of 6-3-2-1.

Kathy's Humor (by Justenuffhumor), owned by James Nolan and Marc and Amanda Padellaro, closed in the Fifth Avenue to finish second. Drawing Away Stable's Saluda (by Congaree) settled for the minor spoils in third position.

Big Business, Storied Lady earn stakes wins on New Year's Eve

IF GARY BARBER'S CHESTNUT GELDING Big Business had a theme song, it might well be "I Love New York." Bred in New York by Henthorn Racing, Big Business began his racing career in California, where he was able to get to the winner's circle just once in 12 starts.

But after being claimed by Barber in August 2012 and transferred to David Jacobson's barn at Aqueduct, the son of Eddington—Spanish Guitar, by Birdonthewire, has notched 10 victories, including his first stakes win, the Alex M. Robb Stakes Dec. 31, 2014.

Breaking from the rail under jockey Fernando Jara, Big Business sat a couple of lengths behind dueling pacesetters West Hills Giant and Readthebyline. Moving up to challenge the leaders coming off the final turn, Big Business tussled briefly with West Hills Giant before taking the lead at the eighth pole, holding off a threat by the fast-closing Beautyinthepulpit to win by a head. He ran the 8½ furlongs in 1:44.33.

After failing to meet reserves as a Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling in 2009 and the following March as an Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. select 2-year-old, Big Business was purchased for \$155,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds in training. He was claimed by Barber at Del Mar in his 10th start for \$25,000, running twice more on the West Coast before shipping east.

"He's a big, strapping horse," said Barber. "He was running some good numbers, and at the time, Del Mar had a synthetic track, and I thought he'd run well on the dirt."

Since moving to New York, Big Business has compiled a record of 10-8-1 in 21 starts for earnings of \$697,340. In August at Saratoga, he completed a New York-bred exacta in the \$500,000 Forego Stakes (gr. I), finishing second to Palace.

A native of South Africa, Barber lives in California and races horses around the globe. He's been a partner in grade I winners Ron the Greek, In Lingerie, and Comma to the Top, and he campaigned the Italian-bred Becrux.

The co-founder and CEO of Spyglass Entertainment, he brought horse racing to

national attention in the U.S. as the executive producer of "Seabiscuit," an adaptation of the Laura Hillenbrand book that was nominated for seven Academy Awards. Among other films that Barber has overseen are "The Insider," "Memoirs of a Geisha," and "The Sixth Sense," all Academy Award nominees in multiple categories.

Barber has horses with several trainers in New York; on the recommendation of his California trainer Peter Miller, he began sending horses to Jacobson about eight years ago. And while he consults his trainers for claims and purchases, he also does a lot of the work himself.

"I do it all," he said. "I look at workout reports, I look at everything."

And while he's long been active in New York, he anticipates increasing his presence here in 2015, with horses bred in New York and elsewhere.

"I've steadily increased the horses I have in New York," he said. "The purses are great, and the program has really come on in leaps and bounds. I have a nice New York-bred named Bullheaded Boy, and I've bought a couple of other New York-breds. They're getting stronger and stronger."

The New York-bred stakes program is likely where Big Business will stay, though neither Jacobson nor Barber would specify where or when. The horse was off from racing for nine months, from late June 2013 to March of last year, and both trainer and owner said they're not in a hurry to race him again.

"I worry one race at a time," said Jacobson. "He'll let us know. It's up to the horse; it's not up to me."

"He was a little body-sore," said Barber of the reasoning behind the layoff. "Nothing specific, but he had run such a strong campaign that we gave him some time off to run in the fields and relax. There's no pressure to bring him back; he's been very good to us and earned a lot of money."

"He's such an honest, hard-trying, great horse," Barber continued. "I love this horse."

Tri County Stable's homebred Storied Lady closed out 2014 in fine fashion, getting her second win in December and her first career stakes victory in the Bay Ridge Stakes the same afternoon. "It's nice to be on a win streak," said Tri County's Charles Goldberg with a wide smile. "She's been fighting all year long, running second, third, fourth, second, and now finally we're sharp enough. She just loves the inner track, and she handled it beautifully today."

Breaking from post 10, Storied Lady raced wide throughout the 11/16-mile Bay Ridge, several lengths off the pacesetters before ranging up in the final turn to challenge a stubborn Miss Da Point. Tenacious under jockey José Ortiz, Storied Lady wore down the leader in the final strides to win by two lengths in 1:47.05.

A bay filly by Read the Footnotes out of Wide Barrel, Storied Lady is the third any longer, so she gave me her clients, including Don Potash and another Tri County partner, Richard Rosee. Don was my original client."

In the winner's circle after the Bay Ridge, Goldberg first thought of Potash.

"Thanks to my partner," he said. "He was the major person in getting the breeding for this horse."

"His passion was horses," said O'Meara of Potash. "He was a schoolteacher in the Bronx, but he'd eat and sleep horses every day if he could."

A resident of Riverdale in the Bronx, Goldberg keeps a few horses in training and a few for breeding, the majority of them New York-breds. Despite an affin-



offspring of the Broad Brush mare to earn more than \$200,000. With the Bay Ridge win, the then 3-year-old joined Love Abroad (by Not For Love) as a stakes winner.

"I've had Wide Barrel for a long time," said Goldberg, "She's produced a lot of nice horses for us."

Now 20, Wide Barrel moved last year from Keane Stud in New York to Kentucky's Milestone Farm, owned by John O'Meara, whose affiliation with Tri County goes back nearly 20 years, through his relationship with the late Don Potash, a Tri County partner who died in 2013.

"He kept mares with Gabrielle Poulos," explained O'Meara, "and when her husband died, she eventually said that she didn't want to be in the business ity for the inner track at Aqueduct, over which she's got four wins from seven starts, Storied Lady will, said Goldberg, get a break for the winter.

And while Goldberg will no longer breed Wide Barrel, it's possible that her days of producing winners aren't quite over. Standing at Milestone is E Z's Gentleman, winner of the 2010 Triple Bend Handicap (gr. I) at Hollywood Park, and O'Meara is thinking of breeding Wide Barrel to him, mindful of her age and the fact that she hasn't produced a foal since 2012.

Whether she is bred or not, Wide Barrel will stay in the extended Tri County family.

"If the breeding doesn't work out," said O'Meara, "she has a home for life." \(\bar{\mathbb{N}} \)

ON JAN. 18 AT AQUEDUCT RACETRACK, Barry K. Schwartz had a horse back in the winner's circle for the \$100,000 Hollie Hughes Stakes, a race that at one point he won four times in an eight-year span (1998-2005).

On a sodden day marked by relentless downpours, Schwartz' Stonewall Farm homebred Captain Serious—named for a fellow that makes his living on the ice, not in the

mud—got his second stakes win, holding on in the Hollie Hughes by three-quarters of a length after a late challenge that threatened to deny him the victory.

Breaking from post six, Captain Serious was steered to the four-path of a sloppy and sealed track by jockey Jose Ortiz, sitting just off stablemate I'm Stoked, who set the pace up the back-stretch of the six-furlong event. Taking the lead

coming off the far turn, Captain Serious looked as though he'd draw off for an easy win, but his rivals weren't going to make it easy.

With Geaux Mets threatening along the rail, Captain Serious, out in the middle of the racetrack, had to repel a resurgent I'm Stoked, who'd looked done when relinquishing the lead but who came back to head Captain Serious at the sixteenth pole. Crafty Dreamer loomed on the outside, but amid challengers swarming him, a determined Captain Serious dug in to regain the lead. Crafty Dreamer got up for second, with I'm Stoked a head back in third. The final time was 1:10.70.

"I thought it was a great race," said Schwartz, who watched the race from California, though he admitted he thought his horse might lose when I'm Stoked came back to challenge him. "Mike's other horse ran really well."

Captain Serious' win is the fifth time since 1998 that Schwartz and trainer Mike Hushion have teamed to win the Hollie Hughes, named for the longtime trainer at Amsterdam, N.Y.'s historic Sanford Farm who died in 1981. Their first win came in 1998 with Thepromonroe, and they won with Papua three times in a row, from 2003-05.

A son of Successful Appeal, Captain Serious is out of the Mr. Greeley mare Madame

Diva, purchased by Schwartz as a yearling in 2003 for \$260,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. Stakes-placed with one win in 10 starts, she was sold in 2013 for \$55,000 at the Keeneland November mixed sale in foal to Flatter, after producing five foals for Schwartz.

The most accomplished of Madame Diva's three foals to get to the races, Captain Serious is named for Jonathan Toews, captain of the National Hockey League's Chicago Blackhawks. A lifelong hockey fan, Schwartz named him after attending games during the team's 2013 Stanley Cup-winning playoff run.

The 4-year-old Captain Serious is the second homebred stakes winner Schwartz has named after a professional hockey player. The New York native and Rangers fan won the Leon Reed Memorial Handicap in 2013 with B Shanny (Street Cry—Nothing But Fun, by Dixie Union), named for Brendan Shanahan, who played for the Rangers from 2006-08.

After winning his first three starts, including the Mike Lee Stakes, Captain Serious moved to open company races last spring, finishing second to multiple stakes winner Kid Cruz in the Dwyer Stakes (gr. II) at Belmont. He was third in both the Amsterdam Stakes (gr. II) at Saratoga and the Fall Highweight Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct, ending 2014 with a record of 9-3-1-3 in his first year on the track.

"It's been a little frustrating," admitted Schwartz of his horse's losses. "He ran so well, and it was heartbreaking, the loss to Kid Cruz."

While Schwartz didn't indicate where Captain Serious will run next, he has no reservations about a return to open company.

"I don't think that's a problem," he said. 🔊


