NYTB's 2016 Legislative Agenda: Finger Lakes Still Front and Center

OVER THE LAST 12 MONTHS New York Thoroughbred Breeders' efforts to protect Finger Lakes horsemen's purses from the adverse effects of the newly licensed Lago Casino & Resort have been outlined not only in this column but across various industry media outlets. Here is an update on recent developments arising from Gov. Cuomo's release of his 2016-17 New York State executive budget Jan. 13.

A brief review: Lago Casino & Resort is located less than a half-hour drive from Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack. Once the Lago Casino & Resort opens, Finger Lakes operator Delaware North is projected to lose up to 40% of its gaming revenue. This loss of revenue will, in turn, gut the Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account. In 2015, for example, 70% of the Finger Lakes purse account was derived from the VLTs. Fund revenue generated from the Finger Lakes VLTs would also take a 40% hit. If not mitigated by a combination of legislative and grass roots action, these developments will utterly transform the New York breeding and racing program as we know it.

Delaware North has sought redress from Lago in the form of gaming tax relief from the state, and its request for relief was included in the governor's budget. The budget did not, however, contain any provision to hold the Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account harmless when the new casino opens. It is critical to realize even when Delaware North receives tax relief, this does not at all protect Finger Lakes horsemen's purses and the Fund after the projected 40% reduction of the VLT business at the Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack.

Immediately after the executive budget was released, NYTB addressed a letter to the governor emphasizing the importance of protecting the Finger Lakes Horsemen's purse account (see page 10). We sent copies to all relevant parties and have since met with elected representatives from the Senate, Assembly, and executive branch and their staffs.

NYTB has set a number of strategies into motion for the immediate future.

The first available legislative avenue is to have

Finger Lakes purse protection added during the 30-day amendment period for the executive budget. It is very unlikely this can or will be done, given the constraints of this process.

The more likely course of action—which would represent a legislative "home run" for the industry—is for the state senate and assembly racing chairs, during their part of the budget review process, to introduce and pass matching budget revisions in their respective houses to protect Finger Lakes purses and the Fund. We are working hard with our lobbyists on this avenue.

Failing this, NYTB and the organization's lobbyists will pursue the stand-alone legislation which NYTB introduced last year (and is still in place) to hold Finger Lakes horsemen's purses and the Fund "harmless" from the effects of the Lago casino. This is a lengthier and more challenging process, but NYTB will spare no efforts should it come to this.

In the meanwhile you may ask, "What can I do?" Much can be done at the grass-roots level and if there were ever a time for stakeholders to take action, it is now. Interested parties need to contact Rochester-area elected officials who may already have ties to Lago but need to be convinced of the importance of horsemen's interests to their constituents.

Our message? Job creation, preservation of greenspace, and support of the agricultural sector of the state's economy.

Meanwhile, NYTB is busy orchestrating meetings with representatives from Lago, Delaware North, the New York Farm Bureau, New York Gaming Commission, and Finger Lakes horsemen to try to get all parties on the same page on this critical issue. We are also advising the Finger Lakes horsemen on lobbying strategies and the benefits of conducting a pro-horsemen's media campaign in western New York.

I will keep you posted about this issue, which presents a serious challenge for all of us. Livelihoods are at stake, and we are sparing no time or effort in pursuit of a good outcome from this crisis. I can, I hope, rely on your help down the line. This is NYTB's number one priority and will continue to occupy all of our resources and attention.

NYTB's Open Letter to Gov. Andrew Cuomo

Dear Governor Cuomo,

The New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. (NYTB), the official authorized representative of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in New York State, is deeply concerned about the negative impact the Lago Casino & Resort in Tyre, N.Y., will have on Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack and subsequently on its horsemen and breeders.

It is our understanding that a dialog exists regarding Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack in the New York State 2016 Executive Budget. It is also our understanding that in these discussions Delaware North is requesting gaming tax relief. At the same time, though, it is critical to address the related issues of the Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account and the NYS Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund ("Fund").

As you know, the casino-enabling legislation in general provides that if a casino is located in a region that also has a racino, the competing casino must guarantee the gaming revenue at the 2013 levels for the horsemen & breeders at the racino track. Due to a legislative oversight, however, there is no statutory obligation in statute for Lago Casino to "hold harmless" and protect either Finger Lakes horsemen's purses or the Fund.

The Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account is absolutely dependent upon VLT revenue from Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack. In 2015, for example VLT revenue accounted for approximately 70% of the Finger Lakes purse account. Given that the Lago Casino & Resort is projected to reduce the Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack VLT business by up to 40%, this also means that both the Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account and the Fund will be reduced by the same percentage.

Its critical to realize even if Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack receives gaming tax relief, this does not at all mitigate the negative effect on Finger Lakes horsemen's purses and the Fund of the projected 40% reduction of the VLT business at the Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack.

Without a guarantee, such as is outlined in bills (A.6345-A) and (S.4367) which hold Finger Lakes horsemen's purses and the Fund "harmless" from the effects of the Lago Casino, the very existence of the Finger Lakes horsemen and the Thoroughbred breeders is at stake.

The health of Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack is critically important to Thoroughbred breeders and horsemen. Statistics tell the story. In 2013, NY-breds were responsible for 71% of the total starts at Finger Lakes and earned 75% of all purse money distributed, winning 76% of the 1,456 races run. Furthermore, races at Finger Lakes generated 52% of the number of breeder awards paid by the Fund in 2013. Therefore, the purse structure and awards at Finger Lakes is central to the New York Thoroughbred Breeding Program.

The infusion of VLT revenue from Aqueduct and Finger Lakes has revived New York's racing and agricultural industries, preserving greenspace and creating jobs. Preserving this revenue stream for the Thoroughbred industry as the State heads toward full-scale casino gaming is critical to continued success and further growth.

In 2012 the New York State Equine Industry Economic Impact Study determined that the equine industry has a \$4.2 billion effect on the state's economy and contributes to the local economies of every one of New York's 62 counties by generating \$187 million in state and local taxes. The industry also preserves 1.3 million acres of precious farmland in our state. In addition to the 2,300 breeding, training and racing facilities across the state devoted to Standardbreds and Thoroughbreds, there are 23,000 family-owned farms and stables. Most important, New York equine industry generates 33,000 full-time jobs. Every 100 racehorses are responsible for the creation of 80 jobs.

It is essential to take a strategic view of the health of racing at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack on which so many livelihoods depend. Our common aims should be 1) to ensure the ongoing health of Finger Lakes racing by protecting purses and Fund revenue and 2) to be proactive about the future, such as introducing plans to increase field size and handle by installing a turf course and taking other racing measures. Such investments by Delaware North will enhance its racing product, increase racing revenue and the pari-mutuel tax from handle, create economic development, and expand employment in New York's agricultural sector.

Please contact me if you have any questions about the New York Thoroughbred industry's concern about the imperative necessity of protecting the Finger Lakes horsemen's purse account and Fund.

LA VERDAD EARNS ECLIPSE AWARD AS TOP FEMALE SPRINTER

ady Sheila Stable's star New York-bred sprinter La Verdad (by Yes It's True) received national recognition Jan. 16 when she was crowned champion female sprinter for 2015 at the Eclipse Awards ceremony at Gulfstream Park.

Onstage to accept the award were owner Sheila Rosenblum and trainer Linda Rice.

"La Verdad has made a dream come true," Rosenblum said. "Thank you to the voters who voted for her; thank you for my trainer who made this happen, who begged me to buy her. We have a passion: We love horses. We respect horses; we've made a great team; we've made syndicates happen for women. And I have a spectacular group of women over there who are my partners and friends. I love this mare. She is a love story. She is one of a kind. She's pretty miraculous."

Rice said, "It's our first trip to the Eclipse Awards and it's nice to come away with a win. Most of all I want to thank La Verdad. Everyone should have a horse like her."

La Verdad opened her 2015 account by repeating in the Distaff Handicap (gr. II) at Aqueduct in April, winning Belmont Park's Vagrancy Handicap (gr. III) in May and repeating in the Dancin Renee Stakes for state-breds at Belmont in June. First across the line in the grade II Honorable Miss Handicap at Saratoga Race Course, she was later disqualified following a positive test for clenbuterol.

After winning the 6½-furlong Gallant Bloom Handicap (gr. II) over Wavell Avenue in September at Belmont, she was a facile winner of the Iroquois Stakes against statebreds on Empire Showcase Day in October, where a rating experiment convinced conditioner Linda Rice that the seven-furlong TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint




Bred by Mark Vondrasek's Eklektikos Stable, La Verdad won five of eight starts in 2015

(gr. I), just a week away, was within the mare's reach. And it almost was. La Verdad and regular rider Jose Ortiz finished a strong second to 10-1 Wavell Avenue after setting the pace.

Despite her second-place finish in the Breeders' Cup, La Verdad's body of work for the season tipped the scale in her favor with voters in the most closely contested category of the year. Of the three finalists, La Verdad outpolled Wavell Avenue by eight votes, 98-90, with Lady Shipman third with 41 first-place votes.

Bred by Mark Vondrasek's Eklektikos Stable and foaled at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm near Chestertown, La Verdad was purchased privately by Rosenblum following her second allowance victory in November 2013. After winning the Jan. 9 Interborough Stakes (see page 36), La Verdad is scheduled for a final start Feb. 13 in the Barbara Fritchie Stakes (gr. II) at Laurel Park before being bred to leading sire Medaglia d'Oro.

HOLD ME BACK TO IRISH HILL CENTURY FARM

Hold Me Back, a top 10 second-crop sire in North America in 2015 by progeny earnings, has been sold and moved to Irish Hill Century Farm near Stillwater, where the son of Giant's Causeway will stand the 2016 breeding season for \$5,000.

"Hold Me Back is a young stallion that is getting solid runners, and he's an absolutely gorgeous physical by a leading sire of sires in Giant's Causeway," said Bowling Bloodstock's Matt Bowling, who brokered the deal with Sullivan Bloodstock.

Campaigned by WinStar Farm and trainer Bill Mott, Hold Me Back was a grade II-winning, multiple grade I-placed 3-year-old. He won the Lane's End Stakes (gr. II) and placed in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes and Shadwell Travers Stakes (both gr. I). At 4 he added the Dominion Day Handicap (Can-III).

Hold Me Back earned \$872,610 before retiring to stud at WinStar, where he's stood since 2011. The 10-year-old is out of the multiple stakes-producing Unbridled's Song mare Restraint, and his second dam is two-time Canadian champion Avowal.

Hold Me Back is the sire of Jet Black Magic, winner of the 2015 Delta Downs Princess Stakes (gr. III).

International Star Returns

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's International Star (by Fusaichi Pegasus), who swept the three Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots preps for last year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) only to be scratched the morning of the race, improved his Fair Grounds record to a perfect four-for-four Jan. 16 when he won the \$75,000 Louisi-

Heavily favored in his return last November in the Zia Park Derby, the New York-bred International Star tired to fourth after contesting the pace. Ken Ramsey dismissed the race, believing that external circumstances worked against the Mike Maker trainee.

ana Stakes at 11/16 miles.

"He had a disastrous trip out to Zia Park," Ramsey commented. "It wasn't so much bad luck as we were probably misguided in sending him there."

Ramsey was confident he'd see a better performance in New Orleans, and he did.

Breaking from the outside post of six under Miguel Mena, International Star entered the clubhouse turn four wide, then dropped to the rail to settle in fifth. Majestic Harbor set the pace, posting splits of :24.46, :48.42, and 1:13.10.

International Star advanced while five wide on the turn. The bay colt shot past Eagle in the lane and opened up

to a 1½-length victory in a final time of 1:44.44. International Star paid \$7.80 as the third choice.

"Mike (Maker) was telling me how good he was doing and he likes this racetrack," Mena said. "We were on the rail on the turn, and I swung him out so he wouldn't get stopped and he was full of run."

In addition to winning the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III), Risen Star Stakes (gr. II),

and Louisiana Derby (gr. II) at 3, International Star was an accomplished juvenile, annexing the Grey Stakes (Can-III)

at Woodbine and finishing second in both the With Anticipation Stakes (gr. IIT) and restricted Rockville Centre Stakes. His record now stands at six wins and two seconds with earnings of \$1,066,629.

Bred by longtime Maryland breeders and owners Katharine M. Voss and Robert T. Manfuso and foaled at Berkshire Stud near Pine Plains, International Star was purchased by the Ramseys as a yearling for \$85,000 out of the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern fall yearling sale.

NYRA Enhances Spring 2-Year-Old Races, Announces Fund-Supported Bonus Program

Six maiden races worth \$100,000 each will be offered by the New York Racing Association this spring as part of a program leading up to the June 9 Astoria Stakes and June 10 Tremont Stakes at Belmont Park.

The New York Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund has also contributed \$200,000 to fund bonuses worth a total of \$25,000 to be offered to the owner and trainer of New York-breds that finish first, second, or third in any state-bred or open maiden juvenile race held during the Aqueduct spring and Belmont spring-summer meet.

For 2-year-old fillies, Astoria Trial A, at 4½ furlongs, will be run April 20 at Aqueduct. The five-furlong Astoria Trial B and C will be run May 4 and May 18, respectively, at Belmont.

Tremont Trial A, at 4½ furlongs, will be run April 21, with Tremont Trial B and C at five furlongs scheduled for May 5 and May 19, respectively, at Belmont.

The fields for the trials are limited to 10 runners, with the winner to receive \$50,000 and all runners to be paid. Should 10 horses start, the second through sixth-place horses would receive \$20,000, \$10,000, \$7,500,

5,000, and \$4,000, with \$3,500 divided among the seventh through 10th-place finishers.

The regular purse for maiden races is \$75,000.

The bonus program for New York-breds calls for owners to receive \$9,000 for a first-place finish, \$4,500 for second, and \$2,500 for third.

Trainers would get a bonus of \$4,000 for first, \$3,000 for second, and \$2.000 for third.





Average prices continue upward trend for New York-breds in 2015

WHILE THE NUMBER of New York-breds offered at public sale dipped a bit in 2015 from the previous year, the average prices for yearlings and 2-year-olds continued forward as the Thoroughbred industry has put a premium on racing stock bred in New York.

niles—the number offered and sold was lower than 2014. Those figures could be the result of slightly smaller foal crops or the fact the value of the product is such that breeders are a bit reluctant to part with their potential runners.

The growth of Fasig-Tipton's preferred sale of yearlings is a likely culprit of the shrinkage of the weanling sale marketplace as the number offered fell from 204 to 190. The average price of a New York-bred yearling advanced a hefty 14.9% from \$50,068 to \$57,524.

"I think it reflects the overall market," said Mallory Mort, manager of Gallagher's Stud near Ghent. "If the horse meets everybody's approval, then you can get plenty of money. With some of the others, it's difficult to move them."

Gallagher's Stud had a pair of prize yearlings during Fasig-Tipton's select sale of yearlings that preceded the state-bred sale last August. Through Denali Stud, agent, they sold a War Front—Hostess filly for \$570,000 to Glen Hill Farm and a Malibu Moon—Tulipmania filly to Crupi's New Castle Farm, agent, for \$500,000. In all, the top four state-bred yearlings sold were fillies.

"Is there an advantage if a horse is a New York-bred? Absolutely. We've seen the averages go up over the last couple of years and I expect to see the same in 2016," Mort said.

"The middle-market horses can bring a premium because of the purses and the state program, especially those sired by New York-based stallions," Mort continued. "That's 30% of the purse that can be added if the horse is sired by a New York stallion."

At the top of the heap was Championofthenile, a son of Pioneerof the Nile out of Lantern Glow that was purchased by trainer Linda Rice for \$840,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic juvenile sale in May in Maryland.

Racing for Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable, Iris Smith Stable, and Rice, Championofthenile broke his maiden by six lengths during the Saratoga stand, then placed in a pair of state-bred stakes.

Other high-end juvenile purchases were Get Jets, a Team D buy for \$300,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale who won the \$250,000 Sleepy Hollow Stakes on Showcase Day at Belmont Park. The son of Scat Daddy was bred by Pat Pavlish.

A \$185,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida purchase in 2015 was Flexibility. The son of Bluegrass Cat won the \$200,000 Jerome Stakes (gr. III) at Aqueduct in January and placed in the Nashua Stakes and Remsen Stakes (both gr. II) last year.

The Next Wave

New York-bred Flexibility starts year on the Triple Crown trail

LAST YEAR NEW YORK-BREDS made quite an impression on the Triple Crown trail. Upstart won the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) and finished second in the Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (gr. II) and second in the Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I). International Star swept the three graded stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and Tencendur was a solid second in the Twin-Spires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I).

The new year was just in its second day when Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's Flexibility made his impression on the 2016 trail with a dominating win at Aqueduct in the \$200,000 Jerome Stakes (gr. III).

Bred in New York by WinStar Farm, Flexibility is a son of WinStar stallion Bluegrass Cat, who stood at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple Farm from 2012-13.

Foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple, Flexibility is the third winner out of Santa Vindi, by Vindication, a Kentucky-bred half sister to multiple graded stakes winner, \$2.19-million-earner, and successful New York sire Golden Missile (by A.P. Indy).

Placed in four starts, Santa Vindi was purchased by WinStar for \$60,000 out of the 2010 Keeneland November sale. She has a 2-year-old daughter by Sidney's Candy, did not have a foal in 2015, and was bred to Bellamy Road last spring.

Flexibility first sold as an \$80,000 yearling at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale in 2014. Consigned by Denali Stud, agent, he was purchased by Chapel Creek Stable. He was picked up by LRK Stable for \$185,000 from the consignment of Eddie Woods, agent, at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Florida 2-year-old sale last March.

WinStar has had good luck in supporting its stallions in the New York breeding program. The farm also bred 2003 dual classic winner and champion 3-year-old Funny Cide in New York. Funny Cide is by WinStar stallion Distorted Humor.



Flexibility, trained by Chad Brown, was the 1-2 favorite in the Jerome based off his back-to-back runner-up finishes to Mohaymen in last year's Nashua Stakes and Remsen Stakes (both gr. II).

With a maiden win first-time out against state-breds last October, Flexibility is 2-2-0 in four outings.

Flexibility got out of the gate sharply under Irad Ortiz Jr. in the Jerome and avoided any collateral damage from Donegal Moon, just to his inside in post three, who went to his nose at the break, unseating his rider.

After this sharp start, the bay colt was wrangled back into fourth position five lengths behind a trio of horses: Vorticity, who led for the first halfmile through opening fractions of :23.48 and :47.31, pressed hard by 3-1 second choice Bird of Trey and Condo King.

Flexibility got his first cue while four wide in the far turn and effortlessly gained the lead.

Once the colt entered the stretch with a narrow advantage, the victory was never in doubt. Flexibility opened up in the stretch, cruising unchallenged to the wire, 41/4 lengths in front in 1:42.98 for the mile and 70 yards. Vorticity stayed on for second, followed by 22-1 longshot In Equality and Bird of Trev.

"He's been professional throughout," said Brown's assistant Cherie DeVaux. "He's always been a big, strong colt who did everything correct.

"After following Mohaymen (in the Remsen and Nashua) it was a good feeling to see him get his head in front of the other horses," she said.

The Jerome win was worth 10 points in the "Road to the Kentucky Derby" standings. Flexibility also earned four points from finishing second in the Remsen.

New York-breds La Verdad, Saythreehailmary's win open stakes at the Big A

Gals with Gusto

LA VERDAD'S OWNER, SHEILA ROSENBLUM, is fond of saying the amazing journey her brilliant New York-bred has taken her on is a "New York love story."

The part of the tale that directly relates to the Empire State has reached its conclusion—at least for now. The 6-year-old, who was crowned the Eclipse Award champion in the female sprint division Jan. 16, made her final racing appearance on a New York track when she won Aqueduct's \$100,000 Interborough Stakes Jan. 9.

Following La Verdad's 2¾-length score as the 2-5 favorite against open company in the Interborough, her 16th career victory and 11th in a stakes, her trainer, Linda Rice, said the mare will compete once more, in the Feb. 13 Barbara Fritchie Stakes (gr. II) at Laurel Park, before heading to Kentucky to be bred to Medaglia d'Oro.

But La Verdad's stay in Kentucky will be brief, and the daughter of Yes It's True will reconnect with her roots when she is returned to New York to deliver her first foal at Vivien Malloy's Edition Farm in 2017.

"New York deserves to have her. La Verdad and her baby belong in New York, and I want that baby to be a New York-bred," Rosenblum, a resident of Manhattan, said of her first foray as a breeder. "This might be a little pretentious, but she is the darling of New York."

Rosenblum, who privately purchased La Verdad in December 2013 from her breeder, Eklektikos Stable, and races her under the *nom de course* Lady Sheila Stable, is

finding it difficult to come to terms with the fact the racing chapter of her mare's career is nearing a conclusion.

"To know that phase of our lives will be over is incredibly bittersweet," Rosenblum said. "I cried the day after the Interborough. The reality hit that my horse is going to a breeding shed. La Verdad has given us so much joy, and put me on the map."

Rosenblum had misgivings about selling La Verdad, and withdrew her from the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. The day before the sale, La Verdad finished second in the \$1 million Twin-Spires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I) at Keeneland Oct. 31.

La Verdad was given the opportunity to race again in 2015 in the Fall Highweight Handicap (gr. III) against males. She finished sixth, but Rosenblum and Rice didn't wish to end her career on that note.

Rosenblum, who admits to pre-race jitters, said the mare's next chapter might also induce hand-wringing.

"Patience was never my thing," Rosenblum said of waiting for the arrival of the first foal. "I'm a little high-strung. But La Verdad is teaching me a lot about that and because of that she deserves to be running in a pasture very soon."

While the door is closing on La Verdad's career, more challenges await New York-bred Saythreehailmary's, the winner of the \$98,000 Ladies Handicap Jan. 10. The Ladies Handicap represented the 5-year-old's first win in an open stakes and her second consecutive victory after capturing the restricted Bay Ridge Stakes in December.

The wittily named daughter of Repent out of Just Call Me Angel, by Devil's Bag, is campaigned by her breeder, Joe Gioia, whose horses race for his Very Un Stable.

"I think she has a lot left in her," Gioia said of the mare, who is trained by John Morrison. "We'll try to get her gradedplaced or win, for that matter, before breeding her. If we can get her bankroll close to three-quarters of a million, that would be nice, and she will be more valuable as a broodmare because we do try to sell our offspring."

While Gioia, a 60-year-old construction business owner from New York, looks forward to Saythreehailmary's' continued racing career, he can't help but dream a bit about whom he will breed her to in 2017.

"Speightstown would be my first choice, if I had unlimited money to spend," he said. "She really nicks perfectly with Speightstown. The stud fee is expensive, and I would have to get her earnings up—either place or win a graded race to justify that."

Gioia still owns the dam of Saythree-hailmary's who is in foal to Courageous Cat and has a late spring due date. Just Call Me Angel also has a 2-year-old Courageous Cat filly, Courageous Angel, whom will be campaigned by Gioia.


Given Saythreehailmary's' pedigree, her name was a no-brainer, Gioia said. Coming up with a stable name, however, required an assist.

"Our first horse was named They Are all Crazy," Gioia explained. "My sister looked at me and my two partners, one who is my late father, and said, 'You guys have a horse named They Are all Crazy, and you're an unstable bunch, why don't you just name the stable, Very Un Stable?'"

Brown Takes the Crown



BIG BROWN CONTINUES TO have a big following. The champion 3-year-old male of 2008 following emphatic scores in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) may not have gotten off to the best start at stud in Kentucky beginning in 2009, but he has bounced back and is making the phone ring for the Sunrise Stallions team that manages his stallion career.

Big Brown's success in 2015, with six stakes winners headed by the grade I-winning Dortmund and more than \$5.3 million in progeny earnings, earns him the title of leading sire in New York. He outlasted Freud, who won the 2014 title and had \$5.1 million in earnings for 2015.

Big Brown, the large burnished bay son of Boundary—Mien, by Nureyev, will stand for \$10,000 at Dutchess Views Farm near Pine Plains, up from \$8,500 last year. He moved to New York prior to the 2015 breeding season after six seasons at Three Chimneys Farm in Kentucky and shuttling five seasons to Vinery Australia.

"We think he's a great deal at \$10,000," said Eric Bishop, general manager at Sun-

rise Stallions. "He's the number one sire, and he's got a huge crop of 3-year-olds that will be running this year, which should help his popularity continue to grow."

Sunrise Stables and Sunrise Stallions is operated by Andrew Cohen, who was part of the IEAH partnership that campaigned Big Brown. The former Wall Street executive also manages the stallion career of Frost Giant, who stands at Keane Stud near Amenia.

Big Brown's 3-year-old crop of 2016 numbers 80, his largest to date. His numbers dropped—he covered 59 mares in 2013, according to The Jockey Club's Report of Mares Bred, and 46 in 2014, his final season in Kentucky. In 2015, his first season in New York, Big Brown covered 138 mares and his team is looking to get him over the century mark for 2016. That will happen with support, not only from New York but from outside breeders as well.

"We have a few Kentucky clients that have bred in Kentucky last year to sires like Flatter and other sires in the \$15,000-\$30,000 range," said Bishop. "People want to put those mares in the New York market and take advantage of

the New York stallion breed-back program. Even if you just want to take advantage of the lucrative purse structure in New York, that's a good reason to go to the better sires in New York and try to cash in on that. Optimally their choice will be Big Brown. My goal is to get 80-100 mares, and I hope we get more. If we're in that range, I'd be happy because

we're more concerned with the quality of the mare than the quantity at this point."

Quality is what Big Brown got with Dortmund in 2015.

The oversized chestnut was unbeaten as a 2-year-old in 2014, polishing off his campaign with a neck victory over Firing Line in the \$500,000 Los Alamitos Futurity (gr. I). He continued his streak at 3 with successive wins in the Robert B. Lewis Stakes (gr. III), San Felipe Stakes (gr. II), and \$1 million Santa Anita Derby (gr. I) for Kaleem Shah and trainer Bob Baffert.

In any other year Dortmund would have been a strong favorite for the classics, but he also happened to be in the same barn as American Pharoah, the first winner of the Triple Crown in 37 years. Regardless, Dortmund was the 4-1 second choice in the Kentucky Derby and was a gallant third.

Following a fourth-place finish in the Xpressbet.com Preakness Stakes, he was given a breather and returned in late October to win the Big Bear Stakes and Native Diver Stakes (gr. III) to finish 5-0-1 in seven starts on the year with \$1,353,080 in earnings.

Bred in Kentucky by Emilie Gerlinde Fojan, Dortmund is out of the stakes-

winning Tale of the Cat mare Our Josephina. His pedigree has not gone unnoticed in the breeding community.

"Pedigree-wise people are jumping in with Storm Cat-line mares," Bishop said of Big Brown's attraction. "Our Josephina is a Tale of the Cat mare and we're getting a few of those. People are trying to jump on the bandwagon. That line has produced a lot of good horses including Big Wildcat, a group III winner; and

Day by a neck. Coach Inge also placed in the 10-furlong Suburban Handicap (gr. II) and Woodward Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga.

Big Brown was also represented in 2015 by the stakes-winning filly Red Sashay, owned by Goodwood Racing V and bred by Cohen and Gary Tolchin (also a partner in Big Brown). Out of the Farma Way mare Sashay Away, she won the one-mile Honey Ryder Stakes over the

Apollo Sonic, grade I-placed in Japan."

Dortmund excelled around two turns in 2015, as did another son of Big Brown, Coach Inge. Out of the Holy Bull mare Touch too Much, Coach Inge came into his own as a 4-year-old in 2015 for Mike Repole's Repole Stable and trainer Todd Pletcher.

Following a pair of wins at Aqueduct in February and April, Coach Inge won the \$400,000 Brooklyn Invitational Stakes (gr. II) on Belmont Stakes (gr. I) Day at Belmont, traveling 12 furlongs in 2:27.17 and topping grade I winner V. E.

Gulfstream turf in early May.

With Big Brown's propensity for siring runners that excel as they get older and the distances lengthen, and as his foal crops get larger once the larger New York-bred foal crops advance, his stock appears to be a long-term proposition. He's not the first sire to be a leading sire in New York based on crops conceived and raised elsewhere but appears to be one who will be around for the long haul.

Considering he was named for the United Parcel Service, Big Brown looks like a shipper with staying power.

Giant Surprise stands at Rockridge Stud

Giant Surprise makes a strong run as the leading first-year sire in New York

Break Out

DESPITE THE BREVITY of Giant Surprise's stallion career, it has already become nearly a cliché to say that the 7-year-old is living up to his name, producing five winners in a first crop of 30 foals. But with a handful of stakes wins to his offspring's credit and his list of first-crop progeny earnings zooming past \$800,000, his success may be coming nearly routine, and not unexpected at all.

The son of Giant's Causeway ended 2015 with five winners from 12 starters, four of them owned by the man who owned Giant Surprise as a racehorse, Mike Repole. Despite having bred 56 mares in his first year at stud in 2012, Giant Surprise topped New York's first-crop sire list, his \$819,662 in earnings more than doubling those of Dublin, who came in at #2 with \$279,651.

Giant Surprise brought a far more modest résumé to his breeding career than the runner-up, who had won the Three Chimneys Hopeful Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga in 2009, then placed in multiple graded stakes en route to a seventh-place finish in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

In fact, four of the top five first-crop stallions in New York were graded stakes win-

ners, three of them with grade I-winning credentials. In contrast, Giant Surprise had only a maiden win and just one start when injury ended what appeared to be a promising racing career, sending him to the breeding shed long before Repole expected.

Known more as an owner than a breeder, Repole supported his young stallion, at first in the shed with his own mares, then purchasing some of his offspring at auction. The Giant Surprise 3-year-olds he owns have earned more than \$750,000 and won five New Yorkbred stakes races, with placings in four others.

"It's been a very good story," said Repole. "I've had inquiries about moving to Kentucky, but I've got Stay Thirsty, Overanalyze, and Uncle Mo there, and

I've always wanted to have a stallion in New York."

Having retained an interest in Uncle Mo, who stands at Ashford Stud in Kentucky, Repole has two stallions who finished in the top 10 of the yearend first-crop sire list: Uncle Mo headed the list with a record \$3,675,388 in

earnings, with Giant Surprise finishing sixth nationally.

"He has two stakes winners, four stakes-placed," said Repole. "I can't explain it. He's a proven stallion that just turned 7."

While he's pleased at Giant Surprise's success so far, Repole also knows that the

next few years may well be tougher.

"People like what's new," he explained. "In their first year stallions get plenty of horses; they might get 40 or 50 or 60 mares. In the second, third, fourth year, new stallions are coming in, along with the proven stallions who are already here. The next two or three years are going to be the toughest, because he'll be down to 15 or 20 foals a year."

According to Erin Robinson, the stallion manager at Rockridge Stud, which stands Giant Surprise, the horse bred fewer than 20 mares in each of the last three years (according to The Jockey Club's Report of Mares bred he covered 19 in 2013, 17 in 2014, and 13 last year). Those small crops will make it tougher for him to repeat the number he had this year, with 35 foals on the ground from his first crop.

"The good news," Repole said, "is that three years from now, he'll have over 100."

Robinson said that as of mid-January, Giant Surprise was booked to about 50 mares. She expects that number to rise to their goal of 100.

"He's hands-down the best value in

New York," she said.

As Repole hopes that the horses that won at 2 in 2015 repeat their success this year, he's also looking at what he can do to continue to support his stallion in 2016. He purchased five mares at the Keeneland January mixed sale, with both Uncle Mo and Giant Surprise in mind. He's booked six mares to each of them this year.

At least one of those mares bred to Uncle Mo will foal in New York, following in the footsteps of Clipthecouponannie, a Repole homebred 3-year-old filly out of Lights Off Annie (by Freud) who broke her maiden at first asking at Aqueduct in December. So far, he has kept all of his Giant Surprise homebreds to race.

The man who owns him isn't the only one impressed with what Giant Surprise has produced so far. Trainer Gary Gullo has three of his offspring in the barn, one, so far unraced, for Repole, and two for Lew Mongelluzzo's Team Power Play.

"The ones I have are nice-looking, nice, big horses," said Gullo. "Giant Surprise didn't go to great mares, but he's still got runners. I think he's a good

sire for sure."

Team Power Play's Cause for Surprise became the stallion's fifth winner on Dec. 30, 2015; the filly they bought, Show Giant, has yet to break her maiden but finished third recently at Aqueduct.

"We're really enthusiastic about the stallion," said Mongelluzzo. "He's doing really well, and I've got a mare, Bird House, in New Mexico that I might bring back to breed to him."

Never one to aim low, Repole wants his stallion to become the #1 overall sire in New York, and he knows that the Giant Surprises will need to keep on winning, especially stakes races, to keep him in the minds of breeders.

To that end, Sudden Surprise, trained by Todd Pletcher, is pointed to the Feb. 6 Gander Stakes for New York-breds at a mile and 70 yards. The 3-year-old has won five of six, including four stakes races at seven furlongs or shorter, faltering only in the Sleepy Hollow Stakes at a mile. If he passes the distance test in the Gander, Repole will look at the March 5 Gotham Stakes (gr. III).

Though Giant Surprise's success as a stallion is a boon to New York breeding, it might also, as Robinson pointed out, potentially have a downside as well.

"A couple of people have told me that they could see him standing in Kentucky for \$30,000 in the next couple of years," she said. "Selfishly, I hope that's not true. We want him to be successful, but we'd love to keep him in New York. He's just a break-out stallion."




