Breeding, Racing, and Governor's 2018 Budget Proposal

IN MID-JANUARY, New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo released his 2018 Budget Proposal. As anticipated, the bill included a section on the re-privatization of the New York Racing Association and other issues of material importance to breeders. There is some very good news. There are also items that require further discussion and refinement, and I look forward to offering NYTB input in the upcoming legislative budget debates, hearings, and amendment process that run through March.

In one way, the very best news for breeding and racing interests was what this year's budget proposal omitted, namely any mention of a cap on video lottery terminal revenue for the racing sector. This was the most troubling and controversial part of the governor's 2016 re-privatization proposal and, as you know, the matter was deferred when the governor and legislature failed to reach an agreement last year.

I am also happy to report the bill enshrines in law the provision that if NYRA seeks to adjust the required 95 race-days during the winter season at Aqueduct, it must secure written agreement from NYTB and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. The importance of this measure to breeders and horsemen cannot be overstated. Finally, the bill contained the permission to run races at night occasionally at Belmont Park.

Areas in which we and/or the horsemen seek alterations, clarification, or refinement include (1) the matter of voting rights for breeder and horsemen representatives on the re-privatized NYRA board, (2) proposed expanded powers for the Franchise Oversight Board (FOB), and (3) the proposed distribution of the financial burden of drug testing.

As the re-privatization section is written, NYTB and NYTHA representatives who will sit on the new privatized NYRA board will not have voting rights. Both groups had a vote prior to the NYRA re-organization in 2012. As the most important stakeholders in the racing enterprise in New York, breeders and the horsemen are committed to recovering their right to vote on the NYRA board—the only thing that will make their inclusion meaningful. There appears to be support in the legislature for our view.

The overall constitution of the re-privatized NYRA board will consist of 15 voting members. Six members will be appointed by the State (four by the governor, one

each recommended by the Senate and Assembly) and eight by the executive committee of the NYRA reorganization board. The president and CEO of NYRA (ex officio) makes up 15.


Two matters in the proposal need further clarification. (1) The bill increases the powers of the FOB over NYRA, including the authority to "impound and escrow racing supporting payments" if NYRA experiences "two years of material losses due to circumstances within the control of the franchised corporation, as determined by the FOB." This needs to be spelled out and the criteria of "material losses" defined. (2) The Gaming Commission, which will now bid out for drug testing services, has the power to make an "assessment" for the costs "on horsemen entering horses in races...on racetracks or both." While horsemen and breeders realize that the industry must share the cost of testing, we are adamant the burden of the cost must be shared equitably among all stakeholders, including the Standardbred industry, and should be spelled out in specific terms.

I would like to point out that the lead-up period to the budget's release marked a significant advance for NYTB's involvement in Albany. Never before have NYTB and the horsemen had so many opportunities to communicate the agenda and concerns to the govenor's officials pre-budget.

We used the time well to educate legislators and make sure they are aware of our importance to the state's economy and of our successes and concerns. For example, as many of you know, NYTB was invited to testify last month at a senate hearing on the future of NYRA. I took the opportunity to paint a picture of our industry and review how we got where we are today. We zeroed in on a critically important issue discussed before in this column: the negative effect of Genting's re-assignment last year of 460 of their most lucrative VLTs to Nassau OTB. I project potential losses of nearly \$11 million in revenue to purses and the Fund, not to mention \$8.5 million to the racetrack operator in 2017 from this arrangement. I believe that elected officials understand and share our position that the Genting-Nassau OTB contract has produced an unintended consequence of diverting money from the equine sector and believe protections need to be put in place.


As always, I will keep you updated on all developments as we work toward the scheduled finalization of the budget by the end of March.

MIND YOUR BISCUITS' GRADE 1 CAPS OFF 2016

New York-bred Mind Your Biscuits capped off a successful 3-year-old run in 2016 by winning the grade 1 Malibu Stakes Dec. 26 at Santa Anita. The win over the quick Sharp Azteca added to his score at Saratoga in the Amsterdam Stakes (G2) and a solid third-place effort in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1; and moved up to second with the disqualification of runner-up Masochistic). The win pushed his career mark to 4-5-2 in 13 starts with earnings of \$795,366.

The son of perennial state-bred leading sire Posse races for J Stables, Head of Plains Partners, Michael Kisber, M. Scott Summers, Hope Summers, and Daniel Summers and is trained by 23-year-old Robert Falcone Jr. and was bred by Samantha Will's Jumping Jack Racing.

Will is the wife of Chris Baccari of Baccari Bloodstock and has only been involved in breeding since 2013.

"I've bred 20 mares in my lifetime, 12 under Jumping Jack Racing," she said. Jumping Jack refers to her background in the show jumping world.

"I had a good string of show jumpers and was able to compete all over North America," she said. "I spent a year with Michael Matz with me riding and him training me. I've been blessed my whole life with horses."

Will gives credit to her husband, Dr. Steve Allday, and Gary and Sue Lundy of Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, who foaled Mind Your Biscuits.

"I have a dream team with my husband who preps them and Dr. Steve Allday," she said. "We work hard. My father always said, 'You can't have a little luck without working hard.'"

Mind Your Biscuits is out of the Toccet mare Jazzmane. She foaled Mind Your Biscuits in March 2013 and later that year Baccari Bloodstock sold her to the Korean outfit K.O.I.D. for \$11,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

"She was a bit of an average looking mare and you never would have thought that Mind Your Biscuits would turn into a very beautiful colt," Will said. "After he won the Amsterdam, I found her half sister (Daryanna, by Friends Lake) and she's going to Into Mischief. I bought her sight-unseen and she was in Washington state, but when she got here, I couldn't believe what a beautiful mare she was when she walked off the trailer."


Mind Your Biscuits was sold to Machmer Hall for \$47,000 at the 2014 Keeneland January sale and then was offered as a Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling and an Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. 2-year-old sale without swapping hands.

"He was a very good-looking colt," Will said. "Who would think a Posse weanling would bring \$47,000? That was a pretty good hit. We sell New York-breds. If you take a Kentucky-sired New York-bred up there, a lot of people want them."

And why not. Will noted she made just under \$70,000 in breeder awards last year and just received a \$6,000 check when Mind Your Biscuits was moved up to second in the Breeders' Cup.

Will reported that the 2017 goal for Mind Your Biscuits, one of 13 New York-bred graded stakes winners of 2016, is a trip to Dubai for the \$2 million Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1).

Beautyinthepulpit to Buckridge in Kinderhook

Multiple stakes-placed winner Beautyinthepulpit has been retired to stud at Amy and Jody Boll's Buckridge Farm near Kinderhook.

Beautyinthepulpit, a son of top sire Pulpit, whose sons include Tapit, Lucky Pulpit, and Sky Mesa, won eight of 31 starts and earned \$410,627. His four

stakes-placings in 2014 include the Empire Classic Handicap, Kings Point Stakes, and Alex M. Robb Stakes against state-breds and an open-company placing in Laurel's Richard W. Small Stakes.

A winner at first asking by 8½ lengths in New York-bred maiden special weight company going six furlongs at Saratoga, Beautyinthepulpit won only on dirt and at distances from six to nine furlongs.

Beautyinthepulpit, bred by Albert Fried Jr., is out of the grade 2-winning Stolen Beauty (by Deputy Minister), who has also produced stakes winner Moonlightandbeauty (the dam of grade 3 winner Giant Moon and top New York-bred sprinter Moonlight Song), and stakes-placed winner Stolen Thunder.

Beautyinthepulpit will stand as the property of Buckridge for a private fee, with the stud fee waived for mares who have black type anywhere under the first two dams; who earned more than \$50,000 on the track; who have produced a winner of \$50,000 or more; and for breeders who send more than one mare per season.

"Beautyinthepulpit represents a unique opportunity for budget-conscious New York breeders," said Amy Boll. "Not only is he by Pulpit, one of the most sought-after sire of sires on the planet, he's also out of a New York graded stakes-winning Deputy Minister mare, and he's got the gorgeous shoulder you'd expect from that lineage. We're going to support him with our own mares — and we invite breeders to visit him in the coming months."

The deal to send Beautyinthepulpit to Buckridge was brokered by New Jersey-based bloodstock agent Michael Slezak.

Trainer Glenn DiSanto, 62, Passes

Trainer and breeder Glenn DiSanto, a veteran of the New York Racing Association circuit for more than three decades, died Jan. 14 after a battle with cancer. He was 62.

According to Equibase DiSanto saddled his first winner in 1991 when Hildaskova captured a maiden claimer at Aqueduct Racetrack. He amassed 49 career victories, including his last with Lotza Heat in 2015 at Belmont Park.

"I've known Glenn since I was a young man just gal-

loping horses," said NYRA steward Braulio Baeza Jr. "He was a great guy. Even when he was sick, he always had a pleasant and good-natured demeanor. Glenn was one of the nicest people and one of the few on the backstretch who would help you with whatever you needed in any way he could."

A native of Carmel, N.Y., DiSanto started with show horses at West Creek Farm near Sharon Springs, where he began his involvement with the state breeding program. He then purchased Summit View Farm near Greenwich in 1984.

DiSanto was one of the pioneers in the use of the Oklahoma Training Track during the offseason at Saratoga, boarding mares at his farms and raising the foals, allowing him to either sell them at auction as yearlings or continue to train them for owners.

DiSanto was also well known for his advocacy for retired Thoroughbred horses.

"He was a big supporter who did a lot for us," said Lisa Molloy, an executive director at ReRun Thoroughbred Adoption, a nonprofit whose mission is to rehabilitate, retrain, and find adoptive homes for Thoroughbred racehorses. "He would also tell people about the program. When his horses had finished running, he would take them home to live on his farm. Eventually he'd bring them over

'He was one of the best horsemen around," she added. "He knew what he was doing, and the animals just loved him."

DiSanto, who graduated from the horse management program at the State University of New York at Cobleskill, is survived by his wife, Melanie, and sons, Brett and Brendon.


State-Breds Sell Well in January


Forty-three New York-bred yearlings were consigned to Keeneland's five-day January sale (Jan. 9-13), with 29 of them reported as sold for an average of \$36,962. The figure outpaces the overall average of \$27,643 for the 376 yearlings sold—a sizable 33.7% lift. The median for the New York-breds, \$20,000, was double the sale's median of \$10,000.

Topping the state-bred offerings was a filly by Shanghai Bobby that sold in Book 1 for \$280,000. Offered as Hip 516 and purchased by Hunter Valley Farm, the dark bay or brown yearling was bred by Yehuda Cohen's Kingsport Farm, Chris Bernhard's Hidden Lake Farm, and David Campbell. She was consigned by Mulholland Springs.

"Her body is so mature that she looks like she will be a grand yearling," said Martha Jane Mulholland. "We knew she would sell well. A lot of people were very interested in her."





Late additions to New York's 2017 stallion roster

...and TWO to GROW On

BY EVAN HAMMONDS

TWO ADDITIONAL STALLIONS have entered the market for 2017 since the January issue of *New York Breeder* went to press. The other newcomers to New York are Scatman and Tapin Mojo.

Standing for a private fee at Foggy Bottom Farm near Geneseo is Scatman, one of the many talented runners by the late Scat Daddy. The two-time grade 1-winning Scat Daddy died in 2015 at age 11, leaving 79 stakes winners with several others in the pipeline. His bloodlines are highly sought after, and his colt out of Leslie's Lady was the highest-selling yearling of 2016 at \$3 million.

Scatman, out of the Grand Slam mare Hit It Here Café, won the grade 3 Aristides Stakes at Churchill Downs at 4 and was second the following year in 2014 while trying to repeat. He was a player on the Triple Crown trail at 3 in 2012, having placed behind Secret Circle in both the Southwest Stakes (G3) and Rebel Stakes (G2) at Oaklawn Park.

Scatman won five times and placed on six more occasions in 19 starts, earn-

An even later addition, Beautyinthepulpit (by Pulpit) joins the ranks in New York at Buckridge Farm near Kinderhook.



Also in Good Landing's immediate family is grade 1 winner and international sire More Than Ready.

Power Couple

TOGETHER, CHRIS BERNHARD of Hidden Lake Farm and Elaine Peck of Rhapsody Farm have become a tour de force in the hard-fought business of breeding and selling Thoroughbreds. Though their farms operate independently, the two began a working partnership approximately six years ago. The results have been absolutely remarkable, with at least one of the pair responsible for the top-seller in several of the most recent high-profile auctions.

Those sales achievements include the top-priced offering at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings—a filly by Lookin At Lucky sold to Mandy Pope of Whisper Hill Farm for \$270,000, consigned by Rhapsody Farm/Hidden Lake Farm, and a state-bred colt by Shanghai Bobby (bred by Bernhard and Anthony Grey) that topped the Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale of 2015 for \$140,000. That colt, out of the mare Electric Shock and a half brother to Fish Trappe Road (winner of the grade 3 Dwyer), brought \$200,000 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale.

"The partnership happened back when the breeding business was slanting downward, taking a real nose dive," said Bernhard, 44, who rode show horses as a pre-teen and then went on to break Thoroughbreds before he caught the racing bug. "We were being hit hard with RNAs, so we wanted to do something together and be cost effective in a turbulent economic environment. We wanted to devise some joint collaboration in which we could bring horses to the table. It was a naturally good mix for us because I'm not a boss, and Elaine is. She runs the shedrow during the sales, hires people, and does all of the

books. Elaine is very detail oriented. At a sale you need to cover all of your bases. The show wouldn't run without her. I love the public relations and selling part and try to support Elaine with the rest."

Perhaps the biggest boost to their business came when both Bernhard and Peck resolved to immerse themselves at the sales—to be there basically every minute, showing horses personally to clients, listening to feedback, and keeping their ears to the ground for evolving trends. In a sense their commitment would be the equal of automotive engineers from Chevrolet and Ford taking up residence at your local car dealership, pitching every sale and trying to gain a better understanding of the needs of each potential buyer.

"Every time I show up at a sale I learn something," said Bernhard. "You pick it up as you go along, learning from others. You're always learning something, whether it's about X-ray reports, vetting, heart scans, or measurements. There's a definite learning curve, and you can discover if there's a specific type of horse that clients have in mind."

Peck, 70, is a true pioneer among women in racing. She practically grew up on horseback and began barrel racing at rodeos. At age 17 Peck started exercising Thoroughbreds at a Massachusetts auction arena. She soon graduated to galloping horses at racetracks such as Lincoln Downs and Narragansett in Rhode Island. Several years later Peck was one of only two females to hold a trainer's license on the New England circuit. And though her barn wasn't sizable, when Peck saddled six winners during the first week of a race meeting, she was actually New England's leading trainer for a short period of time.

Does the nearly three-decade difference in their ages ever cause problems in communication for Bernhard and Peck?

"Chris and I are a good combo," Peck said. "He often refers to me as his other Mom. My husband teases me when Chris calls, 'It's your son on

the phone.' Naturally we have arguments like most partners or relationships. I annoy Chris on occasion and he annoys me. But it never goes much further than that. We're pretty good at talking problems out."

At the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall sale, the team of Bernhard and Peck topped the consignors list, selling 30 Thoroughbreds for \$768,200. The sale-topper at that event was a

chestnut colt from the first crop of Shackleford that brought \$150,000. Bred by Mares Rule II and foaled at Peck's Rhapsody Farm near Plymouth, the colt was the first foal out of Spanish Post (a multiple winner by Flatter in Canada), who was purchased by Peck and Bernhard for \$30,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale.

Coincidently, the pair has also

had great success in building each other's equine rosters. For example, Becky Thomas' Sequel Thoroughbreds offered Bernhard a few mares in-foal on a co-breeder contract. Bernhard had taken a mare named Unbridled Betty infoal to Freud. At the time Bernhard already had several mares bred to Freud, so he moved the mare along to Peck. The next year Unbridled Betty's son, Unbridled Command, won the 2012 Hollywood Derby (G1T). Peck subsequently did extremely well in selling both the weanling and Unbridled Betty in foal. A few years later Peck purchased the mare Electric Shock from Nursery Place for \$22,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November mixed sale in foal to Trappe Shot (eventually producing Fish Trappe Road). Peck sold her to Bernhard for \$1 the following year because she didn't want to carry an open mare.

"In choosing broodmares, I like to look at production records," Peck said. "We also look for mares that have 2-year-olds going to the track. If those babies come out racing and earn some black type, the mare's value increases. We've done well choosing broodmares, but there's also an element of luck and good timing that's involved.

"We work hard and try to pay attention," she continued. "We look for the right sire power, the right mares, and shoot for earlier cover dates. The four or five months of physical development (between horses born in January as compared to those foaled in April or May) really make a difference when you're selling weanlings and yearlings."

Bernhard also had a hand in breeding former New York Giants football coach Bill Parcells' 3-year-old colt Bavaro (by Freud), who is unbeaten in a pair of starts, including a speedy and sparkling gate-to-wire victory in the \$150,000 Great White Way Stakes as a freshman, part of the New York Stallion Series in December.

"Becky Thomas had always told me that Unbridled's Song mares (Bavaro is out of Chantess, by Unbridled's Song) mixed really well with Freud," Bernhard said. "I'd had success before with that combination with a yearling that I'd gotten \$100,000 for. When things like that work out on paper, on the track, and in the marketplace, I tend to stick with it. Bavaro was a very pretty pink baby with a nice walk. Carrie Brogden of Machmer Hall bought him to pinhook in 2014. That was a nice flip for her (Brogden acquired the weanling for \$20,000 and sold him to Parcells' August Dawn Farm for \$85,000). One of the most exciting parts of selling is when other people do well with the horses. I cheer just as hard. It keeps buyers coming back."

A high turnover rate is an essential part of the partners' philosophy, always trying to be in sync with the current pulse of the marketplace.

"We usually don't hang onto our mares for more than two or three years. We're always looking for fresh mares. And we love first-year stallions," said Peck.

Back in mid-December, Bernhard moved his base of operations, some 200 equines, to Barry Ostrager's Questroyal Stud North near Stillwa-

ter, part of Saratoga County. There he found an old friend in one of the farm's new stallions, Effinex, a grade 1-winning multi-millionaire by Horse of the Year Mineshaft.

"Effinex was born and raised with me at Hidden Lake Farm downstate (Otisville) so he is near and dear. I plan to support him with 25-plus mares in 2017. There has been a lot of outside interest in Effinex, so I am looking forward to him breeding a big book of nice mares," said Bernhard. "I did not intend on getting involved with a stallion for 2017 with our move to Saratoga being so hectic, but when Barry and I started speaking about the prospect I got really excited. He is truly the most accomplished horse to come off the track and stand in New York. Mineshaft's Dialed In was the leading freshman sire of 2016, and Effinex has an incredible family. I feel the stars are aligned."

"The breeders' awards in New York are a real nice incentive," said Peck. "I've always been one pushing for more stallion power in New York. I think Effinex is going to get a lot of attention."

Of course, every move isn't a winning or profitable one, and the business of breeding and selling Thoroughbreds can be difficult and exhausting.

"The sales days are long. There is so much to do prior to a sale, so you're already going 100 miles an hour. However, it doesn't matter how tired you are when the horses go in the ring; it's a rush," said Bernhard, who, along with Peck, has sold the sale-topping weanling two of the last four years at the Fasig-Tipton New York mixed sale. "You have to love what you do. The hours in this business—between foaling, sales prep, selling, and the New York winters—can be testing. The best advice I can give anyone starting out

is to listen to those who have done well. Take it in. You need to absorb information like a sponge. I have done this for a long time, and I still learn something new at every sale."

At the end of the day, though, whether the partners produce a sale-topper or not, Peck keeps a discerning and grateful eye on all that she's dedicated her life to achieve.

"Knowing that the horses are happy and healthy, that's a pure joy," said Peck. "Turning them out on a summer evening then watching the mares go off in one direction to graze and the babies go off in another to play and chase each other. Seeing that makes it all worth the hard work. Even though New York winters can be brutal, it's still both a privilege and a luxury to work with these beautiful and intelligent animals. How many people are fortunate enough to go to work and actually love what they do?"



Highway Star allows Chilean-born trainer Rodrigo Ubillo to come into his own

BEFORE THE GO FOR WAND Handicap (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack last Dec. 3, trainer Rodrigo Ubillo had run a horse in one graded stakes race in his 11 years as a trainer. In 2007 his Executive Search finished seventh in the Forego Stakes (G1) at Saratoga, a race won by Midnight Lute, voted that year's champion sprinter.

Nine years later, encouraged by the performance of 3-year-old filly Highway Star in the New York Stallion Series Staten Island Division, a race she won by 3¼ lengths in mid November over Aqueduct's main track, Ubillo took a second shot at a graded win, and this time he found his way to the winner's circle.

Though Highway Star was sent off as the fourth betting choice, Ubillo was typically modest post-race, standing next to owners and breeders Chester and Mary Broman.

"I didn't expect this," he said, "but it's very special."

And perhaps somehow fitting that the milestone came at the Ozone Park oval given the native of Chile had begun his career at Aqueduct when he came to the United States about 20 years ago.

Speaking little English, he arrived in New York in the dead of winter and lived on the backstretch of the racetrack in Queens, galloping horses for trainer Juan Ortiz. Though he had plenty of experience working with horses back home, his experience here was a rude awakening.

"I lived on the track because I had nowhere to go, and I didn't know anything," he said. "It was February, and I came with just one suitcase and no winter clothes. After about a week I was like, 'OK, I've had enough of this.'"

Accustomed to the more temperate climate of his home near Santiago, he galloped horses without gloves in the frigid winds that swept into Aqueduct off nearby Jamaica Bay, then would plunge his freezing hands into hot water back at the barn.

"I wanted to cry," he said.

Two decades later Ubillo is at ease on one of the first cold mornings this winter,

standing inside his Belmont Park barn after exercising one of the 14 horses currently in his stable. The man who once wanted to be a jockey tries to get on all of his horses every morning, and while the schedule doesn't always permit him to, he makes a point of riding each one at least every other day.

"It really does help me as a trainer to know how the horse is doing," he said. "It's one thing to watch them from afar, but being on them, you feel a lot more things than just by looking at them."

The son of a housekeeper, Ubillo speaks frankly about the poverty in the area in which he grew up, seeing horse racing as a way to escape those circumstances. Two of his uncles were jockeys—"to me they were like superheroes," he said—and as a teenager, he headed to the track to try to follow in their footsteps.

Soon growing too big to be a jockey, he settled into the backstretch as a groom, and he hit a jackpot of sorts when one of his horses, Enfático, won the Chilean Derby in 1994. When Enfático was retired to become a stallion, Ubillo got a chance to come to the U.S., thanks to his boss and mentor, trainer Carlos Urbina.

"He brought me into his office one day, and the first thing I think is, 'OK, I'm getting fired,' "Ubillo remembered. "Then he said, 'What would you think about going to work in the United States?'

"I was living with my parents," he recalled, "and he told me that he had a friend in the U.S. It was so exciting and the first thing that came out of my mouth was, 'Of course! Yes!'"

Urbina oversaw the immigration process for him, setting him up with a visa that enabled him to work in this country. After his stint with Ortiz, Ubillo went on to work for Shug McGaughey, Christophe Clement, and Nick Zito, and was an assistant to Phil Serpe.

"I first hired him as a rider," said Serpe. "He's a top, top-shelf rider, and he's really good with horses. He was also very diligent about his work around the barn, and a guy you could trust doing anything. He was an excellent employee, and I could always count on him."

Despite all of that experience, Ubillo didn't feel quite ready to go out on his own, and, in the meantime, he had married Jane McMahon, the daughter of Joe and Anne McMahon of Saratoga's McMahon Thoroughbreds. He worked at the McMahon farm for two years, returning briefly to Serpe's barn, then went out on his own in 2005.

Joe McMahon gave Ubillo a few horses to get his stable started, and, soon, other owners followed suit.

His first stakes win came with a horse bred by McMahon when Dr. D.F.C. won the Solomon Northup Stakes at Saratoga Race Course on Aug. 9, 2008. Though the horse would later be owned by a partnership that included McMahon, on that day he ran in the name of Thomas Paluck's August Forever Stable. Paluck, nearly a decade later, still has horses with Ubillo.

The owner of TSP Capital Management Group in Summit, N.J., Paluck is drawn to the trainer because he sees in him some of the principles that he applies to his own business.

"I've managed money for the last 50 years," said Paluck, "and I have to put clients above my personal goals and

needs. Rodrigo puts the horses first, and that's why I'm so comfortable with him. He's the only guy I know that will take care of the horses more than taking care of my financial interests."

The year of that first stakes win, a gray/roan colt was foaled in upstate New York. Bred by Chester and Mary Broman, other longtime Ubillo clients, Bigger Is Bettor further raised the trainer's profile by winning three stakes races, including the Albany Stakes in 2011 and the Evan Shipman Stakes two years later, both at Saratoga.

"He really loved Saratoga, that horse," said Ubillo.


Ubillo now trains half a dozen horses for the Bromans, voted New York breeders of the year in 2004, 2011, and 2014; he began training for them in 2009 and credits them with much of his success, so it is fitting that his first graded stakes win came with one of their horses.

"He's a big part of this," Ubillo said of Broman. So, too, is Paluck, who is intensely loyal to the trainer.

"I know about his past and his background," said Paluck. "He was raised very poor, and he got really lucky to come to the U.S. with some good advice from people in Chile. I don't think his adjustment to the U.S. was easy. He's gone through a lot of ups and down, and I trust him implicitly."

Back home in Chile, being a groom meant galloping horses and walking them, in addition to rubbing and feeding them, so while Ubillo didn't find the work terribly challenging when he got to New York, other obstacles tested his decision to come to the U.S., not the least of which was the language barrier.

"I had high grades in English in school," he said, "but it was still hard when I got here. I remember people asking me things, and I didn't want to be not

pleasant, so I always said 'yes,' even when I didn't know what they were asking me."

He was also relatively young and completely alone, without friends or family in the area, but despite at times wanting to give up, he forced himself to stay.

"I had to encourage myself," he said.

"Back home there were no opportunities; no matter what you do, you're stuck. Here, there were opportunities if you're hungry enough and brave enough."

He has three children with his former wife, and is, says Paluck, "a great father." He hasn't made the 11-hour flight back to Chile in more than a decade, finding it hard to take time away from his stable, nor has his family—two brothers and two sisters—been to the States to visit him.

"You don't think that (it's giving up) a lot, but if you sit down and start thinking about it...I don't do that often," he said.

That pragmatism informs his approach to his horses.

"Horse racing is like life," he observed. "I would say life is not fair, but you have to keep trying. You can't quit because if you do, you have no goals. You have nothing.


"But races are races," he continued. "Sometimes you think you have a good horse or you think you're going to win a race, and then your balloons get popped."

"His horses always look good on the track," said Serpe. "He does a great job, and I'm really proud of him."


Echoed Paluck, "He's an honest, good, hard-working horse trainer. And he loves horses.

"I've always joked with him about needing to win a stakes race with a number after it, and now he's done it," Paluck went on. "Now I'm going to start pulling for him to do it again.

"Hopefully," he added, "with one of my horses."



Haul Anchor, Bonita Bianca close '16 with stakes wins

Haul Aboard

WHEN THE TRACK CAME UP MUDDY for the Dec. 29 Damon Runyon Stakes at Aqueduct, breeder/owner Chester Broman got a call from trainer Kiaran McLaughlin about their 2-year-old Haul Anchor, entered to run in the \$100,000 race.

"He said, 'I think I want to scratch,' " recounted Broman. "We don't want to go in the mud. There's another race in two weeks.' "

Haul Anchor's previous start had come Oct. 22, 2016, at Belmont Park in the Sleepy Hollow Stakes, run at a mile and over a sloppy track. He finished eighth, the first time he hadn't finished first or second in five starts.

Nonetheless, Broman challenged his trainer's thinking.

"I said 'Why don't we see if he really doesn't like (the mud)?' " Broman asked. "And if we're a failure, OK."

McLaughlin agreed, and a few hours later his assistant Joe Lee was standing in the winner's circle after Haul Anchor won the Damon Runyon by 4½ lengths as a 13-1 shot.

The typically understated Broman said: "It worked out well."

Jockey Cornelio Velasquez guided Haul Anchor from post 4 to the rail and assumed the lead heading in the first turn. Maintaining a short advantage, they held off a contending Mo Maverick before shaking him off in the stretch.

"My horse was fast from the gate, and (Mo Maverick) was sent (to the front)," said Velasquez. "My horse always wants to go on the lead, and I tried not to pull him too much. The other horse moved out a little bit and gave me a break. I had a lot of horse at the quarter-pole. Today he ran big."

"(Velasquez) rode the horse perfect," said Broman. "He's won a lot of races for me."

The Broman homebred is by Bernardini out of the Storm Cat mare Whichwaydidshego, who has also produced Hard to Stay Notgo and Mark My Way, both six-figure earners and multiple stakes winners. Whichwaydidshego is in foal to Malibu Moon and will be bred in 2017 to Will Take Charge.

"We always thought Haul Anchor could go long (because of his breeding)," said Lee. "In the morning he gallops really well, a mile and a half most days, and it doesn't really take anything out of him."

Reflecting on the horse's poor performance in the Sleepy Hollow, Lee pointed out that an off track at Belmont and an off track at Aqueduct are not the same thing.

"The surface today was really nice and tight and sealed," he said.

Haul Anchor came to the race off a bit of a break, one that was initially going to be longer, but, according to Lee, "He was doing so well we decided to keep going on him. He's filled out and grown up a little bit and put on some weight.

"I'm happy we kept going."

Haul Anchor's first stakes win pushed his record to 6-2-3-0 and earnings of \$143,000.

Killer B

A little more than a year ago owners Michael Imperio and Michael Dubb took the family of their trainer Rudy Rodriguez out to dinner. They're known for naming their horses after members of the Rodriguez family, and at some point, 8-year-old Bianca, the daughter of Rudy's brother and assistant trainer Gustavo, pointed out that no horse had yet been named for her.

Before dinner was over the name had been chosen: Bonita Bianca. Now, they just had to buy the horse.

That happened last spring at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-old sale when Dubb and Imperio, along with partner Bethlehem Stables, purchased the daughter of Curlin out of the Artax mare Friendly Michelle for \$97,000.

And on Dec. 30, 2016, with Bianca in attendance, her namesake won her second stakes race, taking the \$98,000 East View Stakes at a mile and 70 yards by 5¼ lengths.

Lagging far behind—almost off the monitor screen—in the early going over an inner track rated "good," Bonita Bianca seemed in no hurry to make up

ground on the field. Coming into the far turn, however, she circled her rivals with relative ease and pulled away at will.

It was not the trip Imperio had expected.

"We thought she'd be close," he said after the race, "but (jockey) Irad (Ortiz Jr.) said she was so lazy he had to ride her into the first turn."

Bred by Dormelito Stud, Bo- § mita Bianca came to the East View off her lone loss in three previous races, a distant third in the Demoiselle Stakes (G2) last November, a race in which she also tried to come from off the pace. She had successfully employed that tactic in her maiden-breaker at Belmont Park in September.

"She's a little lazy," said Ortiz. "You have to work hard. I worried maybe we were a little too far back, so I was riding the whole way. I hit her once, and she started to pick it up and she got there."

"We feel like she's still a little green," said Dubb. The filly is on a break now at the Fair Hill training facility in Maryland. "We might tinker with blinkers to try to get her into the race a little sooner. We'll target some of the longer races in the spring."



This is the filly's second stint at Fair Hill; she spent some time at Bruce and Amy Jackson's Fair Hill Equine Therapy Center shortly after being purchased.

"She didn't work particularly well, and because of her breeding, (blood-stock agent) Kim Valerio drilled down and really felt like she didn't work because she had bucked shins," said Dubb. "So we bought her and sent her to Fair Hill and gave her several months and corrected the shins, and sure enough, that was the issue.

"It feels like she'll run all day, and we'd love to compete her in open company if it's the right thing to do," he continued. "If not, we're very content to have a very nice, New York-stake type 3-year-old filly." ?

Paul Pompa Jr. watched as front-running horses posted win after win in race after race, and wondered how his New York-bred Send It In, who has won most of his races coming from off the pace, would fare in the \$100,000 Alex M. Robb Stakes.

Quite well, as it turned out, with the 4-year-old bay gelding posting a 3¾-length victory over state-breds to earn his first stakes win in his first stakes attempt.

"I was worried about the bias," Pompa admitted. "There's been a big speed bias, and he really wants a target."

He found that target in Iron Power and Becker's Galaxy, who ran neck-and-neck on the lead while Send It In and jockey Manuel Franco sat three lengths off them in the three-path down the backstretch.

Taking them on coming around the final turn, Send It In surged to the lead at the eighth pole and cruised home unchallenged as the 3-5 favorite, running the 11/16 miles in 1:45.41. His seventh win from 14 starts pushed the homebred's earnings to \$338,414.

"I just let him do his thing," said Franco of the horse who has also won on the lead. "I tried to get close to the pace, and it worked out. When I asked, he gave it to me today. He's a nice horse. I trust him."

Send It In is by 2008 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands and Preakness Stakes (both G1) winner Big Brown, whom Pompa purchased as a 2-year-old for \$190,000. Big Brown debuted on turf at Saratoga in September 2007, winning by 11¼ lengths. Shortly thereafter, Pompa sold a 75% interest in him for an undisclosed price to IEAH Stables.

Though Pompa doesn't own any interest in Big Brown, who stands in New York at Dutchess Views Farm, he wants to have "a few" of the stallion's offspring.

Pompa campaigned Send It In's dam, Sharp Instinct, after purchasing her for \$275,000 as a yearling, retiring her in 2010 with a record of 7-3-0-1 and earnings of \$80,176. Pompa sold her in foal to Big Brown at the 2014 Keeneland January sale. Send It In is her first foal.

"He's been a stellar performer," said Pompa of Send It In. "I'm very proud of him. I had the mother and I had the father, and he's just tremendous."

Big Brown ranks fourth on the New York general sires list in 2016 with \$3,649,865 in earnings. His most accomplished offspring was Dortmund, a multiple grade 1 winner whose victories include the 2016 Santa Anita Derby.

The Alex Robb was Send It In's second race off a nearly nine-month layoff, a result of a spiral fracture suffered after winning an allowance optional claiming race over the Aqueduct inner track March 12. He finished second by a neck in his comeback race Dec. 9.

Pompa had indicated after the Robb he was considering the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) for Send It In, but after exploring his options for getting into the race he declined to pursue it.

"The proposal wasn't to my liking," he said. "And he's a New York-bred, and I like to support New York racing. If we run there, we forfeit races on the inner track that he loves."

Send It In has won four of his last five races on Aqueduct's inner track, finishing second by a neck in another. He may start next in the Haynesfield Stakes at Aqueduct Feb. 11.




