

The Big A Makes It Pay

s you are all aware, the New York Racing Association recently dropped six scheduled live race days from its Aqueduct inner track meet. Several factors have converged to get us to this point, but to me the most important by far is the decline in the New York foal crop in the last few years.

This is an issue I've been talking about for some time—at our annual members' meetings, at legislative hearings, and in other presentations. Not long after I joined New York Thoroughbred Breeders, it became clear to me that there would be a significant reduction of horses of racing age about this time and that NYRA, which depends heavily on New Yorkbreds to maintain its year-round schedule, would begin to be hardpressed to fill races.

In short, it was inevitable that the reduced number of potential starters in the horse population should lead at some point to a reduction in racing days at NYRA. Regardless of the dropped racing days, however, no one should lose sight of the fact that maintaining a winter racing program at Aqueduct is absolutely essential to the well-being of our newly thriving breeding program and to the overall success of the racing program in New York.

The numbers tell the story. Last year by far the greatest number of state-bred restricted races in the state were run at Aqueduct: 313, compared with 220 at Belmont and 94 at Saratoga. Accordingly, Aqueduct saw the greatest number of New York-bred starters and starts in restricted races (1,178 starters; 2,613 starts) compared to Belmont (983 starters, 1,974

starts) and Saratoga (567 starters, 813 starts). Maybe not so obvious, purses for restricted races at Aqueduct, which totaled \$15,180,020 last year, were the biggest of the three NYRA tracks (\$13,143,320 at Belmont; \$6,308,200 at Saratoga).

In other words, Aqueduct is the biggest source of racing opportunities and purse money for New York-breds and, as you know, these factors, combined with incentive awards, are what attract buyers to the horses you breed.

Beyond the auction ring, however, winter racing at Aqueduct is the foundation of New York's racing program. Nobody will argue that winter racing at Aqueduct is NYRA's most glamorous product, but as the only NYRA meet where revenue from handle exceeds purse distributions, Aqueduct, in effect, bankrolls Belmont and Saratoga. Aqueduct racing is what makes the whole system work. Also important to note—and this is a topic near and dear to our governor and to all residents of the Empire Stateyear-round racing is one of the reasons our industry is able to create and sustain so many jobs from the breeding shed to the shedrow.

Although there has been some loose talk about future changes to winter racing at Aqueduct, I firmly believe the facts I've just outlined will not ultimately be lost on the decision-makers, from the governor, to the new NYRA board, to the racetrack management. Still, it makes sense to give these facts an airing so there is a clear understanding of the underlying reason for the current reduction in race dates and the real issues at stake.





NERUD CELEBRATES 100TH BIRTHDAY

Hall of Fame trainer John Nerud, who oversaw champions Dr. Fager, Gallant Man, and Ta Wee, turned 100 Feb 9. A celebration including 50-60 close friends and family members gathered at the Sands Point Golf Club near his home in Old Brookville, N.Y., the following day.

Nerud, who had been in the hospital just a week earlier, showed no ill effects from his ordeal and was as sharp and alert as ever as he greeted guests, watched slide and video presentations of his life and career, and addressed the group with the usual eloquence, wit, and straightforwardness that has always defined him.

"I want to thank all you people for coming," Nerud said. "Some of you came great distances and I appreciate it and I'm happy you're here. And I want to thank my three friends (Joe Saggese, John Confort, and Al Weiss) for putting on this party. You did a wonderful job."

After Nerud, Weiss was the first to speak. "About 10 years ago we had a very nice party at Aqueduct to celebrate John's 90th birthday," he said. "The last thing John said to everyone was, 'Make sure you

take good care of yourself; you're all invited to my 100th.' I don't know what he's going to say now."

Nerud trained 27 stakes winners and had more than 1,000 wins in a training career that began in 1935 and continued through 1978. He developed the Tartan Farms breeding program and was instrumental in transforming Ocala, Fla., into a major Thoroughbred center. He helped found the Breeders' Cup and was inducted into racing's Hall of Fame in 1972. He is its oldest living member. Nerud was honored with a lifetime achievement award by the New York Thoroughbred Breeders in 2009. He is also a director emeritus of NYTB.

Born in Minatare, Neb., on Feb. 9, 1913, Nerud developed his first champion, the sprinter Delegate, in 1949. Nerud's best horse was Hall of Famer Dr. Fager, the 1968 Horse of the Year. Other champions trained by Nerud include Hall of Famer Ta Wee, Dr. Patches, and Intentionally.

"Mr. Nerud enjoyed one of the greatest careers of any trainer in the 20th century, and we wish him a happy 100th birth-day and continued good health," said Christopher Dragone, director of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. "Mr. Nerud built a reputation that has stood the test of time, and he has been a tremendous ambassador for the sport of Thoroughbred racing."

In an effort to preserve Nerud's legacy and to allow friends and admirers an opportunity to send Nerud a birthday greeting, a website at www.johnnerud.com has been developed. The site, created by LGB, allows its visitors to post comments, anecdotes, tales, myths, stories, and a greeting.

BIG PLANS FOR FIRST-YEAR SIRE MISSION IMPAZIBLE

Twin Creeks Farm has announced that 21 of its Kentucky-based mares have been booked to multiple grade II-winning millionaire Mission Impazible for the 2013 breeding season. The first-year stallion by Unbridled's Song stands at Becky Thomas and Dennis Narlinger's Sequel Stallions in New York, which will also serve as the new home for the 21 mares, all of which will now be eligible for New York's lucrative breeding program.

Out of the multiple graded stakes-producing mare

La Paz, Mission Impazible is set to stand his first season in 2013 at Sequel Stallions near Hudson, for a fee of \$7,500 stands and nurses.

"We have handpicked an outstanding group of mares at Twin Creeks Farm to breed to Mission Impazible in hopes of giving him the best opportunity to become New York's leading sire," said Randy Gullatt of Twin Creeks. "New York has the best state-bred program for breeders and racehorse owners, and we're excited about being involved in New York."

Of the 21 mares chosen, 17 have earned black type in their careers, including 13 stakes winners. Notables include grade I performers Queen of Hearts and Unspoken Word, and graded stakes winners Little Miss Holly and Nashinda. Notable among the top producers is Deputy Reality, the dam of the grade Ilwinning Teeth of the Dog, who was a top 3-year-old in 2012 in New York.

Mission Impazible scored his most important wins on the track in the 2010 Louisiana Derby (gr. II) and 2011 New Orleans H. (gr. II), and was runner-up in three grade I races: the Donn Handicap in 2012 and the Clark and Stephen Foster handicaps in 2011. Mission Impazible finished in the money in 13 of 21 starts, which included 17 graded stakes races—eight of which were grade Is. He earned \$1,284,949.

First Foals

Multiple graded stakes winner **D' Funnybone's** first foal arrived Feb. 5 at
Dr. Bernardo Mongil's Monhill Farm near
Pine Plains. The foal, a filly bred by Mike
Schrader, is out of Ballado Hill, a winning
daughter of Saint Ballado and producer of
two multiple winners.

A multiple grade II-winning 6-year-old chestnut son of D'wildcat, D' Funnybone stands at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple Farm for a 2013 fee of \$3,500.

Joe and Anne McMahon report that Double Dinghy Day (by Forestry) has produced the first foal by grade I winner **Here Comes Ben**. The filly arrived Jan. 31 at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

Bred by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, the filly is the second foal for Double Dinghy Day, a multiple winner and earner of more than \$180,000.

Here Comes Ben, a son of champion Street Cry and a winner of Saratoga's Forego Stakes (gr. I), was retired to stud in late 2011. He stands for \$7,500 live foal at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds and is the property of his breeders Brandon and Marianne Chase in partnership with McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

Gallagher's Stud has come a long way in its 25 years n the 1970s, Jerome Brody was one of New York City's most celebrated restaurateurs, overseeing establishments such as the Rainbow Room, Gallagher's Steak House, and the Oyster Bar in Grand Central Terminal.

But even those iconic destinations weren't immune from the recession that gripped the nation, and Jerry, as he was known, felt the anxious effects of the troubling economic times.

So his wife, Marlene, who describes herself as a country girl, decided her husband, who had spent most of his life in Manhattan, needed to get out of the city for a little rest and relaxation.

They had met in France in the '60s, when he was expanding his restaurant business to Europe and his Paris office was looking for a bilingual employee.

"I was bilingual," said Marlene simply, "and that's where it started."

They were married in 1964.

To escape the pressures of his business, she brought him upstate, where they rented a "tiny house" in Columbia County. Embracing rural life as enthusiastically as he had the urban hospitality industry, Jerome before long

it's no surprise that GIROLAMO has quickly become one of the most sought after stallions in New York.

began looking for a place to buy. He and Marlene wanted room for their visiting grandchildren and, she said, "some animals."

The daughter of a sheep rancher in Sri Lanka, Marlene was no stranger to agricultural life, and in 1976, she and Jerome bought a 100-acre farm and began breeding and raising Black Angus cattle. Despite an utter lack of knowledge about the industry, they bred two champions within three years.

In 1978, the Brodys' Patriot, a bull named for his Fourth of July birthday, took top honors at the National Western Stock Show in Denver, a cattle breeding event likened to the Kentucky Derby (gr. I). Racing fans, however, might see it as closer to the Preakness Stakes (gr. I): An article on the show noted that with the victory, Patriot had won two-thirds of the breeders' Triple Crown.

Patriot didn't get the third jewel, but the Brodys did taste triple crown glory when their Angus cow Manhattan Gal won supreme champion honors in three top cattle shows.

Jerome soon realized that while cattle breeding brought him prestige and pleasure, it was never going to bring him profits. Marlene Brody had ridden horses earlier in her life, so when Jerome asked her "What should we do next?" her answer was: "Thoroughbreds."

After deciding to raise cattle, the Brodys first went to a local Angus farmer for advice. When they decided to raise horses, they went to a bartender.

"We went to the bartender at Gallagher's, and we asked him, 'Who's the best trainer?' " Marlene reminisced.

"P.G. Johnson," was the answer, so the Brodys contacted him and went to their first Thoroughbred auction, a New York-bred sale in Saratoga where, Marlene said, she "fell in love" with a filly, only to be rebuffed by her husband, who thought the trainer should make the decisions about which horses to purchase.

Johnson knew Brody wanted to breed horses, so he counseled buying a colt "to make all the money," then purchase mares at the fall sales.

But when the filly that had caught Marlene's eye entered the ring, Johnson turned to Jerome and said, "Do you really like her?"

As Marlene remembers it, "Jerome looked at me, I said 'yes,' and we bought her."

Named Manhattan Gal in honor of their champion heifer, the filly would go on to finish in the money in 17 of 21 starts, winning the Steuben Handicap at Finger Lakes and placing in five other stakes.

And the colt they bought?

"He did nothing," said Marlene.

Jerome Brody died in 2001, but Marlene has carried on his work, both on the farm and in the restaurants. She is still involved with the Oyster Bar, but the sale of Gallagher's, known for its handicapping seminars, was finalized in February.


She spends six months of the year in Florida; in her absence the farm is overseen by Mallory Mort, who came to Gallagher's Stud shortly after graduating from Penn State with a bachelor's degree in animal production.

"We talk practically every day," she said. "He is a very, very special farm manager and horseman. He's curious and interested in details.

"And very intelligent," she added. "That helps."

Spread over 550 acres near Ghent, N.Y., about 60 miles south of Saratoga Springs, Gallagher's Stud is currently home to approximately 50 horses; Brody and Mort are expecting about 13 foals this year. Decades after the first foal was born at the farm, her hopes are the same as they were when she welcomed the first crop.

"When you get into it," she said, "you hope that you breed a good horse. You hope that you can breed a stakes winner.

"You do the best you can, and then luck takes over. Some of the best-bred horses can't run a lick. The horses you keep to race are the ones that aren't perfect for the sales, and they can bring you lots of joy, lots of pleasure."

She told the story of Allez Milord, a Tom Rolfe colt out of the Bold Reasoning mare Why Me Lord whom the Brodys entered in the 1984 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale. When he didn't meet his reserve—"Nobody wanted him," Marlene said—Jerome

thought that perhaps the horse might be better suited for a racing career in Europe.

The Brodys reached out to trainer Guy Harwood, who, according to Marlene, took the horse reluctantly, and only after several overtures.

"'If you want me to train him, I'll train him,' " she remembered Harwood saying.

Allez Milord won his first start, at Goodwood May 21—Jerome's birth-day—after which, said Marlene, Harwood sent them a letter saying, "From now, I'll train him as a good horse."

"So we wondered," she said with a laugh, "how was he training him before?"

Allez Milord would go on to win the Gordon Stakes (Eng-III) at Goodwood and the Puma Europa Preis (Ger-I) at Koln; he was second in the Japan Cup (Jpn-I), losing by such a scant margin that the Brodys thought he had won. He was the first New York-bred to race in the Epsom Derby (Eng-I), finishing 10th, but, said Brody, he was only five lengths from the winner.

His final win came in the 1987 Oak Tree Invitational Handicap (gr. IT) for trainer John Gosden. German champion Allez Milord retired with earnings of \$673,273 and stood at the Shadai Stallion Station in Hokkaido. He died in 1995.

The farm's top money-earner is Saint Lyphard (Lyphard—Montage, by Alydar), who earned \$1,607,833 racing overseas; other Gallagher's Stud success stories are the stakeswinning Borrowing Base (\$515,421) and stakes winner and graded stakesplaced Icabad Crane (\$580,895), and graded stakes winner Adcat (\$435,597), and Rahys' Appeal (\$470,638).

Mark Hennig trained Adcat for the Gallaghers and their ownership partners; he was a homebred by Storm Cat, out of the Riverman mare Adorable Micol, New York broodmare of the year in 2000. Adcat won five of 28 starts, including the Mohawk Handicap and New Hampshire Sweepstakes Handicap (gr. III), and was named New York turf champion in 1999 and 2000.

"Adcat was a neat, useful horse who got better with age," Hennig recalled. "He was a nice horse; and I had a lot of fun with him."

Hennig also has fond memories of the horse's breeder.

"Mr. Brody was quite a character," he said. "Most people would say he was tough, but I could see the spark in his eye when he was trying to be that way."

Rahys' Appeal, who won the Top Flight Handicap (gr. II) in 2006, was trained by Tom Bush, who has been training Brody horses for more than a decade.

"Mrs. Brody is a wonderful lady and a very good horsewoman," he said. "And she's got one of the nicest farms in New York, by far. There's no question about that. She raises a good horse."

Bush is enthusiastic—if patiently so—about a Gallagher filly he's currently training in Florida.

Celesta is by Bernstein out of Adorahy (Rahy); Bush trained her half sister, the stakes winner Our Golden

Dream, for another owner, and while Celesta's road to the races hasn't been easy, he's looking forward to starting her soon.

"She got off to a terrible start, and we couldn't figure it out," he said, referring to a ninth-place finish at Aqueduct in her only race. "But we brought her down here and she's doing great. She's definitely going to need the grass, and we may run her in another week or 10 days."

In Florida in frigid early February, Brody spoke warmly about the horses she's looking forward to seeing this year. The Gallagher-bred Glowing Ember was purchased at the 2011 Saratoga New York-bred sale for \$53,000 by Dogwood Stable, and the Bernstein colt (Fanfire, by Elusive Quality) broke his maiden at Aqueduct Feb. 3 after finishing second in his first start in November.

"He's the brightest one on the horizon," she said, in what seemed to be an unintended pun on his name.

Inimitable Romanee (Maria's Mon—Cellars Shiraz, by Kissin Kris) began her racing career in England, where she broke her maiden before coming to the United States. She hit the board in seven of 10 starts in the United States last year, finishing second four times.

"She'll do better than ever this year," said Brody.

Another top prospect could be their Tapit—Adorahy colt who sold to

Spendthrift Farm for \$450,000 at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale—the top price for a New Yorkbred yearling in 2012.

Undeniably passionate about breeding and racing horses, Brody turns a more skeptical eye on the racing industry.

While the farm neither bought nor sold at the Fasig-Tipton New York October sale in Saratoga last fall, both Brody and Mort see it as a good opportunity to sell weanlings; they maintain a more cautious stance about the sale of horses of racing age and broodmares.

Said Mort, who sits on the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, "The market has rebounded fairly nicely since the racino opened at Aqueduct (in October 2011); it's definitely given us a boost. The biggest problem in the near horizon is that there aren't enough horses for the number of racing days we have in New York.

"Next year," he continued, "the smaller crops are going to be ready for the races, and it's going to be a problem."

Brody added emphatically, "I frankly think that racing should be suspended for the whole of January and February, and half of March. There's too much racing, and that's one of the big problems the industry has."

She's also critical of the types of races being carded in New York. "Too

many races at six furlongs," she observed. "It gets boring."

She has not, in the face of a changing racing landscape, adjusted the way she breeds her horses, determined to produce a horse that by contemporary standards might be considered "old school."

"I want to breed a Thoroughbred that can go a distance, not one that's bred to go five furlongs," she declared.

Though fervent and resolute, she can also turn a good-humored eye on herself.

"Most people think we're nuts," she said, a trace of impishness in her lilting English accent. Then she re-considered. "I think that there are other people out there who think as I do."

A cemetery on the farm honors its influential broodmares; marked by a sculpture of mares and foals created by a local artist, it represents the quarter-century that Gallagher's Studhas been in existence.


In a business that stretches back centuries, 25 years isn't all that long, but the farm in upstate New York that began as a side business has taken its place firmly in the chronicles of New York racing. In 2000 the Brodys were recognized by New York Thoroughbred Breeders as breeders of the year, and from 1994 until 1999 Jerome served on the board of directors of the New York State Breeding and Development Fund.

And while at times disappointed in the direction that racing has taken, at this time of year, Brody is reminded of why she does it, and of why she and her late husband got into this business to begin with. New foals are being born, and young horses are getting ready to make it to the races.

"We have what we hope are some exciting 2- and 3-year-olds who haven't started," she said. "Of course, you always have some disappointment; you have bad years and then things pick up again."

She added, "And hope springs eternal."



espite sporting a race record of one win from 12 starts and \$44,016 in earnings, Freud was quite a coup when New York state landed the stallion for its breeding program.

What the colt with all of the genetic tools and three white stockings had going for him was his pedigree and his legendary big brother. However, the stud book is filled of half and full brothers to top horses that didn't make it as sires, so he would still have to make his own way. Now, with eight full crops in training, Freud has more than delivered.

Freud is a son of Storm Cat out of Mariah's Storm, by Rahy, His full brother, Giant's Causeway, was celebrated in Europe as the "Iron Horse." A winner of five consecutive group I races at 3 in 2000 for the Coolmore contingent and trainer Aidan O'Brien, he came stateside to run second, beaten just a neck by Tiznow in his first start on dirt in the \$5 million Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I).

Freud, a maiden winner at a mile in his fifth start, was able to land a third-place finish in the six-furlong Cork & Orrery Stakes (Eng-II) at Royal Ascot.

Regardless of the disparity in their talent on the track, both horses have gone on to be successes in the stallion ranks. Giant's Causeway has been North America's leading sire by progeny earnings three times in the last four years. Freud has made his way at Seguel Stallions in the Empire State during a period when the mare population dwindled and the state-bred program was floundering. He's still managed to sire 30 stakes winners-including two grade I winners-and as the state's Thoroughbred breeding program has gone through a resurgence, has found himself among the state's elite sires.

While his foal numbers waned a bit due to the economic climate a few years back, his grade I successes afforded him the opportunity to shuttle to La Levenda in Argentina, where his first foals will hit the racetrack later this year. Seguel even ceased their stallion operations for the 2010 breeding season, moving Freud to Keane Stud. Sequel re-opened for the 2012 breeding season.

Freud finished fourth on the New

York general sire list for 2012 with more than \$3.8 million in progeny earnings. The three stallions ahead of Freud had all begun their stud careers in Kentucky and had at least 55 more starters on the year than the Sequel Stallions star.

Freud had five stakes winners in 2012. His top earner was William J. Punk Jr. and Philip DiLeo's Hessonite, a winner of back-to-back grass stakes at Saratoga and a twotime stakes winner on the turf at Belmont Park. After earning \$50,000 for running second in the Dr. James Penny Memorial Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Parx, the then 4-year-old filly won the Irish Linnet and Yaddo stakes at the Spa. At Belmont Hessonite won the nine-furlong John Hettinger Stakes and the Ticonderoga Stakes. In between she ran fifth in the Flower Bowl Invitational Stakes (gr. IT). She is out of the Manila mare Lakab and was bred in New York by Berkshire Stud and Waterville Lake Stables.

Also bred by Berkshire Stud, Mr. Vegas won the Colonel E.R. Bradley Handicap (gr. IIIT) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots in January 2012

and later placed in another pair of turf stakes while earning \$117,842 on the year for Andrews T and S Racing. Now 6, Mr. Vegas is out of Lhotse, by The Minstrel.

Aliyu Ben J Stables' homebred Lubash earned \$223,750 in just six starts for trainer Christophe Clement. Out of the Cure the Blues mare Nasty Cure, Lubash took to the turf at the Spa, coming from seventh to win the 11/16-mile West Point Stakes for state-breds, then stretched to nine furlongs at Belmont to win the Ashley T. Cole Stakes for New York-breds in early September on the turf.

Effie Trinket, out of the Editor's Note mare Maya's Note, won the six-furlong Aristic Stakes for 2-year-olds on the dirt at Saratoga for Patsy Symons after breaking her maiden in the slop going 5½ furlongs at the Spa. A \$130,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. juvenile purchase, she was bred by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

All four New York-bred stakes winners were nominated for divisional championships that will be announced April 15.

Internationally, Zeide Isaac, a Kentucky-bred 8-year-old by Freud, won four stakes last year in Peru including the Clasico Almirante Miguel Grau Seminario (Per-II).

And these nice winners and solid progeny earnings come from some of Freud's smaller crops (see stud analysis). The uncertainty of ever getting a casino up and running on the New York Racing Association racing circuit and sinking general economy served as a double-whammy on the state-bred ranks. And despite Freud's success, his foal numbers declined precipitously from his 2006 crop (76 named foals) to 2009 (27 named foals).

"New York breeders are made up of grocery store managers and nurse's aides—they are a different breeder demographic because the horses didn't have the commercial viability," said Becky Thomas, who owns Sequel

Stallions along with Dennis Narlinger. "The population of breeders were not wealthy people; they were not able to buy a better mare. When the country went into recession, there was a huge shrinkage. We were trying to breed horses in a very poor economy and people couldn't afford the stud fees. We stood our stallions at Keane Stud for two years."

But the industry has come roar-

ing back thanks to the strength of the New York breeding fund and its influx of monies from the Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct.

Thomas re-opened Sequel Stallions last year after the slot revenue began rolling. She and business partner Narlinger spent \$1.5 million on renovations and new barns to accommodate the impendent mares coming north to take advantage of the statebred program.

"Anytime you put capital improvements into anything, it's a few years to the payout, but we were full last year," Thomas said.

And Freud bred 168 mares.

Here's to the Winners

Freud's grade I winners are Giant Ryan and Franny Freud. A top sprinter inbred to Northern Dancer, Giant Ryan won the Vosburgh Invitational Stakes (gr. I). He was the New York-bred horse of the year for 2011 while also being named champion male sprinter and older male. Franny Freud was also best around one turn, taking the Prioress Stakes (gr. I) and Keeneland's Beaumont Stakes (gr. II) on Polytrack. Champion New Yorkbred 2-year-old filly in 2009, she was champion 3-year-old filly and champion sprinter the following year. Franny Freud is inbred to both Secretariat and Northern Dancer.

The horses at the top get the glory, but winners get the money, especially now in New York. Freud has sired 219 winners from 409 foals (his first eight crops, not including 2-year-olds of 2013).

"You don't get anything if you don't win," Thomas said. "The thing is,

Freud's runners win. That is what has kept the farm alive."

Thomas points to the stallion awards doled out by the state's breeding funds. Since 2005 Freud has brought home more than \$1.3 million in awards including more than \$270,000 in 2012. That makes standing the stallion, and racing his progeny, cost effective.

Thomas figures it costs \$15,000-\$20,000 to raise a foal and get it into training. Now a New York-bred can earn \$35,000 for a state-bred maiden special weight win and the breeder gets a bonus of \$12,000.

"They don't earn those awards unless they win," Thomas said. "You can look it over. Freud has been able to produce winners with our little New York breeders. That's huge for the program."

Here's What to Expect

If one wants to send a mare to Freud, what kind would work best?

"Because he throws a real 'Quarter Horse' type horse, I wouldn't breed a little, short mare that also looks like a Quarter Horse," Thomas said. "If you have a mare that looks like a 2-year-old and never really matured, you may wind up with a racecar, but I pretty much would breed anything else to him.

"He throws plenty of size—he throws a bigger horse than what you might expect. I breed turf horses to him; I breed dirt horses to him; I breed horses with no hip and no conformation. He's slightly offset but he throws really good knees for a Storm Cat."

When those breeders send mares to Freud, what kind of foal can they expect?

"Freud is like a rubber stamp," Thomas said. "I call them 'circus ponies' when horses have a lot of white on them, and Freud's foals have a lot of white on them, either being white-faced or white stockings.

"They tend to follow the Storm Cat line to where they have a bigger hip than the Giant's Causeways. The Giant's Causeways tend to follow more of the Rahy line; more of a smooth muscle; more of a two-turn horse, whereas the Freud horses have more of a Storm Cat look to them.

"Freud himself is maybe 16 hands but he throws, not a huge horse, but he throws a big Storm Cattype. They're well-developed, well-muscled. When people see a Freud, they say, 'Is that a Freud?' not only because they have a lot of white on them, but they have good butts, like Storm Cat."

Freud has proved he can get flatout runners along with the "big horse" that can compete and win at the grade I level. He, like his big brother Giant's Causeway, seems to have progeny that can do it all.



Bustin Bruss for the state of t

Bruce Levine, trainer of Bustin Stones, is fired up on state-breds

rainer Bruce Levine is a native New Yorker through and through. He came to the New York Racing Association racetracks as a youngster, falling in love with the sport that would become his profession and lifelong passion. It's no wonder that along the way the conditioner has excelled with New York-breds such as the undefeated Bustin Stones (winner of the 2008 grade I Carter Handicap) and Koluctoo Jimmy Al (winner of the 1994 grade III Stymie Handicap), who raced in the 1993 Preakness Stakes (gr. I) at a time when it was eye-opening for Empire State-runners to compete in the classics.

Levine, who has approximately 20 New York-breds in his barn, sees all of the positives about the breeding and racing program established by the New York Thoroughbred Breeders.

"It's just a super program, especially for the average (owner)," noted Levine. "You can buy a top-end (New York-bred) for a whole lot less, maybe \$50,000 to \$75,000. And we're running here 12 months a year. It's really a strong equation, especially with them also winning in open company."

Currently Levine is reveling in the rewards of training the offspring of his sensationally fast sprinter Bustin

Stones (by City Zip) who was six-for-six in his career and currently stands at Dr. Jerry Bilinski's Waldorf Farm near North Chatham, N.Y.

"I think he's off to a great start at stud," said Levine. "I've won with several of his offspring. Soundness and speed—that's what he's passed onto his first crop."

Levine currently has one such runner under his care whose physical attributes particularly remind him of his former star pupil.

"Stonely the Lonely. He's like a clone (of his sire)," he said. "He's the spitting image. A chestnut with a white blaze."

The promising runner broke his maiden Jan. 26 in a \$50,000 maiden special weight race at Aqueduct in his second career start.

Owned by Roddy Valente, Bilinski, and several others—and bred by Jennifer Contessa—the 3-year-old colt rated off swift early fractions before rolling past his competition through the stretch in the 5½-furlong event.

Of course, for Levine to be reminded of his own success as a trainer, he needs only to look at the NYRA schedule of overnight stakes. Two of his past multiple stakes winners—Coyote Lakes (three-time winner of the grade III Gallant Fox Handicap) and the state-bred Clever Elec-

trician, a son of Clever Trick—recently had races named for them.

"I really get a kick out of seeing things like that," said Levine, who cut his teeth in the horse business beneath trainers John Russell and Johnny Campo. He even worked weekends for free at Gulfstream Park while attending the University of Miami, just to gain experience. That was all before going out on his own as a trainer in 1979.

Levine's longevity in the sport has been bolstered by his versatile training style, complementing the talents of top-notch sprinters such as Bustin Stones, middle-distance runners such as Buddy's Saint (winner of a pair of grade II races in 2009—the Remsen and Nashua stakes), routing fillies such as Koluctoo's Jill (winner of a pair of grade II races in 1985: the Black-Eyed





Susan and Ashland stakes) and marathoners such as Coyote Lakes, an Arizona-bred who simply flourished at distances beyond 1½ miles.

"Training is observing. It's trial and error," said Levine. "You have to adjust to the horses. If it's a speed horse, he'll show you. If not, you have to maximize the horse's ability, whether it's going long or on the grass."

Normally, the experience of training Thoroughbreds is something passed down the generational branches of a family tree. But in the case of Bruce Levine and his father, Robert Levine, that knowledge was actually passed upward.

"My father was 55 when he started training horses," said Levine, with a note of pride in his voice. "He'd hang around my barn all the time and watch me. He was very observant."

A retiree from the textile industry, the elder Levine began by purchasing a small group of horses with some friends, rarely paying more than \$25,000 for one and haltering the runners himself. Robert Levine's success in his new-found profession was nothing short of remarkable. And just a few weeks before his death in 2005, he recorded his biggest on-track victory, capturing Gulfstream Park's Bonnie Miss Stakes (gr. II) for sophomore fillies with Jill Robin L, a runner named for his two daughters.

The son did, however, aid the father slightly on that notable day.

"I was able to get stalls for the (Gulfstream) meeting, and I gave him a few. And I sent him down there with a really good groom," Levine recalled fondly.

Even when he has sent a stable of runners to Florida, Bruce Levine has always been a stalwart on the New York winter scene at Aqueduct. And this winter has been no different. Since the start of the year, Levine's horses have been heating up the inner track at Aqueduct, with New York-breds playing a key role in that streak.

On Jan. 11, Keep Bustin, a daughter of Bustin Stones out of the High Yield mare Shuffle the Deck, scored in a \$52,000 allowance/optional claiming sprint for owners Valente and Thomas Lemme, who also bred the filly.

The next day Levine got the venerable 9-year-old gelding Al's Lark, bred by Albert Fried Jr., to the winner's circle in a \$25,000 claiming sprint for owners Saul and Max Kupferberg.

Levine scored with another Valente homebred, The Mad Piper, a gelded son of Toccet, Jan. 19 for a purse of \$23,000.

A day later the trainer captured a \$50,000 maiden special weight event for 3-year-olds with Donnybrook Stables' Rocket Hero. The sophomore son of Street Hero was bred by Joseph and Jennifer Daniels.

On Jan. 26, Levine saddled Gambling Geraldine, a daughter of Wildcat Heir, to victory in a \$52,000 allow-ance/optional claiming sprint for his longtime client Mike Repole.

My Meadowview Farm's homebred son of Noble Causeway, Dandy's Noble, triumphed in a \$50,000 maiden special weight sprint Feb. 1 beneath Levine's tutelage.

On Feb. 3, Repole and Levine teamed up again as Readthesmokesignal, a son of Read the Footnotes, went wire-to-wire in a \$57,000 event.

The average purse of Levine's New York-bred winners during that span was almost \$45,000. So the average winner brought home nearly \$27,000 for its connections, without even considering breeder incentives.

"For me, it's the strong purses," said Levine, of his business model, which keeps plenty of stall space for runners bred in the Empire State. "(As an owner) you can win two or three races and get (back your investment). And then there are those 30% breeder awards (first place for a New York-bred by a registered New York stallion)."

It's still early in the racing year. But it's obvious trainer Bruce Levine will continue to be a strong influence on the New York racing scene and that New York-breds will be a major part of his success.
