

Cuomo Floats Plan for Rescuing Finger Lakes; Horsemen Seek More Assurances

ON THE EVENING OF FEB. 17, after a round of afternoon negotiations with stakeholders, Governor Andrew Cuomo's office released details of a two-year plan (with an option for a third) to keep racing afloat at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack in the post-del Lago Casino era. While considering it a step in the right direction, the Finger Lakes horsemen did not sign on, seeking additional assurances and opting to pursue further negotiations. (*Please note that by the time you read this, this situation could—and should—be further along and most likely resolved.*)

The del Lago Resort & Casino in Tyre celebrated its grand opening Feb. 1, just 27 miles down the road from Finger Lakes, and has been doing a brisk business, netting \$6.3 million in its first two weeks of operation. Racetrack operator Delaware North will be compensated for inevitable loss of revenue at its own facility by a tax break. The horsemen's purse account has no such protection, leaving the Finger Lakes horsemen in limbo for the 2017 racing season and beyond. The potential for job loss in the immediate area and risk to the New York breeding program as a whole if Finger Lakes should be forced to close its doors have garnered considerable attention.

The Cuomo plan calls for three main industry players to shore up the Finger Lakes purse account. Racetrack operator Delaware North would contribute up to \$1 million, the del Lago resort would contribute \$440,000 and the Fund, pending Fund board approval, would allocate 100% of its annual purse enrichment money, which is currently split 60-40% between Finger Lakes and NYRA, to the Farmington racetrack, amounting to an additional \$600,000. The full allocation of purse enrichment from the Fund would provide meaningful support to Finger Lakes via the breeders. As part of the deal the State will commit to evaluating any losses the Fund may incur from statutory payments to keep breeders whole.

At the same time, Cuomo's plan calls for 145 days of racing from April to November (down from 155 days in 2016), cards consisting of eight races a day, and an average per-race purse of \$13,690, which would be up from \$13,224 in 2016. Finger Lakes distributes \$100,000 a day in purses on average. This ten-day reduction in race dates will reduce total available purses by \$1,000,000. Additionally, the one-race reduction to

eight race equates to 145 fewer races annually, which would create another reduction of \$1,305,000 as calculated on the basis of the bottom-level \$9,000 purse.

In return, the State, horsemen, and breeders are seeking to ensure that Delaware North will commit to developing a turf course through financing opportunities available from economic development grants. This would be a monumental change to Finger Lakes racing for all parties. The key element to this solution is to involve the State with advancing this development.

In the eyes of the Finger Lakes horsemen, the Cuomo plan falls short. Even with the roughly \$2 million in contributions just outlined, the horsemen will be burdened by the purse reductions outlined above. The horsemen are also leery of having only a two-year commitment. The deal would apply to 2017 and 2018 and could be renewed for 2019. The Governor and all stakeholders would meet in 2017 and 2018 to evaluate the actual impact of del Lago on Finger Lakes business in the interest of developing a long-term plan. Lastly, we'd all like to see the turf course development be fully ratified in the agreement. The upshot? Negotiations will resume when the legislature returns from a late February break.

While participating in multiple meetings about Finger Lakes, NYTB has also kept its other legislative irons in the fire. We continue to seek redress for losses incurred by the racing sector from Genting's operation of the Nassau OTB VLTs at Aqueduct and have found allies in the Senate and Assembly for several solutions that would be acceptable to breeders and horsemen.

On the subject of the NYRA reorganization plan, NYTB's work continues on three main goals: securing votes for the breeders' and horsemen's representatives on the NYRA board, pushing for clarification of the language in the executive budget regarding "expanded" powers of the Franchise Oversight Board, and clarification of the distribution of the financial burden of drug testing. Our recurring Fund Cap bill is also moving along in both houses.

As you can imagine, Albany has been my second home this winter, and things will probably be no different with the approach of spring. This is, however, as it should be. NYTB has earned a seat at the table in racing and gaming issues, and we are using these opportunities well to make sure that the concerns and voices of New York breeders are heard loud and clear.

CALEDONIAN STRIKES AGAIN IN JIMMY WINKFIELD

Winner of the Lost in the Fog Stakes by a determined neck at Aqueduct on New Year's Day, Curragh Stables' Caledonian rallied from last and split horses in the stretch to win the six-furlong, \$98,000 Jimmy Winkfield Stakes for open 3-year-olds Feb. 20—Presidents' Day—at Aqueduct.

Bred by Kaleem Shah and foaled at Berkshire Stud near Pine Plains, the son of Concord Point broke his maiden for a \$40,000 tag second time out last Oct. 20. He has won two of three subsequent starts, both stakes races, and finished second by only a neck in a starter allowance, earning \$156,565. The gray/roan colt is trained by John Terranova II.

"We weren't sure if he was fine-tuned enough to get it done, but he's just been a honest horse...tough, gutsy, and tries hard," Terranova said.

Caledonian, a winner in 1:12.19, is the first foal out of Dazzling Display, a Kentucky-bred winner by Dehere, purchased by Bob Baffert for Shah, at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton February juvenile sale for \$250,000.

Wilburnmoney Takes Franklin Square at 20-1

At longshot odds of 20-1, the catchily-named Wilburnmoney delivered a strong performance Feb. 19 to upset a robust 10-horse field in the third running of the \$100,000 Franklin Square Stakes for New York-bred sophomore fillies at Aqueduct.

Owned by Bob Petersons Stables and Frank Bellavia, Wilburnmoney is trained by Gary Gullo.

"I thought she ran great," Gullo said. "She was coming into the race very good. She's had a few issues with heat, and the second time and third time she ran, it was very hot out and she didn't run that well but today she ran good. I've always liked this filly."

Bred by Clark Brewster and foaled at Questroyal Stud in Stillwater, Wilburnmoney is the second foal and second winner out of Lady in the Money, a six-figure-earning Virginia-bred purchase by Brewster for \$32,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale.

Wilburnmoney changed hands twice via public auction, selling as a weanling at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale for \$26,000 to Palermo Farm, then going to Anthony Melfi for \$70,000 at the New York-bred preferred yearling sale in Saratoga the following year.

HOT CITY GIRL STROLLS IN BROADWAY

Lady Sheila Stable's Hot City Girl has returned to top form following a four-month break. After back-to-back stakes-placings in December and January, on Feb. 18 the 5-year-old half sister to sprint champion La Verdad scored a victory in Aqueduct's \$100,000 Broadway Stakes for older New York-bred fillies and mares at six furlongs as the odds-on favorite.

The victory leaves owner Sheila Rosenblum with the question of whether to send her mare to the breeding shed fresh off a win, or keep her in training.

"We're not sure (if she'll continue racing or retire)," Rosenblum said. "It's a good option to have: breeding shed or racing, which one will it be? Being that she's mine, I can make that decision quietly, not tonight. But if she didn't race well, we knew the answer."

The Broadway score was Hot City Girl's fourth stakes victory. At 3 she won the grade 3 Charles Town Oaks and open Safely Kept Stakes at Laurel Park, and last summer took the Union Avenue Stakes at the Spa. She has six stakes-placings to her credit, including a runner-up finish in the grade 1 La Brea Stakes at Santa Anita in 2015. Hot City Girl (City Zip—Noble Fire, by Hook and Ladder) has earned \$668,150.

Bred by Eklektikos Stable, Hot City Girl was foaled at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm near Chestertown.



BLUE BUDS

David Greenhouse, Chris Boehning ringing up wins under their Blue Bison banner

WHEN DAVID GREENHOUSE WAS 10 YEARS OLD, he asked for his birthday party to be held at the harness track in Saratoga, not far from where he grew up in Latham, N.Y. A third-generation racing fan, he'd already begun wagering through his father and grand-father, but his windfall that day was the result of the nearly universal childhood racetrack habit of "stooping."

As his father Gary tells it, David had found a stack of tickets on the floor. Scrutinizing them, the 10-year-old found one potential winner, a daily double ticket on which the bettor had keyed the favorite in the second race with "all" in the first race, the winner of which had paid \$80.

"It was the four horse," Greenhouse remembered. "And when the five horse in the second race, the favorite, won, it was a \$710 payoff."

A few years later while in junior high, Greenhouse met Chris Boehning, who had just moved to the area from nearby Clifton Park. Like Greenhouse, Boehning had a grandfather who had taken him to the races; Boehning remembers summer trips to Saratoga Race Course, armed with sandwiches and newspapers to spread out and reserve their seats.

"He was from Italy and he loved the horses," Boehning remembered. "He'd sneak me under the turnstile, claiming for years that I was under 12."

It was inevitable the two would become best friends, and their friendship would take them, inevitably, to the racetrack.

"His father owned trotters, and on Friday nights the Greenhouses would pick me up, we'd go to Pennell's for dinner, and then we'd go watch the races," said Boehning. "That was a good Friday night."

As they got older, they got a glimpse behind-the-scenes at the Thoroughbred track in Saratoga: Boehning's brotherin-law, Joe Layden, along with Joe's brother, sportswriter Tim, both worked at the Schenectady *Daily Gazette* and the Albany *Times Union*, so Greenhouse and Boehning would head to the press box with them to watch the races and hang out.

It was some years later—2008—that the two lifelong racing fans took the logical next step, buying into a yearling filly that their friend Stewart Hoffman had purchased at the Keeneland September sale for \$125,000. They chose for their stable name the nickname of the soccer team that they had both played on at Shaker High School in Latham, Blue Bison.

"David called me and said, 'You've got to be in on this,' "Boehning remem-



bered. "So I was in, and that was the beginning of Blue Bison. How lucky were we? She was fantastic."

By Congaree out of the Carson City mare Look Upon, the filly they named Shine Upon won her first three starts, the first two for Jimmy Jerkens. When Jerkens went south for the winter, Mike Hushion took over her training, and it was her first start for him that Greenhouse still relates with something approaching awe, almost seven years later.

"Her third start was the Dreamy Mimi (Stakes at Aqueduct)," he recalled. "She had won her earlier races by a half-dozen lengths (actually four and 6½). She was stretching out two turns in open company, and she got passed by two horses on the outside. Everything was going against her.

"And she fought back and beat the two horses on the outside in a head bob."

"David's grandfather owned Thoroughbreds, and it took forever for him to get his first win," said Boehning. "Shine Upon spoiled us. She was such a good horse."

Retired with earnings of more than \$175,000 and a record of five wins—two of them stakes—and two seconds from 10 starts, Shine Upon is the partnership's lone broodmare with Hoffman. She's at Rockridge Stud near Hudson, and her first foal to get to the races, Tiz Time to Shine, won the Aspirant Stakes at Finger Lakes in 2014 before injury forced him into retirement.

Shine Upon's 2013 filly by Malibu Moon, Shimmering Moon, took six starts to break her maiden, but she did so impressively at Aqueduct Feb. 2, winning by 17¹/₂ lengths. Blue Bison also has a 2-year-old Shine Upon filly by Lonhro in training in the Ocala, Fla., area.

Though Shine Upon is Blue Bison's only broodmare, her fillies may well prove to constitute the makings of a small broodmare band when they're done racing.

"It's very interesting and rewarding seeing the babies grow up, seeing them when they were newborns," Boehning said. "So seeing them get to the track is a very, very cool experience."

Greenhouse admits he'd be interested in getting more involved with breeding; despite living in Colorado, he's able to travel regularly to New York but admits both his and Boehning's fulltime jobs make further involvement a challenge. Greenhouse owns Rocky Mountain Foods, a snack manufacturing company in Denver that provides products such as trail mix and roasted

nut products for various private label brands, such as Trader Joe's and Kroger. Boehning is a partner in the litigation department of the New York City law firm Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison and his pro bono work to help prevent gun violence recently resulted in a New York *Times* article focusing on the attorneys and firms that have come together to address the issue.

"We're trying to make sure that people are held accountable in appropriate ways," he said. "After the *Times* article, we got calls from other lawyers at top firms, from top consultant groups, and some of our top clients asking how they could help."

Though Blue Bison generally buys on its own now, the partners feel indebted to Hoffman not only for getting them involved with Shine Upon, but for his ongoing influence in their racing ventures.

"Stew is still incredibly generous in terms of getting us introduced to various parts of the sport and allowing us to learn," said Boehning. "Just because you





the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings in 2012, make his 2017 debut in the Hollie Hughes Stakes. Though Boehning couldn't make it—he was attending his son Julian's soccer game—Greenhouse flew in from Colorado and was joined by his parents, sister, brother-in-law, and nephew who made the trip down from New York's Capital Region.

Greenhouse and Boehning first saw Loki's Vengeance before the sale at Rockridge Farm and were immediately impressed.

"He was out of an unproven mare (Subtle Sweetness, by During) and this

"We said, "This is a nice horse.' We picked him out on pure athleticism, and he turned out well."

A multiple stakes winner, including the New York Stallion Series at Aqueduct in November, the dark bay or brown horse has earned just shy of \$500,000 in 24 starts. And while it looked in midstretch in the Hollie Hughes that he was going to add to his stakes total, he and his connections had to settle for fifth, which was just good enough for Greenhouse's nephew Reece, who, along with his sister, was gifted by their uncle a 1% stake in Loki's Vengeance, and thus got a share of his uncle's portion of \$3,000.

It's a been a few years since Blue Bison has been active at auction, having been outbid on the horses that they liked. Their last purchase, Storm Prophet in 2014, was a little over their budget, but they went to \$225,000 to get him, and they hope to get involved again this year.

"My grandfather only had one horse win, and the horse's name was Black Jade," said Greenhouse. "I'm waiting for us to get a black horse and name him Black Jade II."

Professional commitments generally prevent them from attending sales outside of New York, which is fine by Greenhouse.

"We've shopped at sales and had very limited luck with the non-New Yorkbreds," he said, "so Chris and I talked and I think without question, anything we purchase at auction will be a New York-bred. The sale prices seem to be stabilizing and becoming real again."

Now in their early 50s, Boehning and Greenhouse remained friendly when their paths diverged after they left Shaker High School. That day at Aqueduct, Greenhouse's parents talked about Boehning as if he's another son, and both men try to attend as many of their horses' races as they can, Greenhouse taking the month of August off to spend in Saratoga.

"Even before the horses, we always stayed in touch," said Boehning. "Our friendship makes this fun and something for us to do together."



Hanging in There

John and Sandy Crowe find stakes success while hanging on to their homebreds THE NEW YEAR STARTED off on such a promising note for Dr. John and Sandy Crowe of Empire Equines, the owners and breeders of New York-bred Fifty Five. The couple's 3-year-old turf filly faced open allowance optional claiming company for the first time in a Jan. 1 race at Gulfstream Park and responded by closing resolutely through the stretch for a half-length victory at 14-1.

But a devastating blow to their small breeding operation soon followed, when Fifty Five's dam, the 11-year-old Soave, suffered complications after undergoing a Cesarean section surgery and died.

"It was pretty hard to take," John Crowe said. "The mare likely went into premature labor and the Noble Mission foal she was carrying was dead, so they did a C-section. Soave was fine and then a few hours later she just collapsed."

Racing for the first time since her dam's death, Fifty Five, a daughter of multiple grade 1 winner Get Stormy, ran a bang-up race at Gulfstream Park Feb. 4, finishing a fast-closing third in her stakes debut in the \$100,000 Sweetest Chant (G3T). Trained by Tom Bush, the 13-1 Fifty Five was beaten three-quarters of a length by the highly regarded Rymska.

If things had gone to plan, Fifty Five wouldn't have even been running in the (continued on page 40)

red and blue silks of the Crowes, who predominantly breed to sell.

"They are essentially all for sale, but circumstances change things," Crowe said. "Fifty Five's dam, Soave, was a little bit on the small side, and we had her in the yearling sale in New York (2007 Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds) where she was an (\$18,000) RNA. We just didn't want to let her go. She was a nice horse, so why would we let her go? She ended up doing well for us and was stakes-placed. It's probably not the ideal business plan to race the ones that no one wants to buy, but that's what a lot of breeders do."


Crowe, 70, a recently retired orthopedic hand surgeon from Connecticut, became involved in New York's breeding program in 2003. He was drawn to New York because of the promise of revenue from the installation of video lottery terminals at racetracks coming to the state's breeding program. But when the arrival of the VLTs stalled, Crowe moved his mares to Kentucky.

When portions of the revenue began to stream into New York's breeding fund with the 2011 opening of the ⁶⁶ I do a lot of research myself now on pedigrees, and then go through Mike (McMahon) because the thing I don't always know is how the mares fit the sire from a physical perspective.⁹⁹

Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct Racetrack, Crowe returned his mares to New York. He remarked that New York has the "most generous award program in place for breeders and owners of state-bred horses."

A lover of horses since his youth—he worked with Standardbreds owned by his uncles while he was in high school and college—Crowe did some research about the movers and shakers in the Empire State's breeding industry and reached out to Joe and Anne McMahon, the owners of McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, whose operation is among the preeminent full-service breeding establishments in the state.



From there, the Crowes began racing horses, and when the females were retired from competition they became part of their broodmare band, which currently numbers six. The Crowes' mares are boarded at Dr. Doug Koch's Berkshire Stud near Pine Plains.

Empire Equines' most notable home run in the auction ring was the sale of a Henny Hughes colt they bred who brought \$90,000 as a yearling at the New York-bred sale at Saratoga in August 2013. Out of the Crowes' unraced mare Giggly, the colt was purchased by Kentucky bloodstock agent Peter Bradley. The following year the colt sold at auction for \$335,000 and was sent to Japan to compete. The colt, whose name is Moanin, is a multiple graded stakes winner who captured Japan's prestigious grade 1 February Stakes in track record time in 2016.

"Although we didn't go over to watch him race in Japan, it was fun to watch his races on replays," Crowe said. "We couldn't understand a word from the announcer, except for Moanin."

Crowe said he is hopeful a New Yorkbred half sister to Fifty Five, a daughter of Point of Entry, will entice bidders when she goes through the sale ring as a 2-year-old this year at a venue that has yet to be determined.

In the meantime, he and Sandy are thankful that Fifty Five, named for their favorite bar in Bonita Springs, Fla., where they reside during the winter,

didn't pique the interest of buyers at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky October yearling sale in 2015.


"Fifty Five was an RNA at \$24,000," Crowe said. "We sent her to Eddie Woods to be broken, and the plan was to put her in a 2-yearold sale. Last year at that time the market started to soften a lot and Eddie had already been to one or two sales and said, 'Look, she's by Get Stormy, who is probably not desirable for many people-turf pedigree and it being his first crop.' After awhile, Eddie said you're not going to get much for this horse, and she is a nice horse. I asked him what he would do, and he said he would probably keep her."

With the future looking rosy for Fifty Five in light of her gutsy effort in her stakes debut, the Crowes also have much to look forward to from several New York-breds they have in the pipeline—yearlings by Frost Giant, Get Stormy, Mineshaft, and Shanghai Bobby.

"I do a lot of research myself now on pedigrees, and then go through things with Mike (McMahon) because the thing I don't always know is how the mares fit the sire from a physical perspective," Crowe said. "Mike is very helpful with that, and he also helps with what he anticipates would be commercially appealing as opposed to what is not."

Honing his skills as a student of pedigrees is just one side of the breeding business that appeals to Crowe.

"If I had to give up one aspect of it, it might actually be the races," Crowe commented. "I really like being on the farm. I like the animals themselves."

First Strikes

Haul Anchor, Dublin Girl grab early stakes wins at 3 at Aqueduct



IT'S DIFFICULT TO OVERLOOK or undervalue consistency, especially in Thoroughbred racing. To that point breeder/owners Chester and Mary Broman have been uniquely impactful on the New York-bred scene since the 1990s. On Jan. 28 at Aqueduct, the couple continued on that path when their homebred Haul Anchor (by Bernardini) gamely annexed the \$100,000 Gander Stakes, prevailing amongst a talented quartet of newly turned 3-year-olds.

Having drawn the advantageous rail-position over the inner-track going a mile and 70 yards, Haul Anchor, who was coming off a dominant gate-to-wire score in the Dec. 29, 2016, Damon Runyon Stakes at the same trip, out-hoofed the fast and undefeated Bavaro (by Freud) to the early lead.

Named for New York Giants All-Pro tight end Mark Bavaro, Bavaro, is owned by twotime Super Bowl-winning coach Bill Parcells (August Dawn Farm), another in the sports world who made consistency a trademark.

After a solid opening half-mile in :47.14, Haul Anchor, trained by Kiaran McLaughlin, held the speedy Bavaro, who was making his first two-turn attempt, at bay until the added distance of the contest began to take its toll on the pursuer.

Sitting in perfect striking position behind that pair was D A S L Stable's Carradine (by Grasshopper), who rallied boldly nearing the top of the lane, swinging wide to set his sights on Haul Anchor.

Through the lane, however, Haul Anchor, masterfully ridden by jockey Cornelio Velasquez, had something left in reserve, turning back the onrushing challenger to prevail by 1½ lengths in 1:43.31. "I thought we might be in a duel with Bavaro. I left it to Cornelio to break well and make the decision from there," said assistant trainer Joe Lee, who saddled the colt for McLaughlin. "We galloped him a little bit further for this race. He's a fresh horse, but he has mainly just matured mentally.

"They're great people (the Bromans). Whenever Mr. Broman comes to the barn, he's so pleasant to be around," Lee continued. "He has so many horses in training with different trainers. He's great for New York, and great for the game."

Haul Anchor, out of the Storm Cat mare Whichwaydidshego, has won three of seven starts (3-3-0), with earnings of \$203,000.

Carradine, from the barn of trainer Linda Rice, finished a strong second in the Gander. Bourbon Lane Stable's Bourbon Empire (by Majestic Warrior) hit the gate at the start, spotting the others several lengths but was able to put in a sustained run through the stretch to finish third.

The race is named for the Gatsas Thoroughbreds' Gander (by Cormorant), winner of 15 of 60 starts, including the Meadowlands Cup Handicap (G2) and a pair of Empire Classic Handicaps (1999, 2002). The gelding amassed \$1,824,011 in earnings, and in the area of consistency, he won his first stakes in 1999 and final one in 2004. In 1999 Gander was

named champion New York-bred 3-yearold, and in 2000 was New York Horse of the Year and champion older male (a title he also won in 2001-02). Now 21, Gander currently resides at Stone Bridge Farm near Saratoga.

"It's great that this race was named for Gander," said Matthew Gatsas. "We're proud of what he did on the track. He was a fan-favorite being a gray and a real hard-knocker. He has a special place in our hearts. He was our first horse, and he turned out to be so good."

shifting his tack from Parx Racing in Pennsylvania to New York a few years ago. He's known for reading the bias of a track and getting his mount into proper position. In the \$100,000 Maddie May Stakes for 3-year-old fillies Jan. 29, Carmouche seized upon a perfect pocket-trip aboard Michael Parisi's Joemar Racing Stables' homebred Dublin Girl (by Dublin). But even the best laid plans often need an element of luck to succeed.

"I was just sitting patient, hoping something would open up," said Carmouche, a native of Vinton, La. "I was dedicated to the spot."

Turning for home, Carmouche, for a brief instant, had his head on a swivel, searching for an open path. Within a few strides a narrow seam appeared before him, and the jockey sent Dublin Girl to the lead.

Through the final furlong the winner fought off a flying-finish by Toni Tools, owned by St. Elias Stable, MeB Racing Stables, and Brooklyn Boyz Stables, snapping the runner-up's three-race win skein.

Dublin Girl, who is out of Carson City Girl, by Carson City, was one length clear on the wire, racing the mile and 70 yards in 1:46.46.

The filly has won two of four starts and has earned \$110,000.

"She's learning and maturing. She handled the two-turns very well. Her running style is to sit back and stay off the pace. I'm very happy with the race," said trainer Dominick Schettino.

LC Racing's Bree's Got Heart (by Colonel John) finished third. 🕅

ONE OF THE SIGNIFICANT THINGS about breeding and owning Thoroughbreds is that the fruits of a great purchase can continue to produce for many seasons. Just ask breeder/owner Paul Pompa Jr., who bought Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Big Brown at the 2007 Keeneland 2-year-olds in training sale. A decade later Pompa is still succeeding on the racetrack through his breeding shares in the champion who stands at Duchess Views Farm near Pine Plains.

Pompa's homebred Send It In-by Big Brown-who is out of the Awesome Again mare Sharp Instinct, won his second straight New York-bred stakes by taking the \$98,000 Haynesfield Stakes Feb. 11 at Aqueduct (after winning the Alex M. Robb

Stakes on New Year's Eve).

Perhaps bettors were partly inspired by the 5-yearold gelding's name, as well as by a pair of open company victories last year over the inner track, because Send It In emerged from the starting gate as the 15-100 favorite in a field of five older runners.

The odds, however, didn't nearly reflect the degree of difficulty.

Send it In, from the barn of trainer Todd Pletcher, was bumped and was forced to steady right out of the gate before settling into third position as Ivery Sisters Racing's Fox Rules set a deliberate pace, eventually racing an opening half-mile in :48.84 on an uncontested lead.

Jockey Manny Franco asked Send It In for his best as they turned into the lane. The ultra-consistent runner willingly obliged. But the David Cannizzo-trained Fox Rules had something left in the tank.

Franco implored his mount for more through the late stages. The game gelding never stopped giving his best. And in the final stride of the 1¼6-mile contest, Send It In got his nose in front as they hit the line.

"I think he showed a lot of class. He's won eight of his last 15 races and he's been a classy horse. He just keeps showing up for us," said Pompa.

"I thought Sharp Instinct would be a good match (for Big Brown)," he said. "She's by Awesome Again. She was a speedy filly who raced in Todd's (Pletcher) barn."

The final time for the Haynesfield was 1:43.83.

Send It In has earned \$398,414 while compiling a race-record of 8-3-2 in 15 starts.

Eight-year-old Fox Rules, the determined runner-up by Roman Ruler, has hit the board in 24 of his 45 career starts.


It was 10¼ lengths back to the thirdplace finisher Saul Kupferberg's Repent Twice (by Repent).

The Haynesfield Stakes is run in honor of Harvey Weinstein's (Turtle Bird Stable) remarkably consistent Haynesfield, who found the winner's circle in 10 of 19 career starts, capturing stakes from ages 2 through 5. Foaled in 2006, the chestnut son of Speightstown, trained by Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, boasts victories in the grade 1 Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (2010), as well as a pair of Empire Classics (2009 and 2011). Bred in New York by Barry Weisbord and Margaret Santulli, Havnesfield bankrolled \$1,319,481 on the racetrack and currently stands at Rancho San Miguel in California.

Huge in the Hughes

Going back to 1992, when Saratoga Dew (by Cormorant) won the Eclipse Award as the top 3-year-old filly, trainer Gary Sciacca has established a special connection with New York-breds. Sciacca's success has been more than evident recently with promising Empire State youngsters such as Hit It Once More and Bavaro garnering attention with eye-catching stakes victories.

And though it may have taken Amanda Laderer and Gary Downey's Candid

Desire (by Yes It's True) 31 career starts to score his first stakes victory, Sciacca was equally as proud as he stood beside the 5-year-old gelding in the winner's circle after annexing the \$100,000 Hollie Hughes Stakes later that afternoon.

"He seems like he's just getting himself together right now," said Sciacca. "The owners have been very patient with him. It's just great to have success for them." Candid Desire stormed through the stretch to score a come-from-behind neck victory, racing the six-furlong distance in 1:10.19.

Bred by Dr. John and Laura Mc-Dermott, Candid Desire notched his fifth win, increasing his earnings to \$305,814.

Zilla Racing Stables' Celtic Chaos (by Dublin) was a strong runnerup, and Drama King (by Nobiz Like Shobiz) garnered the show slot.

Trainer Michael Hushion, who has won the Hollie Hughes six times and finished fifth in this year's running with Loki's Vengeance, sent out his first career winner in 1975. That was the same year that Hall of Fame trainer Hollie Hughes retired at the age of 87, ending a career that included a victory in the 1916 Kentucky Derby with George Smith, owned by John Sanford.

"I actually approached Hollie Hughes for my first job on the racetrack," said Hushion, who eventually began with Allen Jerkens. "I went to his barn (at Belmont) and Hughes told me to show up the next morning at 5:30 a.m. Well, I overslept, probably the last time in my life I've done that. And I was just too embarrassed to ever go back there."
