



Tough Choices

PREPARATIONS are in full swing for our biggest public event of the year: the New York Thoroughbred Breeders Annual Awards Banquet at Saratoga National April 9. That night we will crown the 2017 New York-bred divisional champions, 2017 New York-bred Horse of the Year, and honor last year's most accomplished human achievers. A lot goes on behind the scenes to make this event happen, but arguably the most important contribution comes from outside the confines of our organization.

Every year a group of distinguished Turf writers, handicappers, chart callers, and racing analysts lend their time and expertise to choose our champions. Their participation in the balloting process gives our awards value and meaning. Putting myself in their shoes for a moment, however, I don't envy their task this year. A number of divisions are very strong and deep, making for some extremely hard choices, and, in my opinion, no division is tougher than the cohort of older dirt male.

Unfortunately, barring a tie, there can be only one winner, so I would like to recognize all the nominees, all graded stakes winners, who did so much to put our program in the national—and in one case—international spotlight. As an additional point of program pride, four of the five nominees are sired by stallions currently or formerly based in New York.

In alphabetical order, the nominees are:

Lauren and Ralph M. Evans' **Diversify**, by New Yorkbased sire **Bellamy Road** (Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions). Diversify ran off with one of the most coveted prizes for older dirt males in racing: the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park, which had also been won by state-breds Haynesfield (2010) and Funny Cide (2004). Trained by Rick Violette Jr., Diversify won four starts last year, including an 11½-length romp in the Evan Shipman Stakes and a stalking victory in the Saginaw Stakes. Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III and John D. Fielding, Diversify earned \$690,825 in 2017.

Giant Expectations is a colt bred by Sunrise Stables and sired by Sunrise's stallion **Frost Giant** (Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions). Giant Expectations won two

races in his home state last year but did his best work on the West Coast for co-owners Exline-Border Racing, Gatto Racing, Garrett Zubok, et al. Like our 2011 champion juvenile filly Weemissfrankie, he is trained by Peter Eurton. In 2017 Giant Expectations won the Pat O'Brien Stakes (G2) at Del Mar and stamped his ticket to the 2018 Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) with a front-running win in the San Antonio Stakes (G2) the day after Christmas. His earnings for the year were \$410,000.

Inside Straight (by Super Saver) also won his season-defining victory out of state, when he took the \$750,000 Oaklawn Handicap (G2) in April. Trained by Robertino Diodoro for owner Randy Howg, the Oaklawn Handicap was Inside Straight's second start after shedding blinkers. Let go at odds of 19-1, he was handled patiently by Geovanni Franco as the pair cruised to a convincing two-length victory. Bred by SF Bloodstock, Inside Straight earned \$523,300 in 2017.

Mind Your Biscuits, by former New York sire Posse, took the New York-bred program farthest afield last year. Following a close-up second to multiple graded stakes winner Unified in the Gulfstream Park Sprint Stakes (G3) for trainer Chad Summers, Mind Your Biscuits scored a sparkling victory in the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) at Meydan Racecourse. Back in the U.S. for his next start, the colt captured the Belmont Sprint Championship Stakes (G2) as the 6-5 favorite. Bred by Jumping Jack Racing and campaigned by the many-headed partnership of Head of Plains; Chad, Dan, and Scott Summers; J Stables; and Michael E. Kisber, Mind Your Biscuits colt netted a whopping \$1,713,800 last year.

At age 6 **Send It In** is the elder statesman of this group. Trained by Todd Pletcher for breeder/owner Paul Pompa Jr., Send It In's campaign was limited to three Aqueduct starts in 2017, but he made them count. Winner by a nose of the Haynesfield Stakes, he scored an open stakes-placing in the Stymie Stakes. Saving the best for last, he won the 1¼-mile Excelsior Stakes (G3) for which he earned an eye-popping Beyer Speed Figure of 119. Send It In is by **Big Brown** (Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions).

This distinguished group includes two Breeders' Cup participants (Giant Expectations and Mind Your Biscuits, who are also nominees in the male sprint division). Voters will consider all these outstanding nominees and the many stars in other divisions, including Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) winner Bar of Gold, when they make their choices for the 2017 New York-bred Horse of the Year.

As I said, tough choices. I am proud of our breeders, who make the voters' job so difficult.

BILL ALLEN TO MANAGE QUESTROYAL NORTH

Barry Ostrager's Questroyal North has announced that Bill Allen has taken up the post of farm manager at the 280-acre farm near Stillwater. A third-generation horseman, Allen comes to Questroyal North with 17 years of experience in the horse industry and a strong prior connection to the farm.

During his teens, Allen worked full time at his family's Ocala, Fla., farm while being home-schooled, doing everything from foaling, breeding, reproductive work, and breaking yearlings. During college breaks Allen worked at Farnsworth Farms in Florida and was foaling manager during the 2000 and 2003 breeding seasons. From 2003-09 Allen managed Liberty Stud in Columbia County and, most recently, was assistant manager at Joanne Nielsen's

Sunnyfield Farm in Westchester County.

Allen is returning to a farm he knows very well. From 2005-09, Allen's father, also William (Bill), managed Questroyal in its previous incarnation as Richard Simon's Sez Who Thoroughbreds, which operated from 2001-09 and was the leading breeder in the state from 2005-07. Allen visited Sez Who often, and by way of a double connection, stood Ostrager's stallions, including Strategic Mission and Patriot Act, when managing Liberty Stud.

"I am excited and honored to be working with the team at Questroyal North," said Allen. "I've had the privilege of standing Questroyal stallions in the past, and I can say definitively that our current roster is as strong as any I've seen in New York—no holes, from top to bottom."

VIOLENCE FILLY TOPS STRONG NYB SHOWING AT OBS WINTER MIXED

Brookstone Farm had to go to \$120,000 to take home the top-selling New York-bred at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' two-day winter mixed sale, a dark bay or brown short yearling filly by Violence.

Overall, the New York-bred contingent put up impressive numbers, outperforming the general population of the sale in average and median.

The New York-bred topper, also the fifth top-seller of the auction, was bred by Rockridge Stud in partnership with Brendan Mullery and Tony Grey. Offered by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield consignment, the April 30 filly is out of Callie's Joy, by Distorted Humor, a half sister to stakes winner Rileys Monarch (by Monarchos) and graded stakes performer Le Jester (by Pyramid Peak). She is from the family of grade 1 winners Willa On the Move and Will's Way.

Callie's Joy has produced five foals. Four have started and all four have won, topped by her Sky Mesa colt Fly Friendly Sky, who is a multiple winner and stakes performer with \$121,399 in earnings. The mare was bred to The Factor for 2018.

The New York-bred average was \$17,186, while the overall average was \$14,999, up from \$9,011 in 2017. The New York-bred median price checked in at \$6,750, a shade above the overall median price of \$6,000, up from \$4,350 a year ago.

After 42 New York-breds sold (including five private

sales) from 51 offered, they posted a 17.6% RNA rate. The overall buy-back percentage was 25.3%.

NY-BREDS START WITH AN ADVANTAGE

Carpe Diem Colt Brings \$77,000 at F-T Kentucky

C J Racing went to \$77,000 to buy the top-priced New York-bred short yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky winter mixed sale Feb. 5-6. Consigned by Royal Bloodstock, the Carpe Diem—Gitchee Goomie colt was one of seven state-breds to change hands in Lexington.

Named Edmund Fitzgerald, the colt was bred by Mare Madness. Racing for Patsy Symons, Gitchee Goomie won seven of 22 starts and \$680,520 while winning the Dr. James Penny Memorial Handicap (G3T) and placing in the grade 1 Garden City Stakes.

Gitchee Goomie (City Zip—Riotous Miss, by Brief Ruckus), bred in New York by Barry Ostrager, was purchased by Mare Madness III for \$100,000 at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February sale from James B. Keogh.

The company reported 107 yearlings sold for an average of \$28,673. The average New York-bred sold for \$19,695.

Swing and Sway's a Beauty at Oaklawn




Swing and Sway

Swing and Sway, a 4-year-old New Yorkbred daughter of Maclean's Music, picked up a \$75,000 winner's check Jan. 27 at Oaklawn following her 7¾-length score in the six-furlong American Beauty Stakes.

Bred by Canyon Lake Thoroughbreds, the bay

filly is out of the Gilded Time mare Placerita and is a half sister to Discovery Stakes (G3) winner Sticksstatelydude (by First Dude). Swing and Sway's younger sibling, a 2-year-old filly by Majesticperfection, brought \$250,000 from Alex and JoAnn Lieblong at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale.

Westrock Stables paid \$185,000 for Swing and Sway at the 2016 Ocala Breeders' Sales' March sale.



Calling the Right 'Audible'

Richard Leahy bred and sold Derby contender Audible

SIX YEARS AGO RICHARD LEAHY bred his homebred, graded stakes-placed stakes winner Akilina to Malibu Moon. In February 2013 she foaled a chestnut colt, and pragmatic, commercial breeder that he is, Leahy entered the colt in the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale with Winter Quarter Farm, selling him for \$175,000.

"I was disappointed with the price I sold him for," Leahy recently admitted. "So when the colt came back in a 2-year-olds in training sale, I bought him back."

Leahy paid \$135,000 for the New York-bred colt he named Governor Malibu, but because he focuses on selling colts and racing fillies, he worked with his trainer Christophe Clement to find partners, and Jump Sucker Stable joined Leahy's Oak Bluff Stables as the majority partner in the horse that went on to be a multiple graded stakes-placed stakes winner, with runner-up finishes in the Peter Pan Stakes and Jim Dandy Stakes (both G2). He earned just more than \$650,000.

In the summer of 2016, Leahy found himself in a similar position. He had sold his yearling colt by Into Mischief out of homebred Blue Devil Bel (by Gilded Time) at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings for \$175,000, the same price Governor Malibu had brought, with the same seller's remorse, but not, unfortunately, the same outcome.

"I felt exactly the same way as I did with Governor Malibu," Leahy said. "And I tried to buy him back, too, but he brought more money than we felt we could go to, even with partners."

The bay colt named Audible brought \$500,000, purchased by WinStar Farm,

which knows a little something about New York-breds, having bred 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (both G1) winner Funny Cide, and China Horse Club International with SF Racing.

Audible made his 2018 debut Feb. 3 with an eyecatching win in the Holy Bull Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream Park, running his record to three wins from four starts and announcing his presence on the road to the May 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve.

Audible made his racing bow with a third-place finish against New York-breds in a maiden special weight at Belmont last September. He returned six weeks later to break his maiden against similar company at Aqueduct, then crushed three rivals go-

ing a mile in an open Aqueduct allowance optional claiming race in December, winning by 93/4 lengths.


Off the strength of that win, Audible headed south to join trainer Todd Pletcher's Palm Beach Downs string.

The dams of Governor Malibu and Audible are half sisters, both out of Fahamore, a 19-year-old mare by Gulch—Cathy's Gal, by Easy Goer. Both Akilina and Blue Devil Bel are six-figure earners: two-time stakes winner Akilina having banked \$316,460. Fahamore has also produced stakes-placed Kitty Panda and Rodinia, both of whom earned more than \$100,000.

Fahamore raced only once and was unplaced. In 2003 Leahy purchased her through Winter Quarter's Don Robinson, agent, at the 2003 Keeneland November sale of breeding stock for \$37,000.

"I had been racing and breeding with two friends as partners, as Water-ville Lake Stables. I liked the breeding side, so I talked to them and told them I wanted to get a few mares and make some decisions on my own," Leahy said.

"On my own" doesn't mean Leahy alone; "on my own" means his team of

advisers, including Dr. Doug Koch at Berkshire Stud, where Leahy keeps his mares; his primary trainer Clement; John Donaldson of Lexington's Donaldson Bloodstock; Robinson, and Suzanne Smallwood of Equix Biomechanics, which combines Smallwood and her team's eye and experience with biomechanical measurements to predict a horse's racing success.

"Everyone has their own eye for a horse," Leahy explained. "I've always been one to try to breed similar body types to similar body types, and I like to have an objective measurement for doing that. Equix will look at Fahamore, compare her to the stallion universe, and tell me who matches up better than others."

Leahy is proud of having cottoned to new stallions while their prices were still reasonable, citing a breeding to Indian Charlie for \$25,000; the stallion was slated to stand in 2012 for \$75,000 before he died in 2011. He bred to War Front, who stands for \$250,000, when he was \$15,000.

"I felt like I missed Into Mischief at a lower price," he said with regret. "After Blue Devil Bel, I bred him again to Kitty Panda for \$75,000 (in 2015), and now he's \$100,000.

"I think I paid \$40,000 to breed Blue Devil Bel to him," he continued. "Into Mischief just checked all the boxes with everyone I knew."

Blue Devil Bel (named for Leahy's daughter, who attended Duke) is in foal to Constitution and booked to be bred back to Into Mischief.

Leahy offered the mare for sale three times, in 2006, in 2014, and last year. Leahy apparently having learned his lesson about letting horses go too inexpensively, the mare was an RNA each time, bringing the highest bid of \$57,000 in 2014. She was most recently offered last year at the Keeneland November sale.

"I kept breeding and getting new females, and I knew I had a good inventory of good fil-

lies coming," he said. "I was just trying to lighten up, and I thought the market might look at Audible and be more interested, but they didn't seem to be.

"Now," he added, "I'm getting offers at much higher prices."

And he'd still consider selling, but, understandably, his reserve has gone up.

"I like doing this," he said. "But I also like earning money doing this."

Leahy owns or is partners in about a dozen mares, and a colt he co-bred with Clement, Therapist, is a finalist for New York-bred champion 2-year-old, on the strength of a three-for-three record, with two wins in open stakes races.

The second dam of Fahamore, the mare that started it all, is Ed A. Cox's Classy Cathy, winner of the 1986 Ashland Stakes, Alabama Stakes, and Gazelle Handicap (all G1); her family traces back to Damascus and Buckpasser. Fahamore delivered a 2017 filly by Declaration of War, and Leahy is undecided about whether he'll breed her again.

"She's 19 now, and I want to make sure that she's ready to get pregnant," he said.

"But," he went on, "hopefully, Fahamore has re-sparked that whole family."



BEFORE WALT BORISENOK WAS BORN his parents bought a place on Saratoga Lake. When he was a little boy, they used to take him to Saratoga Race Course, and not just to see the horses.

"I could barely see over the counter at the betting window," he remembered with a chuckle. "But the tellers would still take my money."

Decades later Borisenok is back at Saratoga Lake and back at Saratoga Race Course, but the gambling he's doing these days is on breeding horses, not necessarily betting them.

Borisenok established Old Tavern Farm in 2016, on the site on which Palmer's Maple Shade Farm used to sit before it was sold off in parcels and developed.

In *A Summer Paradise*, a 1905 guide to summer resorts published by the Delaware and Hudson Railroad, Maple Shade

Farm was said to house 50 guests at \$1 day—a far cry from the prices that contemporary summer visitors encounter. Situated on the east side of Saratoga Lake, Maple Shade Farm was accessible then by a steamer that brought visitors across the lake.

Over time Borisenok pieced the farm back together by buying parcels of land. He had to tear down some of the extant old buildings, including the tavern for which the farm is named.

"We couldn't save it, except for two pillars," he said. "We took them and put them inside the lobby at the entrance of the barn."

Borisenok was brought in to the business end of racing by his friend Tom Mina, owner of Five Oaks Farm near Saratoga. After Borisenok, who remained in the Capital region as an adult, sold Fortitech, the business he founded three decades ago, he and Mina partnered on some racehorses, running in



the name of Twin Farms. Before too long Mina asked whether Borisenok wanted to take the next step into breeding.

"He mentored me," said Borisenok. "I didn't know too much about it. We bought a couple of mares, I spent time at his farm, and I really enjoyed it and said, 'I think we're going to build our own farm.'"

Old Tavern houses five mares, mares Borisenok purchased on his own, in consultation with Summerfield Farms' Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck, broodmare manager Trina Pasckvale, and farm director Greg Daley. He's building what he characterizes as a "boutique breeding operation.

"We focus on the higher end of the market," he said. "We have a Ghostzapper foal now, and our mares are

bred to stallions such as Malibu Moon and Carpe Diem. We shoot for bringing 10 yearlings to market each year, five that we breed ourselves and five we pinhook."

The public can get an intimate look at an Old Tavern mare and foal through the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame's Foal Patrol, an online initiative begun late last year with breeding farms in Kentucky, Florida, and New York.

A live webcam is set up at the farm, through which viewers can see 6-year-old Memento d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro—Intangaroo, by Orientate) in her paddock and in her stall; the mare's daily schedule is also posted, along with details about her feeding and her expected foaling date of March 18. She is in foal to Bodemeister and will be bred to Into Mischief later this year.

"It's an amazing process," said Borisenok of foaling. "Every time you see it, you just shake your head."

While all Borisenok's foals are New York-breds, he breeds his mares to a mix of Kentucky and New York stallions.

"I'm a relatively small guy in this," he explained. "I don't have 30 or 40 mares. To make the numbers work, for a small operation like ours, we need to target the upper end of the market."

He spoke with regret about the late Effinex, who was standing at Questroyal Farm, not far from Old Tavern, before dying suddenly last year from a ruptured pulmonary artery.

"We would have definitely bred to him," he said.

As a native of New York State and a racetrack regular who mixed business with pleasure during the Saratoga meeting, sometimes spending 30 days of the 40-day meet there with business associates, Borisenok has a natural affinity for the state's breeding program. That it's become

enviably lucrative doesn't hurt.

"You can race in state-bred company for a \$60,000 purse at Aqueduct," he pointed out. "The same race at Gulfstream is \$25,000. You breed a horse here, sell the horse, the horse runs, and a check comes in the mail. There's an enhancement to breed in New York. And obviously I'm from here, so it makes perfect sense to have a farm here."

Old Tavern breeds strictly to sell, keeping only the occasional horse that the team thinks is undervalued by the market. Borisenok offsets his breeding risk by pinhooking, successfully selling a yearling filly by Yes It's True at last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale.

"We paid \$30,000 for her (at the Keeneland January sale), and sold her in July for \$155,000 to Stonestreet," he said.

Another one of the farm's successes last year was a yearling filly by New York stallion Central Banker out of the Scatmandu mare Savasana at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-breds in August. A \$31,000 Keeneland January short yearling, she sold for \$85,000 to Jeremiah Englehart.

Francis Vanlangendonck plays a key role in virtually every element of Borisenok's business, including helping to establish a business plan. With his wife, Barbara, he's a 30-year industry veteran, and he has often shepherded newcomers into the game.

"Once Walt figured out what he wanted to do, I gave him an outline of a program that I used for other clients," said Francis. "We talked about what he needed to do to be successful, how many mares he needed to buy, how many weanlings and yearlings to sell. The breeding part of the operation helps the pinhooking, and the pinhooking helps the breeding. He liked the idea of diversifying his holdings."

The Vanlangendoncks, along with Daley and Pasckvale, also assist with matings, and this year, Borisenok has mares booked to Mineshaft, Ghostzapper, and first-year stallion Battle of Midway. He's expecting foals by Carpe Diem, Competitive Edge, and Daredevil. Together, the five-person team plans the breeding and sales strategy.

"We ask, 'What's the market? Who are our mares?' "Borisenok said. "We want to be on the upper end of a sale, rather than having a nice horse in the middle or near the bottom."

Vanlangendonck characterizes Borisenok as "a studier.

"He doesn't just jump in," said the consignor. "We knew him for a couple of years before he really got rolling, and he'd gone to all the seminars; he was well read in terminology, and he understood risk and proper procedures. He still had some conformation work to do and he wasn't real well-versed on pedigree, but he was still pretty good."

Borisenok began buying mares in 2016, purchasing Memento d'Oro in foal to Ghostzapper for \$160,000 and Taste's Classylady (Afleet Alex—Tastetheteardrops, by What Luck) in foal to Carpe Diem for \$155,000. Last year he bought Alpine Sky (Indian Charlie—Alpine Garden, by Lemon Drop Kid) for \$175,000 and To the Moon Alice (Malibu Moon—Love Match, by Partner's Hero) in foal to Maclean's Music, both at the Keeneland November sale.

He raced Alpine Sky twice after buying her, in the Dec. 16 Rampart Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park and the Jan. 15 Interborough Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack. Though still in training with Mark Casse, she was unplaced in both races,

and Borisenok is mulling the next stage in her career.

"Based on those performances, I think she wants to go to the breeding shed," he said. "But Mark's trying to convince me to keep her running."

Two horses owned with Mina keep the racing juices flowing: Bow Tie Affair and a 3-year-old Street Sense colt that's made just two starts, but if racing and breeding aren't enough to keep Borisenok busy, there's also a winery in its

nascent stages on the farm, headed by his daughter.

"We're at the start-up stage right now," he said. "We're acquiring some additional property, and we're going to grow grapes here. We hope to have some products on the market by the fall.

"Farming is farming," he went on.

An innovator at every point in his professional life, Borisenok and his partners began Fortitech, which creates combinations of vitamins, minerals, and other ingredients to increase the nutritional content of food and beverages, while in his 20s, when he was working at the Beech-Nut plant near Saratoga Springs and couldn't find the nutrients he wanted for the baby food.

Though now retired after selling Fortitech for more than \$600 million, Borisenok didn't abandon his pragmatic business sense when he decided to go into the Thoroughbred industry.

"He understands good luck and bad luck," said Vanlangendonck. "He gets it. He understands the good and the bad, and that's what makes my job a lot easier. He's not just a great client, but he's also a good friend, and that's what makes it fun."

Battle Won

Battle Station outlasts favorite Morning Breez in the Rego Park

KEN AND SARAH RAMSEY'S BATTLE STATION lived up to his name Feb. 11 at Aqueduct. Ken Ramsey named the horse off his background in the Navy, recalling the command that would come when an enemy approached.

"'Man your battle stations!' was the command," he reminisced.

The Ramseys' New York-bred must have received the message because when threatened in the final stages of the \$100,000 Rego Park Stakes for state-bred 3-year-olds, Battle Station fought back and refused to surrender.

Breaking from post one in his first start on an off track, the son of Warrior's Reward saved ground over the sloppy (sealed) surface under jockey Martin Garcia.

Battle Station stayed close to leader Stoney Bennett through early fractions of :22.09 for the opening quarter-mile and :44.59 for the half before putting that one away, but his work wasn't done. Challenged in the stretch by favored Morning Breez, Battle Station looked beaten at the sixteenth pool, but rallied

to win the six-furlong race by a neck in 1:12.30.

"He dueled through fast fractions and put away the pace horse," said Ken Ramsey. "Then he came back and won the race. He showed a little gameness, and you like to see that in a Thoroughbred."

The win was Battle Station's second in a New York-bred stakes race. He won the \$147,000 Bertram F. Bongard Stakes at Belmont Park last September.

Bred by Lansdowne Thoroughbreds, Battle Station was purchased for \$50,000 by the Ramseys at the 2015 Keeneland November sale as a weanling from Kearney Park, consignor. The dark bay gelding is out of the unraced Unbridled mare Uriel, who has produced five other winners from her seven foals of racing age. Uriel is from the female fam-

ily of major winner and sire Mr. Greeley and champion and classic winner Street Sense.

"We look at all the New York-breds in a sale," said Ramsey. "My farm manager Mark Partridge picks them out for me, and this one ticks all the boxes as a sprinter, and he was reasonably priced."

The win in the Rego Park pushed the young sophomore's earnings to \$211,334.

Battle Station débuted on turf at Saratoga last August, breaking his maiden at first asking. Back at Belmont in September, trainer Wesley Ward switched him to the dirt for the Bongard, which he won by 9¼ lengths.

"We wanted a horse to run in the New York-bred races at this time of year," said Ramsey of the surface switch. "But he won't be strictly a dirt horse. We thought he was possibly a horse that could go to Royal Ascot with Wesley."

Despite having raced Battle Station exclusively on the dirt since that start at Saratoga, Ward tried to convince Ramsey to enter him in the Breeders' Cup, but the owner didn't think Battle Station's speed figures warranted the trip. The horse made his way to Churchill to run in an allowance optional claiming race Nov. 25, and he finished fourth behind Empire Line, Evaluator, and Morning Breez. Ramsey suggested other out-of-town trips, perhaps to Oaklawn Park, might be in Battle Station's future, along with a return to turf.

"He might be versatile enough to do both," said Ramsey.



New York Milers

Three different divisions vie at a mile at the Big A

THE HUSBAND AND WIFE TEAM of Dr. William Wilmot and Dr. Joan Taylor, owners of Stepwise Farm near Saratoga Springs, are on a serious roll as breeders. Besides producing the state-bred Twisted Tom (by Creative Cause)—winner of the 2017 Empire Classic Handicap, the New York Derby, Albany Stakes, and Federico Tesio Stakes—the couple is currently enjoying the fruits of their homebred broodmare Thin Disguise (by Yes It's True), who has produced a pair of top-flight females in Midnight Disguise (by Midnight Lute) and Holiday Disguise (by Harlan's Holiday).

The 3-year-old Midnight Disguise, who is owned by the couple and stands a towering 17.2 hands, captured the listed Busanda Stakes at Aqueduct in January, earning 10 points toward a berth in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1). Her 4-year-old half sister, Lady Sheila Stable's Holiday Disguise, returned to the track Feb. 8 after an eight-month absence, storming through the stretch to annex the \$100,000 Biogio's Rose Stakes by $3\frac{1}{2}$ lengths.

"Thin Disguise is a beautiful mare; not huge, but big and rangy," said Taylor.

"Her offspring resemble who you breed her to. Harlan's Holiday's progeny are known to often be short-legged, so her being rangy added a bit of leg to Holiday Disguise."

"We've been trying to get Holiday Disguise in a race since Dec. 13, but between the weather and quarantine and cancellations, it's been tough," said trainer Linda Rice.

Her Belmont Park Barn had been closed due to a singular case of EHV-1 (equine herpes virus-1).

"(Last summer) I was pointing her

toward the Test (Stakes, G1) because it was seven-eighths and she had run so well in (winning) the (May 29) Bouwerie Stakes. But she didn't come out of that as well as I had wanted her to, and she's too promising a filly, so I said we have to stop."

Holiday Disguise, piloted by Junior Alvarado, raced the one-mile of the Biogio's Rose in 1:41.06. She has won four of five starts and has earned \$209,150. Her dam has a 2-year-old colt by Verrazano, a yearling filly by Tiznow, and was bred last year to Bodemeister.

ABLE TO DO MORE

Hit It Once More, a 5-year-old son of Hard Spun—Sunday Geisha, by Sunday Break, suddenly appears to have a second act to his racing career.

Two years ago as a sophomore, racing in the colors of Hall of Fame football coach Bill Parcells' August Dawn Farm, Hit It Once More was at the top of his game, annexing the New York Derby and Albany Stakes in consecutive starts. But a surprising subsequent string of unplaced finishes, followed by a change in ownership to Yellow Moon

Hit It Once More strikes in the Haynesfield

Stable, while Gary Sciacca remained at the helm as trainer, seemed to make people forget what the colt had once accomplished.

On Feb. 17, however, in the \$100,000 Haynesfield Stakes, Hit It Once More, who had donned blinkers two starts back, regained his winning ways with a 23/4-length victory in an easy gate-to-wire score in the one-turn, one-mile event.

As the 16-1 rank outsider in the field of six older runners, Hit It Once More raced the opening quarter-mile alone on the lead in 23.80.

"I told (jockey Rafael Hernandez) to get him loosened up; to come out of there running, come out firing, and put him on the front end," said Sciacca. "It worked out today."

Still uncontested after a half-mile in a relaxed :47.73, Hit It Once More widened his advantage and turned into the stretch without enduring an anxious moment as he sailed to the wire.

The final time, contested over a muddy and harrowed track, was 1:39.52.

Hit It Once More, bred by Dennis Narlinger's JMJ Racing Stables, has won six of 24 starts and has earned \$494,642.

Hit It Once More received his name from Sciacca's urging of Parcells to keep bidding on the colt (a \$90,000 purchase) despite going overbudget at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds intraining sale. It was the colt's first stakes win for Yellow Moon Stable.

The 9-5 favorite, Can You Diggit, a Chester and Mary Broman homebred trained by Jimmy Jerkens, was second. It was the 4-year-old son of Tiznow's second consecutive such finish in a stakes.

having also been runner-up Jan. 21 in the Alex M. Robb Stakes.

Havnesfield—a two-time New Yorkbred Horse of the Year and multiple graded stakes winner-had a second act to his own career. He began his 5-year-old campaign with a pair of uninspiring off-the-board finishes. Many pundits believed that he was through, but the chestnut colt rebounded off of a nearly five-month layoff to capture his second Empire Classic in October 2011. Owned by Turtle Bird Stable and trained by Steve Asmussen, Haynesfield (by Speightstown) captured 10 of 19 starts, including the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) in 2010. Bred by Barry Weisbord and Margaret Santulli, Havnesfield earned more than \$1.3 million.

ROUTE'S ROUT

Parcells scored an upset special of his own Feb. 18 when August Dawn Farm's Nine Route (by The Factor) recorded a front-running three-length victory in the \$95,000 Gander Stakes for 3-year-olds. Empire Line, the 1-4 favorite, was third.

"He was on the lead his last two races and coming in we thought he might be able to do the same thing today," said winning trainer Jerremiah Englehart. "(Jockey) Dylan (Davis) did a really nice job with him. Sometimes he tends to start a bit sluggishly, but he got out of there OK and really handled the (sloppy/

sealed) track, which was also a concern. He's now three-forthree for us, and he's pleasantly surprised me every time."

The time for the one-mile event was 1:41.25. He was one of a co-NYRA-record six wins on the day for Davis.

Bred by McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, Nine Route, out of Flash Act, by Sky Mesa, has won three of four starts and has earned \$127,448. The winner had been purchased at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings \$290,000.

Fast Breaks

USUALLY WHEN A TURF HORSE closes from out of the clouds, the animal unleashes an incredible burst of speed and energy in the stretch. Well, now that Startwithsilver (by Jump Start)—owned by Iris Smith Stable, Lady Sheila Stable, and Linda Rice—has traded in the turf for the main track, no one seems to have told the 5-year-old to amend her running style. And that has definitely turned out to be an immensely good thing.

Moving into the far turn of the \$100,000 Broadway Stakes, contested at six furlongs Feb. 18 at Aqueduct, Startwithsilver trailed the field of six older fillies and mares. The sloppy/sealed track had produced a plethora of frontrunning winners throughout the card. So her position appeared anything but envious as the field continued to make the bend, preparing to splash into the stretch.

The opening half-mile was contested in a quick: 46.88, with Sandy Belle (by More Than Ready) having outhoofed the other speedsters to the front and maintained her position into the lane. A pair of slop-loving horses—Frosty Margarita (by Frost Giant) and Picco Uno (by Macho Uno)—looked ready to mount serious bids. Behind those runners advanced Bee Noteworthy (by Read the Footnotes) with Dylan Davis, who had already equaled a New York Racing Association record by winning six races on the day.

Startwithsilver, piloted by Junior Alvarado, could see all five of her rivals as the rallying duo swung widest for home. In less than a dozen strides the gray mare and her rider had made up significant ground.

Just outside of the eighth pole, Startwithsilver was poised to surge to the fore. There was little question she was about to win from that point. But perhaps only her rider knew how much Startwithsilver had in reserve.

During the final furlong, Startwithsilver unleashed a blitz of energy and strode away from her competition, displaying an eye-catchingly rapid action.

"When we started with her, she broke her maiden on the dirt, but her mother had made around \$350,000 on the grass, so we switched her to the turf. There were just more opportunities for her there," said trainer Linda Rice. "Last winter I decided to give her a break and freshen her up, and this winter I thought



to try her on the dirt and give her another chance. We've been delighted with her last performances, and I thought this race was pretty darn competitive."

Alvarado believes Startwithsilver, who began her career at 2 and 3 as a speed horse before maturing into a closer, actually has "two extra gears.

"When she turned for home, she had that big kick, like a natural sprinter, very quick," he said. "I know she can do turf too, but I think her best right now is on the dirt. That turn-of-foot for home is incredible."

The winner, out of Office Miss, by Silver Ghost, stopped the timer in 1:11.44. She was clear by six lengths.

Bred by Burning Sands Stable, Startwithsilver, who has triumphed in her last three races (one on the turf followed by two on the dirt), has won five of 15 starts and has earned \$273,559. A \$32,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale yearling, she was bought by Rice for \$180,000 at the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales' April sale from Kings Equine.

Davis guided Check Mark Stables' Bee Noteworthy, from the barn of H. James Bond, to a runner-up finish.

In the final race on the card, Davis, 23, was also denied his seventh winner of the day, having to settle for second again.

"I really thought I was going to get (that last race). My eyes widened up and I was just trying, getting there, getting there, and it was just not enough," said Davis.

Kennesaw Mountain Racing's favored Picco Uno, trained by Jason Servis, finshed third.

TATE TOPS IN HOLLIE HUGHES

Billy Koch, the founder and managing partner of Little Red Feather Racing, is very pragmatic concerning the success of My Boy Tate (by Boys At Tosconova), who sports a five-race winning streak.

"It's not easy to win one race, let alone five in a row," said Koch, whose California-based partnership stable coowns the gelding with trainer Michelle Nevin, who is also the breeder.

Away from the gate as the 1-2 favorite

Feb. 19 in the \$100,000 Hollie Hughes Stakes, the fleet-footed 4-year-old, usually a pace factor, came away to a slow beginning.

But after a quick opening half-mile of :45.63 over the muddy main track, My Boy Tate, with the hot-riding Davis up, launched a wide bid from third in the field of eight older runners.

"When I saw Dylan make his move around the three-eighths pole, I knew he had horse," said Koch. "My Boy Tate showed another dimension today; to sit back off the fast pace and pounce. All you can ask is that the horse keeps improving, and he does. All of the credit goes to Michelle."

Through the lane My Boy Tate eventually wore down the stubborn 7-yearold Eye Luv Lulu (by Pollard's Vision), an accomplished mud-loving gelding who had gamely set the fractions.

My Boy Tate, out of Backslash, by Sharp Humor, posted a one-length victory, getting six furlongs in 1:10.23.

It was the gelding's second consecutive stakes win, having taken the Jan. 13 Say Florida Sandy Stakes.

My Boy Tate has won five of eight starts and has earned \$252,300. He is unbeaten in five starts while traveling less than a mile.

Nevin came up with the mating after spending time around both the sire and the dam during their racing careers while she was an exercise rider and assistant to Richard Dutrow Jr.

Hollie Hughes is a Hall of Fame trainer, who trained George Smith, winner of the 1916 Kentucky Derby. Hughes, however, didn't retire from the sport until 1975 at the age of 87.

THE BARBAROUS BATTALION

FRANCIS MORRIS WAS BORN IN ENGLAND in 1810 and emigrated with his family to America when he was 13. They settled in Throggs Neck, Long Island (now the Bronx), which would later become the site of Morris' breeding operation.

Morris was active in horse racing before and during the Civil War. In 1856 he helped finance Richard Ten Broeck's effort to race American Thoroughbreds in Europe. When Ten Broeck returned, he brought with him two British imports, the 3-year-old multiple stakes-winning stallion Eclipse and a 4-year-old broodmare named Barbarity.

When relations cooled between the two partners, Morris sued, and, as a result, he wound up with two horses that would enhance the breeding industry in New York State.

Eclipse and Barbarity produced five full sisters for Morris between 1864-73, all stakes winners, and their unusual names and accomplishments earned them the sobriquet "The Barbarous Battalion."

The first sister, Ruthless (1864), was the most accomplished of the quintet.

She won two of four races at 2, including the Nursery Stakes at Jerome Park. Her 3-year-old season would eventually put her into the Hall of Fame. She had five wins and two placings from seven starts, her wins coming in the Spring Stakes at Jerome Park, the 1¾-mile Travers Stakes, the two-mile Sequel Stakes at Saratoga, and the inaugural running of the 1¾-mile Belmont Stakes at Jerome Park.

A leg injury suffered in the fall while in training cut Ruthless' career short. Her breeding career was tragically ended at the age of 10 when a hunter shot her as she was grazing in her paddock. The famed turf historian John Vosburg considered her the best filly he ever witnessed.

The second member of the Barbarous Battalion, Relentless (1865) raced only once, winning the Saratoga Stakes as a 2-year-old.

Probably the most talented of the Barbarous Battalion besides Ruthless was Remorseless (1867), who won the Flash, Saratoga, and Nursery stakes at 2 and the Jerome Stakes at 3.

Regardless (1871) had one win, the Flash, in four starts as a 2-year-old, and two wins, the Monmouth Oaks and the Alabama Stakes,

from three starts as a 3-year-old. Like all her sisters, she never raced beyond 3.

Merciless (1873) won only one race in her two-year career, but it was the historic Alabama. When she was retired, she became the only one of the five sisters not to have a win against males.

A stakes-winning New York-bred colt that was a stablemate and foe of Ruthless was Monday (1864; Colton—Mollie Jackson, by Vandal). He made his debut Oct. 1, 1866, in the Nursery at Jerome Park, finishing third behind Ruthless. According to the New York *Times*, early reports indicated the colt had talent: "Ruthless' stable companion...had never been stripped before, but reports spoke highly of his speed and talent, and the result of the race showed that it (sic) was not unfounded."

Nine days later Monday broke his maiden and ended his 2-year-old season by winning the Trial Stakes at Paterson, N.J., with Ruthless finishing second.

Monday opened his 1867 season by taking two purse events at Jerome Park in May. His next appearance was on June 4 in the Jersey Derby at Paterson. Although the New York *Times* considered it "the most important 3-year-old race of the season," only three other horses were entered against the potent Morris entry of Monday and Ruthless.

The temerity of the owners of the scratched horses proved wise, as Monday won the race by two lengths over his stablemate, with the other three far behind. The Derby also gave Monday two wins in three starts over Ruthless.

Two days later Monday won his sixth race in a row, taking the Sequel at Paterson. On June 19 Monday's winning streak, and his career, came to an end when he finished fourth and last after suffering a breakdown in the Belmont Stakes at Jerome Park. Of the 11 horses entered, the New York *Times* reported that "the prestige of Mr. Morris' pair of flyers frightened away all but DeCourcy and Rivoli."

Ruthless beat DeCourcy by a nose. As an indication of the ability of Monday,

the *Times* reported that it was the intention of Mr. Morris to win with Monday. It is possible to argue that had Monday won the Belmont and continued to race as well as he showed prior to the Belmont, he might have been installed in the Hall of Fame rather than, or in addition to, Ruthless.

Morris' stable went into a decline after he suffered a major financial setback when he invested in the stillborn Nicaragua Canal. He died in 1883.

His son, John A. Morris, was also active in horse racing. In 1889 he built Morris Race Track in Westchester County to replace Jerome Park, which had been taken by eminent domain to be the site of New York City's reservoir. He also combined with his sons, Alfred and David, to maintain an active breeding and racing operation. In addition to New York State, they also had a breeding farm in Kentucky.

One of the Morris family's early prominent New York-breds was Terrifier (1888; Alarm—Bonnella, by Bonnie Scotland). Although he only won eight of 42 starts for the Morris family in 1890 and 1891, six of those wins were in stakes races. His first two stakes victories were in the Pamrapo at Eliza-

beth, N.J., and the Seaside at Gravesend. However, Terrifier lost the last 12 starts of his 2-year-old season.

Terrifier won five races, four of them stakes, from 22 starts in 1891. After opening his 3-year-old season with a second in the Carlton Stakes at Gravesend, he won that track's Fort Hamilton Handicap at odds of 2-1. The Turf writer for the New York *Herald* was impressed, perhaps overly so: "Terrifier's remarkable race...was the redeeming feature of the day...His performance, all things considered, is probably as good a one as was ever made by a 3-year-old."

After winning a selling stakes, Terrifier went on a six-race losing streak that was broken Aug. 13 when he won the sevenfurlong Orange Stakes at Jerome Park. Finishing second was the future Hall of Fame inductee Kingston, whose 89 career wins is still a record. The result was a controversial one, however. For some reason the track officials had moved the finish line one furlong beyond the judges' stand, where it usually was located. Both Charles Littlefield, Terrifier's jockey, and Tony Hamilton, the rider on Kingston, eased their horses as they approached the judges' stand, with Kingston enjoying a convincing lead. Littlefield was the

first to realize the mistake (some reports stated that Terrifier's trainer, R. Wyndham Walden, yelled at Littlefield to resume racing) and by the time Hamilton realized his error, it was too late.

Terrifier did not race in 1892, and in 1893 he raced in the colors of William "Father Bill" Daley. He went to the post 59 times, with eight wins, none of them stakes. He raced in some of the most prestigious races in the country, including the Brooklyn Handicap (sixth), the New York Jockey Club Handicap (third), the Sheepshead Bay Handicap (fourth), and the Manhattan Handicap (third). He was retired after that strenuous campaign.

The Morris' New York-bred that had the most talent was the ill-fated Compute (1899; Hanover—Reckon, by Pizarro). After losing his first two races in 1901 he broke his maiden July 20 by winning the Foxhall at Brighton Beach at 30-1. Among the horses he beat were the favorite, Hatasoo, who had earlier won the Vernal Stakes at Sheepshead Bay, and the winner of the next year's Kentucky Derby, Alan-a-Dale.

Compute was retired for the rest of the year and was declared one of the leading 3-year-olds in 1902 when on May 10 he began the season by winning the historic Withers Stakes at Morris Park. The New York *Times* was suitably impressed: "The race for the Withers...was a splendidly spectacular one from end to end. The finish was...one that will have a place in the memory of racegoers with the famous finish between Domino and Henry of Navarre in 1894."

The Withers would be the last win of Compute's career. On May 22 he was racing in the Belmont Stakes at Morris Park as the 5-2 second favorite when he broke down and had to be humanely destroyed.

JOHN HUNTER

John Hunter was born in 1833, and when he died in 1914 he had enjoyed almost 60 years in the racing business as an owner, breeder, and member of The Jockey Club. Hunter started a farm in Westchester County, although it was likely situated in what today would be called the Bronx. Hunter was one of the founders of the American Jockey Club in 1866 and was also one of the original backers of the Saratoga Race Course.

Hunter's first success as an owner and breeder was Alarm (1869; Eclipse—Maud, by Stockwell). At 2 he won one of four starts, and at three he won all five starts, four of them purse races at a mile or less and one purse race at 11/4 miles. On July 13 he equaled the American record for six furlongs, going 1:16, and four days later he ran a mile in 1:423/4, beating champion Kingfisher and setting an American record for the distance. He retired after the 1872 season. Walter Vosburg described him as "the champion miler of his day."


As good as he was on the track, Alarm was also considered a champion in the breeding shed. Stationed mainly in Kentucky, in 1875 he sired Himyar, out of Hira, by Lexington. A mutiple stakes winner in his own right, Himyar sired Domino, a future Hall of Fame inductee who not only was one of the best sprinters in history, but also had a brief but spectacular career as a stallion.

Another New York-bred standout bred by Hunter was the filly Olitipa (1872; Leamington—Oleata, by Lexington). She was unbeaten at 2, beginning with the Flash Stakes at Saratoga.

John Hervey, writing under his pen name Salvator, described her effort as "so startling that it amazed the whole turf world."

She concluded her 2-year-old season by winning the Nursery at Jerome Park. The Spirit of the Times commented on her win in the Nursery: "The Nursery Stakes fell to that flying filly Olitipa, who proved herself the best of her sex this year, and to her great turn of speed it is evident that she has stamina as well."

After Hunter's trainer A.J. Minor died in the winter of 1875, Hunter sold his

top two fillies, Sultanna and Olitipa, to August Belmont. Olitipa continued to shine, winning the Maryland, Ladies', Alabama, and Hunter stakes. One of her two losses came in the Saratoga Cup when Springbok and Preakness finished in a dead heat for first. In 1876 she won a purse race and finished third in the Centennial Stakes at Jerome Park before she was retired.

In an article in the *Daily Racing Form* Hervey discussed the career of Olitipa: "Olitipa ran a half mile (in the 1874 Flash) in 47¾ seconds...Olitipa was long considered a speed marvel and her half cited as the most brilliant exhibition of 'flying speed' ever witnessed. Yet Olitipa was able successfully, as a three-year-old, not only to win at a mile and a half, but a mile and three quarters in the Ladies' and Hunter Stakes over the trying old Jerome Park Course."

Hunter also had a role in the breeding of Aristides, the winner of the first Kentucky Derby in 1875. In 1871 R.W. Cameron sent his prize stallion Leamington to Hunter's farm for the breeding season. Among the broodmares that paid court was H.P. McGrath's Sarong. After the conception Sarong was shipped to Kentucky, where Aristides was foaled.
