

Breeders' Legislative Agenda: Advocating for our Fair Share

know this is one of your busiest times of the year, but, believe it or not, it is also one of the busiest times of the year for NYTB. Now that the New York State Legislature has hammered out the state budget and is running full steam ahead in the current session, the NYTB lobbyists and I are conducting weekly meetings at the offices of the Governor, State Senators, and Assemblymen.

> Our legislative agenda for 2013 is extremely full. As we have done in years past, we will seek sponsors for the Fund Cap Extender Bill, which will extend for another year the Fund's ability to utilize 65% of its budget on Breeders' Awards. Also this year NYTB will be lending strong support to a bill already in the works involving breeding and racing industry splits from future revenue on table games.

A third item of interest, however, probably has the biggest implications for the Fund's future of any piece of potential legislation we have seen in some time.

In 2010 I prepared a financial analysis and white paper on the breeders' behalf that outlined the impact of advanced deposit wagering entities (ADWs), such as TwinSpires, TVG, and XpressBet, who take wagers on New York racing. Since that time we have made presentations to legislators and key industry leaders. Racing in New York accounts for 30% of the nation's handle, but these ADW entities do not, under the current system, pay into the state's pari-mutuel tax system in the same way that off-track betting facilities or racetracks do. Moreover, even though ADWs pay fees to host tracks, which are shared with the horsemen in the form of purses, the Fund (and therefore breeders) has been entirely left out of the equation. As you probably know, ADWs represent the only growth sector in the pari-mutuel.

As a result of this and others' groundwork the Racing and Wagering Board (RWB) was charged by the state in 2012 to assess the impact of ADWs in New York. They concluded that the impact was significant, as we knew to be the case, and followed our recommendation that ADWs be compelled to make statutory distributions to industry stakeholders, including breeders.

After studying this issue for several years and crunching the numbers, I project that a reasonable percentage of distributions from ADWs could mean as much as \$2 million annually for the Fund.

The upshot for the immediate future is that NYTB will remain in the forefront of this issue and push for relevant legislation to be introduced this session. If we are successful, it will be a huge step forward that breeders will finally get their fair share of revenue derived from the product of which they are one of the main producers.

As always, I will keep you posted on this issue and on all the legislative developments this session. \square

MID-ATLANTIC & NORTHEAST HORSEMEN COMMIT TO UNIFORM MEDICATION PROGRAM

The regulators of eight states in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast, including New York, have committed to implement a uniform medication and drug-testing program. The agreement, announced March 12 and spearheaded by the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (THA), could pave the way for national uniformity.

The states that will implement the Mid-Atlantic Uniform Medication Program are New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and Massachusetts. The time frame will vary, depending on legislative approval processes in each state.

The program divides medications into two categories: controlled therapeutic substances and prohibited substances. The controlled therapeutic substances category will limit horsemen and veterinarians to 24 medications that have been recognized as appropriate for therapeutic use in racehorses to treat illness or injury.

The testing laboratories of the participating states will uniformly test for the substances using the same state-of-the-art technology and levels of detection, officials said. Each state must commit its laboratory to accreditation by the recently enacted "Code of Standards for Drug Testing Laboratories" under the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium.

Dead-heat Keeps Saginaw, Awesome Vision Undefeated in 2013

T wo winning streaks were kept alive in the same race March 21 at Aqueduct Racetrack where New Yorkbreds Saginaw and Awesome Vision dead-heated in the one-mile Compelling Word Stakes.

Saginaw, a homebred for Ted Taylor and one of two 7-year-olds in the race, took command of the race entering the first turn of Aqueduct's inner track. The son of Peruvian—Devilzene, by Devil's Bag, led the field through honest fractions of :23.84, :47.25, and 1:11.52. He was tracked closely by second-choice Johannesburg Smile.

The real racing began one furlong from the wire when Awesome Vision, having swung wide out of the turn, began rolling toward Saginaw from the back of the pack. Along the rail, Johannesburg Smile found his second wind and was making his own charge toward Saginaw. Both challengers ate away huge gaps in their margins with each stride, but it was 3-1 Awesome Vision who caught Saginaw at the wire. The final time was 1:36.46.

Saginaw, trained by David Jacobson and ridden by Junior Alvarado, improves his record to 18 wins from 37 starts. The Compelling Word was his eighth stakes victory since April 2012.


Awesome Vision is trained by Tom Albertrani and had Jose Ortiz in the irons. The 4-year-old son of Awesome Again—Blind Canyon, by Valley Crossing, is raced by West Point Thoroughbreds. The colt was bred by Kaz Hill Farm and Adena Springs.



POLLARD'S VISION TO WALDORF FARM

Grade II winner and millionaire Pollard's Vision, sire of champion 3-year-old filly Blind Luck, has relocated to Dr. Jerry Bilinski's Waldorf Farm near North Chatham for 2013.

A 12-year-old son of Carson City out of Etats Unis, by Dixieland Band, Pollard's Vision will remain the property of a syndicate and stand for \$5,000. He will continue to shuttle to La Mission Stallion Station in Argentina where he has averaged 130 mares a year for the past three years.

A winner of four graded stakes and earner of \$1,430,311, Pollard's Vision was bred in Kentucky by Charles A. Smith and foaled at Wintergreen Stallion Station, where he retired to stud in 2006. The stallion, who is blind in his right eye, was named for Red Pollard, Seabiscuit's jockey, also blind in one eye.

Pollard's Vision was the third-leading-first-crop sire in 2009. In that first crop was Blind Luck, who would go on to earn more than \$3.2 million and be named champion 3-year-old filly in 2010. Pollard's Vision has sired 12 other stakes winners.

"Having bred 165 mares in 2010, foals from his biggest and best book of mares are on their way to the starting gate this year,"

said Dr. Bilinski. "This gives breeders a lot of upside potential. His ability to get a sound, fast, versatile runner with a high AEI makes him a perfect fit for New York."

Flying Zee Racing Stables' multiple stakes-winning sprinter Agave Kiss has been retired from racing due to ankle problems and is booked to Tapit.



III) in March at Aqueduct, the Trevose Stakes at Parx as the 124-pound highweight, and capping the series by wiring the Miss Preakness Stakes at Pimlico. Later in the year Agave Kiss ran third in the Prioress Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga and second in Belmont Park's Valor Lady Stakes.

> Bred by Nustar Breeding, a partnership headed by the late Carl Lizza and his wife, Viane, and foaled at Highcliff Farm near Delanson (now Highcliff Stallions), Agave Kiss is a daughter of Lion Heart out of 2011 New York broodmare of the year Salty Romance (by Salt Lake).

Viane Lizza, who took over Flying Zee Racing Stables after her husband's death in 2011 said, "It was a complete joy to watch her run. She came around at a good time. We had a ball with her. Hopefully, she'll make a good mother."

SIMMARD TO MILL CREEK FARM

Grade II winner Simmard, a son of Dixieland Band, will stand the 2013 season at Anne Morgan and Tim Little's Mill Creek Farm in Stillwater.

Out of the stakes-winning Spectacular Bid mare, Dibs—a producer of two stakes winners and two stakes performers from six foals to start—Simmard is from the same female line as top sires Pulpit, Johannesburg, and Tale of the Cat.

Trained by Roger Attfield, Simmard won the 1³/₈-mile Mac Diarmida Stakes (gr. IIT) at Gulfstream, the 12-furlong Louisville Handicap (gr. IIIT), and 10-furlong Chief Bearhart Stakes. His stakes placings include runner-up finishes in the Northern Dancer Turf Stakes (Can-IT), W.L. McKnight Handicap (gr. IIT), and Singspiel Stakes (Can-IIIT). He finished third in the Elkhorn Stakes (gr. IIT), Pan American Stakes (gr. IIT), and Bowling Green Handicap (gr. IIT). Injured while preparing for last year's Sword Dancer Invitational Handicap (gr. IT) at Saratoga, Simmard retired with a career record of 7-5-4 from 32 starts and earnings of \$635,953.

Simmard's owner, Antonio Francesco, is offering several incentives to breeders, including "The Stallion Club," which earns a lifetime breeding right, a "Black-type Bonus" program, and a "Local Breeders Program" specifically for New York breeders that includes bonus seasons for meeting certain criteria. Francesco also is offering transportation incentives for approved mares.

Simmard's 2013 stud fee is \$2,800, live foal stands and nurses.

Alex's Pal, sire of multiple grade II winner C C's Pal, will stand the 2013 breeding season at Albert Geldmacher's Centen-

nial Farm near Gilbertsville. His fee is \$3,500 live foal or complimentary to the first 10 mares with an A-nick rating or better.

A half brother to grade II winner and sire Successful Appeal, 14-year-old Alex's Pal (Valid Expectations—Successful Dancer, by Fortunate Prospect) formerly stood at Birch Creek Farm in New Jersey.

FROST GIANT TO SHUTTLE TO YARRADALE STUD IN AUSTRALIA

New York's 2012 leading freshman sire Frost Giant will shuttle from his base at Keane Stud near Amenia to stand at Yarradale Stud in Western Australia for the Southern Hemisphere season that begins in August 2013.

Sunset Stables, which owns Frost Giant and is managed by Andrew Cohen, announced the shuttle plans in conjunction with Yarradale owner Ron Sayers. Yarradale will stand Frost Giant for a minimum of three years in an arrangement with Sayers and his partner, Eddie Rigg of Geisel Park Stud.

"After talking with Yarradale and learning about the high-quality mares they will breed to Frost Giant, we are looking forward to seeing how he will do in Australia," Cohen said. "We expect that this shuttle agreement will solidify Frost Giant as the 'real deal' on an international stage."

By Storm Cat's son Giant's Causeway, North America's leading sire in 2009-10 and 2012, 10-year-old Frost Giant is out of the Gone West mare Takesmybreathaway, a half sister to Mutakddim, sire of 109 stakes winners. This also is the prolific female family of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Super Saver, champion juvenile and international sire Rhythm, grade I winner and sire Bluegrass Cat, and grade I winner Girolamo.

Sayers said he will commit approximately 50 mares from his own band of 150 to Frost Giant during his initial Australian season, as well as make the stallion available to outside breeders.

Frost Giant set a record

for first-crop earnings by a New York-based freshman sire when his progeny earned \$840,633 in 2012. Two of Frost Giant's offspring, stakes winners Kelli Got Frosty and West Hills Giant, are finalists for New York-bred juvenile champions in the respective categories for fillies and for males.

Frost Giant, who previously shuttled to Chile for the 2009 and 2010 seasons, currently stands for \$7,500. His Australian fee will be announced at a later date.



GREAT AMERICAN LINES OF STAMINA

American breeders have long been taught to believe that the American sport horse Thoroughbred is inferior to the more stamina-bred Thoroughbreds of other countries such as France. Australia. Germany and Ireland. Contrary to this stigmatization, however, is the evidence that the American Thoroughbred actually supplies more than twice the amount of stayers as all those other countries combined. In fact, America has produced 25% of the world's greatest stamina bloodlines.

One of the greatest sources of stamina in American horses is **Princequillo**, a European-bred horse famous for his ability to correct leg problems and give soundness. His powerful stamina was heavily concentrated in the 6th and 7th generations, after years of being built up.

In order for the successful breeding of champions in the farther reaches, however, there needs to be a closer reinforcement of the pedigree so as not to lose the talent. To produce classic winners, breeders use both stamina and speed influences. Simply breeding speed to speed will result in a horse that may be brilliant at two, but cannot train on. Similarly, breeding stamina to stamina will result in plodders that have little acceleration. We need both stamina and sprint for success in sport.

THE ORIGINS OF SPEED

Alexander MacKay-Smith, the equine expert, determined that the modern Thoroughbred sprinting lines all originate at these 6 great lines:

1. St. Simon: was not raced until after he was 3; is pre-potent for speed, at all distances

- 2. Domino: pre-eminent sprint sire, ALTHOUGH his grandsons Celt and Colin were great classic mid-distance winners- the best of their era
- **3. Americus:** created racing and breeding dynasties in the English Thoroughbred: Mumtaz Mahal and Lady Josephine
- 4. The Tetrarch: produced the sprint sire Tetratema and the amazing Mumtaz Mahal, the fastest filly ever
- 5. Phalaris: most predominant sire line today and the fastest horse of his day at a mile; produced mid-distance horses as well as sprinters
- Havresac: top Italian sire; used by Tesio on his stayer mares

Important to note is that **Secretariat** - one of the greatest horses of modern times and a winner at ALL distances - was not classified as a sprinter, yet he has all six of the above Sprint lines. Therefore, we can see that speed is not just simply created from speed alone.

INBREEDING FOR SPEED AND STAMINA

Thoroughbred pedigree researchers have determined that speed can be built into a horse by duplicating ¾ siblings close up, and that both speed and class can be created by duplicating full sibling close up. Furthermore, stamina is built by multiple duplications in the 6th through 10th generations. Failure to reintroduce the strong stamina

background closer up, which carries the stamina forward to the 4th through 6th generations, can result in gradual loss of the talent.

THE PERILS OF PRECOCIOUS SPEED

In America, racehorses are being bred for fast-maturing, precocious speed with the expectance of a quick return on investment. Precocity, defined as "premature development," has become fashionable among today's breeders of thoroughbreds, and has made way for the coveted 10-second furlong. Today's breeders are looking to make a quick buck, and they are finding that speed is money.

However, many of the sprinter-bred horses do not train on well, and they lack the stamina to succeed at the classics. This new age of speed breeding leaves breeders with horses of weak composition and large bills to pay.

Stamina is what long-distance runners need and what thoroughbreds need if they are to win the longer classic races. Seattle Slew's trainer, Billy Turner says, "if you take stamina out of the line by breeding for the market, they can sprint but they can't stay." Sound blood of old warriors like Princequillo, Round Table and Damascus can provide the stamina that racers need to go the distance.

Saginaw winning the Hollie Hughes Stakes Feb. 18 at Aqueduct

Fame

Saginaw, a \$30,000 claim, is now a bona fide state-bred star

Between Aug. 15, 2009, and March 8, 2012, Saginaw won seven races. He raced 22 times, most of them for the man who bred him, Ted Taylor, earning \$261,620, mostly in allowance/optional claiming affairs. By pretty much any measure, he was a racing success.

Last year, though, the New York-bred became a star.

Drawing Away Stable claimed Saginaw for \$30,000 out of that win March 8, and he has since earned more than a half-million dollars in purse money. At age 7, he shows no signs of slowing down any time soon. "Every claim should be like him," said Ed Boden, managing partner for Drawing Away Stable.

A son of Peruvian (by Conquistador Cielo) out of the Devil's Bag mare Devilzene, Saginaw took four tries to break his maiden back in 2009 as a 3-year-old, but even as a youngster there were signs that he was something special. His apparently aptly named dam was, recalled Taylor, "a mean little devil."

"She was so much trouble in the barn that nobody wanted to train her," he said by phone from his Birmingham, Ala., law office.

Her orneriness carried over into moth-

erhood as she tried to kill her first foal, and all of her subsequent offspring were raised by nursemares...all except one.

"We have loads of pictures of her and Saginaw out in the paddock," he said. "He's the first baby she had that we didn't have to raise with a nursemare."

Saginaw won six times in 16 starts for Taylor, who owned Spendthrift Farm the home of Peruvian until he moved to McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in 2006—from 1994-2000, and who bred, among others, Maggy Hawk, dam of 2005 3-year-old champion Afleet Alex.

Named for a town in Shelby County, Ala., that Taylor drove past when he was

trying to think of a name for the foal, Saginaw was claimed for Robert Falcone by trainer Dominick Schettino June 5, 2011. Winless for those connections in six starts, the bay gelding was claimed again in February 2012, making one start—a 13¼-length romp at the \$30,000 level—for Sullivan Lane Stable before Drawing Away Stable and David Jacobson took him. He joined forces with trainer Jacobson, who had recently returned to racing after a 25-year absence. In the early 1980s Jacobson had been suspended in New York and charged with animal cruelty after one of his horses died of laminitis. Jacobson, a partner in Drawing Away, is the stable's trainer.

Saginaw has played a huge part in the stable's success. Since being claimed by

Boden formed Drawing Away in 2008 after taking a course in horse ownership taught by Chris Wittstruck at Hofstra University in Hempstead, N.Y. Wittstruck is an attorney, horse owner, writer, and a director of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York.

"Chris helped me get started in New York," said Boden, who lives in Westbury, N.Y. "We had a partnership at Charles Town, but that was too far away." Drawing Away, he's won 10 of 13 starts, including his first stakes score, the Carr Heaven Stakes in April last year at Belmont Park. He's gone on to win six more added-money events, including the John Morrissey Stakes at Saratoga, the Promenade All Stakes at Belmont, and the open company Gravesend Handicap in December at Aqueduct.

Jacobson thought enough of the horse to try him in last year's Metropolitan

Mile Handicap (gr. I), in which Saginaw turned in one of his few disappointing performances, finishing sixth behind a winning trifecta of multiple grade I winners Shackleford, Caleb's Posse, and To Honor and Serve.

Saginaw's 10 victories in 2012 made him the winningest horse in New York last year and put him in a three-way tie nationwide for most victories.

He kicked off his 2013 campaign with a victory in the Hollie Hughes Stakes for New York-breds Feb. 18 at Aqueduct. Chasing pacesetter Readytodefer through hot fractions, he gained steadily in the stretch to get up at the wire to win by a head.

"He still has it," said Jacobson after the race.

"He's maybe not the fastest horse I ever had but definitely has got the biggest heart."

To date, Saginaw has 18 wins, six seconds, and three thirds and has earned \$821,690.

Jacobson plans to keep Saginaw in state-restricted races though he doesn't rule out another venture in open company.

"It's what we all try for," he said, referring to Saginaw's success. "Once in a while, we get lucky." 🔊

Sight to See

Pollard's Vision joins growing stallion ranks in New York

P ollard's Vision, the sire of 2010 champion 3-yearold filly Blind Luck and 12 other stakes winners from just four crops to race, has moved to New York for the 2013 breeding season, joining a nice string of Kentucky-based stallions such as Bluegrass Cat, El Corredor, and Posse who have found their way to the Empire State in recent years.

Pollard's Vision, a 12-year-old son of Carson City—Etats Unis, by Dixieland Band, has set up shop at Dr. Jerry Bilinski's Waldorf Farm near North Chatham. His 2013 fee is \$5,000. There he joins New York grade I winner Bustin Stones—a grandson of Carson City—on the stallion roster.

"We are very excited to bring Pollard's Vision to New York breeders," Bilinski said. "He relocates as a successful stallion that has the proven ability to throw a champion.

"In New York you try to get the highest quality you can," Bilinski said. "Over the last five years or so, when we've been more certain that the VLTs were coming and more

certain that the breeder awards would be advancing, you've seen more quality in the influx of horses. We were lacking in bringing in a successful sire, and I think that has changed with horses like Pollard's Vision.

"By having an already proven horse, it's a lot easier for people like myself to buy mares at the sale, have them drop New York-breds, and then breed them back to a New York stallion. Oth-



erwise, I have to foal them out in Kentucky and have Kentucky-breds...and that's not the reason I'm buying them."

Sons of Carson City have done well in New York. At stud Carson City sired 100 stakes winners from 1,025 foals while standing at Overbrook Farm. His best son has been City Zip, who stood his first three seasons in New York before moving to Lane's End Farm in Kentucky for the 2005 breeding season. In 2012 he finished among the top 10 leading sires with more than \$8 million in progeny earnings.

Other Carson City sons include Good and Tough, who

stood in New York, Kentucky, and Louisiana; Hear No Evil, the sire of multiple grade I winner Jackson Bend; Five Star Day; and Cuvee, the sire of 15 stakes winners.

Bred and raced by W.T. Young's Overbrook Farm, Carson City excelled around one turn, winning three graded sprint stakes during two years in training under Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. A winner of the Sapling Stakes (gr. II) at Monmouth Park at 2, he came

the misfortune of being stabled in New York...along with undefeated Hall of Famer Personal Ensign. In Hometown Queen's best effort of the year she ran second to Personal Ensign in the Hempstead Handicap (gr. I) on Belmont Stakes (gr. I) day.

In the breeding shed, Hometown

Queen produced multiple stakes winner and millionaire Bowman's Band, a full brother to Etats Unis, who stood at stud at the Marvland Stallion Station in 2005 and at Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Ky., for two seasons prior to his untimely death in 2008, following complications from colic surgery. Bowman's Band is the sire of 13 stakes winners including sprint sensation Groupie Doll, the champion female sprinter of 2012.

Hometown Queen (by Pleasant Colony) is out of blue hen Nijinsky Star, a daughter of champion and 1974 filly Triple Crown winner Chris Evert. Hometown Oueen's half sister, Viviana (by Northern Dancer's Nureyev), in turn, produced several major winners for Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte operation in Kentucky including mighty Sightseek, a \$2.4 million earner; grade I-winning millionaire Tates Creek; and Quest to Peak, the dam of classic winner and European champion Special Duty. Another half sister, Willstar (by Nureyev), is the dam of



group I winner Etoile Montante.

Prior to a stud career at the Greely family's Wintergreen Stallion Station near Midway, Ky., Pollard's Vision won four stakes including the Illinois Derby (gr. II) for Edgewood Farm and trainer Todd Pletcher and made his way under the Twin Spires for the 2004 Kentucky Derby (gr. I). Not bad for a colt who is blind in one eye. It wasn't his day in the slop at Churchill Downs, but he bounced back to run second in the Ohio Derby (gr. II), win Delaware Park's Leonard Richards Stakes (gr. III), and place in the West Virginia (gr. III) and Pennsylvania (gr. II) Derbys. He finished his 3-year-old campaign with a narrow score in the Walmac Lone Star Derby

A grade III winner at 4, Pollard's Vision returned to Hawthorne Park, the home of the Illinois Derby, to win the National Jockey Club Handicap over Badge of Silver. He also managed a pair of grade I placings in the Pimlico Special and Suburban handicaps (both gr. I).

> stallion ranks in Kentucky, Pollard's Vision was priced at \$10,000 at Wintergreen and was a big hit by the time his first crop hit the track in 2009. Twenty winners came from his first crop, which would eventually yield nine stakes winners. Interest from South America would follow and since the 2010 breeding season Pollard's Vision has shuttled to La Mission Stallion Station in Argentina.

> One of those nine stakes winners was Blind Luck, who would win

more than \$3.2 million and be named champion 3-year-old filly. Out of a Best of Luck mare, Blind Luck would be a grade I winner at 2, 3, and 4.

Her success made the phone ring at Wintergreen Stallion Station in Kentucky. Pollard's Vision's 2010 book was 165 mares. He covered 83 mares in 2011.

"Having bred 165 mares in 2010, foals from his biggest and best book of mares are on their way to the starting gate this year," Bilinski said. "His ability to get a sound, fast, versatile runner with a high AEI makes him a perfect fit for New York. He's obviously produced successful racehorses. He's going to be a top horse for our state and our program.

"You can't go wrong," Bilinski said. "If you win a maiden special weight with a purse of \$33,000 and you've got a New York-sired horse, you've got another almost \$10,000 in breeders awards, and that's a lot of money.

"The proof is how they do on the racetrack...and we'll have fun watching the races and following the stats."

We can't wait to see the results. 🕅

High Cotton filly sells for \$340,000 at OBS March select sale of 2-year-olds in training

chestnut daughter of High Cotton out of a graded stakes-producing dam garnered the fourth-highest price during the opening session March 12 of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s select sale of 2-year-olds in training. The filly went to California trainer Peter Miller on behalf of Richard Pell's Pelican Racing for \$340,000.

She is a half sister to Den's Legacy (by Medaglia d'Oro), a graded stakes winner at 2 and recent third in the Rebel Stakes (gr. II) at Oaklawn Park.

Eight of 13 New York-breds sold bring six-figure prices at OBS

Miller told the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, "(The filly is) exceptionally athletic and very correct. She has a lot of quality about her and seems to have a lot of class. She had one of the best works in the sale (:10¹/₅). We reached on her, but she's got some pedigree, and if you're going to reach for one, you might as well do it for a filly with pedigree."

The filly was bred in partnership by Stephanie Brennan, Marette Farrell, and Gaye Swartz, and foaled at Chestertown Farm near Chestertown. She first changed hands when Ben Weaver purchased her at the 2012 Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale for \$50,000.

She is the third foal, and first New York-bred offspring, from the unraced War Chant mare Sunshine Song, a \$185,000 yearling purchase in 2005. The filly's second dam, Remember the Day, is a stakes winner and producer of three stakes winners including grade I winner C. S. Silk (by Medaglia d'Oro).

The High Cotton filly was consigned by Steven Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds, agent. New York-breds were a hit at the two-day OBS sale March 12-13. Of the 16 juveniles offered after scratches, 13 sold for an average price of \$140,769 and a median of \$145,000. Eight individuals changed hands for six figures.

Sibling Rivalry

If the name Frankie Freud has a familiar ring, you are probably recalling his famous older full sister, Franny Freud (Freud), a grade I winner and multiple New York-bred champion. Little brother, 2-year-old Frankie Freud, was purchased during the second session of the sale by trainer David Cannizzo for \$90,000 on behalf of ZRJ Stables. The colt will train and race in New York.


nia, Frankie Freud recorded a sharp :10¹/₅ work in the under track show. Consigned by Becky Thomas' Sequel Bloodstock, the colt was the fourth top-priced New York-bred to go through the ring at the March sale.

Cannizzo said, "To get him for \$90,000 in my eyes was pretty much a steal. He worked well on the Polytrack, but I think he'll be a good sprinter on dirt and turf. He has a great pedigree, too. His sister was a very nice horse here in New York." Cannizzo added, "I really appreciated how helpful Becky Thomas was throughout the purchasing of Frankie." (Virtual Inspection Video, ThoroStride.com).

A stakes winner on Polytrack, dirt and turf (\$686,029), Franny Freud took the grade I Prioress at Belmont, grade II Beaumont at Keeneland, Lady Finger Stakes at Finger Lakes and three divisions of the New York Stallion Stakes series. She also finished second in the Santa Ynez Stakes (gr. II) at Santa Anita. Winner of eight of 11 starts and out of the exacta only once, Franny Freud retired injured just days before starting as the probable favorite in Saratoga's Test Stakes (gr. I). After her retirement Franny Freud was purchased for \$560,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale by Katsumi Yoshida.

Frankie Freud's dam Frankly Fran, a winning daughter of D'Accord, is a half sister to two stakes winners and producer of two winners in addition to Franny Freud: the resilient Semichi (Brushed On), who started more than 60 times and earned nearly \$200,000, and Saratoga Steve, a full brother to Franny Freud (\$70,211). Frankie Freud is the first foal for Frankly Fran since Franny. Currently the mare has a yearling Freud colt and was bred back to Freud last year.

Cannizzo said, "We'll be pointing to Belmont and Saratoga with him. Since he's a New York-bred there are lots of racing opportunities and of course we'd love to take down some

of those New York Stallion Stakes."

In another wrinkle on the little brother theme, 30-year-old Cannizzo, a former assistant to trainers Bruce Levine, Scott Lake and Dale Romans, is the younger brother of New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo. He bought three other juveniles at the sale.

Other New York-bred standouts at OBS include a pair of New York-bred colts that each brought \$180,000 and both worked an eighth-mile in :10¹/₅. These top sellers were Hip 332, a Heatseeker colt out of Minetonightsfirst (D'Accord—Mine Tonight) bred by Edition Farm; and Hip 345, a bay colt by Broken Vow out of Naughty Natisha (Known Fact—Noble Natisha) bred by Dr. William B. Wilmot and Dr. Joan M. Taylor.

Chika Racing bought the Heatseeker colt that has five winning siblings, including multiple stakes-placed Ouchy Night (\$209,793). The colt sold previously to Eisaman Equine for \$70,000 at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred sale.

Leah Gyarmati, acting as agent for Jeff Treadway bought the colt by Broken Vow.

John W. Greathouse had purchased the colt previously as a weanling for \$135,000 at the 2011 Keeneland No-

vember breeding stock sale and Phase II Thoroughbreds picked him up for \$120,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale last year.


