Icing on the Cake

IN THE MANY DECADES of the New York breeding and racing program, 2014 was a standout year by any measure. I would like to add another exciting item to the long list of the year's successes: Soon every single participant in the program—breeder, stallion owner, and open company owner alike—will receive the largest "supplemental bonus" in the history of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund.

Everyone who earned an award from the Fund in 2014 will be receiving a bonus check for approximately an additional 16% of awards earned. Therefore, breeder, open company owner, and stallion owner awards will be receiving this supplemental payment of 16% on top of their already earned awards for 2014. The supplemental bonus payments for 2014 will total \$2.5 million dollars.

The record bonus is made possible by a dramatic upturn in Fund revenue last year, which was up 14%, or \$2.6 million over 2013 to make a grand total of \$22 million. This comes in part from increased video lottery terminal revenue, but a large portion of the increase (\$930,000) comes from an entirely new revenue source.

You may recall that in 2013 NYTB took part in lobbying efforts to secure a percentage of out-of-state ADW revenue for the Fund. These efforts were successful, and the new income for the program, which began in January 2014, amounted by the end of the year to 4% of the Fund's total revenue.

Bonuses aside, the Fund's prosperity produced new benchmarks for regular program awards in 2014. All awards increased 12% to \$17.8 million, up from \$15.8 million in 2013, and each category of award rose significantly. Breeders' awards increased from \$11.2 million in 2013 to \$12.8 million in 2014. Stallion owners' awards rose from \$2.7 million in 2013 to \$3 million in 2014 and open company owners' awards rose from \$1.8 million to \$1.9 million.

Increased revenue also allowed the Fund to undertake an important mission in 2014 involving Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack. Due to declining attendance, declining handle, and contractual factors, the Finger Lakes purse account suffered enormous stress last year. The Fund was able to offset the declines by giving the Farmington racetrack an additional \$300,000 in the fall, which brought the total amount of purse enrichment money for New York-bred purses awarded to Finger Lakes in 2014 to \$1.2 million.

As for the long term, NYTB is working actively with racetrack representatives and others to devise solutions for the racetrack's ongoing challenges. Above all, we are taking aggressive steps to address the problematic potential licensing of a casino in neighboring Tyre. Senator John Bonacic and Assemblyman Gary Pretlow introduced NYTB's legislation in late March to hold Finger Lakes purses harmless if the Lago Casino is licensed. The upshot of the legislation is that VLT money going to Finger Lakes should be maintained at 2013 levels.

Furthermore, I'm happy to report that NYTB's Thoroughbred Breeding Fund Cap Extender bill has passed the Senate. As we have done in years past, the Fund Cap Extender Bill will extend for another year the Fund's ability to utilize 65% of its budget on Breeders' Awards. We are working with the Assembly to pass matching legislation in the months ahead.

I find it never gets old to report growth and progress in the New York racing and breeding program, not to mention increased benefits for New York's savvy and hard-working breeders, who have earned every bit of good news they can get. This year breeders can celebrate not only nationally recognized successes for New York-breds at auction and on the racetrack but also the Fund's bottom line and active work on the challenges faced in western New York.

BILL WOULD PROTECT PURSES AT FINGER LAKES

Legislation has been introduced in both houses of the New York legislature, which would require the owners of a future commercial casino to make whole any losses suffered by horsemen and breeders at nearby Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack, because of the expected competitive hit the upstate track is facing.

If approved, the legislation would require the owners of the still-to-be-built Lago Resort & Casino to make payments to ensure that purse and breeding funds at Finger Lakes are maintained at 2013 levels. The new legislative push comes after an Andrew Cuomo administration panel chose Lago, located 27 miles from Finger Lakes, as one of the state's three recently awarded full-scale casino development sites.

The measure would require Lago, which would be located between Rochester and Syracuse, to make millions of dollars in payments each year to the track's purse fund and to the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

With threats that Finger Lakes will shut down with new competition from Lago—it will be permitted to offer more lucrative and bettor-friendly types of games than the video lottery terminals currently at the venue—Sen. John Bonacic and Assemblyman Gary Pretlow, who head racing and wagering committees, introduced identical bills a few days apart to address the situation.

"The health of Finger Lakes is critically important to Thoroughbred breeders and horsemen," said Jeff Cannizzo, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, which introduced the legislation. "The statistics tell the story. In 2013 New York-breds were responsible for 71% of the total starts at

Finger Lakes and earned 75% of all the purse money distributed. Furthermore, races at Finger Lakes generated 52% of the number of breeders awards paid by the Fund in 2013."

Barry Ostrager, NYTB president, said in an e-mail statement that the association believes maintaining the current purse structure at the track along with the associated breeder, stallion, and owner awards is "essential to preserve the indigenous (New York) breeding program."

That program, Ostrager said, has grown in recent years with backing from the executive and legislative branches in New York "and is presently a huge economic driver of the New York economy, generating thousands of jobs and billions of dollars of economic activity."

The NYTB's legislation is also being pushed by the Finger Lakes horsemen.

International Star Sweeps FG Stakes

Grounds Race Course & Slots. The son of Fusaichi Pegasus won the Jan. 17 Lecomte Stakes, the Feb. 21 Risen Star Stakes (gr. II), and the March 28 Louisiana Derby (gr. II) and has now earned more than \$1 million.

Bred by Katharine Voss and Robert Manfuso, International Star is out of the French Deputy mare Parlez. Trained by Mike Maker, International Star ranks high on most lists of Derby contenders. (For more on International Star, see page 38)

\$560K SIDNEY'S CANDY 2YO TOPS NY-BREDS AT OBS

The last New York-bred to pass through the ring at the March 17-18 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March sale turned out to be the most successful, when Hip 610, a colt by Sidney's Candy, sold to L.E.B. for \$560,000.

Hip 610, which turned in an eighth of a mile breeze in :10½ in the under tack show, was consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, agent, who purchased him for \$160,000 at last summer's Fasig-Tipton preferred New York-bred sale in Saratoga. He had sold previously as a weanling to Gino Antonio for \$140,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale.

Bred by SF Racing, and foaled on March 10, 2013, at Vinery NY at Sugar Maple near Poughquag, the chestnut colt is the second foal out of Broadway Hennessey (by Hennessy). Purchased by SF Bloodstock for \$70,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale, the mare is a half sister to graded stakes-placed stakes winner Courageous Act.

The cumulative numbers for New York-breds at the sale were very good. Of 31 juveniles offered, 23 sold for an average of \$158,783, not far off the cumulative average for the general population of the sale, which was \$170,804. The New York-bred median price of \$130,000 outperformed the sale median of \$105,000.

NYTBDF Supplemental Awards Up 15%

The New York Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund put in the mail March 20 supplemental award payments of 15% of the awards earned in 2014. To all of those receiving these checks, the Fund congratulates you for breeding and racing the quality Thoroughbreds that earned you this supplemental award payment. As you can see from the chart, 1,232 checks totaling \$2,452,401 are being mailed.

The Fund and stakeholders across New York can boast that the state's foal count increased by 4.4% over the 2013 count.

Sharp Humor Dies in South Korea

Sharp Humor, winner of the grade II Swale Stakes and runner-up in the 2006 Florida Derby (gr. I) won by Barbaro, has died in South Korea as a result of an accident at Let's Run Stud Farm on Jeju Island.

The 12-year-old son of Distorted Humor was in his third season at stud in Korea, and had covered 97 mares in 2013 and 85 in 2014, with



a full book pledged for the 2015 season, according to the Horseracing in Korea website.

Sharp Humor was bred in New York by Patricia Purdy. Trained by Dale Romans, the bay colt won four of 10 starts and earned \$490,410 racing for his breeder who sold an interest in the colt to Win-Star Farm prior his start in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

The native New Yorker won the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes and Sleepy Hollow Stakes (shown here), for New York-breds at Belmont Park in addition to placing in the Hudson Handicap. He also finished third in the New York Breeders' Futurity at Finger Lakes.

Sharp Humor, who previously stood in the U.S. at WinStar Farm until being purchased by the Korea Racing Authority in November 2011, has sired 17 stakes winners and his progeny have earned in excess of \$19.1 million.

ALEX'S PAL SUCCUMBS TO COLIC

Alex's Pal (Valid Expectations—Successful Dancer, by Fortunate Prospect) was euthanized March 11 due to colic at age 16. A half brother to grade II winner and successful stallion Successful Appeal, Alex's Pal stood at Centennial Farm of New York near Gilbertsville, where his 2014 fee was \$2,500.

Alex's Pal, who won six of 19 races and earned \$163,680, began his career at stud in Florida and stood in Pennsylvania and New Jersey before relocating to New York in 2013.

The progeny of Alex's Pal have earned more than \$3.9 million to date, led by multiple grade II winner C C's Pal.

TIM'S LADY, DAM OF MELLOW ROLL, EUTHANIZED AT 29

Stakes-placed stakes-producer Tim's Lady, a 29-year-old Oh Say mare, bred and owned by Jane Schosberg and trained by her son Rick, was euthanized Feb. 23 at Jane and Paul Schosberg's Pine Lane Farm near Katonah due to the infirmities of old age.

Foaled April 7, 1986, Tim's Lady is out of Dot in Spot, a producer of nine winners from nine foals to race. Dot in Spot, a 1967 foal, was the Schosbergs' first Thoroughbred—an anniversary gift from Paul to Jane.

Tim's Lady won three races and finished second twice. She retired after seven starts with \$69,426 in earnings.


As a broodmare, Tim's Lady produced four winners, led by Mellow Roll (by Distinctive Pro), a bay

colt campaigned by Anita and Stuart Subotnick's Anstu Stables.

A \$67,000 2-year-old sale purchase, Mellow Roll won five of seven starts at 2, including four stakes and was named 1997 New York-bred 2-year-old champion male.

The following year Mellow Roll won the Empire Classic Handicap and the Alex M. Robb Stakes and finished second in the Riva Ridge Stakes (gr. II) at Belmont. He retired with \$555,772 in earnings.

"TL (Tim's Lady) lived her entire life with us at Pine Lane Farm," said Paul Schosberg. "We would like to acknowledge the wonderful care given her by our farrier, Ray Galluscio, and our veterinarian, Dr. Chris Koch."

RACHEL M. BROMAN

TIMOTHY SNYDER

Timothy Snyder, a trainer based at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack and the owner of stakes winner Lisa's Booby Trap, died March 24 at his home near Camillus, N.Y. He was 59 years old.

Snyder campaigned Lisa's Booby Trap, a \$4,500 purchase in 2010, to a 10-2-3 record for earnings of \$182,440. The Florida-bred Drewman filly was blind in her left eye, had a left-front club foot, and was flat-footed in her right front, yet managed to win the 2010 Loudonville Stakes at Saratoga Race Course by six lengths.

The filly, named after Snyder's late wife, Lisa, was the subject of a book by Joe Layden published in 2013—*The Ghost Horse: A True Story of Love, Death, and Redemption*. Lisa's Booby Trap also drew national media attention as the subject of a Dateline NBC feature, and was covered by prominent outlets like the New York *Times*.

RICHARD McCARTHY


Richard Lowell McCarthy, a handicapper and Equibase chart-caller who worked in the Thoroughbred industry for decades, died March 7 at his home in Jackson, N.Y., after a long illness. He was 68.

McCarthy worked as a handicapper for several publications, including *Newsday* (N.Y.), *F.I.G.S. Form*, and the *Racing Times* before spending more than a decade as the Equibase chart-caller at the three New York Racing Association tracks before retiring in 2008 due to health issues.

The family said that donations in McCarthy's memory may be sent to the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund.



'He made everybody's life better' WHEN WORD CAME MARCH 18 that Allen Jerkens had died following a short illness, the racing industry collectively mourned. In this pari-mutuel game that's based on benefiting from differences of opinion, he was a unanimous favorite, odds-on to elicit cheers when he won—whether you held a ticket on his horse or not—and an outpouring of grief, gratitude, and memories when we learned that the man who made a career of beating the odds had been unable to stage one more rally.

We had him for longer than we had any reasonable right to expect. A month shy of his 86th birthday, Jerkens had weathered a number of serious illnesses, most recently in 2008 when he underwent open-heart surgery. Having watched him come back every time, we might be forgiven for thinking he'd do it this time, too.

Jerkens was born in New York in 1929. He started working at the track as a teenager, and a photograph hanging at Belmont Park shows him in the winner's circle at the old Jamaica track in 1946. It was before he'd taken out his own trainer's license; he is holding a horse owned and trained by his father.

The Horse of the Year that year was Assault, the seventh winner of the Triple Crown. He was trained by Max Hirsch, famous for the breakfasts he'd host at his capacious barn under the trees on the backstretch at Saratoga. Decades later Jerkens himself would train from that barn, entertaining visitors with stories of those breakfasts.

"He had a cook, and he'd get all his owners in there for breakfast," he said in 2011. "He used to have a big chili party, too, once a year. Only for the rich people. He knew which side his bread was buttered on. He knew all the facets of this game."

"Who else has knowledge of racing from that time?" asked Brad Rawling, the son of Jerkens' late wife of nearly 30 years, Elisabeth.

Though often shy, Jerkens was generous with that knowledge: with his staff, with fellow trainers, with fans eager to hear from a man who had learned from Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons, who had seen Citation run, who possessed what seemed like a limitless store of racing information.

ALLEN JERKENS

Fernando Abreu worked for Jerkens for nearly 20 years, starting as a hotwalker at Gulfstream and working his way up to assistant.

"I came to Florida looking for a job, and a friend of mine said, 'Come work with The Chief,' " Abreu remembered. "Then I saw him kicking buckets, and I thought, 'I'm really going to work for this guy?' "

The famous Jerkens temper—known equally for its ferocity and its brevity—gave way to the equally well-known Jerkens generosity. Claiming he didn't have any jobs open, he nonetheless told Abreu to come back the next morning.

"I was basically a sponge," Abreu said. "I wanted to absorb everything he had to teach. If he'd have lived another 15 years, I'd have never gone on out my own. He was like my father."

An old-school gentleman who referred to his owners as "Mr." and "Mrs." until the end, Jerkens both admired and eschewed some of racing's elite elements. He trained for some of the wealthiest owners in the sport but never, despite his success, considered himself part of that crowd. A paternal figure to so many, he was indebted to his own father, Joseph, who ran a riding and rehabilitation stable.

"When we first came to the racetrack, he was game," Jerkens said several years ago. "We didn't have any money, and he got stalls because we were supplying the horses for the Sportsman's Club, and he knew the owner of the Aqueduct Race Track at the time, a man from the Queens County Jockey Club.

"Things went bad again for a while and we couldn't pay the bills, but he could do things on a shoestring. He was a full-time trainer for only a couple of years. He was a lot better than he ever got credit for."

Joseph Jerkens wouldn't live to see his son achieve racing's highest honors—induction into the Hall of Fame, winning an Eclipse Award—and perhaps because of his upbringing during the Great Depression, Allen never seemed to take for granted what he'd accomplished or what he'd earned.

"He treated everybody with dignity and class, whether you were Jack Dreyfus or the Aly Kahn or (someone like me)," said Tim Whitbred, one of Jerkens' longtime owners. Jerkens won his last stakes race with one of Whitbred's horses, the New York-bred, stakes-winning, multiple graded stakes-placed Go Unbridled. She won the Saratoga Dew Stakes for the second time in August 2013 and was Jerkens' last starter at Saratoga. She recently produced a New York-bred Ghostzapper foal.

"I didn't have the greatest horses," Whitbred said. "A lot of owners sent Allen far superior, better-bred horses than mine, but he got my horses to compete at the highest levels of their ability. I'd have always kept my horses with him, no matter how we did. I knew that they got the best care and the best treatment."

Jerkens' biggest wins came on New York's racetracks; aside from winters in Florida, he was based here for all but one of his 60-plus years as a trainer. In a sport whose roots and identity often come from Kentucky, Jerkens inspired a young New Yorker enthralled with horse racing.

"I'd known him since I was a teenager," said fellow Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito. "He was one of my heroes. He was one of my guys."

In his early 20s Zito was rubbing horses at Hialeah when he was first invited to play in one of Jerkens' legendary backstretch football games.

"Someone said, 'I think Allen Jerkens is playing, too,' and I said, 'Really?' Then I get the great task of blocking him, and he just went right through me," Zito remembered.

"I used to watch the things that he did, all the things you could learn," Zito said. "He was a New York guy, like me, and I was in awe that he was so good and he was from here."

Zito's Fly Down lost the 2010 Travers Stakes (gr. I) by a heartbreaking nose to Afleet Express, trained by Jerkens' son, Jimmy. That night Zito dined at Villa Balsamo near Saratoga, one of Jerkens'

"I walk in," said Zito, "and there's Allen and Liz. And I say, 'Hey, Chief, what a great race.' And he looks up and says, 'Why couldn't it be a dead heat?'"

Zito choked up at the memory.

"Only Allen Jerkens would have said that," he said.

Also part of Jerkens' New York legacy are the horses that his wife bred and raced, often in the name of Hardwicke Stable, and that he trained. She kept her mares at Highcliff Farm near Delanson, often breeding to the horses to which her husband had stallion rights. Among their most successful horses is Spite the Devil, earner of nearly \$850,000 with wins in the 2003 Withers Stakes (gr. III) and back-to-back wins in the Empire Classic Handicap for New York-breds. Elisabeth Jerkens passed away in August 2014.

At Jerkens' Gulfstream Park barn, training continues, with Abreu running horses in his own name for the first time, according to the practices inculcated by the man we called "The Chief."

"Being patient," Abreu said. "Making sure the horse is happy and doing good. Paying attention to how the horse is feeling."

Alumni of the Allen Jerkens School of Training Horses populate the back-stretches of New York and Florida. Some are stakes-winning trainers; some are lifetime grooms; some are jockeys. All benefited from knowing the man with a reputation for taking a gamble on people other trainers might have passed on, the man not afraid to take a shot against a heavy favorite in a stakes race or to take a chance on giving someone a job.

"His legacy isn't in beating Kelso and Secretariat," said Whitbred. "That's great, but the people that he touched and the people that he helped, that he made better people—it's probably in the thousands.

"I respect him like no other person that I've known," Whitbred continued. "He was just a great man. He made everybody's life better."



WHAT A NIGHT AT THE SPA for the connections of Dayatthespa. The chestnut mare owned by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon, and Bradley Thoroughbreds earned three top prizes April 6 at the annual awards banquet of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders at the Saratoga National Golf Club in Saratoga Springs. The event, which was spon-

sored by the New York Breeding and Development Fund, was emceed by former jockey and broadcast analyst Richard Migliore. The 2014 New York-bred divisional champions and Horse of the Year were chosen by a ballot of New York Turf writers, handicappers, chart callers, and racing analysts conducted by NYTB.

DAYATTHESPA

Horse of the Year, Turf Female, and Older Female:

Dayatthespa, owned in partnership by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon, and Bradley Thoroughbreds, became the first New York-bred to win a grade I Breeders' Cup event after she landed the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf Nov. 1, 2014, at Santa Anita Park and earned the Eclipse Award as the top grass female of 2014. A winner of three of four starts on the year, she was guided through her 5-year-old campaign by trainer Chad Brown. Following a runner-up finish in the Fasig-Tipton De La Rose Stakes in August, she reeled off three straight: the Yaddo Stakes at Saratoga, the First Lady Stakes (gr. IT) at Keeneland, and the Filly & Mare Turf. A daughter of City Zip, bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, Cracchiolo & Scott Goldsher, Dayatthespa earned two other championships for the year and was a dual state champion in 2012. She was sold at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale for \$2.1 million.

Callahan Revocable Trust Dated 2/28/02, Palace was a \$20,000 claim by trainer Linda Rice in October 2012. The now 6-year-old was the champion sprinter of 2013 for Antonino Miuccio.

I; her second grade I score) and Gallant Bloom Handicap (gr. II). She has five wins from eight career starts and has earned \$943,800. 

I) where he finished a gallant fifth behind national Horse of the Year California Chrome. Samraat also ran sixth in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) and earned \$745,000 on the year.

She ranked second with New York-breds in earnings behind Chad Brown.

He recorded 234 victories, winning at an 18% clip and was the go-to rider for state-bred champions Samraat and Upstart. Star Appeal

International Star's rise sheds insight into state-bred program's success

KATHARINE "KATY" VOSS AND ROBERT MANFUSO are Marylanders, no doubt. The couple have deep roots in the Old Line State and have been operating their Chanceland Farm near New Freedom, Md., since 1989.

Then how did they wind up breeding classic contender International Star in the Empire State rather than in Maryland? The answer is a good call in timing the market and the rising power and money available in the New York-bred breeding program.

"At the time the market was terrible in Maryland, and the New York-breds were worth a whole lot more than Maryland-breds," Voss said. "We figured a New York-bred Fusaichi Pegasus would be worth more. Also, Girolamo was standing his first season in New York (in 2012), and we really liked him and wanted to send the mare (Parlez) to him. That was killing two birds with one stone."

The Fusaichi Pegasus—Parlez foal, International Star, was delivered at Dr. Doug Koch's Berkshire Stud near Pine Plains in March 2012, and Parlez was bred back to Girolamo. Unfortunately that foal died.

International Star, however, turned out to be "just a really nice colt," according to Voss. "You couldn't find anything wrong with him. He went nicely, and he was well-balanced. He wasn't too big, just a nicely put-together horse."

International Star was broken at the 191-acre Chanceland Farm where Voss oversees all of the training. She also has a string in Maryland in training at Laurel Park.

The Maryland farm is split into two sections, with one side focusing on the

breeding operation and the other featuring a racetrack and a training barn. They also have a turf gallop and a pond where they can swim horses. On the breeding side Voss and Manfuso have about 20 mares and another five they board for clients.

Prior to taking their horses to market, Voss and Manfuso have their yearlings evaluated by Patti Miller of EQB (Equine Biomechanics and Exercise Physiology in West Grove, Pa.).

EQB, according to Miller, in its evaluations does the "add-ons" with cardio assessment of yearlings and high-speed film analysis with 2-year-olds in training.

"But we don't throw the baby out with the bathwater," Miller said. "We believe in traditional horsemanship. Katy's a great trainer and a good, commonsense person, and so is Bob."

Miller was quite taken by the young colt

"I actually watched him and he was a beautiful mover and he had this tremendous cardio," Miller said. "I liked everything about him, and he also was a New York-bred."

Miller got another look at International Star while he was at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale in September 2013. Another client of EQB is Ramsey Farm. Miller purchased him for Ken and Sarah Ramsey for \$85,000.

"That was a lot of money for a Fu Peg; it wasn't like Ken was real happy," Miller said. "But we had had a little luck for him with Vicar's in Trouble and We Miss Artie, so he was willing to take a shot. He was a New York-bred, and I told him he couldn't go wrong."

Voss and Manfuso were pleased with the price.

"That was a good price all things considered," Voss said. "People would come by at the sale and say, 'Nah, can't buy a Fu Peg.'"

International Star's dam, Parlez, is loaded with black type on her page and she has two stakes winners and a graded stakes winner.

Parlez, a daughter of French Deputy—Speak Halory, by Verbatim, is a granddaughter of Halory, a blue hen mare bred by the legendary E.P. Taylor and raced by Jack Kent Cooke.

Halory is the dam of five graded stakes winners including Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (gr. II) winner Halory Hunter, Delaware Oaks (gr. III) winner and stakes producer Brushed Halory, and Van Nistelrooy, a group II winner and \$6.4 million sale yearling.

Parlez' three stakes winners are all by sons of Mr. Prospector. Fools in Love, by

Not For Love, won the Orleans Stakes in 2009 and placed in four other addedmoney events. D C Dancer, also by Not For Love, won the 2014 Maryland Million Sprint Handicap. And International Star already has four graded wins to his credit.

A winner of the Grey Stakes (Can-III) at 2, International Star has swept the series of classic prep races at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots this season. Following wins in the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III) and Risen Star Stakes (gr. II), the colt charged from seventh to record a neck victory over Stanford March 28 in the \$750,000 Louisiana Derby (gr. II). With five wins from nine starts, International Star has earned \$1,010,979 and figures to make his next start May 2 under the Twin Spires in the Run for the Roses.

The Ramseys, who won last year's Louisiana Derby with Louisiana-bred Vicar's in Trouble, have long sought to win the Derby and have been longtime supporters of the New York breeding program. Their stallion Catienus has stood nine seasons in the Empire State since 2004 and is currently at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

The Ramseys are always on the lookout for a two-turn horse.

Parlez, owned by Manfuso and trained by Voss, was "strictly two-turn," said Voss. "She wasn't that fast, but she tried hard.

"International Star and D C Dancer

are neat, balanced, not-real-big horses. Just like Parlez is. Halory apparently was small. They all fit the mold. They're very good, efficient movers."

And International Star is moving on. Last year two New York-breds made the starting gate for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) in Samraat and Uncle Sigh. This year another pair might make the Run for the Roses: International Star and Upstart.

The growth of the New York breeding program has increased competition and is bringing a new level of mare to the Empire State, a place where everybody already wants to be.

"What if we can find a horse that is a good physical, has great cardio, is a good-moving horse, and a New Yorkbred?" asked Miller. "Just by going through allowance conditions as a New York-bred and then the open allowance conditions, you can earn \$250,000. It's a tremendous program...and there's no better racing than in New York—especially at Saratoga. Everybody wants to do that."

And everybody loves a star.



Handy 'Sandy'

BY STEVE HASKIN

State-bred Say Florida Sandy was one of the all-time greats **THERE ARE MANY WAYS** to capture the essence of a Thoroughbred, based on the qualities that have been infused in the blood for centuries. A Thoroughbred is measured by its speed, courage, toughness, and competitiveness.

But because so many Thoroughbreds exhibit all or many of those attributes, it is necessary at times to turn to statistics and the extent of one's résumé.

Such is the case with Say Florida Sandy, a mainstay in New York for eight years, during which he became the leading money-winning New York-bred of all time with earnings of \$2,085,408, before being surpassed by 2003 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Funny Cide.

From 1996 to 2003, Say Florida Sandy, who raced 98 times, won or placed in 41 stakes, winning 19, including five graded stakes and seven listed stakes. In all, he won or placed in 14 graded stakes while competing at nine different racetracks at nine different distances and being ridden by 20 different jockeys, including big-name riders such as Jerry Bailey, Mike Smith, John Velazquez, Ramon Dominguez, Robbie Davis, and Richard Migliore.

And Sandy couldn't care whose barn he was running out of as he had eight trainers throughout his career.

The son of Personal Flag out of the Sweet Candy mare Lolli Lucka Lolli, was bred in New York by Sanford Bacon, who raced the colt, playing a major part in his early days on the track. With Robert Triola listed as trainer, Say Florida Sandy showed instant success, winning his career debut by $4\frac{1}{4}$ lengths going five furlongs at Belmont in mid June 1996, and paying a generous \$22.60. He immediately jumped into open company and ran a huge race to finish second in the Tremont Stakes (gr. III), staging

a powerful rally from 14¼ lengths back at odds of 37-1. He followed that with a third in the Sanford Stakes (gr. III) at 9-1. The winner of both those races was Allen Jerkens' blazing-fast Kelly Kip, who would develop into one of the top sprinters in the country.

A return to New York-bred company resulted in victories in the Aspirant Stakes and New York Breeders' Futurity, both at Finger Lakes. He then jumped back into top-class company and didn't fare well in the grade I Moet Champagne Stakes, but closed out his 2-year-old campaign with a third in the state-bred Sleepy Hollow Stakes and an easy 3¾-length victory in the New York Stallion Great White Way Stakes at Aqueduct.

With four victories in eight starts, as well as a second and two thirds, Say Florida Sandy ended the year with earnings of \$235,720 and was voted the New York-bred 2-year-old male champion, the first of many year-end honors. Sandy would go on to be voted champion state-bred sprinter and older male in 1998, champion sprinter in 2000, and New York-bred Horse of the Year, champion sprinter, and co-champion older male with Gander in 2001 as a 7-year-old, and New York-bred Horse of the Year at 8.

Sandy began his 3-year-old campaign

with a pair of thirds before winning the Mike Lee Stakes in May at Belmont by five lengths. But he lost his form, running three straight disappointing races, and Triola put him in a \$70,000 claiming race, which he won by four lengths but was claimed by Gasper Moschera for Jane Marinos.

"I was out of the country when Triola put the horse in a claiming race and I didn't know about it," Bacon said. "When I got back, he told me, 'He wasn't running good lately and now I got you \$70,000 on the claim and \$30,000 for the purse, so you got \$100,000.' I went to see Moschera and I said to him, 'Look, you got a real fast profit. I was out of town and what happened happened. Right now, you put yourself up \$70,000. I'll give you \$100,000 and you made yourself a fast \$30,000 profit. He said, 'The horse is not for sale and is never going to be for sale.' All I said was, 'Good luck with him.' He ran him four times and couldn't do anything with him (finishing 10th in the Empire Classic and out of the money in three

straight allowance races)."

After a narrow victory and two more out of the money performances in allowance company, Moschera put him in a \$60,000 claiming race, and sure enough he was snatched up again, this time by Juan Serey for John Rotella, who would own Sandy for the remainder of his career. Bacon said he tried to claim him back, but the slip was never put in and Serey had the only claim in on the horse.

"I spoke to Serey, and he said, 'I saw what you were doing with him," Bacon recalled. 'You never ever have to breeze him. You just let him do his own work as he wants and put a bridle on him race day. If you let him train himself, he's phenomenal.' He was exactly correct because with Sandy if you breezed him and did too much with him, he'd get annoyed and he wouldn't run. But if vou left Sandy alone and vou took him out and he felt like he wanted to breeze, he'd breeze, as long as it was what he wanted, where he wanted, and what time he wanted. So, the horse was training himself, and he trained himself for a long time."

Sandy showed huge improvement under Serey and went from strength to strength, eventually venturing back into graded stakes company. When Serey was suspended for administering an illegal drug, Sandy was turned over to trainer John Dowd before returning to Serey in January 2000. Serey eventually had his license revoked when New York regulators found him to be "financially irresponsible" following a financial dispute with his brother, and Sandy was turned over to Victor Cuadra.

From Feb. 27, 2000, to Oct. 21, 2001, Sandy ran 26 times, finishing in the top four in 25 of them, and was in the top three 22 times. Many of those races were in open stakes company, winning

the True North (gr. II), Bold Ruler (gr. III), Gravesend (gr. III), and Philadelphia Park Breeders' Cup (gr. III) handicaps, as well as the Paterson Handicap at Meadowlands. During that time he was also second in the Carter Handicap (gr. I).

Sandy ran his last race on Aug. 17, 2003, trained by Scott Lake, and, after a seventh-place finish, he was retired to Amy Boll's Buckridge Farm near Stuyvesant, N.Y.

Upon his retirement, Rotella said, "He's ready. Whenever we sent him to

the farm before, he was ready to come back to the track right away. Now, he is happy standing there by himself in the paddock. In his race at Delaware this summer, it looked like he would win by five lengths, and then he didn't. (Jockey) Tony Black told me, 'He didn't feel like doing it today.' Sandy had never been like that. He's been so good to me; I wanted to retire him 100% sound, and he is."

Sandy retired with 33 victories, 17 seconds, and 12 thirds from 98 starts, becoming the first New York-bred to earn \$2 million.

Bacon recalled how a New York-bred came to be named Say Florida Sandy.

"I was running a watch on a part-time basis with Jimmy Milner, who was the best clocker at the time in the Eastern part of the country," Bacon said. "I'm a Floridian, but I have a lot of friends in New York, and when I would come up there, people would say, 'Hey, Bacon's back.' And my friend would say, 'No, don't say Bacon's back; his name is Florida Sandy.' So, whenever someone would say 'Bacon's back from Florida,' he would tell them, 'say Florida Sandy.'"

Sandy stood at Buckridge Farm for 10 years before being sent to Michael Blowen near Georgetown, Ky. Blowen, who operates Old Friends, a facility for retired Thoroughbreds, reported at present Say Florida Sandy is at nearby

Hurstland Farm near Midway, Ky. He'll move over to Old Friends upon the completion of some new paddocks.

"He wasn't the most popular sire any more and it was time for him to live out his life down there, and being the celebrity he was, they were happy to have him," Boll said. He's still got lots of kids running.

"Sandy was a real sweetheart; all bark and no bite. He was a handful in the shed and he liked having you play with his tongue. He had a lot of personality. In his third season he was bred to 103 mares, which I found out later was one behind Tomorrows Cat as tops in the state. If I had known that I would have gone out and gotten another mare for him.

"We were really thrilled to get him.

John Rotella really adored the horse and went and saw him every chance he could, even when he wasn't running. Every once in a while he'd lay him up at a riding horse stable and he'd get anxious to get back to the track. The last time he just kinda liked hanging out there, so they figured they might as well try to sell him as a stallion. A mutual friend had recommended me a few years before that and John had carried my phone number around in his wallet for two years, and then he called me out of the blue and asked me if I was interested in this stallion and I immediately said yes. My friend Walter Downey, who had Fabulous Strike, and I split the horse and stood him

here the whole time and I enjoyed every minute of it."

Downey added "I had stood one or


Downey added, "I had stood one or two stallions in Pennsylvania and moved some horses to New York and boarded some at Amy's farm. She called me saying she heard Say Florida Sandy was for sale and would I be interested in partnering with her. I agreed and she negotiated the price. At that time there weren't many top name stallions in New York. But he was an overnight sensation because of the amount of money he earned. We syndicated him with half dozen other people and that got us out on the purchase price. Unfortunately, he wasn't able to reproduce himself.

"When he came off the track, he didn't have a nick on him. No scars,

no leg injuries. He had such strong bone on him, you could ride through the crusades on him; he could carry a man with full armor."

Bacon, who sends Blowen \$5,000 a year to help take care of Sandy, summed up this remarkable horse by saying, "He was like a machine. You didn't have to do anything with Sandy. He trained himself."

One thing is for sure. That was one heckuva training job.


