Straight Story on Breeding & Racing in the NY State Budget

SEVERAL breeding and racing items made it into New York's 2016 state budget, which was finalized just prior to the state's new fiscal year on April 1. Outlined here are the two most important: Finger Lakes/Delaware North and Nassau County OTB VLTs.

As you probably know already, the state budget includes gaming tax relief for Delaware North, a measure introduced to create a level playing field after next year's scheduled opening of the del Lago Resort and Casino just down the road. The new facility could reduce VLT revenue at the Farmington racino by as much as 40%. The Finger Lakes horsemen (FLHBPA) formally supported Delaware North's petition for this consideration.

Unfortunately, although Delaware North gaming tax relief will help that company's profitability and bottom line, the provision does not include the most important corollary for the Finger Lakes horsemen and the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund (the "Fund"): purse protection to compensate for the lost VLT revenue. Purses and Fund revenue depend on this.

Since the beginning of the year, NYTB has pursued all avenues to protect the FLHBPA and the Fund. First, we tried to get the provision included in the executive budget. This was not successful. Second, we lobbied the State Senate and Assembly to introduce matching purse protection provisions during the 30-day budget amendment period. We were successful in the Senate but not in the Assembly, and, consequently, purse protection is not in the budget. Now that the budget process is finalized, we are pursuing Plan C: promoting stand-alone legislation during the upcoming legislative session.

Passing stand-alone legislation on purse protection is an uphill battle, but we will use all the resources at our disposal to try to get this done. Although the Governor's office, Senate, and Assembly have committed themselves verbally to working on the issue, the obstacles that thwarted our earlier efforts remain.

This is an extraordinarily complex issue. Each entity involved not only has competing claims but competing support in Albany. The major players are 1) del Lago, 2) Delaware North, 3) the FLHBPA, and 4) NYTB, which is carrying both the FLHBPA and breeding/Fund interests.

As developments unfold over the next weeks and months, we will be pushing full bore for purse protection in stand-alone legislation. We will also continue to make recommendations to the FLHBPA and its lobbyists about public relations and media initiatives.

Since the del Lago's casino is not scheduled to open until 2017, the effects will not be felt this year. Finger Lakes horsemen and the Fund will conduct business, regardless, in the same manner they did in 2015. It would also not be out of character for the executive and legislative branches to kick the can down the road until a full-blown crisis develops. Unfortunately, as irresponsible as this sounds, our government only acts when there is a crisis. The fact also remains that Finger Lakes racing will need to make substantive changes to survive in the long term, but that is a discussion for another day.

The second budget item that touches breeding and racing interests is the last-minute inclusion in the budget of permission for Nassau County OTB to transfer its authority to install 1,000 video lottery terminals (VLTs) to Genting's Resorts World Casino at Aqueduct.

Nassau OTB had been given the right to open a 1,000-slot machine casino in 2013 legislation, but the county-owned company faced local opposition every time it chose a location. Belmont Park was even considered as a site, but in this case the opposition was universal.

Although NYTB and NYTHA are still analyzing the details of this measure, a few points are clear. The Nassau OTB VLTs were never slated to contribute a percentage of revenue to the Fund unless our Genting VLT revenues dropped below 2013 levels. This is required by law. The only positive, however, the new machines are to be located at the Genting facility, where they may increase business overall (the all-important win-per-machine numbers), rather than leeching business away from Genting to another location.

We are being told Genting will initially transfer some of its 5,400 machines to Nassau OTB for the stipulated fee, but that ultimately the gaming operator will add new machines to bring the total at the facility to 6,400. Therefore, it is too early to say exactly how much this development will harm the Fund in the long term.

As you can see, the upcoming legislative session will be a busy time for NYTB and a critical time for breeding interests. You can count on that NYTB's magazine and weekly newsletter will keep you apprised of all developments.

Twirling Candy Filly Lights Up OBS

The New York-bred offerings at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s 2016 March sale of 2-year-olds in training topped out in the second and concluding session March 16 with Hip 558, a Twirling Candy filly that was purchased by Alex Solis II and Jason Litt on behalf of the Roth family's LNJ Foxwoods for \$825,000. The filly was the top-selling female of the sale.

Of 32 New York-breds offered, 18 were reported as sold (including two private sales). The New York-breds outperformed the sale overall with an average price of \$170,333 and a median of \$112,500. The average price for the sale at large was \$158,923 (down 6.8% from 2015) while the median was \$100,000 (down 4.8%).

The dark bay or brown Twirling Candy filly was a brilliant pinhook, originally purchased by Carrie Brogden's Machmer Hall as a weanling at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York fall mixed sale for \$50,000. On the third day of the OBS breeze show, the filly showed how fast she had become, firing a co-bullet quarter mile in :20%.

Consignor Nick de Meric said after the breeze, "She's been in my son Tristan's division and has been just wicked fast every time she ever breezed. She's an outstanding mover, very athletic, and as fast as she is, looks like she'll stretch out and go two turns when the time comes."

Bred by Mares Rule II and foaled at Rhapsody Farm near Plymouth, the filly is out of Felicitee, a winning daughter of Menifee.

The second-best New York-bred seller, a filly by Uncle Mo, went to Dennis O'Neill in the opening session for \$350,000.

The second day of selling also saw two more New York-bred standouts besides the filly topper: a top-selling Empire-bred colt and top New York-sired juvenile, a speedy filly by Frost Giant.

The top New York-bred colt, a chestnut from the second crop of Trappe Shot that sold as Hip 320, went to Steven W. Young, agent, from the consignment of Steven Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds for \$280,000. A graduate of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale, the colt was another

clever pinhook, purchased by IBA for \$55,000 last summer.

Bred by Eaton & Thorne and foaled at Thorndale Farm near Millbrook, Hip 320 is out of That's OK, an unplaced daughter of Not For Love. A former \$700,000 Fasig-Tipton 2-year-old purchase, That's OK was bought by Jonathan Thorne as a 3-year-old at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$12,000.

The Frost Giant filly that emerged as top-selling New Yorksired, New York-bred sold as Hip 532 to Midwest Thoroughbreds for \$200,000. Bred by Dormellito Stud, foaled at Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater, and consigned by Dormellito Stud Sales, the dark bay or brown juvenile breezed the same co-bullet quarter of :20½.

The filly's dam Easy Erin, a winning New York-bred daughter of Johannesburg, is from a well-known and productive New York family. Easy Erin's dam is 1997 New York-bred Horse of the Year Dancin Renee. Frost Giant stands for \$7,500 at Keane Stud Operations.

NY-BRED FILLIES SOAR AT F-T FLORIDA

Fillies by the late Harlan's Holiday and from the first crop of New York-based stallion Mission Impazible, topped the New York-bred offerings at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale March 2 at Gulfstream Park.

John McCormack went to \$300,000 to buy Hip 16, a dark bay or brown filly by Harlan's Holiday offered by Eddie Woods, agent, who posted a :10% eighth during the under tack preview.

Bred by a partnership of John P.

Hicks, William D. Hart, Dr. Jerry Bilinski, and John Murdza, the filly is the first foal out of Hard Hat, a Hard Spun half sister to grade I winner and sire Albert the Great and to three other stakes winners. The filly sold last year to MJ Stable for \$130,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale.

Selling for \$290,000 was Hip 77, a Mission Impazible—Rodeo'sbeenspotted filly that shared a :10 bullet work with nine others in the under tack

show. She was purchased by Justin Casse, agent, from the consignment of Crane Thoroughbreds, agent.

Bred by Tracy Egan, the filly is out of a winning daughter of Rodeo and a half sister to stakes winner Message Red. The filly was a pinhooking coup, having been purchased for \$40,000 by Harry Weisleder at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale last summer.

FRESH UPSTART SHARP IN RAZORBACK

Trainer Rick Violette Jr. had Upstart just where he hoped he would be after six months on the bench for the talented ridgling's 2016 debut March 19 in the \$350,000 Razorback Handicap (gr. III) at Oaklawn Park.

"He had a long, hard season as a 3-year-old, and we thought it best to give him some time off," said Violette about Upstart's lay-off and development from 3 to 4. "He is bigger, stronger. He's filled out—what you would hope for."

Violette had originally targeted the March 5 Gulfstream Park Handicap (gr. II) but deemed the horse needed a couple of more weeks.

Conceding two to eight pounds to his rivals as the 120-pound highweight and going off the 5-2 favorite in the field of 10 under jockey Joe Bravo, Upstart bided his time early after breaking from post eight. He was a half-dozen lengths off the pace while negotiating the clubhouse turn three wide. Up front, pacesetter Shotgun Kowboy got early splits of :23.15 and :47.50 in the 11/16-mile contest.

Upstart began to come under some extra encouragement as he rounded the far turn five wide. Showing no hint of leg-weariness in

the stretch, the blaze-faced dark bay drove relentlessly to the lead... and the wire, gaining the top spot with a furlong to go and driving home for a one-length victory in 1:44.12.

"I'm going to give full credit to the whole Rick Violette team for bringing this horse together," Bravo said."When you're off that long, it's tough to get a horse ready to run. He left there really nicely, relaxed really good the first turn. Probably a little farther back than Rick wanted. But I was really happy the way he was going.

"He's back. He's a pretty nice horse. He proved it to everybody. I'm just glad he's a big, happy horse for the rest of the season," Bravo said.

Said Violette, "I couldn't be happier. He gave up ground on both turns, but he was resolute up the lane," said Violette. "He's back to where we hoped he would be."

Bred by Joanne Nielsen and foaled at her Sunnyfield Farm near Bedford, Upstart was purchased by owner Ralph Evans on Violette's advice at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale from the Summerfield consignment for \$130,000. WinStar Farm acquired a minority interest in the horse last April.

A real looker from the start, Upstart waged two strong back-to-back campaigns at 2 and 3. Winner of his 5½-furlong Saratoga debut, he followed up just nine days later with a victory as a supplemental entry to the state-bred Funny Cide Stakes. Upstart wrapped up the year with a wide-trip second to Daredevil in the slop in the Champagne Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont before shipping west to run a strong third in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I).

In 2015 Upstart emerged as a top contender for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) in three starts at Gulfstream Park. Dominant winner of the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) in his sophomore debut, Upstart was controversially disqualified from a clear victory in the Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (gr. II). He then ran second in the Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I). Unplaced in the Kentucky Derby Upstart ran three more times in 2015. To date he has earned \$1,460,280 from 12 starts from four wins, three seconds, and two thirds.

Champion Naughty Natisha Dies at 22

Drs. Bill Wilmot and Joan Taylor of Stepwise Farm near Saratoga Springs reported the death of Naughty Natisha Feb. 24.

The 22-year-old mare, the dam of 2007 New York-bred Horse of the Year Naughty New Yorker and the stakes-winning Pupil, was voted Champion New York Broodmare in 2007. The mare was found Wednesday morning in her paddock.

"She was my favorite broodmare," Taylor said. "She's 22, and since her first foal she's done everything right."

"She had been a great broodmare for us," Wilmot said. "She was such a cool horse. She was demure and self-contained. Nothing excited her. She set the tone for our broodmare band. She had all those little things."

Naughty New Yorker won 11 stakes and earned \$1,089,884. He won the Red Smith Handicap (gr. IIT) in 2006 and placed in four other graded stakes, including the 2007 Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap (gr. I).


Naughty Natisha, by Known Fact—Noble Natisha, by Noble Commander, was bred in Kentucky by John A. Chandler and Garrett O'Rourke. She was winless in seven starts. Stepwise Farm purchased her for \$150,000, carrying Pupil (by Unbridled), at the 1998 Keeneland November sale.

Wilmot and Taylor are eagerly awaiting the debut of Naughty Natisha's 2014 Tapizar colt (named Carthon), for whom they have high hopes.



Effinex named New York-bred Horse of the Year

REMINISCENT OF LA VERDAD'S style on the racetrack — break fast and put distance between herself and her rivals — the filly dominated the early proceedings of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders annual awards banquet April 4.

But the brilliant sprinter couldn't outpace Effinex for the evening's highest honor. Tri-Bone Stables' homebred Effinex, who capped his 2015 campaign with a victory in the Clark Handicap (gr. I) at Churchill Downs for trainer Jimmy Jerkens, was crowned New York-bred Horse of the Year, as well as champion older dirt male.

Sheila Rosenblum's La Verdad, who was recognized in January with an Eclipse Award for champion female sprinter for a season that saw her win five stakes from eight starts, took the New York-bred honors as top older dirt female and champion female sprinter.

On an unseasonably chilly evening in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., where snow had fallen earlier in the day, more than 200 people gathered at the Saratoga National

Golf Club to honor the achievements of last year's top New York-breds and their connections.

The New York-bred divisional champions and Horse of the Year were chosen by a ballot of New York Turf writers, handicappers, chart callers and racing analysts in voting conducted by NYTB.

The event, sponsored by the New York Breeding and Development Fund,

was emceed by Richard Migliore, former leading New York jockey and currently a broadcast analyst for the New York Racing Association.

In his fourth year as the emcee of the awards ceremony, Migliore was full of humor. He quipped that with the NCAA Championship game set to begin at 9:19 p.m. ET, he wasn't going to tolerate long speeches, specifically referencing Ef-

finex's breeder, Dr. Russell Cohen, who is known to be loquacious.

Before the awards ceremony began, Cohen, accompanied by his 84-year-old mother, Bernice, Effinex's owner, expressed gratitude for the events that brought them there. He pointed to his neck tie, emblazoned with laughing horses, once worn by his late father, and now Cohen's talisman and go-to gear for

each of Effinex's races.

"It's humbling and I'm honored," Cohen, a private veterinarian on the NYRA circuit, said. "Horse racing is very personal for me. If you're here at this event and you even had a horse mentioned, vou're a winner already because the odds are so stacked against you to breed and own a champion. Effinex has a worthy opponent in La Verdad for Horse of the Year, and I'm not taking anything for granted. Just being here and hanging out with Mom, who I've dragged all over the country to watch Effinex run, is great."

Bernice Cohen echoed her son's sentiments about their homebred, who earned \$1.7 million last



year. In addition to winning the Clark, he finished second in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) and captured the Suburban Handicap (gr. II) and Excelsior Stakes (gr. III).

"It's been a great ride," she said. "I've been to places I've never been before with Effinex. Tonight is the cream on the top of it all."

Two hours later the Cohens joined Migliore at the podium twice in quick succession to gather their awards for Horse of the Year and Older Dirt Male. Migliore and Russell Cohen bantered a bit about how the name Effinex, which is a dig at Cohen's ex-wife, slipped by The Jockey Club.

"I Googled the name and in German, it means integrity and efficiency," Cohen said matter-of-factly, but with tongue firmly planted in cheek.

Cohen, who moonlights as a standup comic, added, "I want to thank Effinex...the four-legged one."

In a more serious tone Effinex's breeder said, "I'm thrilled by the races Effinex won and having his name alongside some great horses who won those races in the past."

A beaming Bernice Cohen, looked adoringly at her son, and said, "It's a wonderful day."

La Verdad's owner, who arrived at the awards banquet with a large entourage of friends from New York City, was bubbly with enthusiasm during the cocktail hour.

"I remember coming to this dinner last year when La Verdad was nominated but didn't win," Rosenblum said. "I remember being overwhelmed with how incredible it was to be here. Now, it looks like this might be my year."

And while Effinex took down the biggest honor, the night largely belonged to La Verdad and her connections. The mare's conditioner Linda Rice won an unprecedented fifth title as New Yorkbred Trainer of the Year.

Rice, who won the award for the third consecutive year, received a standing ovation from those seated at Rosenblum's two tables.

"Every time you win an award

is special," Rice said. "I never dreamed I would get to New York and win meet titles and training awards. I don't take this lightly."

La Verdad's dam, Noble Fire, was recognized as Broodmare of

the Year. Mark Vondrasek of Eklektikos Stable, the breeder of La Verdad, was honored as Breeder of the Year. Vondrasek was unable to attend the ceremony due to a family matter but sent an acceptance speech that Migliore read.

In part, it said, "I'm so thankful for the privilege of this award and proud of the fact that in this business even if you have no experience, you can still accomplish amazing things like breeding an Eclipse Award winner in New York."

Noble Fire and Eklektikos were represented by another 2015 New York-bred champion, Hot City Girl, who is owned by Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable. A half sister to La Verdad, the Rice-trained Hot City Girl earned the champion 3-year-old filly title.

Upon accepting Hot City Girl's award, Rice mentioned that one of the filly's 2016 targets will be the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I). Rosenblum added, in reference to La Verdad's runner-up finish in the 2015 Filly & Mare Sprint, "I'm going to win that race one day."

It was a good thing that Rosenblum and Rice were seated near the podium because no sooner did they sit down, they were back up to receive La Verdad's two awards.

To raucous cheers from her friends, who held cell phones aloft to take Rosenblum's photo, the owner said this about La Verdad, who is confirmed in foal to Medaglia d'Oro and who will drop her baby in New York next year: "If she is half as good as a broodmare, I will be very fortunate."

La Verdad and Hot City Girl were not the only Rice runners in the spotlight. She trained Palace, a former claimer, to win his third New York-bred sprinter title for owner Antonino Miuccio, whose grandsons accepted the trophy on his behalf.

Jose Ortiz, who rode a plethora of 2015 New York-bred champions, including La Verdad and Hot City Girl, was honored as New York-bred Jockey of the Year for the second consecutive year. As Migliore made Ortiz' introductions, the former rider noted with a chuckle, "I won this award twice, and I'm the only real New York-bred to have won it — born, bred, and raised in New York."

With his ever-present smile at full-wattage, and sporting a bow-tie, the soft-spoken Ortiz expressed gratitude to the connections of all the horses he rode in 2015.

"I've been blessed to ride great horses, especially La Verdad," said Ortiz, who drew a standing ovation from Rosenblum's table and then a bear hug from the owner when he exited the stage.

The high spirits and good cheer of the evening

were evident right from the start, when the first of the divisional honors, 2-year-old filly champion, was bestowed upon Frosty Margarita. Accepting her award was her owner and breeder, John "Chip" Acierno III of Gabrielle Farm, who promised the audience if they tracked him down during the 2016 Saratoga race meet, he would "buy them margaritas."

Frosty Margarita's trainer, Rudy Rodriguez, was in attendance and was spied during the cocktail hour doling out margaritas to his friends and family.

"Have to start now because we might win," Rodriguez remarked with a big grin.

Although he didn't win a stakes, the

Chad Brow-trained Flexibility was recognized as champion 2-year-old male, based on the strength of his two runner-up finishes to Mohyamen, in the Nashua Stakes (gr. II) and Remsen Stakes (gr.


II). Owned by Seth Klarman of Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence, Flexibility was bred by WinStar Farm. Accepting on behalf of WinStar was Kyle Wilson, who is the stallion season director at the farm.

Last year's 2-year-old male New York-bred champion, Upstart, earned a second state-bred championship, as top 3-year-old male. On the stage to accept Upstart's award were the ridgling's breeder, Joanne Nielsen, and his owners, Ralph M. Evans and Win-Star Farm.

"It's a once in a lifetime event to have a horse (compete in Triple Crown races)," Evans said of the Rick Violette Jr.-trained runner who raced in many of the top 3-year-old races in 2015, and

won the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II).

The two turf categories for New York-breds featured an evenly matched field of finalists — all three of whom were finalists in 2014. Getting the nod for male turf champion for the second consecutive year was Lubash, who defeated his arch-nemesis on the racetrack, Kharafa and King Kreesa.

Now 9 years old, Lubash will return this year for another season of racing for his owner and breeder, Leonard Pivnick's Aliyu Ben J Stables, and trainer Christophe Clement.

When Migliore asked Pivnick what fans can expect from the millionaire this season, the owner said the son of Freud will be "better" than ever.

While announcing the champion turf female of 2015, Invading Humor, Migliore shared a ditty about an encounter he had earlier in the evening during the cocktail hour.

"I received an interesting offer to give up the name of the winner for female turf horse — a contentious category," said Migliore, who kept mum on details of the offer.

Accepting Invading Humor's trophy was Dr. James Randall McGlinn, the mare's breeder who races her

under the nom-de-course Bloodlines Racing Partnerships.

"The best part of this is that we have 20 partners and a lot of them are here tonight," McGlinn said while gesturing to his co-owners, who cheered in response.

Jeffrey A. Cannizzo, the executive director of the NYTB, made the welcoming remarks at the banquet, and noted that New York's breeding program is "the best regional program in the country." He detailed the achievements of the state's home-grown product in 2015, including that New York-breds accounted for 99 stakes wins, 32 coming in open company and 15 in graded events.

Cannizzo continued the proceedings by announcing that NYTB's Lifetime Achievement Award would be presented to Barry Ostrager, the former president of the NYTB and longtime owner and breeder in New York State, and the proprietor of Questroyal Stud North.

Cannizzo said Ostrager "never shunned a challenge" when it came to supporting and furthering the cause of the New York breeding program.

Accepting on behalf of Ostrager, whose travel was disrupted due to the weather, was Sara Dunham, his farm manager.

"Barry is incredibly humbled by this award and wishes he could be here," Dunham said.

Thomas J. Gallo III, the current NYTB president, took the podium following Cannizzo and announced that an award presented by

Thoroughbred Charities of America would honor ReRun, Inc., which recently opened a New York branch of its adoption program for retired racehorses.

Effinex was a top-end New York-bred 3-year-old in 2014, winning the Empire Classic Handicap and running fourth in the Hawthorne Gold Cup Handicap (gr. II) toward the end of the season. His transformation at 4 was nothing short of remarkable, taking four of eight starts while competing at the highest level. He capped the year by running second to Triple Crown winner American Pharoah in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) and winning the grade I Clark Handicap at Churchilll Downs over a top-notch field.

Effinex was solid throughout the year. He won the 10-furlong Excelsior Stakes (gr. III) and Suburban Handicap (gr. II) within his first four starts.

Bred by New York Racing Association veterinarian Dr. Russell Cohen and raced by his mother's Tri-Bone Stables, Effinex is out of multiple stakes winner What a Pear, who died delivering her only foal. Cohen purchased What a Pear's dam, Perfect Pear, for \$28,000 as a 2-year-old in 1999.

"I've been breeding horses for 30 years and it's about DNA; I follow the horse's pedigree," Cohen said following the Clark. "I'm very proud of this family."

Effinex is already off and running on his 5-year-old campaign. He was third in the March 12 Santa Anita Handicap (gr. I) in Southern California.

For all that La Verdad had achieved in the previous two years while running for Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable, the Yes It's True filly was going after more in 2015—that all-important grade I victory. She came close. Sent after the brass ring, the grade I TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I) at Keeneland, she was run down late by Wavell Avenue—a filly she had beaten just one month prior in New York.

The accomplished filly's dominance in her division in New York was still strong overall, and she was honored with an Eclipse Award as the country's champion female sprinter. La Verdad won five stakes and earned \$722,500 for the year, eventually closing her brilliant racing career Jan. 9, 2016, with an easy win in Aqueduct's Interborough Stakes.

The thought was to go toward Laurel Park's Barbara Fritchie Stakes (gr. II), but Rosenblum and trainer Linda Rice decided to end La Verdad's racing career a bit early and ship her off to Kentucky to begin her new career as a broodmare. Her mate for 2016 is top sire Medaglia d'Oro.

A four-time graded stakes winner, La Verdad also topped state-bred stakes competition six times and earned \$1,563,200. Rosenblum had so much fun with La Verdad, she went and bought her half sister, Hot City Girl (by City Zip), who also developed into a graded stakes-winning state-bred champion in 2015.

With a division as deep as any other state-bred program, it's hard to believe Leonard Pivnick's Aliyu Ben J Stable's Lubash was able to repeat as champion New York-bred turf male, but the hard-driving son of Freud did just that in 2015. The then 8-year-old won an impressive four of seven starts on turf in New York, taking three stakes and earning \$346,650. It was the most lucrative year he's had on the track, and in all he has earned \$1,357,249 with 16 wins from 46 starts.

At the spring Showcase program in May at Belmont Park, Lubash was able to get a length advantage on turf mainstays Kharafa and King Kreesa in the Kingston Stakes at a mile and also topped King Kreesa in Saratoga's West Point Stakes at 11/16 miles. The then 5-year-old daughter of Horse of the Year Invasor was a clear two-length winner of the Mt. Vernon Stakes during the spring Showcase program in late May at Belmont, and she returned to take the fall Showcase event, the Ticonderoga Stakes, by 1¾ lengths.

The Ticonderoga victory was significant for Dr. James Randall McGlinn's breeding program as he ran one-two with Invading Humor's full sister Distorted Beauty.

"I bred to Invasor because he was the best horse in the world," said McGlinn after the Ticonderoga. "Plus, I was just starting out (Bloodlines Racing Partnerships) and I figured he would get us some attention."

Champion Male Sprinter

In 2014 Palace was named champion male sprinter, based on a pair of grade I wins in Saratoga's top sprint races: the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap and Forego Stakes. While 2015 didn't turn out to be as fruitful, he repeats as champion sprinter off a win over state-breds in the Hudson Handicap at the October Showcase and stakes-placings against the nation's best sprinters from July to late December.

The son of City Zip began the year in the seven-furlong Carter Handicap (gr. I), and although he was unplaced, the race set him up for six successive in-the-money placings throughout the remainder of the year. Outside of state-bred competition his best efforts came in a third-place finish at Laurel in the Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash Stakes and a second-place effort—beaten a head—in Aqueduct's traditional Thanksgiving event, the grade III Fall Highweight Handicap in which he toted 133 pounds.

Palace is now serving his initial season at stud at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky for a fee of \$6,000.

Mark Vondrasek purchased and raced Noble Fire, New York's broodmare of the year for 2015 and the dam of champions La Verdad and Hot City Girl. An executive vice president for Starwood Hotels, Vondrasek went to Arlington Park as a child with his grandfather.

"Racing has been in my DNA for as long as I can remember," he told *New York Breeder* magazine in 2015. "Being a breeder is a great experience. To watch horses I've bred race, knowing they would have not existed without my hand in it, it's thrilling."

A Stamford, Conn., resident, he raced La Verdad for her first four starts with trainer Linda Rice before selling her to Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable and sold the team Hot City Girl prior to her racing career. Even with the sales, Vondrasek has said he has had "some regrets" but is a strong supporter of the fillies.

"For me, it goes beyond owning a Thoroughbred," he said. "It's not even about the economics. It's amazing how somebody from the outside can affect racing (through breeding)." A

Trainer Linda Rice has made a good living being around Noble Fire and her offspring. The state's champion trainer conditioned Noble Fire back in 2007-08 to a pair of wins and a stakes-placing and has also trained a pair of Noble Fire's offspring to championship honors.

Bred by Chester and Mary Broman, Noble Fire was purchased by Mark Vondrasek's Eklektikos Stable for \$115,000 as a sale 2-year-old in 2007. By the end of her juvenile campaign she had two wins and a third in the New York Stallion Fifth Avenue Stakes. A lone start at 3 resulted in a cracked sesamoid. Her true value, however, would come in the breeding shed as the producer of both 2015 champion sprinter and older female La Verdad and champion 3-year-old filly Hot City Girl.

Noble Fire, who is also the dam of stakes winner N. F.'s Destiny, was sold privately to Three Chimneys Farm in Kentucky in 2014.

New York Champions

LINDA RICE

Trainer

Linda Rice earns a three-peat as New York Breeders' trainer of the year, and while she did condition two champions—La Verdad and Hot City Girl for Lady Sheila Stables—she certainly had great success throughout the year with the other runners in her barn.

On the year she ranked 16th nationally by purses earned, winning 100 races with her 489 starters (20.0%) for \$5,927,599.

While La Verdad delivered five stakes wins and Hot City Girl added two, Rice had three other stakes winners during the year. Subbing for trainer Mike Hushion, she sent out Barry Schwartz' New York-bred Princess Violet to win Keeneland's Madison Stakes (gr. I) in the spring. In May, Antonino Miuccio's Sheriffa won Belmont Park's Critical Eye Stakes and in the fall added Aqueduct's New York Stallion Series Stakes.

Rice, who has had her training license since 1987, has sent out more than 1,200 winners and has earned four training titles on the NYRA circuit since 2009, when she won the trainer's race at Saratoga.

JOSE ORTIZ Jockey



Jockey Jose Ortiz was the main pilot for state-bred champions Upstart and La Verdad

Jose Ortiz and his brother, Irad Ortiz Jr., have taken the New York Racing Association circuit by storm since Irad began riding in New York in 2011 with his brother coming the following year. In 2014 they finished one-two in the NYRA standings.

Both graduates of the Escuela Vocacional Hipica in Puerto Rico, the brothers had banner years in 2015, with Irad winning 300 of his 1,415 mounts with \$23.5 million in earnings and Jose scoring on 244 of his 1,361 mounts with \$17.3 million in earnings.

Jose repeats as New York Thoroughbred Breeders' jockey of the year, a title he took from Irad in 2013. Jose's major wins in 2015 aboard state-breds came with Upstart, champion 3-year-old male, who won the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) and was second in the Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I) and placed second in the Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (gr. II; finished first).

Jose was also regular rider of La Verdad, who was not only the New York-bred champion female sprinter, but the Eclipse Award winner for her division following a 5-1-0 mark from eight starts in 2015 and the runner-up in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I).

New York-bred 3-year-olds jumped up to win open stakes in consecutive weekends PAUL POMPA JR.'S CONVERGE took a big step forward in his 2016 debut by winning the Feb. 27 Palm Beach Stakes (gr. IIIT). He took the 1½6-mile turf contest for 3-year-olds at Gulfstream Park assisted by a nifty ride from Javier Castellano. The following Sunday Burning Sands Stable's homebred Awesome Gent went from allowance winner to stakes winner after taking Aqueduct's Jimmy Winkfield Stakes by four lengths under Manny Franco.



The initial stakes winner for Sidney's Candy, Converge came into the Palm Beach off a fourmonth vacation following a two-race freshman campaign for trainer Chad Brown. Winner of his debut against state-bred company at Belmont last September, the colt ran a strong second in the Oct. 30 Awad Stakes.

With little gate speed and an outside draw in post 11 of 13 in the Palm Beach, Converge tucked in af-

ter the break and was guided to the rail as American Phantom led the group clocking strong fractions of :23.11 and :47.27. Converge had only one horse beaten through the first turn and advanced closer into contention entering the far turn, coming out one path as he prepared to launch his bid.

Between horses in upper- and midstretch with four rivals still to pass, Converge angled back in under Castellano in the final furlong. The colt split horses and surged forward to win by threequarters of a length. The final time was 1:40.64.

"We knew this horse doesn't have any early speed and he (Javier Castellano) would have to tuck him in off the break," Brown said. "We just said, 'Take your chances and try to find someone live to follow on the inside.' Javier just rode a masterful race, and he had the horse beneath him to do it. He's a real quality horse."

Brown indicated he is aiming for a summer turf campaign with Converge, following this single Gulfstream start

and will pick his next race in due course.

The Empire-bred sold during the second book of Keeneland's 2014 yearling sale when hammered down to Xavier International Bloodstock, agent for \$240,000, Converge was bred by SF Racing and foaled at Vinery New York at Sugar Maple near Poughquag.

A May foal, he is out of Atlantic Ocean, a multiple graded stakes-winning Florida-bred daughter of Stormy Atlantic.

Awesome Gent (by Awesome Again) looked professional while racking up his third straight victory over the Aqueduct inner oval in the six-furlong, \$125,000 Jimmy Winkfield.

Awesome Gent broke well from the three hole but chose to wait in third position while longshot Moon Over a Beauty and 2-1 favorite and fellow Todd Pletchertrainee Sudden Surprise dueled up front through: 22.17 and: 45.64 fractions.

Coming under a drive midway into the far turn, Awesome Gent advanced onto even terms with the leaders and angled out four wide for the drive. The gelding took over with three-sixteenths left and cruised to the wire unopposed in 1:10.60.

Awesome Gent, who has earned \$142,492 from his three wins, is one of seven winners out of Pawnee Patti, an Arkansas-bred stakes-placed six-figure earner by Sir Richard Lewis. She is the dam of Arkansas-bred Comedero by Posse, who won 10 stakes, headed by the Chick Lang Stakes Presented by Apple Ford (gr. III) at Pimlico, and earned \$675,814. The mare currently has a 2-year-old Pomerov filly, a registered New York-bred, and was bred to San Pablo last year. 🗖




