NY State Budget: "Moving Target"

I FULLY EXPECTED my letter for the April *New York Breeder* to contain a complete report on the outcomes for breeding and racing issues included in this year's New York State budget. Instead, Albany lawmakers were unable to reach an agreement on several key (non-racing-related) issues by the April 1 budget deadline as well as the print deadline for this publication, and Governor Cuomo, who has overseen a string of on-time budgets during his tenure, was forced to call for an extender. According to Albany insiders, though, the budget should be completed well before this second deadline. Realistically, it could be done before you read this and days after its printing. Therefore, we could expect these views to be fully ratified, or as politics go, to be completely different.

Let me remind you of the most important issues at play. The state budget is anticipated to include provisions for the re-privatization of NYRA, including the composition of the board of the directors. The governor made an initial proposal on NYRA, and the legislature has offered various modifications. As you also know, NYTB and NY-THA have lobbied for voting rights to be reinstated for breeders' and horsemen's representatives on the NYRA board. Other negotiating points include the expansion of the powers of the Franchise Oversight Board and a new proposal for financing drug testing. We made some progress on these fronts but must wait and see the outcome.

Also related to NYRA re-privatization, and even more far-reaching in its implications, is NYTB's and NYTHA's pursuit of a binding agreement that would give breeders and horsemen veto power over any radical changes to the NYRA winter racing schedule. Specifically, we hope to have it enacted into law that adjustment of the 95-day winter racing schedule could take place *only* with the written consent of NYTB and NYTHA (plus approval by the Gaming Commission). It is hard to overestimate the importance of this. Again, we must wait and see.

One item remains to be resolved: the unintended negative consequences of Genting's operation of Nassau County OTB's VLTs at Aqueduct. Specifically, Genting's transfer of 460 of the most lucrative VLTs to the use of Nassau County OTB is costing the Breeding Fund as much as \$2 million in revenue per annum and the NYRA purse account as much as \$7 million. We have already found support from elected officials on the need to rectify this situation, and the matter will now be addressed during the post-budget portion of the session. There are dialogs on how and when Genting will install 460 new machines during the 2017 calendar year. Those details remain to be seen.

You are probably already aware of one important development last month entirely unrelated to the budget: the stabilization of Finger Lakes. On March 16 the Governor's office announced a plan that has been in the works for some time. Losses to the FLGR horsemen's purse account from the "cannibalization" of gaming revenue by the new del Lago Resort and Casino will be offset for the next two years by annual contributions of more than \$2.1 million from three groups: the Fund (\$1.5 million in purse enrichment money), racetrack operator Delaware North (\$1 million) and del Lago (\$440,000). Additionally, we have earmarked some purse enrichment money for New York-sired maiden winners, which should boost field size at the track while supporting breeders and owners of progeny of New York sires. We continue work on improving the long-term picture for Finger Lakes racing.

In closing, as I've said before, the budget process has been completely different for NYTB this year. For the first time we've had a seat at the table from the very beginning, participated in countless meetings, and have been kept in the loop by the Governor's office and others. This has made it possible to be proactive on breeders' concerns rather than reactive.

We entered the fray with a challenging agenda, and I am guardedly (very guardedly) optimistic that some more hard work and a little luck will bring at least some of our endeavors to fruition.

Mind Your Biscuits Rises to the Occasion in Dubai



Mind Your Biscuits defeats the world's best at Meydan

Mind Your Biscuits, with a New York-bred Horse of the Year title still to come (see page 22), got a jump start on the competition for 2017 with a resounding world-class victory March 25 in the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) at Meydan Racecourse in Dubai.

Overcoming post 14 and a wide trip throughout under Joel Rosario, Mind Your Biscuits was making his first start for trainer Chad Summers. Summers, 32, remarkably got his first win on one of racing's biggest stages.

"I was so wide on the outside. I was thinking 'is this going to work?' But as I said he was the best horse in the race, and I'm proud of him. He'd showed us the last couple of times, he ran very well in the Breeders' Cup and he won the Malibu. It was a very good race in America and every time he runs he improves a little bit more," said Rosario.

"This is what we planned," said a calm, cool, and collected

Summers after the race. "It's a storybook ending to a story. It's a remarkable horse and it was a remarkable ride. I think he is the best sprinter in the country, in the world. He proved it today. It's unbelievable. Everything here is first class."

Bred by Samantha Will's Jumping Jack Racing and foaled at Sue and Gary Lundy's Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, Mind Your Biscuits is one of three winners from three foals to start out of Jazzmane, an unraced Kentucky-bred daughter of Toccet and a half sister to Canadian champion 3-year-old filly Kimchi (by Langfuhr). The mare has a 3-year-old filly by Posse and a 2-year-old colt by Officer.

Mind Your Biscuits was purchased as a short yearling by Machmer Hall at the 2014 Keeneland January sale. Offered at auction twice more, he RNA'd both times for \$47,000 at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale and at the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring 2-year-old sale, after which Summers, who had previously bought an interest in Mind Your Biscuits with his father and brother, acquired the colt privately on behalf of J Stables. Liz Crow of BSW Bloodstock then purchased a minority interest in the colt on behalf of clients Head of Plains Partners and Michael E. Kisber. In 2016 the colt was trained by Robert Falcone Jr.

Mind Your Biscuits came to Dubai off a defeat to Unified in the Gulfstream Park Sprint Stakes (G3) as the odds on favorite. Prior to that he had won Santa Anita Park's Malibu Stakes (G1) on Dec. 26 and had been third, but was elevated to second in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1).

Mind Your Biscuits' second career grade 1 tally and most lucrative score by far, improves his record to five wins, six seconds and two thirds from 15 starts and brings his earnings to \$2,015,166.

STATE-BRED BLUEGRASS FLAG TAKES CICADA

Facing only two rivals March 25, New York-bred Bluegrass Flag took care of business in Aqueduct's \$100,000 Cicada Stakes for open 3-year-old fillies. Going gate-to-wire, the daughter of Bluegrass Cat earned a first black-type win for owners Thomas C. Albrecht and Vincent J. Fusaro.

Rationing out her speed through early fractions of :23.66 and :47.31, Bluegrass Flag began to shake off the persistent Heavenly Score in the turn, widened her margin, and romped by six lengths, getting the six furlongs in 1:11.99.

Trainer Tom Morley has the April 22

Park Avenue division of the New York Stallion Stakes series in mind for the filly's next start.

"She didn't have a hard race today," the trainer said. "It shouldn't bring too many fears. Hopefully she's all good and one work and into the stallion series at 6¹/₂ (furlongs)."

Bred by Susanne Hooper, James Hooper, and Albrecht and foaled at Haven Oaks Farm near Fort Edward, Bluegrass Flag is one of four winners, and the first stakes winner, out of No More Flags, a New York-bred multiple winner bred by the Hoopers. The mare has a juvenile colt by Posse and a year-

ling colt by Dublin on the ground and was bred to Stephanoatsee for 2016.

Finger Lakes Gains State-Bred Incentive for Maidens

An attractive new incentive to invest in New York-breds sired by New York stallions was approved at a March 28 board meeting of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund (the Fund). In 2017 when a New York-bred by a New York-based stallion wins a maiden special weight race at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack, the horse will earn an extra \$7,000, or 37% additional money from Fund purse enrichment.

The added money raises the Finger Lakes purse for a New York-sired winner of state-bred maiden special weight from \$23,000 to \$30,000. In open maiden special weight races, the purse goes from \$19,000 to \$26,000. To be eligible a horse must be registered with the Fund as a New York-bred and the sire must be registered in the state in the year of the foal's conception.

Fund executive director Tracy Egan said, "Our hope is that the seven-grand boost in first-place money will help more of our breeders look to our registered New York stallions first when making breeding plans."

The decision to earmark some purse enrichment money for New York-sired horses comes at the same time the Fund board approved the disbursement of approximately \$1.5 million in purse enrichment money to the FLGR racing program overall for 2017.

According to a plan announced March 16 by the Governor's office, losses to the FLGR horsemen's purse account incurred by a decline of gaming revenue resulting from the new del Lago Resort and Casino will be offset for the next two years by per annum contributions of more than \$2.1 million from three groups: the Fund (\$1.5 million, pending the board approval just granted), racetrack operator Delaware North (\$1 million) and del Lago (\$440,000).

Referring to the Fund's contribution to this plan, Fund chairman John Poklemba said, "We are proud to provide necessary support to help Finger Lakes Racetrack thrive as part of Gov. Cuomo's comprehensive plan to preserve racing. This action, along with the other components forged by the Governor's office, ensures the track and horsemen maintain operations without spending a single taxpayer dollar."

Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, and ex officio member of the Fund Board, commented, "After a long period of uncertainty we are stabilizing Finger Lakes for the short-term, and at the same time using the opportunity to make New York-sired New York-breds an even more valuable investment than they already are by placing the money in the condition that matters most."

New York-sired New York-breds already earn two times more breeder's and open owner's program awards from the Fund than horses sired by stallions standing out of state.

Cannizzo explained further, "The New York breeding and racing programs absolutely depend on a healthy Finger Lakes. In 2016 New York-breds accounted for 73% of all Finger Lakes starts (6,428 of the 88,63) and earned 76% of all the purse money—about \$13.4 million. The more that New York sired horses are involved in this, the more the whole program and its participants benefit."

Cannizzo also points to the work still to be done:

"We at NYTB look forward to continued dialog with Delaware North, the Finger Lakes Horsemen Benevolent Protective Association, the Gaming Commission and Governor's Office on how to improve the long-term picture for racing at Finger Lakes.

"It starts with field-size and ends with handle. We will also ensure that the dialog and a feasibility study for the development of a turf course does not disappear. It very well could be the spark to ignite real change for their racing product, and something that will benefit all stakeholders in New York.

"Breeders, owners, and horsemen do not need to wait long to see the New York-sired bonus at work first-hand: the very first race of the 2017 racing season in the FLGR condition book is a maiden special weight for New York-bred 3-year-olds."

Wake Up Kiss, Dam of A Shin Forward, Euthanized at 19

Vivien Malloy, owner of Edition Farm near Hyde Park, announced her cherished broodmare Wake Up Kiss has been euthanized at age 19. Wake Up Kiss, a two-time stakes winner by Cure the Blues, produced five winners from five starters, led by A Shin Forward, a grade 1 winner in Japan.

Wake Up Kiss was buried Feb. 27. Malloy, who hopes to sponsor a turf race for New York-bred fillies in her mare's name, said, "Wake Up Kiss was stoic and classy to the end of her life. She meant the world to me. She was my favorite always, and I hope she knew it. She was beautiful. Ask anyone."

Wake Up Kiss, whom Malloy called "a New York love story for sure," was bred

in the Empire State by John Hettinger. Purchased in 1999 as a Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling by Equix Biomechanics and trained by H. James Bond, Wake Up Kiss won five of 10 starts for Rudlein Stable and William L. Clifton Jr. Her first stakes win came at 3 in the Perfect Arc division of the New York Stallion Series going a mile on turf and, in her final career start at 5, she captured the Yaddo Handicap at Saratoga. In 2003 Wake Up Kiss was voted New York-bred champion turf female.

Edition Farm purchased Wake Up Kiss in foal to Forest Wildcat for \$380,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. The resulting foal, A Shin Forward, sold as a Fasig-Tipton New York select yearling in 2006 for \$125,000 before being purchased by Hirotsugu Hirai the following February at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale for \$290,000 and going on to become a star in Japan.

A Shin Forward, winner of the Mile Championship (G1) at Kyoto, also placed in the grade 1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen. A Shin Forward stands at Lex Stud in Hokkaido. He earned \$3,416,216 and sits in second place on the all-time New Yorkbred earnings list behind Funny Cide (\$3,529,412).

Wake Up Kiss is also the dam of stakes winner Wake Up in Malibu, by Malibu Moon. Wake Up Kiss' last foal is an unnamed colt by Scat Daddy foaled March 26, 2016. By Sarah Mace





Mind Your Biscuits 2016 NY-bred HOY

Bromans collect fourth trophy as top breeders

Mind Your Biscuits, winner of the 2016 Malibu Stakes (G1) and Amsterdam Stakes (G2), was voted 2016 New York-bred Horse of the Year. The chestnut son of former New York sire Posse also took honors as champion 3-year-old male and champion male sprinter.

Trained by Robert Falcone Jr. last year, Mind Your Biscuits now races from the barn of newly minted conditioner and part owner Chad Summers, whose first victory as a trainer came when Mind Your Biscuits took the \$2 million Dubai Golden Shaheen (G1) at Meydan Racecourse March 25 in Dubai. The ownership group is headed by J Stables, Sol Kumin's Head of Plains Partners, and Michael E. Kisber. Samantha Will Baccari of Jumping Jack Racing bred Mind Your Biscuits who was foaled at Gary and Sue Lundy's Cedar Ridge Farm in Pine Plains. The champion's dam, the Toccet mare Jazzmane, was named New York's 2016 Broodmare of the Year.

Chosen by a ballot of New York turf writers, handicappers, chart callers and racing analysts conducted by NYTB, the New York-bred divisional champions were announced at the annual awards banquet of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. (NYTB) held April 3, 2017, at the Saratoga National Golf Club in Saratoga Springs, New York. The event was sponsored by the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, and emceed by Richard Migliore, a former champion New York jockey and now a broadcast analyst.

The other equine multiple honoree of the night was grade 1 Ballerina Stakes winner Haveyougoneaway. Voted New York's champion female sprinter and champion older dirt female, the mare was bred by Andy and Susan Beadnell and trained by Tom Morley for owners Gary Barber and Sequel Racing.

For the fourth time Chester and Mary Broman were named New York's top breeders. The couple, whose names are synonymous with New York breeding success, also won the award in 2004, 2011, and 2014. The Bromans' standouts in 2016 included Highway Star and Bar of Gold.

Rudy R. Rodriguez emerged as the top-earning trainer of New York-breds last year.

The hot-handed Irad Ortiz, Jr. was top state-bred jockey earnings. Ortiz, who won the award in 2013, had been displaced by younger brother Jose in 2014 and 2015.








New York-bred Champions

Heading into the summer of 2016, Mind Your Biscuits was a nice state-bred stakes horse, but during the Saratoga meet—and beyond—the son of Posse has grown into quite possibly the best sprinter in the world. He got on track at the Spa with an upset score in the grade 2 Amsterdam Stakes for trainer Robert Falcone Jr. Mind Your Biscuits kept digging and later finished a good third in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) and was later elevated to second behind Drefong when Masochistic was disqualified for a medication overage. It was on to the Malibu Stakes (G1) for 3-year-olds at Santa Anita, and Mind Your Biscuits came through with a half-length victory.

The story gets even better in 2017 as Mind Your Biscuits shipped halfway around the world to win the March 25 Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) with new trainer Chad Summers.

Haveyougoneaway's return to New York proved to be the right move as she became a grade 1 winner at Saratoga

Coming "back home" to New York proved a wise move for Haveyougoneaway in 2016. Privately purchased by Becky Thomas' Sequel Racing after a steady stakes career in America's heartland, the Congrats mare came into her own during the Saratoga stand. After taking Belmont's Dancin Renee Stakes for state-breds July 3, she went upstate and upended the grade 2 Honorable Miss Handicap, then pulled off a 10-1 score in the Ballerina Stakes (G1), giving trainer Thomas Morley his first major stakes win. Gary Barber bought in after the Honorable Miss and was along for the ride when she sold for \$1.1 million at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale.

The grade 1 success was also a first for breeders Andy and Susan Beadnell who run the 100-acre Bead Land & Cattle Company near Pottersville. They also bred the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale topper for \$450,000.

EFFINEX Champion Older Dirt Male

While his bid to defend his title as New York-bred Horse of the Year fell a bit short, Effinex competed at a high level all year long. The son of Mineshaft made eight starts—from March in Southern California to late November at Churchill Downs—all against grade 1 or grade 2 competition. He was also the betting favorite in four of those starts.

A strong third in the signature Santa Anita Handicap (G1) was followed by a strong win in the grade 2 Oaklawn Handicap in the early spring. An odds-on defeat in the Stephen Foster Handicap (G1) was followed by a score in Belmont's Suburban Handicap (G2) in July.

Perhaps his best run was a runner-up finish in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1), beaten only a half-length by Hoppertunity. A pair of disappointing runs brought an end to his career, but oh, what a run—he earned 3,312,950 in a 28-start career. Effinex is now standing his first season at stud at Questroyal North near Stillwater. His fee is 10,000 **R**

KING KREESA Champion Turf Male

The old guy just keeps on going. At the ripe old age of 7, he made nine starts, winning a pair of stakes and, as usual, making himself heard in open, graded stakes competition.

The wins came in the open Forbidden Apple Stakes at Belmont in July, and against the usual, double-tough New York-bred Kharafa in Saratoga's West Point Stakes. He ventured into grade 1 territory for the one-mile Fourstardave Handicap at Saratoga and was a close-up fourth behind Tourist, who went on to win the Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T). The "King" was second in the Fourstardave in 2013, the year he won his first New York-bred turf male championship.

In a 37-start career, King Kreesa has won 10 black-type races, with eight of those coming at home at Belmont Park. The \$257,850 he earned in 2016 boosted his lifetime total past the \$1.3 million mark and he's still in training.

Racing for Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables, the 3-year-old Kantharos filly was a commanding 4¹/₄-length winner over entry-level allowance foes on the Belmont turf May 14, then took the \$100,000 Wild Applause Stakes there June 19, topping a good Thundering Sky.

The coup de grace came at Saratoga July 22 when she strolled to a 1¹/₄-length win in the 1¹/₄-mile Lake George Stakes (G2T) to run her record to four-for-four.

Later in the season she tailed off, finishing unplaced in Woodbine's Ontario Colleen Stakes (G3T) and third to Thundering Sky in Belmont's Pebbles Stakes in October.

Foaled at Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, she was a \$225,000 purchase by agent Steve Young at the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale.

SYNDERGAARD Champion 2-Year-Old Male

This lightning-quick juvenile quickly separated himself from the rest of the state-bred pack with his first two starts: a three-length maiden special weight win and a 10¹/₄-length drubbing of Bobby On Fleek in the \$190,000 Funny Cide Stakes. Both wins came at Saratoga.

Showing his value as a \$450,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. spring sale grad, Syndergaard battled to the line and was narrowly beaten by Practical Joke in the historic Champagne Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park.

He wasn't done and was tested in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1), where he was a tiring fifth. He continues to train forwardly at Palm Beach Downs in Florida for his 3-year-old bow. \square

CHESTER and MARY BROMAN Breeder

Chester and Mary Broman have poured their heart and soul into the New York breeding program, and they have been rewarded for a fourth time (2004, 2011, 2014, 2016) with a championship as the leading breeders in the state. The Chesterfield Farm upstate produced four homebred stakes winners for the power couple in 2016, headed by champion 3-year-old filly Highway Star.

The daughter of Girolamo, out of Stolen Star, by Cat Thief, won against state-breds and was able to step up and take the grade 3 Go for Wand Handicap late in the season.

The other Broman stakes winners were Bar of Gold, Cloud Control, and Haul Anchor.

Throughout their career, the Bromans have had graded stakes success with Artemis Agrotera, Friends Lake, Khancord Kid, and Seeking the Ante.

Chester Broman, from Pinelawn, N.Y., became the owner, president, and CEO of Clifford Broman & Sons, a general contracting corporation in West Babylon that was established in 1938. He was appointed to the New York Racing Association board of trustees in 1995 and has served multiple terms on the board of directors for the New York Thoroughbred Breeders.

RUDY RODRIGUEZ



Rudy Rodriguez has won 20 graded stakes in his career

Few can doubt the horsemanship of trainer Rudy Rodriguez, who was named New York's top conditioner for 2016. He worked with Quarter Horses in Mexico before moving to the United States in the 1980s. As a jockey, he was able to reach the brass ring, winning at the grade 1 level aboard Frost Giant.

After retiring from the saddle, Rodriguez became an assistant trainer for Rick Dutrow Sr. and Rick Dutrow Jr. and the late Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel.

A trainer since 2010, Rodriguez has won more than 850 races and has 69 black-type wins to his credit. He also has 20 graded stakes wins on his ledger, including major scores by Dads Caps, Condo Commando, and Belle Gallantey.

His career earnings are approaching \$40 million.

Stakes scores in 2016 include five stakes wins by New York-bred Royal Posse and two by New York-bred champion 2-year-old filly Bonita Bianca. Other state-bred stakes winners came from Good Luck Gus, Frosty Margarita, Drama King, and Court Dancer.

IRAD ORTIZ JR. Jockey

Last year Jose Ortiz was named champion rider in New York for 2015 for the second straight year, and this year Ortiz' brother, Irad Jr., earns top billing to go along with his 2013 title. A top rider since he and his brother arrived in New York in 2012, Irad had the good fortune of winning the 2016 Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (G1) aboard Creator, one of 17 graded stakes he won at New York Racing Association tracks. Grade 1 wins also came aboard Lady Eli, Pretty City Dancer, and Dacita.

He won 295 races at Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga in 2016 and additional stakes wins came aboard New York-breds such as champion 2-year-old filly Bonita Bianca, Empire Classic Handicap winner Royal Posse, turf male champion King Kreesa, and Good Luck Gus.

The brothers, from Trujillo Alto, Puerto Rico, began riding at Hipodromo Camarero. Since they have been riding in New York, both brothers have been among the top riders in the country. In 2016 Irad Ortiz ranked second by earnings, behind only Eclipse Award winner Javier Castellano while Jose Ortiz finished third. Both earned in excess of \$22 million. So far in 2017 they rank among the top five riders.

JAZZMANE Broodmare of the Year

Bred in Kentucky by Stonyfield Farm, Jazzmane (Toccet—Alljazz, by Stop the Music) was unraced but has proved her worth as a broodmare as the dam of 2016 New York-bred Horse of the Year Mind Your Biscuits.

Jazzmane was owned by Samantha Will, who bred Mind Your Biscuits under the Jumping Jack Racing banner. Will is the wife of Chris Baccari of Baccari Bloodstock, and she's only been involved with breeding Thoroughbreds for a few years.

Of Jazzmane, Will said: "She was a bit of an average-looking mare."

As is often the case, Baccari Bloodstock sold Jazzmane at the 2013 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. The buyer was the K.O.I.D. outfit from South Korea. After the success of Jazzmane, Will was able to find—and purchase—her half sister Daryanna, by Friends Lake.

WILLOW U Steeplechaser

The most successful jump horses are generally the ones that fared poorly on the flat, which is not necessarily the case with 5-year-old Willow U, the 2016 champion New York-bred steeplechaser. She was able to break her maiden at a mile at Aqueduct at 3 and was good enough to win twice at Saratoga during the 2015 meeting.

Claimed from her last victory in September 2015 by trainer Richard Valentine, she

quickly transitioned to jumps, breaking her maiden a second time in April 2016 in her second jump try. Things got a whole lot better in 2016 as Willow U ran third at the Spa in the Mrs. Ogden Phipps Handicap at 16¹/₂ furlongs and closed her campaign with a solid 1¹/₂-length score in Camden's Springdale Stakes at 17 furlongs.

COMPETITION AGAINST THE BLUEGRASS always brings out "New York pride" among breeders. "Absolutely. We're always very happy, whether it's one of ours or another New York-bred that does well, whether it's in the sale areana or at the races," Gallagher's Stud farm manager Mallory Mort said.

"I think for the longest time, we got the knock we couldn't raise good horses here, and I think people now realize we can."

That was apparent at the Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream Park sale March 1, when two New York-breds were among the top horses sold and demanded a combined \$1.4 million.

Hip 6, a striking dark bay colt sired by Medaglia d'Oro out of Wild Chant, by War Chant, and bred by Gallagher's Stud, sold to WinStar Farm and Breeze Easy for \$900,000, the fourth-highest price at the sale and third-highest-priced colt.

The second top-selling New York-bred in the sale was Hip 25, an Into Mischief colt out of Blue Devil Bel. The dark bay or brown juvenile was purchased for \$500,000 by a partnership of China Horse Club and WinStar Farm.

"There's a lot of pride from both the Gallagher's side of it and the New York-bred side," Mort said of the high-priced transactions.

The Medaglia d'Oro colt, foaled at Gallagher's Feb. 5, 2015, was the top-selling New York-bred at last year's Fasig-Tipton sale of select New York-breds at Saratoga, in which he went to Hartley/De Renzo from the consignment of Denali Stud for \$300,000.

"Gallagher's owns a breeding right to Medaglia d'Oro. That was totally our mat-

ing," Mort said. "Kitten's Joy, who like Medaglia d'Oro was sired by El Prado, had a very nice horse named Csaba out of a War Chant mare, and that was one of the reasons. Obviously, she's got a really nice pedigree, too."

Wild Chant, a Kentucky-bred winner and winner/producer, had been bought by Gallagher's Stud for \$300,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November mixed sale. A half sister to both multiple grade 1 winners Untapable (by Tapit) and Paddy O'Prado (by El Prado), she has a yearling filly by Lemon Drop Kid and was bred back to Medaglia d'Oro for 2017.

Mort said the dark bay or brown colt displayed confidence in his first year.

"You hear people talk about this, but it's like he knew he was good," Mort said. "He would just come out, set up and pose. He'd show off like he knew he was something special.

"I remember the first time (Denali's) Craig Bandoroff saw him. Craig said, 'Well, there's your horse right there.' "

Bandoroff remembered, too.

"He was a nice horse. You just looked at him and saw a good horse," Bandoroff said. "Horses like him usually go on and do well. Let's hope he goes on and does well on the racetrack for everyone involved with him."

As a yearling, the colt mingled well with others.

"I wouldn't say he was necessarily leader of the pack, but he didn't shy off

of anybody, either," Mort said. "We had some pretty good colts in that group, and he was always right there, rough and tumble with everyone else.

"We always thought he was quite good. He really gave us no problems at all. It seems like the good ones are always the ones who want to get hurt or have something go wrong with them. We got lucky with him."

At the Gulfstream under tack show, the colt posted a furlong breeze of :10²/₅.

"I just liked everything about him, his pedigree, the way he moved, and the way he galloped out," WinStar president Elliott Walden told Thoroughbred Daily News. "Very classy horse. (The price) was a little high, but those kinds of colts bring that kind of range, so I thought it was OK."

Walden added the colt, to be trained by Todd Pletcher, had caught his eye at the Saratoga sale—of which Gallagher's was aware.

"We were actually disappointed in the August sale what he brought," Mort said. "We thought he would bring a decent amount more than (\$300,000). And actually thought WinStar would be a little heavier hitter on him. They really seemed to like him at the yearling sale."

So far, Wild Chant has produced three winners from four foals of racing age.

"We don't have a stakes winner yet. We're still hoping, waiting for the big one," Mort said. "Hopefully, this guy will be him."

Hip 25, consigned at Gulfstream by Crupi's New Castle Farm, also breezed a furlong in :10%.

He was bred by Richard Leahy's Oak Bluff Stables and was foaled on Feb. 19, 2015, at Berkshire Stud.

Leahy, a breeder for nearly 25 years, owns the colt's grandmother, Fahamore, a Gulch mare.

"Everybody loved her at the yearling sale," Leahy recalled. "She injured herself in her first race, but she was so good-looking, I bought her and then proceeded to breed her. I have a number of offspring from her."

Generally preferring to keep females and sell colts, Leahy kept three fillies out of Fahamore—stakes winner Akilina, Kitty Panda, and Blue Devil Bel. He raced all three mares before breeding them upon retirement.

When it comes to breeding, Leahy said he relies on input from such people as trainer Christophe Clement, bloodstock agent John Donaldson, Winter Quarter Farm's Don Robinson, and Berkshire Stud's Doug Koch. He also uses Equix Biomechanical analysis and does a lot of research.

"I loved Into Mischief," Leahy said. "In fact, Blue Devil Bel's half sister, Kitty

Panda, has an Into Mischief filly on the ground, too."

During the sale juvenile's early days Leahy said he visited occasionally and saw photos and videos to stay up on the colt.

"We weren't the best of friends, but I certainly knew how he was doing," Leahy said. "I was constantly asking other people about him. People said the colt was extremely smart and well-behaved. He was a good-sized colt who acted intelligently."

The colt was purchased from Winter Quarter Farm by 4H for \$175,000 at last year's preferred sale of New York-breds at Saratoga.

"He was straight-forward; he breezed good, he galloped out good, and looked like a real horse," said J.J. Crupi, owner of New Castle.

Crupi, who with partners also owns 4H, was very happy with the purchase price at Gulfstream.

"I thought he'd be around \$400,000. He's a real nice horse, showed a lot of interest. He was

scoped seven times after he breezed," said Crupi, who also sold an Uncle Mo colt out of As Promised at the sale for \$250,000 to Colts Neck Stable.

"(Hip 25) was a big, gorgeous, correct horse. And a good horse sells good. And there were a lot of New York trainers there; that's why he went there."

Overall at Gulfstream, 10 New York-breds sold for an average price of \$241,250 (see page 34).

State-bred Conquest Mo Money lands starring role in New Mexico

NEW YORK-BRED SOPHOMORE CONQUEST MO MONEY has certainly taken the long route to success as the son of Uncle Mo made his way to the races at New Mexico's Sunland Park, just across the state line from El Paso Texas.

He ran his race record to three-forthree, including a pair of stakes scores worth \$100,000 before running a solid second at 4-1 in the March 26 Sunland Derby (G3). The \$800,000 race at 1¹/₈ miles was worth some serious points toward the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), and the \$176,000 second-place purse didn't hurt either.

Conquest Mo Money races for Tom and Sandy McKenna, the state's leading owners who race under the Judge Lanier Racing banner. Miguel Hernandez trains. Conquest Mo Money's stakes scores came in the Jan. 29 Riley Allison Stakes at a mile and the 1¼6-mile Mine That Bird Stakes Feb. 26.

In the Mine That Bird, Conquest Mo Money, with regular rider Jorge Carreno up, led the eight-horse field soon after the break. Longshot Conquest Crown Me had first jump and the rail as the field rounded the clubhouse turn, Conquest Mo Money pressing the pace at his flank.

After dogging Conquest Crown Me through early fractions of :22.78 and :46.33, Conquest Mo Money took over and cut the corner neatly into upper stretch.

Irap, the odds-on choice, saved ground and enjoyed a comfortable trip down the backstretch before launching his bid in upper stretch, but Conquest Mo Money turned back his rival under a vigorous ride to win by two lengths in 1:43.12.

In the Sunland Derby, Conquest Mo

Conquest Mo Money came home first in the Mine That Bird Stakes, then ran second in the \$800,000 Sunland Derby

Money was a solid second behind Calumet Farm's homebred Hence. The statebred was a clear second 4½ lengths ahead of third-place finisher Hedge Fund.

Conquest Mo Money, bred by Steve Davidson and Randy Gulatt's Twin Creeks Farm, is one of five winners out of Stirring, an unraced Kentucky-bred mare by Seeking the Gold. Twin Creeks purchased her with the Mine That Bird winner in utero for \$80,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. Twin Creeks sold Conquest Mo Money for \$180,000 at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale to Conquest Stables.

"He was a middle-sized colt who was very athletic and had a lot of energy," said Gulatt. "He brought a fair price. We were hoping for a little bit more, but we always are."

As Conquest Stables decided to exit the Thoroughbred arena, it dispersed its horses at the Keeneland November sale. Judge Lanier Racing picked Conquest Mo Money up for the bargain price of \$8,500.

The colt paid immediate dividends, earning \$12,900 in his maiden-breaking performance Jan. 6 at Sunland. He added \$60,000 in the Riley Allison and in the Mine That Bird.

Stirring has plenty of class in her pedigree. Out of the grade 1-placed stakes winner Daijin, she's a half sister to Canadian champion older female Serenading, a winner of Churchill Downs' Falls City Handicap (G2), and to Handpainted, a stakes-winning Canadian grade 1-placed filly. Both are by A.P. Indy. Daijin is from the immediate family of classic winner Touch Gold and Canadian horse of the year and Triple Crown winner With Approval.



Fifty Five to First

State-bred Fifty Five lands grade 3 Florida Oaks

PUTTING HER SIGNATURE LATE-RUNNING style to excellent use, Empire Equines' homebred Fifty Five earned her first stakes victory March 11 at Tampa Bay Downs, scoring a well-timed last-to-first victory in stakes-record time under Jose Ortiz in the \$200,000 Florida Oaks (G3T) at 1¹/₁₆ miles on turf.

In her first four career starts the bay daughter of Get Stormy had done little wrong. Following a third-place debut effort at Belmont Oct. 13, she broke her maiden for trainer Tom Bush at Aqueduct going 1¼6 miles on turf Nov. 16; on New Year's Day she captured an allowance optional claiming at the same trip at Gulfstream Park. Making her stakes debut in the Sweetest Chant Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Feb. 4, the filly came flying late from last, finishing third, only three-quarters of length behind the good Rymska.

Fifty Five, who was foaled at Berkshire Stud in Pine Plains, is one of two winners out of John and Sandy Crowe's stakes-placed homebred mare Soave, who died earlier this year. Soave was by Brahms out of the New York-bred Cozzene mare Cozzekiki.

Fifty Five, a \$24,000 RNA at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale, is Get Stormy's first stakes winner. She now sports a record of three wins and two thirds from five starts and has earned \$162,600.

After breaking cleanly in the Florida Oaks, Fifty Five, who was the third choice at 4-1, settled in last of eight, working her way over to the two-path from post six by the time the field had exited the chute. She loped along down the backstretch as much as 15 lengths

off the lead. Meanwhile 34-1 longshot Like a Hurricane set speedy early splits of :22.83, :46.90, and 1:12.09.

Fifty Five advanced a spot entering the far turn and, when asked, picked off all but four rivals in the bend.

Making her way out into the five path in upper stretch, she shadowed 4-5 favorite La Coronel just to her inside in the sprint to the wire. Fifty Five cruised past her rival in the final strides to win by a neck.

After a mile in 1:35.68, Fifty Five's final time was 1:41.60, eclipsing the stakes mark of 1:41.89 set in 2013 by Tapicat.

"(Trainer Tom Bush) just told me to keep patient and when you ask her, she is going to give you a big run," Ortiz said. "I just tried to follow the favorite because I knew she was going to be tough, and as soon as we passed the eighth pole, I knew we had a decent chance to win."

John Crowe seems to get plenty of thrills from Fifty Five's running style. "She's a heartthrob because she always comes from behind like that," he said. "When Jose took her back early, I thought 'She's done this before.' But when they turned for home, I said 'Get her moving, get her moving.'"

Bush commented, "The fractions helped us quite a bit, but she did move up on the backside with the rest of the field and was in pretty good shape. It's a terrific feeling. She just won a graded stakes and has improved every time we've run her, and you can't ask more from a horse than that."




