

# Spring Showcase on the Horizon

write this not too long after our exciting awards event April 15 and can't help but think that New York-breds just keep taking us from triumph to triumph. Next stop: the inaugural Spring New York Showcase Day at Belmont Park June 1, the Saturday before the Belmont Stakes (gr. I).

The traditional New York Showcase Day at Belmont in October is one of the most popular and lucrative days of racing on the New York Racing Association calendar, and clearly the consensus was that "one is not enough." My guess is that you agree.

As with the fall version, Spring New York Showcase Day is an allstate-bred card, featuring seven stakes races. You are already familiar with five of these.

The grass season gets underway in full force with the first pair of the eight stakes scheduled every year for male and female New York-bred turf runners at the NYRA tracks: the Mount Vernon for older fillies and mares and the Kingston Stakes for older males. Spring Showcase is also the new home for a pair of longer sprints—the seven-furlong Bouwerie for 3-year-old fillies, first run in 1978, and the 6½-furlong Affirmed Success for 3-year-olds and up, inaugurated in 2012.

Perhaps the best-known of the traditional races to be run on the new Showcase card is the seven-furlong Mike Lee Stakes, also known as the first leg of the Big Apple Triple, our series for New Yorkbred 3-year-olds that runs from

June through August at Belmont, Finger Lakes, and Saratoga Race Course. The running of the Mike Lee is especially exciting this year as it marks the return of a \$250,000 bonus for the connections of a horse that wins all three races. We won't soon forget 2008 when Tin Cup Chalice became the first—and so far only—horse to sweep the series.

Finally, the new Spring Showcase Day brings us two brand new stakes races, each named for a New Yorkbred champion and Horse of the Year: the \$100,000 Dancing Renee at seven furlongs for older fillies and mares and the \$150,000 Commentator at 1½ miles for 3-year-olds and up.

New York-bred stakes worth \$850,000 in purses featured on a NYRA card not only produces a great day of racing, but brings national recognition to our program—especially the week before the Belmont Stakes, when all eyes are focused on the Elmont racetrack. The timing is also perfect for our horses to advertise themselves and the advantages of New York-bred ownership at a time when the yearling sales are right around the corner.

I believe the new Showcase Day is not only an endorsement of our strong breeding program, but an all-around winner for breeders, horsemen, and horseplayers. I'm sure we can look forward to it becoming a fixture on the NYRA racing calendar. Who knows, maybe down the road we will see a Winter New York Showcase Day at Aqueduct.

### The Lumber Guy Named NY-bred Horse of the Year

The Lumber Guy, a finalist for the 2012 Eclipse Award for male sprinter, and his connections garnered six trophies April 15 at the New York Thoroughbred Breeders' awards banquet in Saratoga Springs. The galloping gray was named New York horse of the year, champion 3-year-old male, and champion male sprinter.

The son of Grand Slam is owned and bred by Barry Schwartz and his Stonewall Farm, which was named New York breeder of the year. Mike Hushion, who trains The Lumber Guy, was named New York-bred trainer of the year. The Lumber Guy's dam, Boltono, was named New York broodmare of the year.

Dayatthespa, another multiple honoree, was named champion 3-year-old filly and champion turf female. Reigning three-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey Ramon Dominguez was in attendance to collect his third consecutive award for New Yorkbred jockey of the year.

"In 2012 New York-breds enjoyed unprecedented success on the racetrack," NYTB executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo said. "Five different New York-breds, including four 3-year-olds, won grade I races at five different racetracks. Once again we have proof that a strong regional program has a place for top-quality breeding."





## BIG APPLE TRIPLE TO CARRY \$250,000 BONUS

A \$250,000 bonus will be awarded to the connections of a horse that sweeps this year's "Big Apple Triple," a series of races for New Yorkbred 3-year-olds at Belmont Park, Finger Lakes, and Saratoga Race Course.

The Big Apple Triple includes Belmont's \$125,000 Mike Lee Stakes at seven furlongs June 1, Finger Lakes' \$150,000 New York Derby at 11/16 miles July 20, and Saratoga's \$150,000 Albany Stakes at 11/8 miles Aug. 21.

The bonus has returned after a one-year hiatus. In 2008 Tin Cup Chalice became the first, and so far only, horse to sweep the series.

"The \$250,000 Big Apple Triple owners bonus is up for grabs again in New York," said Jeffrey Cannizzo, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "This lucrative incentive is yet another perk for owning a New York-bred. Monetary incentives like this add value for any owner in racing and that's what makes New Yorkbred ownership even more appealing. The Triple races are worth \$425,000 in purses this year for state-breds."

"The Big Apple Triple is an elusive prize but well worth reaching for," added Tracy

Egan, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. "Our breeders are striving to breed quality horses that can demonstrate the kind of versatility and talent demanded by this series."

In 2012 Willy Beamin won the Mike Lee and Albany before going on to take the grade I Foxwoods King's Bishop. The New York Derby went to Fox Rules.

give horsemen even greater incentive to run their top New York-breds in those races," said New York Racing Association director of racing P.J. Campo.

"We look forward to welcoming the Mike Lee winner and all challengers to Finger Lakes for the New York Derby," said Finger Lakes general manager Chris Riegle. "The New York-bred program is in many ways the backbone of our racing program, and we take great pride in hosting the second leg of this exciting series."





eter Kazamias stood in the paddock at Aqueduct April 10, waiting for his Flying Zealous to go to the starting gate. Owned, trained, and bred by Kazamias in the name of his Kaz Hill Farm, the 6-year-old gelding was making his eighth start in the six-furlong allowance/optional claimer. Not in for a tag, Flying Zealous was on a five-race winning streak, having lost only one lifetime start.

Make that a six-race winning streak: the homebred won by a half-length, but Kazamias hadn't taken victory for granted.

"I was very nervous," he admitted a few days later, sitting near Aqueduct's racing office before belatedly expressing confidence in his horse. "He seems to have just enough to always get there."

Flying Zealous is one of about "50 or 60" horses that Kazamias estimates he has in training, from the 2-year-olds on his New Jersey training farm to his 3-year-old racing homebreds, to the horses he's claimed. The New York-bred Flying Zealous, a son of Kazamias' Here's Zealous—Starship Smokester, by Smokester, didn't have the easiest start to his racing career, and he's far exceeded his owner's early expectations.

"I remember him very distinctly when he was born," Kazamias said, "because his back end was kind of

curved to one side, and I thought, 'Wow, is he ever going to make it (to the races)?' He turned out to be a great horse with a lot of heart."

A native of Cyprus who came to the United States with his family when he was 7 years old, Kazamias first got involved in racing as an owner a decade ago, getting his first win in 2003. He had been involved in various other endeavors—he listed jewelry stores, restaurants, and real estate among his business interests—but in his early 40s, he decided to buy Thoroughbreds.

"My dad had some horses overseas, and I've always been in love with horses," he said, noting his family's horses were for riding, not racing. "I figured that if I wanted to get involved I had to start someplace, to just learn the game a little bit, so I bought a couple of horses."

"A couple of horses" led to

many more, and he got his first win as a trainer in 2004. Before long, he purchased a breeding farm in Middletown, N.Y., naming it Kaz Hill Farm, along with a training farm, Rising Sun, in New Egypt, N.J.

If Kazamias got his love of horses from his father, his own children haven't caught the racing bug. He and his wife have three children, a daughter in college and two sons who work in Kazamias' non-racing business interests. He said that one son, Michael, bought some horses and raced them for a couple of years, then ended his involvement.

"He realized it cost a lot of money," said Kazamias with a laugh.

Though he has assistants on each of his farms, Kazamias is pretty much a one-man operation, breeding, training, and racing the horses he owns. He breeds about 20 of his approximately 50 mares each year, and while he does claim horses and buys some

at auction, he prefers to put his own imprint on the horses he races.

"I don't like to buy 2-year-olds in training," he explained. "I think that they get pushed too hard. I'm more apt to buy yearlings and break them myself, to do it gradually, in the way that I want."

Flying Zealous is an example of Kazamias' patient approach. The chestnut made his first start in November of his 4-year-old year. He won his debut, a 5½-furlong race at Parx, by 10¾ lengths, but came out of the race with an injury.

"He had issues before we got him to the races, and we ran him for a \$12,500 claiming price, but we figured that because he was a 4-year-old, nobody was going to take him. So we took a shot," Kazamias recounted. "He won the race pretty easy, but he ripped part of his foot off and it took a long time to bring him back."

Off for nearly a year, Flying Zeal-

ous finished fourth in his comeback in October 2012 and has since won six straight.

Flying Zealous' sire, Here's Zealous, is one of two stallions Kazamias stands at Kaz Hill: Bank Heist is the other. Here's Zealous won the 2001 Gravesend Handicap (gr. III) at Aqueduct and earned nearly a half-million dollars on the track before being claimed by Kazamias for \$50,000 in 2005; Bank Heist raced six times for owners George Bolton and Gulf Coast Farms and trainer Todd Pletcher. By champion Maria's Mon and out of the Dehere mare Candytuft, he's a half brother to multiple grade I winner and champion Midnight Lute, second on the national second-crop sire list and sire of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) hopeful Govenor Charlie.

"Until now," said Kazamias, "I've been breeding about 10 of my mares to Bank Heist, but I'm going to up that number because of how well Midnight Lute is doing right now."

Though Kazamias will occasionally ship one of his mares to Pennsylvania or Kentucky to breed them, he prefers to manage an already-risky business by breeding to his own two stallions.

"There's some really nice stallions I like to go to in Kentucky, but it's a lot of expense," he said. "You send them all the way out there, you ship back and forth—it's just a lot of time and money involved. Sometimes they lose the baby after you've put so much time into it. I like to basically just concentrate on my farm."

One of his more successful outside breeding ventures is the Awesome Again colt Awesome Vision, out of Kazamias' mare Blind Canyon (by Valley Crossing). Purchased at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale at Saratoga for \$65,000 by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace for West Point Thoroughbreds, Awesome Vision won Aqueduct's Compelling Word Stakes in March and has earned \$175,672 in five wins from seven starts. Kazamias is considering sending Blind Canyon, second in the 2004 Maryland Million Oaks and 2005 Maryland Million Distaff, back to Awesome Again.

In the meantime, though, he prefers to keep the breeding in his own equine family. He doesn't board horses for other owners and seldom books other people's mares to his stallions.

"I have a lot of friends in the industry, and as Here's Zealous is doing very good, they call me and ask if they can breed to him. Sometimes I charge them, sometimes I don't," he said, chuckling. Here's Zealous (a son of Dehere) is ninth on the general New York sire list.

Kazamias also prefers to train only his own horses, though he regularly fields requests from outside clients.

"I did it for one or two people, and it was a hassle," he said frankly. "People call me all the time, and I don't want to be explaining myself to people. They're constantly calling, asking when the horse is going to run, and if you're training babies, you can't be like that. You have to take your time."

The 51-year-old Kazamias keeps his yearlings at Kaz Hill Farm, then sends them to Rising Sun in New Jersey to be broken. The farm has a training track, jogging machines, and what Kazamias calls "aqua spas" for his horses.

His approach seems to be working. His horses have made 32 starts this year, and Kazamias has gone to the winner's circle nine times, with three seconds, and six third-place finishes. His horses have earned \$307,526 so far in 2013.

"You watch them grow as babies and become yearlings and get to the races—it's a lot of work, but a lot of accomplishment when they win," he said.

# Cat on the quite a cat for the New York-bred program

Bluegrass Cat quite a catch for the New

■ he New York breeding program took a major step forward last year when Bluegrass Cat came to Vinery New York at Sugar Maple from WinStar Farm in Kentucky. Now in his second season at stud in the Empire State, Bluegrass Cat, a top-line grade I winner with a classic pedigree, quickly found his way toward the top of the sire list and has drawn a crowd of breeders for his services.

In his first season in New York, the son of the legendary Storm Cat out of She's a Winner, by A.P. Indy, covered 118 mares, according to The Jockey

Club's Report of Mares Bred. That figure ranked second in the state behind leading sire Freud.

Well-built and a powerhouse both on the track and in the breeding shed, Bluegrass Cat stands 16 hands and looks the part.

"He has a gorgeous presence about him," said Erin Robinson, who is in charge of season sales at Vinery in Kentucky. "When he first came to New York last year a lot of people in New York hadn't had the opportunity to see him because he had been in Kentucky, but when they saw him in person they were quite impressed.

That's a good part of the reason why he got so many mares last year."

Bluegrass Cat, bred by WinStar Farm, stood his first five seasons there. In 2011 he also shuttled to Haras Don Alberto in Chile.

He was a hit from the beginning. He ranked second on the freshman sire list of 2010 with more than \$1.3 million in progeny earnings, topping other heavyweights such as Bernardini, War Front, and Rockport Harbor during that first year. His top earner, Kathmanblu (out of a Devil's Bag mare), landed the Golden Rod Stakes (gr. II) at Churchill Downs after running third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IIT).

Bluegrass Cat also ranked second, this time to Bernardini, on the second-crop list the following year, with his big earner coming in the form of Sabercat, winner of the rich Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (gr. III). Sabercat would go on to place in the 2012 Arkansas Derby (gr. I). Also in that second crop was the exciting Teeth of the Dog. Third in last year's Resorts World Casino New York City Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I), Teeth of the Dog (out of the Deputy Minister mare Deputy Reality) would rise up to win both the Dwyer Stakes (gr. II) and Easy Goer Stakes later that summer at Belmont Park.

The sire of 11 stakes winners, Bluegrass Cat has a pair of added-money winners this year: Michael With Us and Laurie's Rocket.

"It's important for the state to have a horse like Bluegrass Cat not just because of his racing quality but of his production as well," Robinson said. "He's well-bred but at the same time he's also had these great runners that can compete at the highest level, so he is an important horse for New York going forward."

### Classic Lines

Bluegrass Cat's pedigree needs little introduction. On the top line is Storm Cat, leading sire of 180 stakes winners and the most influential sire

line in North American pedigrees today.

His bottom side is just as strong while chock-full of black type and successful sires. While his dam, She's a Winner, was not a winner-was not even a starter for that matter-she is a full sister to Supercharger, the dam of 2010 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Super Saver. She's a Winner is also a full sister to grade I winner Girolamo, the New York grade I winner who is now standing his second season at stud at Sequel Stallions New York near Hudson for \$15,000.

His second dam, the graded winner Get Lucky, traces directly to one of the Phipps family's best mares, the grade I-winning Dance Number (by Northern Dancer, the grandsire of Storm Cat) and is a full sister to two major progenitors. Dance Number, a half sister to top sire Private Account, is the dam of champion Rhythm, winner of the 1990 Travers Stakes (gr. I), and Not For Love, a perennial leading sire in the Midlantic region. Get Lucky

is a half sister to Oscillate, the dam of Mutakddim, who has sired more than 100 stakes winners.

### **Classic Starts**

Bluegrass Cat was a star on the racetrack, winning four stakes—three graded and three around two turns—and earning \$1,761,280. Precocious enough for trainer Todd Pletcher to test him at 4½ furlongs in an early June debut at Churchill Downs in 2005, Bluegrass Cat failed to shine but gained valuable experience. Returning more than three months later he crushed a maiden field by 6½ lengths going seven fur-

longs at Belmont Park. Stakes company would be all he would face from then on out.

He came from just off the pace to win the oneturn mile Nashua Stakes (gr. III) at Belmont in late October and capped off his juvenile season by out-dueling eventual grade I winner Flashy Bull in the nine-furlong Remsen Stakes (gr. II) Thanksgiving weekend as the 3-5 favorite.

"See? Storm Cat," said Seth Benzel, then an assistant trainer for Pletcher, after the Remsen. "That's why he's so good. You can't beat those Storm Cats in a fight. He's great to have on your side."

Long seen as an important test for the following year's classics, the Remsen victory helped peg Bluegrass Cat at 115 pounds on that year's Experimental Free Handicap, 11 pounds below champion Stevie Wonderboy. Only seven juveniles that year were weighted higher.

With unlimited potential on the horizon, he tore

through the Sam F. Davis Stakes at Tampa Bay Downs in his 3-year-old debut, then was upset by Deputy Glitters while the 2-5 favorite in the Tampa Bay Derby (gr. III). Shipped to Keeneland, he was on the wrong end of a strong speed/rail bias (pre Polytrack) as Sinister Minister spurted clear to a 12<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length win in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I). WinStar and Pletcher pressed on to Louisville.

Dismissed at 30-1 for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands, Bluegrass Cat would show his true affinity for a route of ground and his toughness as he battled just off the pace to finish second in the Run

for the Roses to the powerful Barbaro. Little luster was lost off that defeat five weeks later when Bluegrass Cat was a 9-2 shot in the 12-furlong Belmont Stakes (gr. I). He came up short again, to Jazil, but was clearly the best of the rest.

His shining moment would come later that summer at Monmouth Park where he flat out ran off with the Haskell Invitational Handicap (gr. I) by seven lengths.

"His performance today is as good as any 3-year-old's this year," Pletcher said at Monmouth. "To win a grade I as significant as the Haskell puts him in an elite category as a racehorse and a prospective sire."

Bluegrass Cat would face the best one more time, running second to champion Bernardini in the Travers Stakes at Saratoga. X-rays taken the day after the race revealed he suffered a fractured right pastern and was retired to WinStar.

His initial fee was pegged at \$50,000, a figure that stood through his first two seasons. His fee for 2013 is \$15,000.

### **Heading to New York**

With the expected rise in the New York-bred program, Vinery New York at Sugar Maple was on the lookout to bolster its stallion roster. In late September 2011 the farm announced the partnership with WinStar to bring Bluegrass Cat to New York.

"We wanted to give the New York breeders another reason to stay home, and have the type of stallion that Kentucky breeders will follow," said Vinery president Tom Ludt. "We feel like everything is in place for him to be the leading sire in New York for many years to come."

While that feat lies on the horizon, his first foals from his first season in New York are arriving. The early responses are more then encouraging.

"We're still midway through the breeding season but the people that have bred to him last year are already getting New York-bred foals and they have been very pleased," Robinson said. "We're getting lots of pictures and people calling us the next day and telling us they're extremely excited about how nice their Bluegrass Cat foal is."


Bluegrass Cat, Vinery New York at Sugar Maple, and the New York breeding program are getting pretty as a picture as well...with room for sharper focus.

"The mare population hasn't quite picked up to the stallion population," Robinson said. "There was a big influx of stallions this year so the mares are still spread pretty thin among them. It will take a few years for the mare population to sort of catch up. Other than that, the industry in New York is booming. It's a good time to get involved."

# Sunny Days Ahead Saul and Max Kupferberg look bright with the success of their Sunny Desert

hen Saul Kupferberg and his father, Max, claimed the 2-year-old filly Sunny Desert in 2011, she had run twice: beaten 18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths in a sixth-place finish in a maiden special weight, and a second-place finish, beaten a halflength, in a \$35,000 maiden claimer.

"We were hoping," Saul said recently, "that she'd be good enough to win a maiden special weight."


Since then, the New York-bred daughter of Wild Desert has won eight of 12 races, including six stakes, most recently the Shot Berry Stakes, run at a mile April 14 at Aqueduct, along with two seconds and a third.

Sunny Desert ran the Shot Berry on short rest, just two weeks after she won the six-furlong Broadway Stakes for New York-breds March 30. Trainer John Parisella has generally given her about two months between races.

"(Racing her on short rest) is against what I believe in," said Parisella two days before the Shot Berry, "but there aren't any races for her until Showcase Day on June 1.

"If I'm wrong, it's not going to hurt me; we'll still have six weeks. She came out of the Broadway great, and you just hope that it's worth taking this opportunity. I don't know if the short rest will work against her, but she figures the best on paper."

She figured the best on the track, too, though she had to work a little harder for this win than she has recently, the three-quarter-length vic-

tory her closest since a nose win in the New York Stallion Series Park Avenue Division last May at Belmont Park.

Out of the Louis Quatorze mare Hoping for Sun, Sunny Desert was purchased as a weanling at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s October mixed sale in 2009 for \$2,000 by Drs. K.K. and Vilasini D. Jayaraman, owners and breeders of Summer Bird, who won the 2009 Belmont, Shadwell Travers, and Jockey Club Gold Cup (all gr. I). She was bred by Breed of Characters and has earned \$421,750, all but \$6,750 of it for the Kupferbergs.

"She's way better than we'd hoped, and John (Parisella) gets all the credit for that," said Saul. "She's a once-ina-lifetime claim."

While many people get hooked on races when their parents bring them to the track, it happened the other way around for the Kupferbergs.

"My dad wasn't interested in racing at all when I was kid," recalled Saul. "I became interested by watching racing on television, and I got started in racing with a partner. Then we had the worst thing happen," he said with a laugh.

"We got lucky with our first horse." That horse, the filly Great Pass (Great Prospector—Via, by Cloudy Dawn), won 14 races, including stakes at Monmouth and Hialeah.

"My dad said that summer, when she'd won her first couple of races, 'Why don't we buy some horses together?' and I said, 'Are you sure you're feeling alright?' That was 1988, 25 years ago."

In the New York City borough of Queens, the name Kupferberg is familiar to more than just racing fans. In 2006, 93-year-old Max donated \$10 million to his alma mater, Queens College, for the Kupferberg Center for the Arts. A physicist who worked with his twin brother on the Manhattan Project in Los Alamos, N.M., Max and three of his brothers started Kepco, an international company specializing in electrical equipment and based in Flushing, Queens.

Saul, who is Kepco's vice president of sales and marketing, shares his father's local philanthropic bent; he serves on the Arts Advisory Board at Queens College and on the board of the Queens Botanical Garden.

The father-and-son team currently have nine horses in training with Parisella and a half dozen more at Finger Lakes with trainer Michael Ferraro. They also have

five broodmares at Stonebridge Farm near Gansevoort, N.Y., near Saratoga, though they get most of their horses through claiming and at sales, where, according to Saul, they'll look for horses "in the high five figures."

All of their horses, he said, are New York-breds. Their best horse was Copper Mount, winner of the 1994 Albany Handicap at Saratoga, but the "best horse" title now clearly belongs to Sunny Desert.

As grateful as they are for their stakes-winning filly, her connections

are hoping for even bigger things from her later this year.

In an effort to get her some graded stakes black-type, Parisella and the Kupferbergs entered Sunny Desert in the Top Flight (gr. II) at Aqueduct in March. She finished third but showed enough that this year's plan is to run her in graded stakes in the fall.

"The truth of the matter," said Parisella, "is that she had a troubled trip and she should have been second instead of third."

So, he said, after the New Yorkbred Showcase Day June 1 at Belmont Park, Sunny Desert will be given a break with an eye on bigger and better races.

Not, Kupferberg is quick to add, that he doesn't appreciate the New York-bred program.

"We're not trying to claim our way to the Kentucky Derby (gr. I)," Saul joked. "We just want to be reasonably successful on the New York circuit, and the improving purse money in New York has helped a lot. It's an incentive to continue to buy, to stay in the game. We want to race in New York and we want to have New Yorkbreds; it's a big advantage to have them."

His biggest advantage at the moment is the New York-bred filly that he had to be persuaded to claim, as Parisella tells it.

Describing himself as "a big replay guy," the trainer said that he watched Sunny Desert's second race "over and over."

"I saw her check several times and finish with a little bit of a flourish," he said. "I couldn't pick it up the first time, then each time I watched it, I got more and more impressed."

Still, he said, "It wasn't an obvious claim, but I talked him into it."

Given what Sunny Desert has accomplished, Parisella likely won't have much trouble convincing Kupferberg in the future.

"She's trained beautifully and she looks fantastic," said Saul. "She's more than we ever dreamed of."




