





The First Weekend in May: Finger Lakes

ON THE FIRST WEEKEND in May, all eyes, including mine, were focused on Louisville, Ky., and Churchill Downs. At the same time, my thoughts turned to another place—one is just as important for the welfare and economics of the New York-bred breeding and racing program as any head-line-grabbing participation of New York-breds in the nation's classic races. I refer to Farmington, N.Y., the home of Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack.

Finger Lakes has been very much on all of our minds lately. New York Thoroughbred Breeders is participating in the process of passing legislation to hold Finger Lakes purses harmless should a casino be built in nearby Tyre, N.Y. As you also know, the racetrack is coping with the long-term challenges of declining handle and attendance, which are only exacerbated by some contractual simulcasting issues.

Meanwhile I have been crunching the numbers from 2014 relevant program awards and purses earned by New York-breds. The statistics produce some dramatic conclusions about the role of the Farmington racetrack in our program.

In a nutshell, the numbers point to the absolutely essential nature of Finger Lakes to the economics of our state-bred program, including the welfare of our breeders and stallion owners. On opening day at Finger Lakes, which was also Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) day, I watched my findings play out in a very concrete way.

On May 1 at Finger Lakes, the nine-race card included eight open races and one race restricted to New York-breds: one open maiden special weight, one New York-bred allowance, two maiden claimers, and five other claiming races.

New York-breds won all nine races. A quick scan through the first three finishers in each race reveals that results of opening day generated 20 breeder's awards (out of a possible 27). A look at first-place finishers only reveals that the winners of five of the nine races were sired by New York stallions, which, of course, produces stallion owners' awards.

This is just a snapshot of what happens for sixplus months a year at Finger Lakes. The Farmington racetrack generates the widest distribution of Fund resources to the greatest number of people. Finger Lakes generates 49% of the number of breeder's awards distributed by the Fund. In 2014 this translated to a total of 2,874 individual awards in the amount of \$2.79 million. Although this only adds up to 22% of the total breeder's awards money disbursed, it means that awards earned at Finger Lakes are reaching an enormous number of breeders and stallion owners across the state, helping them maintain their businesses and, by extension, the whole program.


And there's more. Even though only 11% of the races at Finger Lakes are restricted to New York-breds (vs. 32% at Aqueduct), our state-breds have a huge strike rate in Western New York. In fact, New York-breds earn 74% of the available purse money at Finger Lakes and make 69% of the track's starts.

I can't emphasize enough, especially to those who regard Finger Lakes as kind of an appendage to the New York racing and breeding scene, how important it is to us all and for the program as a whole for this racetrack to thrive.

I would like to comment also on a very special contribution that Finger Lakes makes to all those involved in New York breeding and racing: the Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program (FLTAP).

Recently, the NTRA Safety & Integrity Alliance reaccreditation team again commended Finger Lakes for a "Best Practice" grading in the area of aftercare and transition of retired racehorses. FLTAP, which was founded in 2005, has placed more than 400 Thoroughbreds in new homes and careers. Not all New York-breds can be competitive or remain competitive downstate. Many individuals race at Finger Lakes throughout their careers or transition to the racetrack later on. It would be hard to overstate the importance of FLTAP for this deserving horse population.

I am committed to working with the management at Finger Lakes and Delaware North to do everything in my power to help Finger Lakes succeed in the long term for the benefit of breeders, horses, and our program as a whole. I'm sure I can count on your support as we forge ahead in the important months to come.

LOKI'S VENGEANCE FINDS 'SUCCESS'

Blue Bison Stable's Loki's Vengeance, a 4-year-old son of New York sire Frost Giant (Keane Stud), came up the rail May 3 to collect a second career stakes victory in the six-furlong \$100,000 Affirmed Success Stakes for New York-breds at Belmont Park.

With an energetic closing kick, the dark bay or brown colt drew off to win by $1^{3}/_{4}$ lengths in 1:09.80.

The multiple stakes-winning Empire Dreams came flying late to finish second, three-quarters of a length ahead of John's Island. Captain Serious, Curious Cal, I'm Stoked, and Weekend Hideaway completed the order of finish. Between the Lines was scratched.

Winner of the Times Square division of the New York Stallion Stakes as a sophomore, Loki's Vengeance boosted his career record to 4-4-0 from 12 starts and increased his earnings to \$253,709.

Bred by Andrew Cohen, whose Sunrise Stables stands Frost Giant, and foaled at Vinery New York near Hudson (now Rockridge Stud), Loki's Vengeance is the first foal out of Subtle Sweetness (by During) who was bred in New York by Thomas-Narlinger and Dennis Repp. The mare won two of three lifetime starts.

All five of Subtle Sweetness' foals are by Frost Giant: a

3-year-old colt named How Frosty It Is, who was unplaced in his only start so far; a 2-year-old colt; a yearling filly; and a filly foaled April 24, 2015. Blue Bison Stable purchased Loki's Vengeance for \$35,000 at the Fasig-Tipton New Yorkbred preferred yearling sale in 2012.

LA VERDAD REPEATS IN DISTAFF

Returning to the races at 5 following an off-the-board finish against the boys in the Fall High-weight Handicap (gr. III) late last November, Lady Sheila Stable's star sprinter La Verdad successfully defended her title in the Distaff Handicap (gr. II) April 18 at Aqueduct while making short work of three rivals.

After an opening quarter-mile in :22.25, and a half-mile in :44.87, New York-bred La Verdad drew off to a no-doubt-about-it 51/4-length win, stopping the clock after six furlongs in a very sharp 1:10 flat.

"I can only hope she comes back and races as well as she has the last year and a half for us," said trainer Linda Rice. "I had her in training for quite a long time without a vacation, and after the Fall Highweight I decided to turn her out for a couple months; she deserved it."

La Verdad has compiled two stellar campaigns for Rice at 3 and 4, putting together two separate four-race win streaks in 2013-14, broken only by a runner-up finish in the 2014 Barbara Fritchie Handicap (gr. II) in February 2014.

La Verdad won six times last year, and in 2013 La Verdad won four of five starts. The bay mare's career record stands at 11 wins and two seconds from 17 career starts with \$900,700 in earnings.

Bred by Eklektikos Stable and foaled at Chester and Mary Broman's Chestertown Farm in Chestertown, La Verdad was sold privately to Sheila Rosenblum of Lady Sheila Stable following her second allowance victory in November 2013. La Verdad is a daughter of Yes It's True—Noble Fire, by Hook and Ladder.



OBS Spring Sale: 15 New York-breds bring six figures



New York-breds at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds in training were led by a \$310,000 Here Comes Ben colt

New York-breds made a strong showing during a robust Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds in training, matching the overall sale median and gaining ground in average price over last year. The New York-bred market at the top end expanded significantly.

During the four-day auction (April 21-24) a total of 15 state-bred juveniles sold for six figures, with six selling for \$200,000 and up.

Most meaningful to the Empire State was the increase in sales at the high end of the spectrum, which reflects a broader market trend for New York-bred 2-year-olds over the last two years.

This year, despite a smaller population of New York-bred entered in the OBS April sale (103 offered in 2015, down from

126 offered in 2014), 15 horses cracked six figures; six brought \$200,000 and up, and three sold for \$300,000 and up. In 2014, 17 horses brought six figures, with four individuals commanding \$200,000 and up, and a single juvenile selling for over \$300,000.

Of the 103 New York-breds offered, 79 changed hands, which included 10 private sales, for a buy-back rate of 23.3%. Although this number is up from last year's New York-bred 16.7% buy-back rate, the overall buy-back rate also was higher. In 2014 the buy-back for all horses entered was 18.2% compared to 22.0% this year.

The average price for a New York-bred juvenile of \$66,759 at OBS rose 4.8% over last year's \$63,714. The cumulative sale average was a sale record \$79,455, up 7.4% over last year's record. The New York-bred median of \$45,000 was down a tick or two from last year's \$47,000 but equal to the overall sale median.

The New York-bred sale-topper, who fetched \$310,000 April 22, was a sales home run for New York-based freshman sire Here Comes Ben (McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds).

Bred by Patricia L. Moseley and foaled March 23, 2013, at Cedar Ridge Farm near Pine Plains, the dark bay or brown colt out of Thundersnow (by Storm Boot) was purchased by Japanese buyer K.K. Eishindo, who campaigned A Shin Forward, the second-highest all-time New York-bred earner (\$3,416,216). The sale was a pinhooking coup for consignor Rick Lopez, who purchased Hip 581 as a weanling for \$3,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga fall mixed and horses of racing age sale.

A colt by Scat Daddy—Sunny, by Dixieland Band, bred by Pat Pavlish and foaled April 13, 2013, at Akindale Farm near Pawling, sold to Team D for \$300,000.

Also selling for \$300,000 was a filly by Unbridled's Song—Church Camp, by Forest Camp. She was bred by Gainesway Thoroughbreds and was foaled April 14, 2013, at Edition Farm near Hyde Park. Trainer John Kimmel signed the ticket for Tobey L. Morton.

FINGER LAKES EARNS NTRA REACCREDITATION

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association announced May 1 that Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack has earned reaccreditation from the NTRA Safety & Integrity Alliance. Finger Lakes has been continuously accredited by the Alliance since 2011 and, once again, the inspection team gave the Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program a "Best Practice" grading in the area of aftercare and transition of retired racehorses, noting the FLTAP is one of the best Thoroughbred aftercare programs in the nation.

"Finger Lakes' adoption program stands out as a racing operation that un-

derstands the important role that aftercare and transition of retired racehorses plays in the overall safety of their racing operation," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA.

The FLTAP was ahead of its time when it was founded in 2005 and remains an excellent example of how tracks and horsemen can work together to transition retired Thoroughbreds safely.

Kim Delong, a Farmington native who has worked on the Finger Lakes property for more than 27 years, has been involved with the FLTAP program since its inception and is its president.

"Before that one of our association vets would try to adopt out horses on her own from the backside," Delong said. "We saw that there was a need for a more formal program."

More than 400 Thoroughbreds have found new homes and careers through FLTAP.

"Finger Lakes has displayed diligence and a keen desire to do things right," said Steve Koch, executive director of the Safety & Integrity Alliance. "Finger Lakes management clearly has maximized their available track resources to achieve success in the areas of safety and integrity."



Ralph Evans' New York-bred Upstart makes the Derby field, has

disappointing results



TWO DAYS AFTER the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), trainer Rick Violette Jr. was back in New York, while his Derby runner Upstart stayed in Kentucky for some rest and relaxation before preparing for a summer campaign.

The sting of Upstart's last-place finish in the May 2 Run for the Roses had lessened, though Violette allowed that it had been a long trip home from Louisville.

"You take your lumps in this business," he said philosophically. "I give myself 24 hours to sulk, and then you have to move on.

"On race day I was a little bit anxious because I thought we had a big shot, numbers wise and the way the horse was acting during training," he said. "It ramped up a bit before you got going: at the hotel, getting dressed. Once you get to the track, there are enough distractions and people to talk to."

Prior to the distractions of the first Saturday in May, Upstart had given every indication in his training that he was ready for the 10-furlong contest and that he had a shot at becoming the second New York-bred winner of the Kentucky Derby, following Funny Cide's 2003 victory.

From the first race of Upstart's career, the dark bay or brown horse had inspired confidence in his connections.

He made his debut at Saratoga last August, in a modest maiden race for New York-breds, closing from fifth in a field of seven horses to win by 5½ lengths, impressive enough for owner Ralph Evans and trainer Violette to start thinking about the late summer and fall stakes races in New York, none of which fell into a typical schedule for a horse that made his first start on Aug. 15.

Evans had selected the colt by Flatter out of the Touch Gold mare Party Silks bred by Mrs. Gerald Nielsen at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of New York-breds. He joked last year that he and longtime trainer Violette seldom agreed on the horses that he picks out, but that they had come to rare consensus on this one and Evans purchased him for \$130,000.

After Upstart's initial victory, Evans and Violette knew that they had an open-company runner on their hands. They also had their eyes on the calendar. The Hopeful Stakes (gr. I), on Sept. 1, came up too quickly, especially because they wanted their horse to get a little more experience before moving him up.

New York at the Downs

"We wanted one more race before trying open company," explained Evans last summer, "although we would have preferred that it would not have been nine days after his first start."

So Evans and Violette took a shot, running their inexperienced ridgling back just nine days later on the inaugural Saratoga Showcase day for New Yorkbreds. He rewarded their confidence with another win, this one by a length in the appropriately named Funny Cide Stakes, closing from even farther back than he had in his first start.

Violette said that while Upstart was precocious from the start, he was beginning to realize what he had in his barn.

"That second start was pretty good," he said. "There were some nice horses in there, and the favorite (Bustin It) got loose on the lead. I thought we were going to be second until inside the sixteenth pole and he ran them down. It was pretty impressive."

Though still untested in open company, Upstart was poised off the Funny Cide win to step up in the Champagne Stakes (gr. I) at Belmont Park in early October. Facing off against the "buzz horse" Daredevil, he and that rival cleared the field, with Upstart settling for second 2½ lengths behind Daredevil but 12¾ lengths ahead of the third-place finisher.

After a third-place finish in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Santa Anita Park in November, Upstart was freshened in Florida.

The year before Violette's New Yorkbred Derby runner Samraat spent the winter of 2014 prepping at Aqueduct.

"We wanted to give Upstart a month

off and turn him out down there and let him graze in the sunshine," Violette explained shortly before this year's Derby. "We gave him a good four weeks off, walking the shed and turning him out. Hopefully, that will pay dividends."

And arguably it did: As

Violette pointed out, prior to the Kentucky Derby, only one horse had finished in front of Upstart in 2015—which doesn't mean that he lost only one race.

A dominant 5½-length victory over Godolphin Racing's Frosted in the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (gr. II) at Gulfstream Park in January, over a field that would yield three other Kentucky Derby starters sent Upstart to the Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (gr. II) in February as the odds-on favorite, a mantle that he seemingly lived up to when he crossed the wire first, 2¾ lengths ahead of Itsaknockout.

But after Luis Saez on Todd Pletcher-trained Itsaknockout lodged an objection about the stretch run, Upstart was taken down and placed second in the most controversial call by stewards since Bayern was left up in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I).

"Bad call," said Violette at the time. "It's disappointing. The horse ran great; we just don't get credit for it."

The even-money favorite in his next start, Upstart would be outdone by another Pletcher Derby hopeful, Materiality, in the Besilu Stables Florida Derby (gr. I), this time losing fair and square by 1½ lengths after a bruising stretch duel.

Upstart had attended the early pace under Jose Ortiz in both the Holy Bull and the Florida Derby, but had sat farther back in the Fountain of Youth.

"In those small fields or a two-horse race, sometimes you have to compromise," said Violette, "and certainly in both the Fountain of Youth and the Florida Derby, he had to launch his move at the half-mile pole to try to beat the horse in front of him. He had to engage early over that track to be in contention turning for home."

Still, other than his dissatisfaction with the Fountain of Youth disqualification, Violette was pleased with his horse's preparation and optimistic in the days before the Kentucky Derby.

"He's handled every racetrack he's been on, and I think he'll love Churchill," said Violette. "I think the dynamics of the race could suit him."

Expecting a swift pace that never materialized, Violette welcomed the opportunity for his horse to lie back and move when it suited him, not when he had to.

He was pleased at how Upstart had rebounded from a sinus infection that hit in mid-April, causing the horse to miss

a scheduled workout. He drilled bullets in his final two workouts before the race, both at Palm Meadows in Florida, having recovered quickly after a short course of antibiotics.

He went a half in :47.40 on April 17 and in his last move before shipping to Louisville went five furlongs in :59.95.

"He came back and breezed like a good horse," said Violette approvingly. "It put aside any doubts about running."

Having said before the Florida Derby that he welcomed any post except the far outside, Violette said that he'd virtually guaranteed that that's where he'd draw, and that is exactly what happened. And though he refused to express a post preference leading up to the Kentucky Derby, he again drew the far outside, originally in post 19 and then moving in two slot with the late scratches of El Kabeir and International Star to eventually break from the 17th.

"After being there last year (Samraat finished fifth), the logistics are a little bit easier; I had a fresh memory of where the hotels are, and the barns, and the best roads to get in and out.

"Everything else is pretty ramped up. We're used to be under a microscope in New York, and it's even more so during Derby week," he said. "I was reading that during the three hours on Saturday afternoon, 65% of the households in Louisville had Derby coverage on, 20% nationally. Those are huge numbers.

"The numbers were insane. When you

think about 300,000 people being there over a two-day period...and it felt like most of the 300,000 were making the walkover. It's an incredible, unbelievable experience, so you want to encourage people to participate in that, but there were some dangerous times, with people who aren't accustomed to being in close proximity to athletes on the way to the battlefield."

But despite the horse's brief illness and bad post, Violette made no excuses about Upstart's poor performance. Ortiz said after the race that Upstart had broken a step slow and gone a little wide early; at the quarter pole, he said, "I had no horse.

"I don't think he handled the track."

"He picked a real bad day not to run for us," said Violette ruefully. "He looked really uncomfortable coming up the lane.

The trainer praised Ortiz for taking care of the horse, easing him across the wire instead of trying to beat a horse or two; Upstart cooled out quickly, said Violette, and cleaned his feed tub that night.

"He was quite bright the next day," he said. "It's frustrating, to say the least."

Upstart will get the next few weeks off, enjoying the benefits of the hyperbaric chamber at WinStar Farm, which purchased an interest in the horse in mid-April. He'll skip the Preakness Stakes (gr. I) and the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) and point to a summer campaign at Saratoga, with Violette eyeing the Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. II), convinced that the Derby distance wasn't a problem.

By the afternoon of May 4, Violette's eye was fixed firmly forward, the weekend's disappointment behind him, though Violette did permit himself a moment of glumness.

"It was much worse this year because these are the head-scratchers. Other than getting uncomfortable getting dirt in his face, there are no obvious reasons," he said. "One of his hallmarks is that he lays it on the line; he always delivered. But you brought him over there and he didn't compete the way you expected him to. It's mind-blowing.

"It wasn't much fun," he acknowledged. "But we'll turn the page. He's all right."

NIELSEN NOT UPSET WITH UPSTART

Joanne Nielsen, the breeder of New York-bred Upstart, was disappointed with the outcome of the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) but had a great experience May 2 at Churchill Downs. She traveled to Louisville and went to the races with her children and other family members.

"I was disappointed with my guy. It was unexpected because he's been so 'with it,' " she said of Upstart's 18th-place finish. "However, my whole family—my children and cousins—were all there, and they couldn't have cared less because it was a thrill to take part in it. We had the privilege and that was fun.

"They were all animated and I was the one carefully watching the track. (continued on page 34)

There was a lot of togetherness. It was a very pleasant day, except I'm a worrier about my horse. But he's here to do it another day."

In Bedford, N.Y., near her Sunnyfield Farm, there was a party/reception for the Upstart team Derby night.

"All of my help was there, and they said nobody was really affected by the fact that he didn't win. The thrill was that he was there."

Nielsen has much more for which to be thankful than

her horse being in the Derby. In April she was hospitalized for 11 nights with viral pneumonia and was released just days before the Run for the Roses.

"I'm much better now," she reported. "I'm much better. They put me in the hospital with cardiac care food, and I don't know how they can make food taste like that. It takes a few good meals to get back on your feet. I'm home now, and I'm happy to be home."

And her horse will fight another day. By Evan Hammonds

INTERNATIONAL STAR SIDELINED FROM DERBY

Three New York-bred colts in the May 2 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) were reduced to two the morning of the race when Ken and Sarah Ramsey's International Star was withdrawn from the race by trainer Mike Maker due to some issues with quarter cracks.

On May 5 a hairline fracture was discovered in the colt's left knee. He will now spend the next three months in rehab. The scratch was a blow to the connections in Louisville and to Katharine Voss and Robert Manfuso, who bred International Star.

"Stuff happens," said Manfuso from Chanceland Farm in Maryland. "We were disappointed he didn't get a shot to show his stuff; that's about all I can say."

Of course, they still watched the Run for the Roses.

"I must say I'm impressed with

American Pharoah," Manfuso said. "He's quite a horse."

International Star is quite a horse himself. The points leader heading into the Run for the Roses, the son of Fusaichi Pegasus—Parlez, by French Deputy, came to Louisville riding a three-race win streak, having taken all three stakes for 3-year-old males at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.


Prior to the Derby, Voss and Manfuso were excited about his prospects.

"It's been a delight because a lot of people know that our crew here did an incredible job of raising a potential star as a yearling," Manfuso said. "What I like to remind people is, by the way, he's a New York-bred. So Doug Koch up there at Berkshire Stud had to get him on the ground safe and sound."

Active in the Mid-Atlantic region, Voss and Manfuso saw how the Maryland product was not doing so well, so they opted to have Parlez foal in New York to take advantage of the program, and they wanted to breed her to then New York-based stallion Girolamo.

"We thought a New York-bred might be worth a few dollars more than a Maryland-bred," Manfuso said. "He's a New York-bred that was raised in Maryland. It's a real East Coast phenomenon.

"It's interesting that you are starting to see the regional-bred product bring some serious change," he said. "That's



a reflection of the improved quality of the programs in those states."

They sold International Star for \$85,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern fall yearling sale. He's earned \$1,010,979 while making eight of his nine starts in open company and has run in seven graded stakes.

While he didn't get a chance to show his best in the Kentucky Derby, International Star will hopefully get an opportunity to shine in the not too distance future.








TENCENDUR

Fun While It Lasted

Owner/breeder Phil Birsh has a good time wherever he goes

PHIL BIRSH STOOD OUTSIDE Barn 42 within earshot of his homebred New York-bred Tencendur a few days before the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), a big smile creasing his face as he greeted well-wishers. After nearly 25 years of breeding and racing Thoroughbreds off his farm near the small towns of Charlton and Galway, N.Y., just west of Saratoga Springs, Birsh was drinking in every moment and expansively explaining his philosophy.

The head of *Playbill* magazine, which was passed on to him by his father, Birsh knows success in business as well as horses, and his formula is simple if all too rare.

"You just have to have fun," Birsh said. "I'm not a guy who is going to tell my trainer what to do or tell the jockey how to ride the race. What I like to do is reduce the level of stress. I think people perform better when they're relaxed. So my pre-race instructions to the jockey are to go out there and have fun." Birsh did just that with his colt by Warrior's Reward—Still Secret, by Hennessy. A 17-hand giant, Tencendur opened this season with a victory in the mud at Aqueduct and then ran competitively in the Withers Stakes (fourth in the gr. III) and Gotham Stakes (fifth in the gr. III) before running second to Frosted in the TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (gr. I), earning enough points for the trip to Louisville. Tencendur has the talent; his mind has just been a little slow to catch up to the rest of

"Well, he seems to invent ways to lose races as he goes along," said Birsh, who enjoys topping off each of his thoughts with a punch line. "His first race, last year, he didn't change leads. His first race this year he changed leads because he had to come through a small opening that scared him into changing leads. The next two races he didn't feel the need to change leads. And in the Wood he changed leads, made the front, and proceeded to slow down immediately because he didn't know what to do. So he's found some good ways to lose so far.

"If the light goes on, we'll have something really fun to watch. I don't want to

pretend I knew all along he was going to turn into a good horse. I manage him the same way I manage all the others—give them to people I trust to work with them."

Tencendur wound up having to endure a rough trip in the Kentucky Derby, being batted around leaving the gate in what unfortunately is an annual ritual for many of the participants.

"A bunch of horses got creamed, and with us being in Post 4, we weren't going to escape that nutcracker," said Birsh. "We had a bad trip. That's life. It's the Derby. You get what you get."

But the result of seeing Tencendur run off the board didn't negate the Derby experience for Birsh and his family and friends.

"My family was overwhelmed by the experience," Birsh related. "Those that did the walkover were truly enchanted and thrilled by the sheer pageantry and the joy of the process. To walk along with your horse and wave and say hello to people who are wishing you well, it was so dramatic and good theater. It's a true cultural phenomenon, and I loved it. And we had a great crew there."


The Birsh team includes trainer George Weaver, farm manager Mike Tobin, who has been with Birsh for 25

years; Idle Hour Farm owner David Hager, who suggested the mating that produced Tencendur; and Wayne Mackey, who broke the horse in Kentucky.

Birsh, now in his mid-50s, spent the first five years of his life in the upstate New York town of Staatsburg before his family moved to the Bronx. He became a regular at Aqueduct after falling in love with horses at an early age. He began his small breeding operation in the early 1990s. Stakes-placed homebred Dahl was his first winner. He then bred Polly Jo, a Virginia Rapids filly who became a stakes winner. He bought his farm in 2005 and keeps a half-dozen broodmares there.

Birsh spent \$17,000 at the 2005 Keeneland January mixed sale for Still Secret, who was in foal to Boundary. He bred the mare back to Mayakovsky, a stallion he had purchased, and got Mother Russia, who won six stakes races for New York-breds and earned \$528,996. Unfortunately, Birsh had sold Mother Russia as a weanling to trainer Linda Rice for \$21,000.

"I showed my horsemanship by not thinking very much of her and thus selling her," Birsh said. In addition to her stellar race career, Mother Russia's first foal is the Tapit colt Golden Barows, who has

won the Hyacinth Stakes in Japan and placed third in the U.A.E. Derby Sponsored by Saeed & Mohammed Al Naboodah Group (UAE-II) and has earned nearly a half-million dollars to date.

"It's not a real science," Birsh said of his operation. "We can afford to put two new horses in training a year, and we try and sell the rest. It's more art and hobby. If we were to really refer to this as a business, you could say we're not very good at it."

Birsh was smart enough to hold on to Tencendur, who is named after King Charlemagne's war horse in the French Epic "La Chanson de Roland." Birsh's wife is of French descent, so he named the horse as a homage to her. Birsh is prideful of his home state and the strides New York has made to entice breeders and owners.

"We foal in New York always," he said. "We are big believers in the New York program, which has been great for us and has proved to be great in providing jobs for a lot of people in the state. We are so happy to support it.

"We have so many options now for Tencendur, both New York-bred and open company. Dirt or grass. And wherever he runs, he gets to go into the paddock with his Derby blanket. So we have that going for us.

"We're always going to have fun. This sport is filled with characters and it's a wonderful brew and then we get to see the horses run."

Big Brown landed at Michael Lischin and Anya Sheckley's Dutchess Views Farm near Pine Plains for the holiday season and was greeted with some fanfare. The *Wall Street Journal* was there to record his arrival and has done articles about Big Brown in New York. Cohen and Tolchin had ample reason for choosing Dutchess Views. They already stood Heavy Breathing, their full brother to Frost Giant, at the nursery.

"Michael Lischin has done a super job with Heavy Breathing, and we appreciate the way he has handled Heavy Breathing," Cohen said. "He covered 30 mares and got 28 foals. Michael is a great guy and has a great team, and we're very happy with them."

Cohen and Tolchin are also happy that Big Brown's first big horse has come around just in time for the 2015 breeding season, and his book has taken flight as a result. Dortmund (Big Brown-Our Josephina), large in stature and talent, just like his sire, has mowed down the competition in California since making his debut the day after last year's Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Park. Dortmund topped off his 2-year-old season with a victory in the Los Alamitos Futurity (gr. I) and picked right back up in his 3-year-old campaign, sweeping the Robert B. Lewis Stakes (gr. III), San Felipe Stakes (gr. II), and Santa Anita Derby (gr. I). Shipped to Louisville for the May 2 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), Dortmund was the 4-1 second choice for the Run for the Roses and ran a gallant third behind stablemate American Pharoah and Firing Line while dictating the tempo for a mile. He has won six of seven starts and has earned \$1,489,400.

Taking Flight

Big Brown's progeny hit it big just as he comes to New York


TIMING CAN BE EVERYTHING, and New York received quite a gift when Big Brown arrived in the Empire State last Christmas Eve to continue a stud career that had started in 2009 after the dual classic winner was retired from the races. His immediate female family wasn't setting the world on fire, and despite his sterling accomplishments on the track, Big Brown never quite made his mark while at Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Ky.

"It didn't seem like Kentucky really opened its arms to him," said Andrew Cohen, who, along with his partner Gary Tolchin, were part of the team that raced

Big Brown. "And then he didn't get out of the gate as quickly as we'd hoped. I've always loved the horse, and I think he should be considered among the best racehorses of his era."

Cohen and Tolchin own the majority of Big Brown as far as his Northern Hemisphere stud activity and worked on finding a new home for the son of Boundary—Mien, by Nureyev.

"We were trying to get Big Brown to New York for some time," Cohen said. "My thinking was because of the various state programs here, New York was

"When we got Big Brown to New York, our initial goal was 60-80 mares this year," said Bishop. "Then Dortmund hit, and we bumped it up to 80-100. But then Dortmund kept going, and so did the bookings. It's beyond our expectations. We've booked 120 mares and have a dozen more contracts out there. We will be over 130.

"There are a lot of mares in this area that have Storm Cat on the bottom (Our Josephina is by Storm Cat's son Tale of the Cat) so a lot of people are excited about that cross and they're jumping all over it, which is a good thing. We have some proof now that it works."

There is more to Big Brown than just Dortmund. In fact, the sire also had a Longines Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) starter with his daughter Puca. Puca, who is campaigned by Donegal Racing, finished second in the Gazelle Stakes (gr. I) to Condo Commando. Apollo Sonic, co-bred by Cohen and IEAH, earned \$921,469 before his career was cut short by injury. He ran second in the TV Tokyo Hai Aoba Sho (Jpn-II) and third in the Tokyo Yushun (Japan Derby, Jpn-I). Last year Ground Transport won the Drosselmeyer Stakes and the Harrison E. Johnson Memorial Stakes and has banked \$327,059. Red Sashay, bred by Cohen and Tolchin, won last year's Our Dear Peggy Stakes on turf. This year Special Ops broke his maiden at about a mile by 5¼ lengths.

"He's had nice horses," said Bishop, "including some who have run well on turf. But the big knock on him is that he didn't have the standout marquee horse who could go two turns. You don't want to rely on just one horse, but Dortmund is important because he now is that standout horse and people want to jump on the bandwagon. That's how it works. It's a funny business."

This year Big Brown has yielded a crop of 92 registered Northern Hemisphere 2-year-olds, which will be his largest

to date. It is important that his older horses and now these 2-year-olds perform well because he will have limited crops getting to the races for the next two years. In 2013 he bred only 52 mares in Kentucky, and in 2014 that shrunk even further to 46 mares.

"We have to hope that the past few crops keep running and get better and keep the excitement alive," Bishop noted. "We definitely will have a lull after that. But Dortmund has helped set the tone. We're very excited. It's nice to have a stallion in New York whose son placed in a classic.

"So much of this is luck. It depends on what farm raises the horse, who breaks him, and which trainer gets him. Bob Baffert has done a great job keeping him together. You have to be involved with good people all around. It's such a long chain of events with people caring for the horses."

And it's been a fortuitous chain of events that brought Big Brown to New York at just the right time.

"It's starting to become fun again," said Cohen. "It's an exciting time." 🔊

In fact, that's how he came to acquire Possessed, a 3-year-old son of Posse, out of the Mr. Greeley mare, Ibetyouwishyouknew. The colt was the ultra-game winner of the \$100,000 Times Square Division of the New York Stallion Stakes April 26 at Aqueduct.

"The horse was given to me by the breeder (Grapestock)," said Baker, a native of Jamaica who immigrated to the United States in 1986. "This was a horse that had (physical) problems as a baby. So they couldn't get it to a sale. But it was a good horse for me from that point of view."

Since that time, Dan Hayden has come aboard as co-owner of the colt. Baker's good fortune continued when the breeders nominated Possessed to the NYSS.

"I wasn't even sure he was eligible for this race. I received him as a yearling and (Grapestock, which is under the Vinery umbrella) nominated him as a baby. So I really lucked into a lot with this horse," said Baker. "I like Posse. He's been a great sire. I've actually bred a couple of mares to him myself."

One thing Baker didn't luck into was the phenomenal training job he did with Possessed, who was com-

ing into the Times Square Division on only 16 days of rest since his last race—a second-place finish against open company in a starter allowance.

Away from the starting gate in the quality field of five state-bred runners, Possessed, beneath jockey Jose Ortiz, tracked the early pace from the outside while racing in second.

After an opening half-mile in :46.16 in the 6½-furlong race, Possessed surged to the front entering the Aqueduct stretch. Then, with an eighth of a mile remaining, a pair of runners mounted stiff challenges to his lead. Possessed had a reserve of speed and the resolve to turn back both Organic Gemini and Disco Partner through the final stages.

Possessed hit the wire in 1:17.32. The victory was his second from seven starts, 2-3-1, boosting his earnings to \$134,950.

Posse, a son of Silver Deputy, currently stands at Lere Visagie's Rockridge Stud near Hudson.

As Ortiz guided his mount into the Aqueduct winner's circle, he called out to Baker, "Charlton, I need to ride more often for you."

That sentiment is a reflection of the kind of success that Charlton Baker has had on the NYRA circuit this year.

"My father (Carl Baker) was a trainer back in Jamaica (and in the U.S.)," said Baker, who went out on his own at Finger Lakes in 1997 after an apprenticeship with trainer Mike Ferraro Sr. "My father taught me to have patience with horses and a lot about leg work. I've been around horses since I was very young. My father actually worked for 'The Chief' (the late Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens). That was his idol, and he used to tell me all kinds of stories about working for him."


Turtle Bird Stable's homebred Organic Gemini, a son of Sir Whimsey, put in a serious bid through the stretch and closed willingly for second. Patricia A. Generazio's Disco Partner, a homebred son of Disco Rico, was third.

Park Avenue

Harvey Weinstein of Turtle Bird Stable campaigned Sir Whimsey, the grade II-winning son of Jump Start, who now stands at Mill Creek Farm near Saratoga Springs. Along with Toby Sheets, he bred the mare Control Issue (by Officer) to Sir Whimsey. That pairing resulted

in the gritty and determined 3-year-old filly Take Issue, winner of the \$100,000 Park Avenue Division of the New York Stallion Stakes later on the April 26 program. Take Issue is co-owned by Sheets and ZBS Thoroughbreds.

"It's all about the sire. It's all about (Sir) Whimsey," said Weinstein. "He

was a great racehorse, a grade II winner (Gulfstream Park Handicap in 2008). Unfortunately his career was (sidetracked) due to injury. He could have been a Kentucky Derby (gr. I) horse. It's all about his heart. That's what he passes down (to his offspring). Nobody ever passed (Sir) Whimsey in the stretch."

Early on in the 6½-furlong contest, Take Issue settled smartly into fifth position tracking the first two flights of horses through a contested opening quarter-mile in :23.48 beneath jockey Junior Alvarado.

After a snappy half-mile in :45.98, Alvarado put Take Issue into the game. The rider executed a deft inside-out move that vaulted the filly into fourth-position turning into the stretch while gathering serious momentum.

The pair found a seam in the fourpath as they straightened away into

Tri-Bone Stables' Effinex, bred in New York by Dr. Russell Cohen, was a strong winner of the April 25 Excelsior Stakes (gr. III) at Aqueduct.

"Two turns and then an impressive burst of speed. Watching him go from the quarter pole to the wire is very cool to see. That's how (Mineshaft) did it," said Cohen. "(Effinex's) dam, What a Pear (winner of the Busher Stakes and Wistful

Stakes), was extremely fast. She just glided when she raced. She brought speed and depth to his pedigree, soundness, an unbelievable amount of DNA, and the desire to be a good racehorse."

the lane. After a short series of righthanded encouragement, Alvarado began to pump and drive, motivating the filly beneath a strong and energetic hand-ride.

Take Issue drew clear of her rivals in the final furlong with powerful, succinct strides. She was clear of her closest competition by 1¼ lengths on the wire.

Take Issue stopped the clock in 1:18.15. The filly captured her third race from four starts for the Steve Asmussen barn, increasing her earnings to \$114,850.




