



An Open Letter to the NYS Gaming Commission

THE following text is from a letter, dated April 21, to Robert Williams, executive director of the New York State Gaming Commission. The recent New York State budget agreement permits 1,000 video lottery terminals assigned to Nassau County Off-Track Betting Corp., to be operated by Resorts World Casino at Aqueduct, of which no revenue will go to purses, breeders, or the New York Racing Association.

As you know, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders (NYTB) and the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA) represent a majority of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in New York State and the Thoroughbred owners and trainers competing at the New York Racing Association tracks. We are writing to jointly express our serious concerns with Part SS of S.6409-C/A.9009-C of the recently enacted New York State budget.

Part SS will authorize Resorts World Casino to place and operate 1,000 of Nassau County Off-Track Betting Corporation (OTB) video lottery terminal (VLT) machines at Aqueduct Racetrack. NYTB and NYTHA were not part of the negotiations leading up to this agreement, and we have serious concerns and questions on the impact of this deal on our organizations and more importantly on the Thoroughbred industry itself in New York State.

It is our understanding that the New York State Gaming Commission will have to approve the Term Sheet agreement between Genting New York, which operates Resorts World, and Nassau County OTB. While the Gaming Commission is undertaking its review of the Term Sheet, NYTB and NYTHA urge the Gaming Commission to carefully review the following issues and concerns:

• Will Resorts World be transferring any current VLT machines to Nassau OTB to get the program up and running? Or will they install new Resorts World machines for Nassau OTB? The issue of concern to NYTB & NYTHA is that transferring current Resorts World machines to Nassau OTB will have an immediate negative impact on the Thoroughbred Breeding Fund (the Fund) and Horsemen's purses.

- If any current Resorts World VLT machines are being transferred to Nassau OTB, will there be any requirement for the machines to be transferred back to Resorts World after a period of time?
- Will there be a requirement on Nassau OTB to market the new machines and lure customers to Resorts World to help increase overall attendance at Resorts World?

NYTB & NYTHA understand the complexity of this agreement and the possibility that it could potentially have a positive impact on the Fund and purses in the long run, if overall attendance increases and Resorts World is able to use the new capital acquisition funds to make capital improvements that draw more visitors. However, our organizations are respectfully requesting that the Gaming Commission share a copy of the Term Sheet with our organizations, and consider the concerns outlined above during your review of the Term Sheet. We would be glad to meet with you at your earliest convenience to discuss these issues further.

Thank you in advance of this request, and please do not hesitate to contact either of us if you need further information.

SUDDEN SURPRISE REBOUNDS IN TIMES SQUARE

Mike Repole's homebred Sudden Surprise, by Giant Surprise, a four-time stakes winner last year at 2, bounced back from a runner-up effort in the Feb. 6 Gander Stakes and a poor outing in the Jimmy Winkfield Stakes March 6 with a score in the \$100,000 Times Square division of the New York Stallion Stakes April 24 at Aqueduct.

Out of the More Than Ready mare Ready and Good, Sudden Surprise has earned \$498,800 in nine starts. He was foaled at Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater.

Godolphin's Libreta Surprises in the Park Avenue at 13-1

Libreta, a 3-year-old daughter from the first crop of former New York sire Girolamo bred by Darley and foaled in Kentucky, pulled off a 13-1 score in the April 23 Park Avenue division of the New York Stallion Stakes at Aqueduct. The winner is the first foal out of Enrichment, by Ghostzapper. Girolamo stood his first two seasons at Sequel Stallions New York. He is 10th on the leading second-crop sire list. His 2016 fee at Darley is \$15,000.

EFFINEX STARS IN OAKLAWN 'CAP

Effinex, the 2015 New York-bred horse of the year, continued he proved to be among the leaders in the handicap division with a victory April 16 in the \$750,000 Oaklawn Handicap (gr. II).

Bred by Dr. Russell Cohen and raced by his mother Bernice's Tri-Bone Stables, Effinex won last fall's Clark Handicap (gr. I) after running second to American Pharoah in the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I). His \$2,682,950 in career earnings is third all-time for a New York-bred behind dual classic winner and champion Funny Cide and A Shin Forward (raced in Japan).

Returned to trainer Jimmy Jerkens' barn at Belmont Park, the year's long-term goal remains the Breeders' Cup Classic which will be run at Santa Anita Park in November. Effinex was third in the March 12 Santa Anita Handicap (gr. I).

OBS Spring: NY-Bred Median Outperforms Market

The final figures for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds showed the market remained steady in 2016. Figures for both the number sold and gross fell slightly more than 3%, the average was up a tick—from 78,982 to \$79,211—and the median rose 4.4% from \$45,000 to \$47,000.

Seventy-three New York-breds were offered at the four day sale (April 19-22), of whom 51 sold. The New York-bred average was \$68,627, and the median, \$50,000, outpaced the overall market.

The top-priced New York-bred, a son of Majesticperfection—Magic Belle, by Gold Case, went to Eric Fein for \$450,000 from the consignment of RiceHorse Stables.



2016 LEADING SIRES IN NEW YORK

For stallions that stand, will stand, or stood (deceased) in New York (stallions that are dead or exported prior to 2012 are excluded), and have runners in North America. Listed below are all available statistics for the Northern Hemisphere through April 24, 2016. As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2015 is \$21,782 or 50% of the 2015 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 50% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 57%. Current year stakes winners include all N.H.-black-type stakes results from all available countries. *Foal counts include Southern Hemisphere. Cumulative stakes winners includes all countries. NYRA offers big purses, bonuses on 2-year-old races this summer at Belmont Park

Quick on the Draw

THE EMPIRE STATE'S LUCRATIVE breeding program continues to build on its already solid foundation with its newest incentive mission that specifically targets maiden 2-year-old New York-breds competing at New York Racing Association tracks.

With the seasonal start of 2-year-old racing in April at Aqueduct, owners and trainers of New York-breds who participate in those races—open or restricted maiden-special-weight events—are eligible for bonuses, above and beyond what they earn in purse money. This incentive program will continue through Belmont Park's spring/summer meet, which concludes July 17.

Owners and trainers of New York-bred runners who finish in the top three will be on the

receiving end of the bonuses. The winning owner will collect \$9,000 for a victory; \$4,500 for a second-place finish; and \$2,500 for third. The structure for trainers of New York-breds finishing in the top three is as follows: \$4,000 for first; \$3,000 for second; and \$2,000 for third.

These incentives reflect a collaboration between NYRA and the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund Corp., which has ponied up \$200,000 to help pay the \$25,000 award available per race.

Jeffrey Cannizzo, the executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders and a non-voting member of NYRA's board of directors, said the bonus is illustrative of a continued desire among New York industry leaders to strengthen the overall 2-year-old New York-bred program.


In 2014 NYRA added a handful of New York-bred stakes for juveniles to its schedule. The addition of those races brought the annual total of 2-year-old stakes opportunities for state-breds at NYRA tracks to 14, with available purses of \$2.15 million.

It is hoped this latest initiative will help increase field size for those stakes.

"In 2014 with (NYRA's senior vice president of racing operations) Martin Panza's help and NYRA's support, we bumped up the 2-year-old stakes program for New York-breds," Cannizzo said. "In doing so, and running those new stakes, we saw that participation was good, but we wanted to continue to improve upon that. We needed to get more horses out there—entering and running and breaking their maidens and pointing toward the stakes (continued on page 24)

program, which helps everybody. One way to do so was coming up with this bonus structure, which created an incentive for both the owners and trainers to enter their 2-year-old New York-breds who are ready to run."

Although it's early days, the intent behind the concept appears to be working with regard to New York-bred participation. The first two races carded for 2-year-olds at Aqueduct drew a combined 11 entrants, six of them New York-breds. Those two maiden races were open company events and each carried a \$100,000 purse.

The idea for offering the hefty purse was a creation of Panza's to bolster field size in open 2-year-old races. There are a total of six \$100,000 open company races offered for 2-year-old maidens in the lead-up to the first of the open juvenile stakes to be run at NYRA this year, the \$200,000 Astoria Stakes and \$200,000 Tremont Stakes, set for June 9 and June 10, respectively, at Belmont Park. The

initial restricted stakes of 2016, the \$125,000 Rockville Centre Stakes and \$125,000 Lynbrook Stakes, will be run July 16 and 17, respectively.

The beauty of it for the connections of 2-year-old New York-bred maidens is that they can run for these larger purses in open company or, if they pre-

fer, compete for a \$60,000 purse offered to state-breds. In either scenario the \$25,000 bonus award money per race is offered to the owners and trainers of New York-breds who finish in the top three.

"We looked at it two-fold," Panza said of the new incentives for New York-breds and the \$100,000 purses. "The \$100,000 races are for open horses, but obviously the New York-breds can compete. If we're going to do something for open horses, we asked ourselves, what can

we do for the New York-breds as well? We've obviously set up stakes races for 2-year-old New York-breds and there is pretty significant money there. The thought process is: Listen, you've spent two or three years raising this horse to get it to the races. You've bought a mare and waited for the gestation period and now you have this horse on the ground, and here's another two years to get it to the races. I want to get money into that breeder's or owner's hand as quickly as possible. If you want to run early, I'm try-

ing to get some money into your pocket, so you can go out and buy another mare or pay another stud fee."

New York-breds, Cannizzo said, accounted for 47% of all starts on the NYRA circuit in 2015. With that kind of representation, NYRA is invested in providing a well-rounded racing program to the stakeholders of the regional program.

"State-breds play an important role and are a huge part of our starters per year,

and while we (operate) the racetracks, we also want the farms to prosper, to have more farms, and more state-breds," Panza said. "That in turn creates more jobs for the state of New York, and is a good thing for the whole industry. We try to look at things not only from what is good for our handle and what is good for our immediate business, but what also helps us long term. And long term is how do we help to create more farms, more jobs, and grow the industry in our state. The state-bred program is designed to

make that happen."


To that end, NYRA's 2016 spring and summer state-bred stakes schedule is highlighted by two very important days for New York-breds. New York's homegrown product once again will headline the Memorial Day card at Belmont Park, May 30. The Big Apple Showcase Day features six stakes, worth a total of \$900,000 in purses. The third annual New York Showcase Day at Saratoga will be held Aug. 26, the day before the centerpiece of the meet, the Travers Stakes (gr. I), and offers six stakes, worth \$1.15 million. The Memorial Day and Travers eve programs were added to the schedule in recent years because of the long-standing popularity of Empire Showcase Day, which is traditionally conducted during Belmont Park's fall meet.

"A handful of years ago we had just one showcase day and now we have three," Cannizzo said. "We have an entire stakes program in the state that is worth more than \$8.5 million dollars, which has continued to grow as well. Perhaps a showcase day that occurs at the Aqueduct meet would round out the entire program nicely. I personally want to see the New York Stallion Stakes Series expanded in the terms of the interest and the participation because it benefits the stallion population and is good for breeders here in the state. There are little bits and pieces we can continue to grow on, improve and make better, but I think the foundation is right here. You can't build a wall without a foundation, and that's what we've started. The quality (of New York-breds) continues to improve, which is probably the most important part of all of this."



Wonderment, winning Turfway Park's grade III Bourbonette Oaks April 2

Mike Landers produces his first graded stakes winner from a mare no one wanted **MIKE LANDERS KNOWS** the long odds he faces trying to make money as a breeder with one mare. However, a combination of good fortune, associations with quality horsemen, and the growth of New York's incentive program has made the Maryland accountant's second foray into breeding exceed all expectations.

On April 2 Landers bred his first graded stakes winner when the 3-year-old filly Wonderment, by Cosmonaut, won the Bourbonette Oaks (gr. III) at Turfway Park. The filly is trained by Kenny McPeek and co-owned by Sherri McPeek's Magdalena Racing and Chris Sterbenz.

Landers nearly walked away from the Thoroughbred business entirely in 2009. He had just sold a handful of mares he'd accumulated since 2004 because the expenses were getting out-of-control for Landers' one-man operation.

"I forced myself out of the business and was going back to a normal life," Landers said.

Fortune is a fickle creature. It worked against Landers when he liquidated his stock right as the world was staggered into the Great Recession. Then he found himself at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic mixed sale in December 2009 where he saw a lot of quality mares not bringing any bids due to the rocky economy.

"I don't know what made me do it, but I went there despite my own personal experience," Landers said. "I saw mares basically being given away, and a filly caught my eye. Physically she was very nice, and she was a half sister to a stakes-placed mare named Mama Ella, which is what my kids called my mother."

For \$1,000 Landers ended up taking home A Wonder She Is, a winning daugh-

ter of Three Wonders in foal to Senor Swinger.

A Wonder She Is had won twice and placed twice in eight starts when trainer Joe Orseno claimed her for \$50,000 at Gulfstream Park. He shipped A Wonder She Is to California because he thought she would thrive on the then-Polytrack surface at Santa Anita Park, but the filly got hurt during training and never started again. Because A Wonder She Is' owners were not interested in breeding, they sold her carrying her second foal by Senor Swinger.

Now back in the breeding business, Landers began shopping hard for the right state-bred program.

"I was always looking for the best program because as a small-time regional breeder, these programs allow me to sustain myself and stay in the game without necessarily having a big horse," he said. Initially Landers looked to Pennsylvania because the Maryland program was not advancing as quickly as he had hoped. He bred A Wonder She Is to Ecclesiastic (by Pulpit) in order to preserve the Pennsylvania-bred status of her second Senor Swinger foal, a gelding named Papa Doc whom Orseno raced. After the mare slipped, Landers suddenly had more options.

For the third mating Landers chose Closing Argument at Millennium Farms in Kentucky but foaled the mare in New York, where he saw a program getting ready to boom due to the opening of Genting's Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct in October 2011.

"The New York tracks were a different story than running at Laurel or Penn National or Parx," Landers said. "The purses they were offering certainly got me interested. The other part is that I wanted to get in before everyone was going to get in; I wanted to get in a year or two ahead."

His biggest concern at the time about entering the New York market was whether he would find a stallion that would suit A Wonder She Is.

"I didn't have any contacts or people I was comfortable doing business with, and I didn't have her up there long enough to be a resident mare, so I had to breed her back to a New York stal-

lion," Landers said. He did not have to worry long.

"When I saw Cosmonaut, that was the ticket," he said. Landers had become a fan of Lemon Drop Kid, Cosmonaut's sire, during an earlier visit to Lane's End Farm in Central Kentucky. Cosmonaut, raced by Flying Zee Stable, won four graded stakes and was twice grade I-placed.

"I was a big fan of Lemon Drop Kid, and I respected Cosmonaut as a race-horse, quite frankly. The bonus that put it over the top was that he was inbred to Seattle Slew, which I wanted to introduce into the pedigrees."

Cosmonaut is inbred 3x3 to Seattle Slew while A Wonder She Is has an additional strain of Hail to Reason through Halo on her dam's side. Wonderment was the result of that mating.

"She was a classy baby who had it all from day one," remembered Anne Morgan, who owns Mill Creek Farm near Stillwater, N.Y., where Landers boards A Wonder She Is. "Mike was so excited because he studies pedigrees, and this is a cross he really, really liked."

Once again Landers is weighing his options regarding stallions. This year he has the option of going to Kentucky and is flirting with the idea of breeding A Wonder She Is to Lemon Drop Kid. Or, he might go back to Cosmonaut. Either way he goes, the mare will definitely foal in New York.

"Really, the key to the whole New

York program is the owners," Landers said. "In New York you have a large number of New York owners whose intent is to race in New York. As a breeder, it is a luxury to know I'm likely to get a fair price because they are willing to spend the money and, secondly, I can be comforted it's going to race a high percentage of its races in New York. I wanted to at least break even on the foals; then my success is determined on how I do with any breeders money. If you get those bonuses and are able to make money in the game, then you can increase the quality of your stock.

"New York is the complete program that feeds itself."

Though Wonderment turned out to be a stand-out foal, Landers stuck with his plan and offered her as a weanling through the Fasig-Tipton New York fall mixed sale as part of Sally Thomas' consignment. She sold for \$24,000 to Baccari Bloodstock.

"With what had happened before, I wanted to be cautious," Landers said. "She was completely balanced and racy from day one, but I didn't want to spend the up-front money getting her to the races. I want to keep in the game."

She was later bought back as a yearling for \$47,000 and ended up in the hands of McPeek, whose Magdalena Racing co-owns the filly with north Virginia resident Sterbenz. While Sterbenz was looking for a place to keep his horses, he saw a picture of A Wonder She Is

on the Cordelia Stable website. He called Cordelia, where Landers has sometimes boarded his mare, to let them know he owned Wonderment and through the farm got connected with Landers.

"We talk all the time now, texting back and forth about racing and ideas," said Landers. "I'm back, in a way, as part of the team, so it's nice. Even though I'm not racing her, I'm clued in on what's going on with her."

Landers marvels at what's come from his modest investment a little over six years ago in a single mare no one else wanted.

"After everything bottomed out, things started to turn around, and now I'm really enjoying it," Landers said. "I've loved (Wonderment) from the day she was born, and it is really beyond anything I could imagine."



Phipps'
New York
Legacy

Ogden Mills 'Dinny' Phipps: 1940-2016

Led The Jockey Club, Breeders' Cup, and was CEO of NYRA from 1976-83 **OGDEN MILLS "DINNY" PHIPPS**, continuing a family tradition now in its fifth generation, had an enormous influence on Thoroughbred racing both as the head of his family's Phipps Stable and as a chairman and board member of prominent industry organizations such as The Jockey Club, Breeders' Cup, and National Thoroughbred Racing Association. But the native New Yorker also played a larger-thanlife role in his home state as chairman and CEO of the New York Racing Association from 1976 to 1983, and as a board member for decades after that.

We asked those closest to him—the people with whom he worked during his days at NYRA—to share their thoughts about Phipps, who died April 6 at age 75.

David Stevenson (NYRA director of racing and vice president of racing):

"Dinny and his father came up to Woodbine, where I was general manager, to run horses in the Canadian International Championship, which is where I got to know them. They were a remarkable family. Their lives were dedicated to horse racing, and they did everything they could to maintain the quality in every aspect of it.

"When I joined NYRA in the late '70s, it was in a bit of a dip. The racing quality had deteriorated, and we faced a serious strike by the pari-mutuel clerks union. It was a difficult time. Dinny told me to bring ingenuity to the job, and he was good to his word. We traveled around the world to see what other venues were present-

ing. We insisted to the board that we open up Saratoga for training purposes, which freed up 900 stalls at Belmont Park when it was racing.

"New York-breds were on the upswing, and together we did away with claiming races restricted to state-breds. And that really helped with the program. We also increased European participation to nominate to our stakes and come across, which was good for the sport.

"He was high-quality-minded. He insisted racing be presented in the best light, and believed that people would be attracted to the quality and the wagering would follow. The sport's interests were served by the roles he played at NYRA and The Jockey Club."

Gerard McKeon (NYRA president):

"The thing that impressed me the most about Dinny was that he was one of the wealthiest guys in the world and didn't have to work, but he worked his fanny off as the head of NYRA simply to return something to the sport. He was instrumental in getting the NYRA franchise extended by the state because the politicians in Albany respected him, not only for his wealth but for his intellect and dedication to the sport. They listened to him, and I'd seen them ignore plenty of other people.

"He was impressive with his knowledge of the sport and his fortitude in plugging away to get things done in Albany, which wasn't easy.

"We also had about a half-dozen labor contracts coming due in my time, and he worked with us behind the scenes to help get things done."

Steven Duncker (NYRA chairman):

"Dinny was on the board the entire time I was chairman, and he was always someone I could count on to have a perspective that was steeped in the history and tradition of New York racing.

"The industry in New York couldn't have survived unless it was run in a very businesslike manner, and Dinny was a great businessman.

"When we would be presented with a problem and thought that it hadn't been

solved before, he was there to tell us we've faced these problems before and NYRA had come through them by doing what is best for racing, and he always kept that as a central tenet of how we needed to think of things.

"Dealing with the unions is a key part of running NYRA, and he was always helpful on how to deal with them because he had gone through the same things when he was chairman. He would compromise up to a point, and then he wouldn't, which I think is the right way to approach any negotiation.

"There wasn't a better person to get counsel from."

Tom Bancroft Jr. (NYRA chairman):

"The day Ruffian broke down Dinny and I ended up in the operating room watching the attempt to save her life. She was owned by the Janneys, who were Dinny's aunt and uncle. After that episode Dinny made an extreme effort to get a horse hospital that was available to NYRA and the whole racing industry in the state.

"We saw eye-to-eye on most issues. We worked for a long time on the NYRA franchise extension. We tried to get takeout lowered, which we were not successful on. We both felt strongly

about getting drugs out of the sport as much as possible, and we sought ways to get more fans to the track.

"He was interested in everything. He was a fine family man and was fun to be around, with a good sense of humor."

Lenny Hale (NYRA racing secretary, vice president, and senior vice president):

"Dinny was always looking for a better way to do things. Not everyone agreed with all his decisions, but over time they've proved out. When the industry didn't have control over its data, Dinny took the proverbial bull by the horns and got that going; now we depend on that. He had great vision.

"I had terrific experiences with the entire family. His father, who used to be called The Big O, was a gentleman always. Dinny was very low-key, and he always put somebody else first and made sure everybody was comfortable with what was going on.

"I remember talking to his father, who was getting on in years, up in Saratoga one day. Dinny came up to me afterward and was worried whether his father was being rude to me, and I told him his father was a perfect gentleman. But it shows you that he was even worried about that."

Nancy Kelly (executive director of The Jockey Club Safety Net Foundation; director of development of Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation):

"He was my boss, my mentor, and a very close friend for more than 30 years that I've been at The Jockey Club and before that, at NYRA. He was a great man who treated me like part of the family. And he was so knowledgeable and caring about the industry—the horses, the backstretch workers, and our two Jockey Club charities. Even though it wasn't his main business or job, he devoted so much time to racing.

"I started working at NYRA in clubhouse relations and then left town. When I returned to New York, Mr. Phipps insisted I come and interview at The Jockey Club. I owe him my 31-year career here.

"People thought he was standoffish, but that was only because he was shy until he got to know you. He had a great sense of humor. Sometimes I'd ask him something and he'd just give me a look over his glasses, which were perched on the tip of his nose, and with a cigar in his mouth, and I'd say, 'OK, so I guess that's not a good idea.'

"He started The Jockey Club Research Foundation because he felt we needed to do more to fund medical research, so he raised a lot of money over a few years and we eventually merged with Grayson. He was very proud that we as an industry built things like that and the Safety Net Foundation.

Macagone's victory in Danger's Hour big for Tom Egan



A NEW ENGLAND NATIVE, Tom Egan was a reluctant northern expat. Initially unimpressed by Florida, he gave the Sunshine state another shot after a chance meeting with a Florida resident while working as an attorney in Connecticut, and in 2005, he and his wife, Jaye, moved to Palm City on the St. Lucie River. Two years earlier they had purchased a yearling filly, picked out by Jaye, for \$60,000 at the 2003 Keeneland September yearling sale.

A decade later he describes where he lives enthusiastically, especially in terms of its proximity to his horses, all the offspring of that filly, Isabel Away.

"We're very close to Payson Park and Don Brown's farm," he said, the latter the 60-acre facility where his horses spend the winter. "And we're only about 90 minutes from Gulfstream."

While that southern location gives him plenty of opportunity to be with his horses, at Brown's farm and in training with Michelle Nihei at Palm Meadows, it also means that he was 1,200 miles away from Aqueduct Racetrack when his homebred (Trinity Farm) Macagone (ma-KAY-gun) won his first stakes race, romping in the \$100,000, one-mile Danger's Hour Stakes April 10.

Egan grew up in the horse world, his father a regular at New England tracks such as Suffolk Downs, Rockingham Park, and Narragansett Park, and his mother an accomplished equestrian. Through genetics or upbringing—or both—Egan absorbed an appreciation for both the racetrack and the show horse world, learning to ride and jump, then working as a groom and hotwalker for the Phipps stable in the 1970s.

Decades later he puts that training to good use, visiting his horses at Brown's farm six days a week, describing himself as Macagone's groom. He leaves the riding, though, to Rudy Wolfendale, who gets on Egan's three horses at Brown's farm.

"He's a consummate horseman," said Egan of Wolfendale. "When Macagone got there, Rudy took over. He picked his feet, he saddled him, he bathed him—he adopted the horse. Not every exercise rider is going to do that."

Macagone is Isabel Away's 2011 foal by Artie Schiller. Egan's only broodmare, the Skip Away mare has thrown two runners that have reached the six-figure mark in earnings, and her 2-year-old colt by Pure Prize, named Red Knight and a full brother to Egan's Birchwood Road, may, said Egan, be the best one yet. He hopes to see the colt debut at Saratoga.

Egan's partners in Macagone share not only ownership interest with him, but also a surname. Though not related to his friends Liam and Mary Egan, Tom Egan suspects that enough digging into their Irish heritage—both families trace their roots to Galway—would be bound to turn up a connection. Liam is responsible, at least in part, for Macagone's name.

"My son died of brain cancer in 2011, and Macagone was born a month later," Tom Egan explained. "Liam speaks Gaelic, and 'Macagone' is an Americanization of a Gaelic word meaning 'son of Egan.'"

Even though his horses winter in Florida and could easily take advantage of Gulfstream Park's turf course, Egan prefers to give them the winter off, and not only so that he can spend time with them at Brown's farm.

"I think that's the way to do it," he said of giving them a break. "Don is totally devoted to the horses, and his farm is really the perfect place for them. They do so well there."

"Look at how Big Mac came back," he said, referring to Macagone by his barn name. "He ran a hole in the wind."

Isabel Away is expecting a foal by Freud. Boarded at Keane Stud, she's also got a promising yearling colt by Colonel John, and while most of her offspring have been New York-breds, Egan doesn't always spot them in races restricted to state-breds.

"If you have to stay within the confines of races for New York-breds, fine," said Egan. "But you're also free to venture out, and that's what we try to do."




