



Future Points

Needless to say, I listened with close attention to the casino proposal advanced last month by Gov. Andrew Cuomo and would like to share what I believe are its most significant points vis a vis breeders and the Fund.

The governor proposes to bid out three resort-style gaming destinations in locations other than New York City, Long Island, and the northern suburbs of New York City. The rest of New York would be divided into six regions, three of which would receive one casino each. Winning locations would be given a five-year exclusivity period, with no additional casinos to be sited in New York City or elsewhere. The governor's stated goal is "to create jobs and boost tourism in upstate New York."

During the "Question and Answer" period the governor said something additionally that really got my attention. When asked by a reporter whether the new casinos would "support breeders, horsemen, or racing personnel," the governor answered without hesitation, "The casinos that are done in combination, or concert, or connection with the track would (i.e. support the industry), the way racinos do now, but not one that is freestanding."

All of this should leave stakeholders in the breeding and racing industries feeling more than cautiously optimistic. For the first five-year window, as far as the Resorts World Casino New York City at Aqueduct is concerned, the governor's five-year exclusion of the city from consideration translates into a continuation of the status quo: incoming revenue

for NYRA purses and Breeding Fund awards from VLTs at the Resorts World Casino at Aqueduct.

Also in this first phase, if a casino should be built at a Thoroughbred track upstate (i.e., Finger Lakes), the governor's position is that Thoroughbred racing and breeding should receive a share of gaming revenue. That being said, Finger Lakes is in one of three upstate zones with Indian gaming that could potentially be removed from consideration for casino development if the state can reach an agreement with the Indian Nation, in this case the Senecas. The state has already reached an agreement with the Oneidas and Mohawks. It seems most likely that any casino development at a racetrack in the first phase will be on the harness side, which will have no impact on our fund or purses.

Looking ahead, if Resorts World should win a bid for casino development at Aqueduct after the expiration of the five-year exclusivity period on the three new casinos, we hope that the governor's position that the racing and breeding industries should benefit from a "racetrack" casino will still hold true.

There is no guarantee the governor's proposal will proceed as planned or that lawmakers will accept it. As the basic casino expansion legislation, which involves amending the state constitution, moves forward toward a probable voter referendum in the fall, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders lobbyists and I will be keeping close tabs on all additional developments concerning the siting and selection of the new facilities. 🐾

Governor Touts Expansion of Casino Gambling

Gov. Andrew Cuomo said May 8 there is a big enough appetite for gambling in New York to permit the state to expand casino operations while protecting the interests of existing racetrack-based casinos.

The governor unveiled a new version of a casino plan, absent some details, to locate the first three of seven possible casinos in specific regions of upstate New York. His plan would ban for five years any casino development in New York City, Long Island, and the northern suburbs of New York City, which would make Genting New York's Aqueduct Racetrack casino the major beneficiary by blocking competition during the period.

Cuomo and lawmakers

are trying to get a casino expansion deal done by the end of the session June 20. Lawmakers approved a first step last year and need to pass a second resolution this year to amend the state constitution to permit up to seven Class III casinos on non-Indian lands.

Cuomo released a map of six upstate areas that could be eligible for casino expansion under a new plan he unveiled. Three of those areas—in western, central, and northern New York—would be taken off the site list if Indian tribes already operating casinos in those areas agree by the end of June to make new, or to restart, stalled

revenue-sharing payments to the state from gambling proceeds.

The upstate areas of the state that would be eligible, for certain, under the Cuomo plan include two separate regions that stretch from north of Saratoga Springs down to Monticello Raceway. A third would be a slice of central New York from Lake Ontario southward toward the Binghamton area and the nearby Tioga Downs Casino.

Cuomo dismissed racing industry concerns that racetrack casinos will not be able to compete with full-blown, Las Vegas-style casinos that, rather than just having video lottery terminals, will be able to offer slot machines and table games such as poker. The racetrack casinos have fueled new investment in equine breeding and ownership operations through pumped-up purses.

He cited the success of the Vernon Downs Casino in central New York, located just a few miles away from the Oneida Indian tribe's sprawling Class III Turning Stone Casino.

Cuomo said he expects many of the

racetracks to bid for rights to become Class III casinos, though he has in the past said his chief interest is in developing major, destination-style resort casinos to increase tourism.

The governor is not supporting a key aspect that will determine whether some casino companies seek to locate or expand in New York: tax rates. He said that will be decided, if voters approve the overall expansion, by a temporary panel of financial and real estate experts who would be appointed by the government to assess the bids.

Winners would be chosen based on such factors as the level of impact their plans would have on a local economy and the amount they would pay the state in an upfront franchise fee payment or annual takeout tax levels.

STATE-BREDS SHINE AT OBS APRIL SALE

New York-breds performed well overall at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale of 2-year-olds in training in what turned out to be a record-setting sale April 22-25. Of the 126 state-bred 2-year-olds cataloged, 86 passed through the ring and 64 were reported as sold for \$3,227,500.

The median price for a New York-bred (\$37,000) outperformed the overall sale median (\$35,000), which was up 29.6% over last year. The New York-bred average of \$50,430 did not quite manage to keep pace with the record mark for the sale (\$60,535, up 39.3%), but exceeded the New York-bred

juvenile average price in 2012 (\$47,821), continuing the upward trend of the New York-bred 2-year-old market.

Seven New York-bred individuals brought six figures, led by a bay Freud colt purchased by trainer Linda Rice on behalf of Bear Stables for \$210,000.

Foaled at Hidden Lake Farm near Otisville, the juvenile was bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds in partnership with J.W. Singer and consigned by Becky Thomas' Sequel Bloodstock. He is the second foal from Pulpit's Pride, a daughter of Pulpit.

The colt breezed an eighth in :10. Third dam Seewillo (by Pleasant Colony) is a grade III winner and a producer of two graded stakes performers. Fourth dam Perfect Pigeon (by Round Table) is a multiple stakes producer.

FORMER FUND ADMINISTRATOR WILLIAM WELCH DIES

William H. "Bill" Welch, former executive administrator and board member of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, died May 14 at his residence in Genesco, N.Y. He was 72.



Welch worked with the Fund from its inception in 1973, having lobbied in Albany for the bill that created it and served as its executive director until 1997. Funded by small percentages of on-track and off-track handle, the goal of the Fund was to build the state's breeding industry into an economic force. It succeeded.

With money to enhance state-bred purses and distribute awards to breeders for open-company success, the Fund and the New York-bred program—farms, foals, and stallions—grew dramatically from the mid-1970s to the early 1990s. In 1976 there were 489 registered New York-bred foals and by 1990s there were more than 1,500 registered foals.

Welch was an avid fox hunter with the Genesee Valley Hunt Club.

NEW YORK GAMING COMMISSION TAKING SHAPE

More than a year after it was created by law, the New York Gaming Commission is getting closer to having board members in place who can fully run the new agency overseeing the horse racing, racino, lottery, casino, and charitable gaming industries.

The agency, which formally came to life Feb. 1, has been run the past several months by Robert Williams, who was given special powers previously provided only to the board of directors of the previous agency—the state Racing and Wagering Board—which was folded into the new racing commission along with the state’s now-defunct Lottery Division.

Lawmakers and Gov. Andrew Cuomo’s administration officials for months have

said it has been unexpectedly difficult finding people to serve on the new board who could meet its membership’s strict criteria, which included

mandatory expertise in certain fields, such as law or finance, and banned people from the board if they had ties to any gambling entity in the past three years.

Sources outside government said Cuomo is looking to appoint John Crotty, a member of a state panel that oversees the finances of

the New York Racing Association, and Barry Sample, a widely respected, longtime state government official who has worked at a variety of

agencies, including the state comptroller’s office, budget division, criminal justice services, and, most recently, for Cuomo in his state operations office.

The sources cautioned that Cuomo could change his mind about the appointments because they had not yet been made public.

Cuomo earlier this year nominated John Poklemba, a lawyer who was the top criminal justice adviser to former Gov. Mario Cuomo, the current governor’s father; and Todd Snyder, a financial sector executive in Manhattan. Neither has yet been confirmed by the Senate.

The Senate and Assembly have not named their two appointees to the seven-member racing commission.

The racing commission was approved in the spring of 2012 as part of the state budget process. It was originally supposed to have become active last Oct. 1, but that implementation date was moved back to Feb. 1 of this year to give Cuomo time to find his five board selections and the legislature its two board appointees.

The Senate and Assembly have yet to name either of their two appointees to the seven-member board. Cuomo may name his choices soon.

New York-breds Hessonite, Lubash star in graded stakes at Belmont

The two feature races on the May 4 program at Belmont Park went to the home team, as Belmont-based, New York-breds swept the afternoon stakes. Hessonite and Lubash had already stockpiled victories in restricted stakes against their own kind, but the New York-breds notched their elusive first graded stakes victories in an afternoon double play.

As in 2012, the Beaugay Stakes (gr. IIIIT) was Hessonite's first start of the year. The 5-old-daughter of Freud, out of the Manila mare Lakab, had finished sixth in last year's running to top older turf female Winter Memories, and it was one of only two races in 2012 that Hessonite didn't finish in the top two. The other was the Flow-

er Bowl Invitational Stakes (gr. IT), in which she finished fifth behind Nahrain and eventual older turf female champion Zagora after a troubled trip over a yielding turf course.

For much of this year's Beaugay, it looked as though she might get another difficult journey. Breaking from post one under jockey Junior Alvarado, who kept her on the hedge for much of the 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ miles, Hessonite looked as if she might get stuck behind horses at the eighth pole. When she finally found running room at the sixteenth pole, Alvarado said 'go,' and Hessonite kicked clear to win by three-quarters of a length in a final time of 1:40.82.

"This is the best filly we've ever had," said Bill Punk, who co-owns

Hessonite with Philip DiLeo. Bred by Berkshire Stud and Waterville Lake Stables, Hessonite was purchased by Punk during the seventh session of the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale for \$27,000—not bad for a horse that has won \$803,310.

"She's one of the best yearlings I've ever taken to a sale," said Berkshire Stud's Douglas Koch. "And I've never worked so hard to try to get a yearling sold. I loved that filly so much."

In advance of the Keeneland sale—where she was consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud—Hessonite wasn't, said Koch, attracting much interest. He called New York breeder Gus Schoenborn to tout the filly's quality, and Schoen-

born called Punk, who decided to bid on her, sight unseen.

Waterville Lake's John Meriwether purchased Hessonite's dam for \$16,000 at the Keeneland November sale in 2006; Lakab had been a successful broodmare in Australia, and it's from Australia that Punk and DiLeo have been fielding offers for Hessonite. Though Punk declined to offer specifics, he said, "As you can imagine, they've been pretty high."

They considered putting Hessonite in last year's November sale but decided, along with trainer David Donk, to bring the 2011 champion turf female back for another year and try to win a graded stakes race. With that goal met in her first start, and her having been named champion New York-bred older female for 2012, the plan will be to sell her later this year. Though Punk has bred and raced horses in the past, including graded stakes winners Sabercat and Ordway (1996 Moet Champagne Stakes, gr. I), he is pretty much out of the breeding business at this point and intends to enjoy his mare in the time he's got left with her.

"You feel blessed," he said. "You feel lucky to be around her."

Two races before the Beaugay, Lubash did New York proud in winning the Fort Marcy Stakes (gr. IIIT) by a half-length. Owned by Leonard Pivnik's Aliyu Ben J Stables and bred by Aliyuee Ben J Stable, the 6-year-old Lubash, a son of Freud—Nasty Cure, by Cure the Blues, was making his 26th start and earned his eighth victory, one that Pivnik has watched again and again.

"Every time I see him win that race, I am just thrilled, in seventh heaven," he said. "Wow, we did it again."

Named for former *New York Times* writer Arnold Lubasch, a childhood friend of Pivnik's, Lubash has given Pivnik no shortage of thrills, among them a 2½-length victory over Little Mike at Aqueduct in the Monarch's Maze Stakes in 2010. Little Mike won last year's Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. IT) at Santa Anita.

While Pivnik doesn't entertain such lofty aspirations for his gelding, he does feel the horse's first graded stakes win in his third try is an affirmation of sorts.

Fifth in Churchill Downs' Firecracker Handicap (gr. IIT) in 2011, Lubash ran fourth in the Red Bank Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Monmouth Park July 4, 2012.

"We won a grade III...finally," he said. "He's quality."

Racing well off the pace, Lubash commenced his bid on the far turn, steadily picking up horses and accelerating swiftly at the eighth pole. He held off a late charge by Bombagua to win, running the 1¼-mile stakes in 1:38.89.

Pivnik purchased Nasty Cure at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale at Calder in February 1993 for \$37,000; he also bought a 2-year-old colt, Meadow Flight, for \$105,000.

Netcong, would win 10 of 87 starts and earn \$327,924.

Describing himself as "a punter, as the Brits call it," Pivnik got involved in racing 20 years ago. Among his biggest thrills was Meadow Flight's second-place finish in the 1994 Haskell Invitational Handicap (gr. I) to eventual Horse of the Year Holy Bull.

A "half-retired" real estate developer, Pivnik estimates that he's got 12 horses now, including a yearling full sister to Lubash. Nasty Cure is currently in foal to 2012 New York leading freshman sire Frost Giant.

With a graded stakes victory secure, Pivnik plans to return Lubash to state-bred company in the Kingston Stakes June 1 at Belmont Park, in the newly established spring Showcase Day.

Though a "born-and-bred New Jersey boy," he breeds his horses in

Meadow Flight would be a multiple graded stakes winner—winning the grade II Pennsylvania Derby and the grade III Flamingo Stakes—and five years after he purchased them, he bred Meadow Flight to the stakes-placed Nasty Cure. The resulting foal,

New York and is a big fan of the state breeding and racing program, particularly in light of the recent performances of state-breds.

"When you find a horse like Lubash or Hessonite," he said, "you have to be very, very happy." 🐾

State-breds take flight prior to the June 1 New York Showcase Day

New York Showcase Day doesn't happen officially until June 1, but the New York breeding and racing program was nonetheless the highlight of the card May 5 at Belmont Park.

New York-bred champion 3-year-old filly and turf female Dayatthespa made the \$88,200 You Go West Girl Stakes for open company look like a walk in the park, winning by four lengths in her first race since she did indeed go west for the Matriarch Stakes (gr. IT) at Betfair Hollywood Park last fall. Her fifth-place finish

was her only defeat in 2012, the race bizarrely run as the City Zip filly (out of M'Lady Doc, by Doc's Leader) appeared to have been spooked running up the backstretch and nearly went over the rail, taking jockey Javier Castellano with her.

"We were as lucky as you can get in a bad situation," said co-owner Pete Bradley of Bradley Thoroughbreds. "The injury was superficial, all in the skin. I think it affected her trainer more than it affected her."

Crediting trainer Chad Brown's patience in not rushing the filly back to the races, Bradley had also considered the May 4 Beaugay Stakes (gr.

IIIT) for Dayatthespa's comeback, but the availability of Castellano led to the decision to run her in the listed stakes instead.

"Given what she's done against open company, we thought this would be an easier spot," Bradley said. "We looked at the Beaugay, but Javier was in Kentucky for the Derby that day and they fit together so well, and we were more interested in having the jockey who knew her on board, rather than just going after that race in particular."

Stalking the pace early, Dayatthespa took control rounding the final turn and drew off easily, running

the mile on Belmont's firm turf in 1:33.52.

In 10 starts Dayatthespa is now 7-1-0. Her 2012 victories all came in stakes, including the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (gr. IT) at Keeneland.

A \$50,000 yearling purchase at the 2010 Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale by Sarazen Stable, Dayatthespa was cataloged to the 2011 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March 2-year-olds in training sale. Bradley purchased her privately after she was withdrawn from the sale, and though he declined to specify the purchase price, he did say that she was "a bargain" considering what she's accomplished.

"She had a good way of going," Bradley said. "I was hoping to find a New York-bred I could win a couple of allowance races with. She's done way better than that."

The 4-year-old chestnut filly was bred by Castellare DiCracchiolo Stable, Cracchiolo & Goldsher and is owned by Jerry Frankel, Ronald Frankel, Steve Laymon, and Bradley Thoroughbreds. She's earned \$633,892.

Dayatthespa is again expected to return against open company in the Just a Game Stakes (gr. IT) June 8 on the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) day undercard.

"It's a great showcase race, and it's going to come up very strong from what I hear," Bradley said. "When you've got a good filly and they've confirmed their class and quality, you run them against the best."

"She's a fun one, and they don't come along often enough."

Earlier in the program two New York-bred 3-year-olds made their stakes debuts winning ones in the Stallion Series for horses sired by eligible New York-based stallions and nominated to the series.

In the Times Square division, homebred Belief System, owned by Sequel Racing and bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds and Anthony Grey, was moving from maiden claiming ranks, where he'd broken his maiden in his fourth start. The longest shot in the five-horse field at 15-1, the son of Read the Footnotes out of the Lord At War mare Boatman Road, tracked swift fractions of :21.77 and :44.71 set by In Harm's Way before taking over in the stretch, holding off a late surge by Chapman to win by a half-length. Belief System ran the 6½ furlongs in 1:17.35.

Sequel's Becky Thomas doesn't remember what it was that prevented Belief System from being sold at auction—"some little hiccup," she called it—but, she said, she always liked him.

"He was never a bad actor," she said of the dark bay or brown gelding. "I thought he had the opportunity to be a nice horse for us."

Describing herself and co-breeder Grey as "big Lord At War fans," Thomas bought Boatman Road in foal to Harlan's Holiday for \$13,000 at the 2006 Keeneland January sale. She sold two of the mare's offspring by Harlan's Holiday, a 2006 colt and a 2009 filly, for \$235,000 and \$180,000, respectively, as 2-year-olds in training. A 2008

full sister to Belief System sold for \$45,000.

Thomas has since sold Boatman Road, who is, she said, in foal to Freud at Hidden Lake Farm.

Given Belief System's Argentine blood, Thomas is considering a race on grass for the gelding's next start.

"Tony and I both like to run on grass," she said, adding that Belief System will also run longer next time.

"His best distance isn't short; we never thought he was a sprinter," she explained. "He just has one long, sweeping move, and if you watch how the race unfolded, he could never have kept up with In Harm's Way. He doesn't have that kind of turn of foot."

Mentioning the Mike Lee Stakes on the June 1 Showcase Day card as a possibility, Thomas said that she's "very excited" about the addition of a June day of racing for New York-breds.

"It's a huge boost for New York breeders," she said.

In the Park Avenue division for fillies, the bay with the big blaze went to the front and never looked back, as favorite Lovely Syn remained unbeaten in three starts.

A homebred daughter of Freud out of Lemon Drop's Love, by Lemon Drop Kid, Lovely Syn is owned by Joemar Racing Stables, whose Michael Parisi represents

three generations of breeding and racing horses.

"My grandfather started Joemar in the late '50s in New Jersey," he said. "It was named for my father Joe and his sister Marie."

Beginning as a Standardbred operation, the farm expanded in the early 1970s when Parisi's father branched out into Thoroughbreds with Camijo Stable—named for Michael, his sister Camille, and his brother Joe.

Michael continued the family tradition, focusing on Standardbreds, but when his father died in 2008, he decided to keep the Thoroughbred operation going. Though he still breeds mostly Standardbreds, he's currently got about seven Thoroughbred mares.

"I think I just got lucky with this one," he said, referring to Lovely Syn.

Dominating the field of New York-bred fillies in the \$100,000 Stallion Series, she won by 9½ lengths, running the 6½ furlongs in 1:16.33, more than a second faster than the colts one race earlier.



said. Among their purchases was a 1999 French Deputy—Blue Avenue filly for \$100,000 that they sold a year later for \$925,000. Bella Bellucci would go on to be a multiple graded stakes winner for Michael Tabor.

Another Parisi success story is Cheriepe (Boldnesian—Miss Barter, by Swaps), claimed by Michael’s father. He, too, would be a multiple graded stakes winner, counting the 1973 Jim Dandy Stakes (gr. III) and 1975 San Antonio Stakes (gr. I) among his victories.

And while it’s still too early to dream about Lovely Syn winning those kinds of races, Parisi is beginning to think she might be, as trainer Dominick Schettino has called her, “the real deal.”

“I was offered \$700,000 for her before this last race,” Parisi said. “And after that race I got calls I didn’t even take. I lost a lot of sleep; I chatted with Dominick...I don’t know if I did the right thing.

“I’ve never had a filly of this caliber, though, and while I don’t want to think too far up the line, I love to breed horses, and I look forward to breeding her. Money is nice, but once you get rid of the horse, the horse is gone.”

“I’ve been in the game a long time, and I know what can happen,” he went on. “I can’t look backward now.”

Instead, he’s looking ahead; for now, he’ll keep his filly, who has earned \$127,200, in New York-bred company.

“This is a nice series,” he said. “It gives a young horse an opportunity to make some money.” 🐾







Tried & True

Catienus still going strong at 19

It's easy to get caught up in the hype of a hot stallion, but over the long haul it is often best to stick with the tried and true. One of those types stallions—Catienus—has been a mainstay in the New York marketplace for years.

No particular “flavor of the month,” Catienus seems to be hitting his best stride this year at age 19 and is going strong at McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds outside Saratoga Springs.

"He's just a hell of a nice horse," said Joe McMahon. "He's underrated; he's never gotten his due, but some people have realized what a real, nice horse he is. He's an extremely good value for \$5,000."

The son of Storm Cat, out of the graded stakes-placed Mr. Prospector mare Diamond City, is the sire of 26 stakes winners and had a breakout Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) weekend at Churchill Downs when he was represented as the broodmare sire of both Longines Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner Princess of Sylmar and Churchill Distaff Turf Mile Stakes (gr. IIT) winner Stephanie's Kitten. He's off to a hot start as a sire of sires, too, as his Talent Search has two winners from two starters from his first crop this year.

"He's a Storm Cat, and he's a real correct Storm Cat; he's not offset at all in his knees," McMahon explained. "He was a sound horse, and his foals are very sound. Conformation-wise, he's a little bit more like Mr. Prospector through his body than he is like Storm Cat. As opposed to being big, long-legged, and short-backed, he's kind of stretchy and has more bone than the typical Storm Cat."

Bred in Kentucky by Darley Stud Management, Catien-

us was given ample opportunity to shine under the ownership of Sheikh Mohammed, racing in Europe early in his career. Brought to America, he was with trainer Christophe Clement but after three starts was dipped into the claiming pool. In his second start for a tag—and last—on April 25, 1999, he was taken by an astute Ken Ramsey for \$50,000.

Catienus immediately returned dividends for Ramsey by winning the Charles Staats Memorial Stakes at Delaware Park and placing in four graded stakes through the end of the 2000 racing season. Highlights included a runner-up effort behind Behrens in the Suburban Handicap (gr. II) and a third-place effort behind Victory Gallop and Behrens in Saratoga's Whitney Handicap (gr. I).

He earned \$310,500 for Ramsey while earning \$370,386 in a career that spanned ages 2-6. He won five times from 22 starts and ran second five times and third twice.

He was retired to Ramsey's farm near Nicholasville, Ky., where he spent his first three seasons and was well supported by Ramsey.

When his runners hit the track, the 2-year-old winners came in bunches. Catienus had 18 juvenile winners from his first crop, and he ranked among the top 15 freshman sires by progeny earnings. He had 15 juvenile winners in his second crop, and 21 in his third.

From his first crop came Nolan's Cat, who would run third in the "Test of the Champion," the Belmont Stakes (gr. I), while still a maiden. From Catienus' second crop came Dawn of War, winner of the Lane's End Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) at 2, and multiple grade I winner Precious

Kitten. Multiple grade I-placed Talent Search was in his third crop.

And much like their sire, Catienus' runners kept running.

In the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation's fifth annual Durability Index (2012 sires), Catienus ranks second with his runners making an average of 21.8 starts per career.

Over the next six years of his stud career, Catienus bounced back and forth between Kentucky and Carl Lizza's Highcliff Farm near Delanson. The horse is still owned by Ramsey but is leased to McMahon and for the last four years Catienus has stood at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.

"His book is strong this year," McMahon said. "He's having probably the best book he's ever had. The stallion market is very competitive in New York now. It has changed a whole lot everywhere over the last few years, especially with the lower-end horses. It's very active in New York and Catienus is, too. He'll get around 50 mares this year—that's a big number for him."

For the tried-and-true horsemen, steady Catienus is one who "just keeps on getting it done." 🐾





Power of Love

Foals thrive in Carlland Stables' nurturing climate

Sue Carlson's dream of owning a commercial horse farm began in a cloud of turmoil and much quicker than had been anticipated. But through hard work, quality care, and a steady stream of word-of-mouth endorsements, she has developed one of the leading equine nurseries in western New York's Genesee Valley.

In 1993 Carlson and her husband, Greg, were looking to upgrade a four-acre hobby farm on which they bred and trained Saddlebreds. They participated in driving competitions on antique carriages, dressed in period clothing. This hobby was funded by

Carlson's full-time job as a technical associate helping with Alzheimer's and Parkinson's research at the University of Rochester's Center for Brain Research and through her husband's job in Kodak's information technology department.

They wanted a bigger place and after years of searching found 190 acres near the country town of Avon, south of Rochester. While the farm was bigger than they needed, the plan was to carve out 20 acres for themselves and sell off the remainder to other equestrians.

The plan took a sharp turn, however. Soon after closing on the prop-

erty, Sue Carlson's research group got relocated to Vermont and Greg Carlson's department got transferred to Texas. All this unraveled a few weeks after the couple welcomed their second son into the world.

"I could have had another job, but by that time I wanted to be a stay-at-home mother," Sue Carlson said. "Also, I wanted to make the farm work. I had already run a commercial farm, and I wanted to be in the horse business."

Carlson had grown up in Jamestown, N.Y., near the Pennsylvania state line, where she showed Saddlebreds, Tennessee Walkers, and Mor-

gans. During college she began working for Hobnobbin Farm, a top-notch Standardbred racing and breeding operation. Since the farm was based in Ohio and Carlson was attending the College of Wooster, west of Canton, Ohio, she was also able to help prep and sell auction yearlings in Columbus throughout the year. After graduation, Carlson took over as Hobnobbin's manager. She lived on the farm, and there she learned to love foaling mares.

"I love when the new life comes out," she said of her affinity for foaling. "I did the foaling right away (on the new farm), starting out foaling show horse mares and some Standardbreds."

The former owners of the property that became Carlland Stables were Thoroughbred people and soon after the Carlsons reopened the barns, some clients of the previous owners came calling.

"I'll never forget the first one, Ernie Symes, who asked if he could board his layups with us," Carlson said. Symes had been a chemist at Kodak who became a trainer after he retired. "From him I met Paul Barrow. They were both trainers at Finger Lakes. There were people who had already foaled here previously or had

layups, and they contacted us. After five years we were foaling mostly Thoroughbreds.

"It has absolutely grown by word of mouth," she said.

Attention to Detail...Every Day

Carlland Stables now cares for about 100 horses and has delivered between 36-46 foals annually over the past four years. The farm has grown to 264 acres with the addition of Tadmore Farms, a leased steeplechase farm. Carlland Stables has large pastures ringed by three-board fencing and separated by wide lanes.

Sue Carlson said she has no shortage of valuable resources. She has two full-time assistants—Melinda Walker, the farm manager who has worked at Carlland Stables for 17 years, and Patrick Munnings, who has been at the farm for eight years. Carlson gets additional help from students at nearby SUNY-Genesco, whose equestrian team has supplied a number of ambitious and caring assistants. The farm also uses a talented farrier who addresses and can correct some minor conformation flaws early in young horses. Carlson's veterinarian from the nearby Genesee Valley Equine Clinic comes to the farm at least three days a week, and more

medical expertise is 85 miles away at Cornell University.

The primary reason Carlland Stables has grown and thrived, however, is Carlson's dedication to patience, detail, and attentiveness.

"We love them; we really do," she said about the foals she's raised. "Everything is clean and bright. I pick up the foals' feet every day, and we have two people lead them every day; one handler for the mare, the other teaching the foal to lead."

She only puts four mares with their foals in each pasture so they have plenty of room and groups the mares by their personalities. The older mares, for example, go out together.

"The foals end up being really attentive; we can do anything we want with them," she said. "It might be overboard; except, when they go into training, they are really amiable."

Among the horses foaled and raised at Carlland is New York-bred King Kreesa, a multiple stakes winner and multiple graded stakes-placed runner for Gerald and Susan Kresa.

Frank Lodato, an owner/breeder who lives in Florida but breeds his mares in New York, said he was fortunate to learn about the Carlsons' operation when he got into breeding three years ago. Lodato had a winning Smart Strike mare he raced and just retired named Smartgabriele that he wanted to breed but had some concerns because he lives in Florida and wanted his foals to be New York-breds.

"I wanted to be in New York because that's where the money is, and I really needed someone I could trust," he said. "Sue is a great communicator, she's affordable, and she's very accommodating. She has really made this very easy for me."

Lodato's first homebred (in the name of Loda Luck Stables), a colt by Belong to Me named Canarsie Kid, has been in training in Central Florida with Tony Everard and is about

ready for the races.

"Tony and I are really happy with how this horse has been training," Lodato said. "We both feel Sue put a good foundation under him."

Richard Nicolai, a Long Island businessman and owner of Fortune Farm, found Carlland Stables through his trainer Jeremiah Englehart, who also had horses at the farm.

"My trainer is very particular and pays attention to detail," Nicolai said. "I followed his recommendation and couldn't be more pleased. Sue is always accessible, always returns a phone call. I can't say one thing bad about her and her operation. It is not fancy, but the attention is where it needs to be, on the individuals."

As a small-scale owner/breeder, Nicolai said he prefers doing business with other smaller operations.

"I like hands-on operations because they are on top of things," he said. Carlland Stables' location on the other side of the state never concerned Nicolai because he feels shipping horses is just the cost of having your horses at the right place at the right time, whether it is for breeding or racing. He breeds to stallions in both New York and Kentucky but has all his foals drop in New York.

"The New York stakes program has gotten better, and the breeders' awards are really good so I'm taking advantage of that," he said. "I still have a lot to learn about the game, and Sue helps me with that, too."

Carlson has also foaled every mare bred by owner/breeder Ron Kiser, a Florida businessman who has been breeding in New York about 10 years.

"She just takes great care of the animals," said Kiser, who was referred to Carlson by several trainers. "She has over 100 head and I know she can name all of them."

"Sue also has numerous contacts, and everyone I know bends over

backward to help her out. It is pretty difficult today to find someone who everyone only has good things to say about," said Kiser, who owns a printing and direct mail company in Tampa.

Business has been booming in New York since purses and breeders' awards have received a boost from the Resorts World New York Casino New York City at Aqueduct, but the growth has not been as steep in New York's western region as it has been up and down the Hudson River valley, which is home to the state's premier stallion stations. Still, Carlland Stables' location provides a good set-up particularly for New York breeders who favor Kentucky stallions.

"Right now, if you have a Kentucky-sired horse, it's worth more," Carlson said of the foal's commercial value. She noted it only costs about \$200 more to ship a mare to Kentucky than it does to ship to farms in eastern New York. According to the New York-bred registration rules, a foal by a stallion out of state can be a New York-bred as long as the mare resides most of the year in New York, is back in New York within 90 days of her cover date, and delivers in New York.

"Half of the people who foal at my place, this is what they do. You breed there, you live here, you foal here, and go back. It is very common," Carlson said.

No Substitute for Being There

After 21 years Carlson said she has not missed a foaling. She monitors the mares under her care with help of Birth Alarms and nine closed circuit video cameras.

"Greg helps watch the mares on TV, but I'm with them in the stall," she said.

And even after witnessing hundreds of foalings, Carlson still sees events that amaze her. One year she watched two mares from the same farm, occupying adjoining stalls, lie down and

deliver their foals almost simultaneously. Then there was the night of last Feb. 8, which became her busiest night ever. At 8 p.m. a mare named Charming Mandate delivered a colt by Posse. Just as that colt was up and nursing, the mare Kat Scratch Fever delivered a colt by Dunkirk. Ten minutes later Giant Leap (a daughter of Giant's Causeway) gave birth to a filly by Birdstone. Carlson would deliver two more foals in the wee morning hours.

"After all the foaling, it never gets old," Carlson said.

Besides lavishing attention on the foals, Carlson said it is important to let the mares do things at their own pace and on their own terms.

"If the mare doesn't want to get up, I let her just lie there, and I sit with them and be quiet for as long as she wants," she said. "I'll get milk from the mother and feed the baby, or I may get the colostrum out of the freezer and feed it so everyone can rest and do what they need to do."

"You have to be right there, to be vigilant; there is no substitute," Carlson added. "I always tell the foal, 'Welcome to the world. I'm your Aunt Sue.'" 🐾
