Changing of the Guard

AS MOST OF YOU KNOW, Barry Ostrager, longtime member of the board of directors of NYTB and president of the NYTB board for multiple terms, has moved on to the next phase in his distinguished career, having been appointed to serve as a judge in the Civil Branch of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the Court of Claims. Unfortunately, Barry's elevation to the bench also required him to resign from both the NYTB and NYRA board of directors, which he did with regret. Replacing Barry in the office of NYTB president, with the unanimous support of our board, is longtime director and board vice president Tom Gallo.

Barry took his turn as president of the NYTB board on several occasions, but I want to focus particularly on his service in that office from January 2009 through May 2015, arguably the most transformative period ever experienced by the New York breeding and racing industries. I started my job as executive director of NYTB in 2008 and am therefore in a unique position to bear witness to just how much NYTB and New York breeders owe to Barry's leadership during this time.

The beginning of this period was the "worst of times" on the New York breeding scene. Farms were closing. The Fund was all at sea financially. New York-breds struggled in the sales ring. VLTs were interminably delayed, and, as the "icing on the cake," NYC OTB closed in bankruptcy in December 2009. All was in disarray.

As NYTB addressed breeders' challenges during these difficult times, Barry's leadership and support were critical. While juggling an almost inconceivably complex schedule as a nationally prominent trial lawyer and partner of Simpson Thacher & Bartlett, Barry rarely let a day pass without taking time to contribute to NYTB's mission of helping to right the ship of New York breeding. Although Barry is a soft-spoken man with a tendency to stay out of the limelight, his advocacy for New York breeders and—in his joint tenure as a member of the NYRA board—for New York-bred racing, was truly passionate and he never shunned a challenge. His dedicated

service leaves us very much in his debt.

As I write, our horizons are much brighter. With the support of the Genting VLTs, the enhanced NYRA purse structure, substantial program awards from the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, and various acts of the legislature championed by NYTB, the New York breeding industry is thriving. This is not to say that we don't face serious challenges, but this is where Tom Gallo steps into the breach.

As NYTB board vice president, chairman of the PAC board, and an NYTB board member since 1996, Tom Gallo has a deep well of experience in breeding, racing, promotion, and legislative issues. Wearing his passion on his sleeve, Tom is well-versed in all the issues and just what we need as an advocate for the state's breeders to keep our organization on a positive track.

One issue particularly dear to Tom's heart is Thoroughbred aftercare. Our organization has already made strides in this area, and under Tom's leadership NYTB is positioned to work effectively with our legislative allies and others to play a meaningful role, turning New York into a national leader in meeting the needs of our equine athletes after they have finished their racing careers.

Following Tom's election as NYTB president, the board also elected a new vice president: Mallory Mort, farm manager at Marlene Brody's Gallagher's Stud in Ghent. Mallory has already demonstrated his dedication and insight as a board member and will continue to make positive contributions to our efforts. The Board also selected a new board member to fill the vacancy created by Barry's departure: Joan M. Taylor, DVM. A successful equine veterinarian, farm owner and breeder, Joan has served in many distinguished leadership, fundraising, and board positions. She is a great new asset for NYTB and is, I know, ready, willing and able to take up arms, whatever circumstance throws at us.

The upshot is that we continue to have a winning team on the NYTB board, and I think breeders can count on the organization's leadership as we work with our industry partners to look after their interests with zeal and dedication.

GALLO ELECTED PRESIDENT OF NYTB BOARD

New York Thoroughbred Breeders' board of directors unanimously elected longtime NYTB vice president Thomas J. Gallo III to serve as board president through 2015 during a meeting June 8 at the organization's office in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

Current NYTB director Mallory Mort, farm manager at Marlene Brody's Gallagher's Stud near Ghent, was elected to replace Gallo in the office of vice president. The board also selected Dr. Joan M. Taylor to fill a director vacancy.

The elections and appointment of a new director to the NYTB Board were occasioned by the resignation of board president Barry Ostrager following his nomination to serve as a judge in the Civil Branch of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the Court of Claims. Ostrager, who has served on the NYTB board since 1998 and is the majority owner of Questroyal Stud near Stillwater, is a former partner in the law firm of Simpson Thacher & Bartlett.

Gallo, who owns Blue Stone Farm near Cambridge with his wife, Mia, is the founder and managing owner of Parting Glass Racing and Thomas J. Gallo III Sales Agency. From years of service on the NYTB board and as chair of the NYTB PAC, Gallo brings a wealth of experience and first-hand knowledge about the industry, marketing, and legislative process to the office.

"First, on behalf of the whole board I want to express our gratitude for Barry's long and distinguished service on behalf of NYTB and on behalf of the New

York racing and breeding industries as a whole," Gallo said in a release. "As the new president of the NYTB board, I would like to continue the momentum created by Barry and our board. I will also make every effort to keep NYTB in a leadership role for the benefit of both the New York breeding industry and the breeding industry nationwide."

Taylor is a doctor of veterinary medicine who earned her degree from Tufts University. In 1990 she partnered with her husband. William B. Wilmot, to build and operate Stepwise Farm near Saratoga to engage in breeding and selling racing prospects for the commercial market. Taylor also serves as an adviser for veterinary students at Skidmore and Connecticut College, is a volunteer for local non-profit groups, and has held a variety of leadership, fundraising, and board positions, including the Wesley Foundation, Travers Committee, and for the past six years has chaired the Adirondack Trust Community Fund.

FORTY TALES TO SHUTTLE TO PERU

Multiple graded stakes winner Forty Tales will stand the 2015 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Boris Schwartzman's Haras Barlovento in El Salvador, Peru

Forty Tales who stands at Sequel Stallions New York will be shuttling for the first time after his second breeding season in the U.S. He went into quarantine June 27.

"We are so excited for Forty Tales to have a summer job at a leading stud farm in Peru," said Sequel Stallions' Becky Thomas. "The team at Haras Barlovento has just been great. We are grateful to Marette Farrell for giving Forty Tales another opportunity to prove himself as a sire. Given the success of the Storm Cat sire line, we are sure Forty Tales will become a highly sought-after sire."

The bay horse by Tale of the Cat—Forty Love, by Forty Niner, retired with five wins and \$666,789. He

won his only start at 2 by 2¾ lengths in a maiden special weight at Aqueduct for trainer Todd Pletcher and owner Perretti Racing Stables.

A graded stakes winner at 3 from 6½ furlongs to a mile, he won the Amsterdam Stakes (gr. II) at

Saratoga and the Woody Stephens Stakes (gr. II) at Belmont. Outside of New York he won the Derby Trial Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill Downs and was second in the Hutcheson Stakes (gr. II) at Gulfstream Park. He is out of the stakes-placed Forty Niner mare, Forty Love and his first crop are weanlings of 2015.

OBS June Sale Sees 'Rock Solid' Market for New York-Breds

The four-day June sale at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. (June 16-19) saw records broken for gross, average, and median, and the market for New York-bred juveniles was rock solid.

Of the 65 New York-bred juveniles offered, 49 changed hands for \$1,578,700, good for an average of \$32,218 and a median

of \$17,000. The state-bred numbers are favorable when matched with the sale's average of \$39,722 and median of \$18,000.

The overall average was bolstered by lots of activity at the top end, with 21 juveniles bringing \$200,000 or more against 10 a year ago.

Four Empire-breds brought six figures topped by a Scat Daddy colt (Hip 362) purchased by trainer Linda Rice for \$210,000 during the sale's second session.

Bred by Joanne T. Nielsen, and foaled Feb. 16, 2013, the colt sold last summer at the Fasig-Tipton preferred New York-bred yearling sale for \$135,000 to Champion Equine. In the under tack show June 9 he breezed a co-bullet eighth in:10 flat.

The colt's dam is Forever Smart, a stakes-placed turf runner by Smart Strike who is a half sister to graded stakes winner Raging Daoust (by Kafwain).


A state-bred son of Discreet Cat went for \$150,000 during the final session. Purchased by JS Company Ltd., the gray/roan colt was a \$15,000 buy last summer at the Fasig-Tipton preferred New York-bred yearling sale by Laurence Leavy. Earlier this year the prospect RNA'd for \$70,000 at the OBS spring sale, but clearly opened a few more eyes with a :20% quarter-mile breeze in advance of OBS June.

Bred by Dr. Jerry Bilinski in partnership with Harry Patten, the January colt is out of Two Bad Girls, a winning Florida-bred daughter of Diablo. The mare's headliner is her first foal, Twice as Bad, a grade II winner by Stormy Atlantic. She currently has a yearling colt by Hansen and a weanling colt by Bustin Stones.

West Point's racing manager Erin Birkenhauer.

The Saratoga Springs-based racing partnership group, in consultation

> with trainer Tom Albertrani, decided to retire the son of Awesome Again after a small knee chip was discovered following an sixth-place finish in the Danger's Hour Stakes on April 19 at Aqueduct. After his successful career on the racetrack and with his ability to move on to a second career, West Point management and its partners felt he deserved to retire with dignity and the ability to move on to a second career.

West Point Thoroughbreds president and founder Terry Finley said, "This horse's retirement is bittersweet. He gave us so much joy, but it's not realistic to think that he would run forever. What does feel good is that this is the way all racing retirement

chapters are supposed to be written-a horse going out with class and the opportunity to embark on a new career with another exciting chapter forthcoming."

Added Finley, "He was a major force in the New York-bred ranks for years, a multiple stakes winner who brought his partners to the winner's circle eight times, and earned \$439,286."

Awesome Vision began racing as a 3-year-old in 2012 and has a record of 8-2-4 from 28 career starts. He spent his entire racing career in New York, with 27 of his 28 starts at New York Racing Association (NYRA) tracks. He won the Compelling Word, Saratoga Sunrise, and Move It Now stakes.

West Point Thoroughbreds plans to chronicle his training for the Thoroughbred Makeover on its website and social media channels. The Makeover takes place the weekend before the Breeders' Cup World Championships and has been designated an official Breeders' Cup Festival Event.

New York-bred LaVerdad Is Racing's Newest Millionaire



As supplied to The Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse in 2014 is \$21,617 or 45% of the 2014 average purse in Japan. 
Demand for New York-bred sale 2-year-olds continues to climb

THE OCALA BREEDERS' SALES Co.'s June sale closed with a flourish June 19 in central Florida, with a record gross, average, and median. The traditional end of the select selling season for juveniles put an exclamation point on a very good year for those with good-quality 2-year-olds to offer. Overall, the average price for a sale 2-year-old in North America rose 17.1% over last year's figure—from \$68,483 to \$80,168—and the median rose 12.9% from \$31,000 to \$35,000.

It should be no surprise that the market for New York-breds was even stronger. With fewer offerings in 2015 from 2014—down to 290 from 377—the average price of a New York-bred sale juvenile jumped 29.6%. The average state-bred juvenile sold for \$73,232. Compared to three years ago, the price has climbed 54.6% while the

median has soared 60% from \$25,000 to \$40,000, which is actually higher than the national average.

While a portion of this year's figure can be attributed to the \$840,000 shelled out by trainer Linda Rice and Sheila Rosenblum for a son of Pioneerof the Nile—Lantern Glow, by Mineshaft, at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale in May, the fact the median price of a New Yorkbred juvenile rose 17.6% from \$34,000 shows the strength and depth of the marketplace.

Rosenblum races La Verdad, a Ricetrained New York-bred who has won open-company graded stakes in 2014 and 2015. Rice has also conditioned state-bred multiple grade I winner Palace and New York-bred Princess Violet, winner of this year's Madison Stakes (gr. I) at Keeneland.

"We've had a great run with those horses, none of which went through the 2-year-old sales, but they are indicative of the kinds of horses coming out of the program these days," Rice said.

Rice was the leading buyer of New York-bred juveniles this year, taking home six 2-year-olds for \$1,690,000.

"There is a renewed interest in horse racing, especially in New York with the purses from the VLTs (video lottery terminals)," Rice said. Her buying power has increased with some new clients coming into the game.

A look at the list of leading buyers of New York-bred juveniles this year shows some national players not usually racing in New York are entering the market. West Coast-based Narvick International and Little Red Feather Racing have come to play, along with Oaklawn Park owner Charles Cella, Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables, and newcomer Matthew Schera.

New clients coming into racing along with a better economy and the reduced foal crop have helped the broader market, but the purse structure at the New York Racing Association tracks means the market for the local product should continue to outpace the national averages.

Q: You've been a longtime board member of NYTB. What was the program like when you first became involved?

I first became involved in the program back in 1980 when we purchased our farm outside Saratoga Springs. Under Dominick DeLuke the fledgling organization was just hiring an executive director and things were getting off the ground.

Fast forward to 1996 when I was first elected to the NYTB board. The various New York breeding and racing organizations were a bit splintered with agendas going in different directions. Early on, under the tutelage of then president Louis Salerno, we made progressive strides to open up communication and developed a good working relationship with the horseman and the Breeding and Development Fund.

When Jerry Nielsen was our president, we paved the way for VLT legis-

lation in New York, and when it finally came to fruition under Barry Ostrager's watch, it was a huge shot in the arm for the New York breeding and racing industry. In the interim Mike McMahon hired our current executive director who has been an invaluable member of our team and spearheads many of our current initiatives.

So moving onward and upward under many great presidents, the program has evolved into a leading agribusiness force in the state of New York.

Q: Where is NYTB today?

Today we are on the cusp of some of the most exciting times in New York racing and breeding. We have the richest program in the nation; through our current executive director Jeff Cannizzo we have an ongoing constructive dialog with our representatives in Albany. We will be working to keep the voice of the breed-

ing industry loud and clear as we move forward into the next legislative session.

Barry Ostrager laid the ground work for a great future, and it is now our job as the board of directors to move forward with not only protecting the interests of our membership but also searching for ways to improve the program to continue to attract quality mares and stallions to the state. With that eventuality we can build upon an already strong foal crop to supply owners and trainers with a quality product and stay competitive, not only state-wide but in the national and global arenas.

Q: All the arrows seem to be pointing up for the New York-bred program. What is in the works to keep it going?

As we move forward, we would like to engage our membership and get their voices heard so we can take care of many of their needs and protect their interests to the best of our ability. I am fortunate to be part of a very caring and dedicated board of directors that year after year gives their input. Collectively the board has almost a half-century of experience in the local breeding and racing industry.

We have grown as a cohesive force with one goal, to continue to improve and grow our flagship program as a guiding force, not only in New York but as an industry leader.

We are stewards of the land as well as guardians of some of the most important racing in the world, which makes New York a unique and beautiful place to live and work. Our races are held in the highest esteem in the American Stud Book and throughout the world. When a horse wins grade I races in New York, they have the potential to shape, influence, and improve the overall breed for vears to come. I hold this fact dear to my heart and, along with our board, assume this responsibility with the utmost dignity and respect for the ones (horses and people) who have come before us and the ones who will follow in their footsteps.

On the agenda right now is to spice up some of our already fabulous events and event schedule for the enjoyment of our members, increase membership by adding benefits, and substantially raising the bar for our annual scholarship program.

Q: Working with the state legislature is a key element to the position. How is the current relationship with NYTB and Albany? Is there anything on the horizon to watch for (or be thankful for)? Our relationship with the state legislature has been extremely productive over the past few years. A lot of time is spent in Albany keeping our presence felt so we don't become another face in the crowd. We are very serious when it comes to our role as representatives of a \$4 billion industry encompassing agriculture; green space; 30,000 hard-working people who are fully invested in this costly endeavor which also represents around 30,000 votes that are all important in the fall.

We are working on some new initiatives, but they are in the planning stages so we wouldn't want to jinx anything by mentioning things prematurely. One program we are discussing—which is on everybody's mind—is aftercare and re-purposing the beloved horses we all spend our lives raising. We will have something to present to the membership this summer or fall.

Q: Barry Ostrager headed the board during some heady times for NYTB. What were some of his major accomplishments and how have they advanced the program?

Barry's work has been invaluable to the New York Breeding Program as well as the state's Thoroughbred industry at large. Barry, in his extended reign as president, bridged a huge gap between the New York Racing Association and the NYTB that has been invaluable over the years and will be for years to come. He also paved the way for a working relationship with the new administration in Albany as well as the gaming commission. The relationships he developed

have brought NYTB to the bargaining table. His will be very big shoes to fill.

Q: As manager of Parting Glass Racing, has an interest in New York-breds increased among the partners? Has the program helped in recruiting new participants?

I've always been a huge proponent of the New York breeding and racing program. It just makes so much sense to me to take advantage of the huge purses, stakes program, and running at the best racetracks in the country.

There is a not a lot of explanation to understand what our business model is and for a new person there's a whole lot to get excited about.

Q: As a sales agent, how has the value of a New York-bred foal, yearling, in-foal mare evolved over the past few years? What can we look forward to in 2015, 2016?

With the market swinging from big pedigree to big physical over the past 25 years and the demand for the individual athlete coming to the forefront, people pay a lot more attention no matter what state you are in. The buyers these days are much more selective, and, may I say, sophisticated, without pissing off too many old-timers (me being one) out there?

The big part of the market you are selling into is re-sellers, and this fairly large group, along with the modern-day retail consumers, have some of the sharpest eyes in the business. Add to that your horse has to pass a rigorous vet exam. As a breeder, you probably have pre-selected your horses for the sale you are targeting. I guess my point is you have to do a lot of homework to get a horse to sell well, and New York breeders are doing that along with breeders all over the country. As a result, the New York-bred horses represented at sales are generally selling better and running faster than ever before.

Q: Were you at the Belmont for American Pharoah's Triple Crown victory? If so, tell us about the experience.

Momentous. Stupendous. Ground -quaking. I was shaking like a leaf, quivering like child, with tears in my eyes and screaming at the top of my lungs and high-fiveing everyone in sight. I have goose bumps right now talking about this...it was just freakin' cool!



King Trumps in Poker

New York-bred King Kreesa holds hot hand in grade III Poker Stakes

NEW YORK-BRED KING KREESA might not be getting the support at the mutuel windows his record deserves, but he is surely appreciated by those closest to him. Despite having won the Poker Stakes (gr. IIIT) two years ago, the King Cugat gelding was sent away from the gate of the June 13 edition at odds of 17-1, as most of the betting public backed Chilean import Il Campione, who along with U.S. stakes winner Bal a Bali dominated in South America last year.

But under Jose Ortiz, King Kreesa broke for the lead over the Belmont Park turf and was allowed to settle into a steady rhythm, clicking off modest fractions of :23.69, :47.76, and 1:10.97 in the one-mile Poker.

Heart to Heart was the closest pursuer but never got inside a length away from the leader. Il Campione came calling from a stalking position, and Vyjack, prominent on the Triple Crown trail two years ago, closed from far back, but King Kreesa held sway to the wire, taking the Poker by three-quarters of a length from Vyjack, with Il Campione third. The 6-year-old King Kreesa completed the course in 1:33.48, or .17 seconds faster than he did in his 2013 victory in the race. David Donk is the winning trainer.

Bred by Horse Partners out of the Storm Creek mare Storm's Advance, King Kreesa has won eight of his 24 starts, with five seconds and four thirds. He sits on the cusp of becoming a millionaire, with \$985,370 earned for his owners Susan and Gerald Kresa, who traveled from their home in Minnesota to enjoy their pride and joy in New York.

Perhaps King Kreesa's third-place finish in the May 25 Kingston Stakes against New York-breds swayed gam-

blers away from him. That was a mistake.

"The race before was better than it looked," said Gerald Kresa. "We thought we would take a shot in open company."

Why not? King Kreesa had run second in the 2012 Jamaica Handicap (gr. IT), second in the 2013 Fourstardave Handicap (gr. IIT), and third in that year's Fort Marcy Stakes and Appleton Stakes (both gr. IIIT).

Horse Partners bought Storm's Advance, and the Kresas wound up owning a majority interest in her.

"He has so much heart and just doesn't give up," Gerald Kresa said. "He looked great as a foal but was a little tough to handle. Even after he was gelded, he was high-strung, but I think that is a trait that helps him win races."

Tired of hearing their name mispronounced, the Kresas added an extra "e" to the gelding's name to ensure a long "e" sound.

"We are so proud of 'King,' " said Susan Kresa. "He had a cracked hoof last year and didn't race much, but this spring he gave us that look again that he was ready to go. He's got a heart of gold."

The Kresas have but two horses in training currently, and the other, Lady Kreesa, a Stonecider half sister to the Poker winner, is stakes-placed, having run third in the New York Stallion Stakes last June. The Kresas said King Kreesa may make his next start July 11 in the \$150,000 Forbidden Apple Stakes at Belmont.

All but about a thousand dollars of King Kreesa's earnings have come over turf. In addition to his two Poker scores, he won the 2012 London Company Stakes and that year's New York Stallion Spectacular Bid Stakes on grass, the 2014 West Point Stakes on the Saratoga turf, and the 2013 Mohawk Stakes and that year's Kingston Stakes over Belmont grass. Two years ago he made the journey to Hong Kong for the Longines Hong Kong Mile (HK-I) but ran unplaced there.

King Kreesa's third dam, Advance Reason, should be known to New Yorkers who remember her score in the 1979 Ruthless Stakes (gr. III) at Aqueduct.

Chances Are

Hayden, Baker took a chance with Possessed; Dreamboat Annie sets sail

POSSESSED, A 3-YEAR-OLD SON OF POSSE, does all of his talking on the race-track. His latest victory, a resounding 6³/4-length triumph in the \$95,000 Spectacular Bid division of the New York Stallion Stakes June 21 spoke volumes to the colt's present ability and future potential.

But if Possessed were able to get another message out, surely he'd gallop past the know-it-all veterinarians who pronounced him unworthy of being entered into the yearling sales and snicker.

"The horse was bred by Vinery (Grapestock). He had deformed hocks as a foal, so we had to do surgery," said co-owner Dan Hayden, who began managing Sugar Maple Farm approximately 14 years ago. Hayden owns Possessed in partnership with the colt's trainer Charlton Baker. "When he was a yearling, the vets told us that

no one would buy him at the sales. So we called Charlie (Baker), asked if he would take a chance on training the horse, and he did. I guess Possessed is the poster boy for how wrong the vets can be sometimes. Because he can really run."

Baker was actually given part ownership of the horse as a gift, and the talented trainer has certainly brought out the best in him.

The Spectacular Bid, contested at seven furlongs, scratched down to a field of four sophomores after the race came off the grass and was moved to the main track due to heavy morning rains. Patiently handled by jockey Jose Ortiz, Possessed was allowed to let his trio of rivals take turns scrimmaging for the early lead while he raced in-hand, reserved off the pace.

The fractions were swift over the muddy track—an opening quarter-mile in :22.82 and the half-mile in :46.49.

Three-wide on Belmont Park's sweeping far turn, Possessed cruised alongside of the leaders and awaited his cue. When Ortiz asked for run in upper stretch, the colt asserted his dominance, drawing off through the lane in a muchthe-best score.

The final time was 1:25.17.

"It's a great thrill to win a race like this with Charlie, especially a New Yorkbred stakes. We've been doing stuff together for a long time. We met when (Sugar Maple Farm) started giving him horses (to train) 14 years ago, and we've been friends ever since," said Hayden, who hails from Ireland and originally came to the United States on a student visa before meeting John Nerud and Howard Kaskel. "He's just a gutsy horse. He's got speed and can carry it a little bit. That's from his pedigree."

Possessed is out of the Mr. Greeley mare Ibetyouwishyouknew.

It was the third win (second stakes) for Possessed in nine career starts, increasing his earnings to \$195,575.

"He tries hard, and he shows up every time he runs," said Baker. "The last time out he broke a little slow and had some traffic trouble (a sixth-place finish behind the promising Ostrolenka in the May 25 Mike Lee Stakes). He trained well on the turf. I'm not quite sure when but we're going to give him (his first start) over it soon. But you never

know (if what you see in the morning) translates to the afternoon."

Secured Position, Fenwick Hall (the lone filly in the field), and Ex Ex Ex completed the order of finish.

The Spectacular Bid was named after the son of Bold Bidder who won the 1979 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I), as well as Eclipse Awards at ages 2, 3, and 4. His trainer Buddy Delp famously referred to Spectacular Bid as "the greatest horse ever to look through a bridle." Spectacular Bid stood in New York from 1991-2003.

Dream Trip

In her budding four-race career, Dreamboat Annie, who registered a determined three-quarter-length victory in the \$98,000 Cupecoy's Joy division of the New York Stallion Stakes later on the card, has made both her owners and breeder very happy—each content with their roles in her success.

"Breeding to me is a good business (as opposed to owning). For one, you don't have to feed them. You watch them run and relax," said breeder Michael Spielman, who approximately 30 years ago, along with the late Richard Bomze, had a hand in the breeding of New York racing legend Fourstardave. "It's like found money with the New York-bred program. It's great."

Dreamboat Annie, a sophomore daughter of Freud, is owned in partnership by Crown Stable (Tom Qualtere), Who Wudda Thunk Racing, and Debora Kinns. According to trainer Leah Gyarmati, Qualtere was instrumental in allowing her to take the unraced 3-year-old, who had been sidelined by a case of pneumonia, to Gulfstream Park in Florida. In repayment, Dreamboat Annie broke her maiden there on the turf in late March in her debut.

Next came a pair of races in New York, a hard fought third-place finish in the Park Avenue division of the April 26 New York Stallion stakes, and then an eye-catching win on the turf in an allowance test May 24.

Out of the starting gate in the sevenfurlong Cupecoy's Joy, Dreamboat Annie was in a tough spot, under pressure

and racing along the rail in the field of five. But midway on the far turn, Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez made a move worthy of his

enshrinement. He deftly backed Dreamboat Annie out of that compromising position before easing her to the outside (four-wide) in the stretch to make a run at Michael Henning's Perfect Freud who had edged clear.

The two combatants battled gamely through the lane until Dreamboat Annie extended her stride to power past with a surge of late energy.

Dreamboat Annie, out of the Honour and Glory mare Extra Impact, stopped the timer in 1:25.64.

She has now won three of four starts, with earnings of \$131,200.

"I liked her conformation; I liked her bloodlines. She just looked like the real deal," said Qualtere, whose group purchased the filly privately. Qualtere's Crown Stable currently owns three Thoroughbreds, all in training with Gyarmati.

"She showed a lot of promise from day one. We were really high on her," said Gyarmati, who praised Velazquez' ride and is looking forward to the Sara-



toga meeting where she will have many options (dirt or turf, state-bred or open company) with Dreamboat Annie.

Perfect Freud, from the barn of trainer Gary Sciacca, was a game runner-up in the Cupecoy's Joy. The Lewis Dinner, owned by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and Gary Aisquith finished in third.

The Cupecoy's Joy is named for one of the early New York-bred grade I winners. She recorded victories in the Acorn Stakes (gr. I) and Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I) in consecutive starts in 1982. The speedy daughter of Northerly was bred by Robert Perez who owned her in partnership with Ri-Ma-Ro Stables. Her bright yellow silks led the way for the opening mile of the 1982 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) before finishing 10th.

Interestingly enough, neither Spectacular Bid nor Cupecoy's Joy made a mark on the turf. So it was fitting both divisions of the New York Stallion Stakes were moved to the main track.

The Golden One

HARVEY WEINSTEIN WAS IN A DAZE as he tried to absorb all he had just witnessed and all that was happening in the aftermath of Haynesfield's victory in the Suburban Handicap (gr. II) on July 3, 2010.

The race itself was pretty much a blur for the owner of Turtle Bird Stable, who at the time had 13 horses in training with Steve Asmussen. The New York division of the stable was being run by Asmussen's assistant Toby Sheets, who was the one Weinstein contacted on a regular basis.

"I have to watch the replay to see how he won," Weinstein said after the race. "Did he win easy? I was nervous the whole way. Usually I faint."

What Weinstein didn't know at the time was that the Suburban was merely a launching pad for the New York-bred son of Speightstown—Nothing Special, by Tejabo, who previously had proved himself to be a solid runner who had excelled in state-bred, listed, and grade III stakes.

But after his breakout performance in the historic Suburban Handicap, Haynes-field continued to move up the class ladder, even after a fourth-place finish in Saratoga's Whitney Handicap (gr. I) when he broke through the gate, with the assistant starter holding on for dear life.

Despite the unfortunate turn of events, Haynesfield rebounded with a stunning four-length victory in the 1¼-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I), in which he easily defeated the Whitney winner Blame, who would bounce back to win the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), dealing Zenyatta the lone defeat of her career.

Once again, Weinstein, who had purchased Haynesfield from Vision Racing after his second career start, couldn't grasp the enormity of his horse's achievement.

He had to watch the replay in the Trustees Room, and when he heard track announcer Tom Durkin say, "Ramon Dominguez is like a statue," only then did he realize just how easy a victory this was.

"This was unbelievable," he said. "I didn't think it was this good. This is impressive."

Weinstein paid tribute to Sheets.

"I speak to Toby every day," he said. "When he says jump, I ask, 'How high?' Experimental I buy this horse after his maiden victory, he's taken his time with him and has always done the right thing with him."

Sheets said Weinstein was deserving of this victory, having paid his dues for years.

"I'm happy for Harvey," Sheets said. "He's invested lots of money into the game and didn't do well for a long time. He allowed me to take my time with this colt because he was immature and he had little things here and there. Harvey is really good about letting you do what's right for the horse. He loves his horses and finds homes for all of them when their careers are over."

Weinstein, who resides in upstate New York, named his stable Turtle Bird after his love of turtles and his wife's love of birds.

Following the Gold Cup, Haynesfield had a horrible trip in the Breeders' Cup Classic, getting caught in traffic early and having to steady sharply, eventually tiring and finishing 11th. However he rebounded off that effort to finish second, beaten a head by Jersey Town, in the grade I Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile Handicap.

Although a physical setback compromised his 5-year-old campaign in 2011, he still managed to win the Mc-Mahon Adena Empire Classic Stakes and finish fourth in the Cigar Mile and Westchester Stakes (gr. III) to conclude his career with 10 victories in 19 starts

for earnings of \$1,319,481.

Haynesfield was bred by Barry Weisbord and Margaret (Peggy) Santulli, wife of Weisbord's longtime partner Richard Santulli. Weisbord is not known for breeding New York-breds but hit the jackpot with Haynesfield, who was foaled at Gallagher's Stud near Ghent, N.Y. He was the fifth winner produced by Nothing Special.

"Some time when the New York-bred program escalated in the early 2000s, Rich Santulli and I started to send up a mare or two every year because we race around New York and the program was so good," Weisbord said. "This was a mare we had bought as a 3-year-old in Canada as an allowance winner and sent her to Alan Goldberg (to train), where she became a stakes winner and graded stakesplaced and made quite a bit of money (\$266.590).

"I bought her because I was good friends with David Willmot and he had a couple of horses out of that family who won the Queen's Plate, and so I was familiar with the family. She had shown some ability, and we felt she was a decently bred mare from a nice family. We had a share in Speightstown, and that's how she got bred."

Haynesfield's third dam, Cool Mood, won the Canadian Oaks, and is the dam of 1989 Canadian Broodmare of the Year Passing Mood, dam of Canadian Triple Crown winner With Approval

and Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Touch Gold.

"When Haynesfield was a young horse in training, we sold the mare," Weisbord said. "I remember asking Steve Asmussen at the time if he thought he was special and he said he was just a horse."

Haynesfield had an unusual and dubious career in the sales ring. He was consigned as a yearling to the Keeneland September sale, where he brought \$100,000 from Maverick Racing. Pinhooked the following year to the Keeneland April 2-year-olds in training sale, he was sold to Vision Racing for only \$20,000.

"He must have had a vet issue," Weisbord said. "The mare didn't throw great physical specimens. She was an extended sprinter who could run herself. We might have made a few mistakes in the stallions we bred her to. We gave her some good chances, but this was the one that worked."

Haynesfield made his career debut for Vision Racing, with Asmussen listed as trainer, finishing a well-beaten third. But in his second start, he wired his field going 6½ furlongs, winning easily by 4½ lengths. That is when Sheets recommended that Weinstein buy the

horse, feeling he had a bright future.

It didn't take long for Sheets' opinion to be justified, as Haynesfield romped by 5¼ lengths in the Damon Runyon Stakes for New York-breds in his next start and followed that up with a 3½-length score in the Count Fleet Stakes and a 6¼-length laugher in the

Whirlaway Stakes, both in open company. But any chance of the horse becoming a Derby contender was lost when he finished a badly beaten eighth in Gotham Stakes (gr. III) behind I Want Revenge, in which he suffered an injury that would keep him out for seven months.

He was beaten a head in the Sir Keys Stakes in his return before rattling off victories in the Empire Classic Stakes, Discovery Handicap (gr. III), an allowance optional claimer, and the Suburban Handicap.

Haynesfield was retired to Airdrie Stud near Midway, Ky., where he stands for a \$10,000 stud fee.

For all those who have been part of the Haynesfield story, they have been rewarded, both monetarily and in the thrills he provided.

"We collected a lot of hardware and New York Horse of the Year," Weisbord said. "We received a number of New York-bred awards.

"Everyone likes breeding a good horse, especially out of a mare we raced. I'm pretty sure the mare was the only horse who raced in Peggy Santulli's name with me. At one point Peggy wanted to get more involved so we bought this filly. Seeing her become a good producer, there's something very special about that."


