## Well Worth the Wait

**SINCE THE LATE 1990S**, advocates for equine and agricultural tourism operations have been working on a serious problem. New York was one of the few states that did not have legislation to address the inherent risks associated with inviting the public onto equine and farming establishments, and the cost of liability insurance for farms, especially smaller farms, was out of control.

> Nearly two decades of persistence finally came to fruition in mid-June when the state legislature passed a bipartisan bill to establish limited liability protections for farm owners. The bill has been forwarded to Governor Cuomo's desk, where it is hoped he will sign it into law.

> As a member of the New York Farm Bureau (NYFB) Equine Committee, NYTB has worked closely with the NYFB on this problem over the years, but the issue has only become more pressing over time. In New York's increasingly litigious environment, uncertainty about potential liability for activity that takes place on farms meant that the number of insurance carriers willing to cover equine establishments and agricultural tourism operations was declining while the cost for liability coverage was increasing.

> The short title of the bill is the "safety in agricultural tourism act" and creates explicit and uniform standards for farm owners and farm visitors that remove uncertainties about potential liability. NYTB is pleased to report that that bill expressly covers "equine activities both indoors and outdoors" among a variety of agritourism-related activities (such as u-pick Christmas trees, hiking, hunting, production of maple sap, and winery tours). "Equine therapy" is excluded.

If signed into law, the bill outlines certain

stated responsibilities for farm owners and operators, including posting conspicuous notices and written information warning visitors about the inherent risks of participating in activities on their working farms. Visitors must also be alerted to their own "responsibility to exercise reasonable care regarding the disclosed risks of the agricultural activity."

The bill does not in any sense give equine operations blanket immunity from responsibility. Instead, it protects farm owners from lawsuits by individuals who fail to take responsibility for their own actions or engage in inherently risky activities or situations over which the farmer has no control.

The Assembly bill (A00559A), sponsored by Assemblywoman Carrie Woerner, was passed June 8. The matching State bill (S01152-A), sponsored by Senator Robert Ortt, was approved June 13, 2017 (S01152-A). I strongly recommend that you look up the bills online to review the details.

Following the State Senate's passage of the bill, NYFB President David Fisher said, "The bipartisan legislation will hopefully assist farmers looking to have a better handle on business costs in a competitive marketplace. The significance of that support cannot be understated." As an advocate for New York's breeders and farm owners, I can only second him with emphasis.

I am honored to be part of the team that carried this legislation across the finish line, but it could not have been achieved without two decades of work and persistence on the part of many. The success rests on their shoulders, and everyone who has contributed to the process should be proud such a big win for our breeders and farm owners.

## **Disco Partner Delivers Record-Setting Performance**

A surprise-package runner-up in the 2016 running of the grade 3, \$300,000 Jaipur Invitational, Patricia Generazio's homebred Disco Partner not only got the job done on Belmont Day this time around, but in the process established a course, North American, and world-record time of 1:05.67 for six furlongs on turf.

Disco Partner is a son of the late Disco Rico, a speed-sensation who stood in New York from 2008 until 2013. The gray, now 5, had a successful three-year run with trainer Jim Ryerson and in last year's Jaipur, at odds of 16-1, finished a neck behind Pure Sensation, another gray Generazio homebred trained by Christophe Clement and let go at odds of 18-1. Pure Sensation's 2016 Jaipur victory established a new North American record for the distance on turf (1:06.76), and the all-Generazio exacta paid \$825.

Fast-forward one year. Both horses lined up for the Jaipur, but this time both were sent out by Clement, to whom Disco Partner had been transferred for his 2017 campaign. Disco Partner was sent off as third betting choice at odds of 9-2; his stablemate slightly better regarded at 7-2.

After the break, the late-running Disco Partner assumed his customary position, content to cruise along at the hedge with only two horses beaten and seven lengths off the pace set by Pure Sensation, who led the field through a sparkling opening quarter in :21.43.

Drawing closer through the far turn, Disco Partner cut the corner while Pure Sensation reasserted his lead from challengers Loose on the Town and Stormy Liberal after a half in :43.04.

Disco Partner closed into second at the rail, then tipped out between horses with a furlong to go. Unleashing his devastating closing kick, he collared Pure Sensation and outfinished 5-2 favorite Green Mask who was issuing a late bid, securing the half-length victory and putting his name in the record books for the blistering final time. Holding Gold (18-1) got up for third another length back while Pure Sensation settled for fourth.

"I saved all the ground and when I had horse, I got through, said jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. "We split horses and (Disco Partner) got there. He's a nice horse. He's doing so well."

Clement added, "Disco Partner had a great trip. Irad had him placed in a good position and he was able to take advantage and move forward to finish in the end. Irad has been riding great and he did a good job again here today."

Winner of two of five starts in 2016, including his first black-type victory in

the open Troy Stakes at Saratoga, Disco Partner returned this year after six months on the bench with a sensational victory in the seven-furlong Elusive Quality Stakes.

Not only talented but consistent, Disco Partner has a career record of seven wins, four seconds, and two thirds from 17 starts. The Jaipur win boosted his earnings bankroll to \$621,810.

Foaled at Keane Stud in Amenia, Disco Partner is a third-generation Generazio-bred. His second dam, Mary Lou's Magic (Concord Dream), was bred in Florida by Patricia Generazio and trained by her husband Frank. As a broodmare, Mary Lou's Magic produced six winners, including Lulu's Number, the dam of Disco Partner and a New Jersey-bred multiple winner of more than \$200,000 trained by Ben Perkins, Jr.

Lulu's Number (Numerous) has produced five winners, including Don Six's Number (Don Six), a stakes performer and earner of \$212,686. She has a 2-year-old filly by Posse named Lulu's Partner, and delivered a colt by First Samurai on February 14, 2017. By Sarah Mace

## I Still Miss You Wires Astoria Stakes

I Still Miss You (Majestic Warrior), the front-running winner of a five-furlong, New York-bred maiden special weight by 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths three weeks ago, wheeled right back to wire the \$150,000 Astoria Stakes for 2-year-old fillies at Belmont Park June 15, the opening day of the three-day Belmont Stakes Festival.

Third betting choice in the field of eight at odds of 4-1, I Still Miss You under Javier Castellano shot out of the gate and into the lead from post position two. She was soon joined by favorite Sugar Queen to her outside, then a three-wide Waki Patriot (6-1) through a first quarter mile in :22.19.

Leading her two rivals by a half-length entering the turn, I Still Miss You ended up shoulder-to-shoulder with Waki Patriot as they straightened out for the drive.

I Still Miss You kicked clear in upper stretch as Best Performance advanced into third. From that point Best Performance and Waki Patriot chased in vain.

In the final furlong, first under hand urging, then with a few reminders with the whip, I Still Miss You refused to give an inch of ground, and sailed home a 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>-length winner in a final time of 1:04.85.

Best Performance finished second, a head in front of Waki Patriot who crossed the wire 10 lengths ahead of the fourthplace finisher.

"It was a big field and with the inside post, I had to use her speed and she responded," said Castellano. "We didn't have a chance to rate; we had to send her because of the position she had. From the outside post, we can ask her to relax a little bit and don't push her too much.

"I think you'll be able to stretch her out. I think she's a straightforward filly; it's the first time I rode her. She'll move forward well."


Star Racing Stable, Matthew Hand, and Brian McKenzie, commented on the way I Still Miss You fared after her debut three weeks ago.

"Coming out of that race she's done everything right. She didn't lose any weight, her blood work remained good, and we thought she would give a similar effort her if she was fast enough and she proved that today."

Continued Englehart, "I thought Javier did a great job with her. I've had two great rides from her on Irad [Ortiz, Jr.] the first time, and Javier now and you're pretty lucky when you're in that company."

I Still Miss You has earned \$124,200 from her two wins.

Bred by Emcee Stable and foaled at Hickory Hill Farm Thoroughbreds, I Still Miss You is the first foal out of Maryland-bred Lion's Terms. The mare won 16 races for Englehart and Gold Star Racing Stable and earned \$235,042. Lion's Terms has a yearling colt by Blame and was bred last year to Orb. By Sarah Mace

## Wonderment Upsets Sloppy Dancin Renee

It was a topsy-turvy late-spring Saturday at Belmont Park.

For starters, NYRA canceled the card after the third race due to concerns about the safety of the racing surfaces.

What's more, the six-furlong, \$100,000 Dancin Renee Stakes for 3-and-up New Yorkbred fillies and mares, ended with a surprise. Wonderment, fourth choice in the field of five, ran away with the race, while 2-5 favorite Clipthecouponannie finished out of the money.

McPeek's Magdalena Racing, is a 4-yearold Cosmonaut filly with some back class, having won the grade 3 Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Park 2016.

After getting away cleanly in the Dancin Renee, Wonderment settled in fourth about seven paths off the fence while Super Alison, the longest shot on the board dwelt at the start and never got out of last place. Off a step slowly, Clipthecouponannie rushed to track the pacesetting Court Dancer, who struck a first quarter in 22.66.

As the field rounded the far turn, Clipthecouponannie weakened and was passed by Absatootly and Wonderment.

Absatootly and Wonderment caught Court Dancer midstretch and hooked up briefly, but Wonderment outfinished her rival, winning by five lengths

Runner-up Absatootly finished 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lengths clear of Court Dancer, who preserved the show by a neck. Clipthecouponannie finished fourth,. The final time for six furlongs over the sloppy (sealed) going was a 1:11.63.

Bred by Michael S. Landers and foaled at Mill Creek Farm in Stillwater, Wonderment sold as a weanling to Baccari Bloodstock for \$24,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton New York Fall Mixed sale. A \$47,000 buy-back the following year at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale, she was purchased for \$185,000 by Walking L Thoroughbreds at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, where she was offered as racing or broodmare prospect. The Dancin Renee was her third start for her new connections.

Sporting a record of four wins, two seconds and three thirds from 15 starts, Wonderment has earned \$329,120.



As supplied to Blood-Horse by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., include adjusted money from Japan, Hong Kong, and Singapore. Adjusted earnings are put on par with average North American earnings from the previous year. For example, the average North American purse per starter in 2016 is \$22,141 or 45% of the 2016 average purse in Japan. To put earnings on par, all Japanese progeny earnings are multiplied by 45% before being credited to a sire's progeny earnings. Hong Kong earnings are adjusted by 17%; Singapore by 65%. 

Top-line state-breds sell for \$900,000; \$500,000

## **Juvenile Market Wrap**

WHEN A JUVENILE SON OF MEDAGLIA D'ORO was sold for \$900,000 earlier this year at Fasig-Tipton's selected 2-year-olds in training sale at Gulfstream Park, it was further proof of how New York's breeding program has become mainstream and horses bred in the state are no longer only prized for the state's lucrative breeding program incentives.

The colt, bred by Marlene Brody's Gallagher's Stud, was purchased by the highpowered partnership of WinStar Farm and Breeze Easy and was the highest-priced New York-bred sold at auction this year. The colt was produced from the winning War Chant mare Wild Chant, a half sister to champion Untapable and to grade 1 winner and sire Paddy O'Prado.

Consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds to the Gulfstream sale, the colt, named Metropolis, had been bought for \$300,000 from Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga August yearling sale.

#### 2-Year-Old Sale Stats

Through June 20, 2017

New York-breds have long been in demand, ostensibly due to their enhanced value because of the lucrative owners' and breeders' awards available each year from the New York Breeding and Development Fund. But if the first seven juvenile auctions of 2017 are any indication, New York-breds are also in demand because of their overall attractiveness to buyers and not just the incentives.

Through the Ocala Breeders' Sale's June sale that was wrapped up on June 14, 206 New York-bred 2-year-olds had been sold at public auction in North America in 2017 for gross receipts of \$13.1 million, trailing only the \$142.1 million total paid for Kentucky-breds and the \$19.3 million fetched by the 400 horses bred in Florida.

The New York-bred juvenile average sale price of \$64,06 and median of \$32,000 outpaced those of Florida.

In partnership with China Horse Club, WinStar also purchased the second-most expensive New York-bred 2-year-old sold this year, going to \$500,000 for an Into Mischief colt from the female family of three-time grade 1 winner Classy Cathy. Bred by Oak Bluff Stables, the colt was consigned by Crupi's New Castle Farm, which had purchased him for \$175,000 from Winter Quarter Farm at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings.

Mallory Mort, who manages Gallagher's Stud near Ghent, N.Y., said the hefty prices fetched by the Medaglia d'Oro and Into Mischief colts and the success of state-bred 2-year-olds at auction show that market demand for New York-breds goes beyond the incentives offered by the breeding program.

"People are starting to look past just the New York-bred incentives—the restricted races, the owners' awards and breeders' awards—which help appreciate their value at yearling and 2-year-old sales but only up to a point," said Mort, vice president of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "Now I think people are really beginning to realize these New York-breds are pretty good and can run in open company and graded stakes and win and do well."

New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo

said prices paid for New York-breds at auctions this year reflect the improved quality of the state's horse population.

"The quality has risen so much; these horses have international pedigrees but happen to be state-breds," Cannizzo said. "When they are in the catalog, going through a breeze show, or performing on the track, it has become a little irrelevant to be concerned with whether they are a New York-bred or not. They are buying them just based on them being the best horses in the catalog.

"People are just looking to buy the best horse at the best price, and it just so happens that the quality of New Yorkbreds has risen so much they are falling into being the best horses at some of these sales."

Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning agrees that the sale results reflect the enhanced quality of New York-breds.

"Breeders in New York realize it's like other areas of the market and that quality is much more important than quantity, and they have made great strides in improving the overall quality both in terms of pedigree and conformation," he said.

"I think it shows you there is no ceiling for New York-breds, either on the racetrack or in the sales ring," Browning continued. "They have consistently proved in both those arenas they can compete at the highest levels and will continue to do so. It clearly eliminates any concerns about the potential for a New York-bred, either in the sales ring or on the racetrack."

# THE RIGHT MOVE

**WORKING OFF THE BASIC PREMISE** that success in horse racing requires skill, luck, and timing, it's safe to say Chris and Samantha Will Baccari were firing on all cylinders when they decided to focus more of their energies on the New York Thoroughbred industry.

In 2011 the newly approved revenue stream from video lottery terminals meant more people began to turn an eye toward the New York program, and not long after, Chris and Samantha felt becoming more involved in the state would pay dividends. They were right.

Operating both as joint and separate entities within the sport as Baccari Bloodstock and Jumping Jack Racing, the husband-and-wife team have had major success within the New York sales arena. When it comes to the races, Samantha is the breeder of Mind Your Biscuits, the reigning New York-bred Horse of the Year, whom she sold as a weanling.

"My husband and I are separate entities, but we are married, and we also do stuff together," said Samantha. "I keep six to eight mares, and my husband keeps maybe 15-20. When the Ontario program was still strong years ago, the New York one was starting to get strong, and I made the lucky choice to not send mares to Ontario. Instead, I sent two mares to New York, bred them to Posse, and sent them back up the next year, and, of course, that resulted in Mind Your Biscuits."

Mind Your Biscuits was named the 2016 New York-bred Horse of the Year based on a strong 3-year-old season that included victories in the Malibu Stakes (G1)

and Amsterdam Stakes (G2) as well as a third-place effort in the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1; was elevated to second via disqualification). This year the chestnut colt has gone on to impress on the international stage by winning the Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1).

"At the same time I started sending mares to New York, that is also when we went to our first New York fall sale," Samantha said. "We were one of two or three people from Kentucky up there, and we bought nine or 10 to resell the following year in the New York-bred yearling sale. We came back and sold our Kentucky-sired New York-breds well. We bought a Super Saver for \$50,000 and sold him for \$230,000, and we bought a Tale of Ekati for \$62,000 and sold him for \$180,000, but we did have a problem getting reasonable values on the New York sires.

"That is part of the reason initially I put Mind Your Biscuits in the weanling sale. We do this to make money. When I sold him for \$47,000, that was a fair amount of money for a Posse weanling. I have done well selling homebred weanlings. Sometimes when you know what you have is good, it is good to sell then instead of waiting."

#### **Changing Tides**

A key reason Chris also turned his attention to New York is simple: his respect for the overall program and the lasting value racing well there brings to a pedigree page.

"For me, my goal is either to have horses I sell that can compete in the New York circuit or have horses myself that can run up there," he said. "It is just the best place to run. It is the most prestigious, and you get a lot more credibility when you do well up there.

"I used to run in the Midwest, and we used to do things differently, and I have been slowly trying to push the New York direction. The breeder awards program is a big deal, and I just think the whole of racing is better up there."

Once the Baccaris began participating in the New York sales, they quickly found success. The first year of selling, from a draft of 11 in the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York-bred preferred yearling sale, they had the two previously mentioned six-figure horses as well as two others that went on to be stakes winners.

"It's hard to beat 'Biscuit' as far as what the biggest success in New York has been, but we did well with a filly named Wonderment whom we sold to Kenny McPeek," said Chris. "She won the Bourbonette Oaks (G3) last year. We also sold a colt by Bustin' Stones that year named Bust Another, and he is a New York-bred stakes winner as well.

"We had two stakes winners the first year we went up to try it that came out of our consignment. The whole thing for me is that my horses have to perform for other people when they buy them from me. It is a little like having a restaurant: people remember where they got bad food and they remember where they got good food. The horses have to perform."

Figuring out the best way to be successful at New York sales has required a learning curve about what matters most to buyers.

A perfect example of that is Wonderment, a Cosmonaut filly that Baccari Bloodstock acquired as a weanling for \$24,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton New York Saratoga fall mixed sale. When it came to sell her as a yearling, she failed to meet her reserve at \$47,000. Once proven, however, Wonderment sold at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale for \$185,00.

Meanwhile, they bought Bust Another as a weanling for \$48,000 and sold him the following year for \$80,000.

"People can be hard on these consignments," said Chris. "To be honest, I thought Wonderment was an excellent physical, but I had a very hard time selling her because they were very critical on pedigree. It's the craziest thing I have ever seen. I wasn't trying to get crazy money for them, but it was life and death to make that filly bring \$40,000. With Bust Another, I thought he could have done better too, but they were very critical on those kinds of horses.

"Everybody forgets when the yearlings leave Saratoga, they have one common denominator: They are all maidens. The whole thing that determines value in a horse is that they have to be a good enough physical, and their pedigree will dictate what they should bring after that. That's how it is supposed to be, but sometimes people only want pedigree and the physical is secondary. However, you can't take a pedigree up to the stewards, and say, 'I was supposed to win that race; look at my pedigree.'"

Although the sale records for Mind Your Biscuits, Wonderment, and Bust Another were not overly robust, they have more than proved their

worth on the racetrack. Mind Your Biscuits leads the way with more than \$2 million in earnings while Bust Another has earned \$310,598 and Wonderment, with her victory in the June 17 Dancing Renee Stakes has earned \$329,120.

#### Looking Ahead

The Baccaris might have been early to the scene as far as Kentucky-based players getting involved with New York, but plenty of competition has since joined them.

"From the first time we bought weanlings out of the New York sale to last year is a big difference," said Samantha. "The first year we were there we weren't battling against anybody, and the next year we went we had to stretch a whole lot more to buy them. It's excellent for New York."

It should come as no surprise that after the success of Mind Your Biscuits, Samantha still sends a few mares to New York and plans to continue to do so.

"Honestly, I didn't even realize I had bred Mind Your Biscuits until I got the first breeder's award check because I forgot to put him in my stable mail," she said. "It's a great program, and I think you have got a lot more people from Kentucky who are foaling out up there with Kentucky sires.

However, every year they are trying to upgrade and step up the stallion selection in New York.

"This year I sent up a Carson City mare in foal to Awesome Again that Gary and Sue Lundy are going to foal out for me. For next year I have a Beau Genius mare in foal to Carpe Diem and a Danehill mare in foal to Verrazano, so those two will go up to next year to get foaled out. We do go and participate in the economy, and the Lundys have done a great job for me."

For the Baccaris, making sure the horses they offer have been well raised will always be an integral part of the business plan. On the home front they have a property in Kentucky that benefits from Elkhorn Creek, and they dedicate a lot of man hours to raising their horses right, even though it can cost more to do so.

"We put them on the best land we can put them on, and we do everything in hand, no machines," said Chris. "I have a Eurociser, but we just have to spray Roundup in it because when I bought the place it

had one. It's never been used. Everything is either ponied or swam. We monitor what nutrition they need, what kind of vitamins they might need. We don't do it right before the sale. It is a constant, slowly bringing them along the process, as opposed to, 'Hey, it is 30 or 60 days from the sale; we better get ready.'"

Although Chris estimates this way of raising horses can cost anywhere from one-third to twice as much as other means, he maintains that the resulting horses make it worth it. The goal is to raise quality horses that will attract buyers, and hopefully in turn, those buyers become repeat customers.

"You can have all the money you want, but if you don't have a real good team of people with you to do things, it just won't work," he said. "The whole thing is you don't want to be hard on these horses. They are fragile as yearlings. As they get older, their bones harden up, but when they are young horses, it is very easy for them to have little issues. When somebody buys from us, I want to have done everything we could do to make it work for the new owner. We have raised each horse the best we possibly could, and we do it the right way. We try to be very good caretakers and good shepherds throughout the whole thing."

# SWEETER DEAL

### Malatinos use their skills marketing new stallion War Dancer

**WHEN MILLIONAIRE WAR DANCER** launched his stud career in New York this year, his owners, Anthony and Robin Malatino, already had a very specific business plan in place for the son of War Front who stands at Rockridge Stud near Hudson.

"We looked at this as a business...building a business from the ground up," said Robin Malatino, who along with her husband campaigned the multiple graded stakes-winning War Dancer for the latter portion of his racing career in their Diamond M Stable colors. "We've learned that the most important ingredient is the mare. We already figured we've got the stallion, so now we have to go out and get the absolute best mares. So how do you get the absolute best mares?

"We looked around and saw that some of the best mares in New York leave the state and go to Kentucky and come back to foal," she continued. "So, they are already on a train to leave. They are already spoken for, so to speak."

The Malatinos, who have been married for 17 years and are both senior vice president portfolio managers at Morgan Stanley in Celebration, Fla., devised an incentive program to lure out-of-state mares to New York to breed to War Dancer and then for them to drop their foals in the Empire State. One of the goals behind their first venture into the stallion-standing business is to make breeders in New York and elsewhere aware of the benefits of breeding to sires residing in New York State.

Their program is called "Breeding with the Stars," and its perks sweeten the pot for the breeders of the selected mares that are covered by the only son of top sire War Front standing in New York. The incentives attached to the Malatinos' program further bolster an already sweet deal for breeders whose mares are covered by New York sires. New York-sired New York-breds are eligible to receive 30% in award money when they win a race in New York, versus the 15% offered to out-of-state sired runners.

War Dancer, inside, won the 2014 Louisville Handicap while representing the Diamond M Stable colors

"We set the criteria at stakesperforming or stakes-producing mares, and they had to nick well with War Dancer," Robin Malatino explained. "Then we had to find a way to get the mare to come to New York, so we decided to provide for that mare's round-trip transportation, 90-day board. They pay the stud fee, of course. We probably had 75 to 100 inquire about the program, and we selected 32 mares from out of state. We have some really nice mares.

"If you think about what we did, we shifted the risk from the mare owner to us," she added. "Because it's a risk when you send your mare out of state. You have the transportation cost, the board cost. In our case, we're bearing that risk, so we could be pretty selective about who got into the program."

War Dancer won or placed in 11 stakes, nine of them graded. He won the 2013 Virginia Derby (G2T) and 2014 Louisville Handicap (G3T). His dam, Deed I Do, was the runner-up in the Bonnie Miss Stakes (G2) and a daughter of Carter Handicap (G1) winner and Preakness Stakes (G1) runner-up Alydeed.

War Dancer stood his initial season for \$5,000. The Malatinos said he covered 115 mares this year, including some owned by the couple, and they reported that approximately 50 were either stakes-producing or stakes-performing mares. Next year the stallion's fee will increase to \$7,500.

"The first attraction of the 'Breeding with the Stars' is you can breed to a son of War Front and drop in New York and have a New York-bred, which is worth a lot," Anthony Malatino said. "If we're going to have good mares leaving the state to breed, we need to get good ones in the state. Just getting them to New York is a feat in and of itself. You have to understand it's very difficult for someone from Kentucky to send their mare to New York to be bred because they are not going to know the farms here, and there is the shipping cost. It's easier to walk their mare across the street in Kentucky and breed her and comfortably walk her back to her stall."

The majority of the "Breeding with the Stars" mares are boarded at the Malatinos' Sugar Plum Farm near Saratoga Springs. The nearly 100-acre farm is located on Gilbert Road, less than a mile east of Saratoga Race Course. The Malatinos purchased the land in 2007, and the farm was built five years later. There are two barns and a total of 20 stalls and an abundance of paddock space.

Anthony Malatino grew up in the Saratoga Springs area, and horses have always been near and dear to his heart. While in college, he was a groom at Saratoga's harness track, and later he became a Thoroughbred owner.

"The problem with building a farm, where we're located pretty much on Union Avenue, is that it's not 40 miles out in the country where you can put up a steel building and a barn. If you're going to build something, you have to build something upscale. We thought about it and decided if we're going to do it, let's do it right. If you saw the property, everybody agrees we did it right. People have told us if a horse comes to Sugar Plum that horse has won Lotto. Nothing gets better than this if you're a horse. This is like the Ritz-Carlton for horses."

Just as splashy as Sugar Plum is, so too was the marketing campaign rolled out by Robin Malatino to promote War Dancer. The Malatinos know a thing or two about brand management. In the 1990s they owned the beverage company that manufactured the popular Saratoga Spring Water, which is easily identifiable by its deep blue-hued bottle.

Robin Malatino came up with the notion to feature War Dancer as "America's Most Eligible Stud," a take-off on the popular reality show, "The Bachelor."

The social media campaign allowed people to follow along on Facebook and Twitter as War Dancer embarked on his stallion career.

"I looked at the stallion directory, which is the size of a phone book, and as I was paging through it, I thought,



They all look the same, with that same pose,' " she said. "I wondered how you differentiate yourself in this world where the horse is almost like a commodity. Our background is taking the bottled water company and turning it into much more of a branded product—putting it in the blue bottle and everything else—talk about learning how to work with a commodity. We basically applied that same approach to War Dancer. We needed to create celebrity status and in order to do that, we needed a television show. This year it was a bit of a blog with some video.

"Next year we're going all out. It's going to be full video—literally, tune in this week to the 'War Dancer Show.' We will have celebrities in the video, and it's going to be really cool. We're going to be doing things differently over the next year. We're using an Amazon approach to building our business and building War Dancer as far as the customer service.

"You have to have some fun," Malatino added. "I've got to tell you, one or

two out of 10 people hate what we're doing, but eight out of 10 people can't wait for the next episode."

The Malatinos are also active at the racetrack. They have approximately 15 horses in training, racing some horses in partnerships. Their trainers are Hall of Famer Bill Mott, Charlton Baker, Joe Sharp, and Ian Wilkes. Last year the couple hit Saratoga's Fasig-Tipton New York-bred preferred yearling sale and came away with several pricey horses, including a son of Dialed In for \$260,000, who is named Dial Tone, and a son of Paynter for \$255,000, whom they named Vincent Van Gogo.

"We love the New York program and bought five horses at the preferred sale last year," Robin Malatino said. "And from a breeders' standpoint, it's a nobrainer. We have this one New Yorkbred, Robin's Destiny, whom we bred and is named after you know who. She ran at Aqueduct this year and won a \$40,000 claiming race, so we get the purse, and we then get another \$7,500 as the breeder because she is sired by Rule, who was standing in New York (at the time of conception).

"A very important point that needs to be stressed is that when you're a breeder of a New York-bred by an out-of-state stallion you get 15% of the purse, but when you have a New York-bred whose sire is in New York, you get 30% of the purse. That can't be stressed enough."



### New York-bred fulfills breeders' Belmont dreams by teresa genaro

**JOAN TAYLOR REMEMBERS** a night at Sperry's "old bar," long before the downtown Saratoga restaurant was renovated. She was there with Bill Wilmot, and their conversation, as it so often did, turned to horses.

"It was many, many years ago," said Taylor: "I don't know if Bill and I were already married or still in vet school, but he told me that his dream was to breed a horse that would run in one of the Triple Crown races."

On June 10, Wilmot's dream came true, when Twisted Tom, the horse that he and Taylor bred at their Stepwise Farm in Saratoga, ran in the Belmont Stakes.

"For me personally," said Wilmot, "if I'm dreaming of races, they're the Kentucky Derby, the Belmont, and the Travers. To run in one of those three is pretty special."

"Reaching any grade 1 is something to be happy about, and it's wonderful when it's in your backyard," said Taylor. "Sometimes I think, 'Pinch me—is this really happening?' We're located in New York, and we think the New York-bred incentive program is a wonderful, wonderful thing."

Married this year for 33 years, Taylor and Wilmot are fixtures on the New York breeding scene, Taylor serving on the board of New York Thoroughbred Breeders and Wilmot on the board of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund. They bred New York champion and graded stakes winner Naughty New York, whose dam, Naughty Natisha, was New York broodmare of the year.

Wilmot and Taylor breed primarily to sell but at times over the last couple of years, it seemed they might end up campaigning the son of Creative Cause out of Tiffany Twisted (Thunder Gulch).

Twisted Tom, from the first crop of Creative Cause who stands at Airdrie Stud near Midway, Ky., is the stallion's leading money earner.

"When we saw Creative Cause at Airdrie," said Wilmot, "he had a lot of presence; he's a big, rangy gray. He was a grade 1 winner (the 2011 Norfolk Stakes), and he was third in the Preakness, and for \$15,000, that's a lot of horse."

"The clincher for me," he continued, "is that he's out of a killer mare, Dream of Summer, a top-notch stakes mare out in California. She ran a lot and she was tough and sound, and I like that."

Dream of Summer ran 20 times, compiling a record of 10-4-3, including the Apple

Blossom Handicap (G1) in 2005, with earnings just shy of \$1.2 million.

On his damside, Twisted Tom is a second-generation Stepwise homebred. Tiffany Twisted is out of the Seattle Slew mare Miss Turlington, purchased by Wilmot and Taylor for \$100,000 at the 1994 Keeneland November sale. She produced 11 winners for Stepwise, including two-time graded stakes winner Incurable Optimist; Tiffany Twisted has six offspring of racing age, all winners. Twisted Tom is her first stakes winner.

Twisted Tom failed to meet a reserve at two yearling sales; though he was, according to Taylor, "a really well-conformed, handsome yearling," his size and a banged-up sesamoid kept buyers away.

"People tend to want smaller horses," she said. "They think they come together more quickly, and in general that's true."

So Taylor and Wilmot sent him to Florida to be broken at Niall and Stephanie Brennan's farm and entered him in the OBS April sale of 2-year-olds in training. When he failed again to attract interest, they withdrew him.

Trainer George Weaver, who had visited Stepwise Farm and done business with Wilmot and Taylor, approached Brennan about purchasing the horse privately, and Twisted Tom made his first two starts for Weaver and owner Thomas Brockley. After he broke his maiden at Belmont Park last fall, bloodstock agent Steve Young approached Cobra Farm's Gary Biszantz, who paid \$150,000 for the horse that as a yearling couldn't attract a bid higher than \$22,000, owning him with R R Partners.

"I've known him 40 or 50 years," said Biszantz of Young. "He trained for me for

a year or so, and I trust him implicitly. I have great respect for his knowledge and eye for a good horse.

"George Weaver had done a good job for the previous owner, but I don't think any of us thought he would turn out to be as good a horse as he did."

Transferred to Chad Brown, Twisted Tom started 2017 with three straight wins, including two open-company stakes: the Private Terms Stakes and Federico Tesio, both at Laurel Park.

Though based in California, Biszantz, who is a former two-term president of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, said he likes to come east to compete with the best, and he has been active at the New York-bred sales in the past, in 2013 setting a new record for the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of preferred New York-breds when he paid \$430,000 for a Tapit filly out of the More Than Ready mare Miss Challenge.

"I buy at the sale every year," he said. "I love New York-breds."

After the Tesio, Sol Kumin's Head of Plains Partners purchased a one-third interest in the gelding.

Twisted Tom drew post one for the Belmont, not ideal in an 11-horse field, especially for a horse that likes to run on the lead, but earlier in his career, he had closed from far back to win by a neck. In his seventh start, he'd get his fifth jockey, but that jockey, Javier Castellano, will be inducted into the Hall of Fame this year and is a multiple Eclipse Award winner. Twisted Tom was made a 20-1 chance on the morning line.

Yet by post time, Twisted Tom had been

bet down to 9-1and was being chatted up as perhaps this year's "wiseguy" horse. Unfortunately, despite the Belmont's sometimes-forgiving 12-furlong distance, his race was likely over by the time the field hit the first turn.

After breaking cleanly and establishing position on the rail, Twisted Tom and Castellano had to check sharply when Hollywood Handsome and Florent Geroux ran up behind them and clipped heels, causing Geroux to lose his irons. Obviously discomfited by the incident, Twisted Tom ran rankly before re-establishing his stride, and, all things considered, ran well to a sixth-place finish.

"Bad racing luck," said Taylor philosophically a week after the race. "He tried hard, he didn't embarrass himself, and he had a difficult, challenging trip. It was a very dangerous situation that fortunately didn't result in a horse going down."

"I had my binoculars on him," said Wilmot. "There were six involved in that incident, and we were the first of the last six. The first five finishers weren't involved in the bumping, and that's what really happened in the race. Had he had a reasonable trip, I think he might have been fighting Patch for third."

While the breeders were naturally disappointed that Twisted Tom didn't have a better finish, they found plenty of reason to enjoy the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival. They were looking particularly forward to the Easy Goer Stakes and seeing West Coast, who is out of Caressing, a half sister to Platinum Blonde, a mare Stepwise Farm purchased at the 1993 Keeneland November sale. By Silver Hawk, Platinum Blonde raced in Taylor's name and won the 1995 Natalma Stakes at Woodbine.

"It's going to be a really big day for us to watch horses related to our mares," said Wilmot ahead of the weekend.

And after West Coast dominated the Easy Goer, he said, "It's great to see that family blossoming again."

Impressed with the racing that he saw, Wilmot praised the re-vamped Belmont Stakes weekend.

"It was really special Friday and Saturday," he said. "Hats off to (senior vice president of racing operations) Martin Panza and (CEO and president) Chris Kay and NYRA for building up this festival."

They are also grateful to the many people who got Twisted Tom to the starting gate of the Belmont.

"It takes so many people and a lot of teamwork to get a horse here," said Taylor. "Denali Stud has represented us for a long time; they take our mares in the winter and help with sales prep, and sometimes with raising our horses.

"Niall and Stephanie did such a great job," added Wilmot, "and George Weaver did a nice job. And, of course, Chad."

They look forward to seeing Twisted Tom run later this year, perhaps at Saratoga, their home turf.

"We still have his mom," Taylor said, "and this is a wonderful event in her life and validates our breeding program. We have a gorgeous Fed Biz yearling we'll offer for sale at Saratoga."

"The kid played in the Super Bowl," said Wilmot. That's pretty special. Hats off to the winners."






